

\$2.2-MILLION GUN RUNNER COLT POWERS DAY THREE AS OBS SPRING SALE STAYS THE COURSE

OCALA, FL – For the third straight day, the team of Bob Baffert and Donato Lanni, acting on behalf of Saudi businessman Amr Zedan, made the highest bid of the session, this time going to \$2.2 million--top price of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training sale so far--to acquire a colt by Gun Runner from the de Meric Sales consignment as the Spring sale continued to produce figures largely in line with its record-setting 2022 renewal.

Through three of four sessions, OBS has sold 519 juveniles for a total of 67,661,000. The cumulative average of 130,368 is down 3.7% from the corresponding end-of-day figure from 2022 and is down just 1.8% from the average of 132,821, which includes post-sale transactions from a year ago. The median of 65,000 is down 7.1% from a year ago.

"We were very pleased with the March sale and it seems like that momentum has carried on through April," said OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski. "We set records last year and here we are bumping up against those records this year. It feels good and it is a testament to the strength in the marketplace."

Zedan topped the sale's opening session with a \$1.45-million son of Arrogate and added a \$900,000 son of Frosted Wednesday.

"He's come with a big budget and that's helpful to the consignors," Wojciechowski said of Zedan. "It probably pushes horses that he gets and hopefully, it moves buyers to other horses and they look for other top prospects that they can settle on as well."

With 128 juveniles reported not sold after the final horse went through the ring Thursday, the buy-back rate was 19.8%. it was 16.5% at the same point a year ago.

While the figures remained stronger, consignors continued to see a polarization in the marketplace.


"I had so many people on that horse who just had to have him," Jesse Hoppel of Coastal Equine said after selling a colt by Blame for \$700,000. "But if you don't have the flavor of the week, they don't want to have anything to do with you."

Hoppel said the absence of a select sale like the Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream Sale has buyers scrambling to make sense of the new sales landscape.

"I think the buyers are confused," he said. "They don't know where to go. The 2-year-old sales market now lacks a select sale. It doesn't give you direction--where are these middle market horses going to be, where are the expensive horses going to be. Right now, they are scattered. The public doesn't have an idea of where to go for the right horses."

Still buyers found plenty of competition for the top lots.

"People are saying it's a little bit spotty, but at the same time anything we followed up seemed like it's made plenty of money," said Hunter Valley's Fergus Galvin after signing for a \$575,000 daughter of Into Mischief. "I don't think it's overly strong."

Bloodstock agent Donato Lanni, who has made the highest bid of each of the sale's first three days, said, "It's really strong for the top, top horses. The middle market looks like it is holding pretty strong. Everyone is here, so it's very strong for the top-end horses. The market was very strong here last year and we're seeing that again this year. Hopefully it continues that way."

The OBS Spring sale concludes with a final session Friday. Bidding begins at 10:30 a.m.

Guns Blazing at OBS Day 3

The storms that barreled through the Ocala area Wednesday night seemed like a mere breeze compared to the gale force that swept through the OBS sale's ring midway through Thursday's session. In the moments leading up to the entrance of Hip 782 into the ring, several of racing's biggest names lined up to duke it out for a juvenile colt by Horse of the Year Gun Runner. With several separate interests clashing, including agent Donato Lanni--accompanied by trainer Bob Baffert in their customary perch in the media box--and fellow Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen, who trained Gun Runner during his illustrious campaign, it was Amr Zedan's potent team that outlasted the rest to land the colt for a cool \$2.2 million.

"That was 'wow'," said Lanni. "Amr Zedan absolutely loved him and he *really* wanted the horse. He was not going to go home without that horse...Bob really loved him too. The whole team did."

Outlining some of the factors that led to the team extending to the sale-topping price through three sessions, Lanni offered, "He performed very well and had a great gallop out. He was really fast for a such a large-sized horse. He looks like he wants to go a Classic distance and has gears." *Cont.*

"It's nice to see a horse with that much size by Gun Runner who looks like a two-turn horse but also has the speed. He showed it here."

The Mar. 20 foal is out of Perfect Wife

(Majesticperfection), the dam of the colt's full-sibling GSP Runaway Wife.

"Every day when you have one like that in the barn, you're kind of sweating bullets and you're worried you'll walk into the barn and find him with his legs up in the air or colicking," said Nick de Meric. "But he's been a wonderful horse for us. Tristan and Val [de Meric] take the credit for producing him like they have."

Bred by Fern Circle Stables, the bay brought \$430,000 at Fasig-Tipton last July. Consigned by de Meric sales at OBS, the colt breezed in :10.1 last week.

"It was a ton of pressure," continued de Meric. "Frankly, that [yearling price] was out of our comfort zone. We just all felt so strongly about him and we had a couple of partners on him, so

we didn't have to shoulder the whole load.

"He affected all of us [when we first saw him] and we thought he could be something special."

Tristan de Meric was equally enthused with the colt.

"The way this horse moved, his balance and the way he just kept it up all day long [stood out]," he said. "He always did everything right. He's a horse with a great mind and did everything right from the get-go."

Reflecting on the colt's purchase last term, he continued, "We definitely stretched well

beyond our comfort zone, but when we were signing the ticket on him, it felt right. I am happy it all worked out. We were just lucky to have him." *Cont.*







In regard to the colt's illustrious sire, who led all second-crop sires and ranked sixth on the General Sires list in 2022, the junior de Meric explained, "We started out just trying to find some nice Gun Runners because we believed in him and he had a nice run with his first crop. It was amazing what he did with his first crop."

With the relief evident after hitting it out of the park following months of intense preparation, the elder de Meric could breath a sigh of relief now that the colt was going to get every chance under the care of the Hall of Fame trainer.

"All of us in this business know it doesn't work out like that every time. You need one of those every once in a while and that was outstanding. We couldn't be happier."--@CBossTDN

Hoppel Plays the Blame Game

When Jacob West signed the ticket at \$700,000 to obtain a colt by Blame (hip 786) on behalf of Repole Stable Thursday at OBS, it marked an impressive pinhooking score for consignor Jesse Hoppel, who purchased the youngster for \$70,000 at last year's OBS October sale.

"He was a very sleek horse that looked like he needed to grow up a lot," Hoppel said of his early impressions of the colt. "I still think he has growing up to do. There is no telling how good he

will be when he is finally there because he's not there yet. He's going to keep coming."

The colt is out of the unraced Petunia Face (Congrats) and is a half to graded winner Jalen Journey (With Distinction). He worked a quarter-mile last week in :21 flat.

Of the colt's final price Thursday, Hoppel said, "I was thinking in the \$400,000 to \$500,000 range, but this market is really polarized." *Cont.*

Uncle Mo Draws Fire Early at OBS

After a filly by Uncle Mo brought a \$675,000 final bid during the first day of selling at the OBS Spring sale, a colt by the Coolmore sire (Hip 682) realized the same amount Thursday afternoon. Consigned by agent Gene Recio, trainer Keith Desormeaux signed the ticket on behalf of Dallas, Texas-based Benjamin Gase, founder and CEO of the shipping technology company R2 Logistics.

"He didn't have as much as a quick cadence as most of these eighth-of-a-mile breezers but his movement was fluid, and he still went in :10.1," said Desormeaux. "That's what we're looking for, a horse with speed but most importantly the distance.

"I hate to use the same old cliche but he ticks every box."

Echoing the sentiment, Recio added, "He showed himself well and just has a lot of class. He didn't turn a hair the whole time. He did all the right things."

The colt was offered at Keeneland last September, bringing \$250,000 from Lynnwood Stable. The Apr. 26 colt was offered by a partnership that included the breeder, Breed First.

"I fell in love with him when I saw him at the yearling sales," explained Recio. "I didn't really think I was going to be able to buy him, I thought he was going to bring more than that."

The juvenile is out of the unraced Bodemeister mare Mezinka, a half-sister to dual Grade I-winning Pioneerof the Nile, who also finished runner-up in the GI Kentucky Derby.

"The breeder is a good friend of mine, so I am happy for them. They stayed in for a piece. I'm happy when it all works out like that."



The Desormeaux and Gase axis has already produced results, highlighted by a win in this winter's GII Rebel S. with Confidence Game (Candy Ride {Arg}), who was unearthed for a mere \$25,000 at Keeneland last September. Confidence Game currently stands 12th on the Kentucky Derby leaderboard with 57 points.

Clearly looking to mine another Classic-bred jewel with a longterm view on next season, Desormeaux enthusiastically outlined the colt's list of attributes.

"The horse has Classic pedigree, great lines, awesome conformation and a good foot," he said. "He was as good as you get from head to toe."

He continued, "One of the added values is that he has great sire value, being by Uncle Mo and with Pioneerof the Nile [under the second dam]. We know he's got speed and Classic distance on the bottom."

With the Classics still a year away, Desormeaux's ambitions in the shorter term appeared to be no less lofty.



Sheikh Fahad's Qatar Racing, which enjoyed top-level success along with partners with Caravel (Mizzen Mast) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint,

continued to build its U.S.-based string with the purchase of a filly by Into Mischief (hip 777) at OBS Thursday. Fergus Galvin of Hunter Valley Farm made the winning bid to acquire the filly for \$575,000 from the Wavertree Stables consignment.

"We actually haven't come up with a trainer for her yet, to be honest," Galvin said. "She will definitely stay in the U.S. She is a lovely, big filly. Ciaran [Dunne of Wavertree] recommended her well and we are very happy to get her."

The bay filly is out of the unraced Pearl River (Quality Road) and from the family of champion Sweet Catomine and multiple Grade I winner Life Is Sweet. She was bred by Pam and Martin Wygod.

Marc Tacher purchased the 7-year-old Pearl River, in foal to Nyquist, for \$50,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. In addition to Caravel, Qatar Racing was also partners on Shedaresthedevil (Daredevil), who was purchased for \$5 million

at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton
November and whose 2022
campaign included a win in the
GII Fleur de Lis S. The partners
returned the mare to the sales
ring at Fasig-Tipton last
November where she sold
again for \$5 million.

Caravel has already started 2023 a winner, recently winning the GIII Shakertown S. at Keeneland.

"We just have to keep our run going," Galvin said. "Sheikh Fahad is keen to establish a string here in the U.S. We've had a lot of success with turf

horses and now we are trying to aim a little bit more on the dirt side." @JessMartiniTDN

Here's Queen Elizabeth II visiting Three Chimneys Farm; here's George H.W. Bush posing with Seattle Slew.


Here's the unrepeatable Allaire du Pont, who sold him his first mare when he bought 100 acres of cattle pasture and renovated the farmhouse, reducing it from six chimneys to three. And here's Peter Burrell, his first client, who became like a second father.

Clay had put 10 stalls into a tobacco barn but they stood empty until Joe Taylor at Gainesway passed across this Englishman, Burrell, who wanted the kind of land enrichened by the longtime absence of horses. "We'll bill him \$7," Taylor said. "And we'll pay you six per day." Suddenly they had 10 boarders. Even in his mid-70s, however, these evocative images can now be supplemented by others that attest to Clay's undiminished engagement with the challenges and opportunities presented by the Thoroughbred. Having recently pulled no less a horse than

Olympiad (Speightstown) out of his hat, in Mage he has meanwhile bred one of the big wise guy fancies for the Derby itself.

After selling Three Chimneys to Goncalo Torrealba, a decade ago, Clay would have been entitled to ride off into the sunset. He had cashed out a brand that he had created, from scratch, by an exceptional acuity in the stallion market. Instead, he has adapted the same dexterity to a different corner of the marketplace: the same one, in effect, where he had previously found his clients.

"I didn't have this in mind," Clay acknowledges of the circumstances that have compelled *TDN's* visit. "But the farm had been sold and, well, I had some time on my hands--and you can't divorce yourself from this game! So, I put a little fund together, and we started investing in colts, in hopes that we might be able to develop a stallion. Sort of the flip of what I'd always done." *Cont.*

He already had good relationships with his principal investors. Everett Dobson of Cheyenne Stable had become not just a partner but a friend at Three Chimneys, while the Roth family (LNJ Foxwoods) had kept mares there and Clay has an ongoing affiliation with their advisors Jason Litt and Alex Solis II. (To be clear, there are minor variations in the composition of the

partnerships involved in various dimensions of the Grandview Equine portfolio.)

But while their priority was to roll the dice on some colts, there were one or two ancillary projects: some stallion shares, for instance, and a handful of mares to service them. That was how Grandview acquired a stakes-winning, Grade II-placed daughter of Big Brown named Puca--with a maiden cover by Gun Runner, then a rookie at Clay's old farm--for \$475,000 in November, 2018.

"She was trained by Billy Mott," Clay says. "I only found out later

that he really, really liked her, and thought she had a lot of ability. We haven't been buying many mares. I mean, this year we bought three more. We try not to overpay, and just pick around if there's some potential in there. She had stakes quality, and she's a lovely physical."


They deployed Puca on a Good Magic share, and she delivered a colt who was offered for sale through Runnymede Farm at the Keeneland September Sale of 2021.

"The night before the sale, he came up with a small issue," Clay recalls. "There was only a superficial swelling, but we were concerned and thought we'd better lower the reserve. But in the end, he brought more than we were going ask anyway."

The \$235,000 paid by New Team (for whom he proved only a fairly modest pinhook, reaching \$290,000 from OGMA Investments at the Mid-Atlantic Sale) had in any case been peripheral to the main agenda of developing colts. And sure enough, from only the second yearling crop prospected by Grandview--with around 15 purchases made from each--emerged the \$700,000 Speightstown colt (acquired by Solis/Litt at Keeneland in September 2019) who would become Olympiad.

"So yes, it worked out," Clay says with a smile. "Our idea was that if these colts weren't showing graded stakes potential, we would move them on, get them off the payroll as quickly as possible. We were playing the numbers game a bit, but I had a

great buying team. We invested for two years, and then sort of let it mature. And actually, we still have two other colts left out of that group, Gilded Age (Medaglia d'Oro) and Vindictive (Uncle Mo), and both are somewhat promising this year." (The former did well enough last year to try his luck in the GI Travers S., while the latter was beaten only a head on his graded stakes debut in the GIII Pimlico Special.)

Olympiad, of course, blossomed into the least embarrassed pursuer of Flightline (Tapit) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, having won his Grade I in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. Earlier in the campaign he had run up a sequence of four graded stakes, and Clay has no doubt that the vexation of having to sit out the Classics was redressed by the way he meanwhile matured.

"I have to say, he was in absolutely the right hands," he says.

"Billy Mott knew he had a lot of talent, and was very patient with him. Flightline was a monster, but you'd have to say Olympiad was the best of the rest. He was a really genuine horse and people need to go out and see him at Gainesway, he's a lovely type."

Having each retained a stake, Clay and his partners have been breeding mares to Olympiad and actually tried him with Puca. It may prove a blessing in disguise that she didn't catch, however, because she switched back to Good Magic--and their son, of course, has turned out to be none other than Mage.

"He won his first race at Gulfstream pretty easily, but you never know from that," Clay says. "He didn't gain much experience that day, didn't get mud in his face, but they then moved him up pretty fast. For his third race, to finish like he did, that's pretty remarkable. The move he made into the stretch, for a minute I thought he had it."

In the event, he had burned up too much fuel, too quickly, in the GI Florida Derby to hold off Forte (Violence). But even to be in the champion's vicinity, having only made his debut on January 28, entitles Clay and his partners to hope that Puca could put unexpected "gravy" on the menu they had put together.

"I hope he can be competitive in the Kentucky Derby," Clay admits. "And yes, that would be a lot of gravy! Potentially Puca could become very valuable." *Cont.*

Even as it stands, she has the 4-year-old Gun Runner filly she was carrying when purchased, who has won both her starts in allowances at Oaklawn this year.

One way or another, then, it looks as though Clay is going to have to keep adding to the photos on that office wall. It's quite remarkable, at this stage of his career, to be elaborating a personal legacy that resonates whenever he opens a catalogue and sees some of the names seeding second and third

generations: Seattle Slew, Dynaformer, Rahy. Yet putting Three Chimneys on the map had required real audacity.

"Everybody gets a big break in life, and mine was Slew o' Gold," he reflects. "I didn't have any stallions at the time I wrote this letter to Mickey Taylor and Jim Hill. I told them I wanted to create a unique, boutique stallion operation. At the time, I think Gainesway had something like 45 stallions, Spendthrift maybe 42, Claiborne 23. Those were your G.M., Chrysler,

Ford operations. And I said only wanted six, I wanted to compete with quality. Nobody else at the time was doing that."

Clay was on a vacation with Bud Greeley in Spain, en route to the Arc, when Taylor rang from Washington State at 3 a.m. local time.

"We got your letter," he said. "We've talked about it, we've checked you out. We want \$14 million."

Clay asked for a little time, knocked Greeley's door, and they sat there turning over the numbers for a couple of hours. Clay didn't even have a stallion barn, while his own net worth barely ran to six figures.

"But I was young," he recalls. "So, I came home and, on the Monday, took a lawyer to New York, and we did this \$14 million deal--for which I gave a down payment of \$20! And I was able to syndicate him in about 48 hours. Yes, I took a big risk. But it worked out beautifully."

Slew o' Gold didn't have a lasting impact at stud but had no fewer than five Grade I winners from his first crop, such was the quality of investment the young impresario had secured. So it was that the following summer, walking down the boxes at Saratoga, Clay was stopped by Taylor.

"Would you be interested in standing in Seattle Slew?"

"What do you mean?!" replied Clay. "I'd go home and bed down a stall tonight."

Seattle Slew had been a notoriously difficult breeder, but they

had worked out a modus operandi at Spendthrift--from where he was accompanied by his groom Tom Wade.

"He walked the horse onto the truck, and was told, 'If you stay on that truck, you don't have a job," says Clay. "So, the first thing he said to me when he put the horse in the stall was: 'I'm looking for a job.' And he was there with Seattle Slew until the day he died, really."

Having seen Seattle Slew in action (for want of a better word) in the breeding shed, Clay put him in a stall adjacent to the

teasing shed.

"So, he was able to listen to all of that," Clay recalls.
"And I promise you, when he walked out of his stall, from that point forward, he was never a shy breeder. I attribute it to a change of scenery, the new surroundings, and being able to hear, see and smell all that."

A daring approach having reaped such dividends on Slew o' Gold, Clay again

gambled big when buying into Chief's Crown after he won the GI Hopeful S. The horse was to be syndicated before the Breeders' Cup and Clay found himself with 20 shares to process.

"The Juvenile was the very first race at the first Breeders' Cup," Clay recalls. "And I said to my wife, 'We really need to win this race.' I didn't tell her I'd only sold 17 of the 20 shares! After he won, I sold those other three within an hour. So, we had Seattle Slew, Slew o' Gold and a champion 2-year-old, and it had all happened in a 24-month period."

But others soon began to emulate the Clay model. The industrial approach had taken the foal crop past 50,000 and that kind of market couldn't absorb economic shocks. Moreover, while modestly at pains not to take credit for what should be standard, Clay acknowledges that "the market was just hungry for integrity."

"I think we had a competitive advantage, being boutique," Clay reflects. "That part of our pitch appealed to people. It's like sending your kid to boarding school, you want to know who the headmaster is, what their philosophy is. So, 10 years later, everybody was boutique. Rather than having three competitors, I probably had eight.

"But everything about the market has changed. If you want to buy a horse today, you've really got to compete. And you don't have 40-share syndicates any more, because there's no exclusivity to these 200-mare books." *Cont.*


"Some horses, maybe Mr. Prospector, maybe Danzig, we probably wouldn't have heard of in this environment. That's sort of scary. Dynaformer, look at the impact he's had on the breed. Rahy was a little horse, not very impressive. But the Maktoums sent him 20 to 25 mares a year. That's a really big support system.

"But in the end these stallion farms are like sports franchises. If you've got Michael Jordan, your franchise is here." He raises a hand high. "Michael Jordan

retires, or Seattle Slew dies, your franchise is here." The hand drops way down. "You've got to find another one. And there's never any guarantee on that."

The one and only guarantee was the fidelity of cherished clients: people like John Mabee, or Tim Rogers who bought his first commercial foal. Rogers, rather unexpectedly, then took up an invitation to stay during the Keeneland sales, and before he went home, they had partnered on a 200-acre farm. Clay partnered Rogers and then his widow Sonia for over 30 years with "never one cross word," in the meantime taking on the King Ranch Farm together.

"So, we had these partnerships and friendships that have gone on for forever," Clay reflects. "And you never have to worry about the trust factor."

Much else has changed, however. Clay is dismayed by the loss of diversity in the gene pool; and the way that even the best stallions can't lock in the quality assured when Seattle Slew, in his first year at Three Chimneys, covered 46 mares. He sympathizes, however, with the farms that have to pay for their



stallions so quickly, with modern commercial breeders fleeing nervously from one freshman to the next. He's also convinced of the physical corrosion invited by the shuttling of sires.

Yet Clay has adapted to the modern environment sufficiently to produce Olympiad, himself evidently covering a bumper first book; and now he has the dam of a Derby colt. So, his legacy, already considerable, continues to evolve.

"Listen, you don't bank on anything, because I've seen so


many of them go the wrong way," he says. "But Olympiad, he's got a license. As for Puca, that was pretty fortuitous. We bred her to Good Magic because we had the shares, and all of a

> sudden, she's got a nice Derby prospect. So, while we had a great run at Three Chimneys, this is lots of fun too. We've got some dry powder, because of Olympiad, so we're looking for new opportunities wherever they may come. It makes you wish you were 20 again."

His features light up: no longer 20, perhaps, but full of enthusiasm.

"It was nearly February when that colt ran his first race," he savs with a smile. "We had no idea then. Now, who knows?"

The Texas-bred gelding clocked five furlongs in 1:01.40 and then was pulled up while galloping out down the backstretch. Trainer Joel Marr and jockey Ken Tohill, who was aboard for the breeze, were en route to Lexington as well.

FTC CONFIRMS MAY 22 START DATE FOR HISA'S ADMC PROGRAM

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) on Thursday issued what it called a "final rule" that pushes back the start date for the Horseracing Integrity and Safety (HISA) Authority's Anti-Doping and Medication Control (ADMC) program until May 22.

The ADMC program had been expected to go into effect May 1 after twice having its start delayed this year.

TDN had reported on Apr. 25 that this date change was in the pipeline. The switch was revealed when Tom Chuckas, the director of Thoroughbred horse racing for the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, on Tuesday brought up the ADMC's latest delay during a Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission meeting. *Cont.*





An FTC press release issued Thursday confirmed the change. "Today's new FTC rule notes that a recent federal court decision delayed the implementation of the Anti-Doping Rule until May 1, and the FTC rule also notes that further extending the Anti-Doping Rule's effective date to May 22 will ensure that the horseracing industry has sufficient time to prepare for the Anti-Doping Rule to become effective," an FTC press release stated.

"The FTC's rule notes that the extension will also avoid the chaos and confusion that could occur if the Anti-Doping Rule became effective on May 1, during the lead up to the Triple Crown races scheduled during May," the release stated.

LESLIE AND PIERRE AMESTOY JOIN THE TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST

Owners Leslie and Pierre Amestoy have been involved with a bunch of good horses, some of them stakes-winning Quarter Horses, but never anything like Practical Move (Practical Joke). The winner of the GII San Felipe S. and the GI Santa Anita Derby so far this year, he will be among the favorites in the upcoming GI Kentucky Derby.

The *TDN* Writers' Room podcast, presented by Keeneland caught up with the Amestoys this week to find out more about their operation, their background and their thoughts on Practical Move. They were the Green Group Guests of the Week.

Their trainer, Tim Yakteen, has been a big part of the story. While he has deputized for Bob Baffert the last two years with his potential Derby starters, he's not normally someone who you think of when it comes to having Derby starters. But the Amestoys believe he has been a perfect fit when it comes to Practical Move.

"One of my old racing partners, Mike Abraham, knew Tim," Pierre said. "And then another friend of mine, Jaime Gomez from Los Alamitos, knew Tim. I told them that I wanted to go to a nice barn, but I don't want to be with one of those barns that has 300, 400 horses. I want a more on-hands trainer. They both recommended Tim.

"We didn't meet Tim till last year's Del Mar meet, when Practical Move was running his first race was. He was just as nice as could be. And we could see the operation in the barn. Leslie trained for ten or 15 years. So we knew what we wanted and Tim was what we wanted. He had a great set up and a good operation."

The Amestoys, who own Practical Move in partnership with Roger Beasley, bought the horse at last year's OBS April sale. They said he was their number one pick among all the horses in the sale, but almost didn't get him. They budgeted \$175,000 for the purchase and wound up paying \$230,000. They liked the horse enough that they kept bidding until they got him.

"He was our number one pick, which we never get when we go to sales," Leslie said. "We always pick the number one and can't buy him. We got him and we had no buyer's remorse ever. Oh, we loved him from the start."

And that's why they named him Practical Move, because, in the end they thought it was a practical move to buy the colt.

As far as the Derby goes, the Amestoys are already thinking strategy.

"I think he's tactical enough," Pierre said. "Ramon [Vasquez] can put him where he wants him. I would hope we can get a good enough break that we hit the first turn and we have two thirds of them behind us. We want to be up in the first tier or right behind the first tier of horses. This horse has a really good, really strong, high cruising speed so we can get a good spot and then cruise on the backside and set ourselves up. So if we get our trip, I think coming out of the turn, we're going to be close to the leader and then they're going to have to come get us. If his horse switches leads like he's supposed to I think he'll finish strong."

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by Coolmore, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, 1/ST Racing, WinStar Farm and West Point Thoroughbreds, the team of Randy Moss, Zoe Cadman and Bill Finley took a look back at the problems with the track surface at Laurel, the positive results coming out of Hawthorne since that track cut the takeout on win, place and show bets to 12% and the newest additions to the Hall of Fame. Not to be missed, the trio also discussed Proxy (Tapit)'s win in the GII Oaklawn H., and the decision by Jimmy Jerkens, who has been struggling to find the winner's circle the last few years, to start training in Saudi Arabia. *Cont.*

RAISE CAIN AND AFFIRMATIVE LADY WORK AT KEENELAND AHEAD OF DERBY-OAKS

GI Kentucky Derby entrant **Raise Cain** (Violence), trained by Ben Colebrook, and GI Kentucky Oaks entrant **Affirmative Lady** (Arrogate), trained by Graham Motion, worked at Keeneland on Thursday morning.

Raise Cain covered a half-mile in company with the unraced 3-year-old filly **Merrily Rush** (Cross Traffic) in :49 on a fast track. Clockers caught him galloping out five furlongs in 1:02.80.

"I just wanted him to have something to run at: a horse five lengths in front of him because that's something he'll be doing in the Derby," his trainer said. "It went great. Just what we were looking for."

Andrew N. Warren and Rania Warren's colt is set to be Colebrook's first Derby starter, and was ridden by jockey Gerardo Corrales, who he said is "in the mix." Colebrook said a decision about the jockey had not been made.

AMO Racing USA's Affirmative Lady, who will be ridden by John Velazquez in the Oaks, had her final timed workout when she went five furlongs in 1:01.40 under exercise rider Kevin Lundie.

"Keeneland is where we're stabled right now, and I find it's a nice atmosphere to train here," Motion said. "Churchill's pretty busy, so I'm very comfortable with her being here. She'll have to be over there (early) next week, so she'll get to gallop on the track every day. She's had a breeze here already. I didn't really want to move her to another track to have her next breeze. Normally, I would have done it tomorrow, but with this weather coming in it looks like we've got to do it today. It's not ideal, but it's what we got."

WEEKLY STEWARDS AND COMMISSIONS RULINGS, APR. 18-24

California

Track: Santa Anita Date: 04/21/2023

Licensee: Flavien Prat, jockey **Penalty:** Three-day suspension **Violation:** Careless riding

Explainer: Jockey Flavien Prat, who rode Conclude in the seventh race at Santa Anita Park on April 9, 2023, is suspended for 3 racing days (April 29, 30 and May 5, 2023) for altering course without sufficient clearance and causing interference approaching the right turn (Hillside turf course). This constitutes a violation of California Horse Racing Board rule #1699 (Riding Rules – careless riding).

Explainer: After a hearing before the Board of Stewards, James Graham, who rode Rush Center in the second race at Keeneland on April 21, 2023, is hereby suspended three (3) racing days, April 29, May 2 and May 3, 2023 for careless riding in the stretch that resulted in the disqualification of his mount.

NEW HISA STEWARDS RULINGS



Asked if he was surprised to see Feed The Flame go off at odds of 7-2, Bozo replied, "I think the reason for that was because the horse who he beat easily on debut was well-beaten at Saint-Cloud on Wednesday. I suppose the form of that run and the talk about Silver Crack was very high, so I would say that was the reason why he was 5-1 up until a few minutes before the race. He beat what he had to beat on debut at Longchamp and I thought he was very impressive that day."

Indeed, Feed The Flame was put forward as a TDN Rising Star following that impressive debut performance that saw him pull over five lengths clear of the opposition earlier this month.

The form may not have been provided with a boost in the interim, but Feed The Flame confirmed that initial promise to be true on Thursday, to the delight of his co-breeder.

Bozo said, "I would say that the connections have big hopes for him. I won't speak on behalf of them but I would say that Jean-Louis Bouchard is not shy and he knows the French Derby well. I am sure they will regroup and see if they want to run him in the French Derby or try their luck abroad. I don't know."

Monceaux stretched to €700,000 to secure Feed The Flame's dam Knyazhna (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) at the December Sale at Arqana in 2018. At 12 years of age, Knyazhna could still have a number of big years ahead of her on the farm, and is reported to be in foal to Zarak (Fr).

Bozo said, "She has no yearling this year but had a Dubawi (Ire) colt that Mark McStay bought from us at Arqana last year. She had a spectacular filly foal by St Mark's Basilica (Fr) this year and is now in foal to Zarak.

"We had to pay for her. She was a young mare when she went to the sales and her first two foals were quite promising horses at the time. Sacred Life (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) has been a very good horse for the mare, both in France and in America." Cont. p4

He added, "She has a Le Havre (Ire) colt [Khagan {Ire}) who showed a bit of ability and was a black-type horse. We had to pay a good price for her and, hopefully, it looks like it could be worth it with this exciting prospect."

He added, "That's what we do all of this for. We try hard every day and invest a lot of money to try and breed exciting horses like Feed The Flame. This is how we keep having good results during the sale seasons, when we manage to produce horses with the potential of Feed The Flame.

"That is something we need to really focus on, to breed the Group 1 horses if we can. Kingman is a stallion who is able to produce at a very high level. He puts an awful lot of class into his horses and a turn of foot as well."

FEED THE FLAME (GB) (c, 3, Kingman (GB)--Knyazhna (Ire), by Montjeu (Ire)), who stood out from the crowd enough to warrant a TDN Rising Star tag on debut over 10 1/2 furlongs here earlier this month, was dropped out last of the quintet early by a confident Christophe Soumillon. Looming large on the outer to take command 300 metres from the finish, the 7-2 second favourite was under hand riding to assert his obvious superiority and score without breaking sweat by 1 1/4 lengths from First Minister (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Step Forward Anmaat

Even if Adayar has had an ideal Spring so far, this is unsuitably heavy ground for him and Owen Burrows has a potential thorn in his side in the form of Shadwell's G2 Prix Dollar winner Anmaat (Ire) (Awtaad {Ire}). Unbeaten last term, the gelding is one of the operation's more realistic big-league actors in 2023 and Angus Gold is looking forward to seeing how he measures against the best.

"We'll take it one race at a time, but obviously the plan in a perfect world is to make him a Group 1 winner," he said. "He's an incredibly tough horse with a great attitude. I don't think he's going to want firm ground, so we'll be guided by the conditions as to whether to he's a mid-summer horse or not."

The card's G2 Sandown Mile is the race most affected by scratches, but last year's G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois runner-up **Light Infantry (Fr)** (Fast Company {Ire}) could have an ideal chance to put himself in the picture for the upcoming G1 Lockinge S. and G1 Queen Anne S.

Godolphin put forward two **TDN Rising Stars** on the card, with the Listed Silver Tankard S. winner **Local Dynasty (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) sticking at a mile for the Esher Cup H. and G3 Zetland S. scorer **Flying Honours (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in the Classic Trial that boasted a first three of Alenquer (Fr) (Adlerflug {Ger}), Adayar and Yibir (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) two years ago and was won by Westover (GB) (Frankel {GB}) 12 months ago. Juddmonte's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud runner-up **Arrest (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}), Valmont's G1 Criterium International third **Salt Bay (Ger)** (Farhh {GB}) and The King & Queen Consort's exciting Salisbury novice scorer **Circle Of Fire (GB)** (Almanzor {Fr}) make for a

fascinating cast.

Juddmonte's racing manager Barry Mahon said, "He handled the heavy ground in France last year and I think it was pretty soft when he won at Ffos Las the time before. The trials are all so tight and all so close to the big day, so I think if he was to go to a Derby, we'd probably do what we did last year with Westover and go straight there from Sandown."

Westover's trainer Ralph Beckett said of Salt Bay, "I don't think the trip will be an issue, as he will probably get a mile and a half. He is a generous worker and a very straightforward customer. I think he is a horse that will probably improve physically as he gets older as he is that type, but let's hope he has improved enough over the winter to get competitive on Friday. Westover was much more experienced at this stage last year as he had already had three starts, whereas this fellow wouldn't know quite as much, so the comparisons are unfair at this stage."

ROYAL HORSE SLIPOFTHEPEN GALLOPS OVER ROWLEY MILE

Royal Guineas hopeful **Slipofthepen (GB)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) galloped over Newmarket's Rowley Mile on Thursday, as he prepares for the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas on Coronation Day, Saturday, May 6.

The two-for-two colt, bred by the late Queen and owned by the King and Queen Consort, has triumphed at Kempton last autumn and again on Apr. 10. Cont. p6

Trained by John and Thady Gosden, the chestnut will attempt to put an exclamation point on the Coronation of King Charles III, which will take place at Westminster Abbey roughly six hours prior to the Guineas at Newmarket.

John Gosden said, "He worked well and we'll obviously make our decision over the next few days [on whether he'll run]."

A rider for the colt has not been determined, but James Doyle was in the irons on Thursday.

Gosden added, "It depends. Frankie [Dettori] at the moment obviously has Chaldean (GB) (Frankel {GB}), the [G1] Dewhurst winner, so we'll just have to see.

"Depending on what else runs, James may well be available. There are decisions to be made."

Joining Slipofthepen on the Rowley Mile excursion was D. Howden's **Running Lion (GB)** (Roaring Lion). The grey is three-for-four, and is riding a three-race winning streak. Fresh off of a one-length condition score at Kempton on Apr. 10, the filly is among the entries of the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas on Sunday, May 7.

Slipofthepen is currently a 20-1 shot to win the first British Classic of the year. The QIPCO Guineas Festival runs from May 5-7, with the racecourse opening early to show ceremonial events in full.

BHA STATEMENT RELEASED FOLLOWING PUBLICATION OF THE GAMBLING ACT WHITE PAPER

The Gambling Act Review White Paper, an important step to ensuring proper gambling regulations fit for the digital age, was published by the UK Government on Thursday. The British

Horseracing Authority (BHA) welcomed the news.

There will now be a period of consultation between the Government and partners during which the BHA will continue to work to deliver a secure future for the sport.

Joe Saumarez Smith, Chair of the British Horseracing Authority and member of the Gambling Strategy Group (which has led on representations around the Gambling Act Review and Horserace Betting Levy reform) said, "Today's publication of the White Paper is an important moment for the industry on a significant issue for its future prosperity.

"It is crucial that any regulatory framework for gambling recognises that millions of people safely enjoy betting on horseracing, while taking action where needed to protect people experiencing gambling-related harm. British racing is already supporting work in this area through the development of a safer gambling policy, building on good practice already established on our racecourses.

"We are pleased that the UK Government has reflected on our industry's detailed representations and recognised the importance of British racing in today's White Paper. Throughout the last two years, we have spoken clearly and with one voice to the Government about the importance of proportionate legislation, and the significant potential for unintended consequences.

"While there are a range of measures included within the White Paper, there will be a series of further important consultation processes--including on the critical area of affordability checks--in the months ahead.

"In these, we will continue to make our case that sweeping blanket checks on affordability are not appropriate, with any measures needing to being proportionate and targeted at individuals and their specific circumstances." Cont. p7

He added, "We will now undertake further consideration of these measures, assessing their impacts on British Racing, and will provide a comprehensive, evidence-based, response to the various processes which today's White Paper has commenced."

Julie Harrington, Chief Executive of the British Horseracing Authority, also stressed the importance of the White Paper and confirmed the Government's forthcoming review of the Horserace Betting Levy and added, "We very much welcome the launch of the review of the Horserace Betting Levy. This important review provides an opportunity for the Government to ensure British racing receives a fair return from betting activity, protects the sport against inflationary pressures, and maintains our position as the world-leader in thoroughbred racing and breeding.

"We call on the Government to now complete and implement this Levy review as soon as possible in order to support a great British sporting and cultural asset.

"While the publication of the White Paper sets out a roadmap for the future of gambling regulation in Britain, it is clear that substantial consultations will be required in the important weeks and months ahead."

impact per annum.

"We want to work with our partners in the media rights companies to do our own economic check on those numbers. We're a little concerned that it might be an underestimation."

However, that was not the only concern the BHA expressed, and Harrington noted that the organisation is also aiming to ensure that seasonal gamblers are not unduly penalised.

"Part of our conversations with the Gambling Commission has got to be taking into account customer behaviour and historic customer behaviour shows that people do save up for those major festivals in the same way that other people would save up for holiday," Harrington said.

"We've got a huge amount of evidence on that to share with the Gambling Commission. The wording is also around net losses, so we know some of our customers might use their winnings from a major festival to fund their punting for the remainder of the year--how will those checks take that into account?

"Particularly the 90-day threshold, you could still be losing money in July that you won in March. It's a detail that we need to get some context on."

AFFORDABILITY CHECKS TO BE 'FRICTIONLESS FOR CUSTOMERS'

The affordability checks on lower-level gambling spend proposed in the Gambling Act Review White Paper will be streamlined as much as possible to minimise the inconvenience to the betting public, according to the British Horseracing Authority, who welcomed the news of the Paper's publication earlier on Thursday.

The paper proposes a £125-threshold net loss within a month or £500 within a year and also states that the checks will be 'frictionless for customers and conducted online by credit reference agencies'.

BHA Chief Executive Julie Harrington said, "The numbers around the less intrusive checks, the £125, are much lower [than anticipated], but it depends on the big unknown for us.

"The work we will do with the Gambling Commission on behalf of the government is how unintrusive and friction-free those checks are. The one area we want to get visibility on to see how much of a risk it is to us is those friction-free tests at the lower end of losses."

The Gambling Act White Paper estimated that racing would lose anywhere from £8.4 million and £14.9 million a year as a result of the proposal.

Harrington added, "The government's own economic impact work is estimating between £8.4 and £14.9 million negative

GOFFS PUNCHESTOWN SALE BILLED AS 'SENSATIONAL', AS QUALIMITA MAKES 500K

Consigned by Ballyboy Stables, the gelding is kin to graded-winning chasers Alfie Sherrin (GB) (Kayf Tara {GB}), Kimberlite Candy (Ire) (Flemensfirth) and Hawkes Point (GB) (Kayf Tara {GB}).

"The Original Festival Sale returned a trade that can only be described in the richest of superlatives with huge increases in every statistic and a magnificent new record top price of €500,000," Beeby continued.

"As ever we are indebted to the vendors who put their trust in the Goffs service and sent such quality to the Punchestown Sale. They are a mighty bunch as they truly put their money where their mouth is year after year and it is fantastic to see results like these today."

Successful twice at Chantilly and once at Deauville during the winter, Sauterne had done enough to warrant being sent off the favourite for the ultra-competitive G3 Prix Imprudence back at the Normandy venue earlier this month but beat only one rival home. Always travelling comfortably shadowing the leader Le Tabou, the bay was committed two out and gradually asserted her dominance over her rivals for a clear-cut breakthrough black-type success and keep her connections' G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches dreams alive.



PRIZE-MONEY INCREASED FOR FWD CHAMPIONS DAY IN 2024

Following the news that the domestic prize-money in Hong Kong will increase by 8% during the 2023/24 season, the 2024 FWD Champions Day Group 1 prize-money will also rise to a combined HK\$72 million, the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) announced on Thursday.

The 2000-metre G1 FWD QEII Cup will be run for a purse of HK\$28 million (£2,863,265/€3,240,543/\$3,566,929) (+12%), making it the richest 2000-metre turf race in the world. The 1200-metre G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize and the 1600-metre G1 FWD Champions Mile will each hold a purse of HK\$22 million (£2,249,009/€2,544,984/\$2,802,587), an increase of 10%, respectively, on their 2023 editions.

"We are well-established as a world leader but we are conscious that this requires continuous new investment, especially as international competition intensifies," said HKJC Chief Executive Officer Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges. "We are determined that Hong Kong's international race days continue to be destinations of choice for owners, trainers and jockeys from all over the globe.

"FWD Champions Day provides us with the perfect stage to showcase Hong Kong racing to the world while, at the same time, presenting a platform for international horses, trainers and jockeys to compete at the highest level against Hong Kong's finest. This further investment in prize-money is an important element to achieving this"

All three FWD Champions Day Group 1 races were last year rated in the World's Top 100 Group 1 races. Sunday, Apr. 30 marks the 2023 FWD Champions Day.
