



\$1.2-MILLION JUSTIFY COLT STARS AT STRONG OBS MARCH OPENER

OCALA, FL - The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale opened its three-day run Monday with a session which gained strength throughout the day, ultimately ending with increases in both average and median over the first session of last year's two-day auction.

During Monday's session, 131 horses sold for \$20,192,500 for an average of \$154,141--up 10.1% from a year ago--and a median of \$90,000--up 16.1% from 2022. Without the inclusion of post-sales transactions, the buy-back rate was 32.1%, up from 18.6% from the conclusion of last year's opening session.

The additional session--and an extra 198 horses--makes comparisons between years an inexact science at best.

"It's hard to make apple-to-apple comparisons because we have 200 more horses this year and three days," said OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski.

"It will be interesting to see what happens over the next two days with the RNA rate. I suspect it will trend downwards with the post sales. We've already seen a lot of post-sale activity. Certainly, we would like to see it lower. But I can't pass judgment on the sale until we get through the next two days."

RATE OF FATAL INJURIES LOWEST ON DATABASE RECORD

The rate of fatal injuries in 2022 was 1.25 horses per 1,000 starts, a 10.1% decrease from 2021 when there were 1.39 fatalities per 1,000 starts according to figures compiled by the Equine Injury Database (EID) and released Monday by The Jockey Club (TJC). It was the lowest number since the EID began covering the fatality rate in 2009, when the figure was 2.00 horses per 1,000 starts.

"The data shows that since 2009, the risk of fatal injury during racing has declined by 37.5%, which is statistically significant," said professor Tim Parkin of the University of Glasgow, who has consulted on the EID since its inception. "The overall downward trends are testament to the benefits of an evidence-based approach to safety, which is only possible thanks to the EID."

Since 2018, the rate of fatal injury has dropped from 1.68 to 1.25, a decline of 25.6%. The 2022 numbers marked the fourth straight year that the risk of fatal injury has fallen.

"We can say with confidence that the risk of fatal injury is heading in a sustained downward direction both overall and in many specific areas," Parkin said. *Cont. p13*

A colt by Justify, consigned by Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds, topped the day's trade when selling for \$1.2 million to Maverick Racing and Siena Farms. Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo also sold the day's second highest offering, a son of Uncle Mo purchased for \$950,000 by Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt and Jackpot Farm.

"Those were special horses," Wojciechowski said of Monday's two top-priced juveniles. "They did it on the racetrack and then, when you went back to look at them at the barn, they were spectacular. There was no surprise that those two horses did well. It's the old adage, you can't hide a good horse. The good ones stand out."

A deep domestic buying bench was at the top of the March market Monday, with the top 10 horses purchased by nine different buyers.

Japanese agent Hideyuki Mori, who purchased seven horses during last year's March sale, including a \$1.1 million son of Into Mischief and a \$900,000 colt by Bolt d'Oro, for a total of \$3.55 million, signed for one juvenile Monday, going to \$300,000 to acquire a colt by Bernardini for \$300,000.

The OBS March sale continues through Wednesday with sessions beginning each day at 11 a.m.

WinStar Comes Out On Top for Justify Colt

A colt by Triple Crown winner Justify (hip 215) became the first to reach seven figures during Monday's first session of the OBS March sale when bringing a final bid of \$1.2 million for WinStar Farm's Elliott Walden, who signed for the colt on behalf of the partnership of WinStar's Maverick Racing and Siena Farm.

"[WinStar general manager] David [Hanley] and I just felt like he was the best horse in the sale," Walden said. "I think the whole package, with how he breezed and with his pedigree, he was worth taking a chance on."

Out of graded-placed Zinzay (Smart Strike) and already named Saturday Dreams, the colt was bred by Summer Wind Equine. A half-brother to Grade I-placed Moon Over Miami (Malibu Moon), he was purchased by Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo for \$250,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. He worked a furlong last week in :10 flat.

WinStar Farm was co-owner of Justify and Maverick Racing purchased the future champion in partnership with China Horse Club for \$500,000 at the 2016 Keeneland September sale.

"We were close," Walden said when asked if the \$1.2-million bid was near his limit.

As for what is next ahead for the colt, Walden said, "He will go back to WinStar and we will figure it out from there."

Uncle Mo Colt Hitting the Jackpot

Moving along at a comfortable pace early on in Monday's opening session of the OBS March Sale, it was apparent the tempo was about to pick up markedly moments before Hip 95, a colt by Uncle Mo, strode into the ring. A camera crew swept into the pavilion, quickly setting up at the back as the photogs scurried into position. And it wasn't long before the fireworks began. The bidding initially shot up in \$100,000 increments before accelerating to \$150,000 volleys. When the dust had settled, it was Bill and Corrine Heiligbrodt, in tandem with Terry Green's Jackpot Farm, that landed the session's second most prized juvenile for \$950,000. *Cont.*

"We didn't think we had a chance to get him with what our budget is," admitted Bill Heiligbrodt. "We thought there would be some other players in there ahead of us. Maybe they know

more than we do, but I don't think so."

Added Green, "We just loved the horse. Billy has been at this a whole lot longer than me. I've been the caboose on his train."

He continued, "We're just excited about him. We think he's a great horse and have our fingers crossed."

Consigned by Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds, the Mar. 12 foal is out of unraced Sunshiny Day (Bernardini), a granddaughter of Champion juvenile filly Storm Song (Summer Squall). Having proven an active influence in the

breeding shed, Storm Song is also responsible for GISP Trojan Nation (Street Cry {Ire}) and MGSP Balladry (Unbridled's Song) and Another Storm (Gone West), herself responsible for European Highweight Order of St George (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

The colt worked in :10 flat (video) during last week's breeze show.

"We looked at all the horses in the sale and tried to pick out the best one," explained Heiligbrodt. "And this one was in our

price range."

According to Heiligbrodt, the colt will go to Steve Asmussen, who also trained 2019 Champion Sprinter Mitole (Eskendereya) for the Heiligbrodts.

"He's running speeds that is like a sprinter almost," said Heiligbrodt of his highest-priced purchase of the session. "We're just really happy we got him."

Already having partnered on a handful of horses over the past couple of years, the Heiligbrodts and Green enjoyed prior success with Gulfport,

another son of Uncle Mo. Winner of the Bashford Manor S. at two, Gulfport also placed in the GII Saratoga Special and GI Hopeful S. in addition to finishing third in the GI Champagne S. *Cont.*

"We've been [partnering on horses] the last couple of years-we're both from Texas and good friends," said Heiligbrodt.

Regarding the affinity for the Coolmore sire, he added, "We've had very good luck with Uncle Mo. We ran Gulfport together, so to find an Uncle Mo with this kind of speed and pedigree is unusual. I have been doing this a long time and I haven't seen many Uncle Mos that looked any better to me than this."

Purchased for \$360,000 by Chris Baccari at Keeneland November in 2021, the bay was offered at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale last summer, but failed to attain his reserve of \$575,000. Bred by Aaron Sones, the colt was secured for \$500,000 by Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo privately.

DeRenzo said, "We bought the horse in Saratoga and he was our highest-priced yearling purchase price [in 2022]. We just loved him. Since then, he's trained amazing all year long and we thought he was one of the top horses in the sale. He's going to one of the best trainers, Steve Asmussen. That makes us feel really good because now we know the horse has a chance to do what we thought the horse can do."

As for the purchase price, he said, "I thought he would have brought more than that. I think they got a really great buy."

He continued, "[Heiligbrodt] didn't think he could get him. But I told him 'Always be ready.' We don't set our reserves too high

because selling horses is what we do. He was there, waiting for the horse, and he got it. We are ecstatic for them. [Heiligbrodt] has a great eye and he has a great instinct as well. And he's been right so many times."

In addition to landing the day's top colt, the partnership also secured a son of Mitole, Hip 61 for \$225,000. Consigned by Wavertree Stables, the chestnut's work equaled (video) that of his pricier counterpart.

"[Hip 95] is a little bit faster [than Hip 61], but probably won't go as long," said Heiligbrodt.

Going back to the well for a horse that served the Heiligbrodts so well in the past was an obvious decision.


"Mitole has some really fast ones here so I want to buy all the fast ones here. Because if we own them, we won't have to face the really fast ones in the races!" Heiligbrodt said with a laugh. "We're thinking down the road."

The partnership also purchase Hip 164, realizing \$310,000. Consigned by Cruzin' Thoroughbreds, the colt by Lea also worked in :10 flat (video) during the breeze session.

Hartley/DeRenzo More than Justified

If selling 2-year-olds was a numbers game, Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo certainly didn't get the memo. Lining up with only two juveniles during Monday's opening OBS March session, the duo landed a blow with both of them, with Hip 95 realizing \$950,000 from a partnership of Bill and Corrine Heiligbrodt and Jackpot Farm ahead of Hip 215, who reeled in a \$1.2 million final bid from the converging titans Maverick Racing and Siena Farms.

"They were both very good horses and we had a lot of people calling us about them," said Hartley. "But they're two very

different looking horses. The Uncle Mo is really tall and leggy and this colt has more muscle and bigger. They're both very good and could end up in the same place--on top."

Of Monday's session topper, Hartley explained, "He's an amazing colt and we're so happy WinStar and Siena bought him. He's got the best shot now. It's sad when they leave our hands, but when they go to an operation like that, they're going up in the world."

Bred by Summer Wind

Equine, the dark bay was purchased for \$250,000 at Keeneland last September. Out of Grade III placed Zinzay (Smart Strike), the Apr. 11 foal is a half to SW and GISP Moon Over Miami (Malibu Moon). This represents the family Classic scorers Musical Note and Musical Chimes.

"He's been my little sleeper all year," admitted Hartley. "He has a special place in my heart. He was amazing from day 1."

Explaining part of his attachment to the dark bay colt, he said, "We had his mother, Zinzay, who I bought for \$250,000 [Keeneland September in 2012] and we sold her for \$700,000 [Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale in 2013]. I got to gallop her and was such a big part of her development, so I've had a soft spot for this colt all year long."

He continued, "He's done everything right all year long. He never did anything wrong. He's always been Mr. Serious. And he breezed lights out, it was just spectacular [:10.0]. He just has a

different air about him. He has a real presence. He's good but also very nice too."

Standing at Ashford Stud in Kentucky, the colt's sire Justify is represented by his first crop of 3-year-olds this season.

"We are such big Justify fans," affirmed Hartley. "In fact, we are big Scat Daddy fans. We were around plenty of Scat Daddys and he was such a tremendous stallion. It was such a big loss to our industry when he died so young.

"Justify is getting good runners now and we'll try and buy more of them. We have a few yearlings that we bought as weanlings, so we're keeping it going."

Rarely afraid to extend to buy a worthwhile youngster, Hartley explained that the partnership has branched out a bit in recent times to find the potential commercial standouts they're perpetually looking for.

"We are buying babies to resell as yearlings so we have been stepping up our game in that area," he explained. "We sold [three-time Grade I winner] Taiba two years ago, and given that you can hardly buy a Gun Runner as yearlings these days, we thought we'd jump ahead and get them as weanlings.

We'll bring them back as yearlings."

DeRenzo added, "When the horse hits us and we have a gut feeling that this horses can be an athlete, we purchase it. And usually, nine times out of 10, those horses *are* the athletes."

He continued, "We don't walk into it thinking how much will pay for horse. We use a lot of gut instinct. We've been doing this 32 years so that instinct is usually right."

Also well reputed for bringing to the ring a small but select group of horses, this year's March sale was no different with the pinhooking operation bringing three juveniles to the OBS scene. Already represented by the top two juveniles during Day 1, the duo is also represented by Hip 449, a filly by Tapit, during Tuesday's session.

"We are very small by design," explained Hartley. "I only have 20 stalls in my barn. So, those are all the horses I have. Dean and I have been doing this a very long time. *Cont.*

Hartley continued: "We have always been geared toward quality. We always thought if things weren't so good with the world, the Sport of the Kings would probably come down to the 'kings'.

"So we always tried to keep a boutique consignment. You'll never really see us with more than five or six horses at a sale. We have been very lucky and have sold some very good racehorses. We'll just keep bringing quality."

So what might be the main ingredient to their longevity and success?

"We treat them like champions from the day join us," said DeRenzo. "And *they* believe they are champions the day they leave us." @CBossTDN

Shah Strikes for City of Light Filly

Kaleem Shah, standing alongside bloodstock agent Ben McElroy and trainer Simon Callaghan, went to \$750,000 to acquire a filly by City of Light (hip 123) during Monday's first session of the OBS March sale.

"Ben loved her and so did Simon," Shah said after signing the ticket on the bay filly. "Next year, we will see if they are right or wrong."

Of the filly's final price tag, Shah said, "It's always more expensive than you want. I wish I didn't have to spend this kind of money, but that's what the good horses cost."

Shah is used to signing big tickets at the 2-year-old sales. He purchased the \$1.2million top-priced lot at last year's March sale.

The juvenile, who worked a furlong in a bullet :9 4/5 last week, is out of Tessie Flip (Grand Slam) and is a half-sister to multiple stakes winner Jo Jo Air (Scat Daddy) and stakes-placed Congo River (Mendelssohn). She was bred by Springhouse Farm and Dromoland Farm and, after RNA'ing for \$290,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale, was consigned Monday on behalf of her breeders by Top Line Sales.

"She surprised me as a yearling that we didn't get her done," said Springhouse Farm's Gabriel Duignan. "It's just one of those things that didn't get done. But she's always been beautiful. We loved her. We always did. It's a gamble [to take her home from the yearling sale]. But she looked the right time for this. She came out here and breezed well and I'm delighted that she's going to good hands with Kaleem and Simon."

Springhouse purchased Tessie Flip as a 5-year-old for \$200,000 at the 2014 Keeneland January sale. She has had yearlings sell for \$325,000, \$425,000, \$350,000, \$225,000 and, most recently Congo River sold for \$400,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September sale.

"She just checked in foal to Jackie's Warrior," Duignan said of the mare. "And she has a Maxfield foal." @JessMartiniTDN

Consigned by Jimbo and Torie Gladwell's Top Line Sales, the youngster had been purchased by the family's pinhooking partnership for \$150,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"He is a super-good training horse," Young, who was bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client, said. "He is by a sire who was one of the best freshman sires last year by a long way and he's a half-brother to an undefeated horse. He has sneaky quality all through his bottom line."

The colt is out of Ari the Adventurer (Pioneerof the Nile) and is a half-brother to multiple stakes winner Adventurous Lady (Kantharos). The mare's 4-year-old, Kanthari (Kantharos), purchased for \$575,000 at the 2021 March sale, is now two-fortwo for Todd Pletcher and MyRacehorse and Spendthrift Farm.

Just a few hips before the Good Magic colt went through the ring, Nellie (nee Gladwell) and Chetley Breeden introduced their Grade One Investments consignment with another pinhooking score when selling a colt by Frosted (hip 247), purchased by the family for \$50,000 at Keeneland September, for \$475,000 to Three Amigos.

Watching on from the back walking ring with obvious pride was family patriarch Jimmy Gladwell and his wife Martha.

"The Frosted colt that my daughter sold, we thought he would work fast," Jimmy Gladwell said of the juvenile who shared the :9 4/5 bullet last week. "And we thought he would be well-received, but we never dreamed that he would bring the dollar amount that he brought at the end of the day. So we're thrilled with that. It was a great start for their consignment and we are really proud of the job they did bringing him over and proud of the outcome."

In addition to the pinhooking success with the Good Magic, Top Line Sales also consigned a filly by City of Light who sold for \$750,000 to Kaleem Shah. *Cont.*

"We are a close family and our middle son [Raymond] he works in the business as well," Jimmy Gladwell said. "All of the kids are close. It's just a great feeling. Martha and I couldn't be more proud of them." @JessMartiniTDN





Fatalies Lowest on Record, cont. from p1

Parkin continued: "The six-month period from July 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 was the safest six-month period on record since the inception of the EID in 2009. This evidence of positive progress is very encouraging and should be applauded by everyone in North American racing."

There were just 12 fatalities in races run over synthetic surfaces in 2021, which worked out to a rate of 0.41 fatalities per 1,000 starters, making it, easily, the safest surface. Turf races were next at 0.99, followed by dirt races at 1.44. Races run at more than 8 furlongs were the safest at 0.86. Races run at 6 to 8 furlongs were next at 1.31, followed by races run at less than 6 furlongs at 1.38. Races for 2-year-olds were the safest in the age group at a rate of 0.98. Three-year-old races were next at 1.13, followed by races for 4-year-olds and upward at 1.34. The 3-year-old figure was notable as it showed a 25.7% decline from 2021 and that the figure was as high as 2.08 in 2014.

Since March 2012, racetracks have been able to voluntarily publish their statistics from the EID on The Jockey Club website. The racetracks that publish their EID statistics reported racing fatalities per 1,000 starts of 0.99 as compared to 1.42 for those that do not publish.

Some of the most notable gains have come at the Southern California tracks. At Santa Anita, the figure for 2022 was 0.63, down from 1.45 in 2021. Even more significantly, the rate of breakdowns has dropped considerably since 2019 when the number was 3.01, an alarmingly high rate that led to outcries from animal rights activists and politicians. At Del Mar in 2022, there were 0.56 fatalities per 1,000 starts. In 2016, the number was 3.01.

The trend at Keeneland was also a positive one, at 0.33. In 2019, the figure at Keeneland was 3.21.

TRAILBLAZER SANDY HATFIELD PASSES TORCH AT THREE CHIMNEYS

Veronica Reed had just graduated high school when she met Sandy Hatfield, but that short introduction left a life-alerting impact.

Born and raised in Colorado, Reed moved to Lexington to pursue a career in the Thoroughbred industry. While working in the yearling division at Three Chimneys Farm, she was sent to pick something up from the stallion barn. Peeking into the breeding shed to scope out who was in charge, she quickly noticed that a woman was in command. She was petite--at least, compared to the powerful studs she handled--with a blonde braid and a sharp eye that took in every detail of the session.

From that moment, Reed had a goal. She too would be a stallion manager one day.

This year, that dream came to fruition as Reed has taken over as stallion manager at Three Chimneys. As stallion manager emeritus, Hatfield is still a fixture in the barn--at least for this year's breeding season--but Reed is now at the helm.

When Reed first approached Hatfield about working for her almost 20 years ago, Hatfield told her to gain a bit more hands-on experience and come back. Reed did just that, working

with the yearlings at Three Chimneys while attending Midway University before eventually joining the stallion team. When Reed graduated college in 2008, Hatfield asked her to escort Point Given to Brazil.

The job came with many challenges, but Reed enjoyed the adventure of going to a new country where the only thing familiar to her was the stallion on the other end of the shank. She spent several years shuttling stallions between hemispheres, including a five-year stint going back and forth between the U.S. and Darley Australia.

Of course, whenever she arrived at a farm, she was not exactly what her new co-workers were expecting.

"The first time I moved to a Southern Hemisphere location was Argentina," Reed recalled. "It was not only a new culture, but it was a new language and new people. So when they saw a girl come off the airplane, they were as confused as I was. But the best part about it was after working sessions and showing that I was there every day, I earned their trust in the shed. I think you

just have to give people time to realize that, yes she's a girl, but she can do it too. I think it was a lot of just being a good person and working hard, and in the end they don't care what gender you are."

Reed's predecessor was a pioneer of the industry as she pursued a career in a very male-dominated stallion business in the 1980s.

"When I first came to town, there were a lot of breeding sheds that wouldn't let a woman in the breeding shed to watch," Hatfield recalled. "I mean if you took your mare to the breeding shed, they made you stand outside. There were a lot of times that people came and walked right past me and went to the first guy they saw. Once people realized that I knew what I was doing and could take care of their mares in the breeding shed and

make sure they got a good cover, I think they understood."

Hatfield acquired a love of horses from her father while working on their ranch and racing Quarter Horses in Oklahoma. She moved to Kentucky when she received a scholarship from Murray State University's equine program. She spent a summer prepping yearlings at Spendthrift Farm and instantly fell in love with the industry. After graduating, Hatfield moved back to Lexington to pursue a career as a yearling manager. She was working at North Ridge Farm

when the farm's general manager Dan Elliott asked her to go to the stallion barn and pull manes. It wasn't long before she was back in the stud barn for every breeding session and Elliott was asking her if she would be the farm's stallion manager.

"I had asked him, 'Are you sure? You're going to catch a lot of flak for this.' But he told me that they knew I could do it. So they gave me a great opportunity and I was stallion manager there for two years."

Hatfield would go on to be the yearling and broodmare manager at Calumet Farm and the stallion manager at Gainsborough Farm. In 2000, she was offered the opportunity to move to Three Chimneys.

"It was just the most magnificent place I could have thought of," Hatfield explained. "Dan Rosenberg was a great manager and horseman and Robert Clay and his family were all great. It was just the epitome of what I wanted to do and it was the best decision I ever made." *Cont.*

From her early days with Seattle Slew, Dynaformer, Rahy and Wild Again, then later to Big Brown and Smarty Jones, and on to today's headliner Gun Runner, Hatfield has been at Three Chimneys for them all.

Hatfield hesitates to pick an all-time favorite stallion, but ultimately coins Silver Charm as a special one. She even adopted one of his offspring, Silver Indy, who resides at her own farm today.

"I've been here long enough that I've had a few gravestones go out there," Hatfield reflected. "There are so many of them that you make friends with, especially as they get older and you spend more time with them. You get to know them and appreciate them."

Hatfield has always made a point to participate in many of the tours at Three Chimneys. While most visitors have little idea of just how unique Hatfield and her prominent position might be, or the significance of her contributions to the breeding industry, Hatfield said her goal is to leave them with a positive impression of the business.

"People have a different perspective when they first come here and you try to explain to them about how much we really love our horses and how we take care of them. I think I've changed some attitudes about the horse industry."

The horses are the easy part, according to Hatfield. Where stallions are black and white, she said that humans' personalities can be every shade of grey. But the horsewoman who was named 2011 Kentucky Farm Manager of the Year excels at overseeing every type of charge, both human and equine.

"I've never asked anyone to do anything that I haven't done or wouldn't do," she said. "I think that's important. Treating people like people. I remember when I was a groom, the manager would pull up in his truck and honk the horn and expect us to drop what we were doing and come outside. That always made me a little irritable, that they couldn't take the time to come inside and talk to us. So I've always tried to remember that and remember how excited I was the first time I got to lead a yearling to the sale ring or the first time I got to bring a stallion into the breeding shed."

Hatfield has mentored countless young people who have gone on to succeed in the industry, including several women who now work in stallion barns throughout Kentucky.

"I have two-legged kids and four-legged kids down there," she said, pointing toward the stud barn. "I've watched a lot of people grow up and do great things in this business. It's a feeling of accomplishment that I've watched those people go on to run their own divisions or become farm managers. I mean look at Veronica. She was a young girl, just going to college, and now she's managing stallions at Three Chimneys Farm."

"She's a good horsewoman," Hatfield said of her mentee. "She is also good with people and she speaks fluent Spanish. She knows her horses, which I think is one of the most important things."

Reed, who served as assistant stallion manager at WinStar Farm for four years before joining Hatfield back at Three Chimneys, speaks just as highly of her mentor. She said that no matter the continent, whenever Hatfield's name is mentioned, "basically the red carpet is rolled out."

"Her reputation in this industry is amazing," Reed said. "Not only is she a great horsewoman and very dedicated to what she does, but she also gives a great voice to the industry--a voice for everybody, not just females."

Hatfield's incredible attention to detail, Reed said, is something that she could not have learned from anyone else. **Cont.**

"I've never seen a stallion manager the way that she writes on her sheet. This mare did this or this mare was like that. When you go back to breeding that same mare the next year, you've got tons of information from all the years that she's been here

so you can warn the guys that this mare is difficult or this mare is really sweet. Her horses receive some of the best management I've ever seen around the world."

Yet even today, Hatfield and Reed face opposition from people who doubt their abilities in a male-dominated profession.

"There are a lot of people I talk to today who tell me that women can't work with stallions," Hatfield said. "I've been managing stallions for 35 years, so I know women can do it."

Asked about her greatest accomplishments, Hatfield said

that she is proud to serve as an example for young women in the industry and that she enjoys following the achievements of the people she has mentored.

"Those are great accomplishments," she reflected. "And being around a horse like Gun Runner is a great accomplishment. To be able to watch him grow and develop and become a great stallion is pretty spectacular."

Hatfield was present for many of the 2017 Horse of the Year's shining moments on the racetrack, including his career finale in the GI Pegasus World Cup where she flew home to Kentucky with him afterwards.

"He's very smart and personable," she said of the young sire sensation. "He's not a mean horse, but he will let you know that he is the man. He loves to go out and show off when we have tours. He's a magnificent horse, to think about what he did on the racetrack and see what he's doing as a stallion. He's going to be one of the ones that people will remember his name."

It was Gun Runner's auspicious start at stud that led to the careful changing of the guard in the Three Chimneys stallion barn.

"With Gun Runner's presence and who he is making himself out to be as an important stallion, we really felt a responsibility to him to make this transition as smooth as possible," explained the farm's COO, Chris Baker. "In 2023, we have the benefit of both Sandy and Veronica here. How that changes or when it's 100% Veronica, time will tell. That's up to Sandy. She has earned the right to plot her own course through this.

"Sandy has done a fantastic job over decades, operating at a very high standard and retiring champions from the racetrack and introducing them to the breeding shed," he continued. "Three Chimneys has been the beneficiary of Sandy's professionalism and experience. Both Sandy and Veronica are

driven by a passion for and a love of the horse. That's really what makes them so good at what they do." The love of the horse is

where it starts and ends for Hatfield. Even now, as she is supposedly in the early stages of retirement, Hatfield is up before the sun every morning, layering on coats for another breeding session. After 24 years at Three Chimneys, her love for the stallions she cares for and her passion for the industry keeps her coming back.

"I mean, it's what I love," she said. "I love getting to know the horses. I love the excitement of the breeding shed. I love talking to people about our industry and explaining to people what we do, how much we love our horses and how good of care we give all of them. It has been a great opportunity, a great learning experience, and hopefully I've done a good job."

PLAN FOR THE WORST: SEVERE WEATHER IN **CENTRAL KENTUCKY**

It can be one of a farm manager's biggest headaches: the weather. As spring brings severe weather across Central Kentucky, farms across the state are forced to deal with multiple threats along with the changing seasons--snow or ice storms, heavy rain and flooding, high winds, lightning, and even tornadoes. With herds of horses scattered across hundreds of acres, those fast-moving spring systems require a farm to be ready at a moment's notice to keep both human and equine

A strong area of low pressure swept across the region Friday, Mar. 3. At its peak, the storm produced wind gusts of between 60-80 mph through the afternoon and evening hours which downed trees and power lines, keeping customers in the dark for days following. The National Weather Service in Louisville reported a new daily record rainfall of 2.79" that day, the seventh-wettest March day in the city's history. **Cont.**

Severe Weather, cont.

In addition, several weak tornadoes touched down west of Louisville including an EF-1 which damaged property in and around Johnsburg while packing 105 mph winds.

For the Thoroughbred farms in Central Kentucky, having a plan in place to deal with these threats is key.

"If there is impending severe weather coming like we had [that] Friday, we have all the horses in the barns to protect against lightning, falling trees, and downed fences," said Claiborne Farm Manager Bradley Purcell. "Sometimes during the summer, these storms come up quick and there just isn't enough time to get the horses up so it's safer for the staff not to try and get them up. When we know severe weather is coming again like [that] Friday, we let all the employees go early so they can get home to safety and not

chance getting caught out in the storm traveling home. Planned or forecasted events we plan like we did Friday. The pop-up storms we just don't chance getting the staff in harms way and we have them stay in a safe place on the farm."

While Kentucky saw only one lightning-related death in 2022, thunderstorms remain one of the top risks to those working outside.

"When caught outside during a severe thunderstorm or tornado, the best option is to seek shelter inside a sturdy building immediately," advised Mike Kochasic, Warning Coordination Meteorologist with the Louisville office of the National Weather Service. "A basement is the best place, or if there's no basement, an interior room without windows [a closet or bathroom] is a good option."

When it comes to those working outdoors, he added: "Sheds, barns, and storage facilities will protect you from rain, but not severe wind from a bad thunderstorm or tornado. If you have time, get to a sturdy building and stay away from outside walls and windows. Taking shelter in a vehicle is not safe, but if caught in a vehicle the best course of action is to drive to a nearby safe shelter. If unable to make it to a safe shelter, get down in your car and cover your head, or as a last resort seek a low lying area to take cover such as a ditch or ravine, but be careful of flood waters."

As the spring and summer seasons roll in, farms in Kentucky are doing all they can to stay ahead of the weather with tools

like on-site training.

"We as a farm have tried to be proactive," added Lane's End Farm Manager Todd Claunch. "We provide safety training for our staff once a year. In addition to the usual CPR, first aid, and bio-hazard training, we also cover what to do when there is lifethreatening weather. It's important for us to monitor the

weather several times a day. If we know that unsafe conditions are expected, the horses will stay in the barns. Maintaining equipment and making sure that it is fueled and operating correctly is an important part of our plan. When we do have an event that requires immediate action, the entire farm staff are able to mobilize very quickly."

Having a plan in place for always-changing weather, regardless of the forecast, is always the best option to keep both staff and horses safe.

HIWU Q&A: DENALI STUD'S CRAIG BANDOROFF

The Horseracing Integrity & Welfare Unit (HIWU) provided this Q&A with questions submitted by Craig Bandoroff of Denali Stud.

Although I've read explanations and have had people try to explain it to me I still don't understand why we test to such a small level. As I understand it, a picogram is one-trillionth of a gram. How can that have any affect on a 1200-lb horse? Why do we test to such a small level? Are we using the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI)-recommended guidelines?

It is important to remember that a picogram is a measure of weight, not potency. While some legal drugs are more potent and are administered in low doses, others are less potent and require larger doses to achieve their intended effects. This is why the Screening Limits used by HISA are different depending on the substance.

It is also important to note that substance concentrations are reported "per milliliter." Thus, the picogram amounts you read in a lab report must be multiplied by approximately 50,000 to reflect the total milliliters of blood that can be found in a horse. *Cont.*

HIWU Q&A, cont.

The Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act requires HISA to adopt the standards used by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities (IFHA), which are followed in nations around the world and independent of the ARCI's guidance, as a starting point. The IFHA's Screening Limits and Thresholds are vetted by the European Horseracing Scientific Liaison Committee, which is composed of veterinary pharmacologists, regulatory veterinarians, chemists, and other racing regulators, before being approved by the IFHA. There are certain substances, e.g., phenylbutazone, for which the ADMC Standing Committee decided to deviate from the IFHA's published recommendations based on additional science and industry-specific insight.

Everyone agrees the ultimate goal is to keep honest people honest and dishonest people afraid to break the rules. And

that the objective is not to penalize trainers and owners that make honest inconsequential mistakes but rather catch the cheaters. Are we doing enough to catch the cheaters and those taking advantage of the system? The objective isn't to penalize honest trainers and subsequently their owners for honest mistakes that result in an insignificant overage and that don't affect a horse's performance, is it?

The Anti-Doping and

Medication Control (ADMC) Program is designed to detect and deter those who intentionally try to break the rules, thus compromising the integrity of the sport and the welfare of equine and human athletes. The Program includes a test distribution plan that will focus on utilizing testing resources in a manner that will both detect and deter violations, including thorough intelligence-based target testing.

In addition, sanctions associated with Anti-Doping Rule Violations, which include the use or administration of substances that are prohibited from being present in a horse at any time (Banned Substances), are intended to be harsh.

However, there are significantly less severe penalties for offenses related to legal Controlled Medication Substances. For example, the penalty for a first offense related to a Class C medication such as phenylbutazone or methocarbamol is the disqualification of race-day results and a fine of up to \$500. There is no suspension.

For many types of cases, direct penalties for the Covered Person(s) involved can be reduced or eliminated depending on the degree of fault determined by the adjudicator(s) hearing the case.

Promoting integrity of the competition and welfare of the horse are two key pillars of the ADMC Program. In support of these two principles, the regulations require that disqualifications are upheld for positive tests regardless of fault in acknowledgment of the fact that the integrity of the race and/or the welfare of the horse may have been compromised by the presence of a Prohibited Substance in the horse's system.

On a national scale, HIWU's team includes an investigations unit that will utilize data science, intelligence from local investigators and racing officials, e.g., stewards and regulatory veterinarians, and information received from HIWU's anonymous whistle blower platforms. This group's objectives are to identify and catch those who commit violations of the

Program, especially the most egregious offenses. HIWU Director of Intelligence & Strategy Shaun Richards brings 23 years of experience with the FBI and initiated and directed the criminal investigation that ultimately resulted in the indictments of more than 30 individuals, including trainers Jorge Navarro and Jason Servis.

What are we doing about positives that are possibly the result of contamination or human error? I was involved in

a case that it seemed the positive was a result of contamination at some point. A Hall of Fame trainer with a pristine record had a horse test positive for a sedative drug he said he doesn't use and the horse was never given. The horse ran his eyeballs out that day. My owner lost the \$40,000 purse. We think the sample was contaminated or perhaps nefarious behavior took place, or someone along the chain of testing made a mistake. I guess a positive is a positive and if you break the rules you are going to be penalized. Even so, that's not what we should be trying to do in regulating horse racing, is it? Do we have anything in place to address these types of situations?

The ADMC Program includes an Atypical Findings Policy that is intended to address cases of environmental contamination. Under this Policy, if a laboratory detects the presence of the following types of substances, it will report the result as "Atypical," NOT "positive": **Cont.**

HIWU Q&A, cont.

Specified Substances that pose a higher risk of being present due to environmental contamination, e.g., caffeine, cannabinoids, ractopamine, scopolamine, zilpaterol;

Endogenous substances, e.g., testosterone; or

Substances that pose a high risk of contamination but have yet to be identified.

When an Atypical Finding is issued, an investigation will be launched by HIWU, and the horse's trainer and/or owner will have the opportunity to provide information that can explain the presence of the substance. Examples of evidence could include proof that the horse consumed feed or bedding that was shown to have been contaminated with the substance in question. The trainer could also provide veterinary evidence indicative of the levels of the substance present in the horse naturally.

If HIWU determines that the Atypical Finding was due to environmental contamination and/or that the substance was not exogenously administered based on information gathered, the laboratory result will be considered negative, and no further action will be taken in connection with the result. Consequently, there will be no loss of purse money or imposition of any other sanctions.

The Atypical Findings Policy is intended to protect trainers from being punished for substance exposures beyond their control.

RMTC COMPLETES ANALYSIS OF HISA WITHDRAWAL GUIDANCE

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium's Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC) has now completed its analysis of HISA's proposed ADMC screening limits and detection times and has developed a withdrawal guidance limited to RMTC's schedule of Controlled Therapeutic Substances. This withdrawal guidance is based on existing research and administration data. The complete withdrawal guidance, which is subject to change, can be found here.

The intention is for the RMTC to provide the industry with scientifically derived information to aid attending veterinarians and horsemen in making medication decisions and to avoid preventable errors, promote compliance with HISA's regulations, and provide all available information in advance of HISA's expected ADMC implementation date of Mar. 27.



Beeby credits Goffs International Clients Relations Consultant Tom Taaffe, Nick Nugent and Gerry Hogan for their collective work in liaising with the sale vendors in recruiting the types of

horses that can succeed at the races, be it in the Gulf region or beyond, now and in the future. Taaffe suggested that the freedom to travel abroad during 2022 has made the task at hand significantly easier.

"The vendors, purchasers, Goffs and the Dubai Racing Club have learned much from last year," said Taaffe. 

"This is a breeze-up with a difference because virtually every An old-school mentality has been agreed to by the auctioneer and the Dubai Racing Club to allow other breeze-up held around the world are very clock-based," said Beeby. "When I first started with my father, what people were looking for in those days was a good three-quarter speed work on the bridle showing potential. That's what we told the vendors last year and I think it sat very well."

Taaffe added: "We have to credit His Highness Sheikh Mohammed and His Highness Sheikh Rashid for agreeing with Goffs to run the sale with no clocks. There is no timing here, it's not based on speed, it's about producing the most quality horse that will develop with more of a 3-year-old programme in mind and longer longevity because they race at four, five, six, seven here. Having no clock here is a big thing, we can give a horse a chance to develop and its head not to be blown. The emphasis is more on the longevity and a good career rather than speed."



Take Two

During last year's inaugural sale, 55 2-year-olds (from 69 offered) changed hands for turnover of €8,467,630, good for an average of €153,957 and a median price of €99,169. The event was topped by a colt by the wildly successful Hill 'n' Dale Kentucky-based Curlin who fetched just shy of €620,000 from Mohammed Al Subousi.

The 2022 Breeze-Up received a timely endorsement when two of its graduates--Go Soldier Go (Tapiture, €123,962) and Mr Raj (Bolt d'Oro, €86,773)--finished first and second, respectively, in the Listed Al Bastakiya S. on Super Saturday Mar. 4. The duo face a rematch in Saturday's G2 UAE Derby. Big Red Farm purchased Labeling (GB) (Frankel {GB}) for just over €520,638 at last year's event. Cont. p5

They watched as the half-brother to G3 Chartwell Fillies S. winner and G1 Matron S. runner-up Lily's Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and to the to the stakes-winning and multiple Group 2-placed Zurigha (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) won his maiden at first asking before finishing third, beaten a half-length, in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity last December.

"We've had 14 individual winners out of the sale now, six different countries," said Taaffe. "People are aware of that and I would expect it to fester and grow from there. This is a world-class sale, make no doubt about it. It can stand up properly over the test of time."

Beeby believes there was a bit of a feeling-out process among buyers and sellers alike last year which he expects to have dissipated this time around.

"There was plenty of interest last year, but there's definitely been greater interest this year," he said. "A lot of people watched last year, and we were pleased with the results, but there were people watching and monitoring and now they've seen the success."

The team at Goffs and the Dubai Racing Club are committed to grow and evolve as necessary, and Beeby believes that will be on full display during Tuesday's sale.

"I think the greatest thing we all learned was what that particular market wants and what works there," he said. "The horses that did well at the sale were the dirt horses or the real top-of-the-range European horses--the Frankels and Dubawis. You've got to work to your market. We've got another good bunch."

He won the G3 Sky High S. on March 11 with Protagonist (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), who previously ran in the colours borne to glory by Constitution Hill (GB) last week at the Cheltenham Festival but has now been bought from Michael Buckley by Australian Bloodstock. A week later back at Rosehill the Haggas team was at it again, with Dubai Honour (Ire) (Pride Of Dubai

{Aus}) providing Ryan Moore with one half of his Group 1 double in last Saturday's G1 Ranvet S., a race Haggas also won in 2020 with Addeybb (Ire).

The latter went on to strike two years in a row at Sydney's Championships, each time winning the G1 Queen Elizabeth S., which is now the target for Dubai Honour on April 8.

Issuing an update to *TDN* on Monday, Haggas said of Dubai Honour, "We're really pleased with him. He lost two kilos, which means he was either very fit or he didn't exert himself. He was very fresh this morning and is obviously very happy. He's a better horse, in our opinion, than he was at any stage last year. His last three furlongs on Saturday were quicker than the last three furlongs of Anamoe [in the 1500m George Ryder S.] and the last three furlongs of the Golden Slipper, and I think that puts some merit into his performance."

The 5-year-old gelding could well aim for a Queen Elizabeth double of a different kind, with Sha Tin's G1 QEII Cup on April 30 also under consideration.

"I've entered him this morning for Hong Kong and if all goes well he could take that in on the way home," Haggas said.

Not all has gone swimmingly for the four Haggas horses who made the trip to Australia as recent Kempton winner and last year's Ebor third Earl Of Tyrone (Ire) (Australia {GB}) is now facing a lengthy spell on the sidelines.

"Earl Of Tyrone was the one we were quite excited about but he has sadly damaged a tendon," reported the trainer. "It's really sad and so disappointing. He did well at Kempton and we would have had to decide between going for the Tancred or the Sydney Cup, but that's all over now."

Earl Of Tyrone was another bought last year by Australian Bloodstock, who could yet enjoy more success with Protagonist, who has several options in the coming weeks.

"Protagonist probably put up a career best when he won last weekend and we felt he would come on for that," said Haggas. "He may go to the Tancred on Saturday, or the Doncaster on April 1, or the Queen Elizabeth against Dubai Honour, but I don't think he'd beat Dubai Honour.

I think his connections are leaning towards the Doncaster, which is a very valuable mile handicap in which he's got a weight of 50kg, which is nothing.

"I'm not convinced [dropping back in trip is] the right way forward but he has won over a mile and he does seem in good form, and he'll probably never get the opportunity again of running off such a light weight in such a valuable race."

Haggas's regular jockey Tom Marquand missed out on riding Dubai Honour at the weekend as he continues his recovery from a shoulder injury sustained in a fall at Randwick on February 11. However, he arrived back in Australia on Sunday night and is ready to resume riding.

Haggas said, "Tom has a couple of rides in trials tomorrow [Tuesday] and at Kensington on Wednesday. He says he feels great and he knows his body better than anyone. He was here last Wednesday [in Newmarket] and he could fully extend his arm. He can't ride Protagonist in the Doncaster because he can't do that weight but he will ride Dubai Honour and also Purplepay in the Queen of the Turf."

The trainer will join Marquand and his team in Australia once he has overseen his runners on Lincoln day at Doncaster a week on Saturday.

The success of Dubai Honour in Australia and the Japanese-trained Panthalassa (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) in the G1 Saudi Cup last month have put the late Montjeu (Ire) in a strong position at the head of the broodmare sires' table in the early stages of this year.

Toronado Blows Hot Down Under

Toronado (Ire) has not returned to Haras de Bouquetot for the 2023 covering season, remaining instead at Swettenham Stud in Australia, where he is likely a favourite of the farm's owner Adam Sangster, who bred Saturday's G1 Galaxy H winner Mariamia (Aus). The 6-year-old mare is a daughter of Toronado, who has now sired back-to-back Galaxy winners, following the success last year of Shelby Sixtysix (Aus).

Toronado has also been represented in Australia by the G1 William Reid S. winner Masked Crusader (Aus) and, like his sire High Chaparral (Ire), has enjoyed more notable success in the southern hemisphere than in Europe.

The brilliantly tough High Chaparral shuttled to Windsor Park Stud in New Zealand and it is in that country where his influence remains the most keenly felt. His son Redwood (GB) is currently third in the New Zealand general sires' table, and he is joined on that list by fellow High Chaparral sires So You Think (NZ), Dundeel (NZ), Contributer (Ire), Wrote (Ire) and Tivaci (Aus). In Europe the only sons of the dual Derby and Breeders' Cup winner at stud are Free Eagle (Ire) and Tai Chi (Ger).

Deep Impact's Influence Extends

Another shuttle stallion who looks a decent addition to the New Zealand ranks is Satono Aladdin (Jpn), a Northern Farm-bred son of Deep Impact (Jpn) and winner of the G1 Yasuda Kinen.

From his first crop conceived at Rich Hill Stud hails Saturday's G1 New Zealand Oaks winner Pennyweka (NZ), who was bred by her trainer Jim Wallace with his brother Les. Satono Aladdin is also responsible for the Group 1-winning juvenile Tokyo Tycoon (NZ), and on Saturday he had the third home in the G2 Alister Clark S. at Moonee Valley.

The latter result represented something of a triumph for Japanese sires, who filled the trifecta courtesy of the winner Bank Maur (Aus), a son of Shadai/Arrowfield shuttler Maurice (Jpn) and runner-up Suizuro (Aus), by Real Impact (Jpn).

A top-class miler, who, like so many Japanese gallopers, raced until he was six, Satono Aladdin stands at Hokkaido's Breeders Stallion Station when on duty in Japan.

He is bred on the same Deep Impact/Storm Cat cross as Kizuna (Jpn), who was Japan's leading first-season sire of 2019 and ended last year in fourth place on the general sires' list behind the big-hitters Deep Impact, Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) and Heart's Cry (Jpn).

That same cross is also found in Kizuna's fellow Shadai resident Real Steel (Jpn), who was second in the freshman sires' table last year, the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf winner Loves Only You (Jpn), and the Lanwades stallion and Prix du Jockey Club winner Study Of Man (Ire), who has his first runners in Europe this year.


