



AS HISA MEDICATION PROGRAM NEARS LAUNCH, KEY POINTS RAISED

This past year, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) has encountered more legal scrutiny than Leona Helmsley's last will and testament. But as of writing, no court action prevents the law's anti-doping and medication control (ADMC) program from going into effect Mar. 27 in all but three states--Texas, West Virginia and Louisiana--pending Federal Trade Commission approval.

To prepare for launch, Mary Scollay, the Horseracing Integrity & Welfare Unit's (HIWU) chief of science, has been racking up frequent flier points on a whistle-stop tour of the country's horsemen's groups. On Monday it was Southern California's turn, when she addressed a full court of trainers, veterinarians and other interested parties in Santa Anita's Baldwin Terrace.

Lisa Lazarus, the chief executive officer for the HISA Authority, and Ben Mosier, HIWU's executive director, also addressed the media on Monday to discuss some of the broader looming changes.

The following is a round-up of a handful of key points shared in the above public presentations, from an interview *TDN* conducted with Scollay early Monday and through follow-up questions sent to HISA and HIWU.

HALF A CENTURY OF ONE WHOLEHEARTED

A Monday morning at Glencrest Farm, early in the spring of 1973, and here comes this teenage kid to see what it might be like to work with horses. The dairy where Gene Guy had been employed was closing down, but its owner W.W. Greathouse also had some Thoroughbreds on a place out near Midway and his son had said why not come out and give that a try. Guy lasted until lunchtime.

It sounds as though John W. Greathouse, Sr. had maybe tested him out a little.

"He told me to grab this mare and bring it to the teasing board," Guy remembers. "And, man, she was kicking and bucking and screaming and, to tell you the truth, I was scared to death. And I guess my eyes got big, and John, Sr. and his son Johnny [Jr.] were over there laughing." *Cont. p8*



Voluntary Agreements, 2023 Fees

No states have so far officially signed voluntary agreements with HIWU to implement the ADMC program. "But we are in communication with all HISA-governed jurisdictions and will be prepared to implement the program on Mar. 27," wrote HISA spokesperson, Mandy Minger.

When it comes to the 2023 fee assessments, HISA has not yet invoiced states or tracks these assessments, said Minger. The following states, however, have already officially announced they won't pay the 2023 assessment (placing the financial burden onto the relevant tracks): Ohio, Oklahoma, Arizona, New York and Iowa.

Banned Substances, Bisphosphonates

Drugs are classified in two buckets, controlled and banned substances.

Controlled substances are those permitted for use within specific windows. A full inventory of these drugs can be found here. Banned substances are those prohibited at all times. A full list of these substances can be found here.


The list of banned drugs is fairly rote, but includes some substances of note, according to Scollay, such as isoxsuprine (which can increase blood flow), sarapin (a plant extract that deadens nerves), ammonium chloride (a salt), and carbazochrome (an anti-bleeding medication otherwise known as Kentucky Red).

Also banned under HISA are bisphosophonates, a controversial group of drugs--with brand names like Tildren and Osphos--used in older horses to tackle issues like navicular disease.

Though major U.S. sales companies have taken different steps to prohibit the off-label use of bisphosphonates in horses that go through their rings, some fear these drugs are still administered to young horses, including those coming from abroad.

A problematic feature of bisphosphonates is that they can remain in a horse's system for many years, making this a potentially slippery drug to track as horses pass through multiple hands.

This issue caused much consternation among the stakeholders at Santa Anita Monday, not least because a horse that tests positive for bisphosphonates under HISA faces a possible lifetime ban, said Scollay. The trainer also faces a possible two-year suspension for a first-time banned substance violation.

Further complicating matters is how a horse administered a bisphosphonate won't necessarily test positive for the drug consistently over time, explained Scollay.

"You can see ebbs and flows in bisphosphonates," said Scollay. A likely positive test result occurs "when their bone remodels and you get activity for [the bisphosphonate] to be released into the blood," Scollay added.

When purchasing a horse, is there something the buyer can do to shield themselves from possible later recrimination?

"As a condition of sale, I would have the seller attest that the horse has never been treated [with a bisphosphonate] so you have got the ability to turn that horse back and get your money back," Scollay told the Santa Anita crowd. "It's a civil legal situation, but I think there are ways to protect yourself if needs be."

Horses already in the racing pipeline may have been administered bisphosphonates in the past without their current connections' knowledge. With that in mind, one stakeholder asked Scollay if HISA's investigative body has the authority to go back over the horse's full medical history, in the event of a positive bisphosphonate test.





Though a young racehorse remains beyond HISA's legal purview until the time of its first official workout, HISA does have subpoena authority, explained Scollay. Ultimately though, as the HISA law is written, the burden of responsibility, she stressed, is placed on the trainer and owner's shoulders.

Note: In response to follow-up questions, HIWU said it was expected to be releasing educational materials about bisphosphonates in the near future.

Detection Times vs. Withdrawal Times

One of the key distinctions between now and Mar. 27 is that HIWU is eschewing the current use of thresholds and withdrawal times for a medication schedule based on detection times.

What's the difference? Scollay--who broke it down in detail for the *TDN* last year--explains withdrawal guidelines as based on administration studies with a "statistically derived margin of safety" built in.

In other words, withdrawal guidelines provide a reliable cut-off point to administer a medication to avoid post-race positives.

Rather than a statistically safe guideline, detection times are calculated through studies on a group of horses administered a certain medication to see the earliest time it is eliminated from all the horses' systems--a level below either the lowest concentration identified by the laboratory or below a defined screening limit.

Because horses can metabolize drugs at different speeds--and because of the sometimes small number of horses studied--detection times can provide an unreliable guide for withdrawing a medication from a horse's system to avoid an adverse test finding.

"Withdrawal times have a margin of safety built in. Detection times do not," Scollay summarized, earlier on Monday. In other words, "withdrawal intervals should always be longer than the detection time."

The question is: By how much?

HIWU does not have the authority to issue withdrawal guidance, explained Scollay. But she mentioned a veterinary

pharmacologist called Pierre-Louis Toutain who suggests the following general rule of thumb. "His conclusion was that a conservative minimizing risk move is to take the detection time and multiply it by a factor of between 1.4 and 2.0," said Scollay.

Help may soon be on its way, however.

Scollay said that the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) is in the process of calculating withdrawal times for commonly used medications on the controlled substances list, guidance anticipated to be issued well before Mar. 27.

Standdown Times

That said, HIWU has established some important standdown times, including a restricted administration time for controlled medications 48 hours prior to a horse's scheduled post-time.

However, some substances are permitted up to 24 hours of a horse's post time. The full list--found here--includes orally administered vitamins, anti-ulcer medications, and certain antimicrobials.

To curtail "stacking" of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAIDS)--the use of multiple drugs simultaneously for increased effect--the detection of more than one NSAID is prohibited in a post-race sample, and in a post-workout sample including a vets' list workout.



Though all NSAIDS are prohibited within 48 hours, some of them will have withdrawal times beyond the 48-hour cut-off.

Intraarticular injections have an automatic 14-day standdown before a race and a vets' list workout. Scollay stressed that certain intraarticular injections--like those into the hocks and stifles--may need more than 14 days to clear. Intraarticular injections are restricted to seven days before a routine work.

Polyacrylamide hydrogels (joint treatments like Arthramid and Noltex) have a 180-day stand down.

Testing

Come Mar. 27, all industry participants will start with a clean slate, their prior adjudicatory histories erased completely. That said, for some the new testing system will require no small amount of extra veterinary vigilance, especially during training.

Under HISA, there will be four main testing categories. Post-race. Post-workout. A vets' list workout. And an out-of-competition (OOC) test. Click here for an overview of the system.

Different categories of test permit and prohibit different medications. In OOC testing, for instance, only banned substances are prohibited, while a vets' list workout is treated like a post-race test. A catch-all: Lasix is controlled only in post-race samples.

Importantly, a positive finding from any of these tests can be pursued as a rule violation, said Scollay. A big sea change for many.

Historically, a positive test following a vets' list work, for example, simply resulted in the horse remaining on the list. Under HISA, however, a post vets' list workout positive can result in consequences to the trainer in the form of a fine or a suspension.


At Monday's meeting, Scollay addressed what had been an industry sticking point concerning access to private property. Rather than afford HIWU representatives blanket access to private facilities for OOC sampling, responsible parties must instead present the horse for testing as required.

"People think we're going to storm the court. That's not the case," Scollay told the Santa Anita crowd. "You've just got to make sure we have access to the horse when we want to get testing done."

Lasix

Come Mar. 27, Lasix will be uniformly prohibited for use in 2-year-old races and stakes. For these horses, Lasix has a 48-hour restricted administration time at a 1mg/kg IV dose.

For horses still permitted Lasix on race-day, it cannot be administered within four hours before post-time.

A furosemide advisory committee has also been formed, charged with piecing together a study on the efficacy of Lasix usage, executing the study, then ultimately reporting their recommendations to the HISA Authority.

Compounded Medications

During Monday's presentation, Scollay raised an issue that has recently bedeviled California's backstretch veterinary community--compounded medications.

Scollay confirmed that compounded products are permitted under HISA as long as they comport with the Animal Medicinal Drug Use Clarification Act of 1994 (AMDUCA).

"Compounding is a grey and fuzzy area, it confuses a lot of people--it confuses regulators," said Scollay. Which is why HIWU is working on producing a compounding handbook.

There is a general no-no, however, when it comes to compounded drugs: "Convenience or cost control, neither is accepted by the FDA as justification for compounding," said Scollav.

"So," she added, "when someone puts fenbendazole and omeprazole into the same paste tube because it's easier to give one dose than two separate doses, that's convenience. That is not adequate justification for compounding."

Clearance Testing

A trainer or a veterinarian can request from HIWU clearance testing of a horse to see if a specific medication is eliminated from its system in time to enter a race without triggering a violation.

This is not a free service. Proposed costs, however, have yet to be determined.

If clearance testing is conducted post workout, Scollay "strongly advised" that Lasix is not given within three hours of the work.

"If that horse is producing a dilute urine as a result of the Lasix, the relative concentration of whatever is in that urine is going to be lower," she added. "You want valid results on your clearance test."

Laboratories

While the Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory is not scheduled to make up HIWU's drug testing furniture, HIWU is still in the process of finalizing contracts with other RMTC-accredited laboratories to perform the testing come Mar. 27.

Given the looming deadline, why haven't these contracts already been signed?

"I'm not party to those negotiations for the most part," answered Scollay, prior to Monday's meeting at Santa Anita. "In general what I can say is, each lab's situation is unique," she said, pointing to the multiple parties that weigh into these negotiations, and different testing capabilities between laboratories. "It's not a one-size fits all."

Scollay added, however, that she has zeroed in on a "core group of analytes"--more than 320 of them--and has established a uniform set of performance specifications for each, which are different to screening limits and thresholds.

Each laboratory that eventually forms part of HIWU's testing network, Scollay added, "will be expected to meet those performance specifications."

Results

HIWU's results management processes are broadly outlined here and for medication violations here.

HIWU is not required to make A sample findings public once that finding has been reported back to them.

Rather, HIWU is only required to publicly disclose the resolution of a potential violation within 20 days of a final decision, within 20 days of a resolution between HIWU and the covered person, or within 20 days of the withdrawal of a charge by HIWU.

"HIWU will not publish a resolution/final decision if it may compromise an ongoing investigation," wrote HIWU spokesperson, Alexa Ravit.

The "resolution" will be published on HIWU's website and will include standard information like the name of the parties involved and any associated horses, the rule or rules violated, and the consequences imposed.

"Please note that it is not required to publicly disclose a violation if the Covered Person who has been found to have committed a violation is a minor," wrote Ravit.

HIWU will also report select testing statistics on the HIWU website on a regular basis, wrote Ravit. What will that include?

Half a Century of One Wholehearted Guy (cont. from p1)

Guy continued, "And then it was, 'All right. You can put her up.' And, boy, was I glad to do that. She wasn't in heat, didn't want to be bothered with no teaser. But I didn't realize all that. Now that I know, I see that was all pretty wild. But at the time I said to myself, 'Oh, Lord, I don't know if I want this job or not.' Those Holsteins never did carry on like that!"

And actually Guy felt sick by lunchtime and never came back in the afternoon. John, Sr. telephoned early evening.

"You all right?"

"Yeah."

"You going to come back tomorrow?"

on the farm and beyond.

"Well..." And Guy pictured that livid old mare. He hesitated, thought for a minute. "Yeah, I'll come back. I'll give it another day."

That was exactly half a century ago, on Friday, and for the bulk of that time Guy has been working for the Greathouse family as farm manager, becoming not merely cherished, but more or less indispensable. His caliber was so obvious, from the outset, that every week that March he received a bigger envelope.

> "The first month, I got four raises," he recalls. "So that felt pretty cool. And the rest is history. I must have been 18 or 19, a year out of school. And I'm still here, 50 years on. Guess I liked it!" In the meantime, the young man who watched Guy struggle with that mare first succeeded his own father, alongside his brothers; and now their respective sons, John III, Deuce and Bucky have stepped up to various roles



But Guy's unstinting work ethic, plus an instinct for managing both horses and people, have made him a fixed point of reference throughout.

"Gene has been running at least our broodmare division and


the main farm since I've been born," says John Greathouse, III. "And I'm almost 40 years old. So, yes, he's been doing this a whole long time. And he taught me just about everything I know about horses. The thing about Gene is that he cares so much. The guy really, really cares: about the animals, about doing a good job. For six months a year, during the breeding season, he would never take a day off."

That was evidently the way Guy was brought up--and that was also, no doubt, how he won over John Greathouse, Sr.

"When someone says 'hardboot,' he was what they mean," Guy recalls of his first boss. "When I got here, his sons were about to take over and he was pretty strict. He just wanted everything done right. If you did it right, he was happy with you."

And if you didn't?

"Well," Guy replies with a chuckle. "You would hear about it!



Which, on this farm, meant a little bit of plenty. For a medium-sized operation, Glencrest has always had a very diverse portfolio. As a result, Guy has not only maintained continuity between

generations, but also between disciplines.

"For a time we had a breeding shed here," he recalls. "I learned a lot about that from Johnny [Jr.], after his dad stepped down. He was in the stallion barn with me the first year and then it was my turn to handle it. We had Clever Trick. He was a good-natured horse. He'd just come in, do his business and was done. And Wavering Monarch the same. Stallions were hard work, but seeing their babies going on to the track and doing so well was fun, and good for business."

But Guy's principal satisfaction has always been foaling.

"I like to see new life come in the world," he says. "And then, when you turn them out the first time, their little legs going every which way, wobbling and running and playing. And you see them thinking, 'Wow, so this is life outside that stall.' That's the best part: just a couple days old and they realize they've got legs and can run and jump and kick. And mama running after them, so proud."

In his prime, Guy was a powerful specimen. Once he brought down a deer with his bare hands before hoisting it onto his truck. But that prowess was evidently less pivotal to team discipline than a more fundamental authority.

"Gene has always had the 'doer' mentality," explains John III's cousin Bucky, who supervises the farm's agricultural division. "Obviously as you move up the ranks, you can get out of some jobs. But it helps when you've led by example, like he has. Everybody knows that you're not above any job. You've done the same as they're doing and, if need be, they know you'll help do it at any time."

Guy, equally, only has praise for those who have worked under him. "There's been big changes, from where it used to be," he remarks. "We have a lot of foreigners here now. But thank God for them, because it's hard to find Americans that want to work anymore. And we've got a really good team right now."




Guy continues, "John III and Bucky can relate to them all, and that helps, too. They have a good rapport with our workers, so everybody's on the same page. But I never had a problem, with race or anything else, everything has gone along fine all the way."

That fleeting reference acknowledges that it remains rare for African Americans to have senior roles in the breeding industry. But while Guy insists that he has never experienced any issues, he surely deserves celebration as a role model for any who aspire to improve the wider situation.

"I really haven't thought about that," he says. "Not many African Americans go into the horse business, so that's why you don't have a big pool to choose from. It's not bias or anything like that. That's the way I look at it."

John, III agrees that Guy can be a model for anyone, regardless of ethnicity or background.

"Probably when he first started, the African American presence in the industry was a lot stronger as far as racetrack and guys taking care of horses," he reflects. "Over the years, that has slowly transitioned. But Gene, when I was born, was an African American working with a bunch of Caucasian guys. He was in charge of all of them--and he made it work."

Nobody, of course, can testify to Guy's contribution better than "Johnny, Jr.," as he still calls him.

"Gene's not going to toot his own horn," John Greathouse, Jr. says. "Nobody is looking to be an all-star here. They're just looking to get the job done right. Make sure all the animals are okay. If the animals are okay, we're all okay. And he's just one of those guys that understands horses.

"He's been around them a long time now. He was always willing to work, just had to acquire the knowledge. And after all these years, foaling mares with me and then with John, he knows what he's doing. And that's just something you can't replace, 50 years of experience. It's not something you can hand over to somebody else and say, 'Okay, you go do it.'"

Though Glencrest will inevitably have episodes of colic, vets have suggested that they tend to be caught earlier than elsewhere. And John, Jr. credits that to Guy's eternal vigilance.

"He's never far from the farm," he says. "He's always driving around and, even when he's not working, he'll be taking these wonderful pictures to share on Facebook. Gene's just the kind of person that anyone would love to have work for them, as reliable and steady as any human being I've ever been around. And a nice person to go with it--and the same goes for his wife and daughter."

Those long-suffering ladies have long reconciled themselves to sharing Guy's dedicated nature with his employers.

"Yeah, I was gone a lot of the time," admits Guy wryly.

"Especially during the foaling season. But my wife [Cathy] did a good job and my daughter [Carly] has turned out great."

There have, of course, been labor-saving advances since 1973, but somehow life doesn't seem much more relaxed to Guy.

"You used to have to bale your own hay and straw, but now we have tractors picking up those big hay rolls," he says. "Same

with the manure truck coming through the barn. As far as that goes, our work is more efficient than it was. But I think it's more hectic than back then. Horses are worth so much these days, people have a lot of money invested. So you better be on your toes and make sure you do a good job. If people send a horse in here to be taken care of, to me that's a big responsibility."

And that, of course, is precisely why the Greathouse family has been able to trust him through every stage of every cycle. As John, Jr. notes, for instance, Guy

foaled and raised Wavering Monarch, but also supervised his return to the farm as a stallion.

"In any business, it counts for a lot to have somebody you can trust," Bucky says. "Gene has essentially been part of our family for almost his entire life. And he's still an asset, still brings something to the table. He's not just working with some honorary title, not just here because of longevity. Gene still brings value to the job every day. And I think that speaks volumes about his character. It's not just the loyalty factor, but the dependability. If ever there's been a problem with a horse, you've known that you can always call Gene and Gene will know what to do."

That integration with the Greathouse dynasty obtains a nearly literal quality when Guy, talking with the latest generation at the helm, refers to their grandfather as "Old Dad." He's a living link to their family history, to the foundations of the farm. John, III and Bucky both mention how they turn to Guy to chart the waterlines, and that subterranean knowledge almost seems a metaphor for the very lifeblood of Glencrest.

"I think that for Gene, with my cousins John and Deuce on the horse side, it's like you're working with somebody, not for somebody," Bucky adds. "Everybody's worked and grown up together, everybody has a good relationship, and that's what makes it work."

John, III has never even mentioned the "r" word (retirement) to Gene. "I'm afraid to bring it up, in case he might actually do it!" he says. "He's never once talked even about slowing down. If ever he did, he can be here as long as he wants, in whatever capacity he wants. He could ride out into the sunset or he stay here until he's in the ground! It's up to him.

"When I took over the farm, the place wasn't in great financial shape. We weren't real sure how long we were going to stay open. We could certainly have gotten smaller, run 30 horses without needing all the help we had. But most of the guys here have been with us a long time. I've another gentleman, Ricky Evans, here 35 years. And we felt like we owed it to them to make it work, to try and keep them around. And now the farm's in as good shape as it's been in a long time, because of Gene."

In any walk of life, 50 years with a single employer is a remarkable achievement. In one as demanding as that embraced by Guy, it's quite astounding.

"John, Sr. ran the place when I came," he reflects. "Then it was Johnny, David, Allen and Teddy for 20-some years. And now their sons are running it. It's still kind of odd, without Johnny on the farm every day, like he used to be. And of course David passed away. So it's different. I built John, III a treehouse when he was three or four years old--and now he's running the whole thing! Can you imagine? But yeah, 50 years since my first day on Glencrest. And it just feels like yesterday."

The training and next-race status of sophomore 'TDN Rising Stars' Cave Rock (Arrogate) and Faustin (Curlin) remained unclear Thursday, with trainer Bob Baffert texting a "Don't Know" emoji when asked to outline the game plans for the colts respectively slotted at Nos. 5 and 6 on the most recent TDN Top 12 rankings for the GI Kentucky Derby.

The two were apparently not among a contingent of at least 11 other 3-year-old colts transferred out of Baffert's care prior to a Feb. 28 deadline that would have enabled them to accrue qualifying points and race in the May 6 Derby.

Those transitions were necessitated by a ban imposed by Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI), that prohibits Baffert's trainees from garnering qualifying points or racing in the Derby while under Baffert's control.

CDI first imposed that two-year punishment in June 2021 because of a string of drug positives in horses Baffert trained, including two in CDI's most prominent races, the 2020 GI Kentucky Oaks and the 2021 Derby.

On Feb. 17, a federal judge denied Baffert a preliminary injunction that the Hall-of-Fame trainer had sought to be eligible to race in this year's Derby.

A Mar. 1 report by Ron Flatter in Horse Racing Nation quoted Baffert say saying that Cave Rock and Faustin were "still under my care" without any elaboration on their next-race targets.

Cave Rock was the beaten favorite when second in last November's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. That's the lone loss in his impressive four-race career, which includes Grade I victories in the Del Mar Futurity and American Pharoah S. He has two registered works this year, most recently going four furlongs in :49.40 (18.22) at Santa Anita Feb. 20.

Faustin is 1-for-2, having registered a stylish win on opening day of the Santa Anita winter/spring meet and a second in the Jan. 29 GII San Vicente S. He worked twice in February, most recently going five furlongs in a bullet :58.80 (1/46) at Santa Anita Feb. 18.

JOCKEY ALEX CANCHARI PASSES AWAY

Midwest-based jockey Alex Chanchari passed away Wednesday at the age of 29.

His passing was confirmed in a tweet by Canterbury Park, where Canchari had 334 career winners.

"Alex Canchari achieved his dream as a jockey, following in the footsteps of his father and brother," the tweet read. "The news of this talented and genuine young man's death has deeply saddened the Canterbury Park family."

Though no cause of death had been revealed by Thursday morning, it appears that Canchari's death involved mental health issues.

"My heart physically hurts," his sister, Ashley, wrote on Facebook. "I'm so sorry you were in so much pain Alex and thought there was no other way out. I know you're happy again with Dad. I don't even know what else to say, this is an unbelievable loss."

The Canchari family has had to deal with a number of devastating setbacks in recent years. Family patriarch Luis Canchari, who came to the U.S. from Peru and was a jockey and a trainer, passed away in December of 2020. That same year, Canchari's brother Patrick suffered a traumatic brain injury in a car wreck near Turf Paradise. Doctors told his family the injury could keep him in a vegetated state the rest of his life, but he has made notable progress in recent months.

"This family has gone to hell and back several times," said Terry Meyocks, president and CEO of the Jockeys' Guild.

Canchari, a native of Shakopee, Minnesota, where Canterbury Park is located, began his career in 2011. He had one of his best years in 2012, winning 101 races. He had 1,044 wins during his career and has career earnings of \$28,619,989. Canchari had not ridden since Oct. 2 at Prairie Meadows.

Canchari's death came about seven weeks after jockey Avery Whisman passed away at 23. Whisman's family also brought up mental health issues when discussing his death.

"We've been talking to HISA about jockeys and the mental health issues they face since November," Meyocks said. "It's on the top of our list and is something that needs to be discussed. This is a tough game. Hall of Fame jockeys win at 18-20 percent and regular jocks when less than that. They get taken off of horses. The foal crop is down and there's fewer opportunities for them. With the daily trials and tribulations of being a jockey it's clear to see why depression sets in."

JACK WOLF JOINS THE TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST

As the managing partner of Starlight Racing, Jack Wolf is a part of a team that can always be counted on to have several prospects for the GI Kentucky Derby. That's the case again this year as the trio of Starlight, SF Racing and Madaket Racing will have horses in Saturday's GII San Felipe S., the GIII Gotham S. and the John Battaglia Memorial. To discuss those runners and Starlight's philosophies when it comes to trying to acquire Derby candidates Wolf was the Green Group Guest of the Week on this week's TDN Writers' Room podcast presented by Keeneland.

As was the case last year, the Starlight horses have been transferred to trainer Tim Yakteen, who is taking over for Bob Baffert. Baffert, due to a ban imposed by Churchill Downs, is not eligible to run horses in this year's Derby.

"We sort of went down this road last year and it seems to be working," Wolf said. "The transfer seems to be working a lot more smoothly than last year. Last year, Bob was also serving a suspension (from the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission). We're fortunate to have Bob working with us and trying to continue on to have these particular horses be eligible for the Derby points. Bob, (SF Racing Managing Partner) Tom Ryan and Tim have done a great job working together to try pull this off up to this point."

Among the four Starlight horses that will be running in Derby preps this weekend, Wolf wasn't shy about listing who he believes is the best. It's San Felipe starter National Treasure (Quality Road), who is coming off a third-place finish in the GIII Sham S.

"I got on him as a Derby horse a couple of months before the end of the year," Wolf said. "I just like how things are setting up for him, hopefully, for the next three races. I just really like the horse. He's not peaking too soon. Bob Baffert always says you get Derby Fever in January and February. But you don't know

what you have until April comes around. So even though this horse may have a little case of second-itis, I think from a pedigree standpoint and the way he's been set up for the San Felipe he's our best hope. That's who I have my money on."

Starlight, SF Racing and Madaket were among the first major owners to pool their resources at the sales, which mas become a growing trend in the sport. That means more competition for the trio when it comes to acquiring expensive horses, but Wolf said he believes his team can outperform their rivals.

"We've got better bloodstock agents and better operation than the other ones," he said. "But, yes, they're buying a lot of stock. Mike (Repole) and Vinnie (Viola) put a little bit more money into it than we do. Maybe we put a little bit more money into it than the group Brad Cox has assembled. I like those guys. It's fun to compete with them and have at it."

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by Coolmore, Lane's End, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, XBTV, and West Point Thoroughbreds, Randy Moss, Zoe Cadman and Bill Finley took a look back at the win by Confidence Game (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GII Rebel S. and trainer Keith Desormeaux's knack for developing modestly priced sales horses into stars and a looked ahead to this week's major races, including the GII Fountain of Youth S., the GII San Felipe S. and the GI Santa Anita H. In other news, the team discussed the reinstatement of controversial trainer Rick Dutrow and a TDN column by Sid Fernando that reasons that SGF-1000, the drug Jason Servis has admitted to using on his horses, is not a performance-enhancing drug.

Every week, the *TDN* publishes a roundup of key official rulings from the primary tracks within the four major racing jurisdictions of California, New York, Florida and Kentucky.

Here's a primer on how each of these jurisdictions adjudicates different offenses, what they make public (or not) and where.

With the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) having gone into effect on July 1, the *TDN* will also post a roundup of the relevant HISA-related rulings from the same week.

NEW HISA STEWARDS RULINGS

The following rulings were reported on HISA's "rulings" portal, except for the voided claim rulings which were sent to the *TDN* directly. Some of these rulings are from prior weeks as they were not reported contemporaneously.

One important note: HISA's whip use limit is restricted to six strikes during a race.

The operators of Turf Paradise racetrack have entered into an agreed order with HISA to fix a number of safety-related issues with the facility including problems with the rail and with the equine ambulance.

The track also agrees to enforce certain HISA-related rules, including the void claim rule, and those concerning use of the whip and correct horseshoes.

VETRAN TRAINER BILL SPAWR RETIRES

Bill Spawr, 83, announced his retirement and disbanded his stable after a 46-year career as a public trainer. According to the Santa Anita media team, Spawr was a star running back at Downey High School who got hooked on racing while working as a part time clerk in a local liquor store that served up *Daily Racing Form* and gravitated to the racetrack full-time at age 23. He spent 14 years as a veterinarian assistant before opening a public stable in 1977.

With 1,709 career wins, Spawr captured two Winter/Spring training titles at Santa Anita, in 1991 and 1996, two titles at the track's Oak Tree Meeting, in 2000 and 2001, as well as a pair of summer titles at Del Mar, in 1990 and 1994.

Among his many successful claims was Sensational Star, who Spawr claimed for \$32,000 on Aug. 7, 1988. Ridden primarily by Rafael Meza, Sensational Star would go on to win three stakes and bank more than \$440,000. Exchange, a \$50,000 claim in 1991, went on to win the GI Santa Ana and Santa Barbara H. in 1993, as well as the GI Matriarch S. in 1994 and earned more than \$1.2 million.

The highlight of Spawr's career came with Amazombie, with whom Spawr and co-owner Tom Sanford won the 2011 Breeders' Cup Sprint.

"Right now, I'm going to take a deep breath," Spawr said of immediate plans. "I'm gonna be very active. I own small pieces of a couple of horses...I'll be out there in the morning. I need something to do, I've had a couple of my owners ask me to keep an eye out for horses to claim, so I'll keep my leg markings going...I don't want any money for it, I just want something to do."

Asked how he would like to be remembered, Spawr said, "As a good horseman. As a guy that really cared about the horses, first."

CASTELLANO WINS GEORGE WOOLF AWARD

A four-time Eclipse Award winner and a member of racing's Hall of Fame since 2017, Venezuelan native Javier Castellano has been named the 2023 George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award following a nationwide vote of his fellow riders. Castellano, 45, will be honored in a Runhappy Winner's Circle ceremony at Santa Anita this spring.

Presented annually by Santa Anita since 1950, the Woolf Award, which recognizes those riders whose careers and personal character garner esteem for the individual and the sport of Thoroughbred racing, can only be won once.

"I am proud to have been honored and selected to win this incredible award," said Castellano. "It is one that is obviously prestigious, but to be voted by my fellow riders truly makes this so special. I admire my fellow nominees as well as the other incredible riders that have won this award in years past.

"The significance of this award definitely does not go unnoticed. I have so many people to thank and I look forward to having my family with me to accept this award at Santa Anita."

Named for the late Hall of Fame jockey who gained national acclaim by winning the inaugural Santa Anita H. in 1935 aboard Azucar and by piloting Seabiscuit to victory over Triple Crown champion War Admiral in a match race at Pimlico in 1938, the George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award has been won by most of the greatest names in the history of the sport.

Second all-time only to fellow Hall of Famer John Velazquez, Castellano now has career purse earnings of more than \$377 million and, through Dec. 31, 2022, had recorded 5,595 career wins.

FTBOA ENHANCES GULFSTREAM PARK STAKES INCENTIVES

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association has announced enhanced incentives for Florida-breds in Gulfstream Park stakes. The estimated \$2-million FTBOA program begins Apr. 1 and extends through December.

The GI Curlin Florida Derby card Apr. 1 includes more than \$650,000 performance bonuses for FTBOA registered Florida-breds and for Florida Sire Stakes (FSS) eligible contenders.

FTBOA offers \$100,000 to owners of FTBOA registered Florida-breds, plus \$100,000 for eligible FSS owners that finish first, second or third in the Florida Derby, to be paid on a 60%-30%-10% basis, respectively.

The GII Gulfstream Park Oaks similarly includes \$50,000 for owners of FTBOA registered Florida-breds plus \$50,000 for eligible FSS owners that finish first, second or third, also to be paid on a 60%-30%-10% basis.

For the Apr. 1 undercard stakes, FTBOA offers \$25,000 to registered Florida-breds winners, plus \$5,000 per Florida-bred second through fifth-place finisher.

After Apr. 1 and through the end of 2023, FTBOA offers a \$25,000 win bonus to owners of FTBOA registered Florida-breds that officially win an unrestricted stakes at Gulfstream Park. Owners of runners eligible for the Florida Sire Stakes who win stakes restricted to Florida-breds may receive a \$25,000 FSS bonus, also paid by FTBOA.

All bonuses are an FTBOA program and payments will be administered through the FTBOA. Eligible contenders must be FTBOA registered Florida-breds and/or eligible for the Florida Sire Stakes.

DEL MAR AIMING TO TAKE RECORD PURSES

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club projected its most lucrative racing season ever last summer, then backed it up with a record-breaking meet that saw purse levels total above \$25 million for the season resulting in an unprecedented average purse payout of more than \$800,000 per day. Those numbers, the highest in California racing history, are in the track's sites once again with the aim to go even bigger for this year's 31-day stand, which will be the iconic track's 84th season.

As it did in 2022, the seaside oval will present 39 major stakes, six of which are designated as Breeders' Cup Challenges races, offering a total of \$8,275,000 during its eight-week summer run. It also will continue its "Ship & Win" program to attract more horses to come and take part in the summer festivities and continue with its well-received Maiden Dirt Bonus plan, which was fully implemented last summer.

Del Mar's summer meet set records in 2022 with more than \$18.7 million in daily average handle and a robust 9.1 average field size.

"We were absolutely thrilled by the huge response last year from our horsemen and horsewomen and our fans," said Del Mar's executive vice president and director of racing Tom Robbins. "The racing throughout the summer was extremely safe and first-rate. Obviously, 2022 set a very high bar on all levels; we're excited for the challenge of continuing these very strong trends."

Head-to-head with that rival turning for home, the \$525,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga graduate edged ahead in early stretch and blasted clear late en route to an easy victory. Wicked Again, a full-brother to MGSW Wicked Halo, held on for second over **Wild Thinker** (Lord Nelson). It was the second victory of the afternoon for trainer Brad Cox following a win by Zozos (**Munnings**) in the sixth race.

A half-sister to MGSW & GISP Commissioner (A.P. Indy) and GSW & GISP Laugh Track (Distorted Humor), Covenant is also a half to Mythical Bride (Street Cry {Ire}), the dam of champion older horse and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Vino Rosso (Curlin). The 9-year-old mare was barren in 2021 but foaled a Constitution colt the following season and was bred back to Curlin.



JOHNNY COLLINS: 'I BOUNCE OUT OF BED EVERY MORNING - I LOVE THIS JOB'



Johnny Collins: the man behind Brown Island Stables

No shortage of hard work and bundles of perseverance lie behind Johnny Collins's achievement in turning his Brown Island Stables into one of the finest nurseries of equine talent there is.

It is all the more remarkable in that he achieved this with no racing background and just his own eye and pocket to get the whole thing off the ground.

Competitive and ambitious, the 46-year-old counts several million euros worth of stock at his County Cork base, which is the culmination of over 15 years producing top-class horses over both codes.

And when it comes to identifying young stock, few do it better. Mshawish (Medaglia d'Oro), a dual Grade I winner and the best Flat horse that Collins has had through his hands, cost just \$10,000 as a yearling at Keeneland but rocked into €170,000 at the Arqana breeze-up sale the following summer in 2012.'

Then there has been mammoth success over jumps as well. Irish Champion Hurdle winner Petit Mouchoir (Fr) (Al Namix {Fr}) and Champion Bumper winner Relegate (Ire) (Flemensfirth) were the first big names to fly the flag in that sphere for Collins, who is now a regular sale-topping consignor at the major breeze-up and store sales in Europe. GUINEAS TARGETS FOR MAWJ

Either the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas on May 7 or the French equivalent on May 14 are next for 'TDN Rising Star' Mawj (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), trainer Saeed bin Suroor revealed.

Two-for-two at Meydan after victories on Jan. 27 and Feb. 24, the royal blue silksbearer is pleasing bin Suroor since her latest effort.

Bin Suroor said, "She ran really well [on Feb. 24]. She won over six furlongs in England and she came back here over seven furlongs, the way she worked in the morning I thought she could stay the mile. It was worth a try and she was really impressive, she won it easily. She's a tiny filly but she has plenty of speed, she's by Exceed And Excel."

The Godolphin filly broke her maiden at first asking, earning her 'Rising Star' moniker by 4 3/4 lengths at Newmarket on May 14, and was second in the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot behind subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Meditate (Ire) (No Nay Never) in June. Cont. p6

Johnny Collins Cont. from p1

With this year's breeze-ups on the horizon, Collins can count 24 2-year-olds to represent him from Dubai to Deauville. But it's not a case of just turning up. Oh no. Last year was forgettable to say the least as Collins took a haircut on a lot of his breezers and it was the stores that came to his rescue later in the spring.

It takes a certain amount of resolve to make this game pay. A great deal more of the stuff is required when things aren't exactly going your way. Taking his medicine is something Collins became accustomed to in the early days and, while success has

been more plentiful in recent times, he has dealt with the disappointments the same right the way through: by building back bigger and stronger.

"My horses weren't good enough last year," says Collins, straight to the point. "Even in tough years, if we had good horses and they performed well, we never had any trouble selling them. It's when your stock is below average, that's when you'll suffer.

"But, every now and then, you need a shake to keep yourself focussed in this game. That will

open your eyes and remind you that it's not that simple. If it was only a matter of going around and buying them with your eyes closed, well then anyone could do it."

He added, "You can get complacent at this job. You could think you can walk on water sometimes and that everything you touch will turn to gold. We didn't have a good year last year. Our first sale was our best sale at the Craven and after that we probably just held our own. I probably just about washed my face with the breezers. But then I'd a very good year with the stores.

"The one thing you wouldn't want to do when you've had a bad year is to go and change too many things. What we've done in the past few years in developing horses and the system here, it works, so there's no point in changing that. All that part of it is fine. We just didn't have enough good horses last year. It's all about the horses."

An operation the size of Brown Island Stables is only ever a few bad years away from hitting the rocks. This is a ship that navigates the most unpredictable of waters and one that carries millions of euros worth of cargo. With so much at risk, one would forgive Collins for resembling a German Shepard with a headache on a mid-February work morning, but he and his loyal

> bunch of staff are unfailingly helpful.

One by one, 20 2-year-olds whizz Collins's base, with crucial notes

"I like to see them dropping their heads there now and going about their work," says Collins in between lots. "If they are doing that and trying for you, there's a good chance they will go the right way because they'll do the same in their races."

up the grass gallop close to made on the closest thing he has to hand, which in this case is a white envelope.

In the group of workers we have colts by Twirling Candy and Blame, who are bound for the first breeze-up of the year in Dubai on Mar. 21. There's six for the Craven and the same number will go to Doncaster with the remainder being divided up between France, Fairyhouse and Newmarket.

"When I started breezing horses, we were buying ready-to-rock 2-year-olds. They were little five and six-furlong horses. It's changed an awful lot now. Look at last year for example, an Irish Guineas winner [Native Trail (GB) (Oasis Dream (GB))] and a St Leger winner [Eldar Eldarov (GB) (Dubawi {Ire})] came through the breeze-ups. It's amazing really."

He added, "The yearlings were a great trade last year and it was hard to get them. I bought five at Book 2, two at Fairyhouse, two at the Somerville Sale, two at the Orby and the lads helped me out with six from America."

The lads, as referenced by Collins, are international bloodstock agent Chad Schumer and his European representative Nancy Sexton, who have helped him to source stock from America while he was unable to travel to the States.

He continued, "I like a horse with a bit of strength and a bit of movement. There probably are sires who I wouldn't buy the progeny of because they haven't been lucky for me or they aren't commercial enough but I do try and go to the sales with as open a mind as possible. I'd cast a broad net and would look at as many as I could at a yearling sale.

"You can't overthink it, either. When you've your bundle of horses bought, you can only do the best with the horses you have. Of course it gets to you when they're not progressing the way you'd like them to be. For me, the beauty of it with the breezers is that I have a bunch of National Hunt horses to sell every year as well. So, even if you didn't have a great year with one code, you would be hoping to have a better year with the

other. I'd be telling you a lie if I said that, coming close to the sales, there isn't an odd night where I'd be lying awake in bed thinking about it all. Of course there are."

Collins endured his share of sleepless nights at the start. Whilst riding trackwork in America, he began to trade a few horses on the side but, by his own admission, was forced to learn by his mistakes.

"I went buying horses not really knowing what I was doing," he explains. "I knew how to ride a horse but that was as far as it went. I had to make all of my own mistakes. I was at this a good while before I started making money. But, if you can sustain it, you won't keep making those mistakes. It would sharpen up your ideas and you won't make the same mistake twice. You get to look at your mistakes all year. Now, I wouldn't always buy a horse with perfect conformation but I'd know now what I could live with and what I could work with."

So, when did the tide turn?

"For the first five or six years I really struggled. Even though I sold a couple of good horses, I was only barely making ends meet. The year I sold Mshawish, I also sold a horse by Street Boss, who made around €260,000. That really got the thing going."

He added, "I was only making enough to survive and that was with no staff. Hopefully we can keep it going now. It takes a while to break into it. You've to make a lot of mistakes and you need connections, too. It doesn't happen overnight. It takes time to build up a relationship and a bit of trust. It's easy to break it then as well.

"With the best will in the world, you can never be sure what a horse will do when it's put to the pin of its collar. You could have a horse working well but he might

not deliver on a racecourse. That happens to trainers as well. You could genuinely think you have a good one but they let you down. Horses have a habit of doing that.

"When push comes to shove, they might not have the heart or the mind to go through with it. That's why it's so satisfying when they work out because, you know, everything is on the line as a

trader. You have to experience the disappointment for when they don't work out to appreciate the satisfaction for when it does."

Like most people who are good at what they do, Collins lives for his work and that passion fuels a hectic but rewarding lifestyle surrounded by horses.

"I love it. I enjoy this job, I must

say. I like bringing on young horses and watching them progress. Even the National Hunt horses, I love bringing them on as well. And if they go on to do well for the next man, it's just a great feeling. That's what defines success for me but, at the same time, you can't do it if it's not financially viable.

"Especially when you start off, you need to have good results in the sales ring to keep the whole thing going and to develop the business. Luckily enough, we've sold a few nice horses but you're always looking for the next Cheltenham winner or the next good horse on the Flat."

He added, "When you have the operation built up, bar you have it in your head to scale down, you have to buy the same amount of stock each year if you want to keep the same number of staff and the thing going the way you have it.

"Look it, I'm happy with the way I have it. As long as I have enough help, I've no interest in scaling back. I wouldn't see

myself slowing down ever, as long as my health allows, because I do live for it. I could retire if I sold all my stock but it wouldn't make me happy.

"You could kick up your feet but what would you do then? I'm a late starter with regards to my family. My wife Barbara and I have a son, Daniel, and he's only 18 months old.

"I've a lot of friends working in jobs they don't like. They get up every morning to go to work and it's a struggle. I bounce out of bed every morning to go at this. It's

not like work at all. It's very enjoyable."

Facing the reality that comes with preparing over 120 horses for resale and the need to clear a couple of million euros annually to keep the business afloat would be enough to make most people baulk. Not Collins, whose search for a star--and to make a few quid along the way--sustains him.

"There was an old man I used to drink with below in the pub in Middleton, Denis Twomey was his name. He's since passed away but he used to have a great saying, and it stuck with me.

"He'd say, 'There are 20 years to come and there are 20 more to back it, now where is the man who can tell the man who wore the ragged jacket?' Every time

I'd see Denis, I'd ask him to say it for me. No matter how many times I'd heard it before, I loved listening to it. It's a great saying, you know, and it's very true."

She earned a group rosette herself with a half-length victory over future Group 1 winner Lezoo (GB) (Zoustar {Aus}) in the G2 Duchess Of Cambridge S. in July, but finished fourth in the G2 Lowther S. a month later. Her final 2022 appearance was a third to Lezoo and Meditate in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket on Sept. 24.

"There are options to run her in the French or the English Guineas, one of those will be the next target with her," he said. "The way she's done it, she's definitely improved, she did it so well. She's grown a little bit out in Dubai and she's a better filly now. To run her in the Guineas is a bigger step, but we will have a chance."



ENTRIES CLOSE FOR BALLYHANE S. ON MAR. 8

Entries close for the Aug. 7 €200,000 Irish EBF Ballyhane S. at Naas Racecourse on Wednesday, Mar. 8.

This year marks the fourth renewal of the race which is a median auction race for 2-year-olds that are European Breeders Fund (EBF) eligible, and whose sire established one or more yearling sales in the previous year with a median price of not more than €75,000. The breeder of the winning horse is also recognised by the race sponsors, as they will receive a free nomination to a Ballyhane Stud stallion. The entry fee is €250 per horse, and there are over 300 stallions eligible.

Since its inception, the Ballyhane has offered €920,000 in total prize-money, with the race being won by three different trainers and three different owners during the first three yearsIn 2022, the race attracted an initial entry of 303 horses owned by 192 different owners and partnerships worldwide. Joseph O'Brien trainee Voce Del Palio (Ire) (Bated Breath {GB}) won last year's edition.

Joe Foley, owner of Ballyhane Stud, said, "We're once again delighted to sponsor the Irish EBF Ballyhane S., the richest race at Naas and a big prize fund for owners and trainers to aim at. Prize-money is the lifeblood of racing and races like the Ballyhane are so important to owners. I know that Naas have great plans for the race-day so the Bank Holiday Monday should be great fun."
