weighted the second top www.nzb.co.nz filly on New Zealand's three-year-old Free Handicap in 1993-94. Offered by Esker Lodge, the bay was purchased by trainer John Sargent. The 18-year-old mare Popsy, currently owned by New Zealand millionaire Sam Kelt, is the dam of six

winners, including multiple stakes winner and Group 2placed Lilakyn (Aus) (Danehill). Heading the fillies over the course of the two-day Premier sale was lot 82, a bay by first-crop sire One Cool Cat (Storm Cat). Offered by Sir Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud, the yearling was purchased by Nathan Tinkler's Patinack Farm for NZ\$925,000 Monday. Out of the group-winning mare Diamond Cashel (Aus) (Sir Tristram {Aus}), the yearling is a half sister to Group 3 winner Royal Asscher (Aus) (Stravinksy). "This filly took everyone's eye and we had to beat off a bit of competition to get her," said Tinkler. "At the end of the day, she is a half to Royal Asscher, and if you are going to get a filly out of that family, well, it was always going to cost us a lot of money." Cont. p2


Shopping Spree for Tinkler...

Glory Days...

At the conclusion of the two-day sale, figures were up across the board, headed by gross rising by a healthy 36 percent to NZ\$77,115,500 in 2008. "We knew that we had a strong catalogue this year, but we never predicted the sort of results we have seen over the past two days," explained New Zealand Bloodstock Marketing Director Petrea Vela. With 387 lots sold this term--compared to 363 in 2007--gross climbed to over last year's total of NZ\$56,834,400. Median also shot up by 36 percent from NZ\$110,000 in 2007 to NZ\$150,000, while average increased 27 percent to NZ\$199,265 from NZ\$156,567. "Being the first sale in the southern hemisphere helped this year, but we still needed a very strong catalogue and powerful buying bench to deliver these sort of results," added Vela. "We have been overwhelmed by the support the sale received by both local and international buyers so far, and hope it can continue throughout the rest of the week." The three-day Select Sale continues today, beginning at noon, with the remaining two sessions, Thursday and Friday, commencing at 11 a.m. The two-day Festival yearling sale is scheduled for Feb. 3 and 4, getting underway at 11 a.m. both days.

THROWING HIS HAT BACK INTO THE RING

Three horses have been able to double up in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. One Eyed King captured the inaugural edition of the race in 1959 and came back to win again in 1960. It took 34 years before the next horse was able to accomplish the feat, but Pistols and Roses, who went to the winner's circle as a 44-1 shot in 1993, made it again, this time at 11-1, in 1994. Cigar followed hard on his heels, taking the race at 4-1 in 1995 and, as the 1-5 chalk, in 1996.

Brass Hat (Prized), who galloped to a 4 3/4-length score at 8-1 in the 2006 Donn, was sidelined by a non-displaced sesamoid fracture and was unable to defend his title last year, but he will be back to try and add his name to the list of dual winners this year.

The gelding shipped from his base at Turfway last week and prepped for the Donn Saturday morning. He worked five furlongs in 1:01 4/5 at Gulfstream.

"I'm glad we got this work in because he's coming off the Polytrack up there," said trainer William "Buff" Bradley. "He works good over Polytrack, but I like to get him a chance to get his feet on the dirt again. He likes this track and he worked well."

Brass Hat will be making his first start since running second in the Nov. 23 GII Clark H., and he's looking for his first victory in graded company since the 2006 Donn. But his connections are confident that, at the age of seven, he is more than up to the task.

"I'd like to say he's training well or better than two years ago," said Bradley. "If anything, despite his age, he seems to be putting more into his works. He's working harder and he's in great shape, and he wants to do it. That's the main thing."

The starting highweight in the Donn will be **Daaher** (Awesome Again) at 120 pounds. **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck) is next at 119, and Brass Hat will carry 118, the same weight he toted in 2006.

IEAH ACQUIRES INTEREST IN COURT VISION

Vision (Gulch) from WinStar Farm LLC. Details of the deal were not revealed, but the colt will now race in the IEAH colors, and he will remain with trainer Bill Mott. Court Vision is now threefor-four after taking the GIII Iroquois S. and GII Remsen S. He has earned \$257,542 to date. "Doing business with the guys at WinStar has been nothing but a plea-

sure, and we can only hope to share in their good fortune," said Michael lavarone, co-president of IEAH Stables. "If all the stars align and we find ourselves at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May, it will be a dream come true. I thank WinStar for giving us the opportunity to partner on such an outstanding horse and take part in such a successful operation. Court Vision has the pedigree, the class, and the ability to be a Classic winner." Out of a half-sister to Horse of the Year and top sire A.P. Indy and a full to Classic winner Summer Squall, Court Vision is himself a 3/4-brother to MSW Garcia Marguez and recent Paumonok H. winner Lord Snowdown. "With Court Vision descending from the female line of A.P. Indy and being a top five rated two-year-old on the Experimental Free Handicap, the decision to sell was difficult and came down to two things," said Elliott Walden, vice president of WinStar Farm LLC. "Firstly, it is consistent with our business plan, and secondly, the relationship with IEAH has ben a 'win-win' for all parties. We look forward to the prospects of adding Court Vision to our elite stallion roster at the conclusion of his successful racing career."

A.P. INDY NAMED CHEF-DE-RACE Steven A. Roman, Ph.D., creator of the Dosage Index, has named A.P. Indy an Intermediate/Classic Chef-de-Race. The move acknowledges the Lane's End sire's effect on the Thoroughbred breed, and means that descendants of A.P. Indy will have revised Dosage Index figures that reflect the stamina generally contributed by the son of Seattle Slew. The Dosage Index attempts to predict a horse's aptitude for distance through particularly influential sires in his pedigree. There are five Chef-de-Race 'aptitudinal designations,' from speed-dominant to stamina laden. They are: B = Brilliant, I = Intermediate, C = Classic, S = Solid, P = Professional. He joins his own sire as a Chef-de-Race and becomes just the second active sire on the list, along with Sadler's Wells. There are now 208 Chefs-de-Race.

THE NEW TOP SIRES

As we saw last week, the five top sires in the Northern Hemisphere all have 2001-2007 APEX A Runner indices above 4.00, meaning that more than 8 percent of their starters in any given year ranked among the top 2 percent of earners in whichever jurisdictions they were racing during those years.

There is a different A Runner threshold for each jurisdiction each year: in 2007, for example, the top two percent of earners in North America made \$112,280 or more. In Britain, Ireland and France, the figure for 2007 was just over \$92,000 (converted); in Germany, \$57,500; and in Japan, \$382,000 and change.

The earnings threshold in Japan has dropped by a quarter from its 1999-2000 highs of over \$500,000. In North America, the A Runner threshold advanced by 50 percent in the '90s, from \$74,620 in 1990 to \$111,571 in 2000; since then, it is up less than 1 percent. But the European countries have seen long-term threshold gains, at least at the A Runner level.

If a sire had 100 runners in North America in 2007 and two of them had earnings of \$112,280 or higher, he would have a 2007 NA A Runner Index of 1.00. A sire with 8-percent A Runners 2001-2007 has an A Runner Index of 4.00.

It's significant that all five sires with 4.00 A Runner indices 2001-2007 are sires whose first foals were born before 1996; they are "old school" sires that either started out with smaller crops or, if they had bigger crops, were bred to a high percentage of good mares.

The last two top sires that I believe fit that bill are A.P. Indy, now 19, whose first foals were born in 1994; and Kingmambo, now 18, whose first foals were born in '95. As you know, A.P. Indy is the North's top APEX sire (for the fifth time), with a 2001-2007 A Runner Index of 5.08 (5.53, North America). Kingmambo (who has a crop of only about 20 two-year-olds this year) ranks 18th in the North with a 2.93 A Index, but he is 3.83 in Europe, where his stock clearly thrive.

By the foal crop of 1996 (breeding year 1995), my hypothesis is that the "big-book" factors had kicked in. It may be an oversimplification, but the percentage of "moderate" rather than "good" mares bred to each stallion increased to the point that expectations such as "10-percent stakes winners to foals" went out the window. As long ago as 2004, we presented what we found to be convincing evidence that, in fact "6 percent is the new 10 percent."

In the same way, it seems that A Runner indices above 4.00 went by the wayside, too. Up until 2007, no sire whose first foals arrived in 1996 or later, with the exception of Distorted Humor, achieved a 4.00 A Runner Index, once they had 200+ year-starters.

Last week, we saw that four of the Northern Hemisphere "second five" by 2001-2007 A Runner Index were sires with first foals 1996 or later: Smart Strike (3.87); Unusual Heat (3.80); Monsun (3.74); and Distorted Humor (3.70). That makes those four tops among the 52 sires, listed in the accompanying table (p6), that had first foals in 1996 or later, had 200 or more 2001-2007 year-starters (150+ if first foals 2003, 100+ if first foals 2004), and recorded 2001-2007 APEX A Runner Indexes of 2.00 or higher. Standards are dropping, but these are still the best sires around.

Twelve of these sires had A Runner indexes over 3.00, which translates to 6 percent A Runners from year-starters 2001-2007. Besides the top four, which also rank among the Northern Hemipshere top 10, these include: the number two and three from the 1998 sire class, Pivotal (3.16) and Unbridled's Song (3.09); Awesome Again (3.21), number two behind Distorted Humor in the 2000 sire class; the 2001 number one, Forestry (3.16); the 2002 number one, Successful Appeal (3.33); the 2003 sire class one-two (150 + year-starters), Exchange Rate (3.55) and Galileo (3.32); and the F2004 number one (100 + year-starters), Street Cry (3.33). They are really the new "World Top 12" (Southern Hemisphere excepted) in waiting.



"As was noted, the decline at Barretts was ascribable more to there having been two dispersals at last year's sale. It does demonstrate again that broodmares have very limited appeal at the regional sales these days; there seems to be demand for yearlings, racehorses, even broodmare prospects, but in-foal mares have on the whole limited value at these sales. Maybe Maryland will be different, with some healthy regional programs on the East Coast."



TRF HORSES TO JOIN TEXAS A&M STUDY More

than 100 horses under the care of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation will be involved in a study at Texas A&M University that will link genetics with a predisposition to fractures and catastrophic breakdowns. "We're looking for some kind of genetic trait that may make the difference," said Jana Caldwell, a PhD student in the Department of Veterinary Integrative Biosciences at Texas A&M University's College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences. Caldwell is working with a team, headed by Dr. Bhanu Chowdhary, that specializes in equine genetics. Texas A&M's Equine Genetics Laboratory will receive tissue samples from horses who suffered catastrophic breakdowns from a group of regulatory veterinarians across the country, and compare them with samples from approximately 170 TRF horses that raced 30 or more times and did not suffer career-ending injuries. It is believed to be the first organized study to look to genetics to predict what horses may be at a higher risk for catastrophic injuries.




MURTAGH LANDS COOLMORE JOB Three-time Irish champion jockey Johnny Murtagh has landed the
