# HBPA TRIES TO DERAIL HISA IN FEDERAL COURT-BUT ALSO WANTS ITS HELP IN ARIZONA

### The Week in Review, by T.D. Thornton

If the saga over the supposedly pending sale of now-closed Turf Paradise was a soap opera, its title would surely be "AZ the World Turns." The state's racing is hanging in the balance amid an increasingly acrimonious long-term feud between the track's owner and horsemen, leading one trainer at last Thursday's Arizona Racing Commission meeting to liken the horse community's predicament to children "being used as pawns in a divorce battle" by vindictive parents on the verge of a nasty split.

Although *TDN*'s original story about that Oct. 12 commission meeting didn't have the space to cover all aspects of the ongoing bickering among the Arizona Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (AZHBPA) and Turf Paradise's owner, Jerry Simms, one subplot is worth further mention here, because its irony resonates at the federal level (and perhaps soon all the way to the United States Supreme Court).

J. Lloyd Yother, the president of the AZHBPA, alleged on Thursday that Simms is so far behind in making necessary repairs and upkeep that a new, incoming owner would never be able to open Turf Paradise for a race meet in January. *Cont. p3*

"No significant change from yesterday," texted Fiske in response to a *TDN* request for an update.


"(She) splits her time between lying down and standing at her stall door eating hay. At this stage, that feels like a win. No news is good news."

January is the target date that Simms has said is perfectly reasonable as he attempts to execute a purchase-and-sale agreement with a buyer who has thus far refused to speak publicly about the deal at Arizona commission meetings.

In particular, Yother and Simms sparred verbally over the specific issue of whether or not extensive repairs are needed for the main track railing, with Yother claiming the fencing is not up to spec and Simms countering that Turf Paradise had fixed problems related to a non-compliance warning issued by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety (HISA) Authority earlier this year after an inspection turned up "numerous gaps and exposed edges in the railing material that could inflict serious harm upon jockeys..."

Darrell Haire, the western regional manager for The Jockeys' Guild, told commissioners on Thursday that the Turf Paradise rail during the 2022-23 season "was patched up the whole meet. And I don't know what condition it's in now, because it's just getting older. It's just deteriorated. So I believe that it has to be replaced. The patchwork they did was finished the last week of the meet, and it was supposed to be done at the beginning of the [last] meet."

Haire's points are well-taken. But to understand where things got interesting in this particular argument, you have to widen the lens to encompass the HBPA's 2 1/2-year-old legal quest to kill off HISA over alleged constitutional violations. Keep that court fight in mind when considering what Yother next suggested at that meeting:

"I have a recommendation that maybe we ought to ask HISA to come back in and take a look at the track, to maybe get a step ahead of some of the delays that we're encountering now," Yother said. "If we get HISA to send somebody in to look at the track [we can] see what's going to have to be done before anybody will be able to race, whether it be current owner, future owner, or whatever."

Yes, that's the president of an HBPA affiliate, whose own organization--plus its national parent and 11 other HBPA affiliates--have written in court documents that the HISA Authority functions like "a private police department" with sweeping powers that equate to "oligarchic tyranny," now calling upon that very same Authority to intervene when the AZHBPA needs an entity with federal clout to advocate for its own cause.

This unlikely juxtaposition of the AZHBPA asking the HISA Authority for help while it's simultaneously trying to eradicate that regulator and its enabling law would be stunning were it not overshadowed by the truly dire overall predicament that Arizona racing now faces.

### 'Notion' is 'Great' in Two States

Saturday's win by Witty in the \$100,000 Maryland Million Turf Sprint S. over 5 1/2 furlongs at Laurel Park extended an impressive streak set by Great Notion, the state's top stallion by progeny earnings every year since 2018 (and the leader so far this season). His offspring have now won at least one Maryland Million Day stakes in 14 runnings of that event, dating to 2010.

But the Maryland Million win wasn't even the biggest payday for a Great Notion-sired runner in a state-restricted stakes on Saturday. Later that evening, Coastal Mission splashed home by 5 3/4 lengths in the \$300,000 Sam Huff West Virginia Breeders' Classic at Charles Town. Despite racing beyond seven furlongs for the first time, the 4-year-old was pounded to 1-5 favoritism and delivered by wiring the field over the three-turn, nine-furlong distance.

Owned, bred and trained by Jeff Runco in partnership with his wife, Susan (Coleswood Farm), the win was the sixth straight for Coastal Mission. The gray has won nine of his last 10 dating to December, with all of the victories coming at Charles Town. His lone defeat was a fifth back in March when the gelding ventured to Laurel for a stakes engagement.

# THEY'RE AS HARD AS NAILS



A Woodbine Graded Stakes double for Hard Spun. Millie Girl takes the two-turn G3 Ontario Matron with a career high Beyer to become his 100th career worldwide Black Type winner.

And Spun Glass closes late to win the six furlong **G3** Ontario Fashion Stakes, her seventh (and biggest) triumph from 28 starts. **No stallion under \$100k can top Hard Spun's 23 Black Type horses in 2023.** Just imagine.



In West Virginia, he's scored in state-bred stakes, open allowances, and also in the open-company \$250,000 Russell Road S. last time out.

Coastal Mission's lifetime mark stands at 11-3-1 from 16 starts, with \$572,728 in earnings.

Bred, owned, and trained by Elizabeth Merryman, Witty is a 4-year-old half-brother to last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint victress Caravel (Mizzen Mast). She was also bred and initially trained by Merryman prior to joining trainer Brad Cox for owners Qatar Racing, Marc Detampel and Madaket Stables.

On Sunday, the 6-year-old Caravel just missed giving her dam, Zeezee Zoomzoom, two six-figure stakes winners on the weekend. She ran second as the odds-on favorite in the GII Franklin S. at Keeneland.


### **Jockeying for Graded Stakes**

Flavien Prat won that aforementioned Franklin S., closing the gap to one victory in the North American jockey race for most graded stakes wins in 2023. Heading into the lucrative Breeders' Cup championships, this battle is shaping up as a two-rider run-off, with Irad Ortiz, Jr., (36) narrowly ahead of Prat (35).

Through Sunday's races, the next closest jockeys are Juan Hernandez (24), Luis Saez (21), then Tyler Gaffalione and Joel Rosario (20 each).

Ortiz has ridden in 11 more graded stakes than Prat. Interestingly, Hernandez is the top percentage rider among the leaders, winning graded stakes at a 31% clip from only 77 chances (everyone else mentioned has ridden in at least 121 graded stakes).

Last year Ortiz topped Prat 50-42.





### Echo Zulu Has Another Good Day (cont. from p1)

"The surgery went very good," said Carpenter on Saturday after the surgery. "She's up and headed back to the barn. From this point on, we take it day by day. These cases are not out of the woods for the next four to six weeks but every good day is a day closer to a successful outcome."

In 2023, Echo Zulu won the GI Ballerina H., GII Honorable Miss H., GIII Winning Colors S. Her overall racing record was 11 starts, with nine wins and earnings of \$2,640,375.

Fiske said it was too soon to determine what happens next for the 4-year-old filly, trained by Steve Asmuseen.

"Too early to say," he said. "Steve will go out sometime in the near future to better assess the situation. Then we can look at our options. A lot will depend on when she is deemed able to travel."

### ARCANGELO TUNES UP FOR CLASSIC

Blue Rose Farm's star sophomore **Arcangelo** (Arrogate) continued preparations for his first start against older rivals in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Classic with a five-furlong drill in 1:00.00 (3/33) at Santa Anita Sunday. Trainer Jena Antonucci, in from New York to watch the work, clocked Arcangelo's final furlong in under :12. He galloped out an extra two furlongs, which Antonucci clocked in ":13 and change" for each furlong.

"It was a serious work. A pretty work," Antonucci said immediately after the drill. "I wanted sub-12 seconds the final furlong, which he gave me. I think I'm pretty spot-on with that. That's what he'll need to do on race day."

Ten days ago at Santa Anita, Arcangelo had his first local work when going five furlongs in 1:02.20. Antonucci said the 3-year-old ridgling will have one more work about 10 days ahead of the 1 1/4-mile Classic.

"We'll increase the pace of his gallops and just continue to do what we're doing," the trainer added. "For his final work, we'll see if we need to tighten something here or there, or if he needs more of a lung-opener."

Arcangelo moved to the head of the 3-year-old class with wins in the June 10 GI Belmont S. and the Aug. 26 GI Travers S.

Tony Ann, a 7-1 shot, outkicked heavily favored Caravel to the wire to earn the first stakes victory of her career in the GII Franklin S. at Keeneland Sunday. Caravel, who began a five-race win streak in last year's Franklin, broke from the rail and found herself chasing dueling pacesetters Twilight Gleaming (Ire) (National Defense {GB}) and B G Warrior (Run Away and Hide) through an opening quarter in :21.09. Tony Ann, who had raced just outside of the favorite early, fell back on the turn as Caravel attempted to reel in the pacesetters. Caravel looked to be spinning her wheels at the top of the stretch, as a resurgent Tony Ann swept to the lead. The champion battled back bravely on the inside, but could not get past Tony Ann.

"It felt like the pace was strong enough, and I was traveling really well behind Caravel, so I was pleased with my trip," said winning jockey Flavien Prat. "When I tipped her out, she responded really well. I was a bit worried by the sixteenth pole because Caravel came back on us, but she was really game. To go by Caravel you've got to go all out, but she was really game today."

Trained by California-based Phil D'Amato, Tony Ann was making just her third start of the year after opening the campaign with a runner-up effort in the July 28 Daisycutter S. going five furlongs over the Del Mar lawn. She headed east to be a close-up third after battling on the lead in the Sept. 9 GII AGS Ladies Turf Sprint S. at Kentucky Downs last time out.

Caravel, who followed her win in last year's Franklin with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, was suffering her second straight loss Sunday.

"The filly tried hard, but we just weren't able to get her head in front today," said jockey Tyler Gaffalione, who was aboard the beaten favorite. "The fractions were solid, very fast, but I was content with where I was. I think my filly really struggled with the ground a bit today."

Trainer Brad Cox said a return trip to the Breeders' Cup was still in the plans for Caravel.

"Good run, just came up a touch short," Cox said. "I am proud of the effort. She likes it here at Keeneland and ran another great race. Breeders' Cup is definitely still something we are pointing towards. We'll see how she comes out of this race and go from there."

Tony Ann's dam Never Ever is a half-sister to Grade I winner Cost of Freedom (Cee's Tizzy). She is the eighth graded stakes winner worldwide for her sire, Cairo Prince.





The first of back-to-back GI Breeders' Cup Classic winners retired to Spendthrift, Vino Rosso currently leads the U.S. freshman sire list and has had four individuals place in Grade I races in the last five weeks, including three on Oct. 7.

"Since he is a son of Curlin, we were fortunate enough to acquire the breeding rights to him in his 4-year-old year, and that's when he really began to take off," said Ned Toffey, general manager of Spendthrift. 



# ROUGET: 'IT'S MY PREMIERE PASSION TO BUY YEARLINGS, MAYBE MORE THAN TO TRAIN HORSES'

Always leave them wanting more, they say. In the case of Ace Impact (Fr) (Cracksman {GB}) there is little doubt that racing fans would have thrown wide their arms in joy had he stayed in training next year. Those closer to the business end of the stallion market will appreciate the fine line that had to be walked by Kamel Chehboub and his daughter Pauline in making their decision either to continue the racing career of the unbeaten colt they share with Serge Stempniak, or hasten his departure to their brand new stallion operation at Haras de Beaumont. In the end, heads trumped hearts, and while Ace Impact's retirement is racing's loss, it is also very much French breeding's gain. The man who had the most right to feel aggrieved at Thursday's confirmation of the end of Ace Impact's racing career is Jean-Claude Rouget, who first set eyes on him as a yearling at Arqana two summers ago, and has delivered a masterclass, from Cagnes-sur-Mer to the Bois de Boulogne, in how to train a top-class racehorse. Rouget, though, understands the demands of both sides of the industry all too well, and is magnanimous in regard to the decision that has been taken to stand Ace Impact in Normandy, where the trainer himself was born 70 years ago.

### JOB DONE FOR IRESINE IN THE CONSEIL DE

**PARIS** by Tom Frary

It was harder work than expected, but Bertrand Milliere's leading veteran Iresine (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}) ultimately made his class tell in Sunday's G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris. Held up with two behind early, the 11-10 favourite looked momentarily in trouble two out as Marie Velon asked him to close on the leaders. Staying on gamely in response, the G1 Prix Royal Oak and G1 Prix Ganay winner got to Marquisat (Ire) (Zarak {Fr}) a furlong later before asserting to score by a length. Trainer Jean Pierre Gauvin revealed that Iresine, who had been second on his first start since April in the G2 Prix Foy last month, has an important date in his diary now. "I was concerned to see him so far back, but also confident because he looked very relaxed and when he is like that the good Iresine can really quicken and make up ground," he said. Cont. p6

### Jean-Claude Rouget, cont. from p1

"I was very pleased to sell the share [in Ace Impact] to Kamel because he is very audacious and he is taking a lot of risk, and in France we need people like that," Rouget says in a pause between recruiting the next batch of yearlings at Tattersalls.

"I was very pleased that the horse was going to stay in France at stud. It's a wonderful opportunity for the breeders. I am not a breeder myself but I think about the French breeders always going to England and Ireland every year, and we need a better stallion roster than we have. We had Siyouni and Wootton Bassett but Siyouni is getting old and Wootton Bassett has left, so we need some young horses.

"I hope he will become a good stallion, but nobody knows. A new book will open."

The old book, let's call it the first in the series, was more novella than novel, but it was epic all the same. All we can do now is watch scenes from the story of the season on replay, and we are not alone in so doing.

"What I did the other night as I was trying to get to sleep was to review Ace Impact's six races in fifteen minutes," says Rouget, as much in awe of the horse as the rest of us.

"It was very interesting. He always had quality. Last year he was just asking me to give him time. He had very bad skin in the summer, which is not usual, so I decided to wait until the winter to start with him."

Lucky for Ace Impact that he was bought--at €75,000--by a trainer who has been around long enough to listen when a horse finds his own method of communication. Rouget is of course no stranger to success. In 1991, he set a French record with his 178 wins for the season, but quality has long surpassed quantity.

Three years after that, Millkom (GB) was his breakthrough star, from little heard-of provincial tracks to the big city, winning the Prix Jean Prat and Grand Prix de Paris and becoming the trainer's first runner in the Arc.

It took another quarter of a century for Rouget to win that race, but in the last few seasons his impression on the Arc has been emphatic, with victory for Sottsass (Fr) in 2020 followed this year by Ace Impact. In the interim he had a second and fourth with Vadeni (Fr) and Al Hakeem (GB).

It is the Prix du Jockey Club which Rouget can these days just about call his own, however. Since his first win in the Classic with Le Havre (Ire) in 2009--the year in which he became champion trainer for the first time, having also won the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and Prix de Diane with Elusive Wave (Ire) and Stacelita (Fr)--he has now won it six times. Ace Impact's track-record-breaking success in this year's Jockey Club may well go down as one of the most visually impressive of all time. He broke the hearts of supporters of Big Rock (Ire) as he sped past, gathering a head of steam as if propelled by slingshot from the back of the pack. This was the first time the wider racing world outside France had woken up to the colt's extraordinary talents, but Rouget was already firmly of the opinion that he had a good 'un on his hands.

Casting his mind back to January 26 and Cagnes-sur-Mer, he says, "We gave him a nice first race and he showed good acceleration. At that time it wasn't the same as we saw later in the year, but it was enough to win.

"After that we gave him two months because I knew we had to continue to give him time, expecting a good spring and summer. In Bordeaux he won well, he didn't have the best trip on the outside and he was pulling a bit, but he won easily. After that we started the process to make him into a Group 1 winner."

He adds, "We passed by Chantilly to show him the track. In the Prix de Suresnes he was blocked inside but again he won very easily and that was the confirmation that he was a very good horse."

Rouget, whose training career began in Pau in south-west France, has in recent years increased his satellite stable in Deauville. But he sensibly still steers the easiest route possible to the metropolitan tracks if he can. Of the decision to start Ace Impact at the seaside in the south of France, he says, "We had to choose a path: to run at two a couple of times or to start in March. To me, it's very difficult to start in March and to have a Group 1 horse. I did it with Valyra and she won the Diane two months later, but it is very rare.

"I prefer to give them experience and, to me, Cagnes-sur-Mer is a very good track. I used to send 30 or 40 horses every winter. I did the same with Raabihah. She should have won the Diane for me. She was a close fourth, and after [Cagnes] she won [a Listed race] in Longchamp."



He continues, "I consider running in January to be the same as running in November. I don't push my horses to start. First time out I want there to be no risk."

"Deauville is very interesting but I like Pau, I prefer to have the yearlings there, because Deauville is racetrack. Pau is a special training centre beside the racetrack.

"I think it is better for them to start in the provinces where racing is less strong at the beginning and you can give them one or two races to build their confidence. After that you can go to Deauville to try to win a Listed race. I prefer that route to starting in Longchamp or Deauville with a knife in their teeth."

Ace Impact brought his own weapon to his tussles at Chantilly, Deauville and Longchamp in his killer turn of foot. He retires as the European champion three-year-old of 2023, having blazed, comet-like, through a career which spanned a little over eight months.

He had been under the tutelage of Rouget and his team since the August of 2021, however. By then, his half-brother Alessandro (Fr) (Australia {GB}) had been second on three starts for Rouget, including in the Prix du Suquet on debut, the same race won by his sibling two years later on his own first visit to the races.

Rouget, then, was not entirely unfamiliar with the offspring of Absolutly Me (Fr) (Anabaa Blue {GB}). The 14-year-old mare is owned by German breeder Waltraut Spanner and resides at Barbara Moser's Haras du Long Champ--about as prophetic a birthplace for a future Arc winner as there could be.

Alessandro went on to win three races and finish second in a

Listed contest, while his younger brother moved between Pau and Deauville, his trainer just biding his time.

Recalling his impression of Ace Impact at the yearling sales, Rouget says, "It was his conformation. He was very pleasing to watch, and his dam was doing well."

Anyone who has seen the trainer in action at the sales will know that watching is what he does best. A regular presence ringside, he selects his own horses, and is analytical while accepting the blame if things

don't go to plan. Such a lesson in scrutiny would be well learned by prospective bloodstock agents.

"It's my premiere passion to buy yearlings, maybe more than to train horses," he says.

"I am very happy to choose my horses myself and to train them, and to understand why I did well or why I did badly. Year after year I watch what I bought and ask myself, 'why is this one no

good?' It's very interesting."

Rouget was among the buyers last week at Tattersalls, and he will certainly feature prominently at Arqana this week, a sale which is a home from home for him in Deauville. It will be hard to find one to match Ace Impact, but the trainer will not be deterred from trying to unearth a fledgling racehorse with similar qualities.

"He has a tremendous stride," Rouget says in attempting to pinpoint what set his newly retired star apart. "The same acceleration with a horse who

doesn't move as well as he does is less effective. But his allows him to go very fast; he is covering a lot of ground, with an engine, and as the year went on he became more and more impressive."

While he awaits the first offspring of Ace Impact at the sales, Rouget this year has had a chance to peruse yearlings by his first Arc winner, another home-grown French star, Sottsass.

"I try to stay neutral but I have to accept that his horses walk well and seem, like him, to have good minds," he says. "I have bought a few and Peter Brant will send me a few that he has bred. We will try to help Sottsass to become a good stallion."

In the meantime, Ace Impact has helped his trainer to become champion for the second year running, having snatched the title back from his arch rival Andre Fabre last year. Since Rouget's first championship in 2009, it has passed to and fro between the pair, with Rouget's impending coronation marking his fifth time at the top of the table. He says, "There has been a challenge between Andre Fabre and me for a long time, especially in the last four or five years. Before, he was always in front, but I beat him in 2009, and 2016 was for me the best year with plenty of good horses. For me, when I was a young trainer in Pau I couldn't even imagine that. I am very proud of it. Step by step we have built up the stable over 45 years."

Step by step, too, he built the career of the best racehorse we have seen in Europe this year, one which was shrewdly not started too early, but which finished all too soon. It was brief, he was brilliant, and boy did he make an impact.

Gauvin continued, "He always needs a race to be at his best and on his last run he was a bit too fresh and rusty after five months off. Marie's opinion is also important and she said it was the right Irsesine today."

"We want to travel with him now, we felt it was too early last year but he is now ready for that," he added. "We will go to Japan, because the JRA has been very nice to us and human relations are also an important part of this game and they have been very kind. They have allowed us to let Iresine travel with a stablemate, because travelling is not his forte. Even to come from our base in Lyon, he can be difficult so we worry for the long trip to Asia. Also the ground might be too quick for him, but it is a nice challenge and when you have to go you have to go."

Just a head separated Shagara (Ire) (Zarak {Fr}--She Bang {Fr}, by Monsun {Ger}) and Lady Mary (Ger) (Lawman {Fr}) when they ran second and third in last month's Listed Winterkonigin-Trial at Cologne, and it was a case of as you were as the pair fought out an exciting finish to Sunday's G3 BBAG Preis der Winterkonigin at Baden-Baden. Shagara had earlier defeated the reopposing New York City (Ger) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) over seven furlongs in her Aug. 19 debut at Mulheim and that rival provided an added boost to the form by finishing on the podium in this one-mile test. The eventual winner, sent postward as the crowd's 13-5 pick, raced in mid division during the opening exchanges and went through halfway in fifth. Bustled along rounding the home turn, Shagara made relentless headway in the straight to take a share of third entering the final furlong-where she received a hefty bump from Lady Mary--and kept on strongly under continued rousting to deny that rival by a head on the line for a career high. New York City held a slender advantage inside the furlong pole, but was usurped in the closing stages and finished 1 1/2 lengths adrift in third.

### TEOFILO'S ALESSIO ON TOP AT IFFEZHEIM

Gestut Ittlingen's **Alessio (Ger)** (Teofilo {Ire}--Alandia {Ire}, by Adlerflug {Ger}), who ran sixth in last term's G1 Deutsches Derby, stepped forward off a sub-par eighth in last month's G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte at ParisLongchamp to register a career high in Sunday's G3 The Land Trophy, formerly known as the Baden-Wurttemberg-Trophy, at Baden-Baden's Iffezheim venue. The 19-5 third choice was positioned in fifth passing the judge first time and improved one spot racing along the backstraight. Coming under pressure rouding the home turn, he was one of six in line on the front end--spread across the entire width of track--passing the furlong marker and was driven out thereafter to assert by 1 1/4 lengths from **Waldadler (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) in a thrilling climax to the 12-furlong contest. Ittlingen's **Enjoy The Moon (Ire)** (Sea The Moon Ger}) finished a

half-length back in third.

"We are having a great year, all the trainers and jockeys are doing an excellent job, and I am very grateful and overjoyed," commented Gestut Ittlingen's Manfred Ostermann. "Alessio is homebred, his family is one of our most traditional and highly successful damlines. His dam was [also] trained by Peter Schiergen and she is very well related, being a half-sister to the G1 Prix du Cadran winner Altano, so this is another great victory for the family and I am very thankful."

### **Pedigree Notes**

Alessio, who becomes the 63rd pattern-race winner for his sire, is the third of six foals and first black-type scorer produced by a dual-winning half-sister to three stakes winners headed by G1 Prix du Cadran hero and three-time G3 Oleander-Rennen victor Altano (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}). 

# FACTEUR CHEVAL TO THE QUEEN ELIZABETH II ON BRITISH CHAMPIONS DAY

Group 3 winner **Facteur Cheval (Ire)** (Ribchester {Ire}) will likely start next in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on British Champions S. Day at Ascot if the anticipated wet weather holds, Team Valor's Barry Irwin said Sunday. The 4-year-old gelding was most recently third behind Sauterne (Fr) (Kingman {GB}) in the G1 Prix Du Moulin de Longchamp on Sept. 3.

"It's the plan and he could run on any type of surface, but he's better with some give in the ground and the wetter the better, like when he won the [G3] Prix Perth at Saint-Cloud [last October]," Irwin said. "We have skipped some other races he could have run in waiting for the race next weekend figuring it would be really wet again."

"I think at this point we're looking at it as much, if not more, as a test to see how he handles that [quicker] going at this point of his life, as our goal next year is the G1 Dubai Turf [in March]. This will be a good test to see how he handles that type of track. That mile up the straight at Ascot is more like a mile and eighth and that's the distance of the Dubai Turf."

Formerly with Charlie Appleby, the blue-blooded Dancing Goddess was impressive on debut at Kempton on her sole 2-year-old start and second to Running Lion (GB) (Roaring Lion) back there in April before finishing fifth in Ascot's Royal Ascot Trials Day British EBF Fillies' Novice S. on her British finale in May. Starting her life in France with a six-length success in a mile conditions event at Compiegne last month, she followed Miss Cantik throughout and was able to master that stubborn rival approaching the furlong pole.

"She was facing a much stronger field today, but she had been quite impressive last time and we were hopeful," trainer Henri Alex Pantall said. "She doesn't show much in the morning and nine furlongs is probably as far as she can go, but she has a big heart and she loves a fight. There are very few group 3 races left and the trip in the Prix Fille de l'Air in Toulouse would be too far."

The winner is the first foal out of Winter Lightning, who captured the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas and was third in the G3 UAE Oaks and G3 Atalanta S. She is one of six black-type winners produced by Eastern Joy (GB) (Dubai Destination) alongside the dual G1 Dubai World Cup hero Thunder Snow (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}), Shamardal's G2 May Hill S. winner and G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Fillies' Mile-placed Intimal (Ire), Dubawi's G3 Mahab Al Shimaal winner Eastern World (Ire), the G1 Sun Chariot S. and G1 Falmouth S.-placed Always Smile (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and the G3 Oh So Sharp S. scorer First Victory (Ire) (Teofilo (Ire)). The latter was responsible for the ill-fated G1 2000 Guineas S. and G1 St James's Palace S. hero Coroebus (Ire), yet another Dubawi to star for the operation. Also from the family of the G1 Prix de Diane heroine West Wind (GB) (Machiavellian), who is the dam of the dual group 3 winner and G1 Turnbull S.-placed West Wind Blows (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), she also has an as-yet unnamed 2year-old filly by Galileo (Ire) and a colt foal by Frankel (GB).

THE FIRST DANCE (FR) (f, 2, Dariyan (Fr)--Lavande Violet (Ger), by Hurricane Run (Ire) recovered from an early bump to race in a handy fifth, but was shuffled back to seventh by halfway in this debut. Making headway on the outside once into the straight, the 52-2 chance was ridden to the fore approaching the furlong pole and ran on strongly to hold the rallying bid of Cornelienne (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}) by a short-neck. The First Dance is the latest of seven foals and third scorer produced by a dual-winning half-sister to five stakes performers including G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club-winning sire Lope De Vega (Ire) (Shamardal), G1 Prix de l'Opera third Lady Frankel (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and G3 Prix Andre Baboin victrix Bal De La Rose (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). Gaining her first black-type when runner-up in Clairefontaine's Listed Prix Luth Enchantee in July, Dancing Tango was third next time in the G3 Give Thanks S. at Cork in August and fourth in the Listed Prix des Tourelles at Saint-Cloud last month. Finding that bit extra for the breakthrough here, the homebred was forced to race in rear initially but gradually worked her way into the race from way back to swamp Azazat with half a furlong remaining.

"Things didn't really go to plan out of the gates--I was in there a long time and I'd planned to be in the first quarter if possible," jockey Dylan Browne McMonagle explained. "We knew she stays well and she handles this ground. I was a little bit sluggish away and the pace was strong for the first five or six furlongs even for the grade we were in. I let her find her feet and I knew she would come home well, it was just a matter of getting a clean run."

Dancing Tango's dam Dream Approach is kin to the G3 Silver Flash S. winner Cabaret (Ire) by New Approach's sire Galileo (Ire), who is responsible for the five-times group 1-winning dual Classic hero St Mark's Basilica (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) and the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Futurity Trophy-winning first-crop sire Magna Grecia (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Also connected to the G3 Park S. winner and G1 Moyglare S. runner-up Ugo Fire (Ire) (Bluebird) and the G1 Prix Vermeille heroine Pearly Shells (GB) (Efisio {GB}), her yearling colt Dancing Tiger (Ire) is by Starspangledbanner (Aus) while she also has a colt foal by Sottsass (Fr).

Curvature defeated subsequent G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille victrix Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) when shedding maiden status at Leopardstown in April, but was winless in four black-type starts since that three-length tally. Coming back off a third in last month's Listed Listowel S., she broke sharply from her central draw and led from flagfall in this one-mile test. The 13-2 chance turned the screw off the home turn and was driven out inside the final quarter-mile to hold William Haggas trainee Good Gracious for a pillar-to-post win and a career high.

"She loves that if she can get onto the lead and she's learning now," said Jessica Harrington. "She was too fresh in Listowel, as she hadn't run for a while, but today she was really good and it's great to get that big black type. She was only cruising in front, but it's a long way home here in the straight and she kept on really well."

Curvature, who becomes her sire's 121st stakes winner, is the third of six foals and first black-type scorer produced by a fullsister to G1 Prix du Jockey Club-winning sire Intello (Ger) (Galileo (Ire)). The March-foaled chestnut's dam Gravitee (Fr) (Galileo (Ire)) is a daughter of G2 Prix de Sandringham victrix and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix d'Astarte runnerup Impressionante (GB) (Danehill), herself out of G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest and G1 Prix de la Foret heroine Occupandiste (Ire) (Kaldoun {Fr}). Occupandiste has a quartet of stakes winners to her credit, which also includes GI Arlington Million and GI Woodbine Mile S.-winning sire Mondialiste (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), with this being the direct dam line of stellar producer Fall Aspen (Pretense). Gravitee has the unraced 2year-old filly Pulling Gravitee (Ire) (Kingman (GB)), a yearling colt by Wootton Bassett (GB) and a weanling full-brother to Curvature to come.

**3rd-Naas,**  $\in$  **120,000, Cond**, 10-15, 2yo, 7fT, 1:37.94, sf. KING CUAN (GB) (c, 2, Tasleet {GB}--Rutherford {Ire}, by Dutch **Art {GB})**, who took the six-furlong Goffs Sportsman's Challenge here last month, raced in mid-division early held out on the wing. Swooping on Duplantis (Ire) (Sir Prancealot (Ire)) with a furlong remaining, the 4-5 favourite held that 100-1 outsider's rally to take this valuable Irish EBF Auction Series Race Final by a head. "The race didn't go as smooth as I wanted--I thought they would go a bit more of a gallop and I was trapped wide," jockey Billy Lee said. "I just tried to keep it as simple as possible. I knew I was probably on the best horse in the race, he's cruised there and picked up to win well. He was just getting a bit lonely in front and on that ground you are never going to be ultraimpressive." The dam, whose filly by Kameko is catalogued in the upcoming Tatts December Foal Sale, is connected to Highdown (Ire) (Selkirk) who captured the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano and who was runner-up in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis. # THE CROWN FITS: LIBERTY ISLAND EASES HOME IN THE SHUKA SHO by Alan Carasso

Given a Yuga Kawada ride befitting a \$1.10 (1-10) mortal, Sunday Racing Co. Ltd.'s **Liberty Island (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) became the seventh filly to win the Japanese Triple Tiara with a deceptively easy one-length victory in Sunday's G1 Shuka Sho before a packed grandstand of better than 45,000 onlookers at Kyoto Racecourse. **Masked Diva (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}), the 12-1 third favourite, flashed home for second ahead of narrow second pick **Harper (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}).

Making her first start since smashing her rivals by six lengths in the 2400-metre G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Oaks) some 147 days ago, Liberty Island bounced away nicely from stall six and took up a position in and amongst rivals as the commonly owned **Kona Coast (Jpn)** (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) took them along over ground officially rated good, but perhaps riding softer given the clods of turf being kicked up. Leaving little to chance, Kawada had Liberty Island in about seventh position and in the

clear four or five off the inside passing halfway and the duo was committed to an overland run around the second bend. Asked to circle her rivals with 600 metres standing between her and history, Liberty Island quickly went to the leaders five or six deep on the swing for home, accelerated sharply to put a gap on them at the entrance to the final furlong and reported home a comfortable winner. Masked Diva closed off her final three furlongs in a race-fastest :33.5--Liberty Island was home in :33.6 --while Harper just got the better of a photo with **Dura (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) to earn a second Classic placing, having finished the distant runner-up in the Oaks.

"I'm grateful that we were able to achieve the Triple Crown," said Kawada, riding a 25th Group 1 winner on the JRA. "She is a horse with great ability, so I placed top priority on letting her run comfortably and finding a good path for her. I was confident of her victory when we had an open space at the third corner. She has great potential, and her dreams for the future are wide open, but first of all, I would like to praise her for achieving the Triple Crown."

Named champion of her generation after winning the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies last December, Liberty Island returned in the Apr. 9 G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) and looked to have it all to do in the straight, but rattled home to score a touch cosily. There were no such worries when last seen in the Oaks, as she was waited with until the final 200 metres before blowing the race apart at Tokyo. Should she have another run this season, options include the sex-restricted G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup going 11 furlongs at Kyoto Nov. 12 or a potential clash of the titans with Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) in the G1 Japan Cup two weeks late.

### **Pedigree Notes:**

The sadly departed Duramente joins Almond Eye (Jpn)'s sire Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) as sons of the late King Kamehameha (Jpn) to account for a Triple Tiara winner, while King Kamehameha was himself responsible for 2010 Triple Tiara heroine Apapane (Jpn). Duramente's daughter Stars On Earth (Jpn) was on a Triple Tiara bid of her own 12 months ago, but fell just short in third behind Sunday Racing's Stunning Rose (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}).

Yankee Rose, who cost just A\$10,000 at the 2015 Inglis Sydney Classic Yearling Sale before going on to become a two-time champion and dual Group 1 winner, was acquired privately by the Yoshida family and her progeny have excelled in the sales ring and at the races. Her first foal, the filly Romneya (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), fetched ¥210 million (US\$1.9m) from the latter's owner Makoto Kaneko as a foal at the 2019 JRHA Select Sale and her now 2-year-old colt by Lord Kanaloa was the second-dearest offering at the same event in 2021, selling to Danox Co. Ltd for ¥370 million (\$2.6m).

Yankee Rose is also responsible for a yearling Kizuna (Jpn) filly and a weanling filly from the first crop of Triple Crown winner Contrail (Jpn). Each has been retained by their breeder.
