



KY OAKS WINNER RETURNS ON BELMONT'S 'PRETTY' STACKED FRIDAY CARD

ELMONT, NY – After canceling Thursday's card at Belmont Park amid poor air quality issues, there is optimism that live racing will return with Friday's 11-race program featuring a trio of Grade I events.

Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief), last seen pulling off a dramatic 10-1 upset with first-time blinkers in the GI Kentucky Oaks, will take on seven rivals in the GI Acorn S.

"She's doing great and hasn't missed a beat since she came out of the Oaks," trainer Brendan Walsh said. "This was the obvious next step for her. It's full steam ahead for tomorrow."

The Godolphin homebred turns back slightly in distance to a one-turn 1 1/16 miles, while 9-5 morning-line favorite and 'TDN Rising Star' Munnys Gold (Munnings) makes her first attempt beyond seven furlongs. The latter suffered her first career defeat as the heavy favorite by a painful head in the GII Eight Belles S. at Churchill Downs May 5.

Two-time Grade I winner and two-time Breeders' Cup third-place finisher **War Like Goddess** (English Channel) headlines an eight-horse field in the 1 1/4-mile grassy GI New York S. The George Krikorian colorbearer faces last year's GI Belmont Oaks Invitational S. one-two **McKulick (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) and **With The Moonlight (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}). *Cont. p3*

COURT RULES THAT RICE LICENSE REVOCATION IS UNWARRANTED by Bill Finley

The New York State Gaming Commission (NYSGC)'s three-year ban of trainer Linda Rice is "entirely unwarranted," according to a decision handed down Thursday by the New York Supreme Court's Appellate Division (Third Department). The decision was unanimous.

The Gaming Commission fined Rice \$50,000 and revoked her license for three years on May 17, 2021 after investigating claims that Rice received favorable treatment from the NYRA racing office and that the racing office was releasing to her the names and past performances of horses that had already been entered in races, giving her an unfair advantage. It has been alleged that Rice had paid racing officials in exchange for the information, a charge she denied. *Cont. p3*

Others looking to take on War Like Goddess include streaking GIII Modesty S. winner **Didia (Arg)** (Orpen) and last term's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. winner **Shantisara (Ire)** (Coulsty {Ire}).

The five-horse field for the GI Just a Game S. features a showdown between front-running three-time Grade I winner

and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf runner-up 'TDN Rising Star' In Italian (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and talented New York-bred Spendarella (Karakontie {Jpn}). Trained by Chad Brown, In Italian was third in this race last year. Brown has won a remarkable five out of the last six renewals of the Just a Game. Last term's GI Del Mar Oaks heroine and G1 Coronation S. runner-up Spendarella was second as the favorite in her GII Longines Churchill Distaff Turf Mile S. comebacker May 6.

With a 12:50 p.m. first post, Belmont's Friday card also includes two additional graded races on the turf, the GII Belmont Gold Cup going two miles and the GIII Intercontinental S. at six furlongs.

She did admit to routinely giving members of the racing department, as well as the gate crew, Christmas presents. Rice appealed the decision and was granted an injunction, which allowed her to continue training after the ruling.

The court delved into the tactics the racing office used to "hustle" horses into races when there was not an adequate amount of entries and found that providing trainers with information about the horses already entered was not uncommon. *Cont.*

"Finally, petitioner argues, and we agree, that the penalty of a three-year revocation of her license is so disproportionate to the offense and shockingly unfair as to constitute and abuse of discretion as a matter of law," the ruling read.

The court also noted that Rice's gender may have been a part of the story.

"Not to be overlooked is that petitioner is the only trainer ever disciplined by respondent for this rule violation--a troublesome point given that petitioner is the only female trainer ever to win a training title at a New York track."

It appears that Rice will still have to pay the fine as the ruling noted that neither the court nor Rice's legal team had an issue with that portion of the penalty.

"No one took issue with the fine," said Rice's attorney Andrew Turro. "That was part of the oral argument. The oral argument

was that you cannot revoke her license for this."

The Gaming Commission was looking into a period that began in early 2012 and ran through August, 2014. Martin Panza, then NYRA's senior vice president of racing operations, testified that there was no written rule restricting the information a racing

> clerk could disclose during the hustling process but that it was commonly understood in racing circles that the disclosure of the names of horses that had already been entered was prohibited. Other witnesses confirmed that certain information about horses already entered into a race was often shared with trainers, including the number of horses entered and whether or not there were horses in the race with early speed.

While Panza maintained that the information provided to Rice gave

her an advantage, P.J. Campo, who was the NYRA racing secretary during the period in question, downplayed the idea that Rice had an edge on her rivals. Cont.

"From Panza's perspective, petitioner's actions compromised the integrity of racing," the court wrote. "Campo, who served as racing secretary throughout most of the disputed period, downplayed the issue. Campo observed that most of the trainers would already know which horses would be expected to run in certain races. Campo acknowledged that having the horse names would be an advantage 'to a degree' but that such information would not affect anything."

Considering that "hustling" horses often led to the racing office divulging information about what horses had already been entered in race was, the court reasoned, part of the problem.

"...NYRA bears much of the responsibility for what happened in this matter by fostering an aptly named 'hustling' process without a defined written rule or diligent oversight," the court wrote.

At deadline for this story, Rice had not returned a phone call seeking her comment.

"This was a thoughtful decision from the court and I am very grateful that they will allow my client to continue to race and pursue her livelihood," Turro said. "She's a wonderful trainer and this is what she deserved."

Rice, who has been training since 1987, has 2,314 career wins. Her accomplishments include winning the 2009 training title at Saratoga when she won 20 races. She was also the leading trainer at the recently concluded Aqueduct spring meet, where she won 17 races.

AIR QUALITY ISSUES FORCE BELMONT TO CANCEL THURSDAY'S CARD; OPTIMISM FOR THE WEEKEND by Steve Sherack

ELMONT, NY – With unhealthy air quality conditions continuing to impact Long Island and all of New York State due to the Canadian wildfires, live racing at Belmont Park Thursday-the first of three days of the highly anticipated Belmont Stakes Racing Festival--was canceled.

Thursday's co-featured GII Wonder Again S. and Jersey Girl S. were redrawn and brought back for Sunday's card.

As previously announced late Wednesday evening, training was canceled at both Saratoga Race Course and Belmont Park for Thursday morning.

"Safety is paramount as we navigate this unprecedented situation," NYRA President & CEO David O'Rourke said in a press release. "NYRA will actively monitor all available data and weather information as we work toward the resumption of training and racing both here at Belmont Park and at Saratoga Race Course. Based on current forecast models and consultation with our external weather services, we remain optimistic that

we will see an improvement in air quality on Friday."

Live racing is slated to resume with an 11-race program featuring five stakes races at Belmont Park on Friday.

Trainer Brendan Walsh will be represented in the card's three Grade I races with GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Pretty Mischievous** (Into Mischief) in the GI Acorn S., **'TDN Rising Star' New Year's Eve** (Kitten's Joy) in the GI Just a Game S. and **Flirting Bridge** (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) in the GI New York S.

"Reading between the lines, it looks like it's starting to improve," Walsh said Thursday morning. "Obviously, if the air quality is no good, then nobody is gonna go on to run. But if it's OK, then it's OK. I get the impression that it's a lot better today and the general consensus is that it's going to be cleared out later today." *Cont.*

Walsh continued, "It's not ideal (missing a day of training), today especially. I've had similar situations before with snow and other things though. We shedrowed all of our horses today. We're just gonna have to make the best of it."

NYSGC: `NO RACING OR TRAINING IF AQI REACHES 201'

The New York State Racing and Gaming Commission (NYSGC) issued clear regulations regarding racing and training at Belmont Park based on the Air Quality Index (AQI) Thursday afternoon, in light of the ongoing poor air quality due to the Canadian wildfires, according to a press release from Scott Palmer, the state's Equine Medical Director.

The press release reads: "If the AQI is between 151 and 200, no horse will be allowed to workout or race unless their attending veterinarian certifies that the horse will not be adversely affected by the elevated AQI. If an entered horse evidenced a respiratory issue, the horse must be declared unfit and scratched without penalty. Under present practice, the horse would be placed on the Veterinarian's List when scratched. Horses declared fit to race must be closely scrutinized before and after racing to ensure that they are not experiencing clinical signs of respiratory distress. Pre-race examinations of association veterinarians should include auscultation of the lungs and airways.

"If the AQI reaches 201, no racing or training may be conducted," the release said.

"As stewards of the horse, we must do what we can to ensure their health and safety," said Palmer in a statement.

"Particulates in the atmosphere can build up in both horse and human respiratory systems causing serious health problems including irritation of the eyes and respiratory tract. Poor air quality can irritate pre-existing conditions, including asthma in people and recurrent airway obstruction, or heaves, in horses, as well as Exercise-Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhage. High concentrations of smoke and particulates can cause persistent cough, nasal discharge, and wheezing, and increased effort to breathe and can alter the immune system."

The AQI is published by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency, and it considers the amount of particle pollution, ground-level ozone, and toxic gases (carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide and nitrogen dioxide) in the air. The AQI varies from location to location and changes throughout the day. As of Thursday at noon, the AQI in Elmont, New York, where Belmont Park is located, was 151.

New York Governor Kathy Hochul praised the Gaming Commission's steps. "As New Yorkers continue to experience unhealthy air quality as a result of Canadian wildfires, we must all work to ensure that animals--including these peak-performance equine athletes--are protected," Governor Hochul said. "The measures being implemented at tracks across New York State are effective steps to keep all those who participate in the sport safe now and into the future."

Wednesday, Hochul encouraged New Yorkers to postpone any outdoor activities in impacted regions until conditions improve. "Accordingly, the New York State Gaming Commission directed all tracks to stop all racing, training and workouts until further notice," reads a statement from Hochul's office. "The Gaming Commission continues to monitor air quality and rely on guidance from veterinary expertise to ensure any decision to resume racing is based solely in the best interest of the horse population." "This guidance was arrived at in consultation with the New York Racing Association and is grounded in our shared efforts to provide the safest possible environment for training and racing Thoroughbred horses throughout New York State," said NYRA's Director of Communications Patrick McKenna. "NYRA will continue to closely monitor air quality in and around Belmont Park in the coming days, and we remain optimistic that conditions will allow for the resumption of training and racing on Friday."

blue-and-white checkered colors of Meadow Stables appeared on the track. Secretariat's coat caught the late afternoon light and shone like burnished copper. His neck was bowed, and he walked with a demeanor which was regal in its calmness. I can recall nothing about the four other competitors. My eyes were riveted on that piece of equine perfection which carried 126

pounds and 25 years of hope on its back.

The crowd cheered, shouted, and clapped, the reverberations from the excitement so high, the air seemed to sing. Secretariat was a model of deportment throughout the playing of the traditional "Sidewalks of New York," the announcer's introductions, and the uproarious reception from the multitude. His composure was so restrained, that it was only in the warm-up that one caught a glimpse of the enormous power of his underlying musculature.

In watching countless replays of Secretariat's Belmont, I have felt like a pilgrim returning to holy ground. What remains is a recollection of an event so transcendent that it has illuminated my life and lit my inner world for 50 years.

I will never forget the angst of watching what many considered to be a premature move by Ron Turcotte on the first turn, and the heart-cracking fear that the long sweep of Belmont's stretch would sap Secretariat's last ounce of strength. I cannot hear a replay of TV announcer Chic Anderson's classic call of "Secretariat is widening now, he is moving like a tremendous machine," without reliving the fervor of the crowd, which recognized that they were present at that rarest of alignments—when greatness gives birth to legend; the terror that the giant grandstand would not withstand the seismic shaking of thousands of stomping feet; and the euphoria that motivated a wall of humans to rise in unison to applaud a horse that, for one moment in time, became the embodiment of as much beauty as one could ever hope to see in this world. *Cont.*

THE REMAINS OF ONE MAGNIFICENT DAY

The 50 years that have passed since Secretariat's Herculean victory in the Belmont Stakes have taken a toll on the number of the 67,605 souls who came to witness history and saw a day sanctified by the racing gods. But then, unlike Secretariat, we are mere mortals. I am one of the dwindling number of those who were present on that sweltering day in June 1973. The memory of that magnificent day remains, intensely vibrant and charged with emotion, but it is now more a mosaic than a painting, with some chips lost to time. These are the images of that turbulent time and of that glorious day that have endured:

In the spring of 1973, a country steeped in discord was waiting with open arms to welcome a new standard-bearer, pure and noble, better than the best of themselves. A hero emerged in the form of a charismatic horse, as burning red as a spark sprung from the torch of a god. Within his body beat a titanic heart, nearly three times the size of the average Thoroughbred's. His name was Secretariat.

The second Saturday in June dawned hot and sultry, the first day of the year to reach 90-plus degrees. In anticipation of heavy demand, the Long Island Railway had added extra cars to its Penn Station-Belmont run. I was soon seated cheek-by-jowl amongst every definition of racing's demographic in a sauna on wheels, all stoked with the hope that the 25-year Triple Crown drought would be brought to an end.

At Belmont, the heat and humidity were stifling, and every available shady spot was soon snatched. In defiance of the fire laws, fans were standing on the stairways and in the aisles, anyplace they could to catch a glimpse of the horse which had captured the country's imagination for the past five weeks. I found a few spare inches in the grandstand and guarded my ground.

The hour before post-time was a clinic in anxiety management. I wanted Secretariat to win so badly, I would have gladly traded years off my life to seal the deal. The noise from the crowd was unrelenting and rose to a crescendo when the familiar

With tears streaming as I watched Secretariat's incredible lead continue to lengthen and Ron Turcotte steal a backward glance at history, I experienced an elation so magnificent that I cannot manufacture the words to describe it.

Secretariat had run the fastest Belmont on record, shattering the old mark by an amazing 2 3/5 seconds, and he had broken the world record for 1 1/2 miles. His winning margin was a mind-boggling 31 lengths. But it was not merely a matter of time and distance. For two minutes and 24 seconds on June 9, 1973, Secretariat was the culmination of the best of his breed and the consummate expression of the highest part of ourselves. He was everything that his Maker and nature had intended. The world was not perfect that day. But he was. Fifty years later, the flame of that memory endures. His name is Secretariat.

DAVE O'ROURKE JOINS THE TDN WRITERS' **ROOM**

Not much has changed at the New York Racing Association (NYRA) in recent years, but that's about to change. A new Belmont Park is now in the planning stages and is expected to be ready for the 2026 spring meet. And what about the GI Belmont S.? Will the three Triple Crown tracks stick to tradition or will there be an overhaul of the series, which would likely mean that the final leg of the Triple Crown will be pushed back a few weeks? To answer to those questions and more, NYRA CEO and President Dave O'Rourke joined this week's TDN Writers' Room podcast, which is presented by Keeneland. O'Rourke was this week's Green Group Guest of the Week.

When it came to possible changes to the Triple Crown structure, O'Rourke advocated that U.S. racing form something along the lines of the European Pattern Committee, a group that could work with the tracks so that stakes schedules are better organized and coordinated. Such a committee, he said, could look into not just changes to the Triple Crown schedule but at all stakes schedules.

"I believe that a pattern committee would work for the sport in the United States," he said. "It would help in a lot of other areas--the spacing of the Triple Crown, the spacing of other stakes races around the country and lead us to a more cohesive schedule. (Changing the spacing of the Triple Crown races) is a conversation that you would always have to be open to. But I think if we just limit the discussion to just these three races that might be a mistake. We should possibly take a look at the entire stakes schedule in the U.S. The foal crop has changed and the dynamics of racing are different than they were 20 years ago. Everything should be reexamined."

With a new Belmont Park in the offing, the plan is to run the 2024 spring meet at the current track and then start construction on a new grandstand that will be ready for the 2026 spring meet at Belmont. So what does that mean for the 2025 spring meet and, in particular the GI Belmont? O'Rourke said that decision has yet to have been made, but said that running the race at Saratoga was among the possibilities.

"That might send a benchmark that would be hard to match because that would be sort of unique," O'Rourke said. "That would be really cool. There's no doubt on that from a fan perspective."

Another change that will be ushered in at Belmont will be the addition of a synthetic surface track, which will help with having winter racing there. When it comes to synthetic tracks and their place in the future of racing, O'Rourke said the sport needs to closely examine the data.

"There's a lot of tradition with the dirt racing in the United States," he said. "With safety, you can't compromise. So you go where the data leads us. Now that we have HISA and we have the ability to have uniform rules, we can let the data lead us to where we need to be. If you look at racing, it's a worldwide sport and the statistics for the sport are incredible. We can benchmark ourselves and best practices."

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by Coolmore, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, 1/ST Racing, WinStar Farm, XBTV, Lane's End and West Point Thoroughbreds, podcast regulars Zoe Cadman and Bill Finley were joined by TDN correspondent T.D. Thornton. The group put on their handicapping hats and went through the huge Saturday card at Belmont, including the Belmont Stakes. Other topics of discussion included the decision by Churchill Downs to move its meet to Ellis Park and whether or not it's time for the sport to abandon dirt racing in favor of synthetic surfaces.

National Treasure drew post one, added blinkers, and looked on paper to be the controlling speed in the GI Preakness S. After asserting command with little resistance through leisurely opening quarters of :23.95, :24.9 and :24.57, his wiring of the field was almost a foregone conclusion.

He did have to claw back the lead when Blazing Sevens (Good Magic) edged in front between calls in deep stretch, but this \$500,000 FTSAUG son of Quality Road always had the upper hand. If anything, National Treasure was emboldened by the bumping and brushing with Blazing Sevens before finishing with purpose.

Most post-race analysis focused on those lethargic early splits that lulled the competition and kept National Treasure fresh. But how about that final three-sixteenths blitzed in :18.05?

National Treasure's clocking through that last furlong and a half of the race is almost too quick to believe. It ranks as the fastest since Summer Squall's 1990 Preakness, which was 18

seconds flat. Back then, timing was done in fifths and not hundredths of a second, so it's conceivable National Treasure's fraction ranks marginally faster. At the time, Summer Squall's closing three-sixteenths fraction was widely reported to be a Preakness record (Equibase charts that break out the final three-sixteenths date only to 1991). If National Treasure's clocking is for real, it has to be respected.

Back in March, National Treasure missed some training

and an expected start in the GII San Felipe S. because of a quarter crack. His so-so fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby must be viewed in the light that that nine-furlong try was his first race in three months. So now the question becomes was the Preakness his peak effort, or a bridge to better things in the Belmont?

The Preakness didn't seem to sap National Treasure. You'd have to think he won't get away with such a tepid tempo again in the Belmont. But he doesn't resonate as a needs-the-lead type to win. National Treasure will likely be placed somewhere near the front, and jockey John Velazquez should have the luxury of picking his preferred position over his home-court track.

Knowing that the three favorites ahead of him on the morning line all do their best running from midpack or farther back gives National Treasure a speed-centric advantage that is too intriguing to overlook at 5-1 odds. The Belmont will be his to win or lose on the far turn. *Cont.*

The 1 1/2 miles distance and vast, expansive configuration of Belmont Park both play to the style of 'TDN Rising Star' Tapit Trice. Yet there is an element of "now or never" baked into the equation when it comes to assessing his chances of not only winning the third leg of the Triple Crown, but using the victory as a springboard to dominance for the second half of the season.

His slow-to-go tactics have been well documented throughout the winter and spring. But even though this \$1.3-million KEESEP son of Tapit habitually leaves the gate sluggishly and has to be scrubbed on for run so as not to lag too far behind the field, he very reliably unwinds with a prolonged, mid-race surge.

In both the GI Blue Grass S. (which he won narrowly despite looking beaten on the far turn) and the GI Kentucky Derby (where he was seventh after having his momentum stalled twice), Tapit Trice got rolling six furlongs from the finish. There are quite a few late-race runners at the top of this year's sophomore crop, but none of them have demonstrated they can launch a bid from that far out while finishing with authority.

By way of example, in the Blue Grass, Tapit Trice led the way home in a prolonged stretch fight through a final furlong timed in :12.40, which was the fastest final eighth for the Blue Grass since Keeneland switched back to dirt in the fall of 2014.

Tapit Trice came nine wide into the lane for the Derby after responding to far-turn rousing by Luis Saez. *Cont.*

But when it was evident this burly gray was not going to hit the board, Saez decided to save Tapit Trice for another day. June 10 has been circled on the calendar ever since.

3) FORTE (c, Violence--Queen Caroline, by Blame) 'TDN Rising Star'. O-Repole Stable and St. Elias Stable; B-South Gate Farm (KY); T-Todd Pletcher. Sales history: \$80,000 wlg '20 KEENOV; \$110,000 ylg '21 KEESEP. Lifetime Record: Ch. 2yo Colt, MGISW, 7-6-0-0, \$1,833,230. Last start: 1st GI Curlin Florida Derby at Gulfstream Apr. 1.



Twelve furlongs off a 10-week break for a "headline horse" who has posted declining Beyer Speed Figures (100-98-95) since capping a championship 2-year-old season with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. That sentence sums up all of the reasons to think twice about betting this 'TDN Rising Star' as the Belmont favorite.

Trouble is, this 6-for-7 son of Violence (\$80,000 KEENOV; \$110,000 KEESEP) is such a gifted athlete who carries himself with just the right mix of poise and panache that he could defy conventional value-handicapping wisdom and finally bust out in the Belmont, meeting or exceeding the lofty prognostications that have shadowed his career.

A bruised right front foot derailed Forte's Kentucky Derby chances, necessitating a scratch on the morning of the race. The 15-1 upsetter in Louisville ended up being Mage (Good Magic), who had given Forte a brief scare in the GI Florida Derby before Forte blew by him with his ears pricked in the final few jumps to the wire.

Although the race spacing for Forte is not ideal, and it's still an open question as to how much he's progressed since his juvenile campaign, the foot bruise has reportedly healed, and Forte should, in theory, have an easier time negotiating a field of just eight rivals on Saturday instead of the 18 he would have faced in the Derby. That's because one of Forte's strengths has always been his ability to carve out ideal mid-pack positioning under the guidance of Irad Ortiz, Jr., using that prime stalking spot as a launch pad for a far-turn blast-off that has only failed him once from seven starts.

A crowded, chaotic race like the Derby might have been a challenge for Forte, whose one tactical weakness is a lack of early acceleration to put himself clear of trouble at the front of the pack.

He's not as likely to encounter traffic woes in the Belmont, nor is he likely to be taken out of his game by being asked to go too fast too soon. Forte should be in it to win it three furlongs out. Then the test of this particular champion will begin.

4) ANGEL OF EMPIRE (c, Classic Empire--Armony's Angel, by To Honor And Serve) O-Albaugh Family Stables LLC; B-Forgotten Land Investment Inc & Black Diamond Equine Corp (PA); T-Brad Cox. Sales history: \$32,000 RNA wlg '20 KEENOV, \$70,000 ylg '21 KEESEP. Lifetime Record: GISW, 7-4-1-1, \$1,369,375. Last Start: 3rd in the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs May 6.



Angel of Empire (\$32,000 RNA KEENOV; \$70,000 KEESEP) will try blinkers on in the Belmont. Don't expect the equipment change to transform him into a frontrunner. The intent seems to be to get him a touch more focused in the initial stages of the race.

In the Derby, this Pennsylvania-bred son of Classic Empire settled willingly for Flavien Prat before building steam and picking off most of the field with a grinding rail run. Off the final turn, he was eight wide and right behind eventual winner Mage, but when Mage ratcheted into a higher gear, Angel of Empire didn't produce a similar upper-stretch burst. He did torque it up a notch inside the eighth pole, but couldn't reel in Two Phil's (Hard Spun) for second.

His third-place finish as the 4-1 beaten Derby fave was commendable, but I'm not sure I fully buy into the projection that the effort equated to a 10-point jump in his best lifetime Beyer, from 94 to 104. By comparison, we've already seen that Mage couldn't reproduce his winning 105 Beyer as the only Derby entrant to run back in the Preakness, regressing from 105 to his previous plateau of 94. *Cont.*

Angel of Empire, cont.

That's not to say the Belmont's 1 1/2-miles distance isn't within Angel of Empire's scope. This colt has shown no problems sticking around to have a say in the finish as his race distances have increased. His dialed-in run through the lane in the GI Arkansas Derby came through a final eighth timed in :12.12, the fastest final furlong out of the nine 2022-23 Derby qualifying stakes at nine furlongs.

5) RED ROUTE ONE (c, Gun Runner--Red House, by Tapit)

O/B-Winchell Thoroughbreds, LLC (KY); T-Steven M. Asmussen. Lifetime Record: SW & GISP, 10-2-2-1, \$732,525. Last Start: 4th in the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 20.

To give you an idea of how slow the Preakness pace was, Red Route One--a stone-cold closer whose connections were intentionally trying to set him up for one run from far back-ranged up to be jointly second at the rail five-eighths out, just a length off eventual winner National Treasure.

"This race fell apart for a lot of reasons that nobody will be able to put their finger on," trainer Steve Asmussen said post-Preakness, adding that he knows the same thing could happen in the third leg of the Triple Crown.

"You're not guaranteed to get pace in the Belmont. [But] he's kept very good company his whole career and was probably beaten [4 3/4] lengths in the Preakness in a race I don't think set up ideally for him," Asmussen said. "Does he beat them under different circumstances? Who knows? But I do like the opportunity to run him a mile and a half."

Red Route One didn't look comfortable while carrying his head high entering the Preakness backstraight. After briefly nipping at National Treasure's heels, Joel Rosario backed him down a bit, and it looked on the far turn as if a second, more substantial move was percolating. It never materialized despite Rosario's

urging. The three horses he outfinished were the longest shots in the field of seven.

By Gun Runner out of a Tapit mare, I don't think anyone dismisses Asmussen's longer-the-better belief in this Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred. The question comes down to how fast can he cover that distance--which, of course, hinges on how fast the frontrunners cover the initial nine furlongs.

6) HIT SHOW (c, Candy Ride {Arg}--Actress, by Tapit) O/B-Gary & Mary West (KY); T-Brad Cox. Lifetime Record: GSW, 6-3-1-0, \$494,375. Last Start: 5th in the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs May 6.

When most horses draw the dreaded one post for the Derby, you can almost automatically expect put a line through that race when you next see it in their past-performance block. Not so with Hit Show. This Candy Ride (Arg) homebred for Gary and Mary West enjoyed one of the most trouble-free trips from the innermost gate in recent Derby memory.

Hit Show broke alertly, and Manny Franco positioned him as he liked, gearing back to seventh through the turn, then easing off the fence to the four path right behind the speedsters with no one covering them up. Hit Show started to pick it up with a four-wide run 3 1/2 furlongs out, but the bid required brisk urging from Franco.

Hit Show was very much in it to win it turning for home. But after advancing to third, he had no response to further rousing via left-handed stick work. After being accosted by Mage, Hit Show stayed on doggedly, with Franco keeping him to task to get fifth.

His Apr. 8 GII Wood Memorial second was notable for Hit Show running second, beaten a nose, as the middle horse who got pinballed in a three-way stretch scrum while never backing down. *Cont.*

As a May 9 foal, he's among the youngest of this year's Triple Crown crop, so the extra five weeks since his last start will presumably be to his benefit.

7) ARCANGELO (r, Arrogate--Modeling, by Tapit) O-Blue Rose Farm. B-Don Alberto Corporation(KY); T-Jena Antonucci. Sales history: \$35,000 ylg '21 KEESEP. Lifetime Record: GSW, 4-2-1-0, \$167,400. Last Start: 1st in the GIII Peter Pan S. at Belmont Park May 13.

This \$35,000 KEESEP son of Arrogate burst into Belmont S. relevancy with a 97-Beyer score in the GIII Peter Pan S. May 13.

Rated back to sixth for the early part of that nine-furlong race, Arcangelo came rolling into a two-horse speed setup. He snatched the lead a sixteenth from the wire, then got quite a tussle from favored runner-up Bishops Bay (Uncle Mo), who not only survived the duel but re-seized the lead between calls before Arcangelo won a tight bob at the wire. They were 8 3/4 lengths clear of the rest of the field.

Despite twice racing at a mile (Gulfstream) and once at 1 1/8 miles (Belmont), those were one-turn configurations, which will make Saturday's race Arcangelo's first two-turn attempt.

His 84-Beyer Mar. 18 MSW win at Gulfstream has not evolved into a productive race. Five of the six horses Arcangelo beat that afternoon have since come back to run, and all five have lost, including two as favorites.

Four, then three wide on the turns, this \$300,000 FTKOCT colt by Tapit mounted a rally at the top of the lane, initially with his head cocked out to the grandstand in upper stretch before straightening out and digging in.

He at first had difficulty putting away the favored pacemaker when he drew alongside. Once he dispatched that rival, Tapit Shoes was nipped on the wire by out-of-the-clouds winner Red Route One. What his effort lacked in polish shouldn't diminish the underlying potential here.

Considering that was the first stakes try for this colt (who has a nice base of five races, all at 1 1/16 miles or longer), and keeping in mind that Tapit Shoes (May 17) is another late foal, like stablemate Hit Show, another progression forward isn't out of the question. The morning line says 20-1 is your price point to find out if that advancement is good enough to win. *Cont.*

His previous five tries were stakes on the Derby trail in which II Miracolo was beaten an aggregate 79 1/2 lengths.

This colt shares the same Gun Runner out of a Tapit mare cross as Red Route One.

CITY OF LIGHT COLT EARNS FURLONG **BULLET AT OBS THURSDAY** by Jessica Martini

A colt by City of Light (hip 570) worked the week's co-fastest furlong of :9 4/5, while a son of First Samurai (hip 588) and a filly by Violence (hip 703) shared the day's fastest quarter-mile work of :21 flat during the fourth session of the under-tack show for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's June Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training Thursday in Ocala. Headwinds increased throughout the session and all three bullet workers were on the track during the day's first set.

Working shortly before 9 a.m. Thursday, hip 570 became the 10th juvenile of the week to work the furlong in :9 4/5. The bay colt, consigned by Wavertree Stables, is out of Wear Red (Henny Hughes) and is a half-brother to stakes winner and gradedplaced Jessica Krupnick (Uncle Mo). Wear Red is a half-sister to Grade I winner Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway).

Ron Fein's Super Fine Farms purchased the colt for \$170,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

Omar Ramirez sent out hip 588 to work his :21 flat bullet quarter-mile shortly after the start of Thursday's session of the under-tack show. The colt is out of Woodsboro (Congrats) and his third dam is graded winner La Rosa (Wild Again).

Ramirez acquired the colt for \$65,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton July sale. He was purchased by My Little Team Racing for \$50,000 following a :10 1/5 work at the OBS Spring sale in April.

Just minutes after that colt worked, Hip 703 turned in her :21 flat quarter-mile work for A.G. Sales. Out of the unraced Brief Tears (Orientate), the dark bay filly is a half-sister to graded winner No Problem (Munnings).

Jose Andres Gaspar purchased the filly for \$10,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

The under-tack show continues through Saturday with sessions beginning daily at 7:30 a.m. The June sale will be held next Tuesday through Thursday. Bidding commences each day at 10 a.m.

NJ COMMISSION SUSPENDS COBB

Amber Cobb, the Thoroughbred owner and trainer who in 2021 had her Delaware licensure revoked through 2022 for "still participating in horse racing while under suspension" for "improper or inhumane treatment" of a horse, had her New Jersey licensure suspended and was fined \$11,000 in a June 7, 2023, ruling issued by the racing commission in that state. Cont.

It was unclear at deadline for this story if Cobb, 35, planned an appeal.

The New Jersey ruling cited violations related to Cobb's training base at Westampton Farms in Westampton, New Jersey, between January and March 2021.

The ruling stated that Cobb "did possess hypodermic needles and syringes on the grounds of the licensed off-track stabling facility; did possess six injectable bottles of foreign substances, including four injectable bottles of prescription legend drugs on the grounds of the licensed off-track stabling facility," and did strike one of the horses under her care "with a pitchfork, causing the horse to rear up and flip over on its back, leaving the horse in distress and unable to move."

An initial 60-day suspension in Delaware stemmed from the same horse-striking incident, which was captured on a video recorded by a stable employee.

The New Jersey ruling stated Cobb was a no-show at her March 20, 2023, hearing. Her previous Delaware revocation was also the result of skipping a post-suspension hearing in which she was summoned to "answer to complaints and allegations of past abuse and neglect of horses in her care."

BACKGROUND CHECK: ACORN

Flightline traces to the 2000 Phipps-bred Acorn winner | Horsephotos

In this continuing series, we examine the past winners of significant filly/mare races by the lasting influence they've had on the breed. Up today is Belmont Park's GI Acorn S., the first leg in New York's prestigious summer trio of Grade I events for 3year-old fillies.

Long a coveted prize, the Acorn has been designated a Grade I from the very beginning when the grading system became

official in 1973. A disproportionate amount of its winners are in the Hall of Fame, ranging from Top Flight to Twilight Tear to Cicada to Ruffian, and so many more. The quality of the Acorn winners set the tone for their broodmare careers as well. Not surprisingly, the Acorn boasts a ridiculous number of high-class future broodmares among its winners, including a glorious fiveyear streak in the 1950s that saw five consecutive winners eventually cultivate champions among their descendants.

Following are highlights of some of the most important Acorn winners by what impact they've had on the sport through their sons and daughters.

Finder's Fee (1997, Storm Cat--Fantastic Find, by Mr. **Prospector), bred by Phipps Stable:** Granddam of 2022 Horse of the Year and current first-season sire Flightline (Tapit), whose fee of \$200,000 at Lane's End is one of the highest introductory fees in history.

Prospectors Delite (1989, Mr. Prospector--Up the Flagpole, by Hoist the Flag), bred by W. S. Farish: The 2003 Broodmare of the Year produced Horse of the Year Mineshaft (A.P. Indy), MGISW Tomisue's Delight (A.P. Indy), and three other graded performers. She is also the granddam of GISW Mr. Sidney (Storm Cat).

Meadow Star (1988, Meadowlake--Inreality Star, by In Reality), bred by Jaime S. Carrion: This memorable ginger was granddam to the dams of champion and gone-too-soon sire Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) and MGISW Belle Gallantey (After Market).

Stella Madrid (1987, Alydar--My Juliet, by Gallant Romeo), bred by Calumet Farm: Japanese champions Lucky Lilac (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}), Mikki Isle (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), and Diamond Biko (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), as well as additional Japanese G1SW Aerolithe (Jpn) (Kurofune) and U.S. GISW Lilacs and Lace (Flower Alley) all trace to this classy bay.

Chris Evert (1971, by Swoon's Son--Miss Carmie, by T. V. Lark), bred by Echo Valley Horse Farm: From five daughters, U.S. champion Chief's Crown (Danzig); French champion Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy); GISWs Classic Crown (Mr. Prospector), Sightseek (Distant View), Tates Creek (Rahy), Etoile Montante (Miswaki), Obligatory (Curlin), and Dominican (El Corredor); and many more very useful graded winners hail from this lovely chestnut.

Marking Time (1963, To Market--Allemande, by Counterpoint), bred by Ogden Phipps and Wheatley Stable: Her champion daughter Relaxing (Buckpasser) turned into a Broodmare of the Year responsible for champion Easy Goer (Alydar), as well as additional GISWs Easy Now (Danzig) and Cadillacing (Alydar). Others tracing to her include GISW Strolling Along (Danzig) and several other high-class winners. Cont.

Acorn background check, cont.

Quill (1956, Princequillo {GB}--Quick Touch, by Count Fleet), bred by R. N. Webster: Champions Run the Gantlet (Tom Rolfe) and Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course), Japanese champion Maruzensky (Jpn) (Nijinsky II), and GISWs Dance of Life (Nijinsky II), Sumptious (Summing), Caucasus (Nijinsky II), and Vettori (Ire) (Machiavellian) are among those who trace to this grand gal.

Bayou (1954, Hill Prince--Bourtai, by Stimulus), bred by Claiborne Farm: A number of high-class horses descend from this mare, including champions Slew o' Gold (Seattle Slew) and

War Pass (Cherokee Run); GI Belmont S. winner Coastal (Majestic Prince); and GISWs Aptitude (A.P. Indy), Sleep Easy (Seattle Slew), Oath (Known Fact), Slew's Exceller (Exceller), River Flyer (Riverman), and Victory Ride (Seeking the Gold).

Princess Turia (1953, Heliopolis {GB}--Blue Delight, by Blue Larkspur), bred by Calumet Farm: Her son Forward Pass (On-and-On) was just 1 1/4 lengths shy of winning the Triple Crown, but took the 1968 sophomore colt championship.

High Voltage (1952, Ambiorix {Fr}--Bynamo, by Menow), bred

by Wheatley Stable: This elegant gray's sons and grandsons included U.S. champion Impressive (Court Martial {GB}), MGISW Majestic Light (Majestic Prince), and SW Bold Commander (Bold Ruler), the last two both sires of note.

Happy Mood (1951, Mahmoud {Fr}--La Reigh, by Count Gallahad), bred by Mrs. John D. Hertz: Canadian Horses of the Year With Approval (Caro {Ire}) and Izvestia (Icecapade), Canadian champion Serenading (A.P. Indy), GI Belmont S. winner Touch Gold (Deputy Minister), GI Kentucky Oaks winner Buryyourbelief (Believe It), and other GISWs Haynesfield (Speightstown), Healthy Addiction (Boston Harbor), and Pretty Discreet (Private Account) all descend from this splendid chestnut.

Secret Meeting (1950, Alibhai {GB}--Burgoo Maid, by Burgoo King), bred by James C. Brady: Broodmare of the Year Anne Campbell (Never Bend); champions Sensational (Hoist the Flag) and Rushing Fall (More Than Ready); Epsom Oaks winner Long Look (Ribot {GB}); and GISWs Trumpet's Blare (Vice Regent), Dancealot (Round Table), Albert the Great (Go for Gin), Desert Wine (Damascus), and Menifee (Harlan) all trace to her.

Nothirdchance (1948, Blue Swords--Galla Colors, by Sir Galahad III {Fr}), bred by Bieber-Jacobs Stables: Dam of champion Hail to Reason (Turn-to {Ire}), who later turned leading sire, and ancestress of GISW and sire Meadowlake (Hold Your Peace).

Gallorette (1942, Challenger II (GB)--Gallette, by Sir Gallahad III (Fr)), bred by Preston M. Granddam of champion and Kentucky Derby/Belmont S. winner Bold Forbes (Irish Castle), this captivating bay has a number of other classy descendants, including GISWs Life At the Top (Seattle Slew), Lakeway (Seattle Slew),

Gun Runner is one of several top horses descending from 1945 Acorn winner Gallorette | Sarah Andrew

Saratoga Six (Alydar), and Jilbab (A.P. Indy), as well as English G1 winner Dunbeath (Grey Dawn II {Fr}).

Proud One (1938, Blenheim II {GB}--Some Pomp, by Pompey), unknown breeder: Her descendants have included 1965 Kentucky Derby winner Lucky Debonair (Vertex), as well as GISWs Lady Love (Dr. Fager) and Tantalizing (Tom Rolfe).

Baba Kenny (1928, Black Servant--Betty Beall, by North Star III {GB}), bred by Idle Hour Stock Farm: This very first winner of the Acorn set the tone with her descendants including daughter Bee Mac (War Admiral), who beat the boys in the Hopeful S.; 1988 Horse of the Year and nine-time GISW Alysheba (Alydar), the second of four consecutive GI Breeders' Cup Classic winners to bring a GI Kentucky Derby win to the year-end championship race; G1SW and good sire Lear Fan (Roberto); multiple backtype winner and good sire Better Self (Bimelech); and another Acorn winner in Riverina (Princequillo {GB}).

WEEKLY STEWARDS AND COMMISSIONS **RULINGS, MAY 30-JUNE 5** by Dan Ross

Every week, the TDN publishes a roundup of key official rulings from the primary tracks within the four major racing jurisdictions of California, New York, Florida and Kentucky.

Here's a primer on how each of these jurisdictions adjudicates different offenses, what they make public (or not) and where.

With the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) having gone into effect on July 1, 2022, the TDN will also post a roundup of the relevant HISA-related rulings from the same week.

California

Track: Santa Anita Date: 06/04/2023

Licensee: Flavien Prat, jockey **Penalty:** Three-day suspension

Violation: Appeal withdrawn, careless riding

Explainer: Having received notice from the California Horse Racing Board that the appeal of LATS Ruling #52 (April 21, 2023) has been withdrawn, the original ruling is reinstated. Jockey Flavien Prat is suspended for 3 racing days (June 16, 17, and 18, 2023).

NEW HISA STEWARDS RULINGS

The following rulings were reported on HISA's "rulings" portal, except for the voided claim rulings which were sent to the TDN directly. Some of these rulings are from prior weeks as they were not reported contemporaneously.

One important note: HISA's whip use limit is restricted to six strikes during a race.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

It was with great interest that I read Earle Mack's recent TDN Letter to the Editor and Bill Finley's Week in Review piece supporting Mr. Mack's opinion that a major switch to synthetic racing surfaces is called for to save the Thoroughbred Industry.

Although I do not know either of these men personally, I respect their accomplishments in our business, their intentions, opinions and intellect.

With that said, as much as I agree that training and racing surfaces are critical to horse safety and synthetic tracks have lower catastrophic injury rates, I disagree that a mass movement to synthetic surfaces is prudent at the present time.

We simply do not know enough about the multi-factorial nature of today's equine injury rates to expect a surface change to solve our problem; there is no 'silver bullet' to be had in this

Spending millions to re-engineer and resurface tracks across numerous jurisdictions, conditions and climates, only to find that that wasn't enough to optimize safety for horse and rider when we as an industry can hardly afford to further stub our toe, seems ill advised to me.

I believe this problem is best solved through a multidisciplinary and comprehensive approach. A surface change may indeed be called for, but further study is required before acting.

Many factors contribute to equine injury. Smarter and better-informed professionals than myself can define the parameters for a comprehensive study but here are some key metrics (in categories), I understand to be worth factoring in:

Track Surfaces:

- Composition/Materials/Integrity of base and cushion
- Management and Maintenance Practices
- Environmental Factors Ambient Temperature and Moisture Content

Data Analysis:

- Historical Analysis of Injuries: nature of the injury, surface, distance, horse age, # of starts, spacing between starts, trainer change, track change, etc.
- Condition Book's Influence (including Purse to Claiming Price Ratios)
- Race Meet Length and Timing of Injuries (in the meet and in the race)
- Biomechanics and Stride Analysis
- Identification/Demographics of 'At Risk' Horses

Human Element:

- Horsemanship and Training Methods
- Veterinary Oversight, Medications and Testing/Compliance
- Education

It has been my observation that the best approach to creating sustainability in business or industry or sport or life in general, is to do it right initially and minimize the need to come back to repair or rethink the process.

I agree with Mr. Mack and Mr. Finley that decisive action is called for, but I believe that a more comprehensive undertaking yields the sustainability (if not growth) we seek. Invest the time to get it right up front. The horse and our industry's survival won't allow for anything less. Now, we just need to put our heads together, make the right plan, fund it and act on it--some of which, is already underway.

JOCKEY CLUB MAKES ONLINE FACT BOOK ADDITIONS

The Jockey Club's Online Fact Book includes two new pages to its breeding section with the addition of the Number of Unique Sires by Position in the Pedigree Top Line and Percent of Mares Bred Categorized by Stallion Book Size, the organization said in a release Thursday.

The first table shows the number of unique sires by position within the top line of the pedigree and enables users to drill down by year and generation.

Those links provide stallion names and the number of registered Thoroughbreds for that generation's sires on the top sire line pedigree for the registered foals of the specific year.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY (Belmont edition)...

June 3, 1967...Damascus posted a 2 1/2-length victory over Cool Reception in the final Belmont S. held at Aqueduct during the renovation of Belmont Park.

June 5, 1943...Count Fleet ended his racing career by winning the Belmont S. by 25 lengths, becoming the sixth Triple Crown winner in his final career start.

June 5, 1993...Jockey **Julie Krone** became the first woman rider to win a Triple Crown race, riding Colonial Affair to victory in the Belmont S.

June 7, 1986...Trainer Woody Stephens won his fifth consecutive Belmont S., saddling Danzig Connection to victory. His four previous Belmont winners were Conquistador Cielo ('82), Caveat ('83), Swale ('84) and Creme Fraiche ('85).

June 8, 1985...Brushwood Stable's **Creme Fraiche** became the first gelding to win the Belmont S.

June 9, 1973...Triple Crown winner Secretariat swept to a 31-length victory in the Belmont S., the longest winning margin in the race's history. His time of 2:24 for the mile and a half was 2 3/5 seconds faster than the mark set by Gallant Man in 1957, and the record still stands today.

June 11, 1921...Grey Lag, under jockey Earl Sande, won the first Belmont S. ever to be run counter-clockwise. Previous Belmonts were run clockwise over a fish-hook course which included part of the training track and the main dirt oval.

June 13, 1913...James Rowe, who won back-to-back Belmonts as a jockey in 1872-73, set the record for most Belmont S. wins by a trainer, eight, sending out Prince Eugene to victory.

June 14, 1880...The first post parade of horses in an American race took place prior to the running of the 14th Belmont S. Horses had previously gone directly from paddock to post.





BOTTI AIMS PROGRESSIVE GIAVELLOTTO AT GOODWOOD CUP

All eyes may be turning to Royal Ascot, but Marco Botti has set his sights a little farther down the line to Glorious Goodwood when it comes to the G2 Yorkshire Cup winner Giavellotto (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}).

"We want to run hm in the Goodwood Cup, so all being well he will go for that on August 1, and if he remains in good form we would like to run in the Irish St Leger. The timing would be perfect because there are six weeks between the two races," said the trainer.

At York, the four-year-old notched a half-length victory over Eldar Eldarov (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), the winner of last year's St Leger, in which Giavellotto finished third after a stewards' enquiry promoted him one place owing to him being severely hampered two furlongs from home.

Though Botti has had plenty of experience in sending runners to Australia, with Jakkalberry (Ire) having running third in the Melbourne Cup of 2012 and Dandino (GB) taking fifth a year later, Flemington is not necessarily the number one destination this autumn for Giavellotto. Cont. p3

SIYOUNI & ZARAK TO BE OFFERED ON SH TIME

Two-time French Champion stallion Siyouni (Fr) and his studmate Zarak (Fr) will both be offered on Southern Hemisphere time in 2023, The Aga Khan Studs' Georges Rimaud confirmed to the TDN AusNZ on Thursday.

Siyouni, who will be available for around 20 Southern Hemisphere covers, will stand for €60,000. He is the sire of the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Paddington (GB) and of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Tahiyra (Ire) this season. In Australia, his G1 Northerly S. heroine Amelia's Jewel (Aus) has been representing him with distinction.

Zarak is a sire on the rise with 11 stakes winners, seven of them at the group level. He will command €40,000.

"I would just say, don't miss the boat [on Zarak], because I think that's what happened with Siyouni first," Rimaud said. "We had tried to bring him into Australia but it didn't work out. At the end of the day, we can see that if we had done it, it would've worked really well."

"I don't think the owners would want to do that journey on their own, with all the expenses and the uncertainty," he said. "The Melbourne Cup would depend on how it goes next time and whether we get some Australian owners interested. Otherwise in October there would be either the Prix Royal Oak or Champions Day."

Botti said that Giavellotto had a few quiet days immediately after the Yorkshire Cup.

"You could see that it took a little bit out of him, but at the same time he has bounced back to his best and looks great," he noted.

On avoiding the Gold Cup and a rematch with Eldar Eldarov, who is currently second-favourite for Ascot race which is over an extra half-mile, he added, "I think he stays but I am not sure that he wants to go that far. If we still have him next year we would think about the Gold Cup but I think his best trip is a mile and six [furlongs] or two miles.

"He's in great form and this [decision] allows us to give him a little bit of time and then get back to fast work in the next few weeks. Hopefully he will be in the same shape as he was in at York for Goodwood."

Owned and bred by the Franchini family's Razza La Tesa, Giavelloto (whose name translates to 'Javelin') has been joined at Botti's Prestige Place Stables by his two-year-old half-brother from the first crop of Calyx (GB), named Calumet (Ire).

"The Franchinis had horses with my dad and my brother in Italy, and then recently they moved the horses to my cousin,

Edmondo. In England they have had horses here for a while now, but never a large number: around four or five horses maximum and mainly homebreds," Botti explained.

La Tesa, based in Brescia, around an hour from Milan, is run by Francesca Franchini, who was at York to witness the biggest win to date for her family, who bred both Giavellotto's dam Gerika (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}) and grand-dam Green Tern (Ity) (Miswaki Tern). Gerika was trained in Italy by Botti's brother, Stefano, and is a winning half-sister to the multiple Listed winners Right

Connection (GB) and Donoma (Ire), both by Beat Hollow (GB).

"It was special for Francesca to win a Group 2 in England with a homebred, it was just a great result," Botti said. "Giavellotto is quite a big, imposing horse and his brother Calumet is smaller, but he goes well. Sadly, they lost the mare this year when she foaled a nice colt by St Mark's Basilica (Fr). The foal is okay but the mare died, which was a shame as she was to be retired after that.

"That was another reason that it was so emotional for

Francesca. She was in tears. They have been successful as owner-breeders in Italy but the Yorkshire Cup was their biggest success."

He continued, "Francesca lives at the stud. She's passionate about it, and that's her life. She's there all the time. It is great that she is so involved, as sometimes with some of the old family studs there is no-one to take over, but with Francesca it is very much her passion and I'm sure she will carry on. She understands the game. She knows that things can go wrong, and she takes bad news well. She has been a great supporter of the yard. They are very nice owners to have." Cont. p4

Giavellotto's earlier seasons included just one run right at the end of his juvenile year, when he made a winning debut just before Christmas over 1m3f at Kempton. He won again the following March and, following a few more placed efforts, he took his rating to 104 when running out the easy winner of a 1m6f Class 2 handicap at Newmarket. From there, it was straight to the St Leger.

"We always thought he was going to be a nice horse, even last spring, but he has really progressed," Botti said. "The owners wanted to have a horse for the Italian Derby but when he ran at Sandown [on his third start] he showed that he needed to step up in trip. I felt that taking him to Rome to run 1m3f on a fast track wouldn't really suit him, and that was probably the right decision as it gave him the chance to progress through the summer. In the St Leger he was a bit unlucky."

If that race feels like one that go away, there will be extra cause for cheer should Giavellotto go on to secure one of his major targets for Botti later this year.

"I'm still chasing a Group 1 winner in England," said the trainer, whose previous stable stars have included the top-level winners Excelebration (Ire), Capla Temptress (GB), Euro Charline (GB), Tac De Boistron (Fr), Joshua Tree (Ire) and Gitano Hernando (GB).

"We've had six Group 1 wins, but they have been two in France, two in America, and two in Canada. We got so close with Excelebration a few times but we're still waiting."

FOR LATE BREEDER KATELANIS by Emma Berry

There was a certain poignancy to the debut victory of Islandsinthestream (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) at the Curragh on Wednesday in the absence of the man responsible for developing the colt's family, Peter Katelanis. The Australian owner-breeder died last August and is remembered fondly by Nicolas de Chambure of Haras d'Etreham, who co-bred the Joseph O'Brien-trained juvenile.

"I got to meet Peter when I first went to Australia maybe 10 years ago," he said. "We got on really well and then sadly he was diagnosed with cancer last year and died within three months. He was only young, in his 50s and in great form, but it took him away. That's why it was so special last night."

Katelanis was involved in racing Islandsinthestream's grand-dam, the G2 VRC Sires' Produce S. winner De Lago Mist (Aus) (Encosta De Lago {Aus}), and from her bred A Mist Opportunity (Aus) (Foxwedge {Aus}), who won three races in Australia for a partnership including de Chambure.

He continued, "It's a good family that Peter had for many

years, and he was trying hard to give it every chance as it was a special pedigree for him. When I bought half of the dam as a yearling we decided we were going to race her together in partnership. Because Peter had so many daughters and fillies from the family in Australia, we thought it was worth bringing [A Mist Opportunity] north to give a bit more international exposure to the family. So for the second foal to win like that, it would have been special for him."

Haras d'Etreham has long had good relationships with fellow studs and breeders in the southern hemisphere, and this international aspect to his business is one that de Chambure is keen to extend.

"It's such a small world now," he said. "To have shares in mares in partnerships in Australia or in the States is a good opportunity for us to get different blood, different families, different sire-lines from other parts of the world to avoid too much inbreeding, and try to breed something a bit different. With Peter, with that mare, it was a good opportunity. It was not surprising last year that someone like Joseph, who has been many times to Australia, a young trainer who knows those pedigrees a bit more, would buy the colt."

A Mist Opportunity is a half-sister to Into The Mist (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and Shrouded In Mist (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), both prolific winners who each won the G2 Queen of the South S. Now nine, she remains at Etreham, where she has a Mehmas (Ire) yearling who will soon start his sales prep for Arqana's August Sale. Islandsinthestream was himself bought at Arqana's October Sale for €135,000.

"He's a sharp colt and he won't mind an early sale like that," said de Chambure of the Mehmas yearling, and added that the mare has a colt foal by Etreham resident Persian King (Ire). Cont. p5

He added, "She is now in foal to Almanzor (Fr). I liked the colt so much last year that I wanted to return to the same blood."

It may have been three years since Wootton Bassett left Haras d'Etreham, where his stallion career was established, but de Chambure still roots for his offspring and had extra cause to roar at the television when his son King Of Steel made such a bold bid for the Derby on Saturday. The eventual runner-up was bred by Alberto Figueiredo of Kentucky's Bonne Chance Farm and his dam Eldacar (GB) (Verglas {Ire}) had previously boarded in France.

"We had the mare at Etreham for her owner. When he had a few mares in Europe they were based with us," he said. "We bred the sister [Macadamia {Fr}] for them and it's because of that that they bought into Wootton Bassett fairly early on. They then sent the mare to Kentucky in foal to Wootton Bassett."

That resultant foal was the giant grey King Of Steel, whose jaw-dropping performance in the Derby on just the third start of his life was one of the talking points of a busy Classic weekend in Europe.

"When he quickened out of the pack I really thought he was going to win," said de Chambure. "I will always be cheering for him and for his breeder."

In this series, the TDN takes a look at notable successes of European-based sires in North America. This week's column is highlighted by the victory of Set Piece in the GIII Arlington S. at Churchill Downs in June.

Juddmonte Veteran Nabs Another Graded Race

Decorated 7-year-old **Set Piece (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) won the Arlington S. at Churchill Downs earlier this month for owner-breeder Juddmonte Farms and trainer Brad Cox (*video*).

The newly minted millionaire, who was runner-up in the 2021 GI Fourstardave H., was taking his fourth graded event. A half-brother to dual stakes winner and two-time Group 3 runner-up Alocasia (GB) (Kingman {GB}), the gelding's latest half-sibling is a

yearling Kingman filly. From the extended family of Group 1 winners Elmaamul (Diesis {GB}) and Reams Of Verse (Nureyev), Set Piece is also kin to GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

Juddmonte's late Dansili has sired 19 stakes winners from 88 runners (21%) in the U.S. His 45 American winners (51%) also include 14 graded winners (16%), and eight Grade I scorers (9%). His best progeny in this region are headed by four-time Grade I winner Proviso (GB).

Another Juddmonte Homebred Doubles Down

Juncture (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}), who won the Listed Cooley Fillies S. at Dundalk in her final European start, ran out a handy winner of the Ouija Board Distaff S. at Lone Star Park to give owner-breeder Juddmonte and trainer Brad Cox an end-of-themonth present.

Placed three times at group level in Ireland, the 4-year-old is the first foal out of her dam, Occurrence (GB) (Frankel {GB}), and is followed by the unraced 3-year-old filly Singularity (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}) and a yearling filly by Oasis Dream (GB). Her second dam is a full-sister to blue hen Hasili (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}), and has G1 Pretty Polly S. heroine Promising Lead (GB) (Danehill) to her credit.

One of 24 winners from 42 runners in the U.S. (57%) for Yeomanstown Stud's Dark Angel, Juncture is one of six stakes winners (14%) which includes Grade I winners Raging Bull (Fr), Althiqa (GB) and Hunt (Ire).

Free Spirit At Monmouth

Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables and Chad Brown teamed up to win a Belmont maiden special weight with **Utilization Rate (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}) recently **(video)**.

Bred by Neustrian Associates and Christopher Hirst, the filly is a half-sister to Ride The Skies (Fr) (City Light {Fr}). A €95,000 Arqana October yearling, the dark bay is a granddaughter of G3 Prix Eclipse victress Iron Lips (GB) (Iron Mask) who is a half-sister to G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero and sire Falco (Pivotal {GB}).

The much-missed Le Havre has sired nine winners from 19 runners (47%) in the U.S. All three of his American stakes winners won graded stakes (16%), anchored by GI Turf Mile S. hero Suedois (Fr), while multiple graded winner Rymska (Fr) was second in both the GI Gamely S. and GI Jenny Wiley S.

Wonderfull Second Up Beneath The Twin Spires

Runnymede Farm and A.I.S's **Wonderfull Lady (Fr)** (Almanzor {Fr}) collected her first American win over the Churchill Downs turf for trainer Brendan Walsh in May (*video*).

Bred by former trainer Jean-Philippe Dubois, the bay made one start for Ecurie Victoria Dreams and Dubois last July, before racing for Maurice Lagasse and Catesby Clay in her next three French appearances including a fourth in the G3 Prix des Reservoirs for trainer Yann Barberot. The last foal of her dam, the Elusive Quality mare Tender Night, her great granddam is multiple group winner Smolensk (Danzig), who was second in the G1 Coronation S. and is a daughter of outstanding producer and Classic winner Blush With Pride (Blushing Groom {Fr}).

From five U.S. runners, Almanzor has sired four winners (80%), and one stakes winner, the 2022 Listed Woodhaven S. hero Unanimous Consent (GB). Cont. p7

A winner in three starts for breeder Morera Partnership and trainer Kevin Philippart de Foy, the 3-year-old filly was a 26,000gns Tattersalls Somerville yearling purchase by Mark McStay's Avenue Bloodstock and was acquired privately by these connections. Out of a Teofilo (Ire) half-sister to G1 Nassau S. heroine Sultanina (GB) (New Approach {Ire}), Anisette is followed by juvenile colt Eton Mes (Ire) (Expert Eye {GB}) and a yearling filly by Make Believe (GB).

Awtaad's American sire record stands at two winners from four runners (50%). Ebeko (Ire) won the Listed Zuma Beach S. and was fourth in the GIII Cecil B. DeMille S.

Check It Twice

During a purple patch of form for Klaravich runners after Ultilization Rate's victory in late May, 4-year-old filly **Customer List (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) won a Monmouth allowance for Chad Brown on Derby day last Saturday (video) less than half an hour before **Redistricting (GB)** (Kingman {GB}) became the latest winner to wear the red-and-white silks when breaking his

maiden at Belmont (video).

Bred by S.C.E.A. De La Fontaine & Ecurie Skymarc Farm, the €250,000 Arqana Deauville September yearling is the first foal of her winning dam. A 2-year-old by Sea The Moon (Ger) and a weanling colt by New Bay (GB) are still to come from Equivocal (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}), herself a half-sister to multiple graded winner and GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. second Criticism (GB) (Machiavellian).

Coolmore's Wootton Bassett has 14 winners from 20 runners (70%) in the U.S., and his six stakes winners (30%) are led by Audarya (Fr), who won the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf.

In Redistricting's case, the Farm Cove Thoroughbreds Ltd.-bred was a 140,000gns selection out of the Tattersalls October Book 1 Sale. The final foal out of the deceased Cascata (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), the gelding is a half-brother to the stakes-placed Pacharana (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Misericordia (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who was third in the GII Presque Isle Downs Masters S. Multiple Group 1 winner St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) is under his second dam.

Kingman has accounted for 27 winners from 52 runners (52%) in the U.S., with eight of those (15%) being stakes winners. His best to date has been three-time Grade I winner Domestic Spending (GB), who also raced in the Klaravich silks. Cont. p8

WESTOVER TEAM CONSIDERS ROYAL ASCOT OR SAINT-CLOUD OPTIONS

Classic winner Westover (GB) (Frankel (GB)) is pointing to either Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. later this month, or the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud on July 8, according to Juddmonte's racing manager Barry Mahon.

"The Hardwicke is a possibility," said Mahon of the Ralph Beckett trainee. "It's probably coming too soon, but it's a possibility. It's a toss-up between that and the [G1] Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, he'll run in one or the other of those hopefully."

Last year's G1 Irish Derby hero ran fifth in the G1 King George VI And Queen Elizabeth S. and sixth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. In 2023, he has placed second in both the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan, and the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom in early June.

He added, "We were absolutely delighted. He was second to an exceptionally good filly [Emily Upjohn {GB}], the time of the race was very strong--three seconds quicker than the Oaks I believe-- and he has run a great race.

"The slow early fractions probably didn't suit us 100%, but we have no complaints. Frankie [Dettori, on Emily Upjohn] went past us at the three-pole and it was hard to get him back, but we were getting there at the line. He's a high-class horse and apart from in the King George last year, he's never run a bad race."

We will have a nice team of horses, hopefully."

Sprewell was stabled at Nicky Henderson's yard, a friend of Harrington's, prior to his Derby attempt.

"He went to Nicky's beforehand and he came out of the race grand, she added. "He just had a nice trot and little canter on Wednesday morning. He looks well and I'm happy enough with him. He's eaten up well and put on weight."

Derby first and third Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and White Birch (GB) (Ulysses {Ire}) are also pointing to the Irish Derby.

The statement continued, "Peaceful protest is welcome as it always has been and will be accommodated outside the racecourse.

"As we do every year, we are working extremely closely with the TVP and our own security providers to be as prepared as possible for any planned disruption during Royal Ascot. We will have additional security around the site as well as enhanced CCTV provision and there will be increased police presence throughout the week."

"Thames Valley Police have once again been working closely with Ascot Racecourse Limited on the planning for Royal Ascot 2023," said a TVP spokesman." We have a legal obligation to facilitate peaceful protest and we will be balancing the rights of any protestors with the needs of the local community and spectators. With sufficient policing powers from existing legislation, we will be able to respond to incidents of disorder or disruption in a proportionate manner as they occur."

Labeled a TDN Rising Star on debut here in July, Tower Of London failed to make an impact when over-racing and finishing last behind Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact (Jpn)) in the G2 Champions Juvenile S. back here in September. Only sixth trying out his Derby credentials in the G3 Derby Trial again at this venue last month, the bay had some questions to answer here and duly obliged to get back on track. Settled second throughout the early stages, the full-brother to the Irish Derby and St Leger hero Capri (Ire) took command 1 1/2 furlongs from the finish and despite drifting right as he had on debut was well on top.

Aidan O'Brien was left scratching his head where the winner's exact Royal Ascot target will be. "We're delighted he won, but we didn't learn a lot as it was a very slow pace," he said. "We know that he can quicken, he did that as a 2-year-old. There are a couple of races in Ascot, he could go either a mile-and-aquarter or a mile-and-a-half. He might be a horse that likes to take his time and not be produced until late, Ryan gave him a perfect ride because they were going so slow he had to go. He ran bad in the Derby Trial and that was probably the ground and he was a bit keen behind Auguste Rodin here last year.

"Looking at him, he's probably a mile-and-a-quarter plus horse who wants plenty of pace on in front of him and to take your time. He tanks a bit, he's a strong traveller. He'll come forward from the run, as he still had a bit of a tummy on him. We'll play it by ear, but Ascot is the plan and we'll see then if he comes out of that okay."

825K FRANKEL FILLY SMASHES INGLIS RECORD



Thursday's topper, by Frankel | Inglis

The opening day of the final Australian in-person sale of the year was a history-making one, with a beautiful weanling by one of the best stallions on the planet the subject of an intense bidding duel.

At A Glance:

- At the completion of trade on Thursday, 140 weanlings sold for an aggregate of \$5,801,000, with the clearance rate being 66%. The average price was \$41,436, while the median finished at \$20,000. It is anticipated that these figures will change, as more lots are expected to be sold.
- The headline act was Lot 64--a Frankel (GB) filly from the Burnewang North Pastoral draft. She was knocked down to James Mitchell of Mitchell Bloodstock (FBAA) for owner Stephen Spiteri for \$825,000--a new record price for a weanling offered at an Inglis sale.
- A total of four weanlings--three of them fillies--made at least \$200,000.
- Burnewang North finished up as the leading vendor (by aggregate and average), with their six weanlings that sold

grossing \$1,560,000 (at an average of \$260,000).

Moroney to Train Record-breaking Frankel Filly

Much of the talk ahead of this year's sale centred around Lot 64--a filly from the Burnewang North draft, by global sire sensation Frankel (GB), from the unraced Invincible Spirit (Ire) mare Vedema (Fr).

And the hype was well and truly justified, with the filly realising \$825,000.

The Frankel filly was secured by Melbourne-based property developer Stephen Spiteri, after James Mitchell of Mitchell Bloodstock (FBAA) did the bidding on his behalf, and will be trained by Michael Moroney.

"She's an outstanding filly by arguably one of the best stallions in the world. He's done the job in the Northern Hemisphere and he's also done it down here with Hungry Heart, Miss Fabulass... he's an outstanding sire worldwide," Mitchell said.

"She's a beautiful filly from a fantastic farm. The owner, Stephen, he loved her from the minute he saw her."

"I thought we were out two or three times, but he stuck to his guns and had that one last bid, which I didn't think we were having, but anyway. It's a great thrill for Stephen and I'm sure he'll have a lot of fun with the filly."

Mitchell confirmed the plan is for Spiteri to race the filly.

"Yeah, that will be an end-user job. She will go back to a farm in Victoria and grow out. There are no further plans than to let her grow out in a paddock somewhere. No doubt she will only improve and just continue to be outstanding, as she has been the whole way along," he explained.

The filly hails from a lovely Aga Khan family that boasts plenty of black type. Among the stakes winners is the French Champion 3-year-old Vadeni (Fr) (Churchill {Ire})--a two-time Group 1 winner and runner-up in last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

"She's out of an Invincible Spirit mare, from a big European family, so the residual value is there and was from the minute she was born," Mitchell commented.

"Hopefully, she can add to it on the racetrack and she would be a great addition to any broodmare band."

Asked if he thought the filly would fetch \$825,000, Mitchell said: "Not really. I thought we would be paying between \$500,000-\$600,000. Stephen made the call at the end of the day--I was just doing the bidding--and he's thrilled to have bought her."

Frankel's progeny were well sought-after at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Weanling Sale, with the two colts selling to Yulong Investments for a combined \$1,650,000 (at an average of \$825,000).

Mitchell was asked how this filly compares to that duo.

"Physically, I thought she was better," he said.

"Obviously, being a filly she wasn't going to make as much as the colts did, but on the world stage, as the auctioneer Jonathan D'Arcy mentioned, it stacks up pretty comparably; she's got huge residual value, she's got a whole racing career ahead of her.

"If she's true to type, she should be a pretty handy racehorse." Burnewang North's Cathy Hains was thrilled with the result, admitting the sale price exceeded expectations.

"Myself and the team are absolutely delighted. She was a really gorgeous filly and we got a great result. It was really something special," Hains said.

"It's old-fashioned to say that the proof of the pudding is always in the pudding so we kept our expectations under control and certainly what happened in the ring today exceeded our expectations. We had what we believed was a realistic reserve well below what she achieved.

"It's a huge moment for all of us. There were certainly a lot of nerves and enthusiasm and excitement when she got through the ring."

"She was received very well all week. She's a total professional, paraded well, and often, all week and got the right kind of attention accordingly.

"I'd like to thank all of the team at Burnewang and also thank Paul Moroney and Catheryne Bruggeman, who were integral in us purchasing Vedema privately overseas and we then put her in foal Southern Hemisphere time, and this is the result." Vedema was covered last spring by Kia Ora Stud's Golden Slipper S. hero Farnan.

Price Pleased With Day 1 Results

James Price--Inglis' Victorian bloodstock manager--said Thursday's results met expectations.

"Yeah, it did. I think we were all well aware that in Sydney and the Gold Coast, people were very selective and people are willing to pay a premium price if the quality is there," he remarked.

"Obviously, it's a very selective market and a number of buyers are here to pinhook into the yearling market in 2024, so I would daresay vetting and X-rays have been crucial at this sale and horses that don't check out have been left behind, so to speak."

As has been the norm in 2023, the high-end of the market was again strong, while the lower end faced its challenges.

"There's no doubt we'd like the bottom end of the market to be stronger than it is, but we will do our best to try and get some of those horses sold. There's no doubt there is a tightening in the market in that bottom-end," Price said.

"I think (Thursday's) market again highlighted that the buying bench wants a particular product and they're willing to pay top-dollar for that product."
