LOVE IS ALL YOU NEED

It was another G1 QIPCO 1,000 Guineas, another win for Ballydoyle on Sunday as **Love (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) categorically signalled her rise to class principal with a command performance on Newmarket's Rowley Mile. Always travelling strongly out wide for Ryan Moore, the G1 Moyglare Stud S. heroine who had been third in the G1 Fillies' Mile over this course and distance in October was sent to the front heading down into the "dip". Powering clear with the camber reversed uphill to the finish, the 4-1 joint-second favourite was emphatic there having opened up a 4 1/4-length margin over **Cloak of Spirits (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who in turn held the free-running 11-4 market-leader **Quadrilateral (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) by a head.

Celebrating a sixth success in this Classic and a fourth in the last five back in his study in Co. Tipperary, Aidan O'Brien was already planning ahead to the winner's next step in four weeks' time. "She's a special filly and we always thought she would get much further than a mile," he said as bookmakers moved to ward off liabilities for the July 4 G1 Epsom Oaks. "She showed she got a mile last year and we always thought we'd start here and then maybe go on to the Oaks. Ryan gave her a beautiful ride, very uncomplicated, he got her in a lovely rhythm and I couldn't have been happier really. He had her well-balanced into the dip, she's very genuine and she had her head out and ran to the line." [Cont. p2](#)

With a pedigree like his, Khalid Abdullah's **Sunray Major (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) already had enough in hand on his rivals assembled for division two of Newmarket's Betfair Exchange More Ways To Win EBF Stallions Novice S. on Sunday's 1000 Guineas undercard. Word spreads fast around these parts and it was certainly out for the John Gosden-trained half-brother to the amazing miler Kingman (GB) as he traded at 8-11 for the mile contest. Following the lead of his yard's already-established 'TDN Rising Star' King Leonidas (GB) by Kingman himself in the first division, the Juddmonte homebred was to add further heavy artillery to Clarehaven's remarkable stores with this impressive debut performance.

Going through the staggered stages of juvenile education that O'Brien provides so well with an ever-pleasing aptitude, Love was able to build and build upon quiet beginnings and reach the top of the class while still relishing her duties. From a creeping debut fourth at Leopardstown in early June, the chestnut showed some aggression when second to 'TDN Rising Star' Windracer (Ire) (Showcasing {GB}) at The Curragh three weeks later and was back in Dublin with scholarly enthusiasm for two starts the next month. Breaking her maiden at the expense of the useful Soul Search (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}), she was 8-1 and dismissed by Ryan Moore when tackling the G3 Silver Flash S. a fortnight later but thrived for the taskmaster Seamie Heffernan to issue a 3 1/4-length drubbing to her peers.

Fifth in the G2 Debutante S. when the ground was easy returning to The Curragh in August, she dealt with that setback with a learned professionalism by making no mistake on a livelier surface in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. also in Kildare in September. Giving her all again on her first overseas trip in the Fillies' Mile, she was 1 3/4 lengths off Quadrilateral there with no obvious excuse but the feeling was that the last word had not been spoken in that particular argument.

Whereas Quadrilateral had been hard to rouse in that encounter, the Juddmonte homebred was hard on the steel from the break here and Jason Watson was at pains to restrain her in the slipstream of the leader Cloak of Spirits sandwiched between **Rose of Kildare (Ire)** (Make Believe {GB}) and **Final Song (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}). After three furlongs, the unbeaten favourite was still pulling for her head while Ryan Moore was enjoying a hassle-free time on Love enjoying a perfect rhythm widest of all towards the centre. Passing two out, Godolphin's 100-1 outsider Final Song might have been narrowly in front but Love was coming hard as the closers were struggling in behind.

Using the downhill slope to generate momentum from the strong-staying Love, Moore was soon beyond recall and it was left to Cloak of Spirits to find a second wind and deny Quadrilateral, whose finishing effort was compromised by her early antics. "She's a very uncomplicated filly and we've always thought a lot of her," the winning rider commented. "She's a typical Galileo filly and she was in control of the race from a long way out. I'd say it's a possibility that she'd stay at Epsom and at the moment she looks the best 3-year-old filly around."

Richard Hannon was at the same time both deflated and buoyed as he pondered the much-improved but not entirely unexpected improvement shown by Cloak of Spirits in the runner's-up spot. **Cont. p3**

“She did the donkey work and stuck at it. I’ve been second in a few Classics and it is horrible, but I’m delighted with the run,” he said. “She is a very elegant, pretty classy filly. I might not have given her a prep run as she didn’t look great a month ago, plus she won first time out last year so she doesn’t necessarily need it, but she will improve and there are definitely group races in her. Maybe the [June 20 G1] Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot] could be next, but I will speak to Sheikh Obaid and see what he says. I think being out in front suits her and I think Andrea [Atzeni] rode her perfectly.”

Roger Charlton was not too downcast as he reflected on the run of Quadrilateral, which was in contrast to her last visit here. “She stayed on well, but just got a little tired in the closing stages. She could have probably done with a little more cover, but these races are being run from the front and nothing is coming from behind so you have to be handy,” he explained. “I was happy enough with that. The track probably doesn’t play to her strengths. Jason [Watson] seemed happy enough with the run. I don’t know what we will do going forward. I will talk to Prince Khalid first. I’d imagine she would stay further, but we won’t be rushing her.”

Pedigree Notes

Remarkably, Love’s victory means that both European 1000 Guineas to have been staged this year have been won by daughters of very moderate racemares trained by Stuart Williams. Whereas the G1 Poule d’Essai des Pouliches heroine Dream and Do (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr}) was out of Venetias Dream (Ire) (Librettist), this new doyenne of Ballydoyle is the progeny of Pikaboo (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) who was just as unremarkable a runner for the Newmarket handler. Sold on five separate occasions and twice when her racing career was over, she ended up with the Venners for 50,000gns at the 2012 Tattersalls December Mares Sale just before her proverbial boat came in.

Months after her final visit to a public auction, Pikaboo’s George Margaron-trained daughter Lucky Kristale (GB) (Lucky Story) was capturing the G2 Lowther S. and G2 Cherry Hinton S. and Coolmore moved to acquire her. Giving the operation instant reward via the Group 3-winning Galileo fillies Flattering (Ire) and Peach Tree (Ire), Pikaboo has excelled herself with this latest gem. Despite her modest racing record, there was always a chance that she could do something in her second career being a half-sister to the seven-furlong specialist and dual G2 Park S.-winning sire Arabian Gleam (GB) by Pivotal’s son Kyllachy (GB).

Among Pikaboo’s other half-siblings are the listed-winning sprinter Kimberella (GB) who is also by Kyllachy, and Light Quest (Quest For Fame {GB}). **Cont. p4**

MANUELA DE VEGA IN CHARGE OF THE PINNACLE

Not far off the top performers in 2019, Waverley Racing’s **Manuela de Vega (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) came back with a vengeance when the subject of a masterclass from Rob Hornby to win Sunday’s G3 Betway Pinnacle S. at Haydock. Last seen finishing runner-up in the G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern at Munich in November, the 4-1 shot was sent into a clear lead and while her rivals waited for her to come back she was merely relishing her own version of social distancing up ahead. Too far clear of **Fanny Logan (Ire)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) as that even-money favourite got going in the straight, she hit the line still strong with two lengths to spare, with the third **Vivionn (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) four lengths away. “She’s done that really nicely and we knew she enjoyed an honest gallop on a nice galloping track like this,” Hornby said. “She stumbled coming out of the stalls, but I was able to get into the position I wanted and stretch the rest of the field. I had a sneaky look in the straight, as I couldn’t hear anything but she never had to over-exert and got into a good rhythm. I knew she stays very well on this kind of track and in these conditions and I really liked the way she galloped out after the line. Her ears were pricked and she galloped out right down the back.”

Successful in the Listed Silver Tankard S. at Pontefract at two, Manuela de Vega was no match for Mehdaayih (GB) (Frankel {GB}) when second in the Listed Cheshire Oaks on her 3-year-old bow last May but was just over two lengths behind that rival’s stablemate Anapurna (GB) (Frankel {GB}) when fourth in the G1 Epsom Oaks later that month. Subsequently fifth in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh in July and runner-up to Enbihaar (Ire) (Redoute’s Choice {Aus}) upped to 14 furlongs for Goodwood’s G2 Lillie Langtry S. in August, the bay stayed at that track and trip to be third in the G3 March S. Tailing off slightly when second in Chester’s Listed Stand Cup over an extended 12

furlongs in September, she rebounded in Munich and there was enough there to suggest she could offer some profit for the decision to remain in training.

Pedigree Notes

Manuela de Vega is a full-sister to the G2 Gran Criterium hero Hero Look (Ire) and the Listed Warwick S. and Listed Pontefract Castle S. winner Isabel de Urbina (Ire) and a half to the ill-fated Lincoln H. winner Auxerre (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}). They are out of the dual listed-placed Roscoff (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}), whose own dam is the listed scorer and multiple group-placed sprinter Traou Mad (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}). She is one of four black-type winners out of the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges winner Pont-Aven (Ire) (Try My Best), including the top-class Sainte Marine (Ire) (Kenmare {Fr}) and the G2 Gimcrack S.-winning sire Josr Algahoud (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}). Roscoff also has a 2-year-old full-sister to Manuela de Vega to follow.

LORD NORTH PREVAILS IN THE BRIGADIER GERARD

Lightly-raced and still progressing, last year's Cambridgeshire H. winner **Lord North (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) was on top at the end of an edition of the G3 Betway Brigadier Gerard S. staged at Haydock that proved fascinating despite four withdrawals. Signing off at three with a dominating performance in Newmarket's Listed James Seymour S. over this 10-furlong trip in November, Sheikh Zayed bin Mohammed Racing's imposing bay was always travelling strongly as the 11-8 favourite **Elarqam (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) cut out the running. Brushing that rival aside passing the two-furlong pole, the 3-1 second favourite was either tiring or idling late as Elarqam worked back to force a photo with a short-head the margin separating them.

"He's a strong-travelling horse who has always had a lot of ability, but as a young horse he was very aggressive and angry," jockey Rob Havlin explained. "He was getting the job done, but making it hard for himself and everyone around him and thankfully he's got out of that now and is starting to fulfil the potential we knew he had. He actually put the race to bed quite easily here and then blew up with me and was in the red at the end. He's a class horse--he showed that in the Cambridgeshire last year when he was like a knife through butter. He appreciated the rain that came last night and there is a lot to build on."

Impressing when beating a sole rival by 11 lengths in a two-runner Newcastle novice last April, Lord North was gelded after finishing last of eight in the Listed Heron S. at Sandown the

following month and returned in early September to be second in a mile handicap at Ascot. Landing a gamble later that month in Newmarket's prestigious nine-furlong Cambridgeshire, he was again runner-up back at Ascot in the Balmoral H. on Champions Day before taking the James Seymour in the manner of a genuine group horse. Free early in third on this return, he went by Elarqam with relative ease as **Sangarius (GB)** (Kingman {GB}) began to struggle in behind and may have been feeling the effects of that winning move late as the favourite and **Telecaster (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}) closed in.

John Gosden said of the winner, "We have got to look at the good mile-and-a-quarter races for him as he has now won a listed race and a Group 3. Do you go more sensible and for a Group 2 as taking on Ghaiyyath is going to be quite heartbreaking for some horses. We might enter him [at Royal Ascot] and have a look around the place, but there is no major plan yet. You are coming back awfully quick for Royal Ascot, so they have to take their races well. Everything is so concertinaed, so we will just see how he is. It is the same with all the ones I'm running, they all need their races and even he did. He likes to get his toe in, so that ground helped him."

Elarqam's trainer Mark Johnston was not too disappointed with the run of the 5-year-old. "It looked like he might drop back to third when he was headed, but he's then stayed on again. It looked like he needed his first run last year, so it's not the end of the world."

Lord North's dam Najoum (Giant's Causeway) is a half to the GI Blue Grass S.-winning sire Bandini (Fusaichi Pegasus), as well as the G3 Sweet Solera S. winner Discourse (Street Cry {Ire}) who went on to produce two listed winners including Discursus (GB) to a mating with Dubawi. European champion **Pinatubo (Ire)** (Shamardal) is doing well following his third-place finish in the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas and will point to the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. Trainer Charlie Appleby reported the Godolphin runner to be none the worse following his effort on the Rowley Mile on Saturday. The Shamardal colt suffered the first reverse of his career in the wake of Kameko (Kitten's Joy) and Wichita (Ire) (No Nay Never). Prior to the Guineas, Pinatubo won each of his six juvenile outings and boasted a rating of 128.

Appleby told *Racing TV's* "Luck On Sunday" programme, "First signs are very good, he ate up last night and he's been out and had a walk this morning. He lost three kilos for the race there, so we're very pleased with him.

"You wouldn't want to be losing too much more than that. I felt confident going in there his fitness levels were where they needed to be to compete and he showed that in the race, so I'm pleased. He's come out of the race well, he's eaten up and we can hopefully head on to Ascot, that's the main thing.

"He ticked every box, even throughout the race I was happy. At home he wouldn't get you excited in the mornings so I was pleased he was up there travelling and showing all his usual enthusiasm.

"Much as I feel we saw the mile out, I think we were outstayed by two horses over that trip on the day. It's an unprecedented year this year in where we are and trying to make a bit of ground up, but he gives himself every opportunity to back up quickly because he conserves energy from one race to the next."

John Gosden's middle-distance Classic prospects are seemingly in endless supply and a change of tactics saw Run Wild emerge as a live member of that particular team as she dominated this competitive affair. Off the mark on her third start by six lengths over a mile at Kempton in August, the chestnut was less than two lengths behind Powerful Breeze (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) when fourth in the G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster in September before running second to Pocket Square (GB) (Night of Thunder {Ire}) in Deauville's G3 Prix des Reservoirs in October and third in the Listed Montrose Fillies' S. here in November.

Kept wide from the rest by Oisín Murphy throughout the early stages, she soon held the overall lead allowed to bowl at her own tempo and by the time she had crossed to the far rail the result was beyond doubt. Unrelenting late, she had pulled a field of well-regarded Oaks prospects outside of their comfort zones with Queen Daenerys and Trefoil giving the most meaningful pursuit. [Cont. p11](#)

“It was the plan to relax here wherever that was to be and she pricked her ears after two strides so I left her there and let her go forward,” Murphy said. “She was fit and covers loads of ground—I had them beaten before I got to the dip. I wouldn’t think 12 furlongs will suit her and she’s massive, so Epsom might not play to her strengths. She is so big I would imagine she’ll still be progressing when others have reached their level later on.”

Gosden was in accord with Murphy in ruling out a tilt at the Oaks. “She is not the sort of filly you want to take back and fiddle about with. She just loves to use her stride, which she did to good effect,” he said. “I would say that is it trip-wise and I wouldn’t go any further than a mile and a quarter. She has got plenty of experience and put it to good use.”

Queen Daenerys’s trainer Roger Varian is looking at the July 4 Epsom Classic, however. “They went a good pace and I like the way she stayed on at the end,” he commented. “She looks like she is crying out for further, so I wouldn’t rule out the Oaks but I need to speak to the owner first. I just think it is a very good start to the season and we will keep all the options open to her.”

Professional from the outset, Liberty Beach was successful in a novice contest on debut at Redcar in late May before beating the future dual Group 3 scorer Rose of Kildare (Ire) (Make Believe {GB}) with authority in Beverley’s Hilary Needler Trophy Conditions S. less than a fortnight later. By the time she got to Royal Ascot, she was having a third run in quick succession and was unlucky to be 2 1/4-lengths fourth behind Raffle Prize (Ire) (Slade Power {Ire}) in the G2 Queen Mary S. racing away from the seemingly-favoured stand’s rail. Undeterred, she was out again soon after to score by 3 1/4 lengths in the Listed Dragon S. at Sandown before taking Goodwood’s five-furlong G3 Molecomb S. at the end of July. Upped to this trip for the first time in York’s G2 Lowther S. in August, the bay ran 3/4 of a length second to Living In the Past (Ire) (Bungle Inthejungle {GB}) and was notably fresh and keen on this first start back.

Overcoming that over-exuberance to assert once Jason Hart had given her the command approaching the furlong pole, Liberty Beach was picking up where she had left off. “She was entitled to do that. She probably travelled with a little bit too much zest, she dragged me into the race earlier than I wanted but she put the race to bed nicely,” her rider said. “Now she’s won over six at least it opens up a bit of an option as she proved she stays, but as you’ve seen she’s got plenty of boot.” **Cont. p12**

TDN Rising Star Space Blues proved himself a high-class performer at or around this trip last term, winning Epsom's Listed Surrey S. on Oaks day before finishing runner-up in Royal Ascot's G3 Jersey S. and the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Deauville. A length third in the 6 1/2-furlong G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest back at that Normandy venue in August, the bay had disappointed when seventh in the six-furlong G3 Nad Al Sheba Turf Sprint at Meydan when last seen Mar. 7.

Held up towards the back early by James Doyle, the homebred made smooth progress to challenge last year's winner Safe Voyage approaching the final furlong and after mastering him stayed on strongly to the line.

"He had the form in the book and has been placed in group ones," his rider said. "Things didn't go to plan in Dubai, dropping down to six furlongs. It looks like seven is his trip, he enjoyed that and it set up nicely for him, hopefully he can go on now. Ascot is a stiff six and he does have form there, so the June 20 G1] Diamond Jubilee might be interesting."

High Spirited is also the dam of the G2 King Edward VII S. scorer Amfortas (Ire) (Caerleon) and the G3 Prix de Royaumont winner Legend Maker (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) whose own progeny list is headed by the G1 1000 Guineas heroine Virginia Waters (Kingmambo). Also connected to the promoted G1 Matron S. winner Chachamaidee (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), herself the dam of last year's G3 Pinnacle S. scorer Klassique (GB) (Gaileo {Ire}), Miss Lucifer also has a 2-year-old filly by Night of Thunder (Ire) named Beautiful Future (Ire). bushes. Nathaniels tend to improve with age and I don't think I could have recorded this type of success on him at this stage last year, so this opens up the horizon."

Dashing Willoughby is the second foal out of Miss Dashwood (GB) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), a daughter of Dash To the Front (GB) (Diktat {GB}) who landed the Listed Warwickshire Oaks before producing the G1 Prix de l'Opera and G1 Prix Jean Romanet heroine Speedy Boarding (GB) (Shamardal). Dash To the Front is kin to the Listed Hoppings S. winner and G1 Yorkshire Oaks runner-up Dash To the Top (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who is in turn the dam of last year's G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Prix de Royallieu heroine Anapurna (GB) (Frankel {GB}). GRAN ALEGRIA SPRINGS YASUDA KINEN SURPRISE, ALMOND EYE SECOND

Sunday Racing's **Gran Alegria (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) booked her ticket to the Breeders' Cup while defeating nine other Group 1 winners in the G1 Yasuda Kinen at Tokyo Racecourse on Sunday. The 1600-metre feature is a "Win and You're In" for the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Keeneland in November. It was 2 1/2 lengths back to 2018 Japanese Horse of the Year and 1-5 favourite **Almond Eye (Jpn)** (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}), who was slowly away. 2019 victor **Indy Champ (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) was third.

Made an 11-1 proposition, Gran Alegria raced solidly in midfield for much of the backstretch with plenty of room both fore and aft in the 14-horse field. Swung out to the center of the course on the far turn, the bay slipped back towards the fence and into the four path as she tackled pacesetter **Danon Smash (Jpn)** (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) at the quarter-mile pole. Almond Eye was coming with her customary turn of foot, but she had several more lengths to make up on the new leader, and by the time she truly got going, the line had come and gone. She just pipped fellow Silk Racing colourbearer Indy Champ by a half-length for second. He was a neck to the good of the late-closing 2019 G1 Victoria Mile victress **Normcore (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}). "First of all, I must thank everyone at the stables who tuned her up so well," said jockey Kenichi Ikezoe. "I was focused on keeping her in good rhythm and in a good position which all worked out beautifully. She just gave her best with such a tenacious run down the stretch—I was afraid up to the line that we were going to be caught, especially by Almond Eye."

He added, “I hurt myself when a chunk of grass hit my eye at the third corner, but it doesn’t hurt at all now.”

“We had a poor break but I think we recovered well and made a smooth and strong bid turning for home with Gran Alegria in aim,” said Almond Eye’s jockey Christophe Lemaire. “She showed her good turn of foot but she could have done better. The winner was just so strong, it wasn’t our day.”

A winner of her first two starts, including the G3 Saudi Arabia Royal Cup over track and trip in October of 2018, Gran Alegria finished her juvenile season with a third in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity S. at Hanshin that December. Back on top in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) last April, she was only fifth in the G1 NHK Mile Cup locally that May. Not seen again until a winning effort in the G2 Hanshin Cup on Dec. 21, the 2019 Japanese Champion 3-Year-Old Filly warmed up for this with a third (placed second) in soft going in the 1200-metre G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen at Chukyo on Mar. 29.

Pedigree Notes

One of 46 Group 1 winners for the late **Deep Impact**, Gran Alegria is also among his 127 group winners and 158 black-type winners overall. The 4-year-old joins young sires Real Impact (Jpn) and Satono Aladdin (Jpn) as Yasuda Kinen scorers for the former Shadai Stallion Station resident.

Barren in 2015, Listed Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine Tapitsfly, who went on to capture the GI Longines Just a Game S. and GI First Lady S. as a 5-year-old before selling to Katsumi Yoshida for \$1.85 million at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale in 2012, produced the Yasuda Kinen winner in 2016. She had the winning full-brother Blutgang (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in 2017 and was not bred back.

Tapitsfly is a full-sister to the SP Flying Tipat (Tapit), while her second dam, the winning Fortunate Prospect mare Morning

Dove was a half-sister to SW & GSP Moonshine Hall (Spinning World) and MSW & GI Del Mar Invitational Oaks runner-up Malli Star (Baldski). The latter also found success as a broodmare in the Land of the Rising Sun, as she foaled the Japanese SW & G1SP Bella Rheia (Jpn) (Narita Top Road {Jpn}), who ran second in the Japanese Oaks, as well as the SP Mallos (Jpn) to the cover of Sunday Silence.

Gainesway Farm’s Tapit has 36 black-type winners as a broodmare sire so far, with Gran Alegria one of two Group 1 winners alongside G1 South Australian Derby heroine Qafila (Aus) (Not a Single Doubt {Jpn}).

CAMBRIDGE STUD APPOINTS DEVICICH TO KEY ROLE



Marc Devcich | Cambridge Stud

Marc Devcich has realised a long-held ambition to work at Cambridge Stud, but never imagined it would be in the role as general manager of the showpiece New Zealand nursery.

Devcich has been appointed to the key position at Cambridge Stud and a role vacated by the resignation in March of Marcus Corban, who left after a near four decade-long association to pursue other opportunities.

For Devcich, it is a dream come true and one he has aspired to since his school days when he first became involved in the Thoroughbred industry and a career path that he has followed ever since.

“I didn’t think I’d ever get to this stage of my life where I’d be managing a farm like Cambridge Stud. I remember when I first got into the industry and I always wanted to work at Cambridge Stud, but for one reason or another never got there,” Devcich said. “It’s funny how things can turn out. It’s exciting and a real privilege to be General Manager at Cambridge Stud. It’s an iconic farm and obviously a world-renowned nursery, I’m really looking forward to it.”

Devcich will take up his new role at the Brendan and Jo Lindsay-owned operation on June 15.

Chief Executive Henry Plumtre said Devcich was a great fit for Cambridge Stud.

“I have known Marc and Sarah for 25 years and they are a quality couple. Marc is exactly the right person for Cambridge Stud. “He has a great reputation and the experience we need. He has run a successful business himself and understands the fundamentals of running a stud farm properly.”

A Great Fit

Devcich, 47, said he was very much looking forward to his new role.

“Obviously, it’s a bit daunting going into a different position, but it has come at the right time of my life,” he said. “I have experienced a lot and seen a lot. I’ve met some wonderful people and I’ve been fortunate to have worked under some great horsemen and had a number of great mentors.

“It’s moulded and prepared me well for this and it’s exciting. It’s a great industry, I love horses and all the great people involved.”

Devcich and his wife Sarah own and operate nearby Henley Park, a successful and respected agistment and sale preparation operation and there will be no change in the quality of service provided there.

“Sarah will run it and it will be business as usual. Nothing will change with the business model at Henley, apart from me not being there and I’ll be dedicated to the Cambridge Stud brand,” he said. “Sarah is more than capable--I’ve only been her assistant for 10 years.”

His Cambridge Stud brief is a wide-ranging one and he’s ready to take up the challenge.

“I will oversee the farm, the day-to-day operation, organising staff and employment and keeping an eye on everything, including the farm at Karaka,” Devcich said.

He grew up on a dairy farm, but his early life was touched by a family connection to the Thoroughbred industry.

“Both my grandfathers raced horses with a little bit of success and I picked up on racing through that. I used to work in the school holidays for Highview Stud and I wanted to be involved with horses from then,” Devcich said. “When I finished high school I was given an opportunity to work at Highview full-time by Brent Gillovic, which involved everything to do with the stud side of things--breeding and yearling preps and horse husbandry.

“He also gave me an opportunity in the breeding shed to handle the stallions. It gave me a lot of experience at a young age and I loved it.

“Thankfully, it all worked out well for me and Brent was kind enough to organise a job for me at Segenhoe in the off-season. Duncan Grimley was running the operation then and I did a yearling prep there.”

Return to Australia

Devcich had no sooner returned home before Australia came calling again in the early 1990s.

“I got offered a job by Widden Stud so I went over and stayed there for four years. That’s when they had Marscay, Bletchingly and Vain,” he said. “It was an invaluable experience and a great grounding for me. “There was always plenty to do and I was fortunate to do a horse management course when I was there. I was busy and so involved with the horses and if I wasn’t working I would be at the races.

“There were some great horses raised there, the dam of Schillaci was there and Widden sold horses like March Hare and Sydney’s Dream, the dam of Charge Forward. “They were great times and working with the sort of bloodstock Widden had and the calibre of horsemen was really enjoyable and I learned so much.

“Steve Irwin, who is in charge of the yearlings at Arrowfield was there and so was Tas Riley, who has his own farm now at Mornington, Dave Collison ran the Darley arm in Victoria and I worked with internationals like the successful bloodstock agent Dermot Farrington.”

American Experience

Devcich returned to a stint managing the yearling operation at Highview before he again headed offshore.

“I went to America for six months to Dixiana Farm, a boutique operation in Kentucky, and did a breeding season there. They had Mr. Greeley and I really enjoyed that and got to go to the Saratoga Sales and Fasig-Tipton and the Kentucky Derby,” he said. “I foaled down an English Derby winner called Benny The Dip while I was at Dixiana and that was quite a highlight.

“It was another great experience and I picked up a lot of knowledge along the way.”

Devcich returned home for another stint at Highview and met his future wife Sarah, who was then working at Curraghmore Stud.

“A friend of mine had mentioned to the Schick family about a young couple who might be worth employing to manage Mapperley Stud, a 450-acre property, and we were fortunate enough to get the job and did that for eight years,” he said. “It was a big farm and up to 350 horses and we managed them and the yearlings and broodmares and sold under the Mapperley banner.

“We had some great horses come off there, four or five Group 1 winners and 20-odd stakes winners. It was a wonderful part of our career.”

The couple then moved to manage Windsor Park’s Halidon Hill, a 300-acre property utilised for spelling racehorses, wintering in-foal mares, growing out yearlings and for broodmares and foals over the later months of the breeding season.

“We did that for about three or four years before the yearling manager’s job at Windsor Park came up and I did that for six years,” Devcich said.

In 2008, they purchased a 30-acre property then known as Ashwell Farm to establish Henley Park with the subsequent addition of another 30 acres.

“It’s been a good business venture for us and we’ve raised horses such as Dundee and Bonneval and we bred Norzita and sold her through Windsor Park,” Devcich said. “We sold Midnight Oil under Henley and she won an Oaks and Hong Kong champion miler Beauty Flash.”

And so now on to Cambridge Stud for Devcich, who is appreciative of the opportunity afforded to him by the Lindsays and Plumptre.

“I’m delighted and looking forward to working with such a dedicated and passionate team of people,” he said.





DERBY DREAMING WITH DARLEY'S STREET SENSE



Watch Darley's Darren Fox talk Street Sense

A four-time Grade I winner in training at Santa Anita under Bob Baffert, an undefeated homebred Triple Crown hopeful, and a 2-year-old named a 'TDN Rising Star' after winning on debut by almost nine lengths.

This year, **Street Sense** is a stallion sale manager's dream. The champion juvenile and GI Kentucky Derby winner's race record speaks for itself, but now his top progeny are looking to make this their sire's biggest year yet.

Street Sense spent a year in Japan in 2013 after starting off his first five years at stud at his home base at Jonabell Farm. But Darley Sales Manager Darren Fox said that the son of Street Cry (Ire) was quickly returned to the States when his early performers started making headlines.

"He spent one season in Japan to cover Sheik Mohammed's own mares as well as the Darley Japan's clients' mares," Fox said. "But as soon as he arrived there, he got as hot as a pistol back in the United States and was quickly brought back here. He has just gone from strength to strength since his return."

Street Sense's leading performer to date came from that first crop upon his 2014 return. **McKinzie** burst onto the scene as a 2-year-old, winning the GI Los Alamitos Cash Call Futurity. He added two more Grade I victories at three in the Pennsylvania Derby and the Malibu S. before taking the **GI Whitney S.** last year at four. BOUND FOR CLEMENT STABLE, 10 HORSES PERISH IN TRAILER FIRE by Bill Finley

A Sallee van en route from Florida to trainer Christophe Clement's stable at Belmont Park crashed early Sunday morning on the New Jersey Turnpike. According to reports, 10 horses died in the fire.

Clement confirmed the accident on his twitter feed. His post read: "This morning we learned from Sallee that a van carrying horses to our barn in NY caught on fire. We understand both drivers were admitted to hospital, and that all horses have passed. We are all devastated by the news and heartbroken-- we are working to understand what happened."

Clement did not announce the names of the horses involved. West Point Thoroughbreds later tweeted that two of its runners, Tampa Bay Downs debut-winning sophomore filly Hot Mist (Tonalist) and \$375,000 yearling purchase Under the Oaks (American Pharoah), were among those on the trailer. **Cont. p5**

MCKINZIE BACK TO WINNING WAYS AT SANTA ANITA

It's been an up-and-down stretch of late for the Bob Baffert barn, but the classy 'TDN Rising Star' McKinzie (Street Sense) finished the week on a high note for the Hall of Famer.

“McKinzie was a hugely important horse for Street Sense,” Fox said. “He really got the Street Sense train rolling again as a member of that first crop back from Japan. As a four-time Grade I winner of some of the most prestigious races in the country, he was certainly an announcement of what this horse can do as a sire.”

Another Street Sense colt wouldn't let McKinzie steal all of last year's hype for the sire. Maxfield broke his maiden on debut just weeks after McKinzie's romp in the Whitney, and then the juvenile went on to claim the **GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity** by over five lengths.

“I was able to watch Maxfield work late in his 2-year-old season,” Fox said. “And what struck me about him at that point was that for such a big, leggy, framey-type horse, when you watched him work he was so efficient and so light on his feet. He covered the ground deceptively well.”

The Godolphin-raced colt was considered to be one of the favorites going into the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but a chip kept him from reaching the starting gate in November.

After returning to the Walsh barn early this year, Maxfield came back by storm last month when he took the **GIII Matt Winn S.** at Churchill Downs.

“He encountered a little more hustle and bustle throughout that race,” Fox said. “So he certainly learned a lot from that experience. He's an exciting horse for us and for Street Sense.”

Maxfield remains in training with Brendan Walsh, looking to make his bid in the upcoming Triple Crown season. His connections can only hope he is able to emulate a sophomore season similar to that of his sire's.

After being named champion 2-year-old the year before, ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ Street Sense returned to Churchill Downs to take the 2007 Kentucky Derby from a field that included several other eventual notable sires in Hard Spun (Danzig), Curlin (Smart Strike) and Scat Daddy (Johannesburg). The victory made him the first horse in history to complete the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Kentucky Derby double, an honor he now shares only with fellow Darley sire Nyquist (Uncle Mo).

Street Sense rounded out his career with two more wins--in the GII Jim Dandy S. followed by the GI Travers S.--giving him additional bragging rights as the only horse of this century to complete the Kentucky Derby and Travers double.

The \$4-million dollar earner moved into the same stud barn as his sire upon retirement in 2008 with a \$75,000 stud fee.

“We have a rich history with this sire line,” Fox said. “Street Cry was very near and dear to our hearts here at Jonabell. He is a son of Machiavellian, who stood for Sheik Mohammed's farm in Dalham Hall. Street Cry was an exceptional sire with 23 individual Grade I/Group 1 winners.”

From the beginning, Fox said that Street Sense has thrown a horse reflective of his sire line's mold.

“Physically, he tends to replicate himself,” he said. “If you have a mare who needs leg or some size and scope, he's certainly the man for the job. He just gets an athletic, two-turn type horse. He's also a very easy horse to breed to in that he's receptive to pretty much every sire line out there.”

Out of the Dixieland Band mare Bedazzle, Street Sense hails from the same family as that of graded stakes winner and influential sire Mr. Greeley (Gone West).

With a stud fee of \$75,000 this year, he's also starting to garner attention as a broodmare sire with eight stakes winner to his credit including the Group 1 winner Roaring Lion (Kitten's Joy). **Cont. p4**

As his influence on both sides of the pedigree grows, demand for his progeny in the sales ring continues to increase, with a \$171,000 yearling average in 2019.

With the current group of Street Sense runners in training this year, it could appear as though there's no place for that number to go but upwards.

One of the first 'TDN Rising Star' 2-year-olds of the year, **Cazadero** is a Street Sense homebred for Stonestreet Stables. The Asmussen trainee broke his maiden on debut by almost nine lengths, scoring an 81 Beyer Speed Figure on May 29.

And, of course, there's still Maxfield. The Godolphin organization is keeping close tabs on the colt that could give them their first Kentucky Derby title.

“It would be such a major coup for everyone involved, for the sire and the home team” Fox said. “Maxfield is Darley through and through, by a Darley sire and his dam is also a homebred. Everyone is Derby dreaming at this stage, but it’s certainly very exciting to be able to dream right now.”

Sallee issued a statement, which read: “This morning at approximately 3:15 a.m., our truck and trailer traveling from Florida to New York caught fire. While our drivers attempted to rescue the horses, it was not possible. Both drivers have been taken to the hospital, one driver has been released and the other is being treated for smoke inhalation. Two horses escaped, one died outside the van, and the other had to be humanely put to sleep. We are working with the State police to find out the cause, and will stay in touch. We are sorry for what has happened.”

Sallee President/CEO Nicole Pieratt said that because the investigation was ongoing, she could not comment further on the accident.

According to nbcphiladelphia.com, the trailer, which was traveling northbound on the Turnpike, hit a concrete divider. The accident occurred in East Windsor Township, which is near Trenton.

‘HONOR’ SYSTEM PRODUCES PAIR OF STRONG BI-COASTAL STAKES WINS

The Week in Review, by T.D. Thornton

In a non-pandemic world, this column would be wrapping up the just-concluded Triple Crown, and top-level graded stakes racing in America would be going into that early-summer lull between the spring Classics and the July openings of Saratoga and Del Mar.

But this is the new normal imposed by COVID-19, and one of the post-lockdown perks it provides is that elite-level on-track action is just now starting to heat up.

Belmont Park’s stakes-centric card on Saturday dovetailed nicely into Santa Anita’s gauntlet of graded races, and top honors for best performance on each coast went to—fittingly—the “Honor” horses.

The patient, grind-down, layoff victory by **Code of Honor** (Noble Mission {GB}) in the GIII Westchester S. stamped last year’s GI Runhappy Travers S. victor as a formidable East Coast dirt router in his 4-year-old debut.

And in California, a similarly styled closing kick by **Honor A.P.** (Honor Code) in the GI Runhappy Santa Anita Derby cemented his status as a sophomore powerhouse whose long-term potential is only eclipsed right now by his long, ground-devouring stride.

Back in Action in New York

Away since a seventh-place run in last year’s Breeders’ Cup Classic, Code of Honor’s favored (1.25-1) comeback came amid a sudden cloudburst that rendered Belmont Park’s main track muddy for the 1 1/16 miles Westchester.

The race unfolded in tactically entertaining fashion as second favorite **Endorsed** (Medaglia d’Oro) seized the lead assertively at the half-mile pole with a back-of-the-pack run up an open rail, while Code of Honor took the overland route, advancing methodically under his own power.

The two peeled off from the pack for their own private stretch duel, with the heart of the fight coming between the eighth and sixteenth poles, and Code of Honor edging away incrementally thereafter for a half-length win.

Although the Westchester provided the most aesthetically satisfying stakes finish of the afternoon at Belmont, it wasn’t the feature on the card by graded ranking. That distinction went to the seven-furlong GI Runhappy Carter H., won emphatically by 1.65-1 favorite **Vekoma** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who romped by 7 1/4 lengths against a respectable field.

Vekoma is in the midst of his own comeback—he’s now two races back from a 13th-place drubbing in last year’s GI Kentucky Derby. Now that he’s four-for-four in one-turn races, middle distances are emerging as his obvious sweet spot.

The turf stakes at Belmont on Saturday? Trainer Chad Brown absolutely dominated them.

His trainees ran one-two in the GII Fort Marcy S. over nine furlongs with **Instilled Regard** (Arch) on top. Then Brown saddled the first four finishers of the GIII Intercontinental S. over seven furlongs, with **‘TDN Rising Star’ Newspaperofrecord** (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) keying the superfecta.

For good measure, Brown also won Saturday’s maiden special weight nightcap on the grass.

New post time for Santa Anita: Santa Anita Park announced Sunday that it will shift its first post time for the remainder of its meet (June 12 through June 21) from 12:30 p.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Meanwhile, on the Left Coast...

Honor A. P. emerged from his 2 3/4-length Santa Anita Derby score as the clear West Coast kingpin in the sophomore division.

Authentic (Into Mischief), the 1-2 favorite, did himself no favors by breaking flat-footed and outward, straying about three paths to the right of his outermost starting stall before righting himself to contest the pace while parked three wide into the clubhouse turn.

Authentic sparred for a share of the lead behind a pair of longshot pacemakers while Honor A.P., the 2-1 second choice, never let him out of his striking sights for the backstretch run of the nine-furlong test, staying in the clear and well outside of horses.

As the pack tightened into the far turn, Authentic again gave up real estate, but Honor A.P. loomed even wider, commencing his bid 3 1/2 furlongs out but not truly winding up until five-sixteenths out. His four-wide sweep into the stretch put him over the top three-sixteenths from the wire, and the ridgling determinedly ramped up the pressure through the stretch while not overly extending himself.

Honor A.P.’s win is best described as a blunt-force show of power rather than a lightning-in-a-bottle display of brilliance. Like older counterpart Code of Honor on the East Coast, he is to be feared as the distances increase in future stakes engagements.

The heavy favorites delivered as expected in the 1 1/4-mile GI Hollywood Gold Cup and 1 1/16-mile GII Santa Anita Oaks. But both winners faced little in the way of serious competition in those short-field (six and four entrants, respectively) stakes.



'TDN Rising Star' Improbable (City Zip) stalked the pace and opened up at will to win the Gold Cup by 3 1/4 lengths at 1.3-1 odds.

Swiss Skydiver (Daredevil) easily wired the Oaks by four lengths at 3-5 for her third consecutive victory at her third different track. Gone are the days when you could bet her at 9-1 and 16-1, like in her previous two tallies at Gulfstream and Oaklawn.

It would be a fair question to ask whether or not we saw the GI Kentucky Derby winner on Saturday at Santa Anita. But it would be equally reasonable to wonder if that potential future superstar might not be **Cezanne** (Curlin), the \$3.65-million Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream topper who was unveiled as a 2 1/4-length winner at 2-5 odds in a maiden special weight. He was just nominated to the Triple Crown last week at the revised second deadline for the series.

Named after the 19th-century French painter Paul Cezanne, the Bob Baffert trainee broke okay, was asked to pick up the pace to engage the frontrunners, and shifted outward to the two path soon after clearing the gap at the 6 1/2-furlong start point.

Cezanne was always in the hunt and under pressure in a four-way go for the lead through legit splits. He hit the top coming off the turn, wandered slightly outward, got a couple of right-handed reminders to stay focused, then opened up to win by a measured 2 1/4 lengths.

What's in a Name?

Watching jockeys soar through the homestretch wearing protective face masks in front of empty grandstands should be enough of a reminder that America's racetracks are operating in the midst of a pandemic. But in case you need further reinforcement that the COVID-19 crisis is a part of our social fabric, the first wave of coronavirus-related Thoroughbred names is just now hitting the entries in the form of 2-year-olds.

Herd Immunity (Union Rags) won his five-furlong debut at Santa Anita on Saturday as the 3-5 chalk. The term is a descriptor for when most of a population is immune to an infectious disease, and it's been increasingly cited as a goal for the global overcoming of COVID-19.

Last Wednesday, on the first day of the season at Belmont, juvenile colt **Fauci** (Malibu Moon) ran second as the beaten favorite in his first start. He's named in honor of Dr. Anthony Fauci, the director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases.

Self Isolation (Square Eddie) ran third on May 17 in her 2-year-old Santa Anita debut.

Social Distancing, **Flatten the Curve**, and **No Spectators** are all in the pipeline as registered names according to *Associated Press*, although none of those horses yet appear in the Equibase database.

It's been an up-and-down stretch of late for the Bob Baffert barn, but the classy '**TDN Rising Star**' McKinzie finished the week on a high note for the Hall of Famer. Making his first start since an 11th-place finish in the G1 Saudi Cup Feb. 29, and first over track and trip since he romped in the 2018 GI Malibu S., the bay settled in widest and last of a compact field as stablemate Ax Man (Misremembered) showed the way. Given his cue to inch closer into a :46.13 half, the heavy chalk wore down stubborn Fashionably Fast by midstretch and required only hands-and-heels encouragement from there to lengthen his advantage.

"The wonderful thing about McKinzie is he had me in the game early and I mean he was ready to pounce at all times," said pilot Mike Smith, who had ridden McKinzie in his first 13 starts. "He is not only extremely talented, he's a thinker too and I just love riding him... He will be a different horse, sometimes he'll be close to the lead, next time he may be way back, so you're

always trying to figure him out... He's one of those throwback champions. They could run five eighths of a mile or a mile and a quarter. He just seems to be able to do it all. It is just amazing some horses can do something like that."

A 5 1/2-length debut winner in his only other attempt at seven panels, McKinzie racked up Grade I scores at two, three and four after shipping East to take Saratoga's GI Whitney H. last August. He was second in both the local nine-furlong GI Awesome Again S. Sept. 28 and GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 2 before running in the first renewal of the world's richest race.

"This was a perfect out for him," said Baffert "He had a cozy post and he showed his class. It was workmanlike and this'll really move him up for next time. Yes, this was a prep for the [July 4 GI Runhappy Met Mile at Belmont]... We're happy he's back after that fiasco [in Saudi Arabia]. He's been looking really good training and in all of his works. It's great to have him back."

Baffert took Saturday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup with **Improbable** (City Zip) on the same day it was revealed that his leading GI Kentucky Derby contender **Charlatan** (Speightstown) would be forced to miss at least the Belmont with an ankle injury--his other top 3-year-old **Nadal** (Blame) was retired last week.

A number of conditioners were checking on their charges and plotting their next starts Sunday morning at Belmont following a strong card Saturday that included four graded stakes.

- Last year's GI Runhappy Travers and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup hero **Code of Honor** (Noble Mission {GB}) made a successful seasonal debut in the GIII Westchester S. and has Hall of Fame trainer **Shug McGaughey** weighing either the GI Runhappy Metropolitan H. July 4 or waiting for the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga for the W.S. Farish homebred. "He seems to be fine," McGaughey said. "He looked good [Saturday] after the race and he looked good this morning. I'll look at the Met Mile and see what the stakes schedule at Saratoga looks like. He had a very good winter and the time off really seemed to help him."

- GI Runhappy Carter H. romper **Vekoma** (Candy Ride {Arg}) could also contest the prestigious Met Mile. "He owned them, and it wasn't an easy race," said co-owner Randy Hill of last year's GII Toyota Blue Grass winner. "We're thinking about the Met Mile but the ultimate goal is the Breeders' Cup. [Trainer] George [Weaver] has done such a great job with this horse and whatever he says is what we'll end up doing. I thought he was a stallion prospect after he won the race at Keeneland last year but [Saturday]'s race made him even more valuable."
- MGISW **Mind Control** (Stay Thirsty), sixth in the Carter, will wait for the GI Alfred H. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga. "He didn't like the [sloppy] track," said trainer Greg Sacco. "He just didn't grab a hold of it and [rider John Velazquez] said he was spinning his wheels. He broke sharp and Johnny said he was going to track Vekoma, but when the running started, he just wouldn't pick up his feet."
- Four-time Eclipse Award-winning trainer Chad Brown had a

typically productive Saturday, making up the superfecta in the GIII Intercontinental S. led by '**TDN Rising Star**' **Newspaperofrecord (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}); the exacta in the GII Fort Marcy S. capped by **Instilled Regard** (Arch); and finished second in the Carter with **Network Effect** (Mark Valeski). Newspaperofrecord is likely for the June 27 GI Just a Game S.--where she could be joined by champion stablemate **Uni (GB)** (More Than Ready), while Instilled Regard could run back in the GI Manhattan S. July 4. **Rushing Fall** (More Than Ready), who annexed the GIII Beaugay S. on opening day Wednesday, will head to Keeneland for the GI Coolmore Jenny Wiley S. July 11.

On a tragic day for the Christophe Clement stable, Oak Bluff Stables' Therapist did his part to lift their spirits with a game victory in the First Defence S. Sunday at Belmont.

A dual stakes winner against open company as a 2-year-old in 2017, Therapist picked up three more black-type success at three and started his 4-year-old campaign with a score in the course-and-distance Elusive Quality S. last April. That was the last time he saw the winner's circle last year though, as he was third or fourth in his remaining five starts, most recently in a local optional claimer Oct. 25.

Off from the widest draw as the fifth choice in this 13-horse group, the chestnut stumbled a bit at the break and dropped back to travel in eighth behind splits of :22.42 and :45.52. Advancing five wide approaching the quarter pole, the gelding poked his head in front at the sixteenth pole and had to beat back a game inside challenge from Majestic Dunhill while drifting in a bit to prevail. Chad Brown import Flavius was a close third and had to steady on the wire. An inquiry was lodged into

the winner's herding in deep stretch, but the result was allowed to stand.

On the same day a fire **tragically killed 10 horses** on the way to joining the Christophe Clement barn, the Clement stable got some small solace with a pair of victories; Oak Bluff colorbearer Pandamom (Uncle Mo) broke her maiden earlier in the card for Clement.

"The horses have been running well and we won two races today for the same owner, Oak Bluff Stable," Clement said. "I thought Therapist ran a very game race. He really likes the seven-eighths.
