

She debuted stateside for trainer Patrick Biancone with a 4 1/2-length allowance victory at Keeneland Oct. 11 before closing into a slow pace to be third in the Nov. 12 Audrey Skirball-Kenis S. last time out. "She ran well last time and likes the firm ground," Biancone said of the winner. "We were too conservative last time--too far back. We were closer today. My owner [Joseph Allen] bought her before the French Oaks and sent her to me."

Finlandia (Royal Anthem), who shipped from New York to California on Thursday, was forced to miss the Dahlia after spiking a fever. "She had a little temperature, not bad, but there was a little elevation in her white cell count," explained trainer Tom Bush. Bush said the filly may stay in California and be pointed at the Jan. 7 GII San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita.

Of course the other dominant force on the juvenile front in recent years has been Storm Cat, who topped the table in 1992, '93, '95, '98, '99 and '02. Storm Cat's son Tale of the Cat took over the mantle in 2003 and now it looks as though the 2006 honor is guaranteed to go to another son, Stormy Atlantic (one of four sons of Storm Cat in the top 20).

I highlighted back in January the possibility that Stormy Atlantic's profile was set to rise in 2006 with the emergence of his first Kentucky crop, but even I have been surprised to see how well he has done. His current statistics from this crop stand at four stakes winners and a total of eight stakes horses from 63 runners. Among them are the unbeaten Leonnatus Anteas, who was voted Canada's champion two-year-old colt at Saturday's Sovereign Awards, Miss Atlantic City, winner of the Boyd Gaming's Delta Princess S., and Stormello. The determined Stormello fought off Tiznow's son Liquidity to add the GI Hollywood Futurity to his earlier success in the GII Norfolk S.

It is well worth pointing out that these good winners were sired at a fee of only \$12,500, but Stormy Atlantic has since earned more respect from the breeding community, to the extent that his fee for 2007 will be \$30,000.

This respect has been earned with a steady flow of good winners from the crops sired by Stormy Atlantic at even lower fees during his time in Florida. Retired close to the 1999 season, Stormy Atlantic started out at only \$3,000 before progressing to \$5,000 in 2000 and then to \$6,000 in both 2001 and 2002. In other words, it was only in 2003, after his move to Hill 'n' Dale Farms, that his fee reached five figures. *Cont. p4*

His four crops in Florida have produced as many as eight graded winners--some 2.7 percent of their 295 named foals--but none of them had hit the Grade I target until Stormello came along.

It's a highly enlightening exercise to look at the racing records of the dams of these nine graded winners. Bearing in mind the sort of fees commanded by Stormy Atlantic, I didn't expect to find any graded winners among these nine mares, and I didn't. However, I also didn't find any stakes winners or even any black-type earners. In fact only two of the nine graded winners by Stormy Atlantic (Atlantic Ocean and Twice As Bad) are out of winning mares. Four of the others--Gators N Bears, Icy Atlantic, She Says It Best and Sea Siren--are out of unraced mares and another three--Indian Ocean, Quite A Bride and Stormello--are out of mares who failed to win. Put another way, only one of Stormy Atlantic's nine American graded winners is out of a mare which earned more than \$25,000. Leonnatus Anteas is another out of a non-black-type performer, but his dam did earn more than \$25,000 (\$42,270 to be exact). Could this apparent ability to upgrade his mares have something to do with Stormy Atlantic's being a member of the remarkable Rough Shod family?

As he's a son of Storm Cat, it is hardly surprising that Stormy Atlantic's most successful representative is out of a granddaughter of Mr. Prospector. Stormello is out of a daughter of Carson City, as is Miss Atlantic City, who defeated Appealing Zophie in taking the Delta Princess S. Carson City, of course, is also the broodmare sire of Barbaro and of E Z Warrior, another 2006 juvenile graded winner by a son of Storm Cat.

Stormello is the first foal of Wilshewed, who failed to win in 10 attempts after selling for \$125,000 as a two-year-old. Stormello's yearling sister should be worth watching out for next year, and the mare is currently carrying a foal by Bernstein, another son of Storm Cat.

Although Wilshewed never won, she is a well-connected mare. With a son of Mr. Prospector as her sire and the Lyphard mare So Cozy as her dam, Wilshewed is a three-parts sister to three stakes-winning fillies, each of whom has produced a stakes winner. One of Wilshewed's half-sisters, Max's Sister, produced the Australian Group 2 winner All Bar One to Storm Cat's son Hennessy.

Stormello's third dam, Special Warmth, was a Grade II winner over six furlongs at two in 1976, so precocious talent is nothing new for this family. Interestingly, four of the seven stallions in the first three generations of Stormello's pedigree have held the title of champion juvenile sire, so the colt has every right to be a high-class juvenile, even though injury restricted Stormy Atlantic to just one start at two.

Jockey Rene Douglas was barred from the grounds at Calder Race Course Dec. 15, though he wasn't notified of the reason for the ban, said the jockey's agent, Danny Mellul. Meanwhile, Calder management has enacted a "house rule" designed to strengthen existing state regulations on the use of medication. "We have no idea what's going on right now," Mellul said Dec. 18. "They won't tell us why he has been barred, so we're getting a lawyer and trying to get to the bottom of this and find out when we can get back to riding." Douglas was notified of the decision during the afternoon card at Calder and permitted to fulfill his mounts for the day. He won the eighth race aboard Sincere Man for trainer Harry Benson, boosting his statistics for the 60-day Tropical-at-Calder meet to 31 wins from 152 starts. Nationally, Douglas ranks among the top 40 jockeys in earnings this year after a Nov. 4 win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies aboard Frank Calabrese's Dreaming of Anna. "My main concern right now is making sure other tracks are aware we're not suspended," Mellul said. "Even the stewards here don't know what's going on. And in my opinion, [Calder management] should handle themselves in a more professional manner. If they have a problem, they should take care of it quietly and let the rider know what the matter is." Calder president Ken Dunn had no comment other than to say that the track had employed its right as a private property owner to bar the jockey from the premises. Click for the complete story.



RACE FIXING TRIAL SET FOR SEPTEMBER

Kieren Fallon will have to wait until September to stand trial as a result of being charged with alleged race-fixing. Yesterday's announcement was delivered by Mr Justice Forbes, who carried out a two-hour hearing before deciding on a date of Sept. 24 for the case to be heard at the Old Bailey court. Fallon and fellow jockeys Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams, as well as Miles Rodgers, Philip Sherkle, and Shaun Lynch, all deny the allegations against them. They have been charged by the City of London police with conspiracy to defraud between December 2002 and September 2004, by interfering with the running of horses to ensure they lost races and defrauding punters with the internet betting firm Betfair. Rodgers, who made his name as a syndicate director, was also accused of concealing the proceeds of crime.
