Cody Dorman, the inspirational teen who was suffering with Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome and whose love affair with the two-time GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Cody's Wish (Curlin) warmed the hearts of everyone in the sport of horse racing, died Sunday while en-route from Santa Anita to his home in Kentucky.

STARS SET TO SHINE TUESDAY AT FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER SALE by Jessica Martini

LEXINGTON, KY- The Fasig-Tipton November Sale, which has surpassed \$100-million in gross the last two years, returns with another typically glitzy renewal Tuesday at Newtown Paddocks. Bidding on the first of 271 catalogued offerings begins at 2 p.m.

"We are very excited about the overall quality of the catalogue," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "I think our in-foal mares are definitely stronger than they've been in the past and we have some exceptional younger horses that are going to be offered. It's a tremendous group of young racing and broodmare prospects. The quality is really, really deep and we are very fortunate about that."

The one-session auction begins with a selection of 135 weanlings--down from the 181 weanlings catalogued to begin the sale in 2022.

"We actually made a conscious effort this year to tighten the weanlings," Browning said. "That's why there are fewer weanlings in the catalogue this year. You've got to have a really quality horse to sell well in November. It's the sale of the year and you're competing against some really top pedigrees and physicals. And the last thing we want to do is put somebody in the wrong spot."



The news was released by Godolphin on Monday morning in the form of an announcement from his parents, Kelly and Leslie Dorman.

The announcement read:

"We are heartbroken to share the news that our beloved Cody suffered a medical event on our trip home to Kentucky yesterday and he has passed away. On Saturday, Cody watched his best friend, Cody's Wish, display his usual perseverance and toughness in winning a second Breeders' Cup. Those are the same characteristics Cody has showed time and again for the 18 years we were blessed to have him. We have been

completely amazed to experience the impact Cody has had on so many people, through the journey that this wondrous racehorse has taken us all on. From Churchill Downs, to Keeneland, to Saratoga, to Santa Anita this weekend, we could not move 20 feet without someone stopping to tell us just that. "With Cody's diagnosis at birth, we always knew this day

would come, but we were determined to help Cody live his best

life for however long we had him. Anyone who has seen him at the racetrack, especially around Cody's Wish, understands that in many ways he taught us all how to live, always keeping a positive attitude and being more concerned about those around him than himself."


As a young teenager,
Dorman--who would have turned
18 next month--and his family
visited Gainsborough Farm in
Kentucky thanks to Keeneland
and the Make-A-Wish
Foundation. Despite the boy
being in a wheelchair, Cody's

Wish--at the time an unnamed foal--sniffed him and put his head in his lap, forming a bond between the horse and the boy that would last throughout the colt's career, which ended Saturday with his second Breeders' Cup win. *Cont.*


Following the news of Dorman's death, the Breeders' Cup issued the following statement:

Browning continued: "So some of the horses who may have sold OK in the past on the weanling side of things, we are tightening the selection criteria and as a result, we have fewer weanlings. I think buyers are still going to love the quality of weanlings that they are going to find overall."

The Breeders' Cup championship weekend at Santa Anita provided several updates to the Fasig-Tipton November catalogue, headed by champion **Goodnight Olive** (Ghostzapper),

who won her second GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint Saturday. The 5-year-old mare will be offered Tuesday as hip 237 through the Elite consignment.

Also making the flight from Santa Anita to Lexington following a Breeders' Cup appearance, Canadian Horse of the Year **Moira** (Ghostzapper) will be offered as hip 156 after her third-place effort in the GI F/M Turf. She is consigned by Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa. **Cont.**

The dams of a trio of Breeders' Cup runners-up will also be offered Tuesday evening, with **Belle's Finale** (Ghostzapper) selling as (hip 212) while carrying a full-sibling to GI Turf second-

place finisher **Up to the Mark** (Not This Time). The mare's weanling colt by Maxfield follows her into the ring. Both are consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

Hoppa (Uncle Mo) will be offered through the Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa consignment as hip 257 while carrying a full-sibling to GI Juvenile runner-up Muth (Good Magic).

Vigui's Heart (Quality Road), dam of GI Juvenile Turf Sprint runner-up Valiant Force (Malibu Moon), and in foal to Vekoma, will be offered Tuesday as hip

198. Her weanling filly by Mitole sells as hip 72. Both are consigned by Mill Ridge Sales.

Elite sales will present Toni Tools (Roaring Fever), dam of GI

Juvenile Fillies third-place finisher **Candied** (Candy Ride {Arg}) as hip 254, while Eaton Sales consigns a Tiz the Law weanling half-sister to GI Juvenile third-place finisher **Locked** (Gun Runner) as hip 15.

The glittering catalogue also features champions Nest (Curlin) (hip 163) and Wonder Wheel (Into Mischief) (hip 200), as well as GI Kentucky Oaks winner Secret Oath (Arrogate) (hip 180), and Queen Caroline (Blame) (hip 171), the dam of champion Forte (Violence), carrying a foal from the first crop of champion Flightline.

"We are very, very optimistic and very excited about the catalogue this year," Browning said.

While there has been some weakening at the lower strata of

the market, demand has remained strong at the top. Browning expects that to remain true in the November sale's elite marketplace, but did offer a cautious reminder to sellers. *Cont.*





The sire of Maxfield, McKinzie and Speaker's Corner has a 2023 juvenile crop full of future promise, including two G1 performers, five Graded or Stakes horses, plus the particularly impressive Otto The Conqueror, twice a winner at Churchill.

Sustained sales ring demand for his notably attractive stock, with a pair of \$500k yearlings at Keeneland.

"I think there is some insulation, hopefully, in the segment of the market that the November sale serves," Browning said. "I think it's going to be highly competitive, but I think we also need to be realistic as we look at the entire marketplace that the same trends that we saw at the yearling sales and 2-year-old sales are going to continue at the broodmare sales. You better have quality and if you don't have that top quality--if you have some holes in your produce or your covering date or your covering sire, you need to be very realistic as you approach setting your reserves and what your expectations are with regard to the overall marketplace in terms of broodmares. I think weanlings will be the same exact trend that we are seeing at the yearling sales--great, great competition for the ones that are deemed highly desirable and it will be a little weaker for those that don't 'make the mark.' So you're going to have to be realistic in setting your reserves and evaluating, do you sell this year or do you hold on until the yearling sales next year."

The Fasig-Tipton November sale surpassed the \$100-million mark in gross for the first time in 2021 when 149 lots sold for \$103,699,000. In 2022, the auction saw 169 horses sell for \$101,214,000.

Those sparkling results don't come without some added pressure, according to Browning.

"You go through it year after year--one of the good things and one of the bad things is, 'What do we do for an encore?'" Browning said. "It's always a nerve-wracking apprehensive sale

because there are a lot of expectations and there is a lot of pressure that we put on ourselves and that the owners expect us to deliver. It's a great opportunity and a great responsibility. Hopefully we will be sitting here on Tuesday night having a glass of champagne and celebrating another remarkable November sale."

The 2-year-old filly most recently finished seventh as the favorite in the GI NetJets Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies on Friday.

"Richard Mandella has informed us that Tamara came out of the Breeders' Cup with a small fracture of the splint bone in her left hind leg that will not require surgery," the post said. "She will get some much deserved rest as she recovers."

RYAN MOORE, IRAD ORTIZ, JR., PENALIZED FOR WINNING BREEDERS' CUP RIDES

Two of the planet's top jockeys, Ryan Moore and Irad Ortiz, Jr., were penalized by the Santa Anita Park stewards for riding infractions aboard winning mounts on the Nov. 4 Breeders' Cup program.

Moore was fined \$20,800 and suspended one day (Nov. 12) for being one whip strike over the limit of six when guiding 5-2 favorite **Auguste Rodin (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) to victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Under Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) rules, the fine equates to 10% of Moore's personal purse winnings from that stakes.

Cutting the corner for home with a deft rail run after looking hopelessly bottled up at the fence, Moore's winning ride on Auguste Rodin has been widely praised as one of the most brilliantly executed moves on the entirety of Breeders' Cup weekend.

Moore was also assigned three violation points that will be expunged from his record on May 5, 2024, or six months from the date of final HISA adjudication.


Ortiz was suspended three days (Nov. 12, 17, 18) "for failure to maintain a straight course in the stretch and causing interference" aboard 11-10 favorite **Goodnight Olive** (Ghostzapper), who successfully defended her title by winning the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint.

There was no stewards' inquiry posted after Goodnight Olive's win. The Equibase chart noted that Goodnight Olive "drifted in, taking the path of Society [Gun Runner] near the three-sixteenths pole" before she "quickly opened clear and held safely."

Moore and Ortiz, Jr., cont.

It was unclear at deadline for this story if Moore planned an appeal. After his Breeders' Cup engagements, he flew to Australia, where he was booked to ride in the G1 Melbourne Cup Nov. 7.

Moore is currently rated tops in points for the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities' World's Best Jockey rankings.

Ortiz's agent, Steve Rushing, told *TDN* that Ortiz is still weighing his options regarding an appeal.

"We're not sure yet. We spoke with a lawyer [Sunday]. We're going to make a decision either [later Monday or Tuesday]. It's a possibility, but we haven't decided yet," Rushing said.

Ortiz, currently North America's leading jockey in both purse winnings and victories for 2023, is in the midst of serving a three-day "careless riding" suspension (Nov. 5, 9, 10) imposed by the Aqueduct Racetrack stewards for an Oct. 22 bumping incident that resulted in a victory for Ortiz's mount.

PAT CUMMINGS Q&A: "OUR STRUGGLES ARE ENTIRELY COLLECTIVE" by Dan Ross

Late last month, owner Mike Repole announced the formation of the National Thoroughbred Alliance (NTA), an organization charged with providing emergency triage to an industry struggling with fiscal ill-health for quite some time.

For executive director of the NTA, Repole tapped Pat Cummings, who previously headed the Thoroughbred Idea Foundation (TIF), an organization focused on instituting change for racing's primary customers, the horseplayers and horse owners.

At a press conference for the NTA's launch, Repole discussed his intentions in broad over-arching terms that were light on specifics.

To put some meat to the organization's bones, the *TDN* spoke last week with Cummings.

It's clear that the NTA--only a few weeks into its infancy--is still very much a work in progress. Details are still light, but key areas of concern are swimming into focus.

Indeed, Cumming's comments reveal an approach to tackling the industry's ills similar in effect to the "Broken Windows" model of policing--in other words, focus on the important little details, and the bigger picture will invariably right itself. *Cont.*

The following is a heavily edited version of a much longer, more discursive conversation.

TDN: How would you describe the organization's overall mandate?

Pat Cummings: I think we could reasonably say this is probably the most challenging period in American racing history. When you put all the metrics together and look at everything else that

has changed beyond the business entertainment options, how consumers spend their discretionary income, the ease with which one can be entertained or wager is so dramatically different. But nearly every metric of the racing business is going in the wrong direction. Purses have grown. But I think everyone knows that the purses are coming from sources that have nothing to do with racing directly. It has everything to do with the other gambling businesses that have been created. I think

Pennsylvania is a great example of this.

In less than 20 years, over \$3.5 billion has gone to purses, but is the Pennsylvania horse racing industry better? Are the breeders really better? Are the owners there better, stronger? Is the product better? Is wagering? Purses have kept it going, but have they really helped change the trajectory of the business? I don't think so.

There is no one person to blame for our sport's issues. There is no one organization to blame. Our struggles are entirely collective.

Everyone wants change to happen faster. It hasn't been happening. So, is it possible that the NTA could create a vehicle to assist these many different types of organizations, these many different racing offices or racing operators? Create a resource that can help them facilitate change?

We want to fill gaps that currently exist--create some entities that are going to offer some immediate assistance to groups, tracks within the industry, to help them do things they haven't been able to do.

The blueprint for this is not drawn up. It doesn't exist. There is no history of having done this, right?

TDN: Are you bringing over any tactics from the Thoroughbred Idea Foundation?

The difference--and I don't want to compare everything to what we've done with Thoroughbred Idea Foundation--but if there is at all a modicum of context that we can use to position the NTA going forward, then take a look at what happened when one owner and some generous board members said, 'Pat Cummings, change things that haven't been changed before.'

As a result, bettors have received millions of dollars from betting on Kentucky racing [due to the breakage reforms within the state legislature] that they wouldn't have received already.

And that's essentially in perpetuity until someone decides to change a law again.

It can be done. You just have to figure out a creative way to do it. That was just one small change in one state. The impact can be so much greater with the opportunity to build a team which I didn't directly have with TIF. It was all very self-directed with Craig's [Bernick] investment and some of the board's assistance.

TDN: What industry sectors are you zeroing in on first?


Conceptually, everything must be on the table, right? Can you help in areas like racing office management? Can you help sales companies unify and improve their approach?

I've spent years focused on wagering and now, more than ever, I'm convinced that racetracks are not studying the performance of their customers. How are they doing? How are they doing relative to takeout rates? If they were studying that, our wagering menus should not look like they do today because our bettors are getting crushed. They're absolutely getting crushed.

We have had this conversation for years about the importance of takeout rates. But I have seen bettors in certain pools, some with very low takeout rates, at certain tracks in America where every customer except the high-volume bettors are monumentally worse off. Their return on investment is dramatically worse than the actual takeout rate.

We have driven our customers 'successfully,' tongue in cheek, to bets they're unlikely to win. And in a pari-mutuel wagering environment, that is devastating to building the business. The goal of the pari-mutuel betting operator should be to bring your customer back.

Pari-mutuel wagering is essentially a ticket to print money. If you can keep your customers happy, right, then keep them happy, keep them winning, *Cont*.

In other words, we need to rethink our approach to wagering and the wagering business.

You've got to change. You've got to look at your business in a different way. For racing, sales, breeding, education, marketing, aftercare and of course, wagering--we cannot be inhibited to try new things, obvious ideas, with a goal of improving outcomes for everyone.

It is impossible to be against that given our collective performance.

TDN: Is it primarily wagering that you're focused on?

No. Again, everything must be on the table. How much money is every stakeholder in the sport losing out on by having one fewer horse per race than we did 15 years ago?

We're averaging just over seven horses per race. What does total handle look like if we get to eight horses per race? How many starts does a horse lose per-year because their races didn't go this week, and didn't go the next week, or the week after?

Let's say I had a horse ready to go at peak fitness but our race didn't go until two weeks later. Almost regardless of where that horse finished, we may have missed the opportunity. If these delays happen two or three times a year, I may have missed multiple opportunities to run and potentially win.

So, can we find a way to introduce policies or help existing racing offices help the trainers find spots where their horses are going to run? Give them that extra start? If we can do that, we can present bettors with a more complete package.

We also need to institute a culture of transparency across the sport.

The American racing's equivalent of the referee does not get on the microphone and say, 'here's what happened. Here's the outcome. Have a nice day.' When they suspend a jockey, they don't go into public detail about why that suspension occurred. Those things need to be much more open and transparent.

Transparency encourages participation.

It's good for new owners and existing owners. Transparency keeps everyone motivated to do the right thing. Horseplayers want transparency to have more information--a more informed customer base carries tangible, financial benefits for everyone else associated with the sport. If anyone is against this, they are against growth and progress.

TDN: How is this going to differ from the Thoroughbred Idea Foundation?

This will be bigger--it is already bigger than TIF in terms of what it wants to accomplish.

Look, it's a very difficult thing to talk about one week into it, but what I was saying was, I think from the hot walkers to the

stallion deal makers, everyone in the business wants to see it improve--wants the financials to improve for everybody. That's part of it.

If you're not interested in growing the overall business, that's going to be a problematic position for us. And I think Mike has said from the start, 'if we're sitting down with people in the business, we're going to tell you here's who we sat down with. Here's who we talked to.'

So, everything we want, we believe is positive. It's going to increase the pie as opposed to increasing the fighting over a diminishing pie.

We've had decades of fighting over a smaller pie. That has to end. Let's focus on growing the pie for everyone. I'm thankful for everyone who has reached out so far, but I hope when we start returning calls or sending emails, that everyone is picking up and responding. I don't know how anyone could be against what we want to achieve.

TDN: What will your team look like?

Mike has said that we're looking to probably hire three to five people that'll be on board in a full-time capacity to help us to get this going. We may rely on a network of consultants to help with this, too.

Here's the reality. We're looking for good people who have an interest and a desire to improve the horse business and have some proven abilities. To have grown or to have driven growth and have proven to be able to think outside the box. Creativity will be key. If that's been done directly in the racing business or not, those are the people we seek to engage.

I've got a hundred resumes already. And I can honestly say I've probably looked at six or 10 just because of how busy it's been in these first few days. Post Breeders' Cup, we'll have a chance to really sit down, look at them. *Cont.*

TDN: What's going to make you stand out from the alphabet soup of organizations out there?

You could look at it and say, 'in 2018, what's going to make TIF different from any other organization?'

Well, we said we're here to research ideas and we want to execute them. How? Well, we said we're going to write some foundational papers that serve as the baseline for our advocacy, and then we're going to go out and advocate and we're going to find the right people that can help us execute this vision.

[To get the breakage reforms passed in Kentucky], we had a lunch with Adam Koenig, a [state] representative from Northern Kentucky, and with Damon Thayer, the Senate majority leader in Kentucky.

We had a lunch in Lexington. We just talked about it. That day wasn't the time to get anything accomplished. But three years later, the opportunity was there--as part of the reform package, a word was changed on breakage from the dime to the penny. That was the opportunity.

Ultimately, I would like to think it is creating and assisting change in areas that have not experienced any. If you're committed to the future of the sport, you should want to work with NTA. I hope racetrack operators come to us and say, 'please help us be better.' If they aren't coming to us yet, we will go to them. We have no choice but to be better.

TDN: How do you hope to navigate competing egos?

I don't think ego comes into the equation when survival is at stake. The question is, how are you going to get the big things right if we have so many little things wrong?

It's going to take a substantial effort by all the well-intentioned, dedicated players across our sport. Everyone must start focusing on their own areas and getting little things right first. The rest becomes easier after that.

WEANLING COULD JUSTIFY INAUGURAL GREEN HILLS CONSIGNMENT AT KEENELAND

Maria Sol Aller, who along with Murat Sancal, has been training, buying and selling racehorses for over a decade from their base at Elmendorf Farm, has taken the plunge and will be consigning under her own banner, Green Hills at Elmendorf, for the first time at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The fledgling consignment could get off to a flyer when it offers a weanling filly by Justify (hip 96) during Book 1 of the auction Wednesday in Lexington.

"We've been very busy. We have been buying around 60 to 65 horses a year at the November sale at Keeneland," Sol Aller said of the advent of the consignment. "Some of them were going to go racing and some, we were doing the quarantine [at Elmendorf] and exporting them out of the country, going to Europe, South America and mostly to Turkey. But this year, I decided to open the new consignment since we have such a big number of horses selling as well, to just to start selling on our own."

A bay weanling, hip 96 will be the first horse to go through the ring under the Green Hills at Elmendorf banner. The filly is out of **Primadona (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), a mare Sancal purchased for just \$37,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale.


Following his two-win day at the Breeders' Cup last Friday, there couldn't be a better time to be selling a daughter of the Triple Crown winner, Sol Aller agreed.

"We are super excited about her," Sol Aller said of the weanling. "She is beautiful. She is well-bred. And she is super nice and moves really nicely and she's extremely smart."

And the filly is already proving popular at the Keeneland sales grounds. *Cont.*

"She is showing a lot," Sol Aller said. "We started showing Sunday and she showed a lot yesterday and she has been out almost all [Monday] morning."

The success of the cross of Justify and Galileo mares makes the weanling even more appealing. Both GII Jessamine S. winner Buchu (Justify) and GI Dewhurst S. winner City of Troy (Justify) are out of Galileo mares.

"We think this pedigree is going to serve, not only American clients, but we also think that hopefully Coolmore and a lot of the European clients are going to be interested in her," Sol Aller

said. "We think she will be great for running in the States or overseas. She really looks like a runner."

Primadona won her lone career start for breeder Moyglare Stud and trainer Christophe Clement in 2011. She is a daughter of multiple group winner **Dress To** Thrill (Ire) (Danehill).

Sancal admitted he was surprised to be able to purchase the 15-year-old mare, with the filly in utero, for \$37,000 last November.

"The Keeneland November sale

has a lot of opportunities to buy nice horses at bargain prices from day one to the last day," Sancal said. "Knowing that, I really work hard to find this type of horse for my clients. When they show up, it's time to buy. Primadona was one of them. She is a lovely Galileo mare who was in foal to Justify and I knew some nice horses were in training on this cross. My clients had a budget for her around \$150,000, but bidding suddenly stopped at \$37,000--which I was very happy about. Now Primadona has produced this beautiful-looking filly that will stand out nicely at the sale. We love her personality so much that it will be very hard to say goodbye after the sale."

Sol Aller first found her love of horses working with Polo ponies in her native Argentina, but it was when she first came to Kentucky 15 years ago that she found her true passion.

"When I came to Keeneland for the first time, I just never left," she said. "I completely fell in love with the Thoroughbreds. Even though I had a polo background in Argentina, I just fell in love with how smart Thoroughbreds are. It's just a pleasure to be able to work with them. I started at zero, prepping horses for the sales and things like that, down at the bottom."

She met Sancal through mutual friends and eventually the two formed a like-minded partnership.

"We became great friends," said. "Then Murat decided to start training on his own--he had been working for someone else. He decided to go out on his own and he asked me if I would help him out. And I said yes. So I started to work with him as an assistant trainer at the track."

The two maintain strings both in Kentucky and Florida and switch off taking care of both, while balancing purchasing and selling horses on behalf of overseas clients. While Sancal stays busy with clients during sales time, Sol Aller decided it was time to start her own outlet to sell horses.

Asked if there was pressure in starting her own consignment,

Sol Aller said, "Yes. But I am also pretty excited. This has been super fun. And it's been a great experience. I am meeting a lot of new people and talking to a lot of new clients. At the same time, we care about doing the best for the clients and for the horses. So I am really excited about doing this and I hope it works out for all of them."

Green Hills at Elmendorf will offer 35 horses at the Keeneland November sale and plans to have consignments at the Keeneland January Horses

of All Ages Sale in a couple of months.

How will Sol Aller balance training and consigning, along with all the other facets of the partners' business?

"That is a good question," she said with a laugh. "Step by step. You know how it is in horse racing, we will go day by day and go from there. Always work, prayer and hope for the best."

The Keeneland November sale opens Wednesday with a single-session Book 1 section beginning at 1 p.m. The auction continues through Nov. 16 with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

I GOT IT WRONG, CODY'S WISH IS HORSE OF THE YEAR by Bill Finley

What I wrote in Monday's TDN, that Idiomatic (Curlin) should be Horse of the Year, well, never mind.


It took the tragic news of the passing of Cody Dorman for me to wake up and realize that while Idiomatic had a terrific year, voting for her for Horse of the Year would mean not voting for Cody's Wish (Curlin), and what a mistake that would be.

Everything I had to say about the on-track credentials of the two remains the same. Both won a Breeders' Cup race, both won three Grade Is during the year. But I argued that Idiomatic's overall body of work gave her the edge over Cody's Wish and everyone else. She won eight of nine races and was on top of her game from January through Breeders' Cup day. In an era where most trainers and owners are happy to get four or five races from their horses during a year, what she accomplished was remarkable.

I still maintain that she had a better year than Cody's Wish. Just slightly so, anyway. What I failed to realize is that sometimes what happens on the racetrack is not all that matters, that it's ok to vote with your heart.

Cody's Wish had a Horse-of-the-Year campaign. Coming into the Breeders' Cup, he had won the GI Churchill Downs S, the GI Metropolitan H., the GII Vosburgh S. The only defeat came in the GI Whitney S., where, trying nine furlongs for the first time in his career, he was out of his element. I didn't think he would win Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. He just not as good around two turns as he is around one and I thought that, this year, that would prove to be his undoing. But he won the race again. In 2022, it was by a neck. This year it was by a nose. He was in race that is not in his comfort zone, but he won it anyway. He won it on class.

But the story is so much bigger than the Dirt Mile. Cody's Wish and Cody Dorman, who passed away Sunday at age 17 on his way back to Kentucky from Santa Anita, will forever be linked. We first met Dorman last year when the media latched onto his story. Cont.

New York State recently adopted new rules that expand the reach of the New York-bred awards and benefits by clarifying a pathway for non-resident mares to gain residency status. According to the rule changes, a non-resident mare purchased in foal through public auction is deemed a resident mare provided the mare is purchased for at least \$50,000 in the public auction; is present in the state of New York within 15 days after a sale in North America and 60 days at any public auction sale abroad; the foal is foaled in New York; and the mare thereafter is continuously in residence in New York from within 120 days after her last cover in the year of conception of another foal and remains in residency until foaling.

Cody's Wish Horse of the Year? cont.

Born with Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome, he first met Cody's Wish as a then-unnamed yearling while touring Godolphin as part of a Make-A-Wish outing.

We don't really understand how it happens, but we know that it does. Sometimes something magical happens when horses and humans befriend one another. The weanling acted as if he knew Dorman would was having a hard time of it and could use a friend. Gentle as a puppy, he nuzzled Dorman and then put his head in his lap.

Two years later, Dorman was not doing well. It got to the point where his parents feared he was losing the will to live. The antidote? Another visit to the farm to see the horse the Godolphin team had now named Cody's Wish. The two picked right up where they left off. From there, Dorman became Cody's Wish's biggest fan. He traveled to many of his races and was there for both Breeders' Cup wins. Tears rolled down his cheeks when his namesake won. His parents have said that his love affair with the horse led to a marked improvement in his outlook on life.

Horse racing has been beaten down by so many negative stories of late, mainly ones that involve horses dying on the track, and it needed something to pick its collective head up. And here comes Cody's Wish and Cody Dorman, a story that was so inspirational, so uplifting that everyone, even the most cynical among us, was moved, often to tears.

"This heartfelt story has touched the hearts of many in and outside of the Thoroughbred industry," Dan Pride, chief operating officer of Godolphin, said in a statement. "And while Cody's passing has saddened us, we find comfort in knowing that Cody found many joyous moments during this journey with his best friend, Cody's Wish. Our hearts are with the Dorman family."

We cheered every time Cody's Wish won, and not because we had a bet on him but because we knew what this horse was doing for a young man born with a syndrome that had to have made his life immensely difficult. We cheered because we knew this story made everyone feel better about a sport that was going through trying times.

So, should that matter when it comes to voting for Horse of the Year? Absolutely. There's no reason why we shouldn't look beyond the x's and o's of what happened on the racetrack and look at the bigger picture, take into account what made us smile, what moved us, what made for a good story.

When **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) was named Horse of the Year in 2010 over **Blame** (Arch), I was on the losing end of that argument, voting for **Blame**. They had met once and **Blame** had beaten her in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Why didn't that mean he should have been named Horse of the Year and not Zenyatta? Looking back, I now get it. Zenyatta had had one of the most remarkable careers we have seen this century and one defeat shouldn't have erased everything else she accomplished and what a feel-good story she had been. Those who voted for her realized this was bigger than just the one race.

Though different, Cody's Wish and his story is much bigger than Zenyatta. We will see other great race horses, ones as good as Zenyatta. But we will never again see a story as special as the one that was the bond between a very good race horse and the young man who thrived in his presence.

That matters. It matters a lot. Cody's Wish is your Horse of the Year.



Wagering on U.S. races, available and paid purses, as well as the total number of racing days, all saw declines to varying degrees during the month of October, according to information released by Equibase on Monday.

Total wagering of \$818.9 million on races during the month represented a 9.34% decrease over the same period from 2022, while available purses of \$108.5 million were down by 10.43%. The figure of \$104.2 million for paid purses in October was down 10.81%, while the total number of race days dropped from 332 to 317 (4.52%). Average field size in October was slightly up over a year ago, however, and checked in at an average of 7.77 runners, an increase of 2.12%. Average daily wagering was down by 2.76% to \$2,583,574 and the average available purse number per race day was down 2.75% to \$342,502 from the figure of \$352,224 in 2022.

For the first ten months of 2023, wagering on U.S. races declined 4.70% to \$9.948 billion and the available and paid purse money dropped slightly by .49% and 0.92%, respectively. Average daily wagering of \$2.93 million was also down fractionally by .08% while average available purses per race day increased by 8.55% to \$324,317.

SEVEN DAYS: BREEDERS' CUP SEES OUT THE SEASON IN STYLE

So long has this column been disrupted by sales and travel that this final instalment for a Flat season that seems to have whizzed by faster than ever should perhaps be renamed 28 Days. That's not to say that we are giving you four times the value, however.

The last week or so has been spent in California at the 40th running of the Breeders' Cup. Any racing event which draws some of the best racehorses from a variety of nations is a treat, and with its 14 Grade 1 races, the Breeders' Cup is the leader in this field.

Bill Mott held the bragging rights across the two days, winning the Juvenile Fillies with the elegant Just F Y I, one of two Grade 1 winners on the first day for Justify, followed by a double on Saturday. Of Mott's three winners, Cody's Wish, very much now the 'people's horse' in America, was the one who brought the house down when the stewards announced that the result would stand. The tragic postscript to this magic finale to Cody's Wish's career was the death the following day of Cody Dorman, for whom he was named and who has played such a major role in this extraordinary story. FRANKEL RAISED TO £350,000, JUDDMONTE FEES ANNOUNCED

Frankel (GB), who is set to become champion sire for the second time at the end of this year, has had his fee increased to a career high of £350,000 for 2024. Along with Dubawi (Ire), this makes him the joint-highest-priced stallion in Europe.

Juddmonte has released the fees for its five European stallions, with Kingman (GB) remaining unchanged at £125,000 after a year in which his leading runners have included the top sprinter Kinross (GB) along with French Group 1 winners Sauterne (Fr) and Feed The Flame (GB). Kingman covered 157 mares last year, while Frankel was sent 196.

This season's 2,000 Guineas winner Chaldean (GB) joins his sire Frankel at Banstead Manor Stud and will be introduced at a fee of £25,000. The roster stalwarts Oasis Dream (GB) and Bated Breath (GB) will stand for £15,000 and £10,000 respectively. Simon Mockridge, general manager of Juddmonte UK, said, "[This year] has been another outstanding season for the Juddmonte stallions." Cont. p5

Breeders' Cup Recap, cont. from p1

To Cody's parents, Kelly and Leslie, and sister Kylie we offer our sincere condolences.

The horse's stable-mate Elite Power later effectively brought up a double-double in the final race of the Breeders' Cup, as both he and Cody's Wish were winning their Breeders' Cup races for the second year running. Those two sons of Curlin retire now, respectively to Juddmonte and Darley.

From a European perspective, this year's meeting had a bit of

everything. We're accustomed to seeing the major stables represented around the world, and indeed, Aidan O'Brien took home two gongs, courtesy of Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact (Jpn)) and Unquestionable (Fr) (Wootton Bassett (GB)), while John Gosden joined in with the mighty Inspiral (GB) (Frankel (GB)), and Charlie Appleby maintained his extraordinary 50 per cent strike-rate at the Breeders' Cup when Master Of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) got the better of Mawj (Ire) (Exceed

And Excel (Aus)) in a Godolphin-dominated photo-finish for the Mile.

The participation of the smaller stables of Mick Appleby and Adam West brought an extra level of interest, however, and there was a collective rooting for their runners. Big Evs (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}) got the meeting off to the best possible start for the visitors, and while Live In The Dream (Ire) (Prince Of Lir {Ire}) couldn't quite sustain his blistering early pace, he still ran with great credit in fourth.

Speaking to Matt Chapman afterwards, Adam West's disappointment was palpable and moving. "The most expensive horse in my stable cost £24,000," said the Epsom trainer, and how he and others must look on in frustration at the yearling sales to find that expensive lot after lot is sent to one of the super-stables.

That's not to denigrate the success of those trainers of large strings, of course, but it really would be a breath of fresh air to see the equine population spread about a bit. At the very least, it increases the potential storylines in the sport no end, as the interest in Live In The Dream and Big Evs at Santa Anita showed.

One final point to make is that the Breeders' Cup commenced with an air of trepidation. At Santa Anita in the week building up to the event, the deaths of potential runners Geaux Rocket Ride and Practical Move, from a fracture in training and a suspected heart attack, cast a shadow.

There was already intense veterinary scrutiny on the track and in the barns each morning, and all Breeders' Cup runners were inspected on race morning, leading to the withdrawals of Juvenile Turf favourite River Tiber (Ire) and Juvenile Turf Sprint contender Givemethebeatboys (Ire) among others on Friday morning. This understandably caused some upset for those horses' connections, and it will mean that trainers think carefully before sending horses to major events. Witness the fact that

there are only three European-trained runners in the Melbourne Cup when once there would have been up to four times that number.

The enhanced scanning and veterinary protocols add to the uncertainty, but if they save even one horse, and the worldwide reputation of horse racing in the process, then they are worthwhile and to be welcomed. We all know that we cannot completely vanquish the element of risk involved in the sport, but we must do all we can to minimise injuries and, in the

worst cases, fatalities.

Menuisier's Cross-Channel Success

One of the trainers that owners really should be taking notice of is David Menuisier. The Frenchman is probably tired of answering questions as to why he would train in England when the prize-money in his native country is so much better, but his trips home with runners should be enough to show that it doesn't matter where he is based.

Menuisier pulled off this latest Group 1 success on October 22 with Sunway (Fr) (Galiway {GB}) in the Criterium International. The full-brother to Haras de Beaumont stallion and G1 Champion S. winner Sealiway (Fr) races in a partnership which includes his breeder Guy Pariente, Thomas Lines and Qatar Racing. Cont.

The champion breeder in France in 2021, Pariente is never far away from the top of the table, and he looks to have something of a golden touch when it comes to recruiting less-than-obvious stallions to his Haras de Colleville in Normandy. The Group 1-winning brothers, whose sire Galiway stands at Colleville, are out of a mare by another of the stud's residents in Kendargent (Fr), the horse who put the farm firmly on the map.

Galiway, by Galileo {Ire}), is a stallion worthy of close inspection. His eight group winners include the versatile Vauban (Fr), a Group 3 winner on the Flat and multiple Grade 1 winner over hurdles. By the time you read this, the Willie Mullins-trained Vauban may also be a Melbourne Cup winner.

Returning to the achievements of Menuisier, Sunway's Group 1 win was backed up on the same day by his stable-mate Caius Chorister (GB) (Golden Horn {GB}) scoring in the G3 Prix Belle de Nuit. Five days later the trainer returned to France to claim another stakes double, winning the G3 Prix Miesque with Tamfana (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) and Listed Prix Isonomy with War Chimes (Fr) (Summer Front).

He has at least three classy juveniles to keep him dreaming through the winter, while the progressive Caius Chorister, bred by the effervescent Clive Washbourn, looks as though she should be a major player in top staying contests next year.

Anything You Can Do...

While Justify has received a number of column inches for the success of his runners this year, which include the Group/Grade 1 turf winners City Of Troy, Opera Singer and Hard To Justify, and Grade 1 dirt winner Just F Y I, his fellow Triple Crown winner American Pharoah also deserves some plaudits.

On Saturday, he was responsible for the G1 Victoria Derby winner Riff Rocket (Aus), one of five top-level winners on the turf for American Pharoah, who has another three Grade 1 winners on the dirt. Bred by Debbie Kepitis, who co-owns Winx (Aus) and is the daughter of former Woodlands Stud owner Bob Ingham, Riff Rocket is the first Group 1 winner in the southern hemisphere for Coolmore's American Pharoah, who shuttled for four seasons from 2018. Another result of note down under over the weekend was the victory of Japanese-trained Obamburumai (Jpn) (Discreet Cat) in the Golden Eagle at Rosehill. As a relative newcomer to the calendar, the Racing NSW spoiler for Racing Victoria's Derby Day, the Golden Eagle is not a Pattern race but it is valuable. The purse on Saturday was A\$10 million, with the winner receiving A\$5,250,000.

Three-year-old Obamburumai, trained by Keiji Yoshimura, was beaten just over a length on his previous start when third in the G1 NHK Mile Cup in Tokyo. He also won the G2 Keio Hai Nisai S. on the same weekend 12 months ago. This time around, that contest was claimed by Corazon Beat (Jpn), who on Saturday became the first group winner for his freshman sire Suave Richard (Jpn). The son of Heart's Cry, who stands at Shadai, won the Japan Cup at the age of five under Oisin Murphy and had also been runner-up in the Japanese Derby. He has been represented by 17 individual winners so far this year.

The Japanese team went home empty-handed from the Breeders' Cup, though Derma Sotogake (Jpn) (Mind Your Biscuits) was a running-on second in the Classic on his first start since finishing sixth in the Kentucky Derby, and Shahryar (Jpn) brought up the one-three for his sire Deep Impact (Jpn) in the Turf when finishing a length and a quarter behind Auguste Rodin.

Europe's Loss, Japan's Gain

In the coming weeks, Japan will be welcoming to its stallion barns three European Group 1 winners, two by Frankel (GB) and one by Sea The Stars (Ire).

Between them, Adayar (Ire), Westover (GB) and Hukum (Ire) have won a Derby, Irish Derby, two King Georges, a Coronation Cup and a Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. They retire at a time when Shadwell already has Hukum's full-brother Baaeed (GB) at stud and are about to welcome Mostahdaf (Ire) (Frankel {GB}). Juddmonte already has a Classic-winning son of Frankel of a more commercial bent in Chaldean (GB) retiring to stud, and Dalham Hall Stud is now home to new recruit Triple Threat (GB), a Group 1-wining miler by Frankel, meaning that Westover and Adayar are also somewhat surplus to requirements at what might have been their respective homes in years without such an intake of new sires.

Japan's recruitment of top stallion prospects from Europe is nothing new, and it is worth reflecting that current superstar Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) is out of a mare who has the Arc winners Dancing Brave and Tony Bin (Ire) as her two grandsires. Furthermore, his imported third dam is by the dual Arc winner Alleged (who did not stand in Japan). Classy middle-distance performers remain an easier sell to breeders in Japan, and often with guite spectacular results.

"A season which sees Frankel poised to win his second champion sire title in the last three years and a year where the Juddmonte roster was the leading stallion farm at Royal Ascot.

"Kingman closes 2023 as the sire of more three-year-old stakes winners than Frankel, Into Mischief, Galileo and Dubawi. Significantly, Frankel and Kingman, who currently sit first and third in the European sires' list, are responsible for 64 individual stakes winners between them in 2023 alone. Of these, 39 are group winners, with 14 of them winning at the highest level, further consolidating their positions as two of the world's elite stallions."

He added, "The roster has been further strengthened by the exciting addition of Frankel's most precocious son Chaldean. His physique, conformation, and Classic credentials should give him every opportunity to succeed. We look forward to welcoming breeders to the farm to view the stallions by appointment."

Newsells Park Stud will increase the fee for Nathaniel (Ire) to £17,500 from £15,000 thanks to a strong year which included two new Group 1 winners: Poptronic (GB) and G1 Goodwood Cup victor Quickthorn (GB). The son of Galileo (Ire) had a busy covering season in 2023 with 165 mares sent his way.

Without Parole (GB), who is set to have his first juvenile runners in 2024, will stand for £8,000, and A'Ali (Ire) remains at £5,000 for his third season. All are Special Live Terms.

CLASSIC WINNER MAWJ TO WINTER IN DUBAI

Classic winner Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) will be prepared for a winter campaign in Dubai, trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. The 3-year-old filly, who won the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket in May and the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland last month, finished second in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Mile behind Master of the Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"She ran a huge race and we thought she was going to win, but she was beaten by a good horse, also a Godolphin horse, and I'm happy for Charlie [Appleby]," bin Suroor commented. "Our filly is tough and hard and it was the first time she ran with the colts. She proved herself good enough to be with them."

"Oisin [Murphy] gave her a very good ride, he did everything right and she ran a huge race. Now she is going back to Dubai and we'll try and find a race for her, maybe the [G1] Jebel Hatta and then the [G1] Dubai Turf. After that we'll find races for her in the UK and Europe. I think a mile is her best trip, but sometimes it can be hard to find races for her. I know she won over nine furlongs at Keeneland, but at the mile I think she is at her best."

Lion's Pride, runner-up in a May 9 Newcastle maiden on debut, defeated stablemate and subsequent Listed Noel Murless S. victor Middle Earth (GB) (Roaring Lion) when breaking through here in July and ran third contesting Windsor's Aug. 26 Listed August S. on black-type bow in his penultimate start. He posted another third in Newmarket's Sept. 29 Listed Godolphin S. last time and took his venue record to two-for-two with a dominant display for a career high. Stalking the pace in a close-up second for the most part, the 10-3 chance loomed large off the home turn before seizing control approaching the two pole and stayed on strongly under late urging to comfortably hold the hitherto undefeated Measured Time by 2 1/4 lengths.

"They went a solid pace without going overly quick and, coming off the bend, he quickened up twice pretty well and put the race to bed," commented Thady Gosden.

"It was a solid race on paper, but he's a horse we've always liked and has always had plenty of talent. He should do it back on turf. He's a horse with a good, low action and he likes top of the ground, so hopefully we can find some of that. We'll discuss everything with [owner] Mr Oppenheimer, but there's options here for him and also options abroad, so we'll see what suits him best."

Lion's Pride becomes the fifth black-type performer out of a winning full-sister to G2 Hardwicke S. and G2 Jockey Club S. victor Bronze Cannon (Lemon Drop Kid) and GIII My Charmer H. victrix Valiant Girl (GB) (Lemon Drop Kid).

The April-foaled homebred is a half-brother to G1 Gold Cupwinning stablemate Courage Mon Ami (GB) (Frankel {GB}), G3 Pinnacle S. and G3 Princess Royal S. placegetter Crimson Rosette (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), G3 Neville Sellwood S. second Astronomos (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) and Listed Wild Flower S. runner-up Purple Ribbon (GB) (Gleneagles {Ire}). His dam Crimson Ribbon (Lemon Drop Kid), herself a daughter of Listed Prix Coronation third Victoria Cross (Ire) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}), is also kin to G2 King Edward VII S. victor Across The Stars (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and Listed Washington Singer S. runner-up Valiance (Horse Chestnut {SAf}).
