

TATTERSALLS FEBRUARY SALE GOES VIRTUAL



The sales ring will return to action on Mar. 31 | Tattersalls

Tattersalls will be holding its first sale of 2021 as a "live virtual" event as strict lockdown measures remain in place in Britain and Ireland.

Scheduled to run on Feb. 4 and 5, the mixed sale of almost 500 lots will take place online, with bids being taken through the live internet bidding platform or via telephone to a member of the Tattersalls team. No horses or vendors will be at Park Paddocks. Tattersalls also plans to stage an extra sale on Wednesday, Mar. 31 and Thursday, Apr. 1 to cater for any vendors who prefer to take part in a conventional sale on site.

"The decision to stage the Tattersalls February Sale in a live virtual format has been taken in the best interests of all concerned and reflects our commitment to providing the best possible working environment for participants at all of our sales, in whatever capacity they may be attending," said Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony. "The decision also recognises the increased difficulties surrounding domestic and international travel and it was felt that the prudent option was to stage the February Sale in a manner which allows vendors and purchasers alike to participate with confidence and in full compliance with prevailing rules and regulations. Our live internet bidding platform proved to hugely popular with buyers throughout last year, particularly at mixed sales similar to the February Sale, and we are confident that this live virtual format is the best option under the current difficult circumstances which we all continue to endure." 2021 JUDDMONTE MATING PLANS REVEALED

The 2021 mating plans for the Juddmonte broodmare band were announced by the nursery on Monday. The [list was approved by the late Prince Khalid Abdullah](#) prior to his death last week. Juddmonte will stand five stallions in 2021 led by Frankel.

The undefeated wunderkind and Group 1 sire Frankel became the fastest European stallion ever to reach 40 group winners and celebrated another Group 1 winner in 2020—Grenadier Guards (Jpn). An even two dozen Juddmonte mares are booked on his dance card, among them MG1SW **Ventura** (Chester House), the dam of Group 3 winner Fount (GB) (Frankel {GB}); G1SW **Emulous** (GB) (Dansili {GB}); **Bird Flown** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), the dam of MG1SW and Classic hero Siskin (First Defence); and Group 1 winner Quadrilateral (GB) (Frankel {GB})'s dam **Nimble Thimble** ([Mizzen Mast](#)). His book is enhanced by Group 2 winners **Soffia** (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) and **Modern Look** (GB) (Zamindar), as well as Group 3 winners **Big Break** (GB) (Dansili {GB}), **Dandhu** (GB) (Dandy Man {Ire}) and **Visit** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). He added, "In addition to promoting the February Sale to as many prospective buyers as possible, our bloodstock sales team will liaise with vendors with regard to the requirements of the live virtual sale model."

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to play havoc with the bloodstock sales calendar, Goffs has already announced that its February Sale in Ireland on Feb. 9 and 10 will be an online sale for breeding stock, older horses and 2-year-olds, with a session of weanlings scheduled to sell at its Kildare Paddocks on Tuesday, Mar. 2. The Goffs UK January Sale will offer National Hunt mares and horses in training online on Tuesday, Jan. 26, and the National Hunt weanlings and point-to-pointers will now be offered at the Doncaster sales complex on Wednesday, Feb. 17.

Rounding out Kingman's 2021 partners are **Scuffle (GB)** (Daylami {Ire}), the dam of G1 St Leger hero Logician (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and her daughter **Battlement (GB)** (Dansili {GB}).

The Group 1-placed **Principal Role** (Empire Maker) and fellow listed winners **Scottish Jig** (**Speightstown**), and **Swiss Range (GB)** (Zamindar) will visit the bay son of Acclamation (GB). **Kilo Alpha (GB)** (King's Best), the dam of the GSW & G1SP Juliet Foxtrot (GB) (Dansili {GB}); **Photographic (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), herself the dam of Group 3 winner Shutter Speed (GB) (Dansili {GB}); a full-sister to Showcasing (GB) in **Palmette (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}); and **Strelka (GB)** (Kingman {GB}), a half-sister to Derby/Arc hero Workforce (GB) (King's Best); are also slated to be covered by Expert Eye.

The developing sire Bated Breath (GB) sired Group 1 winner Viadera (GB) last term and he also has His Highness The Aga Khan's homebred GSW and G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud placer Makaloun (Fr) to go to bat for him in 2021 as a leading G1 French Derby hope. Viadera's dam, **Sacred Shield (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}), Group 1 winner **Proportional (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}), Group 3 winner **Tested (GB)** (Selkirk) and listed winners **Alocasia (GB)** (Kingman {GB}), and **Rostova** (Arch) and the unraced **Meridiana (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) will all be covered by Bated Breath this year. The last-named is out of Group 1 winner Middy (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

Oasis Dream (GB) has now sired 200 stakes performers and is becoming a broodmare sire of note with four Group 1 winners in 2020. Juddmonte is sending the winning pair of **Bonne Idee (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) and **Its a Given (GB)** (Bated Breath {GB}), as well as **Occurrence (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), an unraced daughter of Arrive (GB) (Kahyasi {Ire}), a full-sister to Hasili (GB) (Kahyasi {Ire}). **Shared Account (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) will also return to Oasis Dream and she has already produced the Group 2-placed Sand Share (GB) and Group 3-winning Pocket Square (GB) to the roster veteran.

Naturally, some of Juddmonte’s blueblooded broodmares are also visiting outside stallions, with Enable’s dam **Concentric (GB)** (Sadler’s Wells) returning to her sire Nathaniel (Ire), while her half-sister, the GSP **Entitle (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), will consort with Sea The Stars (Ire). Group 1 winners **African Rose (GB)** (Observatory) goes to Dark Angel (Ire); **Announce (GB)** (Selkirk) will be covered by Pinatubo (Ire); and three mares will visit Coolmore stallions--**Middy (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) to No Nay Never, **Promising Lead (GB)** (Danehill) to Calyx (GB), and **Proviso (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) to Wootton Bassett (GB). A trio of mares will hold court with Dubawi (Ire)--Group 1 winner **Quadrilateral (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa)’s daughter **Goldika (Ire)** (Intello {Ger}), and listed winner **Franconia (GB)** (Frankel {GB}). Night of Thunder (Ire) receives **Timepiece (GB)** (Zamindar), while Golden Horn (GB) will cover **Winsili (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). SEVEN RACES DAILY FOR ROYAL ASCOT

Her Majesty The Queen has given her consent for Royal Ascot to consist of seven-race cards following the successful addition of races to the five-day meeting in 2020.

The enforced late start to the Flat season last year in Britain amid the coronavirus crisis saw the introduction of the Copper Horse S., the Palace of Holyroodhouse S. and the Golden Gates S., while the Buckingham Palace S. was reinstated. The meeting also included 'Silver' versions of the Royal Hunt Cup and the Wokingham S. which have not been retained for 2021 but, along with the four races named above, the 2021 meeting will also include the new Kensington Palace S., a 0-105 handicap over the Old Mile for fillies and mares aged four and up.

"A positive that we drew from Royal Ascot 2020 was that the additional races presented more opportunities to participate and that this had been widely welcomed by owners, trainers, breeders and jockeys. We are delighted to be able to make this change permanent," said Sir Francis Brooke Bt., Her Majesty's Representative at Ascot.

In 2020, the juvenile races were staged later in the week in order to give 2-year-olds as much time as possible between their maiden outings and a Royal Ascot appearance. The meeting will return to its traditional running order for this year, with the newer races being run as the final contest on each day bar the Golden Gates S. This will be the penultimate race on the Saturday, with the marathon Queen Alexandra S. bringing the curtain down on the meeting as usual. Royal Ascot will open with the G1 Queen Anne S. on Tuesday, June 15.

"The concept of extended cards last year was well received, and we are very pleased to be able to offer additional opportunities to the horsemen community, the public, broadcasters and media," said Nick Smith, Ascot's Director of Racing and Public Affairs.

"At this time, more than ever, the increased opportunity to win prize-money and to generate more levy and domestic and overseas betting income is crucial. Following consultation with the BHA, we decided to remove the two reserve races and bring in another high-quality handicap, as we are actually reducing the number of races run by one from last year, where eight races were staged on the Saturday. It occurred to us that the Old (round) Mile course is only used twice during Royal Ascot and another race on this track would add to the variety on offer."

He continued, "Last year's extended cards were only possible by reducing some field sizes slightly, and because no overnight stabling was allowed under COVID-19 protocols. In order that field sizes can go up to their maximums again and with overnight stabling extremely important, we have commissioned extra temporary stabling to be built to the required high BHA standards."

PROFITABLE FAVOURITE TO BE CHAMPION FRESHMAN

The start of the Flat season may be more than two months away but there is already plenty of interest in the freshman sires of 2021, and Darley's **Profitable (Ire)** has been made 3/1 favourite by Fitzdares to take the championship.

Ed Guiver, Head of Racing for Fitzdares, said, "We love pricing this market, which would be impossible to price were it not for the Weatherbys Stallion Book used alongside the Weatherbys Return of Mares.

"It was hard to split the front four in the market but Profitable by the sire of sires in Invincible Spirit (Ire) has got the nod. That said, the sector is not without a bevy of shrewd judges, so market movers will be telling."

The betting company makes the Coolmore duo of **Caravaggio** and **Churchill (Ire)** joint-second favourites at 4/1, with **Cotai Glory (GB)**, who hails from Tally-Ho Stud, home to 2020 champion first-season sire Mehmas (Ire), third favourite at 5/1. All of the first four in the betting have at least 124 foals from their first crop.

Guiver added, "**Ulysses (Ire)** is a dark horse, jungle drums suggest he's produced some early types, and we suspect **Ribchester (Ire)** will have his fans. If he had more on the ground, **Time Test (GB)** would have been shorter odds for sure," added Guiver.

SECTIONAL TIMING BEGINS AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL IN FRANCE

The national rollout of race sectional timing at all premium Flat and National Hunt racecourses in France began this month, France Galop and its partner McLloyd announced on Monday. The McLloyd system will be implemented at all French national meetings beginning in February and is the first country to offer such broad coverage. The technology was tested in 2019 at ParisLongchamp, Chantilly, Deauville and more recently in Auteuil. Lyon-La-Soie and Marseille-Vivaux were added to the timing network on Jan. 14 and 15, respectively. Cagnes-sur-Mer joined the fold on Jan. 18. Pau and Mont-de-Marsan are the next courses slated to receive the timing system.

A small sensor is deployed on each horse and has been adapted to both Flat and Jumps racing. [Cont. p7](#)

FREE NOMINATIONS TO BARRAQUERO

Thirty free nominations are being offered to the 2017 G2 Richmond S. winner **Barraquero (Ire)** (Zebedee {GB}), who stands at Pdraig and Paul Moroney's Claremount Stud in Ireland.

Now six, the Manton Thoroughbreds-owned Barraquero retired to stud last year at a fee of €4,000 and his advertised fee for 2021 is €2,500.

KUROFUNA DEAD AT 23

Kurofune (French Deputy--Blue Avenue, by Classic Go Go) passed away at the age of 23 according to the JRA. The grey died on Jan. 17 at Shadai Stallion Station after he had been pensioned for several years.

"Kurofune died due to old age," said Shadai's Eisuke Tokutake to *www.hochi.news*. "The horse had not been feeling well the past two months and passed on Jan. 17. He was a multi-purpose sire and had excellent results regardless of turf or dirt, and he was popular as a stallion and worked hard for 17 seasons until 2018. He was a very friendly horse and was well received by the staff."

Bred by Nicholas Lotz in Kentucky, Kurofune was knocked down for \$70,000 during the 1999 Keeneland September Yearling Sale and bloomed into a \$430,000 2-year-old at Fasig-Tipton's Florida Select Sale in 2000. At two, he sported two wins from four starts and was third in the G3 Radio Tampa Hai Sansai S. Only off the board once in six starts at three, the Makoto Kaneko runner was named the Japanese Champion 3-Year-Old Colt of 2001 on the back of wins four wins. He started his campaign in March of 2001 with a win in the G3 Mainichi Hai and added the G1 NHK Mile Cup that May. Fifth in the G1 Japanese Derby, he returned in September to take third in the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai before adding victories in the G3 Musashino S. and G1 Japan Cup Dirt. Retired a Group 1 winner on both turf and dirt, the Kunihide Matsuka trainee's record stood at 10-6-1-2 with \$3,043,410 in earnings upon his retirement to Shadai Stallion Station.

At stud, Kurofune sired 35 black-type winners with 18 at the group level. Among his six Group 1 winners is the white 2020 Japanese Champion Juvenile Filly Sodashi (Jpn), as well as Curren Chan (Jpn), Whale Capture (Jpn), Aerolithe (Jpn), Sleepless Night (Jpn) and Clarity Sky (Jpn). The 23-year-old is also making his mark as a broodmare sire with 19 black-type winners already, 14 at the group level and two have taken Group 1 events. The three-time Group 1 winner Chrono Genesis (Jpn) (Bago {Fr}) saluted in December's G1 Arima Kinen, while the grey Normcore (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}) captured both the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup in early December to go with her G1 Victoria Mile score.

Out of the black-type winner Blue Avenue, Kurofune was a full-brother to MGSW & MGISP Bella Bellucci (French Deputy), herself the dam of GIII Rampart S. heroine Ciao Bella (Giant's Causeway) and to the Japanese listed-placed Miss Pascali (Jpn) (Mr. Greeley). She in turn would foal G2 Fjui TV Sho Spring S. hero Mount Robson (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), Japanese Group 3 winner Miyamazakura (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and the G1 Japanese St. Leger third Popocatepetl (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). His dam was also a half-sister to GI Vanity Invitational H. and GI Milady H. heroine Brought to Mind (Ruthie's Native).

MAGIC WEEK FOR WIDDEN

Widden Stud celebrated a dream week in the sales ring at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale last week and it was capped off by their stalwart stallion Star Witness siring the quinella in the R. Listed Magic Millions 3YO Guineas on Saturday.

Widden walked away from the Book 1 Sale as the second leading vendor by aggregate, selling 38 of their 39 yearlings for a total of \$12.5 million, including two \$1-million lots and the top lot of the Sale, a Snitzel colt out of stakes winner Bonny O'Reilly (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), who was purchased by Tom Magnier for \$1.9 million.

Saturday's raceday then saw two sons of Star Witness in Aim and Amish Boy lead home the field in the \$2-million feature for 3-year-olds.

"It was a phenomenal week for us and it far exceeded our expectations in the current climate," Widden's Antony Thompson told *TDN AusNZ*. "We were quite anxious about how the sale would play out so to achieve the results we did, selling 38 of 39 yearlings offered and then topping the sale, across the board, we're just really thrilled with the response from the buyers to the yearlings we had on offer and obviously the competition in the ring was so strong.

"It was a fabulous result for the farm and for the whole team."

Having stood 10 seasons at stud, 13-year-old Star Witness is responsible for 18 individual stakes winners including Group 1 winner Global Glamour and Group 2 winners and Group 1 placegetters Star Turn and Graff, and Thompson said it was great to see the stallion secure a result of that calibre on such a stage like the Magic Millions.

"It's a great feather in his cap," Thompson said. "It's a \$2-million race and obviously a highly-competitive race that a lot of horses are set for, so it was wonderful to see him get that quinella there on Saturday.

"They're two very nice horses from two strong stables and it was a very pleasing result for us, the Star Witness syndicate and obviously the connections of Aim and Amish Boy."

In 2020, the son of Starcraft (NZ) stood at Widden for just \$22,000 and covered a book of 47 mares and Thompson believes he is a heavily undervalued stallion.

Under the Radar

"He is a value horse and has always flown a bit under the radar," Thompson said. "But obviously he won the sire-making races, the G1 Blue Diamond as a 2-year-old, the G1 Coolmore Stud S. as a 3-year-old and he really has produced some top-class horses including a filly like Global Glamour, he's got an exciting young stallion at Vinery Stud in Star Turn and he has really proven his worth.

"There are always plenty of breeders out there that are looking for a stallion for their mares that is proven to get Group 1 horses and I think at \$22,000, he is a horse that is certainly undervalued."

Meanwhile, one Widden stallion that has certainly not flown under the radar in his stud career is Zoustar and after coming away from the Magic Millions Gold Coast Sale as the third-highest grossing stallion behind I Am Invincible and Snitzel, Thompson is very pleased with where the son of Northern Meteor's career is at.

"He had a lovely lot of yearlings," Thompson said. "Obviously the yearlings sold at this sale were bred off the back of him being champion first-season sire and having proven himself, so it was probably his first really good book of mares.

"Up until then, he had had good support without having the really, really top-class book which we saw now that he is a proven stallion, the quality goes up again, so it was very pleasing to see all those breeders who did send their better mares get well-rewarded.

"He had his fifth individual million-dollar yearling so it was a top result in the sale ring and across the board, a really consistent lot of horses that sold well."

The Highlight

There were so many highlights across the week for Widden however when asked to pick his standout moment, Thompson said it was seeing his daughter Amy lead Lot 325, a filly by I Am Invincible who was purchased by Willinga Park Operations for \$850,000, through the ring.

"My personal highlight was watching my daughter Amy lead her first yearling through the sales ring and the smile on her face was really wonderful to see," he said.

"She's worked really hard during the prep in the school holidays and she's worked really hard at the sale.

"She's the first there every morning and the last to leave at night and to see the level of satisfaction for her to really bond with that Flying Snitzel filly and take her through the ring, it was wonderful to see."

When asked where this Magic Millions week ranked for Widden, Thompson said: "It was right up there. To top the sale was very special and to see the team present the horses so beautifully and work so well.

"Obviously we invested heavily in some of those mares with our own money on behalf of partners of the farm and good supporters. So it was a great thing to see them rewarded like that, particularly that Bonny O'Reilly colt."

Thompson also said it sets up the farm for a positive rest of the year, starting with the upcoming Inglis Classic Sale where Widden will offer another 39 yearlings.

"It certainly gives you more confidence going forward," Thompson said.

"We do have a lot of yearlings to sell at the Classic Sale so that's now where we turn our focus.

"Knowing that we've had such a successful Magic Millions and such a high clearance rate, it gives us confidence going into the Classic Sale that we can present another nice lot of yearlings and get them sold as well."



KENTUCKY SIRES FOR 2021: THIRD-CROP SIRES, PART I

It's now or never, guys!

The deeper we go into our survey of Kentucky covering options for 2021, the fewer stallions remain standing. And those we reach today, about to launch a third crop of juveniles, have entered a decisive stage of their climb. Two or three are ascending confidently toward the next ridge; a handful are clinging tenaciously to a ledge; but many are now slithering unhappily down through the scree.

Several have already disappeared into regional or overseas programs. For now, the leading Bluegrass farms are persevering with 18 stallions from this group. It's a safe bet, however, that by this time next year, half of them will have been moved on. In each of the three preceding intakes, the same farms now retain no more than seven or eight.

In the course of this series, we've repeatedly remarked how unproven stallions are first supported and then abandoned with equal haste. But the foals conceived by these stallions this spring will have a far more legible value at the yearling sales of 2023. With a fifth crop on the track, their sires will by then have given us a legitimate sense of how their stock develop with maturity. There will be no more excuses.

The stakes, then, are now extremely steep. The rewards are potentially high, with fees generally tumbling, but the risk for the majority is clear. **Cont. p3**

MUCHO UNUSUAL TAKES MEGAHERTZ

George Krikorian's overachieving California-bred **Mucho Unusual** (**Mucho Macho Man**) added to her stellar Santa Anita record and picked up her third graded stakes win in her last four starts with a game success in Monday's GIII Megahertz S.

A beaten heavy favorite twice on dirt after breaking her maiden by 8 1/4 lengths over the local main track in October of 2018, the homebred scored in her first three tries over turf, culminating with a tally in the GII San Clemente S. Unable to find the winner's circle in her next eight tries, a stretch that included placings in the GI American Oaks and GI Gamely S., she got back on track with a wire-to-wire conquest of the GI Rodeo Drive S. here Sept. 26. Sent off as the longest shot in the field in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, she faded to 12th, but returned home to capture the GIII Robert J. Frankel S. Dec. 27.

As such, it's no surprise that many commercial stallions should find their books virtually evaporating. He who lives by the sword dies by the sword. If you launch your stallion to appeal to short-term opportunists, you can't complain when they quit the scene in the same tearing rush as they first arrived.

Unless you're talking about a two-turn horse under restrained management--with the scope to become another **Blame**, say--these stallions tend to require immediate momentum from their first couple of crops. There can be no stalling as the lights go green. It's extremely rare, certainly, that the more commercial types get a reprieve after the remarkable fashion, in this group, of **Daredevil**.

Among those drinking in the last-chance saloon, then, who deserves the funding to go back up to the bar and order one more round? Who deserves one

final opportunity to secure a viable stud career in Kentucky? At a time when generous fee cuts are being made across the roster, there will surely be a bargain or two for those bold enough to take a gamble.

Naturally we start with **American Pharoah** (Pioneer of the Nile--Little Princess Emma, by Yankee Gentlemen), who continues to do everything required by his stellar status and six-figure fee: champion freshman, now champion second-crop sire and once again well clear with his yearling averages too. But bold gambles need not be confined to the strugglers, and I do hope that someday his owners might think about giving this horse at least a year on their farm in Ireland.

The fact is that only one of American Pharoah's six graded stakes winners in 2020 came on dirt (and that was in Japan).

This partly reflects the fact that he already has quite good representation in Europe--not least through the homebred Van Gogh, among the favorites for Epsom after rounding off his first season at Ballydoyle with a four-length Group 1 success in France. American Pharoah's other elite scorer, however, is Harvey's Lil Goil, who left the main track to win the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup and then got within half a length in the Filly & Mare Turf at the Breeders' Cup. The slightly startling bottom line is that American Pharoah, by North American dirt earnings, finished behind nine other second-crop stallions with two black-type winners from 82 starters in 2020.

Ashford is offering him at \$100,000 for 2020, having soon listed him as "private" after launching him at \$200,000, and he's not going to lack either quality or quantity any time soon. After a Breeders' Cup winner from his first crop of juveniles, he

welcomed another 153 mares last spring, following nearly 800 across his first four years. And he had two outstanding sophomores on dirt in Japan, so we're plainly talking about a versatile sire rather than any kind of strict specialist.

In this day and age, after all, it should only be an increasing asset--including in the domestic market--for a Triple Crown winner to parlay his class into different environments. (His own sire, remember, broke his maiden on turf and took a synthetic route to the Kentucky Derby where he finished second in the slop.)

A sojourn in Europe would give breeders there a thrilling opportunity. But American breeders will doubtless remain so jealous of this historic achiever that the Europeans will

just have to keep shipping mares if they want competition for Galileo (Ire) and his sons. Certainly it's none of my business to tell the best in the business how to run their business. **Cont. p4**

They will know the English expression, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it." And American Pharoah's third crop of yearlings averaged \$227,820 for 49 sold of 68 into the ring, including a couple of seven-figure sales.

That was admittedly well down on his first couple of crops, which both exceeded \$400,000. But it's a very solid yield compared with most of these stallions. The market for third-crop yearlings, remember, is notoriously porous at the best of

times; and this cycle, collectively, was under freakish additional pressure in the pandemic economy. To be broadsided in this fashion, precisely when most commercially vulnerable, demands an invisible asterisk for every yearling they sold in 2020.

The one who has bucked that trend most comprehensively is **Constitution** (Tapit--Baffled, by **Distorted Humor**). With his flagship Tiz the Law continuing to thrive as a sophomore, WinStar's comet advanced his third crop of yearlings to \$137,351, up again from \$95,314 after a big debut crop had been rather coolly received at \$71,424. His fee has taken parallel steps, having been cut to \$15,000 from an opening \$25,000 before earning hikes to \$40,000 and now \$85,000. Last year, similarly, having slipped to 85 mares in his fourth season, he broke into the top five books in the nation with no fewer than 231 covers.

Besides the stellar Tiz the Law, in 2020 **Constitution** admittedly mustered just one other graded stakes winner in Laura's Light (scored at both Grade II and III level). But no fewer than 19 black-type performers represented nearly 14% of starters, building on the unarguable breadth of impact (eight graded stakes horses) made by his first juveniles the previous year. For what it may be worth, his sojourn in Chile has been no less productive with three youngsters winning Group 1s.

Constitution has put himself in the vanguard of those sons of **Tapit** contesting the eventual succession, and his own profile--unraced at two, clocked a 111 Beyer in the GI Donn H. at four--suggests that his stock should continue to consolidate from here. Like American Pharoah, his family has been seeded by one or two quirky names, but there are good horses close up on his page and, one way or another, everything is falling into place. He is becoming a model of what farms hope to achieve with a young commercial stallion.

This time last year, the game already appeared to be up for **Constitution's** former studmate **Daredevil** (**More Than Ready**--Chasethewildwind, by Forty Niner). We should congratulate The Jockey Club of Turkey, in fact, for profiting from the panicky temperament of the American commercial market. Having imported a modest but presentable freshman sire, with 13 winners from 41 starters, they saw two of his first sophomores improve into Grade I winners and were immediately able to repatriate **Daredevil** to Lane's End to stand at \$25,000.

Of course, it may yet prove that everyone has now overreacted to his triumph no less than they did in dismissing him as a \$7,500 dud. In percentage terms, none of these stallions owes so much to their principal earner as does **Daredevil** to his extraordinary GI Preakness winner Swiss Skydiver--and we know that any sire can come up with one freaky good horse. Hence the vital importance of Shedaresthedevil beating Swiss Skydiver in their stunning GI Kentucky Oaks one-two; moreover, **Daredevil's** only other black-type winner of 2020 graduated from Ohio-bred company to chase home Vequist (**Nyquist**), albeit at a respectful distance, in the GI Spinaway S.

So **Daredevil** had 'only' three black-type horses. And he had 'as many as' three Grade I horses. You decide. He has been priced strictly for believers, but let's remember that he did all this from not quite half as many starters as American Pharoah. Naturally, **Daredevil** was another of the few to drive up his third crop of yearlings, who rallied to \$42,403 for 28 sales (of 42 offered) from \$14,260 for his second.

After such a wild ride to date, it'll be fascinating to see how he stabilizes from here. If **Daredevil** himself couldn't go on from a juvenile Grade I success, it's encouraging that he's half-brother to an older campaigner as hard-knocking as Albertus Maximus (Albert the Great). His big problem will be the looming bump in the road resulting from just 21 covers in 2019.

There will be no break in the traffic for **Tapiture** (**Tapit**--Free Spin, by Olympio) at Darby Dan, where he significantly secured marginally his biggest book to date in his fifth year, up to 186 from 114 the previous year (after 525 covers across his first three seasons). He made the most of that footprint in 2020, with 16 black-type horses, albeit only one--Hopeful Growth in the

GIII Monmouth Oaks--actually achieved graded stakes success. His principal earner was instead the \$30,000 yearling Jesus' Team, who achieved a Classic podium in the GI Preakness S. and also emulated his sire as runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

His prolific output secured **Tapiture** third place in the second-crop prize money table, albeit his percentages can duly be matched by a number of sires apparently struggling in his wake; and even he endured a declining yield at the yearling sales, down to \$20,605 for 44 sold (from 67 into the ring) from \$39,101 the previous year. (But that, as already noted, is pretty standard at the best of times--never mind in a pandemic market.)

In the round, he has done enough actually to advance his fee to \$10,000 from \$7,500, a rare distinction for a stallion at this stage of his career. His damsire introduces a backwater of the Nasrullah line but, judging from serial graded stakes performance or production by siblings, something is functioning consistently well. And, relative to many commercial sires, his key advantage is that his precocious returns could yet be consolidated by maturing stock: he won graded stakes at two, three and four.



That should also prove true of **Liam's Map** (Unbridled's Song--Miss Macy Sue, by Trippi), who was a late starter on the track but clocked 114 Beyers for both his Grade I's at four, and arguably surpassed even those performances when run down by **Honor Code** in a Whitney for the ages.

The first three home in that epic all ended up at Lane's End and, while I retain no less faith in the other two, it is **Liam's Map** who seems to have caught a following wind to this point. He first prospered from a very useful opportunity: the two stakes winners in his first crop of juveniles did the job properly, both scoring at Grade I level. Now **Liam's Map** has followed through with a solid fifth in the second-crop table, with seven stakes winners at essentially the same clip as American Pharoah and **Constitution**. If eking a second Grade I win out of Basin was candidly a bonus, the easy winner being later disqualified, then the GII Pat Day Mile success of Rushie was a validly fresh string to their sire's bow.

By the prudent standards of his farm, 156 mares in his fifth book--despite a hike from \$20,000 to \$35,000--represented a return to full subscription after **Liam's Map** had eased slightly, in familiar fashion, to 114 the previous year. A trim back to \$30,000 will doubtless help to maintain momentum, and overall he appears to be in good shape. His third crop of yearlings averaged \$80,435 for 39 sold of 54, holding up their value very

well (second crop \$118,801) relative to most in this intake.

That can be no surprise in one who himself cost \$800,000 as a yearling, and whose pedigree has only grown more aristocratic with the flying start made at stud by half-brother **Not This Time** (Giant's Causeway). A family like theirs, combined with six triple-digit Beyers in eight starts, meant that **Liam's Map** always seemed destined to make the grade. And he could not be in better hands to stay on course now. **Cont. p8**

Somehow things don't seem to have fallen quite so obligingly for **Honor Code** (A.P. Indy--Serena's Cat, by Storm Cat) on the same roster, but I believe he remains well qualified to succeed in the long term. He was unlucky that fate restricted his flagship **Honor A. P.** to a single performance that did justice of his true merit, in the GI Santa Anita Derby. Moreover, the odds against **Honor Code** are potentially now compounded by the arrival of his physically stunning son as a rival in the same stallion shed--and a rival, moreover, priced as the outstanding value of Kentucky's entire new intake.

Honor Code's quiet start with his first juveniles left him chasing the pace somewhat, and he was cut to \$30,000 from an opening \$40,000 to receive 85 mares last spring, following four basically full books of around 150. Half a dozen stakes horses in 2020 represented a steady gain, **Honor A. P.** finding his best support from the Gill Withers success/GI Travers podium of Max Player, and another cut (to \$20,000) should help to maintain his appeal to more patient breeders. He certainly throws a seductive foal and \$50,068 for 51 (of 73) yearlings sold from his third crop was a familiar kind of slip--for this vulnerable group, in this market--from \$75,494.

He should certainly retain his appeal to anyone who might be disposed to retain a filly. The maternal line is obviously regal, while the cross between sire and damsire combines twin

bulwarks of Secretariat's broodmare prowess. With plenty of maturing talent on stream, **Honor Code** could yet replicate his Whitney performance, when taking off from the rear and running down the trail-blazing **Liam's Map**. But there's no denying this looks an important year for him.

Mucho Unusual takes Megahertz cont. from p1

Backed down to 2-5 in this scratched-down field of four, the bay broke alertly and led early before deferring to sit second behind Chilean import Brooke (Chi) (No Nay Never) through moderate fractions of :23.78 and :48 flat. Turning up the pressure steadily throughout the far turn run while well held by Joel Rosario, she was carried wide off the bend as Brooke bore out. That one then drifted back in, interfering with Colonial

Creed (**Jimmy Creed**), setting up a three-horse battle for the final furlong with closing Sedamar. Re-breaking between her two foes outside the sixteenth pole to stick her neck in front, Mucho Unusual put away Brooke for good soon thereafter and held off a resurgent Sedamar to prevail. Following an inquiry, Brooke was disqualified from third and placed last for impeding Colonial Creed.

“She’s super honest, we’re excited to have her in the stable, (it’s been) just a great ride,” said winning trainer Tim Yakteen. “We were thinking about keeping her at a mile and one eighth, mile and a quarter, unfortunately, there really wasn’t anything coming up until the end of March, so we thought we would take advantage of a lighter field.”

Pedigree Notes:

Mucho Unusual is one of five stakes winners for 2013 GI Breeders’ Cup Classic hero **Mucho Macho Man**, who now stands at Hill ‘n’ Dale at Xalapa, and is one of his two Grade I winners alongside last year’s Pegasus World Cup hero Mucho Gusto. She is the fourth of five foals to race thus far out of Not Unusual, a \$67,000 Barretts Fall Yearling purchase by Krikorian in 2007 who also produced his GSW/GISP turler Big Score (Mr. Big). Not Unusual is responsible for a juvenile full-sister to that runner and produced a colt by Kitten’s Joy last season before continuing her class ascent with a visit to Uncle Mo.



BOOK REVIEW: EURICO ROSA DA SILVA--RIDING FOR FREEDOM

To the outside world, Eurico Rosa Da Silva came off as a good-natured, level-headed jockey whose natural talent led him to the top of the standings at Woodbine Racetrack and to seven Sovereign Awards as Canada's champion rider. But underneath that veneer was a person whose anger and troubled past had consumed him, nearly leading him down a path to total destruction.

Da Silva rose from the poverty of a small town in Brazil to become the dominant rider in Canada before retiring in 2019. But that's not what his autobiography, "Riding For Freedom," is about. Instead, it is an honest and thought-provoking look at one's demons, how and why a life can unravel and what it takes to put it back together again. A horse racing story this is not.

In time, Da Silva would come to understand just how toxic and damaging his relationship with his father had been. His father was so verbally abusive that Da Silva describes his actions as "emotional warfare." He writes that his father tormented him, made fun of his size, challenged his sexuality and did whatever he could to diminish him.

His father was also a womanizer who, Da Silva writes, raped his babysitter when she was just 13.

Da Silva found his escape. As a young child he started off riding donkeys at an uncle's farm before he graduated to galloping quarter horses for a local trainer. His big break came when he was accepted to the Brazilian jockeys' academy. After graduating, he became the top apprentice in his native country.

But he could not find happiness.

"It consumed me, the negativity and its energies," he writes of his anger. "I was miserable and I couldn't shake it."

Da Silva convinced himself that he was worthless. "I never felt that I had anything to offer," he writes.

Certain that he was not worthy of being loved, he didn't seek out a traditional relationship with a woman. Rather, he went for one tryst after another with prostitutes, something he continued to do well into his many years riding in Canada. To compound his problems, Da Silva developed an addiction to gambling. **Cont. p11**

Yet, he remained generous and kind. He befriended a child with cerebral palsy and learning difficulties who would often come to the track with his parents. So concerned about the welfare of the horses he rode, Da Silva, after learning that an owner wanted to have a horse put down, paid for its surgery and arranged for it to be retired at the LongRun Thoroughbred Retirement Society.

Da Silva would leave Brazil to start riding in Macau, where he rode for four years. It was there that he met his first wife, Claudia. In 2004, he came to Woodbine.

Amid all his troubles, Da Silva never let up when it came to his burning desire to succeed. He had pursued the dream of becoming a champion rider since his childhood and nothing was going to stop him. Starting off as an unknown at Woodbine, he struggled his first few years there, but gradually worked his way into the top barns on the grounds and, in 2010, won his first

Sovereign Award.


But nothing that Da Silva did on the track provided any relief for his inner turmoil. He won his first Queen’s Plate in 2009 aboard Eye of the Leopard (A.P. Indy) but would find no solace in the accomplishment.

“I thought if I won the Queen’s Plate I’d be OK,” he writes. But he said he then started hearing voices afterward, voices that said, “You’ve won the Queen’s Plate. Now is the time to kill yourself.”

He had been working with a sports psychologist to try to deal with his problems, but found that it wasn’t getting him anywhere. He moved on and found a new therapist, one who specialized in sex addiction. He also entered into a divorce with his first wife and entered into a

relationship and eventually married an equine surgeon named Orlaith Cleary.

His release from his demons came all at once, when he realized he did not want to kill himself but wanted to kill the father that was within him. He was able to put aside painful memories of his childhood and replace them with pleasant ones, playing with toys and happy to be alive.

“I might have won the Queen’s Plate twice and been the best jockey in the country for years, but that was nothing compared to winning my freedom,” he writes. “It was the greatest achievement of my life.”

After the 2019 racing season, another in which he led all jockeys at Woodbine with 182 wins, Da Silva retired. He was just 44 and still at the top of his game, but he wanted to step away to do something else with his life. He became a certified life coach and his clients include other professional athletes. He hopes to impart on them the wisdom he gained through his personal struggles. Which are, he says, a thing of the past.

He is, as he writes, a “free and happy man.”


