





UNTAPABLE OUT FOR REVENGE

Winchell Thoroughbreds' **Untapable** (Tapit) was the 1-10 favorite when she went postward in her 4-year-old debut in the Mar. 14 Gll Azeri S. at Oaklawn Park. Last year's champion 3-year-old filly could manage only second, beaten a half-length by '**TDN RISING STAR**' **Gold Medal Dancer** (Medaglia d'Oro) over an off track that day, but she will get the chance to avenge that loss Friday as the 1-2 morning-line favorite in the Gl Apple Blossom H.

"She's doing really well," trainer Steve Asmussen said of Untapable. "I thought she schooled great [Wednesday]. I think she's trained nicely over the racetrack. Obviously, we're a little concerned with what the weather does today. There is a pretty good chance of rain. It looks like it's inevitable, but I think that the racetrack might be in a little better shape to handle some water now.

It was so saturated all of last month."

Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner, Untapable may not have been fully cranked for her 2015 unveiling, but has been training strongly for this second outing of the campaign. She turned heads with a six-furlong breeze in 1:10.80 at Oaklawn Mar. 30 and she most recently worked a bullet four furlongs Monday in :48 flat.

Donnie Von Hemel, who trains Gold Medal Dancer, expects his filly will face a tougher Untapable Friday.

"Untapable's going to be faster this time," Von Hemel said. "How much do we need to improve to be able to compete with her?"

Gold Medal Dancer set all the pace in the Azeri after the scratch of **Sugar Shock** (Candy Ride {Arg}). With that foe in the field Friday, she could have company on the front end.

"Sugar Shock adds a little pace to the race, maybe," Von Hemel said. "It's hard to say what she's going to do, in that regard. She can add pace to the race, if she chooses to."

Sugar Shock, scratched from the Azeri due to the threat of rain, won the GIII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn last year. She returned from seven months on the sidelines to win the Jan. 24 American Beauty S., but is coming off a well-beaten fourth-place effort in a one-mile allowance Mar. 20. *Full field p4*

A total of 350 horses changed hands through the close of trade Thursday for A\$102,110,000. The average of A\$291,743 was up 15.4% from 12 months ago, and the median climbed 5.3% to A\$200,000. Approximately 17% of the offerings failed to sell at the fall of the hammer, which nearly mirrored last year's figure of 16.5%. *Cont. p7*

SUMMER FRONT SEEKS GRADE I

In the absence of the still-sidelined two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry), who won this race the last two years, Waterford Stable's **Summer Front** (War Front) is the 8-5 morning-line favorite in Friday's Gl Maker's 46 Mile S. at Keeneland. The 6-year-old is a four-time graded stakes winner, but is still looking for his first Grade I victory after three

runner-up efforts at the highest level. He was most recently second behind Ring Weekend (Tapit) in the Mar. 7 GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita. Summer Front ventured to the west coast twice last summer, coming away with runner-up finishes in the GI Shoemaker Mile and GI Eddie Read S., before ending 2014 with a fourth-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

Live Oak Plantation's **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper), fourth in this race a year ago, filled the same spot after a wide trip in the Kilroe Mile. The gray veteran will be making his fourth start of the year Friday afternoon at Keeneland. He began the year with a fourth-place effort in the Jan. 10 GII Fort Lauderdale S. before running second in the Jan. 31 Arcadia S.

Walter Swinburn's **Legendary (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) will be an outsider when he makes his 2015 debut in the Maker's 46 Mile. The 6-year-old gelding captured last year's GIII Knickerbocker H., but has been off since running fifth in the Nov. 15 GIII Red Smith H.

"A Grade I is ambitious for his first start back," admitted Rosella Saville, whose husband Niall trains Legendary. "We wanted to come down here and try the track out. The race looked like a good spot for him."

Legendary made his North American debut over the Keeneland turf course last year, finishing second in a 12-furlong allowance Apr. 17.

"He ran a mile and a half and the owners thought, 'You guys crazy? That horse won't get the trip,'" Saville recalled. "But it was really just to school him, teach him to settle because he had struggled with that in England. He's gotten better and better. We like Keeneland, so why not come back? The horse seemed to like the [course] and with Breeders' Cup here this year, it'll be interesting to see what he does throughout the year and if he has the opportunity to come back."

STEP UP FOR DONWORTH IN LEXINGTON

Regis Racing's **Donworth** (Tiznow) was entered for a Thursday allowance at Keeneland, but connections opted to try the '**TDN RISING STAR**' in Saturday's

GIII Coolmore Lexington S. instead. "There are very capable horses in both races, but I would rather run for \$250,000 than \$60,000," trainer Graham Motion explained. "Both races have experienced horses in them and that will be against him in either spot." In his only start to

date, Donworth graduated over seven furlongs at Gulfstream Mar. 14 (video). Of the colt's late start to racing, Motion said, "He is a great big horse and he just had some baby stuff going on, nothing exceptional."

TAMARKUZ TO U.S., POINTS FOR MET MILE

Sheikh Hamdan's **Tamarkuz** (Speightstown), whose four-race winning streak at the recently concluded Dubai International Racing Carnival was capped by a trouble-filled victory in the G2 Godolphin Mile Mar. 28, has been repatriated and will be pointed by trainer Kiaran McLaughlin for a start in the GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park June 6, according to published reports.

Bred in Kentucky by John D. Gunther and consigned by his Glennwood Farm, the chestnut colt fetched \$325,000 from Shadwell Estate Co. as a Keeneland September yearling in 2011 and was a revelation at Meydan this winter with a handicap second Jan. 8 before commencing his winning skein in similar company two weeks later. Winner of the G3 Firebreak S. and G3 Burj Nahaar S. in his next two starts, Tamarkuz missed the break from the inside stall in the Godolphin Mile and was caught in behind runners into the stretch. He called upon all his reserves and was just able to outfinish Sloane Avenue (Candy Ride {Arg}).

Tamarkuz is the first foal out of the unraced Without You Babe (Lemon Drop Kid), a half-sister to GISW Stay Thirsty (Bernardini), GSW & MGISP Andromeda's Hero (Fusaichi Pegasus) and SW & GISP Superfly (Fusaichi Pegasus). Winner of seven of his 13 career trips to the post, Tamarkuz has earnings to date of \$964,825.

MICHAEL DICKINSON

- 1. I have trained in the UK on zero medication. I've also trained in the USA using the permitted medications. The job satisfaction of the former easily outweighs the latter. In the USA I raced all my horses on Lasix and used some of the other permitted medication but I have had my "Road to Damascus" moment.
- 2. During the last seven years I have traveled extensively around the world to 10 of the best Thoroughbred Racing countries where the question is always the same--"When is the USA going to ditch its permissive medication policies?" The rest of the world can run excellent racing without medication and they can't understand why the USA can't do likewise. They are disappointed that we can't do what the rest of the world can do and the ability of our horses and the skill of our trainers have become needlessly questioned. Some people are addicted to the culture of permissive medication and the leaders of the industry don't have the appetite to change. The outsiders feel that it is hurting our product. The public doesn't like drugs. We have the best horses in the world. Let them race without drugs and remove all doubt.
- 3. Many of the younger trainers have not trained without some of the 26 permitted drugs now allowed and are scared to go cold turkey. I don't think they have anything to worry about, we have many hardworking good horsemen who will have no problem adjusting. Maybe a small percentage will struggle, then so be it. Actually the 26 controlled therapeutics do not require anyone to go 'cold turkey'. The intent is to provide guidance on their use such that they can be used to address equine health disorders, but withdrawn prior to a race in such a way that they cannot impact the horse's performance.
- 4. It is not true to say that 'no drugs' is inhumane. The injury rate overseas is far less than the USA. If we are saying we need a shedload of drugs because our races and conditions are so severe, then maybe horseracing does not deserve to survive.
- 5. Surely it is better for the best horse with the best trainer to win the race rather than the best chemist. It is not morally defensible to medicate a physically compromised horse in order to get it to race.
- 6. Gene Blood doping has now arrived in the USA.
- 7. The current lab accreditation is a misnomer and misleading because the bar is so low it is difficult to fail. One lab director knew their equipment was outdated and feared there was "open season" in the state so they sent some samples to Hong Kong where they found so many drugs it took seven days to clean the equipment.

"International racing is growing at a rapid rate and it is readily apparent that Australian horses possess the qualities necessary to be successful at the top world wide."

- 8. We have good personnel running our racing labs but they are hopelessly underfunded. USADA would accredit and monitor the labs and the Racing Commissions would have to up the ante. This way nobody loses their job and the labs will be held to a higher standard. We need more out-of-competition testing and freezing samples.
- 9. If there is a change in American racing, I believe it will be brought on by the breeders. There are less and less international buyers coming to the USA and the problem is only going to get worse. Since 2007, yearlings sold for more than \$100,000 or more are up 12% in Britain and Ireland but down 22% in the USA. France and Hong Kong are leading the way for all graded stakes to be run medication free. If this continues, it will devalue the American Thoroughbred.
- 10. It is disappointing that the debates always revolve around Lasix when it is the vast amount of painkillers given the week of the race that are far more dangerous. The stacking of anti-inflammatories for five days leading up to the race is only one paralyzed jockey away from a gigantic lawsuit.

I support the Water Hay Oats Alliance as the only way forward.





Alsvid, who missed by just a neck when second in this race a year ago, returned from five months on the sidelines to run second behind Ivan Fallunovalot in the Feb. 7 King Cotton S. Third behind The Big Beast (Yes It's True) after setting the pace in a Hot Springs allowance Mar. 1, the consistent gelding tuned up for this with a 1 1/2-length optional claimer tally over track and trip Mar. 27. Alsvid broke on top, but was quickly outfooted for the early lead and settled just off the pace. He raced in third down the backstretch as longshot Picko's Pride zipped through fractions of :21.31 and :44.05. Floated wide into the stretch as Ivan Fallunovalot caught the tiring Picko's Pride, Alsvid wore down that foe in deep stretch to win going away. "I had a great trip," commented winning rider Chris Landeros. "He broke running today and he knew what was going on. I have a lot of history with this horse and I knew to take my time. He can get a little tough early and really will do whatever you want. I knew they were flying up front and it set up perfect. I was just waiting for that last 3/16ths punch from him and I caught it at the right time today. He gave me a 110% and that's all that I ask. He's as honest horse as they come and I'm very blessed to be a part of it."

Favored Gentlemen's Bet (Half Ours) never fired and finished seventh. "It wasn't quite the race I was hoping for, but that's horse racing," said trainer Ron Moquett. "You win a few you don't think you will, and then sometimes you don't run as well as you think you could have. As long as the horse is all right and the rider is okay, we'll rack 'em up and do it again."

Inglis Easter Closes on a High (cont. from p1)

Session two also posted admirable results. The gross of A\$9,085,500 for 96 sold was a record for the session, which was introduced in 2009. The average dropped marginally (0.3%) to A\$94,641, while the overall quality on offer was highlighted by an increased median of A\$80,000 (up 14.3%). The passed-in rate for session two was 21%.

(Note: Inglis updates its statistics to include private purchases on passed-in lots for the duration of the sale. Figures used for comparison here are the figures reported end-of-sale last year by the TDN).

Inglis Managing Director Jonathan D'Arcy pointed to the session one clearance rate as a highlight.

"The average for session one is up about 15% on last year, but more pleasing than that is the fact that we're up to an 82% clearance, and we'll probably get up to 83 or 84% tonight [with private purchases]," he said.

Reflecting on session two, D'Arcy pointed to the fact that many of session one's top buyers stuck around through to the very last lot through the ring. "It was great to see session two go so well, and the last horse [through the ring] being bought by the Hong Kong Jockey Club just vindicated the fact that we've got the sale set up the right way," D'Arcy said. We had Angus Gold, Segenhoe Stud and George Moore from Hong Kong; a lot of international buyers and a lot of local buyers concentrating on that second session, so we couldn't be happier about the way the week's gone."

One of the main talking points on the sales grounds throughout the week was the participation of international buyers, particularly from America. Many internationals also teamed up with locals and other internationals on prospects to race in Australia, creating fierce competition at the top of the market. D'Arcy said that type of teamwork was unprecedented.

"In the past we've seen buyers from the likes of Hong Kong, Japan and Singapore--a lot of the southeast Asian countries--buying here and taking them there to race," he said. "Of course we're at a disadvantage when trying to sell to Europeans and Americans because of the Northern Hemisphere/Southern Hemisphere issue, but now we have such good prize money [that] what we're seeing is the American farms and the American investors are wanting to buy into colts and fillies here because of the strength of their pedigrees, and they're happy to race here under our conditions with the prize money that's on offer. It's the same with the Europeans-they're buying into top-class families and they see these families can appreciate in price throughout their racing careers. It's a very healthy industry here at the moment and its great to see Australia is on the world map."

Gold, who was underbidder on three of the top four lots during Wednesday's second session, guipped, "Yesterday I would have pulled up, but after how soft we were yesterday, I had to keep going a bit."

He added, "When you miss out on the colts like we did yesterday, it puts you on the back foot a bit."

Gold was nonetheless pleased to secure this filly. Bred by SF Bloodstock, the late October foal is the third produce from the Group 1-placed Fleur De'here (NZ) (Dehere), herself a daughter of a Group 2 winner and a half-sister to G1 SAJC Australasian Oaks victress Tully Thunder (Aus) (Thunder Gulch). She is destined to stay in Australia with trainer David Hayes.

"She was really sharp--she's a late foal, but she looked a real 2-year-old Redoute's filly rather than a big, scopier type," Gold explained.

Expanding on the strength of the market at the top end Wednesday, Gold said, "I knew we'd struggle, but it's not often you go in with four colts, with the sort of budget I've got, and you can't buy one of them. That's unusual. It shows how strong a sale it is, to be underbidder to the Americans twice, Hong Kong once, to Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa--lots of different parts of the world. That's fantastic--you wouldn't have had that [in Australia] 10 years ago."

"I haven't been able to buy the colts we've wanted, and while it's bad for me, it's fantastic to see such a strong market," he added. "It really shows Australia has come of age and has such international appeal now."

Gold stayed busy during session two, coming away with the top lot of that portion of the sale in the form of a Snitzel (Aus) colt (lot 504) for A\$500,000. Gold was the leading individual buyer by aggregate for the whole sale, with 19 bought for A\$6,615,000, although the China Horse Club and its various partners purchased a total of 21 for A\$9,125,000.

They have the government behind them as well, so there's so many positives."

Warren is also an advisor to Sheikh Joaan Al Thani's Al Shaqab Racing, which will shuttle its first sires Down Under later this year--Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}).

"Al Shagab have come into the bloodstock industry based in Qatar and they've been very fortunate to have Toronado and Olympic Glory in their armory so early on in their operation," Warren said. "They are two horses, in my opinion, that really tick the boxes. They're big, powerful horses physically, they're very fast horses and they're very precocious horses, and they've got bloodlines that relate to Australians. So we're hoping Al Shaqab will develop their interests here, and the stallions is the first toe in the water to do that."

Arrowfield consigned lot 407, and they ended the sale as leading consignor by aggregate, with 28 sold for A\$10,695,000.

Fastnet Fillies Flying Again...

In their first year in a public training partnership, the father-and-son team of Peter and Paul Snowden have turned out the talented 2-year-old colt Pride of Dubai (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) to win the G1 Blue Diamond S.

and G1 Sires' Produce S., and they have high hopes for another youngster after securing lot 461 for A\$850,000 Thursday. From the draft of Coolmore Stud, which bought into Pride of Dubai after his Blue Diamond victory, the Fastnet Rock (Aus) filly is out of Singapore's Horse of the Year and multiple champion Jolie's Shinju (Jpn) (Jolie's Halo). Peter Snowden

noted that he and Paul train both the 2-year-old and 3-year-old out of the mare: the 3-year-old, a Shamardal filly named Typhoon Jolie (Aus), won her first two outings late last year, and the 2-year-old is a Medaglia d'Oro colt.

"She's a nice filly," Snowden said. "I know a bit about the family as well; I have a half-sister by Shamardal and a colt by Medaglia d'Oro. They both have good talent, and this is a lovely type."

Of the dam, Snowden remarked, "She's very special. Her record speaks for itself. I'm sure one of her stock are going to get somewhere near her [talent], and it could be this filly."

Comparing his newest purchase to her siblings, Snowden said, "She's a lot stronger--that's what I like about her. The Shamardal filly was very backward and it's taken her a while to get there. The Medaglia d'Oro is a nice colt, but this filly is a bit above those two."

Fastnet Rock fillies have proven extremely popular this week.

"They've sold really well at this sale and they're lovely fillies," Snowden noted. "There's already been a good one in Atlantic Jewel and there's going to be more to come, so hopefully it's this one."

Coolmore struck for a A\$1.75-million Fastnet Rock filly during Wednesday's second session, and they added another daughter of their champion sire to their arsenal Thursday when prevailing at A\$700,000 for lot 424 from Milburn Creek, which consigned the A\$2.2 million sale-topping Snitzel colt Wednesday and ended the sale as leading consignor by average with all six consignees selling for an average of A\$679,167.

Lot 424's family is one that has served Coolmore well in both hemispheres; the filly is a half-sister, bred on the same sireline, to dual hemisphere champion sprinter Starspangledbanner (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}), who Coolmore bought prior to his victories in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup, as well as the dam of G1 Thousand Guineas victress Amicus (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). It is also the family of Coolmore's exciting 3-year-old in Ireland Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), winner of last year's G2 Vintage S., who is currently 12-1 for both the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby.

WinStar 'Ready' for Aussie Investment...

The Easter sale has seen strong representation from American buyers, including Stonestreet, Spendthrift and Roy and Gretchen Jackson, and Kentucky powerhouse WinStar dipped its foot into the Australian market for the first time Thursday when partnering with the China Horse Club and Stonestreet on a A\$450,000 More Than Ready colt (lot 427).

WinStar are well familiar with the sire, which they stand in Kentucky, and they have a history with both partners: WinStar campaigns dual Grade I winner and GI Kentucky Derby hopeful and 'TDN Rising Star' Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) with Stonestreet, and in February the China Horse Club bought into WinStar's GI Champagne S. winner Daredevil (More Than Ready).

"We purchased a share in Daredevil, a Grade I-winning son of More Than Ready who WinStar own in America [in partnership with Let's Go Stable], so that's how the relationship began," explained the China Horse Club's Michael Wallace, who signed the ticket. "I guess they've seen the buoyancy of the Australian stallion market and decided to join us in a really great colt. It's a great privilege to have them on board and be associated with them."

Consigned by Kia-Ora Stud, the chestnut colt is out of Gunawati (Aus) (Galileo {Ire}) from the extended family of Royal Academy and Storm Cat. Wallace said he would likely go into training with Peter and Paul Snowden, who already train for the burgeoning Stonestreet Stable in Australia, including G2 Challenge S. winner Miracles of Life (Aus) (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}).

WinStar's Elliott Walden jetted into town last week to inspect Easter yearlings, but left before the start of the sale.

"I spoke with Elliott when he was down and he got a feel for the market and things like that, which is great," Wallace said. "It's good to see more international buyers looking at Australia as an option."

Queen Elizabeth S. WIN AND YOU'RE IN Output Description:

CONTRIBUTER OUT FOR THIRD GROUP 1

Godolphin's **Contributer (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) is widely expected to record a fourth consecutive victory and third at the highest level when he faces the starter in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. The handsome bay, who was a dual listed winner in the UK, has magnificently adapted to his new surroundings and was most impressive when taking the G1 Ranvet S. Mar. 21 courtesy of a devastating turn of foot. However, the blossoming import finds himself up against the stiffest opposition since relocating Down Under, with nine other Group 1 winners lining up for the feature event on day two of The Championships. The rating of the 2000-meter Queen Elizabeth II S. has progressed steadily since 2008, and the race's appeal received an additional boost last year with the creation of The Championships, which saw its purse jumping from A\$500,000 to a whopping A\$4 million, the richest prize money in the world for a turf race over the distance. Chris Waller, who saddles three runners in this year's renewal, has described the Queen Elizabeth as 'the new Cox Plate.'

The trio of Waller trainees is precisely led by Coolmore's Cox Plate hero Adelaide (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who will be making his second and final start in Australia before embarking on a return flight to Ballydoyle. The globetrotting 4-year-old won the GI Secretariat S. last term and made a major impression when storming from last to first despite a wide trip in the Spring Carnival's leading weight-for-age contest. Waller has however expressed doubts about his charge's ability to cope with soft ground, with showers expected over Sydney Friday and Saturday. "[Ballydoyle trainer] Aidan [O'Brien] said he needs the ground to be vibrating under him to be at his best," the trainer told Racenet.

The Japanese pair Tosen Stardom (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and To The World (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) both bumped into Godolphin imports on their Australian debut--Contributer in the Ranvet and Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) in the G1 BMW S, respectively-and will be bidding to emulate their compatriot Real Impact (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) who struck gold in the G1 George Ryder S. To The World was the subject of a jockey controversy this week after connections expressed discontent about Nick Hall's ride in the BMW and opted to call upon Hong Kong ace Zac Purton for Saturday's race. Hall brought the case before Racing New South Wales stewards, arguing that he had been engaged to partner the horse in both Group 1 contests, and has been entitled to a winning or losing riding fee, which could amount to A\$118,800 in case of victory by To The World.

More international flavor comes courtesy of Ed Dunlop's Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who eventually opted for this race instead of the two-mile G1 Sydney Cup. "We came to the conclusion that two miles on a soft track might be hard on him," said Dunlop, who landed in Sydney Thursday. "I went to see him as soon as I got here and he is bright and happy

and looks well," the trainer continued. Worse than the likelihood of soft ground, Dunlop's main worry is his former charge Contributer. "We had Contributer in the stable and I thought he would be a Melbourne Cup horse, but he was sold to Sheikh Mohammed and now we

are racing against him," he said. "That's the way it goes. The amount of money that is on offer for our stayers to race in Australia is too much to turn down."

David Hayes and Tom Dabernig send out a pair of live chances in **Spillway (GB)** (Rail Link {GB}), the narrow winner of the G1 Australian Cup last time out, and **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring {Aus}), who found only Real Impact too good in the George Ryder S.

HARTNELL LOOKS FOR GODOLPHIN DOUBLE

Godolphin could be in line for a Group 1 double on day two of The Championships as the 'Boys In Blue' send out a pair of British imports carrying odds-on favorite status. Some 40 minutes before Contributer (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire})'s bid in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S., Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) will attempt to score a second consecutive victory at the highest level in the G1 Sydney Cup, following his dominant performance in the G1 BMW S. at Rosehill Mar. 28. The 4-year-old hasn't put a foot wrong since shipping from the Middleham stable of Mark Johnston-he would actually be unbeaten in three starts if he hadn't run against his aforementioned stablemate on his Australian debut in the G1 Chipping Norton S. Feb 28. Cont. p13



Saturday's line-up, however, appears stronger than in previous renewals of the staying contest, a fact probably helped by the extra A\$600,000 that has been added to the overall prizemoney since The Offer (Aus) (Montjeu {Ire}) won it last year. **Protectionist (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) returns to the trip that saw him win the

G1 Melbourne Cup, but faces a stiff task as he gives weight to the entire field, including a massive six kilos (13 pounds) to the favorite. The former Germantrained galloper failed to make the switch to middle distances, running sixth in the 1800-meter G2 Peter Young S. and eighth in the 10-furlong G1 Australian Cup, but showed some marked improvement in the 2400-meter G1 BMW, where he rallied on strongly to finish fifth behind Hartnell. The Kris Lees trainee bids to become the first horse

since Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) to register the Melbourne Cup-Sydney Cup double--Australia's only two Group 1 races run over two miles.

Chris Waller's **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital {NZ}), third in Protectionist's Melbourne Cup, was two lengths ahead of this rival in the BMW and appears well handicapped. Waller has been upbeat about his charge, who won the G1 Auckland Cup over the same trip in 2014. "There is no better form than the Melbourne Cup for a two-mile race," he said. "Who Shot Thebarman has really matured. He is a much stronger horse and has had the perfect preparation."

Hong Kong raider **Dominant (Ire)** (Cacique {Ire}) is an interesting candidate as he tackles the trip for the first time. His last victory came in the 2400-meter G1 Hong Kong Vase in 2013, a race in which he ran fourth last season, and he was fifth to Contributer in the 2000-meter Ranvet S. on his first start in Australia. Joao Moreira takes over in the saddle from Damien Oliver.

A deep field of 13 fillies goes to post for the G1 Seven News Australian Oaks at Royal Randwick Saturday, with **Savaria (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}) an interesting challenger from New Zealand. The Roydon Bergerson trainee filly brings Classic form to the table,

having won the G1 New Zealand Oaks at Trentham on her last start Mar. 14. However, a race that would appear to hold the key to finding the winner of Saturday's race is the Mar. 28 G1 Vinery Stud S. run at Rosehill. Four of the

first five finishers from that race renew their rivalry in the Oaks, headed by the victorious **Fenway (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). That score, which was her first since winning her maiden at first asking at Bendigo in October, represented a career best for the A\$700,000 Inglis Easter yearling purchase and she should appreciate the step-up to 2400 meters.

Despite only finishing fifth in the Vinery Stud, the Chris Waller trained **Winx** (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) looks like starting favourite for the race, based partly on her penultimate outing in which she beat Hauraki (Aus) (Reset {Aus}) in the G2 Phar Lap S. at Rosehill Mar. 14. This piece of form looks even better now following the classy effort of Hauraki in claiming second behind Mongolian Khan (NZ) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in Monday's G1 Australian Derby. Joao Moreira takes over in the saddle from Tommy Berry on Saturday, with the latter set to steer her stablemate **Wine Tales** (Aus) (Tale of the Cat).

Further intrigue is added to the race with the presence of Vinery Stud third and fourth Thunder Lady (NZ) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) and Ballet Suite (Aus) (High Chaparral {Ire}). Thunder Lady, trained by John Sargent at Randwick, was a high-class runner last year, winning the G2 Wakeful S. at Flemington Nov. 1 and following up with a second in the G1 Crown Oaks five days later. She has taken a few runs to recapture her form this term, but seems to be peaking at the right time. Coolmore and partners' Ballet Suite gives trainer Chris Waller a strong hand in the race, and has the added benefit of having Ryan Moore in the saddle. Ballet Suite is another that should appreciate the stiffer distance test.

The most recent form in the race is represented by Candelara (Aus) (Real Saga {Aus}) with trainer Bjorn Baker obviously happy to turn out last Mondays G3 Adrian Knox S. right back.

She is also bidding for her first Group 1 success but brings high class form to the table. Conqueror of next-out Group 1 winner Plucky Belle (Aus) (Mossman {Aus}) in the G2 Millie Fox S. Feb. 21, she was runner-up in the G1 Canterbury S. at this venue Mar. 7 and her recent win in the G2 Emancipation S. at Rosehill Mar. 28 sees her arrive in top form. Joao Moreira jets back into Sydney to ride.

First Seal (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) bids to make amends for a narrow defeats in the G1 Coolmore Stud S. Mar. 14 and in the G1 Vinery Stud S. at Rosehill a fortnight later and takes her chance despite a recent scare. Having finished with blood in her nostril after Rosehill, First Seal was subsequently cleared to race after an inspection by Racing NSW vet Craig Suann. Her trainer John Thompson told ANZ Bloodstock News on Wednesday, "She worked over 1200 metres with a mate this morning. I think once they saw the cuts on her head it was obvious something had happened but the stewards are just doing their due diligence and all is good."

Fresh from landing his third G1 Australian Derby on Monday, New Zealand trainer Murray Baker fields two fillies in the 1600-meter event. **Diademe (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}), winner of the G1 Thoroughbred Breeders S. at Te Aroha Apr. 4 has the valuable assistance of Ryan Moore, while **Sports Illustrated (NZ)** (Fast 'N' Famous {Aus}), reopposes her stablemate having been denied by just a neck in the same race last week.

A trio of Group 1 winners at two--Coolmore's Gleneagles (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Qatar Racing's Elm Park (GB) (Phoenix Reach {Ire}) and Khalid Abdullah's Epicuris (GB) (Rail Link {GB})--headline 12 second entries for the G1 Investec Derby, to be held at Epsom Downs June 6.The cost to make a second entry to

Britain's richest race was £8,000 and the additions mean there are now 110 horses remaining engaged in the premier Classic.

Gleneagles captured the G1 National S. at the Curragh last autumn and was also first-past-the-post in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere on Arc day. He is currently the

ante-post favorite for first British Classic, the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, May 2. Elm Park was impressive when winning the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in October and, like Gleneagles, is expected to resume in the 2000 Guineas. Criquette Head-Maarek is maintaining her faith in Epicuris, the winner of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud last season, despite the colt having suffered his first defeat Monday in the G3 Prix La Force. The Juddmonte homebred will start next in the G2 Prix Greffuhle on Saint-Cloud's left-handed course, which has proved a successful prep race for Epsom's Blue Riband.

Two more French-trained contenders, both unbeaten in two outings, have been given Derby entries. They are Gestut Ammerland's **Grey Lion (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), a full-brother to dual Classic heroine Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in training with Andre Fabre, and Sheikh Abdulla bin Khalifa Al Thani's **Migwar (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}), who was saddled by Freddy Head to take a conditions race by five lengths on his seasonal reappearance. Migwar will also contest the Prix Greffulhe ahead of a potential trip to Epsom.

Other second entrants include Al Shaqab's **Moheet** (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who cost 800,000gns at the Tattersalls Craven breeze-up sale and was a widemargin winner of his only start last October for Richard Hannon; David Simcock's **Balios** (Ire) (Shamardal), also a winner on his lone start to date; Yarmouth maiden victors **Bartholomew Fair** (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and **White** Lake (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), both representing the Luca Cumani-Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum tandem who combined to win the 1998 Derby with High-Rise (Ire) (High Estate {GB}; as well as Marco Botti's **Puissant** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Patrick Shanahan's **Carbon Dating** (Ire) (The Carbon Unit), and William Haggas' **Storm The Stars** (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

There are two remaining options for horses to be added to the Derby. They can guarantee their place in the line-up by winning the G3 Derby Trial, run at Epsom Apr. 22, or be supplemented at a cost of £75,000 on Monday, June 1.

Horse of the Year **Designs on Rome** (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), but not **Luger (Aus)** (Choisir {Aus}), recent winner of the prestigious Hong Kong Derby. The race has received a 43% hike in purse money from HK\$14 million to HK\$20 million (US\$2,580,628).

Fresh off a deceptively good fourth-place effort in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic over 2410 meters, Designs on Rome is set to cut back to his pet trip of 10 furlongs at which he has registered four wins from five tries. He is a two-time winner at the distance this season, having defeated

Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup this past December and the G1 Hong Kong Gold Cup Mar. 1. The latter, who announced his arrival on the international stage when besting California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) in the 2013 QE II Cup, was just touched off by Designs on Rome 12 months ago and could look to turn the tables this time around.

A pair of runners set to make an appearance in the Australian version of the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at The Championships at Randwick this Saturday are also among the invitees. Ron Arculli, former chief executive of the HKJC, could be represented in the race by the pouplar globetrotter **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who achieved one of his career highwater marks in the 2012 Hong Kong Cup over the 2400 meters at Sha Tin. The 9-year-old exits a running-on fifth in the G1 Australian Cup at Flemington Mar. 14. **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring {Aus}) also sports solid Hong Kong form, having put a scare into the locals when a good third for trainer David Hayes in December's Hong Kong Cup.

Smoking Sun (Smart Strike) announced himself as a potential player on the international stage when coming home second to Hong Kong's Dan Excel (Ire) (Shamardal) while finishing ahead of Military Attack in last year's G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji. The Niarchos homebred, trained by Pascal Bary, returned to action with an eighth behind Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt over unsuitably easy ground at Longchamp Apr. 6.

Helene Happy Star (Ire) (Zamindar) represents the local 4-year-old form, but he will not be joined in the gate by Luger, who defeated him two lengths into fourth in the Hong Kong Derby Mar. 15. Luger is expected to take on world joint-highest rated horse Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) in the G1 BMW Champions Mile May 3.

"The APQEII Cup is ranked among the top 20 Group 1 races in the world and the quality of the 13 selected runners for this year's race certainly lives up to that," commented Bill Nader, executive director of racing for the HKJC. "The Hong Kong contingent features two past winners in Designs On Rome and Military Attack, both of whom are well-established among the best 2000-meter turf runners in the world, and, as usual, we have some talented challengers flying in from overseas."

Churchill Tightens Oaks/Derby Security Measures:

Churchill Downs has announced it will no longer allow re-entry on Kentucky Oaks and Derby days due to security issues regarding wait times at entry gates and growing concern for patrons victimized by the sale of counterfeit tickets and wristbands outside track gates.

"The decision to prohibit re-entry to ticketed patrons who leave the grounds is a common security policy at major sports and entertainment events and is long overdue at the home of the Kentucky Oaks and Derby," said Ryan Jordan, General Manager of Churchill Downs Racetrack. "This change in policy is intended to improve the arrival experience of our guests by shortening the entry lines into the facility and to better safeguard our guests from purchasing counterfeit tickets outside of our gates."


