



STARS COME OUT AT FASIG-TIPTON TUESDAY

The Fasig-Tipton November Sale returns Tuesday with another stellar line-up of marquee offerings, with bidding on the first of 274 catalogued offerings scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. at Newtown Paddocks. The auction begins with a selection of 135 catalogued weanlings and then proceeds into what has perennially been a blockbuster offering of fillies and mares.

“We’re excited and enthusiastic—we have a fabulous catalogue for the November sale,” said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning.

The 2021 November sale has plenty to live up to from its eye-popping 2020 renewal, which was topped by champion Monomoy Girl (Tapizar), who sold for \$9.5 million to Spendthrift Farm. **Cont. p3**

THREE JOCKEYS GET \$11K IN TOTAL FINES FOR BC WHIP VIOLATIONS *by T.D. Thornton*

Jockeys Florent Geroux and E. T. Baird were fined \$5,000 each by the stewards at Del Mar Thoroughbred Club for exceeding the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB)'s six-strikes-per-race limit on their mounts in Breeders' Cup races.

In addition, jockey Tom Eaves got fined \$1,000 for raising his whip above shoulder level prior to a strike.

All of those actions were deemed to be in violation of CHRB Rule 1688, which mandates six-strike, underhand-only, no-more-than-two-hits-in succession whipping with crops that are designed to deliver lower-impact blows.

The two \$5,000 fines are the highest levied for whipping infractions at any CHRB-sanctioned track since the more humane whip rules went into effect in the state in 2020.

In fact, they are believed to be the highest fines levied in a Thoroughbred race in North America since the advent of stricter whipping rules in many jurisdictions over the past two years.

Although the rulings posted on the CHRB's website did not specify the exact number of strikes administered by each jockey, *Daily Racing Form* has quoted the Del Mar stewards as saying Geroux delivered seven hits and Baird nine.

Terry Meyocks, the president and chief executive officer of the Jockeys' Guild, told *TDN* via phone Monday morning that he believed the fines were excessive and provided another example of why the sport in North America needs a uniform whipping rule. **Cont. p8**



Monomoy Girl was one of 12 purchased by the Spendthrift team on the night for a total of \$25,030,000 and one of 22 overall to top the seven-figure mark a year ago.

“There are big shoes to fill from 2020,” Browning acknowledged. “Our November sale last year was exceptional--we were playing at the top end of the market and we had unbelievable support from Spendthrift who spent \$25 million at our sale in one night here last year. The international participation was very, very strong. I think it will be very strong again this year. But if you go back and review the notes [from last year], it was a really, really good sale.”

While the recently concluded yearling sales season, which ended just two weeks ago with a record-setting Fasig-Tipton October sale, produced competitive bidding from start to finish, Browning sounded a note of caution heading into the bloodstock sales.

“As we head into November, I think it’s important that consignors and sellers be realistic that we haven’t seen 50% increases overall across the board in the marketplace,” Browning said. “Obviously 2020 was somewhat difficult at times, but the November sales were much stronger than the yearling and 2-year-old sales were in 2020. So consignors and sellers don’t need to get caught up in some unrealistic euphoria. I think it will be a strong and healthy market across the board for quality offerings in November. But let’s make sure that everyone remains realistic and we keep everything in balance in terms of the scales between buyers and sellers and be very pleased with selling into a healthy marketplace.”

In all, 142 head sold at the 2020 November sale for a gross of \$80,237,000 and an average of \$565,049, a gain of 6.3% from 2019. The median was \$200,000, down 33.3% from the prior year.



DORMAN RETURNS TO FASIG AS A SELLER

Matt Dorman made an immediate impact when he entered the bloodstock sales last fall looking to build a new broodmare band at his Determined Stud. The Maryland native opened his buying spree at the Fasig-Tipton November sale where he purchased four mares—including the \$1.1-million Desert Isle (Bernardini) in partnership with John Sikura’s Hill ‘n’ Dale at Xalapa—for a total of \$2.125 million. Dorman returns to Fasig-Tipton Tuesday, but this time as a seller as he offers three weanlings through Scott Mallory’s consignment.

“It’s mixed emotions,” Dorman said of Determined Stud’s first offerings of weanlings. “They are really good horses, so part of me is like, ‘We may want to race these,’ but at the same time

Determined is a commercial breeding and racing operation, so the goal was to sell some no matter what. If we hit some really good numbers, then we can sell a little bit less. But the ones that are going to the sale are there to be sold. Some of these broodmares are on the younger side, so it would be great to get some strong horses out of them.”

Last summer, Dorman sold a majority interest in his technology start-up company Credible Behavioral Health and his retirement plan was to get more involved in Thoroughbred racing.

After starting his shopping at Fasig-Tipton, Dorman and longtime trainer Phil Schoenthal traveled across town and purchased an additional 14 head--11 mares and three weanling fillies--for \$4,530,000 at the Keeneland November sale.

The Keeneland group was led by Style of Grace (**Curlin**), a half-sister to Grade I winner Furthest Land (Smart Strike) and graded-placed Luck Money (**Lookin At Lucky**) and Street Move (Street Cry {Ire}), whom they acquired in foal to **City of Light** for \$800,000.


Style of Grace's colt by **City of Light** sells Tuesday at Fasig-Tipton as (**hip 117**). Dorman's Fasig November trio also includes a filly by **Uncle Mo** (**hip 64**) out of stakes-placed Knarsdale (Medaglia d'Oro). The weanling was purchased in utero for \$430,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. Rounding out Determined Stud's first weanlings offered at auction is a filly by Into Mischief (**hip 123**) out of Tenacious Jewel, a mare purchased last November at Keeneland for \$335,000. All three are the first foals out of their dams.

Dorman and Schoenthal were back in action at Keeneland in January and purchased six broodmares for \$2,157,000, with Southern Ring (**Speightstown**), in foal to Into Mischief, leading the way at \$875,000.

"Last year we were buying what we would race eventually and then also building up the broodmare band," Dorman said. "I thought the market, pricing-wise, was in a pretty good place for a buyer."

On the heels of an ultra-competitive yearling sales season, Dorman is hoping to find another strong market for foals at the November sale.

"The weanling market has been really strong over the last few years, too, so it will be interesting," Dorman said of his expectations for demand at the bloodstock sales. "And then a lot of people got shut out at the yearling sales, so this is the 'next sale' for them to be going after horses. They might just get them a little bit younger."

Dorman continued, "It's nice that, for the first time, I am actually buying low and selling high, hopefully. That would be nice. When I got out of undergrad, I graduated into a recession and when I got my MBA, it was an even bigger recession. We always joke about showing up at the party when the keg is kicked. For the first time, it feels like we are in a good spot."

When Dorman began building his broodmare band last year, his plan was to renovate a farm in Maryland and base the band there. A year on and his plans have changed. He's currently in the final negotiations to purchase a move-in ready farm in Kentucky.

"As far as building out the operation in Maryland, it was probably a blessing in disguise because there were challenges with the county on getting the buildings built, there were challenges with getting some of the supplies," Dorman explained. "We just held back and waited and then made the decision to buy a turn-key operation in Kentucky versus trying to build one from scratch because it would have been another two years to get everything done. So that part of the plan, I am fine being flexible on. Obviously, having a horse farm in Lexington, Kentucky is a great fall back. I'm not complaining about that."

Dorman's racing operation has its base at Fair Hill Training Center. Among those set to begin racing in Dorman's D. Hatman Thoroughbreds operation is a half-sister by **Curlin** to Rock Your World (**Candy Ride {Arg}**) who was purchased for \$825,000 at the Keeneland September sale.

"The yearlings that we picked up this year, they are in training and they are doing everything right," Dorman said. "That **Curlin** filly that we picked up that is a half to Rock Your World, she is just a big, beautiful horse. We all thought she'd be late because she's so big, but she has just been incredibly athletic and the guys that are breaking those horses are just ecstatic about her."

After his purchases in 2020, Dorman is on the radar of all the major sellers, but he and his team will be taking a more reserved approach to buying this year.

“I was surprised the last couple of weeks, I’ve gotten a lot of really nice care packages in the mail from people selling big mares,” Dorman said with a chuckle. “Credit goes out to the folks that are marketing Swiss Skydiver and some of the other ones, because obviously I am on the list. We were the underbidders on that big **War Front** in the September sale, so I think people understand the quality that we are going after. And we will look at some of those mares, but we are probably not going to swing as big as we did last year.”

He continued, “There are some of the bigger mares that we will be looking at, but I think quite frankly that we are going to get priced out because I think the market is really strong. Fortunately we have some really good mares and there are some that we bought privately so we are in pretty good shape there. We are not going to be bringing home 20 mares, that I can guarantee you.”

As his plans have evolved over the last year, Dorman said the team of people he has assembled has been a key to building a strong foundation for his operation.

“Scott Mallory has been a great horseman and he’s helped out a lot,” he said. “Obviously Phil on the racing side has done really well for us, as well as John Sikura at Hill ‘n’ Dale. We are business partners with John on different stallions and we started to ramp that up to the next level.”

It has been over a year since Dorman sold a majority interest in Credible Behavioral Health—a software company providing electronic health records—but his 21-head broodmare band has turned into something of a second career.

“I sold the majority of the company in August of last year,” Dorman said. “Everyone tells me I need to do a better job at retirement. My 12-year-old son Chase is in the car with me now and he just said, ‘You really do.’ But when you have this many horses, it does take up a good amount of time. It’s still very enjoyable, it doesn’t seem like work to me.”

While Chase thinks his dad needs to work on the retirement front, the younger Dorman does have some goals for the new venture.

“He said I should sell a horse for a million dollars so he can get a new skateboard,” Dorman said with a laugh.

Dorman takes his first crack at that million-dollar result when the Fasig-Tipton November Sale gets under way at Newtown Paddocks Tuesday. Bidding commences at 2 p.m.

"Flo [Geroux] has been riding basically the last 14 years. He's a well-respected rider and very accomplished. And then going over [the strike limit by one hit] it's a \$5,000 fine? I just think it's over the top," Meyocks said. "I don't think it's in [anybody's] interest to fine a jock \$5,000 for going over the limit once.

"E.T. Baird, he's been riding since 1985, so that's 36 years. He comes to California [to ride occasionally], but still, you just can't change overnight what you've been doing for 36 years. And there's no warning and it's a \$5,000 fine?"

With respect to the British-based Eaves, Meyocks said, "You've got to take into consideration European riders. How they ride, it's totally different than the America riders, their style. Going over [the shoulder] and he got fined? It's just [not] common sense here."

Geroux finished second, beaten 5 1/4 lengths, on Juju's Map (Liam's Map) in the Nov. 5 GI Juvenile Fillies.

Baird rode One Timer (Trappe Shot) to a ninth-place finish in Friday's GII Juvenile Turf Sprint.

Eaves was aboard Glass Slippers (GB) (Dream Ahead), the defending victress in the GI Turf Sprint. Saturday, she finished eighth in that same race. Eaves has ridden Glass Slippers in 19 of the mare's 20 lifetime races dating to 2018.

The penalization part of Rule 1688 reads: "During a race, if a jockey rides in a manner contrary to this rule, the stewards shall impose a minimum fine of \$500. A greater fine or a minimum of three suspension days, or both, can be imposed, if, in the opinion of the stewards, the violation is egregious or intentional."

Geroux took to Twitter Monday morning, writing a post that seemed to indicate he didn't realize the monetary penalty could be so high. **Cont. p9**

"I would gladly pay the fine the stewards gave me over the weekend if [jockeys] knew what the fines were going to be," Geroux stated.

But the Del Mar stewards had made it a point to meet with the riders just prior to the Breeders' Cup to explain Rule 1688 and how they would be enforcing it. And according to Meyocks, the stewards did discuss how high the fines could be.

"I wasn't there, but I think [the stewards] were talking there was much more [in dollar amount] that they could go up to. I heard a number that could be a lot higher."

When *TDN* asked Meyocks if he believed that discussion constituted fair warning about the potentially high fines, he said, "Yes. But again, the problem I have with the stewards [meeting with jockeys] at any racetrack [is] all the jocks aren't there at the same time.... That's why it's important to have one rule throughout the United States that's in the best interest of the game."

In a separate ruling, Geroux was fined \$100 for missing the Saturday morning film review that included his Friday infraction.

A CHRB spokesperson said that as of Monday afternoon, no appeals had been filed by the three Breeders' Cup jockeys, who have 72 hours from the issuance of the rulings to contest them.

If the CHRB had not altered its whipping penalty structure back in April, those \$11,000 in aggregate Breeders' Cup fines could have been even higher.

In an attempt to discourage riders from disregarding the number of times and manner in which a Thoroughbred can be struck with the whip--particularly if the jockey believed the reward of winning a multi-million-dollar stakes outweighed the cost of incurring a smaller fine or suspension--a previously proposed penalty structure called for docking jockeys 50% of purse earnings if they over-whipped while finishing first, second or third in graded stakes. **Cont. p10**

But when the Guild and other stakeholders argued in March that going after purse money was too harsh, the CHRB revised that aspect before that part of the rule went into effect.

At that March meeting, CHRB vice chair Oscar Gonzales had said that "this rule is [about] making sure that the upcoming Breeders' Cup goes off [more] smoothly than anything else." He

articulated a concern that the combination of two days of Grade I stakes and too weak a penalty scheme could create "a wild west type of a situation" in which jockeys openly flouted Rule 1688.

In terms of scale, the only recently comparable whip-related sanction in North America was a \$5,000 fine and 20-day suspension levied against a New Jersey harness driver back in June.

Joe Bongiorno was penalized for whipping his pacer so indiscriminately during a Meadowlands race that the judges deemed his actions caused a three-horse spill that injured one rival horse so severely it had to be euthanized. In New Jersey, whipping a horse to make it run faster is prohibited in Thoroughbred racing but permitted with restrictions in Standardbred races.

CHRB ISSUES JUVENILE TURF CLARIFICATION

Amidst its ongoing investigation of the erroneous scratch of eventual purse-money-only winner Modern Games (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) from last Friday's **GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf**, the California Horse Racing Board issued the following update Monday:

"Concerning the 10th race at Del Mar on Friday, November 5, the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf: Upon review of available videos

showing the horses in the gate prior to the start of the race, the CHRB has determined that #1 Modern Games (Ire) did not rear up in the gate, as was initially reported to the CHRB by the veterinarians at the gate. The starter and assistant starter took protective steps by leading the horse out of the front of the gate. The horse did not break through the gate on its own, as was originally thought."

Prior statements from the CHRB referenced Modern Games rearing up and hitting the back of the gate.

According to a filing with the Los Angeles County Superior Court, dated Sept. 26, Hollendorfer requests the preliminary injunction to prohibit the owners of Santa Anita Park from “unlawfully attempting to bypass or otherwise usurp” the California Horse Racing Board’s (CHRB) authority to “supervise and control” the horse race entry process.

“The requested injunction will maintain the status quo which exists at all other non-TSG owned race meets in the State,” the filing states, pointing out that Hollendorfer has been permitted to enter and run his horses at all other CHRB-licensed facilities, and that no formal regulatory action has been made against him.

According to the filing, Hollendorfer does not seek stalls at Santa Anita as he maintains a barn at Los Alamitos Race Course, “and intends to continue stabling and training horses there while entering and racing his horses at SAP, during the upcoming meet, subject to review by the CHRB Stewards.”

The filing adds that Hollendorfer “will suffer further irreparable harm to his business and occupation without the injunction. Plaintiff is 75 years old and has significant underlying medical conditions. The upcoming race meet at SAP may be Plaintiff’s last chance to salvage his profession.”

The *TDN* understands that a hearing at LA County Superior Court is scheduled for Nov. 19.

TSG banned Hollendorfer--formerly one of California's most prolific trainers numerically--from its facilities after four of his horses were catastrophically injured during Santa Anita’s six-month 2018-2019 winter/spring meet, when the track experienced a well-publicized spike in equine fatalities.

Since then, Hollendorfer has been engaged in a series of legal battles designed to open the door for his broad return to the California racing scene.

Hollendorfer's ongoing legal tussle with the operators of Santa Anita dates back to Sept. 26, 2019, when he filed his initial lawsuit, and the following month, when LA County Superior Court denied his application for a temporary restraining order.

Hollendorfer filed his initial lawsuit against the Pacific Racing Association--the corporate operators of Golden Gate Fields--on Aug. 12, 2019, in Alameda County Superior Court. That Court also subsequently denied Hollendorfer's application for a temporary restraining order, and the case is similarly ongoing.

Hollendorfer is also engaged in ongoing litigation against the CHRB and the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club. These cases are being heard in the Superior Court of San Diego County.

In an emailed statement to the *TDN*, TSG attorney Richard Specter wrote, "We believe that the Motion for Preliminary Injunction and underlying arguments remain without merit (for the same reasons previously found by both the Los Angeles and Alameda County Courts), and shall rely upon our responsive pleadings in that regard."

Hollendorfer's motion for preliminary injunction lays out a series of arguments not only claiming that the CHRB's board of stewards have exclusive authority to refuse an entry by a licensed trainer, but that through months of discovery, TSG's

reasons for banning Hollendorfer have proven meritless.

Among the key arguments posited, the filing claims that TSG chief veterinary officer, Dionne Benson, has "admitted she has no personal knowledge of any unsafe practice or safety violation by Hollendorfer."

The filing claims that Santa Anita's association veterinarian, Dana Stead, "admitted the stories he told about Plaintiff's alleged negligence were false and/or based entirely on hearsay, without any basis in fact," and adds that during a meeting on May 26, 2019, between representatives of the California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT) and those from TSG, "CTT representatives did not make the disparaging statements about Hollendorfer that Defendants rely on to support their ban."

Hollendorfer's stable, the filing states, has shrunk from more than 120 horses in California to an average of just 10, with another 25 to 30 horses traveling between three to four other states.

According to Equibase, Hollendorfer has trained 32 winners and earned \$1,498,536 in prize money thus far this year. In 2018, he trained 176 winners and accrued \$7,191,756 in prize money.

Hollendorfer's attorney, Drew Couto, declined to comment for the story.

NYSGC NIXES MCPEEK'S REQUEST FOR CLARITY IN QUARANTINE ENTRY SNAFU

The New York State Gaming Commission (NYSGC) on Monday denied a request by trainer Ken McPeek to bring clarity to the process of how and when Thoroughbreds coming out of a quarantine can be allowed to enter races.

Back on July 15, another trainer's horse in the barn McPeek shared at Saratoga Race Course tested positive for equine herpesvirus (EHV-1). State agriculture officials, the New York Racing Association, and the NYSGC then imposed a 21-day quarantine of the entire barn retroactive to July 11, which is a common precaution in such EHV-1 outbreaks.

The understanding was that if no other horses got sick during that time frame, the entire stable would be released from quarantine and allowed to race as of Aug. 1.

But when McPeek tried to enter seven horses just days in advance of the quarantine's expiration for the Aug. 1, 4 and 5 cards, the entries were denied by the Saratoga stewards because the horses were still under quarantine at the time those entries were to be taken.

After being unable to make any headway on his own, McPeek retained New York-based attorney Drew Mollica, who reached out to the stewards on July 30, some 3 1/2 hours before the Aug. 3 card was drawn, in hopes that a hearing could be held and the McPeek horses could begin running as soon Aug. 4.

Mollica told *TDN* at that time that he had sent emails and placed phone calls to NYSGC steward Braulio Baeza, Jr. and to the commission itself, but none of the messages yielded a reply.

Mollica wanted to point out that a recent precedent should have been used as a template in the matter: He said that in January 2018, trainer Linda Rice was allowed to pre-enter a horse coming out of an EHV-1 quarantine prior to the actual expiration of that restriction. **Cont. p15**

Eventually, McPeek's horses were allowed to enter races at the Spa after Aug. 1. But he and his clients had already missed out on purse-earning opportunities. Some owners had made plane and hotel reservations to come to Saratoga to see their horses run, and jockeys had given up other mounts to commit to ride the McPeek stable's horses that the trainer thought would have been able to race.

McPeek then had Mollica formally appeal the situation to the NYSGC, seeking a declaratory judgment arguing that the stewards' position was arbitrary and capricious. McPeek also wanted NYSGC to adopt quarantine race-entry protocols so he and other horsemen would know what to expect in the future, and he asked for equitable relief to assuage the financial injury to himself and his owners.

During the NYSGC's Nov. 8 meeting, all three of those requests were denied.

The case was not discussed and ruled upon by commissioners during the open, public meeting. Instead, executive director Robert Williams read a prepared statement that stated the commissioners had previously heard the arguments and had designated commissioner Peter Moschetti to rule on the matter.

"Following consideration of submissions, commissioner Moschetti found that a declaratory judgment was not available, as the time to enter horses in the desired races had passed, and that there was no longer an existing controversy that would have a direct and immediate effect upon the rights of the parties," Williams stated.

"Commissioner Moschetti also found that the granting of the relief sought would constitute issuing an advisory opinion which was not allowable under the facts and circumstances of the matter," Williams stated.

"Finally, commissioner Moschetti found that directing the commission to create a protocol or rule for the future to decide the issue [that was] raised was beyond the scope of the appeal," Williams stated.

After the meeting, Mollica told *TDN* via phone that he wasn't sure if there would be a next legal step for McPeek to seek remedy. But he said it's imperative that the NYSGC address the stewards' inconsistencies in how they handled the 2018 and 2021 EHV-1 entry situations.

"While the commission chose not to delve into the facts and suggested that they procedurally had no power, the reality is that the actions of the stewards were completely contradictory to the actions they had taken in 2018 in the matter of Linda Rice," Mollica said.

"The horse had the exact same virus. It was exactly the same quarantine, and they allowed her to enter the day before the quarantine ended," Mollica said.



"It is my hope that although they didn't decide it on the merits, that Mr. McPeek's efforts brought this egregious situation to light, and that they will address it administratively in the near future, because Mr. McPeek brought the inconsistency of their actions to light," Mollica said.





FRANKEL CAPS 2022 JUDDMONTE ROSTER

The five-strong Juddmonte roster, led by champion-sire elect **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), was announced on Monday. The son of Kind (Ire) (Danehill) will stand for £200,000 SLF, an increase of £25,000, in 2022.

The fasted stallion to reach 50 group winners in history, the bay is already the sire of 20 Group 1 winners. In 2021, eight of his progeny won Group 1 races, with G1 Cazoo Derby and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. hero Adayar (Ire) joined by G1 Irish Derby, G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 St Leger victor Hurricane Lane (Ire). Besides that duo, **Frankel** also sired an Oaks winner Down Under and a trio of Group 1-winning 2-year-olds. His 4-year-old filly Alpinista (GB) won a trio of German Group 1s this season, including Sunday's G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern. In addition to his status as the leading European sire of 2021, **Frankel** is also on top of the British and Irish sire lists, which has not been achieved by a British-based stallion since Mill Reef (Never Bend) 34 years ago.

Frankel's studmate **Kingman (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) remains at £150,000 SLF, and has sired 18 black-type winners this year. His three 2021 Group 1 winners were first past the post on three continents--Palace Pier (GB) (Europe), Domestic Spending (GB) (North America) and Schnell Meister (Ger) (Asia).

FOR BREEDERS', DUBAWI STANDS ALONE

Dubawi (Ire) has long been established as a sire of international merit. This weekend at Del Mar, however, he took his reputation to another level, siring three winners at the Breeders' Cup--something never before achieved by a sire in the meeting's 37-year history.

Twelve sires have supplied two winners in a single Breeders' Cup. That was first accomplished by Cox's Ridge in the second Breeders' Cup in 1985 when Life's Magic took the Distaff and Twilight Ridge the Juvenile Fillies. Four other sires did it when the Breeders' Cup was a single-day event: Nureyev in 1987 with Miesque and Theatrical (Ire); Kris S. in 1993 with Hollywood Wildcat and Brocco; Sadler's Wells in 2003 with High Chaparral (Ire) and Islington (Ire); and Awesome Again in 2004 with **Ghostzapper** and Wilko.

Since the Breeders' Cup became a two-day event in 2007, seven more sires have joined the ranks of turning out two winners in a single year. The seemingly ageless **More Than Ready** earns first mention, having done it twice, in 2010 and 2017. **More Than Ready** remains the Breeders' Cup's leading sire by winners, with a cumulative seven, edging out Sadler's Wells and Unbridled's Song with six apiece.

Smart Strike notched a high-profile double at that first two-day Breeders' Cup at Monmouth Park with **Curlin** in the Classic and **English Channel** in the Turf. Chester House added his name the following year and was then joined by **Mizzen Mast** in 2012, City Zip in 2014 and Medaglia d'Oro in 2017. Into Mischief was the most recent sire to pull off the double with Authentic and Gamine in 2020.

And then, along came the Dubawis (and their trainer Charlie Appleby, jockey William Buick and owner/breeder Godolphin) to Del Mar to tear apart the history books. Modern Games (Ire) got things going (in admittedly dramatic fashion) to give his trainer a third win in eight years in the Juvenile Turf. [Cont. p2](#)

One of his yearling fillies brought €950,000 at the Arqana August Sale, while a colt was knocked down for 1.1 million gns during Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

Banstead Manor veteran **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) will command £20,000 SLF. His Native Trail (GB) won a pair of juvenile Group 1 races this year and is the ante-post favourite for the G1 2000 Guineas. Other notable 2021 runners among his eight black-type winners are: group winners Turaath (GB), Grocer Jack (Ger), Erasmo (GB) and Al Tariq (Fr). Grocer Jack also ran second in the G1 Grosser Dallmayr Preis in Germany, while Imaging (GB) was runner-up in the G1 CF Orr S.

Young stallion **Bated Breath (GB)** (Dansili {GB})'s fee has been set at £15,000 SLF. A consistent source of black-type, he has 18 black-type performers in 2021 led by Group 2 winners Viadera (GB) and Gift List (GB) and Group 3 winners Sacred Bridge (GB), and Makaloun (Fr).

A stallion who will have his first runners next year, G1 Breeders' Cup Mile scorer **Expert Eye (GB)** (Acclamation {GB})'s fee is £10,000 SLF. His 55 yearlings sold for an average of £43,729, double his introductory fee. The highest-priced yearling was 290,000gns, while others sold for 140,000gns, £90,000 and two for 80,000gns.

Dubawi's Breeders' Cup Feat Cont.

Yibir began to wind up heading into the last of three turns and—as his stablemates had done while sitting closer to the pace—employed a sustained rally to wear down his rivals.

The Breeders' Cup was a jewel in the crown of a remarkable season for Dubawi, during which he has had stakes winners in seven countries. His tally of 37 stakes winners in 2021 is greater than any other sire standing in Europe or America, with Into Mischief—the only sire bettering him by prizemoney—next at 26 and Frankel third on 24. Dubawi also leads all European and American sires in 2021 by group winners (23) and is tied with Frankel on six Group 1 winners.

As is typical for Dubawi, his six Group 1 winners this year have been versatile distance-wise, ranging from six furlongs up to a mile and a half. Rebel's Romance (Ire) was an eye-catching winner of the G2 UAE Derby on the dirt, and he is one of 23 stakes winners for his sire on that surface. The likes of Prince Bishop (Ire), Monterosso (GB), North America (GB), Lucky Nine (Ire), Mubtaahij (Ire) and Hunter's Light (Ire) are further proof that Dubawis act on the dirt, and it would be fascinating to see if Dubawi could extend his Breeders' Cup dominance down the road with a few runners pitched onto the dirt.

As for Appleby, his accomplishments this weekend likewise deserve examination in a historic context. Richard Mandella set the mark for a trainer when winning four races on the single-day Breeders' Cup card at Santa Anita in 2003, and 17 years later Brad Cox equaled that tally at Keeneland last year. Chad Brown has twice sent out three Breeders' Cup winners in a meeting, in 2014 and 2019, and Todd Pletcher accomplished the feat in 2010. It is also worth noting that, with the highly unlikely double gate scratch of Appleby's Albahr (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Master Of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), Walton Street (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the Turf was Appleby's only Breeders' Cup starter that did not win. The last-out GI Canadian International winner finished ninth behind Yibir.

So Appleby—in his best year yet as a trainer—joins elite company. It is fair to point out, too, that no other trainer has provided three Breeders' Cup winners in a weekend all by the same sire, though two of Pletcher's three in 2010 were by that Breeders' Cup sire extraordinaire **More Than Ready**, who he also trained. **More Than Ready** is also one of four of the 13 sires with multiple Breeders' Cup winners in a year to have them on both dirt and turf—the others are Medaglia d'Oro, Smart Strike and City Zip.

Dubawi will turn 20 in the New Year, and will stand his 17th season with Darley, all but one of those being at Dalham Hall. The stallion that started out at £25,000—and dipped to £15,000 before his first runners hit the track—has continued to write his extraordinary story through each passing season, and there is every reason to think there is plenty still to come.

SEA THE STARS AND SIYOUNI LEAD THE AGA KHAN STUDS ROSTERS

Irish-based **Sea The Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) and French-based **Siyouni (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}) will jointly lead their respective rosters in 2022 for The Aga Khan Studs.

One of two stallions standing at Gilttown Stud, Sea The Stars will command €150,000. His unbeaten miler Baaeed (GB) and the progressive filly Teona (Ire) both scored at the highest level in 2021, bringing their sire's total Group 1 winners to 16. Overall, the bay has sired 22 black-type winners this term and he was the sire of the top-priced filly and top-priced colt during Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. He is the second-leading sire in Europe by prizemoney based on European earnings.

Siyouni, who stands at Haras de Bonneval, is the leading sire in France for the seventh consecutive year and will remain at €140,000. His son St Mark's Basilica (Fr) won both the G1 French 2000 Guineas and the G1 Prix du Jockey Club among his quartet of top-level races. In addition, Siyouni sired the top-priced colt at the Arqana August Sale, with his yearlings selling for up to €1.5 million. In 2021, he is the sire of 16 stakes winners.

Off to a bright start is first-season sire **Zarak (Fr)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who has had his fee increased to €25,000. **Cont. p5**

The latter’s Oxted (GB) won the G1 King’s Stand S. this year. The fee for **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}), a roster stalwart, has been listed as private. His 42 black-type winners include this year’s G1 July Cup S. hero Starman (GB). In Ireland, G1 Prix Morny victor **Unfortunately (Ire)** (Society Rock {Ire}) will command €3,500 at Springfield House Stud. His oldest foals are yearlings.

Cheveley Park Stud Managing Director Chris Richardson said, “Having significantly reduced our 2021 fees in response to the financial turbulence caused by the pandemic, it has been pleasing to see our stallions’ progeny performing so well on the track and in the sales ring this year.

“The classically bred Ulysses has made a hugely encouraging start with his first crop runners, to date he has sired 13 individual winners, the same number as his illustrious sire, Galileo, managed with his first crop 2-year-olds also. They include two stakes performers, as well as several other promising maiden and novice winners.” **Cont. p7**

The Bearstone Stud homebred, who was trained by Kevin Ryan, won the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert followed by the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at three. In 2020, she added the G1 Flying Five S. in Ireland, ran second in another edition of the l'Abbaye, and maintained that form Stateside with a half-length win in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Keeneland. Although winless this term, the consistent bay placed third thrice--in the July 30 G2 King George S., the Sept. 12 Flying Five and the l'Abbaye in October prior to her second Breeders' Cup run. She retired with a mark of 21-7-3-4 and \$1,264,138 in earnings.

"Glass Slippers was flat out all the way and never got a chance to fill up," said Ryan of the half-sister to stakes winner and Group 3-placed Electric Feel (GB) (Firebreak {GB}). "She's been great and that's it now, she'll be off to the paddocks."

He added, "Had he jumped, he'd have won. In four more strides he'd have won, but I couldn't be any prouder of the horse. Hello You did not travel as well as her stablemate to California, but Loughnane was not deterred by her effort.

"The journey over there probably took a bit more out of her. She jumped, she travelled, she got a lovely run through the race. She travelled like a dream and turning for home, I thought how far does she win, then when Johnny [Velazquez] asked her she just didn't go through with it completely. She pulled up a tired horse. It took a lot out of her. She was only beaten 1 ½ lengths in a Grade I over there when she wasn't at her best.

"I have no doubt on her day she was probably the best horse in the race. She'll go for a holiday as well now and we'll come back and try for a Guineas trial with her.

DESTINATION LEXINGTON: THE CITY CENTER

For those who were unable to travel to Kentucky last year and attend the Keeneland sales, much has changed in downtown Lexington thanks in large part to the completion of the City Center. The residential, commercial and retail project has been in the works for years and was finally completed early in 2020.

What was a hive of activity in its first few months of operation quickly became a desolate landscape with the onset of the pandemic. But today, as more and more travelers return to Lexington, the City Center has transformed into a popular destination for Lexington natives and visitors alike.

The brand-new complex consists of a 12-story tower, with nine floors of office space and three floors of luxury condominiums, dual-property Marriott and Residence Inn hotels, an underground parking garage, a state-of-the-art Starbucks, several restaurants including the world-renowned Jeff Ruby's Steakhouse, and the Keeneland Mercantile. Located in the heart of downtown, the City Center is steps away from Lexington's best bars, restaurants and boutiques.

Courtney Jones is the Director of Sales and Marketing for Lexington Marriott and Residence Inn at City Center. She spoke on the growing number of visitors they've welcomed in recent months.

"It's been really great to see everything back and to have our travelers be super excited to stay with us," she said. "Most of our clientele is the modern business traveler, but we have some great families that stay with us, especially on our Residence Inn

side. [The City Center] is a great asset to downtown and the city has been welcoming this project for a long time."

The **Marriott Hotel** holds 218 guest rooms while the **Residence Inn**, an extended-stay hotel with modern, homelike amenities, has 119 guest suits.

"A lot of our horsemen do prefer the Residence Inn for the extended-stay factor," Jones explained. "It has a kitchen with a

stove top and then a microwave and a decent-sized fridge, so it's great for those people who are staying in town for a bit longer."

The two hotels are connected on the first floor and share the Greatroom Restaurant, which is open every morning with a breakfast buffet. The adjacent Greatroom Bar offers hand-crafted cocktails in the evening and is a popular spot after a day of racing or sales at Keeneland.

"Our Greatroom Bar

really has a great bourbon and wine selection," Jones said. "People can just come right in and have a seat at the bar to gather and relax from the day."

Other amenities include a concierge service, an ultramodern fitness center that features virtual fitness classes, comprehensive meeting facilities and a rooftop pool.

Jones said that while guests come to the City Center hotels for the location and modern conveniences, they return for the atmosphere.

"Our ownership group wanted to make sure that Kentucky was felt as you walked in, but in a modern way with bright, natural light. We also have lots of different horse and horse racing features, but they're done all in a very modern way. It's really an awesome atmosphere." [Cont. p11](#)

On the top floor of the Residence Inn, **Infinity Skybar and Café** serves modern American cuisine and cocktails and offers spectacular views of downtown. Small-plate menu items include deviled eggs, fried green tomatoes, and marsala cream-seared scallops, while steak frites and shrimp tacos are popular entrees. The Moonlight Kiss cocktail is a must-try and is made with Castle & Key Gin, Prosecco and Butterfly Pea Flower Tea.

For those looking for a fine-dining experience without needing to step out of doors, **ItalX** restaurant offers authentic Italian cuisine. Handmade pastas are created daily by Lexington’s renowned chef Jonathan Lundy, while an extensive wine selection is housed in a temperature-controlled wine room.

When visitors’ time in Lexington comes to an end, many stop in at the **Keeneland Mercantile**, a boutique retail shop that showcases the best of Kentucky’s locally-crafted goods.

“The Keeneland Mercantile is a concept we developed to celebrate the traditions of Keeneland,” said Keeneland’s Director of Retail Kyle Cassin. “We wanted to present something a little bit different than with our sister location onsite at the track. A lot of people don’t know that the Keeneland racecourse originally started as a downtown location. So we tried to celebrate that by returning to downtown and showcasing local and regional artisans that we have in Kentucky and in the Southeast.”

The Mercantile offers a wide variety of items from local artwork, stoneware, home goods and leather goods to apparel, books, spirits and cigars.

“It’s a great opportunity for us to engage with people visiting the Lexington community,” Cassin said. “The Mercantile has really started to come into its own as we’ve seen a lot more

people coming and staying in the hotels and visiting downtown. We’re trying to be an opportunity where people can find that perfect gift for themselves or their family member to take home a little piece of Kentucky with them.”

As travelers are now making return trips to the City Center, the complex is growing a reputation as a premier place to stay in Lexington.

“The City Center is a place to stay and play, so to speak,” Cassin said. “It’s really a central hub of activity here in the heart of downtown and it’s the perfect location right off Main Street with all the restaurants and bars in the area.”

“Everything is within walking distance,” Jones added. “Being downtown, you have that feeling of community and ease of access to anyplace you would like to go, whether it’s food, drinks or shopping. It’s all right here.”

EXTREME CHOICE COLT TOPS 2YOS IN TRAINING SALE



A colt by Extreme Choice topped Monday's session | Magic Millions

A surge in demand from local buyers, plus a strong top-end play by Hong Kong trainer Ricky Yiu, has powered a stronger than expected result for the Magic Millions Gold Coast 2-Year-Olds In Training Sale, which was topped by a colt by Extreme Choice, purchased by Baystone Farm for \$350,000.

At A Glance

- Trading defied pre-sale predictions, with strong increases in average and median on the 2020 and 2019 sales.
- The average ended on \$69,238, well up on the \$52,838 of last year and the \$60,822 of the last pre-COVID Sale in 2019.
- The sale median was a very healthy \$45,000, up from \$30,000 in 2020 and \$41,000 the year prior.
- The sale aggregate of \$5.8 million was down on last year and 50% down on 2019 with 84 lots sold.
- As of 6pm (AEDT) Monday night, the clearance rate sits at 72.45, with expectation of more lots being sold in the coming days.
- Baystone Farm went to \$350,000 to buy Lot 58, a colt by Extreme Choice, from the draft of A List Stud.
- Ricky Yiu and Clarke Bloodstock (FBAA) spent \$775,000 across three lots, including \$330,000 for Lot 26, a colt by Capitalist, and \$325,000 on Lot 39, a colt by Smart Missile.

Baystone Gets Extreme

The only 2-year-old by Champion First Season Sire Extreme Choice in the sale was always going to be in heavy demand, and Lot 58, from A List Stud, is headed to Victoria's Baystone Farm, after selling for \$350,000. The colt will join the stables of Troy Corstens after Baystone Farm's Dean Harvey had the confidence to bid from afar and get the 2-year-old he was most keen on.

"The stallion is proving to be elite, I haven't seen a stallion with stats like he has for a long time," Harvey said. "I thought it was a good opportunity, with a lot of the stallion boys not playing at this sale. If he goes to a yearling sale, I reckon he'd be double that which wouldn't allow me to buy him. I thought it was an opportune time to pounce."

Initially a \$25,000 weanling purchase by Gordon Richards, A List Stud had picked this colt up for \$130,000 through the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale from Yarran Thoroughbreds and completed a nice bit of business by selling him for \$220,000 more than it paid for him. He has not only benefited from his own physical development, but the boom that has grown on his sire, who has produced six stakes winners from a first crop of just 48 foals. The colt is out of **Fastnet Rock** mare Arnault, the half-sister to stakes winner Yesterday's Songs (Henrythenavigator {USA}), out of Sarah Vee (End Sweep {USA}), who was a listed winner and twice placed in Group 1 races.

"He's got a nice pedigree. He's a good sort, he vetted out well, and I love the stallion, so I thought I'd see if I can grab him and I have," Harvey said.

The colt will now go to Kolora Lodge for three or four weeks before heading down to Victoria to join Corstens' stables. Harvey said he was familiar with the colt already, having seen him when he was offered in Melbourne and he had used Magic Millions' Managing Director Barry Bowditch to inspect him ahead of this sale.

"Barry gave a him a big tick, he really liked him and we went from there," Harvey said.

He confirmed that Baystone was the underbidder on a couple of other lots, but he was happy to walk away with the one that he wanted. "I'm rapt, I'm really, really excited to get him."

Yiu's Triple Strike

Hong Kong trainer Ricky Yiu has been a strong supporter of this sale historically and enlisted the help of Jim Clarke of Clarke Bloodstock (FBAA) to secure a trio of colts by Capitalist (\$330,000), Smart Missile (\$325,000) and Rothesay (\$120,000).

"They are three nice horses and horses that stood out in the catalogue," Clarke said. "Ricky picked them out by going through all the videos and photos online and by looking at their pedigrees. Thankfully he asked me to do all the due diligence on the ground. We got the ones we wanted, which was pleasing."

The duo won the day for the much-anticipated only 2-year-old by Capitalist to be offered on the day, seeing off substantial competition from over the phone to secure Lot 26, who was offered by O'Gorman Racing Stables. It is not the first Capitalist that Yiu has purchased, having outlaid \$155,000 for a colt from the Twin Hills Stud draft at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale earlier this year.

"Obviously, his sire is doing a phenomenal job at the moment. He is one of the more promising prospects in the country," Clarke said.

The colt is the first foal from city-winning Northern Meteor mare Solar Burst, who hails from an extended family which includes stallions Myboycharlie (Ire), Snowland and Snippetson. Lot 26 was initially purchased by O'Gorman for \$90,000 through the Murrulla Stud draft at Magic Millions' Gold Coast Yearling Sale, represented an excellent return.

"I remembered the horse from the yearling sale in January and he's done very well since. He was prepared by one of the best in the business, Mel O'Gorman, and she had him looking a million dollars," Clarke said. "I saw him multiple times and he was impressive in all sorts of ways. He was very typical of Capitalist, a good strong-bodied horse with a good action. He had a lovely temperament which will help him in Hong Kong."

The result was a standout for O'Gorman, who sold all four of her 2-year-olds for a total of \$592,000.

"I think it just proves if you take the right article there, even in a COVID year with very limited buyers able to attend the sale, you can get the right result. Magic Millions have done a great job and there is still money for the right horses," she said.

O'Gorman was unable to attend the sale, and relied upon Robyn Wise to present her draft, but said in the circumstances, the results were very positive.

"It just proved once again at that sale if you take quality, there are the right buyers online and there at the complex to support

good horses."

A Smart Move

Yiu has been a fan of Smart Missile as a sire over the years, buying six of his progeny through Australasian sales over the journey and he added a seventh in Lot 39, who was offered by A List Stud.

"He's an outstanding individual physically. He is a really big, strong, scopey horse, he had a very nice temperament and his breeze was impressive," Clarke said. "We certainly had to dig deep to be able to buy him, but again, he was one which Ricky had picked out after the breeze ups and he was keen to get him."

The colt is a half-brother to three winners and his dam, Twin Star Rocket (Bel Esprit) is a half-sister to listed winner Ever The

Same (Canny Lad). That family extends down from this colt's fourth dam, Dancing Show (USA) (Nijinsky II {Can}), who not only produced Group 1 winners Hurricane Sky and Umatilla (NZ), but also blue hen Shantha's Choice (Canny Lad). A List had paid \$230,000 for the colt as a yearling through the same Gold Coast sale ring back in January, where he was offered by his breeders at Gooree Park Stud. A List ended up the leading vendor on both average (\$221,000) and aggregate (\$1.201 million).

The third of Yiu and Clarke's purchases was Lot 8, the colt by

Rothesay, offered by Nolen Racing. He is out of Real Saga mare Rhodopis and cost \$120,000.

Zoustar Filly Lures Cunninghams

Clarke has also been working closely with Cunningham Thoroughbreds of late and came together with them as well as one of his other major clients, Bjorn Baker, to pay \$220,000 for Lot 60, a filly by Zoustar from Nolen Racing's draft. It was the highest price for a filly in the sale and one which Clarke said his clients were happy to pay with a view to her long-term value.

"She was probably the filly in the catalogue which had the best pedigree. It was her pedigree that piqued our interest first and foremost," he said. "From a pedigree point of view, the Cunninghams were very keen on her. Bjorn was keen to try and buy a really nice filly as well.

"Neil Douglas, who is one of the partners at Ridgmont is going to own her with the Cunninghams and they will race her together with a view to retaining her as a broodmare down the track, with the hope she can get some black type of her own."

The Zoustar filly, who was purchased for \$190,000 through the same ring in January by Slade Bloodstock and Redgum Racing, is out of the Street Cry (Ire) mare Avenue Whisper. She is a twice-winning daughter of multiple stakes winner Avenue (Anabaa {USA}), the sister of Group 1 winner Virage De Fortune (Anabaa {USA}).

"The Cunninghams and Ridgmont own Avenue, so it's a family that they are familiar with. They have bred mares to Zoustar in the past few years and it certainly seems to be working for them because he's flying at the moment," Clarke said.

Market Strength Pleases Bowditch

Magic Millions Managing Director Barry Bowditch was pleased with how the sale evolved, considering that border restrictions had prevented many buyers from physically attending.

"It had all the hallmarks of being a tough sale going into it,

given the fact we had a very restricted market here on site. But what we have learned over the last 18 months is that we've been able to adapt, take advantage of technology and information and use agents and the like and get the job done," he said.

Australian investment contributed 75% of the overall spend at the sale, a massive change from pre-COVID times, where around 60% of the spend came from overseas. That helped the market weather much of the uncertainty and vendors get much of their stock sold on Monday.

"The market here in Australia is in great shape, racing is phenomenal and I think what today proves is that vendors who provide quality horses that have got a bit of type and appeal on the page, that breeze up well, will be well sought-after," Bowditch said. "To clear 70% and with an average that is very strong in comparison at over \$70,000 is pleasing and it is a result that we would have been pleased about at the start of the day.

"There are still people ringing now about passed in lots and that clearance rate will continue to increase and we will walk away with a pretty solid outcome."
