Here's a conundrum for you. When does your outstanding yearling become merely one that stands out?

It's something the Keeneland sales team find themselves asking a great deal right now, out on the farms, during the annual process of sieving entries into the right tier of the world's biggest yearling catalog.

Time after time, they run into the same, nearly superstitious nervousness among some consignors about September Book 1. The action is too tight at the top end. Let this guy be a big fish in a smaller pond.

Well, that kind of talk is hardly unfamiliar to Tony Lacy and Cormac Breathnach, respectively Vice President of Sales and Director of Sales Operations, in that both took up their appointments last year from positions with leading consignors. On being invited to the other side of the dais, however, Breathnach decided to test perceptions against the data. He did so with an open mind. If there turned out to be genuine vulnerabilities, whether in the format of the sale or a horse's position within it, then Keeneland would do something about it. But where he found misapprehensions, equally, then those would be clarified.

"We wanted to look at the sale and its performance as objectively as possible," Breathnach emphasizes. "To look at facts, not preconceptions." **Cont. p3**

MET MILE BELONGS ON MEMORIAL DAY

The Week in Review, by Bill Finley

A New York racing tradition began in 1971, the first time that Memorial Day was officially celebrated each year on the last Monday in May. A crowd of 61,147 showed up that Monday at Belmont Park to watch Tunex win the \$121,600 Metropolitan Mile for trainer Allen Jerkens and owner Hobeau Farm. For the next 42 years, New York racing fans circled Memorial Day on their calendars, knowing that it would be one of the biggest days of the year, thanks to the GI Metropolitan H.

In 1976 and 1977, they saw the mighty Forego win the race. In 1982, the 3-year-old Conquistador Cielo won by 7 1/4 lengths, five days before he would return to win the GI Belmont S. In 1990, Criminal Type beat Easy Goer and Housebuster. In 1994, Holy Bull won the Met, rebounding from his lackluster performance in the GI Kentucky Derby. **Ghostzapper** won in 2005. The winner in 2010 was **Quality Road**. **Cont. p6**

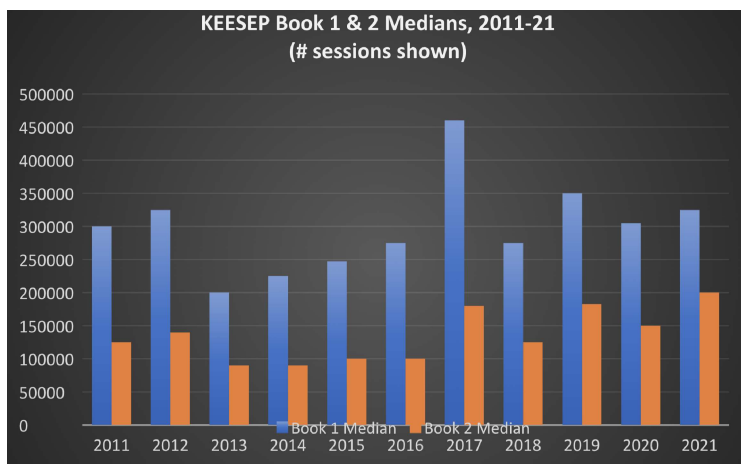
The Premier Book in Every Way *(cont. from p1)*

Breathnach continued, "We know how strongly some assumptions have been propagated over the years and we need some objective analysis. Our goal is to identify where any weak spots might truly be in the sale, and how to combat those: whether by altering start times, or the numbers in a particular session, or marketing focus, anything that Keeneland might do to help offset any dead spots."

But the headline discovery is unmistakable. There should be no cold feet about Book 1. Just best foot forward. In fact, wilfully seeking relegation to Book 2 can be downright counter-productive.

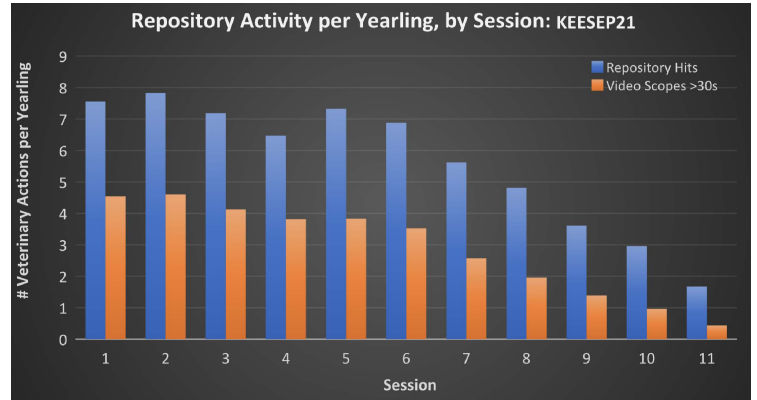
On joining Keeneland a year ago, Breathnach first ran the basic numbers on the relative performance of Books 1 and 2 over the previous decade. In that time, of course, there had been all manner of format changes--with Book 1 variously allocated one, two, three and four sessions; and Book 2 either two or three--and evidently most people now agree that it is time for some consistency. Remarkably, however, Breathnach found that the Book 1 brand had crushed Book 2 every single year, regardless of how the elite stock had been spread.

"Through all those different formats, the average from Book 1 into Book 2 dropped every year between 51 and 60%, from 2011 to 2020," Breathnach says. "And the median fell between 48 and 64% in those years. (It was 37% in 2021). Honestly, that shocked me--and some of the agents I shared the figures with couldn't believe it either. I really did think that there were going to be years when Book 2 at least came close. Even the blended RNA rate was lower in Book 1. Over those 10 years, it came in at 24% for Book 1 and 25% for Book 2. Book 1 is where the money is."



Having established the power of the Book 1 brand, Breathnach set out on a deep dive through his first September Sale at Keeneland. What could be learned by comparisons made Book to Book, session to session, and even within sessions?

The real revelation came in the modelling of buyer activity, which Breathnach measured by the number of radiograph views (blue in the table below) and the number of videoscope views exceeding 30 seconds (orange). This is a most interesting and instructive graph, showing that purposeful prospecting is nowhere higher than across both sessions of Book 1.



"The repository data show convincingly that a large volume of buyers are here, and, more importantly, are active in Book 1," suggests Breathnach. "Some sellers tend to feel that a higher RNA rate might suggest otherwise, even though the RNA rates in Books 1 and 2 over the preceding 10 years are virtually identical. But buyers are not in the habit of vetting horses without intent. This shows that they're here, and they're here to buy from the beginning."

While some vendors are convinced of greater purchasing depth in Book 2, Breathnach argues that some bumper transactions in the opening Book would never be made about the same horse in the next one. Several important principals, if they have come at all, tend to have left town by Book 2. He points to recent Book 1 purchases for \$1 million and \$800,000 that were made simply because those principals were on the spot for Book 1 only.

Breathnach urges sellers (and buyers) to grasp how the complexion of Book 1 is changing: "If you compare Book 1 from September 2019 and 2021 side-by-side--skipping 2020, when international travel was so restricted--buyers who contributed close to \$60 million worth of purchases from 2019's Book 1 did not participate in 2021, for various reasons."

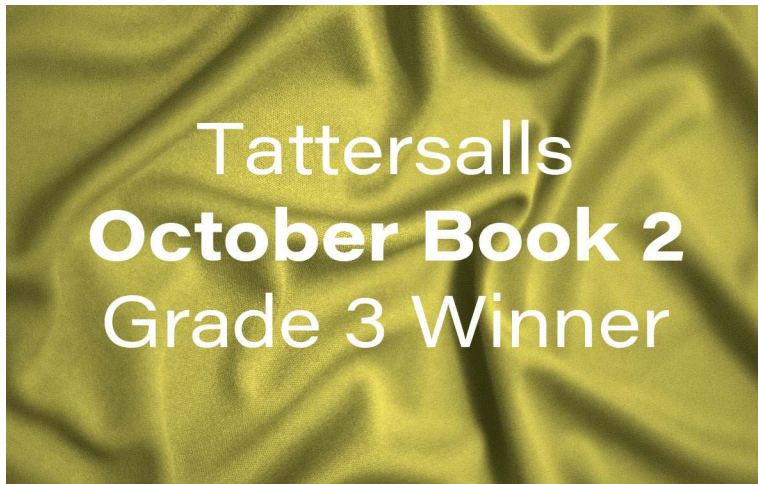
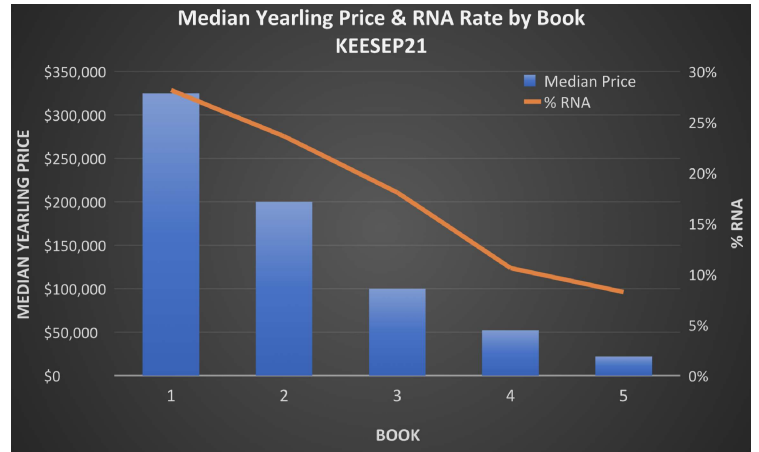
But that deficit was backfilled extremely well, primarily by domestic racing stables: people like Vinnie Viola and Mike Repole, and new entities like the BSW/Crow Colts Group, among others.

"With more exposure for the sport of horse racing and the improved purses, it was refreshing to see domestic end-users so active from the very beginning of the sale. Many vendors sold horses very effectively in the \$400,000-\$750,000 range for example. Of the first 15 horses through the ring last September, 12 sold, to 11 different domestic buyers."

This feels huge, in the perennial debate with nervous vendors. Breathnach believes that some people may set too high a bar when considering their stock for Book 1: that every yearling entrant has to be 'perfect.'

"What we are looking to sell in Book 1 is as many good physicals as possible," he says. "Pedigree and sire power are important too, to a degree, but athletes are what the buyers are looking for in Book 1, and that's what they are going to pay for. They can't all be by the same six-to-eight sires because we have a deep international buying bench, as the repository data shows. If the median is \$325,000, like in 2021, and you've got a \$400,000 horse, Book 1 is where your market is. You're an outlier anywhere else."

In terms of Book-to-Book trends, Breathnach focused on medians and RNA rates as the most reliable gauge of sale performance. As this next table shows, the median conformed pretty neatly to the status of each Book. The RNA line (orange in the table) also descended as the sale moved forward, but that's pretty much as you would expect given the high production costs of elite yearlings, whose breeders are often equivocal about selling at all. (Moreover at an auction that broke records for average, median and completed sales, there may never again be an RNA rate like the one achieved in the second week of last year's September Sale.)

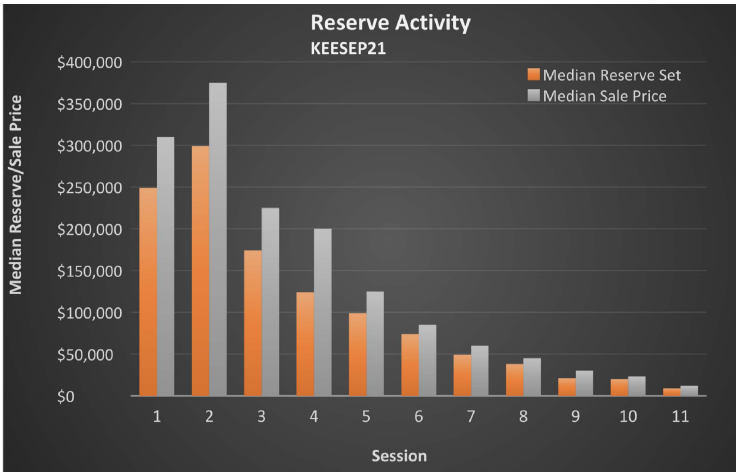

Another nervous assumption is that there are inbuilt momentum swings even within a session. Vendors typically dislike slots at the very beginning or end of the day. Again, Breathnach investigated last September. He identified the first and last 20 hips that sold in each session, and compared them to the 20 that sold right in the middle of that session. In doing so, he compared the average and median price of each of those subgroups as well as the likelihood that a horse sold for at least 50% above its reserve, what might be termed the "pleasant surprises."

"It's interesting to me that in the 11 sessions, those good sales (50% above reserve) were more likely to happen in the first 20 sellers in three sessions (incidentally including the first and fourth sessions); the last 20 sellers in three sessions; and right in the middle of the day in the other four," Breathnach says. "The average sale price of those yearlings was only highest in the middle 20 sellers in two of the 11 sessions. In other words: no pattern."

Where there can surely be virtual unanimity is that the sale finally needs a more settled format. That's certainly Keeneland's intention for 2022, with the first two Books once again expected to be spread over two sessions apiece, with Book 1 opening around 1 p.m. (as was the case last year).

"Industry-wide, almost everybody agrees that we need a consistent format, and that includes our sales team," Breathnach concedes. "Based on the performance of last year's sale, and particularly from a stabling point of view, we feel that the format we landed on was very positive."

Obviously there will always be a certain critical mass of yearlings eligible for the two opening Books. And Breathnach feels that there are two important differences between the format of two sessions apiece, as opposed to commingling over four days.

"You get too many peaks and valleys [with a four-day Book 1]," he explains. "There aren't 1,000 really top-end horses, so the sale gets too inconsistent, and it's hard to build momentum. And, maybe more importantly, when you use the entire barn area like that, it's very hard for buyers to patrol the whole of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and then to do their shortlists and their second looks, when they're going from Barn 1 to 49 on every pass. Some sellers might think they would prefer that—but the horses are just too spread out that way, and several of them are going to be missed."

So if 400 won't necessarily be the precise number of elite horses out there for Book 1, it's a number that gives everyone a chance—buyers and vendors alike.

"It's a manageable number and you can start a 200-horse session at 1 p.m.," Breathnach says. "That allows extra time in the mornings for buyers to get their second looks and vetting done, and to get ahead with Book 2, and not be constantly falling behind. And it gives these good horses the time they deserve. They can be stabled loosely in some of our best show areas, with the time and space for people to show them to the best of their ability."

The lunchtime start also allows atmosphere to build for the beginning of what is, after all, an occasion of great theater.

"Tony and Shannon [Arvin, president and CEO] and the entire team, we want to make sure there's a buzz to kick the sale off," Breathnach says. "That is a priority. The September Sale is a significant event for Lexington and this area, but it's critical to our customers and it deserves to start off the right way."

As he mentions, this is all a team effort. Besides Lacy and Breathnach, the inspections so vital to the balance of these Books are being shared by Mark Maronde, Dean Roethemeier and Kyle Wilson, with valued external perspectives from the experienced Frankie Brothers and Julie Cauthen. And of course there are also important contributions from other vital cogs in the Keeneland machine like Gatewood Bell, Buff Bradley and Ryan Mahan. While every sales company candidly strives on behalf of the vendor, once a horse is on the dais, in planning an auction these people must try to achieve an equilibrium between seller and buyers.

But obviously there's a limit to how much the hosts can assist trade.

"We do understand that there's a lot of anxiety and opinion among breeders and consignors about book placement," Breathnach says. "Our job is to put the whole sale together, which requires taking a broad view, and factoring in the requirements and preferences of buyers and sellers alike. The kind of things we're talking about can't create a strong market, of themselves. But we can do our best to give it space to breathe."

Fast forward to Memorial Day 2022 and the Belmont card not only won't include the Met Mile, but there are no graded stakes on the program. The highlight on this afternoon will be five stakes races for New York-breds. There were supposed to be six, but one, the Commentator H., did not fill. It will be just another day at the track.

During the three-day holiday weekend, Belmont offered just one graded stakes, Saturday's GIII Soaring Softly S. The weekend was crying out for a big race, and there is no better way to fill the void than returning the Met Mile to its traditional place on the calendar.

The Met Mile was last run on Memorial Day in 2013. The following year, it was moved to Belmont Day and it has remained there ever since. The idea was to create a blockbuster card that went beyond just the Belmont Ss. This year, there will be nine graded stakes on the card, eight of them Grade I's. It's working. With the exception of the Saturday Breeders' Cup program, the Belmont S. card might be the best in the sport. Last year's handle for the card was \$112 million, a record for a non-Triple Crown year.

But there's been a price to pay. The weekend racing leading up to and following the Belmont has absolutely no sizzle. That might be fine for some of the weeks, but it shouldn't be ok for Memorial Day.

You can make a case that the Met is the third most important, most prestigious race run each year in New York, behind only the GI Travers S. and the Belmont. Put it along side eight claiming races if you have to and it can carry a day. But on Belmont Day it tends to get lost.

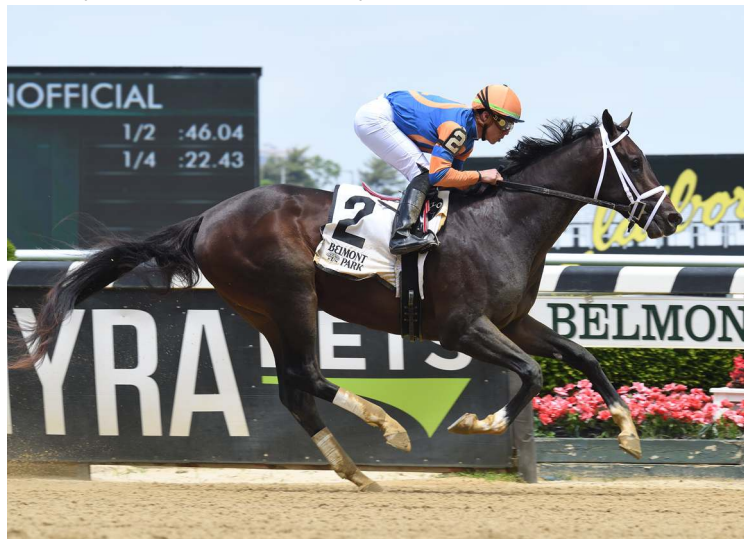
The solution is to go back to Memorial Day. To do so wouldn't affect Belmont Day one bit. A Met Mile-less card that still had eight stakes, seven of them Grade I's, and a Triple Crown event would get by just fine without the Met.

And moving the Met back to Memorial Day would instantly make the Monday holiday program the special type of occasion that it was for 42 years but is no longer.

Repole-Viola Partnership Off To Good Start

It comes as no surprise that the first 2-year-old to earn 'TDN Rising Star' status this year in New York is owned by the partnership of Mike Repole and Vinnie Viola. The feat was accomplished Friday at Belmont when **Forte** (**Violence**) romped by 7 3/4 lengths, paying \$2.40 to win. Forte was purchased for \$110,000 last year at Keeneland September.

On the same day, Repole and Viola finished third in a 2-year-old maiden at Churchill Downs with Summonyourcourage (**Practical Joke**). Summonyourcourage and Forte were their first two 2-year-old starters on the year.

Viola and Repole have assembled a stable of 2-year-olds that is so large and so potent that it is unlike anything ever seen in racing before. They bought 43 yearlings last year at Keeneland September, paying a combined \$16.045 million. They also bought three yearlings at Fasig-Tipton sales for an aggregate cost of \$1.725 million. The vast majority of the horses are colts.

"Vinnie and I have at least 50 2-year-olds together," Repole said via text. "Plus, we probably have at least 25 each alone. I'm extremely excited about these 2-year-olds. Forte looked great in his debut, winning by almost eight lengths and getting an 81 Beyer. Vinnie and I are excited about unleashing some potential future stars at Saratoga. Building this stable has been 15 years in the making for me and the great team I have managing the stable."

While awaiting the debut of more 2-year-olds, Repole can turn his attention to the GI Belmont S. He has a confirmed starter in **Mo Donegal** (**Uncle Mo**) and says that he is "leaning heavily" toward running the filly **Nest** (**Curlin**) in the race.

"If we run her, it will be because she deserves to be in this race," Repole said. "She is just as fast as the 3-year-old colts. She is a daughter of **Curlin** and will relish the distance."

Piggott in the North America

Equibase stats on Lestor Piggott's rides in North America go back only to 1976. Starting with that time, Piggott, who passed away Sunday at age 86, had seven winners in North America from 68 mounts. That includes two stakes wins, with Royal Academy in the 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, and with Argument (Fr) in the 1980 GI Washington D.C. International.

Piggott's last-ever mount in the U.S. was one he probably would have liked to forget. He rode Mr. Brooks (GB) in the 1992 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, where the horse broke down and had to be euthanized.

In 1979, the Meadowlands brought him over to take part in an international jockey challenge pitting U.S. versus European riders. Steve Cauthen captained the victorious U.S. team. Piggott did not win a race that night.

Before the advent of the Breeders' Cup, the Washington D.C. International at Laurel led the way when it came to attracting star horses and riders from Europe. With three wins in the International, Piggott is tied with Manny Ycaza for most wins in the race by a jockey. Piggott also won the International in 1968 with Sir Ivor and in 1969 with Karabas. He also won the 1974 Canadian International aboard Dahlia.

After riding in the 1967 D.C. International, Piggott stayed in the U.S and tried to break in at Aqueduct during a time of year when flat racing is shutdown in the U.K.

According to a *New York Times* report, he was 2-for-his-first-18 over the course of seven days. He said his intention was to finish the Aqueduct meet, which ended Dec. 15. When asked why he had made a detour at Aqueduct before returning to the U.K., Piggott said: “because I enjoy riding. Why not ride here?” He admitted he wasn’t getting on the best mounts. “I wouldn’t be riding these bad ones in England,” he said. “But I guess there’s nothing else I can do here.”

OPEN LETTER TO THE INDUSTRY

Dear Thoroughbred racing community stakeholder,

We appreciate your assistance in spreading the word on the need to register with HISA before the Racetrack Safety Program takes effect on July 1, 2022. It has come to our attention that some users have recently experienced technical difficulties with the HISA registration platform.

The primary issue has been with the two-factor authentication system that relied on text messaging, a standard measure to ensure an additional layer of protection. Our technology team has learned that, despite the success of earlier tests, HISA’s text message verification codes have in many instances been misclassified by telecommunications providers as spam. While we became aware several days ago of this issue, it unfortunately took more time than expected to identify why it was happening. It has now been repaired, but it will take more than a week for the fix to fully propagate through these vast systems. Therefore, we have suspended the account verification requirement and continue to secure the accounts using alternate methods.

While our helpdesk operators have been working around the clock, we understand that many registrants have experienced delays in receiving the verification code and/or responses from the helpdesk. We sincerely apologize for any frustration these delays have caused.

All users who did not receive a verification code after completing the process have been automatically verified and should be receiving an email (or have already received one) notifying them of their successful registration and providing their HISA number. [Monday] we will also initiate an outbound call campaign to verify that the automatically verified users received proper notification.

Thank you for your patience and understanding in the initial stages of our registration launch.

We aspire to deliver the high level of service this industry deserves, and we will continue to work tirelessly to ensure we meet your expectations going forward.

American Theorem outbattled an ultra-game Principe Carlo to upset the GII Triple Bend S. at Santa Anita Sunday. The gray, cutting back in distance, settled off the pace as favored Brickyard Ride (Clubhouse Ride) and Principe Carlo traded blows through a quarter in :21.96 and :44.09. American Theorem rolled up three wide into the stretch and looked set to power clear as the favorite quickly wilted, but Principe Carlo battled back bravely only to be outnosed in the final jump.

“I love when a plan comes together,” said winning rider Joe Bravo. “We really had high hopes for this horse, he had a couple of hiccups along the way, and [trainer George Papaprodromou] cut him back in distance. Look at him around the turn, it seemed like at any time he could jump on those horses and he did.”

Bravo continued, “There were some nice horses in that race, and I give all the credit to George having patience with him bringing him around the right way, it’s all in the details that got him to the winner’s circle today.”

American Theorem was a debut winner at Del Mar in August of 2019 and looked full of promise when finishing second in the GI **American Pharoah** S. in his second outing, but the gray made only one start in 2020, finishing seventh in the GII Rebel S., and three starts in 2021. He opened 2022 with a front-running victory in a Jan. 2 optional claimer at Santa Anita, but was well-beaten when sixth in the Feb. 5 GII San Pasqual S. and Mar. 5 GI Santa Anita H. He was cutting back to a sprint following a ninth-place effort in the Apr. 2 Twinpires Kentucky Cup Classic at Turfway Park.

“We’ve been trying him long and he’s been involved with fast paces and it didn’t work out,” said Papaprodromou. “I think he’s a great horse and like I’ve said, I love this horse. Congrats to my owners, Kretz Racing, they’re the best owners ever. Hopefully, we’ll move forward from this.”

Artie's Storm, making his first start of the year, made it three wins in a row and captured the first graded score of his career in the GII Eclipse S. at Woodbine Sunday. The dark bay gelding settled into an unhurried third as reigning Canadian Horse of the Year **Mighty Heart** set fractions of :23.99 and :48.48. **Frosted Over** was first to challenge that pacesetting favorite, sticking his head in front at the top of the lane, but Artie's Storm was three wide and ready to strike. He surged to the lead in the final sixteenth and inched away to the wire.

“He settled off the pace and I was happy at the three-eighths that no one was pressuring me, so I was able to be a little bit more patient and I said that once I got him straightened up, he kicked in like he always kicks in,” said winning jockey David Moran. “Just fitness-wise, I was trying to wait as long as I could and hopefully, I wouldn’t get swarmed from someone behind.”

Artie's Storm was third in the GIII Ontario Derby last October before ending his 2021 campaign with wins against fellow Ontario-breds in the Nov. 19 Lake Ontario S. and Dec. 4 Steady Growth S.

“This horse has been training lights out,” said Moran. “The only thing we were worried about was first run, two turns off the shelf, against these kind of horses. We didn’t really get a prep for him, but his breezes have been amazing. I would look forward to getting into my car on Monday mornings just to come down and breeze him on Mondays... it was just so good.”

Artie's Storm is the second graded stakes winner for his sire, We Miss Artie. The stallion has also been represented by GII Woodbine Bessarabian S. winner Artie's Princess.

Cairo Memories made it two in a row over the Santa Anita lawn with a 1 1/4-length victory in the GIII Honeymoon S. in Arcadia Sunday. The 1-2 favorite shadowed pacesetting longshot Sterling Crest (Ire) (**No Nay Never**) into the first turn through a quarter in :23.30. The 11-1 outsider was in hand and some three lengths in front down the backstretch through a half in :47.29, but Cairo Memories was tugging her way into contention and loomed a threat midway on the far turn. Cairo Memories stuck her head in front at the top of the lane, but was soon challenged to her outside by Island of Love. Those two went toe-to-toe before Cairo Memories, always confidently handled by Mike Smith, put her away and pulled clear in the final strides.

“If you have been blessed with the opportunity to get on her, you would feel that she’s always there when you need her,” Smith said. “As soon as competition comes to her, she just jumps right back in the bridle, which she did. It gave me the confidence to know that she was going to run down to the wire.”

Cairo Memories was tabbed a **'TDN Rising Star'** following her debut win at Del Mar last September. She quickly added the Oct. 3 Surfer Girl S. to her resume, but suffered her first loss when a close-up ninth behind Pizza Bianca in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

She was second in the Dec. 4 GI Starlet S. in her first start on the main track, but returned to the lawn after a well-beaten seventh-place effort in the Mar. 6 GIII Santa Ysabel S. She was a front-running 4 1/2-length winner of the Apr. 9 GIII Providencia S. in her most recent trip to the post.

“It was a little tougher than we had hoped, but she ran well and I think she’ll run a little farther,” said winning trainer Bob Hess, Jr. “We’re looking at a few things, there’s the [July 9 GI] Belmont Oaks on my birthday and, if all goes well, we’d like to come back to Del Mar and run in the [Aug. 20 GI] Oaks down there).”

Hronis Racing’s Bran went wire-to-wire and gamely held off all comers to win the GIII Daytona S. down the hill at Santa Anita Sunday. The even-money favorite was in front, while prompted by Burnin Turf through an opening quarter in :21.96. He inched away nearing the stretch and was two lengths in front going over the dirt track after a half a in :43.78. Burnin Turf took another run at the favorite, but Bran dug in gamely to maintain his advantage to the wire as Majestic Eagle nipped Burnin Turf for second.

“He ran one time on the lead down the hill and he put up nice fractions like today, so John [Sadler] told me, ‘Just break sharp and if he wants to go to the lead let him go. If someone else wants to go, just follow them,’” said winning rider Juan Hernandez. “I broke on the lead and he was happy there. I waited until we crossed the dirt and then I asked him to go home and he just brought the race. John told me that he was a really nice horse and that you can do whatever you want with him, he won’t do anything wrong, and I just trusted him and we got the win.”

Bloodstock agent Shawn Dugan purchased Bran for €80,000 from trainer Delcher Sanchez’s consignment at the Arqana October sale last fall. He opened his U.S. campaign with a third-place effort down the hill in the Jan. 1 GII Joe Hernandez S. He captured his first win for Hronis Racing and Sadler over that same course in the Apr. 10 Siren Lure S. Shipped east for his most recent effort, Bran was a solid second behind Arrest Me Red (Pioneerof the Nile) in the May 6 GII Twin Spires Turf Sprint S. going 5 1/2 furlongs at Churchill Downs.

“It didn’t look like there was much speed in the race, but the nice thing about him is, he’s won both ways, he can be up close or he can lay off of them a little bit like he did last time at Churchill Downs,” said Sadler. “He’s a very honest horse. He doesn’t have a bad race in his form, he runs good all the time. We’ll freshen him up now and the distances at Del Mar may not suit him well, so we’ll see.”

He returned from eight months on the sidelines to score a front-running victory in the Apr. 10 John Shear S. last time out.

The 7-year-old went to the sidelines after earning top-level success in the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile last March and was closing into a slow pace when a close-up sixth while making his return in the Marker's Mark Mile. He could get a pace assist from stablemate **Dance Some Mo** (**Uncle Mo**) Monday.

Rockingham Ranch's **Masteroffoxhounds** (**War Front**), winner of last year's GII San Marcos S. over the Santa Anita turf course, turns back to a mile off a runner-up effort in the Apr. 30 GII Charles Whittingham S. for trainer Richard Baltas. The 5-year-old will be making his first start for D'Amato Monday.

"On paper, she definitely fits in there," said trainer Ben Cecil. "I think the extra furlong is probably good for her. She runs hard and gives her all every time. I know she'll run well. It will just be a question of if she's up to it."

In addition to her front-running score in the Wilshire, B-4 Farms' Canoodling also captured the one-mile Jan. 29 GIII Megahertz S. at Santa Anita. She will be trying to stretch out to nine furlongs for the first time in her career Monday.

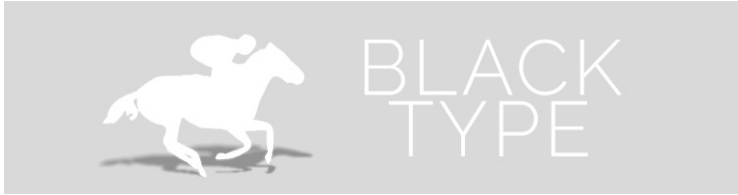

Beaten just once in five starts, Big Invasion ran away to victory in the Paradise Creek S. Sunday at Belmont to pick up his third straight stakes success.

Rolling into this contest on a three-race win streak which included a 4 1/4-length victory Feb. 22 against Gulfstream maidens, a three-length score in that track's Texas Glitter S. Mar. 26, and a two-length win last out May 4 at Churchill Downs where the bay overcame shying into the turn to keep his streak alive in the William Walker S. Stretching out to seven furlongs here, the betting public sent him from the blocks the 6-5 favorite, and Big Invasion chased from fourth down the backside before swinging four wide to make his move. Five off the fence in upper stretch and under a full head of steam, Big Invasion rolled past long-time leader and second choice Asymmetric (Ire) to win by daylight under hand urging.

"He was a bit immature early on and he could be a bit strong. Joel [Rosario] got him to completely switch off today, which was impressive," said trainer Christophe Clement, before mentioning a potential next start in Saratoga's GIII Quick Call S. July 17. "That's the plan at the moment, but I'll have to talk to Mr.

[Dean] Reeves about it. He's got a lot of speed and I think it would be foolish to take all the speed away. I think we'll keep him sprinting this year and maybe stretch him out next year. It makes sense to keep him a sprinter at the moment."

LESTER PIGGOTT OBITUARY: BORN TO RIDE

There's plenty going on in the world at present, including in Great Britain with the daily-changing tragi-comic farce which masquerades as domestic politics. We're definitely not in the 'silly season' in which news editors have to look far and wide, including to the back pages, to find the front-page leads.

Within the sports' pages racing no longer holds its prime position of yesteryear, and when the Cazoo Derby is run at Epsom this Saturday, it will have to fight for its few column inches in the national press. Under the circumstances, the fact that the passing of Lester Piggott at the age of 86 in hospital in Switzerland was the first item on the hourly news bulletins on BBC Radio Four on Sunday morning tells us all that we need to know: Lester (no explanatory surname required) was not merely a national sporting icon or international racing hero, but a figure of worldwide significance whose place in the hearts and minds of the public went far beyond the narrow confines of the sport which he dominated for decades. Born on Guy Fawkes' Day 1935, Lester Piggott was born to ride.

His father Keith was a successful trainer, most notably sending out Ayala to win the Grand National in 1963. Keith's father Ernie had been the leading steeplechase jockey in the second decade of the 20th century, three times winning the National Hunt jockeys' championship and three times riding the Grand National winner. JOHN MAGNIER LEADS TRIBUTES TO "THE GREATEST"

Coolmore boss John Magnier has led the tributes to one of the sport's biggest icons, the legendary nine-time Derby-winning jockey Lester Piggott, who he labelled as "the greatest" following his death at the age of 86. Piggott rode his first Derby victory for former Ballydoyle boss, the late Vincent O'Brien, in 1968 aboard Sir Ivor. They combined to win the race four times together, including with Nijinsky (Can) in 1970, Roberto in 1972 and The Minstrel (Can), for whom the colt's owner Robert Sangster, Piggott was then contracted to ride for, in 1972.

The Minstrel went on to win the Irish Derby and King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. in that same season.

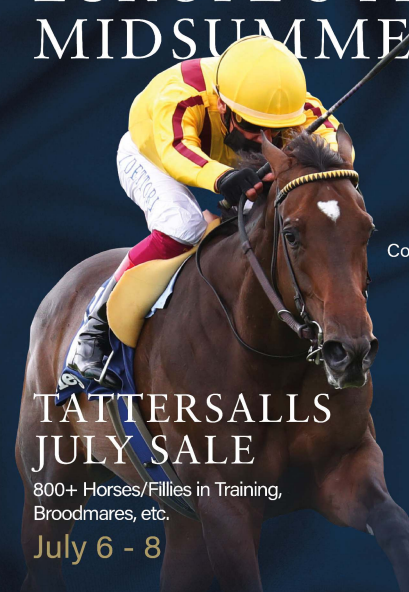

Lester Piggott Obituary cont.

Ernie's wife Margaret, Lester's grandmother, was the sister of Mornington Cannon, England's leading Flat jockey in the final years of the 19th century when he was champion jockey six times and rode six Classic winners. Her other three brothers were also successful jockeys, including Kempton Cannon who, like Mornington, also rode a Derby winner. Keith's wife Iris was the daughter of one Classic-winning jockey (Fred Rickaby Snr), the sister of another (Fred Rickaby Jnr) and the aunt of Fred Rickaby (twice Britain's champion apprentice in the early 1930s and subsequently a leading trainer in South Africa) and his younger brother Bill, one of Britain's leading jockeys from the 1930s to the '60s. She herself was a talented horsewoman, riding the winner of the Newmarket Town Plate in 1928, in the days when that was the only British race in which women were allowed to ride.

This pedigree gave every suggestion that Lester might have the attributes required to become a successful jockey, either on the Flat or over jumps. What it did not predict, though, was the scope of the success which he would enjoy or the full extent to which he would master his craft. Even in a family of master-horsemen, he took the art of jockeyship to another level altogether. Apprenticed to his father, Lester took to race-riding like a duck to water. He rode his first winner, The Chase at Haydock Park, on 18th August 1948, aged 12. The following season he rode six winners from 120 mounts. In his third year, 1950, he rode 52 winners from 404 mounts, finishing 11th in the

jockeys' championship, still aged only 15. (He had to sit out the final weeks of the campaign, including his 16th birthday, as the stewards had suspended him for the remainder of the season after his ruthlessly competitive streak had begun to reveal itself when he had allowed his horse to interfere with Scobie Breasley's mount in a race at Newbury in October).

Aged 16, Lester rode his first big-race winner at the Epsom Spring Meeting in 1951 when guiding Barnacle (GB) to victory in

the Great Metropolitan H. Three months later he scored for the first time at what would now be called Group 1 level, winning the Eclipse S. at Sandown on the French raider Mystery IX (Fr). The career of the greatest jockey of the 20th century thus far, Gordon Richards, was drawing to a close (in that 1951 season he won the 24th of his 26 jockeys' championships) and it was becoming ever clearer that the boy wonder might be his successor. However, it was not all plain sailing.

Coming from a family of racing professionals, Lester had been reared to regard it as axiomatic that he would be competing in a hard game where only ruthlessness might guarantee success. He may have had the boyhood face of an angel, but underneath the surface there lay a core as hard as iron. Richards and his contemporaries were not going to give up their supremacy without a fight but the young pretender was not going to back down either.

Lester had his first ride in the Derby in 1952, finishing second on Gay Time (GB), beaten only by one of the old guard, the 46-year-old Charlie Smirke winning on HH Aga Khan III's Tulyar (Ire). The following year he rode into the winner's enclosure after one of the major races at the Derby Meeting for the first time, landing the first of his nine Coronation Cups on Zucchero (Ire) and then, still aged only 18, in 1954 he won the Derby for the first time, riding the 33/1 shot Never Say Die, the first Kentucky-bred to take the great race, to victory for 73-year-old trainer Joe Lawson and American owner Robert Sterling Clark. Never Say Day followed up in the autumn in the St Leger, but Smirke was in the saddle by then as Lester's career was by then at a cross-roads, his never-say-die attitude having brought matters to a head at Royal Ascot. Two weeks after the Derby, Lester rode Never Say Die in the King Edward VII S. at Ascot. It turned out to be one of the roughest races ever seen at the Royal Meeting as Lester refused to give up without a fight when he found himself trapped in a pocket by Gordon Richards (by then Sir Gordon Richards) at the top of the straight. The stewards decided that he alone was responsible for the interference that ensued, concluding their inquiry with the report that they had 'taken notice of his dangerous and erratic riding both this season and in previous seasons, and in spite of continuous warnings he had continued to show complete disregard for the Rules of Racing and the safety of other jockeys'. They withdrew his license to ride and let it be known that no consideration would be given to its renewal for at least six months, and that in the interim he must work for a trainer other than his father. Consequently Lester came to Newmarket and worked for Jack Jarvis, to whom his cousin Bill Rickaby was stable jockey. As we now know, Lester managed to temper his ruthless will to win with the degree of prudence required to keep on the right side of the authorities. His license was restored in 1955 and, succeeding Richards (who had retired the previous summer) as stable jockey to Noel Murless, he rode a century of winners for the first time, finishing third to Doug Smith in the championship with 103 victories. At that stage, the stewards did not prove to be the only potential obstacle in the way of Lester's progress to the very top of the riding tree. His size was also becoming a problem. He was continuing to grow, eventually reaching the height of 5' 8" which doesn't seem too much nowadays, but was then regarded as unfeasibly tall for a Flat jockey. He was naturally as adept at riding over jumps as his pedigree suggested, and in the winter of 1953/'54 he had ridden regularly over hurdles, scoring at the National Hunt Meeting at Cheltenham (now the Cheltenham Festival) on Mull Sack and winning the Triumph Hurdle (now a Group 1 race at the Cheltenham Festival but then run at the now-defunct Hurst Park) on Prince Charlemagne.

However, showing the iron self-discipline which was to become his hallmark, he managed his weight well enough to be able to do Flat-race weights throughout his career. In later years it became part of the Piggott myth that his breakfast was 'a cough and a copy of the Sporting Life' augmented by cigars, plus the luxury of a cup of black coffee if he wasn't riding light that day.

By the time that Lester attained his majority, therefore, he was well on the way to race-riding greatness. His partnership with Murless was proving to be the first of the three great relationships which defined his career. (The second of them was with Vincent O'Brien in the '60s and '70s and the third with Henry Cecil in the '80s). At the ripe old age of 21, Lester enjoyed a true annus mirabilis on Murless' horses in 1957, taking the 2,000 Guineas in the spring on Sir Victor Sassoon's Crepello (GB) and then completing the greatest double of all at Epsom where Crepello followed up in the Derby and Queen Elizabeth II's Carrozza (GB) won the Oaks.

He and Murless won the Oaks again two years later with Prince Aly Khan's Petite Etoile (GB) and over the next two seasons that charismatic grey filly proved herself to be one of the greatest and most popular horses whom he ever rode.

In 1960, the year in which Petite Etoile and Lester won the first of their two Coronation Cups, Lester won the first of his 11 jockeys' championships, riding 170 winners from 640 rides during one of the several season-long duels which he had with Scobie Breasley during that period. His association with Murless' Warren Place stable seemed like a match made in heaven, while he was he clearly the jockey whom everyone wanted to use when Murless did not have a runner.

This was never more clear than at Royal Ascot in 1965, where he rode three winners for Murless and took the Gold Cup on Fighting Charlie (GB) for Freddie Maxwell, the Coventry Stakes on Young Emperor (Ire) for Paddy Prendergast, the New (now Norfolk) S. for Fulke Johnson Houghton on Tin King (GB), the Chesham S. for Eddie Reavey on Swift Harmony (GB) and the King George V S. for Walter Nightingall on Brave Knight (GB).

All good things come to an end, though, and Lester's insatiable desire for success eventually meant that he outgrew Warren

Place. He had been taking occasional rides for Vincent O'Brien since 1958, when he won the Gold Cup at Ascot, the Goodwood Cup and the Ebor H. at York on Gladness (GB). In 1966 Murless had Varinia (GB) in the Oaks but Lester reckoned that O'Brien's Valoris (Fr) had a better chance. He therefore took the ride on the latter and, needless to say, won. Murless read the writing on the wall and, although Lester won some good races for the stable later in the season including the King

George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot on Aunt Edith (GB), the Royal Lodge S. on Royal Palace (GB) and the Cheveley Park S. on Fleet (Ire), at the end of the season it was announced that henceforth Lester would be riding as a freelance and Murless would be retaining the great Australian George Moore as his stable jockey with the Scottish teenager Sandy Barclay, who had been champion apprentice in 1966, riding as second jockey. That arrangement lasted one year, with Barclay promoted to stable jockey in 1968.

Murless' success continued unabated, most obviously with both Royal Palace and Fleet winning Classics under Moore in 1967, but Lester did even better.

Although O'Brien initially continued to retain Liam Ward as his jockey in Ireland, Piggott became his overseas jockey and a torrent of triumph followed, most notably with four Derby winners in 10 years thanks to the superstars Sir Ivor, Nijinsky (Can), Roberto and The Minstrel as well as the dual Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Alleged. In the 1970 Triple Crown hero Nijinsky, Lester seemed to have found a partner to match his own unparalleled brilliance, although he was reportedly heard once to claim that Roberto (who, like The Minstrel, seemed to need all of his jockey's supreme skill to secure his Derby victory) was the most talented of them all.

Eventually Pat Eddery, whose maternal grandfather Jack Moylan had ridden winners for O'Brien in the 1940s, was offered a retainer for Ballydoyle. The upshot was that Lester, by now well into his 40s, found himself back at Warren Place, where Murless' son-in-law Henry Cecil was now the trainer.

Willie Carson, Pat Eddery and Joe Mercer had been the champion jockeys since Lester had topped the table for the ninth time in 1971, but in 1981 and '82 the Piggott/Cecil team was so dominant that Lester won his tenth and eleventh (and final) championships. His toughness was particularly evident in 1981 when, aged 45, he suffered a horrific injury at the Epsom Spring Meeting when his mount in a sprint burrowed out from under the front of the starting-stalls. He looked set for a lengthy spell on the side-lines but, impervious as ever to pain, was back in the saddle the following week to guide Jim Joel's home-bred Henry Cecil-trained filly Fairy Footsteps (GB) to victory in the 1,000 Guineas. Arguably the greatest horse whom he rode for Cecil during this period, though, was Charles St George's peerless stayer Ardross (Ire).

As he closed in on his 50th birthday, Lester continued to be the man most in demand on the big occasions, riding his ninth Derby

winner in 1983 on the Geoff Wragg-trained Teenoso; winning both the Oaks and St Leger in 1984, on the John Dunlop-trained Circus Plume (GB) and the Luca Cumani-trained, Ivan Allan-owned Commanche Run (Ire) respectively; and the 2,000 Guineas in 1985 on the Michael Stoute-trained Shadeed. Eventually Father Time brought his career to a halt at the end of the 1985 season. Or so we thought.

Lester had always been full of surprises and the next few years contained enough plot-twists to fill the most inventive of novels. He took up training in his Eve Lodge stables in Newmarket's Hamilton Road and, almost inevitably, got off to superb start when Cutting Blade (GB) won the Coventry S. at Royal Ascot in 1986 under Cash Asmussen. However, a trip to prison when convicted of tax evasion (a conviction which saw him stripped of his OBE) intervened and eventually, bizarrely, led to a return to the saddle.

Vincent O'Brien's jockey John Reid had been injured at Longchamp on Arc Day in 1990 and, needing a rider for July Cup winner Royal Academy in the Breeders' Cup Mile, the veteran trainer suggested that his former jockey should re-apply for his license. The process was rushed through and the ultimate fairy-tale followed as Lester, just nine days short of his 55th birthday and having had minimal time to hone his fitness, rode the race of a lifetime to force Royal Academy's nose to the front in the shadows of the Belmont Park winning post.

Lester continued to ride for another four years, notably gaining his record 30th and final British Classic success when taking the 2,000 Guineas in 1992 on the Robert Sangster-owned, Peter Chapple-Hyam-trained Rodrigo De Triano. There was not a dry eye in the house when Vincent O'Brien, aged 76, led Lester, aged 57 and wearing the silks of the trainer's wife Jacqueline, back into the winner's enclosure at Royal Ascot after the Cork & Orrery S. (now Platinum Jubilee) S. in 1993 on College Chapel (GB). Lester's final season riding in Great Britain was in 1994, his final domestic ride coming on the unplaced Sally Hall-trained Mr Confusion (Ire) in the November H. at Doncaster on his 59th birthday. Fittingly, however, for someone who had become the ultimate international jockey and had enjoyed extensive success as well as massive popularity and respect all around the world,

he actually rode his final winners in Australia, in the early months of 1995.

It is nearly 500 years since John Donne wrote in 1624 “..send not to know for whom the bell tolls. It tolls for thee.” When the bell tolls for Lester Piggott, it does indeed toll for all of us because, even for the 99.9% who never knew him (if, indeed, anyone ever did really know this human enigma who was more revered for his reserve than anyone ever could be loved for volubility) he was a massive part of all our

yesterdays. It is doubtful if there will ever be another sportsman as synonymous with his sport, or a jockey as respected the world over. He will, though, be most missed by those closest to him, including Maureen (Haggas) and Tracy (his daughters from his marriage to Susan) and his son Jamie. The TDN sends our condolences to his loved ones and to his friends.

Magnier continued, "I remember meeting Lester in the parade ring before the 1971 Haydock Sprint Cup. A group of us had bought into Green God (GB) a couple of days before and Lester was up for what was to be the horse's final race. 'Don't be looking for me at the furlong pole, I won't be there until the line,' he told me, and sure enough he produced him with his trademark impeccable timing."

Magnier added, "At this time of year MV was regularly frustrated by Lester playing musical chairs of what he would be riding in the Derby. But he said, 'you have to put up with him, otherwise you give the opposition a 7lbs advantage!' He really was the greatest. His family are in our thoughts today."

Willie Carson and Piggott held sway on the track in the 1970s and 80s when both jockeys were in their pomp and five-times champion Carson said he felt like a part of him had died with the most iconic racing figure of the 20th century. Carson, along with Frankie Dettori, who described Piggott as his "hero", paid heartfelt tributes to the legendary rider on Sunday morning.

"I feel as though I have lost part of my life in way, as Lester has been part of my life ever since I came into racing," said an emotional Carson.

"I came to his in-laws as an apprentice and he was part of my life right from the word go, until the end. He was an iconic figure in the horse racing world. He is a legend.

"We had the luck of some ding-dongs on the track and he was a person who made us all better--because we had to be better to beat him. We had to up our game to compete with him, because he was so magical on top of a horse. It is so sad. Part of my life has gone--that is how I feel."

Dual Derby-winning jockey Frankie Dettori, who will be aboard Donnacha O'Brien's Piz Badile (Ire) (Ulysses {Ire}) at Epsom on Saturday, echoed Carson's thoughts on Piggott.

Dettori said, "Lester was a hero of mine and a good friend. The impact he has made in racing, on all of us, is second to none."

He added, "I will always try to remember him for the good things and I offer my sincere condolences to his family and his many friends. He was a legend. We always tried to aspire to be like him and none of us can do it."

Sir Michael Stoute was also among the leading industry figures to pay tribute to Piggott. Stoute shared how he felt Piggott was instrumental in getting his training career off the ground. Piggott rode an English and Irish Classic winner for the Newmarket trainer, who will be represented the likely favourite Desert Crown (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) in Saturday's Cazoo Derby at Epsom.

"It is sad news," said Stoute. "He rode my first winner on the Rowley Mile on a horse called Sandal, who was owned by my father, in 1972.

"He won the Irish Derby on Shergar (GB) (1981) and he won the 2000 Guineas on Shadeed (1985), as Walter (Swinburn) was suspended for both of those. He was super-sub and he was not a bad sub! Lester was a genius on a racehorse. I don't think there has been anyone better."

Piggott's 4,493 winners-over 5,000 worldwide-is the third-highest tally in British racing history behind only Sir Gordon Richards and Pat Eddery.

Stoute added, "Lester could be very entertaining when he was in the mood - he had a great sense of humour. But he was tough to talk to at times.

"In 1980, actually, he had the pick of plenty of mine, with the hope of carrying that on, but he had fallen out with a few people by that stage.

"He is an icon, a brilliant jockey. Many have tried to be like him and no one has come close."

DREAM SCENARIO



Dreamloper takes the G1 Prix d'Ispahan | ScoopDyga

Pitched in against the colts in a winnable renewal of the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at ParisLongchamp on Sunday, **Dreamloper (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}--Livia's Dream {Ire}, by Teofilo {Ire}) put them to the sword to reward Ed Walker's enterprise. Putting it all together with a career-best success in Newmarket's G2 Dahlia S. at the start of the month, the 5-1 shot was kept close to the leader **Sealiway (Fr)** (Galiway {GB}) by Kieran Shoemark before brushing last year's Champion S. hero aside in early straight. Staying on powerfully as the closers struggled to make inroads, she hit the line two lengths ahead of outsider **Wally (Ire)** (**Siyouni {Fr}**) as **Pretty Tiger (Ire)** (Sea the Moon {Ger}) edged third, a neck behind. "Kieran said she's improved so much, but I don't know where it's come from," Walker commented. "She's taken a lot of figuring out, but is mentally easier on herself these days. A performance like that would give her a chance against most." Dreamloper first demonstrated her latent class when handing a 4 1/2-length beating to Lights On (GB) (**Siyouni {Fr}**) in the G3 Valiant S. over a mile at Ascot in July, but dropping back to seven was the wrong way to go on her next start when fourth in Newbury's G2 Hungerford S. Disappointing when 10th in the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown in September, the bay bounced back to be third in the G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket in October but all evidence so far points to her having upped her game again in 2022. "Ever since the end of last year when she finished third in the Sun Chariot she's done nothing but progress," her trainer added. "There is the Rothschild and the Romanet, but the Nassau is the perfect fit." Shoemark echoed that feeling. "I was so lucky to gain my first group one win on Lady Bowthorpe and I think this filly is a similar type who would love it in the Nassau," he said. "She had won the race two and a half out. She was very impressive--when I asked her to quicken she was instantly responsive."

Dreamloper's dam Livia's Dream (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), who was successful in the 12-furlong Listed Wild Flower S., is out of the Listed Dick Hern Fillies' S. winner Brindisi (GB) (Dr. Fong) whose listed-placed half-sister La Spezia (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) produced the G2 Doncaster Cup hero Thomas Hobson (GB) (Halling). This is the family of the G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Talent (GB) (New Approach {Ire}), whose daughter Ambition (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) captured the G2 Prix Corrida. Livia's Dream also has the unraced 2-year-old filly Dreamrocker (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and a yearling filly by Golden Horn (GB).

SAINT-ALARY GLORY FOR ABOVE THE CURVE

Second best in the May 4 Listed Cheshire Oaks, **TDN Rising Star Above the Curve (American Pharoah)** made sure she was front and centre where it mattered in Sunday's G1 St Mark's Basilica Coolmore Prix Saint-Alary at ParisLongchamp. Sent up to track the steady pace by Ryan Moore in a close second, the 7-5 favourite was committed with 300 metres remaining and stayed on to deny **Place du Carrousel (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) by a length, with **Queen Trezy (Fr)** (Almanzor {Fr}) the same margin away in third. "They went steady and that was against her--it turned into a sprint, she's still babyish and is still learning and there is plenty to come," Moore said of the Joseph O'Brien-trained winner.

Above the Curve, who had earned TDN Rising Star status at the expense of Thoughts of June (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in a maiden over this trip at Leopardstown Apr. 6 before losing out to that rival on easier ground tackling an extended 11 furlongs at Chester, could be heading back to Ireland for next start according to Hermine Bastide, representing Coolmore. "She has entries in all the big fillies' races including the Prix de Royallieu and the Prix de Diane, but her next race is likely to be the Pretty Polly Stakes at the Curragh," he said. "She is a lovely filly and Joseph is delighted with the performance. Maybe she will be bred to St Mark's Basilica in the future. She is lightly-raced and there is probably more room for improvement, she has a lovely temperament and ticks all the boxes."

Trainer Yann Lerner said of Queen Trezy, "She is so cold it's unbelievable. We fitted her with sheepskins to motivate her, but still she was caught for speed and doing the bare minimum. On the other hand, it is sometimes an advantage for a horse to be so relaxed and it helps on big occasions when you have to deal with the pressure. There is no doubt that a mile and a half will be her game, but I think we will try the Prix de Diane first."

ALTER ADLER STRIKES AS TASSO FLOPS

Things never really happened for the returning Arc hero **Torquator Tasso (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) in Sunday's G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Wirtschaft and as he gave an anti-climactic performance it was Stall Nizza's **Alter Adler (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) who shone. Breaking a run of seconds in group company, the 29-10 second favourite was delivered from rear by Andrasch Starke to take command a furlong from home and draw away for a 1 3/4-length verdict over **Virginia Storm (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}). Rene Piechulek had been giving out all the wrong signals on the 8-5 favourite some way out and Torquator Tasso trailed in sixth of the seven runners, beaten almost 18 lengths in a display too bad to be true. Alter Adler, who was partnered for the first time by Andrasch Starke, had been runner-up in the G1 Deutsches Derby, G2 Gran Premio del Jockey Club and G3 Prix de Reux last term and it had looked as if his luck might not turn as he filled the same positions in the G2 Carl Jaspers-Preis at Cologne Apr. 18 and May 12 G3 Prix d'Hedouville at ParisLongchamp. "I actually wanted to go to the front, but the pace was so fast that it didn't work out at all," Starke told *GaloppOnline*. "So I made a virtue of necessity and sat last. I was behind Torquator Tasso and when I saw he was in trouble, my horse was suddenly buzzing. You saw the rest." Trainer Waldemar Hickst added, "He will now get all the entries, the [G1] Preis Von Europa and Grosser Preis Von Baden and then, as we have already discussed with the owner, we want to try the Arc."

THE EGOT HAS LANDED

Godolphin's homebred 4-year-old colt **Egot (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) notched a fourth black-type triumph with a narrow win contesting Fontainebleau's Mar. 28 Listed Prix Cor de Chasse in his penultimate start and went postward for Sunday's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal at ParisLongchamp coming back off a fifth tackling six furlongs in Chantilly's May 3 Listed Prix Servanne. Last term's Listed Prix de Tourgeville, Listed Prix Matchem and G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise winner was caught napping at the break and trailed all five rivals through halfway in this seven-furlong test. Angled outside for a clear passage in the straight, the 71-10 chance quickened into contention approaching the final furlong and swooped for control inside the final 100 metres en route to an ultimately snug 1 1/2-length success from **Marianafoot (Fr)** (**Footstepsinthesand** {GB}).

EUROPEAN NEWS

ITBF CONFERENCE KICKS OFF JUNE 6

The International Thoroughbred Breeders' Federation bi-annual Conference, hosted by the ITBF and the British Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, will take place at Newmarket June 6-10. Last held in Lexington in 2018, the conference, which was slated to be held in Paris in 2020, was delayed because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Around 70 delegates from 23 countries across six continents are expected to attend. The programme of events takes place over a week and offers members an opportunity to network with other nations as well as raise breeding and wider Thoroughbred industry issues.

Think of Robin Hood, or the Scarlet Pimpernel. Or even Jesse James. There was a little bit of the Great Outlaw in Lester Piggott: enigmatic, often in trouble, and adored by the people in the street.

Lester defied the rules of charisma: very soft voice, never very friendly, always composed, always keeping to himself in public. Ah, but that face, "like a well-kept grave," as somebody said. The intensity of his facial expression was Mount Rushmore--ready--a la Clint Eastwood.

When he returned to riding in 1990 (post High Point) and won a race at the Rowley Mile on a grey and mournful day riding long-shot trained by Julie Cecil, journalist Brough Scott said that it was as if a specter had appeared out of nowhere near the finish line--coming from behind and coming from the past. Lester was capable of tempting the best British racing scribes into lyrical overstatements, go figure.

I was certainly one of those adoring people in the street. And one of my own treasured little stories about Lester Piggott is this. One sunny day following a rainstorm, I was sitting at a restaurant table at Capannelle Racecourse with an entourage of jockeys and trainers. The Italian owner of the horse Lester was soon to ride came by and insisted for his two jockeys (the other was Alan Munro) to cut the lunch short and walk the course. The champion was not happy with the request, and a refusal seemed to be on the cards. And then the housewives' favourite pointed to me and said: "I will go, but only if Andrea comes as well." I probably blushed at the mere and unexpected mention of my name. It was as if Michael Jordan and Bjorn Borg had asked me: "Hey, what are we doing tonight?" Yes, I was young and starstruck, but Lester was more of a star, and also more of a legend: he was a folk hero, for those who were around at the time. And we did go and walk the course.

TAKE, DO DEUCE HOLD ALL THE ACES IN JAPANESE DERBY *by Alan Carasso*

The legendary Yutaka Take, already five times a winner of the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby), gave out an uncharacteristically bullish vibe about the chances of reigning champion 2-year-old male **Do Deuce (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) ahead of Sunday's second jewel of the Japanese Triple Crown over 2400 metres of the Fuchu course, about 20 miles due west of the city centre. And after a little less than a record-breaking 142 seconds on a warm and sunny warm afternoon and with a crowd on that looked and sounded a bit larger than the announced 62,364, the son of US import Dust and Diamonds (Vindication) kicked home down the centre of the track and found the line a neck better than an unlucky **Equinox (Jpn)** (Kitasan Black {Jpn}). **Ask Victor More (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), one of five in the race for the final intake of the 2005 Derby winner--also ridden by Take--was a forward factor throughout and clung on gamely for third. "This is a truly emotional experience for me and I couldn't be happier," said Take, 53, who can now boast of Derby victories in his 20s, 30s, 40s and 50s. "It's so wonderful to be able to win in front of a packed stand--you couldn't be a jockey and not dream of living this moment." Sent away as the 16-5 third choice exiting a wide-trip third behind **Geoglyph (Jpn)** (Drefong) and Equinox in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) at Nakayama last month, last year's G1 Asahi Hai Futurity hero was away fairly from gate 13 and drifted back to settle in the latter third of the field, racing with Equinox in his wake, as **Desierto (Jpn)** (Drefong) cut out the running from Ask Victor More.

Switched off nicely and unhurried entering the final half-mile, Do Deuce stalked Geoglyph into the final 600 metres and was pulled out and around that star-faced chestnut rival entering the long Tokyo straight. Desierto hoisted the white flag not long thereafter, allowing Ask Victor More to inherit the lead, but Take had Do Deuce in high gear, raced up to the front-runner inside the furlong marker and held sway late to score narrowly. Equinox, who drew 18 in the Guineas was unfortunate to do so again Sunday afternoon, was beaten to the punch by the winner and was fractionally short of room in the waning stages before attacking the line for second. His final 600 metres was timed in a race-fastest :33.6, a tenth of a second quicker than the winner. Favored **Danon Beluga (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) ran on for fourth. "He had so much left in the tank at the final corner when I asked him for his run--he responded amazingly and took the lead earlier than planned, but held on well to the wire," Take added. "The [G1] Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe should be a strong option for the owner and will probably be our next target." Do Deuce is one of seven Japanese entries for Europe's weight-for-age centrepiece and is the third Derby winner in the last seven years for trainer Yasuo Tomomichi, who saddled Makahiki (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in 2016 and Wagnerian (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) two years later.

Pedigree Notes:

Do Deuce is one of 11 top-level scores for the now-pensioned Heart's Cry, who famously defeated Deep Impact in the 2005 G1 Arima Kinen and gave Japan a notable victory on the world stage when carrying Christophe Lemaire to a barnstorming victory in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at old Nad al Sheba in 2006. Do Deuce is the second Derby winner for Heart's Cry, who also supplied One and Only (Jpn) in 2014. Heart's Cry is also responsible for dual-surface Grade I winner **Yoshida (Jpn)**, now standing at WinStar Farm in the US. The winner's dam raced as a homebred for Satish Sanan's Padua Stables for the first 10 starts of her career, winning the GII Gallant Bloom H. for trainer Steve Asmussen in 2012 before finishing a clear second in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint with Richard Santulli part of the ownership group. Sent through the Fasig-Tipton November Sale a few days later, Dust and Diamonds was purchased by Borges Torrealba Holdings for \$900,000 and was turned over to trainer Todd Pletcher for whom she won the GIII Sugar Swirl S. in what would be her final racetrack appearance. Of the three foals the mare produced for Torrealba/Three Chimneys, the most accomplished became Much Better, who went on to be placed twice in graded company. Dust and Diamonds was subsequently sold to Katsumi Yoshida for \$1 million carrying a full-sibling to Much Better at the 2016 Keeneland November Sale.

Now 14 years of age, Dust and Diamonds is represented by a 2-year-old Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) filly and was most recently covered by Real Steel (Jpn), the full-brother to ground-breaking GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Loves Only You (Jpn).
