Goffs UK has released the catalogue for its Doncaster Premier Sale, with 423 yearlings set to go under the hammer on Sept. 1 and 2. The sale has already enjoyed a fruitful 2020, with Golden Horde (GB) (Lethal Force {Ire}) following on from fellow sale graduate Advertise (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) in winning the G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot and The Lir Jet (Ire) (Prince of Lir {Ire}) making it back-to-back wins for the sale in the G2 Norfolk S., with A'Ali (Ire) (Society Rock {Ire}) having taken that prize in 2019. Graduate Barney Roy (GB) (Excelebration {Ire}) has won two Group 1s this year, while group-winning juveniles Supremacy (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}), Cairn Gorm (GB) (Bated Breath {GB}) and Ventura Tormenta (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) were also sourced at the sale.

The latter's half-brother by Starspangledbanner (Aus) (lot 313) is among this year's offerings at the Premier Sale. Other highlights on paper include a colt by Invincible Spirit (Ire) out of G3 Firth of Clyde S. victress Distinctive (GB) (Tobougg {GB}) (lot 173) and a filly by the same sire out of G1 Nassau S. winner Favourable Terms (GB) (Selkirk) (lot 206); a No Nay Never filly out of a half-sister to Equiano (Fr) (lot 195); a Cotai Glory (GB) half-sister to A'Ali (lot 322); and a full-brother to G3 Hackwood S. winner Yafta (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}) (lot 423).

APPLEBY, BIN SUROOR TO SWERVE MELBOURNE

Godolphin's Newmarket-based trainers Charlie Appleby and Saeed bin Suroor have informed Racing Victoria that they will not send horses to this year's Melbourne spring carnival amid the coronavirus pandemic.

Both trainers have enjoyed success at the carnival as of late; Charlie Appleby won the 2018 G1 Melbourne Cup with Cross Counter (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}), while bin Suroor has saddled three runners up in the great race while Benbatl (GB) won the G1 Ladbrokes S. in 2018 and was second to Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G1 Cox Plate. The Australian state of Victoria has seen a surge in COVID-19 cases as of late.

"Both Saeed and Charlie have advised over the last few days that they won't be coming to Melbourne this year," Racing Victoria General Manager of International Operations Paul Bloodworth told Racing.com.

“Charlie Appleby advised last night that because of the change to Stage 4 restrictions, he wasn’t comfortable sending his staff to Melbourne and Saeed has also advised he won’t be coming.

“It’s a great shame. Saeed has been a regular in Australia for 30 years and Charlie certainly over the last five or six years, so it’s a shame they won’t be able to compete.”

Plenty of other European-based trainers have engaged runners in the spring features—Aidan, Joseph and Donnacha O’Brien between them field 22 of the 182 entries for the Cox Plate on Oct. 24—but restrictions on staff travel into the country could yet scupper those plans.

SCEPTICAL SUFFERS FATAL INJURY

Rags to riches sprinter **Sceptical (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}–Jealous Again, by Trippi), a listed winner and twice Group 1-placed this season, died on Tuesday morning after suffering a fatal injury on the gallops.

Trainer **Denis Hogan** tweeted, “We have been dealt a devastating cruel blow at Boherna this morning with the loss of our superstar sprinter Sceptical.”

“He was a horse of a lifetime and a game changer for my training career and everyone at Boherna.”

Bred by Godolphin out of the G2 Queen Mary S. winner Jealous Again, Sceptical was sold by that operation as an unraced 3-year-old at the Goffs UK August Sale last year for £2,800 to James McAuley. He won at second asking for Hogan at Dundalk in November and had won his first three starts this season—including the Listed Woodlands S. at Naas on June 8—before finishing third, beaten a half length, as the favourite in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and second in the G1 Darley July Cup. Sceptical had been due to run in the G3 Rathasker Stud Phoenix Sprint S. at The Curragh this weekend.

Sceptical was raced by McAuley with Hilltop Racing, which tweeted, “We had a terrible tragedy this morning as Sceptical was fatally injured on the gallops. He was an amazing horse for us and we’ll remember all the great days we enjoyed with him. We’d like to thank [Hogan and jockey Joey Sheridan] and all the staff and we feel so sad for everyone.”

VENTURA TORMENTA ADDED TO PHOENIX

Middleham Park Racing’s G2 Prix Robert Papin winner **Ventura Tormenta (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) was one of four supplementary entries on Tuesday to Sunday’s G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. at The Curragh. He was joined, as expected, by G3 Molecomb S. winner **Steel Bull (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}) as well as the G2 Airlie Stud S. winner **Aloha Star (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) and the Aidan O’Brien-trained winner **Giorgio Vasari (Ire)** (Air Force Blue).

Ventura Tormenta will be re-opposing The Lir Jet (Ire) (Prince Of Lir {Ire}), who he beat by a head in the Papin. The Lir Jet finished ahead of Ventura Tormenta when winning the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot.

“Middleham Park were keen to take the race on because the Morny was already looking over-subscribed,” said Ventura Tormenta’s trainer Richard Hannon. “I think this was a good opportunity for the horse to have a crack at a Group 1. He has come back from France well and has never looked better. He has put on weight and the whole experience of France will have done his confidence a lot of good. I think the track at The Curragh will suit him and he is a very straightforward horse. I think he is joint top-rated going into the race and we are looking forward to seeing what he can do. He will be renewing his rivalry with The Lir Jet, which will be a challenge, while there will be some other nice horses in there, which you expect at this level.”

RACING WELFARE NEWMARKET HEATH RIDE RETURNS

The Newmarket Heath Ride is scheduled for Sept. 6, Racing Welfare announced on Tuesday. The charity fundraiser will be the first in-person event since the coronavirus pandemic began. Entries will open on Aug. 10, with a 150-rider limit and close on Aug. 31. The sponsored ride starts and finishes at Newmarket's July Course and offers participants rides over eight, 15 or 20-mile routes. Made possible by the kind permission of The National Stud, Newmarket Racecourses, and Jockey Club Estates, the event offers a unique opportunity to ride over Newmarket's training grounds, utilising the town's network of horse-walks. In the case of the longer routes, they emerge at the base of Warren Hill. The 20-mile course also offers the Al Bahathri all-weather gallop along the way. Entries are £20 and riders are required to raise a minimum of £20 sponsorship in addition to the entry fee.

FRANKEL’S PETRICOR EARNS RISING STARDOM IN FRANCE

Sent postward as the 7-5 favourite for Tuesday’s Prix les Ammonites, a 7 1/2-furlong debutantes’ heat at Deauville, Khalid Abdullah’s **Petricor (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) did not disappoint and earned ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ status with an impressive opening performance at the Normandy venue. The Andre Fabre trainee

broke well from an inside gate, but was shuffled back to race in a midfield seventh after occupying a prominent second through the initial strides. Angled outside for a clear passage with 350 metres remaining she quickened to challenge entering the final furlong and kept on powerfully under mild coaxing to easily deny the pacesetter Grace Shelby (Fr) (Shalaa {Ire}) by 1 1/2 lengths nearing the line.

“This filly has been working nicely at home and she confirmed that promise on the track today,” said winning rider Pierre-Charles Boudot. “More rhythm in the race would have helped and I am certain that she will stay in the future.”

Petricor is the first of three foals produced by a winning half-sister to five black-type performers headed by MG1SW sire Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler’s Wells) and MGSW G1 Irish St Leger and GI Breeders’ Cup Turf placegetter Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}). The February-foaled homebred bay is a half-sister to a yearling colt by Lope de Vega (Ire) and a 2020 colt by Roaring Lion. Descendants of her G3 Park Hill S.-winning second dam Eva Luna (Alleged) include G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe-winning sire Workforce (GB) (King’s Best), MG1SW sire Best Solution (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}), MSW G1 Moyglare Stud S. third Kissable (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and stakes-winning GI American Oaks third Amandine (GB) (Shamardal).

WOOTTON BASSETT'S MIDLIFE CRISIS ANOTHER RISING STAR IN FRANCE

Following the precedent set by Petricor (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in the previous race, Shigeo Nomura's **Midlife Crisis (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) posted a more straightforward display to earn a 'TDN Rising Star' badge of his own in Tuesday's Prix Le Bognat, a 7 1/2-furlong newcomers' test for colts and geldings, at Deauville. The 46-5 chance was away in second and quickly asserted for an early lead. Comfortably holding sway thereafter, he was shaken up in front passing the quarter-mile marker and powered ever clear under mild coaxing in the closing stages to easily outclass **Bouttemont (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) by a geared-down five lengths.

"Midlife Crisis is a horse who I hold in very high esteem," revealed winning trainer Hiroo Shimizu.

"In my opinion, he has plenty of room for improvement and is capable of much more. I very much see him as a [G1] Prix du Jockey club horse for next year and the [Oct. 4 G1] Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere [over seven furlongs at ParisLongchamp] will be his target this season. He may have another race beforehand, but I keep in mind that he is ground dependent and needs it good or faster."

Midlife Crisis, half-brother to a yearling filly by Siyouni (Fr), is the second foal and scorer out of a winning full-sister to G3 Geelong Cup victor and G1 South Australian Derby placegetter Runaway (Aus) (Manhattan Rain {Aus}). His dam The Hunt Is On (Aus) (Manhattan Rain {Aus}) is also half to G1 AJC Australian Oaks heroine Absolutely (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), G1 Australasian Oaks victress Abbey Marie (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and to the dam of G2 S A Nursery winner Mount Pleasant (Aus) (Vancouver {Aus}) and Listed Adelaide Guineas third Quantum Mechanic (Aus) (Deep Field {Aus}). His second dam Catshaan (Aus) (Catrail) is a half-sister to MG1SW dual Japanese champion Kinshasa No Kiseki (Aus) (Fuki Kiseki {Jpn}) out of an unraced half-sister to G1 Prix Lupin-winning sire Groom Dancer (Blushing Groom {Fr}).

HAT TRICK DIES IN BRAZIL

Japanese champion miler **Hat Trick (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence--Tricky Code, by Lost Code) has died aged 19 in Brazil. The news was first reported by Turf Diario.

The winner of the G1 Mile Championship in Japan and the G1 Hong Kong Mile, Hat Trick was based for most of his stud career in the U.S., starting out at Walmac International before relocating to Gainesway, where he stood for five years before being sold to South America, to where he had already been shuttling, in 2017. Hat Trick is best known for siring the G1 Prix Morny winner and good French sire Dabirsim (Fr) and the GI Jamaica H. victor King David, as well as four South American Group 1 winners. His pattern race winners also include the GII John Henry Turf Championship winner Bright Thought; GII Nassau S. winner Secret Message; and German Group 3 winner Peace In Motion. He leaves behind a total 34 stakes winners and 16 group winners.

HISTORIC SIRE SWEEP IN AUSTRALIA

The Australian-bred sweep of the Top 10 on the Australian Sires Championship in 2019/20 may be unprecedented in modern thoroughbred history, but does it re-enforce the debate about the supremacy of the 'colonial-bred' stallion?

Certainly this point in racing history has proven a high-point for stallions which have been bred in Australia, with the Top 10 sweep a culmination of a decade-long plateau of relative dominance. Since Danehill's (USA) final Australian sires title in 2004/05, 14 of the past 15 Champion Sires have been Australian-bred.

The exception is the Darley shuttle stallion Street Cry (Ire), who on the back of his superstar daughter mare Winx, was able to claim the 2015/16 title. In fact for the past six seasons, Street Cry is one of only two internationally-bred stallions to feature inside the Top 10 on the Sires table, having done so on five occasions. The other one is High Chaparral (Ire), who finished seventh, fourth and eighth in three consecutive seasons: 2016/17, 2017/18 and 2018/19. The 2013/14 season was the last time Australian stallions came close to a Top 10 sweep, with Waikato Stud's O'Reilly (NZ), finishing ninth.

The merit of **Snitzel's** fourth Australian title, a feat which even outshines his own remarkable sire Redoute's Choice, is more significant in the context of an era of competition from shuttle stallions as well as the depth of the locally-bred stallion offering. His success has come in the face of substantial competition from Yarraman Park's **I Am Invincible**, whose record over the past

three seasons would be enough for him to be crowned Champion in any other era. History will reflect well on these two stallions, and their legacy will be assisted by the quantity and quality of mares they have been able to serve. The past decade has been a particularly prosperous one for the Australian thoroughbred industry, with an explosion in prizemoney leading to a surge in yearling prices, and a considerable investment globally.

That success was sewn in the previous era of investment, with the shuttling of capital to Australia through the likes of Coolmore and Godolphin/Darley, as well as the global vision of local powerhouses like Arrowfield, just as important as the shuttling of stallions. That global trend flows on through the likes of Yulong, Aquis, Spendthrift and Sun Stud.

Of course, both Snitzel and I Am Invincible owe their existence to a previous generation of shuttle stallions, with Snitzel a grandson of Danehill and I Am Invincible by Invincible Spirit (Ire). Australia's champion first-season sire, **Pride Of Dubai**, is a son of Street Cry, while the leading second-season sire, **Rubick**, is a grandson of Fairy King (USA).

Four of the Top 10 sires in Australia in the just completed season were sons of shuttle stallions, while another four were great grandsons. Only third-placed Pierro and seventh-placed Zoustar had their paternal grandsires bred in Australasia.

The Power of the Hybrid

Pierro is an interesting example, as he represents a dominant Australasian sireline which stretches back to Sir Tristram (Ire) but he is also out of an imported mare, Miss Right Note (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}).

His emergence as the next star of Australia's stallion ranks lends weight to the concept that the mixing of local and imported bloodlines is key in achieving success. 'Hybrid vigour' as it is often referred to.

A quick analysis of the maternal bloodlines of the best performed horses by the top stallions in Australia appears to confirm this influence.

Snitzel had 18 stakes winners in 2019/20, and nine of them were by mares with sires bred outside of Australia and New Zealand. Included in that list are three horses, Wild Ruler, Letzbeclam and Akari, whose dams were also bred outside of Australia.

That impact is not as pronounced with I Am Invincible, who had 13 stakes winners, five of which had broodmare sires who were shuttle stallions, but it nonetheless is a pointer to the manner in which international stallions are influencing successful pedigree on both sides of the page.

A look at the individual Group 1 winners from 2019/20 further shapes that argument. There were 45 sires who had Group 1 winners in Australia last season, and 18 of them were bred outside of Australia and New Zealand.

Breaking that down to the broodmare sire stats, and of the 47 mares who produced Group 1 winners in Australia last season, 27, or 57.4%, were by stallions sired outside of Australasia.

What those stats indicate is that the influence of these international bloodlines is far stronger than a cursory look at the Sires Table would imply.

How You Cut the Stats

Due to the volume of racing in Australia, sires tables, while a good comparative guide for Australian stallions' performance, don't really provide a level playing field for shuttle stallions to be measured by.

Statistics from Racing Australia tell us that over the five years between 2013/14, between five and 6% of stallions in Australia were considered shuttle stallions. They were responsible for around 18.7% of covers of mares in Australia.

With that numerical disadvantage, added to the fact that due to commercial and other reasons, shuttle stallions often have shorter careers in Australia, hence fewer runners, it is difficult to assess the relative performance against Australian or New Zealand stallions based on total prizemoney alone.

Measuring the performance of the Top 100 stallions based on percentage of winners to runners produces a very different looking table, with shuttle stallions occupying five of the top 10 spots, including the top two with **Camelot (GB)**, who stood for one season in Australia, having 64.7% of winners to runners and Street Cry having 57%. Another way to cut the stats is by average prizemoney per runner, which of those with more than 50 runners, sees **Declaration Of War (USA)** top of the charts (\$146,020), Street Cry fourth and **Lope De Vega (Ire)** sixth.

The pattern of dominance all comes down to how you assess the stats. That is not to deny that Australian-bred stallions are enjoying an unprecedented period of dominance. The research we undertook took us back to the 1930s, without finding a season where Australian sires swept the Top 10 position on the sires table.

It certainly stands in contrast to the same table from 2000/01, where six of the top 10 stallions were shuttlers, led by that season's champion Danehill, who led an internationally bred trifecta ahead of Scenic (Ire) and Brief Truce (USA).

The leading Australian-bred sire that season was Zeditave, a living embodiment of the term 'colonial speed', but of course with considerable international influence pedigree on both sides, being a grand-son of dual Australian Champion Sire Showdown (GB) out of a mare by American stallion Crowned Prince (USA).

KNOWLTON LOOKING FOR 'REDEMPTION' WITH 'LAW'

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY - Mixing confidence with the cautiousness that comes from years of experience in Thoroughbred racing, Jack Knowlton is more than ready for the GI Runhappy Travers S. Saturday that will feature Sackatoga Stable's **Tiz the Law** (Constitution).

Seventeen years after Sackatoga's GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) was scratched from the Travers the day before the race, Knowlton is eager to watch one of the horses he co-owns compete in the marquee race in the city that has been his home since 1982. Tiz the Law, winner of the GI Belmont S. in June and the GI Curlin Florida Derby in March, will be a heavy favorite to add the Travers to his list of accomplishments. For Knowlton and a number of his Sackatoga partners, the Travers is more than just a Grade I race with a \$1-million purse. It is personal. First run as the inaugural race on opening day at the newly constructed Saratoga Race Course in 1864, the Travers has become part of the local culture in the region surrounding America's oldest race track. The 2003 Travers looked to be a showdown between the Triple Crown rivals Funny Cide and Empire Maker. Funny Cide had edged Empire Maker (Unbridled) in the Derby. Five weeks later, after skipping the Preakness, Empire Maker won the Belmont, five lengths in front of third-place Funny Cide.

Details of the survey study designed to determine the extent of exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhaging were released Tuesday morning by the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and follows Sunday's announcement of an agreement to card Lasix-free 2-year-old races in the state through Dec. 31. Private veterinarians who practice at Laurel will conduct the video endoscopies and complete information forms for each horse that will include the horse's name, its EIPH score, any related comments, and whether the horse trains on Lasix. **Cont. p7**

Knowlton Looking for Redemption, cont. from p1

Both were entered in Travers on Wednesday. Trainer Bobby Frankel announced that Thursday evening that Empire Maker was sick and would not make the Travers. The next morning, Funny Cide was scratched, too. The Sackatoga gelding had taken ill after running third in the GI Haskell Invitational S. on Aug. 3 and when mucous was found in his lungs after a routine gallop the day before the Travers, trainer Barclay Tagg pulled the plug.

"I tell everyone that my second-biggest disappointment with Funny Cide, other than obviously not winning the Belmont and the Triple Crown, was not being able to run in the Travers," Knowlton said. "He just got knocked out running in the Haskell. That was the race you got money to go to. The timing was right. It was off a nice break after the Belmont. It was kind of the typical progression that you would do. Unfortunately, it


did not work out. It was a bad-weather day down there in terms of heat and humidity. Then he got a clod of dirt in his eye and his eye got infected. It just didn't work out the way we had

hoped it would."

Knowlton paused ever so slightly and said, "Now, God willing we will get through another week and he will be ready to roll in the Travers this year."

In 1995, Knowlton persuaded five of his high school buddies from Sackets Harbor, NY, a little town on the eastern end of Lake Ontario, to form a partnership to buy and race some horses. They blended Sackets and Saratoga to name the stable. With four other partners in the mix, they hit the

mother lode with Funny Cide, a New York-bred they had acquired for \$75,000 in a private transaction in early 2002. Their appealing everyman-beating-the-Goliaths story attracted international press coverage and cross-over appeal.

The Grade 1 Test. In 1989 it was won by **SAFELY KEPT**, eventual 1989 Eclipse Award-winning Sprinter. She ran it in 1:21½. Her only loss that year was a second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint when she was caught at the wire by Dancing Spree. **SAFELY KEPT** was the first sprinter to have ever earned more than two million dollars. She was inducted into the National Racing Hall of Fame in 2011.

Millionaire **SHINE AGAIN** won back-to-back runnings of the Ballerina in 2001 and '02 in her breeder Bohemia Stables' silks. She came back in 2003 to miss a third victory by a mere nose.

While small stables do come up with a Grade I-level horse on occasion, Knowlton appreciates that having a second star is quite unusual. Like Funny Cide, who was from Distorted Humor's first crop, Sackatoga took a chance on the initial crop of babies of Constitution (Tapit). The stable bought him as a yearling for \$110,000, the most it had spent on a horse. He has won five of six starts, earned \$1,480,300 and his breeding rights have been sold to Coolmore.

"It's beyond what anybody could ever imagine, to have a horse like this, that has accomplished what he has already accomplished," Knowlton said. "You've got three Grade I wins, you've got the Classic race. You've got the Florida Derby that is probably considered the most important Kentucky Derby prep. You've got the Champagne that is maybe even more prominent than the Breeders' Cup Juvenile in terms of 2-year-old races. What he has done is pretty incredible. To be along for a second ride after the first one is mind-boggling, quite honestly."

The situation is slightly different with Tiz the Law. Lew Titterton and Knowlton are the only Funny Cide partners in this ownership group. In 2006, Knowlton and fellow Saratoga Springs businessman Ed Mitzen formed Sackatoga Stable LLC with Knowlton as the operating manager. Typically, they have operated a four-horse stable with shares priced at \$5,000.

"Our goal, when we buy a horse, is to have it be a New York-bred that can run in the New York-bred stakes program," Knowlton said. "When we buy them, that's the ceiling that we are looking at. We've been able to do that not that often."

Knowlton pointed to Niko's Dream (Central Banker), who was second in two NY-bred stallion stakes last year and was fifth in the ungraded Dayatthespa S. last week at Saratoga.

"She would be the star of the stable any other time," Knowlton said. "She's earned \$200,000. We paid \$60,000 for her as a 2-year-old. That's our game."

For Tiz the Law, Sackatoga Stable offered 26 shares at \$7,500. Knowlton said that a total of 35 people have ownership stakes in the colt. About half of the owners are expected to be in Saratoga on Saturday. The COVID-19 restrictions in place at Saratoga Race Course allow a total of 12 licensed owners in a horse to be on the grounds for the race. The rest will of the group will be at a viewing party in the ballroom of a local hotel.

Thanks to Tiz the Law's success, the stable has made some changes this year to the way it operates. On June 29, it went far beyond its usual level and spent \$290,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-old sale to purchase a daughter of Tonalist (Tapit) out of the Harlan's Holiday mare Holiday Apple. Knowlton chuckled at the suggestion that Tiz the Law paid for the filly that has been named Tapple Cider.

"You would have to ask all the partners," he said. "Most of the partners are spending found money. There are a couple of people who aren't in Tiz that are in this one. For the most part they are Tiz parnters who have been rewarded. There were some people who were interested in having a little smaller group, so we put one together with 15 shares for this horse."

Sackatoga has also picked up a pair of 2-year-olds by first-crop sire Laoban (Uncle Mo), who was represented by his second winner Aug. 2 at Saratoga. Knowlton said there here are 47 partners in the Laobans, which he said had a lot to do with Tiz the Law.

"I've had to turn people quite a few people away," he said. "I figure that the two percent with 47 is the most that I would ever go. There were a lot of people who seemed very interested. We were able to keep the share price down to \$6,000 and pay all the expenses through the end of the year with that. That's pretty attractive for everybody who are in already and for new

people, many of whom may have had experience elsewhere and are looking for a different experience. All the publicity about Tiz and Barclay and Sackatoga has brought a lot of people out of the woodwork and being interested in being part of it."

Sackatoga completed its deal with Coolmore following Tiz the Law's three-length victory in the GIII Holy Bull on Feb. 1 and the Florida Derby. Knowlton said that there was plenty of interest from breeders in Tiz the Law, whose only loss was a third by three-quarters of a length on a sloppy track at Churchill Downs in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club on Nov. 30. Knowlton gambled on Tiz the Law running well in the Holy Bull.

"They wanted to buy him before that race, but I was in no rush to do anything," he said. "I just felt that after he had lost that race in Kentucky I told people to just draw a line through that. That was absolutely the right answer. You look at his next three races and every one of them has been a knockout."

There were no breeding rights to sell with Funny Cide, who ran until he was seven and earned over \$3.5 million. Knowlton said he knew what he wanted out of any agreement with a farm.

"I drew two lines in the sand with everybody that I talked to: that you cannot buy any racing rights and he has to run through the 4-year-old year," Knowlton said. "If you look on social media there are a lot of people who don't believe that, but as long as he is healthy and running well, that's the deal."

Knowlton was up before dawn Saturday to watch the last of Tiz the Law's three Travers works at 5:30 a.m. He covered five furlongs on :59.44 under Heather Smullen and Knowlton figures that Tagg has him perfectly set up for the Travers.

"I'm hopeful and I think there is a pretty good chance that the mile and a quarter will bring out the best in him," Knowlton said. "I have absolutely no doubt that he is absolutely going to relish the mile and a quarter."

To make his case, Knowlton points to his pedigree, his performances as the races have increased in length and an assortment of statistical data.

"He just closes. He gallops out," Knowlton said. "Then you look at this breeding. With a mare by Tiznow, who won two [GI Breeders' Cup] Classics at a mile and a quarter, I just see a mile and a quarter being so much in his wheelhouse that I probably have more confidence coming into this race than I did in any race that he has run so far."

For Knowlton, in particular, the Travers has so much meaning. He said he went to his first Travers in the 1970s and has been a regular at the biggest race of the Saratoga season for more than 40 years. The Derby on Sept 5. and the GI Preakness on Oct. 3 are very much on the schedule for Tiz the Law. And he could go on to compete in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland. But, first, it's the 151st Travers. Knowlton said a victory in the Travers in front of empty stands would not diminish the accomplishment for him.

"Obviously it would be much happier to have life normal and have 50,000 people there, an awful lot of happy people to see the horse going into the race that will still be the favorite for the Kentucky Derby," he said. "That's pretty exciting stuff. It's historical, the Mid-Summer Derby before the Kentucky Derby. This being a prep race for the Kentucky Derby. But, unfortunately, that's not the way it is, not the way it's playing out. We'll hopefully have our dozen people there and be able to see it, which we haven't been able to see his last two Grade I wins. It will be a big step up."

Additional useful data from each race and race day will be added to the information forms, which will be transferred to an online database. The MRC will maintain all records from the survey study, and only a horse’s owner and trainer will be given the results of a scope to maintain anonymity. Horses will be scored using a range from 0 to 3--none, mild, moderate or severe bleeding--for the purpose of simplification. Dr. John Sivick, a Laurel-based veterinarian who is a member of the Equine Safety, Health and Welfare Advisory Committee, said endoscopies are usually performed 30 minutes to 90 minutes after a race, but the goal will be a window of 40 minutes to 70 minutes post-race to keep the scores as consistent as possible.

The survey study is part of a broader agreement between the MTHA and The Stronach Group for a Lasix-free pilot program that runs through 2023 for 2-year-old races and graded stakes only. Graded stakes in 2020 are not part of the pilot program.


The first 2-year-old race of the year in the state was drawn Tuesday and will run on Friday’s program. The five-furlong event drew a field of 10 colts and geldings and will be contested as the sixth race on the program with a purse of \$40,000.

RACING INDUSTRY SUPPORTS LEXINGTON SCHOOL EQUINE TRAINING PROGRAM

With an eye on bolstering the available pool of labor, several Kentucky horse farms, along with other industry organizations, have come together and donated \$322,000 to the Fayette County Public Schools, which will be creating an all-encompassing equine training program for middle school students and high school students attending the Locust Trace AgriScience Center in Lexington. While Fayette County might seem like a natural breeding ground for future farm employees that wasn’t necessarily the case, said Chauncey Morris, the executive director of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, which spearheaded the effort to develop the program. Morris said that many students in the area had little interaction with horses and never considered horse racing as a career opportunity. The goal of the program was to not only create a source of jobs for local residents but to provide farms with a new pool of skilled labor, something that has been in short supply in recent years.

“We started having conversations about this 2 1/2 years ago and we knew we wanted to provide more work opportunities for a local labor pool,” Morris said. “Once we started to know more about Locust Trace and (principal) Anne DeMott we saw that we had a huge asset, bricks and mortar, in our backyard where we had an opportunity to provide funding that would create more of a local labor source that would meet out workforce needs and accomplish a lot of goals.”

Locust Trace opened in 2011 and has always had equine-related classes, but the donation will lead to a large scale expansion of the program, which will, for the first time, also include middle school students who may end up at Locust Trace. DeMott estimates that as many as 220 students on the high school level will take part in the program.

“With us now working with the middle schools, we are reaching students earlier and creating an excitement and an enthusiasm for the industry,” DeMott said.

Another goal of the program will be to create jobs for minority students in racing, an industry that has recognized it needs to become more diverse. DeMott said that 30 percent of her students are minorities, but the goal is to bring more into the program. In attempt to do so, Locust Trace is working with Ron Mack, who operates the Legacy Equine Academy. The Legacy Equine Academy was formed in 2017 with the goal of promoting the equine and agriculture industries to minority students.

“It’s a beautiful story that’s being written,” Fayette County Public Schools Superintendent Manny Caulk said of the program. “That’s a story that is going to be inclusive of a very diverse group of students, racially, socio-economically. That’s important in today’s times when you are talking about racial and social justice. That’s what is top of mind for all of us. When they look at the role African Americans have played (in horse racing), I think they will be proud of that history. If you are proud of that sort of history and take ownership of it, you’re going to say ‘You know what? I can choose this profession too.’”

The program is geared to for the individual needs and desires of each student and to make them as marketable as possible. In addition to horsemanship skills, students will be taught such things as landscaping and farm maintenance. A curriculum will be established for those who want to go to work on a farm right after high school and for those who want to attend college or pursue a career in the veterinary field.

“My goal is that we have something for every learner, no matter what their end goal is or their ability level,” DeMott said.

While many of the students may start out in entry level jobs, Morris said there’s no reason why they can’t rise through the ranks at a major farm.

“Hands on horsemanship is often vital to getting to the next level,” Morris said. “ Many of our senior managers have been folks that stated at the entry level. Because of the size and scope of the industry here we are always constantly going to have a churn of labor. We need this because people are needed at every single level. If they have proper training at the entry level they can ascend much more swiftly. An industry is oftentimes only as productive and efficient as its labor force is. In the back of our minds, we have been mindful of this. If we are doing our jobs right there is always going to be a need that needs to be met here.”

The industry’s commitment to Locust Trace is for three years, but Morris is convinced that the program will prove to be so successful that it will become a long-term answer to an industry problem, finding good, reliable and skilled workers.

“This is the beginning of the story, not the end of it,” he said. “There are a lot of moving parts and it will probably take us some time to get our heads around all this. We are very grateful that we have the opportunity to do this. It’s going to be the first step and, hopefully, we will see a lot of returns. Central Kentucky has been very good to this industry. There is a humanitarian motivation here in that we are trying to give back to the community, as well. When it all comes together, we should also be producing a well-rounded student, a graduate of Locust Trace, that if they choose to go to work in thoroughbred industry they will come in with training and a skill set.”

ARGENTINA, ALMOST 5 MONTHS WITHOUT RACING AND THAT IS NOT THE ONLY PROBLEM TO SOLVE

Being almost five months without racing is a fact sufficiently relevant to explain the financial crisis faced by the Argentine racing community. However, that alone does not fully explain the risks that all stakeholders are facing in the months ahead. As we explained in the past in this newsletter, the purse structure of Argentine racing is substantially made by the contributions coming from proceeds from slots. At Palermo Racetrack, located in the city of Buenos Aires, the slots are part of the operation of the racetrack. At San Isidro and La Plata, however, the slots are located in "bingo halls" located around the province of Buenos Aires and the two racetracks get a slice of them.

All slots, no matter where they are, have been closed since mid-March and that may not change dramatically until there is a way to allow their safe operation, partially or totally, in line with health protocols, which may take time to be tested, approved and at full operation.

Therefore, even when the time comes for the racetracks to re-open without people attending, the purse structure will be materially lower than it was before the pandemic, unless the government provides some financing to cover the gap, a possibility with not much chance due to the severe financial restrictions created by the long lockdown of economic activities. To make things even worse, when the time comes for the racetracks to open, gambling will occur through phone betting only, since online gambling is still prohibited and the regulations to permit them and its implementation may be additional months ahead.

The funding of the purse structure from the proceeds of slot machines for approximately 15 years has made racing almost completely dependent on decisions made by outsiders to racing, both in the private and public sector, and there is a sense of urgency to find within racing permanent sources of income.

Argentine racing produces approximately 7,000 foals per year and it has had daily racing programs with full cards for a long time. San Isidro and Palermo racetracks host jointly not less than 3,500 horses in training all year round and La Plata adds not less than 1,000. Owners and trainers are making enormous efforts to keep horses around until the reopening occurs, but a large number of them are moving horses back to farms and other facilities away from the racetracks to cope with the mounting expenses that are not being matched by any income.

Prices at the auctions are showing that the expectations of sellers and buyers is that 2020 and probably 2021 will be years that will result in heavy losses that not all will be able to swallow.

There has been no event in the past that has put Argentine racing in a similar situation. And unless positive news come soon there will be chances that the industry as a whole will have to make major and painful adjustments to survive and eventually be restarted under sound new rules. We all hope for the best, but challenges lie ahead. If we can swim these stormy waters Argentine racing may get back to its best traditions and make a future on its own.

Game Day Play (Violence) battles back along the inside to graduate at Lone Star

The New York Jockey Injury Compensation Fund (NYJICF) Amended 2020 Workers' Compensation Premium Assessment and Formula

This is the NYJICF's Amended Assessment Plan for 2020 (2020 Amended Assessment Plan) and, consistent with the last few years, continues to be structured on New York Racing Association (NYRA)-based horsemen contributing 86% of the NYJICF's annual cost, which is estimated to equal \$6,206,204, and Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack (FLRA)-based horsemen contributing 14% of the NYJICF's annual cost, which is estimated to equal \$1,010,312. Although the percentages remain the same, the NYJICF's annual costs have decreased as a result of the shutdown of racing in New York due to COVID-19.

Similar to the last few years, the NYJICF has secured authority (i) to use up to \$2 million from the 2020 NYRA purse cushion fund and (ii) to deduct and use 2% of purses from an owner's share of purses. As a result, the NYJICF sought and received approval of the New York State Gaming Commission (Gaming Commission) to eliminate the second installment of the owner and trainer base payment for NYRA owners and trainers, as well as the June 1, 2020 increase in NYRA stall charges.

NYRA Owners assessment and payment is a \$1,000 base premium, plus 2% of purses earned.

FLRA Owners assessment and payment is a \$2,550 base premium, plus 2% of purses earned.

Each race with a purse over \$1,000,000 will be capped at \$1,000,000 for Workers' Compensation assessment purposes only.

NYRA Trainer assessment and payment is a \$1,000 base premium plus:

NYRA trainers will pay a per stall charge of \$1.60 per day for each stall allotted and accepted during each stall allotment period as designated by the track where each trainer races, provided that the first 12 stalls allotted and accepted will be free and the per stall charge for each stall allotted and accepted in excess of 12 will be \$1.60 per day.

FLRA Trainer assessment and payment is a \$2,550 base premium plus:

FLRA trainers will pay a per stall charge of \$1.50 per day for each stall allotted and accepted during each stall allotment period as designated by the track.

These premium charges will be due as follows:

NYRA and FLRA Owners and Trainers base premium charge is due:

- At NYRA, for those trainers already stabled on the grounds: \$1,000 on or before January 1, 2020.
- At NYRA, for those owners already stabled on the grounds: \$1,000 before they run their first horse in 2020.
- For those trainers shipping in: upon entering the horse on the grounds based on the "shippers" per start schedule set forth below.
- For those owners shipping in: before they run their first horse in 2020 based on the "shippers" per start schedule set forth below.
- At FLRA, for trainers: upon entering the horse on the grounds: \$1,500 on or before April 1, 2020, and an additional \$1,050 (for a total of \$2,550) to be paid on or before June 1, 2020.
- At FLRA, for owners: \$1,500 before they run their first horse in 2020 through May 31, 2020, and an additional \$1,050 (for a total of \$2,550) to be paid on or before June 1, 2020.

Anything in this Assessment Plan to the contrary notwithstanding, FLRA's 14% of the NYJICF's cost, which is estimated to equal \$1,010,312, will be paid by FLRA in five equal installments in the amount of \$202,062 between August 2020 and December 2020.

NYRA and FLRA Owners and Trainers

The stall charges will be due on the last day of the first month of each allotment period, for example: January 31 for winter 2020 at NYRA and thirty days after the opening of the stable area for the spring meeting at FLRA.

If the trainer accepts stalls for the summer meeting but ships in three weeks before that meeting begins, that trainer will be responsible for the entire summer meeting plus \$1.60 per day (\$1.50 at FLRA) times the number of stalls allotted, times the number of days that the trainer occupied the stalls prior to the summer meeting, provided that the first 12 stalls allotted and accepted at NYRA tracks will be free.

Owners/Trainers will be required to pay the base premium charge of \$1,000 at NYRA and \$2,550 at FLRA, plus 2% of purses earned, plus the stall allotment charge.

Private Trainers will be responsible for the base premium of \$1,000 at NYRA and \$2,550 at FLRA. The owner employing that trainer (whose payroll the exercise riders are on) will be responsible for the stall charge plus 2% of purses earned.

Shippers. At NYRA, owners and trainers will be charged \$100.00 each per start for their first ten starts (for a maximum of \$1,000 for 2020). At FLRA, owners and trainers will be charged \$150.00 each per start for their first ten starts (for a maximum of \$1,500 for 2020). Owners will also be charged 2% of purses earned. Shipping trainers will only be charged a stall fee if they are assigned stalls.

A suitable stall count to be determined by the racing secretary at the current stall assessment rate (\$1.60 at NYRA tracks (except the first 12 stalls allotted and accepted will be free for 2020) and \$1.50 at FLRA) will be assessed to those horsemen stabled off of the racetrack proper and who have daily access and use of the racetrack facilities.

Surcharge. Each trainer, upon such trainer's second claim and any subsequent claim filed with the workers' compensation insurance carrier in 2020, shall be charged a per-claim handling surcharge based upon the total number of horses then currently trained on the date of such claim(s) (as measured by the number of stalls allocated statewide as of the date of the claim for which a surcharge is to be collected), as follows: 1 to 10 horses: \$200; 11 to 30 horses: \$400; and 31 or more horses: \$600.

General Information

Should NYJICF determine that the amounts which are actually collected from (i) NYRA is inadequate to cover 86% of the NYJICF's annual cost, which is estimated to equal \$6,206,204 and and/or (ii) FLRA is inadequate to cover 14% of the NYJICF's annual cost, which is estimated to equal \$1,010,312, respectively, then the NYJICF will seek additional funds pursuant to the Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Breeding Law Section 221 (7).

- For determining the responsibility for payment of workers' compensation, an owner is the person whose account would be debited or credited when a horse runs. In the case of multiple ownership, this would be the managing partner.
- In order for trainers to reduce their stall charge, they must officially return stalls to the proper association, stall man or racing secretary within 10 days after assuming the stalls.
- The charge per stall is in no way to be construed as a payment for stall rent. This is only a method which the NYJICF uses to estimate the appropriate premium charge that is due.
