#### TEARS AND APPRECIATION FOR TEAM CODY CARRY THE EVENING AT ECLIPSE AWARDS

Cody's Wish (Curlin) was crowned both 2023 Horse of the Year and Older Dirt Male champion at Thursday night's 53rd annual Eclipse Awards ceremony, and when Kelly Dorman, the father of the late Cody Dorman, accepted the evening's highest honor on behalf of owner/breeder Godolphin, the crowd at The Breakers Palm Beach in Florida met his brief pause to shed a few bittersweet tears with a standing ovation that gave him time to collect his thoughts and let the gravity of the moment sink in.

On the track, Cody's Wish thrilled his fans with a successful defense of his title in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. But his story resonated far beyond the finish line thanks to the bond that began in 2018 when then-12-year-old Cody Dorman, who was born with Wolf-Hirschhorn syndrome, first met the then-unnamed yearling while touring Godolphin as part of a Make-A-Wish outing.

As Cody's Wish rose through the graded stakes ranks, the story of the inspirational teenager he was named after captivated a nation of racing enthusiasts. Cont. p3

In our walk of life, nothing succeeds like succession.

But the years-long emotional ride ended too soon, when Cody Dorman died Nov. 5 at age 17 on his way back home to Kentucky after witnessing Cody's Wish end his career triumphantly at Santa Anita in the Breeders' Cup just one day earlier.

"I never would have dreamed five years ago, when all this happened, that I would be standing right here doing this," Kelly Dorman said. "I wouldn't have dreamed about the wonderful people we've met. But I hope you guys got a TV in front of the stall down at Jonabell right now, because I want to thank Cody's Wish for everything he's done.

"I know everyone here, you guys just blow me away, because I know you put your heart in these horses, day in, day out," Dorman said. "That's your life. And I know a lot of times those horses put their heart into you--the jockeys, the trainers, the owners, everybody. And man, that horse, he put his heart into us...

"One of the best things to come out of this, other than the grit and determination, was we got to watch Cody's Wish run,"

Dorman said. "I think he got that honest when they gave him his name. 'Can't' and 'quit' were two words that we never used, never will. You might think that horse can't talk, but he can. But he won't use those two words either. He always spoke to Cody...

"I want to let you guys know how much it means, the fans that have come up to us and let us know how much the story behind the wonderful horse means, and just so many wonderful people that we've gotten to meet through this, the wonderful connections we've made. It puts a smile on our face, day in and day out."

Earlier in the evening, when the story of Cody's Wish won the Moment of the Year award for the second straight season, Dorman recounted an old adage that he said was appropriate in how his son and family have been accepted and welcomed by the racing industry.

"Over time, people will eventually forget what you've done," Dorman said. "They will eventually forget about the things that you've said. But they'll never forget how you made 'em feel. I know Cody made you guys feel that same way. But this Moment of the Year, it's for you guys too. You guys put so much in our hearts, everybody here in this room, watching on TV, we love all you guys. We appreciate that--thank you." *Cont.*

Earlier in the ceremony, victories by **Arcangelo** (Arrogate) in the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. cemented champion 3-Year-Old Male honors for owner Blue Rose Farm (Jon Ebbert) and trainer Jena Antonucci, the first woman to condition the winner of a Triple Crown race.

"The greatest part of this sport is you just need one special horse and a bunch of people who believe in him," Ebbert summed up.

Although the evening was replete with heartfelt thank-yous from award winners extending gratitude that spanned everyone who planned the Thoroughbred matings all the way down to foal caretakers and daily grooms who do the daily-grind type of work behind the scenes, several recipients couldn't resist a bit of forewarning about the future while commanding the podium.

After doling out thanks to his racing and bloodstock teams, Repole overstayed his allotted 60 seconds at the podium by 2 1/2 additional minutes while advocating for disruptive yet positive changes to the industry.

Repole's passion was evident. But by choosing to punctuate his remarks with f-bomb profanities while surrounded by family members and children on the stage as "exit music" got cued up in the background to encourage him to wrap it up, Repole introduced a level of coarseness that didn't mesh with the spirit and tone of the festivities.

"Right now, this sport, we're all on the Titanic, okay?" Repole said. "There's an iceberg there. But we're not hitting the iceberg yet. We need a vision. We need leadership. We need alignment. We need strategy. We need collaboration. [From] the big entities [all the way down to individuals in the sport], we've got to make this better for everybody.

"So I implore you, please, for the next two years--other than me taking more time--be selfless over selfish," Repole said.
"That's number one. [But] this is the most important message of the night: Let's [expletive] compete in the racetrack. Outside the racetrack, let's compete together for what's best for this game. I love this [expletive] game. It's going to be here a long time."

Stuart Janney III, the chairman of The Jockey Club, was honored with the Eclipse Award of Merit for his lifetime of service to the sport. *Cont.*

He was thankful for his broad supporting cast, but he too had words about the tenuous future of the sport.


Like Repole, Janney spoke of cooperation. But his focus emphasized one of The Jockey Club's main initiatives over the past decade, creating and empowering the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA).

"Our industry's got a lot of issues that [we need] to get in front of and solve," Janney said. "We've now been given the tool kit. We didn't have it before. With HISA, we can go forward, but we need to go forward together.... I hope that we have learned, as an industry, the advantages of being together, and that we really do go forward in a unified fashion.... And where racing's continuation is in question, in some states, we'll work with others to hopefully find viable solutions."

#### Succession: Walker Hancock, cont. from p1

No better place to start than with Walker Hancock, whose accession as president at storied Claiborne Farm at just 25 was, in this context, just about as conspicuous a transfer of responsibility as you'll ever see. Incredible as it must seem, both to Walker himself and to those originally startled by his precocious promotion, this year he will already complete his first decade at the helm.

His father Seth has been duly rewarded for that bold vote of confidence, then, the farm now being in hands still full of youthful vigor and ambition, while far more seasoned than could generally be expected in one of Walker's age.

To a degree, of course, the gamble was emboldened by the fact that Seth had been even younger when himself appointed president. Cont.





At the same time, whatever the similarities, the single factor that most sets their respective situations apart could not be more crucial. For Seth was only elevated so giddily because of the abrupt and premature death of his own father, "Bull" Hancock, such a towering figure in the Bluegrass that people far beyond Claiborne felt that they, too, had in some measure suddenly lost a patriarchal influence. (There was also the incidental drama of Seth's older brother, Arthur, quitting to achieve his own, epic vindication down the road at Stone Farmand we'll be calling on Arthur and his daughter Lynn later in this series.)

So while Seth had to find his feet in the throes of bereavement, not to mention fireworks between his brother and the powerful advisers presiding over the transition, Walker remains blessed to be able to turn to his father for counsel.

"Dad had a trial by fire, literally had to figure it out on his own," he says. "So after he gave me the reins, it was comforting to know that he's still in the background, and that I can always run things by him. I can say, 'Well, I'm not quite sure what to do here,' or 'I can't figure out a mating for this mare, what do you think?' So that's been a luxury for me. He never had that. It definitely takes a little pressure off, makes things a little more comforting, at least when you start out."

That said, just about the first thing Seth was able to do was syndicate a horse called Secretariat.

"So he got things figured out pretty quickly," Walker says with a smile. "Because he had to! I certainly didn't make that kind of a splash. But maybe one day..." *Cont.*

The common denominator in all these situations is how a relationship based on parental authority, through years of upbringing, can evolve so that a son or daughter, if only in a professional dimension, has the confidence to say: "Sorry sir, sorry ma'am--but I'm the boss now."

"We've always got along for the most part, but like anybody, we're going to disagree on some things," Walker says.
"Thankfully, they've been few and far between. When you work with your father, you're younger and sometimes you'll see things differently, which is fine. But I give him credit: especially in the last few years, he's really kind of said, 'You're in charge. If that's what you want to do, go ahead.'"

Walker suspects that his father had taken note of equivalent handovers faltering precisely because of inflexibility in the older generation. And that's certainly a delicate challenge, whenever a filial relationship extends into business. As from any parent, growing up you receive instruction and discipline--but suddenly they have to back off and leave you, if necessary, to learn by mistakes.

"I think it was hard for me to understand that, at first," Walker says. "It was like, 'All right, whatever he says, I'm going to do.' Because that's what I've done my whole life. But then there comes a time where you have to say to yourself, 'Well, you're in charge now. You're going to have to stand up to him at some point, if you feel something isn't going right.' But it feels very successful, because we have still managed to maintain that father-son relationship."

There were bumps on the road, for sure: the little test cases. It sounds as though the opening of a visitor center at Claiborne may have been a case in point.

"It was kind of a big deal for us, in terms of commercializing a brand that has always been pretty close-knit," Walker acknowledges. *Cont.*

"I just felt like that was really what we needed to do at the time, and my sister [Allison] and I had a plan to make it happen. But whenever Dad and I have gotten a little sideways with one another, at the end of the day I think he can appreciate that I'm just trying to do the best I can, and move the farm forward, and that sometimes it might be a little more progressive or at least different from the way he'd do it."

And, in fairness, Walker stresses that his father always showed due sensitivity to the unique pressures of succession-right back to when he was a kid. It was made perfectly clear that Walker and Allison could chart their own course in life, according to whatever preferences evolved as they grew up. Allison, indeed, never made quite the same connection with horses, albeit remains part of the family operation, heading up the visitor center and merchandising.

"Again, I give credit to my dad:

he let me find my way," Walker says. "At an early age he told me, 'If this is something you don't want to do, don't feel any pressure. You don't have to do this. We can sell the farm, whatever. Because if you don't have a passion, there's no sense doing it. If you don't really, truly love it, you're not going to be successful.' And actually because he didn't pressure me, I think that's one of the reasons I gravitated towards it. If he'd been waking me up at five every morning, saying, 'Get to that barn, you got to clean stalls!' I probably would have resented that, or maybe got burned out."

As it was, Walker was able gradually to absorb the enchantment of the Thoroughbred from the environment in which he was growing up.

"At the farm, I started at the bottom," he recalls. "Weeding double fence rows, whatever. At the time we still did a lot of hay and straw, put it in the barns for a couple of summers. I really did work my way up and can now really appreciate the hard work that so many people have to put in. And at least they all know that I did it at one point, as well, so it's like, 'Well, if he did it, I can do it.'"

By high school, Walker had recognized that he was not going to make a baseball professional--the single menace he ever admitted to his Claiborne destiny. But even once his heart was set on the family business, his parents made sure he went away to college so that he could encounter people from other walks of life, and sample the kind of Main Street existence he'd be turning down. So he went to the University of Florida, majoring in Animal Sciences.

"The idea was that I needed to go away, do something else for four years and figure life out for myself," Walker explains. "And honestly it was the best thing I ever did. I was able to grow up, make new friends and connections, learn how to deal with

uncomfortable positions. You can get stuck in this bubble here in Central Kentucky: you're so used to horses being a part of your life, going to Keeneland in the fall and the spring. And now here were all these people that, if they'd heard of the Kentucky Derby, wanted to know why a horse couldn't run in it twice! So it was really good to be exposed to a different culture."

So while ever grateful for being raised at Claiborne, Walker could become his own person and develop his own perspectives. In the same way, since taking over,


he has had to put his own stamp on things while on keeping aboard clients whose own families have a generational relationship with the farm. There literally came a day, for instance, when "Mr. Phipps" told him: "Walker, you need to call me Dinny now!"

"It's just another part of the transition," Walker says with a shrug. "You're no longer the little kid they saw at the races. You develop more of a client relationship. That was definitely challenging. Thankfully, we have a lot of outstanding clients that have been with us for a long time. But at some point we need to start bringing in some younger people, too--and that's another challenge, finding the right kind of people to keep the farm special while also moving forward."

Walker feels blessed, in embracing these challenges, by a priceless rapport with Bernie Sams, whose official title as Stallion Seasons and Bloodstock Manager is barely adequate for the deep knowledge and down-to-earth style that guaranteed continuity to all parties: Seth, Walker, the clientele.

"He's been unbelievable, awesome," Walker says. "We've traveled the world together. He's taught me so much and pretty much been a mentor to me. It certainly gave me a little more confidence to have someone like Bernie around, that's been with Claiborne for 20-plus years and understands so well what we do." *Cont.*

He feels similarly indebted to farm manager Bradley Purcell, and also to his aunt, Dell Hancock.

"Aunt Dell has also been a tremendous supporter of mine throughout the transition process," Walker stresses. "She's always there to cheer me up after a bad result in the sales ring or racetrack. Her positivity has helped me persevere through some low times, and I can always count on her to lift me back up

and find the bright side of every

scenario.

"As for Bradley, he's so professional and level-headed that I couldn't do the job without him. I never have to worry about the day-to-day operations, thanks to his knowledge of horses and understanding of the Claiborne brand. I can be away from the farm and know that everything will continue to run smoothly, which is very comforting."

But if some faces and practices stay the same, in other ways even a farm as symbolic as Claiborne must adapt to a changing market.

It was striking, for instance, that as many as 171 mares were granted a date with rookie Silver State in 2022. Following the defeat of the proposed 140-mare cap, farms like this one must decide where to strike a balance: should they protect their clients from the inundation of catalogues, the clear risk at more industrial operations? Or should they seek the accountancy advantages of a bigger book, whether in writing a check for a stallion or hiring him out at a milder fee?

"Ideally, we'd only breed our stallions to 120 to 140 mares," Walker says. "But if a bigger book is how we stay competitive in the marketplace, then that's what we'll have to do. It's right by the horse, because you have to give them a chance to succeed. It's right by the clients that support him, and the syndicate members that own shares. I mean, it's probably not what we want. But the market's changing, and while I wish we could be stubborn and stick to our old ways, we'd get left behind.

"And I feel like we've found a good balance. We're never going to do over 200, or anything like that, but we probably have to beef our numbers up from what we were doing at 120, 130. It's hard to syndicate a horse if the shareholders know that money will be left on the table because you're not breeding as many mares as they'd get investing in another stallion. So, yeah, it's a changing environment and a difficult one. But I'm sure people had a fit when stallions went from 40 mares to 60, and again

when they went to 100. The reality is that we have to keep up, or get left behind."

Walker has not enjoyed missing out on potential new stars for the roster because rival offers were predicated on huge books of mares.

"You get beat so many times," he says. "And it's like, 'Well, do we just keep doing this in the expectation of a different result?' But that's just not going to happen. So you're better off figuring

> out ways to change things up a little bit and stay competitive. In today's world it's hard to maintain your traditions and your values, with the market forcing your hand. But I do feel like there's a balance and hopefully we have found it."

As things stand, the roster is headed by a venerable stallion in the sunset of his career, War Front, But Walker and his team are certainly sticking to their principles with their younger guns: they have gone back to the Danzig mine for Silver State, for instance,

besides two of War Front's own sons, War of Will and now Annapolis. The unusual versatility of War of Will on the racetrack, meanwhile, is underpinned by the kind of deep pedigree that has always been a Claiborne hallmark. In other words, even as Demarchelier (GB) opens lines the other way, this is still a farm that can transcend the Atlantic divide.

"We have a lot of unproven young stallions right now," Walker says. "We're out there to find the next War Front, a horse that can keep carrying the water for us. Again, it's about trying to find a balance. Because it also makes things difficult that people want to sell these horses right after they win their first Grade I. To me, in the long run, that's a losing proposition."

So some old principles will stand. Claiborne will continue to seek wholesome genetic models for replication. But the farm will continue to adapt, too. After all, that's just what Bull Hancock did in his day.

"And I'm sure dad did things differently than my grandfather, likewise," Walker remarks. "When my grandfather died, it was in his will that we had to sell everything. Well, after 10 or 12 years my dad felt, 'You know what? This isn't the way we need to do things.' And Swale came out of the first crop where he kept horses.

"It would be awesome if we could just run Claiborne the same way as we did in 1948." Cont.

"But the fact is that the industry has changed, even in the last five years; sometimes it feels like it changes almost from year to year. And you have to be willing to respond. For the old timers, I think they'd say the industry has gone too far by them. Dad is probably glad that I'm in charge now.

"I'm a fifth-generation horseman, fourth generation to run the farm. You don't want to let any of your forefathers, grandfathers, fathers down by dropping the ball. So you definitely feel that pressure. Keeping places like this going, through families, is not easy. Hopefully my kids are interested, and their kids too. But with the times changing so rapidly, who knows what the future looks like? All we can do is live in the present, and try to do our best."

#### **RECORD PURSE MONEY FOR HORSESHOE** INDIANAPOLIS STAKES

A record \$5.03 million has been allocated to the 2024 stakes schedule at Horseshoe Indianapolis, a program highlighted by the \$300,000 GIII Indiana Derby and the \$200,000 GIII Indiana Oaks, each to be contested Saturday, July 6, 2024.

Some 42 stakes will be offered over the course of the season,


which gets off to a unique beginning on Monday, Apr. 8 to coincide with Total Solar Eclipse Day. The afternoon's features include the appropriately named Dark Side of the Moon and Total Eclipse of the Heart Handicaps for Indiana-bred and -sired horses.

"We are in the direct line of the total solar eclipse path and thought it was a unique opportunity to offer racing around this phenomena," explained Eric Halstrom, Vice President and General Manager of Racing. "We have worked closely with our horsemen's organization to provide a full day of racing on such a monumental day, which will not occur in North America again until 2044. We will showcase our older Indiana horses in two handicaps during the racing program and hope to expose our racing product to a whole new group of people expected in our area."

The track will also play host to the Caesars S. and Horseshoe Indianapolis S. for 3-year-old males and fillies, respectively, and are the richest events on the turf in Indiana.

"Our Caesars Day has become a great afternoon for us in mid-May," explained Halstrom. "We have found the perfect spot for these black-type turf events. We have seen some really talented horses in both of these races over the past few years."

Derby and Oaks day is the highlight of the annual calendar and continues to grow in popularity. Cont.

"The Indiana Derby continues to grow, and we saw the track's first \$8-million handle day last season," added Halstrom. "This program has become a staple on the summer event calendar for local racing fans as well as our national racing audience. With the addition of Indiana premier races on the day, it gives us a full platform to showcase our state's racing program and feature local participants on a day that captures national attention. And last season, we coupled it with two National Horseplayers Championship qualifiers that were well received and brought in a whole new audience for Indiana Derby Day."

The 22nd season of Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse racing continues through Thursday, Nov. 14.





## HIGH FIVE FOR GODOLPHIN AT THE ECLIPSE AWARDS

It was an evening to remember for Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Godolphin team, as the worldwide operation accumulated no fewer than five statuettes over the course of the evening at Thursday's 53rd Annual Eclipse Awards Presented by FanDuel TV, John Deere, Keeneland and The Jockey Club, honoring and recognizing excellence in Thoroughbred racing.

And they saved the best for last, as Cody's Wish (Curlin),

whose story resonated with nearly every fan of Thoroughbred racing and beyond, was named Horse of the Year and champion older dirt male for a season in which he won four times from five starts for trainer Bill Mott, including a towering victory in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan H. in June and a nails-tough defense of his title in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, overcoming plenty of adversity in the process.

For all they have accomplished in their rich history on the North

American continent, Godolphin was being represented by its first Horse of the Year and Mott was named outstanding trainer for the fourth time in his Hall of Fame career, but first since 2011.

The Brendan Walsh-conditioned 'TDN Rising Star' Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief) became Godolphin's first winner of America's premier race for sophomore fillies, the GI Longines Kentucky Oaks, and largely on the strength of that effort was named champion of her generation.

She is an eighth champion for her sire, whose daughter Covfefe won the same award in 2019. And while falling short of championships, Godolphin's GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero **Master of the Seas (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and the narrowly defeated 'TDN Rising Star' Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) received the third-most number of first-place votes in the male and female turf divisions, respectively.

With 27 victories in North American graded stakes, including 12 at Grade I level, Godolphin was the outstanding owner for the fourth year in a row and outstanding breeder for a third straight time.

A year after accounting for three divisional champions, Hill 'n' Dale Farm's sensational Curlin was responsible for another

trifecta in 2023. In addition to Cody's Wish, the recently turned 20year-old was also represented Thursday evening by Elite Power (Curlin), who took home a second consecutive award as champion sprinter; and by Idiomatic (Curlin), whose meteoric rise through the ranks was capped by an ultra-tough victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Curlin's daughter Malathaat was champion older dirt female of 2022. While Elite Power has joined the

stallion barn at Juddmonte Farms in Lexington, Idiomatic will aim for another championship, as she remains in training in 2024.

The female sprint division also saw a repeat champion, as **Goodnight Olive** (Ghostzapper) parlayed a second straight victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint into an Eclipse Award, easily outpointing **'TDN Rising Star' Echo Zulu** (Gun Runner), whose chances were dashed by a career-ending injury while prepping for the Filly & Mare Sprint.

There were no surprises in the male turf category, as **Up to the**Mark (Not This Time) became a second champion in two years
and third overall for his rising stallion, having won Grade Is at a
mile, mile and an eighth and mile and a quarter before finishing
second to 'TDN Rising Star' Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact
{Jpn}) in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Turf going 12 furlongs.
While the voters did not go for the latter off his single American
appearance, they did in large numbers for Inspiral (GB) (Frankel
{GB}), who--in perhaps the evening's most surprising result-took home the hardware for turf female following her
scintillating score in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf.
She is a first American champion for the Banstead Manor
resident and his sixth all totaled.

Arcangelo (Arrogate) was much preferred to Auguste Rodin and became his much-missed sire's first champion in the 3-year-old male division, with victories in the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. Scratched on the eve of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, the gray stands his first season at Lane's End in 2024.

Courtesy of his bounceback success in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness also gave his sire City of Light a first champion in the 2-year-old male division. There was also little suspense in the 2-year-old filly ranks, as the undefeated GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Just F Y I (Justify) became the first North American champion for her sire.

Merry Maker (Ire) (Malinas {Ger}), who won the G1-Stp Lonsome Glory H. at Aqueduct in September, was a relatively narrow winner of the Eclipse for champion steeplechase horse.

In the other human divisions, Irad Ortiz, Jr. won his fifth Eclipse in six years as outstanding jockey and Axel Concepcion was the runaway winner of the Eclipse for the country's top apprentice. Stuart S. Janney III received the Eclipse Award of Merit, broadcaster Tom Hammond the Special Eclipse Award for Career Excellence and Paul Calia for Horseplayer of the Year.

The *TDN* Writers' Room Podcast was among the media award winners recognized for the 'Wade and Carson Jost' episode from Sept. 20, 2023. On hand to accept the award were co-producer Anthony LaRocca, editor Alia LaRocca and podcast panelists Zoe Cadman and Randy Moss.

The Eclipse Awards are voted by the NTRA, *Daily Racing Form* (DRF) and the National Turf Writers And Broadcasters (NTWAB). The votes are tabulated and certified by LBMC. Voters are asked to identify their top three candidates when submitting their ballots and the three finalists in each division were made public on Jan. 6. Eclipse Award winners are determined by first-place votes only. Of 250 eligible voters, 219 (88%) completed a ballot.

Having had the misfortune of going toe-to-toe with Horse of the Generation Flightline (Tapit) in this division 12 months ago, Cody's Wish was one of three Eclipse winners on the evening for champion trainer Bill Mott after garnering enough first-place votes to take home the statue for best older dirt male of 2023.


Kept in training for a 5-year-old campaign following his victory in the 2022 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, the homebred was unstoppable at seven furlongs to a mile--both the one-turn and two-turn varieties--in 2023. After dusting future GII Cigar Mile H. hero Hoist The Gold (Mineshaft) in the seven-furlong GI Churchill Downs S. on seasonal debut in May, Cody's Wish made light work of his rivals in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan,

finishing 3 1/4 lengths clear of Zandon (Upstart), with White Abarrio (Race Day) a head back in third. Connections opted for a try in the GI Whitney S. Aug. 5, a race which would determine the course of the rest of the season.

A slow start cost the 3-5 chalk any real chance, as he was a distant third to White Abarrio, and it was back to one turn for the Oct. 1 GII Vosburgh S., where he duly obliged by a workmanlike 1 1/2 lengths.

"For me it's been an unbelievable experience, not like others," jockey Junior Alvarado commented when asked what it feels like to partner with a horse like Cody's Wish. "This is a whole different thing for me, first time ever, riding a horse like that with the story behind. It's been amazing, and I'm just glad to be a part of it."

Cody's Wish, the only five-time Grade I-winning son of Curlin, will cover his first mares for a fee of \$75,000 at Darley this winter.—Alan Carasso



It's a long way from an optional allowance winner's circle under the Turfway Park lights on a cold January evening to the spotlight of legitimate Horse of the Year consideration 10 months later, but that's precisely the route Idiomatic took. The late-blooming homebred, who hails from an exquisite Juddmonte family four generations deep, had a stellar year culminating with a Breeders' Cup victory framed by the San Gabriel Mountains at Santa Anita, which made her a slam dunk for Eclipse Champion Older Female honors and put her in the Horse of the Year conversation, even if those accolades went elsewhere.

Perhaps Idiomatic didn't have the most conventional start to her championship campaign as she progressed through her conditions at Turfway, but she's a big, stout filly at better than 17 hands and patience clearly paid off. After two optional allowances, she tried black-type company for the first time over Turfway's all-weather surface in the Latonia S. in March. That win propelled her to New York, where she suffered her only loss of the year with a runner-up finish in the GII Ruffian S., her first attempt in graded waters. She wouldn't lose again.

After reeling off scores in the GIII Shawnee S. at Churchill and the GII Delaware H. at Delaware Park, Idiomatic announced her arrival on the big stage with a mild upset over division heavyweights Nest and Clairiere--both, like Idiomatic, daughters of Curlin--in Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign S. The GI Juddmonte Spinster S. followed--the second Spinster win (Emollient, 2013) for Juddmonte since the famed nursery and racing stable began sponsorship in 2005--and Idiomatic made it a troika of Grade Is with the Breeders' Cup Distaff in November.

Idiomatic joined fellow Eclipse winners Cody's Wish (Curlin) and Up to the Mark (Not This Time) as the only American horses to win three Grade I races in 2023. However, she stands alone with the most graded scores (five) by any horse in North America for the year; not too shabby for a giant filly who kicked off her 2023 campaign with all of her conditions except a maiden win still ahead of her.

"She's a monster," said trainer Brad Cox after the Spinster.
"She has a tremendous stride and covers so much ground. She's really a freak--I mean, she really is a tremendous talent, and we're very fortunate to have her."

With all three winners of the Triple Crown series as well as the previous year's champion juvenile in the same starting gate, the Eclipse Award for champion 3-year-old male was settled on the racetrack in a GI Travers S. for the ages.

Trained up to the Travers by the trail-blazing Jena Antonucci after making history 11 weeks earlier in the GI Belmont S., Arcangelo left little doubt who the best sophomore in the country was, easily defeating six rivals, including GI Kentucky Derby winner Mage (Good Magic) (seventh), GI Preakness S. winner National Treasure (Quality Road) (fifth) and the reigning champion 2-year-old colt Forte (Violence) (fourth).

Antonucci, the first female trainer to win a Triple Crown race, became just the second female trainer to saddle a Travers winner, joining Mary Hirsch (1938).

Arcangelo's feel-good story also prominently showcased the renaissance of Hall of Fame rider Javier Castellano, who became the first jockey to win two Triple Crown races on two different horses in the same year since Calvin Borel did so in 2009. Castellano also rode Eclipse finalist Mage to an upset victory on the first Saturday in May.

An absolute steal for \$35,000 by Jon Ebbert's Blue Rose Farm during the fifth session of the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling sale, Arcangelo graduated impressively at third askingthe first time with Castellano at the controls--going a one-turn mile at Gulfstream Mar. 18.

Arcangelo posted a hard-fought victory in the May 13 GIII Peter Pan S. to earn his way into the Belmont, and, with Antonucci riding as hard as anyone from the boxes, defeated Forte by 1 1/2 lengths in his first attempt around two turns in the 1 1/2-mile Classic.

Arcangelo's aforementioned win in the Travers, good for a career-best 105 Beyer Speed Figure, would prove to be the final start for the ridgling. He was scratched from the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita with an untimely foot issue and was subsequently retired to Lane's End Farm, where he will stand his first season at stud for \$35,000 in 2024.

One of five Grade I winners for the gone-too-soon Arrogate, Arcangelo hails from the extended family of fellow Belmont winners Jazil (Seeking the Gold) and Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy).

After enjoying a clear lead in the stretch and failing to finish the job in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks, trainer Brendan Walsh decided to add a pair of blinkers to Pretty Mischievous.


Led by a heart-stopping, neck victory from post 14 in the GI Kentucky Oaks, her first attempt following the equipment change, the TDN Rising Star was a slam dunk as the nation's champion 3-year-old filly.

The Godolphin homebred backed up her 10-1 upset on the first Friday in May with another game tally at the top level, this time by a head, in the GI Acorn S. during the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival. Following the tragic breakdown of Maple Leaf Mel (Cross Traffic) in the shadow of the wire, favored Pretty Mischievous crossed the wire first by a head while turning back to seven furlongs in a heart-breaking renewal of the GI Test S. at Saratoga. She lost little in defeat rallying for second as the favorite in the GI Cotillion S. over the sloppy going at Parx, her final start of her sophomore campaign.

Pretty Mischievous shipped to Santa Anita to take on older fillies and mares for the first time in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, but was scratched after "she got a little bit colicky" following the trip from Kentucky, per Walsh. The bay's 3-year-old campaign also included a win in the GII Rachel Alexandra S. at Fair Grounds in February.

Her all-conquering sire Into Mischief is also responsible for fellow Eclipse champions: Authentic (2020 Horse of the Year & 3YO Male); Gamine (2020 Female Sprinter); Covfefe (2019 3YO Filly & Female Sprinter); and Wonder Wheel (2022 2YO Filly). Pretty Mischievous was produced by 2016 GI Spinaway S. winner Pretty City Dancer, who was acquired by Sheikh Mohammed's operation for \$3.5 million at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

When Fierceness is good, he's *really* good. Leaving little question what he could do straight out of the box, the Repole homebred destroyed his rivals by 11 1/4 lengths in a muddy career unveiling at the Spa last August. Clearly much-the-best in that six-furlong test, the even-money favorite earned TDN Rising Star status with the win, not only for his gaudy margin of victory but for the humbling ease in which he accomplished the feat. Pounded down to 1-2 favoritism while stretching to a mile for the Oct. 7 GI Champagne S. during the Belmont at the Big A meet, the bay acted up in the gate a heartbeat before the break, prompting an awkward start. Losing valuable position while getting shuffled back, he mounted a brief run but never quite found his groove, and had to settle for seventh behind Timberlake (Into Mischief).

Granted a much better start on Breeders' Cup Day, Fierceness lay just off a respectable early pace, and when push came to shove, fellow TDN Rising Star Muth (Good Magic) took his best shot in the stretch but it wasn't good enough as the son of Nonna Bella powered home a confident 6 1/4 lengths winner over the Bob Baffert trainee. Adding further luster to that form, Muth returned in his very next start to take the Jan. 6 GII San Vicente S.

Fierceness is a member of the first crop of City of Light, who already has a quintet of juveniles who have garnered TDN Rising Star honors. On the racetrack, the Lane's End stallion won a Grade I races at three, four and five, including the Pegasus World Cup Invitational and Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

Fierceness's dam, Nonna Bella, also proved to be a gift for her owner, Mike Repole. A daughter of Repole's GI Belmont S. winner Stay Thirsty, she is out of GISP Nonna Mia (Empire Maker), who is also responsible for GI Wood Memorial victor Outwork (Uncle Mo). The family also enjoyed an epic score in the sales ring last year when Nonna Mia's 2022 colt by Into Mischief realized a \$3-million final bid at Keeneland September. Nonna Bella has a newly-turned juvenile full-brother to Fierceness in addition to a yearling sister by Caravaggio. She is in foal to Coolmore's Uncle Mo, who was also campaigned by Repole.


Coolmore's Justify continued to see his star rise in 2023 with the addition of his first Breeders' Cup winner when Just F Y I sprung the upset at Santa Anita in November as a 7-1 shot to remain undefeated on the year. The homebred, honored in this category alongside another Breeders' Cup-winning daughter of Justify in Hard to Justify, added the stamp of Champion 2-yearold Filly to pick up another first for her sire--his first Eclipse champion. A debut winner for the successful partnership of Bill Mott and Junior Alvarado (also the team behind Horse of the Year and Champion Older Male Cody's Wish) at Saratoga in August, Just FYI then stamped herself a contender with a 3 3/4length romp in the slop to take the GI Frizette S. at Belmont's Aqueduct meeting Oct. 7. The third choice in the wagering behind heavily-favored 'TDN Rising Star' Tamara (Bolt d'Oro) come Breeders' Cup weekend, Just F Y I was able to stalk the pace of that favorite and prevail by a neck to cement her Eclipse honors.

After a deserved break, the champion got back on the work tab Jan. 15 with a three-furlong breeze at Payson Park in :37.20 (2/9). --Stefanie Grimm

To start his campaign, the 5-year-old sprinter shipped to Saudi Arabia to contest the G3 Riyadh Dirt Sprint at King Abdulaziz Racecourse, which turned out to be a professional beginning to his year as he won by 3 1/4 lengths over Gunite (Gun Runner).

The \$900,000 Keeneland September buy returned home to win the GII True North S. at Belmont Park and then triumphed after an epic fight with Gunite in the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga.

Though his rival got the best of him in the GI Forego S. upstate, the Bill Mott trainee celebrated with a resounding score by 1 1/2 lengths in the GI Qatar Racing Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita last November.



What a mare. Goodnight Olive opened 2024 the same way she opened 2023: capturing an Eclipse Award as Champion Female Sprinter. In between, she doubled up in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, added yet another Grade I to her CV in Keeneland's Madison S., and served as co-topper of Fasig-Tipton's Night of the Stars Sale when selling for \$6 million.

With a career quartet of Grade I scores, Goodnight Olive has never been off the board with nine wins in 12 starts. Although she wasn't quite as dominant in 2023 as in 2022, when she went undefeated in four tries, it's hard to argue with a year that began with a win in the Madison and culminated with a defending victory in the Breeders' Cup. She broke a seven-race win streak when third in Churchill's GI Derby City Distaff on Derby Day after finding herself trapped inside with nowhere to go, only to return a month later with a hard-fought score in the GII Bed o' Roses S. at Belmont.

Goodnight Olive got perhaps the sternest test of her career when trying for a repeat win in the GI Ballerina H. in August,

facing both fellow Female
Sprinter finalist Echo Zulu (Gun
Runner) and a muddy Saratoga
track. Echo Zulu had finished
second to Goodnight Olive in
the 2022 Breeders' Cup, but
turned the tables at the Spa
when she set the pace and
stayed there, leaving Goodnight
Olive in the runner-up spot
despite a career-best 108 Beyer
Speed Figure. Rested until the
Breeders' Cup, which Echo Zulu
missed due to a career-ending
injury, Goodnight Olive would

Gavin O'Connor, agent for Lexington financier John Stewart, signed the ticket. Stewart is returning his new acquisition to trainer Chad Brown's barn with a 2024 campaign in the cards and

It's not every year, and not every season, that a horse can boast the claim of spending over 70 % of their campaign in Grade I company, but with seven starts in 2023 and five at the highest level, Up to the Mark can say just that. Even more impressive, he was never off the board in any of them, including in his career finale where he faced the Irish-bred titan formally known as multiple Group 1-winner Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the GI Longines Breeders' Cup Turf and came within three-quarters-of-a-length of playing spoiler.

While he may have lost the fight in the Breeders' Cup, he won the war for year-end honors, defeating that rival and Godolphin's globetrotting group and graded winner Master of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) to claim the title of Champion Turf Male.

Starting his year dominating the Gulfstream Park allowance ranks in back-to-back victories, Up to the Mark was immediately jumped into the highest level of racing and remained there the rest of the year. In his first appearance in a Grade I--and generally graded company--at Keeneland in the GI Maker's Mark Mile S., his rally came short of the long-gone GISW Chez Pierre (Fr) (Mehmas {Ire}), who would win the contest by 3 1/2 lengths and put up a time a little more than a half-second off the track record. In running third, he came within a neck of catching multiple Group 1 and Grade I-winner Modern Games (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), which could have served as a hint of what would come later in the year.

Resurfacing next on the Kentucky Derby undercard May 6, he put on a tour-de-force in the GI Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic S., overcoming early traffic trouble to put away a respectable field by 3 3/4 lengths to pick up his first of three Grade Is. It would be a similar effort in June when he won the GI Resorts World Casino Manhattan S. at Belmont Park by over two lengths despite his lingering gate restlessness.

Up to the Mark returned to Keeneland for the autumn meeting, where he would win the first and only head-to-head match-up with fellow finalist Master Of The Seas in the GI Coolmore Turf Mile S., running down that equally gusty rival in the shadow of the wire and requiring a photo to separate them. From there, both runners would find themselves in the Breeders' Cup starting gate at Santa Anita Park, but their paths would diverge from there. While Master Of The Seas went on to win the GI FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile by the slimmest of margins over Turf Female nominee G1SW-Eng, GISW Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), Up to the Mark would take on some of the best in the world in the 1 1/2-mile Breeders' Cup Turf.

He'd face traffic trouble, tight quarters, and a dirt crossover but in the end was running best of the American contingent to just miss holding off the G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby winner-among his other notable Group 1 accomplishments that year-who would take the rail route home to score. While it would be his final start, Up to the Mark did nothing in that effort to disgrace himself and capped a year highlighted by his monumental rise to prominence with a fine feather in his cap as a three-time winning, and two-time Grade I-placed champion. Not a bad year at all.

Up to the Mark will stand at Lane's End for \$25,000 LFSN for the 2024 breeding season.

Despite making only one start in the United States in the GI Maker's Mark Filly and Mare Turf, producing a stylish victory with Frankie Dettori in the irons, Eclipse voters saw it enough to award Cheveley Park Stud homebred Inspiral (GB) the title of Champion Turf Mare on the back of that win, defeating MGISW In Italian (GB) (Dubawi {Ire})--who ran fifth and garnered 50 first-place votes in the category. Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), runner-up in the GI FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile, would garner the third highest amount with 43 as several others came in behind the leading trio with a handful or a single vote to their

Inspiral secured her spot at the Breeders' Cup via the "Win and You're In" G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay Le Buffard Jacques Le Marois, a contest she'd take for the second time in 2023 and giving Dettori his fourth consecutive victory in the Prix Jacques le Marois to boot.

Almost two months later, the pair again partnered to set another noteworthy record for the veteran rider--his 500th Newmarket winner--when Inspiral swept by Mgse De Sevigne (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr}) in the closing drive and surging 3 3/4 lengths clear to secure her second Group 1 of her 2023 season in the G1 Virgin Bet Sun Chariot S. Crossing the pond for the first time to take advantage of her guaranteed spot in the Breeders' Cup gate at Santa Anita Park in November, it was another scintillating display of her monestrous closing kick as the daughter of Frankel roared home down the center to deny fellow invader, dual Group 1 winner Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and to also tally her sire's first winner in the World Championships. Cheveley Park's Thompson family took home their second trophy with Inspiral's effort having last won the 2016 edition of the race with Queen's Trust (GB) (Dansili {GB}). Inspiral was named the Cartier Champion 2-Year-Old Filly as a juvenile after assembling an unbeaten four-win season in 2021.

In a wide-open division, Merry Maker earned his Eclipse championship at Aqueduct in September when he scored a laterunning victory in the G1 Lonesome Glory H. He was able to defeat fellow Eclipse finalist Snap Decision (Hard Spun), who set the pace in the Lonesome Glory before fading to fourth under highweight of 158 pounds that day. Sandwiching his Group 1 victory at Aqueduct, Merry Maker was fourth behind fellow finalist Awakened (Curlin) in the Aug. 23 G1 Jonathan Sheppard H. at Saratoga and was second over a boggy course in the Oct. 21 G1 Grand National at Far Hills.

# OUTSTANDING OWNER/BREEDER GODOLPHIN LLC

2023 record (owner): 441-86-90-63, \$17,270,223 2023 record (breeder): 999-175-176-131, \$20,907,146

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Godolphin LLC was named America's outstanding owner for the fourth year in a row and the outstanding breeder for a third consecutive season during Thursday night's Eclipse Awards. Horses racing in the Godolphin blue amassed earnings that were some \$900,000 greater than in 2022, while horses bred by Godolphin earned better than \$2.3 million more than they did the previous season.

Whereas Godolphin raced the winners of 20 graded races in 2022, that number was as high as 27 this past season, including no fewer than a dozen at the elite level. For the second time in a row, the operation was represented by a pair of homebred winners at the Breeders' Cup meeting, as Horse of the Year/champion dirt male Cody's Wish (Curlin) made it back-to-

back scores in the GI Dirt Mile, while Master of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) nailed the commonly owned Mawj (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in the GI Mile.

Eclipse Award winner Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief) herself accounted for three Grade I successes, as she became the first Godolphin winner of the Kentucky Oaks, while Wet Paint (Blame) and Mawj knocked off age-restricted Grade Is in the CCA Oaks and QE II Challenge Cup, respectively. Matareya (Pioneerof the Nile) caused a bit of an upset in the GI Derby City Distaff, while Nations Pride (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) took out the GI Canadian International. Master of The Seas also struck north of the border in the Ricoh Woodbine Mile.

Horses raced by Godolphin outearned the nearest competitor-Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables (102 fewer starters, one more winner)--by an imposing \$7.7 million while their runners struck at a win rate of 19.5%. As an honorable mention, Klaravich runners won better than one of every four races in which they were entered.

Runners bred by Godolphin made about a third of the starts as second-placed Calumet Farm and won a bit more than a third of the races than horses bred by Calumet, but still managed to outdistance them by \$4.5 million in earnings.—Alan Carasso

# OUTSTANDING TRAINER BILL MOTT

Hall of Famer Bill Mott doesn't rely on a voluminous string to strong-arm his competition. Also, he's not often (or maybe not often enough) the top choice of trainers that draw the vast majority of million-dollar yearlings that pass through the sales ring every year. And while still erroneously labeled a turf trainer by many (well yes, he can do that too), Mott showcased his strength with his dirt runners in 2023, led by Horse of the Year and Champion Older Male Cody's Wish (Curlin). Mott is adding his fourth Eclipse Award following wins in 1995-1996 and 2011.

Over the past two seasons, Mott has been stationed in fifth in earnings, behind a rotating wheel of Brad Cox, Chad Brown, Todd Pletcher and Steve Asmussen, all of whom are armed with both the quality and numbers that are generally seen dominating the American racing landscape. Certainly, most people wouldn't cry the blues for him, least of all Mott himself, given his ability to continually draw some of the best from several of the nation's leading owners and breeders.

Currently, he ranks fourth lifetime with 5,382 and earnings of \$340,782,251. However, the numbers don't lie. In 2023, Mott-trained horses made 649 starts with earnings of \$17,437,147, standing in stark contrast to the division leading Cox, whose horses amassed \$30,947,677 for 963 starts. And delving a bit deeper, Mott runners collected an impressive 10 Grade I wins in 2023, only two behind division leaders Cox and Brown, and tied with Todd Pletcher.

However, where Mott truly appeared to shine last season, and can be argued to have dominated, is the number of top-level performers that graced his stable.

Mott rounds out the season with a trio of divisional champions--multiple Grade I scorers Cody's Wish and Elite Power (Curlin), in addition to undefeated GI Breeders' cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Just F Y I (Justify), who earned the 2023 Eclipse Award as the nation's leading juvenile filly. Godolphin homebred Cody's Wish was near flawless last year, winning four of five starts, all at the graded level, including the GI Churchill Downs S., GI Met Mile and GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. Campaigned by Juddmonte, Elite Power launched his 2023 campaign with a victory in the G3 Riyadh Dirt Sprint in Saudi Arabia, adding a trio of stateside wins--the GII True North S., GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint--later in the year. Once again demonstrating his ability to train a leading lady, Mott led George Krikorian's Just F Y I to a trio of victories in 2023, punctuated by the GI Frizette S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Last season, Mott was also responsible for toprung winners Art Collector (Bernardini), winner of the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational, Casa Creed (Jimmy Creed), victorious in the GI Fourstardave S., and GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic heroine War Like Goddess (English Channel). -- CBossTDN

# OUTSTANDING JOCKEY IRAD ORTIZ JR.

A native of Trujillo Alto, Puerto Rico, Irad Ortiz Jr. turned in another strong year as he scooped up his fifth Eclipse Champion Jockey Award. Tops in starts, wins and earnings, Ortiz started 2023 by reclaiming the Gulfstream Park Championship Meet riding title.

He then successfully captured one of the most sought after prizes in the sport when he ran away as Saratoga's leading jockey after registering 62 wins--up from 52 the year prior.

After learning he had secured his second consecutive Saratoga riding title, Ortiz said, "It means a lot, it means everything. It's a special place and it's a lot of work. My agent [Steve Rushing] does a great job and I have big support from trainers and owners."

To cap his Eclipse run, Ortiz arrived at Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup and helped both Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper) (F&M Sprint) and Elite Power (Curlin) (Sprint) repeat in their respective races.

In the Classic, Ortiz celebrated his second victory in the race when he guided home White Abarrio (Race Day). His first came over the same surface in 2019 with Vino Rosso (Curlin).

"Everything came out perfect," Ortiz said after he guided White Abarrio home. "We handicapped that race perfectly as we thought Saudi Crown and Arabian Knight would be on the lead and we should be third. I saved all the ground on the first turn and then I was able to get in the clear on the backside. After that, it all about the horse. To be honest, I just let him do his thing and I don't get in his way. When I turned for him, I started to ride him and kept responding."--@campbellparlay

# OUTSTANDING APPRENTICE JOCKEY AXEL CONCEPCION

Outstanding Apprentice Jockey Axel Concepcion, a Puerto Rican native and graduate of the Escuela Vocacional Hipica jockey school, started his year off early by earning his first North American win in February at Laurel Park. Represented by agent Tom Stift, the newly-turned 18-year-old rounded out the spring season in the Mid Atlantic by capturing the Laurel meet title over veterans Jevian Toledo and Jeiron Barbosa.

"I ride all my horses with confidence," said Concepcion following that title. "Thanks to all the owners and trainers that help me. In the morning I work very hard for this, my first meet that I win. I'm very grateful."

Second in the standings behind Jamie Ness to end Laurel's summer season, Concepcion then moved his tack to Kentucky in November where he came second again, this time to Luan Machado, to close out the year at Turfway Park's holiday meet. Riding for top stables and trainers, Concepcion picked up the rides on horses such as GISP Chop Chop (City of Light) and MGSW Field Pass (Lemon Drop Kid). He would finish the year ranked 14th by wins and just inside the top 50 for career earnings. --Stefanie Grimm

Bred by Clearsky Farms, ACCLAIMED VICTOR (Omaha Beach) makes his first start for Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher. The \$725,000 Keeneland September grad, who was purchased by St. Elias, was the third highest selling yearling in 2022 by his top five first-crop sire.

Out of Color Me Flying (Distorted Humor), the 3-year-old is a half-brother to MGSP Colorful Mischief (Into Mischief), who St. Elias acquired at the 2020 Fasig-Tipton Select Yearling Sale for \$300,000.

Not seen until late last summer when she was a well-beaten seventh against allowance company at Ellis Park, the filly was able to draw in as a 'Main-Track-Only' participant here. Donning blinkers and off as a 3-1 shot, the 4-year-old tracked from the third position. Tiny Temper stayed off the rail up the backstretch and steadily began to reel in the frontrunners into the far turn. Entering the long stretch, the Dallas Stewart trainee set her sights on the leader, collared her target just past the sixteenth pole and splashed home by a half length. The winner's dam was purchased for \$120,000 by Brookstone Farm at the 2020 Keeneland November Sale with a colt by Gun Runner in-utero. ### IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF NEARCO, A NEW CHAPTER BEGINS AT BEECH HOUSE STUD

Eighty-five years and a number of equine generations ago, Nearco (Ity) embarked on his stallion career at Beech House Stud. The year was 1939 and, understandably given the age, a bomb shelter was constructed by order of the stud's owner Martin Benson to protect its most prized resident (see the photograph on page 2).

Benson had bought the unbeaten Nearco, winner of the Grand Prix de Paris and Derby Italiano, from his breeders Federico Tesio and Mario Incisa della Rochetta for a then-record £60,000 (the equivalent of just over £5 million today). To note that the son of Pharos (GB) became champion sire twice in England is to tell only a fraction of his story. Nearco's influence on the Thoroughbred breed as we know it today has been profound. His son Royal Charger (GB) established a sire-line which includes Hail To Reason and his descendants Halo, Sunday Silence and Deep Impact (Jpn). Another son, Nasrullah (GB), is responsible for several significant branches, including the lines of Bold Ruler, Grey Sovereign (GB), Red God and Never Bend. And then there was Nearco's son Nearctic, the sire of Northern Dancer. Need we say more? Cont. p3



#### Mostahdaf Cont. from p1

A glance at the official IFHA and Longines world rankings released earlier this week attest to Nearco's continuing dominance. The first nine names on the list are all his direct male descendants, and it takes Cody's Wish and Titleholder (Jpn), from the Mr. Prospector line and in joint-tenth place, to break that run. In second behind Equinox (Jpn), and the joint-top-rated horse in Europe last year was Mostahdaf (Ire), his rating of 128 placing him on a shared mark with Ace Impact (Ire).

Mostahdaf's retirement to the Shadwell stallion roster for 2024 brings a little piece of bloodstock history full circle. Having been based at Nunnery Stud in Thetford for a number of years, Shadwell's collection of British stallions has now returned to Beech House Stud, which was bought by the late Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum in 1990.

Mostahdaf now stands in the box once occupied by Nearco, who is buried at the stud and whose name can be found six generations back on the top line of Mostahdaf's pedigree (among other places), through Frankel (GB), Galileo (Ire), Sadler's Wells, Northern Dancer and Nearctic. Those names alone are enough to provide an entrée to the stallion market.

How many sires will be advertised in the years to come with the line 'A son of Frankel'?

As with all horses, though, that's only one half of the equation. Mostahdaf is a result of Sheikh Hamdan's purchase in 2009 of the Dubawi (Ire) filly Handassa (GB). Bought from her breeder Red House Stud for 100,000gns, she is out of a half-sister to the champion sprinters Goodricke (GB) and Pastoral Pursuits (GB) and earned more black type for the family herself when winning the Listed Garnet S. over a mile for Kevin Prendergast.

Handassa rang the bell with her third foal, Nazeef (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), winner of the G1 Sun Chariot and G1 Falmouth S. during a high-flying career with John Gosden, and it has been pealing loudly once more thanks to the progressive talents of Mostahdaf.

"He was the highest-rated Prince of Wales's Stakes winner since Dubai Millennium back in 2000. He defeated a long list of Group 1 winners in his two Group 1 wins last year and was a very impressive horse throughout his career," says Shadwell's Will Wright, whose job it is to encourage breeders to send their mares to the new stallion. That shouldn't be too difficult.

The Royal Ascot triumph was followed by victory in the G1 Juddmonte International.

In those back-to-back successes, Mostahdaf had first Luxembourg (Ire), Adayar (Ire) and Bay Bridge (GB) in his wake, then Nashwa (GB) and

Paddington (GB). His overall record reads 10 wins from 17 starts and almost £2.5 million in career earnings. Moreover, he is an enticing addition to a line-up in Britain which includes the top-rated turf horse in the world in 2022, Baaeed (GB), and fellow Group 1 winner Mohaather (GB), whose first runners will be seen later this year. It is a young line-up of burgeoning promise, and in Ireland the Shadwell team is completed by two more Group 1 winners, Minzaal (Ire) and Awtaad (Ire).

Shadwell has also recently 'supplied' Baaeed's highly-credentialed brother Hukum (Ire) to Darley Japan and the treble Group 2 winner Mutasaabeq (GB) to the National Stud.

An imposing dark bay stallion, Mostahdaf's wins came between 7f and the 1m4f of the G3 September S. They included two Listed victories at a mile and those crucial Group 1s over 10f and 10.5f. He has the range and scope of a middle-distance

horse, with some intriguing sprint elements close up in his family.

"That speed, as we know, is important in the modern-day market," says Wright. "He's got everything. Obviously [there's] Frankel, and the ability to win stakes races over a mile. He won on debut by four lengths over seven furlongs."

Anyone who saw Mostahdaf up close at the races last year as a five-year-old would have seen that he was already showing signs of being interested in the next phase of his career, not

that his sometimes-noisy intent stopped him compiling his best season on the track. At Beech House in the weak January sunshine, his behaviour is more lamblike. **Cont. p5**

In fact, he is the very picture of relaxed contentment as he stands placidly, his footing being adjusted here and there for the camera by his skilful handler Chris Constantine.

The young Shadwell team, both equine and human, looks to have settled into the new surroundings very happily after crossing the border from Norfolk back to Suffolk.

Wright says, "To have the stallions standing at Beech House is great and has put us back in the heart of Newmarket. It's very exciting to position ourselves in the home of horse racing, and to have our stallions here makes them far more accessible to breeders visiting the sales, etc.

"The move to Beech House is very exciting for all concerned. Obviously this is a stud of great history, being home to past greats Crepello and St Paddy. The list goes on, but obviously Nearco is the headline name here."

The former presence of the Derby winners Crepello (GB) and St Paddy (GB) hark back to the days of Beech House Stud being owned by their breeder Sir Victor Sassoon. Crepello, too, has a

link to Tesio being a son of another of the trainer-breeder's great horses, Donatello (Fr), as does Ribero, another former Beech House stallion and an Irish Derby and St Leger-winning son of Tesio's masterpiece Ribot (GB).

As a final thought, it is worth reflecting on a bloodstock 'Sliding Doors' moment as recounted by Tesio's friend and business partner Mario Inciso della Rochetta in his book 'The Tesios as I Knew Them'.

Incisa tells how Nearco's dam Nogara had been an intended mate for Lord Derby's Fairway (GB), a match carefully plotted by Tesio in the hope that the sizeable Fairway could add substance to the small mare, and his stamina enhance her sprinting race record. A change of stud manager at Woodlands Stud to a new man who had no knowledge of Tesio, meant that Nogara was turned down for Fairway. The mare was thus rerouted to France and Fairway's full-brother Pharos (GB), who was described by Incisa as being physically more compact than his brother. He wrote that Tesio was in despair. That lasted only until the weanling Nearco started to boss his paddock mates at Olgiata, as he would later do to his rivals on the racecourse. Cont. p6

The rest, as they say, is history, and it is a rich one at that. Some six and seven generations removed from Nearco and his appearance at Beech House Stud, three of his many male-line descendants are at his former home and in the early throes of being able to establish their own importance in the bloodstock world.

Will they be modern-day influencers of the breed? Time will tell. But what we do know for sure is that the consequences of Martin Benson's measures to ensure that the less-than-friendly bombs of the Second World War did not fall on Nearco have been far-reaching indeed.

Ironically, Mind Your Biscuits was victorious in the Lukas Classic before finishing down the field in the Breeders' Cup, but Friday, Clapton will meet nothing of the quality of White Abarrio (Race Day) and Mind Your Biscuits's son Derma Sotogake (Jpn)-at least this time around. Antonio Fresu breezed Clapton in California prior to the Breeders' Cup and is in to ride Friday.

"We think that maybe he didn't like being on the inside," Summers said, referring to the Classic. "He's such a big horse that we'd like him to really get into his rhythm and if we lose a little bit of ground, that's OK. We hope they'll go an honestenough pace. We're adding blinkers for this, too."

Kabirkhan (California Chrome) is very much the new kid on the block, and trainer Doug Watson wheels him back on two weeks' rest after the colt--eight for nine in Russia--was an extremely impressive winner of a 2000-metre handicap on Jan. 1.

"He was showing it at home, but he had to go over and prove it at the races, and I believe he did," the conditioner said. "He's come out of that race in good shape. Ideally we wouldn't want to be running back in two weeks, but it's a million-dollar Group 1. I think he belongs in it, and whatever he does in it, we're looking forward to the third round and World Cup night."

Atletico El Culano (Uru) (Alcorano {Brz}) was third to the G1 Saudi Cup-bound Isolate (Mark Valeski) at big odds in last year's G2 Godolphin Mile and prepped for this with a defeat of Military Law (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in a course-and-distance handicap Dec. 22. Third in that heat was Walk of Stars (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), who can improve for that first experience on the dirt in this spot.

#### Mawj Aiming For Hat Trick Of Meydan Wins In Jebel Hatta

It is not every day a GI Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up surfaces in the G1 Jebel Hatta Presented by Longines over 1800 metres of pristine Meydan turf, but Godolphin's Mawj (Ire) (Exceed And Excel (Aus)) will be doing just that in her 4-year-old bow. The diminutive filly, a winner of the G1 1000 Guineas and GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup in England and the U.S., respectively, is trained by Saeed bin Suroor. She was the slimmest of noses behind fellow Godolphin runner Master Of The Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the Mile at Santa Anita last November.

"Mawj arrived in Dubai after the Breeders' Cup and had a bit of an easy time," said bin Suroor, who last won this race in 2019 with Dream Castle (GB) (Frankel (GB)), and trained Mawj to a pair of 2023 conditions race wins over the Meydan lawn. "She's doing well and I'm happy with her. After this the plan is the [G1] Dubai Turf [on Dubai World Cup night at the end of March] and then we will take her back to Europe." Cont. p7

Last-out G2 Zabeel Mile hero **San Donato (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}), from the yard of Doug Watson, is trying for his first toptier victory, as is Zabeel Mile third **El Patriota (Uru)** (Ecologo {Arg}).

Julio Olascoaga, who trains the latter said, "He earned the chance to run this race after his good result last time out. The opposition cannot be stronger but we're confident he will continue to run big."

G2 Bahrain Trophy winner **Spirit Dancer (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), owned in part by Sir Alex Ferguson, is also part of the ninestrong field.

Trainer Richard Fahey said, "It's his first Group 1 and a tough race, a proper Group 1 and we're looking forward to seeing him run. Everything is going well and he's in great order.

"I'm afraid his owners can't make it this time which is a big shame because I know they were keen to come, but it's just fallen on the wrong day sadly. Sir Alex is used to winning, but he gets a good kick out of it, so let's hope he runs well again."

#### An Eighth Al Fahidi Fort For Appleby?

Godolphin trainer Charlie Appleby is gunning for his eighth 1400-metre G2 Al Fahidi Fort, and will saddle both Grade I winner Mysterious Night (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and dual winner Majestic Pride (GB) (Shamardal) in the 12-horse field. Successful in the Summer S. in Canada as a juvenile, the 4-year-old won for the first time since with a four-length drubbing of his foes in a local handicap over this distance on Jan. 19 and is returning just one week later.

Already a winner of the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest, **King Gold (Fr)** (Anodin {Ire}) ran fifth to Kelina (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) in the G1 Prix de la Foret at ParisLongchamp on Oct. 1 going the Fort trip

and makes his first start back on Friday.

"He's settled in really well to Dubai again," said Marine Henry, wife and assistant to trainer Nicholas Caullery. "He's worked a few times on the racetrack and worked well. This isn't a main objective for him--we're not expecting him to win--but we're hoping to run well."

Shadwell's **Danyah (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) stunned the G1 Al Quoz Sprint field at 33-1 last March, and he was a narrow second to the re-opposing **Vafortino (Ire)** (New Bay {GB}) in the Listed Business Bay Challenge warming up for this on Dec. 22.

#### **House Eyeing Blue Point Sprint**

Sailing into the 1000-metre G2 Blue Point Sprint Presented by Longines over the Meydan straight course on a two-race winning streak, Mehmas (Ire)'s **Clarendon House (GB)** will be attempting to negotiate the hike between handicap and stakes company.

"If he can transfer what he did on the all-weather to grass, then I think it will suit him very well," said trainer Robert Cowell, who struck at the Carnival in 2012 with Monsieur Joe (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}). "I think the fast ground and plenty of pace will be ideal, it's whether he's good enough to bridge this gap between handicaps and stakes races."

Of his rivals, one of the strongest is **Equality (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}), who will be attempting softer company after taking the G3 Coral Charge S. in June for trainer Charlie Hills, but failing to hit the mark against several of the best sprinters in Europe later in the year.

"On ratings, he should be right up there, but it is his first run after a break and he's probably fit enough to do himself justice but whether he'll be quite 100% is another matter," said Sam Hoskins, syndicate manager for owner Kennet Valley. Cont. p8

The lightly raced listed winner **Star Of Mystery (GB)**, second in the G2 Duchess Of Cambridge S. during her six-start career, defeated GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint third Starlust (GB) (Zoustar {Aus}) in a Meydan conditions race on Jan. 12. The Godolphin-owned daughter of Kodiac (GB) sneaks into the field carrying only 117 pounds and will leave from gate 11.

#### Like Father, Like Son In the Guineas?

Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa's Asiatic Boy (Arg) took out the 2007 G3 UAE 2000 Guineas in his second local appearance before going on to wallop his Northern Hemisphere counterparts in the G2 UAE Derby two starts later. Seventeen years on, his son **Oasis Boy (Arg)**, a Group 2 winner at home when last spotted July 29 can make his presence felt in Friday's mile event at Meydan.

The other South American entrant is **Quartier (Uru)** (Matterhorn), who has the benefit of a spin around the racetrack on Jan. 5, when he ran on strongly after missing the kick to finish a good second to the well-regarded Ma Yetal (Flameaway), who sits this one out. Both South American-breds must give 10 pounds away to their less-mature rivals.

**Killer Collecte (Collected)** makes his 3-year-old debut in the Guineas, having thrashed a field of maidens by 7 1/2 lengths over course and distance Dec. 8, while **Military Artist** (Munnings) races for the third time in four weeks, having most recently annexed a 1600-metre novice Jan. 12.

#### A Moat By Any Other Name

Friday's 1600-metre G3 Firebreak S. features 10 runners, and it is the progressive G3 Prix du Palais-Royal winner **Fort Payne (Fr)** (Rio De La Plata) who is one of the leading fancies. The Firebreak is not without its challenges, however, as it is his first start on

dirt, and his first appearance at Meydan after a career in France.

"It's his first time on the dirt but he did well on the Polytrack at home," said Marine Henry of the G3 Prix du Pin seventh, who is, like the aforementioned King Gold, trained by her husband Nicolas Caullery.

A veteran of the desert is **Thegreatcollection** (Saint Anddan), who secured a popular handicap victory at the ripe age of 10 over 1400 metres here on Jan. 12. Regular reinsman Adrie de Vries has the call, with the duo slotted midfield in gate six.

#### Al Shindagha River's For The Taking?

Bob Baffert has saddled Laurel River (Into Mischief) four times, with three wins to show from those Southern California efforts. However, the GII Pat O'Brien S. hero last graced a racecourse at Del Mar in August of 2022, and, despite joining the red-hot Bhupat Seemar barn in October, must overcome any ringrustiness due to almost 17 months on the bench in Friday's G3 Al Shindagha Sprint.

"He is doing really well," said Seemar of the Grade II winner. "This looks a good place to start him as he hasn't run for a while."

The Juddmonte runner's task is not straightforward, with several rivals more battle-hardened in recent weeks. Chief among them is **Colour Up (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}), who hails from the Doug Watson stable. The 2023 Listed Garhoud Sprint hero was an encouraging third in the G3 Dubawi S. on Jan. 5.

#### More Black-Type Glory For Siskany?

The evening's nightcap is the Listed Al Khail Trophy Presented by Longines over 2810 metres on grass, and Godolphin's trio is anchored by the well-traveled **Siskany (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) for trainer Charlie Appleby. Second to Broome (Ire) (Australia {GB}) in the G2 Dubai Gold Cup at the end of March, the gelding claimed the GII Belmont Gold Cup S. in the U.S. two starts later in June, and could not quite catch India (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}) when third in the G1 Preis von Europa in September. He ran fifth as the favourite after being outfooted in the GII Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance S. on the dirt at Santa Anita on Nov. 4 and is looking for redemption in Friday's contest.

#### What is your biggest ambition for the new year?

Stay healthy and be lucky.

#### Give us one horse to follow and why?

I watched a horse of Godolphin's called Arabian Crown (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}) win the G3 Zetland Stakes at Newmarket last October. William Buick set some pretty fierce fractions on him and he looked a very good horse to me. He's 12-1 for the Derby.

#### And a young person in the industry to keep an eye on...

Harry Eustace is a young trainer in Newmarket who really impresses me. With luck on his side, he has a big future ahead of him.

#### What's the one horse you wish you'd bought in 2023?

The Blue Point (Ire) half-brother to Battaash (Ire) and The Antarctic (Ire) at Tattersalls October Book 1, offered by Paul McCartan's Ballyphilip Stud. He made 1.5m guineas and was bought by Godolphin. A stunning yearling out of a fabulous mare by a very exiting young sire from a great hotel: what more do you want?

#### **Biggest regret?**

Not playing enough golf.

#### Biggest influence on your career?

John Gosden, who puts up with some rather long short-lists compiled by me at the yearling sales. John has an enviable work ethic and is obviously a brilliant trainer, not unlike Major Dick Hern, who I worked for over 30 years ago, who was also an amazing horseman. Tim Richards, who is an absolute gentleman and a very talented writer, who I worked with when I was Newmarket correspondent for the *Racing Post* many moons ago. A jockey coaching programme, that will see five qualified jockey coaches provide mentoring and specialised skills coaching across a range of subject areas to support and enhance the career development of all licensed jockeys in Ireland was launched by Horse Racing Ireland (HRI)'s equuip on Thursday.

All five jockey coaches are former riders. The coaches and their regions are as follows: Nina Carberry (Meath and North regions), Paddy Flood and Niall McCullagh (East and Midlands regions), Robbie Moran (South region), and Derek O'Connor (Western region). Former champion jockey Barry Geraghty, who is a qualified life coach, will support the jockey coaches and is also a jockey liaison coach. Funded by equuip, the jockey coaches will also assist in implementing continuing professional development (CPD). Jockeys at all levels in Ireland will be required to obtain a minimum of five sessions per year with their jockey coach, as well as five CPD points from engaging in any jockey pathway serves.
