



STRONG START AS YOSHIDA PLUMPS FOR TATTS TOPPER

NEWMARKET, UK—If the opening session was a mere warm-up for bigger and better things to come on Tuesday, then we are likely to be in for some red-hot trade as the stellar names come rolling out. For Monday's trade was, as we have seen at so many auctions throughout 2021, up across all sectors, with buyers from Japan, France, Britain and Ireland all participating in the day's leading ladies.

We are well used to the spending power of Japanese buyers, particularly various members of the Yoshida family, and it was Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm which signed for the day's top lot, a young mare who perhaps appropriately traces back to the great Best In Show, at 450,000gns.

Gains of 33% and 30% in median and average speak to the consistently high level of demand for breeding stock, and though the clearance rate dropped slightly, it still settled at a respectable 84%, while the aggregate had passed last year's opening day mark by late afternoon. By the end of the 12-hour session it was up by 24%, at 15,281,000gns for 232 horses sold—11 fewer than last year. [Cont. p2](#)

RCA WILL NOT MANDATE COVID PASSES

Covid passports will not be mandated at British courses by the Racecourse Association (RCA), which has no plans to **implement a policy similar to Chelmsford's which requires covid passes**. At Chelmsford City, attendees will be required to show a photo ID and a covid pass to attend meetings for the remainder of the year. Wales requires proof of vaccination status or a negative test if crowds exceed a certain level, and Scotland is set to introduce a similar rule.

A statement from the Racecourse Association was released on Monday and it read, "Further to recent speculation, the RCA can confirm that there are currently no plans to introduce mandatory Covid certification at British racecourses other than in devolved nations where venues are already required to facilitate the initiative when attendances reach a certain limit."

Tattersalls December Mare Sale Day 1

- A strong opener, the day's median and average rose by 33% and 30%, with the turnover up by 24% to 15,289,000gns.
- Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm is the new owner of the day's top lot, a half-sister to champion filly Peeping Fawn and Thewayouare, bought from the Al Shahania Stud Dispersal for 450,000gns.
- John Messara's Arrowfield Stud added to the international flavour of the buyers' list when buying Final Thought (Ire) from Godolphin for 240,000gns through John Warren.
- Daughters of Whitsbury Manor Stud's Showcasing (GB) were in demand, with five sold for 167,400gns.
- The Castlebridge Consignment is the leading vendor after the first of four sessions, selling 21 horses for 2,476,000gns.

Japanese Take Pride in New Export

The Blush With Pride branch of the Best In Show dynasty has grown fresh limbs in the U.S. during 2021. The 1982 Kentucky Oaks winner's celebrated daughter Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister) can now add to her record new credits as respectively second and third dam of two brilliant talents, albeit both

meanwhile held up by injury: GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Greatest Honour (**Tapit**), and GIII Kona Gold S. winner Cezanne (**Curlin**). And another of her daughters, Butterfly Blue (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), is third dam of GIII Dwyer S. winner First Captain (**Curlin**).

On this side of the water, however, it is Butterfly Blue's full sister Maryinsky (Ire) who remains the most conspicuous blossom on the family tree, notably through her champion daughter Peeping Fawn (Daneshill) and her Group 1-winning son Thewayouare (Kingmambo). Coolmore's use of Japanese titan Deep Impact (Jpn) as an outcross mate for Peeping Fawn produced a very smart juvenile in September (Ire), and now Maryinsky's 7-year-old daughter by **Fastnet Rock (Aus)**, **Crimson Rock**, will participate in the Japanese industry's quest for regeneration following the loss of its perennial champion sire. Presented here as **lot 1418** by Newsells Park, in the partial dispersal from Al Shahania Stud, she was sold to Katsumi Yoshida for 450,000gns.

It is instructive of the peculiar fluctuations of bloodstock values that Crimson Rock should have caused the ring to fall silent as the bidding climbed, through competition from the likes of James Wigan of London Thoroughbred Services and Greg Goodman of Mt. Brilliant Farm, to the highest level of the sale to date. **Cont. p3**

For she made even more as a yearling, when knocked down to Spendthrift Farm for \$1,000,000 at the 2015 Keeneland September Sale. One way or another, however, she ended up running in the silks of Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Thani when winning a Newbury maiden on debut for Ralph Becket the following year. Sadly she could not live up to that promise in two starts at three, but she appeared here carrying a third foal (by **Highland Reel {Ire}**) and these remain early days in her second career.

"Of course this mare line is one of the best," said Yoshida's representative here, Shingo Hashimoto. "That was very attractive, and **Fastnet Rock** is going well in Japan. We are always looking for the best blood to refresh our breeding. We haven't yet decided whether or not she'll go straight to Japan, but hopefully she will suit the sons of Deep Impact on the farm."

While his odyssey via the breeding stock sales in the U.S. had gone smoothly to this point, Hashimoto will be facing new isolation rules when he returns home.

The Al Shahania draft resumes on Wednesday, headed by the offering of GI E.P. Taylor S. winner **Blond Me {Ire}** (Tamayuz {GB}) as **lot 1837**. At a very similar stage of her breeding career, she is carrying a foal by Siyouni (Fr).

On a page which featured only two dams, and with almost every name listed being in bold black type, Sun Tide's most illustrious immediate relative is her half-sister Midday (GB) (**Oasis Dream {GB}**). Three other half-siblings have also claimed stakes races, while her dam Midsummer (GB) (Kingmambo), a listed-placed winner herself, is a half-sister to the dual Group 1 winners Reams Of Verse (Nureyev) and Elmaamul (Diesis {GB}).

For a new player in the industry signing up a first broodmare, it would be hard to think of a better way to start than with a mare who offers both owner/breeder and commercial possibilities. The lucky new owner of Sun Tide could not be named by Charlie Vigors, who was the last bidder standing at 400,000gns, but he did confirm that lot 1426 would now be residing at his Hillwood Stud.

"She's been bought for a new English-based client and I think this is their first horse. They want to have a boutique broodmare band and there's no better family to buy into. They might race a filly but she has a nice commercial cover if they do decide to

sell," said Vigors.

"She's a neat, attractive mare so there are plenty of options for where you want to go with her in the future."

Sun Tide had followed another 4-year-old, **Tacitly (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), into the ring and the daughter of the G1 Falmouth S. winner Timepiece (GB) (Zamindar) will be heading to Normandy to join an elite group of mares after Robert Nataf and Henri Bozo went to 375,000gns.

"She's for a partnership between Ecurie des Moneaux and a client of Robert Nataf,"

said Bozo of lot 1425, who is carrying her first foal by **Frankel (GB)**. "Her pedigree speaks for itself and she is in foal to the right stallion." **Cont. p5**

Tacitly's family has been in the news of late as her relation Time Test (GB), who is also by Dubawi and is out of her dam's half-sister Passage Of Time (GB) (Dansili {GB}), is currently in vogue with breeders on the back of a successful season for his first crop of runners.

The first eight of the Juddmonte draft, all in-foal mares, sold for an average of 167,750gns, with 15 fillies to be sold on Tuesday.





Showcasing Mares in Demand

Group 3-placed as a juvenile and finally a winner at the 23rd time of asking, **Model Guest (GB)** (Showcasing {GB}) was certainly a trier in her racing days, with eight runner-up finishes to her name. Covered by **Kingman (GB)** in February, she went through the ring on Monday as **lot 1469** and will continue her secondary career in Ireland, having been bought by Eddie O'Leary for 330,000gns.

"If she produces something like herself we'll be okay," said the Lynn Lodge Stud owner. "She's a beautiful mare and there are some good **Kingman** crops to come through."

Another daughter of Showcasing with a markedly similar profile was also on the shopping list of Gerard Larrieu of Chantilly Bloodstock Agency, who bid 270,000gns for **Endless Joy (GB)**. The 4-year-old (**lot 1464**) won over six furlongs at two and was third in the G3 Firth of Clyde S. on her final start for Clipper Logistics. She was sent to Darley newcomer Blue Point (Ire) for her first cover in February. **Cont. p6**

Like so many from her breeders Whitsbury Manor Stud and Margaret Slade, Endless Joy hails from a fast family which includes her half-brother, the hardy listed winner and Group 3 runner-up Laugh A Minute (GB) (Mayson {GB}), while the further family features one of this season's leading sprinters in the July Cup and Commonwealth Cup runner-up Dragon Symbol (GB) (Dragon Pulse {Ire}).

Hillen Has Last Word on Statement

It was a long wait, but Stephen Hillen was "very excited" to have landed one of the final lots into the ring—the standout in a tail-end session reserved for horses in training—as a rather different project from most that had preceded her through the preceding 11 and a half hours.

Statement (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) touched an official rating of 106 for Martyn Meade, having run none other than Alcohol Free (Ire) (**No Nay Never**) to a photo in the G3 Fred Darling S. before trying her luck in the G1 1000 Guineas. Her form has somewhat tapered off since, despite a group placing at Epsom, but she still has miles on the clock and Hillen hopes that she can renew her progress in the silks of his wife Becky.

He duly gave 300,000gns for **lot 1568**, in the process rewarding the perseverance of this filly's breeders at Ballylinch Stud. Offered at the Orby Sale as a yearling, she was knocked down for 100,000gns but ended up running in the silks of her home farm.

"I loved her run at Newbury, beaten a short head by Andrew Balding's filly that went on to win two Group 1s," Hillen said. "It's all about her form, hopefully she can come back to something like that. I don't where she will be trained, but it will be in the U.K."

As and when Statement does move onto the kind of career that drives the rest of this sale, she will be supported by multiple stakes placings in both her first two dams. "Lawman looks like a tremendous broodmare sire, too," Hillen noted. "And this filly is from a brilliant nursery in Ballylinch."

Newsells Invest in French Blood

Rarity value counts for plenty but it was far from the only reason that Jill Lamb singled out the only mare in the catalogue in foal to the Aga Khan Studs' rising young stallion **Zarak** (Fr). Of course the son of Dubawi (Ire) and Zarkava (Fr) owns a wonderful pedigree, but then the stakes-placed mare **Nooramunga** (Fr) has plenty to recommend her too, being by another Aga Khan resident, Siyouni (Fr), and out of the G2 Prix d'Astarté winner Turtle Bow (Fr) (Turtle Island {Ire}), herself a half-sister to the late Group 1 winner and stallion Turtle Bowl (Ire) (Dyhim Diamond {Ire}). **Cont. p7**

The 5-year-old won over a mile in France as well as being listed-placed for her breeder Berend van Dalfsen, who also bred Nooramunga's dam and granddam.

After signing for **lot 1387** at 270,000gns, Lamb said, "She's been bought for Newsells Park Stud. She's a lovely mare and she's in foal to a very exciting young stallion. There's a lot of quality to her and she's a black-type Siyouni mare which has got to be an exciting thing to have."

She added of **Zarak**, "He looks very like Time Test to me, a beautiful horse."

Newsells Park Stud, which was bought earlier this year by Graham Smith-Bernal, will also be acting in the role of vendor this week, with 19 of their own and clients' mares to sell. They include one of the likely stars of the show, **Waldlied (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), the Group 2-winning three-parts-sister to Arc

winner **Waldgeist (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) who sells on Tuesday as **lot 1839**.

"We are selling a few so we will be looking to replace them and we wanted to get one under the belt today," Lamb said. "A lot depends on what happens tomorrow but [Waldlied] sells quite late so Graham said we had to be brave before she goes through."

"It is a beautiful pedigree," she said. "It's mostly colts so far but we hope those fillies can do something too. She's on an early cover, which is a positive, but we need to discuss future covering plans with our client."

'SAFETY NET' WELFARE PROPOSAL DRAWS PRAISE

The establishment of a safety net for at-risk thoroughbreds has been highlighted by leading industry figures as one of the most important recommendations of a **key thoroughbred welfare report**, which also received Federal Government support on Monday.

An industry-commissioned report, *The Most Important Participant - A Framework for Thoroughbred Welfare* - was compiled by a four-person independent panel, the Thoroughbred Aftercare Welfare Working Group (TAWWG). It was published on Sunday, making 46 recommendations for reform to be made to improve outcomes for thoroughbred welfare.

The onus for implementing the recommendation now falls across both government and the thoroughbred industry, with the need for reforms falling into seven broad areas.

The report received significant Federal Government backing on Monday with Agriculture Minister David Littleproud expressing his desire to act on key recommendations around national standards and traceability and imploring the states to do the same.

"There is a role for governments--I encourage the states and territories to expediate work with the Federal Government in the development of national animal welfare standards for all horses," he said in a statement.

"I applaud the thoroughbred racing industry for its work in reviewing horse welfare and want to let them know of the Federal Government's commitment to taking their concerns seriously."

The Federal Government recently put forward \$1.1 million in funding to establish a national traceability register and has asked the states and territories to contribute as well.

The Safety Net

One of the seven areas identified in the report, which also forms recommendation 34, was the need for the establishment of a **national safety net**, to support horses at risk of a poor welfare outcome after leaving racing and breeding.

Such a safety net would allow the industry to help those horses that have left the industry and where intervention is needed to secure their welfare.

"TAWWG's recommendation is the establishment of a national safety net, including a hotline, to provide all thoroughbred horses with such an opportunity," the report said.

"Thoroughbreds at genuine risk could be referred to this scheme. A similar scheme has successfully transitioned hundreds of former racehorses in the UK in recent years.

"This program would enable the industry to help horses that might otherwise suffer mistreatment. It would also send a powerful message to the broader community: the thoroughbred industry is committed to welfare and to providing every vulnerable horse with an opportunity at a second career."

The solution would be implemented only for thoroughbreds classified at risk, not those who are simply at the end of their racing or breeding careers.

Strong Support for Reform

It's a recommendation which has been met with plenty of support, especially from breeders, who are keen to see a whole-of-life approach undertaken.

Peter O'Brien, General Manager of Segenhoe Stud, sees the improvement of equine welfare outcomes as the most pressing priority for the entire industry.

"It is the most crucial issue bar none. It has been for a while. Unless we get on top of this as an industry, everybody united as one, we are going to fall backwards," he told *TDN AusNZ*. "In terms of the optics to those outside the industry, we need to be seen to take control of this issue and manage it and make sure every horse has a safety net for the rest of its life."

The report said that even if a thoroughbred is mistreated long after it has exited the industry, 'the public will, rightly or wrongly, hold the industry accountable at some level'.

"This was confirmed in the public insights research conducted to support this report, in which the majority of respondents' opinions could be summed up as, 'once a racehorse, always a racehorse'," the report said.

O'Brien said the only way to address this issue was to ensure there was accountability for these horses right across the industry.

"I don't think there can be enough accountability. It's always a difficult thing if you sell a yearling and the responsibility passes through to different people over its lifetime, but the word 'safety net' is a perfect word for it, because every horse should have one," he said.

"By implementing the recommendations, it will improve the management and the welfare of these horses in Australia."

Mills Hoping for Progress

Leading bloodstock agent Sheamus Mills provided a submission to TAWWG for this report and has been a long-term advocate of a more co-ordinated focus on equine welfare.

"I had a meeting with Racing Victoria many years ago, and I said to them that welfare would have the ability to end our sport within 25 years if not well dealt with and I was pretty much laughed out of the room," he said.

"I have been an advocate ever since then, and thankfully the industry now strongly realises the position it must take and maybe now that we have come to some concrete ideas, we can make some major progress."

Mills is also a major advocate of the thoroughbred industry taking an active role in managing the welfare of horses from foaling right through to death, and believes the safety net is a

crucial part of that.

"It's naïve to think we can outsource this stuff," he said. "I think the asteroid is coming and we are all kidding ourselves if we think it is someone else's job. It has to be the thoroughbred industry's job."

The report examined schemes across the world including the RESET scheme being used in Victoria and the ROR program in the United Kingdom, for a suitable model.

The program in the UK saw 213 horses accepted into the ROR scheme in 2018 and 2019. Australia has a larger thoroughbred population (approx. 34,000 compared to 23,000), and the report estimated that around 150 horses a year would enter into a 'safety net program' should a similar system be set-up in Australia.

Who Pays?

It is suggested a scheme in Australia can be co-ordinated through a newly established body Thoroughbred Welfare Australia (TWA), which the report proposes can be funded through a small levy of various aspects of the industry, including breeding and ownership.

"As well as being a boon for welfare, the adoption of a safety net scheme would send a powerful message to the broader community: the thoroughbred industry is committed to welfare and to giving every vulnerable horse an opportunity to be rehomed," the report said.

"Furthermore, the relative simplicity of the concept would allow for it to be communicated efficiently to thoroughbred participants, the broader equine community and the public, greatly increasing the chances of it becoming a successful measure to prevent mistreatment."

Mills has long campaigned for a levy on those who profit from the industry to help ensure thoroughbreds don't end up with poor welfare outcomes.

Both Mills and O'Brien echoed the call from Godolphin Australia's Managing Director Vin Cox, that state-based rivalries must be put aside to resolve the welfare challenge and implement recommendations of this report.

"Obviously, a national approach has to happen for it to be effective. Getting all the states together on a collaborative approach is the only way it can really work," O'Brien said.

"If we don't do that, we could have severe ramifications."

KNICKS GO SET TO JOIN GROWING TAYLOR MADE ROSTER

Following his emphatic triumph in the 2021 GI Breeders' Classic, champion **Knick's Go** (Paynter –Kosmo's Buddy, by Outflanker) enjoyed a brief interlude from training as he spent about a week at Taylor Made Farm, where he will soon begin his stud career, before he returned to the Brad Cox barn at Churchill Downs.

The colorbearer for the Korea Racing Authority cemented his status as the top older dirt male in the country with his gate-to-wire Classic victory. Now, the favorite for Horse of the Year honors is preparing for one last dance to defend his title in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. before he takes up stud duty in 2022.

Meanwhile, the team at Taylor Made is counting the days until they can welcome the famed grey back to their stallion facility.

"We are fired up about Knicks Go," Duncan Taylor said. "He's the epitome of a racehorse. When you have a horse that wins the Breeders' Futurity at two, comes back and wins the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and then the next year wins the Breeders' Cup Classic, it doesn't get any better than that."

Knick's Go was able to get an early taste of his future career during his short stay at Taylor Made as a steady stream of breeders dropped in to visit the new stallion. **Cont. p3**

REPORT: CORNICHE TO FRESHEN AT WINSTAR BEFORE RETURNING TO BAFFERT

Presumptive 2-year-old champion male and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero **Corniche** (Quality Road) will be freshened briefly at WinStar Farm in Kentucky this winter before returning to Bob Baffert's barn, according to a report in *Daily Racing Form*. Marette Farrell, who purchased the \$1.5-million colt for Speedway Stable, said Corniche was sent to Kentucky last Wednesday.

"It's time to give him a little bit of a break," Farrell told *DRF*. "Speedway likes to use WinStar for lay-ups. He can be turned out, graduate to a paddock, and they have a track, too. It's important to get a break mentally. A change of scenery is good for all of us."

The ongoing subplot regarding Corniche and Baffert's other potential GI Kentucky Derby contenders is what the respective ownerships will do with their horses as the Derby, now a little over five months away, inches closer on the calendar. Baffert was suspended for two years from running horses at Churchill Downs after his Medina Spirit (Protonico) tested positive for an overage of betamethasone in this year's Derby.

If that suspension holds, it would likely prompt owners to move their horses from Baffert in time to run in the May 7 Derby. But for now, Peter Fluor and KC Weiner's Speedway is staying loyal to Baffert, as Farrell said the plan is to return Corniche to Baffert's barn at Santa Anita after his freshening.

"Peter wants to be loyal," she said. "Corniche won the Breeders' Cup, and he's a possible 2-year-old champion. No decisions have been made--there hasn't even been any talk about another trainer, or who he'd go to if he needs to go to another trainer. If the time comes that a decision needs to be made, if it needs to be that way, we'll put our heads together and make a decision."

“I think his conformation is definitely a plus,” Taylor said. “He reminds me a lot of Blushing Groom and Awesome Again. They’re not overly big horses, but they’re very well-balanced and have plenty of hip. I think those types of stallions cross well with a lot of different mares. He’s very correct and he’s one of those horses that have that look in their eye.”

The Taylor family is familiar with their new addition’s sireline through their involvement with now-pensioned stallion Tiznow, whose female family is also responsible for Grade I-producing sires **Paynter**, Oxbow and Awesome Patriot.

“If you look at this year’s Breeders’ Cup, you have [Filly & Mare Sprint second choice] Bella Sofia, who is by Awesome Patriot, [Classic fourth-place finisher] Hot Rod Charlie by Oxbow and Knicks Go by **Paynter**,” Taylor explained. “So this sireline can get you a runner. We had Tiznow and everybody thought, ‘A son of Cee’s Tizzy. Why do you want him?’ But he turned out to be a great stallion for us.”

Bred in Maryland by Angie Moore and daughter **Sabrina Moore**, Knicks Go is out of the stakes-winning mare Kosmo’s Buddy (Outflanker). A debut winner at two, the colt went on to win the GI Claiborne Breeders’ Futurity and was runner-up in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile.

“Sometimes when horses race until they’re five, you sort of forget about their 2-year-old career,” Taylor joked. “But the fact that he won a Grade I at two says everything. Everybody’s looking for that.” **Cont. p4**

At three, Knicks Go failed to make it to the winner's circle and was transferred to the Brad Cox barn for his 4-year-old season. He was undefeated in three starts that year by over 20 lengths combined, with his season culminating in a record-breaking performance in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

This year, Knicks Go was five-for-seven against graded company, accumulating Grade I wins in the Pegasus World Cup Invitational S., Whitney S. and the Breeders' Cup Classic, where he defeated a pair of leading sophomores in GI Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit (Protonico) and GI Belmont S. winner Essential Quality (**Tapit**).

"Knicks Go's best quality as a racehorse is speed," Taylor said. "I remember Mr. [John] Gaines used to say that we're trying to breed the horse that has the most speed, that is the best looking and that can carry the speed the farthest. That's the kind of horse everybody is looking for. Not only can Knicks Go run fast, but he can carry the speed. Setting the track record in the Dirt Mile, that was quite an accomplishment that shows he has the speed. Then to go under two minutes for a mile and a quarter [in the Classic], that takes a special horse. Those two achievements set him apart from other racehorses."

Taylor said that their team first started speaking with the Korea Racing Authority regarding their superstar's stud career as the colt was training for the Whitney this summer.

"We knew they weren't wanting to sell part of the horse and they knew we do good marketing and work hard," he explained. "When we started doing our research, we found that he was a perfect fit for us so we went for it."

“For us, it’s hard to go out and buy a horse like this,” Taylor said. “We have to have some breaks in getting our stallions. You haven’t ever seen us standing 20 or 25 stallions because we don’t have the financial power to do that. But we do have the hustle and we do a good job with our stallions. We’re aggressive and we’re always trying new things.”

At a farm once home to the likes of heralded Unbridled’s Song, as well as Saint Ballado and Forestry, Taylor Made’s stallion program has welcomed several promising new additions in recent years.

“When you run a stallion operation, horses help each other,” Taylor noted. “Now we have **Not This Time**, who has shown that we have a proven stallion on the rise, and then with **Instagrand**, **Instilled Regard**, **Mshawish** and **Midnight Storm**, we have new blood at Taylor Made. So we have faith and we think Knicks Go is going to be a good one.”

Jay Privman of *Daily Racing Form* first broke the news Monday. *TDN* left a phone message for Velazquez seeking comment, but it did not yield a return call prior to deadline for this story.

The four-time GI Kentucky Derby-winner and co-chairman of the Jockeys’ Guild made his decision public Nov. 29 via his agent, Ron Anderson.

Velazquez has increasingly flown in from his East Coast base to ride stakes horses for trainer Bob Baffert in recent years. He rode at Del Mar over Thanksgiving weekend, winning twice from 10 mounts. Six of those rides were for trainer Richard Baltas; two were on Doug O’Neill trainees.

TRAINER MORRIS NICKS DIES AT 74

Morris G. Nicks, who trained for parts of six decades, primarily in Arkansas, Louisiana and Kentucky, died Nov. 25 at his home in Waskom, Texas. He had been fighting cancer and was 74 years old.

His passing was confirmed by his wife Ellen in a *Daily Racing Form* story that broke the news Sunday. His son, the trainer Ralph Nicks, told *DRF* that his father had requested no funeral services to be held. According to *DRF*, Nicks grew up on a farm in Texas and galloped horses and rode in match races before spending a summer at age 17 working at Ruidoso Downs. He began training shortly thereafter, around 1965, at Oaklawn Park.

According to Equibase, Nicks won graded stakes with the sprinter Run Johnny in the 1999 GIII Aristides H. at Churchill Downs and with Golden Sonata in the 2004 GII Oaklawn Breeders' Cup S. at Oaklawn Park.

Nicks won the 2011 Louisiana Downs training title. He had retired from running a stable in 2018, citing health issues.



FORMER HOF PRESIDENT VON STADE DIES

John T. Von Stade, the longest serving president of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame from 1989-2005, passed away Nov. 25 at his home in Lutherville, Maryland. He was 83 years of age.

Born June 28, 1938, in Old Westbury, New York, von Stade graduated from St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire, and Harvard University, pursuing a passion for music while participating in and managing the choir at St. Paul's and the glee club at Harvard. After attending the Aspen School of Music and a stint in the Army Reserves, von Stade spent some time in the world of banking before opening the Essex Gallery of Sport in Far Hills, New Jersey.

Von Stade's father was a founder of the National Museum of Racing in 1950, president of the National Steeplechase Association and the final president of the Saratoga Association, which owned and operated Saratoga Race Course. In his youth, John von Stade drove a tractor at the track. **Cont. p10**

For a half-century, von Stade served as co-chair at Far Hills, helping to grow an event that early on attracted a few thousand spectators to the country's richest day of steeplechasing.

After serving more than a decade as a trustee of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame, von Stade was elected as its president in 1989, succeeding Whitney Tower.

During his tenure, von Stade oversaw an \$18-million project that modernized the institution and increased the size of the facility to better than 45,000 square feet. In 1995, von Stade was the recipient of the F. Ambrose Clark Award, the highest honor in steeplechasing, given periodically to an individual who has done the most to promote, improve and encourage the growth and welfare of American steeplechasing.

Von Stade is survived by his wife, the former Phyllis Kaltenbach DuVal; his son, John von Stade Jr. and daughter-in-law Ann von Stade; Phyllis's daughters and son-in-law Anna DuVal, Olivia Duval and Joseph Cutrone; and six grandchildren. He was also the uncle to many nephews and nieces, including the opera singer Frederica von Stade.

Services will be held Sunday, Dec. 19 at 2 p.m. at St. Thomas' Episcopal Church in Owings Mills, Maryland.
