



A TEARFUL SERVIS SENTENCED TO FOUR YEARS IN PRISON

NEW YORK, N.Y.–Disgraced former trainer Jason Servis was sentenced to four years in prison by judge Mary Kay Vyskocil in U.S. District Court in Manhattan Wednesday. Servis, one of more than two dozen people charged after a wide-ranging investigation by the FBI into horse doping, had earlier pled guilty to one felony count and one misdemeanor count related to the use of the banned substances Clenbuterol and SGF-1000.

"You deliberately engaged in illegal conduct for years," Vsykocil told Servis. "This was not a one-time offense or an aberration. Your doing so put the lives of the horses and the jockeys who rode them at risk. You caused staggering losses to multiple competitors, making more than 25 million in purses. You reaped huge financial rewards because of your criminal conduct."

Four years was the maximum sentence that Vyskocil could have levied against Servis for the guilty pleas on the two counts. Before entering into a plea agreement with the government, Servis faced up to 25 years in prison on charges of conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud. Those charges were dropped when Servis plead guilty to the lesser charges.

I am the owner of a small stable with 35 horses in training split between multiple states. I wanted to share my first-hand experience on what happens when your trainer has been provisionally suspended, as well as my own thoughts on what is happening within our beloved industry.


HISA/HIWU testing and enforcement went live roughly 60 days ago. Every week, there is news in the trade publications of trainers who have been provisionally suspended or have had an unfavorable test result. The rules continue to be modified as the original implementation of those rules caused more harm than good. (Horses raced that should not have been able to, trainers were suspended, trainers were not suspended, claims were voided, reversals of claims due to failed tests weeks after the fact, just to mention a few...)



Servis, 66, addressed the court briefly, breaking down in tears before he gave his statement. Servis was so emotional that Vyskocil considered taking a recess in order for Servis to compose himself, but his lawyer, Rita Glavin, said that wouldn't be necessary.

"No words can explain how remorseful and sorry I am over the decisions I've made and the people I've let down, and the people I've hurt, mostly my wife and two sons," he said. "I will live with this the rest of my life and I am most truly sorry and I throw myself at the mercy of the court."

Government attorney Sarah Mortazavi told the court that not only had Servis used performance-enhancing drugs to gain an advantage for his horses but he was slow to concede that he had done anything wrong. Part of Servis's defense was that veterinarians assured him that it was not illegal to use SGF-1000. She noted that both the New York Gaming Commission and the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium had made it clear that the use of SGF-1000 was prohibited.


"Jason Servis knew that using these drugs was a problem and was illicit and he tried to hide it," Mortazavi said. "He thought he knew better than two oversight bodies and he assumed he could continue his conduct uninterrupted and that he would be fine. He was wrong."

Glavin, a high-profile New York attorney who represented former New York Governor Andrew Cuomo over sexual misconduct charges, did not deny that Servis had done wrong. But in an attempt to get a sentence of less than four years for her client, she tried to make a case that his offenses were relatively minor when compared to the conduct of other trainers and veterinarians who had come before the same court on charges related to doping.

"SGF-1000 and Clenbuterol, those are substances that are qualitatively different from what was going on with other trainers in this case," she said as part of a lengthy address to the court. "People have been sentenced to just 36 months or less for conduct that is far more egregious."

She continued, reeling off a list of names of both
Thoroughbred and Standardbred trainers who had previously
been sentenced: "Mr. Servis is not Jorge Navarro, he is not Rene
Allard or Richard Banca. He is not Louis Grasso, Rick Dane, Jr.,
Marcos Zulueta or Chris Oakes. But what he did was wrong.
Painfully wrong. He will be going to jail and during that time his
90-year-old parents, who are not in good health, could pass
away. This is not an easy case, but there's something different
with Mr. Servis's case when you look at his conduct and we ask
you to take that into consideration."

Vyskocil was not swayed by Glavin's argument that Servis was somehow less of a cheat than others when had also been convicted and sentenced. *Cont.*

"You cheated, you lied and you broke the law," the judge said. "You did endanger the horses in your care. Luckily, they didn't break down. You tried to gain an unfair advantage. I hope you accept that but I don't think that you do. At the end of the day, unquestionably, you undermined the integrity of horse racing."

Vyskocil seemed frustrated by the fact that, under the plea agreement, she could not sentence Servis to a term of more than four years.

"Your counsel served you very well," she said. "She got an outstanding plea deal for you. As a result, the maximum sentence you face is 48 months. I see no reason to go below it. In my judgment, more than 48 months might have been appropriate."

Vyskocil also made note of Servis's association with Navarro, who was sentenced to five years on charges similar to what Servis faced. Servis and Navarro were caught on government wiretaps comparing notes on their doping programs. Servis would acquire a bronchodilator from Navarro that is believed to be more potent than Clenbuterol.

"You turned to one of the most notorious drug abusers in the industry," she said.





Glavin noted that Servis wished that he never got involved with Navarro.

"In conversations with me, Mr. Servis said that this greatest regret in life was his association with Jorge Navarro," said Glavin. "Navarro ended up in the barn next to him and that was how it happened."

Servis must report for sentencing on November 1. In addition to the prison sentence, he has had to make a payment of \$311,760 in forfeiture and was ordered to pay \$163,932 in restitution and a \$30,000 fine.

I continue to read and hear HISA representatives talk about not being in the public relations business but the enforcement business. I can't decide whether these statements are ignorant, arrogant, worse, or both. Of course you are in the public relations business and the fact that is not understood is baffling. Simply look at the injection-of-joints debacle that has unfolded over the last several weeks. The suspensions, non-suspensions, ineligibility to race, and the fact that they didn't know they had raced. What?!!


Credit to HISA/HIWU for getting the final ruling correct, but look at the unnecessary churn created and the net result: even more distrust within the industry. Worse, without clear conversations about why these animals use injections to benefit their overall health and welfare, the general public will view the industry as giving them heroin.

We hear from HISA representatives that provisionally suspending trainers is in the best interest of the industry and it's what is in the best interest of the horse. I would like to respond to these statements with, `horseshit!' There have been no medical studies to support this position. There are only anecdotal representations to other sports or jurisdictions on how they manage or operate.

Horse racing in the United States is not the Olympics, nor should we be governed by any other country. We live by the rule of law and protections where the government can't deprive any person of "life, liberty, or property without due process." What I have experienced or seen from HIWU could only be described as a kangaroo court where there is no rule of law. Everything is guided by speculation and enforcement without representation on procedural rules.

To suspend someone before they have a hearing and before all test results are complete can only be defined as economic depravity. I think a few Constitutional scholars out there would think this would be a violation of your 14th Amendment rights. There is no consideration given if a trainer is suspended only to have it reversed or an adverse decision reversed. The irreputable harm has already occurred with no remedy.

When one of my trainers was provisionally suspended, I had to find new trainers for all 17 of my horses I had stabled with this trainer. There was zero notification from HISA/HIWU explaining what needed to be done. Every one of my horses under this trainer in the HISA database had a red shield under the horse rather than the traditional green. Listed next to each horse was a statement that none of my horses could compete or train in any timed workout.



All of my horses entered in races at the time of the notification were scratched from the races in which they were entered. Several of them had already received their race-day medications from the various state veterinarians. As the owner, I had no representation in what had occurred or what needed to occur. How anyone could articulate those horses were more at risk running in those races due to my trainer receiving a provisional suspension is not supported by any factual basis but rather a procedure rule. This rule, by the way, is in direct conflict with the Federal Trade Commission's own Federal Trade Commission Act Section A) prevent unfair methods of competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices in or affecting commerce.

We have built a stable around the claiming game. We have been blessed to win a few listed stakes but our program sticks in our swim lane which is claiming horses between the \$12,000-\$50,000 level. When my horses miss works or they were scratched from the races in which we were entered, we are at the mercy of the condition book on when or if those conditions would be written back in a timely manner.

I am fortunate to be in a position to be able to work to move the horses to new trainers, focus on the condition book and get settled in for the summer. We sent a large contingent of horses to Del Mar for their summer meet in hopes to capitalize on the ship-and-win program. *Cont.*

My trainer is a young man who is early in his career. He isn't in the financial position to have his entire livelihood taken from him without due process. Within 18 hours of being notified on a holiday weekend, he was suspended and locked out of the HISA database. He is awaiting the results of his split "B" sample (it's been 19 days, by the way.) He hasn't been charged or convicted of doing anything other than having a blood sample come back with an 'Altered Chemical Identification of Unknown Origin'.

We have heard HISA representatives continue to make representations regarding the testing environment and how the people performing the tests have been certified and the labs for the first time are accredited and testing for the same levels.

What isn't said: are the labs able to differentiate between a contaminated sample vs. an administered sample?

What's worse, in my trainer's case, the people performing the test were not wearing gloves and were not wearing sterile gowns, nor are the receiving barns/test barns cleaned and thoroughly sterilized before and after every animal is processed. The people performing the tests are not drug tested, nor is my trainer allowed to ask anyone if they take the medication in question as it would violate those individuals' rights under HIPPA laws. Remember, people have a right to privacy and have their own medical records be held private.

As the trainer, the HIWU rules are stacked against you. As the trainer, the burden is on you to show how the horse came into

contact with the medication. In this case, the results of the "A" sample showed a level of 1/150 of the required level to have any pharmacological effect. HIWU doesn't seem to care about the facts; they are only concerned about the fact the animal had this medication in its system and this medication is considered to be a banned substance. Everyone should know this medication is allowed under ARCI, WADA, and USADA guidelines. Also for reference, the last trainer to receive a positive for this medication received no days and no fine as it was determined the medication doesn't have any performance-enhancing qualities. (This was prior to HISA/HIWU taking effect in May.)

My trainer will submit a signed declaration under penalty of perjury that he did not provide this medicine to the animal, nor has he ever provided this medication to any animal under his care. Furthermore, at my request, he took a polygraph test to confirm the same information.

A horse who has a chemical-altered identification could be out of competition for up to 14 months. Think about that: if you spent \$1 million on a yearling or 2-year-old, your asset could be stranded and impaired for over a year. You have no rights and no opportunity to remedy or challenge the finding. We hear it's for the greater good of the sport but there is no science or fact to support this position--only talking points. Sales companies and stallion farms should be deeply troubled, and owners will need to rethink a capital investment. Good luck trying to explain during an audit why their asset has become stranded or impaired with no ability to remedy. *Cont.*

HISA representatives continue to make representations about transparency and ethical conduct. I am struggling with this, given they make little to no disclosures around their overall operations. They are operating with an unchallenged budget with no certifications or disclosures. The industry should demand a basic set of disclosures. If they want to establish trust within the industry, they must comply.

- Publish meeting minutes and attendees.
- Publish all officer and director salaries.
- Publish all contracts and financial commitments over \$250,000. Certify those contracts fulfil government accounting and procurement standards and no material conflicts of interest exist between related parties.
- Publish any charitable or political donations by all officers for over \$250.
- Certify the HISA Database meets all federal requirements for security and compliance standards with how every registered individual's Personal Indefinable Information (PII) is maintained.
- Certify all officers and directors have taken appropriate Government Mandated Code of Conduct training.
 Certify there are not any conflicts of interest between anyone in an oversight capacity and those they are regulating.

I support what this legislation was originally intended to accomplish. If I go back and read articles from 2017 about what the legislation was intended to do versus where we are today, I am troubled. The industry needed a common set of rules applied against each jurisdiction to ensure a common playing field. Those who are materially trying to influence the outcome of racing and placing the animal's well-being behind personal interest should be dealt with accordingly.

We seem to have lost a sensible, reasonable approach within an industry that can't afford any additional burdens. The game will not survive unless there can be balanced enforcement that affords equal protections to all parties including the animal. If it is determined the actions taken are detrimental to the industry the pervasive attitude must change or this industry will collapse faster than what anyone is prepared for. All you need to know is one fact: there are fewer horses born this year than there was last year.

Smith will be 58 in August, and business has tapered off for him this year, to the point where his Haskell win was just his sixteenth of the year. He admitted some frustration with that. But he said

that wins like Saturday's gave him confidence.

"If I did anything right in my career, it was that I took up physical fitness at an early age, instead of playing golf and running around. NO FRACTURES OR SERIOUS INJURY FOR VELAZQUEZ FOLLOWING SPILL AT THE SPA

Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez--dismounted from first-time starter Love Thyself (Solomini), who ducked in sharply shortly after the start in Wednesday's third race over the Mellon Turf Course at Saratoga--escaped the incident without serious injury.

"Per agent Ron Anderson, John Velazquez was evaluated by Dr. Richard Alfred at the Bone and Joint Center of the Capital Region following the incident at the start of race three today," said a statement released by the New York Racing Association. "X-rays revealed no fractures or serious injury to Velazquez's left wrist. Love Thyself walked to the barn area and appears unharmed."

Velazquez was taken off the remainder of his mounts on the card. He is listed to ride five at Saratoga on Thursday.

ORTIZ RETURNS AFTER FRIDAY'S SPILL...AND WINS THREE by Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.–Jockey Jose Ortiz's return to competition at Saratoga Race Course Wednesday was very rewarding with three victories…and taxing.

Ortiz was unseated and fell hard to the ground when his horse clipped heels in the first race of Friday's card. He was sent to Albany Medical Center where he was found to have bruised ribs. Ortiz took off his mounts Saturday and Sunday and was ready to ride again Wednesday, the start of the third week of the meet.

In his comeback, Ortiz won with three of his five mounts. All of the wins were for leading trainer Linda Rice: Ichiban (Street Sense) in the sixth, Amanda's Folly (Mendelssohn) in the eighth and Indian Mischief (Into Mischief) in the 10th. Indian Mischief came out in the stretch and appeared to interfere with runner-up He's a Lucky Guy (Street Boss), but the stewards did not change the order of finish.

Ortiz has 11 victories at Saratoga this summer and has ridden eight of Rice's 13 winners. They were the leading jockey and trainer at the spring meet at Belmont Park.

After willing Ichiban to win the sixth race by a head with a hard ride through the stretch, Ortiz took part in the post-race winner's circle photographs, did a television interview and-clearly needing a breather--sat down.

"I feel better," he said. "This filly made me a little bit tired. I had to ride her a lot, but I'm just glad to be back."

Ortiz said he got on horses Sunday and Wednesday mornings and was no longer dealing with pain from the injuries. *Cont.*

"I'm pretty good about the ribs," he said. "Just a little bit winded now. She was very lazy today."

Ortiz was aboard for Ichiban's maiden-breaking seven-furlong victory on July 15, when she was up on the pace. In the mile and an eighth, two-turn race Wednesday, she was four lengths behind the leader at the top of the stretch and looked beaten. Ortiz pushed her and she responded.

"I was a little bit worried because the other horse opened up on me," he said, "but I'm just glad we got there first."

Ortiz came off Same Old Fears (Uncle Mo) near the finish of the program opener Friday. He stayed on the ground for several minutes, was helped to his feet and was able to walk off the course. At that point, it appeared that he might have some serious injuries.

"I was feeling a lot of pain when I left here, so I thought I cracked a rib or something," he said. "I'm just happy to be back."

Getting down to business early, the champion 2-year-old filly from 2021 and 'TDN Rising Star' Echo Zulu added the second graded stakes victory of her 4-year-old campaign with a geared-down win in the GII Honorable Miss H. Wednesday afternoon at Saratoga Race Course.

Breaking from the inside post position, the 2-5 favorite rushed out to the early lead and was shadowed by Frank's Rockette through a quarter in :22.02 and a half in :44.45. Echo Zulu waved good bye to that foe at the top of the lane, striding clear with authority and was taken in hand late as she cantered under the wire 7 1/4 lengths in front. Dr B closed to best Frank's Rockette for second.

"She's able to go very [fast]," said winning jockey Florent Geroux.

Geroux continued: "She's able to get a nice breather at the three-eighths and she's just waiting for my cue down the lane. As soon as I push the gas, she responds right away, so automatic. She's just gifted."

Winning trainer Steve Asmussen added, "I was extremely nervous about just getting away from there [the gate] cleanly. She broke well, very comfortable and very fast. She looked beautiful coming into the stretch.

"[Her speed] is not new. From her maiden race here, she goes along at a rate that they're not comfortable doing. I think it's that simple: she's extremely fast. She really is. She's doing it quicker than they are, easier than they are in comparison to the other horses."

Echo Zulu was named champion 2-year-old filly of 2021 after an unbeaten campaign that included victories in the GI Spinaway S., GI Frizette S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She opened her sophomore season with a win in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks, but suffered her first loss when fourth in the GI Kentucky Oaks. She returned last fall to win the Sept. 24 GIII Dogwood S. and was second behind champion Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper) in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint. The talented bay filly returned this year with a powerful 5 3/4-length victory in the May 29 GIII Winning Colors S.

According to Assmusen, the plan is for Echo Zulu to put her perfect three-for-three record at Saratoga on the line in the Aug. 26 GI Ballerina H., a 'Win and You're In' race for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint.

"Oh, absolutely," Asmussen said. "That is the target for the summer."

ARCANGELO TUNES UP FOR TRAVERS

Blue Rose Farm's **Arcangelo** (Arrogate), most recently winner of the GI Belmont S., tuned up for the Aug. 26 GI Travers S. with a five-furlong work in 1:01.23 (2/10) over the main track at Saratoga Wednesday.

Trained by Jena Antonucci and piloted through the work by Javier Castellano, Arcangelo was caught by NYRA clockers through splits of :24 1/5 and :36 2/5 before galloping out in 1:14 2/5 and 1:27 flat.

"He was great. It was a beautiful work. Javier was very pleased," Antonucci said.

Wednesday's work was Arcangelo's third over the Saratoga surface.

"He loves it. We're so blessed with him, he doesn't seem to care what's underneath him," Antonucci said. "He handles it beautifully. Facilities has done a great job of keeping it very consistent and he's thriving off of that."

Antonucci said Arcangelo has enjoyed breezing on a 10-day schedule, as opposed to the more common every seven days routine.

"You have to pay attention to your horse and understand who they are," Antonucci said. "This horse just needs that space because with his cruising speed and how he trains, he's thrived on more of a 10-day schedule. My job is to listen and stay out of his way."

Spinaway Likely Next for Sam's Treasure

Sam's Treasure (Munnings), an impressive maiden winner at Saratoga last Saturday, is expected to make her next start in the Sept. 3 GI Spinaway S.

"She came out of it really good," trainer Wesley Ward said of the Breeze Easy colorbearer. *Cont.*

"Early on, she was a big filly and we didn't want to run her at Keeneland because she was maturing—those races in April, you've got to be quick out of the gate and smaller and agile. She had shown some grass affinity early on in her training at Palm Meadows and we were hopeful to win at Belmont [over the turf in her May 11 debut], but we were beaten soundly with no excuses. With the experience she got and as sound as she came out of it, we were really pointing to Saratoga and hoping she had an effort in her like the one she showed the other day."

Sam's Treasure's 5 3/4-length graduation came over six furlongs. She will be stretching out to seven furlongs for the Spinaway.

"She's at Keeneland at my main base and my main rider Julio Garcia will ride her in training and hopefully get her there to the Spinaway," said Ward. "Looking at her race at six furlongs, she didn't show any signs of stopping. It will be tougher in the Spinaway, but she just kept bounding along last time."

MAGE 'LOOKED PRETTY GOOD' ON FIRST DAY OVER SARATOGA'S OKLAHOMA TRACK

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.–Four days after his second-place finish in the GI Haskell S., GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mage** (Good Magic) took some small, easy steps toward the GI Travers on Aug. 26, jogging Wednesday on the Oklahoma training track.

Mage shipped from Monmouth Park in New Jersey to Saratoga on Monday and was given another day off on Tuesday. He made his first visit to the track on a cool, foggy morning under his regular exercise rider J.J. Delgado. Assistant trainer Gustavo Delgado held the colt while he was bathed, while his father, trainer Gustavo Delgado, watched.

Delagado, Jr. said that Mage has come out of his first race since the GI Preakness on May 20 in good shape.

"We like what we see, especially the eating, the travel and then here," Delgado, Jr. said. "This morning he looked pretty good."

Mage wanted to move around during the bath and Delgado, Jr. said he was tough to control at times.

"Tomorrow, I think he will start galloping, the way he looked today, because he needs it," Delgado, Jr. said. "He will start off galloping here and then probably next week we'll start taking him to the main track."

Mage's connections set the Travers as the summer goal after he finished third in the Preakness. They gave him 17 days off and embarked on a training program to prepare him for the summer starts. Delgado, Jr. said that even in defeat the Haskell was a success.

"Everything was according to plan," he said. "Of course, we wanted to win. And we never had a doubt that he was going to be competitive enough. The thing is that previous to the race we missed at least one breeze that was on the schedule. It was raining a lot at the training center so we couldn't get one work in. But his last one, he was ready. 'Let's take him to the Haskell because he might pull it off."

Yet to be decided is whether Hall of Fame jockey Javier Castellano will ride Mage in the Travers. Castellano rode Arcangelo (Arrogate) in the GI Belmont S. and that colt is headed to the Travers, too. Delgado said he and his father had dinner at Castellano's house Tuesday night, watched the Haskell several times, but did not discuss the Travers.

Delgado, Jr. said they hope that Castellano will be aboard for the marquee race of the Saratoga season, which could decide the 3-year-old male title. *Cont.*

"We wouldn't want to try with somebody else, that's for sure," Delgado, Jr. said. "But at the same time he's an easy horse to ride. He's not that difficult."

BECKY'S JOKER FROM 'QUESTIONABLE TO PROBABLE' FOR ADIRONDACK by Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.-After watching GIII Schuylerville S. winner Becky's Joker (Practical Joke) work a bullet half-mile Wednesday, trainer Gary Contessa said he may buck convention, take a step back in time and run her in the GIII Adirondack on Aug. 6.

Becky's Joker turned in a stunning performance on opening day, July 13, easily winning the six-furlong Schuylerville by 3 1/4 lengths at 21-1 in the first start of her career. According to Equibase, she is the fifth horse since 1991 to win a graded stakes in her debut.

Years ago during the 24-day Saratoga meets, it was not unusual for trainers to enter their 2-year-old fillies in two or all three of the stakes, the Schuylerville, the 6 1/2-furlong Adirondack and the seven-furlong GI Spinaway. As trainers have sought more time between starts, fillies that raced in the Schuylerville would not compete again until the Spinaway on the closing weekend.

The last horse to win the Schuylerville and the Adirondack was Over All (Mr. Prospector), trained by D. Wayne Lukas, in 1987. Lukas also did the double with Sacahuista (Raja Baba) in 1986.

Contessa was so happy with the way Becky's Joker looked during her half-mile move of :47.40, fastest of 11 at the distance, on the Oklahoma training track that he said the Adirondack was now in play.

"I'm not going to say that she is a definite, but she has gone from questionable to probable for the Adirondack off this work today. It was so impressive," Contessa said. "She can work herself to death and not get paid or she can run in the Adirondack. She's forced us to lean in that direction."

Contessa said that owner Lee Pokoik will make the final call. but he said Pokoik seems inclined to go to the Adirondack.

"[If] it was up to me, I lean toward running her," Contessa said. "I don't have a problem with waiting for the Spinaway and I know how good she is right now. Look, I've got to train her or run her and she's good right now."

Contessa said she did the work, her first since the Schuylerville, under "a death hold" by exercise rider Carlos Lopez. He said he told Lopez not to move on her during the breeze.

"I wanted :50, but I know that's not really in her wheelhouse, so I'm not unhappy," he said. "As long as it's the way that they do it. As long as the rider is motionless and she is pulling him out of the saddle, that's what she wants to do. She didn't look it, but she went:47 and two."

DISMISSAL IN BETTORS-VS.-BAFFERT LAWSUIT COULD IMPACT SIMILAR CASE

A federal judge in Kentucky has dismissed the class-action lawsuit against trainer Bob Baffert and Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI), that was initiated by a group of horseplayers who alleged negligence, breach of contract, and unjust enrichment because their losing pari-mutuel bets on the 2021 GI Kentucky Derby weren't honored as winners after Medina Spirit (Protonico) tested positive for and was subsequently disqualified for a betamethasone overage.

The July 20 order tossing the case out of United States District Court, Western District of Kentucky (Louisville Division), could have ramifications on a similar class-action suit brought by bettors against Baffert in New Jersey.

On July 26, Baffert's attorney in the New Jersey case, W. Craig Robertson III, notified the judge there of Kentucky's "supplemental authority in support of" his client's pending motion to dismiss the New Jersey suit.

"Identical to this case, the [federal complaint in Kentucky] was commenced by a purported class of aggrieved gamblers against the Baffert Defendants asserting claims connected to pari-mutuel payouts from the 2021 Kentucky Derby," Robertson wrote in his letter to the judge presiding over the two-year-old case in U. S. District Court of New Jersey.

"The Western District of Kentucky dismissed those claims as a matter of law," Robertson continued. Cont.

Bettors-vs.-Baffert, cont.

"Specifically, the Court held that Kentucky's Rules of Racing govern all bets placed on the Kentucky Derby and because the Rules are clear that all payouts are final based on official race-day results, aggrieved gamblers have no injury at law and

no viable cause of action even if race results are later altered.

"Similarly here, [Baffert seeks] dismissal of the case before Your Honor due to a lack of cognizable injury, whether under the RICO statute or otherwise," Robertson wrote.

The Kentucky class-action plaintiffs were led by Anthony Mattera.

Baffert and CDI--an odd legal couple on the same side of the courtroom given their history of litigation over Baffert's banishment from CDI's tracks-were co-defendants in the

Kentucky case because they were both alleged to be "negligent in their care of Medina Spirit and his entry" into the Derby.

In his July 20 Kentucky court order, Judge David Hale wrote that he didn't buy the negligence argument.

"Even assuming that [Baffert and Churchill Downs] owed Plaintiffs a legally cognizable duty and breached that duty," the plaintiffs failed to adequately allege what is known as "but-for" causation, Hale wrote. They also didn't claim "reasonably certain" damages.

"And such failure is fatal to any negligence claim," Hale wrote. "Plaintiffs' complaint is devoid of any facts showing that but for [Baffert's] alleged negligence, their alleged injury would not have occurred."

Hale wrote that the plaintiffs themselves even conceded that "the stewards' official order of finish listed Medina Spirit as the winner of the Kentucky Derby."

The judge also noted that "Churchill Downs distributed the pari-mutuel payouts accordingly. Under applicable state law, the fact that Medina Spirit was disqualified as the winner of the Kentucky Derby--nine months after the race--had no impact on the pari-mutuel payouts.

"Thus, Plaintiffs cannot show breach of contract or resulting damages," Hale wrote.

"Because Plaintiffs have both failed to adequately plead two essential elements of a breach-of-contract claim and alleged facts that plead the claim out of court, the claim will be dismissed," Hale wrote.

In the ongoing New Jersey case, the class-action plaintiffs are led by Michael Beychok, the winner of the 2012 National Horseplayers Championship.

The New Jersey lawsuit was filed four days after Baffert's disclosure that Medina Spirit had tested positive for

betamethasone after winning the May 1, 2021 Derby.

The class members of the suit alleged that they had been "cheated out of their property" because they placed wagers on other horses and betting combinations that would have paid off had "the drugged horse" not won the Derby. (Unlike the Kentucky case, CDI is not named as a defendant in New Jersey).

Robertson, in Baffert's defense, has asserted in previously field court documents that the plaintiffs'

claims fail as a matter of law.

"Among other reasons, this is because the rules of racing provide that pari-mutuel wagering is unaffected by any disqualification," Robertson wrote.

"Plaintiffs' argument that a disqualification somehow creates a compensable injury has been addressed and roundly rejected [in precedent cases]," Robertson wrote. "[T]he case law could not be more clear that, among other things, gamblers with gambling losses are simply not within the class of individuals those laws are designed to protect."

Medina Spirit's disqualification appeal is still awaiting a final Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) adjudication. That DQ, plus an appeal of the \$7,500 fine and a 90-day suspension that Baffert has already served but wants expunged from his record, were all affirmed in their entirety by a hearing officer on May 26, 2023. But that recommended order upholding the penalties still has to be voted upon by the full KHRC board.

BREEDERS' CUP EARLY FOAL NOMS CLOSE AUG. 1

The early deadline to nominate weanlings of 2023 to the Breeders' Cup program is Aug. 1 at 11:59 p.m. ET. The one-time regular nomination fee of \$400 entitles each foal with lifetime racing eligibility to the Breeders' Cup World Championships and the Breeders' Cup racing programs.

All foals sired by a fully nominated North American Breeders' Cup stallion are eligible for nomination to the Breeders' Cup program in their year of birth at the weanling rate.

Any foal entered in a fall or winter breeding stock sale must be nominated by the early foal deadline in order for the Breeders' Cup Nominated engagement to be included on the catalogue page.

If not nominated by the Aug. 1 early deadline, standard foal nominations may still be made in the foal's year of birth with a one-time payment of a \$400 nomination fee due Oct. 15.

Late foal nominations may be made in the foal's year of birth by a one-time payment of a \$1,500 nomination fee between Oct. 16 of the weanling year to Feb. 28 of the yearling year.

Bates won 454 races as a trainer, enjoying stakes success with Regal Joy, winner of the 1995 GIII Joe Namath S., and Black Diamond Cat, who won the Bob Umphrey Turf Sprint and Major Moran S. in 2011 and the Housebuster S. and Montbrook S. in 2013. Bates saddled the filly Cher Ami to five stakes victories in 2007. Cont.

A native of Virginia, Bates worked and rode in New England before switching to steeplechase. He rode in Europe for Daniel Wildenstein and in the U.S. for Paul Fout.

Bates was known to be a fiery competitor when riding. In a 1971 *Sports Illustrated* article, writer Frank Deford tells of Bates leaping from his mount at Delaware one afternoon to jockey Jerry Fishback's mount, "as in the cowboy movies...dragging [Fishback] to the ground," to confront Fishback about his ride.

"Larry was an extremely accomplished horseman," former jockey Ben Bealmear said. "He knew a lot about a horse by being on him, but also just by looking them in the eye. He and Allen [Jerkens] became really good friends. Larry told me once when he was having a tough time Allen said, 'Larry, when it comes to training horses, the first 50 years don't count.'"

Bates's last victory was Apr. 6 with Poiema, a daughter of Neolithic who finished second May 28 in an overnight handicap.

Four horses and one horseman will join the Oklahoma Horse Racing Hall of Fame during a ceremony at Remington Park Sept. 23. 

Ready Shakespeare (More Than Ready), a half-brother to three-time Canadian champion and GI Natalma S. heroine Lady Speightspeare (Speightstown), gets his career started for trainer Roger Attfield. While the racing world awaits the confirmed line-up for one of the most exciting runnings of the King George in decades, the aperitif is served by Leopardstown Thursday with some vital staging posts for the 2024 Classic generation. While the card's feature is the G2 Romanised Minstrel S., in which 3-year-old fillies Zarinsk (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) and Tarawa (Ire) (Shamardal) look to have an edge on the older brigade, the most intriguing race is the G3 Jockey Club of Turkey Silver Flash S. for fillies because that's where Ballydoyle's much-vaunted TDN Rising Star Ylang Ylang (GB) (Frankel {GB}) goes. GOSDENS' SQUAD RECEIVES GLORIOUS GOODWOOD ASSIGNMENTS

John and Thady Gosden will be well-represented at the upcoming Qatar Goodwood Festival from Aug. 1-5, with a host of stars set to start at the meeting including Group 1 winners Courage Mon Ami (GB) (Frankel {GB}), Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Nashwa (GB) (Frankel {GB}). At present, the fatherson team has both G1 Gold Cup hero Courage Mon Ami and G2 Queen's Vase victor Gregory (GB) (Golden Horn {GB}), both unbeaten, in the G1 Al Shaqab Goodwood Cup on Tuesday. Both horses race in the colours of the Emir of Qatar's Wathnan Racing, having been purchased in the lead up to the Royal meeting.

John Gosden said, "At present, both horses will be left in the race and then we will make a decision nearer the time whether one of them runs or they both run."

"Gregory saw the mile and six furlongs out the other day and I think he will see the two miles out, too. I think he is very much a progressive sort. "We think Mysteries is a nice filly," Donnacha said. "Everything has gone well with her since her last run and this has been her target. We think the step up to seven [furlongs] will suit her and we are looking forward to getting her out again. The Debutante and Moyglare are at the logical next steps with a filly like her."

He continued, "Ylang Ylang looks like a smart filly, but they all have to prove themselves when they step up in class, so we'll learn a lot. The Debutante and Moyglare are the logical next steps with a filly like that. We will probably be running into dad's fillies the whole way along the way, but we have to meet them eventually."

Like Islandsinthestream...

The O'Brien theme continues in the G3 Japan Racing Association Tyros S., which looks more wide-open in the absence of a Ballydoyle juvenile running at cramped odds. This has always been a significant place to look for the following year's Guineas and Derby stars, but whether there is an Anthony Van Dyck (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a Churchill (Ire) or Gleneagles (Ire) lurking is probably unlikely. The fact that Ryan Moore has opted for the G2 July S. disappointment Mountain Bear (Ire) (No Nay Never) does not inspire confidence in the yard's Naas maiden winner Henry Adams (Ire) (No Nay Never), who is blinkered

here, so the answer could be Joseph's Curragh maiden scorer Islandsinthestream (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}).

Soprano Ready To Star...

At Sandown earlier in the afternoon, the Listed European Bloodstock News EBF Star S. offers Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's G3 Albany S. third Soprano (Ire)

(Starspangledbanner {Aus}) the chance to compensate for missing out on the G2 Duchess of Cambridge S., but there are a

few potential flies in the ointment including the Ollie Sangstertrained Newbury novice scorer **Shuwari (Ire)**, a daughter of New Bay (GB) carrying the silks of the sire's high-class Saffron Beach (Ire).



Harry Herbert has some big plans on the horizon if Soprano can get through this test with reputation intact. "If she were to

be successful on Thursday, we would be looking at races possibly like the [G1] Moyglare in Ireland, you have got the Newmarket race over seven, a Group 2 [Rockfel S.]," he said. "She has such a beautiful action but we do think a trip up to seven furlongs would really suit her, so it makes sense at this stage. Then we will see where we stand. Going over seven furlongs was pretty much the chat from William Buick at Royal Ascot. He said that if the pace had been better, she probably would have gone pretty close, but definitely

Gosden added, "We have been very happy with him since Ascot and he has learnt a lot since then. Interestingly enough, both horses have won there, though I have to say they looked a bit up in the air galloping at some stages, but they would have learnt a lot from those experiences previously at Goodwood."

Group 3 winner Audience (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) is set for the G2 Qatar Lennox S. The Cheveley Park colourbearer ran out a two-length winner of the G3 Criterion S. on July 1.

"He won well last time at Newmarket," said Thady Gosden. "He has come forward from that race, which was his first run of the year. The seven furlongs should suit him."

Gosdens' Distaffers **Aiming For Plum Prizes**

The 2021 Cartier Champion 2-Year-Old Filly, Cheveley Park homebred Inspiral, a three-time Group 1-winning miler, will face males in Goodwood's G1 Qatar Sussex S. on Aug. 2. The bay was beaten just a neck in the G1 Queen Anne S. over her pet distance by **Triple Time (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}), who is also nominated for the Goodwood test.

Thady Gosden said, "Inspiral ran a great race on her return in the Queen Anne, when she was just beaten by a very good horse of Kevin Ryan's in Triple Time. She has come on for that and been in great form since.

"Inspiral has a low action and plenty of speed. She is a very strong filly and hopefully the track will prove no problem to her at all. Emily Upjohn (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) was taking on [Sussex entry] Paddington (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}) two furlongs below her optimum trip [in the G1 Eclipse], whereas Inspiral will be taking him on at her ideal trip. Paddington is a 3-year-old stepping into older miler company for the first time, which is always an interesting one."

Also, a three-time top-drawer winner is Imad Al Sagar's Nashwa, who is entered for the 10-furlong G1 Nassau S. against her own sex, a race she won last year. The 4-year-old was fourth to Group 1 winner Above The Curve (American Pharoah) in the G2 Prix Corrida at Saint-Cloud in May, but progressed to be second in the G3 Hoppings Fillies' S. over the Newcastle allweather last month. She soared to an open-length victory in the G1 Falmouth S. on July 14 when last seen.

The younger Gosden added, "Nashwa has taken a bit of time to come to herself this year as can often happen with fillies who are going from three to four. You could tell in the couple of weeks after the Hoppings S. that she really had taken a step forward.

"She is going to a track that she knows, having won the Nassau

last year. She seems in good order and stepping back up to a mile and a quarter shouldn't be an issue."

Listed winner Running Lion (GB) (Roaring Lion), who races for David Howden, faces her stablemate in the Nassau.


"She won the Pretty Polly here very well and then she has been unlucky in her next two starts," said Gosden. "She had a freak incident in the stalls at Epsom [in the G1 Oaks] but she came out of it absolutely fine. Then we

was a hot day and you could see in the last furlong that the heat was getting to her a bit. We've taken our time with her since then and she seems to have come back to herself."

Multiple group winner Free Wind (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) will take part in the final day of the five-day stand and will attempt to defend her title in the G2 Qatar Lillie Langtry S. for owner George Strawbridge. After prevailing in York's G2 Middleton Fillies' S., the 5-year-old mare was fifth to G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. entrant Pyledriver (GB) (Harbour Watch {Ire}) in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot.

"She won the Lillie Langtry last year. She is a talented filly and the mile and six furlongs suits her well. She didn't quite run her race in the Hardwicke last time. She has been very well since then and she knows the track well."

O'BRIEN HAILS 'INCREDIBLE' PADDINGTON AHEAD OF SUSSEX

No horse has ever improved at Ballydoyle quite to the extent that **Paddington (GB) (Siyouni {Fr})** has this season, according to Aidan O'Brien, who provided an upbeat bulletin on the colt ahead of the Aug. 2 G1 Qatar Sussex S. at Goodwood.

Paddington has swept all before him this season. Having begun his campaign in handicaps, he landed the Irish 1,000 Guineas, the St James's Palace S. and more recently the Coral-Eclipse S, proving that he is equally as adept over a mile than he is over 10 furlongs. The plan is to step Paddington back to a mile for the Sussex S. at Goodwood, for which the hugely progressive colt is a heavy favourite with most firms to continue his winning streak and copper fasten his reputation as one of the most exciting horses in training.

O'Brien said, "What he has done has been incredible. He's gone from strength to strength with every run and it is very unusual. I know Ryan [Moore] is very impressed with him all the time and he looks a very serious horse at the moment. I think he's standing up to a lot of scrutiny by the other horses that have gone before him."

He added, "It's very unusual what he is doing and the ease with which he is doing it. It's very hard to compare him but I'm not sure we've ever had a horse that has made that improvement in the way he is doing it, mentally, physically and confidence-wise and everything really. He just looks so natural."

Having seen off Emily Upjohn (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) over 10 furlongs at Sandown, Paddington could have another John and

Thady Gosden-trained filly to tackle on the Sussex Downs in the form of Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}), who the bookmakers feel has the best chance of knocking Paddington off track.

It will be the first time he will have faced older horses over a mile, but the master of Ballydoyle is eager to see a competitive contest so he can get a true feel for Paddington's potential accomplishments.

"We always treat every horse with total respect, but we're also delighted when the races are as competitive as they can be because that is what we all want to see," said O'Brien.

"That is what we need to gauge our horses and know where we are going next. The more competitive it is and the better the horses are that are in there, the better it is for us and everyone else, we think."

HIGHFIELD PRINCESS TACKLES GOODWOOD'S KING GEORGE PRIOR TO NUNTHORPE DEFENSE

Top sprinter **Highfield Princess (Fr)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) will return from her mid-summer break with a start in the G2 King George Qatar S. at Goodwood on Friday, Aug. 4, trainer John Quinn confirmed on Wednesday.

The triple Group 1-winning sprinter ran second in her seasonal bow, the G2 Duke of York S. in May, and was second and third in the G1 King's Stand S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot last month.

"Last year we gave her a mid-season break, which she did seem to enjoy, and we have done the same this year but instead of going to Deauville, we decided to go to Goodwood," said Quinn of the Trainers House Enterprises-owned runner.

"There are no easy group races over any distance, but we thought possibly that the Goodwood race might be slightly easier than the [G1] Prix Maurice de Gheest. Another factor, as you know, is that the Prix Maurice de Gheest is 6 1/2 furlongs."

Just like last year, an international campaign is also being considered with targets from Europe, America, Australia, and Hong Kong all on the table.

"All being well after Goodwood, we go to York for the Nunthorpe and then we would hope to go back to Ireland for the [G1] Flying Five [S. in September]," he added. "We had possibly thought about going to Australia for the Everest but we don't know. I wouldn't rule out the Breeders' Cup again and, after the Breeders' Cup, there is the big [G1] Hong Kong Sprint in December."

INJURY BENCHES DUBAI MILE FOR THE REST **OF THE YEAR**

Group 1 winner **Dubai Mile (Ire)** (Roaring Lion) sustained an injury to his near-hind fetlock in a piece of work at Martyn and Freddie Meade's on Monday, and has been ruled out for the remainder of the season. "We were preparing him to run in the [G2] Sky Bet York S. when he suffered a conjugal fracture on his near-hind fetlock, so it is an absolute tragedy," Martyn Meade told the Press Association.

"We were giving him his last bit of work yesterday on our watered peat moss gallop, which was absolutely perfect for him, but it was just a complete freak accident. We managed to get him straight up [to] Newmarket, where he has been operated on and it has been pinned. That appears to be a success.

"However, he is clearly out for the rest of the season, I would think. It always happens to the best horses. You wouldn't believe it."

The 3-year-old colt made his first eight starts for owner Ahmed Al Shaikh and trainers Mark and Charlie Johnston. Second in the G2 Royal Lodge S. at two, the chestnut improved to take the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud on bottomless ground to end his juvenile year. Trained by Charlie Johnston in 2023, his best performance from three starts this year has been a fourth in the G2 King Edward VII S. behind G1 Derby runner-up King Of Steel (Wootton Bassett {GB}).

After Royal Ascot, a half-share in Dubai Mile was purchased by the Meades' Manton Park Stud from Al Shaikh with a view to a future stallion career.

"We will have to assess how he recovers from that surgery and assess whether or not he will have a racing career or whether he will be going to stud," Meade went on.

"It is heartbreaking really, also for Ahmad who is our joint-owner, who has been very good about it, I have to say. He has been very understanding. When it happens, it affects everyone, the lads who do them, they get very upset by it, understandably so. It is terrible for everyone. A huge blow."

Among the leading lots are a Profitable (Ire) full-brother to G2 Queen Mary S. winner Quick Suzy (Ire) (lot 299); lot 291, a full-brother to G1 Irish 2000 Guineas-placed Decrypt (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}); a Bated Breath (GB) half-brother to group winner and Irish 2000 Guineas second Gale Force Ten (GB) (Oasis Dream (GB)) (lot 276); a Showcasing (GB) filly out of Group 3 winner Melody Of Love (GB) (Haafhd {GB}) (lot 214); a Dark Angel filly out of Group 3 winner Shaden (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) (lot 289); a Kodiac (GB) colt out of the G2 Park Hill S. winner Meeznah (Dynaformer) (lot 212); and a Sergei Prokofiev colt out of Group 3 winner Buonasera (Ire) (Zebedee {GB}) is lot 69.

gelding was offered by Liss House. John McConnell shelled out €55,000 for the full-brother to Funambule Sivola (Fr) (Noroit {Ger}), who won the G2 Game Spirit Chase twice and was second in Cheltenham's G1 Queen Mother Champion Chase. Just under the two top lots was Krishna Bellevue (Fr) (Buck's Boum (Fr) (lot 69A). Part of the Brown Island Stables draft, the gelding went to David Phelan on a bid of €54,000. This is the extended family of Othermix (Fr) (Linamix (Fr)), who was placed at listed level at Cheltenham and and won the G2 Prix Amadou Hurdle in France, as well as being placed in the G1 Prix Cambaceres 3vo Hurdle.

Of the 268 lots through the ring on Wednesday, 192 sold (72%) for €2,610,300. The average was €13,595 (-9.1%) and the median was €11,000 (-6.4%).

RELIANT (IRE) (Frankel {GB}) is the focal point of all the newcomers on a tantalising Thursday, being the fourth foal out of Nawara Stud's star broodmare Contradict (GB) (Raven's Pass), whose 100% record of producing black-type performers is boosted significantly by her triple Group 1-winning Prix du Jockey Club hero Mishriff (Ire). Like that outstanding individual, Prince Faisal's homebred comes under the tutelage of John and Thady Gosden and he faces a baptism of fire pitched in against Godolphin's course-and-distance third Arabian Crown (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}), the Charlie Appleby-trained €600,000 Arqana Deauville August graduate and half-brother to the classy multiple group winner The Juliet Rose (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}). This was the maiden won in 2019 by Kameko (Kitten's Joy) and last year by TDN Rising Star Nostrum (GB) (Kingman {GB}).

YULONG SNAPS UP JAMAEA FOR A\$1.025M TO TOP THE INGLIS DIGITAL SALE

Multiple Group 2 winner Jamaea (Aus) (Headwater {Aus}) topped the Inglis Digital July (Late) Online Sale at A\$1.025 million to Yulong Stud on Wednesday.

Sold as lot 325, the 4-year-old filly won the G2 Percy Sykes S. at two and progressed to take the G2 Furious S. as a 3-year-old and was retired a millionaire after 20 starts when campaigned by an ownership group including Bruce Noble. The dark bay was an A\$130,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast yearling purchase by Robert Price when offered by breeder Cressfield Thoroughbreds.

"She's been great for us and this is the icing on the cake," Noble told *TTR AusNZ* of the daughter of 2014 G3 Bow Mistress S. heroine Isibaeva (Aus) (Johannesburg). "She's been a pretty good investment for A\$130,000. Inglis did a great job and we're very, very pleased with the result. It's a bit sad to see her go, but we can't wait to see her first foal on the ground.

Yulong was also in action for the five-time winner and group-placed **Brookspire (Aus)** (Hinchinbrook {Aus}) (lot 120), who they bought for A\$640,000. Both purchases will visit Yulong stallion Diatonic (Jpn) this season.

"We want to give Diatonic some really nice mares in his first season to give him the best possible chance and we think Jamaea is perfect for him," Yulong's Sam Fairgray said. Progeny PPs is now

"She's an attractive race mare with a great record, a multiple Group 2 winner and performed at both two and three so we're delighted to have her."

The latter is a 5-year-old half-sister to 2020 G1 Railway S. heroine Inspirational Girl (NZ) (Reliable Man {GB}). Jamieson Park's James Chapman bred the mare, who made A\$300,000 on the bid of Chris Waller Racing/Brae Sokolski at the 2019 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

Of the A\$1-million Magic Millions Fillies and Mares winner who was also runner-up in the 2021 G3 Belle of the Turf S., Chapman told *TTR AusNZ*, "It's been a wonderful family for us, it kind of got us going, really. You need a few mares like that, that's how you build a farm." Chapman said.

On Brookspire, Fairgray said, "We bought Brookspire's half-sister Inspirational Girl (NZ) (Reliable Man {GB}) at the Chairman's Sale so it's just about putting together a family that Mr. Zhang has full belief in.

"Like Jamaea, Brookspire will also visit Diatonic this season. She's a nice race mare who certainly sold for more than we thought she might, but again, you have to almost expect that to some extent with these nicer mares."

Another lot of note included a share in leading New Zealand **Proisir (Aus)** (lot 179) making A\$380,000 when secured by Sean Buckley's Ultra Thoroughbreds.

They are entitled to one breeding nomination per year, plus a pro-rata share of the pooled service. Rich Hill Stud, where the stallion stands, offered the share as agent.

Proisir is firmly on top of the New Zealand Sires' Table, with earnings of NZ\$4,151,650, a New Zealand record. The stallion has four new Group 1 winners to his name this season--Dark Destroyer (NZ), Pier (NZ), Legarto (NZ) and Prowess (NZ)--and he has five his overall, with Levante (NZ) the other.

"I love the horse, I think he's one of the best two stallions in Australasia alongside Savabeel (Aus). I think he's a superstar," said Buckley.

"I'll send two mares to him and I'm just so pleased to have bought this share today because he's a sire I think is going to feature heavily for many, many years to come."

Rounding out the top four was lot 296, the Nostradamus (Aus) mare **Clairvoyance** (Aus). Byerley Bloodstock paid A\$330,000 for the 4-year-old, who won seven of her 11 starts, including once at listed level. She fractured her pelvis during trackwork in March of last year, but has recovered.

In total, the July (Late) Online Sale grossed A\$4,672,250, ensuring July became the second most successful month in Inglis Digital history, thanks to a bumper July (Early) Online Sale as well as the boutique **Miss Roseiano (Aus)** (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) sale which has resulted in a monthly gross of A\$13,283,900.

"Success breeds success and it's certainly been a fabulous month for the platform, with the likes of Miss Roseiano (A\$1.275 million), Another Award (Aus) (A\$1.2 million), Daisies (Aus) (A\$920,000), More Aspen in foal to Maschino (Aus) (A\$720,000) and then these results today making for some fabulous results for our clients," Inglis Digital's Business Manager Nick Melmeth said.


