The Week in Review, by Bill Finley

Flavien Prat is in the right place at the right time in Southern California. Young and gifted, he dominates the circuit in a way no jockey has in years. He picked up his 60th win of the meet Saturday, 25 more than runner-up Juan Hernandez. He won three stakes on the card, giving him 15 for the meet. And he rides for just about all the top barns on the circuit, most notably Bob Baffert.

It’s far, far from broke, but Prat is intent on fixing it. On Saturday, he told Jay Privman of the *Daily Racing Form* that he plans to ride the Keeneland meeting in April and then will move to Belmont Park. Belmont opens Apr. 28.

Prat told Privman that he thought riding in New York would give him as better shot of a winning an Eclipse Award. He was an Eclipse finalist in 2021, but lost out to Joel Rosario.

“It feels like if you want to give yourself a chance to get an Eclipse Award that you need to go to New York,” he said. “That’s just the way it is. I never thought I’d leave here, to be honest.”

It’s not that Prat isn’t good enough to ride in New York. Far from it. The problem for him will be that he will have to find a way to stand out in what is the most crowded jockey colony in the country. There’s Jose Ortiz, Irad Ortiz Jr., Luis Saez and Rosario. John Velazquez, who has been riding in California, will be back. Umberto Rispoli has also announced that he, too, will be making the shift from California to New York. **Cont. p3**

EDA RETURNS A WINNER IN SANTA YSABEL

Baoma Corporation’s **Eda (Munnings)**, making her first start since winning the GI Starlet S. last December, went wire-to-wire to win the GIII Santa Ysabel S. by a half-length over her late-closing stablemate **Under the Stars (Pioneerof the Nile)** at Santa Anita Sunday. Sent off at 3-1, Eda stepped right out to the early lead as even-money favorite Under the Stars sat just off her flank while racing three wide down the backstretch with **Ain’t Easy (Into Mischief)** to her inside. Jockey Juan Hernandez asked Eda for more approaching the quarter-pole as Under the Stars and Ain’t Easy started their rallies on either side of the pacesetter. She began inching away and had a two-length advantage with a furlong to run, but Under the Stars was closing late only to run out of real estate on the wire. With trainer Bob Baffert still banned from starting horses at Churchill Downs, neither the winner nor the runner-up were early nominations to the GI Kentucky Oaks and neither were able to earn the Santa Ysabel’s qualifying Oaks points. **Cont. p5**

The competition Prat will face in New York will be fierce, hardly the case in California, where the jockey colony has never been weaker. That's a big part of the reason Prat has been so successful in California...he's just a lot better than everyone else. The question is, how much has that played into his dominance there?

Prat will no doubt enjoy some success in New York. The key will be breaking into the top barns. He's won 13 races and 10 stakes for Chad Brown. He's had four winners over the years for Todd Pletcher. He won the 2019 GI Kentucky Derby via disqualification on **Country House (Lookin At Lucky)** for Bill Mott. That suggests that those trainers may give him a chance, but there's no way he can move into any of the top stables, push aside the regular New York riders and take over.

He will be in the top five in the standings in New York and maybe better. But there is no chance that he will dominate that circuit like he does in California. So is it better to be the fourth leading rider in New York or the No. 1 rider in California? One would think that the answer is the latter. Prat obviously disagrees.

Richard Mandella is Derby Bound

Hall of Fame trainer Richard Mandella has not started a horse in the Kentucky Derby since 2004. He's had five runners in the Derby over all and none have finished better than fifth. Neither of which is that surprising. Mandella is one of only a few top trainers that does not put a big emphasis on winning the Derby or other 3-year-old stakes. He likes to bring horses along slowly and many of his best runners have been four or older.

But that may be about to change.

Having never raced beyond seven furlongs, **Forbidden Kingdom (American Pharoah)** had some questions to answer in Saturday's 1 1/16-miles GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita. He answered them all and did so with authority, winning by 5 3/4 lengths. He may not be as talented as Life Is Good (Into Mischief), but he wins his races the same way.

Forbidden Kingdom rockets out of the gate, runs away from the competition and has more than enough stamina to complete the job.

That may not be so easy to do at 1 1/4 miles, but Mandella is the perfect trainer to get the horse to relax and stretch his speed out another furlong and a half.

A win in the GI Santa Anita Derby and/or the Kentucky Derby would be huge for the sire, **American Pharoah** (Pioneer of the Nile). While he's gotten off to a good start as a sire, he still hasn't had that Grade I star dirt horse to put on his resume. With Forbidden Kingdom, that may about to change.

They'll likely end their careers after their 3-year-old year and go stand at stud, not enough time to put together a career that includes enough starts and wins to be considered Hall of Fame worthy.

But most top fillies race, at least, until they are four. The two no-brainers on the Hall of Fame ballot are **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) and **Tepin** (Bernstein). Beholder ran 26 times and raced at six. Tepin raced 23 times and raced at five.

Since **Curlin** was inducted in 2014, Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** is the only modern era, non-gelding male to get into the Hall of Fame. Whether or not a horse with a short campaign can make it into the Hall of Fame will be put to the test when **Justify** (Scat Daddy) becomes eligible. He raced only six times, but is, of course, a Triple Crown winner. All other Triple Crown winners are in the Hall of Fame. **Justify** will be eligible in 2024.

“She was comfortable the whole race, she broke really sharp today and I got a good position,” said Hernandez. “I was outside and when she broke like that, I just came to the rail and just let her run. I asked her around the quarter pole when I felt the inside horse and the outside horse closing in. I told her it was time to go and she picked it up pretty good.”

Eda, second in the GII Sorrento S. while still a maiden, was fifth after attending a hot pace in the Sept. 5 GI Del Mar Debutante, but came back to graduate with a front-running tally in the Oct. 24 Anoakia S. She added a win in the Nov. 13 Desi Arnaz S. before stretching out to 1 1/16 miles to win the Starlet in her juvenile finale.

“Both of my fillies were training really well and I was debating whether to run her, there was another spot,” said Baffert. “It was either run here or go to Sunland Park. I thought, well, we’ll keep her here. She worked well coming into this and I’m happy both of my horses ran well...I don’t know where I’m going to run them next. We’ll definitely be in the [Apr. 9 GII] Santa Anita Oaks with someone, but I don’t know yet.”

ASK THE EXPERT: 2021 TAXES

Editor's note: Back by popular demand: our column where readers ask The Green Group's Len Green for advice on saving taxes on their equine-related activities.

What changes in the tax law can I take advantage of this year to maximize my tax savings?

--Kerry L., Lexington, KY

2021 has been another exciting year when it comes to providing new laws that can save you taxes.

1. First-year expensing for qualified property placed in use is allowed up to \$1,050,000. This would include the purchase of horses and more fixed assets used in your trade or business.

2. Qualified Business Income Deduction

If you are a sole business owner, or have an interest in a Partnership, Limited Liability Company (LLC) or a Sub S Corporation, you may be eligible for a tax deduction of up to 20% of your Qualified Business Income.

It is important to note that, if you are eligible, this is considered a personal deduction and can be used even if you take the standard business deduction.

3. There are also positive changes in:

- a. Child tax credit
- b. Dependent care credit and exclusion
- c. Earned income tax credit
- d. Charitable contributions

I own stallion shares. One of the stallions I own was sold abroad this year. Can I replace that with a new season to avoid paying taxes on it anytime during the year?

--John S., New York, NY

Great question.

Prior to this year, there was a section of the tax code (Section 1031) which allowed for the tax-free exchange of like kind assets.

If you meet the rules, it was possible to defer the gain, if there was one.

Under the new rules, Section 1031 only pertains to real estate property.

But can you accomplish your objective in another way.

If you sell the stallion shares, and the sale is for an amount greater than what you paid for the shares, you will have a gain.

If you buy a new share or any personal property (a horse or farm equipment) and it is eligible for a one year write off (Section 179) or for a first-year expense write off, you could possibly offset the above gain with the tax deduction from using either of these methods.

I bought a yearling in September and plan on selling him at the March 2YO Sales. Is that the same season? Or two different years?

--Gregory L., Montclair, NJ

I am assuming like most taxpayers, you are on a calendar year for filing taxes.

So, the buying of the yearling will be recorded in one year and the sale in another year.

If this is your normal business, we can call you a "pinhooker."

You would record the purchase as inventory in the year bought

and the cost of the yearling would offset the selling price the following year when the animal is sold.

If you were not a "pinhooker" but had bought the yearling to race but decided to sell in the next year, there may be different alternatives to the way you handle the transaction.

What is bonus depreciation and how does it affect my boarding business this year?

--Vicky F., Paris, KY

Bonus depreciation is defined as the additional first year depreciation (Section 168(k)) of the Internal Revenue Code.

It can be claimed in addition to any first-year expensing described earlier in the article.

Bonus depreciation can be claimed for eligible property whether it is new or used.

Something new: It also includes "qualified improvement property."

Items which are included in this special section are:

Any improvements to the internal part of a building of an existing building that was made after the building was placed into service.

Example of qualified assets: fences, watersheds, additional stalls, and barns

I am planning on starting a small thoroughbred business. Can you explain the difference between S Corp and LLCs as they regard to taxes?

Tom C., Louisville, KY

There are many advantages of operating your trade or business as a Limited Liability Company or a Sub S Corporation.

The protection against possible lawsuits in itself is a great reason for doing it. There are also certain tax advantages.

To maximize the tax advantages, you should form an LLC with a least two partners.

By taking the step to form either of these entities, you will be demonstrating you are taking steps to run your operation in a businesslike manner.

You will not be comingling your personal expenses with your business expenses.

LLCs offer more flexibility and many other advantages compared to S Corps. The one advantage of an S Corp vis-a-vis an LLC would be the avoidance of self-employment tax.

Is it too late now to make any changes that will help me to save money on my 2021 taxes?

--Susan M., Chicago, IL

The answer is generally no if you are reporting your income and deductions on the cash method.

But here are a few:

1. Check to see if you are eligible to take a deduction for a pension plan for 2021.

The rules are complicated and you must check to make sure you are not covered under another company plan.

But assume you are eligible, certain pension plans (SEP IRAs, IRAs) allow a tax deductions to be claimed for 2021 as long as the pension payment is made before Apr. 15, 2022 (or extended due date for a SEP).

2. If you bought certain business equipment and placed it in service, even if you did not pay for all of it before 12/31/21, you may be able to deduct the cost of the equipment in 2021.

3. If you paid state estimated tax payments on 1/15/22 and your total tax expense did not exceed \$10,000 some portion of the 1/15/22 payment may be tax deductible.

RACE MEET AGREEMENT AT CENTER OF HOLLENDORFER, TSG APRIL TRIAL *by Dan Ross*

A trial on the long-gestating legal battle between trainer Jerry Hollendorfer and The Stronach Group (TSG), along with its subsidiary owners of Santa Anita Park, is scheduled for Apr. 4 in the County of Los Angeles Superior Court of California.

The non-jury trial, however, is focused on a single declaratory relief cause of action against TSG, encompassing the proper legal interpretation of the race-meet contract between the California Thoroughbred Trainers (CTT) and Santa Anita, and excludes some of Hollendorfer's broader causes of action.

TSG banned Hollendorfer--formerly one of California's most prolific trainers numerically--from its facilities after four of his horses were catastrophically injured during Santa Anita's 2018-2019 winter/spring meet, when the track experienced a well-publicized spike in equine fatalities during an unusually wet spell.

In short, Hollendorfer argues in a brief, dated Feb. 25, that when TSG ejected him from its facilities in June of 2019, the company exceeded its authority as written into the race-meet agreement and as outlined in the California Horse Racing Board's (CHRB) rulebook. More broadly, Hollendorfer maintains that he was denied fair procedure when he was told he had

72-hours to vacate TSG properties after a brief and impromptu meeting with TSG representatives on June 22 of 2019.

In response, TSG maintains it has a common law right of exclusion, and that its authority was also granted through language in the stall application--an agreement between the individual trainer and the racing association--as well as through a CHRB rule pertaining to removal or denial of access. In pre-trial briefs, TSG has argued that the company twice gave Hollendorfer the opportunity to discuss his situation, and therefore, met the elements of fair procedure.

Hollendorfer has been barred from TSG-owned facilities since June of 2019--a period that has seen the trainer's fire-power decline markedly.

A court filing from late last year states that Hollendorfer's stable has shrunk from more than 120 horses in California to an average of just 10, with another 25 to 30 horses traveling between three to four other states.

According to Equibase, Hollendorfer trained 35 winners and earned \$1,619,956 in prize money last year. In 2018, he trained 176 winners and accrued \$7,191,756 in prize money.

Hollendorfer's legal tussle with the operators of Santa Anita dates to September of 2019, when he filed his initial lawsuit, and the following month, when LA County Superior Court denied his application for a temporary restraining order.

The plaintiff’s brief summarizes the defendants’ arguments. For one, TSG contends that the terms of the stall application--a document referenced by and woven into the race meet agreement--empowers them to “refuse horse race entries,” the brief states.

Furthermore, CHRB Rule 1989, concerning removal or denial of access, “provides a racing association--as a licensee--unfettered discretion to exclude any other licensees from their premises, including where such exclusion deprives another licensee of vested fundamental rights without Fair Procedure, due process, or equal protection under the law, or any other form of recourse or redress,” the filing adds.

Hollendorfer, however, asks the court to focus on a certain section of the race meet agreement “which provides that the ‘agreement of CTT shall be a condition precedent’ to the execution of a decision by Defendants ‘to limit or eliminate’ a trainer’s ‘ability to participate in racing or training activities’ at their racetracks.”

Since the start of legal proceedings, the CTT has supported Hollendorfer’s argument that he was denied due process and fair procedure.

Hollendorfer also takes aim at CHRB rule 1989, contending that the agency wields ultimate jurisdiction as to access eligibility of licensees onto CHRB-licensed grounds.

“Plaintiff contends that Defendants’ interpretation of the Rule is without merit, inconsistent with controlling case law, and would otherwise constitute the improper abrogation and/or delegation of the CHRB’s legislated responsibilities and duties to private entities,” the brief states.

The CHRB has taken no disciplinary actions against Hollendorfer for the fatalities in the winter and spring of 2018-2019, and he has continued to train at Los Alamitos racetrack.

A CHRB investigation into the fatality spike at Santa Anita that winter found no smoking gun. A concurrent investigation by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Task Force similarly found no evidence of “criminal animal cruelty or unlawful conduct.”

The court’s ruling will have a significant bearing on Hollendorfer’s broader claims for damages when he is expected to take them before a jury.

The ruling is also expected to have a bearing on the outcome of ongoing negotiations to revise the race meet agreement contract currently used in California.

Hollendorfer filed his initial lawsuit against the Pacific Racing Association--the corporate operators of Golden Gate Fields--on Aug. 12, 2019, in Alameda County Superior Court. That Court also subsequently denied Hollendorfer's application for a temporary restraining order.

With the 2022 breeding season underway, we continue to feature a series of breeders' mating plans. Today we have Brian Moore of Brushy Hill, LLC, breeder of recent G1 Saudi Cup winner Emblem Road (**Quality Road**).

Before getting into Brushy Hill's mating plans this year, we asked Moore about the story behind the mating, which was put together by the late Mike Recio, that produced Emblem Road.

"That was a Mike Recio special," Moore said. "All the matings up until last year and our entire portfolio is because of Mike's involvement. Emblem Road's dam Venturini (Bernardini) was out of a great race mare from a really exciting family.

We bought her in foal to Temple City in 2016 and we felt like we got a great deal at \$62,000. That first foal by Temple City went up to Canada and was stakes placed there. At that point we felt like we had a little bit of support behind the mare, so we wanted to go big with her breeding. Mike was super high on **Quality Road** that year and felt like he was the big horse on the upswing. Turns out he was right."

Emblem Road fetched \$230,000 at the 2019 Keeneland September Sale with South Point Sales Agency.

In 2020, Venturini produced a colt by **Nyquist** who sold for \$185,000 at the Keeneland January Sale to OXO Equine, but Moore said the mare died shortly after foaling that year.

“It’s unfortunate because we’ve done so well with all the babies out of her. She was producing runners, so it will be exciting to see what will happen with the **Nyquist** colt and hopefully this is the jumping off point for Emblem Road. We’ll be watching and rooting for him.”

Moore said that Brushy Hill’s program will be sending 15 mares to the breeding shed this year. While at one point they had over 25 mares, he said they have since scaled back due in large part to the loss of partner and advisor Recio.

“It was kind of a regrouping because he was our partner in a lot of these and obviously the advisor on all of them,” Moore explained. “We also thought that last year was a good time to do it. We weren’t sure what the market would look like this year so we didn’t want to get caught holding too much.”

Moore noted that maintaining a boutique-sized broodmare band helps them focus on their goal of seeking quality over quantity.

“It allows us to pick stallions that we really like without getting bogged down on what our total stud fee bill looks like,” he said. “I think the market is such that you have to breed to quality. Everyone knows that the middle market can be tough, so you have to try to play to the top of the market as best you can. For us, that means finding mares that maybe didn’t make it as superstar racehorses but have quality, exciting, active families.”

ALMADA (m, 8, Lonhro {Aus}--Amerique {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}) to be bred to **Violence**

This year Almada will be going to **Violence**. Of course he was hot when he came off the track and we have always loved him.

Almada is a really nice mare out of a great European family. She had a filly a few years ago that we sold to Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners called Dressed (**More Than Ready**). We expect great things from her this year and we think the mare will get support from her on the track, so we’re going back to a really nice, proven stallion for Almada. She had an **Improbable** colt two days ago. We went unproven last year and this year we’re going back to proven.

CATENARY (m, 7, Arch--Grand Pauline, by Two Punch) to be bred to **Good Magic**

Catenary is a big, beautiful Arch mare from the family of GSW Keen Pauline (Pulpit). She never really made it as a racehorse but we love an Arch mare any chance we can get one and obviously her family is impressive. She had terrible luck last year from a breeding standpoint and with her being such a big mare, we have to be really careful about getting huge foals.

This year we are sending her to **Good Magic**. He has had some tremendous foals. While most of what we do is to sell, if we end up with a good filly that’s by **Good Magic** and out of a nice Arch mare, that is something we would be totally content to keep and race in our own stable. We look at everything in terms of being as commercial as possible without getting to the point to where it’s not something we would want to race ourselves.

CELIA’S SONG (m, 7, Distorted Humor--Warbling, by Unbridled’s Song) to be bred to **Audible**

Celia’s Song is named after my daughter, so she’s one that will stick around with us for a while. We bought her as a 2-year-old and she won some races for us. She had a beautiful **Ghostzapper** colt last year. She foaled late, so we decided to keep her open.

This year she is going to **Audible**. Everyone loves **Audible** and is doing well with him. We’ve had a couple **Audible** fillies and have loved every single one we’ve seen, so this was an easy choice.

FORENSIC (m, 11, Medaglia d’Oro--Criminologist, by Maria’s Mon) to be bred to **Practical Joke**

This mare is out of a great family and we also used to own her dam, a multiple stake-producing mare. Forensic was one of the first mares we bought for our breeding program, so she’s another one that is a sentimental favorite.

Going back, this mare has had a Lemon Drop Kid, a **Flatter**, a **Mastery** and a **Speightstown**. It’s a really blue-blooded family and she’s a nice Medaglia d’Oro mare, so we try to breed her to as much class as we can. She will be going to **Practical Joke**. He’s one that was a great horse to watch on the track and we’ve been big supporters of him. It’s an easy decision for us to breed to **Practical Joke**. The battle we have is cutting the list down of who we want to send to him because he checks so many boxes of what we’re looking for in a stallion.

Plus, Forensic is a smaller mare with a slighter frame and we think **Practical Joke** will complement some of her size shortcomings.

OSAGE TREATY (m, 5, Declaration of War--Legendary Peace, by Peace Rules) to be bred to Mitole

This is a really beautiful mare. She was a \$170,000 yearling and a nice turf mare, which we always like. We first bred her to **Street Boss** and this year she will be going back to Mitole. Last year we had one Mitole foal that we absolutely love. I know this is his third year which is always a roll of the dice, but he was such an impressive racehorse that we think adding speed to her turf pedigree is going to be really exciting. It's an easy formula for us.

VENKAT (m, 7, Distorted Humor--Stormy Welcome, by Storm Cat) to be bred to Upstart

We love her family and this mare is beautiful physically. We kind of struggled with her this year in deciding what we wanted to do with her, but in the end it was kind of a roll of the dice but we're going to go with **Upstart**. He's a horse that we've always liked. I really like **Flatter** as a stallion. When we started breeding, he was relatively new and we really liked the foals we had by him. I think **Upstart** is great value at \$10,000 this year and I've always liked how Airdrie has managed their stallions. If we're right and he has a big year this year, with this mare's page I think we have the opportunity to do really well with the horse.

WARD BARN FIRE CLAIMS THREE HORSES

A lightning strike ignited a fire which claimed three horses at a Lexington barn owned by trainer Wesley Ward. The trio included **Strike the Tiger** (Tiger Ridge), who gave Ward his first victory at the Royal Ascot meeting when he won the 2009 Windsor Castle S. Also killed was the 5-year-old maiden winner **Modesto** (**Uncle Mo**) and a Hootenanny 2-year-old gelding.

"The investigators just left and they determined that lightning hit the main service pole and it sent all the electricity right to the box in my barn and caused the fire," Ward said Sunday evening.

Since his own win at Royal Ascot, **Strike the Tiger** had become a regular companion for Ward trainees heading over to the prestigious meet.

"He had been with me forever and he started us off at Royal Ascot," Ward said of the 15-year-old gelding. "We had just flown Dr. Wayne McIlwraith in to do surgery on his hock--he had a little issue with his hock--so he would be up in time to go back to Royal Ascot. That's why he was in the barn. It's heartbreaking. We are just sick about it."

Of Modesto, who broke his maiden at Keeneland last April, Ward added, "He was going to go on to have a stallion career at a smaller farm."

FLORIDA DERBY ON TAP FOR SIMPLIFICATION

Tami Bobo's **Simplification** (**Not This Time**) came out of his victory in Saturday's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. in fine shape and will now be aimed at the Apr. 2 GI **Curlin** Florida Derby.

"Yesterday, good break, a little problem in traffic, and when the jockey took him outside, the horse ran well," trainer Antonio Sano said Sunday morning. "I am proud of my horse. I'm happy for all the support the people give to me. I'm happy for another chance to win the GI Kentucky Derby."

Simplification earned 50 Derby qualifying points for his 3 1/2-length victory at Gulfstream Saturday and gave Sano his second Fountain of Youth win following Gunnevera (**Dialed In**)'s 2017 score.

Fountain of Youth runner-up **In Due Time** (**Not This Time**) exited the race in good order, but connections will wait to pick out a next start for the colt.

"We always thought that he was a nice horse," trainer Kelly Breen said of In Due Time. "We were contemplating going to Tampa, but I wanted to stay here in surroundings he's been accustomed to, and because of his affinity for the track, not that he doesn't like any other track. Why do anything different? I thought he ran a creditable race against a nice field of horses."

Breen continued, "Where we go from here? I'm going to wait for him to get back onto the track and see how he's training. The Florida Derby is in our backyard, but I won't say anything until I talk to the owners and come up with a game plan."

Also likely for the Florida Derby is **O Captain** (Carpe Diem), who finished third in the Fountain of Youth as an 87-1 longshot.

“We expected him to run a big race. He was training so good for it,” Gustavo Delgado, Jr., assistant to his father Gustavo Delgado, Sr., said. “We knew he would like the mile and a sixteenth because of his family.”

Junior Alvarado and Joel Rosario, who were unseated when their mounts **High Oak** (Gormley) and **Galt** (**Medaglia d'Oro**), respectively, fell on the turn into the homestretch in the Fountain of Youth, escaped serious injury. Alvarado took off his scheduled mounts Sunday, but is expected to return to action for Wednesday’s program at Gulfstream. Both horses also escaped injury.

White Abarrio (Race Day), who defeated Simplification by 4 1/2 lengths to win the Feb. 5 GIII Holy Bull S., skipped the Fountain of Youth, but prepped for the Florida Derby with a four-furlong work in :47.12 (2/125) at Gulfstream Sunday.

“He worked really well second work back. We were looking for a little bit more and we emphasized galloping out because we’re looking to build up his stamina a bit more,” trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. said. “The gallop-out was as good as the work.”

Of the Fountain of Youth result, Joseph said, “I’m a big believer in form lines, as far as horses that you beat coming back to win. To see Sano’s horse come back and run like that was a big result for us. Full credit to Sano for having his horse ready to run like that.”

With six victories in eight starts coming in, **Bank Sting** was made the second choice behind **Maiden Beauty**. In the end, it would be the former who would prevail, and notch her third victory in a row against state-bred stakes company. The 5-year-old landed the Dec. 5 **New York Stallion Series S.** by 8 1/4 lengths, and the Jan. 2 **La Verdad S.** in the slop last out.

Getting nice weather here against an open field, **Bank Sting** broke cleanly but was promptly outrun early by the outside speed, which included the 8-5 favorite **Maiden Beauty**. Glued to that one's outside flank as the field left the chute and hit the main track, the flashy **Terranova** trainee contentedly stalked the pacesetter through the final turn. Asked for a run coming into the lane, the blaze-faced bay emerged with a narrow lead, but **Maiden Beauty** refused to go away. As the pair locked horns for the final yards, **Bank Sting** eventually got the better of her elder, and held off a late charge from **Battle Bling** on the wire.

"She's a great ride. She's gutsy and she has a lot of heart," said jockey **Dylan Davis** of his mount's hard-fought victory. "For a

second, I thought the other horse [No. 3, **Battle Bling**] was going to overlap her but she was able to re-engage. She's smart--she had a little left in the tank and was able to get to the wire first."

Bank Sting has a 2-year-old full-sister and a yearling half-brother by **Laoban**. The dam is expecting a foal by **Solomini** this season. **Click for the Equibase.com chart or VIDEO, sponsored by TVG.**

"He definitely wasn't himself in the Saudi Cup. Basically, most of last year, every time he ran in a Group 1 we did a medical check-up afterwards." [Cont. p6](#)

Indeed, rarely does a meeting pass in Dubai without the European breeze-up circuit being represented by a winner. Take for example the meeting on Mar. 25 at Meydan, at which the progressive **Summer Front** colt Summer Is Tomorrow, purchased for £120,000 by Tadhg O'Shea and Michael Burke from MC Thoroughbreds at the Arqana Breeze-Up Sale, ran out the wide-margin winner of the Al Karama S. Two days later at Jebel Ali, Al Habash (Arrogate), sold by Star Bloodstock for 130,000gns to Ed Sackville at the Tattersalls Craven Sale, broke his maiden for Bhupat Seemar.

However, it's not all about Dubai. European breeders are also racing with distinction in Saudi Arabia, a good example being Street Boy (**Street Boss**), a Tattersalls Craven graduate who won his first two races just months after his purchase last year. Factor in additional potential interest from Bahrain, Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, North America and Europe and it's easy to understand the hopes of Goffs to establish this sale as a high-flying event on the sales calendar.

"It's hugely exciting," says Tom Taaffe, Dubai Sale co-ordinator. "It appears to have caught the imagination.

"Henry Beeby [Goffs CEO] has always given me an open hand to explore different avenues for Goffs. It was suggested to me a few years ago that this was something that might work, so we followed it up back then, put some work into it and ended up by putting a proposal together."

Nothing came of those early efforts but the groundwork had been laid, and so when the idea was revisited last year upon the interest of Sheikh Rashid bin Dalmook Al Maktoum, chairman of the Dubai Racing Club, the sales house didn't need much encouragement to set the wheels in motion. **Cont. p3**

Goffs Dubai Breeze-Up Sale Cont.

"Sheikh Rashid rang me to ask if we could look at it again," says Taaffe. "So I travelled out to Dubai, had various meetings, and we pulled it all together. The contract was signed on the day of the Prix Morny [Aug. 22] and we were able to announce it later that evening."

The timing of the announcement ensured that the Goffs UK Premier Sale, held that week in Doncaster, was awash with Dubai breeze-up chatter. It also ensured that the breeze-up community had plenty of time to digest the idea ahead of the sales season, in particular the Kentucky yearling sales, an area of the market that is traditionally attacked by European pinhookers.

And attack it they did. With the idea in mind that plenty of Dubai's racing is staged on dirt, the catalogue features 30 American-breds, among them those by top Kentucky sires such as Into Mischief, **Curlin**, **Gun Runner**, **Kitten's Joy**, **More Than Ready**, **Speightstown** and **Uncle Mo**. **Justify** is also among the first-crop sires represented.

The other half of the catalogue understandably offers a more European slant and is similarly impressive, boasting representation from Dubawi (Ire), **Frankel (GB)**, **Kingman (GB)**, **Kodiak (GB)**, **Lope De Vega (Ire)** and **Oasis Dream (GB)**. Also of interest is a colt by top Japanese sire Daiwa Major (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) bred by Coolmore out of champion Peeping Fawn (Ire) (Danehill) (**lot 31**).

"At the outset, we were hoping to produce a catalogue that was half and half—half turf and half dirt," says Taaffe. "Dirt and turf both work well in all those countries."

"There is always going to be a bit of scepticism when something new is launched and we respect that. But the consignors, who are a seasoned, hardy bunch of guys and extremely professional, have really backed this and given us some of their best horses. We started off with over 200 entries and we have ended up with an excellent group of horses—I think people will be amazed at the quality on offer."

The catalogue consists of 72 lots but three are reserves, meaning that 69 will go under the hammer from 34 British- and Irish-based individual consignors.

Willie Browne's Mocklershill is numerically the strongest with nine, among them the aforementioned Daiwa Major colt and a **Kingman** colt out of listed winner Snowy Winter (Elusive Quality) (**lot 48**).

Church Farm and Horse Park Stud send through a **Frankel** half-brother to G3 winner Lily's Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) (**lot 30**) while Malcolm Bastard breezes a Dubawi daughter of listed winner Joyful Hope (GB) (Shamardal) (**lot 24**), herself a sister to champion Crackerjack King (Ire) (Shamardal). Mark Grant's trio includes a Dark Angel (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) colt who is closely related to champion Tarnawa (Ire) (Shamardal) (**lot 57**). **Cont. p4**

Those with American Grade I connections include two from Meadowview Stables in a **Maclean's Music** half-brother to Grade I winners Majestic Harbor (Rockport Harbor) and Danza (**Street Boss**) (lot 8) and a **Mendelssohn** colt out of the Grade I-placed Maybellene (**Lookin At Lucky**) (lot 28).

The trio catalogued by **American Pharoah** are also unsurprisingly well-related, among them Grangecoor Farm's colt out of G3 UAE Oaks heroine Polar River (Congrats) (lot 36), herself a half-sister to another UAE Oaks winner (and former European breezer) in Down On Da Bayou (Super Saver).

Justify is represented by a filly out of G2 Pocahontas S. winner Dothraki Queen (Pure Prize) from Aguiar Bloodstock (lot 13) and a colt out of listed winner Sarrocchi (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) (lot 44) from Diego Dias.

When it comes to sire power, Micky Cleere's MC Thoroughbreds draft also takes the eye as vendor of a colt by **Gun Runner** (lot 1) and a filly by Into Mischief (lot 67), both sires who are carrying all before them in the U.S. Cleere, who will

breeze the horses himself, went shopping last year with this sale in mind.

"It's exciting and something to look forward to," he says. "It's nice to bring the horses to these buyers for a change. We had this sale in mind when we were buying last year, certainly when it came to the **Gun Runner**--that was the plan when we looked at him."

The **Gun Runner** colt is out of Grade II winner Bank Audit (Wild Event) while the Into Mischief filly is out of Grade III scorer Ageless (Successful Appeal). The draft is rounded out by a Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) colt from a

black-type American family (lot 5). **Cont. p5**

"**Gun Runner** looks a serious sire," says Cleere. "And this colt is the only one by him in the catalogue. He's a good-sized colt and a good mover. Donal Keane was out looking at Keeneland for us and we liked this horse but he didn't sell in the ring, so we followed him down and got it done. And I'm glad we did as he's a lovely horse."

"The Into Mischief filly is very strong and she's fast. She's generous in her work and improving with every week. And the Raven's Pass is a good solid horse who is also very genuine."

American influences also make up the draft belonging to Brendan Holland's Grove Stud, which offers a colt by **Hard Spun** (lot 3) and a filly by **Speightstown** (lot 54).

"Goffs and Tom Taaffe have worked extremely hard to make this sale happen and hard to promote it," he says. "I've got two nice horses—both are good-sized, good-looking, square horses by respectable sires. Hopefully they'll come up the track with a bit of style."

The **Hard Spun** colt, who cost \$80,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, is a three-parts brother to Hawthorne Derby winner Mohs (**Hard Spun**) while the **Speightstown** filly, who cost \$50,000, is the second foal out of the winning **Union Rags** mare Surprising Twist.

"We were looking to get three tiers of horses," says Taaffe. "We have catalogued some upper-league horses. Then there are ones which will be more affordable and a solid middle group in between. And I'm confident some of those middle-market horses will pull up into the upper league."

So How Will It Work?

"Sheikh Mohammed's vision is incredible and he has been very

generous," says Taaffe. "A lot of it is at his own cost, the staff expenses and the plane taking the horses out for example. So it's very important from Goffs' perspective that we have a catalogue with the right horses, and that was one of the reasons for having the horses vetted beforehand [chosen entries were only confirmed once they had passed a vetting examination during the early weeks of February]."

"They fly in on 17 March on a temporary quarantine pass. The jet goes out of London Stansted with the British-based horses and flies into Shannon to collect the Irish horses. They will load up straight away and then go straight on to Dubai."

"They should all be in their stables in Dubai by 9:30 p.m. that night. Then they spend two days in the NOFA quarantine facility at the track. They have excellent facilities; they'll be able to make use of a hacking track and lunge rings among other things. Then on the Sunday morning, they will be able to use the training track if they want and again in the evening as well. And they can repeat that again on the Monday. For those wanting to watch them train, they'll all be wearing cloths carrying their lot numbers."

Prospective purchasers will be able to view the horses on Sunday between 4 and 8 p.m. and again on Monday within the same time slot. The breeze takes place from 7:45 a.m. onwards on Tuesday, Mar. 22 on Meydan's Tapeta training track and, in a departure from the norm, horses will be required to turn in a gentle two-furlong breeze, allowing them to be judged for their movement rather than by the clock.

"It's early in the year and a lot of these horses won't be running until November at the earliest," says Taaffe. "They'll have to be let down afterwards and acclimatise for a few months before going into pre-training. So there'll be no timing and no stride pattern figures, it'll be all about allowing prospective purchasers to see that the horses can move well."

"When it comes to selling them, the horses will come up to the receiving barns at the track and we'll have five walking in the parade ring at the time of the sale while one is being sold in the winner's enclosure."

The sale kicks off at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Mar. 23 and the bidding will be conducted in Emirati Dirham. [Cont. p6](#)

While the expectation is that many will be bought to race in Dubai, Goffs have received intentions of interest from buyers based worldwide. Indeed, given that the horses are coming in on a temporary quarantine pass, it's not inconceivable that several will make the return trip to Europe.

"We've had interest from Europe, Australia, Japan and Turkey, alongside all the Gulf Cooperation Council countries," says Taaffe. "The Saudi Arabian race programme in particular is becoming a lot larger [the Saudi Jockey Club will host 90 meetings at the King Abdulaziz Racecourse in Riyadh this season, up from 64 in 2020-21]. There is another racetrack near Mecca called Taif that they're looking to make more use of during the summer months. So they'll be racing 12 months of the year and they need horses to fill that programme."

He adds: "It's exciting. The whole team at Goffs have put a lot of hard work into it. Nick Nugent [Goffs executive director] has worked hard with me on the logistics.

"We're delighted in the way it's been embraced and supported worldwide. If you have proper horses and proper people, then you will have a proper sale.

"We're very pleased with the catalogue and I'm confident that the consignors will be well rewarded. But this sale will also be judged on what happens afterwards on the track. We want to be selling good horses and also sustainable horses that run year after year, that is the ethos behind it."

Voute continued, "He is valuable and he is pretty well insured, so we made that a standard practice. I think we are waiting to see if that throws any light on it.

"Looking at it, I think it was multi-factorial. He didn't break as well as last year and David had to fight with him a little bit. Every time you do that he hangs his head on the side slightly and says, 'Oh, I'm not sure I like this'. The track was a little bit deeper and he got some dirt in his face, and he wasn't used to that particularly. I don't think any one of those things beat him, but maybe a combination of all of them might have done.

"I can't pinpoint anything apart from what everybody else can see at this moment. I'm sure John will say something when he has run the tests."
