The Week in Review, by Bill Finley

When it was announced last week that a record \$748.6 million had been wagered on sports during September in New Jersey that appeared to be more bad news for horse racing. It was the most ever bet in any one state during a month and a sign of the times. The amount legally wagered on sports in this country is soaring, with no end in sight, and it stood to reason that some of that money had been siphoned off from racing.

Sports betting is now available in 18 states plus the District of Columbia, and 13 other states have introduced bills to legalize sports wagering. Despite a near complete shutdown of sports in the spring and early summer, the record \$13 billion bet legally on sports in 2019 will be shattered this year.

When the Supreme Court overturned the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act (PASPA) in May of 2018, it was widely feared that sports wagering would lure away a healthy chunk of racing's customers, causing a deep decline in handle. That may yet happen, but racing has, so far, been surprisingly resilient in the face of what figured to be a serious threat to its bottom line.

During the same month that sports bettors in New Jersey set a record, pari-mutuel wagering on racing in the U.S. rose by 29.64%. *Cont. p3*

RADICAL CHANGE, STATUS QUO, OR MIDDLE GROUND FOR NEW YORK WHIP RULES? *by T.D. Thornton*

New York has lagged other racing states in addressing changes to whip use designed to be more humane to Thoroughbreds. But not being an early adopter of controversial new rules can sometimes be an advantage, because regulators are able to assess what is and isn't working in other jurisdictions before making potentially radical modifications to long-standing practices.

That was the tone of discussion during the Oct. 19 teleconference meeting of the New York State Gaming Commission (NYSGC), which conducted what amounted to a 2 1/4-hour opinion-gathering dialogue on whether or not the state should adopt new whipping rules. No new regulations were proposed and no official vote on the matter was taken Monday. *Cont. p6*

The Week in Review *(cont. from p1)*

Because the Kentucky Derby was rescheduled and run over the Labor Day weekend rather than in May due to COVID-19, the September numbers can't be taken on the surface. Perhaps a better indicator is the number for the first nine months of the year. Despite all the havoc the coronavirus played on racing schedules, wagering nationwide for the year is down by just \$246 million or 2.86%. With a strong final three months, it's not impossible that the final numbers for the year will be even with the pre-coronavirus numbers from 2019.

There may be several scenarios in play here. The most obvious is that sports bettors and racing bettors could be two different animals and there is little crossover between the two. The same phenomenon largely occurred when so many tracks opened up casinos. Dennis Drazin, the chairman and CEO of Darby Development, the operators of Monmouth Park, said he has seen no signs that the track's racing bettors are shifting over to sports.

None of which means racing shouldn't take the sports betting threat lightly. Estimates are that within three years it will be legal in at least 30 states. That list could include California, Kentucky and Florida, three of the most important racing states. Sports betting is not yet legal in any of them. It is legal in New York, but not on-line and is limited to in-person betting at only some of the state's casinos.

And sports betting has a lot better chance than racing does of attracting future generations of potential customers.

There's also the cost of placing a wager. The average takeout on a racing bet is around 20%, a price that was installed when racing was the only sport that could be wagered on legally. That's more than double the price of making a sports bet, where the effective takeout is 9%.

Bettors are rational consumers who react to pricing and racing's exorbitant takeouts are giving them a valid reason to choose sports. That should mean that racing will make what seems like an obvious adjustment and drastically lower the takeout. That's not going to happen.

There are other ways for racing to try to keep pace with sports betting. Currently, a racing bet can't be made on a sports betting app or website. If that can change and a sports bet and a racing bet can be made from the same account that could lead to some sports bettors trying their luck at racing.

"We need to have horse racing on the same platform with other sports betting products," said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop. "Bettors need to be able to use the same wallet to bet on each. That hasn't happened and that is a disappointment."

The other avenue is in creating racing bets that mirror sports bets, starting with fixed odds wagers. Try explaining to the sports bettor why they can bet a horse at 7-2 only to have its odds drop to 2-1 after the race has begun. Once you have wagered \$110 to win \$100 on the Giants to cover the spread, the bet doesn't change so that you can only win \$80. Monmouth had hoped to institute fixed odds wagering as this year's meet, but Drazin said that the New Jersey Attorney General's office has yet to give a green light to the project. It should be available for the 2021 racing season.

It's hard to tell where this is heading and what impact sports betting will have on racing in, say, five years from now. Racing is holding its own for now, but how long can that last?

But the complaints expressed by Kentucky Downs management last week that its races aren't being fairly judged by the committee is a valid one. When you have 16 stakes races that are worth, on average, \$537,500, you have every right to expect better. That only five of the races are graded and none higher than the Grade III level doesn't make any sense.

In fairness, Kentucky Downs probably didn't deserve much better six or seven years ago when it was having trouble attracting top horses for its many rich events.

Trainers, particularly those outside of Kentucky, were slow to embrace the quirky European-style racetrack, but that has changed. It was just a matter of time until the purses became so high that people couldn't stay away. That's no doubt the reason that trainers such as Chad Brown, Bill Mott, Christophe Clement, Shug McGaughey and Richard Mandella participated at this year's meet, joining a strong roster of Kentucky-based trainers like Brad Cox, Steve Asmussen and Mike Maker.

With a \$1-million purse, the Calumet Farm Kentucky Turf Cup is attracting the best long-distance turf runners in training, but is just a Grade III. The Tourist Mile and the Gun Runner Dueling Grounds Derby are both worth \$750,000, but neither are graded. That makes them the richest, non-restricted stakes races run in North America that aren't at least a Grade III. Kentucky Downs also offers five \$500,000 races that are not graded.

So far, five horses who competed this year at Kentucky Downs have come back to win graded races, including Grade I winners **Harvey's Lil Goil** (American Pharoah) and **Ivar (Brz)** (Agnes Gold {Jpn}). And a number of Kentucky Downs graduates will participate in the Breeders' Cup. Those are facts that will be impossible to ignore, and it is expected that at least some of the track's stakes races will either be upgraded or receive a grade for the first time for 2021. If so, it will be long overdue.

Radical Change, Status Quo or Middle Ground for New York Whip Rules *(cont. from p1)*

Balancing perception versus reality was a chief topic though, as it has been in nearly every other jurisdiction where more stringent whipping rules have been implemented this year.

The NYSGC heard from stakeholders who want the status quo preserved, those who want the whip barred outright, and those who would be comfortable with a middle-ground compromise that preserves safety and competitiveness while eliminating the brutal imagery that is increasingly viewed as socially unacceptable and a hindrance to growing the sport's fan base.

The discussion unfolded against the backdrop of changes that have either already been implemented or are in the process of being codified into rules in various jurisdictions. At the strictest end of the spectrum, New Jersey is banning whip use altogether, except in emergency safety situations. California, Kentucky, Maryland, Delaware and Ontario are in the midst of introducing new rules based on strike limits, and several of those models further incorporate the manner (underhanded or overhanded) in which a jockey can whip.

Detailed explanations were very much in order, because several NYSGC members said outright that they didn't have a firm grasp of the state's current whip-use policies.

In particular, the concept of giving the horse a chance to respond after a certain amount of strikes needed to be clarified at the request of commissioners.

A panel of New York's commission stewards--Braulio Baeza Jr., who is assigned to the New York Racing Association (NYRA) tracks, Erinn Higgins of Finger Lakes, and Carmine Donofrio, a state steward emeritus, kicked off the discussion by outlining the current state standards on whipping.

Right now, New York stewards have broad powers to use discretion in issuing whip violations for imprudent or harmful whip usage. There are rules regulating a more cushioned construction of riding crops, but the "five strikes before giving a horse a chance to respond" standard is just a policy that the stewards adhere to and not an official rule. In order to gain licensure, a jockey must read and sign an acknowledgment that clearly spells out these parameters.

Baeza estimated that NYRA stewards impose about 10 penalties annually for whipping infractions, while Higgins said so far this year the Finger Lakes stewards have issued four.

"Most of the perception issues that we are dealing with now are in the stretch," Baeza said. "And I don't know how else to put it: We don't have a problem. [Why are we] trying to fix something that's not broken right now?"

Donofrio agreed, and added that if New York allowed riders to only carry whips for emergency safety use, it would be problematic for stewards to adjudicate violations.

"What if the jock says, 'I thought my horse was going to prop, I had to hit him?'" Donofrio asked. "Are you going to call him a liar?"

The Jockeys' Guild, represented by a trio of Hall-of-Fame riders--Mike Smith, John Velazquez, and Javier Castellano--spoke supportively of keeping the status quo in New York. The bulk of their comments focused on being able to maintain safety on horseback.

"People say, 'Use the reins,'" Smith said. "Well let me tell you something: Try pulling on a horse that weighs 1,200 pounds. And if it ain't working, all you have next is the riding crop. That's all we have. If you take that away, trust me--the game becomes twice as dangerous. If not more.

"I'm in a state right now, in California where I'm riding, [and] they have rules that are extremely strict," Smith continued. "They've changed our style of the way you're supposed to use your crop and it's not working here. We're having a lot of trouble with it. The system's set up to fail. You're having riders being suspended [and] fined for literally, absolutely nothing, and it's ruining our sport out here. Listening to the stewards there in [New York] speak, is the best that I've heard since this thing's been going on. You guys have got it right."

Smith said that the more humane versions of cushioned whips have made a huge positive difference in recent years, and he added that he's fine with rules that mandate giving a horse a chance to respond before further striking. But trying to administer only underhanded strikes and trying to keep count of the total number of hits a jockey has delivered during the entirety of a race is too difficult, he said.

Yet retired Hall-of-Fame jockey Chris McCarron argued that Smith is only partly right in his assessment. **Cont. p8**

"I could not agree more with Mike that the current riding crops are much kinder to utilize," McCarron said. "However, I disagree with Mike on one point [where he explained] it can be difficult or impossible to strike the horse backhanded or underhanded, especially on the left side. I think we're talking about world-class athletes here, and any change that may happen, I think these guys have the capabilities of adjusting to change."

James Gagliano, The Jockey Club's president and chief operating officer, said that while he respects the opinions of the men and women on horseback, it's his organization's duty to take a broader view on whipping that encompasses public perceptions as they relate to the longer-term health of the industry.

"In today's world, things are changing," Gagliano said. "To me and to The Jockey Club, we see a future where hitting an animal with a stick won't be acceptable, and certainly not for urging [horses to run faster]. We recognize that these are difficult things to change. It's going to take awhile."

Matt Luliano, the executive vice president and executive director of The Jockey Club, said his organization has amassed years of customer survey data to back up that point.

"We certainly didn't enter into this decision lightly, to eliminate the use of the whip for encouragement," Luliano said. "It was a long and painful process that was developed over several years when attempts to regulate the use of the whip had done very, very little to change public perception on its use."

"I realize it's a difficult pill to swallow because crops have been in racing for decades, if not centuries," Luliano continued. "But that perception of striking has changed. In the public's eye, it's something that has been a deterrent to them for greater participation of younger, new fans that may not have been to racing in the past. They see that as a significant barrier. And when we see it, that tells us it's something that needs to be addressed."

"It's a very, very difficult issue," Luliano summed up. "The representatives from the Jockeys' Guild, they're very informed. They have practical experience on the matter. But I think the time has come where we have to look at some of these other inputs that come into this decision, and begin to apply weight to those inputs."

NYRA vice president of racing operations Martin Panza advocated for a middle ground approach that balances safety needs while addressing perception problems. He backed up his position by saying NYRA has been seeing increased criticism of whip use via social media feedback, and he said NYRA has been working with the Guild since January on trying to craft uniform policies that would apply nationwide.

"I think we all agree they need to use the whip. [Horses] are herd animals. They will not go up the rail through a hole on their own," Panza said. "The jockey needs to be able to use the whip. We disagree with New Jersey on taking the whip away completely.

"[New York's stakeholders] have an advantage, because currently, you've got Woodbine and California with rules in place that only allow a horse to be hit underhanded," Panza explained. "And so we have the ability as a group to watch that for the next six months and see if, in fact, that is the right way to go."

Panza said the nation's top racing jurisdictions have an opportunity to set uniform policies that will have a trickle-down effect on smaller tracks within the nation's racing hierarchy. Even though some state racing commissions have already adopted differing whip rules, he said it's never too late to go back and tweak them for the sake of practical improvement.

Will Alempijevic, the executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said that New York's stewards and jockeys are collectively doing a "great job" and that "there does not seem to be an issue from our constituents." But, he added, the racing community should be mindful that "looking internally all the time is not necessarily the best path going forward, and we do need to look outward and grow the fan base."

The NYSGC gave few clues at the end of the meeting as to when, how, or if it would be crafting new rules, although commissioner Peter Moschetti indicated that a complete whipping ban wasn't likely. He also said that the commission needs to make sure that "bad behavior" doesn't become "a business decision" for jockeys who decide that the benefits of breaking the whip rules to win a big race outweigh the penalties for doing so.

Panza underscored near the end of the meeting that, "The train's left the station. California is at six strikes and it's underhand. Kentucky [is mandating] six strikes, albeit overhand. Whether we like it in New York or not, we're probably going to have to do something, or publicly we're going to get attacked."

In response to that point, NYSGC chairman Barry Sample asked rhetorically, "I've been hearing most of the day that in New York, we're doing a good job. And now I'm hearing that if we continue to do the job that we're doing, we're going to get attacked?"

Panza answered by way of example: "I think when you run a Triple Crown and you can hit a horse six times in the [GI] Kentucky Derby, and six times in the [GI] Preakness [S.], and [then] you come to New York [for the GI Belmont S.] and you can hit him 30 times, I'm pretty sure NBC is going to bring that up."

STAY THIRSTY COLT TOPS FASIG-TIPTON CALIFORNIA SALE

by Dan Ross and Jessica Martini

CYPRESS, CA - With numbers predictably down against a backdrop of pandemic and economic uncertainties, a total of 166 yearlings grossed \$3,735,700 during the Fasig-Tipton California Fall Yearlings Sale held Monday at Los Alamitos Race Course. The average of \$22,504 was down 15.9% from last year's inaugural Fasig California Yearling sale and the median dropped 30.0% to \$10,000.

"Statistically it was in line with what we've seen at the Kentucky sales and the Ocala sales," Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning said at the close of business Monday evening. "I thought, all in all, the storm was weathered better for this sale than I would have anticipated coming in."

The buy-back rate improved from 46.3% a year ago to 35.2% Monday.

"I think we've seen across the country, sellers have adjusted their expectations and are being more realistic in setting their reserves," Browning said.

The 2019 auction had been held in Pomona, but restrictions on crowd sizes in Los Angeles county forced the sales company to call an audible and move to Los Alamitos less than a month ago.

“We were limited in our ability to promote the sale because we didn't have a home for it until three weeks beforehand,” Browning said. “We had been holding the catalogue to be printed until we could find a date and a location.”

Browning continued, “I have to thank [Los Alamitos owner] Doc [Ed] Allred and his team and staff here at Los Alamitos because without their cooperation and effort and willingness to pitch in and help out the Thoroughbred industry, this sale would not have taken place today. It took a commitment to try to support the industry and it wouldn't have happened if they hadn't stepped up to the plate and said, ‘We will work with you and we'll do everything we possibly can to make the sale happen.’”

A colt by Stay Thirsty brought the auction's highest price when selling for \$200,000 to Naseer Fasihuddin. Fasihuddin purchased two of the auction's three six-figure lots. A year ago, six yearlings reached that threshold with a top price of \$150,000.

“At least we were able to provide a marketplace for the breeders to give them an outlet for their horses,” Browning said. “That is so crucial because at the end of the day, they have to stay in business to provide the product from a racing and sales perspective.”

Fasihuddin Quenches Thirst at Fasig-Tipton

Naseer Fasihuddin and partner Zahra Madiha attended Monday's Fasig-Tipton California Fall Yearlings Sale with just one stallion on their radar and they came away with a pair of yearlings by Stay Thirsty. Fasihuddin made the first six-figure purchase of the auction Monday when going to \$110,000 to acquire a colt (**hip 51**) by the 2011 GI Travers S. winner.

"We were looking for a Stay Thirsty," Fasihuddin confirmed after signing the ticket on hip 51, a son of graded winner Lost Bus (Bring the Heat). "It's a nice pedigree and he looked really good." Asked if he was done shopping after that purchase, Fasihuddin said, "I am still looking for one."

It didn't take long for Fasihuddin to add a second Stay Thirsty yearling to his stable as he went to a sale-topping \$200,000 to acquire **hip 79**. The dark bay is out of multiple stakes winner My Fiona (Ghostzapper).

"We came here specifically for these two horses," Fasihuddin said. "I am happy to get them."

Both yearlings were bred by Terry Lovingier and were consigned by his Lovacres Ranch. Stay Thirsty stands at Lovacres in Warner Springs for \$10,000.

In addition to the two newly acquired yearlings, Fasihuddin and Madiha's broodmare Smiling Tigress was bred to Stay Thirsty this past spring and is carrying her first foal. A \$20,000 purchase at the 2016 Barretts October Yearling sale, the mare was stakes placed and earned over \$175,000 on the racetrack for the couple.

Later in the auction, Fasihuddin continued his Stay Thirsty buying spree going to \$20,000 for a filly by the sire (**hip 244**). He also purchased a filly by Mohaymen (**hip 217**) for \$70,000 and a filly by Shaman Ghost (**hip 196**) for \$20,000.

Fasihuddin said a trainer had not yet been picked out for the yearlings.

More Nyquist for Eclipse Thoroughbreds

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners has already capitalized on Nyquist's fast start at stud and the operation added a California-bred yearling filly by the GI Kentucky Derby winner to its roster Monday at Los Alamitos. Eclipse's Aron Wellman signed the ticket at \$135,000 to acquire **hip 75** from Tom Bachman's Fairview consignment.

"She is by a stallion who is off to an incredible start," Wellman said of the filly. "Nyquist was obviously based in California, so I was very familiar with him and his record speaks for itself."

Eclipse enjoyed more success with the Darley stallion when Thinking, campaigned in partnership with Farfellow Farm, graduated at Keeneland Saturday.

Hip 75 is out of Moon River Gal (Malibu Moon), a daughter of multiple Grade I placed High Heeled Hope (Salt Lake) and a half-sister to graded winners Lady T N T (Justin Phillip) and Sweet Hope (Lemon Drop Kid). The yearling was bred by Bachman, who purchased Moon River Gal with the filly in utero for \$270,000 at the 2018 Keeneland November sale.

“This filly, to me, was a standout here at the sale,” Wellman said. “To my eye, physically she was a woman amongst girls. She is by a hot freshman sire and she has some female pedigree to bolster the quality. You add on the fact that she is Cal-bred and it’s the complete package. She was certainly the first round draft pick.”

Of plans for the yearling Wellman said, “We are going to ship her out of state to Florida to get her broken, but she’ll make her way back to California to take advantage of the Cal-bred incentives.”

Not This Time Filly for Nichols

Trainer Gary Mandella purchased a filly by hot freshman sire Not This Time for \$95,000 early in Monday’s Fasig-Tipton California sale. Mandella signed the ticket on hip 64 on behalf of longtime owner Tom Nichols. The yearling is out of Masterful Lass (Mizzen Mast) and is a half-sister to stakes-placed Avanti Bello (Include). Bred by Lou Neve, the chestnut filly was consigned by Adrian Gonzalez’s Checkmate Thoroughbreds.

“I just thought she was very athletic looking,” Mandella said. “We think she has a chance to be the right kind of horse. It’s not so much about her pedigree or her page, I just thought she looked the part and walked the part. She was the kind of athlete I like to take a shot with.”

Mandella said he expected the yearling will be seen on the racetrack next year.

“We will give her a month off to get over the stress and then go right back on,” he said. “Not This Time is certainly not going to hold you back in trying to get a 2-year-old to the races given what he is doing. I’m not going to rush her--because I never do--but I’m not opposed to her making the races at some point in her 2-year-old year. We will treat her like the good filly we think she is. I think she was worth every penny.”

Based in Omaha, Nebraska, Nichols campaigned 2003 GIII Hawthorne H. winner Keys to the Heart (Wild Again).

“[Nichols] has been with me for a few years,” Mandella said. “We have had some nice horses and some good luck. Hopefully she’ll be just a little bit better.”

Hanson All in Caps

Trainer Ryan Hanson, who purchased recent maiden special weight winner Teton Valley (Tapiture) for \$26,000 from the Barton Thoroughbreds consignment at last year’s Fasig-Tipton California Yearlings Sale, went back to that family’s consignment Monday to acquire a colt by Dads Caps (hip 142) for \$50,000. Hanson purchased the yearling on behalf of new client Linda Cannon.

“She’s from the Quarter Horse world,” Hanson said of Cannon. “They are joining us in the Thoroughbred world. He’s a very well-balanced colt and we hope he’s good.”

Hip 142 is out of Seeking the Ghost (Ghostzapper), a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Pomeroy (Boundary). Richard Barton purchased the mare in foal to Jimmy Creed for \$2,500 at the 2016 Keeneland November sale. That in utero filly sold for \$130,000 at the 2019 OBS April sale. Seeking the Ghost produced an Upstart colt this year. **Cont. p14**

Dads Caps, winner of the 2014 and 2015 GI Carter H., stands at Barton Thoroughbreds for \$2,500. His first foals are 2-year-olds this year, but the crop includes just three juveniles. He has 27 yearlings. In addition to hip 142, Barton Thoroughbreds sold another colt (**hip 162**) by the 10-year-old stallion for \$50,000 to Sausalito Partners and a third colt (**hip 203**) for \$40,000 to Maher Lutfallah.

While Dads Caps has yet to have his first winner, Hanson is no stranger to getting young stallions their first victories. The trainer sent out Weston, the first winner for freshman Hit It A Bomb, to win the Gil Best Pal S. in August.

"No day is too long, no task is too large or small," said Andrea Greathouse of Paramount Sales, "and he approaches his job with a smile and kindness."







RECORD-BREAKING SIYOUNI COLT HEADS ARQANA



The €525,000 Siyouni colt out of Prudente | Zuzanna Lupa

DEAUVILLE, France—With a pedigree that certainly would not look out of place at Arqana’s August Sale, Ecurie des Monceaux’s Siyouni (Fr) colt out of Prudente (Fr) (Dansili {GB}) set a new October Sale record in Deauville when selling to Al Shaqab for €525,000.

Hailing from the farm which supplied this year’s Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe winner Sottsass (Fr) by the same stallion, the April-foaled sale-topper (lot 157) became the subject of a bidding duel between Al Shaqab and Godolphin, with the Qatari operation placing a late final offer of €525,000 as the hammer was about to be brought down in Anthony Stroud’s favour.

A member of Ecurie des Monceaux’s signature family, he is the second foal of his dam, who is a full-sister to Prudentia (Ire), the dam of Group 1 winners Magic Wand (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). One of their half-sisters, the G3 Prix du Lutece winner Pacifique (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), produced the winner of that same race this year in Paix (Fr) (Muhaarar {GB}), while half-brother English King (Fr) (Camelot {GB}) won the Listed Lingfield Derby Trial. Prudente’s first foal, Hinoshita Kaizan (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), is now in training in Japan having been sold for €1.5-million at the August Sale two years ago.

GHAIYYATH RETIRED TO KILDANGAN

Ghaiyyath (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}–Nightime {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}) has been retired from racing after exhibiting muscle soreness. He will stand at Darley’s Kildangan Stud next year.

Bred by the Weld family’s Springbank Way Stud, Ghaiyyath was a standout from the start being out of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Nightime. He cost Godolphin €1.1-million at the 2015 Goffs November Foal Sale and showed promise soon after joining trainer Charlie Appleby, breaking his maiden at second asking at two before taking the G3 Autumn S. Ghaiyyath ran just once at three, winning the G3 Prix du Prince d’Orange, and after taking the G2 Prix d’Harcourt to kick off his 4-year-old campaign he made waves when winning the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden by 14 lengths. That performance prompted a 2019 G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe bid, but after making the running over the very soft going Ghaiyyath faded to tenth.

“He’s a gorgeous horse and everybody on the team fell in love with him as soon as we saw him,” said Al Shaqab’s Chief Operating Officer Paul Hensey, who accompanied agent Nicolas de Watrigant in signing for the colt. “He’s got one of the best pedigrees in the book and is from one of the best farms you can buy from, so there was an awful lot to like about him.”

In common with plenty of sales, the day’s trade started a little hesitantly at Arqana, but it warmed up significantly in the late afternoon with a rash of six-figure lots.

Hensey added, “We’ve bought a few today but we’ve had plenty of competition for those that we were on. I think there’s good solid trade for the horses that are here.”

By the session’s end, 163 of the 205 yearlings offered had been sold at a clearance rate just shy of 80%. The average was

€58,270 and the median €43,000, while turnover for the day was €9.5-million.

With the sale’s format having changed this year and extended to five days, no direct comparisons are being made with last year, when the shorter opening day’s average was €81,362 and the aggregate €8,788,000 from 105 horses sold.



From the same family as the top lot was **lot 137**, the half-brother to the aforementioned Group 3 winner Paix, who was bought for €210,000 and will join the stable of David Menuisier in Sussex, the trainer confirmed by phone. He said, "I've bought him for a client based in the Southern Hemisphere. He's a lovely horse from a very good family and I love middle-distance horses. With a bit of luck, he could be a colt for the Melbourne Cup in a few years. This is what my Australian and New Zealand clients are interested in."

Eight lots earlier (**lot 129**), another son of Siyouni had been knocked down in the name of Federico Barberini for €200,000. The son of 3-year-old winner Newton's Night (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) is bred on the same cross as both Sottsass and St Mark's Basilica and is from the family of dual Group 2-winning sprinter Muthmir (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), whose dam Fairy Of The Night (Ire) is a Danehill half-sister to his dam.

Siyouni's 11 yearlings sold through the first session of the October Sale returned an average of €146,545.

The latter is now en route to the Breeders' Cup, while the youngster will join the Chantilly stable of Hiroo Shimizu. The second-season Japanese trainer signed for **lot 110b** in association with Daniel Cole at €450,000 and she will race in the colours of Shigeo Nimura, the owner of this season's winning juvenile Midlife Crisis (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}).

"She looks like she will make a lovely 3-year-old," Shimizu said. "She is not very big but her way of moving puts me in mind of Deep Impact. She is light on her feet in the same way. I was instructed by the owner to buy an exceptional filly and, while she was not cheap, everyone was in for the same horse."

The filly was bred in partnership by Ecurie des Charmes and Ballylinch Stud, the latter being home to Matauri Pearl, who is from a family which includes the late Monsun (Ger) and recent dual French Classic winner Brametot (Ire). The 11-year-old mare

picked up all her black-type in Scandinavia, but her family background had plenty to recommend her when she went through the ring at the Arqana December Sale in 2015, where she was bought for the partners by Ghislain Bozo's Meridian International for €400,000. The Cape Cross (Ire) foal she was carrying at the time of her purchase became Cape Cavalli (Ire), a dual winner for Simon Crisford. Rated 91, he is entered in next week's Horses-in-Training Sale at Tattersalls. His younger half-sister Aunt Pearl is now unbeaten in two starts for Brad Cox and is a 'TDN Rising Star'. "Aunt Pearl broke the track record at Keeneland on her second start and that obviously took place in the intervening time

between the sale here in September. It didn't do this sale any harm and it didn't do us any harm, it was mutually beneficial," said Ballylinch Stud's managing director John O'Connor. "The mare has a foal who is a full-brother to Aunt Pearl and she is now in foal to Le Havre." **Cont. p5**

Quickfire Double For Godolphin

Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation played a major part in the success of the Tattersalls October Sale over the last fortnight and Anthony Stroud returned to action in Deauville to sign for a pair of yearlings on his behalf.

The agent went to €280,000 for Haras du Mezeray's Exceed And Excel filly (lot 165) out of the dual winner Rose Et Or (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}), a half-sister to the G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Coquerelle (Fr) (Zamindar). He returned two lots later for lot 167, a colt with Iffraaj on the other side of his pedigree, who was bought for €160,000. Bred by Monceaux in partnership with Trevor Harris of Newmarket's Lordship Stud, he is a son of the listed-placed Royale Du Buisson (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), whose first foal, Barakaat (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), was a winner last year for Sheikh Hamdan.

"The Exceed And Excel is an absolutely lovely filly," said Stroud. "I was underbidder on the Siyouni [top lot] and it just shows how in this market, when we've had a long sales season, a horse like that can come in and make a really good price like that, as did the Sea The Stars filly who sold earlier."

Stroud doesn't only buy for Godolphin and he signed for a total of seven yearlings on Monday to make him the second-leading buyer after Al Shaqab Racing, which bought 12. It is a sale which has been lucky for the agent in recent years as Stroud bought the James Fanshawe-trained G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Audarya (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) here three years ago.

"I always want to come to this sale. It's the fear of missing out on a champion," he said with a laugh. "But this sale has always been very successful with its runners, though I think this year it has maybe been diluted a bit by horses going to the September Sale who might have come here. In fact, I don't think we can really compare either of them to last year, everything is completely different this year." **Cont. p6**

On a day when it was announced that the G1 Qatar Prix de l'Abbaye winner Wooded (Fr) has been retired to start his stallion career at Haras de Bouquetot, his sire Wootton Bassett (GB), who recently left France for Coolmore's Irish base, remained in the spotlight in Arqana.

Haras de Castillon, owned by Bouquetot's manager Benoit Jeffroy, enjoyed a decent result when selling lot 208 for €210,000 to Luck Greayer Bloodstock. The colt hails from a line which has been successful for the Jeffroy family, notably through the G1 Prix d'Ispahan winner Never On Sunday (Fr) (Sunday Break {Jpn}), who is a full-brother to the colt's once-raced dam Texanne (Fr).

Alain Decrion and Nicolas de Watrigant of Mandore International combined to buy lot 29, the Wootton Bassett half-brother to the Group 3-placed treble winner Above (Fr) (Anjaal {GB}) from JK Thoroughbreds for €130,000.

Wootton Bassett's 10 yearlings sold on Monday fetched an average of €80,900, while his champion son Almanzor (Fr), whose first yearlings are selling this season, also had 10 change hands for an average of €61,300.

He was an outstanding part of the Moulton Paddocks team and I know that his numerous top-level successes gave our principal, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed, a great deal of pleasure."

Ghaiyyath is bred on the same Dubawi over Galileo cross that has produced Darley's exciting young sire Night Of Thunder (Ire). Ghaiyyath's page was enhanced after his purchase as a foal when his half-sister Zhukova (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) won a pair of Group 3s in Ireland for Dermot Weld and the GI Man O' War S. in the U.S. before being bought by Godolphin for 3.7-million gns at Tattersalls December in 2017. Zhukova has yearling and colt foals by Dubawi, while Nighttime has a yearling full-brother to Ghaiyyath bought by Godolphin for €1.2-million from Goffs November last year and a colt foal by Kingman (GB) slated to sell at the same sale next month.

Joe Osborne, managing director of Godolphin in Ireland, said, "Ghaiyyath is a great addition to our roster: his superior ability as a racehorse combined with his looks and his pedigree will make him a sought-after option for breeders. We are delighted he will be standing at Kildangan Stud next season."

WOODED RETIRED TO HARAS DE BOUQUETOT

Group 1 winner **Wooded (Ire)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}–Frida La Blonde {Fr}, by Elusive City) has been retired and will stand at Haras de Bouquetot in France next year. A fee for the winner of the 2020 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye will be announced later.

"Wooded stood out from the day he arrived for his good looks and ability and he was very sound, never missing a day's work," said trainer Francis-Henri Graffard. "In the G3 Prix Texanita he announced himself as a potential superstar and we were confident he would go close in the Commonwealth Cup. The difficulties of travelling this year made it impossible for him to run. As a racehorse he had so many qualities, class, courage and speed and he fully deserved his Group 1 win this year."

A winner and placed in both the G3 Prix la Rochette and G3 Prix Thomas Bryon as a juvenile in the Al Shaqab colours, the bay did his best running at three. This year's G1 Commonwealth Cup winner **Golden Horde (Ire)** (Lethal Force {Ire}–Entreat {GB}, by Pivotal {GB}) has been retired from racing after suffering a tendon injury. Stud plans have not yet been decided.

"He suffered a tendon issue that proved to be longer term than first realised, so rather than miss a complete season it was with reluctance that it was decided to retire him to stud," said trainer Clive Cox. "He was the best horse owned so far by HH Sheikh Sultan Al Deen bin Mohammed bin Salman Al Khalifa, who has been deeply involved with all decisions regarding what is best for the horse. We had hoped to finish this season on a high in the Champions Sprint at Ascot last Saturday, but it wasn't possible."

A £65,000 Goffs UK Premier sale yearling, Golden Horde won the G2 Richmond S. at two before finishing third in the G1 Prix Morny and second in the G1 Middle Park S. He opened his 3-year-old campaign with a victory in the Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot before finishing third while facing elders in the G1 July Cup. After finishing fifth, beaten just 1 1/2 lengths, in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest, Golden Horde was third in the G1 Sprint

Cup.

"I've been fortunate enough to train some top-class sprinters, most recently Harry Angel, but Golden Horde had all the physical attributes to maintain his progress, plus a wonderful temperament," Cox added. "He danced every dance, no matter what the course or ground, and was a model of consistency at the highest level. HEFFERNAN TO RIDE PRINCESS ZOE

Seamie Heffernan will ride **Princess Zoe (Ger)** (Jukebox Jury {Ire}) in Sunday’s G1 Prix Royal-Oak, with regular rider Joey Sheridan serving a 12-day ban for his use of the whip on the 5-year-old mare during her half-length win in the G1 Prix du Cadran on Oct. 3. The Cadran was the pinnacle of a meteoric rise for the Tony Mullins-trained grey; Princess Zoe was purchased from Germany earlier this year off a mark of 64 and has since won five straight races and is now rated 109.

“She’s as fit as she can be,” said Mullins. “Seamie sat on her on Sunday. He was very happy with her, and we were very happy with him. Joey is obviously suspended, which is a shame. He got six days for too many strikes with the whip, and they doubled the penalty because it was a Group 1, which is a rule I couldn’t find in any rule book anywhere. Anyway, that’s the way it goes.

“We’re very happy with the mare. All I can say is that in the back of my mind I’m thinking a two-and-a-half-mile race less than three weeks ago has to take its toll at some stage, but there is no evidence at the moment, so we’re set to go. We’ve done all our blood tests, and everything is perfect. I would say the next one is the acid test, in the last 100 metres next Sunday.”

E2SE STUDENTS ARRIVE AT THE NATIONAL STUD

Students from the UK and Ireland arrived at The National Stud this week to begin the 2020 TBA Entry to Stud Employment Programme, The National Stud announced on Monday. Those students that successfully completed phase one of the programme will be invited to interview for a work placement at a UK stud farm where they will complete their Level 2 Diploma in Work Based Racehorse Care (Breeding Option). The course is fully funded by the TBA and the Racing Foundation and is now in its second year.

“This course attracts students from a really diverse range of ages and backgrounds,” said The National Stud Director Tim Lane. “Graduates from 2019 and previous pilot years are working at studs across the UK and we have had a strong level of applications again this year. As with all activity this year we have put in place guidelines and restrictions to safeguard against COVID-19 and we will be monitoring these in line with guidance from government over the coming weeks.”

VERRY ELLEEGANT TO CARRY 55.5KG IN CUP

The Chris Waller-trained **Verry Elleegant** carried 55kg to her defeat of G1 Epsom Derby winner **Anthony Van Dyck (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the Caulfield Cup and a Melbourne Cup penalty was announced on Monday by Racing Victoria (RV) Executive General Manager--Racing, Greg Carpenter.

"Saturday's Caulfield Cup was an outstanding edition of the 2400-metre handicap and it was fought out by two world class horses with Verry Elleegant strong on the line and safely holding Epsom Derby winner Anthony Van Dyck," Carpenter said. "Verry Elleegant carried the second highest weight for a winning mare in Caulfield Cup history behind Tranquil Star's 56kg in 1942 and her hard-fought victory was her sixth Group 1 race to underline her elite standing.

"When we took into account her performance on Saturday, the relative weight to those placed behind her and her overall record, we felt that 0.5kg was the appropriate penalty which equates to 1l over 3200 metres. She will now carry 55.5kg in the Melbourne Cup.

"Only one mare has carried more weight to victory in the Melbourne Cup which was Makybe Diva when she carried 58kg to her third win in 2005.

"She carried 55.5kg when winning her second Melbourne Cup--the task that has now been set for Verry Elleegant."

Stick with a Plan

Bishara said there was no thought about backing the mare up in this Saturday's G1 Cox Plate with the Flemington feature always on the program.

"You stick with a plan and go with it. She's a star attraction in the Melbourne Cup," he said. "That European horse is world-class and had gone past her, but she doesn't lie down and is so tough. In three of her four starts this prep she's picked herself off the deck to win."

Meanwhile, another of Verry Elleegant's part-owners has also said they are thinking of a European campaign next year revolving around the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

"We feel like she's a world-class horse. Not only with that form behind Addeybb, we all know what he did on the weekend beating Magical very comfortably and she's one of the best horses in the world," Brae Sokolski told *RSN927*. "But, obviously with Anthony Van Dyck, he's taken Stradivarius to the sword, he's an Epsom Derby winner himself and you can't have more world-class form around you.

"If they throw up a bottomless track like they did this year, she'd be in the race up to her ears. I don't think it's being overly ambitious to say she could represent this country in that race this time next year."
