



JUST CINDY EARNS JUSTIFY FIRST AMERICAN STAKES WIN IN SCHUYLerville

Already off to a hot start with his first-crop runners that includes a Group 2 winner in Ireland, Triple Crown winner **Justify** wasted no time putting an American graded stakes win on the board as his daughter **Just Cindy** kicked clear late to take Thursday's opening-day GIII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga, the first graded event for juveniles run in North America in 2022.

Unveiled as a poorly-kept secret at 6-5 going 5 1/2 furlongs June 17 at Churchill Downs, the Clarkland Farm homebred settled off the pace professionally and drew clear in the final furlong to a 2 1/4-length graduation. Backed as the clear 21-10 second favorite behind 5-4 chalk **Summer Promise (Uncle Mo)** Thursday, Just Cindy came away well from her rail draw and found a good spot in a pocketed third under Irad Ortiz, Jr. as longshot Musicmansandy (**Accelerate**) clicked off a :22.38 quarter with Summer Promise close in tow.

The chalk quickly swept past the leader midway around the turn, but Just Cindy soon came calling while angling out into the clear, and those two arrived at the top of the lane together. Jostling with her foe several times in early stretch, Just Cindy started to get the measure of Summer Promise at the sixteenth pole and edged away late to prevail by 2 1/4 lengths. Summer Promise held the place, ahead of a green-running **Janis Joplin** (California Chrome). **Cont. p3**

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY – Like it was putting on a comfortable pair of shoes, racing oh-so easily slipped back into Saratoga Race Course Thursday for what turned into a warm, bright, feel-good season opener.

The 10-race program that started during a brief rain storm before playing out in sunshine, did not deliver the expected storybook type of result in the featured GIII Schuylerville S., though. Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas, absent from America's oldest track for two seasons, watched Summer Promise (**Uncle Mo**), the 6-5 favorite, finish second to Just Cindy (**Justify**) in the six-furlong stake for 2-year-old fillies. **Cont. p4**

“It was great and I think she’s still a little green too, so I think there’s a lot of raw talent there,” said Kelly Wheeler, assistant to winning trainer Eddie Kenneally. “She’s an exciting horse to have in the barn. She kind of got knocked around a little bit and she stayed professional and ran on. It’s really all you can ask for in a second-time starter.”

“The filly is really nice. She does everything right,” added Ortiz. “From the one post, she overcame everything and got there on time. When I asked her at the quarter pole, she did it.”

Pedigree Notes:

One of four winners thus far for Coolmore's 2018 Triple Crown hero **Justify**, Just Cindy is already his second graded/group stakes winner, following Statuette, who backed up a 'TDN Rising Star' nod with an **impressive victory** in the G2 Airlie Stud S. June 26 at The Curragh. **Justify's** Tahoma also picked up black type with a runner-up finish in the Fasig-Tipton Futurity S. June 18 at Santa Anita. Just Cindy is the first foal out of 'TDN Rising Star' Jenda's Agenda (Proud Citizen), who started her career three-for-three including a win in the Caesar's Wish S. at Laurel. Second dam Just Jenda (Menifee) was a seven-time stakes winner and three-time graded stakes winner who earned over \$750,000. Bought for \$90,000 by Hill 'n' Dale at Keeneland November in 2018, Jenda's Agenda is responsible for a yearling **American Pharoah** filly and produced a filly by **Mendelssohn** Mar. 1.

The New York Racing Association announced its paid attendance at 28,466 and the all-sources handle at \$21,764,922. In 2021, the attendance was 27,760 and the handle was \$21,935,534.

Lukas, 86, and his wife Laurie watched the replay several times in their clubhouse box after Summer Promise ended up 2 1/4 lengths behind the Clarkland Farm homebred.

"I didn't think that the bump at the middle of the stretch helped," Lukas said. "But I don't think it affected us all that much. I think that she was just a little bit short. I think she needed the race. I was surprised because I trained on her pretty good. But this is a new surface, a deeper surface and I think that she needed to maybe be tighter." **Cont. p5**

Wearing a big, white cowboy hat and aviator glasses as he sought his first Saratoga graded stakes win since Sporting Chance's (Tiznow) score in the 2017 GI Hopeful S., Lukas said the well-bred BC Stables filly just wasn't up to the challenge in her second career start and first venture into stakes company. Lukas said he was eyeing the Schuylerville even before she won her debut by five lengths on June 25 at Churchill Downs.

Lukas will be back in stakes company July 23 when his GI Kentucky Oaks winner Secret Oath (Arrogate) returns to competition in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks.

Two races before the 104th Schuylerville, named for a small town east of Saratoga Springs, favored Tarabi (**First Samurai**), trained by Cherie DeVaux, won the inaugural running of the Wilton. The Wilton for 3-year-old fillies was significant and drew a fair amount of attention because it was the first mile dirt race

run at the track in 30 years and the first out of a chute in 50 years.

NYRA officials decided during the winter to rebuild the Wilson Chute, which was in use from 1902 through 1972. It was torn down to make room for parking. In 1992, NYRA ran 25 mile races from a starting gate on the first turn. That experiment was scuttled after the one season because of complaints that horses starting from inner post positions had an unfair advantage.

Starting from post six in the field of seven under Javier Castellano, Tarabi sat just off the pace, took the lead inside the three-sixteenths pole and prevailed by three-quarters of a length in 1:38.53.

Trainer Todd Pletcher, who saddled the runner-up Goddess of Fire (**Mineshaft**) and two others in the field, had no complaints. **Cont. p6**

“I thought the race went smoothly,” he said. “The fractions seemed a little slow. I wonder how accurate the time was. It seemed kind of slow for these type of fillies to be going that slow. As far as the race, the way it unfolded, it looked like a pretty fair race.”

The addition of the chute enables NYRA to schedule dirt races as a distance between seven furlongs and 1 1/8 miles and run one-mile turf races moved to the main track at the same distance.

“Mile and an eighth races, we’ve had a lot of success there,” Pletcher said. “I’m not going to judge it so soon. I didn’t see a huge need for it, but maybe it will turn out to be a good thing. We’ll see.”

During and after the fifth race, “Bones” Lofaro of Milton, NY, a small town in the Hudson Valley near Poughkeepsie, was the ringleader of a raucous crowd of approximately 50 friends and relatives who saluted their late friend, Freddy Butwell, with the Freddy B. Memorial Race.

“Me and Freddie were elementary school friends. High school friends. We grew up together and played basketball and other sports together,” Lofaro said. “Freddie passed away from complications of COVID this past year. He would always invite me to the track when he had a place up here. For the last six, seven years I’d come up. He loved to be here. I thought it was just a great way to repay him. His wife was here today. We had a great time. This is a great experience. He loved Saratoga.”

As an added bonus, Lofaro said that Butwell was a friend of a co-breeder of the winning horse, the favorite Majority Partner (Unified), trained by Jeremiah Englehart. Majority Partner paid \$5.60 to win and the way the Freddy B. Memorial Race crew celebrated, it was clear that many of them had tickets on the winner.

Lofaro said that he and Butwell often came to Saratoga for opening days and that it was especially nice that the memorial race was held on the first day of the season.

Though he acknowledged being disappointed with the outcome of the Schuylerville, Lukas said he enjoyed being back at Saratoga with a big, loud crowd.

“It was wonderful,” he said. “Racing needs this enthusiasm and excitement and it only happens here. Keeneland, here and Del Mar are the racetracks where you get some kind of atmosphere. It felt like the old times.”

FAYETTE COUNTY COMMUNITY BANDS TOGETHER AGAINST SOCCER COMPLEX DEVELOPMENT

In response to the approval for a soccer complex in an agricultural-rural zone, once home to Ashwood Training Center on Russell Cave Road just outside of Lexington, Ky., members of the equine and agriculture communities in Fayette County came together for a meeting, hosted by the Fayette Alliance at Greg Goodman’s Mt. Brilliant Farm, the evening of Wednesday, July 13, to discuss the implications and potential next steps.

Fayette Alliance, a non-profit of citizens dedicated to achieving equitable, sustainable growth in Lexington-Fayette County through land-use advocacy, education, and research, addressed the issues the soccer complex poses to the land, surrounding equine and agricultural operations, and existing zoning ordinances that protect rural areas in a [letter published to the public Monday](#). **Cont. p7**

The proposed plan for the soccer complex was presented to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Board of Adjustment June 28 by Anderson Communities, on behalf of Lexington Sporting Club, who applied to change the zoning of the land so the 12-field soccer complex and 750 parking spaces could be built.

The application was submitted for conditional use of the land in the agricultural-rural zone. Under current policy, outdoor recreational facilities are permitted as a conditional use, which guarantees that under certain circumstances and in certain locations, those can be approved.

The City of Lexington’s professional planning staff recommended approving the plan for conditional use, though it was subject to 19 conditions that were outlined in order to support that recommendation for approval.

Despite dozens of community members voicing their opposition to the development at the initial hearing, the Board approved the complex on a 60-acre portion of a larger 150-acre agricultural parcel, located between Russell Cave Road,

Newtown Pike, and Interstates I-75 and I-64. The site plan has the soccer fields located near the southeast border of Fasig-Tipton Kentucky’s sales grounds, with the fields adjacent to trainer Ken McPeek’s Magdalena Farm.

The Board also chose to remove the “most critical and protective” conditions that were recommended by the planning staff, including those that dictated that Lexington Sporting Club would be required to work with Fasig-Tipton in terms of what times/dates soccer tournaments would be held, and those that were intended to preserve the integrity of the agricultural-rural zone. **Cont. p8**

“As a result of that, the next two pieces of the soccer proposal will continue to move forward. They will be zoning text ordinance amendments, which means the policy proposed is changing the language of our ordinance that guides how we develop in a rural area, and the first is to permit lights, concessions and retail sales associated with the 12-field soccer complex,” said Brittany Roethemeier, Executive Director of the Fayette Alliance, at Wednesday’s meeting.

“This means that anywhere in the agricultural-rural zone, that is adjacent to the economic development zone, would be permitted to have these uses. The second is going to be to permit soccer stadiums in an economic development zone. By permitting a soccer stadium, we’re also changing the intent of what is supposed to be achieved within the economic development zone.”

Along with amending existing zoning ordinances, the Lexington Sporting Club plans to build a 10,000-person stadium and thousands of more surface parking spaces in the nearby economic development zone, which is designated specifically as a zoning category to promote jobs and job creation. Vince Gabbert, who recently departed Keeneland, is the Sporting Club’s president. Dixiana Farm’s Bill Shively is the majority owner of the new club.

The Fayette Alliance, and supporting industry members and

stakeholders, fear that approval of the complex, along with the zoning policy changes, would not only destroy the protection granted to them by Lexington’s Urban Service Boundary, allowing extensive development to begin across the bluegrass, but also directly impact the equine and agriculture industries that make a \$2.3 billion economic impact annually.

Roethemeier emphasized the detrimental precedent this would set for how uses in the agricultural-rural zone will be evaluated going forward.

“This land is finite. Once it’s developed, there is no do-over, there is no decision that can be reversed. The land in our agricultural-rural zone is protected to preserve the rural character of our service area by promoting agricultural uses. It is meant to discourage all forms of urban development, except for a limited amount of conditional uses,” she said. “If we allow these types of commercial, urban uses in our agriculture area, what’s next? This isn’t about soccer. It may be a soccer complex this time, it’s going to be something else next time, and as urban sprawl continues to move out, that threatens the finite resource that is the farmland that all of us care so much about.

“This fight and this opposition are not about soccer. It’s about land use, because land use impacts generations to come. Your kids, your grandkids, our future, that’s what’s impacted by these types of policy decisions.” *Cont. p9*

Fayette Alliance is in the process of filing an appeal of the Board of Adjustment's decision to the Circuit Court, which must be filed within 30 days from the date the decision was made. They are also filing an Open Records Request to understand how the decision was made, at what point the decision was made, and how the decision was made to remove so many of the conditions presented by the planning staff.

"While it's not our job to help Lexington Sporting Club to find another location, we're absolutely willing to keep the lines of communication open to identify a solution. We believe there are countless other parcels of land and existing facilities throughout the community that can be used for soccer, but our farms are irreplaceable," said Roethemeier.

Nearly 100 community members attended Wednesday's meeting to show their support, including Thoroughbred industry stakeholders such as Ned Toffey, General Manager of Spendthrift Farm; Everett Dobson, Owner of Cheyenne Stables and Candy Meadow Farm; Bret Jones, Vice President of Airdrie Stud; John Phillips, Owner of Darby Dan Farm; Tony Lacy, Vice President of Keeneland Sales; Boyd Browning Jr., Fasig-Tipton CEO and President; Chauncey Morris, Executive Director of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (KTA) and Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders (KTOB); Gary Bizants, Owner of Cobra Farm; Lee Carter, Executive Director of the Kentucky Horse Park; Helen Alexander, Owner of Middlebrook Farm.

Bruce Simpson, an attorney specializing in land use law that is representing Fayette Alliance in their appeal, spoke on the process of overturning a Board of Adjustment decision and why filing the appeal is so important.

"Make no mistake about it, this is not just soccer fields and a soccer stadium, this is an entertainment complex. They want to have concerts, political rallies, all sorts of things that stadiums do to generate money," said Simpson. "As a land use lawyer, this

case that the Board of Adjustment approved is a serious threat. I'm not overstating this case. Anytime you can get a precedent like this, like what happened with the soccer fields, it's going to be seized upon somewhere else."

Goodman also shared that Lexington's Mayor Linda Gorton, though she was unable to attend the meeting, was in full support of opposing the development of the soccer complex, which she has made clear in letters to the planning staff, Planning Commission, and in an upcoming Op/Ed in *The Herald-Leader*.

"For the last 10 years, along with other local organizations, we've been able to deal with the land use issues and they haven't been that public. This could not be worked out, so we need to fight for this," said Goodman.

Samantha Will-Bacarri, whose farm neighbors Goodman's, raised the question of what would come next if the soccer complex, along with the proposed zoning text ordinance amendments, were approved.

"If under some wild circumstance we are unsuccessful in the fight against these two zoning text ordinance amendments that are upcoming, our next step is to propose zoning text ordinance amendments to close the loopholes in our zoning ordinance. That's what our next step is, to do similar work in proposing language that will prevent this from happening again. Frankly, it's probably something we're going to do regardless," said Roethemeier. "After this fight, there will be another, and there will be another one, and the policies matter. This is why. Moving forward, we have to be really cognizant of those policies."

Along with the farm owners and industry members in attendance, Cathy Ploman, serving her third term as Lexington's 12th District Councilmember, was there to show her support.

"We are the horse capital of the world. That is our brand. We are known worldwide, and yet here we are violating the integrity of that wonderful thing that we are, that we have and that we're lucky to have. To put those soccer fields, plus parking spaces, next to Fasig-Tipton is just a total violation and it's reckless. We've got to do better than that," said Ploman.

Support for opposing the soccer complex was strong, and Roethemeier and Simpson emphasized the importance of maintaining and growing that moving forward, particularly when it comes to the upcoming Planning Commission meeting, which will be held Thursday, July 28 at 1:30 p.m. in City Hall.

"It is absolutely critical, in my almost 30 years of doing these cases, that you all show up [to the Planning Commission meeting July 28] en masse," said Simpson.

MAKING NEW MEMORIES: AIRDRIE AT 50

A lot of you will know the feeling. Day three of the January Sale, back ring, and your horse is coming back out after a matter of seconds. The digital board had stalled at \$2,500, and then cleared. Bret Jones exchanged a grimace with farm manager Ben Henley. Pretty terrible, no getting away from it. But what can you do? It wasn't the first time Airdrie has had to cut its losses on a horse, and nor would it be the last. As his father has always told Bret: "Better to sell and be sorry than to keep and be sorry."

After all, this was the one area they had to tighten up.

"Dad has always said that the thing he's done least well, in this business, is culling mares," Bret recalls. "Because he's such an optimist. He's always gone back to that belief, that the next foal would justify why he'd loved the family in the first place. So around that time [January 2017] we'd decided to sell several mares that maybe didn't fit the bill, going forwards, and this was one."

Memories Prevail had just turned three but it was plain that she was never going to make the starting gate. She was from the first crop of **Creative Cause**; her dam, similarly homebred in support of a resident stallion in Indian Charlie, had raced once; the next dam was unraced. A single start, in other words, across three generations.

"And at the time she catalogued that if you sold from her, you'd have had two blank dams," Bret says. "We had her selling through our good friend Mike Recio. And I remember distinctly that as soon as the hammer fell Ben and I turned to each other, as you do, and it was, 'Okay, that's it. Disappointing. But move on.' And about a minute later Pop came along from the front of the pavilion with a yellow sheet of paper in his hand."

Bret reprises the laughter that overtook the pair that day. For Memories Prevail, retained by Airdrie founder Brereton C. Jones, would a year later be covered by **Upstart**: and the resulting colt, his first three dams all mated in-house, is none other than Zandon. **Cont. p10**

To many who saw him cruising into the final turn in the GI Kentucky Derby, the way Zandon then flattened into third cannot possibly circumscribe his potential, and he arrives at Saratoga with every shot still to rise to the top of the crop.

"Pop knew," Bret says. "He's always had an intuition about him that's pretty unnatural."

With sophomore laurels very much up for grabs, hopes remain high that Zandon can set a perfect seal on the 50th anniversary of Airdrie's foundation. It's absolutely characteristic of this exemplary farm, after all, that his maternal line (though introduced by acquisition of his third dam, in 2001, for just \$15,500) should extend to blue hens Your Hostess and Boudoir (GB).

At 83, admittedly, his countless friends and admirers across our community are aware that even Governor Jones--a man still more outstanding in the fundamental human registers, of integrity and decency, than in his many formal distinctions--

cannot elude the universal vulnerabilities of age. But they also know that a living legacy has long been secured; that Airdrie represents continuity not just in the type of blood valued here, in mares and stallions, but also in their management.

This, too, is a question of pedigree--albeit the verve and charm that appears such a familiar inheritance in Bret would doubtless be credited by his father to the distaff side. "Brerry" met Libby, so their son has always been given to understand, at a dinner party "when both were on dates with other people!" At that stage, Brerry was visiting town as a young man so enthused by horses that he had literally rolled up his sleeves to give himself the chance to get involved.

"People don't believe me when I tell them this, but Dad actually started as a builder in West Virginia," Bret says. "As a little boy in Point Pleasant, he'd ridden his pony Trixie around the hills pretending he was Roy Rogers. He started showing but then somebody told him about Lexington, Kentucky, and at that moment he made the decision: 'If that's where the best horses are, that's where I need to be.' So after university he decided that he needed to make some money before he could come out here and live the life he'd set his heart on."

After their marriage, Libby was initially required to tolerate a migration to West Virginia, where her husband had already made a precocious impression in state politics--still in his mid-20s, in fact, when the youngest delegate ever elected to the lower house in Charleston. In those days, as he was often teased after resuming his political career in Kentucky a couple of decades later, he was still a Republican.

Bret, dismayed by the venomous polarization of politics since, wishes that we could retrieve the dialogue and engagement embodied by that switch of colors.

"I think the truth is that Dad couldn't have cared less what party he was associated with," he remarks. "He would vote for Republicans probably as often as he did Democrats, because it was all simply about who was right for the job; about the heart and soul of the individual."

Between the novice and mature phases of his political life, however, Brerry and Libby uprooted to her native state to pursue a parallel vocation with the foundation of Airdrie in 1972.

"Mom's family had a farm," Bret explains. "Not a Thoroughbred farm, an agrarian one. Dad never wanted to be viewed as someone who had just married into this, so he negotiated a 30-year lease with my mother's father and found a way to work 25 hours a day. And as he began to have some success, he was able to purchase more land on the back of investments he'd made. So that was always a great point of pride: that he'd worked for everything he had, and done it by working harder than everyone he competed with. **Cont. p12**

"By the time Dad bought the Woodburn division, about 20 years ago, it had been over a century since there'd been horses of consequence on there. So here was this land with an incredible history, that had raised five Kentucky Derby winners, but that had at the same time been rested for over 100 years."

If it remained an intimidating environment for a young outsider, the Bluegrass then being dominated by the established farms, it was also a propitious time to be forcing an entry. The whole commercial landscape was on the point of transformation—an ironic spur to Airdrie's growth, given how scrupulously the farm today adheres to old-school principles, with relatively conservative books and an emphasis on deep blood and soundness.

"In the early '70s, this was a tough game to break into if you weren't a central Kentuckian," Bret reflects. "And Dad was aggressive. He would go out there, he'd put partnerships together, and he'd compete for stallions that the big farms were also after. And I'm sure there were tensions that came from that. I'm sure plenty of people said, 'Who's this West Virginian upstart that's come in here shaking things up?'"

One early recruit, Bold Ruler's son Key to the Kingdom, was bought at the Belmont paddock auction in 1975 for a record


\$730,000. The horse didn't particularly pay off, in his own right, but had already served his purpose in terms of profile.

"Dad did that because he was a promoter," Bret reasons. "He didn't have anywhere close to the money to do it himself, but knew that was how he could get his name out there."

Terms were negotiated with the sales company and Paul Mellon, allowing a year's grace on payment. But it turned out that his purchase had made precisely the splash intended, and Brerry very quickly assembled the partners required. The sales company and vendor congratulated him on his successful syndication, and suggested that they could now go ahead and clear the debt. Came the reply: "Well, with all due respect, we had an agreement that I have a year to pay for this."

"And Dad used that capital to fund his operation for the next year, which was a gutsy thing to do," Bret says. "But he would always invest in himself. He has never played the stock market. Frankly, he never had any real investments outside the Thoroughbred industry because a) it was what he loved; b) it was what he knew; and c) he had total control over it. As much as anyone does, anyway. But if something was going to be a mistake, it would be his mistake."

Just as Airdrie could harness a following wind in the early 1980s, so it would have to ride out the storms that followed.

"When so many in the industry had their struggles, in the early '90s, Airdrie had them too," Bret concedes. "But that was when Dad brought Silver Hawk over from Europe, just a Group 3 winner, the absolute antithesis of the modern-day commercial horse: wasn't particularly attractive, wasn't particularly correct, and struggled mightily for mares. But Dad believed in him and bred his own mares to the horse. And Silver Hawk came through for him, really took off and became Dad's first major stallion."

The program's seedcorn had been boarding, but every time Brerry made a score the proceeds were recycled into the broodmare band to support the stallion roster. Two of the three Airdrie graduates to have won the GI Kentucky Oaks, for instance, were homebred. Yet with no real apprenticeship or mentoring behind him, Brerry was developing his strategy through that most rigorous of instructors: experience.

"Trial and error," says Bret with a shrug. "Nothing teaches you a lesson faster than investing your own money. I can't imagine how many mistakes he made along the way. But they were his mistakes, and they made him very good at the business he loved. Dad had tremendous trust in his instincts. There were plenty of times where he would invest in something that probably didn't make a lot of sense to other people. And those others may have been exactly right. But he was fearless. He would trust his own gut."

Necessity is the mother of invention, and time after time stallions reached Airdrie along the margin between lesser resources and greater imagination.

"We all know that top stallions can come from more humble beginnings," Bret remarks. "So Dad would take a horse like Harlan's Holiday, whose sire Harlan didn't really have time to prove himself as a sire of sires. Indian Charlie was by In Excess,

and now you look at **Upstart**, only a Grade II winner on the track. Some of these perhaps weren't quite shiny enough for a more deep-pocketed farm. But there was always a belief that with the right support, they could make it. **Upstart** always struck as a tremendously talented horse, so our great hope was that he was a Grade II winner with a Grade I future."

It has been gratifying for the Jones family to watch the remarkable legacy of Indian Charlie and Harlan's Holiday, in **Uncle Mo** and Into Mischief respectively. In the meantime, however, Brerry had always nursed a parallel ambition to make a lasting difference in the wider world.

Not that he received much encouragement, when throwing his hat into the ring for Lieutenant Governor in 1987.

"One of the initial polls had him at two percent," says Bret with a smile. "And the margin of error was three percent! So it was quite possible he did not have a single vote to his name. But anyone who knows Dad just knows that he's a worker. One of the most formative things that ever happened to him was his father giving him *The Power of Positive Thinking* by Norman Vincent Peale, which made an impression that has lasted his entire life. 'If you believe you can, you can.' 'No such word as can't.' These mantras never left his mind. So while some people, seeing that they were getting two percent of the vote, would just have gone back to the farm and tried to breed a fast horse, he just dug in."

Even after that dynamism in turn secured the Governorship, in 1991, Bret and his sister Lucy could remain grateful for an upbringing as loving as it was uncommon.

"I just have really great memories of growing up," Bret says. "Mom and Dad did a pretty incredible job making it not seem as crazy as I'm sure it was. Though it would be hard to be in a busier profession, Dad always made time for us."

"He never scheduled anything for Sunday, that was always family day. And luckily the Governor's mansion was about 12 minutes from the back gate of Airdrie Stud. I can't imagine the stress that he and Mom were under, balancing it all, but I never got a hint of it because of how positive they always were."

In those years, naturally, long-serving farm manager Tim Thornton was especially invaluable in Airdrie's day-to-day operation. "Timmy's a guy that takes great pride in the title of hardboot, because that's exactly what he's always been," Bret says. "A horseman and a tireless worker. He was with us for 30 years and Airdrie would not be what it is today without Tim Thornton."

Bret was seven at the time his father first ran for office in Kentucky, and remembers handing out "Jones for Lieutenant Governor" buttons in the street--and "having a big smile on my face as I was doing it." That has remained a familiar sight ever since, as many of us are glad to attest, but the point is that Bret was no more pushed into that juvenile political service than he was, in later years, to enter the horse business.

"Not for half a second," he stresses. "I fell in love with it just going out in the field with Pop, checking the mares and foals. And watching how excited he'd get before a big race. The first ticket I ever cashed was on Lil E. Tee, because we had At The Threshold at the farm--a forgettable stallion except for the fact that he sired the Kentucky Derby winner. I'm pretty sure, looking back, Dad booked that bet because he thought I'd waste my money!

"You either love it or you don't. Dad knew that, and knew that pushing somebody into something as different as the horse business is futile. But it was always what I wanted to do--so the big question instead became: 'Can you do it with your father?' We'd always had an incredible relationship but as we all know, a working relationship is different. So when I came back after school, and started working for the farm, I'm sure it was a question in his mind as well. But all it did was make us closer. It just worked. There was never a destructive argument. There was education--the greatest education a kid could ever have. There were disagreements, of course, because opinions are what makes horseracing. But we've never had a falling-out, never yelled at each other. At the end of the day, one guy's the boss and one guy's the employee. I knew who I was, and I also knew how lucky I was to be learning from someone like Dad."

In this anniversary year, anyone with the interests of the Thoroughbred at heart will raise a glass to a farm that has become such a wholesome model for our industry. For Airdrie stands as a brand and a beacon for that elusive balance, between a sustainable breed and a sustainable business.

That has only happened so seamlessly because the genes that replicate excellence have not just been confined to the horses.

"I was very lucky that the message--'believe you can, and you can'--resonated with me as well," Bret reflects. "We still probably do things a little differently than some other farms. But nobody on the Airdrie team is afraid to make a mistake. There's still that mentality on the farm that Pop always had. And that great relationship he had with Tim, I'm so lucky to have also with Ben Henley."

Ultimately, however, it is another bond that has sustained farm and family alike: the one between Bret's own sire and dam.

"Mom and Dad have had one of the all-time great partnerships," Bret says. "I don't know that Mom ever imagined for half a second that she would be involved in politics. She was always the lover of the land, the agrarian, never that comfortable in the public eye. But she knew that Dad felt an obligation of public service, with the ability he had, and she was totally supportive through everything they've done. So Dad has been really lucky, between his marriage, the business he loves, and trying to give something back. He has literally lived his dream."

Do memories truly prevail, as Brerry suggested in naming the mother of Zandon? Well, if they do, it's not as mere reminiscence, but as a type of moral instinct. Recollection is like the flaky, porous bark of a tree, fallible in one and all. In the best, however, the grain will run ever true. The rest of us, meanwhile, can be grateful for 50 years of pattern and precedent; of communal memories become communal standards.

JUAREZ: LOPEZ HAS NO REGARD FOR FELLOW RIDERS

Though admitting that he deserved his eight-day suspension after being the aggressor in an altercation with Paco Lopez following a July 1 race at Monmouth, Nik Juarez has some choice words for his fellow jockey, calling him “careless and someone who has no regard for his fellow riders.”

Lopez was suspended five days for his ride aboard Midnight Diva (**Midnight Lute**) in that day’s third race. Juarez was suspended for eight days and fined \$500 for “initiating a physical confrontation with another jockey.”

According to the footnote of the race, Midnight Diva came out midway on the far turn and impeded Juarez’s mount, La Costa (Archarcharch). La Costa clipped heels with Midnight Diva, stumbled badly and was pulled up by Juarez. Midnight Diva crossed the wire third but was disqualified and placed last.

A New Jersey Racing Commission ruling issued July 13 noted that, “Mr. Lopez came out changing paths without sufficient clearance, causing #5 LA COSTA to clip heels and stumble badly, losing all chance.”

Lopez has been suspended numerous times in recent years for careless or rough riding, and Juarez is not the first rider to accuse Lopez of often riding in a reckless manner. The *TDN* was unable to reach Lopez for comment by deadline for this story.

The fight took place after the race when both riders were at the scales to weigh out.

Juarez had traveled back and forth to Sweden to be there for the birth of his daughter and rushed back to New Jersey to fulfill his riding obligations. He said the travel was difficult and he was frazzled.

“I had, literally, spent 31 hours on planes,” he said. “My daughter was born the day before the incident. My wife is still

stuck in Sweden. It was a whirlwind week. Flight cancellations, delays, they lost my bag. It was a nightmare.”

He said his newborn daughter was on his mind when Lopez cut him off.

“He was smirking at me,” Juarez said. “I had just held my baby girl the day before and he just did something that could have cost me my life. He knows what he did and he’s done it before. He has no remorse. He never called Romero Maragh in the hospital after he dropped him and the kid broke his neck. I know he would never do anything for me. To know you’re riding out there every day with someone like that, it’s touchy.”

Juarez said riding against someone like Lopez is like driving on the same road with a dangerous driver.

“Imagine if you are diving to work every day and are driving with the same eight, nine guys every day,” he said. “Just the same people. But you know one guy doesn’t give a [expletive]. One day he’s going to cut you off, one day he’s not. Would you feel safe driving?”

Despite his feelings toward Lopez, Juarez said he got what he deserved from the stewards.

“With me, they sent the right message because I deserve my punishment,” Juarez said. “I took things into my own hands and if I did that out on the street there would be repercussions with the authorities. I have to let the authorities do their job. On my end, I think they were fair. I am ashamed of how I acted. What they do with him is out of my control.”

Earlier this year, Lopez **was handed a 14-day suspension by the Gulfstream stewards** for his ride aboard In Due Time (**Not This Time**) in the GII Fountain of Youth S., in which two horses fell. In 2019, the **Gulfstream stewards hit Lopez with a 30-day suspension** for careless riding and causing a spill that resulted in Maragh undergoing surgery for two broken vertebrae and Carlos Montalvo suffering a fractured ankle. In 2021, **Lopez got into an altercation with Irad Ortiz Jr.** after a roughly run race at Gulfstream. Ortiz was fined \$1,000 and both riders were put on probation.

Lopez tops the Monmouth standings with 48 wins. Juarez is in eighth place with 10 wins.

CHRB ADVANCES 90-DAY-LAYOFF SCRUTINY RULES

With the aim of reducing the incidence of large-bone fractures, the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) voted unanimously Thursday to advance two new rules that would require examinations and veterinary and training record disclosures for every horse that has not had a recorded work or a race within the past 90 days.

Citing the "concerning rate" of large-bone fractures in horses returning to training after extended periods, the CHRB meeting packet stated that, "An initial examination will be required by both a regulatory veterinarian and the attending veterinarian, including review of veterinary and training records for the previous 60-day period, prior to the horse going to the track to train.

"Additionally, a follow up examination will be required between 30 and 45 days. The goal is to provide a baseline examination and identify any at-risk factors that may predispose a horse from suffering a catastrophic injury related to the shins, tibias, shoulder, pelvis, etc..."

Also, amendments were advanced to clarify existing CHRB rules regarding the specific requirements of racing soundness examinations, including the condition of the horse when presented for examination, who must be present, and how the examination information will be recorded.

"These clarifications also establish consistent requirements for both racing soundness and training soundness examinations," the CHRB analysis stated. "Additionally, requirements for veterinary treatment records are clarified, including the timeframe for trainers to submit records and the official veterinarian's responsibility to maintain the records."

CHRB chairman Gregory Ferraro, DVM, said prior to the vote that the new regulations are "directed at long bone fractures of the shoulder and tibia. Horses that come to these injuries have a typical profile that we've identified. This particular regulation would address that profile and require examinations at specific times in order to prevent serious injury."

The proposed rules now advance to a 45-day public comment period, which will be followed by a final CHRB vote.

Sonny Leon, the winning rider aboard Rich Strike (Keen Ice) in this year's GI Kentucky Derby, is about to relocate to Gulfstream Park. He is listed to ride six horses on the Saturday card, including Easy Come Easy Go (**Midnight Storm**) in the \$75,000 Azalea S.

Leon has been riding at Belterra Park, where he was fourth in the standings with 33 wins entering Thursday's card.

"He's going to move his tack there for now and give it a shot," said Jeff Perrin, his agent at Belterra. Perrin will not be working with Leon at Gulfstream. "His last day in Ohio will be Friday and then he'll head to Florida. He was friends with Emisael Jaramillo, who was second in the standings, and that jockey got hurt. He will be working with his agent, who has a good book of business. You can't blame Sonny. It's a great opportunity. We won the Kentucky Derby. We shocked the world."

Leon has flourished at lesser tracks like Belterra and Mahoning Valley, but, aside from the Kentucky Derby, has had few mounts at major tracks. The Derby is his only graded stakes win. Trying to break in against a solid riding colony at Gulfstream will be a big test of his abilities.

BROWN TO DECIDE ON HASKELL OR JIM DANDY FOR EARLY VOTING AFTER SATURDAY WORK

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY – With the \$1.25 million GI Travers S. on Aug. 27 as his summer goal, trainer Chad Brown said Thursday morning that he is close to declaring what path his GI Preakness S. winner **Early Voting** (**Gun Runner**) will take to Saratoga's biggest race.

Brown has two options: send the colt to Monmouth Park to face unbeaten stablemate Jack Christopher (**Munnings**) in the GI Haskell Invitational S. on July 23 or wait a week and race him against another stablemate, GI Kentucky Derby third-place finisher Zandon (**Upstart**) in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga.

"I'm going to work the horse on Saturday and I will decide after the work," Brown said. "If he's going to run in the Jim Dandy then he's going to ship up here the next day. If he's going to run in the Haskell then he will stay at Belmont because it's closer to Monmouth. That's why I've left him there. I've got Jack Christopher down there, who is also going to work."

While Brown committed Jack Christopher and Zandon to their pre-Travers races long ago, he has not been in a hurry to place Early Voting.

Brown said he wants to look at everything: "Who is running where? Make sure everyone is healthy and doing well. These fields might come together a little bit more, be a little more focused. Weather."





LBD Stable, Manganaro Bloodstock and David Ingordo's Tarabi rallied down the center of Saratoga main track and finished strongly to take out Thursday's Wilton S., the first race contested out of the reconstructed Wilson Chute at Saratoga.

Off as the 6-5 chalk, the \$240,000 Keeneland September graduate was content to lay second through the early exchanges as Angitude, a bit reticent to load, showed the way in her first attempt at a distance of ground.

Tarabi began to zero in on the front-runner as the field approached the stretch, grabbed that one with about a furlong to travel and prevailed by three-quarters of a length. Goddess of Fire finished with interest at the rail to complete a chalky exacta ahead of Angitude in third.

A full-sister to Shivaji, a Group 3-winning and Group 1-placed turf sprinter and \$2.1-million earner on the ultra-competitive Japan Racing Association circuit, Tarabi earned a lofty 79 Beyer in decimating a group of Ellis Park maidens at first asking last August, then ran into 'TDN Rising Star' and eventual champion Echo Zulu (**Gun Runner**) in her next two, finishing runner-up in this track's GI Spinaway S. and again in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. The chestnut tuned up for this return to stakes company with a sound runner-up effort in a seven-furlong allowance over the Churchill main track June 18. It's now on to bigger and better things for Tarabi, according to winning trainer Cherie DeVaux.

"The [seven-furlong Aug. 6 GI Longines] Test is definitely what our goal would be, so we're going to have to shorten her back up, but she had a race over the track and she's run two good races here," said DeVaux.

A 35th black-type winner for Claiborne's underrated **First Samurai**, Tarabi is out of an unraced daughter of Grade II winner Buy the Barrel, also the dam of MSP Stave (**Ghostzapper**) and English MGSP Mise En Rose (**War Front**). The winner's 2-year-old half-brother Gunner Bay (**Gun Runner**) was purchased by Robert and Lawana Low for \$250,000 out of last year's Keeneland September Sale. Indian Bay is also responsible for a yearling **Kantharos** filly and was most recently covered by Authentic.

Seizing control from the inside post in a race that was delayed when Missy Greer (**Nyquist**) ran off and was subsequently scratched, Canisy lobbed his rivals along through methodical fractions of :24.11 and :50.17 under a snug hold from Javier Castellano. ONESTO SWOOPS IN THE GRAND PRIX DE PARIS



Onesto | Scoop Dyga

Unleashing his deadly acceleration to maximum effect at a ParisLongchamp blessed by evening sun, **TDN Rising Star Onesto (Ire) (Frankel {GB})** stormed into the big time in Thursday's G1 Grand Prix de Paris. This type of performance had looked on the cards after his scintillating win in the 10 1/2-furlong G2 Prix Greffulhe at Saint-Cloud May 8 and a highly commendable effort from a horror draw when dead-heating for fifth in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and the Fabrice Chappet-trained chestnut was duly made the 10-3 favourite.

Anchored last early by Stephane Pasquier having run freely to post, the first Group 1 winner for his breeder Diamond Creek Farm who sported the colours of Gerard Augustin-Normand for the first time proved perfectly tractable in the race and saved energy tracking the other five. Producing the burst once straightened for home that is already his trademark over a 12-furlong trip that was certain to play to his strengths, he produced a :11.09 penultimate sectional to overhaul the long-time leader **Simca Mille (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB})** a furlong from home. That rallying rival kept the winning margin to a neck only, with the Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up **El Bodegon (Ire) (Kodiac {GB})** adding context 2 1/2 lengths back in third. **Cont. p3**

Since the move of the Prix du Jockey-Club to 10 1/2 furlongs, the draw has become vital with the last winner to have come from a double-figure stall being one of the Chantilly Classic's better ones in the talented New Bay (GB) in 2015. Onesto had fared reasonably well in the original draw in nine, but after the well-documented error he was re-posted to 14 and lost all chance at the start. Still able to get within a respectable distance of the impressive winner Vadeni (Fr) (**Churchill {Ire}**), he emerged from the race as one of a few who could be upgraded significantly. This trip looked truly up his street, hailing from the family of Juddmonte's great blue hen Hasili (Ire) by the stamina influence **Frankel**, whose 25th Group 1 winner he duly became. He was also able to mark the win with the added bonus of supplying **Sea The Stars (Ire)** with his first Group 1 winner as a broodmare sire. It capped a memorable week for the breeders, who had supplied the **Fasig-Tipton July Sale-topping Curlin colt**.

"He can be slightly too keen and Stephane did well to rate him," Chappet said. "In the race, he was slightly too cold but when he made his move between horses two out he was right there to produce his turn of foot. In fact it turned out to be the perfect race for him. He ran a great race in the Prix du Jockey Club, but he was out if it turning for home because of his bad draw. You can have regrets because there is only one Derby in the life of a horse, but take nothing away from the winner--I am not saying we would have won."

Finding only Welwal (GB) (Shalaa {Ire}) too strong on his other juvenile start in a 7 1/2-furlong conditions event on Deauville’s Polytrack in October, he was again behind that rival when eighth as Vadeni was fifth in this track’s G3 Prix de Fontainebleau a mile Apr. 17. It was only when he got to the Greffulhe that he hit his stride and Chappet has the big one back over this course and distance in mind now.

“He’s got plenty of speed, he can win 10-furlong races and he won a mile maiden but now the future is to target the Arc and we will go with some ambition,” he added. “This was a good trial, wasn’t it? He will first go for the [G2] Prix Niel.”

Of Simca Mille, trainer Stephane Wattel said, “He ran a huge race and it was a great performance, so we have to be proud and he doesn’t stop improving. We will see how he comes out of it--the [G2] Grand Prix de Deauville at home could be a possibility.”

Fresh off a confidence-boosting triumph in last month's Listed Prix Melisande at ParisLongchamp, Juddmonte's homebred 3-year-old filly **Raclette (GB)** (**Frankel {GB}**--Emollient, by Empire Maker) continued her resurgence with a narrow victory, back at the Bois de Boulogne venue, in Thursday's G2 Prix de Malleret (Prix Le Bonbon) to set the stakes action rolling on Bastille Day.

The April-foaled bay debuted with a 'TDN Rising Star' display at Deauville last August, closing her juvenile campaign with another win at Chantilly in September, but was off the board in her first two starts this term. She ran eighth in April's G3 Prix de la Grotte and fourth in May's Listed Prix Finlande, regaining her winning thread last time, and was usurped in the betting market

as the holiday crowd marked G3 Prix de Royaumont victrix

Baiyara (Fr) (**Zarak {Fr}**) as the 4-5 pick. The eventual winner found a smooth rhythm stalking the tempo in second after the initial exchanges of the 12-furlong contest. Nudged along to challenge passing the quarter-mile marker, Raclette gained a slender advantage entering the final furlong and was ridden out to bravely hold the challenges on both sides for a career high.

At the line, she was a head too good for the fast-closing Listed Prix de Thiberville winner **Lastotchka (Fr)** (**Myboycharlie {Ire}**), with Baiyara contributing to a thriller and finishing a short neck adrift in third.

"The Family will be delighted with this result," commented Juddmonte's on-course representative after the win elevated the old guard of Andre Fabre and Olivier Peslier to a combined

tally of 16 in the contest, Fabre extending his record haul to a round 10 and Peslier collecting a sixth edition. "Raclette is a smart filly and we have to congratulate Andre Fabre for the fantastic job he has done with this filly. Ever since she ran that first day, he always said the further she went the better she would be and all has gone as he predicted. We will see how she comes out of the race and Mr. Fabre will discuss the future with the Family and [racing manager] Barry Mahon. There are plenty of opportunities for her both in France and abroad."

Pedigree Notes

The best foal of her four-time Grade I-winning dam Emollient, Raclette is a full-sister to the stakes-placed Licence (GB) (**Frankel {GB}**) and a half-sister to **War Front** filly Peace Charter (GB), who

was second in the G3 Juvenile Fillies Sprint S. at Naas and third in the G2 Balanchine S. The 'TDN Rising Star's juvenile full-sister has been named Ardent and has yet to race. Emollient was barren to **Quality Road** last year and her 2022 Into Mischief foal died. She returned to Claiborne sire **War Front** this spring.

The Classic-placed Hofburg (**Tapit**) is under the second dam, while the third dam, Glia (A.P. Indy), is a daughter of the outstanding blue hen Coup de Genie (Mr. Prospector). Her black-type descendants are

legion, with Group 1 winners Denebola (Storm Cat), Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) and Maxios (GB) also part of her brood. The last two both found places at stud and currently make their homes in Japan and Ireland, respectively.

(GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) took to ParisLongchamp to execute
another successful French foray by Hughie Morrison in
Thursday's G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil.

Always in control at the head of affairs, the even-money
favourite was asked to turn the screw turning for home by Tom

Marquand and responded gamely on ground that was as fast as
he can cope with to score by 1 1/4 lengths from the progressive
filly **Jannah Flower (Ire)** (Olympic Glory {Ire}). "Tom said he
never really got out of fourth gear," his trainer said. "I think the
world's his oyster now--there are plenty of Group 1s in the
autumn. He's in the Ebor, but I'd be tempted to go up in grade
now--he's in the [G1] Irish St Leger and I'd love to bring him back
for the [G1 Prix du] Cadran."

Successful in Royal Ascot's Duke of Edinburgh S. over a mile
and a half last June, Quickthorn was a head second to the
subsequent Irish Leger hero Sonnyboyliston (Ire) (Power {GB}) in
York's prestigious Ebor last August before his form tailed off and
he was ninth in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak here in October. Three-
lengths second to the stayer supreme Trueshan (Fr) (Planteur
{Ire}) in receipt of seven pounds in Nottingham's Listed Further
Flight S. on his 2022 bow over this 14-furlong trip Apr. 6, the bay
was a head second to Princess Zoe (Ger) (Jukebox Jury {Ire}) in
Ascot's G3 Sagaro S. tackling two miles Apr. 27 prior to his Henry
II breakthrough.

For Pascal Bary, the rise of Jannah Flower is coinciding with
stepping up in trip and he said, "She ran a blinder, it was a super
performance. I hope she can win such a race one day, as she
deserves it. We can target the [G2] Prix de Pomone now in
Deauville and then the [G1] Prix de Royallieu here in October."

Jim Bolger's G1 2000 Guineas 13th and G3 Gallinule S. third **Boundless Ocean (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}--Novel Approach {Ire}, by New Approach {Ire}) posted a second in last month's Listed King

George V Cup before running sixth of eight in the G1 Irish Derby and stepped forward to secure a career best in Thursday's G3 Green Room Meld S. at Leopardstown. Reined back off a sharp getaway to race third under a firm hold through halfway, the well-backed 15-8 favourite was rowed along to challenge in early straight and bounded clear under continued urging once inching ahead at the furlong marker to easily account for **Bear Story (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) by 3 1/4 lengths, with **Patrick Sarsfield (Fr)** (Australia {GB}) 1 1/4 lengths adrift in third.

"He's been an unlucky horse, several times," commented Bolger, who allied with veteran pilot Kevin Manning to maintain an evergreen theme initiated by Andre Fabre and Olivier Peslier earlier in the evening. "He's good at that [nine-furlong] trip, or a mile-and-a-quarter, so we'll probably keep him to that. We've no plans at the moment, but he'll probably step up to a mile-and-a-quarter. We probably could go back in trip, but then we'd be looking for more pace which you don't always get. He was keen today, but he doesn't do himself any harm. He's an improver and he's getting stronger all the time."

SAUDI CUP HERO EMBLEM ROAD RETURNS IN GRAND PRIX DE VICHY

Emblem Road (Quality Road), who won the \$20-million G1 Saudi Cup in February, will return to the racecourse in the 2000-metre G3 Grand Prix de Vichy on July 20. Representing Prince Saud bin Salman Abdulaziz, the 4-year-old entire was 50-1 when he ran out a half-length winner of the Saudi Cup for trainer Mitab Almulawah. Transferred to Alessandro Botti who is based in Chantilly, Emblem Road will summer in France, before going on to the Breeders' Cup at Keeneland in November. He took a spin over the Chantilly turf course on Monday morning.

Olivier Peslier, who was aboard, said, "We stayed behind the lead [horse] and made him run 400 metres quick. He closed a little bit late, but he was coming in the end. The horse is very well."

Renato Geiger, manager of the racing and bloodstock interests for Prince Saud, said, "After the horse won the Saudi Cup, we had the thought to go to the Breeders' Cup. The first plan was a holiday [in France], not really to run. We thought we'd give him a break and then head to America for a prep race before the Breeders' Cup.

"When Prince Saud bin Salman bin Abdulaziz decided to race him in France, I knew that Alessandro Botti--cousin of Italian trainer Stefano Botti and Newmarket-based Marco Botti--was the right man."

"There is a nice 2000-metre race--the Grand Prix de Vichy--where we are going next Wednesday," added Geiger. "We picked Vichy because it is a flat track, so there are no tricky situations. Where he heads after that is down to Prince Saud bin Salman bin Abdulaziz. If you look at his work, he looks good on turf. Physically, he's a sort of hybrid. He's a smart horse, an athletic horse and we think he's a very special horse."

"He's a horse that will never show who he is in the mornings," he continued. "He's very laid back. That's why Olivier [Peslier] was picked to ride him. He's not only a good racing jockey, but he's a good tester too. In the last three weeks, [Emblem Road]'s come along very well."

SOUMILLON'S ECLIPSE BAN REDUCED TO EIGHT DAYS

Jockey Christophe Soumillon has had his 12-day suspension for careless riding in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. reduced to eight days following an appeal hearing on Thursday. On board **Vadeni (Fr)** (**Churchill {Ire}**), the pair cut across and impeded the third- and fourth-placed finishers William Buick on **Native Trail (GB)** (**Oasis Dream {GB}**) for Charlie Appleby and James Doyle on **Lord North (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) for John and Thady Gosden after the winning post, as Soumillon celebrated. The stewards reviewed the race and subsequently handed out their suspension.

Soumillon, speaking via a Zoom call from France on Thursday, said, "Like I said to the stewards straight away after the race, and seeing the images again today, you can see that I made a mistake, that's for sure." [Cont. p10](#)

He said, "I didn't know how many horses were on my inside. We have seen the videos at quarter speed, but the thing you have to remember is I'm riding at full speed, and I never saw that between Mr Buick and the rail there was Mr Doyle. I should probably look, but I didn't.

"For sure the images after the line are not good, not for racing and not for myself, but nothing was done on purpose, and I really try to give my sport the best image I can.

"For me it was the chance for one of the biggest days of my career, as it is not easy for a 3-year-old colt coming from France to win one of the hardest races in the UK. This race wasn't won by a French horse for 60 years and probably I over-celebrated the moment. My kids were there and there was a lot of emotion for me that day."

He added, "The day after the race I called Mr. Appleby and Mr. [John] Gosden for news about the horses and I know both horses were doing well after the race, so that was a relief as if I heard one of these champions had got hurt from one of my little mistakes, it would have been very hard for me to understand.

"The suspension is probably the hardest I have had in my career. I'm not somebody who puts my colleagues in danger in any part of the race.

"Twelve days is probably a hundred rides for me as I'm riding eight races a day. If you have to give me a suspension I can accept it, but I don't think it was that bad on the day--I think it was very severe for somebody who didn't do it on purpose.

"I think I was professional for 99.8% of the race. Unfortunately, for three strides I wasn't completely concentrated, and that little fraction makes it look worse than what it really is."

Disciplinary Panel Chairman James O'Mahony confirmed the suspension would be reduced, and said, "He said, "Generally, of

course, Monsieur Soumillon is a much-respected horseman and jockey and as can be expected of him, he addressed us with courtesy and realism, accepting what he had done is wrong and we detected significant remorse.

"There's a lot of common ground here. This is careless riding, no one suggests otherwise, the interference was considerable, no one suggests otherwise, and there was irresponsible behaviour, as Monsieur Soumillon has accepted.

"But and there is a big but, there is in this case a very significant safety risk and Mr. Soumillon and Vadeni are included in this. Mercifully, nobody went down and there were no injuries.

"The actual time of which his riding of the horse can be considered irresponsible and indeed careless was very short. Considering all these matters and bearing in mind the mitigation and the aggravating factors, we're going to allow the appeal and do feel the sentence was too severe.

"The panel order that the period of suspension should be one of eight days, thus the appeal succeeds."

In the bay's next start, the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano, he was serving a ban and Frankie Dettori claimed that ride and victory. It was Dettori again in the G1 Champion S., but Egan got back on board for the 2021 \$20-million Saudi Cup, currently the world's richest race. Later in 2021, the pair won both the G1 Sheema Classic at Meydan and the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York last year. They were a close second in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at the start of this month.

In a statement, Prince Faisal's racing manager Ted Voute said, "David Egan has not signed his 2022 riding contract, so Prince Faisal has decided to revert to best available jockey, starting with Sajwaan, a first-time-out 2-year-old that runs on Saturday who will be ridden by James Doyle."

BECKETT BLASTS POOR PRIZE-MONEY AS NO RUNNERS DECLARED FOR NEWBURY RACE

Irish Derby-winning trainer Ralph Beckett has blasted the poor prize-money on offer in Britain in response to no runners being declared for the final race at Newbury on Saturday.

Beckett, who sent out Westover (GB) ([Frankel \(GB\)](#)) to win the Curragh Classic last month, labelled the purse for the Newbury race that did not attract a single declaration "a disgrace."

He said, "£6,500 for a novice race at a Grade 1 track on a Saturday is a disgrace. Furthermore, when the race conditions were published a month ago, it was published at £5,300. It was only upped on Monday and that was too little, too late."

Beckett added, "Horsemen are independent people and are fed up with the derisory prize-money on offer in general and in this instance they decided to vote with their feet."

In what can only be viewed as a boycott in response to the issue of poor prize money, not one of the 13 entries for the Stonegate Homes Fillies' Novice S. were declared.

The 10-furlong contest had a prize fund of £6,500, the same as the opening contest on the card, for which 11 runners were declared.

Some of the biggest yards in the country had entries at the initial stage, including John and Thady Gosden, Saeed bin Suroor, Roger Varian and Beckett.

The feature Super Sprint carries £200,000 in prize money while the bet365 Hackwood S. and the Highclere Castle Gin S. both carry a prize fund of £60,000.

Beckett, who is president of the National Trainers' Federation, has decided to run his entrant elsewhere due to the prize money on offer.

The other six races on the Newbury card features 64 runners but the track's chief executive Julian Thick described himself as

disappointed that the finale couldn't attract a runner.

He said, "It is hard to imagine this isn't a concerted action with a race that had 13 entries from 10 different stables receiving no declarations. It's particularly disappointing for our racegoers to only have six races to enjoy on Saturday afternoon with over £400,000 of prize-money on offer.

"Newbury has always had a portfolio of races run at different values and aimed at different types of horses throughout the year, this year is no different. As an independent PLC we are transparent about our prize-money strategy and our finances and have an ongoing dialogue about this with the NTF.

"We have to run the racecourse on a sustainable basis and we have committed to return to overall 2019 prize-money levels this year, despite having lost £2.4m in 2020 and barely breaking even last year as a result of Covid.

"With all the revenue uncertainty and the rising cost pressures racecourses are facing at this current time, we believe that's a substantial commitment by our shareholders. Looking at our forecast for 2022, we will be putting up £2.5m in executive contribution to prize-money this year, which is the largest amount the racecourse has ever committed to.

"We have recently publicly announced an increase to prize money levels when our new media contract comes into effect next year, committing a minimum of 40% of total media revenues to our prize money for the next three years.

"As a PLC, our total media revenues and profits are always fully disclosed unlike most other racecourses, giving full transparency so there can be no misunderstanding about our commitment.

"Given this background, it's disappointing this has happened and at a time when the industry needs to pull together."

A spokesperson for the British Horseracing Authority said, "It is the responsibility of all leaders within racing to work together to improve the prize-money situation so that we can retain the best horses in Britain whilst also maintaining a horse population that consistently provides competitive and compelling racing.

"Addressing this challenge will form a key part of the strategy that British racing's leaders recently pledged to work together on last month.

"While it is disappointing to have arrived at such a situation on a key day for racing, the BHA remains optimistic that improvements to prize-money and its distribution across the race programme can be found through constructive dialogue between ourselves, racecourses and participants."
