

## \$2.3-MILLION GUN RUNNER COLT TOPS RECORD-CRASHING SARATOGA SALE

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY - During an electrifying session of bidding Tuesday, the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearlings Sale produced 10 seven-figure yearlings--topped by a \$2.3-million son of **Gun Runner**--and crashed records for gross, average and median.

"Rarely do you find me speechless," Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning said Tuesday night. "We are blown away by the results. The energy, the excitement, it just feels so good from an industry perspective. The statistics are phenomenal. We averaged over \$500,000 tonight and had 10 horses over seven figures. We shattered every record known to mankind. It is a really good feeling. It's not just for us. It is a really good vibrancy for the industry. We basically had two yearling sales so far this year and both of them have been really good. It gives breeders hope and encouragement there."

When the dust had settled after a frenzied two sessions of bidding, 143 yearlings had sold for \$66,955,000, topping the auction's previous record gross of \$62,794,000 set in 2018. The sale average of \$468,212 broke the previous record of \$411,459 set in 2019, while the median of \$375,000 eclipsed the record of \$350,000 recorded in both 2019 and 2021. **Cont. p3**

During the 2021 auction, 135 yearlings grossed \$55,155,000 for an average of \$408,556 and a median of \$350,000.

With 36 yearlings reported not sold, the buy-back rate was 20.1%. It was 25% a year ago.

A colt by Three Chimneys' sire sensation **Gun Runner** brought the two-day auction's top price when selling for \$2.3 million to the partnership of Coolmore's M.V. Magnier and Peter Brant's

White Birch Farm. The yearling was consigned by Gainesway on behalf of breeder Debby Oxley. It was the second time during the night that a yearling hit the \$2-million mark, with the team of West Point Thoroughbreds, Woodford Racing and 3C Stable going to that figure to acquire a filly by **Curlin** from the Stone Farm consignment.

In all, 14 yearlings sold for seven figures at the boutique auction. Only four hit that level at the 2021 auction.

Tuesday's 10 seven-figure yearlings were purchased by nine different buyers, reflecting the deep buying bench that was active throughout the two-day sale.

"Tonight we sold 74 horses and 10 out of the 74 brought seven figures, which is, frankly, unheard of," Browning said. "Those 10 were sold to about eight or nine entities. The RNA rate is right about 20%--that doesn't reflect post-sales. It was just a robust market. If you are in the Thoroughbred industry anywhere in the United States, Saratoga is the epitome at the racetrack and I hope in the yearling sales arena. It is kind of the annual dose of hope and excitement. This is why we do it." **Cont. p4**

**Brant, Magnier Team Up for Sale-Topping *Gun Runner Colt***

As the electrifying second session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale began to wind down Tuesday night, the Coolmore team which had already purchased a seven-figure son of *Gun Runner* from its traditional bidding perch out back of the pavilion, was joined by Peter Brant and the partnership pulled out all the stops to secure another yearling by the Three Chimneys stallion (*hip 202*) for a sale-topping \$2.3 million. Bloodstock agent Marette Farrell, standing just a few feet away, was the underbidder on the colt who was consigned by Gainesway on behalf of his breeder, Debby Oxley.

"[Gainesway's] Brian Graves told us he was a really nice horse," Coolmore's M.V. Magnier said. "Mr. and Mrs. Oxley breed a very nice horse."

Of the partnership with Brant's White Birch Farm, Magnier said, "We've had horses with him in the past and hopefully we will have a lot more of them."

The Oxleys' relationship with the sale-topper's family goes back two generations, with John Oxley purchasing the yearling's second dam Darling My Darling (Deputy Minister) for \$300,000 at the 1998 Keeneland September sale. Darling My Darling, who is a daughter of 1994 GI Ballerina H. winner Roamin Rachel (Mining), was second in the 1999 GI Matron S. and GI Frizette S. for the Oxleys and the late trainer John Ward.

"My husband bought Darling My Darling for me because I loved Roamin Rachel," Debby Oxley said. "You guys are too young to know who Roamin Rachel was, but she was just this hard-knocking race mare that raced on the Kentucky circuit. Darling has brought a lot of joy to our lives. It's so amazing to think--you have to pinch yourself. John Ward is up in heaven doing a big dance tonight. To think we could be a sale topper out of the mare is just incredible." *Cont. p5*



**America Provides More Saratoga Fireworks**

Three years ago, a yearling by **Curlin** out of America (A.P. Indy) produced fireworks in the Saratoga sales ring when bringing a co-sale-topping final bid of \$1.5 million from a partnership group that included West Point Thoroughbreds and Woodford Racing. First Captain, already a graded stakes winner and expected to line up for next month's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, was eclipsed in the sales ring by his full-sister Tuesday in Saratoga when West Point and Woodford, joined this time by 3C Stable, was forced to \$2 million to acquire the filly from the Stone Farm consignment.

“The power of the partnership,” West Point's Terry Finley said after signing the ticket on the yearling. “We see it time and time

again. I think it's just going to get bigger and stronger. The key is that you have to have good partners and I think we do. I know we do.”

Of **hip 126's** appeal, Bill Farish of Woodford Racing explained, “She reminds us a little bit of First Captain. She is a very athletic, strong-made filly with a lot of **Curlin** in her for sure. We have had luck with him and we were hoping to have luck with her on the racetrack. She is the kind of filly who will be a great broodmare one day.” **Cont. p7**

The filly's broodmare potential should only increase if her full-brother is able to secure a Grade I victory, according to Finley.

"Everybody is excited for First Captain in the Jockey Club Gold Cup in September, so I think that will be, on top of the rooting interest, I think we all be excited just to add to this filly's pedigree," Finley said. "That will be really, really good if we can get a Grade I on the resume of First Captain."

West Point and Woodford also teamed up to purchase the \$1.5-million son of **Uncle Mo** during Monday's opening session of the boutique auction.

The \$2-million sale was another success for the ever-strengthening broodmare band of celebrity chef Bobby Flay.

"It's a strategy that has taken a long time to create the foundation of, but basically it's trying to buy some of the best families in the stud book, both in Europe and in the United States," Flay said of his broodmare band. "This is not an overnight project. This has taken over 10 years to build up and I've had really great advisors--Barry Weisbord is like the Warren Buffett of pedigrees and James Delahooke is a legendary horse picker. I rely on those two people to really help me out. I do all the matings myself, that's something that I really enjoy doing. I try to play at the highest level."

Flay, who stayed in for a piece of First Captain, agreed it was a tough decision to sell a filly out of his prized mare.

"It is very tough to let a filly like that go," he said. "But as everybody knows this is not an inexpensive business. You have to take some money off the table when you can sometimes. But that said, one of the great things about breeding a horse like this, you can sell them to a great buyer and hope they go to a great trainer--which I know they will--and you can root just as hard. I still have the mom and the siblings and that is the great thing about breeding. It takes a lot of patience, but once you get to a point where you have a lot of things going on, it's so,

much fun. And it's so great to root for them."

America, who herself was bred by Flay and RNA'd for \$3.1 million at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton November sale, has a 2-year-old colt by **Uncle Mo** who RNA'd for \$550,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September sale. She has a weanling colt by **Uncle Mo** and is currently back in foal to **Curlin**. @JessMartiniTDN

### **Baffert Secures Another Quality Filly**

Hall of Famer Bob Baffert ended the Saratoga Sale on a high note, securing a \$1.8 million **Quality Road** filly (**Hip 213**) just three hips before the end of the sale. He was acting on behalf of an undisclosed client and did his bidding from the second floor of the pavilion alongside bloodstock agent Donato Lanni and his wife Jill Baffert.

"She's a beautiful filly," said Baffert, who trained **Quality Road's** champion filly Abel Tasman. "I've done well buying fillies here. Mt. Brilliant raises a really good horse. I was fortunate I had somebody to buy her. She is the kind of filly that I like to buy. I've had a lot of success with those types of fillies. Those kind pan out and play at the top level."

As for the price, he said, "I thought she was going to be expensive, especially tonight, the way the prices are. It is my job to get that back and hopefully we will."

Consigned by Lane's End, Hip 213 was bred by Greg Goodman's Mt. Brilliant Farm & Ranch and Lane's End's W. S. Farish. Goodman purchased her SP dam Ithinkisawapudycat (Bluegrass Cat) for \$2.2 million in foal to **Constitution** at the 2016 KEENOV sale. Her first foal born in 2014 was GI Spinaway S. winner Sweet Loretta (**Tapit**). The half to Canadian champion Spring In The Air (Spring At Last) is also responsible for SP Bridlewood Cat (**Street Sense**), who was the mare's previous most expensive offspring as a \$750,000 KEESEP purchase.

"The filly has so much class," Goodman said. "We came thinking she might bring between \$700,000 and \$800,000. She was so great. She showed here like she is going to be a real racehorse. She was all business the whole time."

When asked how the filly developed on the farm, the breeder said, "She's always been smart. She's never taken a bad step. She does nothing wrong. She's been so nice. She's just been perfect. All of our employees did a great job. Lane's End did an awesome job selling her."

### Ryan Jumps in the Colt Partnership Game

Partnerships focused on buying colts with the potential to run two turns are the name of the game right now and bloodstock agent Mike Ryan is the latest to get in on the action. He went to \$1.75 million to acquire a son of **Curlin (Hip 127)** on behalf of his new group, headed by owner Jeff Drown, who was beside Ryan as he signed the ticket Tuesday.

“We put a group together with Jeff Drown and some other guys,” said Ryan, who indicated the colt would go to a top New York trainer. “We are looking at the First Saturday in May. He is the complete package. It is very hard to find a hole in him. I don’t like to use the phrase ticked all the boxes, but I couldn’t fault him. He is very smooth, beautiful pedigree and came off a good farm. If he is a Grade I winner, he is worth a lot of money down the road. He has a great stallion future.”

As for the price, Ryan said, “To be honest, we were thinking about \$1.5 million, but when you are looking at these types of horses, it is very hard to split them. If they are good, they’re good and they’ll reward you. We thought he was the best colt sale and now we will have to see if we were right or wrong”

Consigned by Taylor Made, Hip 127 is out of Grade I winner Angela Renee (Bernardini), who is also responsible for recent **Curlin** S. runner-up and GSP colt Gilded Age (Medaglia d’Oro), a \$600,000 KESEP purchase. The chestnut colt shares the same third dam as Monday’s \$1.5-million session-topping **Uncle Mo** colt (Hip 68) in SW & GSP Misty Hour (Miswaki), the matriarch of Jane Lyon’s Summer Wind Farm. His second dam is SW Pilfer (Deputy Minister), who also produced MGISW To Honor and Serve (Bernardini).

Hip 127 was bred by Don Alberto Corporation, which acquired Angela Renee for \$3 million at the 2015 FTKNOV sale. The colt topped an excellent Saratoga sale for the organization which also sold a \$675,000 **Curlin** filly (Hip 15), a \$700,000 **Constitution** colt (Hip 66), a \$525,000 Into Mischief colt (Hip 75) and a \$1.2 million Into Mischief filly (Hip 150), who is a full-sister to last year’s Saratoga sale topper.

“It’s been a fantastic sale for us,” said Don Alberto’s Fernando Diaz-Valdes. “Fasig is doing a great job for us, too. I think we are having some results and that is good. When you buy quality, they have to pay up. We have invested a lot of money. Sometimes it’s not always roses, but this time it’s been very good for us. I think we have to say thank you to the whole team at the farm, starting with Reed [Ringler] and the group down there. All those guys, they deserve thanks because they put in 20 hours a day at the farm. The family has invested so much money into the game coming from Chile and they deserve to be rewarded. That is most important. I wish the best to all the buyers.” --@CDeBernardisTDN

## The Coach Schools 'Em in Bidding War For Medaglia d'Oro Colt

A colt by Medaglia d'Oro (**Hip 114**) was the first to seven figures Tuesday when hammering for \$1.35 million after a furious round of bidding lit up the Humphrey S. Finney pavilion early in the session. However, the real excitement came when the crowd realized the buyer was none other than D. Wayne Lukas. A sense of deja vu and universal delight filled the surrounding crowd as the familiar figure in his signature aviators, cowboy hat and boots signed the ticket on the million-dollar colt, while seated in his typical spot on the right side of pavilion alongside his wife Laurie Lukas.

Lukas signed the ticket under the name of John Bellinger, one of the partners in BC Stables, which campaigns 'TDN Rising Star' and recent GIII Schuylerville S. runner-up Summer Promise (**Uncle Mo**) with the Hall of Fame conditioner.

"I think we will do something creative with him," said the charismatic Lukas. "We didn't have time to put anything together. We talked about it briefly. We will sleep on it. John [Bellinger] has a good friend named Brian Coelho [his partner in BC Stables]. A few of us might take a piece. We will just have to work through it."

Summer Promise is one of five 2-year-olds that make up BC Stables current roster. Bellinger and Coelho approached Lukas just before Keeneland September last year. The conditioner purchased a pair of \$425,000 yearlings during Monday's session on behalf of BC Stables in **Hip 65**, an Into Mischief colt, and **Hip 60**, a Munnings filly.

"I think they sat back for a few years and watched what I was doing and they finally came by and said we want to do what Bob Lewis and some of these others did. So, there you go," Lukas said with a broad grin. **Cont. p10**

The final price was more than double what Bellinger had spent on any of his previous horses and Lukas said the colt brought a little more than he expected.

“I was a little surprised at what we had to give for him,” the Coach said. “I estimated he would bring maybe \$1-million or a bit over. I didn’t think he would go quite that high, but when they are good, and you like them, it’s hard to evaluate. Nobody in the building knows whether he is a bargain or not. We will find out. We all think we are smart about it. People have opinions. Horses have the facts. That is how that works.”

Back in his heyday from the 1980’s through the early 2000s, it was par for the course to see Lukas sign a million-dollar ticket, but it has been quite some time since he has been the agent on a seven-figure horse. It has also been two years since the 86-year-old has been to Saratoga due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

“I wasn’t here for two years because all of our clients died and I got COVID,” said Lukas, who captured Sunday’s GI Adirondack with Naughty Gal (Into Mischief). “It is fun to be back here and be in this arena. We will try to keep things going in the fall at Keeneland. As long as we can keep buying yearlings like this, we will have a nice race stable. I don’t want a lot. I don’t want to train like I used to. I still get up early in the morning, but I want them all in front of me.”

Out of GSW Walk Close (*Tapit*), Hip 114 is a full-brother to GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile runner-up Aneau d’Or. His second dam is MSW and GISP Spring Awakening (In Excess {Ire}).

“He is a wonderful colt,” Lukas said. “He was a really good physical, obviously. We weren’t the only people who liked him. I

thought he had a tremendous walk and tremendous disposition. I watched him come out about two or three times.”

Anthony Melfi and retired trainer Gary Gullo’s GMP Stable began just short of two years ago and they hit a high note when their first homebred to sell at the Saratoga Sale, a **Curlin** filly (**Hip 151**), summoned \$1.05 million from Eclipse Thoroughbreds, Robert LaPenta’s Whitehorse and Sol Kumin’s Madaket Stable. “It’s unbelievable,” an emotional and ecstatic Melfi said. “We’ve worked so hard. Gary Gullo is the best partner I’ve ever had. The best. I am so excited. We were feeling very confident. “It’s amazing,” said Gullo, who spent 40 years training horses on the NYRA circuit. “Trying to get the right horse and right breeding is hard. You have to have the right team. I feel so comfortable being involved with the right people who can point us in the right direction. I’m very thankful. I can almost say it is better than winning any kind of race. To have a horse you bred come for over \$1 million is a great thing.”

The horseman added, “We were thinking maybe \$700,000-\$800,000. Everyone kept telling us at Taylor Made—and Elliott Walden was unbelievable—saying this is a real racehorse. We just listened to everybody who is on our team saying how good she is. I am happy and will be rooting for the people who bought her. I hope they do very well with her.”

Eclipse has a history of success with **Curlin** mares, such as MGSW Curalina and current top sophomore filly Nest, so it was no surprise to see Aron Wellman sign the ticket. He indicated the filly would go to Todd Pletcher, who trained both of the aforementioned fillies.

“She was a queen all week long,” Wellman said, while seated beside LaPenta. “She is the same cross as Nest (**Curlin**/A.P. Indy). We’ve had a lot of luck with **Curlin** fillies and she possessed all the traits we’ve seen in our good ones. Time will tell as it always does.”

As for the price, Wellman said, “When you try to get a barometer on the market here and you see what these fillies are bringing, it is pretty serious stuff. We thought she’d be in the \$1-million range. We took a swing and hopefully in a couple of years, she will be in the Lexington pavilion.” --

When this filly developed like she did, I approached Happy about Bridlewood being his 50% partner. **Curlin’s Approval** herself is a queen and her first foal by **Tapit** is a very nice filly. Then we bred her to Into Mischief and this filly obviously developed very nicely also.”

### ***Saratoga Perfection for Machmer Hall***

The Brogdens' Machmer Hall Sales had a perfect seven-for-seven strike rate at the two-day Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, highlighted by a \$720,000 daughter of Into Mischief (**hip 131**) purchased by Peter Brant's White Birch Farm and a \$625,000 son of **Medaglia d'Oro** (**hip 157**) purchased by CRK Stable.

“I knew there was the potential for it to happen because they had the right action,” Carrie Brogden said.

Machmer Hall purchased the dam of hip 131, Astray (Bernardini), for \$170,000 at the 2018 Keeneland January sale. And sold a **Curlin** colt out of the mare for \$470,000 to Mike Ryan at last year's Keeneland September sale. Claire's Song (Unbridled's Song), the dam of hip 157, was purchased in foal to **Gun Runner** for \$290,000 at the 2019 Keeneland January sale.

“Medaglia d'Oro was a no-brainer for Claire's Song because that family just works so well with him,” Brogden said. “I have to thank Jim Fitzgerald--the three stakes winners she has produced since we bought her were all under his care and raising. Her Mo Clare (**Uncle Mo**) just won a \$125,000 a couple of weeks ago. It was good timing.”

Machmer Hall had a pair of pinhooking scores during Monday's first session of the auction. The operation sold a colt by **Classic Empire** (**hip 45**), who was purchased last year for \$50,000 at Keeneland November, for \$240,000 to Hideyuki Mori. A filly by **Audible** (**hip 43**), purchased privately, was sold for \$320,000 to My Racehorse.

“We bought the **Audible** privately for \$65,000,” Brogden said. “I just thought she was a exquisite. We have a share in **Audible** and we have supported him every single year, breeding multiple mares to him. I just love what I am seeing. They all look fast and they have great minds.”

As for what type of yearlings Machmer Hall targets for Saratoga, Brogden said, “The walk. The most important thing is to have an athletic walk. The way the sale grounds are set up, everyone is watching these horses from all sides. When I am sitting at my consignment and I see another horse walk by me--I

saw the **Speightstown** colt that brought \$950,000 yesterday and when he walked back from the ring, I grabbed my catalogue asking, 'What the hell is that?' That is the kind of horse to bring here to Saratoga. The horses that, the more you look at them, the more you like them.” @JessMartiniTDN

- The number of \$500,000-plus horses at this year's sale compared to 12 months ago was comparable (39 vs. 37), but significantly more broke through the seven-figure ceiling this year, with 14 youngsters bringing at least \$1 million compared to four in 2021. Ten of the 14 sold on Tuesday.
- There were no major surprises among the sires who produced seven-figure sellers, but eight different stallions had at least one among the 14 (**Gun Runner**, **Curlin**, **Quality Road**, **Uncle Mo**, **Medaglia d'Oro**, **Constitution**, Into Mischief and **Justify**). Unsurprisingly, Into Mischief had the most with four.
- **Gun Runner** is responsible for several of this year's leading 3-year-old males, and he saw two colts eclipse the million-dollar mark Tuesday, including the \$2.3-million topper.
- **Not This Time** is another sire who has had an exceptional 2022 with his sophomore colts, and his sons averaged \$433,333 from six sold at the two-day auction.
- The large partnership fronted by SF Bloodstock, Starlight and Madaket nicknamed The Avengers was a bit quiet at this year's sale, purchasing just one colt Monday for \$950,000. At last year's auction, they bought five head for \$2,045,000.

However, Florida lays claim to its own slices of history, and most notably, perhaps, would be their impact not just on pedigrees but on track annuals as well.

Horses like 'The Good Doctor', Dr. Fager; the unfortunately infamous Foolish Pleasure; Triple Crown hero Affirmed; 14-length Belmont winner Conquistador Cielo; the feisty Gate Dancer; sire of sires Fappiano, and his son Unbridled, without whom we have no Empire Maker, no Unbridled's Song, no **Tapit**; fan-favorite, Derby hero Silver Charm; big, grey Skip Away; and Afleet Alex, brought to his knees in the Preakness only to regain his footing and win by daylight. These are but a select few examples, which serve as a reminder of the long-ranging impact on Kentucky breeding programs.

A modern version of events is playing out now in part through **Hot Peppers** (Khozan), who looks to add her name to that illustrious collection of 'influencers', if you will. She's a testament to the dedication of breeders like Brent and Crystal Fernung, who together own and operate Journeyman Stallions.

The former experienced great early success in the stallion management sphere; Congrats and Wildcat Heir both beginning their careers under his discerning eye. And that gaze shifted to Todd Pletcher's newest buzz horse Khozan (by Distorted Humor) in 2015, whose limitless potential was cut short by a training injury, but who showed enough promise early to warrant a shot as a sire.

"I like brilliance," Brent Fernung said. "I don't care how pretty a horse is, how much pedigree he has; if he doesn't prove that he has that extraordinary talent, you're at a big disadvantage. [Khozan] showed brilliance in his first start."

While there was the concession of there being a possibility of hidden abilities no one could quite bring out, Fernung admits it's usually an exception to the rule, and not *the* rule. In Khozan's case, he fell well into the model Journeyman Stallions looked for in a sire prospect. Running a monster 102 Beyer on debut, a seven furlong dash where he started from the 14 hole, and then demolishing an allowance field by almost 13 lengths at a mile, he'd set himself up as the early favorite for the Florida Derby off two career starts.

Brilliance check marked, the focus shifted to his pedigree, of which there was plenty. As a half-brother to the fabulous Royal Delta (Empire Maker), millionaire Delta Prince (Street Cry {Ire}), and GISW Crown Queen (Smart Strike), and with no less than six sires hailing from his female line, there was every reason to believe the potential was there. Complete with a \$1 million price tag as a 2-year-old in training purchase by Al Shaqab Racing, Khozan was hard *not* to like.

"If he went on, and stayed sound until after the Florida Derby, and he's a Grade I winner, with that pedigree and everything, it would have been hard to find him at Journeyman Stud," Fernung said. "It would've made him too expensive for us."

Since then, he's more than proven the early faith was well

placed. Khozan has been Florida's leading sire since 2020 and to date has 24 black-type horses from 170 starters. Better news are that his best, and largest crops, are set to arrive this coming spring, while many in his earlier seasons are still competing successfully as 5-year-olds.

When it came to Hot Peppers, the mating was done in the hopes that her dam might produce a foal with a bit more to her than the prior offspring.

"I was a little hesitant to breed A.P. Indy-line mares back to Khozan because it's a little close. He's out of an A.P. Indy mare," recounts Fernung. "I had [the dam] here, bred her to different stallions, and was unsatisfied with the first couple foals she gave me. Or I wouldn't say unsatisfied, but they just weren't Hot Peppers."

The mare, Friends Pro (Friend Lake), went to his rising star, and in turn produced a 'cookie cutter image of a female Khozan' with the most appealing qualities immediately visible. While not a large filly, Hot Peppers had a beautiful balance to her as a yearling, and a big, nice walk to match. Friends Pro was correct with a good size, but she lacked the aesthetic appeal her Khozan filly received from her sire, and it showed when the pair went through their respective rings. Friends Pro sold for \$1,000 to Rebecca Cawvey at OBSWIN in 2020, but Hot Peppers garnered a kinder reception. As Fernung put it: "Nick De Meric bought her off me, and he buys nice horses, there's no question."

That nice \$40,000 OBS October yearling in 2020 would drop the hammer eight months later at OBS June as a 2-year-old in training, and head the way of Ronald Spatz for \$16,000. While he's not entirely sure, the suspected reason for the low price is one which bestows many horses the title of 'the one that got away' and one every consigner knows: the veterinary findings. Despite the low interest at the training sale, it was hard not to be enthusiastic for a good friend. **Cont. p17**

"[Ronnie Spatz] called me after he got her because he was excited about her, and then called me after she broke her maiden by a pole. He did a good job of preparing the filly for the races."

The ability to resist the temptation to jump Hot Peppers immediately into stakes company is what Fernung believes helped develop her into the racehorse we see sauntering across our screens. Those same talents which ultimately attracted the attention of Michael Dubb, and resulted in her private purchase after the 14 1/4-length tour de force, are now paying fruitful dividends for her new owners.

After her troubled seventh in the Stonehedge Farm South Sophomore Fillies S., Hot Peppers moved to the barn of Rudy Rodriguez in New York and two months later looked like herself again, blitzing Belmont's Jersey Girl by almost seven lengths in a hand ride. She kicked on to a game score in the GIII Victory Ride in July and with that effort, stamped her ticket for the Spa, where the big girls came to strut their stuff.

And there she was, the Florida filly with a heart as big as her talent, at the head of the field in the GI Test S. at America's summer playground. She led until the final yards, where Chi Town Lady came from dead last to play spoiler, but the impression was made. The blue-collar filly from the Sunshine state had run an incredible race on track conditions she'd never experienced before, against a favorite on a four-race win streak, and muscling her way through contact in the stretch.

And perhaps, she even had to fight a bit of that Saratoga curse, by proximity.

Hot Peppers' efforts will likely have consequences beyond her own sphere of influence. The doors will also open wider for Khozan and Journeyman Stud, who now have concrete proof that their stallion can throw runners on par with the best. Brilliance begets brilliance, and developing sires with those qualities is as entrenched in Ocala as it is in Lexington. If you're

in need of a stallion, but don't have a bottomless budget, ask Florida for some pointers. They know a little something about breeding the giant, and the giant slayer.

## APPEALS COURT REVISITS SOME ELEMENTS OF HISA STAY ORDER

A panel of three judges from the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit issued a new, more fine-tuned order Monday in the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act Authority (HISA) lawsuit that narrows the scope of an "administrative stay" that same court had **issued five days earlier**.

The Aug. 8 order now means that instead of the entire slate of HISA rules being re-activated in Louisiana and West Virginia (as per the Aug. 3 Appeals Court order that trumped a preliminary injunction issued July 26 by a lower U.S. District Court in Western Louisiana), three contested HISA rules will once again be off-limits from being enforced in those two plaintiff states, at least until "expedited" oral arguments are scheduled in front of the Appeals Court next month.

"The district court in granting the injunction that is the subject of the motion to stay ruled only on the lawfulness of the rules and not on the constitutional issues raised which are pending before this court in another case," the Aug. 8 order stated.

"The district court held that Plaintiffs had a strong likelihood of success on the following two claims: '1) The 14-day period for notice and comment for each set of approved rules was insufficient under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) and 2) Several rules go beyond the statutory authority given to HISA and the Federal Trade Commission (FTC).'" The order stated. "We conclude that the stay elements are met with respect to the insufficiency of the 14-day period of notice.

"With respect to the second part of the ruling, the district court did not address the vast majority of the regulations at issue, instead concluding only that a few of the rules within the regulations exceeded the authority."

The order continued: "Having considered those matters, we rule as follows: The motion to stay the district court's July 26, 2022, preliminary injunction is GRANTED in part and DENIED in part. We grant the motion to stay the injunction as to all of the regulations except for the following: Rules 8400 and 8510 and two provisions of Rule 2010."

Rule 8400 establishes the Authority's power of access to records and places of business used in connection with Covered Horses and authorize the seizure of medications or other items that are in violation or suspected violation of Authority rules. The rules require Covered Persons to cooperate with the Authority in investigations, and they include the duty to respond truthfully to questions posed by investigators about a racing matter. Rule 8400 also authorizes the issuance of subpoenas and oaths to witnesses. **Cont. p19**

Rule 8510 is HISA's "Methodology for Determining Assessments" that fund the Authority.

The plaintiffs in the underlying [June 29 lawsuit](#) (the state of Louisiana, its racing commission, the Louisiana Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association, the Jockeys' Guild, the state of West Virginia, its racing commission, and five individuals regulated as "covered persons" under the HISA Act) have argued that using purses as part of that assessment calculation violates the enabling legislation.

The two provisions of Rule 2010 that now can't be enforced in the plaintiff states deal with the definitions section of the racetrack safety program, specifically "the date of the Horse's entry in a Covered Horserace" and "the date of the Horse's nomination for a Covered Horserace," according to the Aug. 8 order.

The defendants (the HISA Authority, the FTC, and board members and overseers of both entities) are alleged to have violated the Fourth, Seventh and Tenth Amendments to the [Constitution](#), plus the APA, which governs the process by which federal agencies develop and issue regulations.

But that underlying lawsuit can't move forward until the Appeals Court issues get legally resolved first.

## HISA: GUILD'S CLAIM OF CONTEMPT 'FAILS THE STRAIGHT-FACE TEST'

Defending itself against contempt-of-court allegations for purportedly violating an under-dispute preliminary injunction order by imposing riding infraction penalties upon Jockeys' Guild members nationwide, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act Authority (HISA) fired back in federal court Tuesday with a filing that stated the plaintiffs' argument "fails the straight-face test."

At issue is the still-disputed nature of the wording in a July 26 injunction order out of United States District Court (Western District of Louisiana), which stated that HISA rules would be enjoined in two plaintiff states until a [June 29 lawsuit](#) got decided in that court, while also noting that, "The geographic scope of the injunction shall be limited to the states of Louisiana and West Virginia, and as to all Plaintiffs in this proceeding."

The plaintiffs--most specifically, the Guild--believe that last line of the judge's words applies to "all of the members of the Jockeys' Guild, regardless of the U.S. jurisdiction in which the jockey is riding."

The HISA defendants have maintained that individual members of the Guild are clearly not plaintiffs in the lawsuit, and to consider them that way "would wreak havoc on the sport."

HISA had asked the court to provide a clarification of the wording, but had first appealed the preliminary injunction to the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, which resulted in a stay being issued.

Now it appears as if the lodging of that appeal means no clarification will be forthcoming until the Fifth Circuit Court decides the matter it has been asked to consider, as per a separate order handed down early Tuesday evening by the district court.

"Because the Defendants have filed a Notice of Appeal before filing the Motion for Clarification of Preliminary Injunction Order, this Court does not have jurisdiction to clarify the Preliminary Injunction," the Aug. 9 district court order stated. "The filing of a notice of appeal confers jurisdiction on the Court of Appeals and divests this Court over their aspects of the case as it rests before the Court of Appeals. Once jurisdiction has divested, this Court may not take any action that would alter the status of the case as it rests before the Court of Appeals."

On Aug. 2 the plaintiffs, led by the states of Louisiana, West Virginia, and the Guild, [had moved for a federal judge to issue an immediate order](#) to enforce its injunction to keep Guild-member jockeys from being subject to HISA rules nationwide.

The plaintiffs also wanted the judge to make the HISA defendants explain to the court why they should not be held in contempt for "flagrantly violating this Court's injunction within a mere four days after this Court entered it."

The Aug. 9 filing by HISA painted that dispute in a different light.

"Plaintiffs' contempt motion is beyond the pale," is how the HISA filing started off.

"For starters, the Fifth Circuit has now stayed the preliminary injunction (PI) Order in substantial part, including as it relates to the riding-crop rules and other safety regulations that form the basis of Plaintiffs' motion," the filing continued.

"In any event, until the Fifth Circuit's stay, the Authority complied fully with the PI Order as written. Indeed, the Authority's affirmative steps (out of an abundance of caution) to clarify the scope of the injunction contradict any suggestion that the Authority willfully flouted the Court's PI Order."

The HISA filing continued: "The Authority complied fully with the PI Order even before the Fifth Circuit's stay orders. Plaintiffs do not contend that the Authority continued to enforce the enjoined HISA rules in either Louisiana or West Virginia (against anyone), or that the Authority continued to enforce the enjoined HISA rules against any actual Plaintiff (anywhere). And as the Authority has explained, the individual members of Plaintiff Jockeys' Guild (and other 'association plaintiffs') are not themselves 'Plaintiffs' to which the PI Order is expressly limited.

"There is good reason that the Order does not extend to all of Plaintiffs' thousands of individual members nationwide: That would transform the Court's limited preliminary injunction into the sort of expansive nationwide injunction that the Supreme Court and Fifth Circuit have sharply criticized, and it would wreak havoc on horseracing in every racing state [because some] jockeys would be subject to less protective rules (or perhaps no rules at all), while others remain subject to HISA rules.

"That is untenable," the HISA filing summed up. "Yet Plaintiffs have offered no response to those critical legal and practical realities."

In the Aug. 2 filing by the plaintiffs, three Guild-member jockeys (the California-based Drayden Van Dyke, plus Florida-based Edwin Gonzalez and Miguel Vasquez) were alleged to be plaintiffs who purportedly suffered new harms resulting from HISA's whip-rule enforcement that the Guild believed to be in contempt of the injunction order.

But HISA's response on Tuesday pointed out that the first two of those jockeys have yet to avail themselves of HISA's process to request stays pending appeals, and the third was never even formally penalized for the whip infraction that the Guild had alluded to in the court filing last week.

"Those jockeys have not suffered concrete harm for other reasons, too," the HISA filing stated. "For example, the cited infractions for jockey Drayden Van Dyke (resulting in a 1-day suspension and \$250 fine) would have violated California's own (pre-HISA) crop rules, and resulted in an even greater penalty. And no adverse ruling was even issued against jockey Miguel Vasquez."

Performance or pedigree? In an ideal world a breeder would choose both when buying a mare but, depending on budget, almost inevitably there has to be a compromise. In recent weeks in *TDN* we have heard from Mark Johnston about his selection process when buying yearlings, in which he is particularly keen on a decent rating for the dam. On the opposite side of the equation this week as vendor, Andreas Putsch is in agreement.

"For us it is all about selection, of the matings, of culling, and trying to introduce new blood. When I read the interview with Mark Johnston that was music to my ears because that's very much our approach. The form of the dam is so important," says Putsch, who at Arqana will be selling seven of the eight yearlings born on his sumptuous Normandy-based Haras de Saint Pair last year.

Indeed, Putsch had outlined this strategy when interviewed in these pages five years ago.

At the time he said of his early days in the breeding business, "I was breeding to sell. I tried to buy mares with good pedigrees who didn't have such good racing records. Some of their offspring sold well, so commercially it was a success, but what bothered me was that there weren't enough good results on the racecourse with those horses." [Cont. p3](#)

He added, "Then I read Joe Estes's book which compared mares' performances and I studied all the dams of the good stallions. I decided that the way to go was to buy performance over pedigree—it's very difficult to afford both."

Certainly that shift in direction, which has been incorporated into the broader perspective at Haras de Saint Pair, has reaped dividends on the track, both with the graduates of the farm who race in Putsch's own colours, such as the multiple group winner Pearls Galore (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), and with those bought by other owners.

It is no surprise that Saint Pair, just outside Cambremer, is capable of producing top-class racehorses as the farm has a rich history rolling, like its paddocks, back to 1883. Four Arc winners have been born there, and in the 15 years in which it has been under the ownership of Putsch, the Group 1 winner Vadamos (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) has been born and raised there among some other notable group winners, including Glycon (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), Waldbiene (Fr) (Intello {Ger}), Lucky Lycra (Fr) (Olympic Glory {Ire}) and Guildsman (Fr) (**Wootton Bassett {GB}**).

Siblings to two of those mentioned can be found in the septet which forms the Haras de Saint Pair Arqana August draft. The **Kingman (GB)** colt out of Dardiza (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}), lot 249, is a half-brother to the American Grade III winner Guildsman, who was also third in the G2 Coventry S. when trained by Archie Watson. It is a family with roots in the Aga Khan Studs and also features the Classic winners Almanzor (Fr) and Darjina (Fr).

A colt and a filly by **Kingman's** studmate **Frankel (GB)** also feature, with the son of G2 Rockfel S. winner Spain Burg (Fr) (Sageburg {Fr}) being the third horse set to sell on Sunday evening (lot 148). **Cont. p4**

With the remainder of the draft being concentrated on Monday, the **Frankel** filly appears as **lot 284** and is one of three members of the same illustrious family to pass through the ring within four lots. Bred on a cross which has been successfully advertised by Group 1 winners Nashwa (GB), Cracksman (GB) and Hungry Heart (Aus), the filly is out of the Pivotal (GB) mare Girl Friday (Fr), who was a winner at two and is a half-sister to the aforementioned G2 Grand Prix de Deauville winner Glycon. Their dam Glorious Sight (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) was talented herself, as a listed winner who was placed in both the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix de Diane. Furthermore, she is a half-sister to another talented Pivotal mare, Beauty Is Truth (Ire), a Group 2 winner who has produced the Group 1 winners Hermosa (Ire), Hydrangea (Ire) and The United States (Ire) from her repeated matings with Galileo (Ire).

The **Frankel** filly will be followed through by a daughter of **Wootton Bassett (lot 285)**, whose young winning dam Glad Eye (Fr) is by Dansili out of Glorious Sight, while the third filly from the family (**lot 287**), and perhaps the draft's *piece de resistance* is the full-sister to Glycon, whose sire Le Havre died earlier this year. With Glorious Sight being a Kilfrush Stud-bred descendant of the great matriarch Mill Princess (Ire) (Mill Reef), the family has been given a further boost in recent seasons by the exploits of dual Group 1 winner Tenebrism (**Caravaggio**) and her sister Statuette (**Justify**). "The full-sister to Glycon, certainly, is a superstar," says her proud breeder. "She will be very popular. And if you look at the pedigree update, at the



He added, "There aren't many families that have that sort of support. As Coolmore aren't selling, it's really almost an exclusive entry into the family."

Putsch adds, "We have a very consistent draft, I would say. The horses are where they should be. The two colts are also very popular, they are very strong, very racy, very well developed. I'm very happy with them. They're all ready to go."

Only one of the crop of 2021 has been retained this year at Haras de Saint Pair, for practical reasons as well as perhaps a sentimental one, for the **Siyouni (Fr)** filly is the final foal of another successful Singspiel mare for the stud, **Via Milano (Fr)**, the dam of the black-type trio of **Via Ravenna (Ire)** (Raven's Pass), **Via Medici (Ire)** (Medicean {GB}) and **Via Manzoni (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}). The G3 Prix Lieurey winner **Via Medici** has subsequently been exported to Japan, where she produced the dual Group 1 winner and young Shadai stallion **Admire Mars (Jpn)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}).

"We have to keep the filly, because **Via Milano** is now retired in the paddocks. But we really bring our 'A game' to the August Sale," Putsch says. "Because we don't know, as the buyers don't know, which ones are going to be the ones who race successfully. If I'd have known that **Sicilian Defense** was as good as she is, I wouldn't have sold her for, what, €30,000."

"If you look back at the figures, **Saint Pair** does produce a high percentage of stakes winners year after year, but obviously we don't know which ones are going to be the 20/25% of the stakes winners--and over the last four years, with four or five crops, that's what we've been producing, from small crops of on average 11 foals."

He continues, "I think if you look at all these operations that are successful, they have a very good ratio of land to horses, and

that's the key on our land. We have a strict policy of a minimum of two hectares per horse, and that allows us to rest the paddocks. All our paddocks have a minimum of six months of rest every year, and we see very few horses. We see lots of cows during the season, and empty paddocks. And I think that, in terms of management and especially parasite management, is absolutely key. I couldn't do it any other way."

As already outlined in Saturday's *TDN* by Arqana's Freddy Powell, there will be no shortage of international buyers prowling the sales grounds in Deauville. Like many in the business, Putsch can see both sides of the coin when it comes to the increasing globalisation of the racing and breeding industry.

He says, "I welcome it and I am concerned. First of all, I'm not the emperor of racing and breeding so I cannot change the reality. And it's the reality of things right now that Europe has become huge. Look at it historically, I think right now in terms of quality of stock you have Europe and Japan that are leading the world. Japan has different reasons, but why Europe is so good is historically that amazing competition between Coolmore and Darley, and also Juddmonte playing this phenomenal role."

He continues, "This gives us the stallions, on which we feast. And only because we can feast on these amazing stallions, we have superior breeding. I think really the power, in history, has always been led by stallion power." **Cont. p6**

Putsch added, "Where the top stallions are, you have the best breeding. I strongly believe in that."

Of the sires responsible for the yearlings in the Saint Pair draft, the champion sires of France and Britain and Ireland, **Siyouni** and **Frankel**, are represented, along with the proven names of Le Havre, **Kingman**, and **Wootton Bassett**. Only one is yet to prove himself, and that is the Darley freshman Blue Point (Ire), whose filly within this consignment (**lot 311**) features late in the sale and is the second foal of the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches runner-up and listed winner Irish Rookie (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}).

Putsch explains, "I only use first-season sires when I really was impressed with them as a racehorse. Obviously Blue Point winning twice in the one week at Ascot, very few horses can do that. It takes a top horse to do it. And that convinced me to use Blue Point in his first season, but usually I prefer to go with proven sires."

Returning to the theme of Europe's current glut of classy sires, he adds, "We have this situation in Europe where we breed top stock because of top stallions. But that is not a given that it will last forever, and now we have these very important breeders disappearing for age, slowly, and it's a whole new game. We also have ridiculous prize-money, and I include France in that, all over Europe. If you compare it to America, Australia, Asia, the Middle East, our prize-money is a joke. And that is the big problem, because we're becoming right now a nursery for stock for international racing. I have to look at international markets to market my horses. I've got no choice. And long term that can hurt."

With a Group/Grade 1 winner in Japan and Hong Kong advertising the strength of the merits of the Saint Pair broodmare band in no less a stallion farm than the Yoshida family's Shadai operation, Putsch can also see the benefits of

this global mingling of bloodlines.

"It is positive as well," he says. "We really try to get our horses in as many jurisdictions as possible. As small as we are, I very much believe in this international market, and also international racing, and again prize-money. If you look at all our races, apart from the Classics that really are for breeding, but once the Classic season is over, the best horses automatically go to the races where the most money is. I think the Japanese showed us that, they're much more progressive than we are, but Europe is catching up, America is catching up. And the championship races today are the big races internationally that have the most prize-money."

He adds, "So it's important for me, as a breeder, to be represented at the big meetings. Everything that is outside these meetings is just lesser racing, in general, and that is an important development. If you want to be in the limelight as a breeder you have to make sure your horses compete in this kind of company."

Grimthorpe said, "The main thing is there is a bit of running to do this year and then take a look at the options, but she'd look a very interesting 4-year-old prospect."

He added, "I think the Prix de l'Opera has been in John's mind since the Diane, really, so that is on the cards. But we'll keep our eyes open."

"She's not dissimilar to **Frankel** when you look at her head, and she certainly has a good turn of foot—her sectionals were most impressive at Goodwood."

Meanwhile, Inspiral will face something of a retrieval mission at Deauville on Sunday as she bids to bounce back from a poor run in the Falmouth S. at Newmarket last month.

Chris Richardson of Cheveley Park Stud, who own Inspiral, said, "I think we're heading for Deauville, all being well. We were pleased this morning and Frankie [Dettori] was very happy with her."

"Obviously it's a tough race, as all those sort of races are. You've got Coroebus (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) and William's [Haggas] colt [Maljoom (Ire) (**Caravaggio**), who was obviously a bit unlucky in the St James's Palace, but she seems in good form and the plan is to roll the dice."

## MUIR CHARTING A STRAIGHT PATH TO PARIS FOR THE ARC WITH PYLEDRIVER

All roads lead to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October for **Pyledriver (GB)** (Harbour Watch {Ire}), with the 5-year-old's joint-trainer providing an upbeat bulletin on his stable star.

William Muir has described the King George hero to be "jumping out of his skin" as he prepares for a tilt at the Arc and revealed Pyledriver could head straight to Paris without the benefit of a prep race.

Despite being a previous winner of the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot, the G2 Great Voltigeur at York and the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom, the 5-year-old was a widely unconsidered 18-1 shot for last month's midsummer showpiece, but he could hardly have been more impressive in victory.

Muir, who trains Pyledriver in partnership with Chris Grassick, said in the immediate aftermath that his stable star would not run again before contesting Europe's premier middle-distance contest.

And while he is not completely ruling out a possible prep run in Kempton's G3 September S., a direct route to Paris remains his intention.

"Pyledriver is in super shape--he's jumping out of his skin," he said. "I said to the lad who rides him I wanted to give him a break, but he said 'God, I had a job to stay with him this morning'. He's jumping and kicking and squealing and is in really good order."

Muir added, "The plan is straight to the Arc. If there was any reason to give him a run, and this is so far at the back of my mind, there is the September S. at Kempton if we wanted to do that.

"I don't want to do that. I want to go straight to the Arc, then after that it will be one or the other of the Breeders' Cup or

Japan and then on to Hong Kong."

## EVANS HAS HAYDOCK IN MIND FOR STAR SPRINTER ROHAAN

David Evans has nominated the G1 Betfair Sprint Cup at Haydock as the likely next outing for his star sprinter **Rohaan (Ire)** (Mayson {GB}) after his excellent fourth in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville on Sunday.

The 4-year-old bounced back from a spell in the wilderness when successfully defending his crown in the Wokingham S. at Royal Ascot in June.

After finishing a creditable fourth in a Group 3 at Newbury, Rohaan proved he still has what it takes to be a force to be reckoned with at the highest level at Deauville, with Evans of the opinion that he could have even finished closer to the winner Highfield Princess (Fr) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}).

"I think he probably had the worst draw and there wasn't enough pace for him. Other than that he ran exceptionally well," said Evans.

"It was difficult for Adam [Kirby, jockey]. He was waiting to go through them and the gap closed, so he had to pull out. He gave him a good ride and he ran a good race.

"He was probably a little bit unlucky, but I always thought he was good enough and he is good enough. He's got a brilliant turn of foot when he switches on and it's just about using it at the right time."

Rohaan holds an entry in the G2 Sky Bet City Of York S. over seven furlongs on Aug. 20, but is more likely to wait for Haydock, where he won the Sandy Lane S. last season.

Evans added, "I think we'll probably go to Haydock. He's in at York, but it's a bit close and Haydock is a bit close to that and he likes Haydock." [Cont. p7](#)

"There's a mile-and-a quarter Group 3 at Windsor [Winter Hill S. on Aug. 27] and there is the [G3] Prix du Prince d'Orange [ParisLongchamp on Sept. 4], a 3-year-old-only 12-furlong Group 3."

## TORONADO TO REMAIN IN OZ AT SWETTENHAM



Toronado | Haras de Bouquetot

European-bred stallion **Toronado (Ire)** will reside permanently at Swettenham Stud for the remainder of his career in the breeding shed, with the Victorian-based stud confirming on Tuesday that the son of High Chaparral (Ire) will not return to Haras de Bouquetot in France for the next European covering season.

The permanent change of address will come as no surprise to Australian breeders given the impact Toronado has had in Australia in the last few seasons.

Swettenham Stud's General Manager Sam Matthews told *TDN AusNZ* everyone was delighted the stallion will be at the stud forever.

"Shuttling horses these days is very safe, but it is now nice that he gets that downtime between the seasons and unwind a little bit and enjoy being a horse," he said. "You just never know what is going to happen in the world, so it is great to have him here forever and it is great for the breeders as well."

### *Huge Impact*

With 11 of his 26 global stakes winners coming in Australia, headed by Group 1-winning pair Masked Crusader and the ever-popular Shelby Sixtysix and having begun his career Down Under at a fee of \$22,000 (inc GST) the stallion has steadily been

justifying fee increases since 2019.

This spring he will cover mares at a career-high fee of \$88,000 (inc GST), having stood the 2021 season for a fee of \$49,500 (inc GST) and Matthews said that while the stallion was still popular at his now former European home of Haras de Bouquetot, from a risk and commercial perspective it made sense to stand him exclusively in Australia.

"He was really popular in the Northern Hemisphere and covered a lot of mares this year, but when he is standing for \$8,000 in one Hemisphere and \$88,000 in the other, it doesn't take a lot of calculations to work out what it takes to make it worthwhile and you also have to take into consideration insurance, travel costs," explained Matthews.

"Al Shaqab has always been so easy to deal with and it was a very easy conversation to have and they make it very easy for us."

Since arriving on these shores in 2015, Toronado has covered 1160 mares, producing 714 foals and in every year he has stood in the country his fertility has never dipped below 80%, which Matthews said is one of the stallion's many attributes.

"Another amazing thing about Toronado is that he is a weapon in the shed. He covers quickly, his fertility is outstanding and he enjoys his job," said Matthews.

"We have always been very conscious not to over-exert him, so we never do more than four a day and when we do that, the following day will be three. He can handle the workload and he enjoys the workload; his libido and fertility are just world class."

### *Popularity Wins*

After a fee jump this season, Matthews said the horse is as popular with breeders as ever and, even though the new figure places him in the echelons of some of the best stallions in Australia, he believes he still represents very good value.

"These sorts of horses are not easy to come by and you have to start them off at the right level and everyone can get a lick of the ice cream along the way. I think even now at \$80,000 people know they can get a commercial horse they can breed to sell, or breed to race," said Matthews.

"He is a highly commercial horse who represents good value and he will be the headline for our roster for many years to come. He was a tough horse himself and he throws an incredibly consistent type, you can walk into paddock and pick out the Toronados, so you know what you're going to get."

### High-class Sale Ring Performance

The 2021/22 season on the track was top-class for Toronado, with six of his sons or daughters landing stakes races between them, spearheaded by the aforementioned Shelby Sixtysix's triumph in G1 The Galaxy and those track results were reflected in the sales rings when his stock was offered across Australia earlier this year.

During the 2022 yearling sale series, the stallion had 67 youngsters sell for an aggregate of \$9,996,000 at an average of \$149,194 including a top-priced colt of \$850,000, which is a huge 120% increase on the aggregate of sales he recorded in 2021, where 52 yearlings sold for \$4,532,033 at an average of \$87,154.

Matthews said they have always tried to ensure that his stud fee is slightly below what the market prices him at; a tactic they will continue to employ going forward.

"You can send basically any style of mare to him and a lot of different pedigree mares to him. When we increased him to \$27,500 to \$49,500 we still knocked back 150 mares and we have knocked back a lot of mares already this year," he said.

"We have always tried to price him below where the market sees him so that breeders can get a return and there is still enough juice there for everyone. We will continue to price our horses below market expectations.

### Eye-Watering Quality

With the stallion on the cusp of covering his eighth Australian book, Swettenham has made no secret as to the quality of mares set to visit the stallion this year.

"We have been selective again with his book of mares and we are very conscious we want to look after the breeders who have supported him and make sure they get the best result possible," said Matthews.

"We have reserved a few nominations for a few mares that are retiring off the track and we wanted to make sure that we

hand-selected the breeders as well as the mares. It is obviously not an easy job saying no to people, but his book of mares is absolutely exceptional.

"If you had said to us four years ago that this was the of book mares he was going to get we would have laughed it off. The quality of the book is eye-watering and even the mares we knocked back, you look at those and think, 'Geez I'd like to own her'. But you have to knock them back because he can only cover so many."

Toronado joins Darley's **Street Boss** (USA) and Arrowfield's Shalaa (Ire) as former shuttle stallions who have now found permanent homes in Australia.
