"She's been bought for a commercial breeder in Ireland to go to George Washington, and you'd hope to get another fast one like Dutch Art," said the agent. 

Barbaro Update

BARBARO STEADILY IMPROVING by Gail Luciani, Director of UPenn Office of Communications

KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro continues to improve following the removal of his right hind leg cast on Nov. 6, according to his medical team. "Barbaro is steadily gaining strength on his right hind limb now that it is out of the cast," said Dr. Dean W. Richardson, Chief of Surgery. "He is only wearing a very light cotton bandage on that leg and both walks and stands well on it." Barbaro's lower right hind leg had been in a cast since surgery at Penn's George D. Widener Hospital following his accident at the Preakness on May 20. "Radiographs of his fractured lower limb were taken yesterday and look excellent," said Dr. Richardson. Barbaro's left hind foot, which had laminitis, continues to improve. "The left hind foot is improving gradually and has a long way to go although his comfort on that foot remains surprisingly good," said Dr. Richardson.

FALLON DRUG POSITIVE Kieren Fallon's annus horribilis continued vesterday after it was announced the jockey is set to serve a six-month suspension, ordered by stewards of France-Galop, after testing positive to "traces" of a yet-to-be disclosed prohibited substance. The jockey was found to have fallen foul of the French Racing Authority's stringent procedures when both A and B samples failed a random test after the jockey rode [unplaced] Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill) in the July 9 G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly. Dr. Michael Lewis, the disciplinary hearing's expert witness, indicated an exceedingly low quantity of the banned substance may have arisen due to "environmental contact." The jockey has until midnight Friday to appeal the ban, due to commence Dec. 7, but is not expected to do so. "Only trace levels were detected and these are considerably lower than generally accepted thresholds for positive results," Fallon's solicitor Christopher Stewart-Moore told PA Sport. "Kieren is dismayed at this turn of events, but understands that as it is a strict liability offence, France Galop has no alternative but to impose a suspension." Confirming the ban will almost certainly be enforced worldwide, Denis Egan, Chief Executive of the Irish Turf Club, said. "Ireland is signatory to the international agreement which states that if we are requested, by a foreign authority, to reciprocate a ban then we are expected to reciprocate that ban," he commented. "It is a matter for the [Turf Club's] stewards, but my understanding is the ban will be reciprocated. My belief is that he will be ruled out of riding everywhere."

CHEPSTOWS LAUNCHES ON-LINE AUCTIONS

Chepstows, a British-based online auction company devised by Charlie and Anne Oakshott of Whitsbury Manor Stud, went live yesterday with a new, independent and transparent live online auction site for stallion seasons, http://www.chepstows.com/. The site will allow stud farms to market their less popular stallions alongside others that are oversubscribed, according to the company. Oversubscribed stallions will have their stud fee set as the reserve, while undersubscribed stallions will list an agreed-upon reserve. Upon registration, bidders will be able to use a searchable list of available stallion nominations, with links to their individual farm pages. Like items on EBay, seasons will be listed for a set amount of time with rolling bids accepted. After the conclusion of each auction, stud farms will deal directly with mare owners. Said Anne Oakshott, Chepstows's marketing manager, "The first stallions on-line will be those from Shadwell, and they will be an excellent demonstration of how the site works for breeders and stallion owners, with the flexibility to vary terms from those published, in a way beneficial to both sides. It will give an extra opportunity to mare owners, as studs with an oversubscribed stallion will be able to keep five or so nominations back to be auctioned. We have been delighted with the positive feedback we have received."
