The apartment glistens with the quiet discernment of its owner. Lexington spreads below the great windows and balcony, its urban grid seamed green by the many old trees that endure downtown. In somewhat the same way, amid all the artwork, the gleaming décor, Scott Heider draws on nature to explain his love of this business.

He gestures toward a rose in a vase. "That's the best analogy, you know," he says. "Beautiful, but it doesn't last forever. I look at the wonderful broodmares we've been blessed with--these living, breathing creatures--and they're the same. That's part of what makes it so alluring, so intoxicating. Because it's about persistence."

He remembers what his father used to tell him, and his brother: "Nothing worthwhile is easy, boys."

Not, he acknowledges with a smile, something you necessarily wanted to hear when young.

"But for sure, as you mature and experience life lessons, you see that it's true," he says. "If something's given to you, it's probably not going to mean as much."

WONDER WHEEL, WHO TOOK THE GREENS ON THE RIDE OF A LIFETIME, TO SELL AT FASIG NOVEMBER by Sue Finley

When Lois Green was a young girl, her family would take her once a year to Coney Island, where she thought the most exhilarating ride was the Wonder Wheel. So when the family bought a yearling by Into Mischief out of the multiple stakes winner and multiple Grade I stakes-placed Wonder Gal at auction, the name was a natural for the DJ Stable matriarch.

Wonder Wheel would go on to become Into Mischief's first juvenile champion, winning two Grade Is including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and four of five starts at two, taking the family on the kind of exhilarating ride Lois remembered. Lois Green passed away May 31, not long after seeing her juvenile champion compete in the Grade I Kentucky Oaks. *Cont. p3*

Fasig-Tipton Presents The November Mares

Wonder Wheel to sell at Fasig, cont. from p1

When the family sells Wonder Wheel Tuesday night, Nov. 7 at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, her son, Jon, the General Manager of DJ Stable, admits it will be "bittersweet."

"Normally, we like to say we're very businesslike, but in this case, we're not," said Green. "In this case, she really added so much happiness to us as a family and to watch her go to the ring, even though I know she's going to sell really well, is going to be difficult for my dad and for me--to watch her go through the sales ring and ultimately be out of our family at that point."

Jon and his father Len are offering Wonder Wheel as a broodmare prospect, selling as hip 200, where she is expected to be one of the most sought-after offerings on the night.

"You can really summarize her potential very simply," said Fasig-Tipton's president and CEO Boyd Browning. "She's by Into Mischief. She's a two-year-old champion with good looks and a brilliant pedigree. It's a complete package."

Wonder Wheel will sell with Taylor Made Sales, adding another chapter to a long relationship between the Taylors and the Greens. Taylor Made's President and CEO Mark Taylor said that she was a rare filly who looked like she could be a Classic winner, but who was also an early, exceptional 2-year-old.

"I think her 2-year-old speed, precocity, and professionalism show a combination of physical and mental ability," said Taylor. "And pedigree comes in to that precocity, too. Into Mischief is a very good 2-year-old sire. Her broodmare sire, Tiz Wonderful, was a good 2-year-old himself, but she physically looks like a two-turn Oaks filly." *Cont.*

"So this filly did all these great things at two. But really, if I would have looked at her as a yearling, I would have said she's going to be a 3-year-old. So that just shows her talent, that she was able to have this big classic kind of frame, but yet be quick enough, early enough, and mentally good enough to handle a brilliant 2-year-old campaign."

Wonder Wheel surprised her connections by progressing forwardly enough to make her first start at two June 3 at Churchill, winning a maiden special weight by 2 1/4 lengths. One month later, she took the Debutante at Churchill by 6 3/4 lengths, before shipping to Saratoga to finish second in the Grade I Spinaway.

"When I got her up to Saratoga, I told the Greens this may be the best 2-year-old I'd had since Classic Empire," said Mark Casse, Wonder Wheel's trainer. "They said, `what does that mean?' I said, `I think she can win the Breeders' Cup.'"

"She got beat in the Spinaway," said Casse. "But I really wasn't overly concerned with that because I had given her a little bit of a break. She came back and then she won the (GI Darley) Alcibiades and I thought she ran well, but I knew she was going to have to come with a better game in the Breeders' Cup. And oh boy, she did. Her win in the Breeders' Cup was amazing because she got away a little slow, got shuffled back, and the

move she made from the half-mile pole to the wire? I've been doing this for 40 some years, and it was one of the more impressive victories that I've ever had."

But before the race, Casse's prediction of a Breeders' Cup win caused him more than a little stress, as he had more or less guaranteed it.

"I was very attached to Lois, and she was there at the Breeders' Cup," he said. "I had told them early on that we were going to win the Breeders' Cup, so it was a little nerve-wracking. If I had to do it over again, I wouldn't have done it. But to have Lois there and to be part of it was very special. We all miss her."

Like the Greens, Casse said he would also miss Wonder Wheel.

"She has a wonderful personality, couldn't give a hoot about anything," said Casse. "She would go into the paddock and look around and say, `So this is my competition?' She was just a pleasure to train and never missed a beat. She loved what she's doing and she's one of the best horses I've ever trained. She has a lot more leg than most Into Mischiefs. She's got some stretch to her, and I've had great luck with that type of Into Mischief. It's what I look for."

Casse said he expected a smooth transition into her next career.

"She's going to be a wonderful broodmare for a lot of reasons," he said. "One, she's very sound." *Cont.*

"Even though she's big and tall, she was fast. Good broodmares, in my opinion, need some speed. She had that. But she was able to carry it. And she had just a wonderful personality. If she passes her personality traits on to her foals, there will be a lot of good ones. I'm sure she's going to make a super broodmare for someone."

"She offers a ton of options for top breeders from around the world to match her up with the best stallions here, in Japan or Europe or anywhere else," Taylor agreed, pointing out the appeal of a multiple-Grade I winning champion daughter of Into Mischief with an impressive female family, but who is still only three. "Wonder Wheel's Dam is Wonder Gal and she herself was a brilliant 2-year-old. She was a stakes winner. She was second in the Frizette and then she was third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. So, you know, by any other filly standards, that would be a really good benchmark to set. But then she produces this daughter in Wonder Wheel who just goes one better. These type of opportunities are really what I love most about my job. All the possibilities down the line and what she could produce, it's really energizing."

STARS BRIGHT AS KEENELAND'S FALL TRUMPET SOUNDS by J.N. Campbell

The fall isn't really, The Fall, until Keeneland arrives. Well, get your steaming pot of burgoo ready, because it's here.

Scheduled for Friday, Oct. 6, the meet's opening day at the Old Keene Farm is upon us and the 10-race card includes a trio of graded stakes which all have Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' implications.

Leading off is the GII Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix S. for 3-yearolds and up going six furlongs on the main track. Suitors for the GI Breeders' Cup Qatar Racing Sprint include MSW Bango (Congrats), who nabbed the top morning-line at 5-2 with multiple leading rider Tyler Gaffalione in the irons. The 6-yearold is going to have to prove that he can run in graded company and away from his favorite spot at Churchill Downs. Just a few weeks ago, the Greg Foley trainee tied the record for most wins under the Twin Spires.

Opposing him are a number of experienced runners with their share of stakes credentials. Multiple leading trainer Wesley

Ward sends MGSP Nakatomi (Firing Line) back to a course that he loves (4-3-0-0). With Irad Ortiz, Jr. aboard, the tactical 4-yearold chestnut gelding will be a tough customer down the lane. One other entrant of note is the victor from the G1 Golden Shaheen S. on Dubai World Cup Night, Sibelius (Not This Time). The 5-year-old was last seen running seventh in the GI Bing Crosby S. at Del Mar in late July and the Jeremiah O'Dwyer trainee is looking to get back on track here.

"The Phoenix was the plan after the Bing Crosby because we wanted to bring him home and freshen him up and give him plenty of time between starts after all the traveling he has been doing," O'Dwyer said. "He would have to win the Phoenix pretty impressively for me to consider sending him to the Breeders' Cup, even though that is somewhere we'd love to get to run."

Shifting over to the Haggin Turf Course, the GII Jessamine S. offers a path to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Grass routers include **Time to Dazzle** (Not This Time), who broke her maiden by three lengths at first asking for Mark Casse at Woodbine in mid-September. The gray filly will face to her inside along the rail **Smooth Waves** (English Channel), who won at Kentucky Downs by 9 1/4 lengths in what was her fourth maiden try Sept. 10 for trainer Mike Maker. Also not to be missed is Appellate (Constitution), who missed by a head on debut July 23 at Saratoga when she ran second to Wednesday's GII Miss Grillo S. heroine Hard to Justify (Justify). The Todd Pletcher trainee was unlucky upstate once again Sept. 3. Cont.

Finally, the Friday feature is the GI Darley Alcibiades S., which pits some top 2-year-old females against one another as they route for an opportunity to ship to the GI Breeders' Cup NetJets Juvenile Fillies.

Leading the way on many a handicapper's list is the undefeated **Brightwork** (Outwork) from John Ortiz's shedrow. The WSS Racing-owned filly has rattled off three stakes wins in a row after breaking her maiden first out, which includes the GIII Adirondack S. and GI Spinaway S. this summer at Saratoga. Her tactical ability makes her very dangerous.

Standing in her way is the impressive 8 3/4-length winner of the GIII Pocahontas S. Sept. 16 at Churchill Downs, V V's Dream (Mitole). Named a 'TDN Rising Star' after she debuted a winner back in May, the Ken McPeek trainee will look to avenge her only loss when she was beaten half a length by Brightwork in the Debutante S. at Ellis Park July 2.

"I don't think she will have any trouble going 1 1/16 miles for the first time," McPeek said about her chances in the Darley Alcibiades. "She seems to be a push-button filly, and I think the added distance will suit her even more."

Making the starting gate are several other challengers which include Alys Beach (Omaha Beach), Candied (Candy Ride (Arg)), Wine On Tap (Tapit) and Emery (More Than Ready).


sale. There were 4,215 horses entered in the sale this year, the second straight year that number had increased. Breathnach was asked how Keeneland has avoided a downturn in the number of horses entered in the sale.

"It's a great question, and I'm not sure there's an easy answer, but there's a lot of things that we look at in there," Breathnach said. "We're very grateful for the support that we get. Twenty-

> four percent of the entire North American foal crop goes through the Keeneland September sale, which is staggering. It's a tribute to the people who came long before Tony (Lacy) and I, people like Rogers Beasley and Geoffrey Russell and everybody else that made this sale what it is today. We're just trying to be stewards to advance that as far as we can. There are a lot of very clever, very experienced, very dedicated commercial breeders. And thankfully for us, they're looking to our September sale as a large outlet

for their stock every year. That's a privilege for us, but also a huge responsibility that we do the best we can with what they're bringing us." Cont.

The November sale will feature stars like GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner **Caravel** (Mizzen Mast), Grade I winner Dalika (Ger) (Pastorious {Ger}) and Puca (Big Brown). Puca is the dam of GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mage** (Good Magic) and will also be carrying a foal who is a full-sibling to Mage. The sale will also give buyers their first chance to buy mares who are in foal to 2022 Horse of the Year Flightline (Tapit).

"We've had a lot of calls about Flightline already from all over the world about what mares are going to be in the catalogue that he was bred to and how many and so on," Breathnach said. "I think he's going to create the splash that everybody expects. People still remember that last year we sold a 2 1/2 percent share in him that went for \$4.6 million. We're excited to continue that story."

Keeneland opens Oct. 6 with its Fall Stars Weekend. Like everyone else, Breathnach is looking forward to what should be a great weekend of racing.

"It's going to be fantastic," he said. "We have 11 stakes this weekend. Eight of them are Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' races. It's three unparalleled days of action here. One race that I think really jumps out to me is the Darley Alcibiades. I think that race is loaded. Look at the morning line, you've got fillies like Alys Beach at 20-1. It could be one of the best races of the year. The whole weekend, it's going to be action packed, turf and dirt sprints, races going long on the turf and dirt. I can't wait for it."

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by the Retired Racehorse Project, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, West Point Thoroughbreds, WinStar Farm, XBTV.com, 1/ST Racing, and Lane's End, the team of Zoe Cadman, Bill Finley and Randy Moss discussed a story in the TDN in which John Sikura called for a massive purse increase for the GI Kentucky Derby and the GI Kentucky Oaks. While agreeing with Sikura, Finley pointed out that Churchill Downs has very little incentive to increase the pot. The team reviewed last weekend's big slate of races, which included a win by Cody's Wish (Curlin) in the GII Vosburgh S. Looking ahead, the trio agreed that the GI Coolmore Turf Mile at Keeneland could be the highlight of the weekend as it could be a showdown of the best turf horse in the U.S. in Up to the Mark (Not This Time) and the Charlie Appleby-trained star Master of the Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

DECEASED HORSE FOUND AT BOWIE

A dead horse was found Wednesday, Oct. 4 at Maryland's former Bowie Training Center, closed since 2015 and owned by 1/ST Racing. The horse was determined to be recently deceased and was in a remote area.

The *Paulick Report* was the first with the story.

1/ST's CEO, Aidan Butler, released the following statement:

"Horses are the center of the racing community. They are curious, beautiful animals and that someone, anyone, would treat a horse in this way defies comprehension. Everyone at our organization is simply sickened by this discovery.

"As we work together with animal control in its investigation, we have also referred this matter to the local police, as such a heinous act should be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. Additionally, we are working with the Horse Racing Integrity and Safety Authority and the Maryland Racing Commission so that any available sanctions are levied against the responsible party.

"Through our own investigation, we have identified the horsedespite gruesome efforts made by these criminals to mask itand are in the process of working with the other involved authorities to identify the current owner(s)." *Cont.*

ARCANGELO GETS FIRST SANTA ANITA **WORK UNDER HIS BELT**

Leading GI Breeders' Cup Classic contender Arcangelo (Arrogate), winner of this summer's GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S., had his first work at Santa Anita Thursday, breezing five furlongs in 1:02.20 under exercise rider Robert Mallari.

"We're just getting him used to the track," trainer Jena Antonucci said. "There's plenty of time go fast."

Antonucci was on hand in California for the work from her stable in New York. She will be back in New York Friday morning, but will return to Santa Anita later this month and remain through the Breeders' Cup. The Classic will be contested Saturday, Nov. 4.

Well-known private clocker Gary Young timed Arcangelo's work a bit quicker than the official time, getting him in 1:01.60 with a six-furlong gallop-out in 1:16.20. Fractions clocked by Young were: 13.20 for the opening furlong,: 25.4 for the first quarter, :37.60 for three furlongs, and :49.80 for the half.

Slow Down Andy leads the way Saturday in the Awesome Again Benoit

Slow Down Andy (Nyquist), front-running winner of Saturday's GI Awesome Again S. at Santa Anita, will miss the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 4, according to a report in *Daily Racing Form*. Although he was sound following the Awesome Again, the 4year-old came out of the race with some filling in his ankle and will get 60 days off.

The Awesome Again was Slow Down Andy's first Grade I win and earned him a paid berth into the Classic as it was a "Win and You're In" race. He got a 101 Beyer Speed Figure for the effort.

Trainer Doug O'Neill conditions Slow Down Andy for Reddam Racing, LLC. The team plans to bring the chestnut back for a 5year-old campaign.

It's hard for a horse to have a better season than Mitole did at four: his four Grade Is included the Sprint as well as the Met Mile and it's no small thing to set (and still hold) Saratoga's GI Forego stakes record of 1:20.80 for seven panels.

"A long time ago somebody asked a groom what makes a good racehorse. He said speed and more speed. That always makes me think of Mitole," said Ned Toffey, general manager of Spendthrift Farm.


"This was a horse that had an unbelievable career, was brought along really well by Asmussen, developed a reputation early on as a really fast horse, kind of began to assert that speed as he stepped up in class. They never found a class that was too high for him. When you look at him, he's among the most well-made horses we have. He's a smooth-bodied horse: every part of him just fits together and it's easy to understand why he functioned as a well-oiled machine." --Jill Williams

He points to shelves displaying some of his racing trophies.

"But I can promise you... That Park Hill? The Debutante, at the Curragh? These are things that I can't tell you how much they mean to me. That's why you do it."

Both those Group races were won by fillies trained in Ireland by Joseph O'Brien--instructive samples, then, of a program that manages to combine a rigorous focus on quality (barely a dozen mares between Kentucky and Ireland) with an unusual range of application. That is no less than we should expect, perhaps, in one whose own perspectives and engagement have uncommon breadth by the standards of our insular sport. We should duly take heart that for all his passion for art and film, all his success as a real estate developer, nothing animates Heider quite like the animals that bring him here from his principal residence in Omaha.

"My wife and I love cinema," he says. "In fact, we just got back

from the Telluride Film Festival. But I have never seen anything like the Thoroughbred industry. Art, film, these are wonderful things. They can fill your soul, stimulate your mind, hopefully open you to things that you didn't think about or believe before. As my Jesuit friends say, 'Always be open to growth.' So those things are important to me. But the Thoroughbred business? To me, it's just absolute, unlimited possibilities."

True, he feels that some of these have not been adequately realized. He is dismayed, for instance, that we cannot achieve the same media traction for **Cody's Wish** (Curlin) as for less edifying news from the racetrack.

"We have such a unique, beautiful, unbelievably passionate industry," he reflects. "Sometimes I think we don't know how good we have it. There's so much potential."

In his own case, the magic was first ignited by boyhood visits to Ak-Sar-Ben. During high school and college summers he even worked there as an usher and mutuel teller. *Cont.*

Attending the University of Southern California allowed Heider to sample Santa Anita and Hollywood Park, another level again from Nebraska-breds. And soon after he had launched his own career in business, father and son were also exploring this avenue of pleasure together.

First a friend introduced them to the veteran trainer Lyman Rollins. "And that," says Heider, "was the luckiest thing in the world--because Lyman was just an upstanding guy."

In 1987 they bought a \$14,000 yearling colt from Taylor Made

by To-Agori-Mou (Ire), a miler imported from Europe but pretty much a disaster at stud.

"And, as the racing gods would have it, that yearling turned out to be a Californian champion sprinter that won the Hollywood Turf Express three years in a row," says Heider.

Answer Do, who also won three graded stakes, raced six seasons.

"Back then you'd race until September, October, and then you'd turn them out and bring them back in March," Heider recalls. "You just stopped, let

Mother Nature do her thing. And they lasted forever.

"Anyway, because of Answer Do, we came across all these wildly interesting people that were around at the time: Allen Paulson, John Mabee, Margie Everett, R.D. Hubbard. And we realized that you could put Allen Paulson, founder of Gulfstream, together with a jockey, a trainer, a groom--and everybody would just want to talk horses. It didn't matter what your background was. This was the great leveler, and that's a beautiful thing."

The Heiders could not have got off to a better start; nor, of course, a more misleading one.

"When that horse finally retired, we spent probably six or seven years trying to find one that could run a third as fast!" says Heider ruefully. By that stage, however, they were hooked.

"And, in hindsight, it became a really important bond with my father. I was getting married, having a family, life takes over. But boy, did we enjoy our time traveling around the country together."

Losing his father in 2015 confirmed Heider in his hope that he might yet share a similar journey with his own children, Grant and Courtney, both recent college graduates. However their interest proceeds, Heider has long felt grateful for the

indulgence of their mother Cindy--right back to when she ordered a wedding cake in the shape of a chocolate horse head, iced with a Lukas white bridle.

"As a lot of people in this business know, when someone's horse-crazy, their spouse has to learn to live with it," Heider says. "But God bless my wife, she has learned to like it, especially the breeding. And she's very involved in the philanthropic side. In the horse business we've found some really talented people and organizations that might be relatively small, but that are definitely punching above their weight and

making a real difference."

These "small but mighty" operations include the Eddie Gregson Foundation, New Vocations, Bluegrass Farms Charities and, most recently, Stable Recovery.

"If you're fortunate, you're born into a situation where you're going to get a couple opportunities to right mistakes," Heider observes. "But a lot of people don't get that opportunity. And I think the Thoroughbred industry is uniquely positioned to work with some of these folks--not

only to give them a second and third chance, in a profession, but because horses are therapeutic. Some of the programs created for children are amazing. At first, they're scared to death of these animals, but just a few days later you see a remarkable bond develop. And it's the same with some of the people that have been incarcerated, or that have other life challenges."

But if privilege brings duty, do we also owe a certain obligation to the breed itself: to consider its best interests, in how we try to make a living? Or is that a luxury in such a precarious walk of life?

"The Thoroughbred industry is a pretty decent microcosm for society," Heider replies. "For sure, we have people that every day come into work, do a great job, and you know what, they've got bills to pay, they've a family to raise. They might be struggling day to day. But I think those of us in a position to do so can hopefully lead by example, and be involved."

Accordingly he renounces the question that dictates so much commercial breeding: "What have you done for me lately?"

"We have a lot of stallions that would have been successful if given a chance," he remarks. "That shorter-term mentality unfortunately permeates every aspect of the business. But then we're in a disposable society." *Cont.*

"Everybody leases a car, everybody replaces their phone every couple years. But this business is different, or should be anyway. Because the bloodlines that we're entrusted with go back 100, 200, 250 years."

To that extent, he implies, it's not so much a question of who can afford to do the right thing as whether anybody, in the longer term, can afford not to?

"To me, do the right thing means: be respectful to the horse," Heider specifies. "And to those working with them. The commercial market's going to have its influence. I'm all for the

people that want to find the next stallion: there's plenty of risk, and we need that investment, we need to put those horses in the proper hands to determine their potential. But I think there's a limit. Because we want people to play this game long-term, right?"

The Heider program, then, is all "long ball." One example has been his cultivation, over recent years, of a transatlantic presence.

Whenever he's asked what drew him to Ireland, Heider always ends up--besides the heritage and horsemanship--by pointing to the passion and sheer caliber of the

people he deals with. Certainly his admiration for the O'Brien family is not confined to their extraordinary professional accomplishment. But nor did he embrace the experiment merely in some altruistic spirit of adventure: Heider is clear that diversification of bloodlines is not just wholesome for the breed in general, but can also benefit his stable in particular.

"We have a young mare at Mill Ridge, Zofelle (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire})," he explains. "A Grade III winner here, she ran second in the [GI] Matriarch on her final start. She's beautiful, and from the family of Listen (Ire) and Sequoyah (Ire) [both Group 1 winners by Sadler's Wells]. The kind of thing that I could just lie awake thinking about! But I didn't send her back to Ireland when her racing was over. This spring she had her first foal by Into Mischief, and I bred her next to Not This Time."

Heider views such stallions as influences for brilliance, rather than any particular surface or distance. Conversely, the class and soundness of the mare's family can also transcend its recent European setting.

"I have no doubt that she's going to throw something on dirt along the way," Heider vows. "If you look back to the '50s, '60s, '70s, the transfer of blood from Europe to the United States, and vice versa, has taken place for a long time. There's been far less lately, but now we're seeing Justify throw some brilliant horses in Europe. I don't know how many others are out there doing it. But again, it's about trying to do the right thing--in this case, about invigorating the breed."

Heider stresses that he still loves the dirt racing on which he was raised. At some stage, however, he would enjoy testing convention. Had he bought out his partners in Mia Mischief (Into Mischief), for example, he would have been mighty tempted to have her bred in Europe. (As it is, of course, she was sold to Stonestreet.) "So I'm just as intrigued by having Irish

mares over here as by maybe sending something the other way," he says. "Time will tell whether it's going to look brilliant, or whether people end up saying, 'What's wrong with this person?'!"

Some aspects of the program remain perfectly orthodox. Heider likes his trainers to develop fillies with pedigree, such as the \$750,000 daughter of Nyquist and GI Kentucky Oaks winner Believe You Can (Proud Citizen) bought from Airdrie at Keeneland in September, with

a view to promotion into the broodmare band. But that, again, is laying up rather than trying to drive the green.

"I was raised in the investment business," Heider remarks.

"And you'd probably think that I'm always looking at the quotes in the Wall Street Journal and Financial Times, checking my phone all the time. I do read the financial papers every day, but really don't pay any attention to daily or weekly fluctuations in values. Those don't matter to me because I'm not selling today or tomorrow. I'm more likely adding to existing positions over time. It's a share in the business that I own. If you're fortunate to own a piece of a really good business, you don't listen to what the next fad is. You make decisions only to benefit the business. You let good grow."

Sure enough, he isn't going to fret about which stallion or nick might be hot today and abandoned tomorrow. "We don't care about any of that," he says. "I want good, reproducing female families. If the mare has racing ability, even better."

Heider shows a catalogue page for which he's responsible, and accepts that he invited market wariness with a stallion prone to produce a turf horse. But he felt the match ideal, both physically and in terms of the sire's versatility and temperament. *Cont.*

"Because a brilliant horse is what you're looking for, right?" he says. "Doesn't matter if it's turf or dirt, short or long. I think people like John and Tanya Gunther, who I have so much respect for, get that. They understand long ball, without a doubt. It's tough. A lot of times you stand at the plate and miss but, my goodness, they've bred more than their share of amazing horses. So, no, we really don't breed for a market darling. We breed to improve a family. Eventually, the page will prove out."

One of his most cherished examples is the dynasty of Jude (GB) (Darshaan {GB}).

"Through four generations, you lose track of all the Grade I performers," he says. "Well, that's because somebody nurtured it. That's because of Richard Henry. And that, I can tell you, is what you do in business as well. You hire the best people, you keep the best close to you. That's our approach in everything we do. It's never about quick returns. We'll give Flying the Colors, a beautiful young War Front granddaughter of Jude, every opportunity to shine. She's in Ireland, in foal to Night of Thunder, and she's returning to the States this fall to be covered by Uncle Mo. We are committed long term to that Coolmore family, and I will move a mare like her if I see it may benefit her."

Yet even doing it this way soon fills the present moment with fresh cycles of excitement.

"You want to get me going?" Heider asks with a chuckle. "Just ask me about A New Dawn (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}), who's a granddaughter of Cherry Hinton (GB) (Green Desert), and I'll tell you about her Kingman (GB) yearling filly that's going to Joseph, or her Wootton Bassett (GB) colt foal. Or our 3-year-old Gun Runner filly, **Stunningly**, that broke her maiden this summer at Saratoga. I like the balance we have going on. There'll be some interchangeable parts here, some moving back and forth. Time will tell how it all works out. But it's all long-term thinking, and that's what excites me. It's what I know best."

Yet while his ultimate legacy remains an unknowable horizon, each step on the way emulates the one that first embarked Heider on this journey.

"In the end, for me, it's the same thing as it was day one," Heider says. "That love and respect for the horse. But I think our true job in this sport is to leave it better than we found it. Now, that may mean trying to improve the breed: introducing new blood, sounder blood, faster blood. Or it may mean a gentleman

like Ron Winchell saying, 'I'm going to make Kentucky Downs something like the Cella family has done at Oaklawn.'

"That's long ball. I can relate to that, in the investment world. But then we have everything else. The families on the farms, on the backside. The horses, after their track careers are over. So, if nothing else, by the time I'm ready to run my final furlong, I hope people don't say, 'Boy, he had fast horses,' or, 'He raced Mia Mischief; and he did this and that in Ireland.'

"What I hope they say is, 'There's somebody that tried to do the right thing; tried to improve the sport itself, including the folks that participate and dedicate their lives to it, especially those individuals that maybe don't get nearly enough attention or support.' In our own small way I hope we can leave this incredible game, that we all love so much, a little better than when we found it."

One sport though has chosen to embrace innovation.

Baseball has developed multiple changes over several years as they fought to gain fan, media and sponsor revenue. To our credit, racing has innovated in several spaces, specifically health and

safety, but not so much in product presentation.

The last major product innovation in racing happened four decades ago with the creation of the Breeders' Cup.

Major League Baseball announced this week that they enjoyed their biggest year-over-year attendance increase since 1993. Because they listened. And they changed.

The energy is back in baseball. Media attention is back. And

the fans are back in the ballpark and watching games on a bevy of media options.

Can we say the same of racing? Unfortunately, no.

But fortunately, it is not too late. As long as racing will step up to the plate right now and embrace meaningful innovation.

Need one example? There is a 100% chance that realigning the Triple Crown on a better schedule would result in more media attention, more wagering and a stronger safety message.

Earlier this year, leaders within the sport--Churchill Downs, Stronach, top breeders and others--cried out for increased cooperation and collaboration. *Cont.*

There is no question that much of this was due to our safety crisis, but clearly the safety issue is only one of many that should--and must--be addressed by a broad coalition of our industry.

That is if we want to remain relevant and follow a proven path, like our friends in baseball just showed us.

It took bold thinking and a never-give-up attitude by John Gaines to create the Breeders' Cup. And equally as important, it took thinking of the greater good by breeders and racetracks.

The evolution of racetrack ownership should make innovation much, much more possible than ever. You can count on one hand the entities that control the sport.

Throw in the Breeders' Cup and The Jockey Club and representatives from those seven could fit around a small dining room table!

There are 30 club owners in MLB involved in the decision-making process. Not to mention the Players' Association and others.

Undoubtedly, a Commissioner-led model greatly facilitates changes to baseball, but with so few involved to create meaningful innovation in racing, we can still change without requiring a Commissioner.

Want to truly pay homage to the 40-year anniversary of the Breeders' Cup? Create a "Gaines Commission" to study and implement strategic changes within racing.

Outside professional support would moderate our "think tank" project, at first with only representatives from the racing entities mentioned above.

As the commission begins to develop and agree on potential action, others (deservedly so) will be brought into the process. But for now, one step at a time.

Just as baseball went to a pitch clock, the Gaines Commission would be on the clock as well, directed to finalize their recommendations long before Breeders' Cup 2024.

Baseball changed and has been rewarded. Racing can do the same. Our changes will be different. Our changes won't be as

But we don't have another 40 years to wait.

ASSISTANTS TO CONVICTED HARNESS TRAINERS AVOID PRISON IN 2020 DOPING **CONSPIRACY SENTENCINGS** by T.D. Thornton

Two assistants to a pair of already-convicted Standardbred trainers in the 2020 racehorse doping conspiracy scandal avoided prison terms beyond their time already served on Wednesday when a judge in United States District Court (Southern District of New York) sentenced them each to two years of supervised release and joint responsibility for monetary penalties. Both had cooperated with authorities in obtaining the convictions of others in the network, according to court documents.

Conor Flynn, who worked for the former trainer Richard Banca, pleaded guilty to one felony count of drug alteration and misbranding conspiracy, with two similar felony charges against him dropped, according to the court docket.

Brandon Simpson, who worked for the former trainer Renee Allard, pleaded guilty to one felony count of conspiracy to defraud the U.S. via drug alteration and misbranding conspiracy, the docket stated.

According to a pre-sentencing report filed by his counsel, Flynn "timely accepted full responsibility for his ill-advised actions in a horse doping scheme organized by his then-employer and direct supervisor, Richard Banca [and] Dr. Louis Grasso, a licensed veterinarian who treated horses trained by Banca.

"Although Conor participated in the scheme, he played a minor role. Conor did not devise the scheme. Conor did not profit from the scheme, did not expect to profit from the scheme, and did not receive a raise or bonus in exchange for his participation in the scheme," Flynn's court filing continued. "Squarely put, Conor, an unsophisticated young man with only a high school diploma, who desperately wanted to move up into Banca and Dr. Grasso's prominent horse racing circle, simply got caught up in Banca and Dr. Grasso's culture of misdeeds, ill-gotten power, and greed." Doping sentencings, cont.

According to a pre-sentence report filed by his counsel, Simpson admitted that he "assisted Mr. Allard in administering performance-enhancing drugs on a day of a race to enhance a horses race performance. In addition, Mr. Simpson also assisted in obtaining prescription drugs that were obtained without valid prescriptions, and those drugs were administered to racehorses in violation of the applicable racing rules and regulations.

"Significantly, Mr. Simpson does not hide from his illegal conduct. In fact, it is quite the opposite," Simpson's court filing continued. "Mr. Simpson, after being contacted by authorities, agreed to cooperate with federal agents and prosecutors in an attempt to assist them in their efforts against other individuals and he did so knowing that it was the right thing to do in order to help in some way to right his wrongful behavior."

The judgment on the court docket stated that Flynn must pay \$16,220,794 in restitution that is "joint and several" with Bianca and a \$129,975 forfeiture that is "joint and several" with Grasso.

Simpson's judgment stated that he must pay \$31,435,782 restitution that is "joint and several" with Grasso and a \$628,553 forfeiture that is "joint and several" with Allard.

Grasso in 2022 got sentenced to 50 months in federal prison. Banca was sentenced to 30 months. Allard got 27 months.

FLORIDA BREEDER AND STALLION AWARDS UPPED

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association (FTBOA) reported a substantial increase in awards will be paid to breeders and stallion owners for 2024 through their Annual Awards Plan that was approved by the Florida Gaming Control Commission, the organization said in a release Thursday.

The plan increases, which were enabled with the enactment of HB 7063, would increase Florida breeder and stallion awards by one-third, from the 15% level in 2023 to as much 20% of the announced gross purse in 2024.

HB 7063 is a \$1.3-billion tax package and includes \$5 million provided to the FTBOA for Florida breeding awards and incentives.

Breeder awards will be paid at 12.5% for first place, 5% for second place and 2.5% for third place, subject to specified caps. Those caps would also increase to \$12,500 for first (an increase from \$10,500 in 2023), \$5,000 for second (an increase from \$3,000), and \$2,500 for third (an increase from \$1,500).

Stallion awards in 2024 will be capped at \$20,000 (an increase from \$15,000) for wins in black-type races in Florida.

The total Florida breeder and stallion awards budget for 2024 is projected to be more than \$8 million, a 52% increase from \$5.3 million in 2023.

WORLD POOL FIRST: LATIN AMERICA INCLUDED AND WAGERING ACROSS THREE CONTINENTS

Sunday's G1 Longines Grand Premio Latinamericano at San Isidro will be an inaugural World Pool event and this will be the first time global betting will be engaged across three continents on a single weekend, the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) announced Thursday.

The HKJC confirmed that while the local tote in Argentina will not commingle internationally, other partners' pools from the likes of Australia, France, North America and Hong Kong will be joined up by World Pool.

The Latin American Group 1 contest will close a major weekend of World Pool action, with five races on Turnbull Stakes Day from Flemington in Australia followed by four races from Newmarket on Sun Chariot Day.

"One of the core motives for World Pool is to connect totes from across the globe for the most important races, so we're delighted to have extended our reach to take in Latin America's biggest Group 1 contest," said Michael Fitzsimons, Executive Director, Wagering Products at the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "The combination of Turnbull Stakes Day, Sun Chariot Stakes Day and then the Gran Premio Latinoamericano on Sunday makes this weekend's World Pool action a real Group 1 feast for punters around the globe."

Hope After Service, a new organization pairing retired racehorses with veterans with PTSD, as well as with autistic children, has been formed in Shawnee, Ok. Founded by disabled veterans Ashton Strader, Robert Whitlow, and Craig Whitlow, the 501(c)(3) nonprofit's mission is "bringing hope, healing, and renewal to veterans, retired racehorses, and communities nationwide."

The founders have backgrounds in racing and plan to select retired racehorses to undergo retraining as trusted companions and therapists, offering solace and healing to those in need. Horses in the program not suitable for this work will be retrained for essential roles within the federal government, as well as state and local governments.

"Our vision is to contract with the government, providing a centralized location for training these horses to meet government standards," said Craig Whitlow, who serves as executive director. "This streamlined approach saves the

government valuable time, money, and manpower while allowing these retired equine athletes to find a meaningful second career. Moreover, they will serve our nation and communities, safeguarding our borders, aiding in search and rescue operations, and contributing to law enforcement's mounted units.

"There has always been a profound connection between humans and horses. In today's world, where some may question the utility of retired racehorses, we believe in thinking outside the box. These horses have a wealth of untapped potential, and we are committed to proving their worth beyond the racetrack."

'TOP' OF THE MARKET



Muth tops the 2023 OBS March Sale | Photos by Z

When the GI American Pharoah S. even-money morning-line favorite and 'TDN Rising Star' Muth (Good Magic) brought a sale-topping \$2 million at OBS March earlier this year, it wasn't exactly a surprise to see Saudi businessman Amr Zedan and Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert heading back to the Top Line Sales consignment for more.

Fellow Top Line graduate and Zedan Racing Stables Inc. colorbearer 'TDN Rising Star' Arabian Knight (Uncle Mo) will line up next as one of the favorites in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic after posting a game wire-to-wire success over his elders in this summer's GI FanDuel Racing Pacific Classic S. at Del Mar. Arabian Knight topped last spring's OBS April sale (:9 4/5) at \$2.3 million.

'TDN Rising Star' Princess Noor (Not This Time), heroine of the 2020 GI Del Mar Debutante S. while carrying Zedan's sky blue, red and white silks, commanded a sale-best \$1.35-million pricetag at the COVID-19 postponed OBS April sale in 2020 after breezing a quarter for Jimbo and Torie Gladwell's operation in :20 1/5. She subsequently realized \$2.9 million from Katsumi Yoshida while in foal to Into Mischief at the following year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Mixed sale.

"They're such a powerhouse team," Torie Gladwell said. "It's like the dream team when you see them walking around. I have to give a lot of credit to (bloodstock agents) Donato Lanni and Gary Young. You just pray that they land on one of your horses.

"They know what they're doing, that's for sure. Princess Noor and Arabian Knight and now this one. Hopefully, he's as good as those other two and he gets a Grade I."

Muth hails from the second crop of Hill 'n' Dale's promising young sire Good Magic, who, of course, is also responsible for this year's GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage. The first foal out of the winning Don Alberto homebred Hoppa (Uncle Mo), Muth brought \$190,000 from the Gladwell family's pinhooking partnership out of the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consignment on day seven of last year's Keeneland September sale. Don Alberto purchased Handoverthecat (Tale of the Cat), with Hoppa in utero, for \$170,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November sale. Hoppa's yearling filly by Violence was purchased by Rigney Racing for \$385,000 at Keeneland September.

"When we bought him (as a yearling), he was pretty light on the page, but just a standout physical," Gladwell said. "We gave quite a bit of money for him because at the time Good Magic was kind of on the bubble. We just liked the horse that much."

Muth was the talking horse on the grounds at OBS March after delivering a :9 3/5 bullet breeze and a much-discussed monster gallop out during the under-tack show.

"We were behind on him going into the sale," Gladwell said.

"He had a little setback, so we actually had to stop on him. His prep at the sale was his first breeze back after coming off a little layoff and it was pretty spectacular. When he prepped we were like, 'ooh this is gonna be fun.'"

She continued, "When he breezed we weren't ever thinking :9 3/5--that was a surprise--but we knew he was extremely fast because he was as fast on the farm all winter. And then his gallop out. He didn't just go the first eighth really fast, he went the whole three-eighths extremely fast."

Muth has also been extremely fast on the racetrack. A nobrainer 'Rising Star' following a spectacular 8 3/4-length debut score at Santa Anita June 18, Muth was second-best with a 93 Beyer Speed Figure behind his unbeaten stablemate and fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Prince of Monaco (Speightstown) in the sixfurlong GIII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 13.

A late scratch out of Saratoga's GI Hopeful S. on Labor Day, Muth makes his two-turn debut Saturday while facing seven rivals in the 1 1/16-mile American Pharoah, a 'Win and You're In' for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He has breezed four times since returning to the Golden State from upstate New York, including a sharp five-furlong drill in :59 1/5 (2/87) in Arcadia Oct. 2. Baffert has won the American Pharoah a record 11 times.

How will Muth handled the added distance?

"That's always a question," Gladwell said. "When we're getting these horses ready for the 2-year-old sales, we don't really let them do too much on the farm because they're still so young. His three-eighths to half-mile gallop out at the sale was the most we ever really let these horses do before they move on to their trainer."

She concluded, "I think he's extremely talented. I'm hoping he can do it. We'll find out this weekend."

PROS: As a \$700,000 Keeneland September yearling, this February foal was clearly a standout from a physical and conformation perspective...While Bob Baffert is an 11-time winner of this event, trainer Tim Yakteen was along for many of those and would know what sort of animal it takes to win a race like this...Ramon Vazquez ends up elsewhere, but you could scarcely do better than Mike Smith as a replacement. The Hall of Famer won in 2010 aboard Jaycito (Victory Gallop) and again in 2021 astride future champion Corniche (Quality Road)...Won his maiden over a sprint trip where his pedigree suggests he wants a fair bit further...Is one of four in here with a victory.

CONS: Though he showed enough speed to defeat a couple of today's rivals over 6 1/2 furlongs at second asking, he never looked likely when making his stakes debut in the GI Del Mar Futurity last time and was unable to make any impact when the real running started...Needs to pick up his feed and improve by several lengths as his top Beyer of 71 will not be anywhere near good enough here...While the addition of Smith won't hurt anyone's feelings, the fact that Vazquez deserts for another rival cannot be considered a positive.

PEDIGREE: By an Eclipse Award-winning juvenile who has already sired a GI Kentucky Derby winner and out of a mare by a GI Belmont S. winner, Rothschild clearly has a license to do better over this 8 1/2-furlong distance and beyond. His stakeswinning and GI Ballerina S.-placed dam is a daughter of Forever Smart (Smart Strike), whose two stakes-placings came at or about a mile on turf and has two other stakes horses to her credit.

VERDICT: He is something other than a 'banker' and the task ahead is a tall one, but if Smith gets aggressive and puts him into the race from the inside gate and if he appreciates the added real estate, Rothschild couldn't be completely ruled out for a minor slice of the pie. -- Alan Carasso

PROS: A \$190,000 purchase at Keeneland September last fall-already a good result for his boom sire--Muth gave a hint of what might lie ahead when breezing a furlong in :9 3/5 before going on to top this year's OBS March Sale on a bid of \$2 million from Donato Lanni, agent for Amr Zedan. Bob Baffert typically saves his top 2-year-old prospects for Del Mar, but Muth was raring to go come mid-June. He was hammered into 30 cents on the dollar and made no mistakes, setting a lively pace before hitting the line an 8 3/4-length winner. The 1-2 chalk to take the next logical step in the GIII Best Pal S. at the seaside Aug. 13, the bay led after a half-mile, but had no answer for fellow 'Rising **Star'** stablemate Prince of Monaco (Speightstown, 103 Beyer) and was forced to settle for second.... As effective as he's been around one turn thus far, Muth can--on paper, at least--take a step forward as he gets out to a distance of ground for the first time.

CONS: It will take a fair bit of hair-splitting to come up with negatives for Muth at this stage, but just three weeks after his hard-trying effort in the Best Pal, the colt was shipped across the country to Saratoga with an eye on the closing-weekend GI Hopeful S. Baffert explained that he thought the race might be too quick back and returned him to California to prepare for the American Pharoah. It's difficult to quantify just how much 6,000 miles of flying might affect Muth, but there is a non-zero chance that it will have had some impact.

PEDIGREE: Muth combines the collective powers of his indemand young sire--himself the country's champion 2-year-old of 2017--and dam sire, best of his generation in 2010. Making the combination that much more appealing is that Good Magic, just eight years of age, and Uncle Mo, with many years ahead of him at age 15, has each accounted for a GI Kentucky Derby winner from just a handful of crops to race. Though there is no black-type in the second dam, Muth's third dam Frayne (Red Ransom) was a full-sister to GI E. P. Taylor S. winner Advancing Star, the dam of G1 Dewhurst S. hero War Command (War Front) and French Group 3 winner Naval Officer (Tale of the Cat). This is also the family of stamina influence Silver Hawk (Roberto).

VERDICT: By the looks of things, Muth has his seven rivals over a barrel, barring some sort of regression on his part and a significant move forward from something else. His even-money quote on the morning line is likely to be but a pipe dream. A win gives Baffert an even dozen in the race and a horse that will have every chance to turn the tables over the same course and distance in a month's time. -- Alan Carasso

PROS: At first blush, it seems Next Level is woefully mismatched as he remains a maiden after three starts, but this trainer knows how to cook up an upset with modestly priced stock such as Ive Struck a Nerve, the \$272 winner of the 2013 GII Risen Star S., surprise GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victor Texas Red, Classic winner Exaggerator and, more recently, this year's GII Rebel S. scorer Confidence Game. Pitched straight in against stakes company for his debut, the \$20,000 KEESEP grad was unplaced there, but was runner-up to Baffert's well-regarded Mission Beach (Curlin) in Del Mar maiden company before finishing a creditable third behind Prince of Monaco in the GI Del Mar Futurity...Though yet to have his picture taken, has improved on his speed figures with each start.

CONS: While not exactly over his head in this spot, the fact Next Level has not managed at least a maiden score is hardly encouraging...Mission Beach did not exactly go on to frank the form of the maiden when finishing five lengths' fifth behind Nutella Fella (Runhappy) in a moderately graded renewal of the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga last month.

PEDIGREE: Next Level is one of two in the race for his freshman sire (by Curlin), who secured an Eclipse Award as champion older male of 2019 when running away with that year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic right here at the Great Race Place. Next Level's stakes-placed dam is a half-sister to four-time stakes winner and Grade II-placed Pioneer Spirit (Malibu Moon) and Grade III winner Devious Intent (Dixie Union), while the third dam Erandel (Danzig) was responsible for Runspastum (Woodman), a Grade III winner on turf and dual black-type winner on the main track. Two turns should be of no concern to Next Level.

PEDIGREE: Another that is unlikely on a win line (to be fair, most of them are), Next Level certainly has place claims given how he stacked up with the likes of Prince of Monaco down at Del Mar last month. He has trained on since that effort and should give a good account of himself. -- Alan Carasso

PROS: Wine Me Up made the most of his lone racetrack appearance to date, overcoming a bit of a bobble at the break to argue a decent pace before coming away to graduate at first asking....A \$115,000 KEENOV weanling, the Apr. 17 foal made for a solid pinhook at OBS this past June, breezing a quarter in :20 4/5 and selling in a private transaction to these owners known on sales grounds as the 'Three Amigos.'...Pegram, Watson and Weitman go for a third American Pharoah, joining last year's winner, the late 'TDN Rising Star' Cave Rock (Arrogate) and 2009 winner and eventual juvenile champion Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike). As mentioned previously, Baffert is in search of a 12th renewal dating back to Golden Eagle's Souvenir Copy back in 1997.

CONS: Though he clearly showed promise in winning on debut, Wine Me Up spots most of his competition significant experience as one of just two entrants with just the one start to date...Juan Hernandez was at the controls for the debut, but for good reason sticks with Muth here.

PEDIGREE: Interestingly, Wine Me Up is bred very similarly to Next Level, as both are out of mares from the El Prado (Ire)/ Sadler's Wells line. Deanallen'skitten was bred by Ken and his late wife Sarah Ramsey and was retained as a foal after bidding on her stalled out at \$45,000 at Keeneland November in 2007. A stakes winner of nearly \$375,000, Deanallen'skitten was a halfsister to Grade III-placed Darling Daughter (Maria's Mon), the dam of SW Holiday Mischief (Into Mischief); Sabalenka (Good Samaritan), third in last year's GII Jessamine S. at Keeneland and most recently second in the \$1-million Dueling Grounds Oaks at Kentucky Downs; and Grade III-placed juvenile Big Bazinga (Bluegrass Cat).

VERDICT: At a morning-line quote of 12-1, Wine Me Up looms as the value play for the second and third lines of vertical wagers. Doubtful they'll be popping corks post-race, but he seems to have plenty of upside going forward. -- Alan Carasso

PROS: With three races under his belt, Raging Torrent is tied for the most experience coming into the GI American Pharoah S. with fellow juveniles Rothschild (Uncle Mo) and Next Level (Vino Rosso)...The Doug O'Neill trainee broke his maiden by 2 1/4 lengths July 23 at Del Mar against a next-out winner at Saratoga, Tall Paul (Frosted) before competing in the GIII Best Pal S. Aug. 13 and GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 10. Those efforts gave the bay colt's connections some valuable clues as to his capability and the addition of blinkers here could provide just what he needs to give his best effort...Other ticks to the good include the fact that Antonio Fresu retains the mount. A sharp workout at Santa Anita Sept. 24 when he went :59.40 (4/62) certainly bodes well too.

CONS: Not having to face the undefeated GISW Prince of Monaco (Speightstown) for a third straight time is certainly a blessing, but questions remain about whether Raging Torrent has what it takes to compete against well-matched fields like he will see here. If he can run like he did on debut, then there is hope for sure. But a repeat of his last pair of efforts against graded stakes company will have him competing for one the minor awards.

PEDIGREE: First-crop sire Maximus Mischief, a top-five leading man, has 20 winners of 24 races to his credit, plus a pair of stakes winners. Consigned by agent Randy Bradshaw at the OBS April Sale and purchased for \$75,000 by Mark Davis, Raging Torrent is Violent Wave's only winner, but she is responsible for two other offspring--a yearling colt by Honor A.P. and a filly by Collected who was foaled May 2. Violent Wave is a half-sister to The Nth Degree (Distorted Humor), winner of the GIII Shakertown S.

VERDICT: It is time to get back to basics and maybe the addition of blinkers is the key handicapping component for success. --J.N. Campbell

PROS: While he was technically the beaten favorite in his Saratoga debut Aug. 5, that loss came by a just a nose (pictured, left) to Just Steel (Justify) and his connections thought enough of that race to jump him up into the GI Hopeful S. a month later. He endured an eventful trip, having to stop and start several times over those seven furlongs, and still wound up a gusty fourth, beaten just 4 1/4 lengths as the pace absolutely fell apart around him. Repole Stable and Todd Pletcher, never a pair to turn down an opportunity to run a good horse, again were encouraged enough to ship Be You away fromt his New York base to Santa Anita, where he will be the only East Coast runner to line up.

CONS: A colt who has never had his picture taken now ships across the country to face arguably his toughest test to date in the West Coast runners. And while there are several other horses in the field who started Sept. 10 in the GI Del Mar Futurity, Be You last started in that Sept. 4 Hopeful and then had to deal with a trans-continental trip and acclimating to a new track.

PEDIGREE: Sire Curlin has produced plenty of stamina-inclined runners led by GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Vino Rosso while dam Jacaranda was victorious in the one-mile GIII Tempted S. as a 2-year-old. Be You's full-sister, American West, was second in the Tempted S. herself.

Perhaps most notably, Jacaranda, who sold for \$2 million to Alpha Delta at the 2016 FTKNOV sale, is a half-sister to MGISW and sire Constitution (Tapit), who took both the GI Besilu Florida Derby and the GI Donn H. going nine furlongs. Be You's second dam Baffled placed in the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot before selling for \$3.5 million in that same 2016 FTKNOV sale. Most recently, she changed hands again at the 2019 variation of that same sale for \$1.9 million to Don Alberto Corp carrying a foal that would go on to be \$1.1-million yearling I'm Baffled (Medaglia d'Oro). There is also high-class black-type under third dam Surf Club, who also produced GI Forego S. winner Emcee (Unbridled's Song) and GSW Surfer (Distorted Humor) along with the dam of GSW Marzo (Medaglia d'Oro), who scored in the 1/2-mile GIII Sycamore S.

VERDICT: This son of Curlin has the pedigree that suggests he should appreciate the stretch out in distance to 1 1/16 miles but will ultimately need to prove that he's capable of hitting the line first. --Stefanie Grimm

PROS: With only one race to his credit, Indispensable is certainly light on form coming into this Grade I, but juvenile experience could be regarded as a premium for some at this point in the season. What we do know is that the bay colt is still figuring things out and that always means there is an opportunity to take a step forward...Even though that debut Aug. 25 at Del Mar only had five others in attendance and was convincingly won by Rothschild (Uncle Mo) (who is entered in here), the John Sadler trainee did finish a respectable third which was not a bad effort for his first start. Up against some tough competitors as a 19-1 shot, considering he trailed up the backstretch, the ground he made up around the far turn and into the lane made a favorable impression...For you clockers out there, he has produced regular works since that debut with the last coming Sept. 30 when he went six furlongs in 1:12.60 (1/10) at 'The Great Race Place'.

CONS: The GI American Pharoah S. is going to be a mountain to climb against a pair of Bob Baffert trainees in GSP Muth (Good Magic) and Wine Me Up (Vino Rosso). Muth posted a Beyer Speed Figure of 90 in his 8 3/4 length debut June 18 at Santa Anita and a 93 in the Best Pal. Indispensable is going to have to be guicker from the first jump and keep these leaders close, if he wants to have any shot at crossing the wire first.

PEDIGREE:

The sire of five racing crops of age, Constitution has produced 54 stakes winners and 27 graded stakes winners. Indispensable went for \$330,000 at the '21 Keeneland November Sale to Brookstone Farm before being consigned by agent St. George Sales the following September in the same ring when he was bought for \$825,000 by Talla Racing and West Point Thoroughbreds. The bay colt is out of High Performer--dam to six foals, four to race and one winner. That lone victoress is Lovely Trophy Girl (Hard Spun) who foaled a colt by Bucchero May 7. The bay colt's extended female family includes his dam's full-sister, who was runner-up in the GII Super Derby, Chocopologie, and digging a little deeper we find some intriguing connections under his third dam like MGSW Rusty Slipper (Lemon Drop Kid) and GI Wood Memorial S. hero Wicked Strong (Hard Spun).

VERDICT: Drawn to the outside here, that could be a tactical advantage for such a young horse as this one. An epic pace meltdown could be in the cards, so Indispensable can get his picture taken. -- J.N. Campbell

PROS: Yes, he's run second twice in his only two career starts. But those seconds came behind two of the best West Coast runners in 'TDN Rising Star' Muth (Good Magic) and Rothschild (Uncle Mo). In both of those starts, El Magnifico was the standalone second so, had he not run into a pair of monsters, he would very likely have graduated in that Santa Anita debut June 18. Of the eight runners in the field, he's also one of only three with experience over the Santa Anita surface.

CONS: Yes he's run second twice in his only two career starts. Unfortunately for El Magnifico, both horses he lost to (by significant margins) appear in this field alongside him. He's also drawn widest and seems to lack early foot with plenty of speedy rivals to his inside. His last race, Aug. 25 at Del Mar, was run over 6 1/2 furlongs, making him one of just two runners here yet to try a race over seven panels.

PEDIGREE: There's plenty of stamina to be found in sire Street Sense, himself a GI Kentucky Derby winner, along with leading broodmare sire Bernardini. Secret Jewel was a \$1.2-million yearling out of the 2011 Keeneland September Sale due to the efforts of her half-sibling in GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf winner Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect) who went on to produce GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf victress and 'TDN Rising Star' Sharing (Speightstown). Secret Jewel also counts GSW/GISP Sparkle Blue (Hard Spun) and GSW Colonial Flag (Pleasant Tap), herself a \$1.6-million KEENOV broodmare, as half-siblings.

Even further back, the family includes GII Saratoga Special S. winner and GI Forego S. placed High Oak (Gormley), GSW Golden Itiz (Tiznow) and MGSW Sapphire n' Silk (Pleasant Tap) along with her son Shaniko (A.P. Indy) who set the track record for 1 1/8 miles at Turfway Park in the GII Kentucky Cup Classic S. Secret Jewel is already responsible for four winners with an average winning distance of 8.1 furlongs, including GIII Beaumont S. winner Twenty Carat (Into Mischief).

VERDICT:

He should have no problem getting the distance but the odds of him beating not just one, but both of the monsters that defeated him in his maiden races earlier this summer are slim.-Stefanie Grimm



Drawn inside facing a field of 12, **ROYAL SLIPPER** (Uncle Mo) for Wesley Ward is out of \$1.5m Fasig-Tipton Fall Mixed Sale pick up Laffina (Arch), making her a full-sister to MGISW and \$4.2m FTKNOV purchase Bast. The dam is a half to GSW/GISP Mananan Mclir (Royal Academy) and to the dam of GISW Fault (Blame), another FTKNOV spotlight at \$1.2m.

Lady Chai (Kantharos), a \$570,000 Keeneland September buy, is a half-sister to GSW/GISP Shivaji (First Samurai) and to SW/MGISP Tarabi (First Samurai). Cherie Devaux trains for an ownership group that includes CHC INC., Hinkle Farms, David Ingordo and LBD Stable LLC.

Making her second start is \$1,000,000 FTSAUG yearling Charlottesapproval (Into Mischief) who needs to improve in this spot after a well-beaten eighth on debut at Ellis Park Aug. 18. TJCIS PPS

FRANKEL ON TOP AGAIN AS BOOK 1 FIGURES TAKE A DIP



Angus Gold: bought the Thursday top lot on behalf of Shadwell

NEWMARKET, UK—A Frankel (GB) filly out of the brilliant G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Millisle (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) provided a sprinkling of stardust on the final day of the Tattersalls Book 1 October Yearling Sale when selling to Shadwell for 1.6 million gns.

Sheikha Hissa has been a notable presence on the sales ground all week and, according to Shadwell's racing manager Angus Gold, it was her determination that helped see off the attention of underbidder Kieran Lalor for the first foal out of the former Jessica Harrington-trained star.

That result brought Shadwell's haul of fillies to seven and pushed the operation's total spend to 3.66 million gns this week. Gold said of lot 492 bred by Stonethorn Stud Farm, "Sheikha Hissa absolutely loved her when she saw her. I said she's probably going to make a lot of money and she said, 'well, we need fillies for the stud.'

"A first foal out of the Cheveley Park winner by one of the world's great stallions, it's sort of self-explanatory. She seemed very athletic and had a very good mind for a Frankel. A very well-balanced filly."

He added, "I thought she'd make a million and two, probably a million and three. We were determined to buy her and there is obviously a period of rebuilding. It's a long-term project for Sheikha Hissa. It's exciting times for the stud but obviously you need to keep regenerating." Cont. p3

WESTOVER RETIRED WITH INJURY SUSTAINED IN THE ARC

Westover (GB) (Frankel {GB}), winner of the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Grand Prix de Saint Cloud, has been retired after sustaining a "career-ending injury" when finishing runner-up in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

Announcing his retirement on Thursday, the colt's owner-breeder Juddmonte stated that stud plans for the 4-year-old would be announced at a later date.

Juddmonte's racing manager Barry Mahon said, "It's devastating news, unfortunately he suffered a career-ending injury on Sunday and he'll have to be retired. Long-term he'll be fine and he'll be okay for a stallion career, but we had such good days with him this year and last year, we had an exciting end to the season planned and we were all very excited about it. Unfortunately it's come to an end." Cont. p9



He said, "Nevertheless, Europe's premier yearling sale has enjoyed plenty of memorable moments, very much reflecting the quality of the yearlings which have been on show throughout the past three days."

Cumani: 'We Owe That Family a Hell of a Lot'

The last Frankel (GB) colt in the sale, lot 493, from the Cumani family's terrific Souk (Ire) dynasty, lifted the spirits as the afternoon drew to a close when joining the list of Coolmore's purchases this week at 950,000gns.

Last year the Cumanis' Fittocks Stud sold Euphoric (GB) (Frankel {GB}) to MV Magnier and White Birch Farm for 1.9 million gns, and he timed his run rather well

to score on debut at Navan on Wednesday. So it was back to a trusted source, and in fact as association that stretches back at least 24 years to when the Coolmore team bought a Sadler's



Wells colt for 650,000gns at the Houghton Sale for 650,000gns and named him Milan (GB) after the birthplace of his breeder Luca Cumani. As a St Leger winner and a leading National Hunt sire for Coolmore, he served his owners well.

In the case of the team's latest purchase, a decent update could be in the offing, because John and Thady Gosden think enough of the Frankel colt's three-year-old half-sister Naaey (GB) (Lope De Vega (Ire)) to be planning entering her in the G2 Pride S. in the coming weeks. The dam Materialistic (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) won twice and was Listed-placed for Cumani in his training days. Now 10, she is a great-grand-daughter of the Fittocks foundation mare Souk, who was herself by Ahonoora

(GB).

"From the moment he was born he was strong," said Cumani of the yearling. Cont. p5

"Obviously yesterday's result helped, and we have to thank the Juddmonte team, as they were underbidders and without them we wouldn't have got this far," he said.

His wife Sara added, "It'll be great for all the guys at the farm as it's not been the easiest sale. [The market has been] up and down. We sold one for more than we expected, four for less than we expected and two we took home. Anything that is bred to look like a mile-and-a-half horse they didn't seem to be excited about. But this was a great result and we are grateful to the people who support us and grateful to the people who work with us."

Materialistic is now back in foal to Frankel, having lost an earlier colt by him as a weanling, and she has a colt foal by Wootton Bassett (GB).

Luca Cumani added, "We'd like to thank Coolmore very much. They have been great supporters of ours, especially this year and last year.

"I bought Souk as a yearling in Goffs for Ir£100,000, which was a lot of money in those days, and I got home and got quite a bollocking. I'm glad it has worked out okay. [Her grand-daughter] Platonic, who struggled to win, and finally won as a four-year-old in the French provinces, we sold for 100,000gns, and look what she has produced. It is a great family. We owe that family a hell of a lot."

Talking Points

 Edmond Mahony highlighted a "selectivity to the market", and that is reflected in the figures for Book 1.
 The final day's trade dipped by 35% year-on-year to 29,158,000gns, with the median being the lowest of the week at 155,000gns (-35%) and the average at 219,233gns (-32%). Across the three days, the aggregate was down to 95,395,000gns (-25%), which was still up on the 'Covid years' of 2020 and 2021 and just beneath the preceding three years when the turnover passed 100 million gns. From 470 yearlings offered, 391 were marked as sold, to give a clearance rate of 83% (-5%) The median price for the three days was 180,000gns (-10%) and the average was 243,997gns (-18%).

- The trade at last year's Book 1 reached record levels, but it is worth reflecting that more than 10 million gns of that was attributed to yearlings 'bought' by Saleh Al Homaizi which ultimately had to be reoffered after payment wasn't forthcoming. Another 2.7 million gns was spent by John Dance of Manor House Farm, who has not been active in the yearling market this season since Dance's business affairs came under investigation by the Financial Conduct Authority earlier this year. On the other hand, Richard Knight, who last year signed for the yearlings on Al Homaizi's list, is now acting on behalf of a new name on the buyers' sheet, the Saudi Arabia-based Al Salhia Stud, which is owned by Mohammed Saleh Bin Laden. Al Salhia Stud, which has previously been involved in Arab racing, is now branching out into Thoroughbreds and was active at Argana in August. Through Book 1, the operation bought 10 yearlings for a total of 2,555,000gns.
- Though Godolphin was still a significant presence as the leading buyer, with 20 horses bought for just north of 12 million gns, even this expenditure pales next to last year's outlay of 25.3 million gns for 35 Book 1 yearlings. Rabbah Bloodstock, too, spent 1.5 million gns at last year's sale but was absent from the buyers' list this week.
- Tom Goff and Richard Brown buy for a range of clients, and their Blandford Bloodstock was the second-leading buyer at Book 1, with 25 yearlings signed for at a total outlay of 8.1 million gns. Brown has been the main buyer of horses in training for Wathnan Racing, owned by the Emir of Qatar, and a new name in the owner ranks in recent seasons. Though no confirmation was given of any yearling purchases for the operation, it is fair to assume that some of those bought under the Blandford banner may be seen racing in the Wathnan colours in the future.

- For the sixth year in a row, Graham Smith-Bernal's
 Newsells Park Stud topped the Book 1 consignors' list
 with 25 sold for a total of 10,565,000gns. There were
 also noteworthy results from the select drafts of
 Anthony Oppenheimer's Hascombe & Valiant Stud,
 which sold six yearlings at an average of 554,167gns,
 including the overall top lot, and for Paul and Marie
 McCartan's Ballyphilip Stud, which averaged 504,000gns
 for five sold.
- Frankel was responsible for the most expensive colt and filly in the sale, and two of the seven yearlings to have sold for a million or more. That number of seven-figure lots was down from 16 last year.
- Twelve late withdrawals on the day from the final session tells its own tale of how some vendors viewed the dip in trade on Thursday.

Another Gem for Grangemore

Grangemore Stud's full-sister to the Group 2 winners Charyn (Ire) and Wings Of War (Ire), both by Dark Angel (Ire), will join her brother Charyn in the ownership of Nurlan Bizakov, who, under his Sumbe banner, when to 850,000gns for the daughter of the 10-year-old mare Futoon (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}).

Grangemore owner Guy O'Callaghan bought Futoon in partnership with his brother David for 100,000gns, and she has more that repaid that outlay, with her repeat matings with Yeomanstown Stud's Dark Angel having produced those two black-type winners from as many foals of racing age.

O'Callaghan said of the yearling filly [lot 376], "She's always

been a spectacular filly at home. I'm thrilled with the price she made and the home she's going to. We had to come over to the sales a day early with the storm last week, so she's been here nine days and she's not put a foot wrong. It's a lot for a yearling to take and she's been a class act. They're all so great out of the mare but she was probably the best of them."

Futoon, who was placed multiple times at Listed level, is from the family of the G2 Mill Reef S. winner Galeota (Ire) and of the Group 3-winning siblings Burnt Sugar (Ire) and Brown Sugar (Ire).

O'Callaghan added, "My brother David and I bought the mare here as a four-year-old from Steven Hillen and Kevin Ryan. We were following her as a racehorse and she's been very lucky for us ever since. It's a real fast, tough family. There was a good Dark Angel in the family already, and she just made so much sense."

Along with Nurlan Bizakov, major owner-breeder operations Cheveley Park Stud, Shadwell and Al Shira'aa Farms were also among those to have selected well-bred fillies on the final day of Book 1.

On Shadwell's behalf, Angus Gold went to 575,000gns for lot 427, Meon Valley Stud's daughter of Sea The Moon (Ger) and Group 2 winner Jazzi Top (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), whose second and third dams, Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic) and Colorspin (Fr) (High Top {GB}) are both Group 1 winners.

Kieran Lalor picked up another smart filly for Al Shira'aa in lot 393, a Siyouni (Fr) half-sister to Al Husn (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), who won the G1 Nassau S. after publication of the catalogue. Shadwell were under-bidders on the filly, having sold her dam Hadaatha (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) to David Nagle of Barronstown Stud for 400,000gns when she was in foal to Siyouni in 2021. Bennett's Merry Week

Craig Bennett of Merry Fox Stud signed off on a good week of selling alongside Newsells Park Stud when Godolphin went to 800,000gns to secure his Dubawi (Ire) filly (lot 470) out of Luminate (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}).

Along with Newsells Park, Bennett brought four yearlings to the market this week and sold all four, with the owner-breeder describing himself as happy with the business conducted at Tattersalls.

He said, "Great week--I sold four out of four. Going home now! The first mare we bought in partnership with Newsells was Luminate. She is clearly a lovely-walking mare and she passes that walk on. This is the first one we have brought to market and got very well paid to go to a good home. It's a great cross and the Rainbow Quest in the second generation really suits the sire, particularly for fillies, so I think they have got a very good chance of her being a very good racehorse. The mare is in foal to Lope De Vega, carrying a filly, and we are just working out mating plans for next year."

Market View

There were plenty of positives to take from Book 1, the highest-priced yearling sold in Europe this year being one of them, but there were just seven lots all told to break the million gns mark throughout the three days.

Unlike the Orby Sale at Goffs, where well-bred fillies led the way, the majority of the big-ticket horses sold at Tattersalls this week were colts.

Kieran Lalor, who buys on behalf of major owner-breeder Al Shira'aa Farms, cut the image of a frustrated figure on Thursday when sharing his feeling that the well-bred colts matched up better physically than the fillies this week.

That played out in the results and Al Shira'aa signed for four

yearlings--two fillies and two colts--in what was at times a patchy sale.

Bloodstock agent Mark McStay shared that while he felt the top end of the market remained strong at Tattersalls this week, the middle tiers were difficult at times.

In other words, the recession-proof buyers were there, but in reflection of what is going on in the wider world outside racing, the middle market has taken somewhat of a dent.

He explained, "Like every sale that I have attended for the past number of years, for the very good stock, the trade is highly competitive. Underneath that top level, business is being done but it can be sticky in patches.

"The standard of horses has been high and all of the big players are here. What we have seen play out this week is probably a fair reflection of the worldwide bloodstock market."

He added, "Some people who have been active here in the past number of years haven't appeared but, then again, some of the bigger players, the likes of Sheikh Mohammed, have participated stronger than ever."

A much clearer picture will be painted on the middle market, according to McStay, after Books 2, 3 and 4 take place at Tattersalls next week.

He continued, "I am very happy with how my week went. We bought some nice horses and, while we weren't in the big league, I'm happy and am looking forward to Book 2 and onwards. Next week will be telling and it will be interesting to see what trainers have orders."

Edmond Mahony concluded his own assessment of the market in a philosophical fashion. He commented, "Year on year the consignors show enormous faith in Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale with the sale showcasing the very best that Europe has to offer, and yet again we have seen so many of the world's leading owners competing for the finest turf-bred yearlings to be found anywhere in the world." In the course of the past three days buyers from Abu Dhabi, Australia, Bahrain, China, Dubai, France, Hong Kong, Japan, Kazakhstan, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the USA have all made significant contributions at all levels of the market confirming the unparalleled esteem in which the finest European yearlings are held and specifically those found annually at this particular sale. This is a sale that produces stallions and breed-shaping broodmares on an annual basis and it is the sale's unrivalled reputation which annually makes this fixture an unmissable event for so many of the most influential thoroughbred owners in the world."

Buy Of The Day

Mark Flannery has turned water into wine on more than one occasion--the top breeze-up handler famously got €210,000 for €5,000 Book 2 buy Landshark (GB) (Bated Breath {GB}).

Perhaps Flannery found more value at Tattersalls this week in the shape of a 40,000gns Kingman (GB) colt (lot 516) from Blue Diamond Stud.

Kingman has done well with his breeze-up graduates and this could be another. He's gone to a top outfit and could rock into six figures or more at the Craven Breeze-Up Sale here in the spring. Time will tell.

A winner on debut at two, the Ralph Beckett-trained Westover came to greater prominence on his 3-year-old bow when winning the G3 Classic Trial at Sandown. An imposing son of Frankel and the Lear Fan mare Mirabilis, herself a stakes winner in both France and America, he went on to finish third behind Desert Crown (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) in last year's Derby before claiming his own Classic victory in the Irish equivalent at the Curragh.

Westover's career has also included a number of gallant runs in defeat: he was second in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic to Japanese superstar Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) and was also runner-up to Emily Upjohn (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in a memorable running of the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom this June. He claimed his second Group 1 prize in France after that before adding another two admirable second-place finishes to his record when beaten a head by Hukum (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in the G1 King George and Queen Elizabeth S. and, finally, on Sunday behind Ace Impact (Ire) (Cracksman {GB}) in the Arc.

Mahon added, "I'd say he'll be a top-class stallion. He's one of Frankel's best sons and, as we saw with Ace Impact, Frankel's sons are off to a flying start.

"He's been beautifully trained by Ralph, Rob Hornby has obviously built up a good association with him last year and this year, and Colin Keane was exquisite on him the day he won the Irish Derby. It's been a great story for a lot of people, none more so than Juddmonte. We're very lucky to have had him."

A fourth-generation Juddmonte homebred, Westover is a full-brother to the Group 3 winner Monarchs Glen (GB), who was one of Frankel's earliest Royal Ascot winners in the Listed Wolferton S. Their dam is a half-sister to the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix du Moulin winner Nebraska Tornado (Storm Cat) and to the G2 Prix Eugene Adam winner Burning Sun (Danzig).

Westover's trainer Ralph Beckett said, "I am very proud of the

horse and what he has achieved, he gave his all every day at home and on the racecourse and we will all miss him."

NASHWA WILL SKIP BREEDERS' CUP IN **FAVOUR OF CHAMPIONS DAY; WILL REMAIN IN TRAINING**

Imad Al Sagar's Blue Diamond Stud silks will be carried by his star filly Nashwa (GB) (Frankel (GB)) for another year, but the multiple Group 1 winner will skip the Breeders' Cup in favour of competing at QIPCO British Champions Day later this month, The Sun reported on Thursday.

Both the one-mile G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. or the 1 1/4-mile G1 QIPCO Champion S. are under consideration for the 4-yearold at Ascot on Oct. 21. Trained by John and Thady Gosden, the regular mount of Hollie Doyle was third in last year's G1 Oaks before taking the French equivalent and the G1 Nassau S. and running second in the G1 Prix de l'Opera. Fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf last November, Nashwa added a second at Group 3 level in June before padding her Group 1 resume in the Falmouth S. in July. She has run third in both the Aug. 3 G1 Nassau S. and Sept. 9 G1 Irish Champion S. in her last three starts, with a second in the G1 International S. in late August in between.

Al Sagar told *The Sun*'s Matt Chapman, "Nashwa is heading to Ascot and is entered in both the QEII and Champion. She will run on one or the other.

"There will be no Breeders' Cup for her but Ascot is not her last race. She will train on as a 5-year-old."

SHEEZA BELTER HAMMERS AT A\$1.35M TO YULONG

Group 1 winner Sheeza Belter (Aus) (Gold Standard {Aus}--

Saxabelle {Aus}, by Saxon {Aus}) sold for A\$1.35 million to Victoria's Highway Farm during a Magic Millions virtual auction hosted by auctioneer Clint Donovan on Thursday. Yuesheng Zhang's Yulong was buying as Highway Farm.

"It is a very nerve-wracking experience selling a horse around that level," her original buyer and part owner Justin Warwick said. "I'm relieved that the process has been a success and I'm very happy to see where she is going and the opportunity she will have."

Bred by Mt Hallowell Stud, the chestnut was an A\$35,000 buy back before being sold to Warwick for A\$50,000 out of the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale in 2021. Put into training with trainer Luke Fernie, the filly would take her debut on New Year's Day in 2022. Transferred to Peter and Paul Snowden for all barring her last start, a listed race win followed two starts later and she ran third in the G3 Ken Russell Memorial Classic. Successful in the G2 Sires Produce S. that May, the filly added the G1 J.J. Atkins that June. As a 3-year-old the filly would also add the G2 Hot Danish S. and run third in the G1 Coolmore Classic, and was retired in the care of Annabel Neasham in September with a mark of 14-5-1-2 and \$1,279,661 in earnings at four.

"She has taken all of us on such a wonderful ride," Warwick added. "When you buy a horse you dream of what might be to come.

"This girl delivered on that dream. She gave us so much joy on the racetrack and we are excited about her prospects for the next stage of her journey.

"One chapter of the book has now finished but the best thing is, she will get looked after so well and be given a chance with the best stallions in the world. Breeding is not what us part owners do, but we can now sit back and hope that her offspring go well and we can say we played a part in that." Cont. p17


