KEENELAND GETS THE ROYAL TREATMENT

Ben Leon and Frank Stronach had traded blows throughout the day at yesterday's second session of the Keeneland November sale, but the two titans saved their biggest battle for last, with Leon's Besilu Stables securing GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner Royal Delta (Empire Maker--Delta Princess, by A.P. Indy) for \$8.5 million after a dramatic bidding duel. The classy filly, selling from the dispersal of the late Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments, attracted a crowd when she entered the back walking ring, and the sales pavilion began filling up several hips before the likely champion 3-year-old filly entered the ring. With the crowds stacked three and four wide around the pavilion and a buzz in the air, bidding on the dark bay opened at \$2.5 million. The action was quickly down to Leon and Stronach, with Leon rapidly answering every salvo of the Adena Springs' maestro, who had no answer to his rival's final bid. It was all over in five minutes.

After signing the ticket, Leon was swarmed with well-wishers and among the first to offer congratulations was Bill Mott, who trained the filly, as well as her dam and granddam, for Khaled.

Leon, far and away the leading buyer at the two-dayold sale, confirmed Royal Delta will remain in training, although he said no decision has been made as to who will train the filly.

"She is going to go down to Ocala to our place and we'll keep her there for a couple of weeks," Leon said.

"So I can be with her and get to know her and enjoy her for a few days and then she can go on to wherever she is going to go to resume training. I can't think of a better mare to breed in the future, but I also can't think of a better filly to enjoy now on the track. So I hope

that she will give good thrills to us and to all the people who enjoy the sport at the track. We are going to enjoy her at the track for as long as she can do that. We're in no rush, but we're looking forward to the day when she can become a mom and begin to have babies."

Asked if he was near the limit to his bidding, Leon said, "You never know that until you get there. Something like this is really priceless. It's a once in a lifetime opportunity."

Leon did have to do some negotiating even before Royal Delta entered the sales ring yesterday.

"It's my wife's birthday today," the Florida businessman explained. "We had a dinner planned at home, but when we found out Royal Delta was last [in the catalogue], Silvia was nice enough to call home to Miami and cancel the dinner tonight. So in exchange, I told her the filly is a gift from me to her. Now I hope that she thinks that it was worth waiting. But it was very sweet of her to do that ."

Leon paused a moment before adding, "I told her she could have the fillies, but the babies, they are for me."

Leon is putting together an exclusive broodmare band and his efforts have been helped during the November sale by both the Palides Investments and Spring Hill dispersals. During Monday's first session of the auction, Besilu Stables purchased six horses-all from the Ned Evans dispersal--for \$11.4 million. Yesterday, the operation took home three head-all from the Palides dispersal--for \$11 million.

In addition to Royal Delta, Leon paid \$1.6 million for her weanling half-sister by Smart Strike and \$900,000 for a Smoke Glacken weanling filly from the same family.

Leon acknowledged the dispersals were giving his operation a head start in its goal to build a top-quality boutique broodmare band.

"These opportunities arose and we took advantage of them," he said. "These fillies are automatically putting us and our program light years ahead of where we would have been. All the stars aligned and the opportunity was here."

Royal Delta is the third highest-priced filly or mare to sell at Keeneland, behind Playful Act (Ire) (Sadlers' Wells), who sold for \$10.5 million at the 2007 November sale, and Ashado (Saint Ballado), who brought \$9 million at the 2005 November sale. She set a new record for a horse in training sold at Keeneland, easily surpassing the \$6.1 million paid by Aaron and Marie Jones for Half Ours (Unbridled's Song) at this venue in 2006. Royal Delta is also the fourth highest-priced mare to sell in North America. Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister) sold for \$14 million at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Mott Pride...

Even before Royal Delta entered the sales ring, trainer Bill Mott was walking around the Keeneland sales pavilion yesterday like a man who knew he had done a good job and was just waiting for the final payoff. Mott had a long-term relationship with Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments, training not only Royal Delta, but her dam Delta Princess (A.P. Indy) and her second dam Lyphard's Delta (Lyphard).

Royal Delta's championship season, which included a win in the GI Alabama S. in August and was capped with Friday's victory at Churchill Downs, provided the partnership with its brightest moment.

"She is special," Mott said yesterday of Royal Delta. "There is something special about being around her.

She is just a very smart, aware filly. It carried on from the Alabama, to the Breeders' Cup, and it turned the lights on in the sales ring. It's really fun to be part of that."

Mott paid tribute to his late boss, who passed away last January after nearly three decades of

breeding racehorses.

"I have worked for Mr. Khaled for so many years and he did the mating on her," Mott recalled. "He's had the family, and I actually trained the mother and the grandmother of her and several others in the family. It's great to see that it ended with such a bang, particularly for Mr. Khaled. He would have been very, very proud. He was a proud man and he loved his horses. Royal Delta topped it off."

Mott was happy to hear that Royal Delta is expected to remain in training.

"I think it makes sense," the Hall of Famer said. "She's a very sound mare. There is no reason why she shouldn't stay in training. From what I've seen of her, she's just beginning to really figure the game out. She's got a lot of raw talent. They use the term 'We haven't gotten to the bottom of her.' Well, I don't think we've gotten to the bottom of her. I think there is a lot more left."

Todd Pletcher trains the Besilu Stables horses, but does Mott think there is a chance Royal Delta could end up back in his barn?

"I was hoping that someone would be able to buy her that would be able to leave her with us, but we'll just wait and see," Mott said. "I know the gentleman that bought her has a top trainer. We'll see what happens."

When a reporter pointed out that Ben Leon had asked for Mott's business card, the trainer smiled and said, "I heard that, too."

Stronach v Leon: The Undercard...

While Frank Stronach missed out on Royal Delta, the Austrian was able to acquire two mares from the same family. Stronach outdueled Ben Leon's Besilu Stables to acquire Royal Delta's dam **Delta Princess** (A.P. Indy-Lyphard's Delta, by Lyphard) (hip 313) for \$2.6 million. The 11-year-old mare, in foal to Distorted Humor, is a half-sister to Grade/Group 1 winners Biondetti (Bernardini) and a full-sister to Indy Five Hundred. Stronach also acquired Delta Princess's 3/4-sister **Camargue** (Mineshaft--Lyphard's Delta) (hip 293) for \$1.65 million. The 4-year-old unraced mare is in foal to Street Sense.

Asked to comment on the market, Stronach said, "When you buy, you always think you paid too much;

when you sell, you always think you don't get enough. But I think the market is very strong for the right horses--if the conformation and everything is there."

The weanling fillies out of both mares went to Besilu, with Delta Princess's Smart Strike filly bringing \$1.6 million and Camargue's Smoke Glacken weanling selling for \$900,000.

Leon was happy with his weanling purchases. "I think there is better value in what we purchased for future breedings and enjoyment between now and then," he explained. "Hopefully, they'll be good racehorses, but

they certainly have the pedigrees, both fillies, to become excellent broodmares in the future. In the meantime, hopefully they'll give us a lot of thrills on the racetrack."

Wallace Impressed with Dispersal Results...

The Palides horses sold under the banner of Saud bin Khaled's Chanteclair Farm. In total yesterday, the dispersal sold 20 horses for \$16,813,000. The average was \$840,650 and the median was \$105,000.

Longtime Chanteclair President Ron Wallace was happy with the results.

"They are incredible prices, it's wonderful," Wallace said. "I can't usually sell yearlings for that, let alone weanlings."

Asked what his expectations had been, he added, "Not that much, I can tell you. After Sunday [at Fasig-

Tipton November] and Monday, you start thinking that way, but you never want to count your chickens."

Wallace acknowledged the Breeders' Cup accomplishments of Royal Delta played a major part in the dispersal's success.

"The Breeders' Cup
didn't give a little bit of a
boost, it was a major
boost," he said. "She's
made this sale much more exciting."

"Delta Princess is tough," Wallace said. "She's much more competitive than Royal Delta. Royal Delta is more athletic, but she hasn't quite figured it out. She is going to be incredible as a 4-year-old. She's just figuring it out. She was so laid back in the paddock Friday [at Churchill]. Here [at Keeneland] she is just a star and just doesn't care. Her mother would eat horses in front of her. She was going to win no matter what. Royal Delta is just good. If she learns to be competitive, watch out."

Brushwood Nabs Unrivaled Belle for \$2.8 Million...

Brushwood Stable's Betty Moran outgunned bloodstock agent Lincoln Collins and Adena Springs' Frank Stronach for last year's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner **Unrivaled Belle** (Unbridled's Song--

Queenie Belle, by Bertrando), who sold yesterday for \$2.8 million. That was the secondhighest price of yesterday's second session and the fourthhighest of the sale. Reiley McDonald's Eaton Sales consigned the 5-year-old as

hip 261 on behalf of her owner/breeders, Peter Vegso and Gary Seidler. Moran was unable to attend the sale, instead doing her bidding over the phone through Keeneland auctioneer Justin Holmberg, who stood out back.

"Mrs. Moran was very excited and is looking forward to having her in her broodmare band," said Holmberg, who, when asked if Moran would have gone higher, said, "It sounded like it."

Unrivaled Belle broke onto the national scene in May of 2010 when she beat Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GII La Troienne S., but it was her victory in last year's Ladies' Classic that put her firmly amongst the best of her generation. Sportingly returned to the races at five, the big gray was fractious in the paddock prior to the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont in June, flipped, and suffered fractures to her withers. The Bill Mott-trained filly was retired soon after with a record of 14-6-6-1 and earnings of \$1,854,706.

Despite being off the track for five months, Unrivaled Belle looked an absolute picture yesterday walking the rear ring, where Frank Stronach and his Adena crew sneaked a last peak at the mare. Unrivaled Belle began to get a bit worked up as she was led up to the pavilion, however, and by the time she entered the ring, was so fired up that, as bidding hit the \$1.2 million mark, the auctioneer asked that she be removed from the ring.

Worked up in a different way was her co-breeder Vegso, the man behind the "Chicken Soup for the Soul" book series, who had tears in his eyes after watching Unrivaled Belle sell.

"I'm an emotional wreck for some reason," he smiled. "We got so much enjoyment out of her and she's such a unique horse. I've been crying for 15 minutes now and don't know why. It's a great price for the horse, and I should be joyous. It's the emotional rollercoaster of winning the races, then losing races, then her getting hurt. It's what horse racing is about. But I'm missing her already."

Seidler, co-founder of Vegso's self-help publishing company Health Communications, was also on hand. "It's a complete mix of emotions," Seidler agreed. "I'm happy about the sale, but I'm very sad about losing her.

It's family--and I mean family. But I'm reducing my involvement in racing, and I saw this as a good opportunity to do that."

Seidler raced Unrivaled Belle's dam Queenie Belle in California, where she won a pair of Grade II events, including the

Lady's Secret BC H. and Princess S. Later, after Queenie Belle was retired to the breeding shed, he and Vegso joined together in a breeding partnership, where Vegso provided the season and the men split the foal. The mare's first foal, Steven's Being (Fusaichi Pegasus), was a "midget," said Vegso, and so he suggested Unbridled's Song--a sire who typically puts plenty of size in his offspring. Plus, Vegso had enjoyed success with Unbridled's Song before, campaigning MGISW Splendid Blended. The result was Unrivaled Belle.

Vegso said her behavior in the ring was typical of the gray. "She thought she was going to the races, and when it's race day, she wants to race, she doesn't want to be walking around in a circle," said Vegso. "She turns into a whole other horse."

The men have a weanling full-sister to Unrivaled Belle who was scratched from the sale yesterday, but who could return to the auction ring next year; and still have Queenie Belle, who is currently in foal to Bernardini. The men said that while they're amenable to selling her babies, mom isn't for sale.

"When I first moved to California 12 years ago, I bought seven horses, and she was the best of them," said Seidler. "She was the best horse I had been involved with, and there's a lot of history there. Steven's Being was named after my nephew who passed away, for instance. We'll never get rid of Queenie Belle--that's for sure." -LM

Much to Rave About...

It's been a few years since the Keeneland sales pavilion has witnessed the verve and vigor of the last two days of trade at November, and the sales sheets bear that out. The cumulative average of \$402,391 is up 86.5% from last year's figures, while the cumulative median of \$220,000 is up 63%. The RNA rate is a very good 18.8%--it was 19.3% a year ago--and Keeneland has already grossed \$114,681,500, up 63%.

The huge upswings can be attributed to the unabated demand for horses first from Monday's Edward P. Evans dispersal, then yesterday for Palides Investments' Saud bin Khaled's. The latter dispersal, which is being handled by Khaled's Chanteclair Farm, accounted for the sale-topping \$8.5 million Royal Delta (Empire Maker), while Evans's Spring Hill Farm produced Monday's topper, the \$4.2-million Christmas Kid (Lemon Drop Kid).

Following yesterday's action, Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson said it was a matter of everything coming together at the right time for the Chanteclair dispersal. "We topped it with a mare that did every single thing right," he said. "I don't know what else you could ask for one mare to do. She had family, her dam could run, she wins the Breeders' Cup Friday. Of course, she brought a lot of money. And should have."

Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said the response to the dispersals had something in common. "Again, it was a testament to the dedication a man has to this industry, and his [operation] being rewarded for it."

Hernon Drops the Hammer... Twice

For a brief stretch yesterday, Michael Hernon was in the rare position of representing himself while overseeing Gainesway's sale offerings from the back of the pavilion. That's because the Irishman co-owned hips 423 and 424, the respective dam and half-sister to this year's outstanding West Coast sophomore Zazu (Tapit). Both brought top dollar for Hernon and his partner Dr. Phil Andrade. The former, the 11-year-old mare **Rhumb** Line (Mr. Greeley--Rose Rhapsody, by Pleasant Colony), brought \$850,000 from Bowden Global Equine, while the latter, an Apr. 11-foaled filly by Birdstone, went to Dell Ridge Farm for \$300,000.

"Both were here to sell, and they both had a good following," said Hernon. "We're pleased with the results. It is a strong market, and the ultimate acid-test is the market; it will tell you what your horse is worth."

Hernon originally purchased Rhumb Line as a broodmare in partnership for \$20,000 at the FTKFEB sale in 2005, and bred and sold her first foal, the group-placed Art Princess (Officer), for \$65,000 as a weanling. That partnership was dissolved and another, with Andrade, was formed when Rhumb Line made \$65,000 at the 2007 KEEJAN sale. The resulting foal, Star of Sapphire (Tapit), made \$50,000 at auction, and was followed by Zazu, who sold for \$100,000 as a weanling. David Ingordo later selected Zazu as a \$285,000 KEESEP yearling in 2009, and for Jerry and Ann Moss, the filly won this year's GI Las Virgenes S. and the GI Lady's Secret S.

"Rhumb Line has been a super mare for us, and it's been a thrill this year to breed a Grade I winner," said Hernon. "It's unfortunate she missed the Breeders' Cup [with injury], but she's still got a lot of run left in her. She beat older fillies and mares in the Lady's Secret S., and she's going to be a force next year."

Meanwhile, Hernon and Andrade sold a full-brother to Zazu to Gary and Mary West's bloodstock agent Ben Glass for \$260,000 last November, and yesterday's Birdstone filly pushed Hernon's gross sales out of the mare (from two partnerships) to \$900,000. Add that to the mare's price yesterday, and it's a \$1.75-million return on investment.

Of the Birdstone weanling filly, Hernon said, "She was a beautiful filly, very elegant. She was a chip off the old block, just like her mom. She had great quality and disposition and class."

Despite the dual sales yesterday, Hernon isn't without a member of the family. In 2009, he brought Art Princess back into the fold, buying her as a 3-year-old broodmare prospect for \$50,000. "I co-own her with [Gainesway President] Antony Beck," said Hernon. "She had a Tapit filly this year, and she's back in foal to Tapit, so I still have some of the blood, and am happy to."

Hernon added he would likely reinvest later in the sale. "I'll probably look for a nice young broodmare prospect later in the week, possibly when the market settles down and I can afford it," he said. -LM

'Warning' Tracks at \$1.05 Million...

The 6-year-old mare **Gypsy's Warning (SAf)** (Mogok-Gypsy Queen {SAf}, by Royal Chalice {SAf}) will defend her title in the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood Park Nov. 25. But, unlike last year, she won't be carrying the red-and-green silks of Barry Irwin's Team

Valor International. That after Team Valor and partner Green Lantern Stable sold the racing or broodmare prospect to the Niarchos family's Flaxman Holdings for \$1.05 million yesterday. The family's racing manager Alan Cooper signed the ticket out back. Craig and Holly

Bandoroff's Denali Stud consigned the mare as hip 338. "She'll go back to [trainer] Graham Motion, with a view at repeating in the Matriarch at the end of the month," said Cooper, who said the mare will ultimately be retired for the 2012 breeding season. Cooper said the mare will likely stay as part of Flaxman's U.S.-based broodmare band.

"She was being sold to dissolve a partnership, so it's the fair-market price," added Cooper.

The Niarchos family had reason to take an interest in the granddaughter of Storm Cat, as they bred and raised her sire Mogok. "He was the last foal from Coup de Folie and is a grandson of Raise the Standard," said Cooper. "He was trained by Pascal Bary and never actually ran, but he was a lovely, quality horse. He was a much darker horse [than Gypsy's Warning], and she's probably a lot calmer."

Selling as a stallion prospect at the 2003 Goffs France summer sale, Mogok, a half-sibling to Machiavellian (Mr. Prospector) and from the family of Northern Dancer, topped the event on Kern Lillingston's €135,000 bid and was shipped to stand stud in South Africa. In addition to Gypsy's Warning, Mogok is the sire of South African Group 1 winners Orbison (SAf) and The Apache (SAf).

Gypsy's Warning herself started her racing career in South Africa, where Irwin purchased her shortly after winning the G1 S.A. Fillies Classic in 2009. Gypsy's Warning captured her stateside debut in the GIII Eatontown S. at Monmouth in May of 2010, ran third in the GI Beverly D. and GI Yellow Ribbon S., then beat Wasted Tears (Najran) in the Matriarch. For Irwin, departing with a mare less than three weeks from defending a Grade I title wasn't easy, but that's what the business plan called for.

"I'm not the richest guy in the world, and it's just something we had to do as part of the partnership," said Irwin, whose operation won the GI Kentucky Derby this year with Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}).



About a half hour before Gypsy's Warning sold, another successful Team Valor runner went through the

ring. Hip 311, the 6-year-old Daveron (Ger) (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}--Darwinia {Ger}, by Acatenango {Ger}), went to Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation for \$750,000. "I purchased her as a yearling in Germany," said Irwin of the €100,000 BBASEP acquisition. A stakes winner in her native country, Daveron was

later moved to American shores and is enjoying her best season to date. She won the GIII Beaugay S. at Belmont in May, took the GII Ballston Spa S. at Saratoga in late August and finished a close-up third in the GI First Lady S. at Keeneland Oct. 8. Daveron, selling as a racing or broodmare prospect, was produced by a full-sister to Dalicia (Ger), dam of none other than Animal Kingdom. Team Valor acquired Dalicia a month after buying Daveron, going to €400,000 for the then 4-year-old.

Irwin said both Gypsy's Warning and Daveron sold for just about what he'd pegged their value at. -LM

Summer Wind Gets Some Love...

The royally bred **Love Me Only (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells-Mariah's Storm, by Rahy), in foal to superstar Sea the Stars (Ire), attracted plenty of interest at Keeneland yesterday, with Mt. Brilliant Farm's Greg Goodman, Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff and Adena Springs's Frank Stronach all bidding on the unraced 3-year-old, but it was Frank and Laura Jane Lyon's Summer Wind Farm that came away with the bay with a final bid of \$2.1 million.

Laura Jane Lyon, sitting near the back of the pavilion, did the bidding, but let her husband Frank sign the ticket. Afterwards, she admitted she was thrilled with the acquisition.

"We are delighted about her," Lyon said. "That bloodline will go down in history as probably one of the best ever. So I am very excited to have a young Sadler's Wells mare, not to mention that the mother is Mariah's Storm-you just do not get a better pedigree."

Mariah's Storm brought \$2.6 million while in foal to Storm Cat at the 1996 Keeneland November sale. Her in utero foal that day was six-time Group 1 winner Giant's Causeway.

Lyon added Love Me Only's Arc-winning covering sire Sea the Stars was another selling point.

"I was fortunate enough to see Sea the Stars a year or so ago, right after he came off the track, and he was a remarkable animal," Lyon explained. "I can hardly wait for the baby."

Summer Wind has a commercial broodmare band of around 30 mares, so when she was asked if she would keep Love Me Only's Sea the Stars foal, Lyon said, "I'm not allowed to say that I would want to keep one. But we'll just have to see. The market will determine that, I'm sure."


Lyon did admit she was near the limit of her bidding yesterday. "We wanted her, but there has to be a limit if you are in a commercial business," she explained. "And that's what we are. We were pretty much at the top for that, but I'm happy we have her. Really happy."


Summer Wind was able to acquire the mare Dark Sky (Storm Cat) from the Spring Hill dispersal Monday for \$1.5 million, but Lyon acknowledged it has been a competitive market at the November sale.

"I haven't seen anything like it in a number of years," she said. "I don't know if it's because of the dispersals. I suspect that that has made a huge impact. It's sad that a deceased's dispersal would have to pump up the market so much. But hopefully, it will carry on to the yearlings. It looks like weanlings are doing very well. I am excited about that. We'll cross our fingers that it will hold up to the yearlings." -JM

Elm Tree Doubles Up...

Jody and Michelle Huckabay's Elm Tree Farm consignment achieved notable results in quick succession yesterday. First, the dam of this year's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth winner Soldat (War Front), the 7-year-old mare **Le Relais** (Coronado's Quest--Malbay, by Apalachee), sold to Stonestreet Stable for \$800,000. Catalogued as hip 378, she was carrying a member of champion Blame (Arch)'s first crop.

Just minutes later, Elm Tree consigned the 9-year-old Mayan Milagra (Menifee--Dhaka, by Icecapade), dam of TDN Rising Star" and Grade II winner Dancinginherdreams (Tapit), who brought \$410,000 from Woodford Thoroughbreds. Mayan Milagra, selling as hip 386, is carrying a full-sibling to Dancinginherdreams.

Both mares sold for many multiples of what they brought at auction just a few years ago. Huckabay was representing long-time client Nancy Shuford when he purchased Mayan Milagra, a half-sister to stakes winners Deodar (Woodman) and Bema (Pulpit), for \$42,000 at the 2006 KEENOV sale. They got only a modest \$40,000 when selling Dancinginherdreams 26 months later at the 2009 KEEJAN sale, but came back to ring up a big transaction yesterday.

Le Relais, meanwhile, was acquired by Elm Tree client Brooksfield Farm for \$27,000 at the 2005 Keeneland September Sale. The half-sister to GSW Mulrainy (Star de Naskra) never made it to the races, but her first foal made up for that. Soldat, from his sire's first crop, sold for \$180,000 at the 2009 KEESEP sale and has now earned nearly \$585,000.

Huckabay declined to name the principal of Brooksfield, but said, "They bought Le Relais as a [yearling] as an investment, and it worked out quite well. She's an absolutely beautiful mare. We sold all her yearlings, and she's just one of those mares who throws a gorgeous foal every year. Soldat, for instance, was an unbelievable athlete. He wasn't a big horse, but just an athlete. He had a great walk on him. Stonestreet bought her, and I don't know who they'll breed her to, but I think you could breed her to anybody and she'd get a nice foal. Plus, we love Blame. We think it's a wonderful cross, and think he's going to be a wonderful sire." -LM



He will stand for C\$6,500, stands and nurses, in a deal brokered Bernard McCormack's Cara Bloodstock. Winner of the 2008 GII Arkansas Derby for Cubanacan Stables and trainer Paulo Lobo, the dark bay was acquired privately by Godolphin, and added trophies in the GI Ancient Title S. and G3 Mahab AI Shimaal in 2009, as well as the 2010 Presque Isle Mile. He was second in the 2010 renewal of the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. Gayego, who concluded his career with a record of 21-8-4-2 and \$1,722,008, will be available for viewing at Keeneland during the November Sale.

MUCHO MACHO MAN RETURNS GII Risen Star S. winner Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno), who was last seen finishing a well-beaten seventh in the June 11 GI Belmont S., makes his return to the races in this afternoon's third race at Aqueduct. Mucho Macho Man faces six rivals in the one-mile, \$35,000 optional claimer for 3-year-olds and upward. Among his challengers is GIII Phillip Iselin S. runner-up Southern Ridge (Southern Image), who has since been purchased by Paul Pompa Jr. and is under the care of Todd Pletcher.

"He's actually grown up a lot," said trainer Kathy Ritvo. "It's going to be a competitive race, but we have to start somewhere." Campaigned by Reeves Thoroughbred Partnership and Dream Team One Racing Stable, the sophomore finished on the board in four additional graded stakes this term, including a third in the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby. "After the Belmont, we wanted to give him time off," said Dean Reeves. "The Triple Crown was a tough campaign and we knew we wanted to give him two-three months off...About in mid-August, he started back in training [in Saratoga] with jogs, gallops up to his breezes. He developed a little soreness, so we backed off, then brought him to Belmont." In his latest work, Mucho Macho Man covered four furlongs in :47 3/5 over Belmont's training track Nov. 4. Reeves added, "He started breezing and we began to dial in on a race.. Now, we think he's fit and ready to go." According to Reeves, the long-term plans for the colt call for a start in the Sunshine Millions Classic in January and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, both at Santa Anita.
