



## BREEZE-UP SECTOR HOPES FOR POSITIVE REBOOT

NEWMARKET, UK--Business as usual? Hardly. But at least things don't feel quite as unnervingly unusual as last year.

At the best of times, breeze-up pinhookers have a precarious window of opportunity. After a long winter of preparation, their horses get a few, fleeting seconds between those timing lasers--and if for any reason they misfire then very few prospectors nowadays, whatever they may claim, will give them the benefit of the doubt. And, unlike with foals and yearlings, there is no second chance. All you can do is put the horse into training yourself, and hope to sell off the track.

On the one hand, then, it was especially hard on this sector that it should have been the first exposed to the terrifying economic uncertainties that accompanied the outbreak of the pandemic this time last year. On the other, you could argue that the resilience and adaptability routinely demanded of its practitioners made them more eligible than anybody, once the time came for the industry to send someone back up that ladder and over the parapet.

The belated resumption of the breeze-up calendar, then, was not just an exercise in damage limitation in terms of their own profit and loss. It also became a gesture of perseverance on behalf of horsemen everywhere. They would absorb the shock and, so long as they could still afford it, they would be back in the autumn to restock. In the event, that actually proved a somewhat more expensive process than they might have imagined in the summer. But the confidence that had returned to much of the market, by the time of the yearling sales, at least entitles consignors to return to Newmarket on Tuesday with some hope of due reward for their exposure last year.

For all the Covid protocols still to be observed, the Tattersalls Craven Sale is not only restored to its customary slot--having last year been staged the week after Royal Ascot--but coincides with the latest easing in national restrictions. Just to be here, renewing such familiar rituals, heightens a sense that things may finally be getting back onto an even keel.

Yes, the calendar remains in a state of flux, not least given the

contrasting Covid picture in France and Ireland. Yet those present for the breeze show were nonetheless heartened to renew one of the most timeless spectacles anywhere on the Turf: the silhouette of a young Thoroughbred pulling up against the horizon of the Rowley Mile. Pandemic or no pandemic, the skylarks remained delirious as ever; and the slow clouds, hanging high in the East Anglian sky, alternated the lingering chill of winter with samples of brighter days ahead.

True, the number of spectators appeared down on years past, but then this is hardly the only environment where remote retail has matured in consumer trust over the past year. Besides, we know how many people nowadays view even breeze videos through a prism of

evidence gleaned by their timers, stride-counters and all the rest. **Cont. p3**

## Tattersalls Craven Breeze Up Sale Preview Cont.

Quite how many buyers are still incorporating old-fashioned horsemanship into their shortlisting is another matter. As always, it was fascinating to observe the observers: which agents, for instance, didn't bother to make a single note all morning; and which, equally, sited themselves to pick up any "straws in the wind" as the horses were eased.

Tattersalls, for their part, have assisted the regrouping process by introducing a **twin bonus scheme**, worth £125,000 to any graduate of the sale who can first win a juvenile race at Royal Ascot; and another £125,000 to any who can first win one of the 15 European Group 1 races open to 2-year-olds. (This would be split in a ratio of £100,000 and £25,000 to owner and vendor, respectively.) Consignors are complimenting Tattersalls on looking to their laurels, regarding this sale, with Doncaster having made such an effective play for the precocious types likely to be ready for Ascot, and Arqana muscling in on pedigrees that might take a little longer but also reach a little higher.

As ever, of course, it all boils down to flesh and blood and the associated roll of the dice. Few consignors ever get a pleasant surprise at the breeze show, and there were the usual cases of stage fright and/or soreness reported here. But at least those are familiar challenges. By the time this sale was eventually staged last year, with many horses sold to regular clientele off the home gallops, a catalogue of 154 had shrunk to 84 in the ring. Of these, 70 sold for a 61,000gns median and 94,993gns average, down from 85,000gns and 121,682gns, respectively the previous year--and from sale records of 110,000gns and 144,082gns in 2017. Yet it was a relief just to get the cycle renewed in some form.

Overall, the salvaged calendar contrived what was generally considered an acceptable return in the circumstances. Many had feared real carnage.

"It was all little bit nervous, to say the least," recalls Brendan Holland of Grove Stud. "Would there be a marketplace at all? And if so, how would it happen? And not only was there a marketplace, but an amazing increase of about 20% in the amount of individual buyers."

The clearance rate was strong, too, though it must be said that would prove a trend in every sector, suggestive of a "fire sale" mentality.

"For sure, there was a higher-than-normal level of pragmatism in the valuation of stock," concedes Holland wryly. "And possibly there was an element, in the increased number of purchasers, of people seeking value as a result. But ultimately it was about the success the horses have had on the track. Even in an uncertain year, that over-rode everything. There was bigger participation than you'd ever have imagined, and that was because the track end is what it's all about. The breeze-up horses are performing consistently at a higher and higher level every year.

"It's so important for the overall health of the industry that our particular part held up, because we're such important investors in the yearling market--and of course that feeds into the foal market, feeds into the mare market. I'm also a yearling seller, so a healthy breeze-up market was as important for me in that way as it was as a breeze-up seller. They're all links in the same chain and thankfully it held up."

Holland found Book 2 of the October Sale as strong as ever, but did feel that restocking was slightly less expensive elsewhere.

"The other sales, worldwide, were all back a little bit," he says. "Back by acceptable margins, but still back: it was a little bit easier to buy. Because I think people in the autumn were still in that pragmatic mood, with their valuations, and there was still uncertainty."

His biggest concern, as an Irish consignor, is that the business has jumped straight from the frying pan of Covid into the fire of Brexit.

"And that, to me, is much more challenging even than Covid," he argues. "It has different and long-term implications, for the economy and for the ability to do business. Covid will pass. Brexit's not going to pass. You couldn't describe the headaches

it's causing, in unnecessary paperwork and cost."

Routines that Holland has been following for 20 years have suddenly become complicated and expensive.

"I had the Department of Agriculture checking my horses coming here," he says. "Then we had another check for Doncaster. Because I'm now exporting to a 'third country' outside the E.U., by law they have to check all these horses before they can travel. Brexit is adding costs not just to the British economy but to other economies as well, and there's no gain: only extra cost, extra bureaucracy. People give out about E.U. bureaucracy but it's been replaced by even more."

But if the goalposts keep moving, then you can fall back on one constant.

"Your job is to produce nice horses," Holland stresses. "That's what keeps you in business. Your job is not to forecast trade, economies, currency differences. You can't start thinking about

things that you have no control over. Producing the horses is what will get you out, in good times and bad."

Holland himself has started the cycle with familiar challenges. Only three of his original six entries made the journey, thanks to untimely setbacks. One will make another sale, but the other pair will have to go into training. But it's precisely because such experiences are so familiar that this sector has its reputation not only for resilience and adaptability, but also for world-class horsemanship.

"This is an extremely tough way to make a living for many

reasons," Holland reflects. "First of all because you're dealing with something so unpredictable, in livestock. But also because of who you're competing against. When most people go to work in the morning, they're not competing against the best in the world. But we are: every sale we go to, Europe and America. So you just have to make the most of your good luck, and hope that you have a proper card somewhere in your deck. Because some years you won't--and you will always have the other kind!

"It wasn't just our industry that faced challenges last year. It was the whole world. So you just had to be accommodating, had to be flexible. And yes, I'd say we are flexible by nature anyway. When you work with animals, you're being challenged daily, never mind annually. So it was a big deal, but we coped."

Kah is not new to success: she followed fellow Group 1-winning jockey Clare Lindop in landing the Adelaide jockeys' championship in her native South Australia. In fact, she won it three times, the first when she was still an apprentice. Between winning her first and third championship, Kah took a short time out of racing, prompted in part by the fatal fall of her friend Caitlin Forrest at Murray Bridge in a race in which Kah was also riding.

On a busman's holiday she stayed with her compatriot Jeremy Gask in the UK and spent some time riding out there and in Newmarket.

Thankfully for the sport, she decided to press on with her riding career. Since early 2019 Kah has based herself in Melbourne, where she landed the first of her five Group 1 wins to date on another import, Harlem (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}), in the Australian Cup only weeks after her arrival there. She currently leads the Melbourne jockeys' premiership by a wide margin, her 80 wins putting her 26 clear of second-placed Damian Lane, who in turn is 10 clear of Damien Oliver.

There's no doubt that there is still a dearth of female jockeys but, just as attitudes towards them from trainers and owners are changing, that situation will surely change too. Having come into racing from more of a sport horse background, where from my youth the role models Lucinda Green, Ginny Elliott and Liz Edgar loomed large, I've never quite understood the bias against females jockeys in racing.

It always seemed ridiculous and now it is clear to see that it was.

In the last decade we've seen Hayley Turner become the first woman to win a Group 1 outright in Britain (not forgetting Alex Greaves's dead-heat on Ya Malak (GB) in the 1997 Nunthorpe). The recently retired Lizzie Kelly became the first woman to ride a Grade 1 winner over fences in 2015, two months after Michelle Payne became the first to win the Melbourne Cup. In the last year alone, Bryony Frost was the first woman to win the prestigious GI King George VI Chase, Jessica Marcialis was the first to win a Group 1 in France, Hollie Doyle was given a retainership by Arab owner Imad Al Sagar, rode a five-timer at Windsor and was named Sunday Times Sportswoman of the Year. Then there's Rachael, who is now so famous she only needs a first name. Six victories at the Cheltenham Festival saw her become the leading jockey there three weeks ago before her arguably even more important success on Saturday.

Plenty of people have pointed to the fact that she will now have other women and young girls believing they too can be a jockey. That, however, is not the problem. The women have always believed, but not enough men in key positions felt the same. Times are changing, along with attitudes. It can't come soon enough.

## Frankel's French Romp

On Friday, it will be 10 years since **Frankel (GB)** stepped out for his first 3-year-old triumph in the Greenham S. ahead of that breathtaking win in the 2000 Guineas. In the intervening decade, his name has rarely been out of the racing news, and that has been particularly true in the past week, notably in France.

Last Monday **Big Five (GB)** had become **Frankel's** 100th black-type performer in the Northern Hemisphere with his easy victory in the Listed Prix Right Royal at Chantilly. [Cont. p6](#)

Then Juddmonte's **Wensleydale (GB)** dazzled brightly enough in her Saint-Cloud debut for Henri Devin that she became the latest 'TDN Rising Star'.

Another Juddmonte filly, **Petricor (GB)**, was just outdone in the G3 Prix Vanteaux on Sunday but even then it was by another daughter of **Frankel**, **Rumi (Fr)**, who stepped up notably from her seasonal debut when fourth in the Prix Durban only a week earlier. **Hurricane Cloud (Fr)**, the half-brother to promising young French sire Goken (Fr), provided another winner for **Frankel** on Sunday's Longchamp card, while **O'Reilly (Fr)** won on his 3-year-old debut for Jessica Harrington at Leopardstown, where **Mehnah (GB)**, a half-sister to Irish 2000 Guineas winner Awtad (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), was beaten a head by **Keeper Of Time (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) on just her second start in the G3 Ballylinch Stud 'Priory Belle' 1000 Guineas Trial.

Among **Frankel's** spate of other winners worldwide, **Delaware (GB)**, who was previously a Group 3 winner for Andre Fabre, notched his first win since joining Chad Brown's stable and he did so in some style, setting a new Aqueduct track record in the Listed Danger's Hour S.

### Blue Collar Heroes

In the very early skirmishes in the first-season sire championships, Overbury Stud's **Ardad (GB)** is leading the way as the only stallion with two winners to date. His first came last

Tuesday at Bath with **Blue Collar Lad (GB)**, who was bought for just 1,000gns by his trainer Robyn Brisland.

Then on Monday at Windsor, the track where you often find a Richard Hannon hotpot in the early juvenile races, the 150-1 shot **Arboy Will (GB)** made all the running to outdo that hotpot, **Zoltan Star (GB)**, who incidentally was co-bred by Overbury Stallions with Dukes Stud and is by Ardad's sire Kodiak (GB).

Bred by Anthony Byrne, Arboy Will was unsold at 1,500gns as a foal when offered at Tattersalls, and is out of a dual-winning half-sister to the GII Santa Ana S. winner Madam Dancealot (Ire) (Sir Prancealot {Ire}). He became the first debutant 2-year-old winner for his veteran trainer John Bridger who admitted he is "getting near 80".

Ardad could be in for a big week as among his six entries this week he has two horses set to make their debut at Newmarket's Craven meeting.

One of those, **Beautiful Sunshine (GB)**, was withdrawn from the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-up Sale by consignor Robson Aguiar and has instead been sent into training with George Boughey for Amo Racing. Aguiar notably enjoyed success last year with another breeze-up withdrawal, The Lir Jet (Ire) (Prince Of Lir {Ire}), who was trained by Michael Bell to win convincingly on debut at Yarmouth before being sold to Qatar Bloodstock and landing the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot.

Blue Collar Lad and Arboy Will were not the only inexpensive winners over the last week. The Marco Botti-trained **Atalis Bay (GB)** (Cable Bay {GB}) was bought by his Italian owners Scuderia Blueberry for just 800gns as a yearling at the Tattersalls February Sale. The colt has now won four of his seven starts and landed the conditions race at Nottingham off a mark of 97.

However, there's no doubt that the bargain buy of the week was G3 Ballylinch Stud 'Priory Belle' 1000 Guineas Trial winner **Keeper Of Time (Ire)**, who gave Mehmas an important boost as he bids to build on his exciting start to his stud career last year. John Nolan bought the filly for just €3,000 at the Goffs February Sale from the Phelan family's Tullogher House Stud and she became the first group winner for Johnny Feane. The trainer indicated after the race that Nolan has already had offers for **Keeper Of Time**, who is not entered in the Irish Classic and could be sold to race on in America.

### Eagle To Swoop Again?

Gestüt Schlenderhan and partners suffered a cruel blow last week with the death of German champion sire Adlerflug (Ger) at the age of 17.

A day later his son **Martial Eagle (Ger)** carried the Ullmann family colours to a stylish victory at Saint-Cloud for trainer Francis Graffard in the Prix Amour Drake. The colt holds entries for the Prix du Jockey Club and Grand Prix de Paris but he may well be aimed to follow the example of another Graffard-trained and Schlenderhan-bred son of Adlerflug, In Swoop (Ire), in the G1 Deutsches Derby, for which Martial Eagle is currently favourite.

In Swoop, who subsequently finished runner-up to **Sottsass (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}) in the Arc, has remained in training and is entered to return to Longchamp on Sunday in the Listed Prix Lord Seymour. **Cont. p7**

**GOESBRIDGE BREEZE UP SALE RELOCATED TO NEWMARKET**

The Tattersalls Ireland Goresbridge Breeze Up Sale has been moved once again to the Tattersalls headquarters at Park Paddocks in Newmarket, Tattersalls Ireland announced on Monday. Ongoing COVID-19 related travel restrictions in Ireland prompted the location switch and 2021 marks the second year the sale will be held in Newmarket. The practice breeze session and breeze session proper at Newmarket Racecourse will be held on June 1 and 2, respectively, with the sale scheduled for June 3, as the racecourse is also operating as a COVID-19

vaccination centre. Originally, Goresbridge was set for May 20 (breezes) and 21 (sale) in Ireland.

In 2020, the Tattersalls Ireland Goresbridge Breeze Up Sale saw a 9% increase in average and a 22% increase in median. The sale also sported a 85% clearance rate. Haqeeqy (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), a 2020 graduate, took the Lincoln at Doncaster for John and Thady Gosden and Her Highness Sheikh Hissa Hamdan Al Maktoum earlier this spring.

"The decision to relocate the Tattersalls Ireland Goresbridge Breeze Up Sale reflects our commitment to providing the most vibrant marketplace possible for our breeze-up vendors and we believe that this option delivers the best chance of achieving that goal," said Tattersalls Ireland CEO Simon Kerins. "We are extremely fortunate to have the option to relocate to Europe's premier bloodstock sales venue in Tattersalls and we are very grateful to the teams at both Tattersalls and Newmarket Racecourse for again accommodating the sale."

**EU ANIMAL HEALTH LAW IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE**

The implementation of the EU Animal Health Law, due to go into effect on Apr. 21, will instead begin on Aug. 21, the Thoroughbred Breeders’ Association announced on Monday. The rule affects Thoroughbred movements to the EU, and, whilst not yet formally ratified, the Thoroughbred Brexit Steering Group’s understanding is that EU technical experts have approved a delay to the application of the new rule for equine exports until late August. Existing Export Health Certificates, among other export documents will remain valid until the revised start date. The TBA’s advice at this time is therefore to continue to use existing Export Health Certificates and to test for both EIA and EVA as part of the export process, until the new EU Animal Health Law’s Export Health Certificates come into effect.

Once the final position on the timing of implementation of this aspect of the EU Health Law is confirmed, the TBA will announce further guidance. For more information, please visit

meeting down the years under Senior and Junior.

“He’s been working very well,” the current incumbent of East Everleigh said. “I’m a little bit worried if the ground gets too quick as he’s a big horse, that’s all, but he needs a run and he had a good year last year. The latter has also captured the 9 1/2-furlong Meydan Trophy Feb. 11, while an intriguing renewal also features Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum’s mile course maiden winner **Royal Champion (Ire)** (Shamardal) from the Roger Varian stable and Ahmad Al Shaikh’s **Youth Spirit (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) who was last seen finishing third to Battleground (War Front) in the G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood in July.

“He’s a lovely horse and I’m really looking forward to getting him going,” trainer Andrew Balding said. “Obviously he’ll come on a bit for the run, but he’s in good shape for his first run of the season. He did have a niggles after Goodwood and we ran out of time, so we decided to leave him for the year.”

## BACK TO HQ

While the British flat turf season officially kicked off at Doncaster at the end of last month, the real beginning takes place on Tuesday as Newmarket open their three-day Craven meeting. Any self-respecting fan of racing will feel that familiar warmth at the prospect of the fixture that hosts the Nell Gwyn, the European Free, the Earl of Sefton and of course the Craven itself. Tuesday’s card has two longstanding race titles in the Alex Scott Maiden S. which gets the action underway and the Listed Feilden S. which pitches the year’s Derby hopes against one another for the first time on English soil. The sharp and early juveniles get their chance in the British EBF Novice S., while the seven-furlong British EBF Conditions S. which follows may have a 2000 Guineas prospect in its midst.

Two that are entered in the May 1 Classic are Ballydoyle’s **Duke of Mantua (Ire)** (No Nay Never) and Godolphin’s **Noble Dynasty (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), with the former coming here off a fourth as the topweight in The Curragh’s Madrid H. Mar. 21 which has already produced the G3 1000 Guineas Trial winner Keeper of Time (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) and conditions scorer Erzindjan (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}).

In the Feilden, Michael Pescod’s **Fancy Man (Ire)** (Pride of Dubai {Aus}) has to concede three pounds to all having won the Listed Ascendant S. at Haydock in September and he hails from the Hannon establishment which has done so well at this

Prior to that, 2-year-old Triple Crown winner Pierro stood at \$77,000 (inc GST) in his first season at Coolmore in 2013.

Farnan, a son of Not A Single Doubt, is set to be one of the foundation stallions for Kia Ora's new era. He retired as the highest-rating colt of the 14 Golden Slipper winners descended from Danehill (USA).

Time was called on his racing career last month after a brilliant eight-start career that yielded five wins. He was being aimed towards the Group 1 sprints this autumn by his trainers Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott, but niggling injuries ended his career.

Purchased from the Vinery Stud draft at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale for \$550,000 to a consortium involving both Aquis Farm and his breeders at Phoenix Thoroughbreds, Farnan won on debut for Waterhouse and Bott in a Canberra 2-year-old race in November 2019. He went on to win the R. Listed Magic Millions Wyong 2YO Classic at his second

start, and while beaten in the R. Listed Magic Millions 2YO Classic on the Gold Coast, he rebounded to win the G2 Silver Slipper S. and then the G2 Todman S. His crowning glory came in the Golden Slipper S. ridden by Hugh Bowman, he led all the way to beat star filly Away Game (Snitzel) by 1.8l.

"Farnan's a very special colt. I've been lucky enough to ride some really good horses over my career, but I've never ridden a better 2-year-old," Bowman said at the time.

He was subsequently crowned Australian Champion 2-year-old and his Golden Slipper win earned him a Timeform Rating of 122.

Kia Ora purchased into the colt ahead of his 3-year-old campaign, announcing its intention to restart its stallion division, while Aquis and Phoenix remained in the ownership.

"Farnan has won all his trials as a 3-year-old, and in brilliant fashion," Kia Ora Stud Manager, Shane Wright, said on his retirement.

Farnan's dam, Tallow (Street Cry {Ire}) was a Group 3 winner herself and also produced the stakes winner Sandbar (Snitzel). He is just the second Group 1-winning son of Not A Single Doubt to retire to stud in Australia.

The under-tack show for next week's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, delayed a day by Sunday's stormy weather, got underway Monday in Central Florida with 13 juveniles sharing the bullet furlong time of :10 flat and a filly by **Violence** turning in the day's fastest quarter-mile breeze.

Eddie Woods consigns **hip 107**, a daughter of **Violence** out of the unraced Royal Paradise (Unbridled's Song). The bay filly claimed the session's quarter-mile bullet time of **:20 3/5**.

"I was expecting a good work for her," Woods said Monday afternoon. "You can't tell someone a horse is going to go in :20 3/5, it's ridiculous. But whatever the fastest work was going to be of the day, she was going to be really right on it."

The filly is a half-sister to stakes-placed Bano Solo (**Goldencents**), who sold for \$400,000 at the 2018 OBS March sale. She was purchased for \$50,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. **Cont. p3**



## Violence Filly Fastest at OBS (cont. from p1)

“She’s tall, leggy and she’s got some length to her,” Woods said of hip 107. “She’s out of an Unbridled’s Song mare and you can kind of see that in her. And she’s bigger than I’d ever thought she’d be. She was a medium-sized yearling, but she’s a big, beautiful filly now.”

Woods sent out six juveniles to work at OBS Monday.

“We had a good day, it all went pretty well,” he said of his results. “There were no surprises. Everyone looked to come back well, so we are happy about everything.”

Of the track following a day of intense rain storms Sunday, Woods said, “I think the track was very fair. There were a couple of :20 4/5s and :10 flats. There weren’t any :9 and changes and that’s kind of the way the track should be. We had so much rain yesterday and that track acts a little bit like a sponge at times with a lot of water where it absorbs some of the

stuff and expands a little bit. We’re talking minute amounts, but minute amounts effect times. So it will be interesting to see how it is as we go forward in the week. Hopefully it stays the same.”

Becky Thomas’s Sequel Bloodstock sent out four New York-breds to work Monday and came away with three sharing the bullet furlong time.

Leading off the trio was hip 4, a daughter of Laoban out of Paper Kite (Bernardini). The bay filly, bred by Sequel, turned in her :10 flat work early in the day’s first session.

“When you see me have a horse that goes first, that’s usually a horse that I think a lot of in terms of speed,” Thomas said, adding of the filly, “She’s a pretty mover out of a Bernardini mare. She is very nice. We’re happy with her.”

Another Sequel homebred, a son of the operation’s stallion Mission Impazible (hip 135), also turned in a :10 flat work. The gray colt is out of Scott’s Aly Cat (Tale of the Cat). **Cont. p4**

“I bought [Scott’s Aly Cat] from Roy Lerman from his Lambholm program,” Thomas explained. “We bought her in foal to Mission because I had seen her year-before baby and liked it. He has a little bit of a **Tale of the Cat** look and yet has a little more leg to him because of the Unbridled’s Song from Mission. I gave that mare away on a co-breed deal to one of our breeders who is probably very happy today.”

Also working in **:10 flat** from the Sequel consignment was **hip 187**, a first-crop son of Grade I winner **Cupid** out of Silver Sands (El Prado {Ire}). Thomas purchased the colt for \$57,000 at last year’s Fasig-Tipton October sale.

“He’s a May 25 foal and he’s got a lot of length and a lot of stride,” Thomas said. “He belonged to a friend of mine who bred him in New York, so you always feel good when you can give back to our whole community. That horse was a Hidden Lake horse and they like to support our stallions, so I try hard on those breeders who support our stallions.”

Rounding out Sequel’s team of New York-breds working Monday was a colt by Central Banker (**hip 115**), who worked in **:10 1/5**. Thomas is consigning the colt on behalf of breeders Chester and Mary Broman.

“Mr. Broman is another one who supports the New York program,” Thomas said. “So it’s always fun when you have home-team horses.”

Despite the heavy rains Sunday, Thomas called an audible and sent her horses out to train following the cancellation of the breeze show.

“Normally we don’t train the day before the breeze, but because they had already had one day off, I didn’t want to not train,” Thomas said. “So we trained yesterday heading in.”

She added of the weather, “It was terrible. I realized we were about to get a deluge right in the middle of it.”

## BUSINESS IS BOOMING AT NOREVALE FARM

When Leo and Sarah Dooley announced last September that they would be starting their own boarding, quarantine and sales prep operation, they knew there would be a few factors working against them. First and foremost was the pandemic, at a time when the vaccine rollout was still months away. Plus, the couple was expecting to add a third member to their family at the end of the year.

Even so, the Dooleys decided it was the right time to step out on their own, and Norevale Farm was born.

“In the beginning, you’re questioning yourself and you’re thinking, ‘Was this the right idea? Are we going to get enough horses? Are we going to get enough support?’” Leo said, recalling those moments of doubt. “But as we moved into the new year, it was evident that we had lots of support.”

So much, in fact, that they’ve already outgrown their original 110-acre property along Hume Bedford Pike near Paris and are now one month into leasing out an additional farm down the street.

“Leasing the farm across the road was definitely not expected,” Sarah admitted. “I remember when I was first setting up payroll and the payroll company asked how many employees we were going to have. I said two. They asked, ‘Ever any more?’ and I said, ‘No, no way. We’re never going to have more than two employees.’ And now we have seven.”

Despite the explosion in growth, the couple still believes they’re at a size where they can fulfill their initial vision of a boutique, hands-on atmosphere.

“What I love is the fact that we’re not too big,” Leo said. “I can physically touch every horse, every day. We’re on top of everything and with being so hands on, we know the horses inside and out and hopefully down the line that starts to show.”

“I think we both have a really great attention to detail,” Sarah added. “We talk to each other every day about everything, so our record keeping is precise and we have good control over everything that goes into the system.”

Growing up on her family’s Marula Park Stud located just a few miles from what is now Norevale, Sarah learned the ins and outs of running a successful commercial operation from trailing her parents, Tony and Susan Holmes, around the fall breeding stock sales each year. After graduating from nearby Transylvania University, she traveled around the racing globe to complete the Irish National Stud and Godolphin Flying Start programs. Returning to the States, Sarah worked at Bluewater Sales, Hunter Valley Farm and Lane’s End.

While serving as the sales coordinator at Hunter Valley, she met Leo Dooley.

Leo was not from a racing family, but growing up in Kilkenny, Ireland, he caught the bug early and worked for top trainer Jim Bolger as a teenager. He attended University College Dublin while also squeezing in time working at Ballylinch Stud and finding other racing-related jobs across Europe.

“I would take time off college to go and work the sales at Tattersalls and Goffs,” he admitted. “The professors weren’t very happy about that, but I learned more there than I might have in the classroom.”

Before graduation, Leo made the journey overseas for a four-month internship with Gerry Dilger. The short time there was so impactful that after obtaining his degree, he came back to the States to work as the broodmare manager at Hunter Valley where he “met his lovely wife.” After four years there, he moved on to a similar position at Indian Creek Farm.

Before the duo ever became a couple, they both knew individually that their end goal would be to someday run their own operation.

“As a couple, that kind of became more realistic and was simmering in the back of our minds for a while down the road,” Sarah said. “Leo is great in terms of the hands-on aspect and I have experience in sales and the admin side of things. I think we both knew that we would work well together and so that gave us confidence to jump when this piece of land came up.”

Initially, the timing seemed a bit premature in their minds, but they took the leap anyways. Now just a few months in, their fast start is a strong indication that they made the right decision.

“We could not have done any of this without the support we’ve gotten from family, friends and clients,” Sarah said. “The support we’ve gotten has been huge. It’s hard sometimes, but it’s a labor of love.”

Sarah continued, “We’ve been so incredibly busy, but every day we look at each other and we’re like, ‘Alright, we’re doing this. We survived another day.’ One hundred percent, we both know we’re doing the right thing.”

To add one last variable into the equation, a three-month-old daughter keeps them on their toes, just in case they might have had a moment of spare time otherwise.

“Maevie was born in December right before foaling season,” Sarah said. “She’s a huge delight. Leo is going to have a pitchfork in her hands before she can walk.”

“There was a while there where we thought we would have to use her on the farm,” Leo added.

When asked if they ever had any hesitations in taking on a business where they would be working together twenty-four seven, Leo replied, “We did think about that when we started, but it has actually worked out pretty well because I’m spending hours every day on the farm. I’m lucky if I get home for lunch.”

“I think we knew we would work well together from our time at Hunter Valley,” Sarah added. “We complement each other well, we stay out of each other’s way and we respect what the other person does.”

“It gives me a lot of confidence, having been in the States for six or seven years now and having worked for three different farms, that I was able to pull bits and pieces from every operation,” Leo continued. “From Dromoland to Hunter Valley to Indian Creek, I was able to pick what I thought would fit best, from reproductive specialists to podiatrists, so it’s nice to get all those bits of the puzzle together and hopefully have them all contribute to our ongoing success.”

Few were more integral in molding Leo’s career than Gerry Dilger. The late breeder and Dromoland Farm owner passed on in March of last year, but he still played a roll in the Dooley’s decision to start up Norevale.

“I only worked for Gerry for probably four months, but they were a very impactful four months and probably changed the course of my career,” Leo explained. “I never made a single career decision without consulting Gerry. I do remember, probably three or four years ago, he said something that stuck with me. He said, ‘Yeah, you know in five years, hopefully you’ll be doing your own thing.’ I was very surprised because I didn’t think I would do my own thing for another 10, 15 or 20 years. So ultimately when we made the decision on Norevale, which was of course after Gerry’s passing, I went back to that [conversation] and because I couldn’t ask him, it was nice to know he had backed me all those years ago. It made the decision a lot easier.”

Soon after Norevale opened for business, a second Dilger pupil joined the team. Erin Rogers, also a native of Ireland, had worked with Leo at Ballylinch Stud years ago before traveling abroad to work for Dilger.

“Erin has been a fantastic addition to the team,” Leo said. “It’s been great to sort of carry on Gerry’s legacy a bit here in a way, since we both worked for him.”

Both Erin and Leo spoke on the powerful influence Dilger had on their careers.

“For me, it was really the confidence he gave me,” Erin said. “He threw me in the deep end and told me to go for it. His knowledge and demeanor made him a good mentor. Everybody just loved him for being him. I never heard anybody say one thing bad about him and it didn’t matter who you were, if you were a big owner or someone just starting out, he treated everyone the exact same, which said a lot about his character.”

“He had a huge impact on my life for sure, and on countless others across the globe,” Leo echoed. “He wanted the best for everybody. I’ll bet he spent so much of his time thinking about all of his pupils and what they were doing. He just genuinely cared about what was best for people.”

Last fall, an unplaced Bodemeister mare named Bodella was offered in the final days of the Keeneland November Sale as the last of Dilger’s mares to go through a sales ring. When she failed to meet her reserve, her consignor Pat Costello called up the Dooleys to see if they might be interested.

“She didn’t cost much and she was in foal to **Mo Town**, so we said sure, mostly for sentimental reasons,” Sarah recalled. “Leo brought her back to the farm and on his way back, he called Erin and told her we had a surprise for her in the back of the trailer.”

When Erin found the mare waiting to unload, she recognized her instantly from her years spent at Dromoland. The Dooleys offered Erin a partial ownership in Bodella and Erin jumped at the chance.

“It’s cool for us to all own a mare together and Erin just loves her,” Sarah said. “She absolutely adores all the horses, but Bodella is the favorite for sure.”

Bodella foaled her **Mo Town** filly in February this year and has since been bred back to **Volatile**.

“There was a rainbow one day and Bodella and a couple of mares were in a back field here, and the rainbow ended on top of Bodella,” Sarah recalled. “We were all like, ‘Yeah, that’s Gerry.’ So hopefully he’s looking out for us and we’ll have a bit of luck with her.”

While both Leo and Sarah acknowledge that luck may have helped all the pieces fall into place when Norevale first got started, they now attribute the farm’s ongoing success solely to the support they’ve received from their clients.

“We’re very thankful for all the support we’ve gotten,” Leo said. “We’ve got some great clients here and we’re excited to grow with them as we continue to develop the program we have here at Norevale.”

“We’re always telling each other that there’s no resting on laurels,” Sarah said. “We know we’ve got to keep putting in the groundwork, but we couldn’t imagine doing anything else, even on the hard days. I’ve asked Leo a few times on really busy days, ‘So, are you glad we’re doing this?’ And he’s like, ‘Oh yes, one hundred percent.’ And I feel the same way. So we know we’re doing the right thing and we couldn’t be happier.”

## ROSARIO FINED FOR MISJUDGING FINISH IN NOSE LOSS ON STAKES FAVE

Jockey Joel Rosario, who leads North America with 20 stakes wins this year, was fined \$200 for misjudging the finish wire aboard a 9-5 favorite who lost an Apr. 10 stakes race by a nose at Oaklawn Park.

Rosario piloted **Rushie** (Liam’s Map) in the \$400,000 Oaklawn Mile S., but apparently forgot races at that distance at the track end at the sixteenth pole and not the traditional finish line.

Rushie had seized the lead off the turn and was getting reeled in by a fast-closing **By My Standards** (**Goldencents**) as the sixteenth-pole finish loomed.

By My Standards seemed to have the winning momentum regardless of where Rosario thought the wire was, but the head-on replay reveals that Rosario was still driving Rushie while Gabriel Saez rose in the saddle aboard By My Standards.

The two jockeys appeared to speak while galloping out on the far turn, with Saez reaching out left-handed to give Rosario a seemingly friendly post-race tap on the right shoulder.

The official Equibase chart notes that Rosario “continued riding well past the finish wire.”

The ruling was issued Sunday by the Oaklawn stewards.

## AIKEN EQUINE RESCUE REBUILDING AFTER FIRE

A fundraising effort has been launched to help Aiken Equine Rescue, where a barn was destroyed by an Apr. 3 fire.

There were no Thoroughbred retirees in the barn at the time. A pony was rescued and is currently undergoing treatment for thermal burns, reports farm manager Caroline Mulstay.

“We were very, very lucky,” Mulstay said. “There was only the one pony in the barn and we were able to get him out. All of our horses at the farm live out in paddocks and pastures. The only reason we would keep horses in the barn is if there is a medical reason. We were very lucky everybody was healthy and able to live out in paddocks and pastures. A week before the fire, we had a full barn.”

Mulstay said the rescue did have insurance, but their policy will fall short of covering the losses, which, she said included about \$200,000 in supplies and equipment. She said investigators have yet to come up with what caused the barn to go up in flames. Aiken Equine Rescue cares for about 40 Thoroughbred retirees.



But we now know Essential Quality has both a relentless, high-pressure cruising gear and enough extra torque in deep stretch to determinedly seal the deal. But given the arduous nature of that Keeneland effort--for both Essential Quality and Highly Motivated (*Into Mischief*)--it's also within reason to ask whether it was almost too taxing a race four weeks out from the Derby (and within the context of both colts only getting two pre-Derby starts at age three). However, should either one (or both) end up thriving off of such a demanding performance to springboard forward in terms of development and confidence, the rest of the division is in serious trouble. This is an aggressive, athletic gray who meshes well with rider Luis Saez to make his own breaks happen within races, and his overall body of work firmly entrenches him as the horse to beat (although maybe not to bet at underlaid odds) in Louisville.

In recent seasons, trainer Todd Pletcher has generally not been flooded with early-winter Top 12 candidates. But come April every year, he reliably has several Derby threats primed to pounce. Known Agenda is the best of this year's group for Pletcher, and he told the *TDN Writers' Room* last week that this \$135,000 RNA at FTSAUG surprised by running well first time out when finishing second sprinting at Saratoga. Known Agenda then ran to his distance-centric pedigree by beating well-regarded Greatest Honour (*Tapit*) going nine furlongs in start number two (with the rest of the field 21 lengths behind). Yet this colt was green and left himself too much work to do in both the *GII Remsen S.* at Aqueduct and the *GIII Sam F. Davis S.* at Tampa. Blinkers helped to focus him for a breakout allowance romp and then a sharp, rail-running victory in the *GI Florida Derby* (94 Beyer Speed Figure).

"A lot of it's just physical maturity, mental maturity," Pletcher said. "He's a *Curlin*. He's bred to be better a little later."

Flavien Prat will ride Hot Rod Charlie in the Derby, and the standings-topping Santa Anita rider is picking up a live, versatile mount who has impressed with steady advancement ever since he ran a close second at 94-1 odds behind Essential Quality in the *GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile*. Even though this two-time Fasig-Tipton sales grad (\$17,000 FTKFEB; \$110,000 FTKOCT) is a half-brother to 2019 sprint champ *Mitole*, trainer Doug O'Neill was on record as far back as last autumn saying Hot Rod Charlie has the makings of a two-turn horse. This Oxbow colt most recently scored on the front end in the *GII Louisiana Derby*, but he's a fairly relaxed goer who doesn't appear to be a need-the-lead type of speedster. Hot Rod Charlie also got a good deal of schooling out of his Jan. 30 *GIII Robert B. Lewis S.* third, in which he was beaten a neck in a three-way photo after stumbling at the break and bumping in deep stretch, and he is beginning to resonate as a seasoned competitor who can handle varying levels of pace pressure and in-race chaos.

For this \$240,000 KEENOV **Into Mischief** colt to finish second and only a neck behind the undefeated juvenile champ in his first two-turn attempt says a lot for both Highly Motivated and trainer Chad Brown. This colt was two-for-three in progressively better sprints at age two, culminating with an eventual key-race stakes victory on the Breeders' Cup undercard. Brown gave Highly Motivated some extra time after that November win to recover from stiffness; he resurfaced belatedly in the one-turn-mile **GIII Gotham S.**, yet failed to impress with a no-impact third as the favorite. Brown does not usually press horses along on the Derby trail under those circumstances, so it would not have been shocking to see Highly Motivated get rerouted on a different path. But Brown gave him one more chance to prove he belonged in the Blue Grass S., and it was ultra-impressive how he took heat from the top soph in the nation and kept turning back Essential Quality until the final few jumps to the wire (both earned 97 Beyer).

King Fury's lofty placement this high up on the list might seem audacious considering he's parked way out at 28th on the qualifying list. But I had him ranked within the Top 12 way back in December and remain bullish on his chances should multiple defections allow him to enter the Derby. This \$950,000 FTSAUG yearling is a smooth-striding son of **Curlin** who had an ample foundation of two-turn experience at age two (five races at 1 1/16 miles) before making his delayed sophomore debut Saturday, splashing home with a 95-Beyer GIII Stonestreet Lexington S. score. King Fury is two-for-two at Churchill, winning the **Street Sense S.** there last October before wheeling back 12 days later in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile only to get trapped behind a tiring speed horse. The experiment of blinkers and an attempt at setting the pace in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. yielded only a fifth-place effort, but trainer Ken McPeek had this colt finely tuned for an 18-1 upset off the bench in the Lexington. "If he doesn't get in the Derby, he will run in the [GI] Preakness S.," McPeek said. "He seems like a horse that is ready to do all that."

Midnight Bourbon's wire-to-wire win in the GIII Lecomte S. back in January represents his only win this year, yet it wasn't his best effort because he controlled a paceless race and coasted home unopposed. But when this \$525,000 KEESEP colt by Tiznow stretched out to nine furlongs in the GII Risen Star S., it was a deceptively stronger try considering Midnight Bourbon twice led between calls (on the far turn and at the eighth pole), then galloped out longer and stronger than the top two finishers while finishing third, beaten only 1 3/4 lengths.

He tried hard, but was outrun in the Louisiana Derby when chasing the very game Hot Rod Charlie every step of the 1 3/16-mile trip, and you can't quibble with the Beyers this Steve Asmussen trainee has earned as a sophomore (93, 96, 96). Asmussen may be 0-for-21 in the Derby, but two of his four Derby starters who hit the board later ended up getting voted Horse of the Year (**Curlin** and **Gun Runner**).

**7) DYNAMIC ONE (c, 3, Union Rags--Beat the Drums, by Smart Strike)**

This colt might end up as the late-blooming Derby overlay whose potential could exceed long odds over 10 furlongs. Trainer Todd Pletcher told the **TDN Writers' Room** last week he was "a little disappointed" Dynamic One's first three races didn't match the level of ability he displayed in training. But this \$725,000 KEESEP colt had some plausible post-position excuses, and really turned the corner when shipped to Aqueduct for a nine-furlong maiden special weight win followed by a near-miss second in the GII Wood Memorial S. "I think he's still learning how to run, learning how to finish off the race," Pletcher said, adding that Dynamic One "got a little lost by himself" before being collared at the wire by a last-to-first rival. Last week's sidelining of highly ranked Greatest Honour might have incidentally freed up jockey Jose Ortiz for the Derby mount aboard Dynamic One (he had ridden both colts in their recent stakes starts).

If jockey Ricardo Santana Jr.'s instructions for the GI Arkansas Derby were to save ground and make one run at the favored pacemakers, he executed that plan flawlessly. Always in touch behind the dueling duo while stalking in third, this \$70,000 KEESEP colt by **Dialed In** briefly had to switch off the heels of the tiring favorite three-sixteenths from the wire before responding to a rousing stretch ride. His Beyer of 92 translates to a nine-point improvement over his career best. But when you parse the fractions and consider how much Super Stock benefitted from an ideal setup (his winning move was launched into a slow :26.49 fourth-quarter split and there was little resistance from the spent speedsters) the Arkansas Derby doesn't stand out as a particularly overpowering race. On the brighter side, if you look at Super Stock's company lines, he has already beaten two well-regarded '**TDN Rising Stars**' ranked within the current Top 12, and he has run a credible third and second, respectively, behind the Nos. 1 and 5 horses on this list.

**9) ROCK YOUR WORLD (c, Candy Ride {Arg}--Charm the Maker, by Empire Maker)**

If someone told you a few months ago that the winner of the 100-Beyer GI Santa Anita Derby would be a 3-for-3 colt who didn't make his first start until January, would you have guessed correctly that colt wasn't trained by Bob Baffert? Rock Your World, a \$650,000 KEESEP colt by **Candy Ride (Arg)**, is the product of a nice bit of turf-to-dirt conditioning by John Sadler, who now brings an intriguing wild card to Louisville with stout pedigree underpinnings (Empire Maker, Unbridled and Giant's Causeway all in the recent female family). But while the sky is always the proverbial limit with an undefeated colt, I'm skeptical that the Santa Anita Derby is a reliable measuring metric. Rock Your World didn't have to fight for the lead, got pressed chiefly by a 45-1 no-hoper who cracked without resistance, and every successive quarter-mile split that he set on the front end clocked

in slower than the one that preceded it. Rock Your World's triple-digit Beyer represented an 18-point leap from two previous 82 ratings; besting a full field of 20 going 10 furlongs under considerably more strenuous pace pressure will require another tall-task advancement.

One bad race won't totally derail '**TDN Rising Star**' Concert Tour from being an A-list competitor, but his Derby status is in doubt and there was no mistaking the disappointment in trainer Bob Baffert's assessment the day after Concert Tour came up empty in the Arkansas Derby. "We'll see how he works back," Baffert said. "Churchill, I don't like to run there unless they're going to be really live. We'll see how he comes out of this race and see how he trains forward. I didn't really want a hard race out of it, but we still wanted to win. I've won Derbies off of losses. You learn about your horse and see if there is improvement to be made." This **Street Sense** homebred for Gary and Mary West forced the issue as the 3-10 fave at Oaklawn, and although he won the pace battle by the time the field hit the quarter pole, Concert Tour had nothing left to swat away the stretch bid by Super Stock, and he even allowed the front-runner he had already put away to re-rally for second.





**'TDN Rising Star'** Caddo River was hounded until the top of the stretch by 3-10 favorite Concert Tour in the Arkansas Derby, and although this **Hard Spun** homebred for Shortleaf Stable managed to claw back second late in the lane, that re-rally was largely the product of Concert Tour throwing in the towel rather than Caddo River being exceptionally resurgent. Perhaps a return to Churchill Downs--where Caddo River first sparked to life with a 9 1/2-length MSW clock-cleaning last November--will yield a turnaround in time for the first Saturday in May. Caddo River has now been given two top-tier chances to prove he's more than a one-dimensional speed threat, and while he hasn't advanced to that level yet, his first four races showed enough promise that I'm reluctant to abandon him entirely.

**Potentially rounding out the starting gate...**

**13) Mandaloun (Into Mischief):** This **'TDN Rising Star'** bulleted five-eighths in :58.80 (1/28) at Churchill on Saturday as he seeks to shrug off a no-excuse, beaten-fave sixth in the Louisiana

Derby. A Juddmonte homebred, Mandaloun already owns an allowance win over the Kentucky Derby surface (sprinting last autumn) and trainer Brad Cox is banking on the colt being able to rebound to the full potential of his speed-over-stamina pedigree (by **Into Mischief** out of an Empire Maker mare) over 10 furlongs.

**14) Soup and Sandwich (Into Mischief):** There is value-oriented upside in the two-for-three Soup and Sandwich, a Live Oak homebred out of a **Tapit** mare. This Mark Casse-trained gray is a pace presence, and the race that stands out for him was his Florida Derby second, in which he forced the issue and was only one to give Known Agenda a tussle down the stretch despite being on his left lead. "He has a big stride on him and really got over the track well," assistant trainer David Carroll said Sunday after Soup and Sandwich breezed a half mile in :48.80 (8/17) at Churchill.

**15) Helium (Ironicus):** The three-for-three winner of the GII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby shipped from Florida to Louisville last week and on Saturday breezed five-eighths in :59.20 (4/28), besting in-company maiden mate Ghost of the Mambo (**Ghostzapper**) by two fifths of a second before galloping out six furlongs in 1:12 under jockey Julien Leparoux. This \$55,000 FTKOCT colt out of a mare by 1995 Derby winner Thunder Gulch is attempting the Derby off an eight-week break. Only two horses have won the Derby off at least that long a layoff; both were more than 100 years ago.

**16) Bourbonic (Bernardini):** Calumet races its homebreds relatively frequently and it's an outfit with some pricey upsets on the Triple Crown trail over the last decade, like Oxbow's 15-1 Preakness win in 2013, Bravazo's 21-1 Risen Star S. score in 2018, and Everfast's 29-1 near-miss second in the 2019 Preakness. Bourbonic's 72-1 last-to-first thriller in the Wood Memorial tops them all for bombastic odds, but he's a difficult horse to see repeating in the Derby. His final time was the slowest in the history of the Wood, and he won by a bob after closing into pedestrian quarters of :24.88, :25.30, :24.80, :25.78 and a final eighth of :13.73.

**17) Rombauer (Twirling Candy):** The last-to-first winner of the El Camino Real Derby is on the outside looking in, points-wise, but several higher-ranking horses no longer appear to be Derby-bound, so it looks as if he'll make the cut. This Fradkin homebred was not in the same league as Essential Quality and Highly Motivated in the Blue Grass S., yet was still 4 1/2 lengths clear of everyone else when third. Rombauer has won over both turf and Tapeta, but never on dirt. **Cont. p14**

**18) Sainthood (Mshawish)** This 1-for-3 Todd Pletcher trainee led early in the Jeff Ruby Steaks, then conceded the lead and rated from midpack. Sainthood (\$100,000 KEEJAN, \$90,000 KEESEP RNA, \$62,000 OBSOCT) came off the inside for the stretch drive only to get pinballed in heavy traffic, but once clear he was the only one making up ground on the winner, finishing second. Sire **Mshawish** was a globe-trotting, multi-surface victor with a sweet spot between eight and nine furlongs; damsire Lemon Drop Kid won the 1999 GI Belmont S.

**19) Panadol (Flatter):** Only three races on this \$180,000 OBSAPR colt's Meydan resume, which is not so unusual these days for a Derby aspirant. But what is out of the ordinary is that two of them were at 1 3/16 miles, perhaps giving this New York-bred a seasoning edge beyond those limited starts. He has been forwardly placed in all three tries and Panadol's only loss was a second in the UAE Derby when he was run down by open-lengths winner Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) who is bypassing Louisville and waiting for the GI Belmont S. instead.

**20) Like the King (Palace Malice):** This rangy chestnut (\$28,000 KEENOV, \$170,000 OBSOCT) set or forced the pace in four 2-year-old races after starting his career at Belterra Park. He transitioned effectively to stalking, then rating, in two Turfway stakes, and he's moving in the right direction. Yet Like the King was beaten a combined 19 3/4 lengths in his only two dirt tries and is soft in the numbers department, with a career-best Beyer of 86.

## STUDY: ECONOMIC IMPACT OF VIRGINIA RACING INDUSTRY OVER \$542 MILLION

The horse racing and breeding industry in Virginia generated an estimated economic impact of \$542.1 million in the state in 2019, according to a study commissioned by the Virginia Equine Alliance.

“What we’re finding is that jobs are coming back, horse racing related expenditures are up, and tax revenue to the state is increasing,” said John Hannum, Executive Director of the Virginia Equine Alliance. “These are all very positive signs that the racing industry is moving in the right direction and benefiting the Commonwealth’s agribusiness and related businesses. Racing was at a low point in 2014 after the closure of Colonial Downs’ racetrack. The General Assembly took a number of steps, most notably the passage of Historical Horse Racing machines in 2018, that provided the revenue to re-open the track and fund the revitalization of the industry. The study points to the enormous strides the industry has made since 2014.”

Highlights from the study released by the alliance Monday included: annual horse-related expenditures by Virginia horsemen estimated at \$239.44 million in 2019; overall total in state tax revenue for 2019 estimated at \$26.5 million; estimated total economic impact of horse racing events and visitor spending in Virginia was \$68.7 million in 2019; jobs supported in 2019 by the horse racing and breeding industry estimated at more than 5,000; the average amount spent by horsemen in Virginia to care for, train, and board a race horse is estimated at \$14,663.

Chmura Economics and Analytics (Chmura), a research consulting firm in Richmond, VA, conducted the study.

The Virginia Equine Alliance is a a non-profit, 501(c)6 organization comprised of the Virginia Harness Horse Association, Virginia Horsemen’s Benevolent & Protective Association, Virginia Gold Cup Association and Virginia Thoroughbred Association. Its primary mission is to sustain, promote and expand the horse breeding and horse racing industry in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

## T.I.P. CHAMPIONSHIPS RETURN IN OCTOBER

The Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) Championships horse show will return this Oct. 8-10 at Stable View in Aiken, SC, officials at The Jockey Club T.I.P. announced Monday. The 2020 event was a casualty of the COVID-19 pandemic.

A total of \$60,000 will be up for grabs, with awards down to 10th place in 30 divisions spanning hunters, jumpers, dressage, a combined test, Western dressage, English pleasure, and Western pleasure. For the first time, the event will also offer in-hand championships.

Championships; or (5) have participated in the 2020 T.I.P. Performance Awards; or (6) be accepted through a hardship request.
