



IN HISTORIC SHOWDOWN, STARS COLLIDE IN TRAVERS

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – With the three winners of the Triple Crown races gathered for just the fourth time in the GI Travers S. Saturday, will history repeat itself? Will a horse that did not run in the GI Kentucky Derby, GI Preakness S. or the GI Belmont S. deliver an upset in the 154th Travers?

That is how it played out in 1918 with Sun Briar, again in 1982 with Runaway Groom and six years ago when West Coast won the 2017 running of Saratoga's oldest stakes race.

If the historical form stretching over 100 years holds, **Scotland** (Good Magic) will prevail. The LNJ Foxwoods homebred is the only one of the seven horses entered Tuesday that did not start in any of the Triple Crown races.

Kentucky Derby winner Mage (Good Magic) is in the Travers field, as is Preakness winner National Treasure (Quality Road) and Belmont hero Arcangelo (Arrogate). So, too, is Forte (Violence), the 2-year-old champion, who was the favorite in the Derby, but was a vet scratch the morning of the race. He finished second in the Belmont and prepped for the 1 1/4 miles Travers with a nose victory in the GII Jim Dandy S. on July 29.

Also taking aim at the \$1.25-million Travers purse are **Disarm** (Gun Runner) and **Tapit Trice** (Tapit).

MEDINA SPIRIT'S DERBY DQ UPHELD AT KHRC LEVEL, RIPENING CASE FOR COURT

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) on Tuesday closed the 27-month regulatory saga involving Medina Spirit's GI Kentucky Derby drug disqualification by unanimously voting to deny appeals by trainer Bob Baffert and owner Zedan Racing Stables while accepting a hearing officer's recommended order that the penalties originally imposed by the Churchill Downs stewards be affirmed in their entirety.

But the legal battle to restore Medina Spirit's win in America's most historic and important horse race appears to be just now ramping up.

That's because now that the KHRC's decision is final at the state administrative level, it is ripe for being elevated to the court system and challenged by the losing parties.

Medina Spirit crossed the wire first in the 2021 Derby but subsequently tested positive for betamethasone in a KHRC post-race drug screening. **Cont. p7**

From the rail out, the complete field for the Travers S. with morning-line odds:

- 1-Forte (Violence) (7-5)
- 2-Arcengelo (Arrogate) (5-2)
- 3-Tapit Trice (Tapit) (12-1)
- 4-Mage (Good Magic) (4-1)
- 5-National Treasure (Quality Road) (8-1)
- 6-Disarm (Gun Runner) 6-1
- 7-Scotland (Good Magic) 12-1

All starters will carry 126 pounds.

Jockey Javier Castellano rode Mage in the Derby and Arcangelo in the Belmont. Luis Saez will take over on Mage and Jose Ortiz will be up on Tapit Trice.

Jena Antonucci became the first woman to train the winner of a Triple Crown race when Arcangelo beat Forte by 1 1/2 lengths in the Belmont. If Arcangelo extends his winning streak to four in his first race since the June 10 Belmont, Antonucci would join trailblazer Mary Hirsch, who saddled 1938 winner Thanksgiving, in the Travers record book. Arcangelo will be Antonucci's first Travers runner.

"Having the opportunity to be able to participate in these races is obviously a blessing in itself," she said. "It's a really cool field. As a race fan myself, to see what is coming together is

pretty neat. Obviously, Forte being in the mix, as well, I don't think he can be ignored in the mentions. It makes for a great day of racing, and a great talking topic for fans and others alike. Those are things that our sport continues to need to see happen."

In May 2022 at Belmont, Forte lived up to the buzz with a 7 3/4-length maiden victory at 1-5. He was fourth as the favorite in the GIII Sanford S., but romped in the slop to win the GI

Hopeful S. Earlier this year, Forte was disqualified from the Hopeful win for a post-race drug positive, a decision that is being appealed.

Forte wrapped up the divisional title with wins in the GI Breeders' Futurity and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He opened his 3-year-old season with a victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S. and then rallied in the stretch of the GI Florida Derby to beat Mage. On the morning of the Derby, he was scratched when a veterinarian had concerns about a bruised right front foot. Arcangelo topped him in the Belmont, his first start in 2 1/2 months.


Trainer Todd Pletcher elected to keep Forte at Saratoga and prep in the Jim Dandy. That narrow victory over Saudi Crown (Always Dreaming) was in question immediately after the race as stewards decided whether Forte should be DQ'd for bumping Angel of Empire (Classic Empire) while looking for running room entering the stretch. The order of finish was not changed.


With its stature, the Travers is a prize every year, but it is especially important this year for Forte and his connections.

"It's a game of ups and downs," said Mike Repole, who co-owns the colt with St. Elias Stable. "You had the Derby scratch and second in the Belmont. He won the Florida Derby. He won the Jim Dandy. He'll be the favorite in the Travers. And he's the 2-year-old champ. It would be real, real special, especially for him because now he's in the race. The Derby winner is in it. The Preakness winner is going to be in it. So is the Belmont winner. And the 2-year-old champion. Four champs. Real exciting."

Pletcher said a Travers score would be satisfying in what has been a trying season.

"You're never going to make up for not getting to run in the Kentucky Derby," he said, "but it would be, I suppose, some sort





of consolation prize if we were able to win the Travers against the three classic winners."

In 1918, the French-bred Sun Briar became the first horse to defeat the Triple Crown winners in the Travers. Sun Briar, a huge success as a 2-year-old, was withdrawn from the Derby entries when his trainer Henry McDaniel thought he was training sluggishly. In his place, owner Willis Sharpe Kilmer ran the gelding, Exterminator, who had been purchased as Sun Briar's work mate. Exterminator won by a length at 29-1.

Four days after the Derby, War Cloud, who was fourth as the favorite, won a division of the Preakness. Johren had skipped the Derby and finished fourth behind War Cloud in the Preakness then won the Belmont, two lengths ahead of War Cloud. Sun Briar was back in form in the summer and ready for the Travers. He battled Harry Payne Whitney's Johren through the stretch and won by a head to establish the Travers theme.

By the time the 1982 Travers was run on Aug. 21, the Triple Crown series had become a high-profile sporting event. Gato Del Sol won the Derby, but went back to California and did not try the Preakness, which was won by a new shooter, Aloma's Ruler. Trainer Eddie Gregson brought Gato Del Sol to the Belmont, where he was second, beaten 14 lengths by Conquistador Cielo, the Met Mile winner the previous Monday. Aloma's Ruler was ninth.

The Saratoga infield was open to spectators for the Travers and the crowd of 41,839--second-largest in track history--saw the Canadian-bred Runaway Groom come from far back to beat Aloma's Ruler by three-quarters of a length. Conquistador Cielo was rank and could not be controlled by jockey Eddie Maple and raced head to head with Aloma's Ruler from the start. Runaway Groom, the winner of two-thirds of Canada's Triple Crown that summer, pounced on the pair in the stretch. He paid \$27.80.

West Coast leads Always Dreaming, Cloud Computing and Tapwrit in the Travers | Sarah Andrew

The third edition of the Triple Crown showdown in the Travers featured Derby winner Always Dreaming (Bodemeister), Preakness victor Cloud Computing (Maclean's Music) and the Belmont standout Tapwrit (Tapit). Trainer Bob Baffert sent late-developing West Coast (Flatter) in from Del Mar and Mike Smith rode him to a gate-to-wire victory at 6-1. Tapwrit moved toward contention on the second turn, tired and ended up

fourth. Cloud Computing finished eighth and Always Dreaming was ninth. West Coast captured the 3-year-old male championship.


Mage went on to Baltimore after the Derby and finished third in the Preakness. Trainer Gustalvo Delgado gave him a break and started preparing him for a summer campaign with the Travers as the target. He returned to competition on July 22 with a second in the GI Haskell S. at Monmouth Park. He shipped to Saratoga two days later and has worked three times over the main track. Assistant trainer Gustalvo Delgado Jr. said the colt was thriving and that the connections feel he will be at his best after having a month to settle in.

"He's liking it a lot," Delgado Jr. said. "He loves Saratoga." Scotland advanced to the Travers from a front-running 3 1/2-length win in the Curlin S. on July 21. He is handled by Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott, who has won most of the Saratoga stakes at least once, but he has yet to capture the Travers in 11 tries.

Baffert is seeking his fourth Travers win with National Treasure, who has not raced since he was sixth after setting the pace in the Belmont. He will race without blinkers.

After running fourth in the Kentucky Derby in a troubled trip, Disarm won the GIII Matt Winn S. and was fourth in the Jim Dandy. Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen is putting blinkers

on Disarm for the first time in a race.

Pletcher ran Forte in blinkers in the Jim Dandy and has made that equipment change for his other Travers horse, Tapit Trice. He galloped the horse with blinkers last week and had them on again for a breeze Saturday morning. Pletcher is hoping the blinkers will get Tapit Trice into a competitive position in the race. He felt that Forte lost focus at times in the Florida Derby and the Belmont, but has liked what he saw in the Jim Dandy and in training. He knows that Forte is game.

"You could see it in, well, almost all of his wins, but particularly in the Florida Derby," Pletcher said. "He seemed to salvage victory from what looked like a sure defeat coming by me at the eighth pole, to accelerate like you did and make up that much ground on the eventual Derby winner. I was proud of him in the Belmont. He was taking all the worst of it got a bit of a wide trip around the turn, coming off a 10-week layoff and still gaining on the winner at the end. In the Jim Dandy had a lot to do with a sixteenth of a mile to go. He's got that personality that he wants to wants to get there first."

Medina Spirit Derby DQ cont. from p1

The Aug. 22, 2023, final order denying the appeals on behalf of Baffert and Medina Spirit's owner, Amr Zedan, officially elevates Mandaloun as the official winner of the 147th Derby.

Not only does the denial of the appeals uphold Medina Spirit's DQ, it lets stand the 90-day KHRC suspension that Baffert already served in 2022 but wanted expunged from his record. Also upheld was the \$7,500 fine the KHRC imposed upon Baffert.

Baffert did not respond to TDN's request for comment prior to deadline for this story.

But the Hall-of-Fame trainer's attorney, W. Craig Robertson III, said he will soon be outlining next-step legal strategies with Baffert.

"It's disappointing that the KHRC engaged in no analysis whatsoever of the Hearing Officer's Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law," Robertson wrote in an email. "Neither did the KHRC's Order address any of the many objections we raised to the Hearing Officer's ruling.

"Instead, the KHRC did what it does best--rubber stamped its own foregone conclusion. I will discuss with Mr. Baffert, but believe it is highly likely the matter is appealed so that it can finally be presented to an impartial Court," Robertson wrote. Eight days after the 2021 Derby, Baffert first disclosed the

betamethasone positive at a press conference outside the barn where Medina Spirit was stabled at Churchill Downs. In doing so, he was getting out in front of the official announcement that would come later by the KHRC.

In Kentucky, betamethasone is classified as a Class C drug (on an A-through-D scale with A being the most severe). It is prohibited in any amount in a post-race test.

At first, on May 9, 2021, Baffert chose to implicate various non-specific circumstances as the underlying culprit in the positive test. Two days later, on May 11, Baffert's legal team issued a press release stating that Medina Spirit was treated with the betamethasone-containing ointment Otomax as late as the day before his Derby win to help deal with a skin lesion.

Baffert and Zedan's lawyers would eventually build more than two years of court cases and administrative appeals around the contention that the betamethasone that showed up in Medina Spirit's post-race positive test was the type that came from a permissible topical ointment and not via some other restricted means, like an intra-articular injection.

The Twitter account for Zedan Racing posted a statement on Tuesday that underscored that this method-of-delivery argument would continue to be a central plank in any future court case.

"Today's decision by the KHRC finding the use of a commonly used topical ointment to be a medication rule violation relating to Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit was expected. We now look forward to a court's review and legal analysis of the express rules and basic constitutional principles involved. We genuinely believe that the wisdom and guidance that a court can provide will bring clarity benefitting all industry partners and particularly trainers and veterinarians."

Although no KHRC ruling was issued in the first nine months after Medina Spirit's positive finding, the gaming corporation Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI), in June 2021 barred Baffert from competing at its portfolio of tracks for two years.

Medina Spirit died on Dec. 6, 2021, collapsing to the track after working five furlongs at Santa Anita Park. A necropsy conducted by the California Horse Racing Board stated that a "definitive cause of death was not established despite extensive testing."

In 2022, Baffert initiated a federal lawsuit that challenged CDI's ban. The case dragged into 2023, when it was dismissed.

The KHRC finally held its hearing on Medina Spirit's positive test on Feb. 14, 2022, and issued the rulings against Baffert and Zedan a week later.

When stay requests pending appeals filed with the KHRC were denied, Baffert and Zedan took the matter to court, with the KHRC case unfolding around the same time as Baffert's unsuccessful lawsuit against CDI.

In the spring of 2022 Baffert failed to get an injunction against

the KHRC that would have kept him from serving his suspension, so he stepped away from training between early April and early July of that year to sit out his penalty.

The KHRC appeals then led to six days of evidentiary hearings in August 2022. The process got delayed a month later when the hearing officer had to recuse himself after one of Baffert's attorneys bought a horse at auction that the hearing officer co-owned.

A new hearing officer, Eden Stephens, took over, and in May 2023 issued a report that concluded that "the stewards' decision was made on reliable, substantive evidence that the horse, Medina Spirit, was administered and carried the prohibited substance, betamethasone" and that "the KHRC's regulations do not state that any route of administration excuses a post-race betamethasone positive."

It took nearly three more months before the KHRC's vote on the hearing officer's recommendations made it onto the Aug. 22, 2023, monthly meeting agenda. In the interim, CDI extended its private-property banishment of Baffert through 2024.

On Tuesday, the KHRC did not discuss any specifics of the appeals prior to the unanimous voice vote to reject them. The item was listed last on the meeting agenda, and it occurred after a break for the commission to have discussions in an executive session.

When the KHRC reconvened in open session, chairman Jonathan Rabinowitz asked if any commissioners wanted to "abstain due to conflicts of interest, or perceived conflicts of interest." Four did: Michael Dudgeon, Lesley Howard, Charles O'Connor and Catherine Parke.

Rabinowitz then called for a vote "approving a final order as

TDN had to subsequently ask for and receive a copy of the order from KHRC staff after the meeting to learn what it stated.

"The Hearing Officer's Recommended Order is approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference as a part of this Order," the five-page document read, in part. "Petitioners' appeal is therefore DISMISSED. This is a FINAL AND APPEALABLE ORDER..."

The document listed the procedures for just such an appeal, which, according to state statue, must happen in a Kentucky circuit court within 30 days after issuance of the final order.

THE X-RAY FILES: WESLEY WARD

The TDN sat down with trainer Wesley Ward for the next installment in this ongoing series presented in cooperation with the Consignors and Breeders Association (CBA). Through conversations with buyers and sellers, the series looks to contribute to the discussion on radiograph findings and their impact on racetrack success.

Nothing quite goes together like Wesley Ward and winning 2-year-olds in the Spring at Keeneland. The leading trainer at six Keeneland Spring meets, Ward's early starting juveniles are usually treated as sure things when they head to the post. The group is generally a mix of homebreds from Ward's successful off-the-beaten path breeding operation, as well as horses purchased for clients at the previous fall's yearling sales.

When Ward is shopping the yearling auctions, he said he has one non-negotiable on the vet work.

"I always scope," Ward said. "That's what we start with. The horse has to scope fine. That's number one. When I am buying horses at sales, I always try to get a no-airway abnormalities. That's something that can't be rectified."

Buying with the intention of racing gives Ward more flexibility than shoppers looking for horses to re-sell as 2-year-olds the following year.

"You are certainly going to look at any defects, as far as if there are any chips or OCDs, we take that into consideration," Ward said. "But when I am buying yearlings, I am able to forgive a lot of things because I am going to the races. I am not going to try to resell. There will be some issues that consignors of 2-year-olds can't buy because they have to re-sell to future clients. A lot of people aren't as forgiving as I am. I tend to forgive a lot and this way they get discounted by other trainers or owners because they are relying heavily on vets. But a lot of the best horses that I have had haven't passed vets, either as yearlings or as 2-year-olds. And for me, I have never had any issues with them."

Over his three decades as a trainer, Ward said he has learned to structure his training regimen to take into consideration those veterinary issues.

"When horses have issues, I tend to not train them very hard," he said. "When I breeze horses, most of the riders who breeze

my horses are right around 100 pounds and never over 110. I try to not go too fast with them in the mornings. I am sort of evolving with that, whereas I used to like to breeze the horses fast and get them fit. Now I tend to go the other way and I have a really light rider when they are breezing or going fast and then in the interim, I will do a lot of jogging."

In addition to his success with sales purchases, Ward has built a steady stream of success with homebreds by less-than-commercial stallions. During the first week of this year's Keeneland Spring meet, he won with 2-year-old homebreds Bledsoe (Iqbaal), Hibernacle (Hootenanny) and Mangione (Hootenanny). Hibernacle went on to sell for \$310,000 at the Keeneland April Horses of Racing Age Sale a few weeks later.

It's fair to say these homebreds have a very different upbringing than their sales counterparts.

"I try to let them be horses from the time they are born," Ward said. "There is very little human interaction. Everything is outside, we never bring them inside, and we pet them a lot to where they are not afraid of people, but yet they are wild. That's the way I try to raise them. When we wean them, that's when we teach them to walk and we will spend about a week keeping them in the barn, putting a halter on them and walk them. And then in the springtime the following year, when they are just turning one, that's when we bring them in and swim them for about a week, not for anything other than they really learn a lot mentally. And then we will kick them out until September when we start breaking them."

During his breaking process, Ward utilizes his horses' natural herd instinct, always working with young horses two at a time or in a large group.

"They are all together--horses are herd animals," Ward said.
"Gradually we move them from Kentucky to Florida and we start weaning them to where they can go individually. But that will be

a long way. It's a long process."

he cleans it up."

It's a long process...and where is the vet in the process?

"I have very few vet bills, but I do a lot of X-rays," Ward said.

"My veterinarian Tami Gillon will have radiographs on all of our babies just to see moving forward what issues they have and if they do have any issues, Dr. Wayne McIlwraith has been my veterinarian surgeon for 30 years. He comes in once a month and cleans up whatever we have. I just wait on him and sometimes we will have to wait a month. What I have found is that, waiting on Dr. McIlwraith to come in, that joint calms down. Say with some of the older horses who are injured in a race or work, if they chip an ankle or a knee, the longer you wait to fix whatever issue there is, it helps to let that joint calm down and just keep that horse in the stall until he can get in there and

While the process of raising his young horses may be long, Ward thinks it shows up in the way they perform on the racetrack.

"That wildness is still in them," he said. "Which is why I think raising them that way, they outrun their pedigrees."

The sales yearlings, on the other hand, come into Ward's barn with a whole other upbringing and their addition to the herd can help bring the homebreds up to speed.

"The ones I get from the sale are pretty much already broke," Ward said. "They have been handled so much and prepped so much that it doesn't take much with them. We will get them and turn them out with the ones that I raised and we will sort of use those horses who are way more advanced. They are a lot easier to break than mine and they help mine because they will follow them. Mine, you can hardly lead them. And these ones are essentially broke. Mine are followers. They will follow the other horses, but within a couple of weeks, they fall right into where you couldn't tell who is who."



Il Miracolo (Gun Runner), a longshot second in Saratoga's Curlin S. July 21, broke through with a career high in Tuesday's GIII Smarty Jones S. at Parx.

Drawn widest of all in post eight, the 7-2 chance was hustled from his outside draw and raced three wide around the clubhouse turn. He sat a perfect, stalking trip from an outside third, made his move on the far turn, kicked for home as the one to catch, and, despite drifting out badly down the lane, was never in any serious danger late. It was three lengths back to **Cagliostro** (Upstart) in second; **Daydreaming Boy** (Goldencents) was third.

A well-beaten sixth in both the GII Fountain of Youth S. Mar. 4 and GI Curlin Florida Derby Apr. 1, II Miracolo followed an optional claiming win at Gulfstream Park May 11 with a seventh-place finish in the GI Belmont S. June 10. He finished 3 1/4 lengths behind the GI Travers S.-bound Scotland (Good Magic) in the Curlin.

Il Miracolo becomes the 14th graded/20th stakes winner worldwide for leading young sire Gun Runner. The Gun Runner over Tapit cross is also responsible for GISW Society and GSWs Wicked Halo, Red Route One and Disarm. The winner's dam Tapit's World, a \$175,000 purchase by Willow Oaks Farm at the 2015 FTKNOV sale, is also responsible for the 2-year-old colt Mister Cruiser (Catalina Cruiser) and a Vekoma filly of this year. She was bred back to Vekoma for 2024.

IN TRIBUTE TO ANTHONY MANGANARO

Tributes continue to come in to industy innovator and Siena Farm owner Anthony Manganaro, who passed away suddenly Sunday in Saratoga.

Anthony Manganaro wasn't out to make friends. He was out to change an industry he loved. He was a street fighter, a former labor organizer, and he was willing to fight. When one idea hit a dead end, he came up with another one and another one and,

well, you get the idea. He never gave up in his mission to make the industry better.

I often say one of the wonderful things about my career is I've had the opportunity to be around and learn from some very smart and remarkable people. If I had to rank them, Anthony might be #1 for me. He was one of those rare people who was a visionary and who flew at 30,000 feet, seeing the big picture. That's not something many of us can do. We know we should and we try, but we just aren't capable of doing it. Anthony had that gift.

I first met him around 15 years ago. He introduced himself and brought me into his circle of confidants. He included me in his mission to make the sport better for everyone involved, especially the people who didn't have a voice.

I soon learned he had the ideas, the vision and the finances to change the industry. He spent millions of dollars of his own money with architects, lawyers and consultants as he refined his ideas. He took me to meetings with former NBA commissioner, David Stern, former Major League Baseball players attorney, Don Fehr, and a sports business icon, Harvey Schiller. The thing each of them had in common was they recognized that Thoroughbred racing had all the ingredients to make it a major league sport again. They were truly excited about its potential and the possibilities. The ideas they had and the vision they could see for horse racing were inspiring.

There was just one problem. They didn't know our industry. They didn't know we were an industry, as Anthony always said, that refused to want to make the pie bigger. Instead we'd rather fight over our slice of a shrinking pie.

Anthony, like another visionary, B. Wayne Hughes, worked tirelessly to make the industry he cared about better. They were both remarkable individuals who commanded enormous amounts of respect, regardless of what side of the debate you were on.

If you knew him, you realize we just lost our biggest thinker. If you didn't know him, then you have no idea what we lost. Trust me, we lost a lot. We lost someone we won't replace very easily.

There are very few Anthony Manganaros out there, if any. And unfortunately we weren't always smart enough to listen to him. If we had, I can promise you we wouldn't be facing as many challenges as we do today.

But he can rest in peace knowing he sure tried. I'll miss him and whether you know it or not, so will you. Go in peace, friend.

Anthony had a profound impact on many. He mentored in such a way that traversed typical career advice and focused on the fundamentals of who we are and who we could become... He truly wanted others around him to be successful. Perhaps the easiest way to describe how he mentored was through a passage he sent me after my first child was born:

To win the respect of intelligent people and the affection of children;

Indeed, Anthony left the world a better place. He consistently cultivated his 'garden patch.' He paid special attention to all of those in his life and ultimately trained countless gardeners to carry on that legacy.

Rancho Temescal, a leading Thoroughbred farm in Southern California, has opened the gates of its 6,000-acre property to house incoming tenant Fresh Start Sport Horses, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that retrains racehorses for alternative careers under the direction of founder and head trainer Cassandra Andersson. The move to relocate all Fresh Start horses and equipment from the group's former, five-acre leased facility in Agua Dulce is expected to be completed by Sept. 1, 2023.

"We are honored to welcome Fresh Start Sport Horses to our farm," said Rancho Temescal President Tim Cohen. "My family has long operated under the philosophy of always care--not just after care--for our athletes. This exciting addition of Fresh Start and its wonderful retraining program will allow us to continue that commitment on a much more fundamental and meaningful level."

Over the past seven years, approximately 50 horses campaigned by Red Baron's or owned by Rancho Temescal clients have been rehomed through the Fresh Start program.

These graduates range in status from \$1,384,604-earner Itsinthepost (Fr) and \$397,140-earner Si Sage (Fr), each of whom carried Red Baron's silks to multiple graded stakes victories, to the non-winners Fi Fi's Wild Heart and Endearing Suances, whose combined career earnings on the racetrack were just over \$1,000.

"It is so rewarding to see our former racehorses thrive in their new careers, no matter how much talent they displayed on the track," Cohen said. "So, when we learned recently that Fresh Start was considering closing their facilities due to a lack of resources, Red Baron's Barn jumped at the opportunity to provide significant funding and housing so Cassandra and her crew can continue their important work here at Rancho Temescal."

RETURN TO V2 SALE STYLE RESULTS IN SUPERB RISE IN TRADE AT ARQANA



Lot 328: the Kodiac colt led the way at V2 | Zuzanna Lupa

DEAUVILLE, France--The return to the V2 Sale at Arqana worked wonders for the middle market trade on Tuesday with eight six-figure lots going through the ring on a day where over €5.5m was spent on 141 yearlings.

The V2 Sale was replaced by the September Sale 12 months ago due to an oversupply of yearlings but an average price of less than €20,000 on 202 horses sold brought an abrupt end to the new concept.

With the Tuesday average over double that of last year's September Yearling Sale, reverting to the V2 style can be deemed a resounding success for Arqana and tops off a memorable weekend for the sales company following the bonanza of an August Sale.

It didn't take long for the big prices--relative to the stock on offer--to start rolling in at Arqana on Tuesday with lot 328, a Kodiac (GB) colt from Haras de la Louvière, selling to Arthur Hoyeau on behalf of the Windfield Colt Partnership for €200,000.

The Kodiac colt is out of Rainbow Vale (Fr) (Moss Vale {Ire}), herself a half-sister to the black-type performer Rainbow Crossing (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}). She is also the dam of dual listed winner Prince Lancelot (GB) (Sir Prancealot {Ire}). Cont. p3



Hoyeau commented, "He's been bought for a partnership put together to acquire colts. He'll stay here initially and we'll decide later whether he is to be trained in France or Britain.

"He was one of my favourite colts in the sale and it has been hard going over the first three days so I'm delighted to get him. You have to pay for the nice horses and I think I had Jean-Claude against me so I knew I would have to keep going."

Of the 167 yearlings offered at V2, 144 were sold at an average of €39,063 and an aggregate of €5,625,000. Compared to the corresponding sale in 2021, the average climbed almost 30% while the aggregate was up a massive 90%. The clearance rate stood at 86.2%.

Breeze-Up Handlers Struggle To Land A Blow

There was a notable turnout from the British and Irish breeze-up fraternity but few managed to land a blow given the competition from the home trainers and buyers from further

afield in Europe.

Mick and Sarah Murphy of Longways Stables, who added five yearlings to their team from the August Sale, were not in attendance on Tuesday but still managed to pick up a Galiway (GB) colt (lot 318) for €85,000 from Haras de Beaufay.

Robson Aguiar also picked up a Hello Youmzain (Fr) filly (lot 371) from Etreham remotely for €8,500 while Mark Grant landed a €30,000 Kodiac colt (lot 390) from Haras de

l'Hotellerie. Danny O'Donovan was another breeze-up handler to get on the scoresheet with a Wooded (Ire) colt (lot 412) for €45,000 in what was considered by many players as a competitive day's trade.





Romanised Continues To Earn Plaudits

Romanised was another freshman sire to do well with his only representation in a sale, when a filly of his realised €170,000 at the August Sale, and the Haras de Bouquetot resident posted more decent figures on Tuesday. Of the yearlings offered by the Irish 2,000 Guineas winner, all four were sold for an average of €58,500. That included lot 351, a colt consigned by Haras de Castillon and sold to Pauline Cheboub on behalf of Yellow Agency and Jean-Etienne Dubois, for €87,000.





Al Shaqab Show Loyalty To Wooded

During a busy August Sale where Al Shaqab spent over €4m on 10 yearlings, Benoit Jeffroy described Sheikh Johaan's operation as being back and even hinted that there could be more to come in V2. That proved to be the case when Al Shaqab demonstrated its loyalty to young stallion Wooded by signing for a colt from Tourgeville for €60,000. Wooded, who stands at Haras de Bouquetot for €12,000, had one colt in the August Sale and he sold for €140,000. The G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner enjoyed an encouraging V2 session with nine yearlings making €329,000 at an average of €36,556.

A Sign Of Things To Come With Shaman?

The only Shaman (Ire) colt in the sale was knocked down to Jean-Claude Roget for €50,000. Best known for his performances in France, including a Group 2 victory over Way To Paris (GB) over 1m2f at ParisLongchamp in 2020, the Yeomanstown Stud-based freshman sire provided connections of lot 347, consigned by Capucines, with a tidy profit for just a €6,000 cover fee. Doubtless we will get a better gauge on how the progeny of Shaman is met by the market in the British and Irish yearling sales in the coming months but he certainly made a decent start at V2.

Galiway (GB) is proving himself as one of those good, versatile sires and his stock is clearly on the rise with seven yearlings selling for \in 519,000 at an average of \in 74,143.

Bozo Bags Two Nice Fillies

One of the fascinating subplots of the August Sale and V2 was the market's reaction to Etreham's freshman sires Hello Youmzain (Fr) and Persian King (Ire) but one would wager that Nicolas de Chambure and his team will also be happy with how City Light (Fr) has performed in recent days.

City Light has already had runners, of course, and plenty of promising types at that. Judging by the results posted at Arqana in recent days, buyers have a lot of time for the €7,000 son of Siyouni.

One of the keenest men of City Light's offering was Ghislain Bozo of Meridian International, who went to \in 115,000 to secure lot 403, a nice filly by the sire and offered by Haras de Beauvoir.

Bozo said, "I thought she was outstanding and she has a great page. For V2, I thought she was outstanding. I loved her. She has a lot of Sea The Stars (Ire) about her."

He added, "City Light is exciting. He's had a very good start and obviously his sire is fantastic. He's an exciting young sire and has been well-managed by Etreham and the owner of City Light has given the stallion every chance as well."

City Light had nine yearlings sold at €480,000 on Tuesday. Lot 403 is out of Boscastle, a Sea The Stars half-sister to black-type performers Anothertwistafate (Scat Daddy) and Ajourneytofreedom (Hard Spun).

Bozo went on to add an Olympic Glory (Ire) filly (lot 431) on behalf of Écurie des Charmes to be trained by Christophe Ferland. She was consigned by Haras de Grandcamp and sold for €115,000.

He said, "She is a beautiful filly and has a great page as well and is a half to black-type horses. It was a bit more money than we expected to spend but I think the market is very strong and you have to pay a lot of money for the nice ones. The sales over the past three years have been unbelievably strong and you have to give a bit of money for the best ones."

He added, "I bought her for old clients and very good friends Carsten Schou and she will be trained by Francois Rohaut, who we have a strong relationship with."

Malcolm Bastard may have found himself a bargain at V2. The renowned horseman signed for lot 420, a filly by the rising force Galiway, for just €45,000 and there are plenty of reasons to think he got the value.

Consigned by Haras du Longchamp, there was a lot to like about the Galiway, not least her walk and general conformation.

However, she may not be too early and looks a bit of a project who could flourish in time despite being out of an Iffraaj (GB) half-sister to two black-type sprinters.

She's gone to one of the best outfits there is and, given how well the progeny of Galiway sold all weekend and on Tuesday, she could prove to be excellent value.

He needs this win to match the five-in-a-row Group 1 tally of one of the current regime's initial superstars Giant's Causeway, who was beaten in the Irish 2000 Guineas in which Paddington began his sequence. Shape shifting between supreme miler and 10-furlong horse just like the "Iron Horse" before him, he remains in pursuit of the seven consecutive elite-level triumphs of more Rosegreen royalty in Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire).

After mastering the stern uphill climax of the Eclipse and the unorthodox gradients of Goodwood, fast and deep turf, the latest test comes on the Knavesmire's level playing field which catches out only the complacent. What can possibly go wrong? Aidan O'Brien can't pinpoint a weakness.

"He's an amazing horse really and all he's done is progress with each race," he reiterated on Tuesday. "There's nothing much else I can say about him, every time we've asked him a question he keeps coming up with it. The ground is fine and we know he stays the trip. He went to the Coral-Eclipse for his first run over a mile and a quarter, so this is a little bit further on a flatter track."

This is Frankie's last chance to edge Lester Piggott for the outright record of six wins and it would be a freakish turn of fortune if Jim Crowley's suspension meant that it came on Wednesday on Shadwell's Mostahdaf. One of the least heralded of the big guns that lined up for Royal Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales's S., the Clarehaven slow-burner left nobody in any doubt that he was the only member of that particular cast made for a fast-ground mile-and-a-quarter test as he dished out a humbling beating to Luxembourg (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) and Adayar (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) et al.

The evidence of Riyadh and Royal Ascot suggest Mostahdaf is finally the finished article, but the question is whether that extra strength brought about by maturity is the equivalent of the seven pounds weight-for-age he advances to Paddington. John Gosden is looking forward to finding out now that the cards have fallen right with the wet spell behind us. "There's no change in Plan A, it was always to give him the time," he said. "He benefited from time between Saudi Arabia and running in Dubai through to June and, again, we've taken a similar spacing with him."

On Mostahdaf's surge up the Rankings, Shadwell's racing manager Angus Gold admits to having underestimated the 5-year-old as he headed to the Royal meeting. "If I'm honest, I was a bit surprised to see him win [the Prince of Wales's] quite like that, but I probably shouldn't have been after the way he won in Saudi earlier this year. He was very impressive there and really quickened," he said. "I thought he ran well in the Sheema Classic at Meydan too, where Equinox just killed him off the bend and he didn't get home but I was still surprised to see just how well he was travelling against a proper group one field at Royal Ascot and just how well he quickened."

Ballydoyle vs The Gosdens is the modern-day customary tale in these kind of events and it is significant that the Newmarket father-and-son axis bolster their challenge with Imad Al Sagar's beloved Nashwa here. Last year's G1 Prix de Diane heroine failed to see out this trip on testing ground on her return mission in Goodwood's G1 Nassau S., but had previously looked to be peaking in the G1 Falmouth S. over a mile and this faster surface is a prerequisite over this distance these days.

Hollie Doyle is keen to put the 4-year-old's latest effort behind her and she could be the fly in the ointment with her invaluable fillies' allowance. "They had an easy time on the front end and Nashwa moved up like the best filly in the race, but she'd possibly been further back than ideal on that ground which probably blunted the turn of foot she showed in the Falmouth," she said. "She takes her races very well and I'm hearing good reports from home through Teddy Grimthorpe."

Already a winner over this course and distance in the G2 Dante S., King Power Racing's The Foxes has to do much better than a subsequent fifth in the Derby and second in the GI Belmont Derby Invitational.

"The others may be proven at a higher level, but I do feel The Foxes is an improving horse and we haven't seen the best of him yet," racing manager Alastair Donald explained. "It looks like he'll get his preferred conditions of fast ground and we know he likes the course and distance. It might end up being a trappy race and, you never know, it's worth being there."

Gregory The Key Player In The Great Voltigeur...

With Mostahdaf facing such a stern challenge on Wednesday, Frankie might give the York faithful the flying dismount they crave after the preceding G2 Great Voltigeur S. where Wathnan Racing's unbeaten **Gregory (GB)** (Golden Horn {GB}) looks a solid proposition. Despite carrying a three-pound penalty for his G2 Queen's Vase exploits over two furlongs further than this mile-and-a-half contest, he looks a genuine stayer with speed. Ballydoyle's representative **Continuous (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) had the pace to be third to The Foxes in the Dante and to get closest to one of his generation's bigwigs King Of Steel (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in a slowly-run G2 King Edward VII S., so if Gregory can usurp him and Godolphin's G3 Bahrain Trophy winner **Castle Way (GB)** (Almanzor {Fr}) with the odds slightly against him the St Leger will loom even larger on his horizon.

Big Moment For Keatley In The Acomb...

Adrian Keatley has been slowly making a name for himself from his British base and in another Wathnan Racing acquisition in **Ballymount Boy (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}) he has the right material to make waves in the always-important G3 Tattersalls Acomb S. Looking in need of this extra furlong when a length second to the subsequent G1 Prix Morny hero Vandeek (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}) in the G2 Richmond S. over six at Goodwood earlier this month, he sets the standard and it is just a case of whether he can contain the flow of unexposed types.

"We thought a lot of our horse going to Goodwood, so we weren't by any means surprised by his run and we appreciate that the winner now looks very good as well--it's all stacking up," his trainer said. "He went from a four-runner novice race at Hamilton into a group two and it was a massive step, a massive ask, and he answered all the questions bar one. We think he could be a top-class seven furlong horse or miler for the future."

With two Guineas winners in Phoenix Of Spain (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and Chaldean (GB) (Frankel {GB}) winning this in the last five years, it pays to watch the untested colts closely and Cogitate (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) is one of the more intriguing.

Trainer Charlie Hills said of the Newbury novice scorer, "His work has been good and we think he could be a nice horse for the future. He travelled very well [at Newbury], he's got a good attitude and a good temperament—I was really taken by his first run. He's a big, scopey horse and he should be a nice horse for next year as well."

Also in the mix is Ballydoyle's Naas maiden winner **Edwardian** (No Nay Never), the Eve Johnson Houghton-trained Ascot maiden scorer **Indian Run** (Ire) (Sioux Nation) and the course-and-distance winner **Loose Cannon** (Ire) (Territories {Ire}) from the William Haggas stable.

Classic Rematch In Yorkshire Oaks...

Thursday's G1 Pertemps Network Yorkshire Oaks will see the G1 Irish Oaks one-two **Savethelastdance** (**Ire**) (Galileo {Ire}) and **Bluestocking** (**GB**) (Camelot {GB}) square up again after a field of 10 was confirmed on Tuesday. Shadwell's G1 Nassau S. heroine **Al Husn** (**Ire**) (Dubawi {Ire}) is the key member of the older brigade, while in the supporting card's six-furlong G2 Lowther S. the G2 Queen Mary S. runner-up and Weatherbys Super Sprint winner **Relief Rally** (**Ire**) (Kodiac {GB}) encounters eight rivals including Ballydoyle's impressive Curragh maiden winner **Cherry Blossom** (**Ire**) (No Nay Never).

His 10 rivals include Juddmonte's Qirat (GB) (Showcasing {GB}), a half-brother to Ralph Beckett stablemate and G1 Irish Oaks runner-up Bluestocking (GB) (Camelot {GB}) out of G1 Matron S. heroine Emulous (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who recovered from a slow getaway to post a promising debut third over six furlongs at Newmarket earlier this month.
