ELM TREE ROOTED IN SOLID GROUND

They were already through the show ring and into the Keeneland pavilion, circling for their turn. Jody Huckabay knew that the dam's only previous foal, a Ghostzapper colt, had coincidentally been declared to make his debut at Churchill the same afternoon. Still more fortuitously, the rate of selling that session last September had now conspired to let him advertise their genes even as his half-sister by Flatter was strolling the back ring.

"I couldn't see the race but had people watching," Huckabay recalls. "And suddenly my phone was going off, and they were running back in to tell me this horse just freaked at Churchill." By eight and a half lengths, in fact, having started odds-on for Brad Cox. Huckabay had already told their breeder, P.L. Blake of Pop-A-Top Stables, not to give this filly away. Okay, she wasn't a total paragon, conformationally, but she was very intelligent and never seemed to get tired. **Cont. p3**

They had set a \$75,000 reserve.

"Look, let's not sell her," Huckabay suggested now. But Blake told him to let the market decide, and didn't even elevate the reserve.

Well, people are busy at that sale. But the fact is that nobody was sharp enough to clock what had just happened, and the filly was led out unsold at \$70,000.

"And afterwards, of course, a multitude of people came back and tried to buy her!" Huckabay says. "If they're consigned, we try to get them to the ring and give the public the opportunity. But as soon as somebody didn't buy her, Mr. Blake said, 'That's it. They had their shot.""

And that is the real point of this story. It's not just that the filly's half-brother happens to be none other than Loggins, beaten only a neck by champion Forte (Violence) in his only subsequent start despite being exposed to a grueling pace in the GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity. For now, admittedly, Loggins must rely on Forte as his proxy on the Derby trail when resurfacing at Gulfstream on Saturday, his own resumption having been delayed so that he will have to renew their rivalry down the line. But whatever happens, it's already hugely fulfilling for both the Blake family and Elm Tree Farm to see a young mare vindicate their shared insistence on doing things right.

They know that it's a long game, but that you may get rewarded if you trust the process and stay patient. The Blakes had retained Beyond Blame (Blame), the dam of Loggins, for their own small operation though she could have been cashed in after winning four of her eight starts including the GIII Regret S. After all, she'd been homebred from a mare found in the same ring by Huckabay, at the 2011 November Sale, for \$140,000.

So this third-generation filly by Flatter was a classic example of playing it straight: Blake didn't try hastily to exploit the situation, but nor did he let other people move the goalposts, either. *Cont*

"I'm glad we didn't sell her, I'll be honest," Huckabay says. "She could be a nice broodmare. She's with Dr. Eisaman in Florida now and doing well so far. It's fulfilling, very fulfilling, to work for good people. Our very first paying customers, Danny and Cindy Bockmon from East Texas, are still here with us. They only keep a couple of horses, but they've been very loyal clients, for many years, and we bought a mare with them in November.

"So when you get a horse like Loggins coming along, that's what gets me up in the morning. I get emotional about it, because this is a tough business and a hard life. And we've been doing it a while. Man, we've been trying for 38 years. It takes time to get all this to come together."

Yes, indeed: if "mighty oaks from little acorns grow", then that is no less true of Elm Tree Farm. The very name has deep roots: Huckabay's grandfather owned a plantation in Louisiana named Elmwood, but lost it in the Depression. In the 1970s, Huckabay's father was able to buy back some of that lamented acreage. When Huckabay and his wife-to-be Michelle founded their farm in 1989, it was named in homage to those original steadings. Though his father and grandfather had both been country doctors, neither Huckabay nor his sisters turned out to share the family vocation.

"My father and a partner had the last privately-owned hospital in the state of Louisiana," Huckabay recalls. "But he worked 24/7, there was hardly time for family. Thank goodness my mother had time to raise us! But both my parents were certainly instrumental in helping us get that first parcel of land, here in Kentucky, besides giving us lots of direction and guidance. Without them, we'd never have been able to get where we are now."

But a less literal inheritance was equally important. Raised among cattle and horses, Huckabay had absorbed stockmanship throughout his boyhood. *Cont.*

He showed Arabian horses for his father all round the country, and was no more than nine when daily feeding "a hundred and something mares" after school. Moreover it was his responsibility to alert his father at the surgery if anything were then amiss.

Huckabay was introduced to Thoroughbreds when his father became a founding shareholder of Louisiana Downs in 1974. And by the time he finished college in his home state, Huckabay was opting for the University of Kentucky as graduate school specifically to "get my feet wet" in the Bluegrass.

It was at UK that he found a partner in life and work. Michelle had grown up riding hunter jumpers in North Carolina, and together they

established a farm near Paris comprising "one barn, two fields, three paddocks and a wheelbarrow." They also had one half of a \$500 mare, albeit not especially certain where to find the \$250.

"We started out with 112 acres but only about 60 ready for horses,"Huckabay recalls. "The rest wasn't even fenced and had sat idle for several years. There was a recession at the time, and we had one paying boarder. It was pretty dire at times." Dire enough that Huckabay couldn't turn down an offer to

return to the University of Kentucky and run their horse farm for a spell. But after marriage and the arrival of a daughter, Huckabay told Michelle that trying to do two things at once meant doing neither properly. He brought a trailer house to the farm, promising to build a house after six months. In the event they lived in that trailer for four years. "For years we parlayed everything we had back into the farm," Huckabay recalls. "But both of us are cut of the same cloth, in

that failure was not an option. We

were going to persevere no matter

That's probably one of my faults. But when you think how many years we've been doing it now, and all the people that have come and gone, and we're still pressing forward... Well, we're very proud of that."

The farm has since expanded to 600 acres with eight barns, 125 stalls and a faithful core of returning customers. Around 15 of the 105 mares to be bred this spring are Elm Tree's own; the rest belong to clients large and small. (Those who sell through their consignment, meanwhile, extend right the way to Stonestreet.)

What brings them to Elm Tree? Well, it certainly isn't bragging; nor even advertising. "It's always been word of mouth," says Huckabay. "Secondly, the land. As far as I'm concerned, it's the best in the world. You could raise anything out here. And thirdly, our motto is 'solid from the ground up'. We believe in treating every individual horse as if we own it. From the matings, to raising them the very best we can. If you do that, every one of them has a chance to run. We've had several that were mediocre sale horses come on to be leading runners. For example, the mare You (You and I) that we raised for Mr. Dolphus Morrison. We couldn't get \$7,500 for her as a yearling [Keeneland September 2000] and she won six Grade Is." Huckabay's degree in equine nutrition signposts another key element of the Elm Tree regime.

"But I'm also a big believer in raising horses outside," he stresses. "Yes, our horses come in and they're fed and checked once a day, but then they're turned back out. Unless it's inclement weather, they stay outside all but two hours a day. We know they have to be managed and taught proper etiquette, to get their feet trimmed and be groomed. But you have to let them be horses."

You hear that often enough, but a less common dimension to this program is a herd of pedigree Angus cattle. That adds 125 calvings to the workload, but there are all kinds of dividends, whether in terms of emotional satisfaction or scientific inquiry. After all, John Magnier is famed for his eye for cattle; and Huckabay remembers reading how another great breeder, Bull Hancock, considered cattle to be useful aerators in their grazing.

"People ask me all the time, 'Why are you doing all that stuff?'" Huckabay admits. "Well, one, we enjoy it, me and my wife. It's a lot of work but we're homebodies. But we also do a lot of rotational grazing. It breaks the parasite cycle. And of course they eat a lot of grass. We've got tremendous grass in Kentucky, and the horses can't utilize it all. And finally, we recycle our muck. We put up a lot of bluegrass bedding, and then we feed that back to the cattle."

Huckabay reckons you can learn a lot about cattle from horses, and vice versa. True, there are radical divergences--artificial insemination, embryo transfer--but someday he envisages horsemen informing their breeding decisions with similarly increased DNA testing. *Cont.*

Above all, however, he feels that the cows help to hone his intuitions about the maze of genetics.

"I love the breeding side, whether it's horses or cattle or dogs," he says. "And I think if you're a good stockman, you can apply it to about anything. You see that in your labor. Some people have that sixth sense, and just pick right up on it. And other ones don't, and never will."

With the farm now embarked on another foaling cycle, Beyond Blame is actually one of those only on the covering loop. She missed on a late cover last year, but was duly booked for an early date with Life Is Good. Meanwhile she has a "very, very nice" colt by Authentic set for sales prep, while her "gorgeous" dam Quippery (Forest Wildcat), at 16, has a yearling filly by Game Winner.

This continuing dynasty represents a cherished memorial to Blake's late wife Shirley, who died in November 2018.

"A very special lady," Huckabay says. "She loved the horses, and Mr. Blake told me that one of the last things she said was, 'I don't want you to get out of the horse business! I want you to keep going.' And so they have, with some of the children now involved and enjoying it too. They've four mares with us right now: three are graded stakes-producing mares, while the other is half-sister to a couple."

Loggins duly feel like an apt memorial to his departed breeder. "He was a horse that we were always very high on," Huckabay recalls. "He was kind of special from the time he was born. He wasn't mean, but always had a cocky air about him. And prepping him, he did everything right. He was never sick, never had any problems. He would do whatever you wanted, and never got tired."

Cox had trained Beyond Blame, who had required patience with a couple of issues but combined talent with a notably tough outlook. And he was duly determined that his "Colts Group" take her \$460,000 son from the Denali consignment at Saratoga. After outclassing inferiors on debut, Loggins certainly showed his dam's fighting qualities in what proved a very demanding second assignment. "It was a very physical race, he got banged and bumped several times, but I thought he showed lots of courage," Huckabay remarks. "He did a lot of the dirty work and was still fighting at the end."

It feels instructive of the Elm Tree way that even a conspicuous new client should actually have had many years to learn what kind of people they would be dealing with.

"Michael and Susan Simpson lived across the fence from where I was raised in Louisiana," Huckabay explains, when asked about their arrival on the scene. "I went to school with Susan, all the way from first grade to graduate high school, and we've been very good friends, well, my whole life. And out of the blue they called last year and said they were interested in buying a mare. Unfortunately, their first one had a dead foal--but they

came back in November and jumped in with both feet to buy two very nice mares."

Even in opening a new chapter, then, the Huckabays have built on a reputation earned over many years. And exactly the same applies to the growing involvement of their daughter Caroline, along with son Jack when not away at college.

Caroline was actually on another path until Huckabay had to tackle a bout of cancer three years ago. "She's a very good equestrian

but hadn't really developed that passion for the farm until I got sick and we talked her into coming back in," he explains. "Now she really enjoys it and she's doing a very, very good job. Both kids are certainly stepping up, and hopefully that keeps going. To have them involved as well now is very rewarding."

Since his reprieve, meanwhile, Huckabay himself cherishes his way of life more than ever.

"I vividly remember being in the third grade and drawing on a piece of paper what I wanted to do," he says. "And I had my horses, I had cattle, a dog kennel, my house: I had everything down on that piece of paper. So I'm one of those rare people that have been able to do exactly what they always wanted to do, from a very young age. *Cont.*

SPENCER'S SPARKLE CARRIES NAMESAKE'S LEGACY IN DEBUT

A 3-year-old filly trained by Cherie DeVaux will be looking to do more than just break her maiden when she makes her career debut at Turfway Park on Thursday. The daughter of Unified named Spencer's Sparkle carries the legacy of Spencer Stephens.

Spencer, whose mother Dawn was DeVaux's high school classmate, died in a car accident at the young age of 18 in November of 2020.

An openly gay person, Spencer was loved by many and was an inspiration to those around him. He was active in his church and

his school's theater department and was crowned homecoming king during his senior year. After his passing, an outreach program called Spread Spencer's Sparkle was set up in Spencer's honor.

On the organization's website, Spencer is described as someone who "always had a smile on his face" and "looked out for the people he loved, was incredibly thoughtful and was one of the most fun people to be around." **Cont.**

The filly now named Spencer's Sparkle was purchased as a 2year-old by DeVaux's 11-year-old stepdaughter Reagan Ingordo. Inspired by Spencer's story, the Ingordo-DeVaux crew named their new acquisition after Spencer.

David Ingordo's daughter Reagan has used her platform in the industry to help spread awareness about charities in the past. In December of 2021, her own namesake Reagan's Decision (Unified) raced to benefit relief efforts for the tornadoes in western Kentucky.

"David and I try to teach Reagan about charity and empathy," DeVaux explained. "With this filly, it opens up the door for conversation and it creates teachable moments. We talk about how we're blessed to have a lot of nice horses and it gives us an opportunity to show her that what we do can have a bigger meaning and can raise awareness."

DeVaux shared that Spencer's Sparkle, who has put in seven works over Keeneland's training track this year, seems to have adopted a bit of her namesake's personality.

"I was telling Dawn about how the filly is quite opinionated and tries to get the better of her riders. She told me that Spencer was the same way."

Spencer's Sparkle will debut in the nightcap of Turfway's Thursday card, which features a field of 12. DeVaux said she doesn't like to place too many expectations on her first-time starters, but added that the filly shows all the potential for success.

"She seems pretty quick. She should fit the six furlongs and she's bred to be able to handle the Tapeta. She definitely acts very forward mentally."

Various DeVaux trainees have had a meaningful story behind their names over the years, like in the case of another maiden filly named Mayo Miracle that was in their stable a few years ago.

"If a horse's name can bring awareness to something, we're happy to use it as a platform," DeVaux explained. "For us it's just naming a horse, but for Spencer's mom, who has really had a hard time with the grief, it has given her something to look forward to. She gets excited when I send her updates about the filly."

DeVaux said that Dawn won't be able to make Spencer's Sparkle's debut, but that her team is planning to livestream the race for her. And if all goes well in the filly's first start, there will be more sparkles to watch for in the future.

Top-ranked on this list since the outset of the season, this intimidatingly speedy, sales-topping son of Uncle Mo (\$250,000 KEESEP, \$2.3 million OBSAPR) is being aimed for either the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 1 or the GI Santa Anita Derby one week later.

Staying home at Santa Anita means being able to race out of his own stall there. But shipping hasn't adversely affected either of his on-the-road wins, and Arabian Knight showed he can absolutely devour a wet Oaklawn racetrack if that condition arises again.

That last victory was a thorough shellacking of an overmatched field in the GIII Southwest S. in Hot Springs Jan. 28, in which Arabian Knight earned a 96 Beyer Speed Figure while dominating the tempo and not being throttled for maximum output.

Arabian Knight has only had one published workout since that win, a three-furlong move at Santa Anita back on Feb. 13, though there have been no recorded breezes of any variety since Feb. 23 owing to a rare winter storm.

Divisional champ Forte (\$80,000 KEENOV; \$110,000 KEESEP) will have a figurative target on his back in Saturday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream. It's his 2023 debut off a four-month layoff, and he drew post four as the 7-5 morning line favorite.

Somewhat surprisingly, this **'TDN Rising Star'** by Violence didn't go off favored in any of the three Grade I victories that closed out his juvenile campaign, although he was the chalk in both his May 27 debut win at Belmont (7 3/4 lengths) and in start number two, a fourth-place try in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga.

Yet this colt's trio of Grade I wins in the Hopeful S., Claiborne Breeders' Futurity S., and Breeders' Cup Juvenile each revealed new tactical dimensions, and Forte's knack of being able to essentially pick his own positioning before reliably firing a big shot off the far turn is a skill that a number of his competitors still haven't mastered. Watching the leggy, athletic Forte target and reel in horses without flinching from stretch fights whets the appetite for what he might be able to deliver on a two-prep path to Louisville.

But longer-term statistical trends could be stumbling blocks: as for this Saturday, be aware that favorites have lost 12 of the last 16 editions of the Fountain of Youth. Widening the lens to take in 38 years of Breeders' Cup history, only two colts (Nyquist and Street Sense) have parlayed wins in the Juvenile into a blanket of roses on the first Saturday in May.

'TDN Rising Star' Tapit Trice is headed for the Mar. 11 GIII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby for start number four. His Nov. 6 debut at Aqueduct was a better-than-it-looks learning experience based on his fast-closing third. This colt's Dec. 17 MSW win, also at Aqueduct, rated as an eye-opener because of his unfazed attitude after brushing, bumping and running down a rival in a deep-stretch mud fight. But it was the over-the-top nature of Tapit Trice's gaudy, eight-length allowance pummeling at Gulfstream on Feb. 4 (92 Beyer) that stamped his Kentucky Derby aspirations as realistic and achievable. *Cont.*

This \$1.3-million KEESEP son of Tapit still needs to hone his early-race skills by overcoming lackadaisical breaks from the gate. But as the distances increase and he gains experience against larger fields, those are the types of developmental concerns that seasoning can melt away like the spring thaw.

This year, the Tampa Bay Derby has been downgraded from Grade II to III. Part of that demotion had to do with the race's

recent trend of well-meant favorites being no-shows while the long-shot winners went on to be low-impact factors in subsequent stakes.

Although the 4-5 choice Classic Causeway (Giant's Causeway) won Tampa's big race last year, the previous four Tampa Derbies were won by harder-to-figure horses at odds of 15-1, 49-1, 8-1 and 19-1.

As the co-fourth choice on the morning line for Saturday's Fountain of Youth S., Rocket Can isn't facing the same scrutiny or pressure as race favorite and divisional champ Forte. But this Into Mischief gray (\$245,000 FTSAUG RNA) will still be under the gun to prove his GIII Holy Bull S. score was no fluke, and he needs to shrug off the stigma of having relatively low speed figures compared to other top Derby hopefuls.

Rocket Can has plateaued with 82 Beyers in his last two starts on Nov. 26 and Feb. 4. Cont.

But as discussed in previous editions of this list, his efforts rate considerably higher from a "how he did it" visual perspective. He gave up ground on both turns of the Holy Bull while always within three lengths of the leaders, and when he commandeered the lead off the final turn of that short-stretch configuration, Rocket Can finished focused through the lane while chased home by a tenacious stablemate.

Over the same 1 1/16-mile setup that starts close to the first turn and ends at the sixteenth pole, look for jockey Junior Alvarado to try and execute a follow-the-favorite strategy on Saturday, a tactic that should be a smooth fit for this colt's capable stalking style.

'TDN Rising Star' Cave Rock, who races with his head slung low in a style that evokes his sire still merits a strong foothold within the Top 12 despite the certainty that he'll be the last colt on this list to make his first sophomore start.

Powerful and promising at age two, this physically imposing dual sales grad (\$210,000 KEENOV; \$550,000 KEESEP) detonated a 104 Beyer in his two-turn debut, the GI American Pharoah S., while never being fully extended.

But in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, he got hot and bothered pre-race, then had trouble settling when trying to clear an irrationally exuberant 70-1 shot through a :22.90 opening quarter. Cave Rock seized the lead a half-mile from home, but Forte had far more in the tank while Cave Rock languished too long on his left lead in the stretch.

Still, the second-place effort was commendable given those less-than-optimal circumstances, and Cave Rock looms as a front-end force when he finally hits the entries.

Faustin (\$285,000 RNA KEESEP; \$800,000 OBSAPR) was christened a **'TDN Rising Star'** upon debut back on opening day at Santa Anita, overcoming multiple examples of trip adversity (some of it self-inflicted) to win first time out.

In start number two, he ran a credible second despite being tactically disadvantaged behind a one-turn-specialist stablemate Havnameltdown (Uncaptured) in the GII San Vicente S. going seven furlongs. The latter returned to just miss in last weekend's G3 Saudi Derby Cup over a stamina-stretching mile.

Additional ground along the Derby trail (next start not yet disclosed) should aid Faustin's development arc, because 10 furlongs is well within the scope of his pedigree. His damsire and sire, Hard Spun and Curlin, finished second and third, respectively, in the 2007 Kentucky Derby. Half a year later, Curlin and Hard Spun ran one-two in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

This will be his second start off a freshening (and his first for trainer Tim Yakteen on a transfer from Bob Baffert), and Hejazi merits respect based on the 97 Beyer he earned and the authoritative way he swatted back two deep-stretch challengers inside the final 100 yards.

A concern, though, is that four of the horses he beat on Jan. 15 have already raced again, and the best finish among them was a third-place try.

Instant Coffee's company lines got a boost when the third- and fourth-place finishers out of his Jan. 21 GIII Lecomte S. tally came back to win their next starts. Confidence Game (Candy Ride {Arg}) scored in last Saturday's GII Rebel S. at 18-1 odds and Denington (Gun Runner) popped at 8-1 in a Feb. 18 first-level allowance route at Fair Grounds. This son of Bolt d'Oro (\$200,000 KEESEP) is three-for-four lifetime, with his only loss coming when fourth in a key renewal of the Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland last October.

He is, however, the type of colt you'd like to see more of before deciding if he's a true 10-furlong horse.

That's not going to happen under trainer Brad Cox's current two-prep sophomore plan. With the Mar. 25 GII Louisiana Derby projected as his next race, Instant Coffee is going to have nine weeks between starts trying to make the jump from 1 1/16 miles to 1 3/16 miles, then another six weeks until the 10-furlong Kentucky Derby.

He's currently two breezes into training since his last race.

This son of Gun Runner out of a full-sister to Eclipse Award and GI Longines Kentucky Oaks winner Untapable (Tapit) is a Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred who rallied from far off the tailgate and splashed into the homestretch of the GII Rebel S. with abandon, avoiding the crowding that was going on closer to the rail but not still shying from outer-path roughhousing in upper stretch before accelerating with a separate, deep-race burst in the run to the wire (92 Beyer for second).

True, he's never won on dirt. But Red Route One's past-performance block consists of seven route races on turf and dirt, and a wet racetrack hasn't been a problem on the three occasions he's encountered slop (twice second, once fifth).

"Obviously, we're anxious for the races to go farther," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "Not positive we won't wheel him back in the Louisiana Derby, a mile and three-sixteenths. Quit messing around and get him on out there."

This colt's 92-Beyer, 5 3/4-length, smash-and-grab score in a six-furlong Santa Anita MSW sprint was encouraging enough for the generally conservative trainer Richard Mandella to declare him a "geaux" for two-turn stakes company, and he'll start from post eight in the 1 1/16-mile San Felipe S. on Saturday.

Geaux Rocket Ride's form was flattered when the runner-up from that Jan. 29 win, Sonoran (Ride on Curlin), returned Feb. 20 to break his maiden by 7 1/4 lengths as a 3-5 favorite.

This \$350,000 FTKJUL son of Candy Ride (Arg) retains the services of jockey Flavien Prat for this weekend's engagement.

But, like six other entrants in the San Felipe, he'll have to come off the medication Lasix as he advances into stakes territory. That many horses making the off-Lasix switch lends an accentuated wild-card flavor to what already looms as a tough 11-horse race to handicap.

Confidence Game is a plucky, adaptable overachiever (\$25,000 KEESEP) with some racing royalty in his bloodlines: his dam, former **'TDN Rising Star'** Eblouissante, is a Bernardini half-sister to the mighty Zenyatta.

Trainer Keith Desormeaux said this son of Candy Ride (Arg) "sort of lost his mind in the paddock" prior to his 94-Beyer winning effort in the sloppy Rebel S. last Saturday. But jockey James Graham was able to settle down Confidence Game during his warm-up, and the colt got a sweet mid-pack trip while fifth behind two longshot speedsters and two stalking favorites who never truly fired despite no-excuse trips.

Responding to far-turn rousing, Confidence Game got third run at the wilting leaders while widest off the turn, then largely avoided inside traffic with a work-in-progress kind of stretch run that included some outward wandering late (94 Beyer).

"He's really come into his own," Desormeaux said. "He started off pretty immature. But as the races went on [seven total, five of them routes], he has improved things mentally and physically."

Litigate, a \$370,000 KEESEP colt by Blame, will be on trainer Todd Pletcher's traveling team with an expected next start in the Louisiana Derby. He most recently scored a 1 1/4-length win in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa.

Note that even though the track is listed as 'fast' on the Equibase chart, that Feb. 11 race was run in a downpour, which might be a contributing factor to Litigate's tepid 77 Beyer and the race's lethargic closing fractions. *Cont.*

Sent to clear the field from post 10 by Luis Saez, Litigate ably rated back to fifth on the backstretch. He uncorked a decent move between the five-sixteenths pole and the quarter pole, then had to be ridden hard through the lane to put away a 21-1 shot and a 12-1 shot, finishing through driving rain in a sluggish final sixteenth clocked in :7.05.

His two previous tries showed promise, and they could prove to be useful building blocks as this colt attempts longer races more suited to his distance-centric pedigree: sprinting 6 1/2 furlongs at Aqueduct Nov. 19, Litigate stalked with purpose behind a three-way battle for the lead, patiently took the overland route through the turn, then drew away respectably. Tasked with a one-turn mile allowance at Gulfstream Jan. 8, he nailed second by a nose behind a daylight winner.

He's worth consideration in New Orleans if you think the long Fair Grounds stretch will be his friend.

Attendees heard from General Counsel Michelle Pujals, Head of Investigative Operations Shawn Loehr and Head of Intelligence and Strategy Shawn Richards, as each outlined a different segment of HIWU's program. A question and answer session covered topics including the contracting of outside investigators, how out-of-competition testing would be conducted and the current status of agreements with state racing commissions, which could directly affect the role played by members who serve on the frontlines at their respective tracks.

Besides the HIWU session, ORI examined a number of issues earlier in the day from ethics, the media, barn surveillance, proper licensing and employee retention. Participants came away from Tucson with a greater understanding of a myriad of best practices that they can immediately implement in their respective jurisdictions.

"This year's ORI meeting was our best yet," said Chairman Juan Carlos Estrada of the Arizona Department of Gaming. "Not only because of the camaraderie, but we heard from some excellent speakers that gave our membership the opportunity to add to their skills, so we are already looking forward to next year."

The 28th ORI Conference will be hosted by Parx Racing in Bensalem, Pennsylvania with dates forthcoming.

Stakes races are excluded from Owner's Reward program. Owners of runners competing in allowance races will be eligible as long as seven or more horses arrive in the paddock. Owners of horses competing in all other races will be eligible as long as eight or more horses arrive in the paddock.

"Halfway through our 2022-2023 season, Oaklawn has awarded jockeys, trainers and owners with the highest purses in the country for the time we race," said Louis Cella, Oaklawn's president. "In addition, we have instituted a new trainer bonus this season. For the first time at Oaklawn, we now offer an Owner's Reward for the second half of our season. We hope this reward will entice owners to continue Oaklawn's standing as having the nation's leading field size per race."



The daughter of Aclaim (Ire) propelled the already upwardly mobile trainer to new heights last season when she became Boughey's first Classic winner and she has given her owners in the Highclere Thoroughbred Racing syndicate much cause for cheer through her two seasons of racing. A graduate of the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-up Sale of 2021, Cachet won on debut at the Rowley Mile a month after the sale and gained important black type later in her juvenile season when finishing second in the G2 Rockfel S. and third in the G1 Fillies' Mile. Her love affair with her home track was fully confirmed the following spring, however, when Cachet bounced straight from winning the Nell Gwyn to becoming a Classic heroine in the Guineas. Cont. p3

He added, "As a result, demand from vendors for places this year has been at an all-time high and that has led to a brilliant catalogue of breezers with a strong sire profile which looks well-placed to continue the sale's unrivalled Royal record. As Europe's first breeze-up it is also a first choice for so many and deservedly so."

Perfect Power, top-class at two with wins in the G2 Norfolk S., the G1 Prix Morny and the G1 Middle Park S., doubled his Royal Ascot tally when landing the G1 Commonwealth Cup last season.

He was snapped up by Blandford Bloodstock for £110,000 and consigned by his breeders Tally-Ho Stud at this sale in 2021. Perfect Power is set to embark on his stallion career at Dalham Hall Stud this year and will stand for £15,000.

Bradsell capped a memorable year for this sale at Royal Ascot when storming to G2 Coventry S. glory for Archie Watson and Hollie Doyle last summer.

He cost just a fraction of what Perfect Power made when he went through the ring at Goffs UK last year. Consigned by Mark Grant Racing, Bradsell, who made 12,000gns as a yearling, fetched £47,000 at the breeze-up, with Blandford Bloodstock doing the buying.

Godolphin Flying Start Leading to Success

THE NEW BOY AT BALLYLINCH STUD

It is never a chore to pay the team at Ballylinch Stud a visit. The winding road that leads to the stone entrance is hugged by greenery and pastures as well as a resplendent view over the River Nore which separates the Mount Juliet Estate and the stud. Once on the grounds, history is preserved amongst the new infrastructure as The Tetrarch's grave greets you on your way to the stallion yard. It is a yard which houses horses who need little in the way of introduction.

The newest member of the roster is Bayside Boy (Ire), who was one of three individual Group 1 winners for his sire New Bay (GB), a fellow resident of the Kilkenny stud farm. Without a doubt, Lope De Vega (Ire) currently leads the five-strong roster but 2022 saw New Bay catapulted toward elite sire territory after three of this progeny struck gold at the highest level.

"Last year really was an exceptional year for him," says John O'Connor, Managing Director of Ballylinch Stud. "To get three Group 1 winners from less than 90 runners is, statistically, not an easy thing to do and he's got a lot of other nice horses to back those up so he's well on his way."

With the model that Ballylinch employs to launch the careers of their stallions it is no wonder that they are one of the foremost stallion farms in Ireland. When New Bay retired to stud, he was supported by a strong syndicate which included China Horse Club--breeders of Saffron Beach (Ire), who was her sire's first Group 1 winner--among other prominent breeders.

O'Connor explains, "Luckily enough he kicked right off, he got some nice foals, his yearlings sold well and his first crop of 2-year-olds were impressing the breeze-up boys."

As such his fee rose in increments over the years but, given the monumental strides taken in 2022, it was doubled for 2023, to €75,000.

"In general, we're relatively conservative with stud fees and we like for horses to gradually increase so that there isn't a sudden shock," notes O'Connor. "But with this guy for the last couple of years, we've been so overbooked. We don't want to cover excessive books of mares as it's not good for the breeder or the stallion himself. So effectively, it's the market deciding."

O'Connor added, "He's overbooked this year at his new fee so maybe I've got it wrong again, but I think we'll take it nice and steady, let the horse build into whatever fee he ultimately ends up at."

The solution to the problem of New Bay's popularity would be to look to his son, Bayside Boy, who is stabled in The Tetrarch yard. Bayside Boy is well known to the team at Ballylinch considering that he was bred and raised on the farm. His listed-winning dam Alava (Ire) (Anabaa) had already produced a four-time group winner by a former Ballylinch resident in Forest Ranger (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}). Bayside Boy was offered by Ballylinch as a yearling and, while he captured the attention of many, it was Richard Ryan for Teme Valley who was the victorious bidder, with Ballylinch retaining a share.

During his racing career, Bayside Boy was held in high esteem from the word go.

"Roger [Varian, trainer] said, 'this is a very talented horse' and he proved it," says O'Connor. "He won first time out and he got the highest Timeform rating for a debutant of the year in his first start, so we knew he was well on the way. He then went on and won the [G2] Champagne S., and he was placed in both the [G1] Dewhurst [S.] and [G1] Vertem Futurity."

The early part of his 3-year-old year was "quiet", according to O'Connor, with his down-the-field run in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains being a "bit of a non-event."

"He built back into form and both William Buick and Tom Marquand said he was a really tough horse," he continues. "He won the [G1] Queen Elizabeth II S., and it gave us a bit of dilemma of whether we should keep him in training or retire him. So, the deciding factor was the fact that New Bay's fee was rising and those people who had started him may not want to be sending their mares to him at the new fee." In his turn, now Bayside Boy will benefit from a syndicate of breeders and "excellent judges who have taken shares in him," as he begins his stallion career.

The roster at Ballylinch has something for everyone. Lope De Vega has recently sired his 105th stakes winner, Make Believe (GB) is set to be represented by his best crops yet, and the first crop of the Arc winner Waldgeist (GB) will be hitting the track this year. O'Connor admits to being "quite positively surprised" by the feedback from trainers of Waldgeist's offspring.

There is then much for the Ballylinch team to be keeping tabs on as the busy season progresses. "One of the things I'm most proud of is the team we've built at Ballylinch," says O'Connor. "They're high-quality professionals. Obviously, you need to get the genetics into the place, with the stallions and the mares, but equally then you must have the horse people to see to it that the horses achieve their potential and we're lucky that we have some great people working for us."

With those people helping Bayside Boy settle into life alongside his sire, the tried-and-tested formula of starting a stallion at Ballylinch will no doubt stand him in good stead.

BREEDERS' CUP WINNER REBEL'S ROMANCE OUT OF SUPER SATURDAY

Godolphin's **Rebel's Romance (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland in November, will miss an intended start in Saturday's G2 Dubai City Of Gold due to inflammation in his foreleg, the operation announced via Twitter.

Trained by Charlie Appleby, the 5-year-old is still an intended runner in the Mar. 25 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic on the \$12million G1 Dubai World Cup undercard.

"Rebel's Romance was found to have inflammation in his foreleg during a routine inspection this morning and will miss Saturday's City Of Gold," Godolphin tweeted. "He is still aiming for the Dubai Sheema Classic on World Cup night."

A winner of all five of his starts last year, the gelding claimed a Newmarket listed affair in June, before adding Goodwood's July 29 G3 Glorious S. and clawed out a neck victory in the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin on Aug. 14. He added another German top-tier score in the Preis von Europa on Sept. 25, his Breeders' Cup warm up. Saturday's start would have been his first outing in 2023.

COMPAS STALLIONS EXPANDS NAAS SPONSORSHIP

Five races, up from four, will be sponsored by Micheal Orlandi's Compas Stallions at Naas Racecourse in 2023, the racecourse announced on Wednesday. The operation is one of the headline sponsors for the first Flat meeting of 2023 at Naas on Sunday, Mar. 26.



YARRAMAN PARK AND AIRLIE STUD STRIKE GOLD



Shuffle Dancer takes the G2 Angus Armanasco S. | Bronwen Healy

Shuffle Dancer (I Am Invincible) was a smart winner of the G2 Angus Armanasco S. last weekend (*video*) and, as we discovered when we sat down with Anthony Rogers of Airlie Stud and Harry Mitchell of Yarraman Park, she's a new thread in a long history between the two operations.

Airlie Stud in north Kildare is a long way from Sandown Racecourse, and at 2 a.m. in Ireland last Saturday, parked alone on the couch with just a phone, television and cup of tea, studmaster Anthony Rogers felt every mile of it.

His 3-year-old filly **Shuffle Dancer** (I Am Invincible), co-owned with the Mitchell brothers at Yarraman Park, was lining up in the G2 Angus Armanasco S. When she won by a nose in a squeezed finish, it was beer, skittles and a party for one.

"I was slightly giddy," Rogers said, speaking to *TDN AusNZ*. "It was really exciting and I then stayed up for another four hours because I couldn't get back to sleep, bouncing around the house by myself.

"At this time of year over here, though the foals are starting to come through, there's not much happening on the racetrack, so to have a bit of excitement like that from the other side of the world, it was just amazing."

Anthony Rogers is the son of Sonia Rogers, and the pair run the old, established Kildare nursery that is Airlie Stud. It's one of Ireland's most accomplished operations, run initially by Roger's father, Captain Tim Rogers, who died when his son was 12. The horses that have emerged from this property since the 1960s demonstrate a rich vein of decades-long success, and this eye for good pedigrees is how Rogers became involved in the neat, Group 2 Sandown winner Shuffle Dancer.

"My mother initially found the full-sister to this filly in an Easter catalogue," he said. "My mum goes through every single catalogue, and the reason she found this one, who was later called Forbidden City, was because we had bred the great-grandam, Eljazzi, who was from a mare called Border Bounty.

"This is going back a very long time, almost before my time. We had Border Bounty here at Airlie and we sold Eljazzi, but we'd been trying to get back into the family.

"You can have a family for a very long time and then you lose it because it just goes a bit quiet, but we'd been looking for the family for 15 to 20 years by the time my mum came across Forbidden City."

Forbidden City (I Am Invincible) was bred by Yarraman Park and sold to Peter Moody for \$450,000 at the 2020 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale. To date, she has won three races and placed six times in 14 starts, including dual Group 3-thirds at her last two starts.

"We tried to buy her, but she made too much for us at Easter and that was that," Rogers said.

"But after we couldn't buy Forbidden City, Harry Mitchell came back to me to say they had a full-sister coming through that's even nicer. We did a deal, Mum came through for a bit and I came through for a bit, and Arthur and Harry stayed in her, so that's how we ended up with Shuffle Dancer."

Long-time Family Ties

Initially, Shuffle Dancer was consigned by the Mitchell brothers to the 2021 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, a year after her full-sister had gone through the ring.

However, she was Lot 1 in the catalogue and, in-hand with an X-ray issue that later resolved itself, she was withdrawn, which was a happy situation for Sonia and Anthony Rogers and, in the end, for Harry Mitchell.

"Anthony was interested in her before we knew she had an X-ray issue, and when she was withdrawn from Easter he was still keen to follow it through," Mitchell said. "When she came completely sound and was broken in, he wanted to buy half of her so we decided to race her together and we gave her to Peter Moody, and it's been a really enjoyable ride." Shuffle Dancer, like her sister, is with Moody at Pakenham. In six starts she has won three races and placed twice, which is a very good record.

She's one of the first horses that Harry and Arthur Mitchell have had with Moody since he resumed training, the brothers eager to send the trainer a particularly good one. They thought Shuffle Dancer fitted that mould perfectly, as she has since proved.

"We've had a long association with Peter, going right back to when he worked for my brother," Harry Mitchell said. "He and I worked as foremen for my brother back in the 90s, so there's a connection there all along the way."

In fact, the connections through Shuffle Dancer go back even further than that, as Rogers well knows.

"I've known Harry for a long time," he said. "I worked out at Widden in the early 90s, and Harry's father was very good friends with my father. They were in the army together, and

when I worked at Widden I went and stayed with Arthur and Harry and they fed me a couple of times.

"That's not to say that Widden didn't look after me or anything, but Antony Thompson was just a pup at that stage and always in Sydney."

The memories are good for Rogers, probably of simpler times in the hot Australian summers when the likes of Danehill (USA), Bletchingly and Rubiton were covering books.

He remembers wartime stories

with the Mitchells, and the two families have been friends ever since, so their coming together on Shuffle Dancer was, in a way, written on the wall.

"I'd always mentioned that we should have a filly together, and this one is inbred four-by-four to Eljazzi, which we love," Rogers said. "We got lucky, I suppose, and I've got to thank Arthur and Harry for letting us come in on the filly and my mum for finding her. She looks like she's very good."

A New Foothold in Australia

Eljazzi (Ire) (Artaius {USA}) is, in fact, the great-great-grandam of Shuffle Dancer. She was born in 1981 at Airlie Stud and is also the dam of the G1 Prix de Diane winner Rafha (GB) (Kris {GB}), so it's not difficult to see why the Rogers family wanted back into it.

The first emergence of this line in Australia was via Fayfa (Ire),

the prize-money... I mean, gosh.

"This filly is the first time I've had a racehorse where I'm looking at what she can win on the racetrack rather than what she's worth to sell. It's a sad state of affairs but that's the way that it is over here, I'm afraid."

As such, Shuffle Dancer could be the first of something significant for Rogers. In the past, he's had a small number of mares at Widden, but a business and four children dragged him back to a more local focus. He doesn't pretend that his smart filly will end up as a broodmare at Airlie Stud, but she will be a valuable addition to Yarraman Park at the very least.

She's All the Talk

The immediate plans for Shuffle Dancer involve the G2 Kewney S. at Flemington on Mar. 11, on the same card as the G1 Newmarket H.

a Slip Anchor (GB) daughter of Eljazzi who was imported to Australia by Coolmore in 1997, and Fayfa foaled Duduo (Danehill {USA}), who in turn foaled Palace Talk (NZ), the Street Cry (Ire) dam of Shuffle Dancer.

The Mitchells bought into the family in 2017, picking up Palace Talk via Boomer Bloodstock (FBAA) at the 2017 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale. She was consigned by Newhaven Park, costing the Mitchells \$140,000.

"The family goes back with the Rogerses a very long time, which is why they were so keen to get back into it," Mitchell said. "For Yarraman Park, it doesn't go back that far but we bought her because we liked the pedigree. She was also a beautiful physical and she was by Street Cry, which really appealed to us.

"My brother actually bought her and it's worked out really well. At the time, we didn't realise it was an old Rogers family until Anthony mentioned it to me one day. He started following

> up on this filly, Shuffle Dancer, and he's always wanted to do a bit of stuff with us here in Australia and this was a good starting point."

Rogers makes no secret of his interest in Australia. It might have started with the good 'ol days at Widden, but these days it's a sound admiration of the country's racing and breeding practices.

"I love Australia," he said. "I'm very jealous of your racing. You're very lucky because the animals are outside most of the time, you breed a tougher racehorse and "She'll go the Kewney on Saturday week, and I think Peter wants to give her a break then," Mitchell said. "She's a valuable mare now but she'll come back and race in the spring in Melbourne, and we'll see after that."

Without doubt, Shuffle Dancer has a breeding career ahead of her at Yarraman Park. She's a Group 2-winning third foal from Palace Talk, but she's also the third group performer from the mare in as many foals.

Palace Talk's first born was Never Talk, a daughter of No Nay Never (USA) who was second to Every Rose (Choisir) in the G2 Light Fingers S. She's now retired after four placings in group and listed races.

The second foal was Forbidden City, who was third in both the G3 Mannerism S. and G3 Geoffrey Bellmaine S.

Since her three foals, Palace Talk has had a colt by I Am Invincible, born on Oct. 18 last spring. Mitchell describes him as one of the best on the farm, which is saying something, and the mare went back to the farm's leading stallion again.

"With the first three out of this mare being black-type horses, she [Palace Talk] could prove one of our best," Mitchell said.
