



HARD SPUN COLT 'ROCKETS' TO TOP AT WORKMANLIKE OBS JUNE OPENER

OCALA, FL - The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's June Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training duly marched through its opening session with a \$450,000 son of Hard Spun one of three horses to top the \$200,000 mark Tuesday in Ocala.

At the close of business Tuesday, 192 juveniles had sold for a gross of \$7,110,400. The average of \$37,033 was up from the 2022 session's final average of \$34,431--which included post-sale transactions--but was down from the end-of-session figure of \$38,628. The median of \$20,000 dipped from the final figure of \$22,000, as well as from the end-of-session figure of \$25,500. With 74 horses reported not sold, the session's buy-back rate was 27.8%.

Before the inclusion of post-sale transactions, last year's opening session of the June sale saw 184 head sell for a gross of \$7,107,500. The average was \$38,628 and the median was \$25,500. With 90 horses reported not sold at the fall of the day's last hammer, the 2022 opening-session buy-back rate was 33.1%. That figure improved to 20.7% as a further 33 horses sold post-sale, bringing the final gross to \$7,756,400.

Midway through Tuesday's session, Frank Fletcher, bidding alongside agent Donato Lanni, went to \$450,000 to acquire a son of Hard Spun from the de Meric Sales consignment. Late in the day, Fletcher returned to acquire the day's second-highest priced offering, going to \$230,000 to acquire a colt by Malibu Moon from Gene Recio's consignment.

The session-topper led a day of mixed-bag results for de Meric Sales, which sold all 10 of its horses through the ring for \$988,700 and was the session's leading consignor. The consignment had results everywhere from the session-topping \$450,000 price tag down to \$3,700.


"We saw a little bit of everything today," admitted Tristan de Meric. "It's definitely a little spotty at best, but there is still some demand for the more quality horses. There is a bit of action in the lower-middle, but not as much as we'd all like to see for the number of horses here. I think it's basically typical of the June sale, but maybe a little more magnified this year."

The Hard Spun colt was making his first sales appearance of the year, an angle which has worked well for the consignment in the past, according to de Meric.


"He was sent down to Florida and started in January and we always thought of him as a horse for this sale," de Meric said. "We've found that a fresh horse in this sale can stand out.


People always like to see one for the first time. And that horse stepped up and did everything right. We have done well with horses like him at this sale and, even this year in a spottier market, we are happy with this result and best of luck to Frank Fletcher and Donato."

Fletcher Gets His Hard Spun Colt

Frank Fletcher flew down to Ocala Tuesday morning with the specific intention of purchasing a colt by Hard Spun and the Arkansas native did not go home disappointed, securing hip 130 for \$450,000 from the de Meric Sales consignment midway through the first session of the June sale.

"I just flew down this morning and Donato Lanni showed him to me," Fletcher said. "He liked his work, he likes the way he's built and he likes his speed."

Bred by Reiley McDonald's Athens Woods, the chestnut colt is out of stakes-placed Mine All Mine (Belong to Me) and is a half-brother to stakes-winner Athens Queen (Majestic Warrior). The juvenile worked a furlong last week in a co-bullet :9 4/5.

"We are always looking for 2-year-old colts," Fletcher said. "And it's exciting to get him. I always like coming down here. I love this city and I love this sale. I've been coming here for 25 years."

Fletcher famously names all his horses with some form of Rocket or Rockette in their names. Does he have a name already picked out for this colt?


"He will be something rocket," Fletcher said with a laugh. "I had a horse down here earlier this year in the sale and she worked so well, I withdrew her from the sale and I named her Almost Gone Rocket."

Fletcher had to see off a determined internet bidder to secure the colt, but said he never had a doubt that he was going to come out on top.

"We were going to get him one way or another," he said. "I flew down for him. So I'd be very sad if I was going home without him."

Fletcher said no trainer had been picked out for the youngster.

Goodman Has High Hopes for First Pinhook

Billy Goodman, whose involvement in racing started almost by accident and evolved into a full-on passion, is hopeful his first foray into the juvenile pinhooking market proves just as successful when he and partner Caio Caramori send a colt by American Pharoah (hip 1030) through the OBS sales ring with the SBM Training and Sales consignment Thursday.

Goodman purchased the colt for \$100,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. He is out of Jeweliana (Smart Strike), a daughter of multiple graded winner Roshani (Fantastic Light), and the dam of \$775,000 juvenile Nile River (American Pharoah).

"He just had all the right parts," Goodman said of the colt's appeal last fall. "He was a May 5 foal and a little immature, but I kind of looked at him like, if he just expands exactly as he is right now, he's going to be an absolute beast of a horse. He had an incredible walk and an incredible mind on him. And all of those things came to fruition with him. He blossomed into this incredible specimen and he's got a mind on him like a 4-year-old stakes horse."

Goodman had never even touched a horse when he decided to make a major pivot in his life some 12 years ago.

"Back in 2011, I was managing an Irish pub in Miami for a childhood friend," he explained. "Things just weren't going well and I didn't enjoy it, so I decided to stop. I got a license at Gulfstream and went on the backside and asked for a job. I got a job walking hots."

Goodman, who began working for trainer Peter Gulyas in Florida, eventually made his way to Kentucky and the barn of trainer Todd Pletcher.

"I worked for Todd for six years as a groom," Goodman said. "I was a hotwalker and then a groom and within two months we had two horses in the Derby and My Miss Sophia was second in the Oaks."

Of his experience with horses before that, Goodman admitted, "None. Zero. Never touched a horse. I always knew that I would at some point. Horses were in my system. I was 45 and I said, 'All right, it's time to do this.'"

Goodman purchased his first horse, Eternal Heart, for \$50,000 at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October Sale. Now six, the West Virginia-bred mare is still in his care.

"I was just bathing her when you called," Goodman said of Eternal Heart. "This is going to be her last year racing. I bought this filly and gave her to my friend Caio Caramori, who is a trainer. I went to the barn to help out and I wound up working for him. And I'm still working for him and still buying horses."

Goodman purchased a few weanling-to-yearling pinhooks and enjoyed success on a small scale before deciding to put together a partnership to make his six-figure investment in an American Pharoah colt last year.

"This is the first decent horse that we put a little money together and bid \$100,000 on him," Goodman said.

The colt was originally targeted at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale, where he was to sell under the Goodman Caramori banner, but the partners decided to call an audible earlier this year.

"We broke him and trained him at the Classic Mile right there in Ocala," Goodman said. "We spend the winters down there. We were going to consign himself ourselves at Timonium, but he just got shins. I was battling shins because we got a late start on him. I could have brought him there, but I didn't think it was right for the horse. So we backed off on him a little bit and sent him to Susan Montanye. She's got him now because I had to go back to Lexington. We have 45 horses here."

The colt proved the extra time was worthwhile with a :10 flat work at last week's under-tack show.

"Susan took care of his shins and didn't do too much with him and he went over there and went :10 flat, :20 3/5 and :33 2/5," Goodman said.

"He's just a beast of a horse. He really didn't train all that much and did that. It was kind of freakish what he did."

Goodman expects to be back in action at the upcoming yearling sales.

"I am going to be buying in July, hopefully, and go to New York and September," he said. "We will probably have 40 horses down there in Ocala, total, but we will probably put together four or five [to pinhook] with this group, if this horse sells the way we think he will. And I'll try to build a little business from there, buy our own and do it like that."



Apparently the colt had several of those familiar issues liable to keep a horse off shortlists. He was on the small side, immature. There was that ever-divisive quibble, a touch of sesamoiditis. He was a ridgling. And of course his sire had deceased, which the market tends to view as a discourtesy surpassed only by export to Turkey or Peru. Worse yet, Arrogate had only notched his first winner the week before the sale. The unraced dam, meanwhile, had made a poor start to her breeding career.

The pinhookers were out of the game, then, but Ebbert saw that a little patience might yet draw out genetic potential way in advance of the colt's cost. After all, Don Alberto Corporation had given as much as \$2.85 million for his dam Modeling (Tapit), whose own racing career had been written off so early that her previous owners had her covered as a 2-year-old.

That's not to everyone's taste, it has to be said, and nor did the Distorted Humor colt she was carrying (result of that maiden cover) when acquired by Don Alberto at the 2014 Keeneland November Sale contribute a great deal as the only starter listed on her fifth foal's catalogue page. (He did win a maiden, but ended up beaten under a \$12,500 tag at Belterra.)

But the rest of that page was simply spectacular. Modeling's dam was a Storm Cat half-sister to consecutive Belmont winners, Jazil (Seeking The Gold) and Rags To Riches (A.P. Indy), out of the broodmare legend Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister). And don't forget that the Japanese-trained Casino Drive (Mineshaft) might well have made it three in a row, judged on his impressive reconnaissance in the GII Peter Pan S., but for the injury that kept him out of "Big Brown's" Belmont.

Arcangelo, given due time by Ebbert and trainer Jena Antonucci, came to notice in that same race-and very aptly so. The Peter Pan, positioned between the first two legs of the Triple Crown as a latecomers' springboard to the third, is named for the champion sophomore of 1907. He missed the Derby and Preakness before winning the Belmont, and Arcangelo's revelatory performance last Saturday makes it quite feasible to aspire to the same laurels himself. His lamented sire, after all, was himself a late developer who picked up the pieces of the Triple Crown horses in the GI Travers S. Indeed, Arrogate only broke his maiden the week before the Belmont.

Those to have previously set up their Belmont wins in the Peter Pan include A.P. Indy, whose grandson Tapit this time enhanced his astonishing impact on the most grueling test of an American Thoroughbred in the guise of a broodmare sire. Besides the two starters sired by Tapit himself, Arcangelo was among four of the remaining seven to have been delivered by one of his daughters.

With Tapit as damsire and Better Than Honour as third dam, then, Arcangelo was born for the Belmont. And both sides of his pedigree virtually guarantee continued progress from here.

The dynasty spreading beneath Better Than Honour's granddam Best In Show (Traffic Judge) is too large and familiar to be condensed here, but it's worth reminding ourselves that it features a young stallion very closely related to Arcangelo's dam. By Tapit out of Modeling's half-sister by Street Cry, and far more talented than his final record suggests, Greatest Honour will surely have been in strong demand at just \$7,500 during his debut season at Spendthrift.

Arrogate, meanwhile, is now launching his final juveniles. Having now produced Classic winners from both his first two crops, he has clearly demonstrated a genetic legacy worth preserving from his tragically confined opportunity. Cave Rock has disappeared from the radar for now but would have commercial mileage at stud, as a dual Grade I winner at two. But Arrogate's legacy might yet prove no less secure with a son who was not only among his cheapest yearlings, but among the very best-bred.

Curlin Cuts a Dash

Another daughter of Tapit to be celebrated in New York on Saturday was Dance Card, dam of the brilliant GI Met Mile winner Cody's Wish (Curlin). She was a pretty fast horse by the standards of a stallion who has so dominated the Belmont Stakes, having started out as a \$750,000 2-year-old and finished with a length defeat in the GI Filly & Mare Sprint at the Breeders' Cup. Her own mother was by a Belmont winner, however, and on paper it might seem baffling that his seasoned connections should be so hesitant to stretch out a son of Curlin with first two dams by Tapit and Editor's Note. Apparently a ninth furlong in the GI Whitney will at least be discussed, but speed is plainly considered his forte-just as it is, still more obviously, in another son of Curlin resident in the same barn.

Elite Power, too, extended his winning streak in the GII True North S. on Saturday, replicating their double score at the Breeders' Cup last fall. On that occasion, the Curlin procession also featured Malathaat in the GI Distaff, and this time her role was filled by Clairiere in the GI Ogden Phipps S. Another famous day, then, for a stallion who reiterates the most wholesome of hallmarks in the robust consistency of Cody's Wish and Elite Power, now on a roll of six and seven wins respectively. But this pair, while typically thriving with maturity, can also make us stop and think afresh about the Hill 'n' Dale patriarch, even at 19.

Elite Power's dam Broadway's Alibi represents a different line of Seattle Slew from the one that gave us Dance Card, as she is by his son Vindication. Again, on paper, you might expect a son of Curlin out of GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up by Vindication (albeit Broadway's Alibi also won the GII Forward Gal over 7f) to relish a second turn-much as Exaggerator did, as a son of Curlin out of a stakes-placed sprinter by Vindication. Okay, so it's a sharp family in behind: the dam of Broadway's Alibi was an Astoria S.-winning half-sister by Seeking The Gold to Dialed In (Mineshaft), out of a daughter of juvenile champion filly Eliza (Mt. Livermore). Nonetheless it does feel striking that Bill Mott is talking about his two Curlin dashers respectively stepping up and down in trip to meet over seven furlongs in the GI Forego S.

It just goes to show how different strands of pedigree come through in different horses. If you identified Stallion X as having Mr. Prospector as a grandsire and Deputy Minister as damsire, you'd be perfectly comfortable with the idea that he could pass on a ton of speed. The intrusion of Smart Strike, whose diverse portfolio included several that matched Curlin in thriving round two turns with maturity, has set a tone for much of Curlin's best stock. But that won't stop other flavors filtering through.

And if you'll permit an Englishman the observation, it doesn't help us that so much American blood tends to have been tested over such a narrow span of distance. How many of the names in Curlin's third and fourth generations, all indigenous and largely operating in a standard window, might have been at the limit of their fuel? Is the forgotten sire of Curlin's third dam, Wise Exchange, smuggling through more speed or stamina?

In broader terms, Curlin's dashers remind us that horses are made of flesh and blood, not software data. That being so, we should surely breed for balance and depth of quality, rather than seek some alchemy between a couple of coarsely interpreted sire brands (Curlin x Tapit; Curlin x Vindication). That way, it won't really matter which genetic ingredients end up coming through-it'll all be good stuff.

Lion Runs Up the Ensign for Justify

It was his unusual precocity, by the standards of Curlin, that always set Good Magic apart. Happily, his stock is also emulating his own consolidation at three, and a Derby winner and a Preakness runner-up have helped him carry forward the fight after he narrowly lost out to Bolt d'Oro in that remarkable contest for the freshman title last year.

It's important for the other protagonists to hang in there, then, and **Arabian Lion** duly has the look of a very important horse for his sire.

Justify's breakout Grade I scorer in the Woody Stephens S. continues an exciting June for Arabian Lion's breeders at Bonne Chance Farm, who watched in amazement as another farm graduate, King Of Steel (Wootton Bassett {GB}), broke clear of the pack in the Epsom Derby on his first start in 224 days, only run down late by the winner.

Arabian Lion amply repaid Justify's opening \$150,000 fee as a \$600,000 OBS April purchase, by Zedan Racing from Hidden Brook. In turn, he brings a pedigree that would make that look a bargain, too, if he can keep progressing to a place at stud. His third dam is none other than Personal Ensign, who founded a dynasty commensurate with her elite racetrack status-starting with three Grade I winners among her own foals (plus a fourth beaten a nose in the Carter H.).

As it happens, Arabian Lion is out of a full-sister to the dam of Major Dude, whose recent GII Penn Mile success topped up his status as leading contributor to the coffers of Bolt d'Oro this term.

Bolt d'Oro has so far had four stakes winners this year (101 starters, earnings to date of \$3.1 million), one more than Good Magic (who is certainly making his punches land where they count most, with 83 starters banking \$4.8 million) and two more than Justify (85 starters, \$2.1 million). As last year, however, we again need to congratulate Army Mule, who has also had four stakes winners and tipped \$2 million from just 61 starters (just cents behind Mendelssohn, from as many as 110 starters).

Veterans Strike Gold

Some people were doubtless a little irritated by my choice of a 25-year-old stallion standing at \$80,000 for gold on our "value podium" among proven sires last winter; and no doubt those supervising the evening of his career at WinStar will have managed his book with all due sensitivity to his age. But Speightstown appears to have produced yet another brilliant talent in **Gold Sweep**, nine-length winner of the Tremont S. at Belmont on Sunday.

Born For the task cont.

Bred in Kentucky by Joe Anzalone, Gold Sweep will get some iron out of his dam, who's by Giant's Causeway out of Canadian champion Ginger Brew (Milwaukee Brew). That makes him inbred 3 x 3 to Storm Cat, who gave us Speightstown's dam Silken Doll as well as Giant's Causeway.

Having learned plenty when missing by a neck on debut at Churchill, Gold Sweep looked worth every cent of the \$285,000 he cost Mike McCarty from Indian Creek at Saratoga last summer. He smashed the time for the equivalent filly stakes earlier on the card, by over three seconds, and duly wears a 90 Beyer on his chest going into his next battle.

The disappointment of the race was Vitement, who bombed out after his debut success had promised to reward his breeders for their perseverance in using Speightstown's admirable contemporary, Mizzen Mast. The Juddmonte stalwart was pensioned after producing a single live foal from a few covers in 2021, leaving Vitement as one of 11 current juveniles with the chance to draw out the priceless genes of a son of Cozzene out of a Graustark mare.

With that compression to past glories in mind-the sire of Mizzen Mast's fourth dam was born before the First World War!-you could argue that Caravel was well bought at \$500,000 at Fasig-Tipton in November 2021, simply as a breeding prospect. She was already a graded stakes winner, back then, but now she has supplemented her Breeders' Cup success last autumn with the GI Jaipur S.

Mizzen Mast has duly reserved some of his very best material for late in the piece, and maybe Speightstown, having lately given us Charlatan and Olympiad, is going to keep doing the same with Gold Sweep.



Extra Interest for the Winchells

A good weekend for Tapit mares (and Godolphin homebreds) was kicked off by **Pretty Mischievous**, albeit only just, in the GI Acorn S. on Friday. That helped Into Mischief to a new landmark of \$150 million in earnings, and also keeps him on track for another successful defense of his crown as champion stallion.

Away from Belmont, moreover, the Spendthrift phenomenon also showcased a rising force among the sophomores when Extra Anejo blew away his allowance rivals at Ellis Park on Saturday. This colt cost Winchell Thoroughbreds \$1.35 million from Mt. Brilliant Farm (co-breeder with Orrin H. Ingram) at Keeneland in September 2021, and you could see why in his spectacular debut at the adjacent racetrack last fall. Unfortunately he was then sidelined by a minor injury, and while he did run at Churchill on the first Saturday in May, it was only in an optional allowance. He ran well there, just unable to reel in a sprinter, but this was something else again and he looks ready to make up for lost time.

Like Good Magic, Extra Anejo is out of a Hard Spun mare-and what an interesting mare she is. Superioritycomplex (Ire) brought 400,000gns from the ever astute Marette Farrell, on behalf of Mt. Brilliant, at the dispersal of the storied Ballymacoll Stud at Tattersalls in 2017. She had just finished a light career with a maiden win, but she was out of an unraced daughter of Galileo (Ire) and the Ballymacoll matriarch Hellenic (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), dam of three Group 1 winners. So sending her to Into Mischief really was an attempt to combine the best of both worlds.

The second half of the campaign is looking pretty exciting for the Winchell family and their team, then, with their Derby fourth Disarm taking another step forward in a strong race for the GIII Matt Winn at Ellis Park on Sunday. Inevitably, given his breeders, that colt is by Gun Runner out of-you guessed it-a Tapit mare.





THE X-RAY FILES: TOM MCCROCKLIN

The TDN sat down with 2-year-old consignor Tom McCrocklin for this first offering in a new series presented in cooperation with the Consignors and Breeders Association (CBA). Through conversations with buyers and sellers, the series looks to contribute to the discussion on radiograph findings and their impact on racetrack success.

Tom McCrocklin, who was represented this spring by graduates in both the GI Kentucky Derby and the GI Kentucky Oaks, as well as by a pair of million-dollar juveniles in the sales ring, admitted his approach to vet work varies greatly whether he is shopping for a racehorse prospect or for a potential pinhook prospect.

"It's a very clear distinction when I buy a racehorse for myself or I buy a prospective pinhook horse," the Ocala horseman said. "With the racehorses, I have a pretty good feel of what I can and cannot live with anymore. I feel like I've got my brain wrapped around what young horses can live with and move on with and be racehorses. And then I have the other category of pinhook horses where I know I will have to make buyers and buyers' vets on the other end happy. Then it doesn't matter what I think and what I feel like I know. It matters what they think and what they want."

McCrocklin said veterinarian scrutiny of the horses in his 2-year-old consignments has only become more stringent in recent years.

"The diagnostics done on the sales grounds pre-purchase are off the charts," he said. "I will give you a perfect example. The genie is out of the bottle now with ultra-sounding and ultra-sounding so many structures. These vets are all on a kick now where they want to ultrasound eight suspensory branches and four tendons and four proximal suspensories, which is a lot of soft tissue structure. The long and the short of it is this, in this age group, 2-year-olds in training, under pressure, breezing, very few are going to have pristine ultrasounds. They are almost all going to have some commentary; all ranges of everything from swelling to fiber disruption to actual tears. And they are learning as they go--just like me as a consignor--that we are going to get to where we can't sell many horses if the vets are going to expect perfection."

McCrocklin purchased Kingsbarns (Uncle Mo) for \$250,000 at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale and sold the future GII Louisiana Derby winner and Kentucky Derby runner for \$800,000 at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream sale. And he is co-owner of GIII Gazelle S. winner and Kentucky Oaks runner Promiseher America (American Pharoah). He said the proof of the vet report lies in the performance of horses like those on the racetrack.

"I compare the ultrasounds to their race records," McCrocklin said. "I personally had a filly in the Oaks this year and I personally sold a horse that ran in the Derby this year and they both had soft tissue pathology at the 2-year-olds in training sale. They were both given 30-60 days after the sale and they both wound up being fine. A lot of very good, sound racehorses have significant radiographic and ultrasound pathology. They have it at the 2-year-old sale and they have it throughout their racing careers and a lot of them are very sound horses."

He continued, "I had this conversation with Bob Baffert. 'I tell you what, you pick the 10 soundest horses in your barn--not the 10 best, but the 10 horses that you perceive to be the soundest ones. And you go through those 10 horses and you X-ray everything and you ultrasound everything and do everything these guys are doing at the 2-year-old sales and it will blow your mind what those horses have on radiographs and ultrasounds. You will not believe what you find. And the first thing you are going to say to me is the same thing I am going to say to you at my consignment. I don't know what to tell you, I've been training this horse for six months and he's never had a bad day and he's never had a gram of bute, he's never taken a bad step, he's never worn a bandage. And here you come with all of your machines and when you are done, I want to start crying."

Once McCrocklin buys a yearling in the fall, he will spend the

rest of the year and early spring working with the youngster. That experience gives him a unique perspective on both the horse's potential and his limitations.

"So many of these horses on all ends are being bought by agents," he said. "These guys are really bright and they are good horse buyers. I am in no way criticizing them for the decisions they make, but one distinction between us is that I am in my horse laboratory every day in my barn. I put my hands on horses and I am training horses and I am putting young horses under significant pressure

to buy them in September or October and make a 2-year-old in training sale in March. They show up in September, October and August and they are on the buying end. And they come back in March, April, June and they are on the buying end again. What gets lost along the way is everything that happens on a daily basis in the six to eight months in between. And there is a significant amount of knowledge and education that comes with that process."

Asked for specific examples of issues with yearlings that will knock them out of his pinhooking portfolio, but not necessarily his racing stable, McCrocklin said, "Subcondylar cysts in cannon bones--basically a hole in the cannon bone that you are never going to be able to sell as a 2-year-old--subcondylar cysts in a stifle, which would basically be a femur. I can live with those horses because I've trained so many of them that they are fine. But you take that horse to a 2-year-old sale and you are dead,

you're absolutely dead. So I can't buy them anymore."

McCrocklin's biggest vexation, he said, was the variance of opinions on throats.

"When we're looking in a horse's throat with a scope, everyone has a different opinion," McCrocklin said. "Some people like this, some people like that. On these real popular horses, you can have 10 to 20 scopes and I can have 10 guys come in and say, perfect, perfect and then the 11th vet comes in, a really reputable vet, and says this horse flunks miserably. It is not black and white, it's far from it.

"But here's what I can tell you, again, as a horse trainer, not as a buyer, not as a seller, I have a lot of horses that scope fine and they can't breathe and I have horses that scope like shit and they breeze great, never made a noise, they get their air, they don't make noise when they are breezing. Again it's very mysterious because we keep those vet books at our

> consignment and it says Grade I, everybody loves it, and I'm thinking I've been training this horse for eight months, this horse can't breathe. The only way to identify those horses that scope great at the barn, but can't breathe is what we call a dynamic scope where we put it on them and we actually view what's happening in their throat while they gallop and or breeze. And we see a lot of crazy things happen in these throats that are good at rest and the horse can't tolerate training. And then we have horses that can't fully abduct, they can't

open their arytenoids all the way to clear their airway, but they've never made a noise and they don't have exercise intolerance. And they breeze great."

McCrocklin's advice to shoppers is to find a vet who knows what's a deal-breaker and what might not hinder a horse's performance on the track.

"The big-picture message is that there are definitely not parallel lines between racing performance and vet work," he said. "There is a lot of gray in there. What I tell people is get yourself a very experienced--not just a good vet--but an experienced vet that has a body of work and says, 'Look, I've seen a lot of these horses and they can live with this,' and he also has a body of work and he says, 'Look, I've had a lot of these and none of them make it."

There are a lot of opinions about the Triple Crown. Most of them center on the Preakness and the spacing of the three races. In my opinion, the Preakness is the victim of the Kentucky Derby's success, or as T.D. Thornton said so well in his article June 12:

"Underscoring how the Derby itself is devolving into a be-all/end-all, one-shot endeavor at the expense of the Triple Crown race that follows it, for the first time in 75 years, Mage was the only horse out of the Derby to enter the Preakness."

The Preakness is a very popular event in Baltimore, it just isn't popular on national television because it hasn't been a good, competitive, highest-level race. Here's why that needs to change and how it can be improved for next year.

The 20-horse field for the Kentucky Derby offers bettors and fans Roman chariot race excitement. The horses get banged-up cut-up, and many put on the shelf for a while. Any extra betting handle coming from the cavalry charge of 20 horses to the first turn is not worth the risk to riders, horses and the sport, especially right now. Many in the industry hold their breath for two minutes.

For safety reasons, Churchill Downs (CD) needs to limit the Derby to a maximum 14 starters, like the Breeders' Cup. If they do that, good things will happen. The immediate result is CD is seen as making a positive safety move, but the magic for the Preakness, is that potentially six horses move to the second Classic with fresh horses and perhaps a full field for bettors and fans. NBC gets to promote a much better product and the Triple Crown improves.

CD may not like it, but the rest of the industry should. If CD does not make this change on its own, then there are two strategies to make it happen. First, the TOBA Graded Stakes Committee rules the maximum starters in a Grade 1 race is 14, same as the Breeders' Cup, which is a very common sense move. Second, HISA rules the same for safety reasons.

This idea is one way the industry can help the Preakness, the Triple Crown and the sport without controversy. But it's an incremental strategy that does not get to the core reason we have the Triple Crown.

Around the Thoroughbred world, breeders and owners each year seek to "prove the breed" through a series of 3-year-old Classic races for colts and fillies. All the other racing countries start in a common sense way with a shorter race first, usually at one mile, then move to 1 1/2 miles, then the final leg is somewhere longer. Not us. We start at 1 1/4 miles, then backslide to 1 3/16, then jump to 1 1/2 miles. It doesn't make

sense, thus it doesn't work in an increasingly competitive sports world.

1/ST Racing, owners of the Preakness S., should do something in their own best interest to improve the Triple Crown. They should move the shorter distance Preakness to become the first Classic, perhaps two to three weeks prior to the Kentucky Derby, which is locked into the first Saturday in May. They do not need Churchill Downs permission.

1/ST Racing also owns two of the major Classic prep races, the Florida Derby and the Santa Anita Derby, both at 1 1/8 miles, which they can adjust dates and leverage toward the Preakness. What about all the other Classic prep races? They will need to adjust, which they have done from time to time. Remember, the objective is three Classic races to "prove the breed."

With the shorter Preakness moved out of the way, the Derby horses would then have five weeks to rest up and prepare for the Belmont, which is what many trainers are doing now by skipping the Preakness. This extra time for all horses will make the Belmont a much better competition.

Moving the date of the Preakness would require the Maryland Racing Commission, City of Baltimore and 1/ST Racing to continue to collaborate on how to make Maryland racing a more successful venture with a future. To that end, the uncertainty of Pimlico and Laurel should lead to some bold thinking about how Baltimore can have a true racing success story. It's going to cost a lot of money to find any facility solution, even a bad one, why not go big on a proven racing model?

Baltimore Harbor has been the focus of major urban renewal to bring tourism downtown. It's been a struggle to find a dynamic focal point. There is great opportunity to bring Baltimore harbor a Hong Kong-style, urban race track. A sports and residential complex on the harbor, right downtown. It can be a multi-purpose facility without training stalls, where horses are shipped in on race days/nights from the training centers at Laurel and Fair Hill. Happy Valley is a multi-purpose sports complex on less than 100 acres in Hong Kong. This could be the most stunning racing facility in America, a true tourism draw for Baltimore.

It's a lot easier to address the minor problems of three races in the Triple Crown than it is to tackle the structural problems of the sport in America. *TDN* does a good job of allowing readers to offer ideas, maybe some of them will click.



NEWMARKET, UK--George Boughey is aiming to build on his two winners at Royal Ascot last year by taking a team of around 20 to next week's meeting, led by the G2 Coventry S. favourite Asadna (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}).

Sheikh Abdullah Almalek Alsabah's colt, who earned a TDN Rising Star with his 12-length win at Ripon on his sole start, will be ridden by William Buick, who partnered him in a gallop on Tuesday morning. Buick will also ride Soprano (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) in the G3 Albany S.

"The two-year-olds will probably be leading the charge," said Boughey, who also plans to send Muqtahem (Ire) (Soldier's Call {Ire}) to either the G2 Norfolk S. or Windsor Castle S., and Graceful Thunder (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}) for the G2 Queen Mary S.

"Asadna was very good at Chelmsford in a piece of work the other day. Oisin Murphy rode him there and William rode him this morning and was very happy." Cont. p3

AUSTRALIAN BLOODSTOCK APOLOGISES OVER NEW ENERGY COMMENTS

Luke Murrell, one of the directors of Australian Bloodstock, has issued a public apology following disparaging comments made in regard to the former connections of the syndicate's recent purchase New Energy (Ire) (New Bay {GB}).

Australian Bloodstock has enjoyed notable success with horses recruited from Europe, which include the Melbourne Cup winners Protectionist (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and Gold Trip (Fr) (Outstrip {GB}). A video released over the weekend promoting last year's Irish 2,000 Guineas runner-up New Energy as a potential Cox Plate candidate included comments from Murrell which called into question the competence of his former trainer Sheila Lavery and jockey Robbie Colgan. The video sparked widespread outrage from members of the racing community in Ireland and Britain and has subsequently been deleted.

Boughey added, "He has a super attitude. I think we will watch him walk round the paddock ahead of the Coventry like he is here in the paddock. He'll go there with a good chance.

"He just has an amazing temperament. He doesn't sweat, he doesn't do anything wrong. He's a very sound horse. He just loves his work."

Hosting owners and press at his stable on Tuesday morning, Boughey took all of his Ascot hopefuls onto the nearby watered gallop alongside the Rowley Mile. Soprano, owned by Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, won at Newmarket on Guineas weekend, beating Midnight Affair (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), who subsequently won Saturday's Hilary Needler Trophy at Beverley. "Soprano was very good at Newmarket," Boughey added.

"She's certainly not a five-furlong horse. When she steps up in trip we'll see a better filly."

Amo Racing's retained jockey Kevin Stott was aboard Graceful Thunder, a winner on debut at Sandown, alongside Pat Cosgrave and Pontefract winner Muqtahem, who could bid to emulate his


sire Soldier's Call by winning the Listed Windsor Castle S.

"The two-year-olds are still learning. We worked six, and four of them will go to Ascot," Boughey said.

"I didn't find anything out, necessarily. They are just teaching each other as they go along. Asadna, Soprano, Muqtahem, Graceful Thunder, they are all going to their respective races and it was all pretty straightforward work, but they all pleased me."

Among his older horses, Boughey has two candidates for the G1 Commonwealth Cup in Al Dasim (Ire) (Harry Angel {Ire}) and Believing (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}), who each have Group 3 wins to their credit already this year, in Dubai and France respectively.

He said of Al Dasim, "He was meant to go to the Sandy Lane and we just weren't happy with the ground that day for him. He needs fast ground and I don't think we'll see the same horse at Ascot if we do get the rain. His work on fast ground is much better. He worked well on the watered gallop with a bit of ease in the ground and he's in good shape; I couldn't be happier with him." Cont. p4

Having saddled both Inver Park (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Missed The Cut (Quality Road) to win at Royal Ascot last year, Boughey, who now has just over 100 horses across three yards in Newmarket, is understandably hungry for more success.

He added, "This is by far the best team we've had [going to Ascot] so far. It's the international stage. We're trying to find horses to run around the world, everyone's there and it really is the be-all-and-end-all for us at this time of the year. Obviously the better two-year-old races happen towards the end of the year but at the moment this is what everyone is gearing up to. It's the feature event."

The trainer notched an important first Classic win in 2022 with Cachet (Ire) (Aclaim {Ire}) in the 1,000 Guineas, and the Highclere-owned filly has not raced since running at Royal Ascot last year.

"Cachet looks better than she has all spring," Boughey noted. "It wasn't fair to take her straight to Royal Ascot after a year off the track, running six furlongs for the first time, and I also didn't think it was fair to run her in a Group 2 over a mile, not having been a convincing stayer on the stiff track.

"I haven't really got a plan at the moment. She's training away nicely, but at the end of the day, her main target is a mares' sale at the end of the year.

"She wasn't right to go to a sale at the end of last year and we will try to have her as busy as she can be into December, but I'm not going to rush her. She's a valuable filly and doesn't really need to prove anything else."

He added, "She has done a couple of bits [of work], but she's not sparkled yet and we know what she can do, so we've given her plenty of time. I don't know why she hasn't [sparkled]. It's very warm now and she is starting to thrive, but it has been a pretty hard spring for them and she just hasn't for some reason."

The treble Group 1 winner is heading to the G1 Queen Anne S. on the opening day of the royal meeting, having missed her initial intended resumption in the G1 Lockinge S.

"We have been very happy with her recently and she enjoyed her work there," said John Gosden. "A racecourse gallop was part of the plan and it is a big help heading into Royal Ascot without having had a run."

Inspiral also made her seasonal reappearance at Royal Ascot last year, when winning the G1 Coronation S.

Gosden added, "It does give us confidence going there, knowing that we have done this before. It is like all these fillies though, they will tell you when they are ready to run, you don't tell them."

The trainer also issued an update on Inspiral's stable-mate and fellow four-year-old Emily Upjohn (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), the winner of the G1 Coronation Cup on her sole start this year. She will now drop back in trip for the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown on July 8.

"For a big girl she has a tremendous turn of foot which is a potent weapon," Gosden said. "She had quite a time off from October before her run at Epsom and she didn't run a lot last year after it all went a bit strange in the King George but she seems in great order now.

"Coming back in trip will be alright for her, and 10 furlongs at Sandown should suit her fine. We will then hopefully look towards going back over a mile and a half again."

One of Emily Upjohn's potential rivals in the Eclipse, Adayar (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), appeared on the July Course as Inspiral was warming down after her piece of work, and the Godolphin star was joined by Native Trail (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Yibir (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) among a team of six horses from Moulton Paddocks.

Speaking after they exercised in three pairs, with William Buick aboard Adayar, James Doyle on Native Trail, and Shane Featherstonhaugh on Yibir, Charlie Appleby said, "We are only a week out so I wasn't going to be asking them to put in a thunderous piece of work. I was happy with the way they all behaved.

"As we know, this is a testing week going into [Royal Ascot] but if they all stay fit and well from here on in they should be a nice competitive team. It is one of those meetings you can't go there with your chest out. We will go there and take it day by day. As we stand here now we are going into the start of the meeting with Modern Games and Native Trail in the Queen Anne and hopefully that will start the ball rolling early doors for us."

Of Native Trail, who was runner-up in the G2 Bet365 Mile at the Guineas meeting, he added, "He has definitely come forward for his run at Newmarket. He had wind surgery during the winter but I was very pleased with that this morning. He moved well today but he has always got that raspiness, but that is him, however it doesn't stop him. I was pleased with the way he hit the line there. He will head to the Queen Anne now along with Modern Games, who is back at home as he doesn't need to do any more himself.

"I'm a strong believer that Native Trail won't be too far behind him in getting his Group 1 this year."

Last year's Derby winner Adayar, who won the G3 Gordon Richards S. on his return to action in May, is also pleasing Appleby.

"You could see his enthusiasm in dragging William to his lead horse, and he went through the line well and he had his ears pricked. I think it is a great experience for these horses and we are lucky to be able to do it. A week out we just want them to come up and enjoy themselves.

"He goes into the Prince Of Wales's as near-on favourite or joint-favourite and deservedly so on what we saw at the Guineas meeting. We all want decent ground but the one thing he has up his sleeve is that he can handle soft ground."

The Breeders' Cup Turf winner Yibir is taking a big step up in trip for the Gold Cup a week on Thursday.

"We know it is an extra mile on top of his normal trip but on the back of what we have seen with the likes of Broome and those good older mile-and-a-half horses they can do that," said the trainer.

"I would be a bit bold to say he is going to get the two and a half miles but he has got the right run style and if it is quick ground we know he enjoys that sounder surface.

"These older mile-and-a-half horses don't get any guicker and the division he is in is a tough division now. We thought going this way might just open up some doors for him."

"I must admit that my emotions and excitement in relation to the purchase of this horse got the better of me and I used some language in that video which was extremely disparaging, untrue, cruel, malicious and hurtful to the people either mentioned or implied.

"The video and comments by me went online without being edited or checked and I am not going to make any excuses to justify the comments because there is no excuse. None at all.

"But nothing I can say, whether it be emotions or stress or words used to encourage a buyer, nothing at all excuses the comments made by me in the promotional video which were related to some very good people, Sheila Lavery, Robbie Colgan and any person associated with the horse.

"I unreservedly withdraw any comments that have caused harm or distress to those three people, Sheila's staff and any persons connected to them as family, or friends or colleagues in the racing industry.

"Our company has built a wonderful association with our friends and colleagues all over the world but in particular Europe and my comments can only cause damage to those relationships and cause harm to the subjects of those comments." Cont. p7

"Again, I apologise for the harm caused to those involved and to anyone who has been distressed by those comments and trust that my mistake will not damage the work we have done over a long period of time to build professional and personal relationships in this great industry we are involved in."

New Energy, who also finished a length behind subsequent Group 1 winner Kinross (GB) (Kingman {GB}) when second in the G2 Park S. last season, is to join the stable of Ciaron Maher and David Eustace after a short time in Newmarket with the latter's brother, Harry.

MAJOR VAT DECREASE FOR FRENCH **BREEDING**

The rate of Value Added Tax (VAT) for Thoroughbred breeding in France has been reduced from 10% to 5.5%, according to a report by Jour de Galop on Tuesday. Furthermore, the tax reduction will be applied retrospectively to Jan. 1, 2023.

Loic Malivet, president of the Federation des Eleveurs du Galop (French TBA), said, "This rate of 5.5% is very important because it puts racing back in the agricultural sector, and that's only fair. I thank the minister of Agriculture and the Director of the Horse."

NICHOLLS SNAPS UP 160K BEAUMEC DE HOUELLE GELDING AT GOFFS ARKLE SALE

Trainer Paul Nicholls and bloodstock agent Tom Malone flexed their muscles at the newly-branded Goffs Arkle Sale on Tuesday by signing for three lots to the tune of €410,000, including the €160,000 day one topper, a Beaumec De Houelle (Fr) gelding already named Zamek (Fr) consigned by Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables.

That was the highest average posted by any buyer on day one, however, it was the point-to-point outfit Monbeg Stables who posted the highest aggregate spend by signing for 15 lots to the

tune of €784,000.

Of the 224 horses offered at Goffs on day one, 204 were sold for an aggregate of €10,862,500, representing a €53,248 average.

Zamek was picked up as a two-year-old from Precolette at the mixed sale at Argana last July for €70,000. Out of the Sinndar (Ire) mare Zanatiya (Fr), the gelding is a half-brother to the classy jumps performer Zarisk (Fr) (No Risk At All {Fr}).

Beaumec De Houelle is a son of Martaline and fittingly stands at Haras de Montaigu for €6,000. A Grade 1-winning hurdler himself, his first crop are just three years' old.

On the day one headline act, Nicholls commented, "He is a lovely, sharp horse and we're delighted to get him. He actually reminds me a lot of Call Equiname, who was a similarly lovely-looking grey horse. Hopefully he can be as good as him."

WELLINGTON PRIMED FOR ROYAL ASCOT AFTER STRONG TRIAL

Dual Hong Kong Champion Sprinter **Wellington (Aus)** (All Too Hard {Aus}), who is slated to take part in Royal Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee S., placed third in a 1000-metre turf trial (*video*) at Sha Tin on Tuesday morning, to the delight of trainer Richard Gibson.

A four-time Group 1 winner, Wellington was kept under a tight rein throughout by Alexis Badel and clocked :57.94 for the trial.

"There's no greater judge than Alexis to base his [Wellington's] form and condition on and we're really satisfied with the trial," Gibson said.

The gelding, who triumphed in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in December, would be the first Royal Ascot winner for Hong Kong since the Danny Shum-trained Little Bridge (NZ) (Faltaat) won the G1 King's Stand S. back in 2012.

Gibson, who saddled Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) to a second-placed run in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. in 2016, added, "It's hot and we've got to travel in a few days. He did everything perfectly today. He's on the plane on Saturday and we're looking forward to it. It was a good boost to see him work so well this morning."
