

MAXIMUM SECURITY, IMPROBABLE TO MEET IN AWESOME AGAIN

Stablemates **Maximum Security** (New Year's Day) and **'TDN Rising Star' Improbable** (City Zip) will face one another in Saturday's GI Awesome Again S. at Santa Anita, trainer Bob Baffert has confirmed.

Baffert had earlier discussed shipping Maximum Security to New York for the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, but instead will race him this weekend in his own backyard.

Via text, Baffert said he thought the race was a good fit for both horses because he likes the spacing and the fact that no one has to ship. The Jockey Club Gold Cup will be run Oct. 10, two weeks after the Awesome Again.

With the two Baffert stars set to meet one another, the Awesome Again could decide who will be the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Coming off wins in the GI San Diego H. and the GI TVG Pacific Classic, Maximum Security will be favored in the Awesome Again, but Improbable has strong credentials, as well. He has won two in a row, the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and the GI Whitney S.

The list of possible starters for the \$300,000 race also includes **Higher Power** (Medaglia d'Oro), **Midcourt** (Midnight Lute), **Sharp Samurai** (First Samurai), **Sleepy Eyes Todd** (Paddy o'Prado) and **Take the One O One** (Acclamation). *Cont. p3*

VANDERBILT WINNER VOLATILE INJURED; RETIRED TO THREE CHIMNEYS

Saratoga's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. winner **Volatile** (Violence--Melody Lady, by Unbridled's Song) has been injured with a hairline fracture of his right front cannon bone and has been retired. He will stand the 2021 season at Three Chimneys in Central Kentucky.

While competing for the partnership of Three Chimneys Farm and Phoenix Thoroughbreds, Volatile was undefeated in three starts in 2020. In addition to his Vanderbilt win July 25, in which he clocked a final quarter in :22.94, the fastest in the race's history, the gray also captured Churchill's Aristides S. by eight lengths in June and an allowance/optional claimer by 7 1/2 lengths in April at Oaklawn. The Steve Asmussen trainee retires with a record of 6-5-1-0 and earnings of \$341,040. He received a Beyer Speed Figure of 112 in the Aristides, the highest on record for 2020. *Cont. p3*

"He reminds me very much of Mitole [Eskendereya] in his championship season," said Asmussen. "Volatile is as fast as any horse I have ever trained. His brilliant performances this year would have made him the likely favorite for the [GI] Breeders' Cup Sprint and a tough horse to beat. I trained his mother and his grandmother, the incredible Lady Tak [Mutakddim], who won multiple Grade I races for us. You will not find a better looking individual than Volatile, nor one with as much speed and raw talent."

Volatile was his sire's most expensive yearling sold at public auction when hammered down for \$850,000 at the 2017 Keeneland September sale.

"Volatile is a beautiful horse that breeders will like when they see him," said Three Chimneys owner Goncalo Torrealba. "He exudes class and is a great physical. He was brilliant and that is what can make a stallion special. Three Chimneys will proudly support him with plenty of quality mares, I can guarantee that."

A stud fee for Volatile will be announced at a later date.

CALIFORNIA'S MORE RESTRICTIVE WHIP REGULATIONS TO GO INTO EFFECT OCT. 1

California racing regulators, who have long sought measures that would limit the use of the whip, announced Monday that a set of more restrictive rules will be implemented starting Oct. 1.

The rules were approved June 11 at a meeting of the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), but could not go into effect until undergoing a regulatory review process.

The new rules will bring about three major changes:


(*) Riders cannot use the crop more than six times during a race, excluding showing or waving the crop or tapping the horse on the shoulder.

(*) Riders cannot use the crop more than two times in succession (within the six-time limit) without giving the horse a chance to respond before using the crop again.

(*) The crop must be used in an underhanded position with the crop always at or below the shoulder level of the jockey.

"Most of the riders are not happy about this," said Flavien Prat, who is coming off a riding title at Santa Anita. "I'm for a change, but I think we have gone from one extreme to another. We have gone from no restrictions to pretty much no whip at all. Having a restriction is fine. It would be nice to have a restriction on how many times you can use the whip, something in the middle."

The whip will still be allowed to be used when there are mitigating circumstances, such as when the jockey feels its use is necessary because of safety concerns.

Under current rules, a jockey must give his or her horse a chance to respond after using the whip three times in succession, which is the only major restriction when it comes to whip use.

Though he was aware that it was just a matter of time before the rules were enacted, Darrell Haire, a Jockey's Guild Regional Manager whose territory covers California, was not pleased with Monday's news.

"The riding crop is a valuable tool," Haire said. "It's part of the art of race riding, how you switch sticks and how you encourage a horse. It helps you get the most out of a horse. It's going to hurt everybody, starting with the jockeys because they won't be able to do their job. It will hurt the owners, the trainers, the fans, the bettors. It's going to affect everybody. We have tried to compromise and believe they could have come up with something more reasonable."

Starting Oct. 1, any jockey that violates the rules will be subject to a maximum fine of \$1,000 and a minimum suspension of three days. However, the CHRB has recommended to stewards that they impose lesser penalties at first and allow for a transition period. The stewards are set to meet with the riders before the rule goes into effect in order to explain the regulations and answer any questions.

"...the CHRB is recommending to the Boards of Stewards that they should, for a reasonable period of time, use the "mitigating circumstances" language to employ the current penalty structure--lighter penalties--in order to make the transition to the amended rule less disruptive to jockeys, in particular, as well as all stakeholders and the wagering public generally," read the statement from the CHRB.

The new rules will mean that California will have the most restrictive regulation in the U.S. when it comes to the whip, but that won't last long. Starting with the 2021 season at Monmouth Park, jockeys in New Jersey will not be allowed to whip a horse, with the only exception being when there are safety concerns.

California appears to be heading in that same direction. CHRB Executive Director Scott Chaney has said that he would like to see whip use eventually eliminated all together. The CHRB's new rules could be an interim step in that direction.

"I don't think jockeys should carry crops. It's not necessary," Chaney told the *TDN* in April. "To me, it's not a safety issue. That's a red herring. Ten years from now, if jockeys are still carrying riding crops, we've taken a wrong turn somewhere."

BRISK TRADE AS BOOK 4 CONCLUDES AT KEENELAND *by Jessica Martini*

The two-session Book 4 portion of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale concluded Monday in Lexington with spirited action at the top of the market. Bloodstock agent Donato Lanni, the most prolific buyer of the auction, made the day's highest bid when going to \$320,000 to acquire a colt by hot freshman sire Not This Time (hip 2739) for an undisclosed client. For the session, 255 yearlings sold for \$11,832,500 for an average of \$46,402 and a median of \$25,000. The buy-back rate, which was as high as 40% during sessions last week, was 23.88% Monday.

For the two-day Book 4 section, 492 yearlings sold for an aggregate of \$23,349,000. The average was \$47,457 and the median was \$32,000. The book's \$320,000 top price was one of 11 to sell for \$200,000 or over for the two days.

During last year's two-session Book 4 section, 562 yearlings sold for \$28,329,200 for an average of \$50,408 and a median of \$37,000. The top Book 4 price in 2019 was \$310,000 and 10 horses sold for \$200,000 or over.

"The good ones are tough to buy, they are really tough," Lanni said. "You just have to bid extra and push a little bit more and hopefully you get them."

Hip 2739 was one of two yearlings to bring over \$300,000 Monday. The chestnut colt, bred by Stelly Stables and consigned by Stuart Morris, is out of Ready at Nine (More Than Ready) and is a half-brother to stakes-placed Drummer Boy (Parading).

"He is a neat horse, a cool dude," Lanni said of the yearling, who will be trained by Bob Baffert. "He was one of the standouts today. Every day there are good horses coming through, you just have to find them. He was easy to find. He's a nice horse. And the sire helped. The sire has been on a roll and people believe in the sire. They are willing to pay extra for them. Not This Time is a horse that came under the radar. You never know who is going to make it, but it looks like he's going to do well."

Also topping the \$300,000 mark Monday was a filly by Nyquist (hip 2419), who sold for \$305,000 to Nicoma Bloodstock. Consigned by Candy Meadows Sales, the yearling was one of five by the GI Kentucky Derby-winning freshman sire to bring six figures during the session.

"I think yesterday was a little light, but the quality of horses is a bit better today in day two of Book 4 and there certainly seems to be a little more high-end trade today," said Nicoma's Ben Gowans.

Oracle Bloodstock, bidding on behalf of Zilla Racing Stables, struck late in the day to acquire one of three fillies by Nyquist to sell for \$200,000 Monday. Hip 2772 is out of Soarwiththebirds (Giant's Causeway), a half-sister to Canadian champion Up With the Birds (Stormy Atlantic), who was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

"I loved her," said Oracle's Conor Foley. "She had a coltish body, but a feminine way about her. I don't think she's done improving. I thought she fit the mold of the nice Nyquists. I'm excited that Zilla Racing was able to get her. This was their first time to Keeneland and they were the underbidder several times over the last several days and we just decided this filly ticked all the boxes. We were lucky to get her."

Of Nyquist, who was represented by his second Grade I winner when Gretzky the Great won the GI Summer S. at Woodbine Sunday, Foley said, "I'm really impressed with them. Obviously they are showing themselves to be the real deal on the track. The Grade I win maybe cost my client a little bit more money than I would have liked, but I am happy for Darley that they stand the horse. I used to work there and I'm a big fan of the stallion." **Cont. p6**

Oracle Bloodstock has been active at all levels of the market during the first week of the Keeneland September sale, purchasing horses from \$1.1 million to \$15,000. In all, the operation has signed for 19 yearlings for \$3,534,000.

“I am shocked at how strong the market is with everything that is going on in the world,” Foley admitted. “It’s been punishing because I’ve been outbid a lot. There is still a strong desire for people to get really nice horses to compete all over the world. I still have barely even bought for my foreign clients. I am nervous—I would be shocked if I was going to be able to fill all their needs at this sale. But that’s great for everybody in the business. It’s been a weird year, but I’m relieved for the breeders. They need to do well, they are the synergy and the strength of our industry.”

The Keeneland September sale continues through Friday with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

Nicoma Strikes Early for Nyquist Filly

A day after earning his second Grade I winner from his first crop to race, Nyquist was responsible for the top-priced filly of Monday’s eighth session of the Keeneland September sale when Nicoma Bloodstock’s Ben Gowans made a final bid of \$305,000 to secure a daughter of the GI Kentucky Derby winner ([hip 2419](#)) on behalf of an undisclosed client.

Out of multiple stakes winner and multiple graded stakes placed Unforgotten (Northern Afleet), the bay filly is a half-sister to Grade I placed Silverpocketsfull (Indian Charlie).

“We thought coming in to today that this filly would be around \$200,000 to \$250,000 range, but Nyquist had a big weekend,” Gowans said.

Nyquist's son Gretzky the Great captured Sunday's GI Summer S. at Woodbine, adding to Vequist's win in the GI Spinaway S. earlier this month.

"Seeing what Nyquist has done so far obviously gave us the confidence in the filly, but we loved her physically," Gowans said. "She is a beautiful filly with good size, plenty of leg, really well balanced, and she moves really well."

Of his client, Gowans said, "He is in it to race. We've really enjoyed working for him and he was delighted even though we went a little over [budget on the filly]. So that's always a good thing."

The yearling was consigned by Candy Meadows Sales and was bred by Matt Lyons's Three Lyons Racing and Dennis Farkas. Farkas purchased Unforgotten, with this filly in utero, for \$75,000 at the 2018 Keeneland November sale.

"Matt [Lyons] was the one who got me going on the mare a couple of years ago," Farkas said from his home in Indiana. "I really liked her, but she was out of my price range and when she RNA'd in November, Matt asked me if I wanted to go partners on her. I said, 'Sure.' After that, it's been all Matt."

Of Monday's results in the sales ring, Farkas said, "Matt was really happy with the way the filly had grown and thought we would do ok with her."

Farkas continued, "He had high expectations, I don't know if he thought we'd be the sale topper today, but he was very happy and I am, too."

Unforgotten, who produced a filly by West Coast this year, is Farkas's only Kentucky-based mare, but he has a band of some 10 mares in Indiana.

"Ian Wilkes trained [2012 GI Indiana Derby winner] Neck 'n Neck and we ended up getting him back and we brought him up here to Indiana to stand stud," Farkas said. "I bought five or six mares to breed to him, but toward the end of the breeding season, he got off a mare and kicked the wall and shattered his leg. So my dream of standing a stallion in Indiana ended. It's pretty costly to take as many mares as I have right now, which is 10, to take them all to Kentucky and get them in foal and bring them back. So I have four I am going to sell in November. But we have some really nice Indiana-bred foals born this year. I have a Maclean's Music, a Good Magic and a Practical Joke and I ended up getting five Neck 'n Neck babies, all fillies. And they are good looking, so we're really happy with that."

He continued, "They have the Indiana-sired program here. They can run against only Indiana-sired horses, which is a big advantage. It's a great program and I'm leaning towards just staying with that for a little bit."

Filly a First for Hernon Bloodstock

Michael Hernon, longtime director of sales at Gainesway, made the first purchase for his new bloodstock agency Monday at Keeneland, going to \$42,000 to acquire a filly by Speightster (hip 2541) on behalf of Steve and Cynthia Sansone.

“This filly jumped out at me with her motion and she had a very good stride to her,” said Hernon, who partnered with trainer Mark Casse to purchase unbeaten stakes winner Spanish Loveaffair (Karakontie {Jpn}) for \$35,000 out of last year’s September sale. “I looked at her three times and she’s a very positive type who moves forward willingly.”

The yearling is out of Diamondsandcaviar (Street Cry {Ire}), a half-sister to Grade I winner Haynesfield (Speightstown).

Hernon made his first purchase under the Michael Hernon Bloodstock banner on a single bid.

“I could have seen her bringing \$50,000 and change,” Hernon said. “But we are happy with the price and we’re happy with the horse. She was the first one on our list to come up, I have a couple of other fillies to go through today and we have a short list for tomorrow, so we’ll see how it plays out.”

Thomason continued, "This project will strengthen Kentucky's vital horse industry and positively impact the Commonwealth and the local communities by stimulating significant economic growth, generating hundreds of new jobs and enhancing tourism and hospitality."

Officials from each racing association are working with state and local officials on a number of incentives and necessary infrastructure improvements to bring the facilities to fruition. Additionally, the venture is working with local investors to enhance the magnitude of the impact to the region.

"Corbin is thrilled to be a part of this endeavor," Corbin Mayor Suzie Razmus said. "The new racing facility will be a welcome addition to our city's already long list of sites and attractions for local residents and visitors."

"We are proud of the significant investment this partnership is committed to making in our community, and are excited to see the infusion of tourism, economic development and new jobs it will bring to Williamsburg and Whitley County," Williamsburg Mayor Roddy Harrison stated.

Each facility is contingent upon approval of an initial pari-mutuel racing license by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

Code of Honor (Noble Mission {GB}) will not be back to defend his title in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and will instead make his next start going a mile in the GII Kelso H. at Belmont Oct. 3.

"I said all along after the Whitney that I was going to start all over again," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "I thought the Kelso was a good spot to start over again, running him at a mile instead of a mile-and-a-quarter in the Gold Cup after he's been away for 2 1/2 months. We'll run him at the mile, see what happens and take it from there."


McGaughey said that if Code of Honor runs well in the Kelso, he will be pointed for either the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile or the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Code of Honor was placed first in the 2019 Gold Cup after Vino Rosso (Curlin) was disqualified for interference.

He's trained really good since the Pegasus at Monmouth. Off that work we expect a big effort in the Preakness."

Third to Maxfield (Street Sense) in the GIII Matt Winn S. May 23, Pneumatic was a well-beaten fourth behind Tiz The Law (Constitution) in the GI Belmont S. June 20. He came from just off the pace in the Pegasus to defeat Jesus' Team (Tapiture) by 2 1/4 lengths.

NY COMMISSION INCHES CLOSER ON WHIP REFORM *by T.D. Thornton*

As New York remains well behind other racing states to pass rules on whipping reform, the Sep. 21 meeting of the New York State Gaming Commission marked the fourth consecutive session over a nine-month span that the commission again declined to take up any substantial action on the topic.

The NYSGC did, however, inch forward on the matter by declaring at the end of Monday's 14-minute meeting that October would be the month in which it sought public commentary from stakeholders.

"I think we all agree that this is a matter that needs to be brought to closure sooner rather than later. Some of us contend that it's been out there too long," said NYSGC chairman Barry Sample. "The theme of the October meeting is going to be the crop."

Commissioner Peter Moschetti agreed: "From my perspective, it is time to move on that issue." He added that the NYSGC needs to consider "everything from an outright ban, as they did in New Jersey," where whip use is only permitted in emergency safety situations, to the California, Kentucky, and Maryland models, which have variations about the number of allowable strikes and the manner in which they are delivered.

"I think the time has come. We want to do this. We've talked about doing this. Staff has done their work," Moschetti said.

After soliciting the stakeholders' commentary, the NYSGC would have to come back at a future meeting to vote on any proposed rule it might craft. If that rule passes the proposal stage, it must be published in the New York State Register and be sent out for a general public comment period.

Then commissioners would then come back for a final vote, pushing any implementation into 2021.

The Jockeys' Guild has largely opposed measures of whip reform that have surfaced in other states. The organization that represents riders across the continent has cited various objections, including concerns that safety would be compromised without whip usage and an argument that the sport's regulators are waging a crackdown on public perceptions rather than reality. The Guild has also stressed the need for North American uniformity in whip regulation, a request that has not been met by the various state-by-state implementations of the new anti-whipping plans.

"I just ask that [stakeholder input] be done by the end of October. And if people are not available, they're not available," Moschetti said.

IF YOU ARE AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR, WHAT TAX DEDUCTIONS ARE YOU ENTITLED TO?

COVID-19 has changed the way we go about our daily lives. It has also increased the number of individuals who are self-employed and have no other employees, also known as independent contractors.

The formal definition of an independent contractor is a person or entity contracted to perform work for, or provide services to another entity as a non-employee (meaning that the employee is "at will" and not eligible for an employer's health or retirement benefits). The general rule is that an individual is an independent contractor if the payer has the right to control or direct only the result of the work and not what will be done and how it will be done. The earnings of a person who is working as

an independent contractor are subject to self-employment tax.

Self-employed professions such as jockeys, jockey agents, confirmation videographers, bloodstock agents, blacksmiths, veterinarians, exercise riders, equine chiropractors, bid spotters/auctioneers, sales short listers, etc. are all possible examples of horse-related independent contractors.

Prior to the enactment of the new tax act in 2017, if you operated your business as a sole proprietor, you could still take advantage of many of the tax deductions that you incurred. With the adoption of the new Tax Act came a limitation on the deductibility of state income taxes, real estate taxes and the elimination of all personal business-related expenses.

Expenses that Could Become Tax Deductible

There are a number of expenses, if you are in the above categories, that can be tax deductible such as the following:

- a. Training--training expense whether for racing, shows or for sales become deductible
- b. Professional fees
- c. Veterinary fees
- d. Vanning and other transportation expenses--if you own racehorses and/or consign horses at sales, you should be sure to include all transportation expenses
- e. Work clothing--all of you involved in the training side of the business, including jockeys, should deduct any garments/outfits that are primarily worn while riding, breaking or training horses
- f. Barn and stable supplies
- g. Feed and shavings; as well as removal expenses
- h. Books, magazines, online subscriptions and/or sales analysis reference guides
- i. Breeding fees
- j. Broodmare leases
- k. Meals for employees who were taking care of the horses
- l. Equine therapy
- m. Depreciation (including bonus depreciation)

In order to ensure that you are maximizing the above deductions, be sure to communicate with your tax provider. Have your accountant confirm your status as an independent contractor and indicate that status on your tax returns. If you want additional legal protection, you may want to either form an LLC which provides you with additional liability protection or a Subchapter S Corporation.

Important Additional Fact

The deductions listed above are, in most cases, equally tax deductible for partners in an LLC or shareholders in Sub Chapter S corporations. **Cont p13**

Increasing Your Retirement Contributions

Most independent contractors can make retirement contributions into an IRA. The annual contribution limit for 2020 is \$6,000 or \$7,000 if you are age 50 or older. If you have a Roth IRA, the 2020 contributions may also be limited based on your filing status and income.

However, there is a plan that will allow you to greatly increase your retirement contributions and simultaneously reduce your taxable income. A Solo 401(k), also known as a Self-Employed 401(k) or Individual 401(k) is a 401(k) qualified retirement plan that was designed specifically for employers with no full-time employees. The Solo 401(k) is unique because it only covers the business owner(s) and their spouse(s), thus, not subjecting the 401(k) plan to the complex ERISA (Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974) Rules which sets minimum standards for employer pension plans with non-owner employees. Independent contractors who qualify for the Solo 401(k) can receive the same tax benefits as in a general 401(k) plan but without the employer being subject to the complexities of ERISA.

The contribution limits for the Solo 401(k) are the same as a standard 401(k). They are broken down into a profit-sharing contribution, which comes from the employer and a salary deferral contribution which comes from the employee. However, due to the fact that in a Solo 401(k) the plan holder is acting both as employer and employee, the actual percentages assume a more meaningful role. If the plan holder is filing as a Sole Proprietor or Single Member LLC, which is true in most cases, then the limit is capped at 20% of the self-employed income, plus \$19,000 for 2020. IRC Section 401(a)(3) states that the amount of employer contributions is limited to 25% of the entity's income subject to self-employment tax. Schedule C sole proprietors must do an added calculation starting with earned income to determine their maximum contribution which, in effect, brings the maximum 25% of compensation limit down to 20% of earned income.

In both cases, the IRS has declared an upper limit for total employer and employee contributions to a plan, the IRS Section 415(c) limit which may not be exceeded. As of 2020, this upper limit is \$56,000 for those under 50 and \$62,000 for those 50 and older.

Other contribution limits may apply so we highly recommend that you discuss your options with your tax professional and/or investment advisor.

There may be alternative retirement plans such as SEP which you may be eligible for.

Bottom Line

The Thoroughbred horse business is like no other business when it comes to its complexity, challenges and strategies.

The same can be said as to how to maximize your tax deductions.

LOCAL TRAINER HOPING TO REVITALIZE RACING IN ANTIGUA, BUILD A NEW TRACK

There has not been any racing in Antigua since June, 2019, and when it does return it will be contested at a bare-bones track that is too small, too narrow and doesn't drain properly. There's no certainty that racing in Antigua can survive, which is why a local horseman named Hansen Richards is behind an ambitious plan to build a new track on the Caribbean island.

"After all the work I have done, I cannot sit back and do nothing," the trainer said. "I want to put horse racing in Antigua on the map."

That won't be easy. Richards is not a wealthy man and racing in his country is overrun with problems. But he believes he can find investors to help him fulfill his dream. He wants a new track to be the centerpiece of a multi-purpose facility that would include restaurants, shops, beach condos, a marina and, eventually, a casino. He has already found the land for the project, 377 acres that is valued at \$32 million. The project would be similar to what the China Horse Club did when building a racetrack in Saint Lucia.

All Richards needs now is someone with deep pockets.


"I want to find an investor who can see the vision I have going forward," he said.

Richards works as a customs inspector and trains as a hobby. He grew up poor and in a neighborhood where crime was a problem. He is inspired by the thought that his project could create jobs for his fellow countrymen.

"I was raised up in the ghetto," he said. "I look at this as an opportunity to raise standards of living for my community and for my friends. Unfortunately, some of them have lost their lives to violence. I made a vow I would make our society better and provide some jobs and programs out of the horse racing industry."

He originally wanted to play professional basketball at some level, but reversed course and started training in 2007. In Antigua, it's not a job where anyone can expect to make a living, but there are people like Richards who are so passionate about the sport that they'll dedicate many hours a week to training.

He is also working on creating a stud book for horses bred in Antigua. That would allow them to race in other Caribbean countries and, perhaps, in the U.S. They've been racing at Cassada Gardens Race Track since 1964, running anywhere from 12 to 20 dates a year. Richards's father was an owner, trainer and breeder and he brought his son to the track a time when he racing was a popular pastime on the island.

"The tradition is that it was a family affair to go to the races," Richards said. "You'd get an average of 6,500 to 7,000 people at the races in the '80s and '90s. The people in Antigua love horse racing."

Richards said that since racing reached its peak in Antigua, interest in the sport has dwindled and now a typical crowd might be 2,500. He said that one of the reasons is that little has been spent on upkeep or improvements and fans don't want to spend the afternoon in what he says is a rundown Cassada Gardens facility.

The problem has only been compounded since June, 2019, when the final leg in the Antigua Triple Crown series was run. A spate of wet weather that began last summer caused racing to be canceled for the remainder of 2019 because the track was not fit for training. COVID-19 has kept the track closed this year. A possible re-opening in December has been mentioned by officials of the Antigua Turf Club.

But Richards doesn't see Cassada Gardens as the future of Antigua racing. It is lacking in many basic amenities and the racetrack itself is a 5 1/2-furlong track that is just 40 feet across and can't handle a lot of rain.

"Our major issue of concern is the racing surface," he said. "It has always been an issue and when you have inclement weather the horses cannot exercise."

Another issue is the purses. They are so small that owners have little incentive to invest in horses. Richards said an average purse would be in the neighborhood of \$800 U.S. Normally, Antigua gets most of its horses from places like Puerto Rico and Florida.

"It cost \$6,000 U.S. to fly horses here from Miami," he said. "That is a lot of money when you look at the purses. I do not encourage anyone to purchase horses to run here. I do it because I love it and I know what I am getting into."

With a new racetrack, he sees Antigua simulcasting its product to other countries, picking up additional sponsors and increasing the amount of money brought in by gate receipts. There's also the possibility of having a casino to help fund purses.

Richards has created the company Mecke Development Corporation and has given himself the title of Managing Director. For now, it is little more than a concept. But its head executive is enthusiastic, driven and has a plan. He sees great potential for horse racing in his country and says he will do what it takes to ensure its future.

T.I.P. DEADLINES FOR 2021 FAST APPROACHING

Applications for The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) horse shows and T.I.P. Youth Ambassador Program are due Sept. 30 and Oct. 1, respectively. Created in 2011, T.I.P. sponsors Thoroughbred classes and high-point awards at sanctioned horse shows, year-end performance awards, a recreational riding program, and non-competition awards.

Horse shows, trials, and other events interested in offering 2021 T.I.P. awards must apply by Sept. 30, even if the dates are tentative. Shows that offered awards in 2020 or that were approved for awards but were canceled must still reapply for 2021.

The Youth Ambassador program, which selects about a dozen young people annually to represent T.I.P. and the Thoroughbred breed at local barns, shows, and other events, closes applications Oct. 1.

Youth Ambassadors must be 18 or younger as of Jan. 1, be a resident of the U.S. or Canada, own or lease a Thoroughbred with a T.I.P. number, and must participate in T.I.P. shows or programs.

“Offering T.I.P. awards is a great way of increasing participation from Thoroughbreds and their riders at horse shows, and we encourage applications from all interested groups in anticipation of a more typical horse show schedule in 2021,” said Kristin Werner, senior counsel of The Jockey Club and coordinator for T.I.P. “Similarly, our Youth Ambassador Program has proven to be an excellent opportunity for individuals to develop leadership skills while promoting the versatility of the Thoroughbred breed.”

TEOFILO COLT SETS TATTERSALLS IRELAND RECORD



Lot 165 topped Monday's session | Tattersalls Ireland

NEWMARKET, UK—In the unfamiliar setting of Newmarket instead of Fairyhouse, the uprooted Tattersalls Ireland September Yearling Sale broke a new barrier as well as new ground with a record top lot sold for £325,000.

The fact that transactions are being made in pounds rather than euros is another anomaly in this strange year but the name in the buyer's slot alongside the market leader was the same as last year: Hong Kong Jockey Club.

For Clare Manning of Boherguy Stud this too was a breakthrough, but in the weeks since the session-topping Teofilo (Ire) colt was consigned to the sale, two of his full-brothers have provided significant updates. The 3-year-old Assurance (Ire) is now a winner for Manning's grandfather and the colt's breeder Jim Bolger and, better still, the 2-year-old Gear Up (Ire), is unbeaten in two starts, including the G3 Tattersalls Acomb S.

The affinity for the Toccet mare Gearanai with Teofilo (Ire) had already been indicated by her 4-year-old son Guaranteed (Ire), who won the G3 Eyrefield S. as a juvenile and garnered more black-type last year in the Listed TRI Equestrian Silver S. Repeated matings with the Bolger-bred and -trained stallion, who is now one of the stalwarts of Kildangan Stud, has certainly reaped rewards, both on the track and in the ring.

Manning said of lot 165, "He has been a superstar since he has been here. He has the pedigree and the physique, he was busy and had a number of vettings, but it was difficult in this climate to gauge how much people had in their pockets." [Cont. p2](#)

Addeybb (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) first came to wider prominence when cruising home to an easy victory in the Lincoln on the first weekend of the British turf season in 2018. Behind him that day in second was **Lord Glitters (Fr)** (Whipper), and the two of them were reunited on Saturday to finish in the same positions in a strong field for the Listed Doonside Cup at Ayr.

In the two and a half years between these two races, both horses have won at Group 1 level, with Addeybb lighting up the gloom of early lockdown for William Haggas's stable by snaring the G1 Ranvet S. and G1 Longines Queen Elizabeth S. in a fruitful sojourn in Sydney earlier this year. Since then he had been seen just once in Britain before Saturday's victory when finishing second to Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the Prince of Wales's S. on ground probably a tad faster than ideal. She added, "I've had a brief chat with grandad and he is absolutely delighted."

Acting on behalf of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, Mick Kinane, a former rival in the saddle for Manning's father Kevin, said after outbidding Alex Elliott, "He is a lovely horse, and we didn't think we'd be pushed that hard. He was a standout, he could have been sold here in a few weeks at the October Sale. Hopefully, he can run like his brother."

Kinane also signed for **lot 63**, Croom House Stud's colt by Mastercraftsman (Ire) out of Barzilian Samba (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) at £55,000. The mare has already produced the Hong Kong Group 2 winner Endowing (Ire) by Mastercraftsman's sire Danehill Dancer (Ire) and she is herself a half-sister to Group 3-winning sprinter Brazilian Bride (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}).

With the day's final statistics converted into euros for the sake of comparison, the first session of the sale must be considered to be the most successful yearling sale in this difficult season so far. The clearance rate dropped four points but was still a respectable 83% with 172 of the 206 horses to pass through the

ring finding a buyer. The average figure of €25,706 (£23,392) was fractionally up on last year, while the median was down by only 3% at €20,330 (£18,500). The first day's aggregate was €4,421,441 (£4,023,500), down from €5,084,500 on the corresponding day last year.

Double Bonus For Beechvale

The double whammy of a Group 1 update and having a yearling by a desirable young stallion turned a 10-time profit for Beechvale Stud, who bought the half-brother to Champers Elysees (Ire) (Elzaam {Aus}) for €19,000 as a foal. Ten months later the colt's sire Mehmas (Ire) is romping away with the first-season sires' championship, while his half-sister is now the winner of the G1 Matron S. for Johnny Murtagh.

Joe Foley, who stands the sire of Champers Elysees at his Ballyhane Stud, went to £190,000 to secure **lot 222** on behalf of Clipper Logistics.

"He is a particularly nice colt," he said. "The mare is good, and has actually bred two good Elzaams. Obviously Champers Elysees is there, but even without her he was a lovely colt and the sire has done very well so I'm pleased to get him." **Cont. p3**

The colt's dam Bulrushes (GB) (Byron {GB}) has proved her prowess beyond that, however, as he is just one of her four black-type-earning offspring, which include Ross Castle (Ire) (Bushranger {Ire}) and Ten Year Ticket (Ire) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}).

After signing the docket at £75,000 for the colt who will be campaigned by Middleham Park Racing, Cox said, "We're delighted to get the brother of Snazzy Jazzy, who won the sales race and was a prolific earner for us. I loved him when I saw the horse, he is really athletic, and sadly there are not many Red Jazzes around. Breeze-up Buyers Back For More

Following a heavily disrupted 2-year-old sales season, it has been heartening to see breeze-up pinhookers reinvesting since the yearling sales started last month, and Katie Walsh of Greenhills Farm stepped in for one of the best bred fillies in the book on Monday.

Lot 98 was one of just two Kingman (GB) yearlings in the September catalogue and, as a daughter of juvenile winner Continental Drift (Smart Strike) boasts a deep pedigree with dual Group/Grade 1 winner Intercontinental (GB) (Danehill) as her grandam and Juddmonte's outstanding broodmare Hasili (Ire)

(Kahyasi {Ire}) as her third dam.

The Juddmonte-bred filly was offered by the Castlebridge Consignment and sold for £70,000.

"She has a pedigree to die for and she will always hold her value as a broodmare," said Walsh after signing for the sister to maiden winner and Group 3-placed juvenile Masen (GB), who is trained by Ger Lyons.

"Hopefully her full-brother will go on next year and do some more. This filly has a lot more positives for me than negatives."



the May-foaled filly out of the Group 3 winner Duchess Andorra (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}).



The Newmarket training ranks will be boosted by at least two new names in the coming weeks and months, with Harry Eustace set to take over from his father James and Belgian-born Kevin Philippart having recently left James Fanshawe to set up on his own.

Eustace will be welcoming a daughter of Australia (GB), the sire of three group winners in the last 10 days, after Hubie de Burgh went to 68,000gns for lot 115 from Manister House Stud.

"She is for a new client, new to the industry, and he particularly wanted to send a horse into training with Harry Eustace," said de Burgh of the first foal of the unraced Dillydallydo (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).


"She is by a good young stallion, who is proven producer of group performers. She comes from a good family, and if she becomes a stakes performer she will be worth many multiples more."





He may well have his favoured soft ground come British Champions Day back at Ascot, where he is likely to meet fellow mudlover Mishriff (Ire) (Make Believe {GB}) in the Champion S.

Of course, if Addeybb wasn't missing two vital parts of his anatomy he may not still be racing at the age of six but, having been gelded even before he made his debut, there were no potential stud decisions to distract his owner Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum. Addeybb is now the winner of 10 of his 19 starts and is very much the star of Haggas's Somerville Lodge.

He'll have some competition for that title in the stable in the coming months, however. The trainer has sent out 13 winners in the last fortnight, with five of those coming on Saturday. [Cont. p7](#)

Addeybb spearheaded a treble at Ayr, with rising sprint star **Nahaarr (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) pouncing late in the Ayr Gold Cup to give Sheikh Ahmed a big-race double, and **Johan (GB)** (Zoffany {Ire}) sticking his nose in front where it mattered most when winning the mile handicap by a short-head.

Over in France, **Sea Of Faith (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}), the sister to G1 Sydney Cup winner Shraaoh (Ire), landed her first stakes win in the Listed Prix des Tourelles, and at Newbury **Ilaraab (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) added to both his trainer's and Sheikh Ahmed's good day when winning his fourth race on the bounce from only five lifetime starts. Stakes company surely beckons for him.

For Haggas's Ayr hat-trick the man in the saddle was Tom Marquand, whose prolific winter in Australia was greatly enhanced by his association with Addeybb and whose rising stardom in the riding ranks is rivaled only by his own girlfriend, Hollie Doyle. At the time of writing Marquand was in joint-second with William Buick in the jockeys' championship on 86 wins behind reigning champion Oisin Murphy. Doyle, who continued her excellent run as retained jockey to Imad Al Sagar with victory in the Listed John Musker Fillies' S. aboard the John Gosden-trained **Majestic Noor (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), is in fourth place.

Like Haggas, Marquand has also notched 13 winners in the last fortnight and, though Addeybb may well be his favourite, he doubtless enjoyed riding an even older warrior, **Caspian Prince (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) to his 21st win at Yarmouth last Wednesday. The 11-year-old has now run 105 times, and his two victories this season have both come in the hands of Marquand. Moreover, Caspian Prince, who recorded his latest success off a mark of 100, set a new five-furlong track record. If you blinked and missed that, you can catch him again in action on Tuesday in the 2:40 at Beverley.

Victory Chant

With the yearling sales now in full swing, there will undoubtedly be concerns over how well the middle to lower tiers of the market will hold up in the coming weeks. The last week on the racecourse has again delivered reminders that

good horses can come from anywhere and that all level of sales are worth perusing by agents doing their jobs properly.

One man who has a proven track record of buying stakes performers for very reasonable sums is Federico Barberini, the British-based Italian agent who, with Roger O'Callaghan, unearthed Dream Ahead at Keeneland's September Sale for \$11,000. His latest success story is the G3 Prix Eclipse winner **Plainchant (Fr)** (Gregorian {Ire}), who has been highly progressive in her five starts to date for Maurizio Guarnieri.

Also an Italian native, Guarnieri is based near Bordeaux at La Teste de Buch, where Plainchant recorded her first two victories, the second of those coming in the Listed Criterium de Bequet. She then ventured north to Deauville to take second in the G2 Shadwell Prix du Calvados before last Friday's group victory at Chantilly.

Plainchant failed to sell in the ring at last year's Arqana October Sale but a private sale was agreed immediately

afterwards and Barberini bought the filly from her breeder Haras des Loges for just €4,000. Her earnings to date, including French premiums, stand just shy of €120,000.

The filly became the second group winner for her Rathasker Stud sire Gregorian, and Barberini is the man who signed the ticket for both of them, the first being the G3 Summer S. winner Queen Jo Jo (GB).

Gregorian's sire Clodovil (Ire),

who stands alongside him at Rathasker, had only 14 named foals in 2018 but he too has been represented by a smart juvenile in France this season in the G3 Prix Francois Boutin winner Tiger Tanaka (Ire). He also featured in the list of sires with stakes winners over the weekend thanks to his 5-year-old son **Duca Di Como (Ire)**, who won his second listed race of the season at Bro Park in Sweden.

A Spanish Queen For Kingman

At the other end of the sales figures, the filly who topped the Goffs November Foal Sale of 2018, made a winning debut in Madrid on Sunday for trainer Alvaro Soto. Now named **Reina Madre (Ire)**, the daughter of Kingman (GB) races in the name of Centurion, the racing and breeding operation of Leopoldo Fernandez Pujals.

The owner has amassed his fortune through telecommunications companies and pizza restaurants in his native Spain and has been notably active at the sales in Europe and America over the last few years, buying both young stock and broodmares.

Reina Madre, a €350,000 foal, was the sole weanling purchase at Goffs that year by agent Francisco Bernal of Outsider Bloodstock, who was acting on behalf of Fernandez Pujals. He also bought Simawa (Ire) (Anabaa), a half-sister to Sinndar (Ire) from the mares' sale that year for €210,000. A fortnight later, he signed for six mares at the Tattersalls December Sale for 1,145,000 guineas.

The spending of Fernandez Pujals was increased further still with an outlay of \$3.3 million for broodmares at Keeneland's November Sale of 2019, at which he indicated his intention to amass a band of 100 broodmares.

Reina Madre was bred in Ireland by Paddy Burns and is one of three fillies listed in training in Spain for Centurion. Her taking debut over 1400 metres in the Premio Carlos Sobrino at Hipodromo La Zarzuela gave the impression there is plenty more to come.

Time To Say Goodbye

There has been an abundance of [tributes to Pat Smullen](#) Smullen since his sad passing last Tuesday. All have pointed to the thoroughly decent man he was out of the saddle, as well as the unstinting professionalism he exhibited in his riding days.

This element of his character continued after his enforced retirement 17 months ago on health grounds. At that time, he had recently started a weekly column in *TDN Europe* and we were proud to have him as a much-respected member of our editorial team.

Though being a columnist would have come a very distant third at best on his career wishlist behind being a jockey and an advisor to Moyglare Stud, it was a role he took very seriously. In common with so many of Pat Smullen's family members, friends, colleagues and fans, we will miss him terribly.

BHA/HRI ADJUST RESTRICTIONS ON INTERNATIONALLY-TRAINED RUNNERS

Reciprocal arrangements on participation by runners trained in international jurisdictions were announced jointly by the British Horseracing Authority and Horse Racing Ireland on Monday. Beginning on Oct. 1, internationally-trained horses will be permitted to participate in all British races other than Class 5 and 6 handicaps/classified stakes on the Flat and Class 5 handicaps over Jumps. All such runners will be subject to the relevant government regulations. The same arrangements will also be introduced in Ireland on Oct. 1. The Irish Rules of Racing will continue to state that "a horse trained outside of Ireland, with a Flat handicap rating of less than 60 will not be qualified to run in an Irish Flat handicap." All overseas runners in Ireland will also be required to adhere to Irish government guidelines and HRI protocols.

The UK Industry Racing Group determined that it is appropriate to relax these restrictions which were approved by the BHA board on Sept. 15. [Cont. p9](#)

Going forward, the purpose of the new restrictions is intended to balance the importance of GB-trained horses being given an opportunity to run, especially in low-grade handicaps, with the requirement to improve the quality of racing and see the best possible horses compete, and encourage international competition. However, these restrictions will remain under constant review as the COVID-19 pandemic continues.

WARWICK WELCOMES PILOT CROWD

Warwick Racecourse welcomed a crowd of 500 annual members and hospitality guests for its jumps meeting on Monday. It was only the second time since racing resumed from a nine-week shutdown on June 1 that a crowd was permitted on a British racecourse—Doncaster had a week-long pilot project planned for its St Leger festival but that was shut down after just one card due to tightened government regulations.

Trainer Christian Williams was among those praising the Warwick project on Monday, saying, “It was brilliant, I think everything has been run so well. I think we’ve advertised ourselves well, and it was just great to come in today and see the crowd here. It’s our sport, and it’s great to see people back at the races.”

Racing continues to hold its collective breath, however, with Prime Minister Boris Johnson set to make a statement on Tuesday in the wake of rising COVID-19 levels in the country.

Owners were allowed to return to Irish racecourses beginning on Monday, with meetings staged at Listowel and Fairyhouse. Part owner Darragh McDonagh was on-course to see his Politicise win the featured Liam Healy Memorial Lartigue Hurdle at Listowel, and he said, “We come to Listowel every year and

normally we come Thursday and go home on Sunday, but today is strange. We went for lunch in Listowel and were considering staying down today if the horse won, so at least we have decisions to make.

“It is a strange atmosphere, but they are doing the best they can. We are all trying to do our bit to stay safe and we’re back racing, so we’ll take it.”

Fairyhouse’s General Manager Peter Roe said of the return of owners, “It’s a great step. It’s the first tiny steps, and we hope we can keep going. It’s great just to get a bit of atmosphere back here again, and great to see their enthusiasm. They pay the bills, keep the show on the road, and it’s great to have them back. They’ve come back to a different experience than they left beforehand, but I think everyone here is just delighted to get going again—we hope we’ll be able to continue.”

ALKUMAIT ENTERS DEWHURST PICTURE

Group 2 winner Alkumait (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) is likely for the G1 Dewhurst S. on Oct. 10, but would need to be supplemented. A winner at Goodwood at second asking on July 28, the Shadwell colourbearer won the G2 Mill Reef S. by 3/4 of a length at Newbury on Sept. 19.

“We were absolutely thrilled with him,” said Sheikh Hamdan’s racing manager Angus Gold of the Marcus Tregoning trainee. “He showed a really nice turn of foot and won very nicely. The Mill Reef/Middle Park double has never really worked out for us, so we were never going to go down that route.

“His action would suggest he prefers top of the ground. That’s not to say he wouldn’t handle cut in the ground, but I certainly don’t think he would want it heavy.

“Marcus would like to run Alkumait again this year—and as he said on Saturday, the only race for him really is the Dewhurst, which we didn’t enter him for because he’d only won a maiden at that stage.

“We’ll see how the land lies. We also have [G2 Champagne S. runner-up] **Albasheer (Ire)** (Shamardal) as a possible for the Dewhurst—I think he was undone by his inexperience as much as anything at Doncaster.

“There would be a question mark over the trip for Alkumait—but if he settled well, like he did on Saturday, he’d give himself a chance. Seven furlongs at Newmarket is a different test to six at Newbury, so we’ll see.

“It wouldn’t be the end of the world if he didn’t run again this year, (but) the Dewhurst is the best 2-year-old race in England, so if you can give yourself a better chance of winning it, maybe you should.”

CON TE PARTIRO RETIRED, WILL SELL AT KEENELAND

The racetrack career of dual Group 1 winner and **'TDN Rising Star'** Con Te Partiro (USA) (Scat Daddy {USA}) has come to an end, with the mare to be sold at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale without having another run.

A small setback at trackwork saw her connections, headed by Newgate Managing Director Henry Field, opt not to give her a farewell run in Australia and also skip the Breeders' Cup meeting.

"She did a piece of work there and came out of the piece of work just feeling her knee. So we just erred on the side of caution. She has done her job. She has won two Group 1s, so we just thought there is no point taking a risk. She's been good to us and we should be good to her," Field told *TDN AusNZ*.

The imported mare, who was purchased by SF Bloodstock and Newgate Farm for US\$575,000 (AU\$785,000) at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, became an unlikely hero of the 2020 autumn, having been brought out of retirement after missing to Zoustar last spring.

She won both the G1 Coolmore Classic and the G1 Coolmore Legacy for her trainers Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott, becoming the flagbearer for the black and red Newgate colours.

Prior to her first retirement, she has been a stakes winner in three countries having won the Listed Bolton Landing S. at Saratoga and the Listed Sandringham H. at Royal Ascot for her previous trainer Wesley Ward, before travelling to Australia

where she won the G3 Dark Jewel Classic for her new ownership.

"It was great what she has been able to do. She's been a great mare and I think it's really credit to Adrian Bott," Field said. "He was very bullish that if we put her back into training, she could go to the next level and his judgement was to prove correct.

"It was great for Adrian. She has been an important horse in his career and we have had a great ride with her. I'm sure wherever she ends up, she will be a very special commodity."

Field said the original travel plans to the United States would progress and said that he and SF Bloodstock's Tom Ryan and Gavin Murphy felt Keeneland was the right place to sell such an internationally performed mare.

"She was booked to fly out in mid-October to Kentucky and she will still be on that flight. She will now ship to the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale," he said. "She looks like being the standout mare in that catalogue. She's got a huge pedigree and it is a rare achievement to do what she has done on three continents."

Bred by KC Garrett Farm, Con Te Partiro is out of Grade I-placed mare Temple Street (USA) (Street Cry {Ire}), who has also produced the listed winner Donworth (USA) (Tiznow {USA}). Among her extended family are North American Grade I winners A Phenomenon (USA) (Tentam {USA}), Seattle Meteor (USA) (Seattle Slew {USA}), Pleasant Stage (USA) (Pleasant Colony {USA}), Marsh Side (USA) (Gone West {USA}), Nadal (USA) (Blame {USA}) and Changeintheweather (USA) (Gone West {USA}).

"We just felt with her pedigree, coming from a massively deep North American family, and being by Scat Daddy, who has been an extraordinary stallion, she is well-suited to a Northern Hemisphere broodmare band so it makes sense to sell her over there," Field said. "The transport cost of a mare like her is negligible compared to her overall value. We thought that was a smart manoeuvre with that massive international pedigree and she has as extraordinary international CV.

"Keeneland were really eager to have her and we thought it made sense to offer her there."

Con Te Partiro retires having won six of her 25 starts and \$1.24 million in prizemoney.
