RICH STRIKE TO SKIP PREAKNESS

Rich Strike (Keen Ice), who sensationally upended last Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby as the 80-1 longest shot in the field of 20, will bypass the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 21, owner Rick Dawson said Thursday afternoon.

"Our original plan for Rich Strike was contingent on the Kentucky Derby--should we not run in the Derby we would point toward the Preakness, should we run in the Derby, subject to the race outcome and the condition of our horse, we would give him more recovery time and rest and run in the Belmont, or another race and stay on course to run with five or six weeks' rest between races," Dawson said in a statement released by 1/ST.

"Obviously, with our tremendous effort and win in the Derby, it's very, very tempting to alter our course and run in the Preakness at Pimlico, which would be a great honor for all our group, however, after much discussion and consideration with my trainer Eric Reed and a few others, we are going to stay with our plan of 'what's best for Ritchie is what's best for our group,' and pass on running in the Preakness, and point toward the Belmont in approximately five weeks.

"We thank the wonderful Preakness and Pimlico folks that have reached out to us and very much appreciate the invite."

Q&A WITH HISA'S LISA LAZARUS: PART TWO

Last week, an important piece of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) puzzle was slotted into place when the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority's board of directors announced that **Drug Free Sport International** (DFSI) had been selected as the enforcement agency for the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) arm of the program.

In **part one of this two-part Q&A**, HISA CEO Lisa Lazarus discussed the reasons behind DFSI's selection, details about the newly announced Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU) and broad updates on the Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) program in general.

In part two, Lazarus discusses the working relationship between DFSI and the Authority--the non-profit umbrella established by HISA to oversee the broad program--as well as practical concerns about implementation of the safety program on July 1. Rich Strike Passing the Preakness cont. from p1

The Derby winner's defection comes just one day after trainer D. Wayne Lukas confirmed that GI Longines Kentucky Oaks winner **Secret Oath** (Arrogate) would back up in the second leg of the Triple Crown. **Epicenter** (**Not This Time**), who finished 3/4 of a length behind Rich Strike in the Derby, is also moving on to Old Hilltop, while a decision on third-placed **Zandon** (**Upstart**) is pending. The latter's stablemate **Early Voting** (**Gun Runner**) is already a confirmed starter in the Preakness and Derby fourth **Simplification** (**Not This Time**) is already on the Pimlico backstretch.

Claimed for \$30,000 out of a second-out maiden victory at Churchill last September, Rich Strike was beaten 14 lengths into fifth by Epicenter in the Dec. 26 **Gun Runner** S. at Fair Grounds and entered the Derby off a third behind Tiz the Bomb (Hit It a Bomb) in the Gill Jeff Ruby Steaks at Turfway Park Apr. 2.

I suppose it wasn't a complete surprise that the connections of **Rich Strike** (Keen Ice) announced Thursday that their GI Kentucky Derby winner will not run in the GI Preakness S. and will instead point for the GI Belmont S., forgoing any chance he might have had to win the Triple Crown. Owners and trainers have grown so frightened by the idea of running their horses back on two-weeks' rest that something like this was inevitable.

So this year's Preakness, missing the feel-good 80-1 winner of the Derby will not be as good as it could have been. Does that mean it's time to change the structure of the Triple Crown and put more time between the Derby and the Preakness? No.



By all accounts, Rich Strike is in the best form of his life and came out of the Derby in good order. But that wasn't good enough for owner Rick Dawson and trainer Eric Reed.

The last Derby winner to skip the Preakness was, actually, last year's winner Mandaloun (Into Mischief). But he wasn't declared the winner of the Derby until well after the race, when Medina Spirit (Protonico) was officially disqualified. Before that, there was **Country House (Lookin at Lucky)**, who also picked up the win thanks to a disqualification. But he came out of the Derby with a problem and never raced again. Before that, there was Grindstone in 1996, who suffered an injury and was retired after the Derby. In 1985, Spend a Buck won the Derby and passed on the Preakness to shoot instead for a \$2.6 million payday he was eligible for if he were to win the Jersey Derby.

You have to go all the way back to 1982 and Gato Del Sol when a Derby winner passed the Preakness for no other reason than the connections didn't think running back so quickly was the right move. Gato Del Sol finished second in the Belmont.

I disagree with the decision made by Dawson and Reed. There's no reason why a healthy, fit horse can't run back in two weeks. There's that and they have a chance to make history by winning the Triple Crown. That's not something anyone should just toss away. But I understand where they are coming from.

They genuinely believe that they are doing the right thing by the horse and there's never anything wrong with that.

Their horse. Their decision. It happens. Let's move on.

But some aren't willing to do that. Within minutes of the announcement out of Pimlico that Rich Strike would not run in the Preakness, there was the expected hue and cry that it's time to change the Triple Crown. Maybe four weeks between races. Or maybe more. Some even want to change the distances of the races, shorten them and end with the mile-and-a-quarter Belmont S. Call it the Triple Crown Lite.

Coming into the 2015 Triple Crown, the clamor to alter the Triple Crown was at a fever pitch because it had been 37 years since a horse had swept all three races and the pundits were saying winning three very tough Grade I races in a five-week span was impossible. Except it wasn't. **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) proved it could be done. Three years later, **Justify** (Scat Daddy) did it again. That was two Triple Crown winners over a 4-year span and the "let's change the Triple Crown" crowd went quiet.

The reason why the Triple Crown should never be changed is simple and, I would think, obvious. One of the reasons it is so hard to win is because the spacing of the races does indeed present a huge challenge. But that's exactly the way it should be. This is very hard and that's why it has only been done 13 times and every horse who has pulled it off is, rightly, considered an immortal. Putting more time between races would cheapen the accomplishment and all future Triple Crown winners would deserve to have an asterisk next to their names. That just can't be.

Yes, a Preakness with Rich Strike is a better, more compelling race that one without him. But this year's Preakness has a lot to offer. Trainer Wayne Lukas, who would rather have his right and left arm cut off than skip the Preakness with a Derby winner, has all but taken care of that. The filly Secret Oath (Arrogate) is a terrific story and her quest to pull a Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) and beat the boys in the Preakness makes this a fascinating race. Derby runner-up Epicenter (**Not This Time**) is coming back for round two and is a very good horse who would have been the favorite whether Rich Strike ran or not.

On Preakness afternoon, Rich Strike will spend his afternoon resting and relaxing in his stall at trainer Eric Reed's Mercury Equine Center. Jockey Sonny Leon will ride a couple of \$5,000 claimers at Belterra Park. It's OK. The Triple Crown will be just fine.

TDN: What will the working relationship between the Authority and DFSI--what is essentially a service agency--look like? Will they be working primarily at the behest of the Authority or will they be an entirely separate, autonomous agency?

Lazarus: Entirely separate. Once we sign off and give them the contract, we don't have any influence.

Our only authority, so to speak, is over the rule-making process and over, of course, selecting the agency. So, if we feel the agency is not doing their job, we have the right to make changes. But ultimately, running the day-to-day business of the unit is going to be their responsibility and the responsibility of the advisory council.

TDN: At the recent Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) conference, journalist Tim Livingston made remarks about lax drug-testing protocols in sports like the NFL and the NBA. He said, "I think you guys have to be careful because a lot of these guys who architect these doping programs are doing so with the leagues," and then he made the comment that they're not particularly thorough and aren't designed to catch cheats.

DFSI has worked with both the NFL and the NBA. Do these comments concern you?

Lazarus: They don't at all. I think they're completely untrue and actually quite shocking.

I worked at the NFL for 10 years, so I know very well how the NFL runs its drug program. To say that it's not intended to catch [cheats] while people are caught all the time, I don't really understand that perspective. I mean, I would disagree wholeheartedly.

I know people involved in every sports league in the U.S. I think the one difference is that the drug programs are collectively bargained between the leagues and the unions. So, there's obviously a representative of the athletes that has the chance to make sure that there's due process. There are protections--that's expected. That's what makes a program good. I mean, the program has to have integrity and fairness. But DFSI for me has the highest level of integrity. They also do work for USADA [U.S. Anti-Doping Agency] from time to time. So, they really have a stellar reputation.

I think the comments that were made are really unfounded and I don't know where they come from. My understanding was that his talk and experience wasn't in anti-doping, it was [to do with] a referee scandal.

TDN: But in terms of transparency of results, transparency of who's getting tested, the sharing of results, this is a different ball game to what DFSI has had to largely handle with some of those other human leagues, right? This is a different beast for DFSI, no?

Lazarus: Yes, it is an entirely different beast. And that's why we've created this Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit.

The way that I look at it is, DFSI is sort of the anchor tenant, because testing is the most work-intensive component of the unit. But ultimately, what they're doing is working with the advisory council to oversee experts that we're going to hire in all of these different pillars. So yes, it is an entirely different beast than what they're used to, but that's why the structure reflects that difference.

TDN: Stepping back, July 1 is looming large, and so far only three states--California, Kentucky and Minnesota--have agreed to shoulder the costs of the track safety component of HISA. What if all or nearly all of the other states decide not...

Lazarus: And Colorado. But I don't know if that's public.

TDN: But what if all, or nearly all, of the other states decide not to join them? In that worst-case scenario...

Lazarus: It's not a worst-case scenario. It's not a question of whether or not the costs get paid, it's a question of who's responsible.

The constitution doesn't allow us to force the state to do anything, so, if the states choose not to pay, what happens is that cost gets transferred to the racetracks on a per-start, strength-of-purse basis. The race tracks then take on that responsibility and they have to come up with a formula to spread that cost amongst the covered persons and to determine who pays how much. **Cont. p7**

If it's not paid, obviously we're going to work with the tracks to make it as easy as we can for them, but ultimately, the stick that we have in the Act is that they can lose their signal for pari-mutuel wagering.

TDN: There's an important personnel component to this as well, right? Let's take regulatory vets. There's already a real shortage of qualified veterinarians available to do the regulatory work. If a substantial number of states opt to leave that part of the equation to HISA come July 1, do you have a contingency plan to make sure there is a nationwide team of vets who can do the pre-race examinations, all that necessary work?

Lazarus: You're mixing up two concepts here. There are two components with every state. One is the money assessment. The other is the voluntary agreement. While only a few states have agreed to opt into the money [assessment], we have about 80% of the states agreeing to enter into a voluntary agreement.

For a very high level of success with voluntary agreements, I'm hoping it's going to be about 90%. But we're at about 80% now. And what that means is that we're agreeing with the states...to use their state stewards to enforce the HISA rules. Otherwise, what's going to happen is that HISA is going to have to come in and hire a steward to sit alongside the state steward.

We do have plans in place for those states where we have to do that. But a few racetracks have [also] come to us and said, 'Even though our state doesn't want to enter the agreement, can we work out a deal with you, because we have these staff, we want to be able to use them?' And we've been able to work with them. **Cont. p8**

We're in the process of getting together a stewarding panel that we can ship out to different racetracks if we need to, as well as regulatory vets, which you are right, there's definitely a shortage of. We're looking at ways that we can essentially plug those shortages if we have to. But we're really hopeful and optimistic that most states are going to reach that voluntary agreement with us.

TDN: As many as 80% to 90% of states have already signed the voluntary agreement?

Lazarus: No, I'm sorry, I should have said that about 80% have said that, because we still have a few more weeks. So, the deadline for opting in [about the] money was about May 1. The deadline for the voluntary agreement is toward the end of May. We've reached agreements with a number of them, but very close to reaching agreement with the majority.

To be fair, what I'm basing that number on are the ones that we're speaking to, working through logistics, coming to an arrangement. It's my belief and understanding that with those states, it obviously shows they want to make it work. We just have a couple more weeks to kind of wrap it all up.

TDN: You do have a contingency plan to make sure that the necessary personnel will be in place for those 10%, 15%, 20% of jurisdictions that don't sign that voluntary agreement?

Lazarus: Correct.

TDN: There is a considerable amount of concern--both from people stridently against HISA and those who are wholly supportive of it--that come July 1, we won't be ready for launch. What does the industry need to do to make sure this plane lands smoothly?

Lazarus: A couple things. One is everyone needs to go on to hisaus.org and register. We will soon be launching a campaign to remind everyone that they need to do that by July 1.

The second is racetracks need to get more involved and engage with us more--and most are--but especially in those jurisdictions where the racing commissions are not working with us, particularly the states that are suing us or are less likely to work with us. In those states, that's where the racetracks need to get involved because the burden is going to fall on them, not to pay for everything, but to be the sort of [fee] collector or the place where the information is going to be disseminated.

And [lastly], do what you can to kind of help get the message out to those that maybe are less likely to be on their laptops reading about developments. The industry belongs to all of us and this is a heavy lift. Congress gave us very aggressive timelines and we're going to be ready on July 1, but you're right, we're definitely going to need help and support to make this work.

TDN: There's a lot of really busy people in this sport who just don't have the time to go onto a website and try to find information that may not always be easily accessible. Do you think your outreach could be better?

Lazarus: Yeah, for sure. And we're working on that now and there'll be a lot more outreach between now and July 1.

I cannot tell you how many groups I've spoken to and how many appearances I've made on board calls, on Zoom calls, etcetera. I do that day and night. So, I hope I've reached a lot of people that way. And I think I have.

We've created materials for jockeys that are kind of a cheat sheet guide for them, what they need to do. We've disseminated those. We have one for the trainers that's coming up very soon and we also have a social media campaign that's about to launch. So, I'm hoping that's going to do as good a job as we can expect. We still have a couple months to get the word out, and I think we're going to get there. It's moving quickly, but we're going to get there.

HIGHFLIER LANDS RUNNING ON PASTURES

Somehow they had got it into their heads that it might be nice to buy "a small, gentleman's farm", just 10 acres or so, as an eventual retirement project. Jana Barbe's daughters, emulating her own childhood passion, had always enjoyed riding and some of the show horses were kept here in Kentucky. Such a beautiful part of the world, they hired a local broker and did some idle prospecting. Then came the 2008 crash.

"And this business, being built on disposable income, suffered terribly," Barbe recalls. "Suddenly it felt like every farm was on the market. And our broker called with this place on Newtown Pike near Georgetown. Just a little bigger than we wanted."

Like, eight times bigger. But they came out and had a look anyway. A little Eden on the Elkhorn Creek. There and then, Barbe's husband announced that their search was over.

They returned to their Chicago home, situated on a 25x125-foot lot, and Barbe summoned all the hard-headed sense that had for six years made her the only woman on the global board of law giant Dentons.

"Roy," she said, "you're out of your mind. We can't possibly do this. I work like a dog, seven days a week. I'm on the road all the time. Not to mention the fact that we know nothing about farming. You grew up on the northwest side of Chicago. I've never taken care of my own horses. We don't even have a yard. This is a working farm. It comes with a tractor!"

"No," he said, immovable. "We're going to do this."

Be in no doubt, there are still days when she lies there at night, watching the monitors from the foaling stalls, asking how did this happen.

"I can never sleep when we're waiting," she says. "Even though we have someone on duty."

This week she has been fretting over the overdue delivery--aptly enough, of a **More Than Ready** foal share--by an 11-year-old daughter of Tiznow, one of eight Thoroughbred mares now residing at Henley Farms. Letchworth's fourth foal is imminent even as her first prepares for the GIII Peter Pan S., at Belmont on Saturday, with prospects of breaking into the elite of his crop. **We the People** (**Constitution**) disappointed when fast-tracked to the GI Arkansas Derby, after two sensational scores, but that attempt to shoehorn him into the first Saturday in May was perhaps too much too soon. Either way, as its first graduate, We the People has already sealed the accidental emergence of this boutique Thoroughbred nursery. **Cont. p10**

But it's a fair question she asks: how did this happen? Raised near Miami, without the affluence for horses of her own, Barbe always found a way to get across a saddle: summer camp, stable work, college riding club. On graduating from law school, when her peers were leasing apartments, she devoted her first paychecks to leasing a jumper. She stabled him in downtown Chicago, on Schiller and Orleans, alongside the carriage horses.

By the time the Barbés bought Henley Farms, however, horses had long been marginal to her stellar career and the raising of a family. The first thing they did, then, was track down all the show horses that had maintained an equine connection over those years. "They looked after you and the girls all that time," said Roy. "Now it's our turn to look after them."

That's why you'll find a 31-year-old Welsh Pony next to the dam of We the People. But the Bluegrass soon began its cultural osmosis. Their first farm manager's dad was the late Marvin Little, Jr., breeder of Hansel (Woodman), who invited them to take a piece in a broodmare.

"And that's how it starts, right?" says Barbe. "You dip a toe in, then a whole leg. And one day you wake up and say, 'You know, we could do this. We have all this land, we have paddocks, stalls, everything we'd need.' So that's how it began. But those first years, it should have been a reality TV show. Every stupid horse mistake you could make, we made. Amateur with a capital 'A.'"

But every trial, every error, became a lesson learned. Four years on, they confidently perform their own foaling. And the two sides of Barbe's life not only dovetail but nourish each other. Long before Covid, she was adapting to remote working.

"It soon became apparent that clients were more focused on whether the work got done, and its quality, as opposed to where it might have been done," she says. "Lexington has airports. I can travel wherever. I'm on a public company board [Invitation Homes, Inc.], a private company board [The Boler Company], I'm a senior advisor for Blackstone. And they all get it."

"Mine is a life of extremes. Yesterday one of the warmbloods had a gas colic. It wasn't severe, but he loves attention so I groomed him for an hour and a half, because it kept him standing. And when I came in and looked in the mirror, I mean, I was wearing his winter coat. I was disgusting. And I did think that if I had to get on a Zoom call now, and explain this! But they've all accepted that people have passions in life, that can run the gamut, and it's OK."

And then what a treat to break off: nice clean office, fancy hotels, not to mention intellectual stimulation.

"The business world gives you at least an illusion of control," Barbe reflects. "I'm a control freak by nature, and it gives you that feeling: 'OK, I'm in charge, we're going to make a decision, we're going to weigh in on this. I have authority, a degree of autonomy.' Then you come here, and some colt is dragging me down the road, and there's no control. None. You can be derailed by the weather. And these horses, they all have minds of their own. Like Letchworth's Audible [yearling]. From a very young age, he found it necessary to jump out of the paddock. Doesn't go anywhere, doesn't actually want to leave his herd. But he can clear a four-foot fence, uphill, without a scratch. So very athletic, right? But I have no control."

Obviously they try to be as proactive as possible in sales prep.

"But so much of farming is about reacting," Barbe accepts. "And being tuned in. And accepting that what will be, will be. So yes, it keeps everything fresh. During Covid, it was the horses that kept me sane: the bonds, the empathy, were amazing. When I go away for business, I get to be a different person. But then I come back here, and I prize it: I'm in heaven on earth."

With that inquiring mind, Barbe has relished learning pedigrees. Indeed, while stressing her gratitude to advisors at Taylor Made, it was she who found Letchworth at the 2019 January Sale: unraced, but out of Grade I winner Harmony Lodge (Hennessy).

"The inner nerd takes over, reads every page of every book," she says with a laugh. "It was one of our first sales, she was pregnant to **Constitution**, who at that point was an unproven 'bubble' horse. We knew that bloodlines plus black type would be out of our range, so we had to choose--and we went with bloodlines. So I dragged Roy to see her, and she's big and beautiful. At first Taylor Made said, 'Hmm, don't know, what are you going to do with the baby?' And we said we weren't buying for the baby, so they went and looked at the mare and said actually she's really nice."

And, in the event, the baby turned out to be an unexpected bonus. **Constitution's** first juveniles flew, and this colt--from his third crop--proved formidable in every way. Barbe shares footage of him bucking and careering round a paddock when barely a week old.

"He was strong-willed and aggressive," she recalls. "Like, if you turned your back, he playfully bit you. He literally came out bucking. He'd cow kick. He was high-spirited, independent, fearless. The mare's **Audible** colt, he's massive too, but you can walk into the box and pet him. You couldn't have done that with We the People."

Slipstreaming the momentum of his sire, the feisty weanling immediately recouped the \$40,000 paid for his mother when making \$110,000 at Keeneland November from Machmer Hall. (He exactly doubled his value in the same ring the following September, albeit a second pinhook cycle only inched him up.) And he may yet perform further services to the page, plainly having far more ability than he showed in his first big test.

"He's so fast, his times were insane," Barbe says. "But he'd never been in a crowd before, he got stuck in there and didn't like it one bit. The trainer [Rodolphe Brisset] in his interview said that he's not an easy horse, and he wasn't from birth. The personality comes through pretty quickly. My hope would be that he learned, that he can digest and process the experience and bring that speed to bear."

With his upgrade, We the People's half-brother by **Always Dreaming** advanced his \$65,000 yearling cost (lower than Barbe expected, evidently due to a corrected OCD) to \$220,000 from SBM Training & Sales at OBS April. ("The same athleticism," says Barbe. "Only in a more manageable brain and package.") But whatever happens next, We the People has already taken the couple who raised him somewhere they hadn't really anticipated in starting their Thoroughbred adventure.

"I was a little ambivalent about the racing," Barbe admits. "I love animals, and in many ways racing is problematic in how it treats horses. It's an industry in transition, and appropriately so. It does need to clean up its own house. But I do now understand what I didn't fully appreciate before: the way that these Thoroughbreds are born to run. Our babies in the back field, they gallop up the hill, they gallop down the hill, nobody's forcing them. And then We the People happened. Watching this horse we bred, I was screaming like a lunatic at the television. It was like, 'OK, now I get this. This was a baby I played with here. This is quite different.'" **Cont. p12**





In the meantime, she had been heartened that her new community not only embraced these city novices but shared their values; that so many walk the walk on welfare. But something else also happened, the day Letchworth's bronco baby made his debut. All her competitive spirit was suddenly in play. And, as Barbe acknowledges, you don't carve out a career like hers without being extremely competitive.

"It's never easy when you're the only woman in the room," she says. "But in life I generally find it helpful to give people the benefit of the doubt, to ascribe good motives. Life's too short to go into the room expecting trouble or rejection or condescension. And anyway I'm not easily dissuaded. It's like riding: you fall, you pick yourself up, you get back on."

She works hard to be not just a model for aspiring young women, but also an advocate and mentor. "Choose your battles, with an eye on the prize," she urges those who seek her counsel. "Not every pass is a touchdown. You can get a first down by three relatively short running plays. Tortoise, not the hare. Don't be derailed by every obstacle, every potential argument. Don't allow your sense of security and self-worth and identity to be shaken by others. External validation is great, when you get it, but it in the end it's artificial. What has to drive you is internal."

Easier said than done, she grants. "There'll be lots of days with lots of tears," she says. "You know that 'glass ceiling' people talk about? I used to come home from work and my husband would be picking shards out of my head. When I graduated from law school, in 1987, the percentage of women equity partners at big law firms was between 15% and 18%, and the goal was 20%. And the goal today? Still 20%.

"But the more deliberate and strategic I became, the more I understood my power, and married that power to my authenticity, the more effective and accepted I became. But you shouldn't have to wait until you've turned 50 to wake up one

morning and say, 'OK, so maybe if I hold my breath a little here, am a bit more measured there...' We're demanding a level of grit and resilience that is unfair. Because the work is hard enough."

So how has she found the Turf, still so dominated by males?

"It is a very conservative environment, and needs a lot more diversity of all kinds for sure," she accepts. "But the only way we're going to achieve that is one person at a time, one foot in front of the other, and being really smart in how we go about it. We will get there. Because we have to. In the end the sport will become integrated because it can't not."

That's also why she believes other, systemic issues will also be tackled: because continued obstruction of reform will simply kill the industry. "In the end, everybody engaged in the sport will have a choice to make," she says. "Change is hard, I get it. But the sport will have to evolve, or it won't survive. If people think that's not coming, they haven't been paying attention."

Not that the Barbés intend turning the game on its head. Certainly their program is conforming to established market prejudices, using new sires and fashionable crosses. But they have shown imagination, too, for instance in acquiring (with Taylor Made's help) a 2-year-old **Ghostzapper** filly for just \$10,000. She wasn't going to stand training but conformation and pedigree nonetheless made her eligible to breed.

"So we put her in the field and she was raised by two old hunter geldings," she says. "And her first baby is to die for. So we've tried to be super strategic in our shopping, and super nimble."

Barbe and her husband are heartened by their reception from a community that might normally profile them only as patrons, not as rivals or colleagues.

"Lots of people have told us it's great to have new blood in the sport," she says. "And I do feel like we do have a place here; that our voice as a new entry matters, and can join others to advance the sport."

Recently they hosted an organization of young corporate highfliers at Henley Farms, eager to learn more about opportunities in Kentucky and the horse world. More than one took them aside with the same awed message. "Look what you've done here," they said. "You've made your life the way you want it. How many people would take on that risk?"

"I married a man who knew nothing about horses, and he embraced the dream," Barbe says. "I got really lucky there. And I feel like we're so privileged to be here, to have the chance to pursue dreams. I mean, my dream wasn't horseracing. It was living with my horses. But to have found a life that revolves around them, to have been able to make that happen? It's like everything else, really. One foot in front of another, and chase the dream."

NASHVILLE RETIRED TO WINSTAR

CHC Inc. and WinStar Farm's track record-setting **Nashville** (Speightstown--Veronique, by Mizzen Mast) has been retired from racing and will stand alongside his sire at WinStar, the farm announced Thursday.

Tabbed a **'TDN Rising Star'** off his impressive 11 1/2 length debut romp at Saratoga in September of 2020, the \$460,000 KESEEP buy followed suit with a dominant Keeneland allowance win a month later, good for a 103 Beyer Speed Figure.

Nashville may not have won the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but he was the fastest sprint winner on the card. After sizzling through fractions of :21.54 for the opening quarter and :43.87 for the half-mile, Nashville sailed home the easiest of winners. Geared down in the late stages, he crossed the wire 3 1/2 lengths ahead of his nearest pursuer in the new track-record time of 1:07.89, earning a 102 Beyer Speed Figure. Nashville's final clocking proved nearly a second faster than subsequent Eclipse Champion Sprinter Whitmore's time (1:08.61) in winning the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Sprint later that same day.

This season, Nashville continued his winning ways with a 4 3/4-length, wire-to-wire victory at Fair Grounds in March, covering six furlongs in 1:08.61, the fastest sprint race of the entire Fair Grounds meet and the fastest time at that distance in more than two years.

"Nashville is the fastest horse we have ever had at WinStar," said Elliott Walden, president, CEO and racing manager of WinStar. "He is a freak of nature. Three times he went :43 and change; he led through the first quarter in every start and led after a half in all but one start. The brilliance he showed will give him a big chance at stud. **Speightstown** is always a plus, already having six sons to sire Grade I winners."

By champion sprinter **Speightstown**, Nashville is out Veronique, a half-sister to multiple stakes winner Almond Roca (**Speightstown**) and graded stakes-placed Calistoga (**Speightstown**), who was purchased by James Delahooke for \$800,000 in foal to **Collected** at Keeneland November in 2020 just days after Nashville's powerhouse performance in the Perryville. He hails from the direct female family of GI Kentucky Derby winner Giacomo, GI Santa Anita Derby winner Tiago, and graded stakes winner and Grade I-placed Stanwyck. Nashville was bred in Kentucky by Breffini Farm and purchased from the Lane's End consignment.

REPORT: BALTAS BARRED FROM ENTERING HORSES AT SANTA ANITA

Trainer Richard Baltas is currently restricted from entering horses nor are his horses permitted to engage in timed works at Santa Anita Park, according to the *Paulick Report*.

"We are conducting an investigation into matters concerning trainer Richard Baltas," Aidan Butler, chief operating officer of 1/ST, which runs Santa Anita, told the *Paulick Report* via text message. "Pending completion of that investigation and any final decision based on the results, horses trained by Mr. Baltas are not permitted to enter races at 1/ST Racing venues nor engage in timed works."

According to the *Paulick Report*, the news comes in the wake of a sesamoid injury suffered by the Baltas-trained 4-year-old filly Speedcuber (**War Front**) in the stretch of a maiden special weight event on the turf May 7 following which she was added to the vet's list. She succumbed to her injuries two days later. Baltas trainee Noble Reflection (**Liam's Map**), who was entered for the 10th race May 8, was listed as a stewards' scratch.

A statement read: "The CHRB is investigating the circumstances surrounding the late scratch of Noble Perfection from the 10th race at Santa Anita on May 8 and does not comment on pending investigations."

According to **California Horse Racing Board records**, three Baltas trainees have suffered fatal musculoskeletal injuries in the past 12 months. **In March**, the Santa Anita stewards fined

Baltas \$1,000 after trainee Lookin At Sweetie (**Lookin At Lucky**) tested positive for methocarbamol when working Jan. 3 for removal from the veterinarian's list. Lookin At Sweetie won a maiden claiming race Jan. 21, prior to the methocarbamol positive coming to light.

When reached for comment by the *TDN's* Dan Ross, Butler declined to share any further details at the moment. *TDN* has also reached out to Baltas for comment, but did not receive a response prior to press time.

"He went out to the turf so he could have a light canter and then he just had a little blowout down the straight for a couple of furlongs to open up his lungs and stretch his legs," said Chris Connett, traveling assistant to trainer Charlie Appleby. "Shane was very happy with him and the way he was moving and covering the ground."

Impressive winner of the \$1-million Jockey Club Derby Invitational at the Long Island oval last term, Yibir made his 4-year-old debut in the G1 Longines Dubai Sheema Classic, dropping a heartbreaking decision to G1 Japanese Derby hero Shahryar (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Last seen finishing second in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket Apr. 29, Yibir arrived in New York early Sunday and cleared quarantine Tuesday.

"It is good to be back here," says Freddy Powell, Arqana's executive director. "But we are still very grateful to Goffs UK for hosting us for two years. We know our own place better though and it's great to see the smile on everybody's face to be back in Deauville. Some of them are already saying that they can't wait to be back in August."

It is easy to see why, for there is no more pleasing backdrop to the serious business of a horse sale than the seaside town where racehorses wander through the streets of a morning. With the horses in training back in their stables for the day, it is the turn of the next intake. In front of packed stands and a complimentary hot dog stall, juvenile after juvenile breezes down the back straight of Deauville's turf course with pleasing frequency, coats gleaming now that the winter is fully behind us.

"The consignors have done a wonderful job," Powell says. "Obviously we have more time than the other sales, and especially with fillies at this time of the year, suddenly they start to look great. The feeling is that if you don't have a horse for the early races, what is the point in rushing them to a sale when you can come to Deauville in May."

The horses don't just look good, however. There are some serious pedigrees among the original 145 catalogued and the seven wild-card entries. Just by Lope De Vega (Ire) alone you can find the full-brother to Phoenix Of Spain (Ire) (lot 17), winner of the Irish 2000 Guineas three years ago and now a member of the Irish National Stud roster. At the National Stud in Newmarket is the new recruit Lope Y Fernandez (Ire), and his

full-sister pops up in the catalogue as lot 107. Both 2-year-olds hail from the draft of Church Farm & Horse Park Stud. **Cont. p3**

Bhupat Seemar, who had his first taste of the Kentucky Derby experience with Arqana graduate Summer Is Tomorrow (**Summer Front**) last Saturday, sits alongside his uncle Satish, from whom he took over the training licence in Dubai last year. MCGIVERN OPTIMISTIC AS SPEEDY FILLIES CATCH ATTENTION by Brian Sheerin

DEAUVILLE, France--Deliverance came a day early for Katie McGivern at the Arqana Breeze-Up Sale as **lot 64**, a **Sioux Nation** filly and **lot 66**, a filly by **Siyouni (Fr)**, finished in the top five

fastest times overall in the session.

It was McGivern's fillies, the only two that she brought to one of the premier breeze-up sales in Europe, who emerged from the cavalry of 130 juveniles as being up there with the fastest on show.

McGivern stuck her neck out in going to €68,000 for the **Siyouni** filly out of Stars So Bright (Ire) (**Sea The Stars {Ire}**) at the Goffs Sportsman's Yearling Sale and she looks like being handsomely rewarded when she offers the speedster under the banner of Derryconnor Stud on Friday.

"I'm delighted," the in-demand consignor said in between showing the fillies post-breeze. "They put in a solid breeze and had shown some pretty good homework before coming here. They stepped up on what I asked them to do here.

"The **Siyouni** just naturally knew how to go. There was no teaching in her. The **Sioux Nation** was very straightforward as well in fairness. I actually came over here on my own with them.

"Everyone was asking me why I didn't bring staff with me but I kept telling them how straightforward they were and they showed that today. I have a girl helping me today and for the sale tomorrow but usually the good ones are horizontal." **Cont. p4**

So, too, is McGivern, who knows a thing or two about producing good horses. Daban (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), winner of the 2017 G3 Nell Gwyn S., is one of many high-class graduates from McGivern's nursery and, given the **Siyouni** and **Sioux Nation** fillies have passed the vet and pulled out of the breeze in top shape, the popular consignor was feeling optimistic on the eve of the sale.

She said, "They stepped up to the mark. You can do all of the homework you like but some will let you down at the sales. Not these fillies. I'm very proud of them.

"I bought the **Sioux Nation** in Book 2 at Tattersalls in October. I gave 36,000gns for her out of Sherbourne Lodge and I bought the **Siyouni** in the Sportsman's Sale off Castlebridge for €68,000, which would be a huge amount for me. We gave a big price for her as €40,000 is normally my maximum but we were lucky in that the mare hadn't produced a winner when we bought her but the first foal out of her has won since and that definitely helps."

McGivern added, "It's very busy here and hopefully they sell well. I know they vet 100% which is a relief because there's no point in having a fast one who isn't going to pass the vet. I actually had Kaboo (**More Than Ready**) here last year, and he didn't pass the vet despite being the fifth fastest, so he only made €40,000 in the end. Thankfully, these two have passed so that hurdle is crossed. I'll definitely sleep easy tonight but it will be nerve-wracking tomorrow."

There was a real international feel to the afternoon session, with Joseph O'Brien, Jean-Claude Rouget, George Boughey, Thady Gosden and Francis Graffard some of the many recognisable faces in baking heat.

Few have concentrated so heavily and reaped such rewards with breezers in recent years quite like Michael O'Callaghan has

and, while he hopes to be active at the sale which kicks off at 2 p.m. local time, the Irish trainer admitted it will be tough to compete against the international competition.

"It's going to be very hard," O'Callaghan admitted in between viewings on Thursday evening. "This, the best breeze-up sale there is, and the consignors keep their best horses for France. It will be hard to buy the best of them but we will give it a good go."

He added, "Blue De Vega (Ger) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), Now Or Later (Ire) (Bushranger {Ire}), Letters Of Note (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), they all came from the breeze-up sales and we'll be doing our best to find the next one tomorrow [Friday]."

In doing so, he drew Stoute level with the late Sir Henry Cecil on a joint-record seven winners of this prestigious Derby trial.

"He is possibly still a little bit green, but he's a very relaxed individual and I don't see a mile and a half being a problem," the winning rider said. "I moved him a little earlier than I would have ideally liked, but he was shrewd. I was in front plenty long enough and we were just rolling around a little in the finish. He's had a little shout on the way to the start, so you'd like to think there could be more to come."

Following on from Galileo's rampant week, his son Nathaniel has helped to put the Derby even more out of the grasp of any sire not directly imbued with his rarefied genes. Either the sire or sire's sire of the top seven quoted at present, the late Coolmore great could come to dominate the 2022 Blue Riband like no other year and if it is Desert Crown on top of them all it will surprise nobody after this. Not even his trainer, who has made choosing his words carefully an art form. Even the master of Freemason Lodge couldn't water this one down.

"You'd have to be very happy with that performance--he surprised me actually," he said. "I wasn't confident, as we only just got him up to a race after a minor setback in February but he was very professional. That was a big leap up. He was impressive in his maiden, but as he got behind with the hold-up and behind schedule we had to do what we did and he didn't let me down."

There is nothing in racing style, comportment or pedigree to suggest Desert Crown isn't made for the Derby and Stoute was unable to offer up any potential weaknesses for his rivals to seize upon. "We'll find out if he stays at Epsom, but I'd be very hopeful it wouldn't be a problem," he added. "His temperament isn't a problem, he's a very relaxed horse. He is a beautifully-balanced horse, so hopefully he'll handle that aspect as well and he has to go there with a very sound chance. Other than Workforce, all my Dante horses had had a previous race early in the season so that was very encouraging." [Cont. p6](#)

Royal Patronage is not certain to go to Epsom according to Mark Johnston. “You’re never delighted with second, but it’s nice to be back in the game,” he said. “I’d like to watch it back, as just as we started to make our move it got a little bit tight in front of him. He wasn’t exactly checked, but maybe the winner got a run on us, I’m not sure. We ran in a mile in the Guineas, having previously planned to come here and go to Epsom. We talked ourselves into a mile for the Guineas and the one thing we know now is that’s wrong. We’ve got lots to think about regarding where he goes next. It could be France, but it could still be Epsom.”

Pedigree Notes

The winner’s dam, who captured a mile maiden on Lingfield’s Polytrack, was bred exclusively to Archipenko until Desert Crown, with her best performer to date being the G3 Premier Cup winner Archie McKellar (GB), known in Hong Kong as Flying Thunder. Her 2018 colt Cu Chulainn (GB) was a 425,000gns purchase by the Hong Kong Jockey Club at the Book 2 Sale as a result of his full-brother’s exploits, but failed to make his mark for Brian Meehan.

This is a Juddmonte family, with the third dam Binary (GB) (Rainbow Quest) responsible for the operation’s prolific producer Binche (Woodman). She is responsible for the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. hero Byword (GB) (Peintre Celebre) and the four-times Grade I-winning Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}). When bred to Galileo’s Frankel (GB), she threw the G2 Prix Eugene Adam scorer Finche (GB) and the recent Listed Prix Lord Seymour winner Baratti (GB). Desert Berry’s 2-year-old filly is by Al Kazeem (GB), while she also has a yearling son of Study of Man (Ire).

TAKING THE HIGH ROAD

Jon and Julia Aisbitt’s homebred 4-year-old filly **Lilac Road (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}--Lavender Lane {Ire} {MGSP-Fr}, by Shamardal), whose lone stakes success came in last term’s Listed Upavon Fillies’ S. at Salisbury, went postward at odds of 15-2 for Thursday’s G2 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai Middleton Fillies’ S. at York and displayed a willing attitude at the end of the extended 10-furlong test to continue William Haggas’s fine run of form at the Knavesmire venue.

She had closed last term with a second to the reopposing **Ville de Grace (GB)** (Le Havre {Ire}) tackling 10 furlongs in October’s G3 Pride S. at Newmarket and finished behind that rival once again when fifth to Dreamloper (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) on seasonal return in last month’s G2 Dahlia S. down to nine furlongs back at headquarters. The eventual winner adopted patient tactics behind the leaders along the rail in fourth through the early fractions, but slipped to fifth rounding the home turn. Stirred into action approaching the quarter-mile marker, she quickened smartly to go second entering the final furlong and was ridden out in the closing stages to deny the game pacesetter **Aristia (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) by a half-length nearing the line for a career high. **Cont. p7**

"I was half-expecting her to win, to be honest, as she ran well the last day," admitted winning rider Tom Marquand. "We've started dropping her out in her races and it is very hard to come from behind at Newmarket. She relaxed into this today, we didn't go very fast and it worked in our favour. When I got off her at Newmarket I said to William [Haggas] if she stays on this path she'd get a mile-and-a-half, but she's clearly a filly with lots of talent. It was William's idea to drop her out at Salisbury [last year]. He told me to drop her out last and it'd be his fault if she got beaten. It's been the making of her and, as a jockey, you always want to give horses the best chance and basically William made her in one day. She's building up now and you'd have to say that was her best effort."

Reflecting on the performance of runner-up Aristia, rider Sean Levey added, "She ran a cracker," he said. "I think maybe in the paddock she wasn't as fully furnished as the rest of them and she's not quite there in her coat, so we'll take second today. I believe she'll improve as her whole family improved with age. She's faced good opposition today and has run quite nicely. She got a little bit tired before the line and she'll definitely improve."

Thursday's G3 Prix d'Hedouville at ParisLongchamp had the look of a smart race for its type and although there was little in between the first four home, it was Sheikh Abdulla bin Khalifa Al Thani's **Mutabahi (Fr)** (French Fifteen {Fr}) who had that bit extra for a career-best.

Shaping as if he was ready for this kind of test with a win in the Listed Prix de la Porte de Madrid over this 12-furlong trip at Saint-Cloud Mar. 24, the homebred travelled smoothly in fourth under Olivier Peslier until asked to go to work before the home turn. Responding gamely, the 11-10 favourite grafted his way to the front approaching the furlong marker and kept to his task to beat last year's G1 Deutsches Derby runner-up **Alter Adler (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) by 3/4 of a length, with the G1 Grosser Preis Von Bayern runner-up **Mendocino (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) half a length back in third and the G2 Prix Niel scorer **Bubble Gift (Fr)** (Nathaniel {Ire}) a neck away in fourth.

"He keeps improving and only he knows his limit," trainer Henri-Alex Pantall said. "He will tell us what it is one day and in the meantime we will try to keep going up the ladder."

Mutabahi listed-winning dam Marina Piccola (Ire) (Halling) has served up another in the mold of her G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin and dual H.H. The Emir's Trophy winner French King (GB). QUEEN OLLY ANOTHER TDN RISING STAR FOR NO NAY NEVER

David Loughnane is firing on all cylinders with his juvenile band this term and added another string to his Royal Ascot bow, and provided Coolmore sire **No Nay Never** with a fourth 'TDN Rising Star' of the campaign, when Amo Racing's €300,000 Goffs Orby yearling **Queen Ollly (Ire)** (**No Nay Never**--Surprisingly {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}) routed nine rivals in Friday's £20,000 Frank Whittle Partnership ebfstallions.com Maiden S. over York's straight six furlongs to earn an instant accolade.

The February-foaled bay was swiftly into stride and occupied a handy fifth, just behind the front rank, through the early fractions of this unveiling. Looming large going well at the two pole, the 11-4 favourite was ridden to the front approaching the final furlong and surged clear in the latter stages to outpoint **Catch The Paddy (Ire)** (**No Nay Never**) by an impressive 3 1/2 lengths. In winning, Queen Ollly provided her sire (by Scat Daddy) with a record four juvenile pre-Royal Ascot TDN Rising Stars.

"I didn't feel any pressure because we've had more expensive juveniles run this year and, if I felt pressure, it was because I felt she was the nicest we had," Loughnane said. "I don't really feel pressure, we make an assessment of them and they have to go and prove it's right. They don't always, but she's done it tenfold. She's still a bit green and had to muscle her way out of a tricky spot. She hit the front, pricked her ears and didn't really do a lot. She took a fair bit of pulling up and it'll take a good one to beat her at [Royal] Ascot." [Cont. p9](#)

He's loved by everyone and has done so much for racing, where do you even start with a horse like him? He's a one-off."

Aidan O'Brien said of the stable's leading hope for the Royal Ascot feature, "He's a brave horse. We have always thought he'd be nice and while he is four, he still has very low mileage, having only run five times."

Miami Twice?

Back at York, Amo Racing Limited's impressive Newmarket maiden winner **Miami Girl (Ire)** (Cotai Glory {GB}) bids to follow up in the Listed Knights Solicitors British EBF Marygate Fillies' S. with the G2 Queen Mary S. on the near horizon. Labelled a **'TDN Rising Star'** after that May 1 romp, the Richard Hannon trainee faces a dozen other winners in a contest sure to sort out the early wheat from the chaff. Amo have begun this season with a vengeance and had another TDN Rising Star at the track on Thursday.

"She surprised me a little in the manner in which she won and this is the next logical step for her," Hannon said. "It was this or the National S. and we just thought we'd be best off sticking to fillies' only, but it's a good race, unusually so."

Successful in the 10 1/2-furlong Listed Prix Melisande here in June, Jannah Flower was up markedly in trip on this return to action having signed off with a third in the 12-furlong Listed Prix des Tourelles at Saint-Cloud in September. Settled wide in mid-division after breaking from the outside stall, the chestnut was committed with stamina no concern for Stephane Pasquier passing the two-furlong pole and she ran hard to the line.

"This filly has it all, class, pedigree, lovely temperament and a nice action," trainer Pascal Bary said. "She is lightly-raced just because she was still tender and immature last season and we gave her a long break. The program is such that now there is nothing to run these older fillies in over a distance until August and the [G2] Prix de Pomone in Deauville. After that there are plenty of nice races for them like the Vermeille and the Royallieu, but she has three months without running. That is not right."

The filly was bought for €400,000 out of the 2019 Arqana August Yearling Sale by Shawn Dugan for Al Shira'aa Farms. Dugan selected four other yearling fillies for the operation at that sale, among them the €700,000 Rumi (Fr) (**Frankel (GB)**), now a winner of both the G3 Prix Vanteaux and the G2 Prix de la Nonette; €380,000 buy and Deaville winner Silvestri (Fr) (**Siyouni (Fr)**), second in the G3 Prix de la Grotte in

April of 2021; and the winning Grace Shelby (Fr) (Shalaa {Ire}), who was acquired for €230,000.

The winner's dam, the champion 3-year-old filly in Spain, is responsible for Ballydoyle's high-class Fleeting who was successful in the G2 May Hill S. and was placed in the G1 Epsom and Irish Oaks, G1 Pretty Polly S. and G1 Prix de l'Opera. She hails from the family of the G3 Atalanta S. winner and G2 Duke of Cambridge S. runner-up Ladys First (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) and the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud-winning sire Poliglote (GB). Azafata's 2-year-old colt Academian (GB) is a full-brother to Fleeting, while she also has a yearling colt by **Kingman (GB)** and a filly foal by **Sottsass (Fr)**. **Video, sponsored by TVG.**

An 11-time Group 1 winner, Verry Elleegant has netted her connections over £8 million and was described by Chris Waller, the man who managed her glittering career in Australia, as an “honour” to be associated with.

The statement from the ownership group was released on Thursday, and it read, “Being part of a champion racehorse is not just an enormous privilege but also a huge responsibility.

“We take this seriously and in the last couple of weeks have given further thought to what constitutes the right plan for our beautiful mare. We know she's a world-class stayer but we expect her to be weighted out of the Cups and there are limited options for her domestically.

“After much deliberation, we came to the realisation that if we want to campaign her in Europe, we need to do it properly and send her to be trained and prepared in the Northern Hemisphere.”

A tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe is understood to be the main reason for sending Verry Elleegant to Graffard this season.

The statement added, “We're incredibly excited about the journey ahead and showcasing her on the world stage. We know win, lose or draw she'll do us, Australia and of course New Zealand proud.”

Graffard shared his excitement of taking over the training of Verry Elleegant on Twitter.

He said, “It is a huge honour to be entrusted with the 2021 Melbourne Cup winner and Champion race mare Verry Elleegant. I am conscious that I will be standing on the shoulders of a giant in taking her on from Chris Waller, who has done such an impeccable job with her.”
