The rest of the Patrick family had all come and gone by the time Belle's Finale (Ghostzapper) was preparing to sell at the 2017 Keeneland November Sale, but Mary Leigh Patrick was there to watch as the pretty bay mare stepped into the ring. Mary Leigh had decided to hold out for the rest of the session, hoping to find one last addition for Ramspring Farm's broodmare band ahead of another breeding season.

The octogenarian knew she had accomplished the mission when she spotted Belle's Finale, an unraced 3-year-old out of GISW Capote Belle (Capote) carrying her first foal by Not This Time, and she secured the winning \$70,000 bid.

TIF ISSUES ALARMING REPORT ON CAW IN CALIFORNIA

Nine of the 11 largest betting pools have shown declines from all customers except computer-assisted wagering groups over the past four years, while the handle of the largest CAW groups grew dramatically, according to an extensive study of data released Monday by the Thoroughbred Idea Foundation (TIF).

"The Thoroughbred Idea Foundation's analysis of data from Del Mar between 2018 and 2022 showed on an inflation-adjusted basis, per-race (or per-opportunity basis for certain bet types) CAW betting, from what is believed to be 17 accounts, has grown tremendously in the last five years-up 46% in the superfecta pool, 49% in trifectas, 78% in pick fives, 128% in the show pool and a staggering 403% in the pick six pool," reads the report, concluding, "The trend for all other customers is disturbing."

This trend is problematic; the report concludes that major problems is that the increases in CAW betting, due to rebates, does not make up for the handle decline from other sources. That has a deleterious effect on purses, whose soul source of funding in California is through wagering.

The report, "Sharks & Minnows--Managing the Growing Imbalance in Racing Wagering Markets," is available on the TIF website, racingthinktank.com.

CAW bettors receive rebates on the takeout because of the large volumes they bet, but they quote Del Mar president Josh Rubenstein as saying that those rebates will be limited at the Del Mar summer meet--at least in the win pool. *Cont. p6*

Ramspring Farm Hits the Mark (cont. from p1)

Mary Leigh's son Clay Patrick, an attorney in their home town of Frankfort who also works alongside his mother to oversee the daily operations of Ramspring, has spent decades observing his mother's knack for scoping out value at the breeding sale.

"She just loves horses, period," he explained. "She could look at horses all day long, 24/7. She goes into the sales and waits until the last one sells, making sure they don't slip through the cracks. She's very good at spotting a good-looking horse and finding a new mare that might be a good addition for the broodmare band."

While the acquisition of Belle's Finale exemplifies her purchaser's bargain buying routine, the mare's accomplishments since she arrived at Ramspring have been far from ordinary as her son **Up to the Mark** (Not This Time) has emerged as one the top turf horses in the country.

When the Patricks were impressed with Belle's Finale's first foal, they sent the mare back to Not This Time and the resulting foal was Up to the Mark. The February-foaled colt was a standout throughout his time at Ramspring.





Clay Patrick recalled how their team, along with Taylor Made advisor Stuart Angus, always thought highly of the youngster.

"Stuart comes out frequently and inspects the horses and the foals and he gives them a grade," Patrick explained. "I think the colt was one of the few horses that he's ever given an A- grade to on every occasion that he saw him. He was very handsome, a very good-looking young foal from the day he was born until he went to the sales ring."

While Patrick described sending the colt through the Keeneland September ring to sell for \$450,000 as a thrill, he said it has been even more gratifying to watch Up to the Mark's rise to the top of the sport this year.



The Todd Pletcher-trained, Repole Stable and St. Elias Stablescampaigned 4-year-old has made a name for himself after switching to the turf, recently reeling off masterful performances in the GI Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic S. and the GI Resorts World Casino Manhattan S.

"When he turned for home, it was just a thrill," Patrick said of the recent victory on Belmont weekend. "The hair stood up on the back of my neck when he got loose. Just seeing the horse that you nurtured and took care of from conception to the day he was a mature athlete ready to run was something. Todd Pletcher and the owners have done a super job with him."

Up to the Mark was one of the 12 to 15 foals Ramspring Farm breeds every year. The breed-to-sell operation focuses on quality over quantity and has been a family business from the beginning.

Mary Leigh and her husband Mac, a surgeon and businessman deeply involved in the Frankfort community, purchased the 200-acre farm in 1976. They named it after the spring located on the property that once had a ram pump system used to send the spring water uphill for livestock.

"I think it was something that they always wanted to do," Patrick explained about his parents' desire to get involved in the horse business. "They had it in their mind that they wanted to and then once they took the plunge and got into it, it was in their blood."

Bail Out Becky (Red Ransom) was one of the first horses to gain the Patricks recognition in the Thoroughbred world when she won the 1995 GI Del Mar Oaks and earned over \$700,000 for Ken and Sarah Ramsey. Other standouts among the stakes winners to come off the farm over the years include MGSW Lead Story (Editor's Note), 2012 GI Florida Derby runner-up Reveron (Songandaprayer), the MGISP 2017 GIII Turnback the Alarm H. winner Eskenformoney (Eskendereya) and GSP Winning Envelope (More Than Ready).

Ramspring Farm sits alongside the Kentucky River and as the crow flies, is just over a mile from where Dr. James Crow is said to have perfected the sour mash fermentation process used to produce bourbon. Appropriately, the farm is in the early stages of launching their own Ramspring Farm Kentucky Bourbon.

As a teenager growing up at Ramspring, Patrick—who is the youngest of three children—developed his own admiration for the land, the horses and the business.

"I've always enjoyed being out here and have spent a ton of my time on the farm," he explained. "The most exciting part for me was to see the foals grow up here and make their way to the sales and hopefully do well on the racetrack. I've moved out here and built a house on the farm."

Last summer the farm's patriarch, Dr. Patrick, passed away at the age of 87. Mary Leigh continues to oversee the operation from their home that overlooks several of the farm's main pastures, but she now has two more generations of Patricks who have developed their own passion for the land.

"My mother has always taken care of most of the aspects of the farm and is continuing to do so," Patrick said. "I have three boys and they all enjoy the farm and we combine to take care of it, along with all of the good people that we have working out here. I think the fact that it's a family affair is the most special part of it. We've had a lot of special events and family outings out here. To have the whole family enjoy it is special."

The farm's star broodmare Belle's Finale has a pipeline of foals that has the Ramspring team excited for the future. While her foal of 2021 died of colic complications, she has two youngsters on the ground and she recently checked in foal to Not This Time.

"He's got a lot of his sire in him and is a big, strong colt," Patrick shared. "He's got a very powerful motor on him and looks like he's going to be a runner."

This spring, Belle's Finale foaled a colt from the first crop of Maxfield on April 12.

"The Maxfield is a stoic individual who has a good head on his shoulders and looks great," said Patrick. "He looks like an A physical to me."

Until those youngsters hit the sales ring, the Patrick family will await news of Up to the Mark's next challenge as his connections point for a bid in the Breeders' Cup this fall.

"I would say he's definitely the best that we've ever had here," Patrick said. "That hair-raising experience of seeing him turning for home and giving that final kick, it's something to behold."



TIF Issues Alarming Report on CAW in California (cont. from p1)

"We get that late odds fluctuation is frustrating to players," Rubinstein said, referring to the fact that CAW players place their bets based on their perceived value in the odds close to post time, which creates major odds shifts--often after the horses have left the gate.

"Beginning with our upcoming summer meet, [we] will be implementing new protocols for CAW players that are designed to limit participation in the win pools at two minutes to post. Based on what we've monitored and analyzed from other tracks, we believe these protocols will reduce late odds changes." TIF reported that the largest rebates will be given to bets made with more than three minutes to post, a smaller amount at two minutes, and the smallest rebate at under two minutes. Non-rebated customers pay 15.43%, the report says.

"Limiting CAW guardrails to merely a rebate change in the win pool, while potentially helpful in reducing some late odds changes, amounts to little more than window dressing for mainstream customers," TIF concludes. "CAW betting in Del Mar's exotic pari-mutuel pools, particularly the trifecta, superfecta, pick three, four, five and six pools has been substantial. Play from Elite (Turf Club, a top CAW) and RGS (Racing and Gaming Services, another) customers exceeded 32% of total handle in each of those bet types last year and was 38% of pick five handle.

"CHRB data does not delineate how much is staked on the early pick five, with its friendly 14% takeout to mainstream bettors, and how much is on the high takeout late pick five, with a 23.68% takeout rate. It is reasonable to expect the percentage of CAW play reflects their enormous pricing advantage over the public on the late pick five. Total handle figures do not tell the most accurate story. In nearly every pool offered by Del Mar, all non-Elite and RGS handle is declining."





It's a huge need given the obstacles backstretch families encounter when it comes to how to care for their kids, but the Racetrack Chaplaincy has come up with an answer.

Some 10 years ago, the group started the Saratoga Enrichment Program, which places the children of Saratoga backstretch workers into local summer camps during the meet.

"The kids love it," said Humberto Chavez, New York Chaplain

for the Race Track Chaplaincy of America . "They get out of city life get into the country."

When racing moves to
Saratoga, the backstretch
workers have to adjust. There is
no housing for families on the
Saratoga backstretch, which
leaves only a few options, one
of which is a campground near
the track made available by a
local church. But that doesn't
solve what to do with the
children. During much of the
rest of the year, they go off to
school during the week while
their parents work their

backstretch jobs. With schools closed during the Saratoga season, parents sometimes have to choose between working or staying home to take care of their children.

"What they do is the mom or dad goes up to work in Saratoga and kids and the other parent stays back home here at Belmont or in Florida or Kentucky," Chavez said. "That was the only other option. In that case, the family component wouldn't be

> together. As a chaplaincy, we believe that families need to stay together. Families had traditionally always been very cautious about bringing their kids with them to Saratoga because of the restrictions of the track."

> To have the camp option solves much of the problem. The workers can go about their day knowing that their children are being looked after and having fun.

The chaplaincy has partnered with five camps and accepts children as young as six and as

old as 14. Chavez said that in a typical year about 25 kids will sign up for the program.

"The highlight of it last year came with a young girl who had never owned or ridden a bike," said New York Racetrack Chaplaincy president Ramon Dominguez. "We partnered with Saratoga Shredders, which has a youth mountain bike program. They donated bikes for each individual child in our program. They taught this girl how to ride a bike. That was her highlight and our highlight. That's what we're here for, to give them an experience that would be hard to have back home in a city environment."

The Saratoga Enrichment Program is wholly dependent on donations and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, Thoroughbred Charities of America and NYRA are among those who help out. The group also depends on donations from individuals, and Chavez admitted that donations "have been a little light" this year.

"We get donations from individuals who love what we do and want to give a child a good opportunity to spend a good summer in Saratoga and keep the nucleus of the family together," Chavez said. "We need people to help. It's for the kids and it helps their mons and dads who are working really hard in the industry."

IRAD ORTIZ, JR. SUSPENDED THREE DAYS FOR 'CARELESS RIDING' by T.D. Thornton

Irad Ortiz, Jr., who is currently the nation's leading jockey this year in both purse winnings and victories, waived his right to appeal a three-day "careless riding suspension" imposed by the Belmont Park stewards for a June 11 stretch-run infraction that resulted in an inquiry, but no disqualification.

Ortiz will sit out June 25, 30, and July 1, according to the New York State Gaming Commission ruling dated June 17.

Ortiz was attempting to rally from last by coming up the inside rail aboard **Federalist Papers** (More Than Ready) in that afternoon's third race, an allowance/optional claiming grass route.

According to the Equibase chart, Ortiz's mount "had a clear lane just off the fence initially between foes and then went on through a tighter seam a furlong out as Strikingly Spun came in very slightly as Shad Nation came out very slightly, had the rider release the right handed rein to go to a right handed crop and came in impeding Shad Nation on the fence forcing that rival to check sharply [with Ortiz] pausing himself to look back to assess the damage done..."

Federalist Papers finished third. **Strikingly Spun** (Hard Spun), ridden by Jose Ortiz, Irad's brother, finished second. **Shad Nation** (Cairo Prince), with Dylan Davis aboard, finished sixth.

MARYLAND COMMISSION CHAIR RESIGNS, CITING 'EMASCULATED' POWERS

Michael Algeo, who has served on the Maryland Racing Commission (MRC) since 2016 and was chairing that board, resigned from both positions, effective immediately, June 14.

Frank Vespe of Maryland's "Off to the Races Radio" was first to report the scoop on his show's June 17 broadcast.

Algeo's departure accentuates a time of regulatory upheaval within Maryland racing that in recent months has been marked by three other long-serving commissioners (David Hayden, Tom Bowman, Tom Winebrener) also either resigning from the MRC or not having their terms renewed by the governor.

Those recent departures have roughly coincided with the passage of a Maryland law in April to create a to-be-appointed oversight board with broad powers, the Maryland Thoroughbred Racetrack Operating Authority (MTROA).

In addition, the MRC is in the midst of the nationwide regulatory transition involving the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) Authority coming into power to police the sport's safety and drug testing.

Speaking on Vespe's show, Algeo also cited other concerns for the sport as he leaves his position, like the seemingly never-ending cycle of horse safety issues, plus the decades-old debate within Maryland about whether Laurel Park, Pimlico Race Course, or both figure into the state's long-term plans for racing.

"I've often compared it to playing a Whac-A-Mole game," Algeo told Vespe. "The minute you address one issue, one crisis, up pops another. And so I just thought it was time for new blood, younger blood, somebody that can come in and have a fresh look. And God bless them, because it's a great industry, and I feel very honored to have served for the past seven years....I'm going to be as interested as everybody else to see where this goes and how this all ends."

Asked by Vespe how all those pieces of the puzzle-the MRTOA, HISA, horse safety, the possible rebuilds at Pimlico/Laurel-are going to fit together under the commission's umbrella, Algeo admitted he didn't have a good answer.

"I'm going to plead ignorance," Algeo told Vespe. "I don't know how they're going to fit together. [The question I often get now is] 'Oh, so Maryland has created a new racing authority to oversee Maryland racing. So there is no more commission?' That's the question I'm getting. That's the perception of people, and perceptions carry a lot of weight."

Algeo continued: "I believe that the role of the MRC has been diminished significantly. It has been emasculated significantly. And it is not what it was when I started in 2016. And so it's going to be really interesting to see how two entities, the racing authority and the racing commission, work together.

"The simple answer is that the commission is a regulatory body, period," Algeo told Vespe. "I have been told that the [MRTOA] is really just a failsafe creation in the event that [1/ST Racing, which owns Laurel and Pimlico] should leave Maryland and [some entity] is needed to run the day-to-day operations. But until it actually forms and we see how it operates, I still have a lot of questions."

Algeo is a retired Maryland Circuit Court judge. His stint as the board's chair had been scheduled to end in October, with his term on the MRC expiring in July 2024.

Last month, Algeo was honored before the GI Preakness S. with the Special Award of Merit at Pimlico's annual Alibi Breakfast. That award recognizes those "who have made a positive impact on the racing industry."

FOUR HORSES DIE IN TRAILER FIRE ON **KENTUCKY HIGHWAY** by T.D. Thornton

Four Thoroughbreds died and four were rescued after a fire consumed a transport trailer on the Bluegrass Parkway near Bardstown, Kentucky, at around 6:25 a.m. Monday. No people were reported injured in the blaze.

The horses were being transported from California to Lexington, fire chief Todd Spalding of the Bardstown Fire Department told TDN. A posting on his department's Facebook page estimated the combined value of the perished horses at \$750,000.

"The cause of the fire is still under investigation," Spalding said. "Once the fire started, they pulled off to the side of the road and they tried to get as many horses out as they possibly could. I'm not sure what challenges they faced in getting the horses out; if it was just too much fire to get the other four horses out. One of the horses that did get out got a pretty good laceration on its rear hindquarter, but other than that, all of the other horses were okay that made it out."

Spalding said he did not have details about the precise location of where the horses were heading or to whom they belonged.

An employee who answered the phone in the California office of KC Horse Transport confirmed that its trailer was involved in the fire. But that person said they were not authorized to comment further. A request for a call back from someone who could speak on the record did not yield a reply prior to deadline for this story.

Bardstown is about 60 miles southwest of Lexington.

"When crews arrived on scene they found a horse trailer with heavy fire involvement," the Facebook posting stated. "Crews shut down the Bluegrass Parkway to commence fire attack."

HERNANDEZ, D'AMATO, REDDAM AMONG **HOLLYWOOD MEET LEADERS**

Juan Hernandez, Phil D'Amato and Paul and Zillah Reddam's Reddam Racing emerged as the leaders in the jockey, trainer and owner divisions, respectively, during Santa Anita's Hollywood Meet, which concluded a 28-day run at the Los Angeles area oval Sunday, June 18.

With a Sunday three-timer, emerging talent Hernandez continued his stranglehold on the Southern California jockeys' premiership, as he booted home 42 winners during the meeting. Hernandez, whose closing-day victories included the ride aboard new 'TDN Rising Star' Muth (Good Magic), saluted in 10 addedmoney events, five more than Hector Berrios.

D'Amato sent out 17 winners at the Hollywood Meet, besting Doug O'Neill (15) and Mark Glatt (14). D'Amato was also the leading conditioner during the Classic meeting at the track and is now the owner of five Santa Anita training titles overall. His five stakes victories were one better than Richard Mandella and Bob Baffert.

Reddam Racing runners posted seven wins from 38 starters-two better than Hronis Racing LLC.

"We certainly want to thank our horseplayers, owners, trainers, jockeys, backstretch workers and the thousands of people that help us put on the show that is live racing," said Santa Anita Senior Vice President and General Manager Nate Newby. "We are extremely proud of our safety record this year and we want to acknowledge this progress is the result of a true team effort from all stakeholders."

With the winter and spring meetings in the books, officials at Santa Anita turn their attention to the fall and the Breeders' Cup World Championships, which pay another visit to Arcadia this coming November.

"Looking ahead to the fall, it is indeed a great honor to be able to host the Breeders' Cup for an 11th time and preparations will begin tomorrow," said Newby. "We'll be offering our on-track fans a number of improvements, including a pair of brand new high resolution big screen televisions in the paddock which among many other things, will help to ensure the Great Race Place continues to look spectacular."

Racing returns to Santa Anita Friday, Sept. 29.

then, he has accounted for 387 individual winners according to Turkish Jockey Club statistics, 11 of which have succeeded at stakes level.

Lion Heart has also gone on to become a respectable sire of sires. In addition to Dangerous Midge, whose produce have achieved considerable success in Chile, his son Uncaptured was among the leading sires in Florida prior to being sold to continue his stud career in Korea. Kantharos also got his start in the Sunshine State before moving to Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Kentucky.

LION HEART PASSES AWAY IN TURKEY

Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat--Satin Sunrise, by Mr. Leader), a Grade I winner at two and three and runner-up to Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) in the 2004 GI Kentucky Derby, has passed away in Turkey, where he stood stud since 2011. He was 22 years of age and died from a circulatory disorder caused by heart failure.

A \$100,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling turned \$1.4-million Fasig-Tipton Florida juvenile, the Sabine Stable-bred Lion Heart was trained for the Coolmore connections by Patrick Biancone and capped a perfect 2-year-old campaign with a victory in the GI Hollywood Futurity. Second in the GII San Rafael S. and GI Toyota Blue Grass S., the chestnut filled the exacta underneath Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) in the 2004 GI Kentucky Derby and added another top-level tally in that year's GI Haskell Invitational H. He retired to Ashford Stud with five wins from

10 starts and earnings of \$1,390,800.

Lion Heart is the sire of 45 worldwide black-type winners, 15 of which have come at the graded level, led by elite scorers Bradester, GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Dangerous Midge, Line of David and Tom's Tribute. Sold to the Turkish Jockey Club in 2010, his first foals in that country were born in 2012, and since



LEXINGTON: THE EXTRAORDINARY LIFE AND TURBULENT TIMES OF AMERICA'S LEGENDARY RACEHORSE, BY KIM WICKENS

On the surface, it seems far-fetched to believe that the racing environment of today is in any way similar to that of Lexington's heyday, but after the concluding Lexington: The Extraordinary Life and Turbulent Times of America's Legendary Racehorse (Kim Wickens, *Random House*, available July 11, 2023), it seems that those by-gone days, in some ways, bear striking resemblance to our modern racing industry.

To begin with the basics, the work is well-worded and seamlessly carries the reader from one point to the next without having to hold hands and is researched to a meticulous degree. Taking into account the obvious difficulties of preserving records from a period when the country was rife with upheaval, whether societal or political, it can be a daunting task to seek out things as minute as stud fees and purchase prices. Wickens has done her homework, and thus spared the rest of us the footwork if one was hoping to learn about a Thoroughbred who largely has become lore.

The preview promised a colorful cast of characters and, for better or worse, the story delivers. Sabotage from bitter competitors, the tragedy of Lexington's fading vision, and interstate rivalries peppered much of the early racing landscape. The bedlam-while scandalous at the core--provides for a most amusing reading. Humanity is prone to tantalizing willingness to forget that we all haven't changed too much from our racing forefathers on a visceral level. Not to any notable degree, in any case. Lexington was a horse who drew a fiercely loyal legion of fans, not much different from Secretariat or Flightline or the Zenyattas and Rachel Alexandras of the present day. Said stallion also appears in every last one of their pedigrees and in every Horse of the Year in the last ten we've awarded the golden trophy; a note Wickens also makes in the back portion of the work.

Granted, though none of our readers are old enough to remember heats of four-mile races such as what the subject of the novel gleefully overcame, they vividly remember the emotions storied racehorses gave them. Like much of what all great philosophers and educated men have claimed, the adage rings true today: "the outside of the horse is good for the inside of the man". In that regard, we as racing fans, racehorse owners, breeders, and industry participants haven't fallen far from the tree at all.

Curiously, not just the early life of all involved, but the rush to secure breeding rights and his offspring once Lexington's career on the track was finished--a feeling many prominent Kentucky farms undoubtedly understand--was a fascinating section to read through. Stolen horses, roving bands of ransom-favoring ruffians, the tale of son Asteroid's theft and subsequent recovery felt almost to the level of wild west fiction, but alas, such was the demand for progeny of a living legend. Of course, chronically, the life of proud men isn't complete without various expositions of just how heated venue stand-offs could be when it came to arranging match races, and it reminded me of much of the posturing we see today...just with less arguing about locations and more about who is ducking whom.

In the ensuing chaos brought by Civil War, those around the hallowed horse either danced on a fine line or went all in for displaying loyalty to their belief systems (however we feel about them now), but it could perhaps be argued that their faith to Kentucky bloodstock was by far their lasting legacy to the sport of racing. As painstakingly detailed in her novel, men like R. A. Alexander not only sourced the best and the most promising lines for a state caught in the middle of bloody disputes between her surrounding neighbors, but Alexander in particular could well be called the father of the Woodlawn Vase. It is his prized Lexington sitting atop, proudly at the pinnacle. It was he who commissioned it, and then buried it while war raged around him. His precaution is the reason we have something to display every year during the Preakness.

In all, I thoroughly enjoyed Lexington: The Extraordinary Life and Turbulent Times of America's Legendary Racehorse. It is a work worth the time to sink into and dissect, if one feels so inclined. There is a lot to marvel at and think on. Mainly, the similarities between now and a past many like to believe we've left far in our rear view mirrors.



That said, he still has work to do to catch Royal Ascot's true ruler in Dubawi (Ire) whose multiple winners almost every year

come over all distances. Sheikh Mohammed's emperor sire is currently staying ahead of his Juddmonte nemesis, so it is fitting that their paths cross instantly in 2023. Godolphin's **Modern Games (Ire)**, whose professionalism and straightforward nature has seen him jump from Charlie Appleby's third-choice miler a year ago to leading light, shades favouritism for the Queen Anne as this is written.

Frankel's influence on the meeting that witnessed one of

his incredulous displays continues all week, with the opening fixture's G1 St James's Palace S. hosting his high-achieving son **Chaldean (GB)**, another Dettori posting. There is a touch of *The Rock* about Juddmonte's no-fuss Dewhurst and 2000 Guineas winner and the way he is going he could end up another



Kingsclere legend. First, he has to suppress the Curragh Classic winner **Paddington (GB)** (Siyouni {Fr}), the season's stealth bomber. A key component of Team Ballydoyle's opening salvo,

which is perhaps a touch light for them, he has to overcome a wide draw as well as a Newmarket Classic winner as he bids for edition number nine for Aidan O'Brien.

Galileo's influence, so longstanding here, is sadly confined on Tuesday to one of the yard's second division performers in **Bolshoi Ballet** (Ire) in the Listed Wolferton S., a kind of Princes of Wales's S. consolation prize. If his omnipotence has diminished with his reduced

representation, then the opportunity is there for a new Coolmore figurehead to emerge. Wootton Bassett (GB) is doing just that at present and his son River Tiber (Ire) heads into a battle of the TDN Rising Stars in the G2 Coventry S. With George Boughey's Asadna (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}).

The latter's scintillating time trial at Ripon put him into another dimension where his age group is concerned and recent Royal Ascots have proven how crucial the study of individual sectional time performances have been ahead of these tests.

Despite the Asadna effect, River Tiber has some of the best in the business already excited. As Ryan Moore discussed the operation's new 2-year-old sensation in his *betfair* blog, it felt almost like a warning. "Confidence is not a word I would use with so many similarly-unexposed promising two-year-olds in here, but I'll just say he is in very good shape for this," he stated, which could translate as "watch which way he goes".


Where the premier Royal Ascot sprints are concerned, 2023 marks a special anniversary with it being 20 years since the hemisphere-breaching revolution set in motion by Choisir (Aus). Prior to that moment, the idea of a strong Australasian, North American and Asian presence at this meeting was a flight of fancy, not the perennial certainty it is now. A barometer of how much respect overseas sprinters generate was evident again twelve months ago as Nature Strip (Aus) (Nicconi {Aus}) and Golden Pal (Uncle Mo) dominated the market for the G1 King's Stand S.

This year's renewal, which seems one for the fillies and mares, is not nearly so pre-destined for export with the Boadicea-like Highfield Princess (Fr) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) standing firm. Not since Britain celebrated the likes of Habibti (Ire) in the 1980s has a sprinting mare captured the imagination as she did during her golden summer in 2022 and her task is to ward off the chief Antipodean challenger Coolangatta (Aus) (Written Tycoon {Aus}) here. United with Nature Strip's rider James McDonald, having gone the tried-and-trusted Lightning route, she is Australia's apparent flag-bearer. Then there is the seriously-fast TDN Rising Star Dramatised (Ire) (Showcasing {GB}), who tries to do a "Lady Aurelia" for the Northern Hemisphere 3-year-old generation.

With all the subplots to a day at Royal Ascot, burning questions remain ahead of Tuesday's action. Will Irad Ortiz Jr be able to impose himself this year after a forgettable intro in 2022? Wesley Ward's Keeneland dynamo Fandom (GB) (Showcasing {GB})--the first horse to be double-entered this week having been confirmed for Wednesday's Listed Windsor Castle S.--and established sprinter Twilight Gleaming (Ire) (National Defense {GB}) can possibly help get him more into the Ascot groove. Can Amo Racing break their Royal meeting duck? The juvenile Bucanero Fuerte (GB), another Wootton Bassett owned in partnership with Giselle De Aguiar, is their first representative of the week in the Coventry. Can the pair of TDN Rising Stars Cicero's Gift (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}) and Mostabshir (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}) defy the inexperience gap and make their mark in the St James's Palace?

Can Willie Mullins tighten his grip on the staying handicaps with the dual-purpose stars **Bring On The Night (GB) (Gleneagles {Ire})** and **Vauban (Fr)** (Galiway {GB})? The latter is undoubtedly the classiest hurdler that his trainer has brought here and could conceivably have won Thursday's Gold Cup. Ryan Moore is on both supposed "good things" and a double on top of any earlier successes could see him stake an early claim for a landmark 10th leading rider title. With such firepower this week, what can stop him? Ah, yes. Frankie.

Amy Marnane said, "It's completely surreal, really, to buy Givemethebeatboys for €11,000 and then for him to not get into a breeze-up sale, and then to go on to win his maiden so impressively at Navan, and then to win the Marble Hill Stakes at the Curragh. It was won by Blackbeard last year, and has been won by Caravaggio, it's a fantastic race to win."

She continued, "Goffs put on such a show. Everybody who is anybody is here and we just hope that the horse goes on to win the Coventry tomorrow. Mrs Harrington and Kate Harrington have been a huge part of this horse's career and they are so excited to see him run tomorrow, which gives us huge confidence in him."

Kate Harrington confirmed that the colt will return to her family's stable. She said, "We're delighted for Bronsan Racing to have bought such an exciting horse in Givemethebeatboys and let's hope he can go and do them justice in the Coventry. He will stay in training with us after Ascot which is very exciting."

The Marnanes will not be without a runner at Royal Ascot, however, as they retained the recent Tipperary winner Supersonic Man (GB), another son of Bungle Inthejungle who is

declared for Wednesday's Windsor Castle S., at £270,000.

"He'll go close," said a delighted Con Marnane, while his daughter added, "We didn't sell Supersonic Man but we are very excited to see what he can do on Wednesday. He's not just a small, sharp two-year-old, he's a big, robust horse who will go on and hopefully we'll have a lot of fun with him throughout the summer."

It was nine years ago that the racing crowd first descended on London on the eve of Royal Ascot for the sale of a select group of Thoroughbreds, plenty of whom had some smart entries for the week ahead. It is a unique concept in Europe, and as much a lavish cocktail party as it is a horse sale. But since that inaugural event of 2014, the boutique auction, which has been tweaked and trimmed in the process, has sold 148 lots for just shy of £37 million. That tally was boosted by the £3,770,000 bid on Monday, when, from 21 lots offered, including breeding rights to Havana Grey (GB) and Soldier's Call (GB), 11 were sold at an average of £342,727 and median of £250,000.

Other highlights of the sale include:

No Nay Mets (Ire) won a Royal Ascot qualifying race on his sole start at Gulfstream Park for trainer George Weaver and Bergman Family Racing. Not only has he had his airfare paid by Ascot Racecourse, but he has now netted his owners £800,000 before even setting foot on a racecourse again. The No Nay Never colt, who was bred by Coolmore and sold as a yearling by Baroda Stud at Arqana for €180,000, was bought by Liam Culman's Tuckernuck Stables.

- Gai Waterhouse has supported the Goffs London Sale since its inaugural year and she and co-trainer Adrian Bott purchased two lots on Monday assisted by bloodstock agent Johnny McKeever. The first, bought in partnership with Craig Thompson's Mount Hallowell Stud, was Cuban Dawn (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), bought for £300,000 from his breeder Jim Bolger and co-owner Teme Valley Racing. The three-year-old colt has finished second in two of his three starts during May, having made his debut in the Listed Tetrarch S., in which he was fourth behind subsequent Irish 2,000 Guineas winner Paddington (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}). Teme Valley was also the co-owner, with Ballylinch Stud, of Waterhouse's other purchase, New Endeavour (Ire). The New Bay (GB) gelding was sold for £260,000 and is entered for both the Britannia and the Buckingham Palace S. on Thursday for Roger Varian.
- Ocean Vision (Ire) (U S Navy Flag) was knocked down to Marguee Bloodstock, with bloodstock agent Martin Buick

acting on behalf of Ramiro Restrepo, best known for purchasing Kentucky Derby winner Mage (Good Magic). It is understood that the three-year-old will remain with his trainer Tim Donworth in France for the immediate future but the plan is for the colt to continue his career in America. Ocean Vision, who was sold for £250,000, was one of three French-trained horses to be offered at the sale. He won the Listed Prix

MORLEY BACK ON FAMILIAR TURF WITH CYNANE

English-born trainer Tom Morley will be represented by his first runner at Royal Ascot on Wednesday when **Cynane** (Omaha Beach) lines up for the G2 Queen Mary S. A winner on debut at Belmont Park in May, the filly will be ridden by Javier Castellano. Castellano, who is currently enjoying a fantastic season having won the Kentucky Derby on Mage (Good Magic) and Belmont Stakes on Arcangelo (Arrogate).

Morley, the nephew of Gold Cup-winning trainer David Morley has been training in America for ten years. He previously worked in Newmarket for Jeremy Noseda and Ed Dunlop.

"When we saw this filly at the Keeneland September sales, I really had a feeling that I was looking at a horse that was very similar to the type that my ex-boss, Jeremy Noseda, went to America and purchased with a view to races like the Cheveley Park and the Queen Mary," said Morley of Cynane, who has been stabled in Newmarket ahead of her Royal Ascot bid.

"It has always been in the back of my mind and a little bit of a plan that maybe she could turn out to be a Royal Ascot filly if she was precocious enough and if she was fast enough to win on debut. Fast forward to five weeks ago at Belmont when she crossed the line and the dream was really in motion then."

Cynane is owned by three ownership groups, VinLaur Racing Stables, West Paces Racing and Rainbow's End Racing Stable.

Morley added, "She's arrived in fantastic condition. She arrived very hydrated and has eaten fabulously since she got here. She's got a wonderful mental outlook on life; we've always believed that she had the right mind to take a trip like this."

In 1997, the trainer's uncle saddled Celeric (GB) (Motto {GB}) to win the Gold Cup for his late owner-breeder Christopher Spence, an occasion which would prove pivotal in the life of the young Morley.

He recalled, "My mother and father took me out of school when Celeric won the Ascot Gold Cup and that was the first time I went to Royal Ascot and the last time that I ever considered doing anything else in my life but training racehorses."

CAPE WINTER MIXED SALE POSTS GAINS

The Cape Winter Mixed Sale, held June 16 at Hollywoodbets Kenilworth, South Africa, posted strong increases over the same sale a year ago, Cape Racing Sales announced on Monday.

Overall, 129 lots of 169 offered were listed as sold for a R12.47 million (\leqslant 628,000) aggregate, which produced an average of R96,667 (\leqslant 4,879)--up from last year's average of around R80,000 (\leqslant 4,030)--and a median of R60,000 (\leqslant 3,023).

The 15-year-old mare **Louvre (SAf)** (Doowaley {Ire}) brought R900,000 (€45,344) from Jono Snaith/Philaris Ltd. to claim top price for the sale. Drakenstein Stud Ltd., agent, consigned the Grade 2 winner, who is the dam of G1 Turffontein Horse Chestnut S. winner Trip of Fortune (SAf) (Trippi). Overall Snaith was the highest buyer, securing four lots for R1.31 million (€66,000).

"This sale showed a resurgence in the buyers bench. I saw a few old faces coming from the woodwork," Snatih said. "It was encouraging and I believe the interest was revived as a result of Cape Racing's latest incentives. The venue was beautifully renovated, the atmosphere was good and we enjoyed ourselves. This is the way of the future for bloodstock auction sales, and Cape Town remains the ideal city to host them."
