#### CRAZY EIGHTS AT KEENELAND

On the eighth day of January, the first of eight sessions gets under way at the Keeneland Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. A total of 2,933 horses are set to go under the hammer, an increase of



nearly 17 percent from the previous record of 2,508 head set just last year, when the January sale spanned the course of seven days for the first time. The catalogue features 1,152 broodmares, 361 broodmare prospects, 224 racing or broodmare prospects, 90 racing prospects, 1,011 'short' yearlings, 59 racing or stallion prospects, 27 stallion prospects, five stallions and four stallion shares. Given the rousing results

from the November Breeding Stock sale, officials at Keeneland are expecting another positive result this time around. "We're looking for a very successful sale," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's Director of Sales. "The January sale has always been there as a continuation of the November sale--that's the historical nature of it--but we've seen in the last couple of years that it's an entity unto itself. And now, with the size of the sale up to eight days, it's firmly established itself as one of the largest and most important breeding stock sales in the world. The niche which seems to have shown the greatest success is the broodmare prospect market and we hope that will continue on this year with some very nice broodmare prospects. People seem to be pleased with the catalogue, based on what we've heard. Not everyone was successful in buying in the fall and we hope they've shown up to purchase here." Given the positive vibe of the Thoroughbred marketplace across the board, Russell says the expansion in the catalogue is a reflection of the confidence breeders retain. "The market is very strong at the moment and the breeders are taking advantage of that and we hope that supply doesn't outstrip demand," he commented. "That's always the big question, but there seems to be good quality dotted through the whole catalogue. We're hoping for a good, solid middle market." To better last year's sale will take a gargantuan effort. Last year's auction established records for gross receipts (\$72,174,900) and average (\$44,443). Bidding gets underway each morning at 10 a.m. Cont. p2

By the time the Keeneland January catalogs went to press, Premium Tap already was a Grade I winner, having taken the GI Woodward. S. as a rank 31-1 out-


sider in early September. He also had added a very good third to Invasor (Arg) and Bernardini as a 27-1 longshot in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. But after the catalogs were out, he staked his claim as perhaps the second-best handicap horse in the East Coast, behind Invasor, with a rousing 7 1/4-length tally in

the GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 24. Those efforts, and the high expectations they bring for the 2007 season, can only help the price of not one but three half-sisters of Premium Tap's that are scheduled to go through the ring at Keeneland January. Perhaps none more so than hip 111, Premium Hope. The sixyear-old daughter of Miswaki brought \$33,000 as a weanling in 2001 and \$35,000 as a yearling the following year, but didn't make it to the races and was knocked down for just \$1,500 to Redemption Stables at the 2003 Keeneland November sale. The chestnut, who is consigned by agent Taylor Made Sales Agency, figures to bring considerably more than that here. The other two sisters to sell are the seven-year-old Top Fox (Prenup), as hip 561 out of Bluegrass Thoroughbred Service's consignment on Tuesday; and the four-yearold Red Behreness (Behrens), as hip 1244 out of agent Hartwell Farm's consignment on Thursday.

#### Decisions, Decisions...

It's a decision she faces every year. Determined to keep the Pin Oak Stud broodmare band to a manageable top 40, Mrs. Josephine Abercrombie must choose which fillies from her racing string will retire to her Louisville farm, and which will head to Lexington to go under the hammer. "Everything she breeds goes into training--she doesn't sell foals, she doesn't sell yearlings," said Pin Oak manager Clifford Barry. "That's a very expensive endeavor if the numbers keep growing, and Mrs. Abercrombie is always a lady who wants to maintain quality over quantity." So how does she make her sales selections? "It is a very difficult decision," Barry explained. "There are several aspects that go into it. Obviously racing performance, that's number one. And how many fillies we can actually retire to the broodmare band is number two; cornformation is number three. You take your best guess and hope for the best." Pin Oak has been sending mares to Keeneland January since 2003. They were second-leading consignor by average in 2004, and led the way in 2005, selling five hips for a total of \$1,315,000 and an average of \$263,040. Last year, the consignment was third by average, with 10 hips bringing \$2,123,000, an average of \$212,300. And the farm has yet to take a Keeneland January offering home. How does Pin Oak avoid the RNA? "On Mrs. Abercrombie's behalf, we bring the fillies here to sell," Barry remarked. "We're not here to use Keeneland as a valuing stick. Mrs. Abercrombie is a very astute horsewoman; she knows all aspects of the business. She knows what to take to the marketplace." Leading this year's eight-horse consignment--all three-year-old fillies--is hip 711, Golden Mean (Mt. Livermore--Strike a Balance, by Strike a Pose). A maiden winner on the turf, she is a full sister to MGISW Peaks and Valleys, who carried the Pin Oak colors to a Horse of the Year title in Canada. "I would say she is definitely the strongest of the group," Barry said, but added, "We have three generations of the family. We own so much of these families, if we have to sell a piece, we still retain so much. It's not a loss if the filly jumps up and does well, and I believe the fillies we sell will make very, very good broodmares."

#### Dixon Dispersal Should Prove Popular...

The January Sale presents buyers with the opportunity to purchase horses of all ages from the complete dispersal of F. Eugene Dixon, the longtime Pennsylvania horseman who passed away last summer. The consignment is being handled by the Charlton agency of Dixon's friend Rick Abbott as well as Claiborne Farm.

So revered was Fitz Dixon that even the governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania attended and eulogized him at his funeral last spring. Dixon was a mainstay on the Pennsylvania Racing Commission, serving that body as its chairman for 16 years, during which he lobbied passionately for the advancement of Thoroughbred racing in the state. And, by all accounts, he did so with great distinction. According to Abbott, who served alongside Dixon on the PRC, the veteran horseman had a unique ability to visualize and anticipate change to the betterment of the game.

"He was very involved in all aspects in Pennsylvania," said Abbott, whose consignment for the dispersal numbers 32 horses. "He oversaw some unbelievable changes and although he was very traditional, he was also forward-thinking. He was instrumental in developing the off-track-betting system, when the only real model was in New York. He also was a great advocate for account wagering and, more recently, was very active in passing the slots legislation in the state and saw slots as a way to make racing economically viable. He had a great rapport with the legislature."

Legendary for his efforts behind the scenes, Dixon was an avid horse owner and campaigned the likes of Dr. Kashnikow, a multiple graded stakes winner on the turf; the good grass runner Political Attack; and was represented in 2006 by Aunt Henny, winner of the GIII Herecomesthebride S. in March.

A few months earlier at the January sale, it was Abbott, connected by cell phone to his friend and client Dixon, who went to \$950,000 for the good racemare Solvig. And Abbott made no effort to hide the fact that Dixon, a Keystone-stater to the core, was especially interested in the mare's covering sire, a certain Pennsylvania-bred named Smarty Jones.

"Yeah, he really, really wanted to have a Pennsylvania-bred Smarty Jones," Abbott confirmed.

"Given the strong connection of Smarty Jones to the area, it was a no-brainer."

Solvig gave birth to a filly by the 2004 Kentucky Derby hero in early 2006, but Dixon's health took a sudden turn for the worse and he passed away in August at the age of 82. The sale of Solvig will be especially painful for Abbott.

"It's really killing me," he

admits. "She is such a lovely mare and her [Smarty Jones] filly is just beautiful. Fitz was really excited about her. We had a Commission meeting at the farm early last year and he brought the entire group out to see her."

That Dixon was so enamored of his Solvig filly makes the dispersal something just short of complete as his enthusiasm has led his widow to retain ownership of the filly. In addition to the yearling, Mrs. Dixon has also decided to hold on to the aforementioned Aunt Henny, stakes winner Smart Enough and one jumper, Abbott reports. Not surprisingly, Solvig sells in foal to another horse with ties to Pennsylvania, the dual Classic-winning Afleet Alex.

In addition to Solvig, Abbott says he has been "pleasantly surprised" with the consignment thus far. He singles out newly turned two-year-olds by Seeking the Gold, Dixie Union and Dynaformer as ones to keep an eye on.

#### Looking for a Peak Performance...

Walnut Green President Russell Jones thought so highly of the mare Zenith (Roy), that he was involved in buying her not once but twice. On behalf of his client Phillip Fanning, Jones went to \$150,000 for the mare

at the 2001 Keeneland November sale. But when Fanning decided to disperse his holdings last year, through the Walnut Green agency, Jones was unwilling to let her go and signed the ticket on the mare, carrying a foal by Golden Missile, for just \$30,000 on behalf of his client Daniel Ryan. So, why was break-

ing up so hard to do? "I really liked the looks of her," Jones said by phone. "She was a good, solid racehorse and had some ability. She was a very nice physical and I thought she had enough pedigree to make her a nice broodmare prospect." Things took a serious turn for the better in late 2006, when Great Hunter, the Aptitude three-parts brother to the mare's foal, stamped himself a legitimate Classics contender with a victory in Keeneland's GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity. Jones understandably could not curb his enthusiasm. "Hell yes we were excited," he offered. "How can you not be excited when a horse who could win the Kentucky Derby is so closely related to something you've got?" Jones and Ryan carefully considered all options regarding the Golden Missile colt, but decided they'd try to strike while the iron is still hot. "We mulled it over a bit, but it just seemed like the right thing to do to try him now,"Jones explained. "The hope is from a marketing point of view that this would be the right time instead of waiting until the summer or fall. He's a pretty damned-nice horse." Jones added that Zenith was bred just one time late in the 2006 season, but did not catch. She is due to be bred this winter to Bernardini and Jones is hopeful that the cross of A.P. Indy-line sires with the mare continues to click. "It's worked so far and what do they say? If it ain't broke, don't fix it," he quipped.



It's because the first comments that anyone thinking of entering the racing world hears are:

- 1) You can't do this on your own--there's too much to learn.
- 2) Don't trust ANYONE in the industry--they all have their own agendas.

I won't even mention that story about treating new owners like mushrooms. I've heard that lots more times than I've heard anything about kindness or luck befalling new owners. It's tough for those of us who were successful in our previous businesses to enter into a new industry that seems so closed to outsiders and so highly stacked against our success.

So, what possessed me to jump into this fray? Was it the drone of the auctioneers (does anyone else wonder if they're humming along under their breath), the sight of mares that might look a little like mules when standing in the pasture, but transform into horse gods on the auction stage? Maybe it's the promise of the little "huff" on your hand when you are alone with your new acquisition for the first time, and you know in some way, beyond the papers that were signed, that you and this new entry into your life are now, and perhaps forever, linked.


But back to the scene at the auction. It was one of those Keeneland moments--I had a price in mind, but hadn't gotten into the bidding yet. Just as it looked like she was going to be in my range, the auctioneer made those noises that mean he is serious about dropping the hammer, and some big guy in front of me started talking to people behind me and blocked my view of the spotter! I gently but firmly moved him out of my way, but nobody was looking at me, they were all looking up at the auctioneer. So I waved my hand and shouted, "Me...me!"

Dead silence. You know that moment at Keeneland when for 10 seconds there is not a sound and everyone looks around to see if they've lost their hearing or if the sound system is broken. No, it was not the classy, too cool bid I'd imagined.

There were polite chuckles in the crowd. And me, grinning like a fool, happy and surprised when the hammer fell and she was to be mine. Looking around at all the serious faces, I thought, "Don't you guys know this is a great moment?"

It was the moment I went from being someone thinking about getting into the horse business and became someone in the horse business. Welcome home, 883.





#### A Word About BRIS Speed Ratings...

BRIS Speed Ratings accurately represent how fast a horse has run. Like other popular speed ratings, BRIS Speed Ratings are based on the final time of the race and, most importantly, include an accurate "track variant" (which measures the speed of a racetrack on a specific day.) Unlike other speed indicators, the track variant is derived by an objective, computer-precise method rather than the subjective opinion of one handicapper. The highest BRIS Speed Ratings (110 and up) will usually only be achieved by the best stakes horses. And, of course, older horses will typically run faster than their younger counterparts. A 2-year-old might win a stakes race with a 95 BRIS Speed Rating or may become a champion with a rating over 100.
