

## INJUNCTION HALTS HISA RULES, BUT ONLY IN LOUISIANA, WEST VIRGINIA

The plaintiff states of Louisiana and West Virginia won a preliminary injunction in federal court Tuesday that will keep the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) Authority's rules from being implemented in those two states until a [lawsuit challenging the constitutionality](#) of HISA gets decided in full.

"This court believes the threatened harm to Plaintiffs outweighs any harm that may result to the Defendants and that a preliminary injunction will not undermine the public interest," wrote Judge Terry Doughty of U.S. District Court (Western District of Louisiana).

"This Court is only ruling on the adoption of the rules by HISA, not the constitutionality of the Act," Doughty was quick to add.

"The geographic scope of the injunction shall be limited to the states of Louisiana and West Virginia, and as to all Plaintiffs in this proceeding," Doughty wrote.

The defendants, who consist of the HISA Authority, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), and board members and overseers of both entities, are alleged in the June 29 suit to have violated the Fourth, Seventh and Tenth Amendments to the U.S.

## STEEPLECHASE STAR SNAP DECISION TACKLES FLAT HORSES IN COLONIAL STAKES

**Snap Decision** ([Hard Spun](#)) may be the best jumper in the country, but his next assignment will be in a flat race, Wednesday's \$150,000 Colonial Cup at Colonial Downs. As trainer Jack Fisher sees it, he's got nothing to lose. While he wants to win and doesn't think that is out of the question, Fisher said one of the reasons he went into the race is that it should set his horse up for the G1 Jonathan Sheppard S., an Aug. 17 steeplechase at Saratoga.

"If nothing else, this will be a good work for the Jonathan Sheppard S.," he said. "I can get that much more into the horse by doing this. In this case, one race equals three works. Depending on where he finishes, we should also pick up a little bit of purse money."

## Injunction Halts HISA Rules, but Only in Louisiana and West Virginia (*cont. from p1*)

Lisa Lazarus, the chief executive officer of the HISA Authority, told *TDN* in an emailed statement that read, in part, “[Tuesday’s] ruling from the Western District of Louisiana relates only to the FTC rules, is limited in geographic scope to Louisiana and West Virginia...and does not question HISA’s constitutionality or validity. The Authority remains focused on implementing the Racetrack Safety program and drafting Anti-Doping and Medication Control rules for implementation in January 2023....

“The reality is that the majority of racing participants support the Authority’s mission to protect those who play by the rules and hold those who fail to do so accountable in order to keep our equine and human athletes safe and the competition fair. The immense collaboration with state racing commissions, stewards, veterinarians, racetracks, trainers, and other horsemen that has taken place to date is evidence of this support, and we intend to continue to fulfill our mandate and work to make the industry safer,” Lazarus continued.

The plaintiffs, led by the states of Louisiana and West Virginia, plus the Jockeys’ Guild and various Louisiana-based “covered persons” under HISA rules, had told the judge that it was imperative to obtain an injunction before the case winds its way

through the legal system, lest they be exposed to the alleged harms of the rules. These types of federal court cases can often linger in the legal system for years without resolution.

In a 28-page memorandum explaining his ruling, Doughty noted that two civil suits attempting to get HISA struck down based on alleged unconstitutionality have already failed in federal courts and are currently pending appeal, and that those suits shared some common plaintiffs with the case that is now before his court.

But a key difference, Doughty wrote, is that, “This suit is the third attempt at stopping enforcement of HISA but the first to address the legality of the rules enacted.”

Doughty wrote that he first had to determine whether his court has judicial power to hear this case under the doctrine of “standing.” A federal court has judicial power only where a plaintiff has demonstrated that it 1) suffered an injury in fact; 2) is fairly traceable to the challenged conduct of the defendant, and 3) is likely to be redressed by a favorable decision. The party invoking federal jurisdiction has the burden of establishing those three elements.

Once the first phase of rules (covering racetrack safety, enforcement, and financial assessment methodology) went into effect July 1, Doughty wrote "All Plaintiffs allege they will suffer injuries 'in the form of vast destruction of the horseracing industry through individual penalties and systematic changes to the longstanding regulatory structure and revenue model. They argue that there will be financial costs so great that numerous participants will be driven out of business if the rules are enforced."

On the other side, Doughty wrote, "Defendants argue there is no injury to Plaintiffs because 1) none of the alleged injuries have 'transpired over the two weeks in which the rules have already been in effect'; 2) the harms are self-inflicted under the rules; 3) there is not a challenge to the Act's scope; 4) the injuries derive from the Act enacted by Congress itself, not any of the implemented rules, and 5) the mere apprehension or fear of future harm does not establish a concrete injury."

Doughty reconciled those conflicting viewpoints this way: "The applicable time period under this element is not whether the injury has occurred since the implementation of the rules, but whether it was imminent at the time the complaint was filed. While Defendants' argument that the injuries have not occurred and that the private Plaintiffs' fear of future injury might go to the success on the merits, they do not negate Plaintiffs' standing. Plaintiffs are challenging the legality of government

action and are objects of said action. All Plaintiffs are participants in the horseracing industry, making them directly affected by regulation actions."

Doughty wrote that the "fairly traceable" link requirement was straightforwardly accomplished by the plaintiffs.

"Here, there is an obvious link between the HISA rules and Plaintiffs' alleged injuries," Doughty wrote. "All the above alleged injuries are 'fairly traceable' to the rules enacted thus far by HISA and the FTC."

The plaintiffs also had to prove the "redressability element of standing," which requires demonstrating "a substantial likelihood" that the requested relief will remedy the alleged injury.

"Because Plaintiffs are challenging the legality of government action in the form of HISA and the FTC approving and implementing rules, Plaintiffs have demonstrated a substantial likelihood that the requested relief would remedy the alleged injuries in fact," Doughty wrote. "If Plaintiffs are successful in having the HISA rules declared invalid, this would redress their alleged injuries."

At a later point in the memorandum, Doughty wrote that "Obtaining a preliminary injunction is an 'extraordinary and drastic remedy'" that a movant is only entitled to if four factors are established.

They are: 1) a substantial likelihood of success on the merits; 2) the movant is likely to suffer irreparable harm without preliminary relief; 3) the possible injury to the movant outweighs the possible harm to the other party, and 4) an injunction is in the public interest.


"Plaintiffs have satisfied all four elements required for a preliminary injunction to be issued. After considering all factors, this Court has determined that a preliminary injunction shall be issued by Plaintiffs against the Defendants," Doughty wrote.

The injunction shall be in effect, Doughty wrote, "pending the final resolution of this case," adding that the final ruling could extend all the way up to an appeal before the United States Supreme Court.

## Snap Decision Tackles Flat Horses in Colonial Stakes (*cont. from p1*)

Take a closer look at Snap Decision's lifetime record and you'll see a horse that shouldn't be in over his head in a stakes race on the flat. A half-brother to Mr Speaker (Pulpit), the winner of the 2014 GI Belmont Derby Invitational, Snap Decision began his career for the Phipps Stable and trainer Shug McGaughey. He was 2-for-18 on the flat, but finished third in the GIII Palm Beach S. and third in the Better Talk Now S.

Fisher went to the connections and got them to agree to sell. "For one, they wanted to know that he was going to go to a good home," Fisher said. "Secondly, he wasn't winning those races. He was third, fourth, fifth. That's the type of horse I am very interested in buying. I have to give all the credit to [co-owner] Charlie Fenwick because he was all about the sire, **Hard Spun**. I told him it wasn't **Hard Spun**, it was the dam [Salute]. She is a very nice dam. But Charlie was right."

Snap Decision, who is eight, debuted over the jumps in 2019 and ended that year with a pair of stakes wins. He won his first Grade 1 win over jumps in the 2021 Iroquois S. and this year has run second in the G2 Temple Gwathmey S. before winning another Iroquois, this time by 7 1/4 lengths. He has finished first or second in 15 consecutive jump races.

After the Iroquois, Fisher had the option of running Snap Decision over the jumps in the G1 A.P. Smithwick S. at Saratoga, but passed the race because of the amount of weight Snap Decision would have had to carry. Fisher said he was told his horse would have had to carry 158 pounds in the race. The winner, Down Royal (Alphabet Soup), carried 141 pounds.

"If I ran him in the Smithwick, I was going to get creamed with the weight," he said.

Not wanting to go into the Sheppard off of a three-month layoff, Fisher found the Colonial Cup. (A race with the same name used to be one of the major stakes on the steeplechase circuit). Can he win? Fisher is trying to take a realistic approach to the race.

"I saw they had this 1 1/2-mile race there on the turf and I thought he is a good enough horse that he belonged," Fisher said. "Rusty Arnold has a tough horse in there in Cellist (Big Blue Kitten). He won the [GIII] Louisville S. in his last start. I'm not sure he can beat him, but I'm not really scared of anyone else."

Fisher continued, "I don't think the race is too short for him. I think it will be perfect."

There aren't many examples of top steeplechase horses winning on the flat. In 1971, the Sheppard-trained Wustenchef won a flat stakes, the Sussex Turf H., and one over jumps, the Indian River Hurdle H., at the same Delaware Park meet. John's Call ran four times over jumps before being converted to a flat horse. In his second career, he became a two-time Grade I winner, winning the 2000 GI Turf Classic Invitational S. and the 2000 GI Sword Dance Invitational.

Fisher said that if Spun Decision turns in a big effort in the Colonial he might be tempted to run him again on the flat. But he said that the etiquette in his profession is that once a steeplechase trainer buys a horse from a flat racing stable, the horse should compete only in jump races. He said he will keep that in mind when making future decisions.

Forest Boyce has the riding assignment on Snap Decision and the gelding has been assigned 122 pounds, 36 less than he carried in the 2022 Iroquois at three miles. It's been three years and four months since he last raced over the flat, finishing third in a 1 1/8-mile dirt allowance race at Aqueduct. Since then, he's become one of the best jumpers in the sport. Does that mean he is good enough to be competitive in a \$150,000 non-graded stakes race on the flat? The question will be answered Wednesday at Colonial Downs.

## QUARTER HORSE RACINO APPROVED FOR EASTERN KENTUCKY by T. D. Thornton

By unanimous voice vote after zero public discussion among commissioners at a "special" meeting, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) on Tuesday quickly approved a license awarding a Quarter Horse racino license for a track to be constructed in the northeastern part of the state.

The license is the ninth and final of its kind to be awarded in Kentucky.

Although the focus of press releases announcing the deal accentuated the rebirth of Quarter Horse racing in a state better known as the nation's Thoroughbred epicenter, the real prize for applicant Revolutionary Racing will be the privilege of operating historical horse race (HHR) gaming at the facility and its satellite locations.

Although the July 26 KHRC meeting was short on details, the *Daily Independent* newspaper in the town of Ashland, where the racino will be located, has previously reported that the track will be built behind a mall there, with the 400 HHR machines to be installed in a vacant Sears department store.

In a press release, Revolutionary Racing stated that it envisioned a \$55-million investment in the 177-acre property would transform the suburban site near the Ohio River into a "world-class facility."

The 660-yard sprint track is projected to feature purses of \$500,000, which would make the facility the kingpin of Quarter Horse racing east of the Mississippi River, where the breed gets only sporadic support from sanctioned racetracks.

No specific race dates or an opening date were discussed during the public portion of the KHRC meeting. The facility is projected to get year-round use for Quarter Horse shows and other equestrian competitions, and an adjacent entertainment complex is also part of the plan.

No existing Thoroughbred or Standardbred track licensees stated objections to the Quarter Horse racino. Its nearest in-state Thoroughbred competitor would be Keeneland, some 120 miles west.

Four years ago Revolutionary Racing was a partner in the \$20-million purchase of then-dormant Colonial Downs in Virginia. Revolutionary Racing was eventually bought out of that deal, and Colonial Downs was subsequently sold in 2022 to the gaming corporation Churchill Downs Inc., for \$2.5 billion.

According to the KHRC, in 2021 The Kentucky House of Representatives passed a resolution in support of the Quarter Horse industry in the commonwealth, recommending that at least one race track license be awarded or held explicitly for Quarter Horse racing.

According to the brief comments made prior to the vote, Revolutionary Racing needed to adhere to six conditions to achieve its licensure. But it was not publicly disclosed during the meeting what those conditions were. One day prior to the meeting, TDN requested from the KHRC the portion of the public meeting packet that contained the license application and related materials. That query did not result in a reply from the KHRC prior to the Tuesday deadline for this story.

Two commissioners, William May and James Worley, abstained from the vote, citing interest conflicts.

## EQUINE ETHICS, PART II: A CASE FOR TEACHING THE LANGUAGE OF HORSES

**In Tuesday's TDN, we ran part I of Diana Pikulski's interview with Robert (Bob) Duncan ([click here to read](#)). This two-part piece is the first in a series called Equine Ethics, which examines ways in which racing can exist in the most ethical way possible.**

**RD:** My next ah-ha moment occurred with horse trainer Pat Parelli. After my visit with Monty, I started exploring the internet for more horse related info. The name that kept popping up was Pat Parelli of Parelli Natural Horsemanship. I was then lucky enough to be invited to his International Savvy Conference including an intensive VIP week where no more than ten people would have a seven-day accelerated program exclusively with Pat.

At Parelli's place you checked your ego and your machismo at the front gate--a concept that many gate crews struggle with. Here, I gained a more extensive horse vocabulary. They came up with so many interesting and provocative ways to engage your horse and your imagination. Horses were encouraged to make choices for themselves. They became invested partners and showed true enjoyment and connection with their humans. Cues became feather light and the response was flexible and fluid. I learned that this level of connection and trust would have to be our new standard on the starting gate.

Pat and Linda (Parelli)'s principled approach and ethical, horse-centric, practices guide me to this day.

**TDN: As your horsemanship advanced, how did you refine the starting gate protocols?**

**RD:** The foundation of our success was built on embracing the concept of "Right brain/Left brain" thinking in horses. That phrase describes, in layman's terms, how horses process information and react to their environment.

We changed the way that we approached the horses and how we approached the schooling process. The buggy whip, the need to back the horses into the gate, the forced loads all basically disappeared because we didn't need them any more. Those things were part and parcel of a different era, a different way of doing things.

With our newfound knowledge, by approaching the horse in a relaxed, non-threatening way, we could begin to build trust and connection through subtle movements that mimic how horses communicate with each other in the herd. In the mornings, a palpable change would occur (left brain/safety) and the horse's curiosity would kick in. This was a quantum shift, creating a calmer, safer environment for all.

Also, I changed the curriculum, so to speak. Once a horse learns to break, they never forget it. Our goal now is to develop a horse that is alert but calm at the gate. Horses get calming, remedial visits between races and aggressive gate works. These stand-and-back-out days are key to keeping a horse on an even keel. A nervous or fearful horse goes into "fight or flight" (reactive, right brain response) mode when stressed. It pumps adrenaline and hyperventilates, using up a good part of its reserve early in the race. Calm horses breathe deeply into the abdomen, increasing oxygen reserves while preserving energy.

**TDN: Was the transformation successful?**

**RD:** I believe that the transformation was successful, especially in New York, where we have been able to continue the philosophy for over 20 years through starters Roy Williamson, Mike McMullin and now Hector Soler.

After consulting for NYRA in 2009, using only our new techniques, I reviewed my records of gate work for the six-month summer season at Saratoga's Oklahoma track. We had six thousand horse visits to our schooling gate. Of those six thousand visits, we never used the buggy whip, never used the blindfold, never muscled a horse into the gate, eliminated rearing up and flipping, never had to back one into the gate and taught each and every horse to walk quietly and willingly into the closed-door gate. All horses left our gate in a better frame of mind than when they arrived. These were overwhelming statistics.

**TDN: What is your response to people who resist re-learning how they handle the horses in their care and control?**

**RD:** The changes we made didn't grow out of some mystical new-age whispering. This recent spike of interest grew out of the practical, intuitive minds of the Dorrance brothers, Tom and Bill, who ran a horse and cattle outfit out of Oregon. Word of mouth spread the news of their common-sense success with horses. Ray Hunt, a disciple of Tom and Bill, carried the message like Johnny Appleseed, trailering his horses across the country to spread the word to horse persons and ranchers across the states.

I was fortunate to connect with Ray in his later years. We met at a clinic attended by 16 starters at Sunland Park Racetrack, in New Mexico. Ray was dealing with breathing issues by then and I was asked to assist him. It was an amazing few days that led to two other clinics with Ray at WinStar Farm in Kentucky. After the success of the Sunland clinic, the AQHA asked Ray to do a series of clinics at various tracks, but his health would not permit it. I was then asked and I accepted the opportunity. You will find a thread of Ray's philosophy in almost every modern-day clinician's presentation. His reputation and influence lives on.

**TDN: Because of your success, were you called upon to work with horses outside of the U.S.?**

**RD:** Yes, our success in New York was establishing that not only were the horses at the gate more calm and consistently cooperative, but they were breaking and racing better. Word was getting around. I was approached by Aidan O'Brien to go to Ireland and work with their team and by Gai Waterhouse to go to Australia to help with the barriers there. Gai was determined to get her staff educated so I ended up going down every year for a few years. Then, on a number of occasions Gai would send members of her staff to stay with me in Saratoga and observe our gate crew.

**TDN: Where are now in your career?**

**RD:** I retired from NYRA in 2005 and remained on as a consultant, schooling horses at the Oklahoma training track in Saratoga for another 12 years. Since 2005, I have worked for Todd Pletcher doing his gate work in Florida at Palm Beach Downs. Todd and I have had a long relationship going back to his early days of training. I think we see eye to eye on how to get the most from his horses. His dad, JJ, puts the foundation on the young horses, making my job much easier. It has been a great pleasure to be a part of the family's success. I've been around a long while and I know that I've landed in a place that I can feel proud to be a part of.

**TDN: What do you see as the next most important step for racing to take with respect to how horses are handled at the track?**

**RD:** Training and educating backstretch workers. I would like to see racetracks embrace this program and institute a practical study course to educate new hires on the backstretch. Clinics could be scheduled as needed and new hires could be issued temporary credentials until such time that they complete a course. It needs to be taught from the nurseries to the retirement facilities so that we are all speaking the same language. I don't know anything of greater value for the long-term well-being of our horses and personnel.

Anyone who wholeheartedly commits to this process will arrive at a point in a schooling session when a change comes over their horse. If you have been fair and consistent and working toward lightness with your touch a transformation occurs. The horse's head drops and the eye softens. Tension leaves the body and you know you are with a friend. The focus is on you and the gate becomes a curiosity. It is a moment of such intimacy and trust that it can bring a tear to your eyes. It is a feeling of pure joy. I wish for all horse people to experience it.

## WALLACE JOINS ST. ELIAS, GANDHARVI TEAMS

Michael Wallace has accepted roles working for Vinnie and Teresa Viola's St. Elias Stable as well as Kuldeep Singh Rajput's Gandharvi Racing Stables, the bloodstock agent told the *TDN* Tuesday. Wallace served as Chief Operating Officer of the China Horse Club before **leaving that post** at the end of last year. He will serve as a sales and bloodstock consultant for St. Elias and an overall bloodstock manager for Gandharvi.

"It's a wonderful opportunity to work with two great business minds, really," Wallace said. "You can learn a lot off of them in terms of business and the way they think about things."

St. Elias has been one of the more active participants in the yearling market in recent years, particularly in **partnership** with Mike Repole's Repole Stable. Last year, the two powerful New York-based operations spent nearly \$17.5 million together on yearlings at the major U.S. auctions.

Wallace said that partnership will continue at this year's sales. "They already have their teams in place, and they will continue in their roles," he said. "I'll just quietly slot into those teams and offer an opinion where I can."

He added, "I took a bit of time off earlier in the year, and it was a nice call to get from that operation asking if I would join them and assist their team. I feel very privileged to get a call from the Viola family and Rory Babich. I'm excited about that for sure."

Gandharvi, meanwhile, is in its relative infancy. Rajput, founder and CEO of the digital health company Biofourmis, emerged on the radar last year, and partnered with China Horse Club on three yearlings at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale (see **Rajput Makes Most of Spa Trip**), and another nine at Keeneland September for \$3.765 million. Gandharvi has remained very active in the international market, and has even gotten into the claiming game, teaming up with Michael Dubb

and trainer Rob Atras to claim next-out stakes winner and recent GII Delaware H. runner-up **Battle Bling** (Vancouver {Aus}) for \$62,500.

"Kuldeep Singh is a very intelligent, great business man. He's an exciting addition to the Thoroughbred industry worldwide," Wallace said. "I met him last year, and he reached out--he has a growing portfolio of horses and asked if I'd step in and look after the management of them. Obviously, I was more than happy to do that."

Gandharvi celebrated a first victory at Saratoga last week when **Impulsiveness** (*Quality Road*), a \$280,000 OBSJUN '21 acquisition, graduated at second asking while stretching out on the grass for Todd Pletcher.

"It was great for them to experience that and have a winner at such a great place--hopefully the first of many," Wallace said.

Wallace expects both entities to be active at the upcoming Fasig Saratoga sales.

"Any time there's a yearling sale of that quality, you've got to be there and see what's available," he said. "No preconceived plans--just see what's put in front of us and go from there."

## JOHN MOONEY ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT

John Mooney, executive director of racing at Delaware Park, has announced his retirement, effective Aug. 1.

Mooney has been involved in racing in the Mid-Atlantic region for nearly 40 years. Shortly after Delaware Park was purchased and reopened by William Rickman, Sr., in 1984, Mooney was named general manager. He was instrumental in keeping Delaware Park competitive in the 1980s and early 1990s with his innovative approach to the sport which included the introduction of the very successful Twin Trifecta.

In the summer of 1993, he left Delaware Park to take a similar post with the Maryland Jockey Club and later headed up the drive to establish racing in Virginia as head of Maryland/Virginia Racing which was the group that organized the opening and operation of Colonial Downs.

Mooney returned to Delaware Park as the Executive Director of Racing in the spring of 2008 at the request of William Rickman, Jr.

"His career has been brilliant, and like everyone in the Delaware Park family, I am proud and thankful to have been a part of it," said Kevin DeLucia, the track's chief financial officer. "So much of what Thoroughbred racing at Delaware Park is today has come from his leadership, guidance and experience over the last four decades. I wish John all the best in his retirement and am truly grateful for the significant contributions he has made to the industry."

Mooney was born into the sport. His grandfather, J.D. Mooney, won the 1924 Kentucky Derby aboard Black Gold and trained the 1962 Canadian Horse of the Year Crafty Lace. His father, John J. Mooney, was a prominent horse racing executive who served at many racetracks, including the Ontario Jockey Club where he played an instrumental role in the development of the "new" Woodbine Racecourse in 1956.

Delaware Park's seven-furlong turf course will be dedicated to Mooney during a naming ceremony planned for Owners Day, Saturday, Oct. 1.

## KYPROIOS PREVAILS IN CUP THRILLER

Tuesday's G1 Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup was every bit as engaging from start to finish as it had promised to be, with ultimately **Kyprios (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) winning out ahead of **Stradivarius (Ire)** (*Sea The Stars {Ire}*) in a pulsating finale.

Sent forward by Ryan Moore from the break to provide his two big rivals with their target racing in third overall, Ballydoyle's June 16 G1 Gold Cup hero was the first to commit up the straight with his initial task seeing off last year's title-holder **Trueshan (Fr)** (Planteur {Ire}) in the centre of the track. With that accomplished, there was no small matter of getting the prize ahead of Bjorn Nielsen's four-times Goodwood Cup winner who was thrusting towards the line a few horse widths away out of sight of the 6-4 favourite.

Getting in close enough proximity near the finish to truly eyeball that iconic stayer, Kyprios showed steel to eke out a winning margin of a neck in one of the great Cup races sure to fill conversations for some time to come. Trueshan, who was gamely put into the mix by Alan King and co., ran with great credit on ground on the tight side, 1 1/4 lengths behind in third.

"That's only his eighth start and he's still learning a little bit," Moore said. "He stays very well, but he's got a lot of pace and always gives you the feeling that there's more there."

## BAAEED CASTS A LONG SHADOW IN THE SUSSEX by Tom Frary

Twelve months on from the confirmation of his potency in the G3 Thoroughbred S. at the Qatar Goodwood Festival, Shadwell's **Baaeed (GB)** (*Sea The Stars {Ire}*) returns to the famous Downs as a relative giant as he pursues ever higher ground in Wednesday's G1 Qatar Sussex S. at Goodwood. While his tally of four straight Group 1 wins--in the Prix du Moulin, the QEII, the Lockinge and Queen Anne--is highly commendable, it is still shy of the five achieved by the likes of Dubai Millennium (GB), Enable (GB), Giant's Causeway and St Mark's Basilica (Fr). By the end of the year, it is not inconceivable that he could be matching the seven of this race's 2002 hero **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)**, even if the nine of **Frankel (GB)** looks out of reach.

Comparisons with **Frankel** were being bandied about prior to the June 14 Queen Anne, but his performance there failed to satisfy that on a visual basis. [Cont. p11](#)

## G1 Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup Cont. from p1

This was one of those outcomes that justified all of the preceding hype, with Stradivarius displaying all the right signals before, during and after the contest in which he came home better than he has for some time. Looking for all the world like the horse we all knew well before the fortunes conspired against him, he gave new hope to a continuation of his stellar career. Kyprios had looked the new staying supremo at Ascot and confirmed that impression, suggesting he can forge on and chase down the tally of the stable's former great Yeats (Ire). Trueshan finally got the chance to show how he could operate on a surface that wasn't slow and let nobody down, while even **Coltrane (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) threatened briefly to gatecrash the private function before accepting a minor humbling in fourth.

Kyprios, whose formative months were a muddle of definite promise shown in Ireland and complete anti-climax in his forays to Britain, had faced a potential full-stop as early as last year's G2 Queen's Vase when he went under the stalls and injured his back. More or less unknown outside of Rosegreen at that time, his rise to these heights has been dizzying since entering the fray when taking Navan's Listed Vintage Crop S. Apr. 23. Backing that up with his 14-length win in an uncompetitive G3 Saval Beg Levmoor S. at Leopardstown May 13, he had to battle in the Gold Cup at the Royal meeting but with Stradivarius suffering ill fortune there he had to do it again to confirm his newfound status.

Moore was keen to get him ahead early and with **Thunderous (Ire)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) and **Nate The Great (GB)** (Nathaniel {Ire}) providing him with a lead, things were set up perfectly for the Moyglare colour-bearer who had Stradivarius, Trueshan and Coltrane in a line directly behind. Andrea Atzeni

was still following when Hollie Doyle allowed Trueshan to surge forward on the descent to the home straight, which prompted Moore to begin the winding-up process on Kyprios and for a brief period Stradivarius was stuck in a pocket before receiving a bump from the wandering Thunderous. Undeterred, the Gosdens' legend's blood was up as he produced his familiar powerful effort to usurp Trueshan as the favourite's main challenger inside the final furlong and for a few strides it looked as if it would be enough for the fairytale. It was only in the dying

yards that it was clear that Kyprios had turned it on again with the race almost slipped from his grasp in one of the great finishes at this revered meeting.

"It panned out how we thought it would, but even here they were going a little bit steadier than I'd have liked," Moore added. "They didn't go as slow as they had at Ascot, where he'd started slow and I'd ended up a bit further back than I'd wanted, but he's got a great attitude.

He's beaten two very good stayers today and the fourth is a horse going somewhere, so that was probably as good a Goodwood Cup as you'd see. Aidan was always complimentary about him in the spring and at the moment he's doing everything right--I'd like to think there are more good days ahead."

Aidan O'Brien gave his own lowdown on the dramatic events. "He's a lazy horse, so our only worry was that Stradivarius was a little bit away from him--he likes a fight," he said. "He was always very professional and wastes no fuel at any stage--he only uses what you want him to and he's won on all types of ground, so he's a horse to enjoy. He'd probably have no problem coming back to a mile and a half--his work earlier this year meant that we nearly started him at a mile and a quarter, that's the kind of quality he has."

The trainer continued, "We thought he was our Leger horse last year and what happened at Ascot was one of those things. He'd never done it before and he had a badly bruised back and was very sore. I think he's very good--he's won a Gold Cup and Goodwood Cup at four and that's a big call. He's a lightly-raced, fresh horse who hasn't a lot of miles on the clock and he has the most beautiful mind you've ever had anything to do with. He has a lot of class and he's right at the beginning. Stradivarius is a great horse--John has done a brilliant job with him and it's great when they compete in these races. The plan from here is to go to the Irish St Leger."

John Gosden believed that the runner-up was at least in part compromised by being away from the winner. "He was a bit stranded and hit the front slightly sooner than ideal and was idling in front, but it was a superb run," he said. "He travelled round beautifully, but I'd have preferred it if he had something to race with. That's the way it turned out and he came into the winner's enclosure and started shouting, so he's not stressed. As long as he's enjoying racing and training, and I'm the one who will let Mr. Nielsen know when that is not the case, there is no reason to stop--it's all about the horse telling us. He's been around so long and always run valiant races. He reminds me of

the great jumps horses like Desert Orchid--here he is, still battling the youth brigade now."

Hollie Doyle said of Trueshan, "He ran a solid race and he is a better horse on heavy ground, but I can't blame the ground today."

## Pedigree Notes

Kyprios is the final success story for Moyglare's remarkable Polished Gem (Ire) (Danehill), who had already produced his dual Irish St Leger-winning full-sister Search For a Song (Ire) and the G1 Prince of Wales's S.-winning sire Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}). Her total of eight black-type winners include the seven-times group scorer Custom Cut (Ire) (Nonowcato {GB}) and the G2 QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares S. winner Sapphire (Ire) (Medicean {GB}), while Kyprios's other two full-siblings are the listed scorer and G2 Blandford S. runner-up Amma Grace (Ire) and last year's Chester Cup winner Falcon Eight (Ire).

Polished Gem is a full-sister to the GI Matriarch S. heroine Dress To Thrill (Ire), with both being out of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Trusted Partner (Affirmed) who is also the third dam of the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. hero Thunder Moon (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}).

It is almost poetic, in a bloodstock kinda way, that two of the best horses of the modern era, Derby-winning half-brothers no less, should feature in an epic battle between their two sons for a race that was so much more than just the Goodwood Cup.

## Stradivarius Cont.

For **Stradivarius (Ire)**, a son of **Sea The Stars (Ire)**, Goodwood was in a sense where it all began. Sure, he'd won races on the way to his first Goodwood Cup victory five years ago, three in fact, but in his first foray into Group 1 company he sprang to wider attention when quashing the chances of fan favourite Big Orange (GB). Stradivarius returned, year after year, and as popular as Persian Punch (Ire), to win four Goodwood Cups, until the weather gods put a halt to all that last July with a deluge of such force that he remained in his stable.

Now there's a new kid on the block, one half his age, and doing an excellent job this season to keep the name of his late sire Galileo (Ire) in lights. **Kyprios (Ire)**, who is equally an important totem for his breeder Moyglare Stud as they celebrate their 60th anniversary, is now unbeaten in his four starts this year. He is indubitably the rising star in the galaxy of stayers, now with a Goodwood Cup to add to his Gold Cup. But at Goodwood, he was also to a degree the pantomime villain.

It started with a ripple of applause that followed Stradivarius along the grandstand as he strode out on the track to go to post. Then, turning for home, as he ducked and weaved in a desperate search for daylight through the pack the roar started, with only one horse's name on the lips of the crowd: "Go on, Strad."

Go on he did, his lionheart and the rousing cheers of thousands driving him briefly, narrowly, to the head of the

challenge. But Kyprios, who had led the charge into the straight, dug deep for a turbo-charged final effort in the manner of the champion stayer he will now surely be.

Stradivarius has been there, done that, but he is certainly no has-been. As he returned to the winner's enclosure, he clearly considered it somewhat infra dig to be led towards the unfamiliar spot for the runner-up. The sudden squeal and buck he let out as he was clapped back in seemed to say, "Didn't you see me out there, how hard I tried?"

Certainly his owner-breeder Bjorn Nielsen did. Inevitably, as much of the post-race fanfare centred on Stradivarius as it did on Kyprios, and Nielsen, clearly dismayed by the flags handed out around the racecourse foreshadowing his hero's retirement, was adamant in his appraisal.

"He's run a great race. He could have won, he got beaten a neck, but he won't stop on that, I'll just say that. This is not his last race, as long as he comes out of it well."

As to future plans, Nielsen took a swipe at the Doncaster

Cup, staged on an Arena Racing Company track, and suggested York as the most likely next stop.

"There's no prize-money at Doncaster, so you can tell ARC that unless they double their prize-money he'll never go back to Doncaster," he said. "But there's the Lonsdale, potentially. Then soft ground starts in October so it gets a bit more difficult, but let's see how he comes back. But I'd say he'll run again, in spite of all this 'Thank you Stradivarius'. We're not going to say goodbye, not when he is at the top of his game and ran like that today." [Cont. p7](#)

The winner, given a trouble-free passage through the next 12 months, should certainly be back next year. Just four, and the 10th foal of the remarkable Moyglare matriarch Polished Gem (Ire) (Danehill), Kyprios now has six wins to show for his light racing campaign to date and is a progressive force for Moyglare and the Coolmore partners.

Reflecting on Polished Gem, the dam of eight black-type winners, including Kyprios's fellow Group 1 winners Search For A Song (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), Moyglare Stud's breeding advisor Fiona Craig said, "She's amazing. I said to someone just now there was never any skill breeding Polished Gem. Look at what she went to, and look at what she produced. She was just one of those mares that I think we could have bred to anything. We built up to Galileo but obviously that made perfect sense when he became available and with her being by Danehill. We've had four by Galileo—Amma Grace, Falcon Eight, Search For A Song and now this horse."

She added, "That was a great race. I think next year we'll have to make our own flags saying 'Come on, Kyprios'. But Stradivarius is a fine horse and he lost nothing in that. For a moment you thought he was going to be swallowed up but then he was right there, and Trueshan as well. There's a great bunch of stayers in training and I think Kyprios will go on."

Indeed he will, and Stradivarius will go on with him, for the time being at least.

The March-foaled bay opened up with a May 22 third to the reopposing **Dark Thirty (Ire)** (Straspangledbanner {Aus}) going six furlongs at Newbury before streaking to a five-length tally over the same trip at Nottingham in June and embellished his win column with a half-length score when upped to seven furlongs at Salisbury earlier this month. The eventual winner was steadied in rear after an alert getaway from the outside stall. Easing closer in the straight, he was shaken up approaching the final furlong and quickened smartly in the latter stages to deny Royal Ascot's Listed Chesham S. hero **Holloway Boy (GB)** (*Ulysses {Ire}*) by a half-length nearing the line.

"We have always thought a lot of Marbaan and it was a real boost over the winter to be sent horses by Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum," revealed Charlie Fellowes. "He was a really good-looking yearling who has just progressed and progressed and we put him in at the deep end today. We've had a rough season, but to have a winner at Goodwood for such an important owner on a wonderful day of racing is phenomenal. It means a huge amount to me and the team who have worked unbelievably hard, and it was a wonderful ride from Jamie [Spencer]. Training at the moment is as difficult as it ever has been, there is a lot of competition and a lot of talented young trainers coming through as well. This for some reason has been a hard year for us, but all credit to the team who have kept on delivering and hopefully we can have a big second half of the year. I genuinely have no idea where we will go and I will sit down and take a breath." Looking ahead, the trainer added, "I put him in the [G2] Champagne S. this morning and he is in the [G1 Vincent O'Brien] National S. in Ireland. There are lots of lovely options for him and he now warrants a trip anywhere. I will speak to Sheikh Ahmed and his team and see where they want to go."

"Marbaan has always been a smart horse and I liked him from the first time I sat on him," said Jamie Spencer. "My only fear today was the [outside] draw and, to be fair to Charlie, he said to take our medicine rather than trying to go forward and get in. We would rather him coming home, instead of being stuck on the outside and learning nothing." **Cont. p8**

He added, "I knew down by the three-furlong pole that I was running away and Danny [Tudhope] on Holloway Boy was starting to squeeze, so I just timed my run. Marbaan is a gorgeous looking horse and I'm sure he'll stay a mile. He has progressed with each run and needs to progress again. You would think physically he should do so and it's down to Charlie and his team. I'm sure the autumn races will be there for him."

Reflecting on the performance of Holloway Boy, Karl Burke commented, "Holloway Boy ran really well. He got messed around a little bit in the run early doors, which didn't help, and he has pulled a front right shoe off as well, which again wouldn't have helped him. But from three out, no excuses, the winner just had a little bit more turn of foot. Danny [Tudhope] says he feels like a top-class horse. He has a great cruising speed, although he just lacks that little bit of speed at the important end of the race. He's run a great race and all credit to the winner for cutting us down."

## SANDRINE BACK TO WINNING WAYS IN THE LENNOX by Tom Frary

Jockey David Probert described Kirsten Rausing's **Sandrine (GB)** (Bobby's Kitten) as a having been a "forgotten horse" following her success in Tuesday's G2 World Pool Lennox S. at the Qatar Goodwood Festival, but last year's G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. and G3 Albany S. winner made sure she was back in the headlines at a seven-furlong trip that may prove her niche. Already signalling a return to her best when fighting out the finish of the G1 Falmouth S. with Prosperous Voyage (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) and Inspiral (GB) ([Frankel {GB}](#)) at Newmarket July 8, the Andrew Balding-trained homebred was always happy tracking the leading quartet throughout the early stages.

Delivered wide in the closing stages as last year's winner **Kinross (GB)** ([Kingman {GB}](#)) went for the rail, the generously-priced 12-1 shot got to the front ahead of him yards from the line and had a neck to spare there, with **Pogo (Ire)** (Zebedee {GB}) a short head back in third.

"She deserved that, as she's become a bit of a forgotten horse but she took a while to really blossom this season," Probert said. "The plan to try seven furlongs today worked out great for her, as she is able to travel at a very strong gallop." **Cont. p9**

## G2 World Pool Lennox S. Cont.

Sandrine was the first winner on the storm-struck Friday card at last year's Royal Ascot meeting, overcoming the deep conditions to prevail in the Albany before demonstrating her versatility when adding Newmarket's Duchess of Cambridge to her tally on good-to-firm. Second in the G2 Lowther S. at York in August and third in the G1 Cheveley Park S. on the Rowley Mile the following month, it was a surprise that she was overlooked at 25-1 for the 1000 Guineas back there at the start of May and while she was unable to land a serious blow was coming home notably strongly to be fifth. Only seventh in the G1 Coronation S. back at the Royal meeting June 17, she

had another go at Inspiral in the Falmouth and at one point in the closing stages looked as if she might take her before fading late.

"We've tried her at a mile this year and she has run very consistently, but she had shown a lot of speed as a 2-year-old and so I'd imagine seven furlongs suits her down to the ground. I've always thought she was a Group 1 filly and if she could get that it would be an amazing feeling for me and her. I think she does see the mile out well, but she would probably be a little bit more able to bag that group one over seven."

Andrew Balding has the same feeling. "The [G1 Prix de la] Foret is the golden target, with maybe the [G2] City of York beforehand," he said. "I am delighted and thrilled for Kirsten Rausing. She is such a great owner and so supportive. We had a few options on the table, but she was happy to go with what we felt was best and we just wanted to try Sandrine round a bend. She slightly blew the bend in the Coronation S., but I thought she handled it really well today."

"She looked like she would win the Falmouth at one stage and probably just didn't quite get home. We just felt that if she was effective at seven furlongs, she could be a filly for the Prix de la Foret as she goes on any ground. We just wanted to try her round a right-handed bend before that and it's worked out well. She doesn't have a penalty in the City Of York S., so that could be a stepping-stone."

"Like Alcohol Free in the spring, for whatever reason the

horses were slower to come to hand than usual but it's nice to have understanding and patient owners who know the game. You're not under the same pressure you could be. We just found our way to here with Sandrine and now she has the rest of the season to kick on."

Ralph Beckett said of Kinross, "He is brave and has run another proper race. Frankie felt that he was a couple of lengths further back than he would have liked and that has cost him, but he has run his race. That is all you can ask for."

Pogo's trainer Charlie Hills commented, "Unfortunately, they have put too much water on for him today. He just could not get his feet out. He has run a great race again. He was just starting to come

again, but on that bend it is too loose and does not suit him."

Aga Khan's **Tahiyyra (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr})** surged to **TDN Rising Star** status on Tuesday evening with a performance full of Classic promise. Sent off the 7-2 second favourite for the Colm Quinn BMW Irish EBF Fillies Maiden, the February-foaled half-sister to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine Tarnawa (Ire) (Shamardal) who was third in this four years ago was always travelling comfortably tracking the leader **Remind (Ire) (U S Navy Flag)** under Chris Hayes. Sent on at the top of the straight, the fifth '**TDN Rising Star**' for her sire opened up to put 5 1/2 lengths between her and Ballydoyle's 5-6 market-leader **Dower House (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})**, the full-sister to **Churchill (Ire)** and Clemmie (Ire) who had experience under her belt. Remind faded to be beaten a further 2 3/4 lengths in third in a race sure to be chewed over during the next few months, by which time the winner could already be at the top.

In the centenary of The Aga Khan's Studs, this was the latest exciting moment for the operation and Weld was unable to put water on the flames afterwards. "She is a very good filly--I thought we'd win to be quite honest," he said. "My concern was that our horses have been running a bit disappointingly, but we had a virus in the late spring and early summer which I've identified now." **Cont. p11**

Weld added, We'll discuss what to do with her with Pat Downes and see how she comes out of this, but she's going to stakes level next. She's very professional and knew her job, so there should be lots to come."

Hayes was also understandably full of praise. "I've loved her from day one and she's bred to be nice," he said. "It's just fallen into place for her to be ready for this week, but it's hard here first time out. Pedigree can overcome. She wasn't exactly electric from the gates when we tried her last week, but she was today and was able to turn it on and run through the line. She's done something her half-sister wasn't able to do at two and rides like a stakes filly--to what level I don't know."

Weld's former winners of this include the G1 Bayerisches Zuchtrennen winner Market Booster (Green Dancer), the Irish Oaks heroine Dance Design (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), the G3 Debutante S. winner Saranac Lake (Smart Strike), the G2 Blandford S. scorers Tarfasha (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Eziyra (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}). Ironically, probably the best filly he has saddled in it was Tarnawa herself, who was third behind the top-class Hermosa (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in 2018 before going on to scale the heights.

Tarnawa, who missed out so narrowly in the Arc in October, proved a phenomenon for the dam Tarana (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) who didn't make it to this Ballybrit circuit but who went on to capture the Listed Oyster S. and Listed Martin Molony S. as well as finishing third in the G3 Curragh Cup. The second dam Tarakala (Ire) (Dr Fong) took the Listed Galtres S. and was third in the G3 Noblesse S. Tarana, who has had only three runners including this filly, has a yearling colt by **Frankel (GB)** and a filly foal by Lope De Vega (Ire).

## Wednesday's Goodwood Previews Cont. from p1

Time-wise, it was the meeting's key moment, however, with startling final sectionals placing him in a league of his own. Running the final two furlongs faster than the King's Stand winner Nature Strip (Aus) (Nicconi {Aus}), he was quicker even than Battaash (Ire) had been over the same last quarter mile in the King's Stand in 2020. This is a fast animal and William Haggas's quip that he could win a July Cup was actually close to the mark.

Angus Gold is not being complacent, however. "As far as I know everything is good, he worked very nicely last week and I think they've been happy since, so you can but hope. There's some very good horses in the race and as we saw in the King George on Saturday, you can never take anything for granted," he said. "It's possibly not his ideal track, but you could say that about a lot of them so I don't see that as a reason for him not to win if he's in good form and gets a good run through the race."

Connections already have their sights trained on the G1 Juddmonte International at York Aug. 17. "He's done all his winning at a mile and he's shown he's got the speed and the class to win Group 1s at a mile," Gold added. "For me, it's going to be more interesting to see whether he can be versatile and carry that speed over a mile and a quarter. I know William felt it was too big a gap between Ascot and York and as he rightly said, they're here to race these horses so that's why he's going to Goodwood."

## A Free Hit

Tuesday's G2 Lennox S. win of Sandrine (GB) (Bobby's Kitten) proved that the Andrew Balding stable is in hot form and Baaeed's biggest concern could come from **Alcohol Free (Ire) (No Nay Never)**, who has nothing to lose tackling the favourite bidding for back-to-back renewals at a track that plays to her strengths. Very few horses can win this and a July Cup, but that is what she did at Newmarket July 9 where she put upwards of 1 1/2 lengths between her and the Platinum Jubilee crew led by Naval Crown (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). "It took her a couple of runs to find her feet this year, but she's in great form and she looks very well," Balding said. "She won the race last year and while this looks a very strong renewal, it wasn't a bad one when she beat Poetic Flare. At Goodwood it's not always enough to be the best horse, as you need luck too. We wouldn't want to win that way, but it's a horse race at the end of the day." **Cont. p12**

## Game Changer

While the loss of Coroebus (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) from this picture is a blow to Godolphin, it is worth remembering that Charlie Appleby houses the three winners of the English, Irish and French 2000 Guineas and he still has one of them engaged in **Modern Games (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). While the form of his success in the May 15 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at ParisLongchamp has yet to be seriously boosted, it is early days and this return to a mile on a fast course should see him in a positive light. "He can do it every which way and can adapt, plus the draw in one is a positive," jockey William Buick said on Tuesday. "Everyone has to respect Baaeed and rightly so, as he's a fantastic horse and is obviously going to be very hard to beat."

Appleby added, "The step back up in trip is going to suit him and the quick ground will also be in his favour. He loves it rattling fast. He's a very classy colt, he's a multiple Group 1 winner and a sharp track such as Goodwood will pose no problem when you recall how he handled Del Mar. He will give a good account of himself."

## Rocket Powered?

Goodwood's action on Wednesday also includes a pair of Group 3 contests, with the 2-year-olds lining up for the five-furlong Markel Molecomb S. and the fillies and mares set for the seven-furlong Whispering Angel Oak Tree S. Victorious Racing's June 15 Listed Windsor Castle S. runner-up and July 1 Listed Dragon S. winner **Rocket Rodney (GB)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) is back over the course and distance over which he opened his account in style Apr. 29 and ticks all the boxes, but the lurker could be Rockcliffe Stud's impressive July 15 Newbury maiden scorer **Trillium (GB) (No Nay Never)**. "She's a very good filly who stepped up from her first run to her second when bolting up at Newbury in fine style," Trillium's trainer Richard Hannon said on

his *Unibet* blog. "That was over six furlongs, but she's got a fantastic turn of foot so I'm not worried about going down to five furlongs and she receives a bit of weight as well for being a filly." Al Shaqab Racing have a habit of plundering the Oak Tree, with three wins between 2015 and 2017 with French raiders and are here again with the Francis-Henri Graffard-trained June 12 Listed Prix Volterra winner **Samahram (Fr)** (Sea The Moon {Ger}).

## Nashwa Faces Eight In Nassau

Thursday's G1 Qatar Nassau S. has attracted nine, with Hollie Doyle keen to renew her partnership with Imad Al Sagar's G1 Prix de Diane heroine **Nashwa (GB)** (**Frankel {GB}**). This is one of the weaker renewals on paper in recent times, with the May 29 G1 Prix d'Ispahan winner **Dreamloper (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and the May 12 G2 Middleton Fillies' S. scorer **Lilac Road (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) key among the older brigade. "Nashwa is just unreal and she's getting better and better," her rider told *QIPCO British Champions Series*. "Every time I sit on her between races she's improved again. I rode a piece of work on her last week which was very similar to the work we did before France and she's bigger and stronger once again, and better than ever."

## GOLDEN HORN SOLD TO STAND AT OVERBURY STUD

**Golden Horn (GB)**, the brilliant G1 Derby winner and European Horse of the Year in 2015, will take up stallion duties at Overbury Stud after being sold to new investors Dash Grange Stud from Darley and Anthony Oppenheimer.

The move will see Golden Horn, who has already sired 13 individual winners over jumps in Britain and Ireland, marketed as a dual-purpose stallion.

Golden Horn is best remembered for storming to Derby glory under Frankie Dettori in 2015. He won handsomely from subsequent Irish Derby hero Jack Hobbs (GB), who he will now stand beside at Overbury Stud.

Trained by John Gosden right throughout his glittering career, Golden Horn retired to Dalham Hall Stud with an impressive Group 1 haul under his belt.

As well as winning the Derby in 2015, Golden Horn landed the Coral-Eclipse at Sandown, the Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown and recorded a memorable triumph in the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp on his penultimate start.

His last dance on a racecourse came when he went down fighting behind Found (Ire) in the Breeders' Cup Turf that same season.

While Golden Horn has sired a good level of smart horses on the Flat, he has made quite an impressive impact from limited numbers over jumps, exemplified by the fact that 13 of his 22 offspring to run in that sphere have won at least once. [Cont. p14](#)

In fact, seven of those 13 individual winners recorded official ratings of 120 or more, with three-time scorer First Street (GB) rating a nice prospect after finishing second in the County Hurdle for Nicky Henderson last season.

The Fergal O'Brien-trained Byzantine Empire (GB) is two from two over fences, with his latest win coming at Perth on Tuesday, while Stag Horn (GB) and Trapista (Fr) are also multiple winners over jumps for the sire.

A son of Cape Cross (Ire) out of the Dubai Destination mare Fleche D'Or (GB), Golden Horn covered a three-figure book in his last season at Dalham Hall Stud, where his fee was £10,000.

Dash Grange Stud, owned by Jayne McGivern, purchased Golden Horn privately in a deal that was brokered by Blandford Bloodstock.

Blandford's Richard Brown commented, "I can't recall a more brilliant middle-distance performer in recent years than Golden Horn. He was an absolute star on the track for John Gosden and his team at Clarehaven. He is one of only three horses, alongside Mill Reef and **Sea The Stars (Ire)**, to have won the Derby, the Eclipse S. and the Arc."

"Overbury Stud has established a fantastic reputation in recent years for developing and making stallions under both codes. Golden Horn is a magnificent addition to their roster."

Golden Horn stood at Dalham Hall for seven seasons and Sam Bullard, director of stallions at Darley, wished his new connections luck with the stallion.

He said, "On behalf of Anthony Oppenheimer and the team at Darley, we want to wish Golden Horn and his new connections the very best of luck. At Overbury he will be given the very best chance to excel over the coming years."
