MARKET PROVES RESILIENT IN TIMONIUM



Tuesday's session topper, Hip 443 | Fasig-Tipton

TIMONIUM, MD - The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, delayed two months due to COVID-19, opened Monday with trepidation in the air, but the clouds of fear and doubt dissipated and, for two days at least, there was a feeling of a return to normalcy in the industry. The auction featured solid demand for horses at all levels and concluded with a remarkable 19.2% buy-back rate. "We had a terrific day Monday and I said I hoped and prayed that we could keep the momentum going and the RNA rate at a low or acceptable range," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "Overall, we are just thrilled with the activity that we've observed the last two days. I think it restores some confidence among our buyers and sellers. It proved to us that there remains a legitimate viable marketplace out there. The resiliency in the industry continues to be on display." At the conclusion of the sale, 303 horses sold for \$23,572,500. The average of \$77,797 fell 13.7% from last year's record-setting figure of \$90,104 and the median dipped 7% to \$40,000. But this is one year in which the success of the sale likely goes beyond the raw numbers. "When we started the process last week, there was fear in people's eyes," Browning said. "There was legitimate fear for their livelihoods. And if you look at them today, the fear has been transformed into relief. 'Thank God, I was able to sell horses.' It probably won't be the most lucrative year financially for many pinhookers, but I think the survival rate at the end of the day will be dramatically higher than many would have assumed 60 days ago." **Cont. p3**

DIVERSITY IN RACING: DESHAWN PARKER

He grew up on the racetrack, mainly at the old Latonia, spending many a morning and afternoon there with his father Daryl, who worked as a jockey agent, an exercise rider and a racing official. And everywhere he went, Deshawn Parker saw people just like him. Young, Black and eager to make a name for themselves in the sport. It was the '70s and the '80s and at whatever track you went to, the majority of backstretch workers were African Americans. Today, they make up a small fraction of a workforce that is dominated by Hispanics.

It's shocking," he said. "It went from being mainly all Black and now there aren't many Black people back there at all. Honestly, I have no clue why that is. I look at it and think about it every day, but I don't have an answer for you."

F-T Midlantic sale cont. from p1

The two-day sale was topped by a \$1.1-million son of Uncle Mo who sold to Michael Lund Petersen during Monday's opening session. Tuesday's session was topped by a colt by Candy Ride (Arg) who sold for \$875,000 to bloodstock agent Gary Young. The juvenile was consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stable.

"I think the market has been solid," Dunne said Tuesday. "All of the big buyers have been here and they've shopped it hard. We've had some [horses] that were disappointments, but we've had more that surpassed expectations."

Of the auction's success under difficult and uncertain conditions, Dunne said, "The thing about horse people is that we're eternal optimists, no matter what they throw in our faces. And you have to be because horses will try to disappoint you at every level. So you learn to roll with the punches pretty good. I think that's what we are seeing from everyone, from owners to agents and trainers, everybody is trying to make the most of it and trying to conduct their business like we're going to have a future. Which we will."

Consignor Cary Frommer enjoyed a standout auction, with 19 juveniles sold for \$2,396,000 and an average of \$126,105. Her consignment was led by a \$600,000 son of Flatter who sold Tuesday. The results made up for all the precautions and social distancing at the sales grounds this week.

"I can't be complaining about my mask right now," Frommer said with a laugh. "The market is definitely strong for the right horse. I am never surprised when a good horse brings a lot of money, but I am surprised when some of the horses you were worried about bring good prices. And that's what seems to be happening, at least with me."

The Midlantic sale had been originally scheduled for mid-May and its place on the calendar was in doubt as recently as Memorial Day. Browning gave credit to Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic team for the successful auction.

“I take my hat off to our team in the Maryland office,” Browning said. “There were days we didn’t know what we were going to do in a geographic area that was impacted by COVID more than we were in Kentucky. We really didn’t have a firm decision until right around Memorial Day that we would be able to have the sale and they’ve done a remarkable job. This sale was a testament to the hard work of Paget [Bennett], Penny [Woolley], Polly [Mooney] and Anna [Thorp].”

Candy Ride Colt Lights Up Midlantic Sale

Gary Young made the highest bid of Tuesday’s second session of the Midlantic sale, going to \$875,000 to acquire a colt by Candy Ride (Arg) (hip 443) from the Wavertree Stables consignment. Young was bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client, but the agent did say it was the same buyer for whom he acquired a colt by Not This Time (hip 1254) for \$1.35 million at the OBS Spring Sale.

“I knew we would have to pay for him and we did,” Young said. “I think he is a very good horse. We’re going to give him a couple months to recoup and then he’ll go to California and we’ll go from there.”

The seven-figure Not This Time colt has joined the Bob Baffert barn in Southern California and when asked about who would train hip 443, Young said, “It’s probably going to be a guy with white hair.”

The bay colt, who worked a furlong at last week’s under-tack preview in :10 1/5, is out of Causara (Giant’s Causeway), a daughter of graded winner Lady Belsara (Boundary).

Bred by Brian Kahn, the colt sold for \$215,000 as a weanling at the 2018 Keeneland November sale. He was purchased by Ron Fein’s Superfine Farms for \$175,000 at last year’s Fasig-Tipton October sale.

“The colt has been very well received all week,” said Wavertree’s Ciaran Dunne. “We thought earlier in the year he was one of the best colts we had on the farm, one of the better horses we’ve had in a while. He had a little setback which forced him to miss OBS March and we rerouted him to here. He is such a big colt we were worried coming up here how he would handle the racetrack and the turns, but obviously he did and he breezed really well. At the end of the shank, he’s always been a wonderful horse, so once you cross all the bridges you just have to sit back and watch.”

Fein was represented by his first seven-figure sale last year at the OBS Spring sale when selling a colt by Liam’s Map for \$1.2 million through the Wavertree consignment.

Flatter Colt Finds a Home on West Coast

Trainer Mark Glatt, acting on behalf of a new client, added a colt by Flatter to his stable when purchasing hip 360 for \$600,000 from Cary Frommer's consignment Tuesday in Timonium. Mike Machowsky handled the bidding on the phone.

"Mike did the in-person inspection," Glatt said. "Because of the move to Del Mar, I was not able to get back there for the sale this year. I have a new owner in the business and he was very much interested in the sale. I did all the homework here that I could and the colt passed Mike's physical evaluation. We decided to take a shot at him and fortunately we were able to get the horse."

The chestnut colt, who worked a furlong last week in :10 1/5, is out of the unraced Wildaboutshopping (Wildcat Heir) and is the unidentified buyer's first horse.

"He was just looking for a racehorse," Glatt said of his client.

"Something that looked like it had a lot of potential. He kind of left it up to me to search out certain numbers and he was looking himself--he had a friend of his who is familiar with the business. It kind of worked out because I sent him a list of numbers and it seemed like we all came to the same horse.

That's why we zeroed in on the Flatter colt."

Frommer was consigning the colt on behalf of his breeder, former Hobeau Farm manager Craig Wheeler. Hobeau Farm is responsible for the juvenile's second dam Shopping and Frommer sold that mare's son Trappe Shot (Tapit) for \$850,000 at the 2009 Midlantic sale as part of the historic farm's dispersal.

"I was nuts about him from the time he shipped in to me," Frommer said of the colt. "Barry Berkelhammer had him before he came into me, so he filled me in

and he was so laid back. He gained weight at the sale, nothing phased him. He was a fun horse to be around."

Also on behalf of Wheeler, Frommer sold a filly by Into Mischief (**hip 31**) for \$250,000 during Monday's first session of the sale.

Ellis Doubledowns for Templer

California trainer Ron Ellis has been busy shopping the juvenile sales for longtime owner Richard Templer's Doubledown Stable and made his second purchase of the Midlantic sale when going to \$375,000 to acquire a colt by Tiznow (**hip 296**) from Bobby Dodd's consignment Tuesday morning.

"I loved the way he moved," Ellis said of the bay colt. "He is bred to run long, but he worked fast (:10 1/5). "He checked all of the boxes as far as soundness, which is hard to do. I tried to buy his brother a couple of years ago, but we couldn't get close to him. So we got this one for a little better bargain."

Out of Tanglewood Tale (Tale of the Cat), the colt is a half-brother to 'TDN Rising Star' Tale of the Union (Union Rags), who Dodd pinhooked for \$925,000 at the Midlantic sale in 2018. Dodd and Brad Grady's Grand Oaks purchased that colt for \$90,000 at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. The team purchased the Tiznow colt for \$130,000 at that same sale in 2019.

"I didn't necessarily buy him because I had that horse. I really liked this horse," Dodd said. "It was really just a coincidence that I had the other horse."

Asked if there were similarities between the two colts, Dodd said, "They were both built the same. I really like Tiznow, but this horse doesn't look like a Tiznow. He's out of a Tale of the Cat mare and looks more like him."

Ellis purchased a colt by Union Rags (**hip 67**) for \$140,000 during Monday's first session of the Midlantic sale. At the OBS Spring, the trainer purchased three juveniles: a colt by Malibu Moon (**hip 971**) for \$200,000; a colt by Frosted (**hip 367**) for \$160,000; and a filly by Speightster (**hip 515**) for \$85,000.

Of the market in Timonium, Ellis said, "It's buyable. I think it's ok. I don't know when you pay \$375,000, you can say it's a bargain, but I've seen the market a lot stronger in other years."

Dodd agreed it's been a buyers' market, but taking uncertain global conditions into consideration, it has been strong enough for sellers.

"We have been doing ok," Dodd said. "I think this is a pretty good market if you have the right horse, but it's always that way. I think they are still discounted. I think this horse a year ago would have brought \$600,000 or \$700,000. So I feel like they are buying them at 50 cents on the dollar. But that's ok. We still make some money and we are out of the trap and got a little cheese. So we're happy."

Quick Turnaround Pays for McKathan

Kevin McKathan had high hopes when he brought a daughter of Dialed In over to work ahead of the OBS Spring Sale earlier this month, but the filly's breeze over the synthetic disappointed and the Ocala horsemen decided to scratch her from the auction and try again over the dirt track in Timonium. The juvenile (**hip 552**) duly delivered a :10 flat co-bullet work and sold for \$310,000 to Lauren Carlisle Tuesday.

"She worked in :10 1/5 down there [in Ocala], but I didn't think she handled the synthetic surface," McKathan said. "I really thought when I brought her over there, she'd be a :9 4/5. I was in love with her all year. So on the synthetic, she seemed to scramble, didn't start well, she was on the wrong lead. She just didn't look good or comfortable over it. In my mind, I knew I had the opportunity to bring her up here and let her showcase herself. Because at our home track, she had looked beautiful and that was not what I was seeing on the synthetic. That's why I took the shot and brought her up here."

There were just two weeks between sales, but McKathan was concerned about the quick turnaround.

“It did not concern, just knowing her, everything is so easy with her and she’s a good-minded horse,” he said. “Racehorses breeze every week anyway, it wasn’t like she needed the time. It wasn’t too much to bring her and breeze her, the travel and everything, she got over that really good. We were kind of easy on her up here.”

Out of Fall Fantasy (Menifee), the filly is a full-sister to GI Breeders’ Cup F/M Sprint runner-up Chalon. McKathan purchased her for \$165,000 at last year’s Keeneland September sale.

“I loved her as a yearling,” McKathan said. “She was a beautiful filly. She cost plenty of money. I believe the Jacksons were the underbidder on her as a yearling, so they made me pay for her. But I just loved her and with the pedigree I thought there was a little upside on her. So we took a shot and it worked out.”

The juvenile was consigned Tuesday by SBM Training and Sales.

“I am happy with it,” McKathan said of the result. “It was good money made by everyone. Anything can happen at sales, but in this kind of year, I feel like that was nice.”

Speightster Colt an Unexpected Pinhook Success for Trombetta

When Mike Trombetta purchased a colt by Speightster for \$25,000 at last year’s Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale, the plan was to race the youngster, but the trainer called an audible and returned the juvenile to the sales ring where he sold for \$130,000 Tuesday in Timonium. Consigned by Best a Luck Farm, [hip 528](#) is out of stakes winner Fancy Diamond (Eastern Echo) and worked a furlong last week in :10 1/5. He was purchased by High Point Bloodstock as agent for Irish Smith.

“I bought him to race, being a Maryland-bred, but he did well in Florida and the way things were going this year, to cover my bases, I thought I would put him in the sale and see how it goes,” Trombetta said. “He continued to progress so nicely, I figured we would go ahead and give it a try.”

Asked if he was happy with Tuesday’s result, Trombetta said, “Oh yes. Absolutely.”

He continued, “We race most of them, but once in a while, if you have the right individual, it’s nice to try to make a buck.”

Trombetta agreed there was plenty of uncertainty over what the market would be like in Timonium this week.

“I think everybody was worried, but I think it was better than most people thought it was going to be.”



While he can't answer why the demographics have changed so much, he is convinced that the absence of Blacks on the backstretch is a reason why there are so few African American jockeys today.

"I grew up on the racetrack and on the backside and that's why I became a jockey," said the 49-year-old veteran. "There were a lot of people back there who wanted to be a jockey and the backstretch is where they got their start. Now you don't have a lot of Black families on the backside anymore, so you don't have Blacks who want to be a jockey. You don't get many people who didn't grow up in racing who decide they want to be jockeys."

The history of Black riders in this country is well known. They dominated the sport in the 19th century. In the first Kentucky Derby, in 1875, 13 of the 15 riders in the field were Black. Since 1922, only two Blacks have had mounts in the race, Marlon St. Julien in 2000 and Kevin Krigger in 2013.

Today, there are other African American jockeys who have tasted success, but not many. Kendrick Carmouche won numerous riding titles at Parx and can usually be found in the top 10 in the standings at the NYRA tracks. C.J. McMahon rides first call for Karl Broberg at Evangeline Downs and Delta Downs, where he was the second leading rider at the 2019-2020 meet.

Parker would like to see an influx of new Black riders, but he doesn't see that happening. But, if a young African American were to come around, they couldn't find a better role model than Parker or his father. In 1986, Daryl Parker became a steward, the first African American in U.S. racing history to achieve that position. Deshawn was 16 at the time and, at 5-11, appeared to be too tall to be a jockey. But his father told him that if he finished high school he had his permission to be a rider.

The elder Parker has had to take some time off while battling cancer, but his son said he's doing well and should return to the stewards' stand soon. He works in Ohio at Thistledown and Mahoning Valley.

"I idolized him and always tried to learn from the way he did things," Parker said of his father.

Parker struggled, winning just 60 races total over his first five years of riding. But he kept improving and by the late '90s was an unstoppable force at Mountaineer Park. In 2010, he led all riders in the nation with 377 wins, becoming the first Black jockey to hold that title since 1895, when James "Soup" Perkins was the leading rider in the nation. He was again the leading rider in the nation in 2011. When Mountaineer cut back on its scheduled and lowered purses, Parker left in 2016.

He's currently the leading rider at Indiana Grand. Entering Tuesday's card there, he had won 5,728 races from 34,379 mounts. He's 22nd among all jockeys in lifetime wins and seventh among active riders.

He has become far more than just the best Black jockey in America.

"While it's an honor to be the all-time leading Black jockey, you definitely want people to look at you as a good jockey, period," he said. "You don't want to be categorized by your color or as just a good Black jockey. It's the same with a female or a Hispanic, most people just want to be known as a good jockey, period."

Does he feel that he might have done even better or made it to a top circuit if not for the fact that he is Black?

"Sometimes I think the color of my skin has held me back," he said. "I've never had anyone say anything racist to me to my face. I don't know what they are saying about me behind my back. But I'm not one to make excuses or find something to blame. If things aren't working out what I do is just try harder."

He is a popular veteran, well-liked in the jocks room.

"I might be blind to a lot of things, but what I do is treat everybody with respect," he said. "When I treat people with respect I expect the same in return. I always try to be polite and treat people the way I would like to be treated."

Though he has several more good years to come, Parker has

already set his goal for when he does retire. He wants to be a steward and envisions some day working alongside his father. If that happens, he will again be a rarity, an African American steward. He wishes there were dozens of Black stewards, but understands why that isn't the case.

"[African Americans] are not around the track as much as we used to be and I can't understand why," Parker said. "Back in the day, it was all Blacks back there, working hard and

busting their butts and looking to move up. Now, it's mainly Hispanic people. I don't know what happened or where all the Black people went. But when you don't have Blacks working in racing at any level, who is going to move up the ranks? You just don't have many Blacks on the backside or anywhere around the track anymore. It's a shame."

9-FOR-9 ASSINIBOIA DOWNS FILLY SEEKS PERFECT 10 IN CANADA DAY S.

Hidden Grace (Going Commando), a nine-for-nine Manitoba-bred, will seek a perfect 10th straight stakes victory in her 4-year-old debut Wednesday night in the \$25,000 Canada Day S. at Assiniboia Downs. Hidden Grace has raced exclusively in Manitoba (eight starts) and Alberta (one start), with five of her nine stakes victories coming against provincial-bred or sales-restricted company. Essentially, she has wrapped up every single one of her wins by the eighth pole, having never been headed in the stretch. Her breeder and owner partnerships are comprised of some of the same people who bred and raced the hard-trying overachiever Escape Clause (Going Commando). That mare retired last autumn with 20 wins and \$866,100 in earnings after emerging from small-circuit racing in Canada to win 2018 stakes at Del Mar and Santa Anita before losing only by a nose to the powerful Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute) in the 2019 GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn. **Cont. p11**

Hidden Grace is owned and was bred by Cam Ziprick, Charles Fouillard and Barry Arnason. As a yearling, Ziprick consigned her to the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society (Manitoba Division) sale, then bought her right back for \$11,919. This transaction made her eligible to compete in the stakes program for horses sold through that auction. In addition to her provincial- and sales-restricted stakes dominance, Hidden Grace

has also won four \$30,000 open stakes at Assiniboia. She's been off since October and will make her first start for a new trainer, Murray Duncan, after being previously trained by Michael Nault in 2019 and Don Schnell in 2018. Her main competition in Wednesday's second race, which is a 7 1/2-furlong open stakes, will come in the form of Miss Imperial (Maclean's Music), who is also conditioned by Duncan.

Miss Imperial sports an 8-for-18 record after stints in the barns of trainers Jason Servis, Joe Sharp, and Brad Cox on the New York, New Orleans, and Oaklawn circuits. She was claimed three times for decreasing prices between last August and this April (\$50,000, \$40,000, \$25,000), and it was Duncan who most recently dropped a slip for her at Oaklawn Apr. 11. Since shipping to Winnipeg, Miss Imperial has wired two open sprint stakes.



MAKING ENDS MEET

Much of the early part of the 2020 racing season has been uprooted, courtesy of the coronavirus pandemic, forcing many businesses into states of unexpected struggle and uncertainty. As a result, the flagging economy, coupled with the shutdown of racing at many tracks around the nation, left an indelible mark on many small equine-related businesses, many of whom have been shuttered or saw their trade fall off dramatically over the past months. With racing slowly resuming, albeit spectator-less, many businesses attempt to regain some traction as the industry ebbs toward a sense of normalcy. The TDN reaches out to small businesses in the racing industry and asks how the pandemic has affected their business and what are their plans to help expedite recovery.

COMPANY: THOROUGHBRED THREADS LLC

PRINCIPAL/OWNER: EVAN CIANNELLO

What prompted you to launch Thoroughbred Threads?

EC: After spending a lot of time at the racetrack, I noticed that mostly everyone wears a hat to proudly display their silks, farm or big horse. I also noticed there was a lot of room for improvement as far as the quality of these hats, so I started Thoroughbred Threads to offer an upgrade. Thoroughbred Threads offers high quality branded apparel and other promotional products catered to the Thoroughbred industry.

Can you tell us a little about your business model?

EC: I'm a big fan of giving back to the industry so we donate a

percentage of proceeds from every sale to Thoroughbred aftercare. After an encouraging first full year in business in 2018, our sales grew by over 150% in 2019 so there was a lot of optimism going into 2020. And then COVID-19 hit.

How did you deal with the coronavirus pandemic early on?

EC: Like other companies during the shutdown, I began making more calls and sending more e-mails just to stay top-of-mind for when the time did come when my customers were ready to start placing orders again.

Previously, our website had been used as a landing page for prospective customers to see what we're about as our orders are very detail-oriented and so we traditionally hadn't handled a lot of e-commerce, but we have recently been accommodating a few clients who wanted us to set up an online store to sell their branded products to their own clientele. It's something new for us, but we're always happy to learn new things and help make life easier for our clients. People are usually stocking up on polo shirts and lightweight hats and vests to wear on the backside or golf course in the spring time, but now they're looking for branded face masks and hand sanitizer. I'm very grateful for the manufacturers who are able to adapt in this sort of environment to meet this new demand.

How did the economic uncertainty impact your business?

EC: I knew sales would suffer during the early days of the pandemic when auctions and other events were canceled and many racetracks shut down overnight. You know it's pretty serious when Churchill Downs is willing to postpone the Kentucky Derby! With so much uncertainty on the calendar, it put ordering on hold as marketing departments had little to promote. For the others who were still operating, many had to make drastic cuts to their marketing budgets. Thankfully, now that more race meets are resuming and sales companies are announcing new sales dates, the phones have started ringing which is a very welcome sound.

Do you have advice to other small business owners on how to weather future storms?

EC: I am blessed to have had a few other sources of income which helped to weather the storm as I also co-manage a few racing/pinhooking partnerships and I'm also a sales rep for U.S. Compounding Veterinary Pharmacy. I know many other small businesses aren't as fortunate and my heart really does go out to them. Now that the stock market has bounced back in a huge way, hopefully there are a lot of people out there who are eager to get out and spend some money (especially on some horses or some nice swag for their barn)!

DONCASTER, UK—There aren't many bloodstock sales companies that can boast of an Irish auctioneer who can speak French with a Yorkshire accent but if you happen to walk in to the Goffs UK sales ring at Doncaster on Wednesday while Nick Nugent is on the rostrum that is what you're likely to find.

In the spirit of COVID-encouraged entente cordiale, the breeze-up sector finds itself in a situation few would have imagined at the start of this year, with British sales house Goffs UK and French-based Arqana holding their respective breeze-up sales effectively as one in England after the initial idea of staging them together in Ireland had to be scrapped owing to human quarantine issues.

This reporter hasn't been near a race meeting since the Cheltenham Festival in mid-March, but from the solitude of the press office at Goffs UK on Tuesday there was the dual benefit of being able to enjoy a flamboyant and bilingual Nugent rehearsal for the online bidding facility which will be in operation during both sales while watching the runners canter to post on the Town Moor right next door. Normality, almost.

There appeared to be a good flow of agents from Britain, Ireland and France around the sales grounds on Tuesday along with a smattering of, mostly young, English trainers such as George Boughey, Tom Clover, Charlie Fellowes and James Ferguson. [Cont. p2](#)

"I was talking to the lads [John Magnier, Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor] this morning and it looks like Love, **Passion (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Ennistymon (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will go to Epsom," said O'Brien. "Peaceful might go to the Diane. That's what we're thinking at the moment anyway. The Diane is worth a lot of money.

"I think it's a question of splitting them up--that's the way the lads are thinking at the moment and you can't blame them for that. The other two going to Epsom with Love are very good fillies. Eric Hoyeau added, "For the breeze-ups in particular, it is the beginning of the season and it was important to get this organised for the yearlings sales as well, to give a chance for the pinhookers to recover, so we took that very seriously."

Each sale originally had 165 2-year-olds catalogued to sell in their respective traditional slots in late April and early May but 120 of those have subsequently been withdrawn for various reasons, including private sales, leaving 210 to sell through the ring on Wednesday from 10 a.m.

A little over £5 million was accrued from the sale of 111 horses at 2019 Goffs UK Breeze-up, which registered an average of £45,570 and included the group-winning juveniles A'Ali (Ire) (Society Rock {Ire}) and Kenzai Warrior (Karakontie {Jpn}). Arqana meanwhile, which usually trades in euros, saw record turnover slightly in excess of €15 million, with 119 horses sold at an average of €129,798. The sale's top price of €1.1 million was given for Ocean Atlantique (American Pharoah), presented by Grove Stud. Winner of the Listed Prix des Suresnes for the Coolmore team and Andre Fabre, he is entered for Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey Club.

Tim Kent, who is now overseeing his second sale since succeeding Tony Williams at the head of Goffs UK, said, "There has been the feeling from everyone that we had to work together to make this happen and that is especially true for the vendors. They need to get some liquidity back into the market and they were very happy to work with us to get this going.

"Our agent in Scandinavia, Filip Zwicky, can't travel over so he's having a little lunch party tomorrow and getting potential buyers together to bid from there as every horse in the Goffs UK catalogue is eligible for the Scandinavian Classic series." [Cont. p4](#)

He concluded, "There's been a real sense of community, of everyone coming together and offering advice. Not seen since winning on debut over seven furlongs at this venue in August, her trainer is hoping for a bold show. "She's in great form and we look forward to getting her back and getting her started," he said. "I'm sure we can plan from there, but she's ready to start."

Tackling Ridenza are Ballydoyle's Irish 1000 Guineas third **So Wonderful** (War Front) and Qatar Racing's **Know It All (GB)** (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}), with the latter last seen finishing runner-up in the G3 Leopardstown Fillies Trial S. over seven furlongs June 9. In the Amethyst, Sinawann stays at a mile having finished sixth in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh June 12. Halford is keen on seeing if he can build on that encouraging comeback effort. "He's been in good form since his run in the Guineas and I'm very happy with him," he said. "This looks a nice race for him. He's come forward in his work at home."

SANTIAGO CAMP EYEING GOODWOOD CUP

G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby winner **Santiago (Ire)** (Authorized {Ire}) could clash with three-times G1 Ascot Gold Cup hero **Stradivarius (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in next month’s G1 Qatar Goodwood Cup. Victorious in the 14-furlong G2

Queen’s Vase at Royal Ascot, Santiago dropped back to a mile and a half at The Curragh just eight days later and fended off stablemate Tiger Moth (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to take the Classic honours.

Aidan O’Brien’s charge is the ante-post favourite for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September, but the Ballydoyle handler has raised the possibility of taking on John Gosden’s star stayer Stradivarius over two miles first.

Stradivarius joined an elite band when making it a Gold Cup hat-trick at Royal Ascot and will be bidding for a fourth Goodwood Cup win, having landed his first title as a 3-year-old in 2017.

O’Brien said, “It could be straight to the St Leger, but we have it in our head he could go to Goodwood—we’ll just see how he is between now and then. We’ll give him a week before we have a good chat with the lads (Coolmore), so it will be straight to Doncaster or the two-mile race at Goodwood.

“It will depend on what the lads want, but we’ve always thought he was a horse who would stay very well and he showed that at Ascot. At The Curragh you have to stay very well as well. We had other horses in, so we knew it would be a test.”

Group 3 winner **Berlin Tango (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), a George Strawbridge homebred, has been sold to Hong Kong, *Racing Post* reported on Tuesday. In the care of trainer Andrew Balding, the newly gelded bay won at second asking at Ffos Las last July and was third in both the Listed Stonehenge S. at Salisbury in August and Doncaster's Listed Flying Scotsman S. in September. He returned this March to fill the runner-up spot in the "Road to the Kentucky Derby" Conditions S. at Kempton before taking the G3 Unibet Classic Trial S. there on June 3. Berlin Tango was third in Royal Ascot's G3 Hampton Court S. on June 17.

"He's got the ideal profile for Hong Kong as he's got a mile and a quarter and fast ground form and has been really progressive for Andrew Balding," SackvilleDonald's Alastair Donald, who brokered the deal, told *Racing Post*. "His form is stacking up well and hopefully he will be an ideal Hong Kong Derby type. He's going to be going to Tony Cruz for a client of ours. He won't run again here and has already been gelded. He's currently chilling

out and getting over his exertions, hopefully to ship to Hong Kong in mid-August."

The fifth foal out of the Sadler's Wells mare Fantasia (GB), a winner of the G3 Prestige S. and second in the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile as a juvenile, Berlin Tango is also the third winner from his dam. Third in the G1 French 1000 Guineas and a winner of the G3 Nell Gwyn S. in the UK, Fantasia also landed the GIII Modesty H. Stateside and was runner-up in the GI Just a Game S. there. She is a half-sister to Irish Group 3 winner Pink Symphony (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and to the dam of the MGSW Western Hymn (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}). Berlin Tango's third dam is the European highweighted juvenile filly Blue Duster (Danzig), who won the G1 Cheveley Park S. in 1995.

GOFFS PREMIER YEARLING STAKES REVISED

Following consultation with York Racecourse and the Horsemen's Group, York's application to revise the conditions of the Goffs Premier Yearling S. has been approved, the British Horseracing Authority announced on Tuesday. Slated for Aug. 20 during the second day of the Welcome to Yorkshire Ebor Festival, the race's prize money has been reduced to £180,000, with the third and fourth stages of the race now notpayable. There will also be a partial refund made to owners of the first (£120) and second (£240) stage entrants. The remaining conditions of the race remain the same, with the next scratching deadline July 7 at noon.

"In what continues to be an extraordinary season, we have sought a collaborative approach to find an equitable solution," said York Racecourse Clerk of the Course William Derby. "We wanted to retain the status and relative high value of this race without appearing out of step with the reality of the COVID-19 crisis and resultant funding challenges for all. We feel this is a fair solution to ensure the race is run with six-figure prize money and our thanks go to the Horsemen, the team at BHA, as well as our sponsor, Goffs UK, for their support." 



THE ART OF THE BROODMARE PURCHASE



James Bester | Bronwen Healy

TDN AusNZ courted the opinions of a number of prolific mare buyers about their assessment criteria when sourcing broodmare prospects. Today, we bring you the first of a two-part series.

'What you see is what you will get' is an approach agent James Bester has long used to his advantage when purchasing broodmares.

"In my case, performance and physique come ahead of anything within reason. I tend to look for high-class race mares who have the sort of physique I want to see in my foals," Bester said.

"Of course, you get high-class race mares that can buck that trend and win Group 1s with what I would call compromised physiques, but I have no interest in such mares, irrespective of their race records, because black cats have black kittens.

"I want in my foals what that mare took to the racecourse. I am very, very particular about physique."

With the criteria met, Bester then looks to build on that with pedigree.

"When that is the base, I then want as much pedigree as possible. I am a huge believer in pedigree, but I don't want the ugly sister, the useless sister, of a good horse," he said.

"I make an exception in the case of an unraced or very lightly-raced animal if she has the physique I'm looking for and really deep in pedigree. If it looks like it should have been a Group 1 winner I dig deeper."

A shining example of that was his involvement in securing Atlantic Jewel (Fastnet Rock), who would go on to win four Group 1 events and a burgeoning career as a broodmare.

"When Demi O'Byrne bought Atlantic Jewel as a yearling her mother was a winner and nothing more. The mother only raced a few times," Bester said. "We had it on good authority from the mother's owner Lloyd Williams and that mare's rider Danny Nikolic that she was every bit as good as Efficient.

"It was unusual for Lloyd Williams to have a mare racing, but she was one. We looked into the dam so I will buy a mare without performance with a really strong pedigree if something went wrong and she should have been a Group 1 winner.

"I would rate Atlantic Jewel and Global Glamour as the best looking fillies I've bought for racing purposes. I can't think of any others that I had such strong feelings about."

A \$320,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale purchase, Atlantic Jewel's two foals to race are winners with Russian Emperor (Galileo {Ire}) successful in the G3 Royal Ascot Hampton Court S. and a leading contender for this weekend's G1 English Derby.

Bester was also part of a major broodmare success story when he had a hand in securing the Group 1 winner O'Marilyn (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}).

"She was a particularly good-looking individual that I bought in conjunction with Paul Moroney and Glen Harvey," Bester said. "She had outstanding physique and a deep, deep pedigree as a half-sister to Headturner and Anacheeva.

"She was purpose bought for Fastnet Rock, who appreciates quality, good head, refinement and athleticism in his mares. O'Marilyn offered that and her first foal by Fastnet Rock went through the ring at \$1.8 million and was bought by George Moore.

"The second foal went for \$600,000 and was bought by Katsumi Yoshida and the third foal made \$540,000 through the ring and bought by myself for a Coolmore syndicate.

"The fourth foal is by I Am Invincible and is every bit as good as the previous. When one gets it right and you have performance, physique and pedigree and correctly mate the mare to the stallion you have in mind and get the required product it comes together in a beautiful way."

More Mares on List

Yulong will this year launch the stallion careers of Group 1 winner Alabama Express while associate sire Grunt (NZ) will stand his second season and the Victorian operation is continuing to add to its broodmare band with them in mind.

“We try and get nice looking mares and those that have worked with similar sire lines previously to increase our chances,” Chief Operating Officer Sam Fairgray said. “Ideally, we like mares in foal for the first or second time and for Alabama Express, mares that have worked with the likes of Beneteau, Snitzel, Not A Single Doubt and Redoute’s Choice to increase the chances of producing a nice horse.

“We prefer to try and buy them in foal to a commercial stallion and also we’re keeping in the back of our minds that we’ll have Tagaloa at stud next year. This year there may be some good buying because next year the market could be stronger again.

“We’re still looking to buy more so we’ll go through those at Magic Millions and identify the ones that we think will suit them. We’ll probably go up to the Hunter and look at the ones that won’t be at the sale and go from there.”

Array of Factors

Bill Mitchell, who operates Mitchell Bloodstock with son James, said he took an array of factors into consideration when selecting broodmares.

“There’s type, size, what they are going to be mated with and we use G1 Goldmine system to make sure the matings are compatible with all the data that it brings to the table,” said Bill. “Then of course, we often find that clients have certain criteria. Often people pick out a number of mares and ask us to inspect them. We don’t have anything set in concrete and keep an open mind.”

Broodmare sires and race performance were other major factors and both influenced by budget.

“With the internet, everyone knows who the best broodmare sires and most of the leading stallions end up being the leading broodmare sires,” Mitchell said. “You can take more risk and go with a lesser known sire of a mare or something a bit less commercial and if you think she’s going to throw you a good type, you are probably going to get away with that.

“With regard to performance, it’s about how much you’ve got to spend—you can’t buy champagne with a beer budget. It’s about knowing value and understanding what things are worth.”

Mitchell enjoyed multiple Group 1 successes during his years as a trainer before he retired from that role in 2005 and since then has been working for private clients and as Racing Manager for Kevin Maloney’s Segenhoe stud.

In the latter role, one of Mitchell’s success stories has been Sister Madly (Redoute’s Choice), a half-sister to former Hong Kong champion Silent Witness (El Moxie {USA}).

She was purchased at the 2011 Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale out of Edinburgh Park’s draft for \$1 million. At that time, she had won at Group 3 level and subsequently added the G2 Salinger S. and the G3 How Now S. to her record.

“We paid a lot for her and she had four starts for us for two wins and two seconds and won about \$400,000 on the track. We got \$1.2 million for her first foal by Sepoy,” Mitchell said. “Segenhoe have made a lot of money out of her and she’s there for life. She’s got a daughter by Street Cry (Duessa), who only

won one race due to injury, and she’s a beautiful mare.

“Sister Madly’s one of those foundation mares and there will always be a few daughters hanging around at Segenhoe. She went to So You Think and missed so he’d start favourite again for her.”

Band Well-stocked

Dean Hawthorne manages the extensive bloodstock portfolio of prominent breeder and owner Jonathan Munz, who has holdings in

recently retired stallions Castelvechio and Super Seth.

While Munz has a broodmare band of nearly 100, he hasn’t ruled out adding to the tally.

“We’re pretty well placed because we’ve been accumulating mares for the last five years and we’ve got enough mares that haven’t got Danehill or Sadler’s Wells in their pedigrees to go to Super Seth,” Hawthorne said. “Of course, with Castelvechio not having Danehill in his blood we’ve got enough mares to send to him as well. We weren’t expecting both of them to go to stud in the same year, but we’ve got enough mares to give them good starts.

“I won’t be able to get to the Gold Coast Broodmare Sale I wouldn’t think, which I find strange given soccer teams and that can go and play sport and we can’t go and do our business. It’s disappointing, but the way it is.

“We will be looking though, whether I do the work or we put someone in place there I’m not sure yet. We’ve also got a leg in King’s Legacy as well, so we’ll be looking ahead for quality mares for him.”

Munz’s broodmare band features a number of seven figure purchases, among them The Broken Shore (Hussonet {USA}). She was secured for \$1.9 million from the Teeley Dispersal Sale when carrying subsequent three-time Group 1 winner Shoals.

As a half-sister to the four-time Group 1 winner and champion sire Redoute’s Choice and in foal to Fastnet Rock, The Broken Shore had obvious broodmare appeal and so it proved in the auction ring.

Shoals’ brother Groundswell, a winner and Group 1-placed in the Caulfield Guineas, is the only offspring to be offered so far and he sold for \$2.3 million to Anthony Freedman Racing at the Inglis Australian Yearling Sale.

“Another one of the best mares we’ve purchased was Miss Sharapova, about the same time we bought The Broken Shore. She was fourth in the G1 New Zealand Oaks and third in the G3 Lowland S. and had a nice pedigree,” Hawthorne said. “A relation, Villa Verde, was going well at the time and sold as a broodmare for \$1 million. Miss Sharapova has been an absolute gem of a mare and a fantastic type.

“She’d be in the top 10 broodmares in Australia for sale ring receipts. She produced this season’s G3 Kindergarten S. winner Domeland and he made \$1.1 million as a yearling.”

Physique is paramount, but not necessarily performance as evident with the purchase from Widden Stud’s draft of the non-winner Purely Spectacular (NZ) (Pins) at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

“Purely Spectacular was a mare I paid \$300,000 for and she’d left Stratum Star, who wasn’t a Group 1 winner at the time, and went on to win three of them. These mares don’t really have anything in common,” Hawthorne said.

Her son Prague (Redoute’s Choice) ensured a tasty return on investment when he sold for \$1.6 million at the Gold Coast last year and has won twice at Group 3 level this season and been Group 1 placed.

“We’ve got mares that we’ve bred and if they leave good types year in year out then we will hang on to them, type always sells even if they are lower grade sales,” Hawthorne said. “Now we have the volume we really only target top end mares if they suit our stallions and the quality we have bought as yearlings are coming through as well. We always buy with residual value in mind.”
