O'BRIEN SHARES UPDATE ON DWC NIGHT SQUAD

Coolmore's **Kew Gardens (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who snapped champion stayer Stradivarius (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire})'s winning streak in the G2 Long Distance Cup on British Champions Day at Ascot in October, will make his 2020 bow in the \$1.5-million G2 Dubai Gold Cup. The Aidan O'Brien trainee, who won the 2018 G1 Grand Prix de Paris as well as the G1 St Leger during his 3year-old year, was never off the board in four starts last term, running second three times–in the G3 Ormonde S. in May, the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom later that month and the G1 Irish St. Leger in September, prior to his Ascot win.

"I'm very happy with Kew Gardens," O'Brien told the Emirates Racing Club notes team. "It's more possible at the moment that he'll go for the two miles. He was at Dundalk recently [for a piece of work] and we're very happy with him."

Other O'Brien stablemates that are likely to line up for Dubai World Cup night on May 28 are 2019 G1 Investec Derby hero **Anthony van Dyck (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and the globetrotting G1SW **Magic Wand (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). The latter was last seen in action running ninth over the dirt in the \$20-million Saudic Cup in Riyadh on Feb. 29.

Added O'Brien, "Anthony Van Dyck and [GSW & MG1SP] **Fleeting (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}) are likely for the [\$6-million G1 Longines Dubai Sheema Classic] and Magic Wand has come out [of] her [unplaced finish in the Saudi Cup] very well."

FRANCE CLOSES ALL NON-ESSENTIAL BUSINESSES, RACECOURSES REMAIN OPEN FOR NOW

At 8 p.m. Saturday evening, French Prime Minister Edouard Philippe announced stricter social distancing measures due to the coronavirus, and that all places non-essential to French living including restaurants, cafes, cinemas and clubs, will be closed beginning at midnight on Saturday, *Jour de Galop* reported. At this time, French racecourses, which are currently racing without spectators for the foreseeable future, will remain open.

France Galop's President Edouard de Rothschild and Managing Director Olivier Delloye both confirmed late Saturday evening to the *JDG* that racing will continue in "closed camera" mode, but that the situation remains delicate. France's PMU is affected by the closure, as all businesses where the PMU operates that does not also have the designation of café, must be shuttered.

Irish and German racing is also currently being conducted without spectators, while racing in the UK has proceeded very much as normal. All Italian racing has been suspended until at least Apr. 3, as the entire country is in lock down.

A winner of Listed Paradise S. back in 2016, GM Hopkins doubled down and saluted in his second consecutive G3 Abu Dhabi Championship in the UAE on Saturday. Winless since his score just shy of a year ago, the venerable gelding ran fifth in the G2 Singspiel S. to Benbatl (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) at Meydan on Jan. 9 in his 9-year-old bow, and returned to run second in a handicap there at the end of the month. His latest appearance prior to Sunday was a flat 10th in another handicap there on Feb. 27.

Settled in midpack one off the fence as Jaaref (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Positions were largely unchanged until the final turn, when GM Hopkins made his bid for the lead. He took over around the 200-metre mark and eked out a narrow win, as Seniority launched a rally, but could not quite claw past his rival.

Pedigree Notes

The winner is a half-brother to Zvarkhova (Fr) (Makfi {GB}), who was MSP in France. A half to Italian listed winner Reknowing (UAE) (Halling), Varsity's two latest produce are the unraced sophomore filly and juvenile colt Opening Night (Ire) (Night of Thunder {Ire}) and Kyrov (Fr) (Dark Angel {Ire}). European highweight and sire Mark of Esteem (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) is under the third dam.

Facing off against males in the G3 Falcon S. stepping up to 1400 metres for the first time, Shine Garnet produced a withering finishing burst to win going away by 1 ½ lengths. In close quarters and tugging hard in the wake of pacesetter Dental Balloon (Jpn) (To the Glory {Jpn}) for the backstretch run, the blaze-faced chestnut fanned out into the center of the course leaving the bend. She charged to the head of affairs 150 metres from home and won a shade cozily with ears pricked. Favoured Lauda Sion, who had stalked from fourth for much of the race, was 2 ½ lengths clear of the closing Westerwald in third.

The Northern Farm-bred was first past the post in a Nakayama newcomers' affair in September, and made it two on the bounce--still over a mile--at Tokyo on Nov. 17. Only fourth in the G3 Fairy S. on Jan. 13, the chestnut was 9-1 on Saturday.

REGAL POWER TAKES ALL-STAR MILE

Short of a dead-heat, high-profile Western Australian breeder and owner Bob Peters couldn't have dared to dream of a better result in the All-Star Mile at Caulfield with his colours producing a memorable quinella in the \$5-million feature.

With wife Sandra, he bred and races the winner **Regal Power** (Pierro) and runner-up **Superstorm** (Sebring) with the pair trained at Karnup by Grant and Alan Williams with William Pike, the regular rider of the pair, pulling the right rein to be aboard the former.

With the Melbourne Racing Club making a decision on Friday to race behind closed doors due to the coronavirus outbreak, Peters was at home on Saturday and was on his way to the Ascot races when *TDN AusNZ* caught up with him.

"I'm not celebrating, I'm just driving out to the races," he said. "It was a great result and if you reversed the barriers I think the other one would have won.

"Regal Power had the good draw and when he came around the barrier I said to my wife, gee he's going easily and he got the perfect run."

Peters has been breeding and racing for nearly five decades and, while he's won numerous Group 1 races in that time, the All-Star Mile represented a pay day to remember. "It's been 47 years and it's the most lucrative result we've had and it's good that it all worked out," he said. "We planned for this after our horses ran at our carnival and purposefully missed the Perth Cup with Regal Power to aim him at these races. It's nice when a plan comes together."

Peters has enjoyed a successful association with his trainers and jockey.

"We're all a team and we breed the horses and educate them and then they take over the training of them as 2-year-olds. We don't start racing until they are 3-year-olds and each year we hope to get a few good ones out of it to help pay the way.

"Regal Power is only four and hopefully he goes on with it. Even though it wasn't a Group 1, there were 10 Group 1 winners in it."

Superstorm, who had finished runner-up in the G1 Australian Guineas at his previous appearance, is another exciting future prospect.

"We've always knew he had a lot of potential, but he's been very green and a work in progress, but he's got the ability," Peters said.

Regal Power stalked the leading pack and was presented at the perfect time 200m metres from home and had enough in reserve to see off the late run of Superstorm with the Kiwi mare **Melody Belle (NZ)** (Commands) third. The favourite **Alligator Blood** (All Too Hard) enjoyed a good run and made a short-lived challenge on the straight before he weakened out to finish 10th.

"They both went super and I didn't see the other one (Superstorm) so I'll have to go back and look at the replay," Grant Williams said. "We've got a great team and they'll be all on cloud nine.

"It's unbelievable and Bob (Peters) has been super to us and we wouldn't be where we are now without him. It's just great that he gives us these opportunities.

"Superstorm came over as a travelling companion and he ran second in the Australian Guineas to Alligator Blood and now he's beaten a lot of good horses in the All-Star Mile.

"He's going to be a serious horse in 12 months, he's not been a bad travelling companion."

For successful rider Pike, his timing was exquisite to land his first winner in Melbourne in the All-Star Mile.

"I'm thrilled and I gave a salute and that was for me. I'm very happy and this horse has been so good to me," Pike said. "Right now, I don't think anyone is training any better than the Williams camp. Their record in big races is amazing.

"And Mr Peters just keeps finding good horses year after year and keeps us all informed and keeps us all looking good.

"I was waiting for them to steady up mid-race, which they've done in nearly all the races I've ridden in here, but it just didn't come. I was at least one or two spots closer than I thought I'd be and it told a bit late but he was good enough."

Pedigree Notes

A son of Broadway Belle (Redoute's Choice), Regal Power is a brother to the G2 Western Australian Derby winner Action with the dam the winner of five races including the Listed Jungle Dawn Classic. She is a sister to the Listed Burgess Queen S. winner Antique Belle and the family of Peters' G1 Kingston Town Classic winner Arcadia Queen (Pierro).

CON TE PARTIRO CLAIMS GROUP 1

Con Te Partiro (USA) (Scat Daddy {USA}) was purpose bought as a broodmare prospect and the decision to put her into training has proved to be a masterstroke with the mare's future broodmare value skyrocketing following her G1 Coolmore Classic victory.

Purchased for \$575,000 at Fasig Tipton's Kentucky November Sale in 2018 by Newgate and SF Bloodstock, Con Te Partiro was bought for breeding purposes but, as something of an afterthought, she was put into pre-training.

The mare came to Australia with a tidy racing record for top American conditioner Wesley Ward and was the listed winner of the Sandringham H., at Royal Ascot. In her new environment, she quickly showed she still had a zest for racing when placed with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott.

Con Te Partiro confirmed that when she added the G3 Dark Jewel Classic to her record last year and subsequently went to stud but failed to get in foal and was returned to Waterhouse and Bott, who have weaved their magic with the sometimes cantankerous mare.

She was unplaced when resuming in the G2 Guy Walter S. and showed the benefit of that outing with a hollow win in the Coolmore on a rain-sodden Rosehill track.

"I'm very happy for the team and everyone involved and Gai's got an amazing record and it's a great thrill to do it alongside her," Bott said. "A big thank you to Henry Field and Newgate for giving us the opportunity to have another crack with the mare, it's been a great story.

"All along we've been able to make genuine excuses for her and she's performed very well, while it may not read like that on paper.

"She's very well-travelled and well-credentialed. We're very lucky to get the opportunity and Gai is great personal friends with Wesley and got an insight into what she was like before she came over.

"We certainly needed it because she can be a bit quirky at times and we've just kept her in a routine. The team has done a fantastic job with her as she can be quite high maintenance at times."

Con Te Partiro is likely to make her next appearance in the G1 Queen Of The Turf S. at Randwick.

"That looks a lovely race for her and she's also got a nomination for the Doncaster H. so we've got different options," Bott said.

Con Te Partiro was ridden by Tim Clark and he had the mare travelling well near the pace and they skipped clear 250 metres from home to have 1.31 on **Miss Fabulass** (Frankel {GB}) at the post with Noire (Foxwedge) back in third spot.

"It worked out perfectly. I just wanted to ping her out and get her comfortable and have her travelling where she was happy," Clark said. "We weren't sure about the ground, but we got in a great spot and she was right there. "She can be a little one-paced at times and she's a funny mare to work out. She's a bit quirky and I got her off the other day and said to go to 2000m. Gai always had a plan to run in this race and stuck solid and to be able to ride another Group 1 winner for Gai and Adrian is great."

Con Te Partiro is a daughter of Temple Street (USA) (Street Cry {Ire}), who won five races and finished runner-up in the G1 Humana Distaff S. and all four of her foals to race have been successful and includes the stakes winner Donworth (USA) (Tiznow). Temple Street is from the family of the G1 Spinaway S. winner Seattle Meteor (USA) (Seattle Slew {USA}), the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' S. winner Pleasant Stage (USA) (Pleasant Colony {USA}) and the G1 Woodbine Canadian International S. winner Marsh Side (USA) (Gone West {USA}).

DAUGHTER OF RIP VAN WINKLE EXCELS

The lead-up to the fillies' feature was dominated by **Jennifer Eccles (NZ)** (Rip Van Winkle {Ire}), who had strung together impressive Group 2 victories in the Eight Carat Classic, David & Karyn Ellis Fillies' Classic and Lowland S.

Her hopes were dented midweek when she drew the extreme outside gate in the field of 18, but jockey Jason Waddell played his part to perfection and had her one off the rail in midfield within the first 300 metres of the race.

Jennifer Eccles settled into a smooth rhythm behind a strong pace set by **Nothing Compares (NZ)** (Jakkalberry {Ire}), and she began to improve her position coming down the side of the track.

A group of fillies in front of her tired quickly approaching the home turn, and Jennifer Eccles clipped a heel and briefly stumbled. But Waddell extricated her from that pocket and got her into clear air, and she quickly balanced up and regained her momentum.

Jennifer Eccles powered to the lead 300 metres from the finish and opened up a clear lead, and despite tiring in the last 100 metres she raced to an emphatic victory by 1.5l.

Last-start maiden winner **Vancooga (NZ)** (Proisir) came from second-last with a huge finish to run second at odds of 50-to-one, with a long neck back to **Feel the Rush (NZ)** (Proisir) in third.

Trained by Shaune Ritchie, Jennifer Eccles has now had 11 starts for four wins, six placings and NZ\$499,650 in stakes for owners the Challenge No.10 Syndicate. Syndicator Adrian Clark paid just \$5000 to buy Jennifer Eccles from the 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock National Weanling Sale.

Pedigree Notes

Jennifer Eccles was bred by the Westend Partnership. She is by Rip Van Winkle (Ire), who shuttled to Windsor Park Stud before becoming a permanent resident there in 2017. He is the sire of 400 winners from 693 runners worldwide, with 31 individual stakes winners.

His Southern Hemisphere progeny have combined for 166 winners from 277 runners, including 16 at black-type level. The last two months have produced his first two Group 1 winners in the Southern Hemisphere, with Jennifer Eccles following on from the BCD Group Sprint and Chipping Norton S. winner Te Akau Shark (NZ).

The dam of Jennifer Eccles is Platinum Elle (NZ) (Elnadim {USA}), who won four races and placed in the Listed Canterbury Breeders' S. Platinum Elle is out of the G3 Eulogy S. placegetter Lady Tee (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), who is a daughter of four-time Group winner Waikiki (NZ) (Crested Wave {USA}). Platinum Elle's third dam Dancing Maid (NZ) (Sovereign Edition {Ire}) is also the granddam of Hong Kong Horse of the Year and three-time Group 1 winner Sacred Kingdom (Encosta De Lago).

Jennifer Eccles is Platinum Elle's fourth foal to race and second winner. She produced a colt by Sweynesse in 2017, and a filly by What's The Story (NZ) in 2019, then returned to Rip Van Winkle.



NADAL ACES TWO-TURN TEST IN REBEL

'**TDN Rising Star**' **Nadal** (Blame) made it a perfect three-forthree digging down gamely to deliver as the 4-5 favorite in wireto-wire fashion in Saturday's \$1-million GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park.

Removing blinkers for this first two-turn test, the rail-drawn bay was hustled to the front by Joel Rosario and was immediately hounded by unbeaten Louisiana-bred **No Parole** (Violence) and the returning GI American Pharoah S. runner-up **American Theorem** (American Pharoah) rounding the clubhouse turn.

No Parole backed off, but the two California invaders continued to throw down through sharp fractions of :22.89 and :46 over the sloppy, sealed going. Nadal began to shake clear approaching the quarter pole, but appeared to be in deep water once 80-1 bomb **Excession** (Union Rags), eighth at 43-1 in the GII Risen Star S. last time, angled off the rail under a full head of steam in the stretch.

Nadal just kept on finding down the lane, however, and gamely held that rival safe by 3/4 of a length. It was another seven lengths back to comebacking GI Runhappy Hopeful S. winner **Basin** (Liam's Map) in third.

"We were hoping for that outcome," Hall of Famer Bob Baffert said after saddling a record seventh Rebel winner.

Baffert continued, "We knew he was a good horse, but until they go two turns... and then the way it set up, the speed duel and all. Pretty impressive when they can just keep going like that. Only the really good ones can do that. I was just fortunate that you guys even ran the race, right now with the way things are. Crazy."

Nadal secured 50 points towards Kentucky Derby eligibility

with the victory.

Regarding future plans, Baffert added, "It's a little early, but we'll get him back here and we'll look at all of them. One of them will be there [GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 11]."

The \$65,000 KEESEP yearling turned \$700,000 FTFMAR juvenile made two previous starts sprinting at Santa Anita, posting a flashy debut win with a gaudy 98 Beyer Speed Figure Jan. 19, then dueling his way free to add the seven-furlong GII San Vicente S. on short notice Feb. 9. Nadal is campaigned in partnership by George Bolton, Arthur Hoyeau, Barry Lipman and Mark Mathiesen.

Bolton said, "When he turned for home and was a length or two ahead, I thought, 'You know what? He may be special. This may be a special horse and he may have the ability to go fast and then go faster.' And that's rare in a horse, to go in a Grade II, which I considered today a Grade I because it's a million dollar race in front of the Kentucky Derby. When the pressure hit, he stood and he took it and he accelerated."

Serengeti Empress (Alternation) hadn't visited the winner's circle since her victory in last spring's GI Kentucky Oaks, but marked her return in style, airing by 6 1/4 lengths in Saturday's GII Azeri S. at Oaklawn.

Exiting post five, Serengeti Empress broke alertly as 16-1 chance Awe Emma (War Front) hopped at the start, unseating Richard Eramia leaving post seven. The favorite quickly opened up on the field, but was soon joined by the riderless grey down the backstretch with the remainder of the field several lengths

behind. Having shaken clear of the wayward Awe Emma and well clear of her nearest pursuer at the top of the stretch, Serengeti Empress remained under a hand ride by Joe Talamo, rolling home an uncontested winner over the closing Mylady Curlin, who got up late to complete the exacta. Saracosa was third, besting Grade I winner Street Band.

Serengeti Empress won three of five starts at two, including a 19 1/2-length romp in the GII Pocahontas S. at Churchill Downs. An uncharacteristically flat seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies later that fall, she returned at three to take that winter's GII Rachel Alexandra S. before being vanned off after visibly bleeding from her nostrils in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks. Let go at 13-1 for the Kentucky Oaks, she went wire to wire to garner the blanket of lilies before finishing runner up in her next two--GI Acorn S. and GI Test S. Sixth behind winner Street Band in the GI Cotillion S., she rounded out the season with a third in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Santa Anita. Favored for her latest, she came up a half-length shy of Lady Apple (Curlin) in the GIII Houston Ladies Classic S. Jan. 26.

"I really felt like the Sam Houston race [Houston Ladies Classic] was a missed opportunity and I said that quite a few times publicly because I'm going to tell you what I think," winning trainer Tom Amoss said. "There was no secret what the plan was going to be today. We took it to them early and she set such a blistering pace. It's the kind of pace that a lot of people would not think she could withstand, or a racehorse could withstand. But she's a little different."

Amoss said that the \$1-million GI Apple Blossom H. Apr. 18 is the next expected start for his stable star.





"I was worried right down to the wire," Maker said. "I try to bring some of my better turf horses for the Ruby. It's paid off over the years. He ran a great race off the bench in the Dania Beach in a very competitive field and I thought he would run very well here. He's a good-sized horse. His conformation's great. Great mind on him."

Drawn widest of all in post 11 in this first try on the allweather, the gray stalked from a three-wide third as stablemate **Fancy Liquor** (Lookin At Lucky), a narrow debut winner over the Gulfstream turf last time, led Invader through opening splits of :23.76 and :47.78. Field Pass began to wind up entering the far turn as those two locked horns. Invader started to get the better of Fancy Liquor in deep stretch and briefly looked like he could be on his way to his third straight victory, but just couldn't hold off Field Pass, who got the money under a perfectly timed ride by Irad Ortiz, Jr.

Runner-up in the GIII With Anticipation S. over the Saratoga lawn and fourth after showing speed in Keeneland's GIII Dixiana Bourbon S., Field Pass concluded his juvenile season with a wellbeaten sixth in his lone try on dirt in an optional claimer at Churchill Downs Oct. 27.

HURRICANE SALLY

Turning for home in Saturday's GIII Hurricane Bertie S. at Gulfstream Park, **Sally's Curlin** (Curlin) appeared to have far too much to do to catch the free-running front runner Blamed (Blame). Taking advantage of the effects of a lively early pace, however, Sally's Curlin came flying down the center of the lane late to win going away. Unhurried at the start, Sally's Curlin settled several lengths behind the field as Blamed (Blame) led through initial fractions of :22.13 and :44.61 while stalked by Pauseforthecause and Lady Kate (Bernardini). As Blamed began to weaken turning for home, Pauseforthecause took the lead with Wildwood's Beauty in hot pursuit. Five wide turning for home, Sally's Curlin found her best stride late, rocketing to the front to win by 2 3/4 widening lengths over Wildwood's Beauty.

"She broke a step slow so I didn't rush her, I just took my time," said Hall of Fame rider Edgar Prado. "I've been watching all her races and it seemed like she has a very nice kick. I just let her settle and tried to pick them up and when I asked her, she rolled home. I didn't want to be that far back, but because she broke a little slow I didn't want to rush her to catch the group and then have her slow down. I was trying to make the right move. Around the turn I felt good when I started to see her getting closer and closer and I wasn't really asking her. I was encouraging her, but I wasn't really asking for her best. I was like, 'She's got a good chance.' I was looking for a place to go but the rail was taken so I went outside and she kept on going."

The victory has placed Prado to within two wins from fellow Hall of Famer Angel Cordero for ninth all-time with his 7055th career victory.

Sally's Curlin needed several tries to break through, but beginning with her maiden score in June, she won four of six starts, including a pair of optional claiming wins at Ellis and Churchill, respectively, and followed those with a score in the 2020 Stud Fee: \$20,000 LFSN

"We saw what she was made of at the end of last year," said winning trainer Dale Romans. "She had a little issue in her last race. I don't think it was the distance. We knew this was going to be her year."

Romans said he would consider his options for Sally's Curlin's next start.

"With this performance the sky's the limit. The way she ran today--I didn't know she was going to run that big; I knew she was going to run big--it might change things. We might have to look for some bigger stuff."

Pedigree Note:

Multiple stakes placed Cabo Queen is also responsible for a yearling colt by Carpe Diem and was bred back to Maclean's Music. Out of stakes winning and graded-placed First Quarter (Sky Classic), the 10-year-old mare is a half to Canadian champion sprinter and champion older horse One Way Love (Regal Classic). Two-time Horse of the Year Curlin is responsible for 66 black-type winners from nine crops of racing age.

Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association representatives tried last week during eight hours of negotiations with Arlington Park and parent company Churchill Downs to reach a reasonable agreement on a contract that would provide adequate funding for overnight purses at Arlington in 2020. But Arlington and Churchill offered only what could charitably be described as proposals made in bad faith.

The ITHA is deeply disappointed. And if Arlington's past actions serve as any guide to its steps in the coming weeks, we are bracing for an attempt by Churchill and Arlington to castigate Illinois owners and trainers--the men and women whose considerable financial investment and efforts underpin the success of our sport and industry--as the scapegoat for what is squarely a spectacular failure on the part of Churchill and Arlington to demonstrate any meaningful commitment to the future of live Thoroughbred racing in Illinois.

Churchill is the same corporation that, following two decades of lobbying state lawmakers for the authority to develop Arlington as a racino, declined to even apply for the racino license that lawmakers granted as part of the gaming expansion law approved last year. The intent of that new law was to boost overnight purses and otherwise invigorate the growth of Thoroughbred horse racing in this state for the purpose of creating jobs, sparking economic opportunity and diversifying the tax base for the state and local communities. But having purchased the majority stake in the nearby Rivers Casino, Churchill opted instead to abandon that racino pursuit and shield Rivers from the prospect of competition that might result from casino-style gaming at Arlington.

Churchill's disdain for live racing knows no bounds. It has shown not only that it will make no commitment to horse racing beyond that which is minimally required by law--as evidenced by its refusal to adequately fund the overnight purses at Arlington this year--but also that it will not bother to follow even the plain letter of the law.

Last year, Churchill failed to comply with a state law requiring that Arlington agree to a contract with the horsemen's association by Dec. 31. Thereafter, Arlington doubled down by applying with the Illinois Gaming Board for a sports betting license--notwithstanding another state law that says any applicant for a sports betting license must comply "with all federal, state and local laws."

Now, in what should give pause to horsemen across America, Churchill appears poised to violate the federal Interstate Horse Racing Act by threatening to take wagers on a signal for which there might be no broadcast. And, if it follows through on its parallel threat to conduct racing without a contract with the horsemen's association, it would uproot the most basic understanding between management and horsemen that a contract must exist, for racing to occur, between the horsemen's association and the track.

And so, Illinois horsemen are compelled to reiterate that adequate funding of overnight purses at Arlington this year is well within Churchill's reach. Indeed, Churchill must only abandon its plan to divert from the purse account nearly half of the funds earmarked for overnight purses.

As it stands, Arlington intends to send more than 44% of those funds not to those actively supporting the Illinois racing industry--but to Churchill, its out-of-state corporate owner, and to individuals not committed to Illinois:

• An estimated \$17.7 million will be earned for purses at Arlington in 2020.

Arlington plans to give \$4.5 million of that money to Churchill as a cash subsidy ("recapture") to use however it may please.

• Arlington would then devote another approximately \$3.3 million to subsidize open stakes.

• After that, and accounting for a fraction of purse funds that Illinois horsemen have set aside to support the ITHA's services and efforts to advocate for live racing opportunities in Illinois, only about \$9.1 million would remain for overnight purses in 2020.

• Overnight purses on average each day this year would then amount to only an estimated \$133,000, according to the ITHA's calculations.

Illinois horsemen are appalled by Churchill's continued contempt for live racing and the working men and women, from

backstretch workers to breeders, who have committed themselves to Illinois racing and who depend on overnight purses to support themselves and their families.

Churchill's plan to divert \$7.8 million from the horsemen's purse account is all the more egregious given rising concern that handle--and, by extension, purses earned during dark time-could drop precipitously at Arlington and other tracks across North America this year if track attendance and wagering suffer amid fears related to the coronavirus. A massive money grab from overnight purses that directly support Illinois jobs could not come at a worse time.

Our owner members have invested an estimated \$100 million in the race horses stabled at Arlington and Hawthorne Race Course. Additionally, we spend more than \$40 million annually to keep those horses trained. And every four or five years, we replace and replenish retiring horses (thereby re-investing another \$100 million). Under Arlington's 2020 plan for the purse account, horsemen committed to this state's racing industry would be racing at that track for a substantial--and unacceptable--loss.

No future meeting concerning a contract has yet been scheduled. But the ITHA will continue to urge Churchill to abandon its misguided plan and to instead devote those purse dollars for their intended purpose--support of Illinois jobs. We stand with Illinois jobs. Arlington Park should, too.

FARALDO TESTS NEGATIVE FOR CORONAVIRUS

Standardbred Owners Association of New York President Joe Faraldo has tested negative for coronavirus, also known as COVID-19. SOA NY Director John Brennan, who was posted at Yonkers Raceway, became the first coronavirus-related death in New Jersey Tuesday, resulting in the closure of Yonkers Raceway. Faraldo had close contact with Brennan and recently developed symptoms similar to those of coronavirus.

The SOA NY made the following statement on their Twitter account: "We were notified today that SOA President Joe Faraldo has been tested and confirmed negative for COVID-19. He is currently at home recovering from an illness that has now been confirmed as unrelated to COVID-19. We wish him a speedy recovery."

Yonkers racing is suspended through Mar. 18. Freehold Raceway also canceled all racing and simulcasting for the next two weeks after it was discovered that an individual who had been exposed to someone who tested positive for coronavirus was at the track Mar. 7.

Many other harness tracks have followed suit, including the Meadowlands, Poconos and Monticello, who have all canceled live racing for varying time periods.

TURF PARADISE ENDS SEASON EARLY DUE TO CORONAVIRUS CONCERNS

Turf Paradise has announced that it is ending its season immediately due to the outbreak of Coronavirus, and to assist Arizona in slowing the spread of the illness. Recently Governor Doug Ducey declared a public health emergency and he signed a bill that would spend \$55 million in Arizona to combat the virus. The track's Clubhouse and Turf's network of Off Track Betting locations will remain open for simulcasting at other tracks. Live racing had been scheduled to run until May 3. Live racing at Turf Paradise will resume in mid-October which is the traditional start of the season. Rillito Park in Tucson has suspended live racing.

Turf Paradise joins professional basketball, baseball, and hockey leagues in suspending large scale events to prevent the spread of the disease. While there have been no documented cases of Coronavirus at Turf Paradise, track management feels it is important to be proactive and to put the health of the fans, employees, horsemen and jockeys first.

"The State of Arizona, Governor Ducey, and responsible sports franchise and business owners are all working together to slow or halt the spread of the Coronavirus. Arizona is at its best when everyone does their part in a crisis," said Vince Francia, Turf Paradise General Manager.



Francia added, "Horseracing involves large numbers of people who must compete and work in close proximity to each other. It would be irresponsible to put them at risk of getting the Coronavirus. As soon as this crisis is over, we look forward to getting back to the business of providing Arizona with thrilling live, local horseracing."

GRAN VENTA SELECTA SUNDAY



Argentine-bred, international Grade I winner and sire Candy Ride | Lane's End

The second renewal of Argentina's Gran Venta Selecta yearling sale takes place on Sunday at the sales pavilion at San Isidro Racecourse in Buenos Aires, with 109 yearlings catalogued. Despite the Coronavirus pandemic causing some sales in the U.S. and Europe to be canceled or postponed, Gran Venta Selecta has opted to go ahead while limiting patrons to serious agents and buyers, and no spectators.

Gran Venta Selecta was launched last year by leading local stud farms Haras Vacacion and Haras Abolengo with the vision of it growing into a sale of international stature. Yearling sales in Argentina are conducted differently than in other parts of the world; rather than droves of breeders pooling their resources into a few select events, two to three breeders will generally band together to offer their yearlings in small batches (usually around 50) at sales that occur sometimes multiple times a week during the high season, with the stud farms contracting out auctioning duties to one of a few select sales firms. The quality has been historically spread across the various sales.

Vacacion and Abolengo principals Pablo Zavaleta and Julio Menditeguy last year each committed their finest yearlings to the inaugural Gran Venta Selecta with the hopes that the sale would someday develop into a one-stop shop for international buyers looking to reap the best of what the country has to offer. And those studs are no strangers to producing top-class international horses; Abolengo bred Candy Ride (Arg) (Ride The Rails), while Vacacion is responsible for the 10-time American Grade I winner Paseana (Arg) (Ahmad {Arg}).

The pilot project was deemed a success, with the top lot bringing ASD5.6-million (£103,960/€119,991), a record for an Argentine yearling in pesos and with all of the sale's international visitors from the U.S., Hong Kong, Malaysia and South Africa each taking home at least one horse.


International bloodstock agent Emmanuel de Seroux summarized last year's sale, saying at the time, "I think this is a very good first experience to show the Argentine yearlings to the world. I think people will be more and more interested to come and they need to, because they can access some fantastic pedigrees at 20% of the price of what they'd have to pay at Keeneland or Newmarket.

"You can come to a sale like this and buy half a dozen very well-bred fillies for \$50,000 or \$60,000 each, and you start a very nice breeding program. If you have one or two good ones out of the five or six it's fantastic, and the others, due to their pedigrees, they're still very nice broodmares for the future."

While the challenges facing the second renewal of the sale are no doubt heightened by the Coronavirus effect and an Argentine economy that was already struggling, it doesn't suffer from a lack of quality bloodstock. The sale has been bolstered this year by the addition of a select handful of yearlings from studs Embrujo, La Providencia and Santa Ines, and the offerings include the progeny of leading local sires like Equal Stripes, Hurricane Cat and Orpen, as well as promising young sires like Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and John F Kennedy (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), the latter represented by his second crop. The sale includes 21 first-crop Southern Hemisphere yearlings by Coolmore shuttler War Command (War Front), including a halfsister to Group 1 winner and sire In The Dark (Arg) (Mutakddim) (lot 4); a filly out of Que Piensa Cat (Arg) (Easing Along) (lot 14), a local Group 1 winner who produced the stakes-winning Always Thinking (Street Sense) during her time in the U.S.; and a halfsister to last year's record-setting sale topper (lot 28). International flavour is added by sons of Cityscape (GB) (lot 12)-a half-brother to Argentine and American Group/Grade 1 winner Hi Happy (Arg) (Pure Prize) and Violence (lot 108)-from the family of former international sire Mutakddim.

Quality is evident from the first turns of the catalogue pages. Lot 1 is Abolengo's son of the champion sire Equal Stripes and a full-brother to Paulinho (Arg) and Positive Mind (Arg), winners respectively of the Group 1 Gran Premio Estrellas Juvenile and Juvenile Fillies; the equivalent of the Breeders' Cup in Argentina. Lot 2 is by Godolphin's Grade I-placed Fortify (Distorted Humor) and a full-sister to G1 Gran Premio Jockey Club winner Roman

Joy (Arg), while lot 3 is an Orpen half-sister to 2-year-old champion Galicado (Arg) (Asiatic Boy {Arg}) and Group 1-winning juvenile Got Talent (Arg) (Easing Along {Arg}).

Lot 7 is an Equal Stripes full-sister to Group 1 winner Shyster (Arg) and Peruvian champion Shakita (Arg); lot 9 is by Orpen and a half-brother to champion Expressive Halo (Arg) (Halo Sunshine); lot 18 is a filly by In The Dark out of Group 1 winner Peluca Fizz (Arg) (Slew Gin Fizz); lot 19 is a full-brother to champion Care Lady (Arg) (Equal Stripes {Arg}); and lot 46 is by Treasure Beach (GB) out of Estrellas Juvenile Fillies winner Coordenada (Arg) (Equal Stripes {Arg}), herself a full-sister to champion Cooptado (Arg).

The nation also gave us the American Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes), and more recently horses like Blue Prize (Arg) (Pure Prize), Hi Happy and Vale Dori (Arg) (Asiatic Boy {Arg}) have flown the flag at the highest level abroad. Argentine mares have produced recent Grade I winners like Carina Mia (Malibu Moon) and Salutos Amigos (Salute The Sarge) in the U.S., and they have been on a particular tear in Japan with the likes of champions Satono Diamond (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Danon Fantasy (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) to their credit. G1

CHARLATAN LOOKS THE REAL DEAL IN TWO-

'TDN Rising Star' Charlatan (Speightstown--Authenticity, by Quiet American) made 30 cents on the dollar seem like Christmas in March and is on to bigger and better things following a thoroughly convincing 10 1/4-length allowance victory Saturday afternoon at Santa Anita.

Quickly into stride from the outside gate in a scratched-down field of five just minutes after stablemate and fellow '**Rising Star**' Nadal (Blame) stamped his authority on the GII Rebel S., Charlatan looked to settle well enough through an opening quarter-mile in :23.14 and skipped along ears-pricked past the half-mile in :46.86 while setting the pace a bit off the inside. Always clear of his rivals, the \$700,000 Keeneland September yearling hit the quarter pole after three-quarters in 1:11.04 and opened up at will from there, clocking a respectable :25.20 for the final two furlongs while never asked for anything approaching a top effort.

"We don't know if we'll run here in the [GI] Santa Anita Derby [Apr. 4], because nobody's really sure when anything is going to happen," said trainer Bob Baffert. "Whenever they cancel the Masters, that's like the Derby...I've never seen anything like this, it's kinda scary. Hopefully they can get everything under control."

A chestnut who bears a physical resemblance to his sire, Charlatan earned a debut 105 Beyer Speed Figure in posting a 5 3/4-length victory (raw time 1:08.85) at Santa Anita Feb. 16.

Charlatan, whose dam placed twice at Grade I level at Santa Anita. is a half to Hanalei Moon (Malibu Moon), SW-US, SP-Can, \$295,090. Authenticity, a \$1.2-million purchase out of the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, is the dam of the 2-year-old colt Bennyfromthebronx (Tapit) and a yearling filly by Into Mischief. She was most recently covered by Curlin.



This year marked the second that the Bourbonette Oaks was conducted since losing its Grade III status, and it was Queen of God who saluted Saturday afternoon at Turfway, earning 20 points on the Road to the Kentucky Oaks. Part of the calvary charge into the clubhouse turn, the Respite Farm-bred sat in midpack against the fence for the backstretch run. She began to creep closer past six furlongs in 1:12.08 and, although lugged in, took command 200 yards from home before holding off the rallying Pass the Plate. Off the mark at second asking when in for a \$35,000 tag over the grass at Gulfstream Park West Nov. 22, Queen of God won a Gulfstream optional claimer across town just seven days later. After a rough break in the Ginger Brew S., the dark bay could only manage eighth Jan. 4, and she set the pace and plugged on to take fourth upped to 1 1/16 miles Jan. 31. Transferred from Alexis Delgado to Mike Maker, she closed from midpack to take Gulfstream's Mrs. Presidentress S. Feb. 17 and was making her first start on the all-weather and outside of Florida Saturday.


