MARK TAYLOR REFLECTS ON CLOSE OF ANOTHER NOVEMBER SALES SEASON

After wrapping up the annual whirlwind doubleheader between the Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November breeding stock sales, Mark Taylor has a lot to be grateful for as he reflects on another successful year for the Taylor Made Sales consignment.

Taylor Made was the leading consignor at both auctions, with 35 horses sold at Fasig-Tipton for \$22.965 million and 262 sold for over \$22.8 million at Keeneland. While the Lane's End consignment beat Taylor Made out for the title last year at Keeneland by a little under \$500,000, Taylor Made was back on top this year for the 26th time since 1987.

"Our market share at Fasig-Tipton was 22.8%, which is pretty healthy for us, and our market share at Keeneland was 12.5%," said Taylor, the President and CEO of the eminent leading sales consignment. "It's really a testament to our great team. I think the Taylors have surrounded themselves with really talented people, many of whom could have their own consignments if they wanted to but they prefer to stay on our team under our umbrella. Then we have awesome customers who have been with us in many cases for decades. It's not about Taylor Made or our horses or anything like that, it's about the customers and you've got to help them find success to continue to receive their support." **Cont. p3**

Mark Taylor Reflects on Close of Another November Sales Season *(cont. from p1)*

At Fasig-Tipton, Taylor Made's highlights included the \$3.2-million sale of champion Wonder Wheel (Into Mischief), selling three Grade I producers for seven figures, and offering two of the top three highest-selling weanlings. At Keeneland, the consignment sold the top-selling foal, a \$750,000 **Gun Runner** colt that went to Shadwell Racing.

Of course, not everything was rosy as numbers were markedly down in many segments of the market. The polarization that has been a common narrative in recent years was once again a salient theme as the last major sales of 2023 came to a close.

"It's been going on for a long time, but I do think that it was more evident and that there was some correction this year as we got into the breeding stock sales," said Taylor. "There were definitely a lot more mares going through pregnant to popular first-year or second-year stallions or popular proven stallions that you could buy for the stud fee. I was shocked. One of our customers reacted quickly and went in there and bought six mares all in foal to nice horses roughly for their stud fees. If they're good-looking foals, these foals could be bring \$150,000 a piece and they were buying the mares for \$30,000 or \$40,000."

In a buyer's market, any extra help that a consignor could provide for their clients might go a long way. Taylor said he was proud of how his team responded to the added challenge.

"We've got all the Taylor brothers, plus we've got eight Thoroughbred advisors that are all working synergistically to help each other get our horses sold," he explained. "We were actually up 23.3% versus last year at Keeneland and 5% at Fasig. I think that in a little bit of a tricky market, that's where we really shine because we have a lot of people to hustle horses. The market is adjusting and we can help adjust reserves too. I think that's where our size can be a real asset in a lot of situations."

With a buy-back rate of 24.9% at Fasig-Tipton and 21.99% at Keeneland, sellers were judicious as they set reserves, but there was still plenty of demand as the RNAs-to-sales activity doubled at Keeneland compared to last year.

Taylor said that their team has been busy selling horses long after the last offering went through the ring.

"There was a mare from Fasig-Tipton that we sold just this week for \$275,000," he reported. "Sometimes the word RNA is like a dirty word. Nobody wants to talk about it. But within Taylor Made, we're okay with it. Sometimes the horse was just in the wrong part of the sale and it got overlooked and then two days later, it looks like a star."

Like several consignors have noted, Taylor said that many of their clients that normally sell their foals as weanlings held onto their higher-end offerings to sell next year. **Cont.**

"There's one of our big customers, and they're some of the best breeders in America. For decades, a staple of their program was selling a large percentage of their best offspring as weanlings. They still sold some very good ones this year--they had one sell for \$750,000 at Keeneland--but in general, those ones that maybe were going to go for \$150,000 or \$250,000 as weanlings, they said, 'With the way the market is going, the best way for us to maximize our sales crop is to hold onto those.'

"Let's say you're a relatively small breeder," he continued. "You breed six to eight foals a year and you've got one that is the star of the show. That's your home run potential that could pay for all the others. The other ones are going to pay the bills, but your profit is going to be what that one horse brings. Even if you have a great sale for a weanling and it brings \$300,000, if somebody turns around and gets \$750,000 for it the next year, for some of these breeders that's just money they can't afford to lose."

Taylor predicted that the pinhookers who jumped at opportunities at Fasig-Tipton or early on at Keeneland will be rewarded.

"I don't think that the pinhookers really understood that they were going to run out of quality sooner than they typically do," he said. "I thought that there were some horses in Book 1 that people made good buys on. They seemed like they paid a lot at the time, but if that same horse would have been in Book 3, it probably would have brought more because there just weren't that many weanlings with pedigrees left. It was an interesting dynamic. I think that the pinhookers will adjust next year and maybe be a little bit more aggressive at Fasig. There were probably some pretty decent buys in there in hindsight."

Taylor pointed out two evolving trends that he believes will impact any market correction and might diminish breeders' profitability going forward. **Cont.**

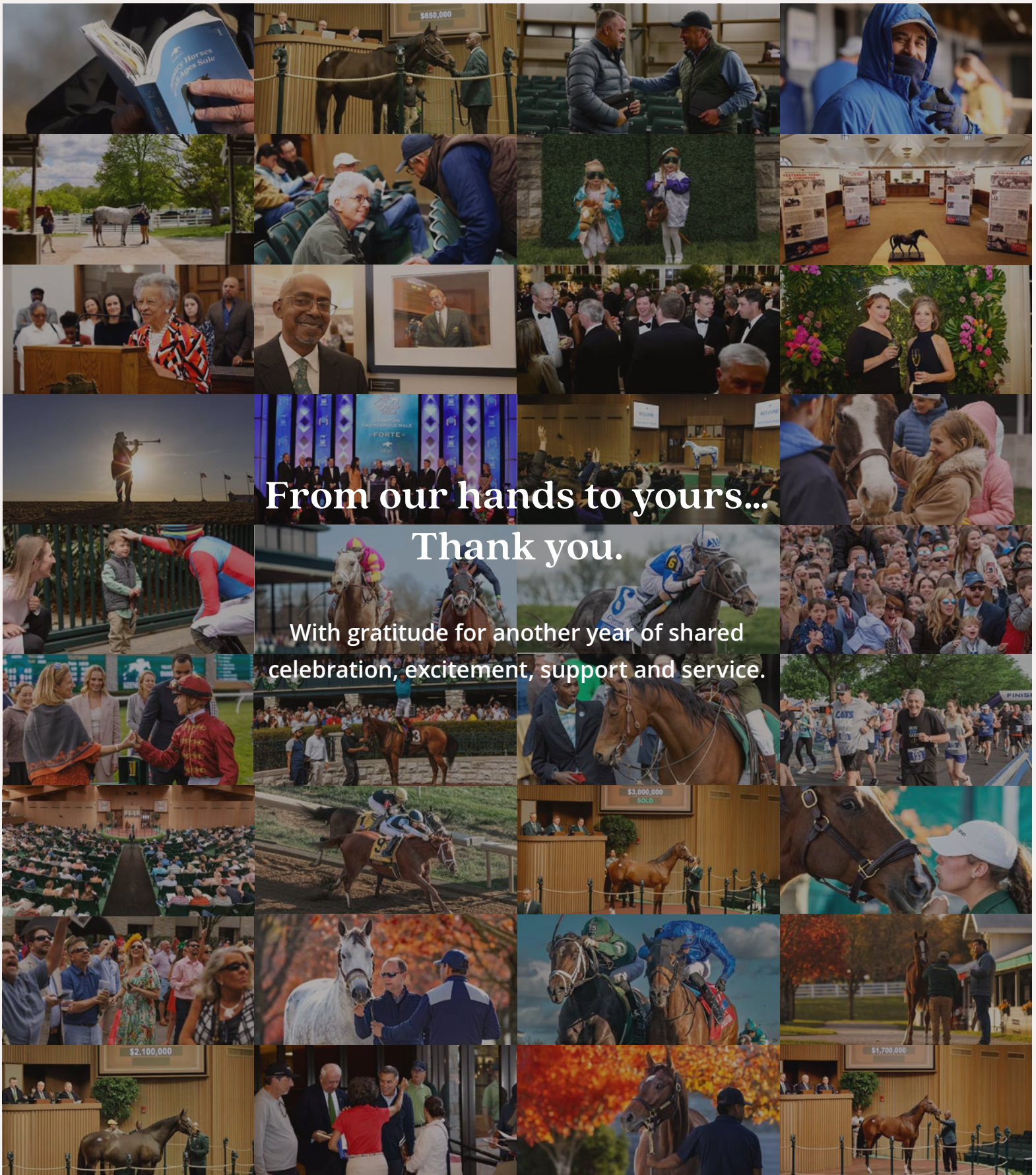

He started with the increase in stallions' book sizes. Taylor is quick to note that Taylor Made's own **Not This Time** bred 200 mares this year and said he does not disparage the stallion farms, but rather considered the significance of the market's reaction to an uptick in the number of horses sired by the same stallion presented at the sales.

"In my dad's era, it used to be 40 mares," he said. "Then it crept up and I remember when 100 or 150 was a lot. Now it's like we're bumping up against 300. What this does for a lot of smaller breeders is they feel like they've got the golden ticket because they're getting into this horse that they really like. They used to not be able to get into this horse when he could only breed 120 because none of their mares were good enough. Now that they can get in, it's actually backfiring."

Heightened scrutinization from buyers when it comes to X-rays, he continued, is another factor that has increased costs for

breeders.

"Thirty years ago, nobody did spring X-rays," he explained. "Now you do spring X-rays, which are \$600 a pop. Then a ton of these horses have little P1 chips. In my opinion it would be great for the breed if everybody would sign a document and say, 'I'm

not going to discount a yearling at the sales because of P1 chips that are not clinical.' Now not only do you take the two sets of X-rays and multiple scopes, but you add in the surgery costs. You're taking an equine athlete during the prime time their skeletons are supposed to be developing and putting them in a stall for 45 or 60 days. If you told me that all you want to do is race, I would much rather buy a horse with a little P1 chip that had never been put up in a stall."

"These breeders are facing rising costs and unless you have a mare

that can produce a six-figure foal consistently, it's hard to make money," he admitted. **Cont.**

And so, Taylor said, he is proud that their sales team was just as active recruiting buyers during the ninth and final day of Keeneland as they were during the opening session.

“We realize that for the people selling the \$40,000 foal, in some case that money means more to them than any of these horses we sold in Book 1 at Keeneland or at Fasig-Tipton. That foal bringing \$50,000 instead of \$30,000 can really help someone's cashflow, so even though that's not the part of the market that we're focusing on and that we're actively recruiting in, if somebody gives us their horse to sell, they're going to get our best effort all the way through the end.”

“The track is so deep and slow here,” he said. “I think my horses needed a run over it. Most of the horses, when they ran back, got better with each succeeding start. They hadn’t trained over it or raced over it like some of the horses here have. When racing shifted here, to Riyadh, we had some fresh horses and they popped right away.”

Another adjustment he had to make was running horses back with less rest than they normally get between starts in the U.S. He said the racing managers for his owner, Prince Faisal bin Khalid Al Saud, and he don’t always agree on racing schedules.

“I've been here for a little more than five months and I think I only have one horse that's run that's run four times,” Jerkens said. “I've been trying to stretch things out so they stay a little fresher and they get stronger instead of getting knocked out. But I get some resistance. The Prince's men want to run a little more sometimes than I do. Sometimes I talk them out of it and then other times I don't. It all depends on the situation.”

After working for his father, Hall of Famer Allen Jerkens, Jerkens went out on his own in 1997. By 2000, he had established himself as a steady winner on the New York circuit who had the type of stock that could compete in stakes. He won 59 races in 2000, good for a 28% winning rate, and won six stakes. His numbers stayed relatively stable and in 2018 he won 38 races with stable earnings of \$2,922,392. But his fortunes declined every year thereafter and in 2022, his last full year in the U.S., he won just four races and had earnings of \$365,995, which, he admitted, was causing financial problems. Looking back, he says he made a mistake when deciding not to expand his stable.

“When the stable was going really good, I had a chance to expand pretty good,” he said. “The owners were coming to me and I was getting offers to train more horses. I didn't really take it and go with it. I didn't want to get to be so big that I couldn't do the job the way I like to do it. In the long run, that hurt me. I probably should have done whatever it took to get the extra horses and keep it going. It's a numbers game now, especially the way horses are so disposable. I understand why those guys have so many horses, even if they spread themselves thin. Looking back, I realize you have to get the horses in the barn. That's the bottom line. Get the horses in the barn.” **Cont.**

THREE GRADED EVENTS ON HOLIDAY MENU

Churchill Downs will host two Grade III races to go with your turkey and gravy Thursday, while Del Mar will add its own graded event for dessert. The GIII Cardinal S. opens the holiday action in Louisville with a field of seven fillies and mares expected to go nine furlongs over the Churchill turf. CHP Racing's [Saffron Moon](#) (Malibu Moon), the 2-1 morning-line favorite, is making her first start against stakes company for trainer Chad Brown. The 4-year-old has three wins in four turf appearances and is coming off a 1 1/16-mile Keeneland allowance victory Oct. 7. She will be trying nine furlongs for the first time Thursday.

Juddmonte homebred [Juncture](#) (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}) won the one-mile Ouija Board Distaff S. at Lone Star in her second U.S. outing in May. The Brad Cox trainee was most recently third in the 1 1/4-mile GII Rodeo Drive S. at Santa Anita Oct. 7. Multiple group-placed in Europe, the 5-2 shot will be looking for a first graded victory Thursday.

Nine fillies and mares go postward in the GIII Falls City S. with [Xigera](#) ([Nyquist](#)) heavily favored at 3-5 on the morning line for the nine-furlong main-track contest. Trained by Phil Bauer on behalf of Rigney Racing, the 3-year-old is coming off wins in the Sept. 23 Seneca Overnight S. at Churchill and in the Oct. 28 GII Mother Goose S. at Aqueduct. **Cont.**

60 SUPPLEMENTED TO FASIG-TIPTON

MIDLANTIC DECEMBER SALE

An additional 60 horses have been supplemented to the upcoming Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed and Horses of Racing Age Sale. The sale will be held Dec. 5 at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium.

Horses of racing age are catalogued as hips 161-220 in a separate supplemental catalogue. *Daily Racing Form* past performances, Ragozin speed figures, and race replays for all horses of race age entries are now available online.

"We have a variety of in-form entries to suit various racing circuits and conditions," said Midlantic Director of Sales Paget Bennett. "Buyers from coast-to-coast should take a hard look at this catalogue as it's one of the last major opportunities to purchase racehorses before year's end."

SANTA ANITA CLASSIC, HOLLYWOOD MEETS TO OFFER 90 STAKES

Santa Anita's Classic Meet will get off to its traditional fast start Dec. 26 with a trio of Grade I events each worth \$300,000--the GI Malibu S., GI La Brea S., and GI American Oaks--and the track will continue racing through June 16 with a total of 90 stakes scheduled for the 78 race days. Those 90 stakes races include 53 graded events, with 10 Grade I races highlighted by the 87th running of the \$400,000 GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 2 and the \$750,000 GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 6.

In addition to the Santa Anita Derby on the Apr. 6 card, 3-year-old fillies will go postward in the \$300,000 GII Santa Anita Oaks and older fillies and mares will compete in the \$100,000 GIII Monrovia S.

Santa Anita will offer a total of 16 stakes restricted to state-bred horses, with five to be run both on California Cup Day, Jan. 13, and again on California Gold Rush Day, May 25.

Live racing at Santa Anita will take a brief pause following the Santa Anita Derby, as the 49-day Classic Meet will draw to a close Apr. 7 and the 29-day Hollywood Meet will begin Apr. 19. The Hollywood Meet will be highlighted by three Grade I, \$300,000 stakes on Memorial Day, Monday, May 27--the Gamely S., the Shoemaker Mile and the Hollywood Gold Cup.

KING'S PLATE 2024 DATE SET; E.P TAYLOR TURF COURSE RENOVATIONS UNVEILED

The King's Plate will be held in August for the third straight year in 2024 when it will be run Aug. 17 at Woodbine Racetrack.

"This year's King's Plate was a big success, delivering a record handle, sold-out crowd and really exciting racing," said Michael Copeland, CEO of Woodbine. "The third weekend in August has been a good spot for attracting a quality field on the track and

WEEKLY RULINGS



NOVEMBER 14-20

Every week, the *TDN* posts a roundup of the relevant Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA)-related rulings from around the country.

Among the key rulings from the last seven days, trainer Jaime Cruz has been suspended for 15-days--beginning on Nov. 21--after his runner, Animal Princess, tested positive post-race for Detomidine, which is used primarily as a sedative in horses. Detomidine is also labelled as an analgesic.

Trainer Tanner Tracy has also been suspended for seven days--beginning Nov. 15--after a post-race sample from his trainee, Carry On, tested positive for Cannabidiol (CBD). As human CBD-containing products have become much more ubiquitous in recent years, they've **proven something of a headache** for regulators and trainers alike.

There have also been a number of actions surrounding the alleged use of intra-articular injections within the seven-day window before a timed or reported workout--two resolved cases, which resulted in \$3,000 fines meted out among other sanctions, and three pending cases.

Initially funded by Breeders' Cup Ltd., The Jockey Club, and Keeneland Association Inc., the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance has garnered widespread support from owners, trainers, breeders, racetracks, aftercare professionals, and various industry groups. Since its inception, the organization has distributed \$31.9 million in grants, leading to the successful retraining, rehoming, or retirement of 16,500 Thoroughbreds through accredited organizations. This year, 86 accredited organizations received grants totaling \$3.8 million.

Established in 1994, the Clay Puett Award is bestowed upon a person or persons for their outstanding contributions to the racing industry. The award is named after the late Clay Puett, an Arizona resident whose innovations, including the development of the mechanical starting gate, helped to revolutionize racing around the world. The list of previous Clay Puett Award winners includes Joe Harper, Marylou Whitney, The Grayson-Jockey Club Foundation, John Gaines and Clement Hirsch.

AAEP SEEKS WEARABLE BIOMETRIC SENSORS

DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS *Edited Press Release*

The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) has released a Request for Proposal (RFP) soliciting proposals from applicants for a joint project that will involve the development and application of wearable biometric sensor technologies to improve early detection of musculoskeletal injuries in Thoroughbred racehorses in the United States.

Wearable biometric sensors have shown promise in the identification of sub-clinically affected racehorses or those at risk of musculoskeletal injury. Any proposed system that monitors musculoskeletal parameters related to gait needs to have data transmission capabilities that interface with algorithms designed to detect injury; be scalable enough for widespread use; and be user-friendly and economical in order to be employed on all Thoroughbred racehorses for all races and recorded workouts. **Cont.**

AAEP seeks RFP, cont.

The AAEP will work with the successful applicant(s) on funding, licensing agreements, commercialization efforts, and other legal issues. Depending on the nature of the response to this proposal request, the AAEP may also solicit funding from industry leaders.

Issuance of this RFP is among nine recommendations coming out of the AAEP-sponsored Forum on Thoroughbred Safety and Injury Prevention, which in late September convened 23 invited private racetrack practitioners, regulatory veterinarians, surgeons, and radiologists to explore additional measures to reduced racehorse injuries.

Much of the bidding was carried out online, with two buyers going head to head from the outset. 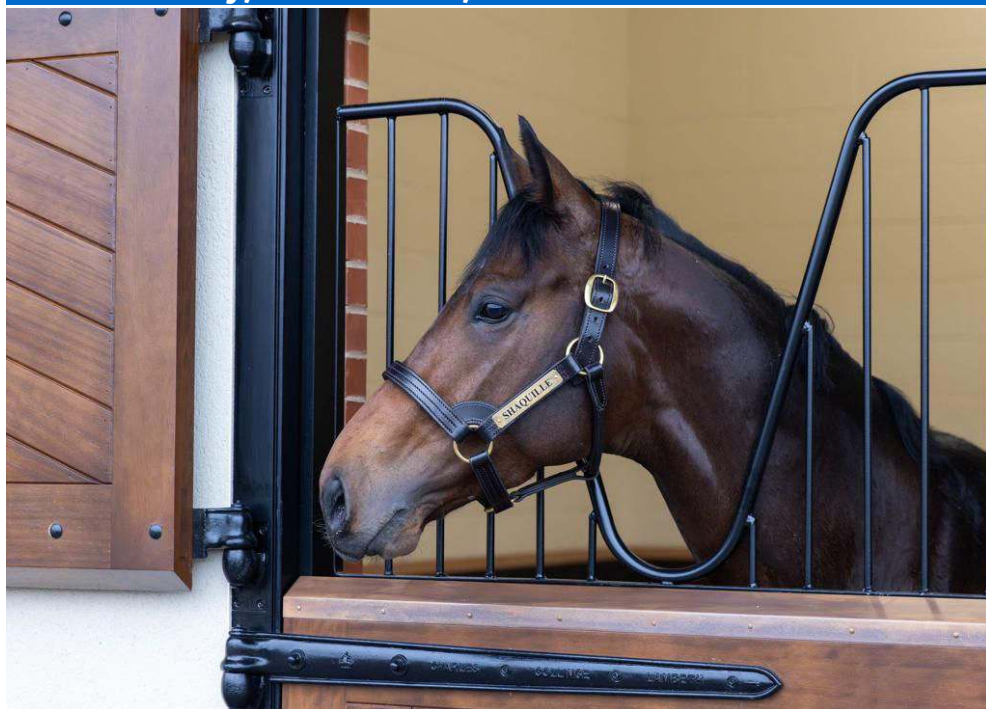

He added, "It's a wonderful family and a lot of work went into it. I'm very proud of the farm and for my son Mark and all the team, including the stud groom Mark Murphy. I think this is a very good colt, a lovely foal. He's a lovely individual and a great walker."

Of course, it was at this sale in 2015 when Ghaiyyath was knocked down to John Ferguson on behalf of Godolphin for €1,100,000. He would go on to prove himself a world-class older horse for Charlie Appleby, winning four Group 1s including the Eclipse and the Juddmonte, and his yearlings and foals have proved to be very popular among buyers this year. Weld went on to reveal that he has a couple of Ghaiyyaths to look forward to next year.

Weld said, "I have a couple of very nice Ghaiyyaths. Not only do we have the dam, but we also have the granddam, Caumshinaun (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who naturally is retired. She's a matron and we're very proud to have her."

Of the 202 foals offered on Wednesday, 172 were sold at a clearance rate of 85%. The aggregate stood at €12,360,500, which represented a 19% drop on last year's figures. The average also fell by 19% to €71,864 while the median dipped 10% to €52,000.

'Out Of This World' - Breeders Langan And Hickey Reach For The Stars

Breeders Aaron Langan and Jer Hickey, who sold lot 655, a **Sea The Stars (Ire)** colt to Peter and Ross Doyle, were left flabbergasted by the €310,000 payout.

The pair purchased the dam Celeste De La Mer (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}), a half-sister to Mojo Star (Ire) (**Sea The Stars**), Portage (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Cape Magic (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), for just €19,000 at Goffs in 2017 and the pedigree has just gotten better and better ever since.

Not least with the emergence of Mojo Star, who the Doyles also purchased as a yearling on behalf of Amo Racing and trainer Richard Hannon, but she has also produced a black-type performer in her own right in the shape of the Joseph O'Brien-trained Maritime Wings (Ire) (**Gleneagles {Ire}**).

Langan said after the sale, "We're on cloud nine and we have been since we started showing him. To make that sort of money, it's out of this world. Can't believe it."

"The one thing about the progeny of **Sea The Stars**, their temperament is very good and he's got that from his father. That probably helped a lot."

He added, "We'll be going around Ireland and England following him in a couple of years if he's good. Part of breeding these foals is the huge kick you get when you see them running. It's like Christmas Day when you see them making it to the track because so much can go wrong in the meantime. To have a horse like this to go forward for the mare is just brilliant."

The colt was sold under the banner of Carrick Hill Stud, owned by Mark Lawless, and Hickey was keen to acknowledge the abundance of help the breeders have benefited from before netting their major payday with the **Sea The Stars** colt.

Hickey said, "We bought the mare here at Goffs and have just been very lucky. A lot of people have given us a lot of help along the way, too. A neighbour of ours, Christy Swords, gave us the use of a stable in the field. Christy passed away this year. Another friend of ours, Mark Lawless, who actually owns Carrick

Hill, has been a huge help to us over the years. We're blessed with all the help we've got."

The **Sea The Stars** colt came in for high praise by Ross Doyle, who bought him on behalf of an existing client who not only races, but reoffers horses at the yearling markets.

Doyle said, "An outstanding individual by one of the best sires we have seen for a long time. The dam has also done the job as well. She has produced two black-type horses—one on the Flat and one over hurdles, which is obviously a good sign of toughness in the family. The pedigree goes back to Mojo Star, who we bought as a yearling. I thought he was a standout, very unique and a good mover.

"He'd a wonderful temperament every time I went down to see him. I haven't seen a foal fill the box like he did for a long time. He has a great presence and took my eye every time I went to see him. He showed great every time." **Cont. p5**

Crowley had sourced the dam, La Rosetta (GB) (New Approach {Ire}), from Godolphin for just 40,000gns through bloodstock agent Ted Durcan at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2021.

Less than two years later, things turned full circle when the powerhouse owners snapped up the Ringford Stud-consigned colt (lot 726) by their very own stallion for one of the highest prices recorded at Goffs on the day.

Wham Bam, Thank You Tham!

Hanshen Tham continues his love affair with Night Of Thunder (Ire) at Goffs on Wednesday by snapping up a colt by the sire for €200,000.

The popular breeder and pinhooker, who netted himself a cool 500,000gns with a homebred Night Of Thunder filly at Book 1 this year, revealed the colt (lot 574) will be offered for resale.

Tham said, "He's a proper Book 1 type and will go back to Baroda Stud [who consigned his Night Of Thunder filly back in October]."

'We're Having Amnesia About How Hard It Was To Sell Yearlings This Year!'

Brothers Michael and Laurence Gleeson of Aughamore Stud have rightly earned a reputation as being one of the shrewdest pinhookers in the business and the pair broke new ground on Wednesday by shelling out €200,000 for a Lope De Vega (Ire) filly who was consigned by Alice Kavanagh.

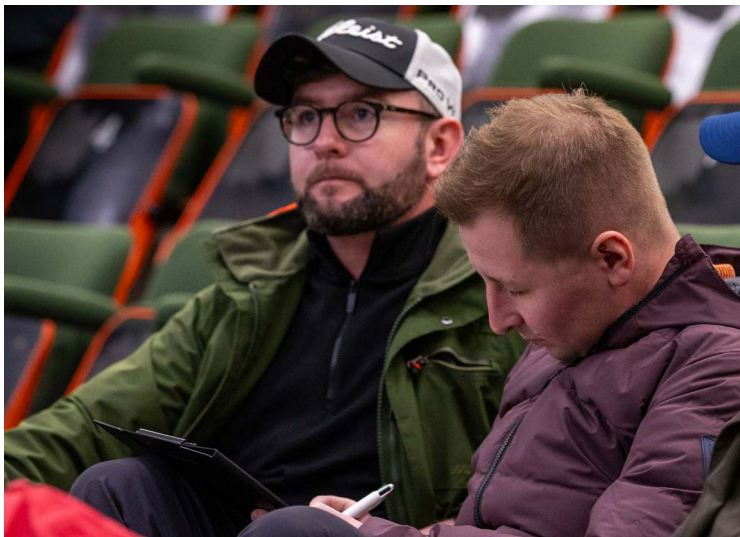
That made lot 563 the most expensive pinhooking project the Gleeson brothers have ever undertaken and brought the total Aughamore Stud spend at Goffs this week to €287,000 on three foals.

Laurence Gleeson said, "It's the most money we've ever spent on a foal but the way we viewed it was, the market was a small bit dicey this year and, with what may come next year, well-bred fillies by proven stallions should hold their value. Yes, we were paying a bit more to be playing at the top end of the market, but that's our thinking behind it. Look, she is just a beautiful filly. We looked at her three or four times and it was the same show every time. She's a hell of a first foal."

Remarkably, this is the first year that the Gleeson brothers didn't encounter altogether smooth waters, with some of their pinhooks failing to make a profit. Nevertheless, Gleeson explained that, in this game, you need to be able to take the rough with the smooth. Either that, or you have to suffer from amnesia!

He explained, "It's been going so well for six or seven years now and we barely lost on any pinhook up until this year. We had a little bit of a hiccup this year. It's just fine margins. That's the difference between making eighty grand or one-hundred-and-eighty grand.

"We were keen to buy the horses we liked this week. Whether that's at two hundred or less, I mean, we bought a lovely Kodi Bear (Ire) colt earlier in the day for small money [€22,000] and he'll be an ideal Donny type." [Cont. p7](#)

Gleeson added, "It's funny, us pinhookers, we're a strange bunch as we're having amnesia about how hard it was to sell yearlings this year! And now everyone is going hard again. It's extremely strong in there, especially for the nice ones."

The Lope De Vega filly in question is the first foal out of Quiet Times (Ger) (Reliable Man {GB}), a listed winner in France. The sale formed part of a strong session for the Ballylinch Stud-based sire with seven foals by Lope De Vega selling for €1,043,000. They included a Stanley Lodge-drafted colt (lot 539) who was knocked down to Camas Park Stud for €260,000 and a filly (lot 593) who fetched the same to Dan Hayden from Donnelly's Well.

'Eddie O'Leary Said He Was The Best Colt He Saw All Week'

Popular bloodstock agent Peter Kelly might only have four mares but 7,000gns purchase Wild Mix (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) has already proved herself a valuable commodity being the dam of Caught U Looking (Ire) (Harzand {Ire}).

The Kelly family still own half of the Group 3-winning juvenile, who is in training with Noel Meade, and it was the Classic contender's half-brother by Supremacy (Ire) who caught the imagination on Wednesday when snapped up by Yeomanstown

Stud for €180,000.

Kelly commented of lot 620, "He is a belter. A lovely horse who couldn't be faulted--he'd 14 vets. Eddie O'Leary said he was the nicest colt he'd seen all week. Of course, there is a cap on what a horse by a first-season sire can make. I went to Supremacy because Gay [O'Callaghan of Yeomanstown] does a lot of business with me.

"Anyway, Yeomanstown don't come up with a bad horse too often and they back them all themselves. It's the same with Tony [O'Callaghan of Tally-Ho Stud], they don't buy what they wouldn't use themselves."

Caught U Looking emerged as one of Meade's stable stars on the Flat this season when building on a brilliant Leopardstown maiden win to land the G3 Weld Park S. at the Curragh.

While she proved no match for Ylang Ylang (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket on her final start of the season, she remains an interesting candidate with a view towards the domestic fillies' Classics, and Kelly is enjoying the ride.

He said, "Caught U Looking provided the mare with a good update and the family still own half of her with Tony. The Inns Of Court is with Johnny Murtagh and the mare is in foal to Cotai Glory (GB). She's a lovely mare. We've only four mares and my family own this mare. There have been offers for the mare but we've turned them down." **Cont. p8**

ARQANA'S AUTUMN SALE FINISHES ON A HIGH

While all the clamour at last week's Tattersalls Ireland November National Hunt Sale was for the offspring of Walk In The Park (Ire) and Blue Bresil (Fr), at Arqana's Autumn Sale the dominant sire for young stores and National Hunt yearlings was Doctor Dino (Fr).

The Haras du Mesnil resident accounted for five of the nine six-figure lots, including the top lots on the last two days of the sale. Wednesday's concluding session saw Frederic Sauque bid €265,000 for Haras de l'Hotellerie's Doctor Dino yearling half-brother to Flat listed winner Joplin (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}). The colt's 4-year-old full-brother Meatloaf (Fr) was placed in a listed bumper at Cheltenham and won over hurdles at Wincanton for Paul Nicholls earlier this month.

Sauque confirmed that the colt was bought on behalf of the same team of owners who were behind recent Grade 1-winning hurdler Jigme (Ire) (Motivator {GB}), who has been retired to Haras du Hoguenet for the 2024 season. He too was bred and raised at Hotellerie for Classic and Breeders' Cup-winning breeder Yeguada Centurion.

"Buying as a yearling, it's a gamble on the future, but we have been very lucky with the horses from Haras de l'Hotellerie," he said of lot 684. **Cont. p10**

As the sire of Epatante (Fr) and Allaho (Fr), Haras de Montaigu's No Risk At All (Fr) is another National Hunt sire very much in favour and two of his yearling colts were sold on Wednesday for €150,000 and €140,000, respectively.

Thomas Saudet signed for Lot 707, from Haras des Sablonnets, who is a half-brother to the Network (Fr) siblings Thrilling (Fr) and Placenet (Fr), both of whom are listed chase winners at

Auteuil. Karwin Stud and Trotting Bloodstock were also among the raiders of the Hotellerie draft when buying Lot 722, the son of No Risk At All out of Molly Has (Fr) (Coastal Path {GB}). He too is a half-brother to a listed-winning jumper in Mombasa (Fr) (Martaline {GB}), while his dam is a half-sister to the Grade 1-winning hurdler Moises Has (Fr) (Martaline {GB}), who is another top jumper now standing at Haras de Hoguenet.

Like the previous day's catalogue, this session had also been trimmed from last year. With 87 sold from 115 offered, the clearance rate improved significantly to 75%, and the turnover of €3,222,000 was up by 22%.

For the Arqana Autumn Sale as a whole, the clearance rate held steady at 79%. Turnover was up by 8% to €12,413,000 for 341 horses sold at an average of €36,240 (+15%).

The action continues in Deauville on Thursday with the one-day National Hunt Breeding Stock Sale.

ANOTHER TRAINER AND STABLE STAFF SURVEY LAUNCHED BY BHA

A survey for trainers and stable staff, commissioned by the Industry People Board, has been launched by the British Horseracing Authority (BHA). The aim is to improve recruitment, skills, and retention of staff in the British racing industry.

The appropriate racing industry staff will shortly be contacted by Public Perspectives to give their views on the survey, which is funded by the Racing Foundation, and delivered in partnership with the BHA, the National Trainers Federation (NTF) and the National Association of Racing Staff (NARS). The survey will also provide feedback on major initiatives funded by the Racing Foundation that have aimed to:

- Support the recruitment of stable staff into the racing industry--such as the Scottish Racing Academy, HEROS Racing Academy and the Riding a Dream Academy.
- Develop the skills of its workforce--including the Racing Staff Development Programme (RSDP); Rider Coaching Programme; NARS Education Programme; and an enhanced Jockey Coaching Programme.
- Encourage greater retention of staff--such as the Careers Advice and Training Service (CATS); Personal Development Programme for Jockeys; Racing Welfare's Occupational Health Service and mental health support services.

Since the 2016 baseline survey, the Racing Foundation has invested over £12 million to address the issues highlighted in the surveys. The survey will run from November and continue until early January.

SUNDAY RACING DUO SONGLINE AND SCHNELL MEISTER RETIRED

Triple Group 1 winner **Songline (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}--Luminous Parade {Jpn}, by Symboli Kris S), and Group 1 winner **Schnell Meister (Ger)** (Kingman {GB}--Serienholde {Ger}, by Soldier Hollow {GB}) have both been retired, Sunday Racing announced on Wednesday.

A Northern Farm-bred, the Toru Hayashi trainee won once in two starts at two, and added the Listed Kobai S. in January of her 3-year-old year. She was only a nose behind Schnell Meister in the G1 NHK Mile Cup in 2021, placed in the G3 Sekiya Kinen, and claimed the G2 Fuji S. as her first group victory in October of 2021. Last year, the G3 1351 Turf Sprint went her way in Saudi Arabia, and she defeated Schnell Meister later that season in the G1 Yasuda Kinen. **Cont. p15**

At five, Songline added the G1 Victoria Mile and Yasuda Kinen, to bring up her third top-level victory, and was second in the G2 Mainichi Okan. Fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in her career finale, the 5-year-old emerged lame from that effort. She has earned \$6,273,096 with a mark of 17-7-3-1.

Like Schnell Meister, Songline is the first foal of her dam. Her second dam, Luminous Point (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}), is a half-sister to Japanese group winners Renforcer (Jpn) (Symboli Kris S) and a full to Northern River (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}). Songline is also kin to G1 Nassau S. and G1 Shuka Sho winner Deirdre (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}).

Kingman Miler Bound For Stud Duty

Bred by Northern Farm in Germany after buying his G1 Henkel-Preis der Diana-winning dam Serienholde after her racing career, Schnell Meister excelled over 1600 metres.

A winner of his first two starts at two, he was second in the G2 Hochi Hai Yayoi Sho at three prior to narrowly taking the NHK Mile Cup in May of 2021. After running second in the Yasuda Kinen that year, he added the G2 Mainichi Okan to his haul that October and signed off his 3-year-old year with a second in the G1 Mile Championship at Hanshin. Winless at four, he did run second in the Yasuda Kinen, once again. This term, he took the G2 Yomiuri Miler Cup, ran third in the Yasuda Kinen--to Songline--and was third in the Mainichi Okan in five starts. His record stands at 17-5-3-3, and \$4,446,225 in earnings.

His third dam is the influential matron Salde (Ger) (Alkalde {Ger}), a listed winner and responsible for 10 winners including the group winners Saldenschwinge (Ger) (In The Wings {GB}) and Saldentigerin (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), the latter second in the G1 Preis von Europa. Another German Oaks victress, Salomina (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}), is also a descendant of Salde, and she has produced Japanese Group 1 winner Salios (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) and two other stakes winners in Japan.

Stud plans are pending for the 5-year-old.

Winner of this year's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and a narrowly beaten second to his GI Breeders' Cup Turf-winning stable

companion Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in defence of his crown in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 9, the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup-bound Luxembourg is one of four for trainer Aidan O'Brien on the day. **Warm Heart (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) could try to give the team a fourth victory in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase, while **Cairo (Ire)** (**Quality Road**) is engaged for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile and recent GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint third **Aesop's Fables (Ire)** (**No Nay Never**) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint.

Highfield Princess swerved the Breeders' Cup meeting in favour of this fixture, though it is a race in which European raiders--and foreign-based runners, in general--have struggled mightily. Danon Smash (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) is the last overseas horse to take the Sprint, and Japan fields a pair as well, including **Mad Cool (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}), a €225,000 purchase by Katsumi Yoshida out of the 2019 Goffs November sale and who just failed when last seen in the Oct. 1 G1 Sprinters S.

Two-time Mile winner **Golden Sixty (Aus)** (**Medaglia d'Oro**) goes first-up this year and will face as many as five Japanese invaders led by 4-year-old filly **Namur (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}), who just got the better of **Soul Rush (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}) and former Hong Kong star Joao Moreira in the G1 Mile Championship last weekend. Godolphin's treble 2023 group scorer **Tribalist (GB)** (Farhh {GB}) is also engaged for the Mile for trainer Andre Fabre, and Singapore is also represented by its standout galloper **Lim's Kosciuszko (Aus)** (Kermadec {NZ}). Winner of 15 of 19 at home, he finished at the tail, but beaten under seven lengths, behind **Wellington (Aus)** (All Too Hard {Aus}) in last year's Sprint.

Simon and Ed Crisford trainee **West Wind Blows (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) will try to give his sire another winner of the Vase, joining Hong Kong's Exultant (Ire) back in 2018. [Cont. p16](#)

The 4-year-old had a busy Spring Carnival in Victoria, running second in the G1 Turnbull S. and G1 Caulfield Cup before finishing ninth in the G1 Champions S. America is set to be represented by its first HKIR runner for six years when **Soldier Rising (GB)** (**Frankel {GB}**) competes in the Vase. The 5-year-old has placed in five Grade Is in the States and has winning form in France going right-handed. Japan has won the Vase three out of the last four years and will have a strong chance yet again with recent GI Breeders' Cup Turf third **Shahryar (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and **Geraldina (Jpn)**, a daughter of Cup and Mile winner Maurice (Jpn) and fellow Horse of the Year Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}).

In addition to the aforementioned Golden Sixty, also defending the home turf will be **Romantic Warrior (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}), who will try to go back-to-back in the Cup having posted a memorable win in the G1 Cox Plate in late October; champion sprinter **Lucky Sweynesse (NZ)** (Sweynesse {Aus}), an unlucky sixth in last year's Sprint; 2022 Mile champion **California Spangle (Ire)** (**Starspangledbanner {Aus}**); and **Russian Emperor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who gave trainer Douglas Whyte a first win on foreign soil in the Listed HH The Amir's Trophy in Qatar this past February.

"We are excited by the quality of selected runners for this year's Longines Hong Kong International Races and the presence of so many global stars is in keeping with our long-held commitment to deliver sporting excellence," said Andrew Harding, the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "This is particularly highlighted with Japan, Europe and Ireland's contingent as they prepare to compete against Hong Kong champions Golden Sixty, Romantic Warrior and Lucky Sweynesse."

Out of stakes winner Whazzat (GB) (Daylami {Ire}), the 8-year-old spent five seasons at Rathbarry Stud in Ireland. Of his 71 foals of racing age, 53 are runners with 27 winners among them. His two stakes winners are Maria Branwell (Ire), and Man With The Plan (Ire), while Littlejames (Ire) was also third in the G3 Premio Primi Passi. James Garfield is from the family of the blue

hen Rafha (GB) (Kris {GB}).

NZ800K HARRY ANGEL COLT BREAKS**KARAKA RECORD** by TTR AusNZ

Soon after a sale-record price of NZ\$725,000 was paid for Lot 45 - a Written Tycoon (Aus) colt, Tartan Meadow Bloodstock and Andrew Williams Bloodstock (FBAA) went to NZ\$800,000 to secure Lot 143 - a colt by Harry Angel (Ire) out of the three-time winner and Group 3 runner-up Monrecour (NZ) (Zacinto {GB}). Both colts were offered by Kilgravin Lodge.

Those prices surpassed the NZ\$700,000 David Ellis spent on the Savabeel (Aus)-Miss Opulence (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}) colt, which was subsequently named Zeitaku (NZ), in 2020.

Wednesday's sale-topper clocked :10.47s for his breeze. He will remain in New Zealand to be educated, before heading up to Hong Kong.

The colt was initially sold by Inglewood Stud to RTR Partnership and McKeever Bloodstock for NZ\$150,000 at the 2023 New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale (Book 1).

"He was one of the stars of the breezes," Williams told The Thoroughbred Report. "He's by a stallion that's now a Group 1-winning sire in Australia. "He was a lovely yearling and he's flourished into a real athlete."

"He was highly recommended by the breeze-up vendor and Eion Kemp [of Kilgravin Lodge], who has done a fantastic job this year. "He will go to an existing client in Hong Kong."

The colt is Monrecour's first foal and she is a half-sister to Speedy Grey (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}), who began his career in New Zealand, before winning a Group 3 as Fifty Fifty in Hong Kong. Other stakes winners on his page include the Listed scorer Udditagain (NZ) (D'Cash {Aus}) and the Group 2 victress Kelly O'Reilly (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}). [Cont. p17](#)

"He's [the colt] a real New Zealand product, being born in the South Island," Williams added. "He's a horse we've been following from the start of the whole breeze-up process."

"His dam is a group performer that's a half-sister to a Group 1 performer in Hong Kong, so that helps," Williams said the colt will do his pre-race education in New Zealand with Debbie Sanders. "He will probably get up to trialling stage and then head up to Hong Kong," Williams commented.

Williams was bidding online on Wednesday. He was unable to be at Karaka as his wife, Lily, is set to give birth to the couple's first child any day now.

High-priced Written Tycoon Colt to Race in Australia

The Written Tycoon colt (Lot 45) is from the three-time winner and listed placegetter Fromparis Withlove (Aus) (Smart Missile {Aus}) and was knocked down to Blandford Bloodstock and Andrew Williams Bloodstock for NZ\$725,000.

He is a half-brother to the Matt Laurie-trained Count Of Toulouse (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}), and the colt's grandam, Umaquest (Aus) (Umatilla {NZ}), was a listed winner who has produced the Group 3 victress Yattarna (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}).

Kilgravin Lodge and McKeever Bloodstock went to A\$90,000 for the colt at the 2023 Inglis Premier Yearling Sale when offered by Morningside.

The 2-year-old, who breezed in :10.56s, will race in Australia, with Annabel Neasham to train him.

"We have been working the breeze-up sales in Europe extensively for many years now and we've built up a good record up here and we've been watching the New Zealand Ready to Run Sale from afar for a couple of years," said Blandford Bloodstock's Stuart Boman.

"I have been involved with a few purchases and advising a few clients from afar, but we wanted to take it to the next level this year and we've put a group together, some European clients, to try and buy a couple with the intention of racing them in Australia.

"With the great prize-money available in Australia and the potential trade opportunities and a vibrant breeding industry, we're looking at this colt in particular to hopefully get ourselves a potential stallion which is what you hear at the yearling sales regularly and I often cringed when I have read that.

"But I feel the breeze-up sales, the Ready to Run sales, the degree of information and confidence in our processes and systems, we worked this as a team.

"Richard Brown, my colleague, has worked this very closely and we have also enlisted the services of Andy Williams to

inspect the horses and be at the breeze-ups, so it was an extensive project that we've worked on and he was the one we came up with."

Boman is hoping this colt follows in the footsteps of some purchases made in Europe, including the highly successful Dream Ahead--a five-time elite-level winner and Group 1-producing sire.

"They're [the clients] all European-based. We have a similar group up here put together and we buy breeze-up horses to have with David Simcock. We've been quite successful with that partnership," Boman commented.

"We bought the [2018] French Thousand Guineas winner called Teppal (Fr) and, looking through the horses here, we also had Dream Ahead who came through the breeze-ups and was trained by David. He was a champion sprinter up here and obviously a stallion.

"There's been others, Perfect Power (Ire), so we've built up a fairly good record up here at the breeze-up sales and hopefully we can bring a bit of know-how of how we do it up here.

"We are not arrogant in thinking we're doing anything revolutionary, but we have confidence in what we do and we've got the people who want to back us and our opinion."

Boman said he would talk to Neasham to discuss the plans for the colt.

"I've booked a flight to Australia and asked if she wants the horse to go straight into work, so we'll find out," he said.

"We can feel with this horse, from the descriptions from Andy and our observations and as a lot of the Written Tycoons can be, he's probably going to be more of a 3-year-old type but we'd be hopeful he'd be up and running in the autumn."

Williams said he was honoured to be given the opportunity to work with Blandford Bloodstock.

"It's exciting that there's new and fresh blood wanting to play in Australia. It's obviously very exciting to be associated with Blandford Bloodstock and this particular horse," he said. [Cont. p18](#)

The clearance rate (68%) was marginally better than 2021 and 2022 (65%), while the Day 1 average of NZ\$157,345 is far better than the corresponding figure from 12 months ago (NZ\$124,500). The median was a healthy NZ\$90,000, which is NZ\$10,000 more than Day 1 in 2022.
