## SEPTEMBER SNAPSHOT OF STALLION SCENE

It's all the trees I feel guilty about. That, and the postman's lumbago. But while many people nowadays complacently compress the world's biggest yearling auction onto a digital device, a stubborn few of us will always prefer scribbling notes on the dog-eared pages of a paper catalog.

Whichever your preference, of course, you will do well to avoid wearing out the soles of your shoes during the Keeneland September Sale--not to mention other reserves, in morale or finances. Before you start appraising individual hips, however, it might be worth attempting a wider panorama of the sale. Because their relative representation, across what is unarguably the most comprehensive of all marketplaces, provides an interesting measure of the current balance of power among Kentucky stallions.

We've divided the sale into three sectors: Book 1, for the elite tier; Books 2 and 3, for a version of that elusive "middle market"; and Books 4, 5 and 6. Pretty crude, clearly. Many horses in Book 2 will have far more in common with their Book 1 peers than with anything in Book 3; and some in Book 4, equally, will be different class from Book 6. But, look, it's just one snapshot; a picture drawn in clumsy brushstrokes, not a draughtsman's pencil. We'll just demarcate stallion representation across the two weeks, and see what--if anything--turns up. **Cont. p3**

## ROUTE OF ADMINISTRATION ARGUMENT CONTINUES IN DAY 5 OF DERBY DQ APPEAL

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's hearing to address Bob Baffert's appeal came to a crossroad early in its fifth session Monday in Frankfort, Kentucky following a three-day weekend break. After the KHRC closed its case at the start of the session, the appellants began their case by calling for a partial directive verdict in their favor based on their claim that the KHRC never proved how Medina Spirit (Protonico) received the betamethasone that led to his positive test and subsequent disqualification from his 2021 GI Kentucky Derby victory.

"Although we heard the testimony of a veterinary pharmacologist and three analytical chemists, none of the KHRC experts testified that Medina Spirit received an intra-articular injection of betamethasone within 14 days of the race or ever," said Baffert attorney Joe DeAngelis. **Cont. p7**

## September Snapshot of Stallion Scene

*(cont. from p1)*

The first thing to remember is that catalog distribution is never a simple, scrupulously neutral assessment of merit. The sales company has to work with consignors, and consignors with their clients. The freshman, for instance, needs to be given his now-or-never platform. Same with the proven elite: bury a six-figure cover in Book 6, and you might as well send the creature in towing a plow.

There are some consignors, equally, who remain adamant that a certain type of yearling will do better if relegated to stand out from the crowd at a lower level. Whether or not that strategy is justified, it obviously backfires in an exercise like this one.

Besides, the market will nearly always end up more or less obeying the cover fee. That's certainly true of spending, especially on new sires, no matter how loudly agents claim simply to be assessing the flesh and blood in front of them.

Much the same can be expected, then, when inspectors and consignors try to anticipate the market. Even so, perhaps we can find one or two stallions that deserve an extra rosette.

## Quality Tells in Book 1

There's an immediate caveat here, in that some of the best yearlings of the crop have already gone under the hammer at Saratoga. As we've already stressed, however, this is just one moment in time and by no means definitive. It was tempting, indeed, to combine Book 1 with Fasig-Tipton's Select catalog. But Book I does at least give an undiluted elite flavor.

The table above is ranked according to the percentage of stallions' September entries to have gained admission to Book 1, down to a ratio of one-in-10.

There's an unsurprising correlation between Book 1 footprint and fee. But the six-figure club has internal competition all of its own and, while the proportion of his Book I stock is only a scintilla higher than that of Into Mischief, there's no mistaking the statement made here by **Quality Road**.

Because this is a very important stage in the career of a stallion now in his prime at 16. This crop was conceived during his single season at \$200,000, in 2020, a second consecutive hike after he had been catapulted from \$70,000 to \$150,000 the previous year. City Of Light had driven the initial rise before joining his sire at Lane's End in 2019, his swansong success in the Pegasus being promptly followed that year by other Grade I scores for Dunbar Road, Roadster and Bellafina.

Their sire has since reverted to \$150,000, but it's obviously a great sign that he has managed to get very nearly half his September stock into the two showcase sessions. His first six-figure covers, in 2018, resulted in a spectacular juvenile, Corniche, and if that colt has since proved a source only of frustration, then the gap was helpfully filled this summer by a graduate of the previous crop, Bleecker Street, in the GI New York S. at Belmont.

**Quality Road** has already sold a \$1.8-million filly this summer at Saratoga, where his four other hips reached \$700,000, \$350,000, \$205,000 and \$575,000 (RNA). Having worked his way up from a base of \$25,000, it was vitally important for **Quality Road** to match his billing once promoted to the top echelon. So far as the Keeneland inspectorate and the consignors are concerned, at any rate, that seems to be pretty much what he's doing.

Nowadays, of course, Into Mischief stands alone in terms of his fee and, having exponentially advanced his record with the quality of his books, he accommodates no fewer than 90 of his 92 September entries in the first three of the six books. **Tapit** and **Curlin**, long established at this level, also house over 40 percent of their September stock in Book 1, and the phenomenal young sire **Gun Runner** has now also tipped that mark.

Having had 11 in Book 1 last year, the Three Chimneys champion is now up to 26. He has, moreover, already sold a couple of standouts from his third crop at Saratoga: a colt bought by White Birch Farm and M.V. Magnier topped the whole sale, at \$2.3 million, while the latter gentleman also signed for another at \$1.4 million. And remember that **Gun Runner** was only elevated to the six-figure bracket this spring.

The star of the next intake, **Justify**, has also consolidated well; while we should remember that **Constitution** remained no more than \$40,000 when conceiving the 16 yearlings (of a whopping 105 in the catalog) that have made the elite book.

**Beach Making Waves on Debut**

Among the debutants at the sale, Omaha Beach stands apart with an impressive Book 1 ratio of one-in-eight. With two-in-three then surfacing in Books 2 and 3, moreover, he looks well positioned to maintain his early momentum as top rookie.

He dominates the table below, which is restricted to Kentucky rookies with more than 15 yearlings in the September Sale.

Having processed 10 of 13 so far offered at other auctions, at an average \$268,882, Omaha Beach has jumped pretty flamboyantly through every hoop so far. Even on the top fee of the intake, he looked fair value at his introductory fee and Spendthrift have meanwhile been characteristically aggressive in keeping him in the game.

**Audible** managed to get four into Book 1, having already sent seven yearlings to Saratoga. He has punched weight with a significantly bigger proportion in Books 2 and 3 than all bar Omaha Beach.

The only other newcomers to break into Book 1, with one apiece, are **Catholic Boy**, **Vino Rosso** and **Preservationist**. I'm a huge fan of the latter, who was launched against a fairly steep commercial slope, so he deserves congratulation for getting **hip 179** into the premier book off a \$10,000 cover. This colt must be pretty special, in the circumstances, so y'all get down to Barn 12 and take a look!

The dam is a half-sister to a Grade II winner/Grade I runner-up and has already contrived graded stakes winners by **Creative Cause** and, wait for it, **Haynesfield**.

Don't be alarmed by how many of these freshmen will be doing the bulk of their trade in the second half of the sale. That's pretty standard for many established sires, and we all know how vital sheer volume is to the launch of these fellows. And it can't be reiterated enough that this is just one fleeting glimpse of one market, however big. Budget stallion **Flameaway**, for instance, hit one out of the park at Saratoga at \$425,000.

All these horses have to do now is run.

## Grass is Greener

One real paradox is the deference the U.S. market will show to turf stallions based in Europe, while giving so little commercial oxygen even to the most eligible imports to Kentucky.

A number of European stallions surface in this catalog, mostly with a single shot. Given American activity at the breeding stock sales in recent times, most of these yearlings were presumably imported in utero with their dams. And, curiously, they have all been given a ticker-tape reception.

Galileo (Ire), **Frankel (GB)** and **Kingman (GB)** unsurprisingly get the Book 1 limelight for their respective samples. **No Nay Never**, as a thriving son of Scat Daddy, fields four--one in Book 1, the rest in Book 2. But even stallions that maybe aren't so well known in Lexington get full respect: **Bated Breath (GB)**, **Calyx (GB)**, **Study Of Man (Ire)** and **Wootton Bassett (GB)** all field their solitary offerings in Book 2. **Caravaggio**, himself since imported to Kentucky, has been followed over the water by four from his last European crop and all but one are accommodated in Book 2.

## Stoking the Embers

When a stallion is pensioned, or sold abroad, or lost prematurely, vendors always anxious about his residual stock being ruthlessly abandoned to fend for themselves. With the marketing teams no longer putting their shoulders to the wheel, these hapless animals tend to be left to fend for themselves. It's a tribute to pure quality, then, if they retain prominence in the catalog--as, for instance, when **Arrogate** sells three-in-four of his final crop in the first half of the sale.

They are all collector's items, after all, but the same is true of just three yearlings salvaged here from the final crop of **Tiznow**. Surely it would be rash to leave town on Friday without at least checking out this trio of colts. **Hip 1195** is out of a mare whose son by **Tiz Wonderful** won a Belmont maiden and the **Gill Sanford S.** on his only two starts; and the second dam is half to a French Classic winner. **Hip 2011** demands a look regardless, simply because you must never miss a visit to **Crestwood's** consignment.

And **hip 2090** is out of a **Storm Cat** mare (herself daughter of a Grade I winner) that has previously produced a multiple graded stakes-placed Listed winner by **Tonalist**.

Noble Mission (GB), meanwhile, sadly proved too well named, having failed to prise open the eyes of myopic Kentucky breeders before the Japanese cannily rehomed **Frankel's** brother. Predictably enough, 10 yearlings from his final Kentucky crop have been dumped towards the end of the second week, but I shouldn't be at all surprised if there was a gem or two lurking there.

Among those sires still persevering against neglect, you'll find some chastening names with a bare handful coming under the hammer. Several haven't been given anything like an adequate chance, but they're in trouble enough as it is and we won't make things worse by drawing attention to specific examples.

But it's too poignant to pass over the fact that the pair responsible for the first and third past the post in last year's Kentucky Derby, Protonico and Oxbow, can, respectively, muster just two yearlings and one. Let's hope both earned some renewed attention this spring, and might yet return from the brink.

Oxbow must obviously share the plaudits for Hot Rod Charlie with the dam of that heart-warming racehorse: Indian Miss, after all, had already produced Mitole by Eskendereya. Yet Oxbow would surely be amazed to learn that even \$1.6 million was insufficient to get her latest colt, by Into Mischief, to his reserve at Saratoga!

### Hats off the Middle Men

Here's a club you can be proud to join; one that shows you have done what it takes to achieve a viable niche in Kentucky. The table below probes the very marrow of the market. It excludes the absolute elite, which for present purposes we'll define as those (featured in Table A) whose Book 1 footprint represents 10% or better of their September stock. It also leaves out the freshmen, who are a case apart and duly treated as such in Table B. And it cuts off at 40% representation in Books 2 and 3. Believe me, that's a true badge of distinction.

You may well think it depressing that even some of these rock-solid operators must sell half their September stock in the second half of the sale. But all you have to do is think of your favorite stallion that might be eligible for this table, only he's nowhere to be seen. A quick, back-of-the-catalog calculation on his distribution will teach you due respect for these guys.

And, above all, for **Ghostzapper**. What an unbelievable shape we find to the distribution of his yearlings in this sale: just three in Book 1, but just four in Books 4, 5 and 6. And 33 crammed into Books 2 and 3! That is what I call a stallion you can set your clock by.

There are quite a few other veterans in this group, the odd pensioner, and indeed sadly a couple that have left us altogether. Conversely there are also one or two younger guns, notably **Not This Time**, who are laying strong foundations for the leap into that one-in-10 Book I echelon as the ageing sires in that group fade.

True, some of these are still riding that initial commercial wave, their longevity at this level contingent on the deeds of stock now venturing onto the racetrack. But I tip my hat to anyone who can keep less than 25% of his trade out of Books 4 through 6, as has **Munnings** in maintaining his model rise.

If only the "middle market" truly represented the middle of the road! Wherever you find yourself this September, mind the traffic--and good luck.

## Route of Administration Argument Continues in Day 5 of Derby DQ Appeal

*(cont. from p1)*

The route of administration that was used when Medina Spirit received the betamethasone has already been a thoroughly debated point since Baffert first filed the appeal to clear from his record a 90-day suspension (which he served earlier this year) and reverse Medina Spirit's disqualification. While Baffert's team of attorneys have said there is no evidence that Medina Spirit received betamethasone via injection and that he instead received the medication topically to treat a skin lesion, the KHRC argues that the route of administration does not matter as betamethasone is a Class C, prohibited substance in any form.

The attorneys volleyed back and forth on this subject, but ultimately hearing officer Clay Patrick opted to deny the partial directive verdict motion and proceed with further witnesses.

While Baffert was present in court for the hearing last week, he was not present in the hearing room Monday. He is set to appear back as a witness on Tuesday via Zoom, along with Medina Spirit's owner Amr Zedan.

Over a seven-hour span Monday, three scientific experts took to the stand, all virtually, to discuss the details of Medina Spirit's test result findings.

The first witness of the day was Dr. George Maylin, the director of the New York State Equine Drug Testing Lab which was responsible for the court-approved outside testing of Medina Spirit's urine sample last summer. Taking the stand virtually, Maylin's questioning was frequently interrupted due to technical difficulties, but it went on for over two hours.

Baffert attorney Craig Robertson asked Maylin about the procedure used to test Medina Spirit's sample and the results that were found. Maylin reported that the substances found included betamethasone 17-valerate, clotrimazole and a metabolite of clotrimazole. He concluded that all three were components of the topical ointment Otomax. Later asked by Robertson if the injectable form of betamethasone contains clotrimazole, Maylin replied, "Not that I'm aware of."

Maylin was cross-examined by Jennifer Wolsing, general counsel for the KHRC. Wolsing's questioning focused in on the

fact that betamethasone acetate and betamethasone phosphate, which would be found in an illegal injection of betamethasone, were not directly tested for.

"Had there been more urine and more time, more could have been done," Maylin said. "But the judge wanted an answer in a hurry."

When the examination was redirected to Robertson at the end of Maylin's time on the witness stand, Maylin concluded that he was confident in the test results and that he believed there was no injected betamethasone in Medina Spirit's system.

After a break for lunch, the Baffert team brought Tom Lomangino to the witness stand. Lomangino has previously served as the Director of the Maryland Racing Commission

Laboratory and the Director of USEF Equine Drug Testing and Research Laboratory.

Lomangino worked under Maylin for a brief stint at Cornell University and categorized Maylin as, "Very dedicated. Consummate technician. Good person to work for."

Baffert attorney Clark Brewster asked Lomangino about the Standard Operating Procedures (S.O.P.) that were used for the original testing conducted by Industrial Laboratories of Colorado. When asked if he believed that the original test

followed these procedures, Lomangino said, "No. I read something that said the analyst guessed...What we're talking about here is analytical chemistry. You're going to have certified reference material of the exact compound you're trying to find and you're going to compare that to the unknown."

Lomangino's time on the witness stand went into the details of the S.O.P. for both the initial test through Industrial Laboratories and the second test conducted by the University of California, Davis. Lomangino said he was not confident that S.O.P were followed for either test.

While Wolsing's cross-examination went into Lomangino's qualification as a lab technician and started a deep dive interpreting the graphs from Medina Spirit's UC Davis test, the examination was cut short due to a medical appointment Lomangino had to attend. He will return to the witness stand tomorrow.

The last witness of the day was Dr. Steven Barker, the former head of the laboratory that tests horse samples in Louisiana. Barker was supportive of the results Maylin discussed earlier in the day.

“Let’s keep something in mind,” he said. “Dr. Maylin was asked to do the analysis from three different companies. He did not have an existing method before any of the three. He was asked to, in a very short time, develop an analysis for betamethasone valerate, clotrimazole and gentamicin. Those are not typically monitored in equine horse samples...There’s nothing routine about this.”

Barker also criticized Dr. Scott Stanley, who, in his testimony last Thursday, said he did not believe that Medina Spirit got betamethasone from a topical ointment.

“Dr. Stanley made a number of egregious errors in interpreting the data and results,” Barker said.

Robertson later asked if Barker had an opinion as to whether the findings reported by the KHRC were the result of an ointment or an injection.

“The evidence clearly shows that it was as prescribed by the veterinarian,” Barker replied. “It was a topical administration of Otomax that contained the [betamethasone] valerate, clotrimazole, and the clotrimazole metabolite. Yes, this had to have been—with the levels in the urine and with the other facts—from a topical administration.”

With the possibility of the hearing meeting its end Tuesday, the upcoming session is expected to see virtual appearances by Baffert and Zedan, along with Baffert’s veterinarian Dr. Vince Baker. From there, Patrick can arrive at his ruling that the KHRC may accept or reject. Hearing officers hired by racing commissions typically take months to issue a written report and recommended findings.

## AIRDRIE SIRE DUO SENDS FIRST CROP TO KEENELAND SEPTEMBER

The Brereton C. Jones/Airdrie Stud consignment will be bustling in just a few weeks at the Keeneland September Sale as an assembly of over 60 yearlings bred and raised at the landmark Midway farm prepare to go through the ring. The majority of these youngsters represent the dozen-strong stallion roster at Airdrie, which includes two sires that are represented by their first crop of yearlings this year in Grade I-winning millionaires **Preservationist** (Arch--Flying Dixie, by Dixieland Band) and **Divisidero** (Kitten’s Joy--Madame du Lac, by Lemon Drop Kid).

Airdrie will showcase 14 yearlings by the stallion duo at Keeneland, starting with the consignment’s first horse to go through the ring in Book 1. **Hip 179**, a **Preservationist** colt out of Brereton C. Jones homebred Church By the Sea (Harlan’s Holiday), reflects the caliber of broodmare that Airdrie chose to back these young sires.

“This colt is from a family that everyone knows well,” said Airdrie Stud’s Director of Sales Jocelyn Brooks. “Not only has Church By the Sea produced multiple graded stakes winners herself, but her family goes back to MGSW Cairo Memories (**Cairo Prince**) and GI Blue Grass winner Zandon (**Upstart**). This colt is what you want to see in a Book 1 horse. He’s big and strong, beautiful and athletic, and he has a really nice way of going. We’re excited about bringing him over to the sale.”

The consignment has eight additional **Preservationist** yearlings cataloged including **Hip 1067**, a colt out of Lifetime Memory (Istan) from the family of Grade II winner Speaktomeofsummer (**Summer Front**).

“He comes from another favorite family here on the farm,” Brooks explained. “He’s a stunning physical and is another big, strong colt. He’s powerful looking, but is still very fluid moving. We think he’ll be very popular with his physical and his really nice family that we’ve had for all these years.”

A \$485,000 yearling himself, **Preservationist** made six trips to the winner’s circle for Centennial Farms and trainer Jimmy Jerkens, with headline victories in the GI Woodward S. and the GI Suburban H. Despite **Preservationist**’s success as an older horse, Brooks said that Airdrie was initially drawn to the bay because of the speed he showed early in his career.

“Our big conversation that we’ve had with breeders—and actually what we found out when we were looking to bring him to stud—is that he was very precocious,” Brooks noted. “As a 2-year-old, he was the best-training horse in the barn, as they said. When he broke his maiden going six furlongs in 1.09:01 and ran a 3 1/2 Ragozin number, you say, ‘I’m thinking of the horse that won the Woodward and the Suburban. I didn’t realize that he had that speed.’ So not only was he a Grade I winner going long, but he also had the speed that everyone is after.”

A homebred for Emory A. Hamilton, the son of Arch boasts a pedigree that contains a number of influential broodmares like Too Chic and Courtly Dee.

“Preservationist's pedigree, top and bottom, is one of the best that you'll find with those Middlebrook Farm and King Ranch families that go back for generations of top-quality horses,” Brooks said. “His pedigree has been a huge draw for breeders.”

Brooks explained that based on the first few **Preservationist** crops on the ground at Airdrie and the additional yearlings they have had a chance to look at, the stallion is passing on some of his best qualities.

“Preservationist is a big, powerful, strong horse, but he's still very athletic,” she said. “We've been really excited about his foals. They are all nice physicals and definitely are very athletic. A lot of them look like him in having that good bone and nice size.”

**Preservationist**, who has stood for a fee of \$10,000 in his first three years at Airdrie, had 26 progeny go through the ring as weanlings including an \$85,000 Airdrie-consigned colt out Limitless (Discreet Cat). Brooks said their team was happy with the results from the weanlings that Airdrie sent through the ring.

“They sold very well and went to the right buyers—people who have a wonderful eye and who we respect their opinion,” she said. “We always say that the Airdrie pinhook is the best angle because we brought them over to the sale as weanlings to show off how much we love our Preservationists and hopefully they show up and do even better in September. When [buyers] see the individual physicals, with his pedigree on top of everything, we think that he's going to have a really strong sale.”

**Preservationist** has 36 progeny cataloged for the Keeneland September Sale while his studmate and fellow first-crop yearling sire **Divisidero** will be represented by nine yearlings.

Airdrie's consignment includes **Hip 2689**, a **Divisidero** colt out of MSW Keep Crossing (Istan).

“This colt is a good example of a **Divisidero** because they really do favor him,” Brooks said. “They definitely have his balance, build, and fluid movement and hopefully they have his speed. This colt is just a lovely horse. He's been really easy to be around and he looks like '**Divisidero 2.0**.'”

Another Airdrie stallion with an impressive pedigree, **Divisidero** hails from the family of breed-shaping stallions Northern Dancer, Halo and Danehill.

“He's from a female family that you don't get the chance to breed to very often,” Brooks said. “It's just a fantastic pedigree and we're really lucky to have that here on the farm. He's a beautiful horse. He's very well put together and he definitely looks like a horse that would be a very fast turf horse.”

Campaigned by Gunpowder Farms, the son of Kitten's Joy was a debut winner early in his sophomore year and went on to claim the GI American Turf S. on the Kentucky Derby undercard in his third career start. The turf specialist claimed at least one graded stakes win every year over his five seasons on the track, including back-to-back scores in the 2016 and 2017 editions of the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S.

“We always joke about telling people to go back and watch his race on Derby Day because any one of them would work, either his first stakes win or one of his two Grade I wins,” Brooks said. “He raced against some of the best turf horses that there have been in recent years and he had an incredible turn of foot. People are excited by his explosive speed, for sure. Everyone wants that in their sire.”

To help fight the ongoing battle for a fair shake in the commercial market for young turf sires, Airdrie Stud has thrown whole-hearted support to **Divisidero** to get his stud career off to a fast start.

“We have bred 15 to 20 mares to **Divisidero** every year that he has been here,” Brooks shared. “We really believe in this horse. We love his pedigree, we love what he did on the track and we love him physically. His foals have followed in his footsteps in that they’re very similar to him. They have his build and they look like very fast horses and very good-moving horses.”

With the recent loss of Kitten’s Joy, who passed away in July this year, **Divisidero** is one of just a handful of young stallions standing in the U.S. with the opportunity to carry on the perennial leading stallion’s legacy.

“With the loss of Kitten’s Joy, who will never be replaced, it’s nice to have such a well-bred son of his that was so accomplished on the racetrack standing here at Airdrie,” Brooks said. “Hopefully he will have an opportunity to fill a tiny bit of the footsteps that Kitten’s Joy left behind.”

## FLYING START GRAD LINDSAY SCHULTZ OFF TO FLYING START *by Bill Finley*

Lindsay Schultz checked a lot of boxes. She is a graduate of the University of Louisville’s Equine Industry Program, moved on to the prestigious Godolphin Flying Start program, managed Glen Hill Farm in Florida and worked as an assistant to Tom Proctor and Hall of Fame trainer Shug McGaughey. Yet, she admits to being nervous and not knowing what to expect when she decided last fall to go out on her own as a trainer. Maybe she shouldn’t have been.

Less than a year after opening her stable, Schultz, 34, is making a name for herself at Monmouth Park, where she has six winners from 22 starters for a winning rate of 22%. Overall in her brief career, she is 11 for 61, good for 18%.

“This is definitely beyond my expectations,” she said. “I have exceeded my goals.”

Schultz rode hunter-jumpers while growing up in Connecticut and enrolled in the racing program at the University of Louisville. It was not, however, until she entered the Godolphin program that she decided she wanted to be a trainer.

“I knew I wanted to be in the industry, but didn’t know exactly what,” she said. “When I went into the Flying Start program I got to see every aspect of the industry and decided I wanted to focus on the racing part. Once I started working for Tom Proctor as his assistant, I thought maybe I could do this myself and do a good job.”

Along the way, she caught the attention of Marshall Gramm, who runs the Ten Strike Racing Partnership. Schultz and bloodstock advisor Liz Crow are close friends and Crow has had a long and fruitful business relationship with Ten Strike. Gramm has helped a number of young trainers kick off their careers and, in Schultz, he saw someone he was happy to take a chance on.

“I was talking to her around this time last year and it was clear she was at a stage where she was about to go out on her own,” Gramm said. “We had discussions about it last summer and I told her that if she was going to do it she should come to Oaklawn Park and that I could use her there. I told her that it would be a good place to start and I thought I could really help here there. It’s a track I want to win at.”

“That I had the backing of Ten Strike and Marshall was huge,” Schultz said. “It’s a good feeling to have someone who is so intelligent put his faith in me and helped me get started. It really meant a lot. The opportunity that he gave me was the biggest reason why I thought it was a good time to try this.”

Gramm didn’t exactly hand her the keys to a 50-horse stable filled with stakes horses. Schultz told him she thought she could get by if Ten Strike gave her six to seven horses and she was fine with taking on claimers. Her first winner came with a \$10,000 claimer at Oaklawn, Capture the Glory (Scat Daddy). Another winner at Oaklawn came with Tiger Moon (**Upstart**). Schultz talked Gramm into claiming him for \$10,000 out of a maiden claiming race. She bumped him up to a \$40,000 maiden claimer for his next start and he won at 29-1. (Gramm, an astute and enthusiastic horseplayer said he did not have a bet that day on Tiger Moon).

What Gramm did give her was the chance to prove that she could make the most of an opportunity.

It was Gramm who suggested that Schultz head to Monmouth after the Oaklawn meet ended.

“She has really blossomed at Monmouth,” Gramm said. “The competition is little bit easier there. We realized we could take some horses who were average horses at Oaklawn who would be successful at Monmouth. She’s really hit her stride there and it’s exciting to watch. She works really hard and knows her stuff. I’ve been very pleased and impressed and I am excited to be part of her burgeoning career.”

Schultz has 14 horses at Monmouth, seven of them for Ten Strike. The stable includes five 2-year-olds, none of whom have started yet this year.

While happy to have accomplished so much so early in her career, Schultz makes no secrets of her aspirations to take things to the next level.

“I’d like to get up to maybe 40 horses to be able to have two strings,” she said. “It would be nice to be able to utilize two different circuits. I’d like to keep improving the quality. Obviously, to get to there you need the horses and you need the owners. All I’m trying to do is to do a good job, go to the sales and go to big race meets, meet people, talk to people. I am not a big self-promoter, but I hope if I keep doing a good job and keep looking for new opportunities they will come my way.”

Can it happen? Gramm believes that it can.

“Lindsay is going to need to find some other owners willing to take a chance on her and she’s going to need to get some good 2-year-olds in her barn,” Gramm said. “Claiming is a way to get noticed and get your first set of owners, but, ultimately, you need to show you can develop some nice horses and win some stakes races. That’s what gets you more and more noticed. Each year is a baby step. She’s gone from five horses to 14 and has some 2-year-olds in her barn. That’s a great place to be after a year. Hopefully, she can keep the momentum going and pick up some more owners. She has such a great background and I’m excited for her considering where she’s at at such an early stage in her career.”

“We look forward to building upon our existing efforts to collaborate with participants in all facets of the sport by seeking more targeted input from active horsemen and women,” said Lazarus. “Their hands-on experience will help ensure the practicality and effectiveness of our rules for all racing participant. HISA is proud of and grateful for the unparalleled expertise that has informed the development of our regulations—the first ever national rules to govern our sport. As we continue

the implementation phase of our mandate from Congress, HISA will benefit immensely from additional perspectives from the trainers and owners who are on the backside, standing trackside and in the racing office every day.”

HISA will select a group of 10-12 horsepeople with input from its Standing Committees and seeks members who are involved in both small and large racing operations. Those interested should expect to participate in monthly meetings with HISA leadership and to serve as individual sounding boards on specific issues on which they may have unique knowledge or insights on a more frequent basis.

“Establishing the Horsemen’s Advisory Group will significantly enhance our regulatory system and allow us to account for the wide range of environments found at tracks across the U.S. as we continue to implement HISA’s safety and integrity programs,” said Ann McGovern, HISA Director of Racetrack Safety.

The Advisory Group’s membership is expected to be announced and hold its first monthly meeting in October.





## SEVEN DAYS: PERFECT NEWS FOR HAGGAS

Few, if any, trainers have been in more consistent form this season than William Haggas, who now finds himself atop the table in Britain, with a strike-rate of 27% for the season. His earnings of £4,611,340 at the time of writing place him narrowly ahead of reigning champion Charlie Appleby.

Top of the Somerville Lodge list of horses, and the earner of roughly a third of the yard's prize-money this year, is of course arguably the best horse in the world, Baaeed (GB), around whom continues to swirl uncertainty as to where we will see him next. What we now know with some certainty is that he will appear only once more on the racecourse, but whether that will be at Ascot or ParisLongchamp seems largely dependent on how soft the ground becomes in October following a drought-ridden summer.

The Haggas stable is no one-trick pony, however. Star of the show Baaeed is backed by a supporting cast which includes G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup winner Alenquer (Fr), the Group 2 and 3 winners Sea La Rosa (Ire), Maljoom (Ire), Purlepay (Fr), Lilac Road (Ire), My Prospero (Ire), Ilarab (Ire), Bashkirova (GB), and the Haggas family homebred, Hamish (GB).

## OSARUS RETURNS IN BOUTIQUE FASHION

With just 150 horses catalogued, the Osarus Yearling Sale, which takes place on Tuesday, is reduced to the size of catalogue last offered at September in La Teste de Buch a decade ago. Osarus had made some inroads in the French market to the extent that Tattersalls took a majority stake in the business in 2014. But its sales never really took off in the way that they had at one time suggested they might and the pandemic only exacerbated the problem, with its September fixture not taking place at all in 2020, and yearlings originally bound for Osarus being amalgamated within a larger-than-usual October Sale at Arqana. The auction house's location in south-west France may also have been a factor in the sale's decline in fortunes in recent years, with an increasingly packed sales calendar rendering it less convenient for trainers and agents to attend. 



A particularly pleasing result for the team would have been the victory nine days ago of Perfect News (GB) in the G3 Ballyogan S., a first at group level for the daughter of Frankel (GB) and the former Haggas-trained G2 Lowther S. winner Besharah (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}), who died earlier this year at the age of just nine. The championship is far from over, with some of the most valuable races of the season still to be run during an action-packed autumn. Haggas will doubtless be guided not just by weather forecasts but by Baaeed's owner Sheikha Hissa when it comes to deciding on the colt's swansong. While the Arc is the more valuable race overall, the near £750,000 on offer for the winner of the QIPCO British Champion S. could potentially make the difference for Haggas to gain his own championship for the first time.

The relentless winner-producing machine that is Mark Johnston reached a new milestone in the last week when passing the 5,000 mark. Technically speaking, the Johnston counter was reset to zero on New Year's Day 2022 when the trainer brought son Charlie on board as co-trainer, but only a pedant could insist that Johnston senior, one of racing's most successful participants and clearest thinkers, could be denied a continuing tally.

### Donny Dances to the Tune

I was strolling on a quiet Scottish beach last week while my colleague Brian Sheerin did the hard yards at the Goffs UK Premier Yearling Sale. The Highland idyll was interrupted every now and then to check on proceedings at Doncaster, where the words 'frenetic' and 'hunger' appeared to be being bandied around with frequency. Indeed, the final results testified to the strength in demand across the board that is extremely welcome at a yearling sale pitched at a more everyday level than the elite boutiques of Arqana August, Goffs Orby or Tattersalls October Book 1. There had been pre-sale angst in some quarters that the relatively new Tattersalls Somerville Sale had been taking some of the Premier Sale's ground but that appears to have been unfounded, and Donny did as Donny does, only better again than last year. A rise in the number of six-figure lots and strong clearance rate pulled the rest of the sale up by its bootstraps to deliver what appears to be a satisfying set of figures.

The results from next Tuesday's Somerville Sale will be indicative as to whether this level of demand is set to continue as the season wears on. Considering racing's myriad problems, particularly in Britain, it is heartening, and perhaps somewhat mystifying, that this bullish market for horses continues not just at the very top level but on lower tiers as well. Yes, to a degree, there will be people buying with a close eye on the overseas resale market, and that includes the bold breeze-up pinhookers. But a scroll through the results shows that there remains a huge range of trainers waving their catalogues to start the annual restocking of their yards, which is an encouraging sign.


John and Jess Dance's Manor House Farm was the second-leading buyer at the sale which must remain a favourite to them, having purchased the mighty Laurens (Fr) (*Siyouni {Fr}*) at Doncaster six years ago. The Dances can also take encouragement from the excellent start made at Manor House by their resident trainer James Horton, who now has 12 wins to his name and sent out his first stakes winner at the weekend when Sam Maximus (GB) (*Showcasing {GB}*) won the Listed Hopeful S. at Newmarket. The 3-year-old was bred by Whitsbury Manor Stud, which continues to enjoy an excellent year courtesy of its graduates.

The sales caravan rolls on next to the somewhat depleted Osarus Yearling Sale at La Teste de Buch on Tuesday, with much livelier fare likely to emanate from Germany's main event, the BBAG Yearling Sale, on Friday. I've been lured back from the beach for a return to the glorious spa town of Baden-Baden later this week. Go figure.

### Buick Forges On



Walter and Martin Buick at Tattersalls | Laura Green

There are few nicer people to bump into for a quick chat at the sales than Walter Buick and his son Martin, who now works with agent Hubie de Burgh having completed a stint with the Niarchos family. Walter, a former multiple champion jockey in Scandinavia, is a regular buyer for a number of his contacts in that part of the world and can count this year's Swedish Derby and Norwegian Derby winner Hard One To Please (Ire) (Fast

Company {Ire}) among his recent purchases.

The greatest result of the season for the Buick family, however, will be if William, the eldest of Walter's three sons, is crowned champion jockey at Ascot in October, and it is a scenario that becomes more likely by the day.

After an extraordinary week, particularly at Goodwood, where he won all three group races on Saturday and eight of his 12 rides there across the weekend, William added another 13 wins to his name and is now 43 clear in the championship (though only nine wins ahead of Hollie Doyle for the year as a whole).

### Tempus Fugit

While William Buick was hogging the Goodwood group action, his nearest pursuer for the title of champion jockey, Hollie Doyle, added yet another black-type victory to her increasingly impressive record at Deauville on Tempus (GB) (Kingman {GB}), who has now won back-to-back Group 3 races for Archie Watson and the Hambleton Racing syndicate.

Tempus was already a four-time winner with a rating of 97 for Roger Charlton and Juddmonte when he came up for sale exactly a year ago, and it now seems scarcely believable that the half-brother to Time Test (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) was bought for just 25,000gns.

But by the time he popped up in the Tattersalls August Sale he had missed all of the 2021 season with what Juddmonte's useful and typically fulsome sales notes described as "sub condyle bone bruising in his left fore and left hind cannon bones" and which noted that Tempus had "exhibited a high level of form but is delicate".

So, caveat emptor and all that, but in this case the outlay of 25,000gns was a risk worth taking because Tempus really is now flying. Making his first start for more than a year, and since being gelded, the 6-year-old won at Newcastle on January 2 and, with another five starts and a ratings rise to 103, he struck again at Ascot on July 23.

Following that latest handicap success his two subsequent runs--and wins--have been in the G3 Sovereign S. at Salisbury, followed by Sunday's G3 Prix de Quincey. What next for the son of Group 1 winner Passage Of Time (GB)?

And talking of time flying, Deauville's August meeting has passed in what seems like the blink of an eye, and it has been a fruitful one for the Andre Fabre-trained Botanik (GB), who won the G3 Prix de Reux followed by Sunday's G2 Grand Prix de Deauville. With seven wins under his belt he thus becomes the top performer for his sire Golden Horn (GB). The Derby and Arc winner of 2015 recently moved from Dalham Hall Stud to Overbury Stud and has been represented in the past fortnight by the Ebor winner Trawlerman (GB) and Juddmonte's Listed Galtres S. winner Haskoy (GB), who appears to be heading next to the G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster.

**Classic Potential?**

If you saddle a horse with the name Classic, you'd have to be pretty sure he was worthy of such a portentous moniker. In the case of the 2-year-old Classic (GB), a winner at Newmarket for Richard Hannon on Friday, he had justifiable claims to a proper name just on paper, for the colt is a son of Dubawi (Ire) out of the stakes-placed Date With Destiny (Ire), the only offspring of the subfertile and ill-fated superstar George Washington (Ire). Date With Destiny raced in the colours of Julie Wood, who now owns her son Classic. She has already produced the Group 3 winner Beautiful Morning (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), and Classic could yet surpass his elder sister as he has some pretty fancy entries in

the coming months.

"He still has signs of immaturity there but he is a very talented horse," said Hannon of the colt, who was making his third start on Friday. "It wouldn't surprise me if we see him turn up at the top level, especially on soft ground. We will speak to Julie but she is never afraid of taking on these big races. I'd say there is a fair chance we go to the Champagne at Doncaster next."

The Group 2 on September 10 is certainly a

race in which the trainer has enjoyed plenty of success, having won three of the last eight runnings of the Champagne S.

Date With Destiny, who is now 14, remains in the Newsells Park Stud broodmare band and will be represented at Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale by her colt from the first crop of another Newsells Park graduate, the Arc winner Waldgeist (GB).

Officially described as 'royal blue and white check, striped sleeves, royal blue cap', the set of colours formerly worn by the champion lovingly known as 'Big Red' is one of six to be offered for auction by the BHA during Sotheby's sporting memorabilia sale on September 6. The sextet of cherished colours also includes the distinctive set of aquamarine jacket and black cap and, according to the BHA's notes, the auction "presents the opportunity to purchase a unique set of silks that are not available to own through any alternative avenue".

The guide price for Secretariat's silks is £5,000-£10,000. Then all you have to do is find a horse to wear them who moves like a tremendous machine.

### Osarus Preview cont. from p1

One of the stand-outs among the sale's list of notable graduates is the admirable Trueshan (Fr) (Planteur {Ire}), who was sold for just €8,000 at Osarus five years ago by Haras de Clairefontaine on behalf of breeder Didier Blot. Now six, his 12 wins include two Group 1s and he has amassed earnings just shy of £1,250,000.

Buyers on the hunt for the next Trueshan could do worse than to head to the eight-strong consignment of Marie-Laure Collet's Haras de Clairefontaine, and one would think that Anthony Bromley and Alan King would be beating a path to her door, as not only did Trueshan emanate from that draft but so too, four years earlier, did Sceau Royal (Fr). The son of Doctor Dino (Fr) was bought for €14,000 by Philippe Sogorb before being sold on as a winning 3-year-old from the stable of Guillaume Macaire. Now 10, he has won another 15 races for King, including the G1 Henry VIII Novices' Chase.

First-crop yearlings by former British-trained Group 1 winners Donjuan Triumphant (Ire) and Robin Of Navan (Fr), both of whom ended up at stud in France at Haras de la Barbottiere, feature in the catalogue. Among the more established sires, Miswaki's son Panis is represented by three yearlings, all from Haras des Faunes, and he can lay claim to having provided another of the Osarus Yearling Sale's star graduates from the other end of the distance spectrum in the Group 1-winning sprinter Sands Of Mali (Fr), who has his own first crop of yearlings at the sales this year.

Alain Chopard's Haras des Faunes, a prolific source of winners, was the leading vendor at last year's sale, with 19 lots sold, including the €50,000 co-top lot by Gutaifan (Ire), who now stands at the stud to the east of Bordeaux. That colt is now named Hattam (Fr) and is in training with Richard Fahey for Middleham Park Racing.

The sale commences at 1pm local time and can be viewed live online.

**FERGUSON TO RE-OFFER \$1M WORTH OF FILLIES AT MAGIC MILLIONS SALE**

Everyone has done something they have almost instantly-regretted at one point in their life. Be it ordering a round of tequila shots at the end of night on the tiles or simply saying hello to a random stranger on the street because you mistook them for somebody else; we've all experienced such pangs.

Ferguson, who suffers from a lung condition, was in the throes of being weaned off some strong steroids by his doctor when he went out and made a name for himself at the National Yearling Sale. Unbeknown to him, one of the side effects of this process are feelings of invulnerability and euphoria.

He explained, "It is like having been at the Magic Millions bar all day and then deciding to buy some horses. It felt like a great idea at the time."

All horses have been paid for by Ferguson and, while he admits that he expects to "take a haircut" on each filly when he reoffers them for sale next month, he can at least see the funny side to the episode.

Ferguson said, "It was just one of those things that happened. I'll probably end up famous because of it. I have had some feedback from a few good judges who have seen the horses and they tell me that there are some nice fillies in the group. So, I may not have done too bad a job."

He added, "One of the vendors has already offered to buy their filly back at what we paid for her, as they felt she was sold too cheaply. I didn't accept the offer, as I want the sale to be fair and transparent. We bought 22, so all 22 will be re-offered."

Since the National Sale, all fillies have registered at Di Hannel's Warrandale Stud at Biddaddaba. A vet will carry out a clinical and a laryngoscopy examination of each horse on arrival at the Magic Millions complex, and the reports of the vet's findings will be posted on the Magic Millions sale pages.

Ferguson has decided to offer each filly with a reserve of 50% of their recent purchase price.

He said, "Obviously it looks like I am going to show a loss, as I'm willing to take a haircut on each horse. But it was never my intention to own these horses. When I purchased these fillies I am sure I made a lot of vendors happy. This time around I will probably be making a lot of buyers happy."

All of the fillies will be available for inspection at the Gold Coast Sales Complex from 9 a.m. to 4p.m. Tuesday Sept. 6 to Thursday 8th and 9 a.m. until sale closes Friday, Sept. 9.
