

VALUE SIRES PART I: THE NEWCOMERS

The holiday season is done and dusted for another year, but for those in the bloodstock business the most prized packages remain wrapped and hidden away. In the coming weeks and months, another year's worth of planning, investment and anticipation will come to fruition in the form of a fresh crop of foals frolicking the paddocks, and the cycle of boundless optimism that has fueled the Thoroughbred business for so many years will begin anew.

And one cycle rolls right into the next, as foaling season brings with it the endlessly fascinating task of planning a new round of matings. Proven sires and those on the bubble are joined by yet another intake of young pretenders. Over the coming weeks the *TDN* will present its annual multi-part Value Sires series, analyzing stallions by sire crop and career stage. We begin this week with the new class of 2020 and will advance through stallions with first foals, yearlings and runners, and later look at the stallions who have already proven their worth on the racecourse, highlighting value at each level.

That begs the question, what is value in the bloodstock business?

For the end-user, value is doubtless turning a modest nomination fee into a reliable money-spinner that turns up year after year on the racecourse. But this style of breeding is falling out of fashion in favour of a mating that will meet the demands of the yearling sale market, and in this realm value is most likely to be found among the young sires who have not yet had the opportunity to decrease their worth with progeny on the racecourse.

While the definition of value is muddled, for the purposes of this series we will look to strike a happy medium between those sires whose progeny are likelier to earn their keep on the racecourse, and those that may prove most fruitful earlier on in sales rings. At the end of each installment we will present a podium of value for the sire crop.

Standing alone at the top of the fee table for his sire crop is **Too Darn Hot (GB)**, Darley's triple Group 1-winning and dual Cartier champion son of Dubawi who starts out at Dalham Hall Stud alongside his sire for £50,000. **Cont. p2**

That is fully double the fee that Dubawi--a Group 1 winner at two and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois winner at three--commanded when he retired to Dalham Hall in 2006, and the manner in which Dubawi clawed his way to the top means his son won't have to do the same. It won't be lost on breeders, either, that Dubawi's Night of Thunder (Ire) is this year's leading first-season sire in Europe, the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Lockinge S. winner having notched an eye-popping seven black-type winners in 2019. The fact that he has already left the likes of Makfi (GB)--in turn the sire of another useful young sire in Make Believe (GB)--as well as Poet's Word (GB) and Al Kazeem (GB), who have both enjoyed success from limited opportunities, bodes well for the preservation of Dubawi's line, and Too Darn Hot should be short odds to top the table. He is beautifully bred, being out of Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), who is not only a triple Group 1 winner and prolific stakes producer, but also a half-sister to leading sire Darshaan (GB). He was the unbeaten 2-year-old champion, besting the subsequent Irish 2000 Guineas winner Phoenix of Spain (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) in the G2 Champagne S. and the G1 Commonwealth Cup winner Advertise (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) and G1 Investec Derby winner Anthony Van Dyck (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. He added two more Group 1s at three: the Prix Jean Prat over

seven furlongs and the one-mile Sussex S., where he beat the G1 St James's Palace S. winner Circus Maximus (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Too Darn Hot was Europe's best miling 3-year-old in 2019 and duly earned divisional honours at the Cartier awards. Too Darn Hot retained the same level of brilliance across both seasons, posting RPRs of 125 at both two and three.

Too Darn Hot isn't the only champion and multiple Group 1 winner that Darley introduces alongside his sire in 2020: at Kildangan Stud it is the triple Royal Ascot hero **Blue Point (Ire)**, who stands in the same yard as his sire Shamardal at €45,000.

While Galileo and Dubawi once again occupy the top two spots on Europe's general sires table, there should be little doubt that it was Shamardal who closed out the year as the sire of the moment, his Group 1-winning juveniles Pinatubo (Ire), Earthlight (Ire) and Victor Ludorum (Ire) putting the exclamation point on a stellar season that was kick-started with a win by Castle Lady (Ire) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and Blue Point himself in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint over the subsequent G1 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint heroine Belvoir Bay (GB) (Equiano {Fr}). By that point, the 5-year-old Blue Point's reputation was already well established: the winner of the G2 Gimcrack S. and placed in two Group 1s at two, Blue Point won the G3 Pavilion S. and the G3 Bengough S. at three and was third in the G1 Commonwealth Cup.

The fastest son of KINGMAN

Just 10 days after his runaway debut success at Newmarket, **CALYX** won the **Coventry Stakes-Gr.2** from triple Group 1 winner **Advertise**

He took the G1 King's Stand S. over the record-setting sprinter Battaash (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) back at Royal Ascot at four, but it is doubtless that it was at five when Blue Point was at his best. He was unbeaten in five starts this year--three at Meydan and the King's Stand and G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot, after which connections called time on his career. He earned a career-best RPR of 127 in the King's Stand and ran RPRs of 121-plus in every race this year.

Advertise (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) may have had to play second-fiddle to Too Darn Hot in the Dewhurst last year, but he built on victories in the G1 Phoenix S. and G2 July S. to take command of the 3-year-old sprinters' division in 2019. After failing to see out the mile in the G1 2000 Guineas, he dropped back to six furlongs to win the Commonwealth Cup with a career-best RPR of 121. Second to Ten Sovereigns (Ire) (No Nay Never) in the G1 July Cup, Advertise bounced back to add the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest against elders. Bred by Cheveley Park Stud out of a daughter of that nursery's potent Pivotal (GB), Advertise is the first six furlong Group 1 winner at two and three to retire to stud in Britain since Oasis Dream--who also happens to be his grandsire. Advertise starts out at the National Stud at £25,000.

Coolmore introduces a trio of newcomers next season, with this year's G1 2000 Guineas winner **Magna Grecia (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) introduced at €22,500. Continuing the theme that permeates through most of the highest-regarded young stallions, Magna Grecia was a Group 1 winner at two who held his form to win again at the highest level at three. Both his top-level wins came over a mile: he beat Phoenix of Spain and stablemate Circus Maximus (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Vertem Futurity Trophy at two and on his next start took this year's G1 2000 Guineas with an RPR of 121. It is likewise not a coincidence, being among the elite group to retire to stud, that Magna Grecia is from a red-hot sireline and Invincible Spirit's

stock just seems to keep rising. Kingman (GB) has built on the promise he laid down last year to stamp himself as one of the hottest sires on the planet, while Cable Bay sits second on the first-season sires' table and I Am Invincible (Aus) continues to fly the flag Down Under. Other representatives of the dynasty include Lawman (Fr) and Charm Spirit (Ire), while the first yearlings by Shalaa (Ire) were highly sought after this year. Magna Grecia is one of four sons of Invincible Spirit to retire in Europe for 2020.

Kingman's potency perhaps needs no better plug than the fact that the shrewd folks at Coolmore have decided to invest in it with the purchase of the sire's first stakes winner, **Calyx (GB)**, who stands for €22,500 in Co. Tipperary next year and is Kingman's first son at stud. Calyx is a Juddmonte homebred from a long line as such; his fourth dam, Populi (Star Envoy), was bought by Khalid Abdullah for \$2-million at Keeneland November in 1983 and Khalid Abdullah bred Kingman's first three dams. First dam Helleborine (GB) (Observatory) won the G3 Prix d'Aumale and was second in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, and Calyx certainly inherited her precocity. A **'TDN Rising Star'** when winning by five lengths on debut in Newmarket last June, he beat Advertise by a length in the G2 Coventry S. just 10 days later. He suffered a setback thereafter which ruled him out until May, when he won the G3 Pavilion S., and met with his first defeat when second in the G2 Sandy Lane S., after which he was retired. Calyx was blessed with the incredible turn of foot that his sire used to such affect and that many of his best progeny possess. While it is a shame that we never truly knew where Calyx ranked among the best sprinters of his generation, he is a young sire that will get every shot to wind up among the best of them at stud.

It is noteworthy that Coolmore is retiring no sons of Galileo this year, and **Ten Sovereigns (Ire)**, like his sire No Nay Never, could prove a valuable outcross to the great champion and begins at €25,000 at Coolmore.

Like Too Darn Hot, Ten Sovereigns was an unbeaten Group 1 winner at two, taking the six-furlong Middle Park S. in addition to the G3 Round Tower S. Like Advertise he failed to see out the eight furlongs of the 2000 Guineas, and connections were rewarded for cutting him back in trip with a win over Advertise, and elders, in the G1 July Cup. Ten Sovereigns is out of a daughter of Exceed and Excel, who is proving very worthy as a broodmare sire, with this year alone with the Derby winner Anthony Van Dyck in addition to Ten Sovereigns to his credit.

It is likely a sign of the times that of the five highest-priced colts to retire in Europe for 2020, none won a Group 1 beyond a mile. It is good news for racing, however, that the likes of Stradivarius, Sottsass, Japan and Ghaiyyath remain in training next year. And while Crystal Ocean (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), the joint-highest rated horse in the world this year (at the time of publication), is headed straight off the bat to do National Hunt duty for Coolmore. However, one of the two horses he shares the title with, **Waldgeist (Ire)**, is available at Ballyinch Stud for €17,500.

The only elite son of Galileo (Ire) to retire for 2020, Waldgeist truly packs a punch with both his race record and pedigree. He is the first foal out of the exciting young producer Waldlerche (GB) (Monsun {Ger}), a half-sister to the G1 St Leger winner Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). Waldgeist won two of his three starts at two, including the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. He was a short head away from victory in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at three and earned his first Group 1 at four in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud going 2400 metres.

Waldgeist was undoubtedly at his best this year at five, however, winning three of his five starts including the G1 Prix

Ganay and the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, and finishing third in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. behind Crystal Ocean and Enable (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}), respectively. Waldgeist was the joint highest-rated horse in the world this year with those two rivals on a mark of 128 and earned RPRs of 128, 126 and 124. He was a model of consistency through his four seasons on the track, winning or placing in 15 of his 21 starts and winning eight pattern races.

Waldgeist is brought to you by the stud that produced the ascendant Lope de Vega, and that one's first Classic winner, **Phoenix of Spain (Ire)**, debuts at the Irish National Stud for €15,000. Phoenix of Spain was good enough at two to win the G3 Acomb S. and finish runner-up to Too Darn Hot in the Dewhurst and Magna Grecia in the Vertem Futurity Trophy--

running the eventual 2000 Guineas winner to a head in the latter--and he turned the table on both those rivals when earning a 120 RPR on seasonal debut in the Irish 2000 Guineas.

Starting out at £15,000 in Newmarket are a pair of 2018 Derby winners: the Epsom hero **Masar (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) and the G1 Prix du Jockey Club victor **Study of Man (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}).

Masar is an excellent example of that coveted blend of speed and stamina, and he has the pedigree to boot. Fast enough to beat the four-time group-winning sprinter Invincible Army (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) on debut in May of his 2-year-old season, Masar ran five times that campaign, winning the G3 Solario S. over the eventual Irish 2000 Guineas and Prix Jacques le Marois victor Romanised (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and finishing third in the G1 Prix Jean Luc Lagardere. Masar won the G3 Craven S. by

nine lengths with Roaring Lion (Kitten's Joy) back in third, and after finishing third in the 2000 Guineas he won the Derby with an RPR of 122.

Masar is out of the G2 UAE Derby and G3 UAE Oaks winner Khawlah (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and his third dam is Melikah (Ire) (Lammtarra), who was placed in both the English and Irish Oaks and is a half-sister to none other than Sea the Stars (Ire) and Galileo (Ire). Masar, therefore, possesses an intriguing blend of speed, stamina, pedigree and talent, and he is an imposing individual who really fills the eye.

Similarly, Study of Man—standing at Lanwades—boasts one of the most sought-after pedigrees in the stud book, and one that will be an outcross to much of the European mare population. He is out of a Storm Cat daughter of the great Miesque, and it is a family that has already produced the sires Kingmambo, Miesque's Son and Karakontie (Jpn), who has three stakes winners from his initial crop this year. Study of Man won his only start at two, over a mile at Saint-Cloud in September, and he clearly relished the step up to 2100 metres, taking the G2 Prix Greffulhe and the G1 Prix du Jockey Club. He was not disgraced when ninth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths, by Enable in last year's Arc, and he picked up two Group 1 seconds this year in the Prix Ganay and Prix d'Ispahan.

A pair of multiple group-winning sprinters by highly sought-after sires start out in Ireland next year at €10,000. **Soldier's Call (GB)**, in addition to Advertise, is the second son of Showcasing to go to stud in 2020; he is available at Ballyhane Stud. Soldier's Call was an admirably tough juvenile who carried his form through his 3-year-old campaign. Soldier's Call won the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot, the G3 Prix d'Arenberg at Chantilly and the G2 Flying Childers S. at Doncaster during an eight-race 2-year-old campaign last year that also included a third-place finish, beaten a neck, against older horses in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye followed by a sixth in the inaugural Listed Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint. Soldier's Call failed to find the winner's enclosure this year at three but still posted a career-best RPR of 116 when second to Battaash in his record-setting G1 Nunthorpe S. He was also third in the G1 King's Stand S.

Yeomanstown Stud debuts **Invincible Army (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), one of four sons of Invincible Spirit to retire in Europe next year. Invincible Army is out of Rajeem (GB) (Diktat {GB}), the G1 Falmouth S. winner and close relative to this year's

G3 Fred Darling S. winner Dandhu (GB) (Dandy Man {Ire}). Invincible Army made seven starts at two, winning the G3 Sirenia S. and placing in the G3 Molecomb S., G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S. He added the G3 Pavilion S. at three but it was really this year at four that he was at his best. He earned RPRs of 118 when winning both the G2 Duke of York Clipper Logistics S. and the G3 Chipchase S., and he picked up a Group 1 placing when third in the Flying Five S.

Another son of Invincible Spirit to join the ranks is Tally-Ho

Stud's **Inns Of Court (Ire)**, who debuts at €7,500. Racing as a homebred for Godolphin and Andre Fabre, Inns Of Court was a debut winner at Chantilly at two. Dropped back to seven furlongs after failing to hit the board in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at three, he ticked off wins in the G3 Prix du Palais-Royal and the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot, and earned an RPR of 120 when second to Al Wukair (Ire) (Dream Ahead)—with Thunder Snow (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}) back in third—in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. Inns Of

Court won the G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis over six furlongs at four last year and was a short-head second to One Master (GB) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the G1 Prix de la Foret, and he recorded a career-best RPR of 121 this year when winning the five-furlong G2 Prix du Gros-Chene by 2 1/2 lengths.

Inns Of Court is out of the Seeking The Gold mare Learned Friend (Ger), a half-sister to Fierement (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), a dual Group 1-winning stayer this year and last in Japan.

Siyouni (Fr) has made a big impact in France and beyond in the early stages of his stud career, and thus his first sons to retire to stud are likely to be met with great interest; those include in Britain this year Overbury Stud's **Le Brivido (Fr)** and in France, Haras d'Etream's **City Light (Fr)**.

Initially trained by Andre Fabre, Le Brivido beat none other than the triple Grade I winner Uni (More Than Ready) on debut at two. He won a Chantilly conditions race at first asking at three before finishing a short-head second to Brametot (Fr) (Style Vendome {Fr}) from the dreaded outside 13 gate. Le Brivido bounced back to take Royal Ascot's G3 Jersey S. over seven furlongs in a faster time than both Ribchester (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) and Expert Eye (GB) (Acclamation {GB}), and he retired rated higher than both his sire and his grandsire, Pivotal (GB). He starts out at £7,000 in 2020.

Highclere Stud, which this year provided the second-ranked first-season sire Cable Bay (Ire), next year brings you **Land Force (Ire)**, who joins Ten Sovereigns as a first-crop son of No Nay Never to retire to stud, at £6,500. A €350,000 yearling, Land Force is beautifully bred being a half-brother to the dual Grade I-winning Photo Call (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and from the family of this year's standout mare Magical (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and many, many other Group 1 winners. Land Force won last year's G2 Richmond S. and Listed Tipperary S. and was third in the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot.

In addition to its flagship newcomer Advertise, The National Stud debuts last year's G1 Irish St Leger winner **Flag Of Honour (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) as a dual purpose prospect at £4,500. Flag Of Honour, a half-brother to three stakes winners including sires Misu Bond (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Air Chief Marshal (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), won the G3 Eyrefield S. at two and the Irish Leger and two other pattern races at three. He was this year runner-up to Magical on three occasions, including the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup.

A Bright Light In France

City Light, at €7,000 at Etreham, is the most expensive flat stallion to retire to France next year. A debut winner going a mile at Saint-Cloud at two, he skipped the Classics at three in favour of sprint trips, and before the year was out he picked up a conditions win over six furlongs and three black-type placings. City Light got off the mark at pattern level at four when winning the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges over five furlongs, after which he was a short-head second to Merchant Navy (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot. That effort earned him an RPR of 121, and City Light carried his form through to his 5-year-old campaign this year, when he won the seven-furlong G3 Prix du Pin and was second in the G1 Prix de la Foret. While City Light's dam, Light Saber (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}), did not earn black-type, his next two dams boast plenty of class; second dam Leariva (Irish River {Fr}) won Laurel Park's G1 International S. in 1991, while third dam Leandra (Fr) (Luthier {Fr}) was France's high-weighted 2-year-old filly of 1980.

Also in France, Haras de la Barbottiere had great cause to celebrate on Oct. 19 when **Donjuan Triumphant (Ire)** at last picked up an elusive Group 1 win in the British Champions Sprint S. at Ascot with an RPR of 120. The son of Dream Ahead had won the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte by a stylish 5 1/2-

lengths at two but his only other black-type win in 29 starts in the interim had come in a listed event at Doncaster last November. That hardly tells the whole story, though; in that time period he was also second in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at three, third in last year's British Champions Sprint S. and picked up a total of six black-type placings. The dark bay, who comes from the classy extended family of champions Scorpio (Fr) and Sagaro (GB), is available for €4,000 in 2020.

Also joining the ranks at Barbottiere at €3,000 is **Robin Of Navan (Fr)** (American Post {GB}), who defeated the dual G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe-placed Cloth Of Stars (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud at two. He won at pattern level again at four and this year at six and was placed at Group 1 level in France and Italy.

France receives a genetic goldmine in the form of Gleneagles (Ire)'s full-brother **Taj Mahal (Ire)**; the son of Galileo and the standout producer You'resothrilling (Storm Cat) won three group races between a mile and a mile and a half Down Under and he stands at Haras de la Haie Neuve for €4,000.

Another classy stayer to start out in France is **Marmelo (GB)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}), who is available at Haras du Grand Courgeon for €3,500. The five-time pattern race winner who signed off with a victory in the G2 Prix de Kergorlay on Aug. 18 is perhaps best known for finishing second in last year's G1 Melbourne Cup.

While City Light is the first son of Siyouni to retire to France, **Roman Candle (Fr)** is the first horse by the similarly meteoric Le Havre (Ire) to go to stud in the country. Godolphin's €190,000 yearling purchase was a winner at two and took this year's G2 Prix Greffulhe and stands for €2,800 at Haras de la Hetraie.

Group 1 Winner New To Germany

Bolstering the German stallion ranks next year is Godolphin's three-time Group 1 winner **Best Solution (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}), who was purchased by a quartet of German studs and will stand at Haras de Auenquelle for €6,500. Best Solution won the G3 Autumn S. at two and was second to Waldgeist in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. He won Lingfield's Listed Derby Trial S. at three and later in the season took the G3 St Simon S. Best Solution truly came of age last year at four, reeling off three consecutive Group 1 wins over a mile and a half: Germany's Grosser Preis von Berlin and Grosser Preis von Baden, and Australia's Caulfield Cup. Best Solution's third dam is the top-class stayer Eva Luna, who passed her marathon talents on to her sons Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}), as well as to her daughters who produced the likes of Derby and Arc winner Workforce (GB) (King's Best).

Value Sires Podium

Gold - Waldgeist (€17,500): the joint highest-rated horse in the world this year was consistently good over four seasons on the track and is a son of Galileo. Just missed in the stallion-making Prix du Jockey Club.

Silver - Masar (€15,000): a precocious 2-year-old who went on to win the Derby from the family of Galileo and Sea The Stars.

Bronze - Calyx (€22,500): the fastest son of Kingman is well-bred and shared his sire's brilliant turn of foot.

CONTRAIL UNBEATEN IN G1 HOPEFUL

Contrail (Jpn) | Horsephotos

Contrail (Jpn) earned his first win at the highest level while remaining undefeated with a professional victory in Saturday's G1 Hopeful S. at Nakayama. Sent off the 2-1 choice in the field of 13, Contrail broke sharply from an inside draw and was immediately settled in a stalking fourth behind Panthalassa (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}), who rushed out from stall nine to set a brisk pace. Gradually improving his position through the last two turns, the favorite easily reached the heels of the leader 400 meters out, took over effortlessly passing the furlong pole and pulled away for a confident 1 1/2-length victory. **Weltreisende (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), settled off the early pace, closed 600 meters out, but was no match for the winner. **Wakea (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) closed from the outside to finish third.

"He was really strong. I didn't have to do anything but just sit

on him," affirmed winning jockey Yuichi Fukunaga, who was winning his third JRA-Group 1 title this year and 25th overall. "He's always been a good starter and I didn't want to pull him back too much. I was able to settle him behind another runner and although [the leader] was racing well up front, I was confident that we could make it through to the end. He does tend to be a little keen, but the training staff had conditioned him to [rate], so it worked well in the race. He really changed his gear effortlessly, but seemed little lost once up front. He is still a little green, which [I suspect] is why Ryan [Moore] rode him the way he did last time. He really showed potential for his upcoming 3-year-old campaign."

Trainer Yoshito Yahagi, who won the G1 Arima Kinen with Lys Gracieux (Jpn) last week, registered his ninth JRA-Group 1 title in the Hopeful.

After breaking his maiden in his September over 1,800 meters, he followed up with an impressive five-length tally in the G3 Tokyo Sports Hai Nisai S. in November, establishing a new course record in the process.

Rhodochrosite, a \$385,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, is a daughter of 2-year-old champion Folklore (Tiznow), who won four of eight career starts for earnings of \$945,500. Among her most notable wins are the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GI Matron S.

KING'S LEGACY BURSTS INTO MAGIC MILLIONS MIX



King's Legacy selling for \$1.4million at Magic Millions | TDNAusNZ

In just the second start of his career, the \$1.4-million yearling purchase King's Legacy (Redoute's Choice) outclassed his opposition in the G3 Magic Millions B.J. McLachlan S.

Leviathan (Zoustar) moved into contention for the Magic Millions Guineas with an impressive win at Randwick, while there was good news and bad news for the stable's two potential 2YO Classic contenders in the Hyland Boxing Day Sale H.--Nitrous earned his spot in the field with a strong come-from-behind win, while the hopes of highly-rated favourite Bartley (Written Tycoon) were extinguished with a luckless third. At Eagle Farm, all eyes were on King's Legacy, who had finished second to Aim in his only previous start at Rosehill on December 11. On Saturday he took a huge step forward.

The Snowdens now have Aim (Star Witness), Nitrous (Deep Field), Sancy (I Am Invincible), Stellar Pauline (Not a Single Doubt), Strike (Spirit of Boom) and King's Legacy among the top 18 qualifiers for the \$2 million Magic Millions 2YO Classic at the Gold Coast on January 11, although Strike is considered an unlikely starter. King's Legacy's performance provided a satisfying end to the Snowdens' day, following a mixed start to the afternoon in Sydney. Ridden by Kerrin McEvoy, the colt settled in third position after Every Rose (Choisir) kicked through inside him to take the lead. Every Rose sprinted well at the top of the straight and looked hard to catch, but King's Legacy worked through his gears in the straight and steadily wore her

down to win by half a length. Euphoric Summer (Not a Single Doubt) ran on from midfield to finish third, almost three lengths adrift of the first pair.

"He produced a great finish," McEvoy said. "He's learned a lot from his trials and through his races. We thought he was a bit unlucky not to go to the wire right alongside Aim, which gave us a good bit of confidence coming into this race today.

"He's sharpened up a bit more from that run, and he's a colt the Snowdens have got heading along the right path. We've always thought he'd want more distance than 1200 metres, and that might well be the case. But now, after this nice win today, he's got to tackle that big race in a couple of weeks' time.

"He jumped nicely and lobbed into a good spot. I was happy to travel in behind Josh (Parr) on Every Rose, knowing they'd take me with them for a good portion of the race.

"Once I got after that filly in the straight, he picked up really well and I always knew he was going to grab her."

Raced by the James Harron colts syndicate, King's Legacy has pocketed \$150,000 in prizemoney to date, with the promise of a lot more to come.

"There's two weeks now to the Magic Millions, if we decide to go there," Peter Snowden said. "That's still to be decided with the owners, but on that effort today, I think there's a good chance he'll be there.

"We thought he'd run well today, although I was a bit surprised that he sat so close to the pace. I was concerned that he might be doing a fair bit of work too early in the race. But good horses are able to keep pulling something out, and he did that today. That's a good sign of what might be to come."

OMAHA BEACH BRILLIANT IN MALIBU; SMITH BREAKS BAILEY'S RECORD

Fox Hill Farms, Inc.'s **Omaha Beach** (War Front) put an exclamation point on his sophomore season with a powerful run as the heavy favorite in Saturday's GI Runhappy Malibu S. at Santa Anita. It was the fourth stakes win on the card for Hall of Famer Mike Smith, but more importantly the 217th Grade I victory of his storied career, surpassing Jerry Bailey's record. Smith tied the record two races earlier aboard **Hard Not to Love** (Hard Spun) in the GI La Brea S.

Pounded at the windows and off at 2-5 facing just four rivals, the future Spendthrift Farm resident Omaha Beach was off cleanly from his outside draw and sat perched out in the clear in fourth down the backside as longshot **Much Better** (Pioneer of the Nile) tore away from them through a :22.43 opening quarter. Smith and Omaha Beach could wait no more entering the turn, and they mounted a sweeping offensive that quickly changed the complexion of the race. Much Better dropped out at that point, with second choice **Complexity** (Maclean's Music) and **Manny Wah** (Will Take Charge) working hard to keep up with the chalk. Any attempts to run with Omaha Beach appeared futile as he continued to cruise on the lead past the quarter pole, and the dark bay cantered home from there while seeming to save something for next month's GI Pegasus World Cup. 'TDN Rising Star' **Roadster** (Quality Road) rallied from last to second, while Manny Wah hung on for third. **Cont. p3**

Omaha Beach hit the board thrice on the grass and once more on the local dirt before finally breaking through by nine lengths in the slop over this track and trip Feb. 2. The light bulb went on after that, and he wasted little time climbing the class ladder, annexing a division of the Gil Rebel S. at Oaklawn by a nose over champion 2-year-old Game Winner (Candy Ride {Arg}) Mar. 16 and besting highly regarded Improbable (City Zip) and subsequent GI Kentucky Derby winner via DQ Country House (Lookin At Lucky) in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 13.

With his stud rights already secured by B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift, he was expected to go favored in the "Run for the Roses", but an entrapped epiglottis required him to scratch at the beginning of Derby week and undergo surgery. When he did race again, he found himself somewhat surprisingly in the Oct. 5 GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship over six panels. **Cont. p4**

That abbreviated trip proved anything but too sharp for Omaha Beach, however, as he reeled in brilliantly quick Shancelot (Shanghai Bobby), who came back to be second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Omaha Beach's connections, meanwhile, had three Breeders' Cup options to consider--the Sprint, GI Dirt Mile or GI Classic--and opted for the middle distance. The even-money choice found himself too far back that day, however, and could only manage second behind a powerhouse performance from up-and-coming fellow 3-year-old Spun to Run (Hard Spun).

When asked after the Malibu if Omaha Beach was the best horse he ever trained, Mandella said, "I can't think of one better, although he hasn't been around long enough of those that stayed forever, [Spendthrift's] Beholder (Henny Hughes) and them, but probably the few times he ever got beat were my fault."

Omaha Beach will race once more in the Jan. 25 Pegasus before heading to Kentucky to begin his second career.

"He's like a son; he's better than a son. He makes me money; he doesn't cost money," Mandella quipped. "I thought about it a lot and I should have spoken to Mr. Porter when he was a 2-year-old and suggest castrating him, and I still haven't. He's a great horse."

After a rough year for Santa Anita and Southern California Racing, the Hall of Famer said, "This is really special for us, Opening Day at Santa Anita, after all the trouble we have been through this year, this place is The Great Race Place and we all need to remember that."

Omaha Beach hails from one of the most potent female lines in the stud book. His dam, a \$3.2-million Keeneland September yearling, is a daughter of three-time GISW Take Charge Lady (Dehere), who was named Broodmare of the Year in 2013 after the exploits of her sons Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song), that year's champion 3-year-old colt; and GISW Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy), the leading third-crop sire who was recently repatriated from Korea. Omaha Beach's half-sister Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway) pulled off a 61-1 shocker at Santa Anita in the 2014 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies en route to an Eclipse Award, and has topped two renewals of the Keeneland November sale--when selling for \$6 million in 2015 and for \$3.2 million in foal to Justify this year. Charming has not produced a foal since Omaha Beach.

"It is very humbling, I am a very blessed man and when you are blessed, opportunities arise, like I get to ride for Mr. Mandella and all kinds of things happen," Smith said after breaking Bailey's record. "It's just amazing, and this horse speaks for everything. He's just beautiful, so fun to be around, so fun to ride, and so fun to train. It just shows how great this horse really is. I'm so happy and so blessed to be a part of it. To surpass Jerry on Omaha Beach even makes it that much more special."

Smith has been following in Bailey's footsteps for a long time: "Jerry is someone that comes from my hometown. I was born in New Mexico, but raised in Texas, in El Paso where he's from. His father was my dentist. I went to the same high school that he did. When his high school gave him an honor, I was in the grandstand watching him. I wasn't even riding yet; I was just a kid. He's always meant a lot to me, so to surpass him means a whole lot."

Hall of Famer Mike Smith racked up 13 of his prior Grade I wins coming from a mile out of it on the back of a John Shirreffs-trained female in Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}), so it was only fitting for him to tie Jerry Bailey's record of 216 Grade I tallies from out of the clouds aboard Hard Not to Love.

The lightly raced 'TDN Rising Star', who lost an eye to infection as a yearling, dropped far back to last while well out in the track as heavy chalk Bellafina showed the way with Mother Mother in hot pursuit through splits of :21.70 and :44.41. Hard Not to Love came alive and began to slingshot past rivals around the turn for home, and was third by about four lengths at the top of the lane. Bellafina fended off Mother Mother, but neither frontrunner had any response for Hard Not to Love, who blew by both like they were standing still late under a demonstrably excited Smith.

"It's quite a feat," Smith said of tying Bailey. "It is something that is going to go up there as one of my greatest achievements. Just to equal a guy like Jerry Bailey is amazing. He's someone I've looked up to for years. That was actually Jerry's celebration out of respect."

“She was really a handful going to the gate,” Shirreffs noted. “She only has the one eye (her right), and when she gets nervous, she tends to spin around to see. This was a great race to win. For a filly to win a Grade I, that’s like a PhD, so it makes it especially fulfilling... Mike has really made a difference with her. When he made the decision to ride her, he put his reputation as a horseman on the line. I think that made this even more special.”



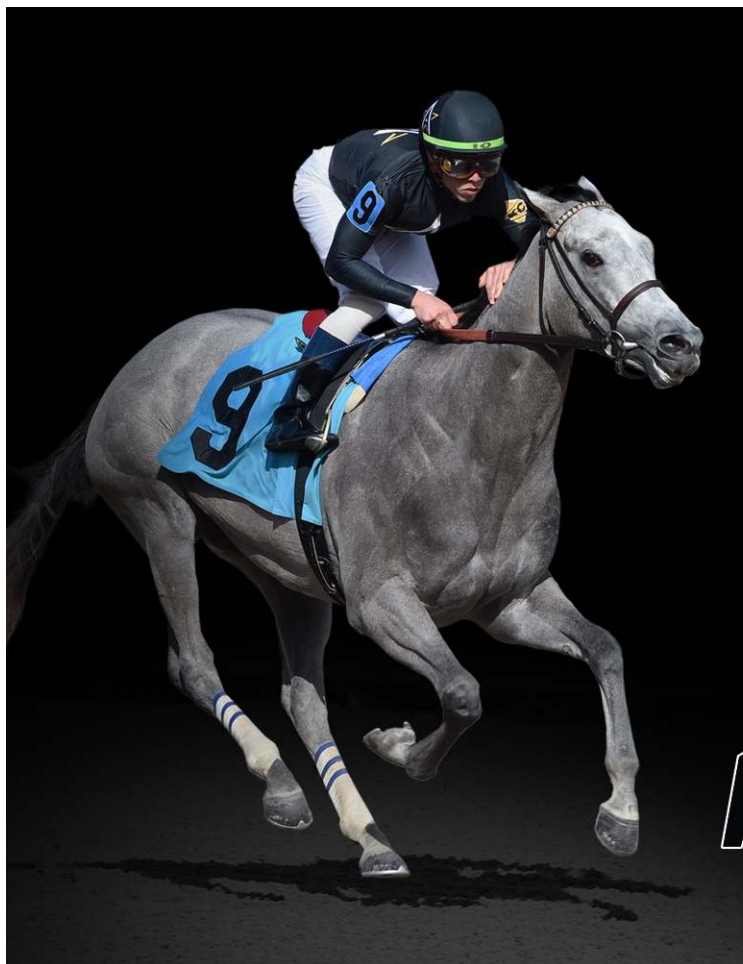

West Point’s Terry Finley added, “I’d like to thank the partners because it all starts with them. We were all excited about the race. We felt the big favorite (Bellafina) on paper would be tough to beat, but that is why they run the races and I’m just proud of the entire team... I love the people from all over who are dedicated to our industry and our horses. If we do that every single day I think our game is going to be better. We are all focused on 2020 and we are going to make this industry better.”

Pedigree Notes:

Hard Not to Love is the 13th highest-level winner (40th graded) for her sire, whose much-deserved first and only Grade I win also came at seven panels in the 2007 King’s Bishop S.

Ontario-based breeder David Anderson paid \$180,000 for the winner’s dam, who boasted a 104 Beyer Speed Figure top herself, at the 2011 Keeneland January sale. Her first foal was Solemn Tribute (Medaglia d’Oro), a \$385,000 KEESEP yearling who would go on to become a stakes winner and graded stakes-placed. Three seasons later came Wonder Gadot (Medaglia d’Oro), who Anderson sold for \$80,000 as a KEESEP yearling. She’d go on to be named Canada’s champion 2-year-old filly in 2017, and champion 3-year-old filly and Horse of the Year in 2018 after annexing the Queen’s Plate, before bringing \$2 million at this year’s Fasig-Tipton November sale. **Cont. p9**

Anderson sold Loving Vindication's unraced 2-year-old Loch Garman (Bodemeister) for \$300,000 at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton October sale, and then bought back the mare for \$1.45 million in that same sales ring that November. Loving Vindication, a daughter of GSW Chimichurri (Elusive Quality), produced a Nyquist filly in 2018 and Curlin colt Apr. 23. She was bred back to Medaglia d'Oro.

An A.P. Indy half-sister to Loving Vindication produced this year's GI Beholder Mile S. heroine Secret Spice (Discreet Cat), who would go on to fetch \$1.4 million at Fasig November.

Lady Prancealot parlayed a perfect trip under a gutsy Joe Bravo ride to grab her first Grade I trophy Saturday at Santa Anita. Unhurried early and unaffected by jostling into the first bend that impacted Mucho Unusual, the bay revved up as she had two beaten heading for home. She sliced through a seam and back down to the fence to confront Mucho Unusual for the stretch drive, and powered past that foe determinedly to earn the decision.

“I was just glad to be sitting on Lady Prancealot this afternoon,” Bravo said. “I take my hat off to [trainer] Richard [Baltas] and his team. She was so relaxed post break, so turned off and relaxed like she had full control over the whole race. All I had to do was point her to the hole turning for home and she took me through. She made my job easy. If she was a fat horse she would have never made it.”

Originally campaigned in Great Britain under the tutelage of trainer P. David Evans, Lady Prancealot resurfaced Stateside last September to finish second in the Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf and again in the Surfer Girl S. here in October. Last in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, she got her first North American win two tries later in a local optional claimer Feb. 1. It was right back into stakes company for Lady Prancealot after that, and she was a very close third in the GIII Providencia S. Apr. 6 and runner-up in the GIII Seniorita S. May 4 before annexing the nine-panel GIII Honeymoon S. in June. Third in the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 17, she was sixth in the Jockey Club Invitational Oaks at Belmont Aug. 16 before belying 10-1 odds to finish with a flourish and capture Keeneland’s GIII Pin Oak Valley View S. Oct. 18.

“This filly came over here from Europe and the first time she worked she had an issue and we gave her a bunch of time,” Baltas noted. “We thought we bought a bad horse, but we didn’t. She has been ultra-consistent. I want to give a hats off to the guys at San Luis Rey Downs, my assistant trainer who has had her there most of the time. ‘Jersey Joe’ rode an awesome race and we are all happy now.”

Pedigree Notes:

Lady Prancealot becomes the first Grade I or Group 1 winner for her young sire, whose success with runners in California prompted a deal to be made for him to reverse shuttle from Australia to Rancho San Miguel in the Golden State for the 2020 breeding season. Lady Prancealot’s dam Naqrah (Ire) is an unraced half-sister to French Group 2 winner Baqah (Ire) (Bahhare), who in turn produced 2017 GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. and 2019 GII Monmouth S. winner Almanaar (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). Bravo also piloted Almanaar to his most recent graded victory. Naqrah produced a Vadamos (Fr) filly in 2018 and a Galileo Gold (GB) colt Apr. 16.

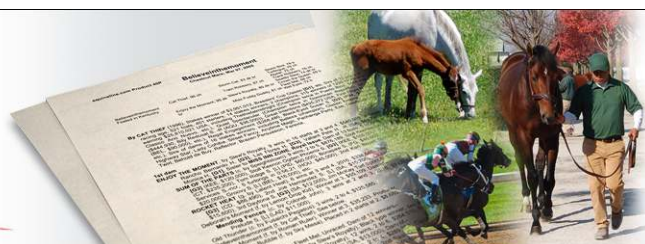

Mo Forza capped 2019 with his third straight graded victory with a 1 1/4-length score in the GII Mathis Brothers Mile S. at Santa Anita Saturday. Unhurried early, the bay colt dropped well back in the field while racing some five wide. He pulled his way to mid-pack down the backstretch and rushed up into contention on the far turn. Four wide into the lane, he surged to the front in upper stretch and bound clear.

"I thought we'd be sitting a couple lengths off the pace in third or fourth, and there we were in the back of the pack and five wide, and I'm going, 'Oh Geez, I don't know about this,'" said winning trainer Peter Miller. "But the pace was hot, and Joel [Rosario] knows what he's doing, so everything worked out."

Of the trip Rosario added, "It was not my decision [to be so wide], but I just have to be with the horse. I loved making the move on the turn the way he did, I was just hanging on to the bridle and he just loved that, so we stayed with that."

On the board in four of his first five starts, Mo Forza put it all together in his sixth outing, graduating by two lengths in a one-mile maiden special weight over the Santa Anita lawn Sept. 29. He came back to win the Nov. 2 GII Twilight Derby in his very next start and was 3/4-lengths to the good of Neptune's Storm when winning the GI Hollywood Derby last time out Nov. 30.

"He's like a big kid that finally learns to use his feet and hands and it's all over," Miller said of Mo Forza. "He always had the talent, but he never really could put it all together. I think we haven't seen the best of him yet. He is just starting to learn and once he relaxes a little bit better and doesn't want to lay in when he passes that last horse, I think the sky is the limit. He's just a tremendous horse."

Mo Forza was bred and is co-owned by Barry Abrams, who purchased his dam with the colt in utero for \$90,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November sale.

"A great job to Barry, who bred the horse," Miller said of the longtime trainer who has battled throat cancer for the last 15 years. "To win the race for Barry, it's a thrill."

Rosario added, "It's unbelievable [to be back at Santa Anita] and to get a win for Barry Abrams. When I came here from Northern California, he was the first one who gave me a winner here, so it's very special for me to give him another winner here."

Miller said a trip to South Florida could be next up for Mo Forza.

"I think the [Jan. 25 GI Pegasus World Cup Turf Invitational at Gulfstream Park] is our first option, if everything is going well," he said. "With no Lasix, the horse has never been a bleeder and so I don't see any reason why the Pegasus wouldn't be our next option."

Pedigree Notes:

Mo Forza's dam Inflamed, in foal to Tapiture, sold to Glen Hill Farm for \$170,000 at last month's Keeneland November sale and is consigned by that operation to next month's Keeneland January sale.

The mare, a full-sister to Grade I placed Brushburn and graded winner Burns, has a weanling colt by Munnings.

Gift Box's 2018 score in the GII San Antonio S. represented a break-out effort, but his 2019 title defense was more of a bounce-back.

Third in the GII Remsen S. at two and second in the Curlin S. at three when part of the Chad Brown barn, the grey was purchased privately by these connections after an 8 3/4-length romp in a second-level allowance at Aqueduct in March of 2018. He was 6-1 when he out-gamed star-crossed Battle of Midway (Smart Strike) here 12 months ago, and then reached the highest level in the Apr. 6 GI Santa Anita H. by a nose over MGISW McKinzie (Street Sense) with eventual GI Awesome Again upsetter Mongolian Groom (Hightail) back in third. On the wrong end of a bob with eventual GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Vino Rosso (Curlin) in the GI Gold Cup at Santa Anita May 27, he could only manage fourth in the GII Stephen Foster S. as the chalk at Churchill Downs June 15 and was put away for the rest of the summer and fall.

Ridden along up the inside by Joel Rosario to take over by a half-length from fellow grey King Abner, Gift Box was pestered by that rival down the backside through a :47.33 half. His longshot foe attempted to crank up the pressure through a 1:10.99 half, but Gift Box spurted clear at the head of the lane and won for fun from there with nobody from the back of the pack able to muster any kind of challenge.

"He ran really well," said Rosario. "He kind of broke a little slow, but then got it going a little bit. I got to the first turn and he was in front, and he was able to keep on going from that position and take it all the way."

Conditioner John Sadler added, "He was fighting the track at the Stephen Foster. He was going against horses that trained there. He has run against quality horses wherever he has run, so today we said let him run a little more free and we had a good result."

As for what might be next, Sadler said: "I hope we can go for a Santa Anita H. double [Mar. 7]. We have a lot of choices with these handicap horses. We'll see how he comes out of the race and maybe run him back East or maybe take [GI TVG Pacific Classic S. winner] Higher Power (Medaglia d'Oro) back there. We're blessed to have two or three horses in this division, so we're going to kind of mix and match... we're going to be judicious."

The Brogden family's Machmer Hall paid just \$6,000 for Gift Box's dam Special Me (Unbridled's Song)--an unplaced half-sister to G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen hero Our New Recruit (Alphabet Soup)--at the 2009 Keeneland January sale, and her first foal was \$77,000 yearling and speedy MGSW/GISP Stonetastic (Mizzen Mast). There have been plenty of solid sales results out of Special Me since then, including a \$550,000 Speightstown filly who sold at KEESEP '17 and a \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton November weanling of 2018. Special Me produced an Into Mischief filly Mar. 23, but aborted after being bred to Quality Road this past season. Machmer Hall, meanwhile, has continued its buying spree snatching up mares by the late, great Unbridled's Song, paying \$914,000 for seven of them at the 2019 breeding stock sales.

Mirth, winner of the 10-furlong GI Rodeo Drive S. at this venue in September, bounced back from a lackluster sixth in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf to take Saturday's GIII Robert J. Frankel S. Mirth was settled in a mid-pack sixth early as longshot Harmless (Creative Cause) showed the way through initial fractions of :23.95 and :48.77. Continuing in the two path down the backstretch, Mirth remained off the leading flight following six quarters in 1:12.31. Swung out five wide turning for home, Mirth dug in through the lane, ground her way to the front midstretch, and was momentarily passed by closing fellow Phil D'Amato runner Tiny Tina in the final sixteenth, who edged up on her outside, but re-rallied in the final strides to eke out the victory over her game rival. Excellent Sunset (Ire) closed well to be third. The Frankel win was the third of four stakes on the card for jockey Mike Smith, who also won the GI La Brea S. with Hard Not to Love and the GI Runhappy Malibu S. with Omaha Beach.

Pedigree Notes:

Prior to the Robert J. Frankel winner, dam Di's Delight produced Vault (Jump Start), the winner of her three most recent starts, including Laurel's Thirty Eight Go Go S. Nov. 30; and stakes-placed Heat Dome (Jump Start). After foaling a colt by Jump Start in 2018, Di's Delight produced a colt by Alliance earlier this term and was bred back to that stallion. Expatriated to Korea, 19-year-old Colonel John (Tiznow) is responsible for 27 black-type winners--nine of them at the graded level--from seven crops of racing age.

Airdrie's Bret Jones said he is excited to have the opportunity to showcase this new stallion. "He's been on our radar since he was three. It's been a long courtship getting the deal done, but I'm so glad that we have."

Divisidero's career began with a debut victory at Gulfstream for Buff Bradley and owner Gunpowder Farms as a 3-year-old. Starting at the back of the field, he ran six wide through the second turn, and then showed a strong turn of foot to win by a half-length.

From there he went directly into graded stakes company, winning the GII American Turf S., also at Churchill on the first Saturday in May, in his third start going a mile and a sixteenth on the turf. Again, he settled at the back of the pack before circling six wide heading into the stretch, and edged away from the field at the wire. He went on to claim the Pennine Ridge S. in his next start, setting a course record at Belmont Park.

Jones said the farm was drawn to Divisidero because of his strong start as a 3-year-old: "Divisidero was good right from the start. He wasn't a horse that took time to develop. All we ask is that people go back and watch this horse's races. If you watch his win in the American Turf S. and see the turn of foot that he had, it's so exciting. That race was really when he got on our radar." **Cont. p15**

His next two years on the track were highlighted by back-to-back victories in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. In each, he faced staunch competition including Eclipse champions World Approval (With Approval) and Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy), as well as Grade I winners Tourist (Tiznow), Bal a Bali (Brz) (Put It Back) and Beach Patrol (Lemon Drop Kid).

Jones spoke highly of the competition in both of these races: "The list is really extraordinary. These two GI wins were against the best turf horses in the country, and Divisidero beat all of them."

After transferring to the barn of Kelly Rubley for his 6-year-old campaign, Divisidero caught two more graded stakes victories in the GIII Arlington H. at six, and the GIII Red Bank S. at Monmouth at seven.

Jones said of Divisidero's career, "He retired totally sound, and there is a lot to be said for that. This was a horse with an explosive turn of foot and a lot of speed, and these qualities are important calling cards for a potentially top stallion."

Divisidero retired with earnings of over \$1.6 million, claiming at least one graded stakes in each season of his five-year career, with victories at five different tracks.

Jones spoke about the combination of quality and commercial value he expects to see from Divisidero's progeny. "Kitten's Joy is absolutely, unquestionably, one of the best stallions in the world. A lot of people talk about Kitten's Joy not being the most commercial horse in the world, which frankly is a little silly, because they run faster than the horses they compete with."

Kitten's Joy has been leading turf sire for the last six years, and will likely be number two on that list for 2019. He also consistently ranks in the top 10 in North America on the general sires list, finishing in the top spot last year with the likes of Hawkbill, Henley's Joy, and Catapult.

Jones also noted that Divisidero's commercial appeal was another factor that drew the farm toward him. "Thankfully, Divisidero is a nice commercial prospect. He was an expensive Kitten's Joy, picked out by a really good judge in Josh Stevens [then] of Margaux Farm. He is a medium-sized horse, standing right at 16 hands. He is really well balanced with a big walk and nice physical. Everything is in the right place."

Divisidero was a \$250,000 yearling purchase at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, bred and consigned by Hinkle Farms.

Jones said that Divisidero's pedigree is a defining quality on his resume. "His pedigree is fabulous. He's from arguably the best female family there is, tracing directly back to Northern Dancer, Danehill, and Halo. The genetic bank is all there. This horse has as good a pedigree as you could ask of one."

Out of the Lemon Drop Kid mare Madame Du Lac, Divisidero is a full-sibling to Kitten's Kid, who ran second in the GIII Pilgrim S. at Belmont. Madame Du Lac is a half-sibling to Genial Boy (Arg) (Songandaprayer), a graded stakes winner in Chile, and is out of the stakes-placed mare Geisha Girl (GB) (Nashwan).

Jones said he believes Divisidero will appeal to buyers as one of the next outstanding turf sires at a time when turf sires are in short supply in the United States. "There's a lot to be said for the movement we are seeing as turf racing becomes increasingly more popular.

"These turf races are so important, and there's a shortage of stallions that are capable of getting a superior turf horse. This emergence of turf racing is carrying a lot of momentum, and hopefully Divisidero can fit into that fabric and be one of those horses people talk of as a sire for any turf race."

Devil Made Me Do It, a \$43,000 KEENOV weanling, was purchased by Ciaran Dunne and Paul Reddam's Red Wings pinhooking partnership for \$72,000 as a FTKJUL yearling and was bought back for \$245,000 after working a quarter in :20 3/5 at this year's OBS June sale. He is the first foal out of Bible. In foal to Super Saver, that mare sold to WinStar Farm for \$25,000 at the 2017 Keeneland November sale. Her Super Saver yearling filly sold for \$35,000 at this year's Keeneland September sale. She produced a filly by Outwork this year and was bred back to Carpe Diem.

Bella Aurora became Country Life Farm and Mike Trombetta's second good-looking winner of the afternoon Saturday, following in the hoofsteps of now two-for-two sophomore gelding Let's Play Nine (Super Ninety Nine) while becoming the first black-type winner for her freshman sire (by Giant's Causeway). A second-out graduate sprinting on the local lawn in August, the chestnut was second in the restricted Jamestown S. at Colonial Downs Sept. 7 and third in the Anne Arundel County S. back here Sept. 28. Away only faster than Ankle Monitor, Bella Aurora hugged the fence under a tight hold early behind a :46.57 half. She was handled very patiently until midway on the turn, at which point she was swung wide to mirror the move made by the eventual runner-up. She continued to gobble up ground down the center of the track, struck the front in midstretch and cruised home comfortably from there.

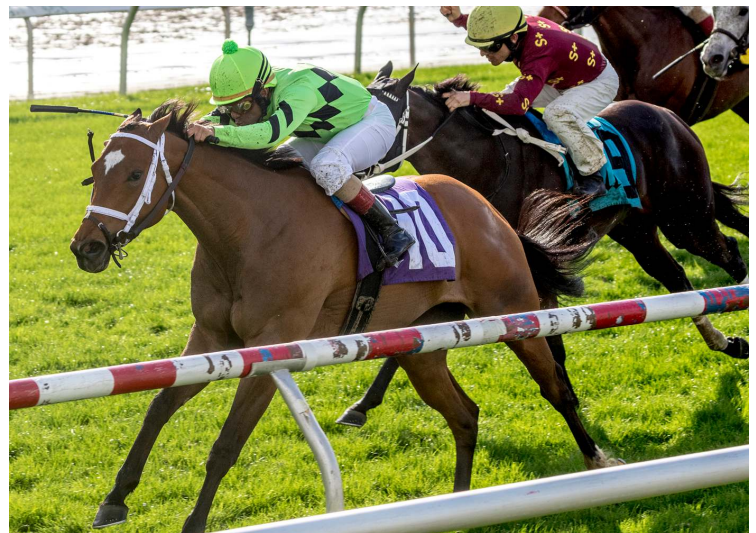

Payson bought third dam Adoryphar for \$110,000 at the 1990 Keeneland July yearling sale, campaigning her to a graded stakes-placed career, then bred and raced her stakes-winning daughter Ruthian. Three of Ruthian’s daughters were black-type winners, including Our Bay B Ruth’s dam and her full-sister, GISW Rutherienne. With Our Bay B Ruth’s win in the Tropical Park Oaks, Ruthenia is now a dual stakes producer herself. Her most recent foals include \$425,000 2018 Keeneland September yearling Soviet (Super Saver), who has been on the sidelines after finishing off the board for Todd Pletcher in a Saratoga maiden this summer, and a weanling colt by Union Rags. 
