# PROMISES TO KEEP IN THE ADIRONDACK

I Promise (Hook and Ladder) came up just a nose short to Subtle Aly in the July 25 GIII Schuylerville S. and the bay filly looks to improve on that finish against eight rivals in today's GII Adirondack S. in Saratoga. In the Schuylerville, I Promise set quick fractions and battled back gamely on the rail to just miss earning the win. "You've got to love her heart," trainer Gary Contessa said of the speedy juvenile. "That filly has a heart as big as her body. She weighs abut 700 pounds, and probably about 680 of it is her heart. You've got to love them when they come back like that." Eibar Coa rode I Promise in her first two starts, but Joe Bravo has the mount today. Coa takes the mount on trainer Rick Violette's Phantom Income (Montbrook), a 10 1/4-length maiden winner in her only start to date at Belmont July 6. "She was a little more impressive, than we thought she'd be," Violette admitted of his filly's debut effort. "We knew she could run, but to do what she did was very, very impressive and she's continued to train well. She wants to be a racehorse and she has the talent." The most-seasoned runner in the field is the Steve Asmussen-trained Sky Mom (Maria's Mon), who will make her fifth start in the Adirondack. The bay filly broke her maiden over Keeneland's Polytrack in April and added a Churchill allowance tally June 15 before a runner-up effort in Woodbine's July 2 My Dear S. last time out. "She has shown a lot of talent," said jockey Shaun Bridgmohan, who has been aboard Sky Mom for all of her previous starts. "She is an honest little filly and gives you everything that she has. She is consistent."

**EMOTIONAL TIME FOR O'NEILL BARN** It's been a rough month for the Doug O'Neill barn. Just over three weeks ago, Noe Garcia, the groom of the O'Neill-trained **Lava Man** (Slew City Slew), was in his Toyota Sienna when he was struck--purposely, it has been reported--by a drunk driver in the early-morning hours of July 23. The accident, a tragic case of road rage, resulted in the loss of Garcia's left arm just below the shoulder. Then, on Sunday, one of O'Neill's most prominent owners, Merv Griffin, passed away at the age of 82. For Griffin, O'Neill conditioned, among

others, champion and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Stevie Wonderboy and graded winners Skipaslew and Cobalt Blue.

Despite those emotional setbacks, O'Neill and company are doing their best to focus on the positives, like Lava Man's at-

tempt at a second consecutive GI Pacific Classic S. at Del Mar on Sunday.

"It's been really tough, with Noe and then with Merv passing," said Dennis O'Neill, assistant to his brother Doug, during a national teleconference yesterday afternoon. "But hopefully Sunday brings it all together. It will be a very emotional day, with Lava Man running. Noe's supposed to come out, so that will be very meaningful."

Before they hope to raise spirits with a win in the Pacific Classic, though, Team Lava Man hope to raise money for Garcia, a 39-year-old native of Guatemala. *Cont. p3*

Quesnay for the 2008 Northern Hemisphere season, according to a press release. The 15-year-old stallion, currently at Australia's Widden Stud, will stand for  $\in$ 27,000. "We have been very privileged to stand this magnificent stallion for a year, but, with the losses the French breeders

have suffered this year, they are desperate for a proven sire of Group 1 winners," said Stuart Fitzgibbon, commercial manager at Castleton Lyons. "We are disappointed to see him go, but with Anabaa being a sire of not only Group 1 winners, but champions and Classic winners, we understand why they want him back." A press release from Haras le Quesnay cited the death of Kendor (Fr) and fertility problems with other major stallions for Anabaa's repatriation. Bred in Kentucky by Gainsborough, but a champion sprinter for the Head family in 1996, Anabaa has sired eight Group 1 winners from eight crops of racing age, including 2001 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club victor Anabaa Blue (GB) and 2002 G1 Hong Kong Cup hero Precision (Fr).


FINSCEAL AIMING FOR CHAMPION Jim Bolger has confirmed Michael Ryan's Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) on target for the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. Sept. 8 at Leopardstown after withdrawing the dual Classic heroine from Sunday's G2 Royal



Whip S. at The Curragh. Bolger had hoped to test the G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas heroine over 10 furlongs prior to running her in the Irish Champion, but testing ground at The Curragh canceled out that scenario. "I would have liked to

have got a run into her over a mile and a quarter before Leopardstown, but it wasn't to be, so she will go straight there if we have good ground," Bolger told Racing Post. "If it happens to be soft, then we will have to make other plans, and there are plenty of options in England and in France. We would look at the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket [Oct. 20] and the G1 Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 7], while the G1 Sun Chariot S. [at Newmarket Oct. 6] is another race we might consider. She has a very relaxed way of racing, and we always felt that a mile would be the minimum trip for her this year." Bolger also revealed that the chestnut would likely remain in training at four, with a trip to Dubai on the agenda. "Her owner Michael Ryan likes to travel, and the G1 Dubai Duty Free is worth a lot of money [\$5 million], so it's possible that if she stays in training as a four-year-old she might start off there in March," he added.



**'HENRY' EYING NATIONAL Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) looks likely to take in the G1 National S. at The Curragh after being upset in Sunday's G1 Phoenix S. Trainer Aidan O'Brien, who reported the G2 Coventry S. hero to be in good shape following his length second to Saoirse Abu in the six-furlong Phoenix, is looking to step him up in trip for the Sept. 16 contest. "Henrythenavigator seems to be fine, but he had a tough race on ground that was all against him," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "Him getting beaten is not the end of the world. He's not a heavy-ground horse and, in the circumstances, we were happy enough with him. He has plenty of options, including the National S., and we will leave it for a week or two before deciding what will be next for him."

AUTHORIZED GETTING READY G1 Epsom Derby winner Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) pleased trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam in his latest work yesterday as he gears up for Tuesday's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. Stretching out over 7 1/2 furlongs of Newmarket's Al Bahathri gallop, the sophomore was partnered by regular work rider Adrian McCarthy. "That was a real good blow-out and he will be ready by next Tuesday," Chapple-Hyam commented. "I will work him once more, towards the end of the week, before the race at York." Authorized was runner-up to Notnowcato (GB) in Sandown's G1 Eclipse S. when last seen July 7.

Garcia, who was on his way to work to tend to Lava Man when his accident occurred, is in need of a prosthetic arm, and, tomorrow, a benefit Texas Hold'Em poker tournament and silent auction will be held to help pay for Garcia's recovery and rehabilitation.

There is a \$200 buy-in for the tournament, in which

players will compete for prizes rather than cash. The grand prize is a new car. The tournament will be held at the Del Mar Hilton, across from the racetrack, with play beginning at 7:30 p.m.

"We're hoping to raise \$100,000--that's the goal," said O'Neill. "If we can get three or four hundred people out there, I think we can get close. And we've got some incredible stuff for the silent auction."

Notably, some of the items were donated by Merv Griffin, who at that time was

fighting what would ultimately be a losing battle against prostate cancer.

"I talked to Merv a few weeks ago, and within two or three days he sent me some stuff from Ronald Reagan, and also a signed CD from himself, so he was real generous in what was a bad time for him, to say the least," said O'Neill.

Lava Man's owners, Steve Kenly and Jason Wood, as well as owner J. Paul Reddam, have also been instrumental in raising money and organizing tomorrow's tournament. "The support has been incredible, and we're really excited about Thursday night," said O'Neill.

While the short-term goal is to provide Garcia with a new arm, the ultimate aim is to get him back into Doug O'Neill's barn, doing what he has done for the barn for the last 11 years--taking care of the operation's top horses.

> "Doug's trying to get him back as soon as he can," said Dennis O'Neill. "At this point, Doug's got a leg man and a foot man as assistants, and he would fit right into one of those roles as soon as he's mentally able to get back to the barn. He's groomed some champions, with Sky Jack and Great Hunter and Sharp Lisa--he's had some great horses down the line, and we want to get him back doing that. If we can get him the Rolls Royce of prosthetic arms onto him, [doctors] are actually saying they'll be able

to move his fingers within a year. There's a goal there we're trying to achieve, and it's definitely an achievable goal."

Understandably, Garcia initially had trouble coming to terms with the accident, suffering bouts of depression when the reality of losing his arm set in, according to Dennis O'Neill. Cont. p5

# **MID-YEAR APEX: THE ELDERS**

Only 10 of the top 25 sires in the world, calculated by 'A Runner' Index (top two-percent earners in North America, Britain, Ireland, France, Germany, and Japan), sired their first foals before 1997, according to the mid-year 2007 APEX calculations covering racing in those countries from the beginning of 2001-July 31, 2007. But, as has been the case for the last several years, this diminishing band of older sires (Sunday Silence, for example, drops off the list, because he had his last three-year-olds in 2006) still includes the Northern Hemisphere's top five. Even among these venerable elders (A.P. Indy is the youngest, 18 this year), though, there has been a little bit of a shake-up at the top.

This is Danehill, who replaced Nureyev in the World Top Five in 2005, and now becomes the first horse other than A.P. Indy, Danzig, and Storm Cat to rank in the World Top Three since 1998. In fact, it is Storm Cat, now down to fourth spot (4.50 A Runner Index, equal to 9.00 percent of runners since 2001), who he knocked out; Sadler's Wells, as ever, ranks fifth. Danehill (now 4.92, and the sire of 17 A Runners this year) is up to second spot, ranking behind only fourtime year-end A Runner index leader A.P. Indy (5.09). There are still five months of earnings before the end of the year, so a lot can change, but so far in 2007, Danehill has sired 10 graded or group stakes winners, Storm Cat just two.

As for A.P. Indy, he would rank even higher if we looked at just his North American figures: 89 percent of his 1,111 year-starters since 2001 have raced in North America, but they account for an even higher proportion--97 percent--of his 113 A Runners. His A Runner Index in North America alone is 5.54, over 11 percent of runners; overall, his 5.09 index keeps him in first place. Through the first seven months of the year, A.P. Indy had 16 A Runners, eight of them also graded/ group stakes winners. Danehill leads him in both categories, with 17 A Runners and 10 graded/group stakes winners.

Distorted Humor has emerged as the Northern Hemisphere's leading sire with first foals 1997 or later, ranked by A Runner Index, but he has dropped below the 4.00 index threshold this year--normal for a relatively young sire as their older runners (especially the moderate ones) keep racing. His A Runner Index has dropped from 4.07 at the end of last year, to 3.84 now, ranking him only a whisker ahead of Smart Strike (3.83), who has had a huge year, headed by GI Preakness S. winner Curlin. Smart Strike ranks second on the General Sire List, behind only A.P. Indy, with Giant's Causeway (2.75) third and Distorted Humor fourth.

Distorted Humor has 12 A Runners and eight gradedstakes winners this year, Smart Strike 10 A Runners and seven graded-stakes winners.

Besides the usual suspects, the California stallion Unusual Heat (3.71) would have to qualify as the unusual suspect, ranking eighth among the 619 sires with 200 + year-starters since 2001. He is, no doubt, a beneficiary of the California state-bred program, and, being closely held and without big crops, he's not a horse a lot of people are going to benefit from. Nonetheless, he has the numbers, so anything by him that does come on the market should be taken seriously.

Five stallions with first foals 2002 (first five-year-olds 2007) rank among the top 25, though three of them have between 200-250 year-starters, lowest among the top 25. The only other Top 25 sire with under 300 year-starters is F2003 Coolmore stallion Galileo (3.17). The three F2002 sires who maybe aren't yet household names, but sure could be, are: Successful Appeal (3.45); Cape Canaveral (3.20); and Sinndar (2.75). The two F2002 sires who are household names are both Coolmore's: Montjeu (2.84) and Giant's Causeway (2.75). Montjeu quantities of runners are huge. He has the same A Runner Index as Sinndar, but with almost three times the year-starters (637) and A Runners (35). Giant's Causeway was third on last year's General Sire List, and is again third this year. *Cont. p5*

G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas winner Cockney Rebel and multiple American graded-stakes winner Valbenny, combined with relatively smaller numbers (62 year-starters) have propelled Val Royal, the GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner in 2001, to the top of the list of 'sophomore sires' (first foals 2004, three-year-olds of 2007), with an initial A Runner Index of 4.03. Among this group's top 10, only third-ranked E Dubai (64 yearstarters, 3.13) and ninth-ranked Pure Prize (71 yearstarters, 2.11) have fewer than 90 year-starters. Street Cry (3.89), not surprisingly, tops the seven who have 90 + year-starters, followed by the Coolmore pair of Johannesburg (3.06) and Rock of Gibraltar (2.78). Other North American sires Officer (2.73), Include (2.71), and Orientate (2.00) hit the top 10, along with Europe's leading second-crop sire by progeny earnings, Invincible Spirit (2.38). Two other sires who are catching the attention of European breeders are: Sakhee (1.69), winner of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in 2001; and Juddmonte's Kentucky-based Mizzen Mast (1.33). The highly touted Came Home (1.18) is only just beginning to come around, but another highly touted horse, Buddha (0.76), is looking disappointing right now.

"Spirits-wise, he was having a rough, rough time, to say the least," O'Neill said. "They sent him home about 10 days after the accident, and we got him counseling right away. Physically, he's doing fine. Mentally, it's kind of another story. You can only imagine waking up one day and not having your left arm, especially for a guy like him who relies on his physical abilities to do things. But he's getting better and better, and realizes how much support he has."

As for the Merv Griffin runners currently in Doug O'Neill's barn, including Cobalt Blue, Dennis O'Neill said he was unsure if Griffin's son Tony would continue to race his father's horses.

"I've met Tony a couple of times and I know Doug has, too," he said. "He's kind of behind the scenes a lot, but what a nice man he's been through the whole thing. "I saw him on Larry King, [Jr.] last night and he was mentioning how much the Breeders' Cup win with Stevie Wonderboy meant to him. So I'm sure he's going to stay in somewhat, but at this point it's hard to say how much."







We were unable to find such a solution."

"He's a gorgeous-looking individual; I couldn't believe it when I saw him. I have no doubt that breeders are going to love him." Produced by a stakes-winning full sister to dual Classic heroine Ramruma, the bay was a 150,000gns TATOCT yearling and came to hand quickly for trainer Paul Cole at two, capturing the G2 July S. and G2 Vintage S. before finishing 2006 with a third to champion Teofilo (Ire) in the G1 Dewhurst S. Oct. 14. After finishing 4 3/4 lengths behind Cockney Rebel (Ire) when eighth in the G1 2000 Guineas May 5, Strategic Mission was unplaced in both the G1 Derby S. and G3 Jersey S. Bred on the same Danehill--Sharpen Up (GB) cross that has produced both Danehill Dancer (Ire) and Dylan Thomas (Ire), Strategic Prince will be the first son of Dansili to stand in Ireland.

**ARD FHEIS (IRE) (Lil's Boy)**, the latest offspring of stakes winner Affianced (Ire) to hit the track, has some illustrious family hoofprints to follow. The half-sister to Group 3 winner Heliostatic (Ire) and this term's G1 Irish Derby winner Soldier of Fortune (Ire)--both by Galileo (Ire)-carries the silks of Jackie Bolger and faces a host of well-bred individuals in this hot contest. Chief among them is His Highness The Aga Khan's **Simarian (Ire) (Kalanisi {Ire})**, who is out of a half-sister to G1 Irish Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Sinndar (Ire).





NAYYIR RETIRED Abdulla Al Khalifa's Nayyir (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}--Pearl Kite, by Silver Hawk) has been retired from racing, according to Racing Post. A multiple Group 2 winner, the nine-year-old gelding failed to sparkle in two starts this season for trainer Gerard Butler. "Unfortunately, we have retired Nayyir and it is the end of a great career," Butler told Racing Post. "It really choked me when I told the owners what I thought they should do. We've done it before something went wrong; he just doesn't seem to be enjoying it as much anymore. I would never have forgiven myself if something had gone wrong in a race or in training--at least he retires sound." Nayyir was a 15,000gns TATOCT yearling and a 57,000gns TATAPR juvenile. At four in 2002, the chestnut landed the G2 Challenge S., G3 Lennox S. and G3 Diomed S. and also ran second in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest. He added another Lennox victory in 2003 and the Diomed in 2006, and also placed second in the 2004 G1 Sussex S. and 2004 G2 Celebration Mile, and finished third in the 2004 G1 Dubai Duty Free. Nayyir retires with a record of 37-9-3-4 and earnings of £570,612. Butler added, "I will speak to the owner, but I would imagine he will go to a place like Moorcroft [Racehorse Welfare Centre]. I don't think he would be suited to lounging around my yard. He was at his absolute best when he beat Firebreak in the 2002 Challenge S. under Eddie Ahern. I thought that was a phenomenal performance, especially as he wasn't right the week before and my heart was in my mouth. The races he didn't win were probably as good as the ones he did, but in the Challenge he cut down a good field very quickly. He won the Diomed twice and was just touched off in a Sussex S. by Soviet Song--he was at his best at Goodwood."

AL QASI HAS HAYDOCK OPTION Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam yesterday announced that Al Qasi (Ire) (Elnadim) may join Dutch Art (GB) and possibly Tariq (GB) in the Sept. 8 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup following a victory in Sunday's G3 Phoenix Sprint S. Ziad Galadari's four-year-old was opening his stakes account in that Curragh contest, and will either remain at six furlongs for the Sept. 8 feature or step up a panel for the Oct. 6 G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp. "It could end up that I have three running at Haydock," Chapple-Hyam said. "That isn't ideal, but that is what you have to do sometimes. Dutch Art, Tarig and Al Qasi are three similar horses. Al Qasi is a horse who is better with cut, and we may go for the Sprint Cup or...consider the Prix de la Foret. The way he ran in Ireland makes me think that he will get seven furlongs."

Princess Haya of Jordan's four-year-old, who showed a need for fast conditions when runner-up to Miss Andretti (Aus) in the June 19 G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot and when fifth in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket last time July 13, may miss York's five-furlong dash if the present heavy rain continues. "He's very well and with a bit of luck it will keep drying out over there," Collins commented. "He's a good, honest horse and he put up a good performance at Ascot, but if conditions don't come right for him he won't go."

SOLDIER'S TARGET UNKNOWN Aidan O'Brien has reported Soldier of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to be back in work after a break, but announced that no particular plan has been mapped as yet. While Doncaster's Sept. 15 G1 St Leger and the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe have been mentioned as potential aims for Susan Magnier, Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's nine-length G1 Irish Derby hero, O'Brien held fire on committing to either race. "We gave Soldier of Fortune a good rest after the Irish Derby and, while he is in good form and cantering away, we haven't made any decision about where he will run next," the Ballydoyle conditioner told Racing Post. "At this stage, he's a possible for the St Leger and no more than that. There will be plenty of other options for him, including the Arc."

**TITUS HAS MOULIN DATE** Scuderia Millennium's **Golden Titus (Ire)** (Titus Livius {Fr}) is being aimed at the Sept. 9 G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. According to his Rome-based trainer Armando Renzoni, the G3 Premio Parioli hero and G1 Prix Jean Prat third was not granted an entry in Turkey's \$1.02-million Topkaki Trophy Sept. 9 at Veliefendi, and will instead ship to France. "I'm very disappointed, as this race [Topkapi Trophy] would have been perfect for my horse who is in top form," said Renzoni. "He will now run in the Moulin before a possible tilt at the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua [at San Siro Oct. 21]."

**RICHARDSON HONORED** Tim Richardson, who has managed the Niarchos Family's Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard stud since the 1970s, was yesterday awarded a knighthood in the Agricultural Order of Merit for his work in helping to create uniform sanitary rules within the European Union. Having been president of the Sanitary Commission on the "Syndicat des Eleveurs" or French Breeders' Syndicate, the Englishman by birth received the honor from Emmanuelle Bour, who is set to become General Manager of France Galop next year.
