NYRA ASKS COURT TO HALT FRANCHISE

The New York Racing Association is asking a federal bankruptcy judge to halt the state's plan to turn Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga over to the next Thoroughbred franchise-holder. NYRA, in a battle to hold onto its franchise after a state panel recommended it be replaced at the end of 2007 by Excelsior Racing Associates, also filed a motion with the United States Bankruptcy Court in Manhattan to force the state to approve a long-stalled video lottery terminal casino at Aqueduct. The court action throws yet another wrinkle into the state's franchise bidding process. An effort by some officials to get the franchise issue resolved Dec. 13 in the state legislature appears dead, legislators and state officials said. The legislature is in town for a one-day special session, and some backers of Excelsior were trying to get lawmakers to accept a recent recommendation by the Ad Hoc Committee on the Future of Racing that Excelsior get the next 20-year franchise. The developments came as officials with an Australian betting company Capital Play met with state officials to discuss its interest in the NYRA franchise. Capital Play was disqualified earlier in the fall by the Ad Hoc Committee for failing to produce certain documents. The firm, sources said, is telling officials it will provide \$1.8 billion to the state, including \$50 million a year, for the franchise--about \$1 billion more than the next-highest bidder. Change in Purse Structure at Philly Park:

Overall purses at Philadelphia Park will be boosted 40 percent in 2007, it was announced yesterday. The track will be able to offer the increase as their slot machines go on line next week. The current daily purse distribution is \$125,000; it will be raised to \$175,000 beginning in '07, and, for the first time, purses will be paid back to last. "While we're thrilled to take these initial steps in the advancement of Philadelphia Park, we also realize that this really is just the beginning of turning this track into one of the prominent players in East Coast racing," remarked Director of Racing Sal Sinatra. The track will also implement a state-bred program, offering restricted maiden special weight races, as well as NW1X and NW2X allowance events. The bottom price for some claiming divisions has been raised as well, with the bottom for maiden claimers at \$10,000 and for conditional claimers at \$5,000. "It's the best Christmas present our horsemen could receive," said Mike Ballezzi, executive director of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. "It will certainly change the face of Pennsylvania racing forever and be of great benefit to all Pennsylvania horsemen and their families."

Leptospirosis Getting an Early Start this Year:

Researchers at the University of Kentucky's Livestock Disease Diagnostic Center have reported numerous early cases of leptospirosis, a bacterial disease that can cause a variety of equine problems, including abortion, a flu-like illness, and uveitis (moon blindness). Leptospirosis can spread from horses to humans. Craig Carter, DVM PhD, a professor of epidemiology at the university, said the center has seen 10 cases of leptospirosis in Kentucky since October, compared to zero cases in the same timeframe last year. With the upcoming Kentucky breeding and foaling season closing in, Carter said he believes there will be many more leptospirosis cases. "It feels like we're maybe shifting a little earlier, maybe a couple of months, of when we see cases," Carter said. "Whether that's due to the rainfall or not, who knows, but it looks like a shift." Carter said the Leptospira bacteria are particularly fond of wet weather, and are killed by drying or freezing, and as Kentucky transitions from a soggy fall into a wet winter, the conditions are just right for increased infection rates. Carter said that the infected horses brought in to the diagnostic center so far have been mostly midto late-term abortions, with one weak neonate, and one older horse that died and was confirmed to be a carrier. The Diagnostic Center has verified leptospirosis via a fluorescent antibody test performed on kidney and liver samples combined with pathology on the affected horses. Meier, 52, was thrown when his mount, Miss Classified, stumbled leaving the gate. The all-time leading rider at the track, he is expected to be back in action when the spring meet opens Feb. 23. Meier posted 12 victories at the current stand.

ROAP To Unveil Evaluation Program for Stewards:

The Racing Officials Accreditation Program has developed an annual performance evaluation program for stewards and judges, as well as a list of points of emphasis for judging races, and that information will be disseminated to state racing commissions by the end of the year. "We have had several inquiries from racing commissions asking for suggestions on how to properly evaluate the job performance of their stewards and judges," said Stan Bowker, executive secretary of the Virginia Racing Commission and chairman of ROAP. "With the help of executive directors John Wayne in Delaware, John Blakeney in Ontario and Bob Leitner in Washington, we have developed the key elements that should be included in a program to evaluate stewards and judges. The ROAP program envisions annual evaluations, and we believe the reviews will show that stewards and judges, by and large, are doing an outstanding job of enforcing the rules and regulations of each racing commission and maintaining the integrity of our sport. In situations where improvements are needed, the reviews will provide opportunities to discuss performance changes." The points of emphasis that ROAP has come up with are: the uniform posting of the inquiry sign; requiring jockeys to ride horses out to the wire; uniform review of race video before declaring a race official; and routine communications with all stakeholders, including owners, trainers, jockeys, track management, fans and other racing officials. "In today's age of simulcasting where 88 percent of handle originates off track, it is more important than ever to develop consistency in the way stewards and judges handle certain situations," Bowker said. "Consistency of officiating is characteristic of other professional sports, and we believe that horse racing's patrons will be better served if stewards and judges handle certain situations the same no matter where a track is located." ROAP was established in July of 2005 to improve the integrity of racing by accrediting all racing officials, stewards and judges.
