

## ATTFIELD CLOSES IN ON THE 2000 CLUB

In an era where robust stables seem to dominate the upper echelon of racing, dual Hall of Famer Roger Attfield has proven that while numbers matter, how you handle the ones you've got is often of greater consequence. And although one operation might attain a certain number of wins at half the speed of another, in part buoyed by its sheer loft, crossing the wire first remains the great equalizer. Illustrating that importance of reaching the milestone following a lifetime of churning out the highest quality runners, Attfield remains only two shy of yet another career achievement, the 2000 win mark.

"It's obviously a milestone," he said. "I feel it's a big accomplishment considering how many horses I've actually run over the years. Honestly, I hadn't really thought about it too much until very recently. But all of these milestones are very satisfying, aren't they?"

Attfield's list of racing accomplishments would make any racing novice blush. The native of Newbury, England has accounted for 22 Canadian Classics, winning a record eight Queen's Plates, the Prince of Wales S. five times and the Breeders' S., the final jewel in Canada's Triple Crown, on nine occasions. Earning the Sovereign Award as the Outstanding Trainer eight times, the 82-year-old has also shown his might south of the border on racing's biggest days, including a victory in the 2011 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf with Perfect Shirl. **Cont.**

## ATTORNEY FRANK BECKER ON TEXAS, HISA STANDOFF by *Dan Ross*

The simmering stand-off between the Texas Racing Commission and the powers behind the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) bubbled higher Monday, when the commission's executive director issued a letter warning Texas will prohibit the import and export of pari-mutuel simulcast signals at its racetracks if the Act goes into effect on July 1 with jurisdictional authority over the state's Thoroughbred racing operations.

In the letter, Amy Cook, the Texas Racing Commission's executive director, invokes various statutes in the Interstate Horseracing Act, the Texas Racing Act and the Texas Rules of Racing to substantiate this approach. **Cont. p6**

He is also responsible for molding the careers of seven Canadian Horses of the Year and subsequent Hall of Fame inductees--Norcliffe, Play The King, With Approval, Izvestia, Peteski and Alywow. Included among Attfield's 51 Canadian champions is GI Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile winner Perfect Soul, the leading grass horse in 2003. Among his most recent Grade I winners, Lady Speightspeare (**Speightstown**) took the 2020 renewal of the GI Natalma S. before adding last season's GII Bessarabian S. And already this season, he showed he still has fire power in the arsenal when Shirl's Speight (**Speightstown**) annexed the GIII Tampa Bay S. in February before giving his Hall of Fame trainer yet another win at the highest level in the Apr. 15 GI Maker's Mark Mile S. at Keeneland.

### Scaling the Cliffs

Armed with a degree in agriculture, while specializing in farm management, Attfield was an accomplished international show jump rider in his native England, and also spent a time as an amateur steeplechase rider, before immigrating to Canada in 1970.

"I had anticipated carrying on with my show jumping career but I got sidetracked a little bit," he recalled. "I started to help Frank Stronach out. He had a very small stable at that time,

about a 25-acre farm in Canada. I trained a few for him, so that got me started with the flat racehorses. I also had a few surgeries on my ear which affected my equilibrium, so I wasn't really able to carry on with showjumping anyway."

In 1971, the Englishman began training for Roy Kennedy's Gateway Farms in Milton, Ontario and three years later, took over as head trainer of Lt. Col. Charles (Bud) Baker's Norcliffe

“Col. Baker bought a young horse named Norcliffe,” he explained. “At that particular point in time I galloped all my horses, and he approached me about training privately for him since he was concerned about how this young colt would be handled. In 1974, I went to Payson Park with him as a yearling turning two.”

Getting off to a fast start with that operation, Attfeld nurtured Norcliffe to a juvenile championship in 1975 and the colt followed up the next season with a victory in the Queen’s Plate, the trainer’s very first attempt at the Canadian Triple Crown. The son of Buckpasser, who also won the Prince of Wales S., failed to handle the soft turf while finishing fifth in the final leg of the Triple Crown. He went on to earn 1976 Horse of the Year honors.

“In the early years, the Prince of Wales was actually held on the turf at Fort Erie,” explained Attfeld. “Norcliffe won the Plate and then won at Fort Erie, where the turf was rock hard because it was the middle of the summer. But the [old turf course] at Woodbine could be very soft indeed. And some horses, like Norcliffe, just couldn’t handle that soft going. He had low action, so that was really tricky. But he went on to be a tremendous horse. That really launched my career in Canada.”

While successful in his first decade of training, Attfeld’s career hit another gear after becoming the private conditioner for D.G. ‘Bud’ Willmot’s Kinghaven Farms in 1985. It didn’t take long for him to register his second Queen’s Plate win in 1987 with Market Control before bagging lucrative \$1-million bonuses when Kinghaven runners With Approval and Izvestia won consecutive Triple Crowns in 1989 and 1990. With the help of Attfeld, Kinghaven rounded out the 1990 season as Canada’s leading owner with over \$5-million in earnings. The trainer also guided Alydeed, the 1992 winner of the Queen’s Plate, to a second-place finish in that season’s GI Preakness S. and added a victory in the following year’s GI Carter H. In all, Kinghaven earned the Sovereign Award as Canada’s leading owner on five occasions, four of those under the guidance of Attfeld.

“We had a great relationship for a number of years,” he said.

Although Attfeld largely made his mark handling high quality stock and many leading prospects in the north, he also proved his ability to develop less likely candidates into champions as well.

“A horse that has always been a favorite in my mind, but wasn’t really the best horse was Play The King,” he said of the Canadian champion that went on to be inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2020. “He was a huge surprise that went on to become a very good horse. He was an absolutely useless 2-year-old. We left him in Canada when we went to Florida that year. In fact, the farm manager tried to find a good home for him as a riding

horse. He was clumsy. He’d stumble over a pole on the ground and fall down, so he never went anywhere. I came back the following spring and I saw him turned out with a donkey and a retired pony. That pretty much says it all. So, we started to train him again to see if we couldn’t find a way to find him a home. All of a sudden, he turned around to be a very good horse. Literally, the change came from out of the blue, which surprised all of us. I had never seen anything like it in my life before and I don’t think I’ll see anything like that again.”

Unraced until his sophomore season, the Kinghaven homebred won four of six starts at three, before taking seven of 13 starts at four--six at the stakes level--including Aqueduct’s GIII Toboggan H. in 1987. Injured prior to that season’s Breeders’ Cup, he underwent surgery to insert screws into the damaged leg and was given seven months off, but had done enough to earn the Sovereign awards as champion sprinter and older horse for the 1987 season. He returned at five better than ever, winning four of six starts, including a repeat in the GIII Nearctic H., and finishing a close-up second behind eventual Eclipse Award-winning sprinter Gulch in the GI Breeders’ Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs.

“He was an amazingly good horse,” stated Attfeld. “Just a really nice horse to be around. He always tried his best. And he was always a barn favorite because of his laid back character. He might not have been the best horse I trained, but he definitely was one of my favorites.”

### ***Esteemed Company***

When Mark Casse’s induction to the National Museum Hall of Fame was announced in 2020, it marked the latest commendation of the Canadian racing industry. However, it

wasn't the first time that a horseman entered the great Hall on both sides of the border. It began with the 1977 induction of Quebec-bred Lucien Laurin (inducted a year later in Canada), who famously trained the mighty Secretariat, and the trend continued when Argentine-born Horatio Luro, overseeing the powerful Windfields Farm of E.P. Taylor, joined the U.S. elite in 1980 (he was inducted into Canada's HOF in 2014). However, Attfield remains the sole member of the illustrious bi-Hall of Fame club to win a Canadian Triple Crown. Inducted into the U.S. National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame in 2012, he was inducted to its Canadian counterpart in 1999, his first year of eligibility at 60 years old. Attfield further widened the chasm between himself and his illustrious predecessors, sweeping the Canadian Classic trio on three separate occasions with Kinghaven's With Approval in 1989, that operation's Izvestia in 1990 and Peteski, campaigned by Earle Mack, in 1993.

### Triple Wow

Considering the Canadian Triple Crown has been landed only 12 times since 1932, the fact that a single trainer has accounted for three of those victories illustrates Attfield's dominance in the Canadian racing landscape. And all three of his Triple Crown heroes provided Attfield with rollercoaster rides that are often associated with horse racing.

Attfield's first Triple Crown winner With Approval proved he could compete, and win, on either surface. And while talented, the grey was definitely not a lock.

"We definitely saw the talent in him early, but we also knew he was a turf horse. To win the Triple Crown with him, we had to win the first two phases of it first. We thought he was capable of doing it, but it was going to be a struggle because he really didn't like the dirt."

"When he won the Plate, it was literally a head bob that could have gone either way. He later won the Prince of Wales, but not very convincingly. I longed to see him on the grass, so when the Breeders S. came around, I just knew he'd win it. After that, he never set foot on the dirt again."

In addition to the trio of Classics, the son of Caro also took the 1989 renewals of the Marine S. and Plate Trial S. en route to a 3-year-old championship and Horse of the Year honors. He also annexed the Bowling Green H. and Tidal H. at four. The grey was inducted into the Canadian Racing Hall of Fame in 1993.

Whereas With Approval had to earn his stripes, Izvestia was pegged a star early on. Flashing his brilliance at Keeneland when winning the Transylvania S. and Forerunner S., the grey later added wins in a pair of Woodbine stakes, including the Plate Trial S., before sweeping the triple in impressive fashion.

"I knew [Izvestia] had a great deal of ability, but after he won those two stakes so impressively at Keeneland, I began to think he could sweep the Triple Crown, too," recalled Attfield.

Later in the season, he added a win in the Molson Export Million. Named Canadian Horse of the Year, Champion Turf Horse and Champion 3-year-old in 1990, the son of Icecapade kicked off his 4-year-old season with a pair of stakes wins, including Gulfstream's Canadian Club H.

"Izvestia really took it to another level to be quite honest," said Attfield of the colt who tragically broke down in the 1991 Rothmans International. "He was just an exceptionally good horse. He won the Triple Crown by over 31 lengths. I had a real soft spot for him."

Flashy in both look and style, Peteski wowed Canadian racing fans by sweeping the Triple Crown by a combined 16 lengths. Setting a track record while taking the 1993 Prince of Wales, the son of U.S. Triple Crown winner Affirmed gave Attfield yet another win in the lucrative Molson Export Million, besting that season's Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero and GI Belmont S. scorer Colonial Affair, in addition to Grade I winner Kissin Kris. Following a narrow loss in the GI Super Derby, the chestnut was forced to miss the Breeders' Cup Classic due to an ankle injury and was retired thereafter.

"He was an exceptionally good turf horse," said Attfield. "He also went through the Triple Crown impressively."

With 12 horses officially recognized as winning the Canadian Triple Crown, Attfield has won a quarter of them, more than any other trainer in Canadian history. The only other conditioner to win more than one is Pete McCann, who trained 1959 winner New Providence and Canebora, who swept the triple in 1963.

If there is a secret recipe to Triple Crown success, surely Attfield must know.

"There really isn't a secret," he admitted. "First, you have to be lucky and that nothing happens to them between one race and

the other. A little thing like a cough could knock them off course. So timing is a big factor. But the main thing is keeping the horse fit and happy. As far as the Triple Crown goes, you have to train them with the intention of bringing them into every one of those races at their peak. That can sometimes be difficult [because of the spacing on the calendar]. You sometimes have to just let them down a little bit so you can bring them back to peak. You just can't keep them up there for an extended period of time. And experience helps you in that regard."

### **Five Decades and Counting**

A regular on the Woodbine racing scene, Attfield has also raced at many racetracks throughout North America, including Arlington, Pimlico, Hialeah, Belmont, Saratoga, Delaware, Monmouth, Santa Anita, etc. Attfield, who has been based at Payson Park during the winter months since he took his first champion Norcliffe there in the early '70s, continues to compete at Gulfstream during the Championship meet when the opportunity arises. Having enjoyed vast amounts of success at Keeneland, he continues to target the Lexington oval's spring meet before returning to his Woodbine base for the summer and fall months.

"I've raced all over America," the horseman affirmed. "I think I've won stakes at every track and in every state that I've run at. At one point in time, I was traveling a lot. I had three divisions and I had a motor home to facilitate moving from one track to another. We did a lot of moving around, which is difficult to do now, especially given how we did it in those days."

With approximately 30 horses currently under his care, Attfield recalls having as many as 65 horses during the height of his career.

"The number of horses in my barn never really fluctuated too

much," he admitted. "In the last couple of years I decided to cut back, because getting good help is getting more and more difficult. And I can't stand doing things incorrectly, so I decided to downsize. I also didn't want to travel as much as I used to. So, I don't really want to top out at any more than 30 horses."

Attfield continued, "I've pretty much run everywhere, but I never really ran all that many horses. I went about 20 straight years averaging 20% [winners]. Last year, I may have run 20 horses in total. So, I don't run many horses anymore. But I never really did, as compared to some of the trainers out there now. And I wouldn't even want to be trying that at this point right now honestly. I know when I had the three divisions, I was working very hard. I was at every track at least once a week. Having the motor home helped a lot. But that all gets old after a few years."

In an era that has proven wildly lucrative, yet tempestuous in equal measure for the contemporary trainer, Attfield admits that the current racing landscape has its challenges.

"To be honest with you, I'd find it difficult to be starting off now, the industry has changed so much," he admitted. "Training is really very time consuming. You have to be a good horse person but you also have to be a good people person. You have to be very good at communicating, which quite honestly, has never really been one of my strong points. I get so wrapped up in the horses that I would forget to bring anyone else into the picture. But despite everything that has changed, the one thing that really hasn't is you need to surround yourself with the best help you can find."

And the other ingredient for training success that hasn't changed?

"I just love horses," he said. "And I plan to keep training until I am just not capable of doing it anymore or I just fall off my perch."

### **Texas, HISA Standoff cont. from p1**

"Since the Texas Racing Commission regulates all aspects of Texas horse racing, including, in particular, pari-mutuel and simulcast wagering in Texas, the application of federal law pursuant to HISA in any aspect of horse racing regulation for a particular race or meet will necessarily preclude the Texas Racing Commission from full compliance with the Texas Racing Act and will, therefore, necessitate that no such affected race shall be allowed to conduct on-site pari-mutuel wagering or provide simulcast export signal," Cook writes.

"Any such request will, of necessity, be denied by the Texas Racing Commission," Cook adds.

[In an article for horseracing.net](#), Cook is quoted as explaining

how Texan tracks will, pending race-date approval by the commission, be permitted to run after July 1, but that imported and exported wagering signals will not cross the state line. In other words, “Texans supporting Texans,” Cook is quoted as saying.

To discuss some of the legal implications of Texas' approach, TDN spoke with Frank Becker, a noted equine lawyer and former adjunct professor at the University of Kentucky College of Law.

The following is a mix of written answers and a recorded conversation, slightly edited for brevity and clarity.

**TDN:** As I understood, the federal HISA supersedes state law. Am I wrong in thinking that?

**Becker:** No.

**TDN:** And so, this includes Texas?

**B:** HISA goes so far as to state it preempts inconsistent state law. Texas obviously has its haunches up by the federal government's intrusion into what it considers state business.

**TDN:** Cook is reported as saying that when it comes to pari-mutuel betting, only in-state wagering will be allowed come July 1. She also states that under the Texas Racing Act, no pari-mutuel wagering on live or simulcast races is permitted on races the state commission does not supervise. What are your thoughts about the arguments and the approach? Are they legal?

**B:** The federal government's authority is limited by the United States **Constitution**. Typically, the federal government justifies its constitutional authority for pervasive regulation on the

'commerce clause' of the constitution. The 'commerce clause' provides that the federal government has jurisdiction over 'interstate commerce.'

HISA's purported jurisdictional authority is based on the commerce clause. Thus, it relies on 'interstate commerce' as its justification. HISA attempts to codify the authority in the definitions of 'covered horse,' 'covered persons' and 'covered horserace.'

Texas appears to be attempting to be excluded from the definition of 'covered horserace.' That definition is: "The term 'covered horserace' means any horserace involving covered horses that has a substantial relation to interstate commerce, including any Thoroughbred horserace that is the subject of interstate off-track or advance deposit wagers."

Although Texas attempts to avoid its races being covered horseraces by eliminating 'interstate off-track or advance deposit wagers,' that may not fully solve the problem because a Texas track might be considered to be otherwise having a 'substantial relation to interstate commerce.'

The federal government often takes a very expansive view of what constitutes 'interstate commerce,' and might argue that many other aspects of horseracing involve 'interstate commerce' such as the presence of horses, participants, and even equipment from other states.

It will be up to a federal court to ultimately determine this issue, although some courts have recently taken a dim view of regulatory overreach attempted to be justified by an expansive view of 'interstate commerce.'

**TDN:** Let's take the hypothetical scenario that Texas takes this approach on July 1. What you're saying is, if trainers, owners and jockeys and such who are registered with HISA, and compete in states under the supervision of HISA, if they also try to compete in Texas, that potentially could yolk Texas to the Interstate Horseracing Act?

**B:** Even if Texas succeeds in avoiding HISA for horseracing conducted in Texas, are horses and participants nevertheless subject to HISA, even with regard to activities in Texas? We look to HISA's definition of 'covered horse' and 'covered person.'

A 'covered horse' is any Thoroughbred from the time it begins a workout at 'a racetrack that participates in covered horseraces or at a training facility' and ends 'when the horse has been retired.'

The federal government might take the position that any Thoroughbred horse that has ever done a workout at any track outside of Texas, or any training facility anywhere, remains subject to HISA even while in Texas.

And because the definition of 'covered persons' is very

expansive and applies to those dealing with 'covered horses,' the federal government might take the position that all racing professionals and owners are subject to HISA, even while racing in Texas, if the horse involved ever worked out outside the state of Texas.

If the federal government takes this approach, it appears that the only way to avoid HISA is for horses and participants to conduct activities exclusively in Texas.

Thus, Texas' effort to avoid HISA may end up excluding horses, trainers, owners, and other participants from being involved in racing in Texas, unless they confine all of their activities to Texas.

**TDN:** I know you're not a self-professed expert in the economics of the industry, but just on a common sense reading of the threatened scenario, how impactful could this be to the industry there? Is Texas shooting itself in the foot?

**B:** It could have a dramatic negative impact on Texas horse racing. It's hard to imagine it wouldn't.

I don't think it takes an economics expert to say, 'gosh, eliminating simulcasting is one thing, but if Texas has to keep out participants from other states, that's going to have an extremely deleterious effect.'

**TDN:** So, what do you think is driving this?

**B:** Do you want me to answer this?

**TDN:** Sure.

**B:** It doesn't appear to be difficulty in complying with the regulations. It appears to be somewhat philosophical. Texas has, traditionally, been averse to federal regulatory overreach into what it considers state business.

**TDN:** What do you think about the other argument Texas is making, that they're doing this to slow down HISA's implementation so as to better manage some of the problems that have arisen, and are expected to still arise?

**B:** It seems to me that the slowing down may be their main goal here. It's hard to say. I mean, [if so], it's a pretty drastic action to get them to slow down.

## DONEGAL RACING TO GIVE SEASON IN MO DONEGAL TO IRAD ORTIZ, JR. *by Bill Finley*

Donegal Racing, the co-owner of GI Belmont S. winner **Mo Donegal (Uncle Mo)**, will give a stallion season in the colt to jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr., who guided the horse to victory in the final leg of the Triple Crown, Donegal CEO Jerry Crawford revealed during his guest appearance on this week's TDN Writers' Room podcast.

Crawford said that, going forward, any jockey winning a Grade I race aboard a Donegal horse will receive a stallion season for that horse.

"It's something we've done with trainers for a long time," Crawford said. "We've been very supportive of our trainers and think doing something like this is very appropriate. We think that giving a season to any jockey that wins a Grade I for us is manageable from an expense standpoint and it recognizes the accomplishments by the best jockeys out there."

Donegal owns Mo Donegal in partnership with Mike Repole.

Crawford said he was inspired to give stallion seasons to jockeys **by efforts being made in California to do the same for riders**. The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) is exploring a rule that would make it mandatory that a rider be given a season when winning a graded race aboard a future stallion. CHRB Executive Director Scott Chaney told *TDN* that the proposal is part of an effort to keep high-profile riders from leaving the Southern California circuit for greener pastures.

"After I started thinking about it, I saw that the people out in California have been talking about this for a while," Crawford said. "I spoke to (CHRB Vice Chairman) Oscar Gonzales about this and he said they were trying to get some momentum behind this. I thought that if we did this and it helped push things along in California that would be a good thing."

Crawford said that Ortiz, who rode Tuesday at Royal Ascot, did

not know about his intentions before the Belmont. Ortiz chose to ride Mo Donegal over stablemate Nest ([Curlin](#)), the filly who finished second in the Belmont.

“We got separated after the Belmont because I went to the press conference and Irad had to ride in the next race,” he said. “I spoke with him on Monday and told him about this and he was pleasantly surprised.”

When asked if a rider would get a season with each subsequent Grade I win after the first, Crawford replied: “I know we need to have an answer for that, but at the moment I don’t.”

### CHURCHILL CANCELS WEDNESDAY CARD DUE TO EXCESSIVE HEAT

Wednesday's eight-race program at Churchill Downs has been cancelled because of excessive heat in the Louisville area. A National Weather Service excessive heat warning for Louisville remains in effect until Wednesday at 9 p.m. ET. Heat index values of 105 to 109 are forecasted for Wednesday.

Cancellations of races at Churchill Downs because of weather conditions are rare. Wednesday's cancellation was the 22nd in track history and only the second related to extreme heat, joining June 28, 2012.

Racing at Churchill Downs is scheduled to resume Thursday at 5 p.m. ET, although track officials will continue to monitor the forecast. Any decision about cancellations in extreme weather conditions is made through consultation with CDI's Equine Medical Director, track management and regulatory officials. Many factors, including temperature, humidity and wind speeds, are evaluated to ensure the safety and well-being of human and equine athletes.

Simulcast wagering also has been cancelled Wednesday at Churchill Downs, but online wagering is available at [www.TwinSpires.com](http://www.TwinSpires.com).

## ZHOU CAPTURES 2022 BELMONT STAKES CHALLENGE

Tournament veteran Tony Zhou bested a field of 68 horseplayers to capture the 2022 Belmont Stakes Challenge, which was contested online via NYRA Bets and on-track at Belmont Park during the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival.

Zhou, a 38-year-old New York City resident, took home \$85,800 in prize money plus \$52,945.50 in live bankroll for a total of \$138,745.50. With the victory, Zhou secured a seat at the 2022 Breeders' Cup Betting Challenge in November at Keeneland.

The Belmont Stakes Challenge was a live-money contest featuring a \$5,000 Entry Fee [\$3,500 in Live Money Wagers/\$1,500 to Prize Pool], contributing to a prize pool that the New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) seeded with \$50,000 - including \$40,000 to the winner and \$10,000 to the runner-up.

Contestants were permitted to make Win, Place, Show, Exacta, Trifecta, Quinella, and Daily Double wagers and required to wager a minimum of \$200 per race on at least five separate Challenge Races conducted on Friday; and an additional \$500 per race on a minimum of five separate Challenge Races conducted on Saturday.

"After 3rd and 2nd place finishes in previous years, getting this win in a major brought pure joy," Zhou said via Twitter. "My 1st day at the races was Belmont Stakes 2010 when I left with an empty wallet. I vowed to figure out the game and with some hard work and deliberate practice, things do work out!"



High Opinion broke her maiden at a staggering 97-1 going last to first in October of 2020 at Belmont and quickly proved that was no fluke when running a close second at 25-1 in Aqueduct's Winter Memories S. next out. Stalling a bit in taking four tries to clear her first-level allowance condition, she did so over a mile on the Saratoga lawn July 31 before just missing by a nose in the GII Ballston Spa S. and filling the exacta again in the GIII Noble Damsel S. back at Belmont. Fourth going too short in a six-furlong Aqueduct allowance/optional claimer Apr. 16, the dark bay most recently ran third in the GIII Beaugay S. May 14 in Elmont and was backed to odds-on to break through with her first stakes success here.

Bumped and pinched back to last in the first handful of strides under visiting Flavien Prat, High Opinion moved up several spots through the stretch for the first time and landed in fifth behind a :23.90 quarter. Advancing into third for the backstretch run, the chalk appeared to be one-paced as the tempo picked up past the five-sixteenths pole, but found her best stride in the final furlong and charged past dueling leaders late before holding off the closing bid of Tic Tic Tic Boom to her outside to prevail.

A full-sister to MGSW Tammy the Torpedo and half to GSW Seek and Destroy (Verrazano), the winner's dam was bought by Fred Hertrich for \$115,000 at Keeneland November in 2015. She has produced six foals, remarkably all fillies, including an unraced 3-year-old by Carpe Diem named Extra Speed, a yearling by [West Coast](#) and a 2022 foal by Flatter. Tuesday's curtain-raiser to the Platinum Jubilee Royal Ascot 2022 went as planned, with Shadwell's **Baaeed (GB)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) carrying on his winning streak in the G1 Queen Anne S. in the kind of straightforward fashion that is his hallmark.

With the G1 Lockinge S. runner-up **Real World (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) taking it to him this time up the centre of the track, the 1-6 favourite was forced to engage with that rival more than he had done at Newbury but while the final margin was narrowed, the outcome was the same in this 'Win And You're In' for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Keeneland in November. Settling the result with his usual sharp acceleration to take over with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, the homebred was ridden out to maintain a safe distance as the Godolphin runner stayed in contention to the line. There were 1 3/4 lengths between the pair there, with the returning **Order of Australia (Ire)** (**Australia {GB}**) four lengths away in third.

Jim Crowley enjoyed the prime position and said, "It doesn't get any easier than that. Everything went smoothly. Baaeed got a lovely tow into the race, the ground is beautiful, and I just let him stretch out for the last furlong of the race. It was like clockwork."

By the clock is exactly how Baaeed can be measured to date, with his sensational fractions during his earlier races in 2021 foretelling his explosion onto the scene on Champions Day here in October. **Cont. p2**

If the Lockinge had created a frenzy where comparisons were drawn with **Frankel (GB)**, this probably put that debate to bed as there was no surging away from the Suroor challenger. That is not Baaeed's style and he looked more of a cut-and-dried miler here than anyone would have expected, again displaying that ruthless ability to kill contests with a burst.

William Haggas is wanting to go up in trip, but he had a humorous aside to offer which was not far from the truth. "He'd be more interesting in a July Cup!," he said. "He is obviously a good miler and is bred to get further. I think we'd like to try it and I think it would be remiss of us not to."

Haggas has the G1 Juddmonte International in mind for Baaeed, with the potential to take in the G1 Sussex S. en route.

"He didn't do a lot really--he was not extended really," he added. "He travels well and settles well and that is a really important part if we are going to go further. I will speak to Sheikha Hissa and Angus Gold, but I think we are all quite keen to give it a go and that will be at York. It's whether we slot Goodwood in, in the meantime. The easy option is to stay at a mile, but I think we will give it a go."

Sheikha Hissa is in total accord with the trainer's plan and commented, "Obviously his brother and all of his family have been stepped up, so he has been bred for that. He has shown some speed, so William and I were adamant he will stay at a mile until we see he is ready and I think he is ready. I promised myself that I will enjoy it whatever happens, because I don't know when I will see a horse like this again. We will try to enjoy it as much as possible. I have so much pride. I hope I do my father justice. I hope that there are many more from this bloodline that we can enjoy, because he worked very hard on it."

Where Baaeed goes, Real World will not fear to follow with the winner still the only horse to beat him on turf.

"Real World ran well, he was just beaten by a better horse. He is getting closer, but not close enough," Saeed bin Suroor said. "I am thinking about a mile and a quarter, maybe the Eclipse in two weeks. I would be keen to run him, but I need to see how he comes back from here. Maybe also the Juddmonte after."

Danny Tudhope, who was to go on to ride a double on the day, added, "Real World is probably the best miler I have ridden and we have to bump into Baaeed! He has done nothing wrong and I am pretty sure that his Group 1 is just around the corner. He is versatile, he is a good horse."



## NATURE STRIP DOMINATES THE KING'S

**STAND** by Tom Frary

There was as much drama at the start of the G1 King's Stand S. as there was a lack of it at the end, where **Nature Strip (Aus)** (Nicconi {Aus}) and James McDonald emerged triumphant for Australia in a show of power to remind Royal Ascot what it had been missing. With the 15-8 favourite **Golden Pal (Uncle Mo)** blowing his chance at the start and **Khaadem (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) losing his rider there, the Australian maestro's biggest concern was the presence of the latter as he joined him loose late on to keep him company.

Always happy leading a trio up the centre as the field broke into groups in this G1 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint qualifier, the Chris Waller-trained 7-year-old took control with splits of :10.48 and :10.45 and was in his comfort zone from two out to register a ninth Group 1 success. Posting a sub-12 second final furlong, he inflicted a 4 1/2-length defeat on **Twilight Calls (GB)** (Twilight Son {GB}), with the 200-1 shot **Acklam Express (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) a head behind in third.

"That was incredible. He is just a freak of a horse and has silenced a few critics with that performance, because it was scintillating," commented McDonald, who had tasted Royal Ascot success in 2018 with **Expert Eye (GB)**. "We had a bit of a scare when I thought one was coming for me and it had no rider on—I thought that was a bit unfair!"

All the signs were that Nature Strip was getting stronger as he matures, winning Randwick's Everest in October, Flemington's G1 Darley Sprint Classic in November, finishing an unlucky

runner-up to stablemate Home Affairs (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) in the G1 Black Caviar Lightning back at the latter track in February and taking the Apr. 2 G1 T J Smith S. by storm returning to Randwick before his flight here. Chris Waller was making up for his near miss with Brazen Beau (Aus) in the 2015 G1 Diamond Jubilee S., which was the closest that Australia had come to a win since 2012.

"It means a lot," he said. "We don't get the opportunity very often to come here and take on the English, Irish, French, Americans and even Dubai and Hong Kong runners. To therefore bring a horse here and not only run, but win, is very special. I guess he is in the twilight of his career, but he has learned to be a racehorse."

"Nature Strip was tricky early on in his career, but he has got better with age and it is an honour to train a horse like him," he explained. "Australia has a huge racing and breeding industry. To showcase our breeds and what we do is important. Ratings stack up and he is one of the highest-rated horses in the world, but until you do it on the main stage it's another story. It will just remind everybody about how strong we are in Australia."

Of the winner's engagement in Saturday's G1 Platinum Jubilee S., he added, "Nature Strip still has jobs to do in Australia, but we'll see how he comes through this race and no decision will be made today." [Cont. p6](#)

Twilight Calls was putting up a career-best and trainer Henry Candy said, "I am absolutely delighted, what can you say about the winner? How many races has he won? How many millions has he won? So it is no shame to finish second and I thought Twilight Calls ran an absolute cracker. Ryan said there was a slightly messy start and he lost a length which did not help, but it did not make a difference. He might have been a better second, that's all. I would imagine we will go to York and somewhere they go very quick. He loves this fast ground."

Nigel Tinkler was understandably delighted that Acklam Express had justified his faith and commented, "The winner is very, very good. We thought we'd finish in the first half, although we did not expect to be as close as that. I am delighted. He is just a lovely, lovely horse. York and Goodwood are the targets. He shows a lot of pace and is very quick. He was just a bit too prominent today--we thought we'd come from behind. He has been to Dubai before and the Breeders' Cup is high on the agenda--we can't wait to travel again."

Nature Strip, who was bred by Golden Grove Stud, was a \$90,000 purchase at the 2016 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale. 

## COROEBUS PREVAILS IN PALACE THRILLER

It was tight at the death, but **Coroebus (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) had his head in front in a blanket finish to the G1 St James's Palace S. to add to his G1 2000 Guineas triumph and extend Godolphin's incredible run of success in the season's mile monuments. There were many moments when it looked as if the 10-11 favourite would fail to deliver as he first ran free in William Buick's hands off the moderate pace and was then trapped on the fence in early straight, but class acts find a way and he was able to do just that.

With Pat Dobbs riding everybody to sleep on the front-running **Lusail (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}), Coroebus had no way forward other than up the rail and he was fortunate that the Hannon runner veered left to let him through approaching the furlong pole. Battling courageously, he held the rallying 28-1 shot by a head, with a short head back to **My Prospero (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) in third and the race's hard-luck story **Maljoom (Ire)** (Caravaggio) flying late to be a further neck behind in fourth.

"I felt it was class and determination which got us over the line there," trainer Charlie Appleby said. "It was going to be a big learning curve for him today and I was delighted with how he took it in the preliminaries--he has never been more than 20 minutes up the road out of Newmarket."

Coroebus's draw in two was both a help and a hindrance here, meaning that he was at the same time able to gain vital cover while being penned in on his first foray away from the wide-open spaces of his two home tracks. By halfway, the writing was on the wall that he would have to be as slick as he was in the Apr. 30 Classic to find his way out of the pocket that was made

by the front two **Aikhal (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Lusail** and by **Wexford Native (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) and My Prospero on his outer. While he was able to slip by the weakening Aikhal passing the two-furlong marker, Maljoom was being stopped in behind and that was the crucial factor at play in this year's renewal. The Haggas runner produced his familiar late charge, but the line had come in time for the front trio and as they passed it Cieren Fallon's body language spoke volumes as the reality of Maljoom's ill fortune hit home.

Buick was relieved as well as delighted as he said, "I am very privileged to get on these good horses but, at the same time, it is a case of getting the job done. It was one of those races where it was tricky. I had a good draw, but a good draw can turn into a bad draw very quickly. Coroebus travels extremely strongly and you just want him to drop his head. Coroebus was brave, has a good turn of foot and a will to win. He has everything you could ask for in a racehorse."

Appleby is pondering a meeting with Baaeed at

Goodwood now. "William just said Coroebus was taking him on the whole way round," he said. "Thankfully, the turn allowed him to have a breather. We'll have discussions, but I think the [G1] Sussex S. is an option along with the [G1] Prix Jacques le Marois. On the evidence of what I have seen today, Coroebus deserves to be in the Sussex--Baaeed was very impressive winner, taking nothing away from him, but this was just our horse's fifth start of his career and I thought it was a gutsy performance in a race that probably wasn't run particularly to suit us."

Richard Hannon said of Lusail, who had drawn attention for how he had performed in the Guineas from a poor draw, "He's run a super race." [Cont. p9](#)

Hannon added, "He has confirmed the run from the Guineas, which we thought was an extremely good run--he didn't get it right in the gates and I think we proved it right here. A lot of people thought we should be going to the Jersey S., but he's won Group 2s and he's run not necessarily the race of his life, but he's put his name in place in a Group 1 and one's going to fall his way before the end of the year, I'm sure."

William Haggas said of his pair, "My Prospero ran a great race. He just wants further and he just doesn't have the gears. Tom [Marquand] said he is just not quite there yet. He is going to be a very good horse. Poor Cieren is absolutely distraught. It is just the way it is. It is a horse race and he finished very well and he would have won in probably two strides, but he didn't. When you are slow away and he got in behind, then had two horses falling back on him, what do you do? It is a shame, we had an opportunity, but that is the way it is. We will keep him going and maybe there will better luck next year."

The third dam is the G2 Sun Chariot S. winner Red Slippers (Nureyev), a full-sister to the G2 Jockey Club S. winner and G1 Epsom Derby-placed Romanov (Ire) and a half to the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Balanchine (Storm Bird) who was responsible for the G1 Prix de Diane heroine West Wind (GB) (Machiavellian). Becoming the first of the **TDN Rising Stars** to emerge successful at Royal Ascot in 2022, Victorious Racing Limited's **Bradsell (GB)** (Tasleet {GB}) conquered a host of talent to win the G2 Coventry S. and make Hollie Doyle Royal Ascot's most successful female rider on three successes.

Keen initially from her draw in the centre, the Archie Watson-trained £47,000 Goffs UK Breeze-Up graduate ended up tracking the right rival in **Royal Scotsman (Ire)** (**Gleneagles (Ire)**) to the two-furlong pole. Taking over soon after, the 8-1 shot forged away for a 1 1/2-length verdict over **Persian Force (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}), who stayed on to edge out Royal Scotsman for second by a neck.

"He got squeezed coming out of the gates, which was frustrating, and to begin with I thought I was drawn on the wrong side but once I got into a handy position on the girths of them I knew the further I went the better I would go," Doyle said. "Two furlongs down I was pretty confident, as they were all sitting ducks. His instant response surprised me, as in his gallops he is a little bit lazy, but he turns it on at the track. He hit the line hard and I struggled to pull him up after."

In a Coventry that seemed stacked with even deeper promise than usual, Bradsell who had surged on to the scene with a nine-length success over this trip on good-to-soft at York May 21 was coming home clear-best with no excuses for the beaten fancied horses.

Trainer Archie Watson is confident he can perform at the highest level now. "He is a very, very good horse," he said. "I said to my fiancé Brodie last night that whatever wins this by daylight will be a superstar, so I am delighted it is us. Early on it looked like the near side was well ahead, I was a bit worried we were out on the wing with nothing to lead us there. I said to Hollie before to try and get them to take you as far forward in the race as you can before you press the button. She pushed it two down and it was plenty far enough to go."

"He was bought by Tom Biggs [of Blandford Bloodstock]--he is the genius who bought him," Watson added. "He has won the best Group 2, so he'll go to the [G1] Phoenix S. or the [G1] Prix Morny. If he is to run before, I should imagine it might be the [G2] Prix Robert Papin, but I am not sure he needs to do that."

Richard Hannon said of Persian Force, "He ran a super race, he just ran around a little bit. We came here to see if we had a very good horse, and we have, which is the main thing. There's a big difference between first and second, but he's still a champion in my eyes and it's up to the horse to prove that." **Cont. p11**

Oliver Cole said of Royal Scotsman, “He probably did a bit too much in front and we probably used the two lengths we were beaten by too early. He had too much daylight, basically.”

**Pedigree Notes**

Bradsell's dam Russian Punch (GB) (Archipenko), who captured the Listed Radley S., also has a yearling colt by Ulysses (Ire). By Shadwell's first-season sire, he was watched by his breeder Deborah O'Brien who said, “Sadly, she lost her latest foal, a filly by Twilight Son (GB), so I decided to give her a break for a season. But we have a gorgeous yearling colt by Ulysses, who will be sold at the Goffs UK Premier Sale this autumn. We have also kept her 3-year-old filly by Mayson (GB), who is called May Punch (GB) and is trained by Tim Easterby. She won at Ripon last month and we are going up to Scotland tomorrow to see her run at Hamilton.

“I take a lot of time working out the matings for my mares, I don't believe that you need to spend an awful lot of money and I've never used a stallion from outside Britain as you don't need to. I was attracted to Tasleet because he was tough and sound over several seasons and was the right price for an, as yet, unproven mare. He's bred in not dissimilar lines to Baaeed.”

Providing a timely boost to the already-solid prospects of Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S. favourite **Bay Bridge (GB)** (New Bay {GB}), who he trailed by 11 lengths when fourth in the May 26 G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown, **Dubai Future (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) made only his third European start since the end of 2020 a significant one by stamping his authority on this competitive contest. Mainly confined to Meydan since the beginning of last year, Godolphin's bay had demonstrated the stamina to garner the 14-furlong Listed Meydan Cup last February and the Listed Dubai Racing Club Classic over a mile and a half in January. In the last two editions of the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, he had been unplaced but beaten around five lengths with his latest effort involving a run in reasonably close proximity to **Alenquer (Fr)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) and **Hukum (Ire)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}).

Away from Group 1 talent, the 20-1 shot was able to travel comfortably off the honest early pace with **Danny Tudhope** biding his time. That came approaching two out, when the bay was allowed to kick on and seal the outcome quickly as he pounded to a three-length dismissal of **Sheikh Abdullah Almalek Alsabab's** Goffs London purchase **Cadillac (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}). **Cont. p12**

In a sad postscript for Godolphin, the Charlie Appleby-trained **Star Safari (GB)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) was fatally injured at halfway.

Tudhope, who ended day one as leading rider, said, “We had such a smooth run round and I couldn’t have asked for a better position. He stays a mile and a half and they went a good gallop, which suited him. I was a bit surprised as to how far in front I was, but the way he was travelling, I would have been surprised if something had come past me.”

Saeed bin Suroor added, “The cheekpieces keep Dubai Future more focused. We might take him to Newmarket for a Group 2 now.”

Dubai Future is the sole black-type performer so far out of the GIII Orchid S. winner and GII Sheepshead Bay S. runner-up Anjaz (Street Cry {Ire}), a daughter of the G1 Fillies’ Mile scorer and G1 Irish Oaks runner-up Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells). Anjaz, whose GII New York S.-winning half-sister Giants Play (Giant’s Causeway) produced Dubawi’s G3 Nad Al Sheba Trophy and G3 Deutsches St Leger scorer Ispolini (GB) and G2 Park Hill S.-placed Vivionn (GB), is a daughter of the remarkable Magnificent Style (Silver Hawk) responsible for the likes of Nathaniel (Ire) and Great Heavens (GB) by Galileo (Ire). The dam’s 3-year-old filly After the Rain (Ire) (Shamardal) is a three-times winner for Charlie Appleby, while she also has the unraced juvenile filly Winter’s Love (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). **VIDEO.**

**COLTRANE (IRE) (g, 5, Mastercraftsman {Ire}--Promise Me {Ire}, by Montjeu {Ire})** was winless in six starts since annexing 2020’s Melrose H. at York and lined up for this marathon coming back

off a second in last month’s Chester Cup. Held up in touch along the fence, the 14-1 chance weaved a passage to the front with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and was driven out in the closing stages to prevail by an ultimately snug 3/4-of-a-length from Bring On The Night (GB) (**Gleneagles {Ire}**). “I must say a big thank you to the boss [Andrew Balding] and to the Mariscottis for giving me such a great opportunity,” said winning rider Callum Hutchinson after landing a maiden Royal winner. “The boss has been a great supporter this year and I’ve ridden six winners from 17 rides for him. He’s been great to me and I’ve been kicking on throughout the year. Hopefully this winner will give me a real kick and the season will keep on progressing. Coltrane jumped beautifully, I kicked to go forward and could sit sort of handy. All the horses from the outer draws wanted to get handy as well so they kicked on and we got a lovely tow. The horse got me out of trouble two out, he got through the gap nicely and quickened away. I saw Ryan [Moore] coming upsides me [on Bring On The Night] and in the back of my mind I thought this could be game over, but he’s a tough horse and he’s galloped strongly all the way to the line. He is a big yard legend, I’ve ridden him a fair bit at home and he’s just a brilliant horse to have. My mum and my nan are here, so they’ll be delighted to see that.”

Balding added, “I was just really happy all the way through and I thought Callum gave him a beautiful ride. He was always in the right spot and made his space like a seasoned pro in the straight. I thought Ryan was going to come and do us, but Callum is strong in a finish as well. I’m very proud of the jockey and very proud of the horse.” Coltrane is the first of five foals and lone runner out of an unraced half-sister to Listed Eyrefield S. second The Fist of God (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells) and Listed Polonia S. runner-up You’re resobeautiful (Ire) (**No Nay Never**). **Cont. p13**



Shaken up for his bid just before the quarter-mile marker, the 16-1 chance gained a narrow advantage entering the final furlong and was driven out to withstand the rally of Chester Cup victor Cleveland (Ire) (**Camelot {GB}**) by 1 1/4 lengths in game fashion. "This is brilliant and Mark [Markey], who owns Get Shirty as part of Akela Thoroughbreds, is a great supporter of ours," said trainer David O'Meara. "Get Shirty did it very well, it was very straightforward and, apart from a little bit of scrimmaging on the rail late on, everything went pretty smoothly. We gave him a few runs last year and then he has come out and won three out of four this year. He ran on good ground in France, so we were hopeful enough that he'd handle it here. It would be nice to think he was a stakes horse and I'm not sure he's up to that level yet, but today was brilliant. Danny [Tudhope] gave him a great ride and he's had a double today, which is brilliant for him. We've had some Royal Ascot winners over the years, with the likes of Lord Glitters, but they are hard to come by and are all very much appreciated."

Tudhope, who secured a quickfire double after winning the Listed Wolferton S. aboard Dubai Future (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), added, "Get Shirty is a lovely horse, he stays and it is great for the owners who have given great support to David. It is great to ride a winner for David at Royal Ascot, too." Get Shirty, who won the Listed Prix du Carrousel and ran third in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier in 2020, is the first of five foals and lone performer produced by a multiple-winning full-sister to G1 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) and G1 Premio Lydia Tesio placegetter Soberania (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). The February-foaled bay's dam Soccer Mom (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) is also a half-sister to G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern hero Seismos (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and G3 Grosse Europa Meile victrix Samba Brazil (Ger) (Teofilo {Ire}). ## THE MAJOR ROYAL ASCOT TALKING POINTS

And breathe. As starting dishes go, few have been tastier than what Ascot served up on day one of the royal meeting, with promise of more to come later in the week.

From bargain buy **Bradsell (GB)** (Tasleet {GB}) bolting up in the G2 Coventry S. to **Golden Pal (Uncle Mo)** disappointing in the G1 King's Stand S., there were a huge amount of talking points to emerge from day one. Brian Sheerin examined the big takeouts from a pulsating day's action.

### Bradsell the Best Result Imaginable

You would be doing well to buy a horse to win a races at any level in Britain or Ireland for just 12,000gns and, the fact that the brilliant Coventry S. scorer Bradsell once went through the ring for that paltry sum should offer an incentive to everyone who has ever flirted with the idea of getting involved in racehorse ownership.

Bradsell, bred by Deborah O'Brien who has developed the family for generations, was offered on her behalf by Bearstone Stud and sold to Highflyer Bloodstock for just 12,000gns at the Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale in September 2021.

### Royal Ascot Talking Points Cont.

By first-season sire Tasleet (GB), Bradsell was subsequently sold for £47,000--again a relatively small figure--by Mark Grant to Blandford Bloodstock at the Goffs Breeze-Up Sale in April.

Arguably one of the most impressive juvenile winners of the season when winning on debut at York, Bradsell confirmed the impression he left that day was completely correct by storming to Ascot glory, the win made all the more memorable for the fact that Hollie Doyle was in the saddle.

It shouldn't be forgotten that Bradsell's trainer Archie Watson, who lost the G1 Commonwealth Cup last year in the stewards' room after first-past-the-post Dragon Symbol (GB) (Cable Bay {Ire}) was deemed to have inconvenienced Campanelle (Kodiac {GB}), was securing his second win at the royal meeting after sending out Parent's Prayer (Ire) (Kingman {GB}) to score in 2021.

It is one of the captivating aspects of racing that, no matter how much money you throw at the game, it doesn't equate to success and the victory of Bradsell, in a stallion-making race, shows that everyone has a chance.

### Maljoom Another Top Miler in the Making

Tongues were sent wagging, and rightly so, after Baaeed (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) sauntered to G1 Queen Anne S. glory while Coroebus (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) got out of trouble in the G1 St James's Palace S., and it will be fascinating if both colts lock horns in the G1 Sussex S. later this summer.

However, **Maljoom (Ire)** (Caravaggio) should not be forgotten about with a view towards top honours over a mile this season, as he hardened his reputation in defeat behind Coroebus, enduring a luckless passage to fly home for fourth.

Another stride or two, and the case could be made that Maljoom would have won and, for all that his trainer William Haggas would have been hugely disappointed not to win the St James's Palace, he left Ascot in no doubt that he has another top miler in his stable.

Like his stablemate Baaeed, Maljoom didn't grace the track until his 3-year-old campaign, and the rate at which he has improved from each start to the next has been nothing short of phenomenal.

This is a horse who won the G2 German 2000 Guineas on just

his third start and, if he can show the same improvement as he did from Cologne to Royal Ascot as he can between now and his next start, he will need to be respected wherever he lines out in the future.

It was also notable in the St James's Palace that **New Energy (Ire)** (New Bay {Ire}), trained by Sheila Lavery, ran a similar race to his second-place showing in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas in that he travelled extremely well up to a point. Perhaps better will be seen from him back in trip with the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly next month looking the most obvious race for him.

Looking ahead, Charlie Appleby will not want similar tactics for Coroebus to overcome and it could be the case that Godolphin run a pacemaker for him in the Sussex.

### Bay Bridge Boost

Bay Bridge (GB) (New Bay (GB)) looked a potential top-notch

older horse in the making when winning on his reappearance at Sandown and **Dubai Future (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) provided believability to what Sir Michael Stoute's 4-year-old achieved in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. by bolting up in the Listed Wolferton S.

Dubai Future was no match for Bay Bridge at Sandown, finishing 11 lengths off Stoute's hugely exciting colt back in fourth, but he paid a handsome compliment to that form in running out a convincing winner of the penultimate race on Tuesday for

Saeed bin Suroor.

Bay Bridge is a short-priced favourite to provide Stoute with his fifth G1 Prince Of Wales's S. on Wednesday and it wouldn't be a huge surprise to see those odds contract further into a shade of odds-on given what Dubai Future achieved.

### Callum Hutchinson Clinches Opportunity

It is one thing to be given an opportunity to showcase your talents on the biggest stage of them all and something altogether different in being able to take advantage of it. Nobody could accuse Callum Hutchinson of not doing just that.

One of just a handful of claiming riders to be in action on the opening day of the royal meeting, Hutchinson was exemplary aboard **Coltrane (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in the Ascot S. and even had time to celebrate a stride or two before the line.

The most impressive aspect of the ride was that Hutchinson had to fight for a gap two furlongs down when the door was almost closed in his face.

In doing that, and galvanising Coltrane to record a memorable success, Hutchinson rewarded the faith entrusted in him by Andrew Balding. He's certainly a rider going places.

### Golden Pal Can Bounce Back

What did we learn from **Nature Strip (Aus)** (Nicconi {Aus}) setting fire to the Ascot turf in the King's Stand S.? That the Australian-based sprinters are on a completely different planet.

Another major talking point of the race was the performance of **Golden Pal (Uncle Mo)**, who gave himself no chance at the gates by breaking slowly, eventually trailing home last of the 16 runners.

There was a huge amount of confidence behind Golden Pal, possibly fuelled by his trainer Wesley Ward's comments in the build-up to the race, and it was fascinating to see him usurp Nature Strip as the clear favourite before the off.

Of course, it's not the first time that Golden Pal has failed to fire in Europe, having fluffed his lines in the G1 Nunthorpe S. last season.

The fact remains that this is one of the fastest horses in the world and, while he is clearly not best suited by the straight courses in Europe, he remains a potent force in his homeland and should not be underestimated for some of the major sprints in America later in the year. He can bounce back from this.

It should also be noted that fellow Chris Waller-trained sprinter **Home Affairs (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}) shortened up considerably for the G1 Platinum Jubilee S. on Saturday. Anyone on the double will be sitting pretty.

## REDVERS: 'HAZIYA OUR BEST CHANCE BUT MANGOUSTINE THE ONE WE WANT MOST'

David Redvers, racing manager for Qatar Racing, has put forward Wednesday's Kensington Palace S. favourite **Haziya (Ire)** (Le Havre {Ire}) as being Sheikh Fahad's best chance of having a winner at Royal Ascot, but revealed the week will be defined by how G1 French 1000 Guineas heroine **Mangoustine (Fr)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) performs in the G1 Coronation S. on Friday.

Mangoustine carried former NBA star Tony Parker's black and white silks to victory in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at ParisLongchamp last month and Redvers, who bought the filly as a yearling for just €46,000, is looking forward to seeing how she performs later in the week.

Along with Parker, the Mikel Delzangles-trained Mangoustine is owned by Monceaux Stud and Qatar Racing and, despite being available at odds as big as 10-1, she is expected to put up a bold show in what is shaping up to be one of the races of the week.

Redvers said, "It could be one of the races of the week. If the ground gets very quick, perhaps it will cut up a little, as there is a lot of talk that the Irish Guineas winner [Homeless Songs (Ire) (Frankel {GB})] won't run if the ground is too fast. It's a hell of a contest."

He added, "We bought Zotilla (Zamindar), the dam of Mangoustine, in partnership with Lordship Stud and Monceaux at the Arqana December Sale in 2014. She was a lovely mare, very athletic, and possibly a little bit hot temperment-wise, but she had the most amazing action.

"We then sold her because Henri [Bozo]'s model for Monceaux is a good one in that, if they [mares] are not producing winners, he just outs them. That's why Zotilla was sold." [Cont. p16](#)

He added, "But this filly [Mangoustine] was an absolute beauty and we decided to buy her back up to a certain level because we had to buy out Lordship Stud who weren't interested in racing her.

"We bought out Lordship and Henri made a deal with [trainer] Frederic Rossi. Shortly after that, it was decided to bring in Tony Parker as a partner, because the filly was so nice and everyone is so keen for his operation to have a good horse. It all worked quite well."

To say it has worked well is an understatement. Parker, one of the most successful basketball players of the modern era, brings a new fanbase to the sport and the decision to put him into Mangoustine has proved an inspired one.

Redvers said, "It's been great. Nobody can ever imagine the way these things will work out and we'd all be lying if we knew we were steering Tony into a Guineas winner. We knew she was a lovely filly with a proper pedigree and by a proper sire. She's a hugely exciting race filly and equally exciting broodmare prospect."

Mangoustine was moved to Mikel Delzangles earlier this year after her previous trainer, Frederic Rossi, lost his licence. Delzangles, best known in Britain for his exploits with G1 2000 Guineas winner Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), endured a period in the wilderness but Mangoustine's Guineas win represented a new dawn for the yard.

Redvers said, "It's well documented that Frederic lost his licence and we needed to find another trainer. Luckily, everyone agreed on Mikel, as he had done an amazing job for us in the past so luckily it has all come full circle.

"By his own admission, he was in the doldrums for a little while, but it's fantastic to see him back. Not only is he a master trainer, he's also a complete gentleman, and we really felt for him during the period when his horses weren't terribly healthy."

He added, "Whatever problem held them back before, they seem to be over that, and it's great to see Mikel back to his glory days. It's wonderful to see all of his horses running well again and we're looking forward to Mangoustine this week."

Mangoustine may be the one that matters most but, according to Redvers, the Joseph O'Brien-trained Haziya is Qatar Racing's best chance of a winner this week.

He said, "We were looking at horses who had serious chances in some of the races and she stood out. I've got to say, she was a shrewd acquisition by Joseph in November [cost just €36,000 at Goffs] so hopefully she might win. She is probably our best chance of a winner for the entire week."

On the rest of their team, Redvers said, "**Emotion (GB)** (**Frankel {GB}**) runs in the G2 Queen's Vase. She's a homebred who won by half the track at Kempton. She got found slightly wanting at Goodwood, where she didn't really handle the conditions, but Ascot will play to her strengths.

"We're partners in **Silencer (Ire)** (Kessaar {Ire}), who is a breeze-up horse we bought with James Harron. Hopefully he'll be able to give the Australians a bit of fun in the Windsor Castle. Friday is really our big day with Mangoustine. She's the one we're all really excited about."

### Is This The Breakthrough?

Surprisingly, Japan is without a Royal Ascot winner and have fared no better than sixth from the eight that have tried to date, but that could have been so different six years ago when A Shin Hikari (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) went to post as the 8-13 favourite for this race only to falter and finish last. In a year where it feels like the tide has finally turned for the nation's fortunes on the international stage, it is another son of the late, great sire that comes forth this time in **Shahryar (Jpn)**, Hideaki Fujiwara's G1 Tokyo Yushun and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner. Yasuhiro Matsumoto, manager of Northern Farm, is full of hope. "As a horseman, I want to win races in the UK with Japanese horses," he stated. "It is a dream and a real honour for us to have runners at Royal Ascot. Many people think the Arc is the pinnacle, but I think many of the best sire-making races are in the UK."

### The International Playground

It is a measure of how far this contest has come since it was shifted to Group 1 status in the millennium year that it contains winners of top-level prizes in Dubai, Japan, the States and Australia as well as France and Britain despite there being just five runners. The only one to prevail in this company on British soil is **Lord North (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), whose success in the COVID Prince of Wales's two years ago was followed by an outright win and dead-heat for first in the last two renewals of the G1 Dubai Turf. He could be suited by a potentially tactical affair, which may not apply to **State of Rest (Ire)** (**Starspangledbanner** {Aus}) who has a Cox Plate to boast of and at this stage is on a par with the 2011 winner of this race, So You Think (NZ). They met last time when State of Rest was a place ahead of Lord North in third in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh on May 22, but John Gosden believes there is the

prospect of a reversal. "I think that he raced a bit too close to the strong pace at the Curragh and the one mile and two and a half furlongs there just stretched him a bit," he explained. "He's a grand horse, but he needs to be ridden a little differently to Ireland."

### Back To Earth

In the G2 Duke of Cambridge S., last year's 1000 Guineas and G1 Prix Rothschild heroine **Mother Earth (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}) bids to provide Aidan O'Brien with a first edition and get on track again after misfiring when seventh in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. May 14. On what could be a big day for New Bay, his daughter **Saffron Beach (Ire)** re-opposes the Ballydoyle stalwart having galloped her into submission in Newmarket's G1 Sun Chariot S. in October. There is also the unknown quantity that is Cheveley Park Stud's **Bashkirova (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), who is here just 10 days after her G3 Princess Elizabeth S. win, and '**TDN Rising Star**' **Sibila Spain (Ire)** (**Frankel** {GB}) who came of age last time when winning the G2 Prix du Muguet at Saint-Cloud May 8.

### A Day Of Contrasts

While the future stayers get their chance in the 14-furlong G2 Queen's Vase, the G2 Queen Mary S. and Listed Windsor Castle S. provide for the fast juveniles. Roger Varian has a live contender for the Vase in KHK Racing's unbeaten '**TDN Rising Star**' **Eldar Eldarov (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), while Wesley Ward may have suffered a demoralising reversal on day one but in Stonestreet's sensational Keeneland winner and '**TDN Rising Star**' **Love Reigns (U S Navy Flag)** he has the archetypal Queen Mary filly. Looking for a landmark fifth renewal, he is in reach of Fred Darling's record of seven winners of the five-furlong contest and if he keeps bringing radically fast types like this daughter of Coolmore's first-season sire he could even get there in this decade. **Cont. p18**

"Every horse that kind of engaged her, she just exploded away from them," Ward warned.

**More Rising Stars**

Another '**TDN Rising Star**' in the Queen Mary is Clipper Logistics' impressive Newmarket maiden winner **Dramatised (Ire)** (Showcasing {GB}), who according to Karl Burke is in a league of her own as far as pace is concerned. "Her figures for her first run at Newmarket were pretty good and I'm adamant and convinced she's come on from that," he said. "She's as quick as I've trained anyway, so we'll see." Adding intrigue to the contest, there are a total of five others from the first crop of Havana Grey (GB), James Garfield (Ire) and Tasleet (GB) who had such a breakthrough moment on Tuesday. They include the Listed National S. winner **Maria Branwell (Ire)** by Rathbarry Stud's James Garfield and Havana Grey's Salisbury and Windsor winner **Katey Kontent (GB)**, who looked special last time. In the Windsor Castle, Ballydoyle's '**TDN Rising Star** **Little Big Bear (Ire)** (**No Nay Never**) looks to hold the aces following his impressive Naas maiden success while the Roger Varian-trained Leicester novice scorer **Bolt Action (Ire)** (Kessaar {Ire}) is one of the more intriguing home-trained contenders.

**LOPE DE VEGA FILLY A NEW RISING STAR AT THIRSK** *by Sean Cronin*

With the build-up to Royal Ascot reaching fever pitch down South, Kevin Ryan unveiled the well-bred **Glenlaurel (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}--Nada {GB}, by Teofilo {Ire}) in Thirsk's six-furlong Vickers.Bet Extra Places At Royal Ascot EBF Fillies' Novice S. and she outclassed overmatched rivals to attain 'TDN Rising Stardom' in hugely impressive fashion. The 9-1 chance dwelt as the gates opened and raced in rear through the initial fractions. Making eye-catching headway hard on the steel from halfway, she cruised into contention approaching the final furlong and powered clear once allowed an inch of rein to easily defeat Signora Camacho (Ire) (Camacho {GB}) by an unextended 3 3/4 lengths.

"She was a bit slowly away and raced green early, but she gave me a nice feel," said winning rider Kevin Stott. "I gave her a little squeeze and she came back on the bridle at halfway. We got a lovely gap and, when I pressed the button, she quickened away. I'm glad she did it in the way she did, she's a big-framed filly by Lope de Vega and there's plenty to build on. We'll take it one step at a time going forward."

Glenlaurel, half-sister to a yearling filly by Dark Angel (Ire), is the third of four foals and second scorer produced by an

unraced half-sister to five stakes performers headed by MG1SW sire Dubawi (Ire) (Dubai Millennium {GB}).

Black-type descendants of her G1 Oaks d'Italia-winning second dam Zomaradah (GB) (Deploy {GB}), herself out of a half-sister to G1 Derby-winning sire High-Rise (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}), also include G2 Lancashire Oaks victrix Emirates Queen (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}) and stakes-winning G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Sun Chariot S. placegetter Cloak of Spirits (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}).
