Last year's Japanese Triple Crown winner, Deep Impact sustained his first career defeat in this race last year when the elder Heart's Cry (Jpn) bested him. The dark bay began 2006 with three straight victories in the spring before setting his sights on the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Though Deep Impact crossed the line a close third in that Oct. 1 contest at Longchamp, he was later disqualified for a medication infraction. He rebounded with an impressive victory in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 26 at Tokyo and was odds-on once again in Sunday's Arima Kinen. Deep Impact gave his legions of fans one last thrilling display and now heads to stud at Shadai Stallion Station on Hokkaido. He was syndicated earlier this year for ¥5.1 billion. Latent Heat Wins Malibu (cont. from p1)

Latent Heat (Maria's Mon) showed great promise with a maiden score at Santa Anita in January and a 9 1/2length allowance tally at Belmont in June, but he was winless in three tries in graded stakes company; finishing third to Brother Derek in the Mar. 4 GII Santa Catalina S. and second in the July 15 GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. He was coming off an uncharacteristic ninth-place finish in the Oct. 13 GIII Perryville S. at Keeneland, an effort trainer Bobby Frankel said was due to illness. "He wasn't eating well before the race and I wasn't back there and they were saying he was going to be all right, but he came out of the race with a 13,000 white blood cell count. Obviously he had to have an infection in his system. High normal is 10,000. But he performed like he was supposed to today." Frankel would not commit to a start for Latent Heat in the Jan. 13 1 1/16-miles GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. "I'm not sure he wants to go around two turns," the trainer commented. Favored Brother Derek (Benchmark) found himself stuck in traffic along the rail in the stretch and finished seventh. "I was down inside and he wasn't liking it down in there," explained jockey Garrett Gomez. "Every time I tried to give him his head and get him to do something, his first move was out, so he had my hands tied where I couldn't do anything with him."

Kip Deville won the Oct. 15 Bryan Station S. at Keeneland before a sixth-place finish in the GI Hollywood Derby. The gray colt ran a stalking fourth and waited for racing room into the stretch before bullying his way to the lead along the rail at midstretch and inching clear to the wire to give jockey Richard Migliore his first Santa Anita victory and trainer Rick Dutrow, Jr. his first stakes win at the Arcadia oval. "I can't even begin to describe how thrilled I am to win a race like this on opening day," Migliore said. "The atmosphere here, with the big crowd, the mountains, I mean this is Santa Anita. TDN's Dec. 23, 2006 memorial to the late R. Smiser West omitted Mr. and Mrs. West's most significant contribution to the breed, but understandably so. After all, it remains not widely known that Fast Line, a filly bred by them in 1958, became one of the most prolific foundation mares of the latter half of the 20th century.

A study I did a few years ago ranked Fast Line, by Mr. Busher ex Throttle Wide (1936), by Flying Heels ex Let Her Fly, in eighth place by tail-female unrestricted stakes production worldwide for the period 1978 to the present, adjusted for average number of generations removed. In other words, among all tail-female ancestors, she was eighth in terms of the number of unrestricted stakes winners per average number of generations removed, just ahead of Rough Shod II (1944), in ninth place. Most recently, Bernardini, six generations removed from Fast Line in tail-female descent, added his name to her copious list of credits.

Mr. and Mrs. West purchased her dam, Throttle Wide, at auction. She had produced Miss Request, winner of two stakes, but no runners of note thereafter. They bred her to Spy Song to get the 1957 filly Nimble Feet, which, although a winner of only three races in 23 starts, was a very good producer in her own right. The next year they bred Throttle Wide to Mr. Busher and got Fast Line, her dam's last foal. Fast Line won only one race of eight starts, but produced stakes winners Fairway Fun and White Star Line, plus nine other fillies, many of whom became stakes producers and the dams of stakes producers. In all, she produced 19 foals, including G1 Prix Morny winner Filiberto. *Cont. p9*

EURO VALUE

Whereas almost half the horses recommended in last week's North American 'value column' were 'proven' sires, under 30 percent of the stallions recommended in this week's column, covering Europe, had three-year-olds and up of 2006. This indicates quite a lot of promise among unproven European sires, though to be fair the numbers would even up except that I've selected eight European freshman sires of 2006 to feature.

Without trying to, I think I ended up with 32 stallions on each side of the Pond, plus the 10 (five and five) from the previous week. For this week's column, I have used a stud fee ceiling of €25,000 (or the equivalent in GBP), with the exception of one proven sire who I think is significantly underpriced compared to his contemporaries: Cape Cross. I think at €50,000 he compares favorably with horses standing for twice as much. According to figures compiled by Hyperion Promotions, he is the number 10 sire in Europe this year, and it's not just Ouija Board, by any manner of means, as the likes of G2 Park Hill S. (and G1 Epsom Oaks second) Rising Cross and two-year-old Group 2 winner Halicarnassus testify. His 2.83 mid-year APEX rating is almost exactly the same as other top young sires Giant's Causeway (2.71) and Montjeu (2.79), yet he stands for far less than either. He's a bargain at €50,000, and now I'll go back to my list of 31 sires standing for €25,000 or under.

Established Form

In Ireland: Barathea has always been a solid, though unspectacular sire, yet is now having success both as a minor sire of sires and as a broodmare sire. He's an ideal sire to give a mare the right sort of start: the number 12 sire in Europe this year, when he had 78 'hits' on the TDN Sire Count and 37 Northern Hemisphere stakes wins and placings. In America, you want a \$25,000 sire to be really consistent and a useful sire €25,000 level, and Barathea fits that definition precisely. He's tied, at that fee, with Peintre Celebre, the brilliant 1997 Arc winner and sire this year of Pride. He's been maybe a little more brilliant than Barathea as a sire, but a little less consistent; but he's getting plenty of support from pundits right now who see him as that bit underrated. Verglas moved to Ireland for 2005, having spent his first five seasons in France. He produced some very impressive numbers there from crops which weren't that big, and proved popular at the Goffs' November Sale with his first Irish crop. If he reproduces his French form from bigger crops in Ireland, he'll be even more impossible to get to--and at a higher price--than he is now.

In Britain: The venerable Cadeaux Genereux will be 22 next week, and has been one of Europe's most consistent sires for 15 years. His APEX figures have hardly ever wavered: through Aug. 1, he was 1.77 for A Runners since 2000, 1.65 for ABC Runners, and 1.68 for two-year-olds. He's the sire of 13 Group 1/Group 2 winners in 14 crops, and 94 stakes horses, and his fee is down to £15,000 for 2007; good value for a thoroughly proven sire. Still at £12,000, Hernando

represents excellent value for the owner-breeder who isn't desperate for a two-year-old (he has only a 0.71 two-year-old ABC rating). He has 16 'A Runners' from his first five crops, including two French Derby winners in his first three crops, so we are just waiting for the

fireworks from his subsequent crops.

Good cheap sires abound in France, but none is gaining more cachet than the 1992 G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Marchand de Sable, by Theatrical. He sired his second Group 1 winner this year, when Marchand d'Or captured the G1 Maurice de Gheest. Though rising 17, he's never been very well known, but now looks like he'll be getting his biggest books yet, at €10,000, his highest price yet. Interestingly, he himself is out of a Kenmare mare, and Marchand d'Or is out of a mare by Kenmare's son, Kendor; that Grey Sovereign is inbreeding a lot lately.

Gold Away ran second in four Group 1s and would have been among the favorites for the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, but injury forced his retirement a couple of weeks before the race. There's a tendency to suppose his good figures are all due to his top-class first-crop daughter Alexander Goldrun, but his 2.92 two-year-old ABC Index shows he's also a sire of quite precocious horses. He's a gift at €3,500 at Quesney.

Euro Frosh

This looks to be an especially deep crop of European freshman sires, headed by Invincible Spirit and the new Japanese stallion Rock of Gibraltar and also including Noverre, Tobougg (reviewed two weeks ago), the surprising Fath, Kyllachy, and Golan among the top seven. I think there is some great value, also, in the group of sires ranking between eighth and 16th position (using figures from Hyperion Promotions, Dec. 11). The 2001 G1 French Derby winner Anabaa Blue is eighth, with 12 winners, including Spirit One, a Group 3 winner and head second to Mount Nelson in the G1 Criterium International. Quite a few judges rate him the best Frenchtrained two-year-old colt of his crop and are predicting big things for the sire next year. Iron Mask, Europe's number 10, has moved back to Quesnay after a stint at Huma Park in Ireland. By Danzig out of an Alydar half-sister to the rocket Gold Beauty (which makes him actually a three-quarter brother to Dayjur), he was first or second in his first six starts as a two-year-old, including a win in the G3 Prix d'Arenberg. His only off-the-board performance at two came when unplaced in the all-aged G1 Prix de l'Abbaye. At three, he was shipped to Singapore in May and defeated olders in a big Listed six-furlong sprint out there, but it effectively finished him. He never ran again at three, and was unplaced in his two stakes starts at four. He has sired 15 first-crop winners, including the Group 3-winning filly, Iron Lips. He's only €5,000 for next year.

In Britain, another speedball by Danzig, Group 3 winner Ishiguru, occupies ninth spot on the European Freshman Sire rankings. His nine winners include the

classy Hellvelyn, winner of the G2 Coventry and second to Holy Roman Emperor in the G1 Phoenix S.; and Ferneley, placed in two seven-furlong group races. Clearly they are going to stay farther than he did himself. Tweenhills is standing him for just £4,500, which seems awfully cheap for a sire with the Coventry winner in his first crop. The GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner in 2001, Val Royal has been added to the roster of the reviving National Stud in Newmarket, having stood in Ireland up until now. He ranks number 11 among European Freshman Sires, his 14 winners including Valbenny, winner of the GIII Miesque S. at Hollywood Park. He stands for £6,500 next year. That leaves only Redback, from this short list, remaining in Ireland. A dual Group 3 winner and third in the 2002 English 2000 Guineas behind Rock of Gibraltar and Hawk Wing, he had early-season stakes winners Sonny Red (Listed) and Gilded, winner of the G2 Queen Mary at Royal Ascot. He ranks number 13 on the European Freshman Sire list, and will stand for €6,500 next year.

Two who were more staying types and have made promising starts are Beat Hollow (number 16) and Act One (number 20). Beat Hollow, by Sadler's Wells out of G1 Irish Oaks winner Wemyss Bight, made a sensational start, with a Group 3 and Listed winner, and another group-placed. Though he was third to Sinndar in the 2000 Epsom Derby, he was probably best at around 10 furlongs, at which distance he won the G1 Jean Prat in France, and three Grade Is at nine-10 furlongs in the States under Bobby Frankel's tutelage. He's £10,000 for 2007, and probably just about full.

Act One, by In The Wings, went into the 2002 G1 French Derby a prohibitive favorite, unbeaten in five starts, but was upstaged in the final furlong by the longshot Sulamani. Act One never ran again, but Sulamani (see below) went on to prove himself one of the most durable horses Godolphin ever raced, thus franking the 2002 French Derby form. Act One hasn't maybe set the world alight so far, but don't write him off. He had some very promising winners who look like they'll be a lot better three-year-olds, especially 2007 French Oaks candidate Woodland Faery. *Cont. p6*

Finally, may I recommend, at a price of only £2,000, the 2000 G2 Cork and Orrery winner Superior Premium. He won 11 of 53 career starts, and is by Forzando (grandson of Foril, by Formidable) out of a Song mare; it's a speed pedigree. He isn't actually a freshman sire, but his small second crop includes a really good colt called Baby Strange, winner of the Rockingham S. (Listed) at York, and second in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Lafitte, behind Captain Marvelous (by Invincible Spirit), with Iron Lips (by Iron Mask) third. Believe me, if this sire throws any more that look like Baby Strange (he was a 20,000gns Doncaster October yearling, which would have been a lot of money for that pedigree), he's the find of the decade at that fee.

The Younger Crowd

There are some very interesting young stallion prospects in Europe, and some pretty hot prospects lined up as the beauty contests end and their first runners actually go to the racetrack in 2007. Oasis Dream has always been everybody's dream play. He was a sixfurlong Group 1 winner at two; and the top sprinter in Europe at three in 2003 (Timeform 129). He is a dead ringer for his sire Green Desert, who proved he could be a sire of sires with Cape Cross; and his yearlings were genuinely popular. Insta-tistics says 48 of them averaged over \$190,000, second among European sires only to Dalakhani--partially, no doubt, because both are 'neutral' European stallions, so acceptable to both of the warring Titans. If it all comes off, he won't be standing for £25,000 next year, and if ever a horse had every possible credential for sire success, it's Oasis Dream. Coolmore's duo of High Chaparral and Hawk Wing both face the moment of truth as well, and are both priced at enticing €20,000 fees. High Chaparral attempts to become the third consecutive successful son of Sadler's Wells for Coolmore in the last four years, after Montjeu (Timeform 137 and three and four) and Galileo (Timeform 134 at three). Rated 130 by Timeform at three and 132 at four, he maybe wasn't quite as devastating a racehorse as the previous two, but his record is quite impressive nonetheless.

He won six Grade 1s: the Racing Post Trophy at two, then the English and Irish Derbies, the Irish Champion S. (at 10 furlongs; the other were all 12 furlongs), and the Breeders' Cup Turf twice (dead-heating with Johar the second time) at three and four.

A lot of the shrewdies want to bet against Hawk Wing making a sire, for one principal reason: Woodman has never sired a really successful sire. That is true, but Hawk Wing did something no other Woodman has probably ever done, either: the day he put it all together, in the 2003 G1 Lockinge S. over one mile as a four-year-old, he ran a truly off-the-graph race, winning off by 11 lengths and earning a 136 year-end rating from Timeform. He's been given a chance, too: Insta-tistics says he had an incredible 96 yearlings offered, of which an equally amazing 73 sold, and averaged a little over \$118,000. The Woodman might stop him; on the other hand, if he sires to that 136, he could be lights-out, the next Danehill.

Speaking of Danehill, a horse Hawk Wing had a lot of form with was Where Or When, who was from Danehill Dancer's first crop, and was maybe the first indicator that Danehill Dancer was a sire that was going to way exceed expectations. Where or When ran fourth to an Aidan O'Brien 1-2-3 (Rock of Gibraltar, Landseer, Tendulkar) in the 2001 G1 Dewhurst, beat Hawk Wing in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at three, and ran second to the same horse in the aforementioned Lockinge. He only stands for £6,000 at Cheveley Park, and, given his form, might surprise a few better-known types at higher prices.

Another horse with all sorts of form with this crowd is Dubai Destination, who beat Rock of Gibraltar in the G2 Champagne S. at two and impressively won the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot at four in 2003. He has sold very impressively--Insta-tistics says 54 yearlings averaged \$177,755 (third-highest European sire for first yearlings)--but at £20,000 I would call him fairly priced, rather than an actual bargain. I give the horse a big shot, though.

Captain Rio, from Pivotal's second crop (Kyllachy is from his first), never figured in the Classic standings with the rest of these: he was an out-and-out sprinter. He was a serious rocket, too: three times he ran RPR's (Racing Post Ratings, similar to Timeform) of 120+, including an eight-length demolition job in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Lafitte. At two, Captain Rio was the number three rated two-year-old in Europe by

Timeform, behind Johannesburg and Queen's Logic, and ahead of a few horses you've heard of, like Dubai Destination, Rock of Gibraltar, and Hawk Wing. A graduate of Joe Foley's speed academy at Ballyhane Stud in Ireland, Captain Rio had just 107 yearlings offered, and a mere 87 sold, which averaged over \$57,000, so I'm not sure if he's really been given that much of a shot ... just kidding, Joe.

Of the sires with their first foals in 2006, the horses I rate as the best values happen to be three Maktoum stallions. We are into equal opportunity endorsement here, and this looks like a good team for them. The top two sires on foal average, according to Insta-tistics, were two of the three, Shadwell's Haafhd and Kildangan's Refuse To Bend. I've written before about Shadwell's production of useful (Intikhab and Muthathir, from my column two weeks ago) and promising (Sakhee and Nayef) sires, and there's a chance Haafhd could be the best of the lot. He won the 2004 G1 English 2000 Guineas quite convincingly, and came back, having been beaten twice thereafter, to again score impressively in the G1 Champion S. over 10 furlongs, at year's end, when Timeform rated him 129. By Alhaarth out of the great Blushing Groom mare Al Bahathri, one of Sheikh Hamdan's first top horses, there just could be something a little extra-special about this guy. Refuse To Bend won the key G1 National S. at the Curragh at two and the G1 English 2000 Guineas for Moyglare at three, then added the G1 Queen Anne, at one mile and G1 Eclipse S. at 10 furlongs for Godolphin at four. It adds up to a pretty useful record, and his first foals got good reviews by the market, too. He was very effective at a mile for a Sadler's Wells. Sulamani upset Act One in the 2002 G1 French Derby, and probably lost the G1 Arc that year when he went outside while Frankie Dettori went inside on Marienbard. He went on to win five Group 1s over the next two seasons for Godolphin, and proved probably one of the toughest horses they've yet had. He had a lot of the great Nijinsky II traits, as did his sire, Hernando, and it would surprise me not at all if Sulamani proved to be a worthy representative of the Nijinsky II line; he was a really good racehorse.


Of those who covered their first mares this year, and will be standing their second seasons in 2007, there are four I would particularly like to mention. First up is Starcraft, owned by the colorful Paul Makin and standing at Cheveley Park. From Soviet Star's southern hemisphere crops, he won Group 1 races from seven to 12

furlongs in Australasia, then proved a top miler up north when, trained by Luca Cumani, he won two Group 1 mile races in Europe, the Prix du Moulin at Longchamp and the Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Makin has heavily supported the horse by buying and selling mares to go to him at the sales, and a few judges who saw him at Cheveley Park pronounced him 'a magnificent specimen.' Timeform gave Antonius Pius the dreaded squiggle along with his 123 rating as a three-year-old in 2004, when he threw away certain victory in the G1 French 2000 Guineas, and finished second to Singletary in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. But, as I said about Powerscourt last week, that was the Jamie Spencer year, so the results need to be analyzed with that in mind. A \$1.5-million yearling by the incomparable Danzig out of G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner Catchascatchcan, I say this horse is a serious bargain at €8,000; he had the ability.

And there are two sons of Zafonic among this group I've got time for. David Redvers' Tweenhills Farm, which also stands Ishiguru and a popular new sire this year, Sleeping Indian, has one of them, the Juddmonte-bred Trade Fair. Timeform rated him 124 as a three-year-old in 2003, when he finally delivered on his considerable promise to win the seven-furlong G3 Criterion S. at Newmarket. I like him at £4,000. I also like Zafeen, who was rated Timeform 123 at three, when he finished second to Refuse to Bend in the G1 English 2000 Guineas and won the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. Zafonic, like his own sire Gone West, generally much preferred fast ground, and it was only when Zafeen didn't get firm ground, in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Sussex S., that he couldn't show his impressive turn of foot. After two years with Godolphin, when he never ran, Zafeen resurfaced at Overbury Stud last year. He's only £3,000, and, on firm ground, he was a real runner. Cont. p9

Juddmonte's Cacique won two and was second in another three Grade Is in America this year at distances ranging from nine to 11 furlongs. As he's also Dansili's younger full brother, he is certain to be hugely popular at £12,000. Shirocco's two biggest wins came in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf and this year's G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom. He improved into a real high-class Group 1 horse, rated 128 by Timeform last year, and 129 (black book) this year. By the fabulously successful Monsun, he is a great buy at Dalham Hall at £10,000. Iffraaj, another Zafonic horse (yeah, I guess I do), was beaten a dirty nose or so by Darley castoff Les Arcs in this year's six-furlong G1 July Cup, but did win three Group 2 races at seven furlongs. Timeform's final 2006 'black book' rated him 128. He should have a following at €12,000 at Kildangan. And for a £5,000 horse who should be popular at the sales and has got the credentials, too, have a look at Cheveley Park's Iceman. Fast Line's first foal, Fairway Fun (1962), by Prince John, set the tone for the family when she won the Alcibiades S. If Fast Line had been bred by one of the great breeding dynasties, one would be justified at this juncture in saying, quite simply, "The rest is history." What is most intriguing about this family to me, though, is that it is not history, at least not in the sense that it has a place alongside, say, Rough Shod II in what people talk about when they discuss pedigree. To be sure, the accomplishments of the family are matters of record, but in pedigree lore the Fast Line family, as such, does not even exist.

Why this is so can be attributed to the fact that, in origin and development, the Fast Line family was and remains a commercial family. In spite of the increasing importance of the commercial market, the history of the breed is still as much about the great breeding dynasties as it is about the horses themselves. It is easy to chronicle a family that was developed as an organized property, with the advantage of systematic opportunity, not so easy to chronicle one that developed organically on its own merit, subject to the discontinuities of market distribution. In any event, a history that draws its time lines along continuities established by the breeding dynasties cannot speak about, nor even notice, a foundation mare like Fast Line. Her distinction lies in her having been the first--perhaps the only--great commercial foundation mare.

From Fairway Fun to Bernardini, the many breeders and sellers of those horses, and their many owners, have enjoyed and deserved their measure of plaudits, but it's an inspiration to us all that none deserve more commendation for this long chain of fortune, as a whole, than Mr. and Mrs. West.



EHV-1 UPDATE: NINE CONFIRMED CASES IN FLORIDA courtesy of The Blood-Horse

There have been nine confirmed cases of equine herpesvirus (EHV-1) and five deaths have been attributed to the contagious equine disease in Florida, according to an update from the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services/Division of Animal Industry. According to the Dec. 25 update, the confirmed cases were of seven horses in the Wellington area, one in Ocala, and one in Indiantown. The Department of Agriculture reported that the Ocala horse shipped from south Florida and had a direct link to one of the horses shipped in from New York Nov. 29. Although five deaths have been attributed to the current EHV-1 outbreak, only two of those cases could be confirmed by laboratory tests. The first case reported was a horse imported from Europe through the USDA New York Animal Import Center, according to the Dec. 25 advisory. "There are 10 quarantined premises, seven in the Wellington area, one in Ocala, one in Jupiter, and one in Indiantown," the advisory stated. "Eight premises with confirmed cases are under state quarantine and two premises with suspect neurologic cases are under state quarantine. State and federal officials are working closely with veterinarians, owners, managers, and others in the affected equine industry to identify potentially exposed animals and suspect cases and to prevent further spread of the disease. Currently, there are not state or federal restrictions for horse movements into, within, or out of the state of Florida. Some premises and events have their own entry requirements. Contact your point of destination for specific information concerning any restrictions that premises/events may have imposed." Click for the complete story.

Phantom Rose Euthanized:

The three-year-old Juddmonte homebred Phantom Rose (Danzig--Honest Lady, by Seattle Slew), who was very impressive winning a Hollywood allowance in her U.S. debut, was euthanized last Friday after suffering an accident while training the day before, reports Daily Racing Form. A stakes winner in France, Phantom Rose was transferred to Bobby Frankel's barn this fall and, after her allowance victory Dec. 1, was being pointed toward Saturday's GI La Brea S. "This is probably the worst I've ever felt," an emotional Frankel told DRF. "What made it worse was being around her all day [Friday]. She wanted to live. She wanted somebody to help her. But when they did the surgery on her, there was nothing they could do." He added, "She was so kind. Those kind don't come around too often." A granddaughter of the bluehen mare Toussaud, Phantom Rose unexpectedly veered into a metal rail while training and was injured near a stifle. She had won three of six starts and banked \$98,055.

Gomez Gives to Winners Foundation:

Jockey Garrett Gomez, the nation's leading jockey in purse earnings this year, donated \$10,000 to the Winners Foundation. "I wouldn't be here today and all this wouldn't be possible if it weren't for the Winners Foundation, so the money is just a small way of saying thanks for what they've done for me," Gomez explained. The Winners Foundation is an industry-funded organization based at Santa Anita that helps racing personnel overcome alcohol and drug issues. Gomez was sidelined from riding for nearly two years while battling substance abuse problems. He returned to the saddle in September of 2004.
