NTRA NAMES WALDROP PRESIDENT. CEO

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association yesterday announced during a special board meeting that it had appointed Alex Waldrop, former president of Churchill Downs, as its new president and chief executive



Turfway Park President Robert Elliston as executive chairman. Waldrop replaces current NTRA interim CEO Greg Avioli, who will continue as interim CEO of Breeders' Cup Limited. "Alex brings to the table intellect, political savvy, hands on racing experience and expertise from within and outside our industry," said Craig Fravel, who has served as NTRA chairman throughout 2006. "He is well equipped to lead the NTRA during its next phase as the organization

seeks to implement a number of important strategic priorities on behalf of the industry." Waldrop, 50, currently is a partner at the Kentucky-based law firm of Wyatt, Tarrant and Combs, whose clients include the NTRA and Churchill Downs Incorporated, and chairs the firm's equine, gaming and entertainment practice group. Waldrop will assume his new duties on Jan. 15. "I am honored that the NTRA Board of Directors has selected me to lead the organization and I am eager to join the management team to build on its many accomplishments," Waldrop said. "With Thoroughbred racing confronting many challenges, the NTRA's leadership role has never been more important." Prior to returning to Wyatt, Tarrant and Combs, Waldrop spent more than 12 years with Churchill Downs, first as its General Counsel, then as President of Churchill Downs Racetrack and most recently as the Senior Vice President of Public Affairs for Churchill Downs Incorporated. Elliston has been president and CEO of Turfway Park since June 1999 and will continue to hold those positions while serving as the NTRA's first executive chairman. He has served on the NTRA board since 2004. "The appointment of an executive chairman is becoming more and more commonplace as companies and organizations seek a clear delineation between Board and management responsibilities," Fravel said.

While racing for that partnership, Too Much Bling ran third in the GI Hopeful S. at two, then went on to take four of his six sophomore efforts, including the GII San Vicente S., GII Carry Back S. and GIII Bay Shore S. He concluded his career with a troubled sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and retires with a record of 11-5-1-2, \$509,674.

FLEET INDIAN BOOKED TO STORM CAT

Fleet Indian (Indian Charlie--Hustleeta, by Afleet), leading candidate for champion older mare, will be bred to Storm Cat in 2007. The five-year-old mare went postward as the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, but suffered a suspensory tear during the race and is currently recuperating at Taylor Made Farm, Fleet Indian was purchased by Paul Saylor at this year's Keeneland January Sale for \$290,000 and went on to a stellar 2006 campaign, winning six straight stakes before her injury. She retired with 13 wins in 19 starts and earnings of \$1,704,513. Fleet Indian was originally entered in the Keeneland November sale, but had to be scratched after her injury in the Breeders' Cup. She was also entered in the upcoming Keeneland January sale. In a press release, Saylor said his main goal was to assure Fleet Indian's well-being and "breedability" and added that the mare may be offered for sale privately or publicly later in the year through Taylor Made Farm.

Colonial Turf Cup Worth \$750,000 in '07:

The 2007 running of the Colonial Turf Cup, which will be run as a Grade III event for the first time, will be worth \$750,000 after a compromise was reached last Wednesday between Colonial Downs and the Virginia HBPA. The race was run with a \$1-million purse this year, when won by subsequent multiple Grade I winner Showing Up. The extra \$250,000 will be used to increase overnight purses by as much as 12 percent. The Colonial Turf Cup is scheduled for June 15. The GII Virginia Derby, slated to run July 21, retains its \$1million purse. "We're quite happy with the compromise we've reached with Colonial," said Frank Petramalo, Jr., executive director of the VHBPA. "This will give us at least a 10-, and more likely, a 12-percent increase in the overnight races, which are the bread-and-butter races for the horsemen." Under the new proposal, overnight races will be worth approximately \$150,000. "Not everybody got everything they wanted," said Colonial Downs President Ian Stewart. "We would have preferred the [Turf Cup] purse stay at \$1 million, but in the spirit of making everything work, it seemed like the best answer." The Virginia Racing Commission also voted 3-2 to cut the number of scheduled Thoroughbred racing days from 42 this year to 40 in 2007. The New Kent track will race from June 15 through Aug. 7.



A three-time Group 1 winner in the Southern Hemisphere, Starcraft won the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. in 2005.
