465 ENTERED FOR 2008 EPSOM DERBY The barns of Godolphin and Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum boast the highest number of entries, with 44 each, among a 465-strong list of possibles of the £1.25 million 2008 G1 Epsom Derby it was announced Wednesday. Among the Godolphin contingent is the \$11.7-million Kingmambo colt, who became the second highest-priced yearling ever sold at public auction when passing through the ring at Keeneland September; a \$9.2-million colt from the final crop of Danzig purchased at the same venue; and a Pivotal half-brother to George Washington (Ire) and Grandera (Ire), bought for 1.2-million guineas at Tattersalls' October Sale. Sue Magnier has 30 horses entered, plus one in partnership with Fittocks Stud, while Coolmore associates Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith have 15 and nine entries, respectively, making a total of 55. The Coolmore contingent includes a Hawk Wing colt out of 1996 Oaks victress Lady Carla, a half-brother to Hawk Wing himself and a Montjeu (Ire) three-parts brother to last year's Oaks heroine Alexandrova. International interest comes in the form of entries from Ireland, France and Germany, as well as a nine-strong team from Japanese owner Hidetoshi Yamamoto. Yamamoto's entries include a colt by Red Ransom out of Oaks winner Love Divine, the dam of G1 St Leger winner Sixties Icon. There are two further entry opportunities for the 2008 Vodafone Derby; the Apr. 9, 2008 second stage costing £8,000 and the June 2, 2008 supplementary stage at £75,000.

"It's the first time he has ridden him in a race, but he actually rode a piece of work on him last Tuesday," trainer Ed Dunlop told Racing Post. The six-year-old, who will retire to stud in Japan, has remained on the island since his close seventh to Daiwa Major (Jpn) in the G1 Mile Championship at Kyoto Nov. 19. "Everything has been fine," Dunlop continued. "He's been there five weeks now and has settled in well. Court Masterpiece has a lead horse and three members of our staff to keep him company and he had a slight excuse about the ground last time." Court Masterpiece contests the 1400-meter distance for the first time since taking the 2005 running of the G1 Prix de la Foret. "Returning to seven furlongs should suit and they say the track is great," Dunlop said.

## PHILLY PARK JOCKEYS TAB LABOR UNION FOR REPRESENTATION

by Jason Shandler, courtesy The Blood-Horse In a continuing effort to increase catastrophic on-track accident insurance for riders, Philadelphia Park Jockeys has taken the unprecedented step of affiliating itself with a labor union to help resolve the issue. Philadelphia Park Jockeys president and longtime rider Anthony Black said Dec. 13 the decision to join the International Union of Journeyman Allied Trades was necessary because of the lack of progress over the past eight months. Philadelphia Park currently offers jockeys only \$100,000 in catastrophic on-track accident insurance coverage, believed to be the lowest of any major racetrack in the country. Philadelphia Park Jockeys are asking for a \$1-million minimum policy similar to those at tracks around the country. "We are at an absolute deadlock with management," said Black, the Bensalem Township, Pa.-based racetrack's all-time leading rider who continues to recover from an on-track accident suffered in November. "This step hasn't been taken before that I know of, but it was worth investigating. It still might not help, but we wanted to explore the possibility of jockeys belonging to a union. We can't resolve the issue, so we had to take another step. "This is a 70,000-person strong union that also represents the Philadelphia blacksmiths. We hope that they can help us get what we deserve." The IUJAT was established in 1874 and is one of the oldest labor organizations in the United States. Based out of New York, IUJAT has a special chapter set up just for the equine trade, though it has never represented jockeys before. "We are putting in a petition on the jockeys' behalf," said Gloria Lorrando, president of IUJAT local 947. "One of disputes is whether or not jockeys are considered independent contractors. Our contention is that they are acting as an employee of the racetrack. "We'd like to do everything we can to help the jockeys get what they deserve. They sacrifice a lot and are at high risk, but do not receive the recognition they deserve by the industry. "There are many things that they are entitled to, not just (additional insurance) coverage.




