SMARTY JONES' Yearlings Sold Like They Looked...FAST

DUTROW APPEALING DRUG POSITIVE

Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. will appeal the 15-day suspension he received from Kentucky stewards after Salute the Count tested positive for clenbuterol after his second-place finish in the \$100,000 GIII Aegon Turf Sprint May 2, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Dutrow

waived his right to a hearing before the stewards' ruling was issued, but later informed John Veitch, chief steward for the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority, of his intention to appeal. The KHRA's suspension would run July 6-20 prior to any appeal. Veitch told *DRF* that the lowa State University testing lab, which handles all of the Thoroughbred and Standardbred tracks in Kentucky, found Salute

the Count's urine sample contained 41 petagrams per milliliter of clenbuterol; Kentucky's permissible level is 20 petagrams. Per a request from Dutrow, a split sample was sent to another laboratory at Louisiana State University, which confirmed the same level as the original test. A bronchodilator, clenbuterol is an approved medication for training in most states, but is illegal for race-day use. In Kentucky, the recommended withdrawal time is 72 hours prior to racing. The purse will not be redistributed until "the case is fully adjudicated," Veitch added. Click here to view the ruling.

IF YOU CAN'T STAND THE HEAT

Heatseeker (Ire) (Giant's Causeway), the 123-pound highweight in Saturday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup, was installed as the 7-5 morning-line favorite when a 10-horse field was drawn yesterday. After narrowly defeating Go Between (Point Given) in the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 1, the big chestnut came up a head short to Tiago

(Pleasant Tap) in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 5, but could not have been more impressive when turning the tables on the latter by 5 1/4 lengths in the GII Californian S. May 31. Tiago will get just two pounds from his main rival, but that may not be enough, conceded trainer John Shirreffs.

"Unless Heatseeker is carrying an anchor, I don't know how we're going to catch him," the conditioner quipped. Heatseeker has thrived since arriving in Jerry Hollendorfer's barn last fall. "He's been training very well for quite a while now and he's been a very consistent horse for me," Hollendorfer said. "I hope he's coming up to this race in as good a form as I think he is." Tiago is listed at 9-2 on the morning line, while Go Between is the 7-2 second choice.



S. and G1 Hong Kong Vase winner, who took the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly on home soil last time June 1, was the subject of an upbeat bulletin from trainer Richard Gibson vesterday. "We're excited because we feel he has improved," he said of the six-year-old. "We thought he looked a bit heavy and a bit rusty in Chantilly and in training he has gone forward since then. His racing is better over a mile and a half than a mile and a guarter and we're excited about the challenges that lie ahead this year. We've certainly got the same category or horse we had last year. He's a horse who likes fast ground, so we can't make many plans in Europe after the summer. I think the track condi-

tions will suit our horse, as it's going to be nice, hot weather and fast ground." Re-opposing in the 1 1/2mile contest will be the Grand Prix de Chantilly second and third Zambezi Sun (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and Not Just Swing (Ire) (King's Best), with the latter one of a trio from the Andre Fabre stable headed by Baron Georg von Ullmann's Getaway (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). Aidan O'Brien is set to run Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 Coronation Cup hero Soldier of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) and reliable rabbit Song of Hiawatha (GB) (Sadler's Wells), while Mick Channon may saddle Jaber Abdullah's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up Youmzain (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), who was also second in the Coronation last time. "Youmzain has come out of the Coronation Cup in great nick and is ready to go," Channon told Racing Post.



CASTING A SPELL

It was a crowning moment for Airdrie Stud owner and former Kentucky Governor Brereton C. Jones when his homebred Proud Spell (Proud Citizen) streaked under the line a five-length winner in the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks. Jones, along with his wife, Libby, established Airdrie in 1972.

"I grew up as a kid wanting to win two races -- the Kentucky Derby and the Kentucky Oaks," said Jones, who also bred 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Caressing. "The fact that we have the sire, the dam and her, it really does make it extra special. It's a family affair."

Airdrie stallion and secondleading sophomore sire Proud Citizen, who placed second and third in the 2002 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. behind War Emblem, needs

little introduction, but the same can't be said for Proud Spell's dam, the daughter of Langfuhr, Pacific Spell. Bred in Kentucky by Nellie M. Cox and Rose Retreat Farm, the 1999 foal went through the ring twice, selling for \$80,000 as a KEENOV weanling and \$125,000 as a KEESEP yearling. Cont. p4

Pacific Spell graduated for a \$30,000 tag at Ellis in her fifth career start at the age of three in August of 2002, and was claimed for \$7,500 by Dale Romans in her victorious career finale at Turfway Park the following April. Overall, the daughter of Malibu Magic won two of 16 career starts and bankrolled \$20,771. Following her retirement, Pacific Spell was purchased privately by Jones and was bred to former Airdrie stallion Mazel Trick. Entered for the 2003 Keeneland November sale in-foal to the speedy son of Phone Trick, she RNA'd for \$25,000. Pacific Spell was bred to first-season sire Proud Citizen the following year.

"I was trying to find fillies and mares that were of the Northern Dancer line so that we could have the inbreeding to Natalma," Jones offered. "The fourth dam of Proud Citizen is Natalma, and Pacific Spell fit that very nicely because she had two crosses of Natalma. Pacific Spell's dam [Malibu Magic] had produced a nice stakes winner [Call Her Magic, MSW, \$195,013] and her dam [Dream Harder] was a half-sister to a Grade I winner [Imaginary Lady], so it was a filly who had quite a bit of value that actually wasn't readily appreciated."

Although Airdrie is primarily a commercial breeding operation, Proud Spell was never slated to go under the hammer.

"Proud Spell was a late foal and, because she was a

late foal and was small and weak in the pastern, we didn't take her to the sale," Jones explained. "After the yearling sales, we always break our yearlings here on the farm. We broke her and then turned her out for several months so she could just be a horse and could grow and mature in a natural way. Early the following spring, we sent her to [trainer] Larry [Jones] at Delaware Park and the rest is history."

Jones continued, "We race the ones that we can't sell or the ones that we don't think will sell well.

Occasionally, we will keep a well-bred filly with the purposes of putting her in the broodmare band."

Pacific Spell has produced three colts since her second foal, Proud Spell, her only filly to date. She has an unraced two-year-old by Canadian Frontier (Gone West), a yearling by Friends Lake (A.P. Indy) and a Forest Grove (Forestry) foal. Pacific Spell was bred to Proud Citizen this spring, but wasn't pronounced in foal yet as of yesterday. According to Jones, she was scheduled to be checked again Thursday. -S. Sherack

Paris, Kentucky. The four-year-old has not started since finishing third in the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26. A homebred for Martha Parfet and her late husband Ray Parfet Jr., the chestnut is a grandson of multiple Chilean Group 1 winner Carita Tostada (Chi) (Gallantsky), who also produced graded winners Shaconage and Jadada in addition to Horse Greeley's Grade I-placed dam. After finishing second in his career debut in July, Horse Greeley graduated by four lengths next out at Del Mar in

August, then defeated Great Hunter and Stormello in the GII Del Mar Futurity the following month. Eased to seventh as the favorite in Stormello's GII Norfolk S., the Richard Mandella trainee was sidelined with an ankle chip. Horse Greeley finished a close fourth in his return to action in May, but sustained a strained ligament, and faced the starter just once more in December in the Malibu. "He is an extremely good-looking horse and has been since the day he was foaled," said trainer Richard Mandella. "He is big, strong, has good bone and a great mind. Horse Greeley also had a lot of talent, which he showed us, but was the victim of some bad luck his

three-year-old year." Horse Greeley, raised at Claiborne will stand as property of a syndicate. A stud fee will be announced at a later date. "Horse Greeley was a standout as a foal here at Claiborne, and he certainly showed that he could run," said Claiborne's Bernie Sams. "He's by a solid sire and from a durable, quality family. I think

he has a lot of potential."

ROSE HANDED SIX-MONTH SUSPENSION

Jockey Jeremy Rose has been suspended for six months by Delaware Park stewards after striking his mount in the eye during Monday's third race, according to published reports. Rose was aboard Appeal to the City when the filly appeared to lug in; the head-on replay shows the filly's head jerking sharply before veering out several paths. She wound up finishing third. In a statement released through attorney Alan Foreman, Rose said that he intended to hit the filly on her shoulder when she was lugging in, and apologized to trainer Howard Wolfendale and Wolfendale's wife Tammy immediately after the race. Appeal to the City was sent to New Bolton Equine Medical Center for further examination. "I spoke to Mr. Wolfendale early on the morning of June 24 to apologize once again and to make clear to him that I accepted full responsibility for the filly's condition and all expenses related to her care," Rose said in the statement. "I want everyone to know that this was an accident and not an intentional act on my part. I did not mean to hit her in the face. As a jockey, I have the responsibility to give my best effort and use my skills to allow the horse I am riding to perform at his/her best. I also have the responsibility to protect the health and welfare of my horse. Notwithstanding that this was an accident and was unintentional, I failed to meet the standards required of me in this instance. I am truly sorry for what happened and apologize to Mr. Wolfendale, [owner] Mr. Ray Makarovich, Jr., Delaware Park, and the racing industry." Wolfendale issued a statement indicating that he accepted Rose's explanation that the incident was an accident, and that he would "not hesitate to use Jeremy again." Appeal to the City's injuries were deemed superficial, and she was

> slated to return to Wolfendale's Laurel Park barn yesterday.

NY HORSEMEN TO PAY FOR STEROID TESTING The New York

Other notables include Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's G1 QEII Cup winner Archipenko (Kingmambo) from the Mike de Kock barn and six of the sponsor's best headed by the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up Famous Name (GB) (Dansili {GB}). He was confirmed on course for York by trainer Dermot Weld. "He went within a head of winning the French Derby from a 17 draw and I believe we would have won otherwise," Weld said. "He's come out of the race well and we'll aim for the Juddmonte International at York."
