## HARRINGTON IN FACT-FINDING MISSION

Jessie Harrington is keen to put some of her most promising juveniles to the test in an intriguing card at Leopardstown on Thursday which features the G3 Japan Racing Association Tyros S. and G3 Frank Conroy Silver Flash S. In the former, which has played host to the likes of Teofilo (Ire), New Approach (Ire), Rip Van Winkle (Ire) and Churchill (Ire) in recent times, she saddles Alpha Racing 2020's impressive July 1 nine-length course-and-distance maiden winner **Cadillac (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}), while Robert Scarborough and Susan Magnier's **Oodnadatta (Ire)** (Australia {GB}) and the O'Callaghans' **No Speak Alexander (Ire)** (Shalaa {Ire}) are currently scheduled to go in the Silver Flash.

"Cadillac seems in good form. We've an awful wet morning here, so the ground might end up turning soft, but I don't think that will bother him--I think he'd be fine on any ground."

Easy conditions may not suit Oodnadatta, however, who beat the subsequent G3 Marble Hill S. winner Minaun (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) and the July 28 11-length Galway maiden scorer **Meala (Ire)** (Epaulette {Aus}) in a maiden also over this track and trip June 21. She may instead head for Saturday's G3 Sweet Solera S., leaving the 6 1/2-length July 7 Roscommon maiden winner No Speak Alexander as the sole representative. "Oodnadatta is in good form, but it is a wet morning here today, so we might take her to Newmarket if the ground goes soft and just run the other filly at Leopardstown," Harrington added. ## MILITARY MARCH TO FOLLOW BENBATL ROUTE

Last year's G3 Autumn S. winner **Military March (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), a leading fancy for the G1 Investec Derby before meeting with a setback in the lead-up to the race, will follow a similar path over the winter to his Saeed bin Suroor stablemate **Benbatl (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the trainer said. Military March, last seen finishing fourth in the G1 2000 Guineas on June 6, is training towards an autumn return in Europe and will later target dirt races in Dubai.

"Military March is back in light training," bin Suroor said. "We are not going to rush him and he will be out at the end of September or early October, where we will find a race for him. The horse is doing well physically. We will look to give him one more run in England, then take him to Dubai--but he needs to have one more run here to make sure he is fit when he goes out there as he is a big horse. We will target one of the Al Maktoum Challenge races to start with to see if he handles the dirt. Everyone is always searching for a horse for the Dubai World Cup and if he did well on the dirt he could be a horse for the race." [Cont. p2](#)

She continued, "No Speak Alexander is in good order. She improved from her first run to her second and I hope there's more improvement to come."

Aidan O'Brien has won nine of the last 10 renewals of the Tyros and 13 winners overall, while his tally is seven of the last 11 Silver Flash scorers and 11 in total. He has three colts in the Tyros, with Wayne Lordan booked for the maiden **Van Gogh** (American Pharoah) who was fourth on debut over this track and trip behind the re-opposing **Masen (GB)** (Kingman {GB}) and **Charterhouse (GB)** (Charming Thought {GB}). The latter was 66-1 when just denied by the Juddmonte rival there and trainer John Joseph Murphy sees him as a live outsider again in a year when the lesser-celebrated Irish stables are coming to the fore in the important juvenile staging posts. "He's in tremendous form and I think he's come on a lot from his first run," he said. "You've got the horse that beat him there again and it does look a very hot renewal. We haven't got a great draw and I hope they don't get any more rain, as he definitely prefers quicker ground."

Others to note in the Tyros are the Donnacha O'Brien-trained July 8 Gowran Park maiden scorer **Southern Cape (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and July 11 course-and-distance maiden winner **Vafortino (Ire)** (New Bay {GB}) who hails from brother Joseph's stable. Coolmore are well-represented in the Silver Flash by Ballydoyle's July 19 Curragh maiden winner **Snowfall (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Donnacha's July 8 Gowran Park mile maiden scorer **Shale (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), while Jim Bolger saddles the aforementioned Meala, Dermot Weld runs Moyglare Stud's June 26 six-furlong Curragh maiden winner **A Ma Chere (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) and Joseph O'Brien pitches in John Oxley's **TDN Rising Star Pretty Gorgeous (Fr)** (Lawman {Fr}). She impressed over a mile at Bellewstown on the July 2 card which has already thrown up a subsequent luminary in the recent G2 Airlie Stud S. scorer Aloha Star (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}).

was last seen finishing third in the Saudi Cup, he is expected to resurface next in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois on Aug. 16 or the G1 Juddmonte International on Aug. 19.

### UK EQUINE ANTI-DOPING RULES ALTERED

A number of changes have been made to the equine anti-doping rules in the UK, the British Horseracing Authority announced on Wednesday. These changes have been made following a comprehensive review of the sport's anti-doping rules announced in 2018. Individual trainers and the National Trainers Federation were consulted, with additional input from both the UK and World Anti-Doping Agencies and sports bodies such as the FEI. Northridge LLP, a specialist sports law practice, also provided independent legal advice on the rule changes.

## Equine Anti-Doping Rules

In summary, the changes, which will go into effect on Sept. 1, are as follows:

- If a horse tests positive for a prohibited substance, in order to avoid a penalty the responsible person must establish the precise source of the positive finding and that they had taken all reasonable precautions
- Cautions are available for lower level breaches
- Suspended sanctions are available for breaches

Tim Naylor, Director of Integrity and Regulation at the BHA, said, "The culmination of this project has followed consultation with the appropriate parties as well as legal advice in relation to the rule changes, and it is our hope that we now have a set of equine anti-doping rules which are clear both for those who enforce them and those who are bound by them.

"We have to ensure that our rules in relation to anti-doping are sufficiently robust, but also that as much as is possible in such a technical area everyone bound by the rules understands what is required of them. Whilst in places the requirements upon the responsible person have been strengthened, there have also been changes to allow more appropriate penalties for lower and mid-level breaches of the rules.

"We have communicated these changes now ahead of their implementation date next month to allow sufficient time for participants to ask any questions they may have prior to the rules taking effect."

## Equine Anti-Doping Rules

In response to these new changes, the National Trainers Federation released the following statement, which read in part: “Trainers have strict liability for the presence of prohibited substances in a horse’s system. In the light of Disciplinary Panel decisions since the cases that led to the BHA’s review, the NTF believes the existing equine anti-doping rules provide sufficient encouragement for compliance. In that context, the outcome of the BHA’s review into penalties in these cases is a mixed bag for trainers.

“The NTF is pleased that the BHA took on board the need to remove penalties where malicious administration could be proved. However, strict liability reverses the principle of “innocent until proved guilty” by putting the onus on the defendant to prove innocence – in this case by having to prove the precise source of the prohibited substance....

“To mitigate the burden of strict liability, the BHA and NTF have agreed restructured penalties. It is right that the Disciplinary Panel should have the option of cautioning a trainer instead of imposing a financial penalty (as required by the current rules), for the least culpable breaches.

“We disagree with the BHA about the minimum sanction of a suspended disqualification in addition to a financial penalty for the lowest level breach for substances prohibited at all times. If the Panel is satisfied the trainer had no knowledge of the substance’s administration and had taken reasonable precautions, a suspended disqualification is an unwarranted stain on the trainer’s reputation...”

## SISKIN’S NEXT START UP IN THE AIR

Classic hero **Siskin** (First Defence), who lost his unbeaten tag with a third in last week’s G1 Qatar Sussex S., has emerged from that effort well, but his connections are not sure where he will start next. Trained by Ger Lyons for Prince Khalid Abdullah’s Juddmonte operation, the homebred had scored an impressive victory in the G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas in his sophomore bow at The Curragh on June 12. The bay was unbeaten in four runs as a juvenile, including the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. and G2 GAIN Railway S.

“He’s come out of the race well,” said Abdullah’s racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe. “I’ve got to discuss with Prince Khalid what he would like to do. We’ll look at all the options, which are pretty straightforward really.”

Another Juddmonte colourbearer also received a positive update, as two-time G1 Prix de l’Arc heroine **Enable (GB)** (Nathaniel {Ire}) continues to shine after take the July 25 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth QIPCO S. at Ascot, her third win in the race. [Cont. p5](#)

**RICHARD FITZGERALD ENDING TENURE AS RMG CEO**

Racecourse Media Group Chief Executive Richard FitzGerald will leave his position after a 12-year run. FitzGerald will slowly step down over a six-week period, with RMG Finance Director Martin Stevenson becoming acting CEO. RMG, which holds the media and data rights for 34 British tracks, has enjoyed a profitable run under FitzGerald, as his tenure included the deal for ITV to provide terrestrial coverage (through 2023) and Racing UK becoming Racing TV, with Irish rights also secured.

“It has been a fabulous and rewarding 12 years working for RMG,” said FitzGerald in a statement. “The business has flourished and delivered on the vision of the founding shareholders around a collective approach to commercialising their media and data rights.

“There is never a good time to step down but with resumption of racing, the new Watch & Bet deals, the terrestrial TV renewal and launch in Italy of fixed odds, and a new cycle of renewals starting shortly, it seems the right time to step down.

“It has been a great journey and I have enjoyed working with a strong, capable, committed and stable team to deliver the results we have been able to achieve consistently over the last decade.”

Added RMG Chairman Roger Lewis, ““On behalf of the board of RMG, I thank Richard for his exceptional leadership of the

RMG team for almost 12 years. During this period RMG has produced great returns for our racecourses, generating over £800m of licence fees during his tenure of office.

“The recent renewal of the RMG contract with ITV until 2023, the successful launch of our new Watch & Bet Service in June, and ensuring RMG is fully operational following the COVID-19 outbreak and so generating significant revenues for our racecourses, has created the right moment for Richard to announce his decision to step down.

“The achievements of RMG, which have driven its financial performance with Richard as CEO are significant, and include a ground-breaking data licensing and production service, an innovative LBO deal with SIS, the securing of the rights to Irish racing, the rebrand and launch of Racing TV, enhancing its HD service, and the expansion of RMG opportunities across the world. Richard leaves RMG with our sincerest thanks and best wishes for having delivered an outstanding performance over a considerable period of time.”

**AYR MEETING ABANDONED**

Wednesday’s meeting at Ayr was abandoned after the fourth race after heavy rain was found to have caused patches of false ground. The Scottish track had received more than an inch of rain on Tuesday and it continued to fall during the afternoon on Wednesday, causing conditions to deteriorate.

“Jockeys came in after the third race and reported they felt a bit of false ground,” Clerk of the Course Graeme Anderson told Racing TV. “We had a look but it just seemed to be a wetter area, a heavier patch. They came back in after race four and reported a couple of areas, one about the furlong-and-a-half mark and one about just the half-furlong. We had a look. They were pretty deep holes, just really heavy ground. We’d had eight millimetres since 12:30 [Wednesday] on top of 28mm [Tuesday]. It’s been relentless so it’s taken its toll.” **Cont. p6**

The card's last five races were abandoned.

"It's right in the centre," Anderson added. "We looked at trying to run the races on the round course and abandon the sprint race, but there's a fear you can't avoid it during a race. It was better to be safe than sorry.

"It's an area where we've never had a problem before. It just seems to be wetter than others and just holding water and the holes are starting to fill with the rain coming down. It's going to ride false. I'm hoping it's just a case of the amount of rain we've had and it's nothing more than that, but we will definitely be investigating and see what caused it and see what it's looking like. It's two weeks on Monday for our next meeting and then the Gold Cup meeting about three and a half weeks after that."

## MIDLIFE CRISIS HAS ROOTS IN AUSTRALIA



Midlife Crisis | Scoop Dyga

The impressive debut of **Midlife Crisis (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) in a 2-year-old maiden at Deauville in France on Tuesday owed more than just a little to the foresight of Australian-based agent Louis Le Metayer of Astute Bloodstock, who sourced his dam, The Hunt Is On (Manhattan Rain) for his French breeders, Haras d'Etream. Midlife Crisis is being touted as a possible contender for Group 1 races later in the season by his trainer Hiroo Shimizu, after his 5-length win at Deauville over 7.5f.

"In my opinion, he has plenty of room for improvement and is capable of much more. I very much see him as a (G1) Prix du Jockey club horse for next year and the (G1) Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere [over seven furlongs at Longchamp in October] will be his target this season," Shimizu said after the win.

Over four years ago, Le Metayer dispatched then assistant Nicolas Lefevre to Millicent in South Australia to inspect the broodmare prospect The Hunt Is On, the three-quarter sister to Group 1 winners Abbey Marie (Redoute's Choice) and Absolutely (Redoute's Choice), and sister to Group 3 subsequent Geelong Cup winner Runaway.

"I am always on the lookout for well-bred mares that can be sourced privately or even for auction. Ones with a bit of ability. We really like this family, it's a beautiful big international family," he told *TDN AusNZ*. "We spotted this mare who was in training in South Australia. I sent my assistant at the time, Nicolas Lefevre, to go and have a look at her.

"He drove from Sydney all the way to a town near Mt Gambier. He drove about 2500 km to go and look at her and he came back and reported that she was a beautiful mare and we should buy her.

"The trainer who had her at the time was just scratching his head about this kid driving from Sydney to look at this mare, to take 10 photos and then jump back in the car again."

Lefevre's legwork proved all important. While The Hunt Is On's race record of one win from 12 starts didn't jump off the page, her pedigree did, with her dam, Catshaan (Catrail {USA}) a half-sister to multiple Japanese Group 1 winner Kinshasa No Kiseki (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}).

Le Metayer wanted confirmation that she had the type to suit the pedigree, and after initially buying her himself, he sold her on to his old friend Nicolas de Chambure of Haras d'Etream.

"We have been friends for a long-time and worked at Lindsay Park together. We do a fair bit of business," he said. "She was fairly cheap and I had regretted not taking a share in her. A month or so later, Abbey Marie comes out and wins the Australasian Oaks in Adelaide and following that, Runaway, the full-brother, who was a beautiful yearling, ends up winning the Geelong Cup.

"The family has just kept evolving. It's always been my theory that big pedigrees get bigger. Particularly where there is a strong depth to the pedigree."

The latest Group 1 winner added to the pedigree page is the Doncaster Mile winner Nettoyer (Sebring), who like The Hunt Is On, is descended from the imported mare Keltshaan (USA) (Pleasant Colony {USA}).

### ***Finding the Right Mares***

Utilising his knowledge of both the French and Australian breeding and racing industries, Le Metayer is a specialist at identifying suitable mares for export and import, and The Hunt Is On very much fit the bill.

"With the way the currency works, it's a really good deal for European buyers to source mares out of Australia. They generally get stronger horses with a bit more speed, and in France, there is not an oversaturation of Danehill blood as much," he said. "We are always looking for pedigrees which make sense to bring back to Europe."

"Australian breeders are more performance-orientated where European breeders are more pedigree-orientated, so you just need to find the right balance and the right horse that is going to suit. Not every horse is going to suit both hemispheres.

"This mare, The Hunt Is On, she is a beautiful mare, very correct, big scopey, well put together and so when we saw her, we definitely thought she would suit wherever she went."

She was put into foal to Lonhro on Northern Hemisphere time and sent to Haras d'Etream in Normandy in northern France.

### ***A Crisis Worth Having***

The subsequent Lonhro filly, Nouvelle Escale (Fr), was a winner at Pau in January, while the second foal, a colt by Haras D'Etream resident Wootton Basset (GB) always stood out.

"He was a really nice yearling at the Deauville sales last year," Le Metayer said. "A little bit open in the knees but he was a big, strong imposing sort of horse, built more like an Australian horse rather than a more lighter-framed French horse. We thought he'd sell well."

Midlife Crisis sold for €120,000 (AU\$197,000) to Daniel Cole and races under the ownership of Shigeo Nomura and looks to be very promising indeed.

"It's so nice to see him winning on debut like this so impressively and for Nicolas, who has the dam and the stallion,

it was a good result. I think those horses that can lead and quicken, and dictate off the high cruising speed, they are often the better ones," he said.

The yearling filly out of The Hunt Is On by Siyouni (Fr) is catalogued as Lot 475 at the upcoming Arqana Deauville Select Sale.

Le Metayer has sourced several mares for Haras D'Etream out of Australia, including the dual stakes-winner Selenia (Not A Single Doubt), who they paid \$575,000 for at the 2018 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale.

De Chambure also has a strong connection to this part of the world through his time spent at Lindsay Park, and Haras D'Etream has built a partnership with Cambridge Stud through another son of Wootton Bassett, Almanzor (Fr), who shuttles to New Zealand, as well as recent G1 Diamond Jubilee S. winner Hello Youmzain (GB) (Kodiak {GB}), who they co own. Haras D'Etream is also the European home of Australian stallion Scissor Kick.

"I organised the Scissor Kick deal with Arrowfield as John Messara is my old boss," Le Metayer said. "Haras D'Etream are an international player who are selective breeders. They are doing very well. It's nice to see Nicolas, who is only in his 30s, really giving his family business a renaissance by building relationships with like-minded people around the world and by breeding good horses."

### ***Winners Flowing from Astute Purchases***

The emergence of Midlife Crisis as a potential star is a further filip for Le Metayer's Astute Bloodstock, which has had a good run of results of late.

"I'm very lucky to have such a good bunch of clients. We have had four winners from our last four runners. That's been really pleasing and business has been terrific the last six months. I have been able to source some top mares for clients, like Spright and Miss Leonidas," he said. "I'm always importing nice fillies out of France to race in Australia as well. Business has been good, I'm sure it will get tougher, but so far so good, I'm not complaining."

## COLLECTOR A LOCAL HERO FOR LUNSFORD

"The Homeboy, I call him: the Louisville Homeboy." Bruce Lunsford gives a proud chuckle. "With Tommy, and Brian, we've made it an all-Louisville crowd. So that's kind of fun. In fact, when we laid out a plan, one of the good things was that we could get all the way to the Breeders' Cup without leaving Kentucky. I think that's an advantage, but who knows?"

One thing he does know: he would prefer to cede the limelight to those unsung horsemen, Tom Drury, Jr. and Brian Hernandez, Jr. But if **Art Collector** (Bernardini) can keep their dream alive in the Runhappy Ellis Park Derby, Lunsford will have to accept his share of civic goodwill when his homebred colt ships back along the Ohio River for the GI Kentucky Derby itself.

Because it's the silks, above all, that qualify Art Collector as the hometown hope: the silks of a Kenton County native whose entire life--whether in business, in public service or, as now, in pursuit of a sporting passion--has rooted him in the Bluegrass.

Here's a guy who was not just raised on an 80-acre tobacco farm, but who was running the place, right down to hiring the help, when 13 years old. That way, his dad could go out and work. The lesson, he said later, was that "the meek will inherit the earth, but not any time soon." Sure enough, he worked on a road crew to pay his way through college. After the University of Kentucky, it was night classes at law school, between Army Reserve stints at Ft. Thomas.

## PENNSYLVANIA DERBY, COTILLION WILL NOT BE HELD IN 2020

Due to circumstances that arose with the coronavirus pandemic, Parx Racing has canceled all of its open stakes for the remainder of the year, including the GI Pennsylvania Derby and the GI Cotillion S. The two \$1-million events were part of a program that had been scheduled for Sept. 26 and also included the Turf Amazon S., the Parx Dirt Mile and the GII Gallant Bob S.

"We will not be running any open stakes races this year," racing secretary David Osojnak said. "We will be going on hiatus. The virus, the plague, just wiped out everything. We think we will be able to come back stronger in 2021."

COVID-19 caused two major problems for the Parx stakes. Since being moved to mid-September they had an open spot on the calendar, coming after the major 3-year-old races at Saratoga and before the Breeders' Cup. **Cont. p7**

At 32, he was appointed the state's first Secretary of Commerce by Governor John Y. Brown Jr. Then, still in his thirties, Lunsford co-founded Vencor, the nationwide healthcare group nowadays known as Kindred but still with its headquarters in Louisville. And he even ran Mitch McConnell close, unexpectedly so, in their Senate race in 2008.

Lunsford has always polled well in Henderson and, within the prevailing restrictions, can again bank on local support Sunday.

"I used to spend a lot of time at Ellis Park, in my early days of racing," Lunsford says. "I've a lot of friends down there. I've known the racing secretary for years, and everybody sounds so thrilled about having this horse come down. Hopefully it could really make their day."

It would be hard, however, to do more than maintain the emotional pitch of Art Collector's success in the GII Toyota Blue Grass S. Not just because Lunsford views Keeneland as another highly evocative environment, but also because of the personal significance of that particular race.

"In my college days I knew a lot of the old guys at Keeneland, the trainers and agents, names people might not know anymore," Lunsford says. "That was when Keeneland really led the show. And it was a Blue Grass day when I really decided that I wanted to own horses: when I saw Graustark get beat by Abe's Hope in a huge upset [in 1966]. Graustark was ahead 12, 15 lengths in the backstretch only to take that bad step. But he had such guts that he only lost by a nose. I got a copy of the photo finish, and had a painting made of it, because it meant so much to me being in the business. So I always wanted to win the Blue Grass S."

As such, it was a poignant day when First Samurai (Giant's Causeway), a dual Grade I winner co-owned with Lansdon Robbins III, derailed in the 2006 running. One minute they were on their way to the Derby, the next their horse had fractured ribs and would be retired. **Cont. p4**

"I owned him with a close friend, and he'd run third in the Breeders' Cup despite getting stuck in the gate, then he'd run big in Florida," recalls Lunsford. "He's turned out to be a very good sire, at his level. But yes, that was a real, punch-in-the-gut lesson."

So there will be no complacency about Art Collector making the Derby line-up until the moment the gates open. Fortunately, a syndication deal for First Samurai had already been tied up. At 72, however, Lunsford will this time roll with any punches.

"There've been lots of offers to buy Art Collector," he admits. "But I don't need the money, at this stage of my life, so I'm hopeful that maybe I can get lucky and he could be something akin to a long-term sire for me. I learned a lot watching Bill Young handle Storm Cat, and it would be great to have a really superior stud that I can co-own with people, and do favors for friends, and watch him grow. I may or may not get that chance. But at my age, it's nice for this to be my baby."

That's a prospect that brings things full circle for Lunsford, as Art Collector's grand-dam Bunting (Private Account) was one of his first two purchases—counselled by Seth Hancock of Claiborne Farm, where First Samurai found his home—after he decided to start his own program. Having been Grade I-placed, and offering a foothold into the Green Tree family of Buckaroo, Stop The Music and company, Bunting cost \$500,000 as a 3-year-old in 1994.

"I can't even remember the name of the other mare," Lunsford says. "I sold her because she was one, out of not many that year, that did manage to get in foal to Lure. But yes, Bunting was bought to be a foundation mare. Up till then I'd just been fiddling around on a cheaper scale, claiming and stuff, kind of learning the business the way the old guys did it. At that time, \$500,000 would put you in the top of the crop, to get a pretty nice mare. I raced Bunting for a year and then I bred her to Storm Cat." **Cont. p5**

The result was Vision And Verse, who won the GII Illinois Derby and was beaten only by Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo) in both the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. The whole program, indeed, got off to a flying start. The first foal of another of his very first mares, again picked out by Hancock, turned out to be Golden Missile (A.P. Indy). Though sold as a weanling, Golden Missile's third in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic enabled Lunsford to cash in the dam days later for \$1.35 million.

Bunting couldn't quite come up with another Vision And Verse, but in 2007 delivered a Distorted Humor filly who matured into a very smart grass runner: Distorted Legacy was second in the GI Flower Bowl Inv., and then just missed the podium in a bunch finish for the GI Filly and Mare Turf at the Breeders' Cup. Art Collector is her second foal.

His story, to this point, is well chronicled: one of the few silver linings to the clouds of COVID-19.

Art Collector was first welcomed by Drury at the Skylight Training Center in Goshen, Ky., simply for a spell of freshening. The colt was following a well-worn path. For while Drury had never been formally credited with graded stakes success, he can claim a behind-the-scenes contribution to animals as accomplished as Tom's D'Etat (Smart Strike) or Lunsford's cherished, Classic-placed Grade I winner Madcap Escapade (Hennessy).

Art Collector was initially just taking some time out after an impressive allowance success for Joe Sharp at Churchill last fall. When stripped of that success, as one of three Sharp horses that tested positive to a deworming agent, Lunsford decided that Art Collector should not return to his previous trainer but join Rusty Arnold. Then came the pandemic. Race programs and horse traffic were suspended. Lunsford told Drury to train Art Collector up to a race, when Churchill reopened; and when the colt won so well, it was decided to let destiny take its course. Characteristically, Arnold was among the first to ring and congratulate Drury.

Lunsford is thrilled that a horseman educated by Frankie Brothers, the trainer of First Samurai and Madcap Escapade, should now be getting his day in the sun.

"I've known Tommy almost since he started," he says. "He has always been the go-to guy, out at the farm there, to bring horses back. And I'm one of the few who would go ahead and let him race once or twice before I sent a horse back out of town.

"Now Joe Sharp did a good job getting this horse ready as a 2-year-old, and I give him credit for that. But when all that stuff happened, I was going to send the horse to Rusty because he'd be going to Saratoga. And then the COVID has come along and we sat down and I said, 'You know what, Tommy? You race this horse first and we'll see what we got, okay?'" **Cont. p6**

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

"I had never wanted to press this horse. You rush a horse to the Derby and they either never race again, or not much. So I'd laid him off for three months: a little swimming, a little jogging, let him grow up a little. And I could go out there and watch him train. Unlike a lot of these horses, he wasn't losing any training time. And he just got better and better."

Lunsford remembers hauling Drury into the winner's circle photo when Madcap Escapade won her first race at Gulfstream back in 2004.

"He was young then but he's still incredibly humble," Lunsford says. "He's a really good horseman with a work ethic second to none. The last two and a half years, he's had one day off. He's got a good head on him, and has had good mentors over the years, Frankie being one of them. I feel almost like I've got a nephew training for me. And I think his time has come."

Another important member of Lunsford's team is Patti Miller, who helps him at the sales; while he is also grateful to the teams at Claiborne, where he boards his mares, and Hill 'n' Dale, where he partners with John Sikura in a few others. A big decision looms, if

Art Collector happens to go well in the Derby, as his Into Mischief half-brother is in the September Sale. (Distorted Legacy also has a weanling by the same sire, and is now in foal to Justify.)

In principle, however, Lunsford remains pretty much a breed-to-race guy; quite a throwback, as such, and likewise in his disinclination for the kind of high-end partnerships that are nowadays so common. He likes a horse to have an identity; and wants to share the highs and lows with his real buddies.

"Back in the old days, you knew who owned a horse," he says. "Whether it was Claiborne, or E.P. Taylor, everybody knew. Now you have 17 people in a partnership to get these very expensive horses.

"I'm a little bit of a jokester and kidder anyway. Most all of us who know each other, we all do that, right? So I think that's part of the game. With my closest friends—Greg Hudson, his dad Hoolie, and Bill Latta—we've been going to the races for 52 years. I mean, that's unbelievable. We've gone to Del Mar, we've gone to London, we've had a tremendous amount of fun. When Vision And Verse ran in the Belmont, we had 16 people in an Italian restaurant and it was just a hoot night. And then flew back about one in the morning. That's the kind of stuff that

makes your memories."

Lunsford has taken a similar approach to his business career. He loves to be in the thick of the action.

"I either want to be involved or not be involved," he says. "I'm a guy with lots of interests and have never rested long. I grew up on a really small farm. I took care of the farm so my dad could have a job 40 hours a week, so we could get by. I raised tobacco, I did all kinds of things, and as a result I learned a lot about how to run things, both small and big. I think that's helped me in life. And even today, at the companies I'm invested in, I don't want to be passive."

Of course, the ultimate example of this engagement, this urge to get out there and make a difference, is a political career crowned by that stirring Senate race in 2008, when he slashed McConnell's margin from 29.4% to 5.9%. (Compared, moreover, with a 16.2% buffer for presidential candidate John McCain at the top of the state ticket.) Today, standing back from the political fray, he views the present crisis as a cue for leadership that inspires unity, not division.

"I think it's been driven by a lot of things," he says of the virulence of political discourse. "For one thing, by too much money spent on campaigns. I guarantee they'll spend \$3 billion in this presidential race. Both sides, and it's all negative. And the media has picked sides. With no real advertising done anymore, the only way they can make revenue is through subscribers. So what they tend to do, liberal or conservative, is pander to their audience. It's become so negative.

"I think it was Winston Churchill said democracy is a poor form of government, but it's better than all the rest. And eventually democracy will win out. At the moment, we lack strong leaders. If you go back, I'm a big fan of the guys that made tough decisions in tough times. Truman probably made the toughest decision of all time, when he allowed the atomic bomb. Churchill, completely over-matched in the battle, called on England to fight on anyway. And they won. The spirited leaders know how to get things done. But I think a lot of avenues in the country have been [taken] because money has bought direction, not policy or values."

But Lunsford feels optimism, too. He predicts a bright future for our industry in Kentucky, that's for sure, and hopes that Art Collector can assist morale in the meantime. **Cont. p7**

"Listen, this is a horse that could be fun if he stays sound," he says. "We all know that's day-to-day. But I'm really proud of Tommy. I tell him all the time: 'Just enjoy the ride. Enjoy the interviews, enjoy the media, enjoy everything that happens. Because it could be over in one day and then you'd look back and ask why you didn't.' I've always tried to be like that that with my horses. Even when something happens like with First Samurai, I don't wear it too hard. I feel you learn a lot just by being in the business for a long time. You learn a kind of a free-spirited attitude about it.

"And I think Tommy's felt that. He's doing a great job, really handled himself well. He has tremendous passion for these horses, so I would really like to see it for him. I think the only time I ever cried at a race was when Madcap Escapade won her second race and set a stakes record down at Gulfstream Park. Because I felt a horse like that was what I'd got in the business for. So if this horse were to win the Derby, I don't know if I'd cry more for Tommy, or more for the horse. But that's how I feel about it."

That allowed Parx to attract quality fields that included recent Pennsylvania Derby winners like McKinzie (Street Sense) and West Coast (Flatter). Once the GI Kentucky Derby was rescheduled for Sept. 5 and the GI Preakness S. for Oct. 3, the mid-September slot no longer worked.

The purse account at Parx was also dealt a blow with the closing of the on-track casino Mar. 16. It reopened June 29, but can only operate at 50% capacity.

"It was 50-50," Osojnak said. "As soon as they moved the Derby, we had a problem. We would have had to run three weeks after the Derby and a week before the Preakness. The way things were working out, it just didn't make any sense to do so, from a financial standpoint or from where the calendar fell."

Using the money that would have been earmarked for the Sept. 26 stakes has allowed Osojnak to keep purses for overnight races near their 2019 levels.

"We cut our purses, but not significantly," he said. "I did an analysis of the local tracks--Laurel, Delaware, Monmouth. We had to work things out between the horsemen and Parx management, but what we wanted to do was to make sure that our purses were comparable, plus or minus a few thousand dollars, with those other tracks. We are doing OK, and if the casino revenue picks up, I anticipate that the purses will go back up."

Parx will hold a handful of Pennsylvania-bred stakes races this year, including five scheduled to be run Sept. 7.

"It's disappointing that we won't be able to run these stakes this year," Osojnak said. "This virus has affected so many things. These races will be back and, we believe, stronger than ever."

## MSW PURSES: \$97K DERBY WEEK, \$75K REST OF CHURCHILL MEET, \$70K AT KEENELAND

Projected autumn purse levels for maiden special weight races on the Kentucky circuit were revealed during a video meeting of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) advisory committee on Tuesday.

Ben Huffman, director of racing at Churchill Downs, said, "We're going to have two [MSW] purses. We're going to supercharge [GI Kentucky] Derby Mweek, like we've been doing. And that maiden purse Derby week is going to be \$97,000. The remaining nine days are going to be \$75,000."

Churchill had closed out its spring/summer season at the \$79,000 level for MSW races.

The MSW races for the 17-day Keeneland Race Course meet will be \$70,000, the same level as the July mini-meet.

Bob Elliston, Keeneland's vice president of racing, said that his track will "basically give away the same amount of money this fall as we did last fall" in terms of overall purses.

"As we sit today, there will be limited participation of owners or fans on-track, so at this hour we are not projecting significant daily earnings from on-track wagers. We hope that changes," Elliston added.

Both tracks had their requests approved unanimously for KTDF funding, which means a recommendation from the advisory committee to release that money will be forwarded to the full Kentucky Horse Racing Commission board for final voting at its next meeting.

Kentucky Downs MSW purse levels were not discussed on Tuesday because the track had already requested funding for its September season back in June. At that time, a track official said the MSW level projected to be \$90,000.

The KTDF is funded by three-quarters of 1% of all money wagered on both live Thoroughbred races and historical horse race (HHR) gaming, plus 2% of all money wagered on Thoroughbred races via inter-track wagering and whole-card simulcasting.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic that shut down racing, the KTDF was not able to generate revenue via (HHR) gaming and on-track wagering between March and June. It has since been able to recoup some funding with the limited reopening of HHR.

"To give you a sense of how fragile this is...had the governor not taken the act that he did to permit historical racing to come back online, for us it may be \$200,000 to \$300,000 a month in KTDF funds that wouldn't be earned. So God forbid if we have a continuation of a problem or an escalation of a problem where we had to rescind the activity. It could really encroach upon the numbers that we had," Elliston said.

Bill Landes III, the chairman of the fund's advisory committee, who represents the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (KTOB), echoed that sentiment. "Our situation, as everybody knows, is in flux," he said.

## HANDLE SOARS IN JULY, TOPS \$1 BILLION

The total amount wagered on U.S. races in July saw a 16.63% increase over 2019 figures, the best month the sport has had this year and a sign that the effects of the coronavirus are no longer negatively impacting handle. The July handle of \$1,098,728 was the first \$1 billion-plus monthly handle on the year.

Prior to the release of the figures, there had already been signs that July was going to be a good month. The handle for GI Haskell S. day at Monmouth was over \$20 million, the most that track has handled outside of the Breeders' Cup. NYRA reported that handle at Saratoga for the opening weekend was up 9.4%.

The July numbers were a welcome sign after handle was battered by coronavirus shutdowns in March, April and May. Handle was down at least 22% all three months and fell by 30.16% in May, which, in a normal year, would have included the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. Those races have been postponed until later this year.

Thanks in large part to the July numbers, total handle is down only 6.96% on the year.

The number of races run during the month and the number of race days remained on the decline. There were 3,290 races, a 12.35% drop off from last year, and 484 race days, a 17.77% decrease. But wagering on the races that were run was robust. The average amount wagered per race day was \$2,761,165, a 41.83% increase. **Cont. p10**

**Economic Indicators cont.**

Average field size also inched up. It was 7.97 starters per race versus 7.4 in July, 2019.

Perhaps the only negative news in the figures released Wednesday by Equibase came in the category of total purses. They were \$90,224,084 in July, down 12.69% from last year. But average purses per race day was up, by 6.17%. For the year, purses are down \$233 million or 35.99%.

Belmont third-place finisher and GIII Withers S. victor **Max Player** (Honor Code) and GIII Peter Pan S. winner **Country Grammer** (Tonalist) were both given 6-1 morning-line quotes. Trainer by Linda Rice, Max Player drew post four with Joel Rosario in the irons. Chad Brown pupil Country Grammer will be in stall two with Irad Ortiz at the controls.

The rest of the field is as follows: **First Line** (First Samurai), post one, 30-1; **Shivaree** (Awesome of Course), post five, 30-1; **Caracaro** (Uncle Mo), post seven, 10-1; and **South Bend** (Algorithms), post eight, 15-1.

**"MAKE OTHER PLANS": TURF PARADISE FACING UNCERTAIN 2020-2021 MEET**

Ongoing tensions between the management of Turf Paradise and Arizona-based horsemen is placing the upcoming 2020-2021 meet under a cloud of uncertainty. Last week, Turf Paradise released a press release detailing plans to push back its opening day from Oct. 17 to Friday, Nov. 27. The revised dates meant an overall reduction in live race days from 133 to 110.

"We are working with AZHBPA [Arizona Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association] president Bob Hutton as to a date when the horses can begin to arrive in the stable area," said track general manager Vincent Francia, in the release.

According to Hutton, his organization emailed last Thursday the operators of Turf Paradise a list of 17 questions and concerns surrounding such issues as the multi-year agreement that the HPBA entered into with Turf Paradise, stable area renovations, and contingency plans in the event of a second wave of COVID-19 infections this winter, including a promise not to close the track prior to the end of the scheduled meet.

When Turf Paradise suddenly closed its doors earlier this year in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, track management gave the horsemen days to vacate the premises--a move the facility later shied away from.

The response to the 17 emailed questions, however, failed to allay the Arizona horsemen's concerns, said Hutton. As such, he said that he advised trainers "to make up their own mind" about whether to stable and race at Turf Paradise when the facility opens its doors once again.

"But my recommendation would be to, based on the track not being able to guarantee that they'll run the entire meet, then you'll probably need to make other plans," said Hutton, who added that he'll be sending his horses to alternate tracks this winter.

TDN attempted to reach Francia by email and by phone Tuesday, but did not receive a response before publication. These developments form just the latest chapter in a protracted stand-off between the horsemen and Turf Paradise management. Earlier in the year, a simulcasting dispute led The Stronach Group's Monarch to pull its signal from the state, dealing a sizeable blow to the industry's coffers.

The crux of the issue surrounded Arizona Downs, one of three tracks in the state. When Arizona Downs reopened for live racing in 2019, Monarch sent its signal to the track itself but not to the track's network of off-track betting sites (OTBs). In contrast, Monarch distributed its signal to Turf Paradise and its network of some 60 OTBs.

Near the start of March, the HBPA voted to withdraw the Turf Paradise signal from all Stronach Group affiliates. Before that could happen, however, the track was closed due to the onset of the global pandemic.

When Turf Paradise closed its doors at the beginning of May, track management sent the Arizona HBPA a letter giving the organization 30 days to "remove its belongings" from its Turf Paradise office and to "remove the trailer [medical trailer] from Turf Paradise property." Ordinarily, all HBPA equipment would have remained at the facility during the summer, said Hutton.

According to Hutton, Turf Paradise failed to answer HBPA concerns about whether the organization would be permitted office space at the track during the upcoming meet.

The two parties appear to agree on some things, however. Turf Paradise's proposed Nov. 27 starting date, detailed in last week's press release, would have jeopardized the various sales stakes and Arizona bred races that typically occur at the end of October and the beginning of November, said Hutton.

But Turf Paradise agreed to a compromise, said Hutton--a Nov. 1 starting date for the meet. "That would be the only thing we agree upon," he said.

The next Arizona Racing Commission meeting is slated for Aug. 13.

**CABALLERO SUSPENDED FOR WHIP INFRACTION**

Parx Racing suspended jockey Hector Caballero for 10 days because of his "misuse of the riding crop" after the finish of the 10th race at Parx July 27. The incident occurred aboard Belongs to Babe in a maiden event for fillies 3-year-old and up. On the date in question, Caballero and Belong to Babe crossed the wire in second behind Solid Gold Dancer, who was subsequently disqualified for interference with another rival. During the gallop out, Caballero was observed to have struck his mount on the shoulder, which is in violation of the State's recently implemented rules relating to whip use.

Following a July 30 hearing, the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission stewards issued the ruling Aug. 3. The suspension is to run from Aug. 6-15.

Among the rules deemed to have been violated by Caballero by stewards:

- "Prohibited use of the riding crop includes but is not limited to striking a horse: During the post parade or after the finish of the race except when necessary to control the horse."
- "The stimulus provided by the use of the riding crop shall be monitored by the Stewards at all times so as not to compromise the health, safety and welfare of the horse."
- "A licensee shall not, alone or in concert with another person, engage in inappropriate, illegal or unethical conduct which violates the Commission's rules and regulations of racing, is inconsistent with the best interests and integrity of racing or otherwise undermines the general public's faith, public perception and confidence in the racing industry."

**JACK SISTERSON TALKS VEXATIOUS, RETURNING CALUMET TO GLORY ON TDN WRITERS' ROOM**

Two years ago, when it was announced that legendary Calumet Farm was hiring Jack Sisterston as its primary trainer, there was skepticism. At just 33 years old, with only experience as an assistant to his name, it was fair to question whether or not Sisterston was prepared to carry the flag for such a powerful racing and breeding brand. Those questions have now been answered--resoundingly in the affirmative, as just a short while later, Sisterston has not only proved equal to the task, but appears on his way to the even larger accomplishment of restoring historic Calumet to the glory of its heyday. **Cont. p12**

Still in the afterglow of pulling off a colossal upset of champion Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute) with Calumet's **Vexatious** (Giant's Causeway) in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga, Sisterson joined the TDN Writers' Room podcast **presented by Keeneland** Wednesday to talk about his first Grade I victory, his hands-on education in racing and the bright future for him and Calumet.

Calling in via Zoom as the **Green Group Guest of the Week**, Sisterson spoke on how he adapted his training approach to fit Vexatious, who is reaching her career peak at the age of six.

"She has an extremely high cruising speed, and she can carry that over a distance of ground," he said. "What we found with her, she's a filly that loves to train at 5:30. She goes right out when the track opens, because that's what she wants. She's very businesslike and wants to get on with it. And when I initially got her, if I asked her to go three-quarters of a mile in a workout, she would put so much effort into it that she was doing too much in the mornings and not leaving it for the afternoon. So we decided to back up all of her works to half a mile and crossed our fingers that would result in her being a little bit more energetic in the afternoons. It's slightly worrisome when you just breeze them half a mile--do they have enough foundation in them to compete at that classic type of distance on the dirt? But with her, she puts so much effort into her gallops and half-mile breezes that she's in that happy stage of her career at the moment."

Asked about the process that led to his hiring by Calumet, Sisterson credited former boss Doug O'Neill and compared the aura of Calumet to another iconic brand from his upbringing playing soccer in England.

"Initially, when I had this small conversation with them, I'd never been to the farm before," he said. "I was working for Doug at the time, who still to this day is very supportive of everything I do, which I'm very grateful for. It was Doug who pushed me out there, saying, 'If you don't do it, I'm going to do it.' Being from England and a soccer player, when you grow up,

there's Manchester United, at the top of the league with so much history and success. I assumed Calumet was the Manchester United of farms. Why would they want someone like me? I'm nobody. It was honoring, humbling. I'm just a very, very, very small piece of so much hard work that goes in behind the scenes that people don't see."

It was soccer that first brought Sisterson to the United States and sent him on his path to stardom in the Thoroughbred racing world. Having a lifelong passion for both sports, Sisterson killed two birds with one stone by enrolling at the University of Louisville, which led to a first racing gig working alongside a Hall of Fame trainer.

"From as far as I can remember, there was racing on TV or we were going to some big racing events in the Northeast of England," he recalled. "I fell in love with it from day one and always wanted to have some involvement in it. I was fortunate enough to be offered a soccer scholarship at Louisville, which offered the equine program. And in return, I worked summers for Todd Pletcher. That was my first introduction to the American side of racing."

Elsewhere on the show, the writers analyzed last weekend's major stakes action, previewed Saturday's GI Runhappy Travers S. and took stock of where the 3-year-old picture stands exactly one month away from the GI Kentucky Derby. Then, in the **West Point Thoroughbreds** news segment, they reacted to the news of increased restrictions on out-of-state jockeys attempting the ride in the Derby, even as fans are still slated to be on track with much more lax requirements. At this time Golden Gate Fields cannot offer refreshments of any kind (however owners may bring their own food and non-alcoholic beverages if desired), and there are no on-track betting facilities available.





Nonna Madeline took it to her chief market rival Golden Award from the outset and out-stayed that foe in the lane to earn a belated first stakes score. Named a 'TDN Rising Star' for a successful Monmouth debut as a June 2-year-old, the bay was second in the GIII Schuyvlerville S. here that July before fifth-place runs in the GI Spinaway S. and GI Frizette S. She went missing for some 14 1/2 months after that, but resurfaced going seven panels at Gulfstream in December to air by 5 3/4 lengths. Third in the GII Inside Information S. Jan. 25, the bay was fourth in the GIII Hurricane Bertie S. Mar. 14 before stretching out to 8 1/2 furlongs to be second in an Apr. 16 Oaklawn optional claimer won by Mexican star Letruska (Super Saver).

Letruska and Nonna Madeline again ran one-two in Gulfstream’s Added Elegance S. over a one-turn mile June 27, with the connections of the former opting to cut back for the seven-furlong GI Ballerina S. this Saturday while Nonna Madeline was asked to go in the opposite direction distance wise and try the longest trip of her career here.

One of three Todd Pletcher trainees in this five-horse affair, Nonna Madeline was ridden along by Irad Ortiz, Jr. and locked on to the rail-drawn Golden Award going into the first turn. They remained glued together through splits of :23:31, :46.22 and 1:09.66, and still couldn’t be separated at the top of the lane. Nonna Madeline started to edge away in midstretch once she figured her leads out, and she kicked away from there as her stablemates checked in far back in third and fourth.

"I had a perfect trip," said Ortiz, who has won eight of 13 this meet for Pletcher. "We didn't know what [Golden Award] was going to do. I just went with my plan to come running out of there and if I can make the lead easy, make it, and if something else changed, Todd let me do whatever I needed to do."

"I didn't anticipate that they would go that fast," Pletcher said. "It sort of turned into a match race up front, and I'm proud of her for digging in and finding more the first time going a mile and an eighth. She was coming out of some faster races so we anticipated we'd be close."

As for the decision to try more distance and regarding what could be next, Pletcher added, "The more we've done with her and having had the opportunity to run her two turns at Oaklawn, I thought there was a decent chance she'd see out the mile and an eighth. To be honest with you, I looked at this one hoping to get that stake win for her. Now that we've got that, we can be a little more ambitious.

The winner hails from the deep female family of GISWs Bluegrass Cat, Girolamo, Rhythm, Imagining, Super Saver, Got Lucky, etc. Her dam sold to Chuck Fipke for \$800,000 in foal to Daredevil at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton November sale. 
