### FIGURES UP AT TATTS FEBRUARY OPENER



The listed-winning I'll Have Another | Tattersalls

NEWMARKET, UK--The February Sale may present a relatively low-key start to the sales year at Tattersalls but it has nevertheless drawn a decent crowd of potential buyers from many countries and trade during the first session was well ahead of that produced 12 months ago in only the third time that the sale has been extended to two days.

The major boost came predominantly from the former Mark Johnston trainee and listed winner I'll Have Another (Ire) (Dragon Pulse {Ire}) (lot 120), who led the first day of trade when sold to agent Cormac McCormack for 200,000gns. The 4-year-old, who was also Group 3-placed in Germany and runner-up in the Zetland S., was sold through the National Stud for owners Paul and Clare Rooney.

"We sold horses for the Rooneys in December and they very kindly let us consign this mare too," said National Stud director Tim Lane.

The winner of four of her 18 starts and bought as a yearling by Kevin Ross for £32,000, I'll Have Another is a daughter of Jessie Jane (Ire) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), a winning half-sister to the G3 Chester Vase runner-up Icon Dream (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

### **BARNEY ROY BACK A WINNER AT MEYDAN**

The G2 Al Rashidiya S. at Meydan on Thursday came down to a pair of Godolphin Group 1 winners in the final furlong, and it was the returning G1 St James's Palace S. winner **Barney Roy** (GB) (Excelebration {Ire}) who collared and passed the defending race winner and last year's G1 Jebel Hatta S. winner **Dream Castle (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) inside the final eighth to score by 2 1/4 lengths, leading home a Godolphin top four finish.

Barney Roy was making his fourth start back from a failed stud career due to fertility issues, and his first appearance since finishing eighth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last June. Gelded in late 2018, Barney Roy joined the stable of Charlie Appleby, having previously been trained by Richard Hannon, and was second on return in Ascot's Listed Paradise S. in May before taking ParisLongchamp's Listed Prix de Montretout three weeks later.

The family has served breeder Manister House Stud well over the years, especially through another of the dam's half-sisters, Starfish (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), whose offspring include dual Group 1 winner La Collina (Ire) and listed winner Fox Chairman (Ire).

McCormack didn't name his client but said. "She has a pedigree and is a lovely scopey mare, a queen. She will be covered by Ten Sovereigns this season."

The median for the session was close to double last year's mark at 5,000gns, while the average was up 79% at 12,712gns. In total, 138 horses sold for 1,754,300gns, a rise of 90%, bringing an improved clearance rate of 83%.

Also reaching the six-figure mark was the gelding **Power Link** (Data Link), sold from James Tate's Jamesfield Stables on behalf of Rabbah Bloodstock for 100,000gns. Paul Murphy signed the ticket for lot 159 and was acting for Paul Harley, who is currently in Saudi Arabia, where the 4-year-old will continue his racing career from Abdul Rahman Fahd Al Bawardi's Emblem Stables.

Murphy said, "This horse has a good rating and looks as though he will be a great fit for racing in Saudi."

The 96-rated four-time winner is a three-parts brother to

Lane's End Farm's Grade I winner and accomplished young sire The Factor and has won at three of Britain's all-weather tracks as well as finishing runner-up last February at Meydan.

The 20-strong Godolphin draft provided two of the day's leading lots headed by 156, Memphis (Ire), a daughter of Dubawi (Ire) and a half-sister to G1 Fillies' Mile winner Lyric Of Light (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}). Matt Houldsworth secured the unraced 3-year-old for a bid of 62,000gns and she will be heading to the Southern Hemisphere.


"She's been bought as a breeding prospect and is off to a good farm in Australia," said the agent. "Her sister is a Group 1 winner who is breeding now and she's from a really good family."

That family is one made famous over the last four decades by Meon Valley Stud as Memphis's third dam is the famed Reprocolor (GB) (Jimmy Reppin {GB}), whose Group 1-winning descendants include Colorspin (GB) (High Top {GB}), Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic).

British-based Australian agent Stuart Boman of Blandford Bloodstock stepped in for another member of the Godolphin draft, **Dubrava (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) (lot 154), for an unnamed client at 55,000gns. Cont. p3

### **Figures Up At Tatts February Opener Cont.**

A 78-rated winner for owner-breeder Sheikh Mohammed Obaid when trained by Roger Varian, the 4-year-old is a half-sister to GIII Robert G Dick Memorial S. winner Real Smart (Smart Strike) and a granddaughter of the Group 1-winning sprinter Tante Rose (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}).

"She was one we selected in the catalogue and we loved her when we saw her so we're delighted," Boman said. "It doesn't often happen that a horse matches the pedigree physically. She is a beautiful filly and is by a good broodmare sire in Dansili."

From a small selection of just-turned yearlings, the top price was paid for the sole offering by the dual 2000 Guineas winner Churchill (Ire) in the catalogue. The April-born filly has joined the team at Tally-Ho Stud after Roger and Henry O'Callaghan outbid Paul McCarthy at 56,000gns.

Sold by the Castlebridge Consignment for Italian breeder Azienda Agricola Gennaro Stimola, lot 109 is out of the unraced Hussonet mare Miss Mariduff, the dam of G2 Premio Ribot winner Porsenna (Ire) (Dylan Thomas (Ire)) and listed winner Basileus (Ire) (Dream Ahead). The 15-year-old mare has also produced another two black-type performers among her seven winners.

Members of the first crop of the Coolmore stallion proved popular at the foal sales in November, with 13 sold for an average price of 108,000gns.

The February Sale concludes on Friday with trade getting underway at 10 a.m.

### SEBASTIEN LE FORBAN DIES

The French bloodstock industry was shaken on Thursday by the tragic news of the death overnight in Florida of bloodstock agent Sebastien Le Forban, who was just 35 years old.

Le Forban's friend Rupert Pritchard Gordon, who he also had a successful business relationship with, said, "He had a lot of good friends and we are all in total shock. He has gone far too soon. "Seb was a great guy, very thoughtful and kind. He was also

the funniest and most quick-witted man a lot of us had ever met. He just had that ability to make a very quiet supper become lively, often with people he hardly knew, and have people literally bent over laughing for hours on end with his stories and personal adventures. Once you'd enjoyed a dinner with him, you didn't forget it. He didn't live long enough, but I'd bet he lived life a whole lot more than most people that lived twice as long as him. Seb bought two horses at last October's Arc Sale, Graignes and Les Hogues, and it would be a fitting tribute if one of them was to land a big prize in 2020."

Another close friend Le Forban also brokered successful deals with was Edouard Lyon, who told Jour de Galop, "We have to keep our heads up high for him, but it's very, very hard. Sebastien, he was someone always in a good mood. Like me, he was from Maisons-Laffitte, but we really became friends in Florida. He was there when I had difficult moments; he knew how to find the words to boost me. We had a few horses together and he came to the stable almost every day. He was a real horse lover. He came to evening stables and enjoyed walking the horses, dressing them; even if they weren't his own. Although he came from a family in racing for several generations, it can be said that he made himself. He worked in Australia, then in Dubai, for Satish Seemar, who also entrusted him with the responsibility of a few horses in France. He then [started his agency] in France, and had a great clientele, French and foreign. He was a great guy."

Funeral arrangements could not be immediately confirmed but will be published when available.

Boudot enjoyed a career-best year on the track last year, his Group 1 wins including the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe aboard Waldgeist (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), the Coronation S. at Royal Ascot on Watch Me (Fr) (Olympic Glory {Ire}) and the Prix de Diane with Channel (Fr) (Nathaniel {Ire}).

### CRAVEN A POSSIBLE TARGET FOR KAMEKO

Andrew Balding could look to the G3 bet365 Craven S. at Newmarket as a potential starting point for **Kameko** ahead of an outing in the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas. The Kingsclere handler believes the mile Group 3 contest could be the ideal stepping stone for the son of Kitten's Joy, before returning him to the track for the opening Classic. After finishing second over course and distance in the Royal Lodge S. on his penultimate start, Kameko ended the year on a high when winning the first Group 1 race staged on an artificial surface in Britain, the rearranged Vertem Futurity Trophy at Newcastle.

Balding said, "Kameko is just starting out to do two canters. He has been ticking over quietly during the winter. We are looking forward to this year as he is a high-class horse. As long as he stays healthy the 2000 Guineas will be his first main objective. It is quite possible he will have a run beforehand as he improved with racing last season.

"The Burradon S. at Newcastle is a listed race and he would have to carry a penalty, but he is a course and distance winner. He wouldn't have to carry a penalty in the Craven S., so we might end up looking at that if everything falls right and we decide to have a run."

Though Balding expects Kameko, who is the general 10-1 second-favourite for the G1 Investec Derby at Epsom, to get further than a mile this season, he remains unsure what his ultimate trip will end up being.

He added, "I'm not sure just how far he will stay, as there are mixed messages in the pedigree. Without a shadow of a doubt he will stay a mile and a quarter, but whether he stays a mile and a half there is a big question mark. Hopefully we will be able to work that out by the first Saturday in June."



### Barney Roy Back A Winner At Meydan Cont. from p1

It was the French Group 2 winner Loxley (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in the Godolphin black cap who bounced out of the gates on Thursday to lead the field of seven through the opening stages, with listed winner Mountain Hunter (Lonhro {Aus}) stalking and Dream Castle leading Barney Roy, each separated by not much more than a length. Those margins diminished approaching the quarter pole as the quartet bunched up with Barney Roy and Dream Castle soon separating themselves. They engaged in a brief battle before Barney Roy took control on the outside and drew clear from his rival with relative ease. It was the second time that pair has finished one-two, with Barney Roy having also beat home Dream Castle in the G3 Greenham S. three years ago on his second start. Barney Roy would go on to finish second to Churchill (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) in the G1 2000 Guineas and also picked up placings behind Ulysses (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Coral-Eclipse and G1 Juddmonte International before the season was out.

"He came in here with a bit to work on," said Appleby. "He's a very lightly framed horse, so we don't do much with him. He was fresh in the paddock and for the first half of the race, but once he got into it, I was always hopeful that his class would prevail and that is what we've seen at the end. That will hopefully take the freshness out of him now and hopefully we can work backward from the Jebel Hatta [on Mar. 7]. All being well, it's one step at a time. We'll get Super Saturday out of the way and hopefully we can book ourselves a slot for Dubai World Cup night.

Appleby wasn't ruling out Europe's middle-distance highlights for later in the season. **Cont. p7**

"Visually, from what we've seen there, you'd be quite happy to step up to 10 furlongs. He was just touched off in the [2017] Juddmonte [International] and is a class animal. It's just nice to see him back to his winning ways this evening."

### **Pedigree Notes**

Barney Roy is the first foal out of the unplaced Galileo (Ire) mare Alina (Ire), also the dam of the listed-placed Wisdom Mind (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}). The second dam, Cheyenne Star (Ire) (Mujahid), won the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. and G3 Brownstown Stud S., and it is also the family of the top-class evergreen sprinter Gordon Lord Byron (Ire) (Byron {GB}).

Eliza Park International purchased Alina for 65,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2013 carrying Barney Roy. He was let go for 30,000gns as a foal and pinhooked as a yearling for £70,000, and Eliza Park has since enjoyed a couple excellent sales of the mare's produce. David Redvers purchased the mare's 2016 Kodiac (GB) filly for 400,000gns, and last year her Dubawi (Ire) colt topped Tattersalls October Book 1 when bought by Godolphin for 3.6 million gns. Alina also has a 3-year-old colt by Free Eagle (Ire) named Thames River (GB) who was retained by Eliza Park and was a winner last year for Joseph O'Brien.

**Gladiator King** has proven a shrewd purchase by Sheikh Rashid bin Humaid Al Nuaimi, the 4-year-old son of Curlin now two-fortwo in Dubai, having added victory in Thursday's G3 Al Shindagha Sprint to his score in the G3 Dubawi S. on opening night of the carnival on Jan. 2.

Gladiator King was previously trained by Jaime Mejia in the U.S., and he won a key U.S. 3-year-old sprinting contest, the GIII Hutcheson S., last winter before finishing a head second in the GIII Chick Lang S. on the Preakness undercard. Transferred to Satish Seemar, he defied odds of 10-1 to win the Dubawi first-up and is now firmly among the favourites for the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen on Mar. 28. Cont. p8

### SHALAA, A GLOBAL BRAND



Shalaa | Scoop Dyga

Haras de Bouquetot's stud manager Benoit Jeffroy was a recent visitor to the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. *TDN AusNZ* caught up with the Frenchman to get his impression of the Australiasian industry, as well as some insights on dual-hemisphere stallion **Shalaa (Ire)**.

As the recent Magic Millions Sale wore on, there was one name that surged the current relentlessly and it was Arrowfield's newcomer Shalaa. His sire is a genuine dual-hemisphere sensation, one of those genuine sire of sires that we talk about in reverential tones. As his sons Kingman (GB) and I Am Invincible bestride the globe's opposing zones like some joint command, attention inevitably turns to his latest offering up to the commercial powers in bloodstock.

Shalaa is to date Invincible Spirit's (Ire) highest-achieving juvenile, having stampeded through the sprint mainstays of the July S., the Richmond, Morny and Middle Park in 2015. On the track he was pure devastating speed and precocity, fired by that Danzig (USA) intensity that has so impacted European racing since the 1980s.

At stud he has so far produced correct, smooth-moving foals who have evolved into yearlings with augmenting prowess. In Europe, they are now in their first racing year awaiting the true test of their physicality and bloodlines.

Now back in his Northern Hemisphere home of Haras de Bouquetot in Normandy, France's most happening stallion presence for many years faces considerable scrutiny as his juveniles stride on to the turf of Britain, Ireland, France and Japan's racecourses.

### A Tantalising First-Season Sire

In all respects, Shalaa is as tantalising a first-season sire as it is possible to name in 2020. "He ticks all the boxes," Haras de Bouquetot's stud manager Benoit Jeffroy says. "The Magic Millions was my first experience of an Australian sale and I was impressed with the enthusiasm and the buzz around it. Shalaa has been received as well as we could have expected he would be and we can only be happy."

Topping Shalaa's seven yearlings to fetch more than \$300,000 at the auction was John Sadler's \$600,000 purchase, the half-brother to the G1 HKJC Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup and G1 Champions Mile hero Contentment (Hussonet).

There had been 600,000 spent in euros in his native France at the Arqana August Sale when his son of the G2 Prix de Sandringham winner Maiden Tower (GB) (Groom Dancer {USA}) was snapped up by Emmanuel de Seroux for the Satomi Horse Company. His brand is already global.

Shuttling is nothing new to Al Shaqab, with **Toronado (Ire)** and **Olympic Glory (Ire)** occupying important space in Australia in recent seasons, but Shalaa could add that extra dimension with his enticing profile.

Jeffroy sees the link with Australia and New Zealand as vitally important to the operation. "We are trying to be closer to the Australian market and there is a great atmosphere with great people doing great business there," he comments.

"After I Am Invincible it makes Shalaa easier to advertise, he has plenty of speed in his pedigree with his sire-line bringing that factor and so he has arrived here at the right time. Paul and John Messara spoke to the local buyers and they said they looked great, so they are very hopeful he can make it."

Shalaa's influence is spread across Europe too, as Jeffroy points out. "He has as many horses in England and Ireland as he has in France," he states. "They are going well early, have good minds, seem easy to train and want to go to work, so we'll hear more when it gets to March or April. There is a real expectation around him and it is an exciting and worrying time. It depends on him now, as all stallions have to pass something on, to be improvers."

Jeffroy is in no doubt about the importance of Shalaa standing in France, a country in resurgent mood when it comes to breeding top-class commercial prospects. "We are very proud to be able to retire a horse of his calibre in France," he says. "French bloodstock has been more on the map in the last five years, with the likes of Siyouni, Kendargent and Le Havre and it's

a boost for the whole French bloodstock economy and the young breeders and investors. There was a big gap for a while after the old names Anabaa, Linamix and Highest Honor and it went a bit quiet without much happening.

"You only have to see what Siyouni has done in recent times. Ultimately, they have to do it themselves and if Shalaa can in both hemispheres that can only be a positive. The Australian people are winners," he concludes. "They have a good attitude and we have a good relationship with them which we want to be long-term. You can see that they are willing to do things to promote their country's breeding and racing. This is going to be a big thing for us and it's so far, so good."

High-class juvenile, gifted with speed and quality with the genetic factors that tell in both regions of world racing, Shalaa has the perfect alchemy. Now to the proving ground.

# FOAL DEATHS FROM NOCARDIOFORM PLACENTITIS SPIKING IN KY

A spike in foal deaths caused by nocardioform placentitis has been reported in Kentucky as the first month of the 2020 Thoroughbred foaling season comes to a close.

As of late Thursday afternoon, the number of equine abortions reported by the University of Kentucky Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (UKVDL) stood at 44. The UKVDL's statewide map of the foal deaths listed 29 in Fayette County alone. Other abortions listed by county include six each in Woodford and Bourbon, and one each in Shelby, Scott, and Harrison. You can view the interactive UKVDL map here. Note that it accounts for all reported equine deaths, and is not Thoroughbred-specific.

Dr. Barry Ball, a veterinarian with the University of Kentucky's Gluck Equine Research Center who holds the Albert G. Clay Endowed Chair in Equine Reproduction, told *TDN* that in a normal year, the number of foal deaths from nocardioform placentitis might be in the single digits or low teens by this time of the season.

"This would be a significant upturn from those numbers, and right now it's looking like it's on par with numbers reported in 2017 and 2011," said Ball, referring to Kentucky's two most recent breeding seasons that saw spikes in foal deaths from nocardioform placentitis. *Cont. p3*

Tagg doesn't look his age. He carries his lithe, fit frame upright, with no slouch or limp despite plenty of falls as a jock; dresses like a country gentleman; and has a stern countenance that belies an easy laugh once you get to know him.



Ball continued, "Both of those years were significant upturns, and this certainly looks like it's heading in that direction."

Dr. Karen Wolfsdorf, a reproduction specialist at Hagyard Equine Medical Institute, told *TDN* the situation calls for vigilance--not panic--at this point.

"While I do think we have an increase in incidence this year, it's still not the worst that it's been, or at 'epidemic' levels," Wolfsdorf said. "It's just something to be aware of that is on the increase this year."

Wolfsdorf gave an overview of what nocardioform placentitis is, how it's diagnosed, and what warning symptoms

Thoroughbred farm personnel can look for in pregnant mares.

"Nocardioform placentitis is a group of organisms that forms mucous production that then causes separation of the placenta from the mare's uterus," Wolfsdorf explained. "So it stops nutrients and oxygen getting from the mare to the fetus, which can damage and be life-threatening to the foal."

Foals can either be stillborn or born in a weakened state that requires euthanization. Some foals are "born alive and do perfectly fine" in cases where mares have only a small lesion, Wolfsdorf said.

"There are two main types of nocardioform placentitis that we see most commonly," Wolfsdorf said. "One is the bacterial organism Crossiela equi. The other one is Amycolatopsis. We tend to see foals either aborted or born a month early with the Crossiela equi, as opposed to Amycolatopsis, where [foals] seem to have a better survival rate or live foal rate. It depends on when the mare is infected or when the lesions start to form as well as how large those lesions are, because that will determine how much nutrients and oxygen that foal is deprived of."

Wolfsdorf noted that nocardioform placentitis differs from placentitis caused by an "ascending infection," which is when pathogens get past a mare's vulva to ascend through the reproductive tract.


In nocardioform placentitis, "we don't know how it gets there," Wolfsdorf said.

"We believe it's in the soil in the environment," Wolfsdorf continued. "We don't know how it gets to the uterus. But the lesions that you see are pretty characteristic, and they're usually found at the base of the horns of the uterus or in the body of the uterus. This is unlike ascending placentitis."

The first clinical signs of nocardioform placentitis are usually vaginal discharge and premature lactation.

"Usually how we identify it is when a mare starts to develop a mammary gland prematurely," Wolfsdorf said. "Usually that's associated with placentitis or twins."

Wolfsdorf said that if those signs are present, the first step is to rule out ascending placentitis by ultrasound. Then a different ultrasound view will be used to look for the distinctive nocardioform placentitis lesions.

But that diagnostic method is far from perfect.

"It's more of a rule-in than a rule-out process," Wolfsdorf said. "If [a nocardioform lesion] is there, you can see it. But if it's not there, it doesn't mean that she doesn't have it, because the area where the lesion can be is so small and the surface area of the uterus is so large."

Ball agreed: "The difficulty with those kinds of clinical signs is that the disease is pretty far progressed by the time you see some of those changes," he said.

"We don't have good diagnostic techniques for early diagnosis," Ball added. "That's something that we've been working on for awhile. Ultrasound of the placenta is being used with some success, but the sensitivity of that is uncertain. It may only be useful in relatively late cases, but we are seeing it being used at farms that are at risk "

Wolfsdorf explained how farm personnel can be on the lookout for those first clinical signs.

"Monitor the mare for premature mammary gland development," Wolfsdorf said. "And then just practice good husbandry. Look under the tail every day to make sure there are no signs of a discharge there. Make sure the mare is acting and behaving normally."

Wolfsdorf pointed out that vigilance should also extend to foals that appear totally healthy, underscoring her earlier point about how a foal can be born without complications even if the mare had nocardioform lesions.

"The only way you know sometimes if they had that disease is by examining the placenta," Wolfsdorf said. "That's another thing farm personnel can do--make sure to turn the placentas inside out both ways, so you look at not only the white shiny side, but you look at the red side, where you're going to see these lesions. And if you see that you're having an increased number of lesions, then maybe it's time to be proactive and ultrasound your mares transabdominally to see if you can identify any more lesions."

"It's a disease that although there's been a lot of research to try and determine where it comes from, it still eludes us," Wolfsdorf said. "It's very farm-dependent, area-dependent. We don't know why some farms have it and some farms don't have it."

Both Ball and Wolfsdorf noted there appears to be a spike of the disease in years when unseasonably warm weather precedes foaling seasons. Cont. p5

"Hot, dry Augusts and Septembers are statistically associated with an increased incidence of the disease in the following

winter and spring," Ball said, noting that he is in the process of completing a 30-year historical study on potential effects of weather on nocardioform placentitis.

"We don't know what the meaning of that association is," Ball said. "But it's a statistically significant relationship. It doesn't mean it's a cause. It just means that there is some association, and we don't yet understand" what that is.

This past autumn, parts of Kentucky broke dryness and heat records, with a string of

rainless, 90-degree days extending through September. On Oct. 1, a National Weather Service meteorologist based in Louisville described conditions statewide as "really, literally, the summer that won't end."

Ball said future projects he is involved with might yield better larity.

"Nocardioform placentitis is on our radar. It has been for a

long time," Ball said. "We're finishing a study right now looking at the genome-wide transcript of those kinds of tissues, basically looking at gene expression across the placentas of mares with those diseases compared to controls. We know a lot more about the inflammatory picture associated with it. But that hasn't given us much in the way of clues about the etiology in terms of how this starts.

"We've also done some pretty extensive studies with inoculating mares trying to

reproduce the disease," Ball summed up. "But to date we have not had any success. So we clearly have a lot to learn."

He's frequently in the company of his longtime assistant and

significant other, Robin Smullen, with whom he shares a home in Boynton Beach near Palm Meadows in the winter and a place behind Belmont Park the rest of the year. Whenever he doesn't know or recall the answer to a question, he'll turn to her and she'll provide it without missing a beat. It's Smullen who gets the call when there's a tough horse to ride in the mornings or when there's a special one, like Tiz the Law. Between the two of them, they have the bases covered on their team like the experienced

double-play partners that they are, Tagg the field general at shortstop and Smullen sure-handed and deft on the pivot at second base. It's the type of defense you want when you send a young but talented pitcher to the mound or a thrice-raced colt on the Kentucky Derby trail.


They won the Kentucky Derby and the GI Preakness 17 years ago with Sackatoga Stables's Funny Cide (Distorted Humor). Sackatoga, a partnership whose principal is Jack Knowlton, is

also the owner of Tiz the Law, who, like Funny Cide, was foaled in New York and is sired by a first-crop WinStar stallion.

Smullen galloped Funny Cide too, but the obvious similarities end there. For one, most of the partners in Sackatoga are not the same as they were in Funny Cide, and the latter was a 16.2-hand gelding compared to the 15.2 and a half-hand colt that is Tiz the Law.

"They are just two completely different types," Tagg said. "Funny Cide was a big and strong horse, a tough horse to gallop, with a real

long stride to him, a lovely big horse. He looked like he could go any distance to me, by the way he looked and trained." *Cont. p7*

Tagg continued, "I could not see any reason why he couldn't, but I got a hemorrhage from the press on it and a hammering

from other people, and everybody told me I was crazy and had Derby fever and the horse would never go a mile and a quarter. Tiz the Law, I thought he was a sprinter/miler when I bought him--he was smaller and a stocky type--and that's what he looks like. He doesn't have the long stride on him that Funny Cide did, but nothing bothers him and so far he's trained like distance isn't a problem. He hasn't shown me one thing that would make me think that he couldn't do it. He's just got a great, great mind to him."

GI Champagne S. last year and two of three starts altogether, has a lot of late-maturing blood close up in his pedigree, including some horses and sires that have won at the Derby

distance or have sired winners that got the trip. There's also enough early maturity and speed further back in his family to explain his own development at two, and this combination appears to give him a great balance of speed and early maturity with some promise of stamina and continued development. This is what Tagg sees in the colt and the way he trains, which are positives for Tiz the Law's Derby aspirations.

Tiz the Law's third dam, stakes-placed Crafty and Evil (Crafty Prospector), was sired

by a stallion noted for speed. Crafty and Evil won her debut in April of her 2-year-old season in a

4 1/2-furlong dash at Keeneland and was placed in the seven-furlong Indian Summer S. at the same track in October after giving way late in the race. Altogether she won two races, but none after the age two, and she was challenged at distances above sprints.

Crafty and Evil's half-brother was champion Favorite Trick (Phone Trick), an outstanding 2-year-old of 1997. He, too, won his debut in April at Keeneland but kept going, winning all eight of his starts that year, including the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and was named the first Horse of the Year at two since Secretariat in 1972. However, he wasn't the same colt at three and was eighth in the Kentucky Derby.

Likewise, there are others in Tiz the Law's immediate family that were limited by distance and/or were specialists at two or in sprints. They include GII Smile Sprint S. winner and millionaire Favorite Tale (Tale of the Cat); Moonshine Memories (Malibu Moon), a two-time Grade I winner at two who didn't train on at the same level at three; and Indian Evening (Indian Charlie), who only raced at two and won the seven-furlong Swynford S. at Woodbine and two of three starts altogether.

However, this family has shown that when bred to stamina horses, it can deliver stamina. The mare Legs Lawlor, a half-sister to Favorite Trick by Derby winner Unbridled, produced the listed 12-furlong turf stakes winner Clarinet, a daughter of Giant's Causeway.

### The Pedigree

Tiz the Law was bred by Steve Davison and Randy Gullatt's Twin Creeks, which was recently profiled in *TDN*. They sold him to Tagg and Knowlton for \$110,000 at the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearling sale at Saratoga. Twin Creeks, in partnership with WinStar, had purchased and raced Constitution.

Constitution (Tapit--Baffled, by Distorted Humor) finished second to American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) on the leading freshman sires list last year and is an up-and-coming stallion who flashed serious potential with his first 2-year-olds, despite not racing at two himself. It's logical, therefore, to assume that Constitution's progeny will be even better at three and four, when he won the GI Florida Derby and the GI Donn H., respectively, at Gulfstream--the site of the Holy Bull.

Tiz the Law's dam, Tizfiz (Tiznow--Gin Running, by Go for Gin), won the Gll San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita at nine furlongs on turf at five and was also unraced at two, as was her sire, who won the 10-furlong Gl Breeders' Cup Classic at three when he was Horse of the Year and again at four when he was the champion older horse. Her dam, Gin Running (Go For Gin), sired by a Kentucky Derby winner, was also unraced at two. She also produced Tizfiz's full brother Fury Kapcori, a graded winner at four in the Glll Precisionist S. at a mile and a sixteenth on dirt at Santa Anita. Fury Kapcori, unlike his sister, was a winner at two, and he'd placed second to Violence (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Gl CashCall Futurity on all-weather at Hollywood Park.

On the surface of things, then, Tiz the Law, who won the

Tiz the Law's sire's performance with his 3-year-olds this year will shed more light on his contributions to the pedigree, but Constitution's sire has three GI Belmont S. winners to his credit, and his broodmare sire, aside from getting Derby winner Funny Cide, has reliably and surprisingly sired an array of staying horses, including Belmont S. and Breeders' Cup Classic winner Drosselmeyer, GI Travers winner Flower Alley and GI Man o' War winner Boisterous.

At the time Tagg was preparing Funny Cide for the Derby, all that was known about Distorted Humor was that he was a sprinter who didn't stay past a mile, which is why Tagg caught some flak for believing that his gelding could win at the Derby trip. History has frequently shown, however, that a horse's own race record doesn't necessarily define him as a stallion. With Constitution, there's probably more to recommend Classic ability on paper than there was with Distorted Humor, but none of that mattered to Tagg then or now, because he goes by what he sees in front of him.

### The Colt

"For his size, he's got a very efficient stride on him," Tagg said Thursday, describing Tiz the Law's way of going. "He doesn't waste any motion, and, yeah, he pulls a bit, but he doesn't take anything extra out of himself."

Smullen had galloped the colt a mile and three-eighths
Thursday at Palm Meadows. A day earlier, after a
mile-and-a-half gallop at the training center, Tagg had shipped
the colt to Gulfstream to school in the paddock before the first
race

"He's doing great," Tagg said. "We weighed him over there, and he's 1,084 pounds."



The colt's last serious piece of work for the Holy Bull was completed Sunday at Palm Meadows, a half-mile in a bullet :48--fastest of 41 works for the distance. The colt had worked in company with the Tagg-trained 7-year-old stakes winner Realm (Haynesfield).

"We broke him off two lengths behind Realm, and he went by him pretty easily," Tagg said.

A few works earlier, Tagg's pocket rocket had easily handled an older graded stakes-winning sprinter in similar style.

After the Holy Bull, the Gll Louisiana Derby Mar. 21 at Fair Grounds is next for Tiz the Law, Tagg said. The \$1-million race will be contested at a mile and three-sixteenths and is the longest Derby-points prep (40) in the U.S.

"I like to give him about six weeks between races, and that falls perfectly," the conditioner said. "If you're going for a mile-and-a-quarter race, you can't be afraid of a mile and three-sixteenths."

Aside from winning the Derby with Funny Cide in 2003, Tagg was sixth in the race with Lael Stable's Grade I winner Showing Up (Strategic Mission) in 2006 and fourth with Charles Fipke's Grade I winner Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat) in 2008, when he'd also saddled Eric Fein's GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner Big Truck (Hook and Ladder) to an 18th-place finish.

In other words, Tagg isn't one to chase after the Derby unless he thinks he's got a legitimate chance to win the race, and his actions with Tiz the Law speak louder than the few words he utters. Last fall, he bypassed the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and a chance at the 2-year-old championship to race his colt instead in the Gll Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs.

Over a sloppy track, the colt didn't have a great trip and finished third in the race, beaten less than a length for it all, but the experience of a run over the track, Tagg knows, was worth the gamble, because his intent all along was to return there this spring.

The Holy Bull begins that journey for Tagg and Tiz the Law, and the veteran trainer couldn't be more confident in the abilities of his developing colt.

### APB STEVE SHERACK Tracks Down **Top Horses** on the Sidelines

### COMEBACKING 'KING' COULD RESURFACE AT TAMPA by Steve Sherack

The lone horse to defeat--err, let's make that cross the wire ahead of--recently crowned champion 3-year-old colt Maximum Security (New Year's Day) is nearing a return to the races.

Red Oak Stable homebred King for a Day (Uncle Mo) posted a hard-fought victory over the disqualified GI Kentucky Derby winner after that one stumbled at the start in the TVG.com Pegasus S. at Monmouth June 16. The bay disappointed in his next start, however, and was placed on the sidelines following a well-beaten fifth-place finish as the 5-2 second-choice after being checked hard on the far turn in the weather-delayed GI TVG.com Haskell Invitational S. on a scorching summer day on the Jersey Shore July 20.

With four breezes under his belt at Todd Pletcher's Palm Beach Downs base this month, including a four-furlong spin in :48.69 (2/22) Jan. 19, the GIII Challenger S. at Tampa Mar. 7 is a tentative early-season target for King for a Day, per Rick Sacco, Red Oak's racing and operations manager.

"It was just a rough day overall waiting to run that horse on Haskell day and he wasn't the same when he hit the paddock," Sacco said.

"He didn't run his race and he lost his action before the quarter pole having to steady and pull up. He hit himself at that point and he was a little banged up when he came back to the barn. We decided to give him the time at Red Oak Farm and

pinfired his ankles where he hit himself and the horse has come back super. Each and every week he's getting better and stronger and the horse physically looks awesome. He's sound and happy and Todd is very pleased with him."

Sacco concluded, "We're looking forward to getting him back on track and just can't wait to get him back to the races."

King for a Day, also a smart winner of last May's Sir Barton S. at Pimlico, is out of the unraced French Deputy mare Ubetwereven. He is a half-brother to the stakes winner Feel That Fire (Lightnin N Thunder), the dam of Red Oak and Madaket Stables's MGISW Mind Control (Stay Thirsty), who recently returned from a layoff with a game victory in the GIII Toboggan S. at Aqueduct.

### SOUTHERN BELLE THOROUGHBREDS' **IMPACT GROWS** By Diana Pikulski

Since the TDN first interviewed Katie Larsen, who founded Southern Belle Thoroughbreds in 2017, the organization's impact on safe placement of racehorses at Woodbine and Fort Erie has grown exponentially.

Southern Belle has placed 257 racehorses in two years and it has become a regular source for Thoroughbred Makeover prospects. The operational model at Southern Belle resembles that of Canter in the United States. Southern Belle has volunteers on the racetrack grounds who serve as the organization's ambassadors and facilitators, making contact with trainers who have racehorses they wish to retire and sell. The volunteers are experienced in seeing the potential in a horse as well as limitations based on injury or conformation. They photograph and video the horse and then the horse is listed on Southern Belle's website, promoted on social media and shared with the network of potential buyers that Larsen has developed.

"Without dedicated people to be our 'boots on the ground, we would not be so impactful," said Larsen. "At Fort Erie, Lamar Squires is my go to volunteer if a call comes in from a trainer. He goes immediately, sends me the photos, videos and descriptions and I write the ads and find the suitable buyer."

In the summer and fall, when Southern Belle is receiving its highest volume of calls, they can be listing as many as five to seven horses a day. Cont. p11

"Exercise rider Chelsea Clouter is my partner at Woodbine Racetrack," said Larsen. "She has been a cornerstone for us, taking photos of up to five horses a day sometimes which need to be re-homed immediately. Chelsea, Lamar and I all work closely together which is why we are as efficient as we are in the placement of these Thoroughbreds."

Larsen works full-time in the banking industry. She rode as young girl, but could not keep up with the high cost of horses and life on the show circuit. After making the decision to bring horses back into her life, she bought her first Thoroughbred, Mia Bella Amore (Golden Missile). Her relationship with the mare inspired Southern Belle Thoroughbreds.


"I didn't expect to be so successful, so soon," said Larsen. "I understand the trainers and owners wish to move a horse as quickly as possible once they make the decision to sell it. We appreciate that they have made the decision and the horse is our number one priority so we act immediately and hit our growing network of trainers who are looking for sound horses or horses who need a little bit of time off or rehabilitation. Many of our horses from last year appeared at the Retired Racehorse Project Thoroughbred Makeover in 2019, which was overwhelmingly incredible to see."

Thoroughbreds are enjoying an increase in popularity in the showing and eventing circuits fueled in large part by the Thoroughbred Makeover and the racing industry incentive programs such as NYTHA's Take2 and The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Incentive Program. These initiatives create Thoroughbred-only divisions and offer prize money to winners. Southern Belle emerged at the right time to help meet the increased demand for sound Thoroughbreds.

"With the help of Facebook, we reach a large audience," said Larsen. "Also, I am diligent about following up on horses and staying in touch with our purchasers. They appreciate that and see us as a family. On our website, in addition to the horses which are available, we feature the horses in their new homes."

One of Larsen's favorite success stories is Smooth Spirit (Smooth Bid), a 9-year-old mare who raced 30 times and is now eventing at training level with Darby Delle Donne. As a racehorse, Smooth Spirit, was trained by Anthony Alderson and earned \$33,320 before retiring at six.

"Donne is an accomplished eventer and she saw the potential in Smooth Spirit, now known as Renegade," said Larsen. "The duo even travels to Florida to train on the eventing circuit throughout the colder Ontario months. This horse is thriving and absolutely loves her new job."

Another inspiring placement was **Ultimate Blue** (Giant Gizmo), known at Fort Erie as the 'one-eyed wonder horse' who started 48 times. He is now on the hunter circuit as a true ambassador of the breed.

"There has been a ton of negative publicity this past year around horse racing in regards to the meat industry as well as track conditions and I think it is important to share the positivity that we experience in our dealings with trainers who want to do the right thing and the loving homes where we place our horses," said Larsen. "It is a labor of love for us at Southern Belle and it is a thrill to experience success at securing happy retirement for our beloved Thoroughbreds."

### TIF PUBLISHES 'AMERICAN RACING'S SUSTAINABLE FUTURE'

Considering three systemic issues and offering three recommendations, the Thoroughbred Idea Foundation released its newest white paper, "American Racing's Sustainable Future."

"No matter where an American racing stakeholder stands on the issues that seemingly have consumed the majority of the dialogue in the sport in recent months--the 'federal bill' or use of the crop amongst them--it is beyond time to start tackling the larger, fundamental concerns which threaten our industry and work towards a more sustainable future," said TIF Executive Director Patrick Cummings. "This paper is broader than our previous work and is the culmination of months of research and discussion with dozens of concerned industry stakeholders who rightly believe that modernization and evolution are necessary to arrest our decline."

"Stakeholders have rightly complained about a worrisome future for American racing over decades," added Craig Bernick, President and CEO of Glen Hill Farm and TIF founder. "It is a tremendous time to be an owner or breeder given slot-fueled subsidies that have left purses at record levels, but many owners and breeders remain unaware of the industry's struggle as it relates to lax oversight from some state racing commissions, the lack of incentives from racetracks to grow the sport or the failure of the industry's own organizations to address these systemic issues. Meanwhile, racing's wagering business is not competitive in the current market. This is an unthinkable position.

"Substantial change is needed and we are just starting the greater campaign to raise awareness. Horse owners have the greatest incentive to save racing."

Recommending a rethink of the role of the industry's self-created organizations, "American Racing's Sustainable Future" embraces a more centralized structure where it such centralization can be achieved.

"Our industry's greatest critics take delight in racing's inability to get its act together," said Cummings. "Why has our sport allowed this to continue year after year after year? Again--it doesn't matter where you stand on some of the issues that seemingly draw the most attention and divide us far more than they unite us. We must make our own sport as sustainable as possible."

### **GOLDEN GATE CANCELS RACING THE REST** OF THE WEEK DUE TO LACK OF HOT WATER

Golden Gate Fields has cancelled racing for the rest of the week after repairs from a gas leak in the area surrounding the track damaged the facility's hot water system. In addition to affecting food and beverage at the track, the issue impacts backstretch workers and the track is installing portable hot water showers for them during the repair process.

"There is no concern of a gas leak at Golden Gate Fields," said David Duggan, Vice President & General Manager, Golden Gate Fields. "Unfortunately, there was a leak in the area Thursday. In order to repair it, the utility company responsible for the gas line had to shut off the gas to the track. When they repressurized the lines afterwards, it did some damage to the pipes that supply hot water to the facility. After speaking with specialists, it's highly unlikely we will be fixed this weekend, so in the best interest of our horsemen, fans and employees and to safely expedite the repairs, we are cancelling both racing and simulcasting this weekend. We feel confident we can be fully up and running by Thursday."

The Stronach 5 was also canceled due to the absence of racing at Golden Gate Friday. It will return next Friday.

### IN TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST, MOLLICA DISCUSSES DIFFICULTIES FACING N.Y. TRAINERS

Trainers who run on the New York circuit tend to have the best horses in the country and compete for some of the highest purses in North America. But attorney Drew Mollica, whose expertise is equine law, said investigations conducted by the New York Sate Department of Labor have put many New York horsemen in a precarious position. Mollica made his comments on this week's edition of the *TDN* Writers' Room podcast in a segment sponsored by The Green Group.

Several prominent New York trainers have been hit with huge fines from the Department of Labor, which alleged that backstretch workers employed by those trainers were victims of wage theft. Mollica said the charges were not accurate and that the penalties were substantial.

"The Department of Labor has done things to fillet great employers and get them on technicalities," he said. "I have had the privilege to represent some very prominent people in these Department of Labor issues. The Governor of New York put out a press release that said the trainers were fined or settled because they were exploiting labor. I'm not going to get into the specifics of any one case, but I will say some of the employers who were targeted didn't exploit labor. I represented some people that treated their employees very well and the Department of Labor somehow found problems with them. One of the problems is that the Department of Labor doesn't understand this industry."

Mollica also touched on the on-going dispute between Ahmed Zayat and MGG Investments that has led to the possibility that a receiver will be responsible for overseeing the stable's assets. Mollica represented trainer Rudy Rodriguez in a dispute with Zayat over alleged unpaid training bills.

"There are probably a lot of other issues in this case that no one knows about," Mollica said. "The court pleadings are just meant to be a general laying out of the party's position. When a lawsuit goes to the discovery stage, these things tend to open up a little bit more. There are general pleadings, general denials, general accusations. A lawsuit is nothing more than an allegation...There are a lot of other issues in play here, like horses that are racing, licensing issues. A lot of things are going on here and there are a lot of moving parts."

### What was the experience that made you fall in love with horse racing?

Like a lot of other people who aren't born into the business, my exposure to racing happened when I went to the races with my father, who was a school teacher. When I was a kid, I started working at Colts Neck Farm in New Jersey. As soon as I started working there, I realized how much I loved this world. And that love has not subsided in the last 45 years.

The industry was a lot more popular with American society then, so it was a lot easier to gain exposure and access to racing. Times change and our industry is a lot different now in many ways.

### Would you commit to creating one new fan this year and, if so, what would be the experience you use to introduce them to the sport?

It is incumbent on every one of us to bring in at least one new fan each year, so I feel like it is my duty to give back by bringing in more than one fan every year.

### Hooked on Horse Racing cont.

I think it is best to bring in new fans in a very individualized way. We know that marketing programs are good, but there's nothing that beats one-on-one interactions and looking someone in the eye to explain what our industry is all about.

It's important to get the feel of where they are struggling with in our business. Most of the time, they struggle with the handicapping side of it. I've found that when I've introduced people to it, it's so much more effective to do it individually. That way I can pick up on body language to see where they are exhibiting misunderstanding or confusion.

I don't downplay our industry's challenges. It goes a lot easier when you are trying to turn someone on to our game that you put our issues up front. Here are the things we are dealing with. People like authenticity, when you don't sugar coat our sport. We don't live in a fantasy, we live and work in an industry that is currently struggling to keep and build upon its identity to the American public. We can help change that by interacting with the public one by one.

Whatever way you do it, just do it.

MERITATEN is a daughter of QUEEN NEFERTITI, in very ancient history--and also in the Jockey Club Register three millennia later.

The original Nefertiti (1370-1330 BC) was an Egyptian queen and the Great Royal Wife of Akhenaten, the Pharaoh who started a religious revolution by worshipping one god only, the sun (named Aten). Meritaten was the first of their six daughters and her name means "She who is beloved of Aten." As naming strategies go, I would call this a "parallel thread", which mimics an original link or connection.




