The Pegasus has become a huge event for 1/ST, who owns both racetracks.



#### TREASURE CHEST

National Treasure (Quality Road), last year's front-running GI Preakness S. hero and a latest painful second to Horse of the Year Cody's Wish (Curlin) in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Santa Anita Nov. 4, gave trainer Bob Baffert a third victory in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. and his sire a second Saturday afternoon at Gulfstream Park.

"I'm proud of him. He ran his race. He showed up," said Baffert by phone from Southern California. "That's all you can ask for as a trainer. He was prepping well for it."

Baffert also won the Pegasus World Cup with Arrogate (2017) and Mucho Gusto (2020).

"I've always thought he was that good a horse," Baffert added. "He was just very immature and he's getting better and better, the way he's training. He trained much better than he was going into the Breeders' Cup."


Flavien Prat was intent on being a forward factor aboard the 5-2 post-time favorite, but John Velazquez aboard GII Cigar Mile H. hero **Hoist the Gold** (Mineshaft) had similar designs on the lead.

Hoist the Gold showed the way with National Treasure a pressing second through taxing fractions of :23.18 and :46.32. National Treasure came after Hoist the Gold with a quarter mile to race and kicked for home as the one to catch.

In the meantime, GI Breeders' Cup Classic seventh and Cigar Mile runner-up **Senor Buscador** (Mineshaft) was winding up with an inside run on the far turn and would have had every chance given the shape of the race.

It seemed inevitable that he'd race right by National Treasure in the deciding stages, but the latter had just enough in reserve to take it by a long neck. **Crupi** (Curlin) closed from last of 12 to finish third at longshot odds.

"He's very brave. Obviously, a great job by Bob," Prat said of

the winner. "He's always on point. It's been a great pleasure riding [National Treasure]."

National Treasure, a solid third in the 2022 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Keeneland, followed his Preakness win with a sixth-place finish in the GI Belmont S., a fifth-place finish in the GI Travers S. and a fourth-place finish in the GI Awesome Again S. He just got tagged by a nose by Cody's Wish at the Championships.

National Treasure is campaigned by the powerful partnership of SF Racing LLC, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables LLC, Robert Masterson, Stonestreet Stables LLC, Jay Schoenfarber, Waves Edge Capital LLC and Catherine Donovan.

"It's a wonderful partnership," SF Racing's Tom Ryan said.
"Great group of people that have stood behind us the whole way throughout over the last five or six years. Bob has taken us to places that we probably didn't feel we could arrive. This horse, what he did today, sitting off a horse, showed a new dimension. He's going to be a very nice 4-year-old."

'TDN Rising Star' First Mission (Street Sense), a narrow runner-up in the GII Clark S. and the 5-2 second choice, showed a little early speed before fading to ninth for trainer Brad Cox, who had saddled Knicks Go for a victory in the 2021 Pegasus World Cup.

"Just didn't handle the track at all. A lot of dirt hitting him in the face. He didn't seem like he wanted to go forward through it," Cox said. "Luis [Saez] said at the half-mile pole he didn't move forward when asked. Pretty simple watching the race on television, I kind of thought going up the backside he was struggling with the ground. Regroup and see what happens."

leading sire Quality Road. Quality Road, winner of this race's predecessor (GI Donn H.) in 2010, also sired the 2019 Pegasus winner City of Light. National Treasure was bred by Peter Blum Thoroughbreds, who retained his dam Treasure--a maiden of seven career starts--after she RNA'd for \$375,000 as a yearling at the 2013 Keeneland September Sale. Treasure is also responsible for the stakes winner Ultimate (Speightstown) and last year's GI Hopeful S. third-place finisher and 'TDN Rising Star' Pirate (Omaha Beach), who commanded \$350,000 as a Keeneland September yearling. Treasure's 2-year-old Authentic filly has been named Renoir. Blum also bred the aforementioned Breeders' Cup Classic winner and Horse of the Year. Treasure delivered a full brother to National Treasure Jan. 19.

#### WARM HEART BEATS THE BOYS, SETS NEW COURSE RECORD IN PEGASUS WORLD CUP



As farewell tours go, this was a pretty good one.

Four years after the Coolmore contingent's Magic Wand (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) gave the GI Pegasus World Cup Turf a mighty shake when second to upset-minded Zulu Alpha (Street Cry {Ire}), the globetrotting Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was given an A-plus steer from Ryan Moore, showed plenty of heart and guts when in very tight approaching the entrance to the final furlong and stayed on courageously to become the first female winner of the \$1-million GI Pegasus World Cup Turf.



The final time of 1:44.45 for the nine furlongs on firm turf broke the previous record set by English Channel back in 2007. Made the 12-5 second favorite behind the previously

undefeated Integration (Quality Road), Warm Heart secured a forward position, with Integration a few lengths in her wake, as Main Event (Bernardini) and Catnip (Kitten's Joy) came across from their double-digit draws to fight out an opening quarter in :23.47. Jerry the Nipper (Liam's Map) went up to spilt that pair, and when he did, Moore made a critical decision to hustle his filly along for a stride or two, enabling her to secure a groundsaving rail position just behind the pacesetters.

Remaining glued to the fence through the middle furlongs and with no real changes to the plot, Warm Heart began to zero in on the dueling front-runners rounding the turn, and Moore opted to ride her for luck nearing the stretch, attempting to work the same sort of magic as he did aboard Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Main Event was holding firm as they hit the stretch, but Javier Castellano had left a sliver of daylight for Warm Heart at the inside if she was good enough to capitalize. She sliced through there gamely to lead a furlong out and held safe to the wire as 'TDN Rising Star' I'm Very Busy (Cloud Computing)--who didn't enjoy the clearest of stretch runs--came running late. Frankie Dettori also put an outstanding ride on the outposted Catnip, riding him for speed before sitting a wide trip and staying on for third.


Integration, perfect in three tries prior to this, raced ahead of midfield and enjoyed a decent inside trip for the opening seven furlongs. But whereas Moore was able to get through, the runs never came for Integration, as he was stymied behind Jerry the Nipper and inside of Catnip when push came to shove and he flashed home full of run for fifth once clear.

"She's always traveling very comfortably," said Moore. "I didn't want to be there too early, and I didn't want to be tipping out into the straight, and I thought I'd rather just wait. She's a great filly. She's had an incredible year. She hasn't had a bad race.

"The leader, he was always leaning out, and he was weakening and I knew I had plenty of horse, so no problem. I was happy to wait."

A maiden winner over a mile and two furlongs in the soft at Leopardstown last May, Warm Heart took the 12-furlong G2 Ribblesdale S. at the Royal Meeting and belied odds of 9-1 to defeat older females in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks Aug. 24. A neck winner despite a stumble at the start of the G1 Prix Vermeille at ParisLongchamp Sept. 10, she was set for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf and the quick ground at Santa Anita as opposed to the oft-easy conditions for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The plan nearly came together perfectly, as Warm Heart snuck through inside and looked home in the 10-furlong event Nov. 4, only to be stung on the wire by the fast-finishing Inspiral (GB) (Frankel (GB)), who would go on to be crowned at the Eclipse Awards. Sent over to Hong Kong for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase, she made the lead a long way from home and was there for the taking late, finishing third to Junko (GB) (Intello {Ger}).

"She's an incredible filly," said trainer Aidan O'Brien. "Ryan said it just didn't work for her the last race, but she's tactical, she's tough and she quickens. She doesn't do an awful lot when she gets there, but that's the way she's always been. She's very classy and very hardy, loves the fast ground, fast track."

Much to the Ballydoyle maestro's chagrin, Warm Heart heads up to Kentucky to begin her second career.


"She's incredible. We'd love to have her and to be racing her, but the lads business is breeding these horses and she's an absolutely incredible broodmare to be going to Justify, who looks probably the most incredible stallion that ever was based on what he's done so far. It's so exciting, really," O'Brien said.

#### **Pedigree Notes:**

A three-time Group 1 winner in Australia over sprint trips, Sea Siren was sent to the Northern Hemisphere in late spring 2013, finishing eighth in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. before taking the Listed Belgrave S. to conclude her racing career.

A half-sister to Australian Group 3 winner Oratorio (Aus)--not to be confused with the eponymous Irish-bred--and New Zealand Group 2 winner Lady Dehere (NZ), Sea Siren is also responsible for Warm Heart's 3-year-old full brother Bremen (Ire), a maiden winner at second asking for Donnacha O'Brien at Killarney last July. Sea Siren was bred to Camelot (GB) on Southern Hemisphere time and was returned to Australia, where she foaled a colt by the sire of G1 Cox Plate winner Sir Dragonet (Ire) in August 2022. Chris Waller Racing/Mulcaster Bloodstock went to A\$275,000 for that produce at the recently concluded Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. After producing a colt by Home Affairs (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) last August, Sea Siren was covered by Justify at Coolmore Australia in September.

As stated above, Warm Heart also has a date with Justify this year, and with good reason. The cross over Galileo has resulted in three winners at the graded level, including champion and G1 Dewhurst S. winner City of Troy, GII Jessamine S. victress Buchu and Group 3 winner Red Riding Hood (Ire). G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Opera Singer is out of a mare by Galileo's sire

# DIDIA OUTCLASSES RIVALS IN PEGASUS WORLD CUP F/M TURF by Alan Carasso

The exceptionally consistent **Didia (Arg)** (Orpen) won for the 10th time in 15 career starts and for the sixth time in eight appearances since coming to North America, kicking on gamely in the final eighth of a mile to take out Saturday's \$500,000 GIII TAA Pegasus World Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Gulfstream Park.

Sent off the lukewarm 33-10 favorite, some \$1,500 more than GIII Cardinal S. romper **Star Fortress (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}), Didia jumped alertly and put herself right into the race, as she settled just off the flank of longshot leader **Accomplished Girl** (Street Boss) through the opening exchanges. The pace was not overly taxing up front--Didia eyeballed Accomplished Girl past a half-mile in a modest :48.62--and Didia was held together by Jose Ortiz on the turn, waiting for her cue to sprint for the wire.

Asked for her best when level with the front-runner on the swing for home, the 6-year-old stuck her head in front at the furlong marker and was home first. **Surprisingly** (Mastery), a 25-1 outsider, was able to drop down onto the fence rounding the first turn when Star Fortress was taken hold of and rode the rail throughout. She turned in a menacing late rally to be a good second. California raider **Ruby Nell** (Bolt d'Oro) was well and truly taken out of her game when unable to make the running, as is her custom, but she was settled well enough by Frankie Dettori from a forward position and finished a highly credible third, just ahead of the well-bet **Fluffy Socks** (Slumber {GB}).

Twice a Group 1 winner in Argentina, Didia won the first four starts of her stateside sojourn, capped by a powerful victory in the GII Modesty S. at Churchill last May. A pace-compromised second in the GI New York S. June 9, the bay was freshened with an eye on the tail end of the season and she returned to boss her rivals in the GII Rodeo Drive S. Oct. 7. She was most recently 10th to champion Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}) as the 9-1 fourth

choice in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf Nov. 4.

"I told [jockey] Jose [Ortiz] to be close and don't leave her that much to do," said winning trainer Ignacio Correas of Saturday's effort. "He was a bit closer but when I saw that the pace was not that fast, I was very happy with where she was. I thought if she got beat it was going to be if she beat herself. She had everything in her favor.

"I think that probably she's better than I ever imagined," Correas added. "She can do whatever. When you think that she was running a mile and a quarter and them come and put in such a performance almost wire to wire, close to the lead, these horses they just train themselves. We just need to stay out of the way."

The victory earns Didia a spot in the field and a \$25,000 travel stipend for the G1 Qatar Nassau S. at Glorious Goodwood later this summer.



During an interview on Saturday's NBC broadcast of the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational, 1/ST CEO Belinda Stronach announced that Santa Anita Park will play host to the "California Crown" Sept. 28, which she said will have some of the same elements as Gulfstream's Pegasus World Cup Day. The Pegasus has become a huge event for 1/ST, who owns both racetracks.

"We have an amazing relationship with the folks here in Miami, but we're going to move it out West," Stronach said. "Not the Pegasus, but a new race called the California Crown. We're going do something that's unique to California, something old school with a Hollywood vibe. It will be tremendous racing. It will be the richest day of racing in California. We're going to be bi-coastal. The Pegasus will remain here in Miami and continue to grow. We'll be doing something very similar but very 'California' at Santa Anita Sept. 28 this year."

The Associated Press reported that the California Crown would replace the GI Awesome Again S., a race for 3-year-olds and up. The AP reported that the California Crown will be for 3-yearolds.

"(Santa Anita) doesn't have a marquee, special-event date," Stronach told The AP.

Few details were available at deadline for this story, including the intended purse or what would consist of the undercard.

1/ST Racing and Gaming President Aidan Butler told the Associated Press that the purse would depend on the division of revenue between northern and southern California this year after the closing of Golden Gate Fields in June.

current connections at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton July Horses of Racing Age Sale for \$325,000.

A bullet work--five furlongs in :59 (1/100) Jan. 20 over the Arcadia oval under new rider Victor Espinoza--signaled Newgrange's sharpness going into the San Pasqual. Although he hadn't won a race from the front end since an optional allowance 14 months ago, Newgrange met little resistance when he gunned for the lead before the :23.27 first quarter. "He always miss[es] the break," said jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. "He missed the break with me, he missed the break with [Umberto] Rispoli, too, so I was ready for that. So I tried to travel with him and he was responding, every time I asked him. In the middle of the race, he was responding and he kept responding at the end. I was very impressed."

Saratoga in August, winning a scrached-down and rained-off event by an astonishing 22 3/4 lengths. On the board in two of her last three, including a last-out third over the local grass in the Tropical Park Oaks Dec. 23, Alpha Bella entered the gate as an 8-1 shot with blinkers off in her first try over the marathon 1 1/2-mile distance.

In command from the first jump, the pacesetter really slowed things down under Luis Saez, cruising in hand through early fractions of :24.25 and :49.03. Longshot Tass (Temple City) never stayed far off the leader, tracking her just a half-length back past the wire and into the second of three turns. Race favorite Romagna Mia (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) trailed throughout after a slow break and failed to produce a bid when called upon as the top pair swung into the final bend. Angled just off the rail, Alpha Bella let 2-1 shot R Calli Kim through along her inside, but was able to hold that rival off and survive a claim of foul and steward's inquiry to secure the front-running win.

"It looked like there was a lot going on there," winning trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We tightened it up a little bit, but it looked like we took the worst of it. We got bumped a couple times. I thought she ran a courageous race. The strategy was to go to the front and take it from there. It worked out really well. She's a filly that's always been knocking on the door. I think stretching her out is what she's been looking for."



Whisper Hill homebred **TAP MY BELLE** (Tapit) makes her first start for trainer Ralph Nicks.

The gray is out GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic heroine Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song), who was bred and raced by Gary Seidler and Peter Vegso. Initially, she was purchased by Brushwood Stable for \$2.8 million as the fourth highest price at the 2011 Keeneland November Sale.

Five years later at the same auction, Whisper Hill made the mare the sales topper when Mandy Pope took her home for \$3.8 million, while Tap My Belle's older full-sister, Unrivaled Princess, was in-utero.

Unrivaled Belle's most famous produce to date is also another full-sister to this Gulfstream first-time starter--two-time Eclipse Award recipient Unique Bella. Winner of the GI Beholder Mile and GI La Brea S., the champion was purchased for \$400,000 by Don Alberto at the 2015 Keeneland September Sale.

Unrivaled Belle claims a 2-year-old colt and a yearling one of the same sex, while Unique Bella--herself a dam--also has a 2year-old colt and she foaled a filly last year. All four offspring are by multiple leading sire Into Mischief.



I'm happy with both performances, but Bergen is a really cool horse and he's a very forward horse in his training and his races. He likes what he does. Trevor [McCarthy] worked him two breezes back and he came back with some really good feedback, so we used that today."

The winner's dam is responsible for a 2-year-old filly named Aledean (Game Winner), who sold to Greg Tramontin for \$600,000 at last year's Keeneland September Sale, and a yearling filly by Not This Time. 



### Q&A W/Andy Slattery Cont. from p1

**AS:** A lot of people advised me to do it and it has been a complete no-brainer. I've had the chance to get on some nice horses, pick up good prize-money and live a very different

lifestyle than I would at home. I wouldn't say it's a different quality of life but you are certainly treated a lot differently in Dubai than back home.

### Is this your first trip away as a rider?

I have been to America but I never rode in races over there. I worked with Paddy Gallagher at Santa Anita and rode in a lot of work. It's funny, a lot of what I picked up in America has stood to me in Dubai because a lot of our work out here is done on the

clock. Having that clock in your head has been a life saver. Bhupat trains very similarly to how they do it in America and, if I hadn't spent that time in the States, I'd say I would have been lost. There are about 10 or 11 work riders here in the yard and everyone knows their job and what times they have to do each morning. These are top horses in Bhupat's and there is no room for error. It's a very good system he has in place.

What has been the biggest learning curve for you in Dubai? I'd hazard a guess that riding those big dirt horses is a bit different to riding around Roscommon and Sligo.

They are absolute bulls, they're class and I love riding on the dirt here. Funnily enough, I was joking with Caroline, who is Bhupat's wife and was my neighbour back home in Ireland, that some of these dirt horses look like point-to-pointers. Some of them could be mistaken for

our National Hunt horses, they are that big and powerful. But I tell you something, by God they can move. I get some thrill riding on the dirt. Cont. p4

### Q&A W/Andy Slattery Cont.

AS Cont.: The horses are so tough and hardy. The good ones travel and just keep finding and finding. It's all rhythm. It's a different style of riding altogether out in Dubai, though. Say Friday night, for example, you had Christophe Soumillon, Oisin Murphy, Jim Crowley and many of the top riders from all over the world riding at Meydan. Competing against those lads, it makes you raise your own game and you become sharper and a better rider as a result. The one thing I would say is that Ireland is extremely competitive as it is and you don't get anything easy back home. That probably stands to you when you come abroad because you are used to not getting anything easy.

We saw your cousin Ben Coen flying the flag for Ireland in Australia over the winter. That's another case in point for the benefits of going away and getting out of your comfort zone.

Big time. I suppose it is the same with everything, when you go to different places and see how they do things, it can't do you any harm. Stepping outside of your comfort zone, as you say yourself, can only be a good thing and I feel the benefits of it. I came out here on holiday two years ago. I came for a month and just rode out for Charlie Appleby. It was a bit of a working holiday but I really loved it. I had a couple of spins in Arab races

and they are quirky but it was a good experience. I'm riding those a bit more frequently but they don't get any easier. Luckily I was given the opportunity to come back this year to ride for Bhupat and it has been going well.

### And how would you look back on last year's season in Ireland?

Things were going great up until when I fractured my vertebrae in a fall riding out. I missed the last couple of months of the season so, all things considered, it was a good year. That injury actually delayed me a little bit when I got out here but, once I got the all clear, it hasn't been a bother. I've had a couple of winners for Bhupat so it's a case of so far so good.

We all know the prize-money in Ireland can't compete with the likes of Dubai so I'd imagine you have felt those winners a bit more than you would if you had won a nice handicap at home.

That's spot on. The prize-money is very good out here and being able to earn tax free is a big bonus as well. Take riding fees, prize-money etc, none of that is taxed over here so, even if you finish third or fourth in a race, it's a very good payday for a rider. It's not simple to make the game pay back home in Ireland. Cont. p5



### Q&A W/Andy Slattery Cont.

**AS Cont.:** You have to ride a couple of nice winners every year, definitely. I have been involved in horses outside of the riding and I love the bloodstock side of things so I have been lucky enough in that side of things. If you weren't riding a good few winners or at least bagging one or two big pots a season, you wouldn't exactly be flying it in Ireland.

We know your father Andy and the rest of the family are

excellent horsemen and have had some brilliant horses through their hands. For example, your Dad trained Faugheen to win his point-to-point before selling him to Rich Ricci and Willie Mullins. Do you dip your toe in that side of the business as well?

Big time. I am stuck in five or six young horses and it will be up to Dad if we go racing them or selling them. It's a great interest and [I] love that side of the sport.

You had a great year with your Dad last year riding eight winners for him. Without his backing, it would probably be fair to say it would have been a tough season.

The way Ireland has gone, you only ride for the people who you ride out for or who ride work for as there are

only a handful of spare rides up for grabs. We have a family-run yard and I am happy to help out the four or five days a week. I also ride out for Fozzy Stack two days of week and spend an odd Saturday with John O'Donoghue on the Curragh. I rode winners for all of those trainers last season but, the big thing is, you need a stable behind you. I've been lucky enough to have worked for some very good trainers, the likes of Dermot Weld for example, and it's good to be able to bring that sort of experience to the table at home and fire ideas around. Whatever we are doing, it

seems to be working well and we are getting some good results. You'd like to think that, if we were to get our hands on some of those nicer horses, we could do the job as well as anyone. It can be tough to get your hands on those horses, though, because we are a selling yard. That can be tough for me as a rider because, as soon as we have one who runs well or wins a maiden, the likelihood is that the horse will be sold. Then you are left searching for the next one and they aren't easy to find. The strength of Irish racing is a major plus when it comes to selling one but sometimes it can come at the detriment of leaving

yourself short on ammunition for the track. It's not simple taking on Aidan O'Brian and Ger Lyons and we are operating on a budget but thankfully it's going well.

### What would the hope be for the new year back home in Ireland?

It's the same as every year; try to win as many races as I can and to get on as many nice horses as I can. We've 20 two-year-olds so hopefully some of those can shape up to be nice. It has been nothing to do with me so far, all of the lads have been doing the heavy lifting over the winter, but I have to say I am looking forward to seeing what we have to go to war with this season. I'll be home in the second week of March and Dad tells me we have lovely colts by Mohaather (GB), Blue Point (Ire), Without Parole (GB)

### FRANKEL COLT PREVAILS IN FLORIDA

In this series, the TDN takes a look at notable successes of European-based sires in North America. This week's column is highlighted by the victory of Royal Majesty in a maiden race at Gulfstream Park.

### Frankel Colt Lords It Over His Rivals At Gulfstream

Benjamin Leon's Besilu Stables' homebred Royal Majesty (GB) (Frankel {GB}) won in his American unveiling at Gulfstream Park on Saturday (video).

The Bill Mott trainee is out of former Besilu runner and GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. winner Crown Queen (Smart Strike). A half-sister to dual Eclipse champion Royal Delta (Empire Maker) and fellow Grade I winner Delta Prince (Street Cry {Ire}), she was purchased by Leon for \$1.6 million out of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in 2011. Her latest

foal is a 2-year-old filly by Kingman (GB), and she was covered by Flightline in 2023. Second dam Delta Princess (A.P. Indy) was a three-time graded winner and a half-sister to Group/Grade 1 winners Biondetti (Bernardini) and Indy Five Hundred (A.P. Indy).

Juddmonte's Frankel (GB), who is standing for an all-time high fee of £350,000, now has 27 winners from 52 runners (52%) in the U.S. His 11 North American stakes winners include top-level scorers McKulick (GB) and champion Inspiral (GB).

### Sir Percy Filly Breaks American Duck

Bred by Kirsten Rausing, Khinjani (GB) (Sir Percy (GB)) won her U.S. debut for trainer Mark Glatt at Santa Anita last weekend (video).

The daughter of Kandahari (GB) (Archipenko) won a pair of handicaps for her breeder during her 10-start career in the UK including an Oct. 16 affair at Windsor before changing hands for 160,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale. She now races for Jackpot Farm, Lordship Stud, Rancho Tememscal, Thoroughbred Partners and Joseph Navarro.

A full-sister to Rausing's stakes-winning and multiple group placed Kawida (GB) (Sir Percy {GB}), Kandahari is followed by a trio of half-sisters--the unraced duo of Vera Cao (GB) (Sea The Moon (Ger)) and Khadidja (GB) (Study Of Man (Ire)), and a yearling full-sister to the latter. Kandahari's half-brother Zaaki (GB) (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) is extremely successful in Australia with four Group 1 titles to his name.

The pensioned Lanwades Stud stallion Sir Percy has sired 15 winners from 18 runners (83%) in the U.S. His six stakes winners (33%) are anchored by GI Man o' War S. winner Wake Forest (Ger).

### GETAWAY GELDING TOPS THE TATTERSALLS CHELTENHAM SALE

**Old Tom Morris (Ire)** (Getaway {Ger}) (lot 5), offered by Rob James Racing, was snapped up by Hamish Macauley Bloodstock for a sale-topping £150,000 at Saturday's Tattersalls Cheltenham January Sale.

A winner of his only point-to-point at Turtulla earlier this month, the 5-year-old gelding is out of the winning hurdler Caheronaun (Ire) (Milan {GB}), who was twice graded placed. He was earlier sold for €75,000 during the 2022 Tattersalls Ireland Derby Sale.

Another six-figure lot was **Admiral Stewart (Ire)** (Soldier Of Fortune {Ire}) (lot 8), who went to agent Tom Malone and trainer Jamie Snowden for £130,000. Offered by Milestone Stables, the son of Ivy Queen (Ire) (Green Desert) is a half-brother to G3 Kilkenny H. Hurdle winner The Crafty Butcher (Ire) (Vinnie Roe {Ire}). A  $\in$ 78,000 store, he won at second asking at Tinahely on Jan. 7.

Rounding out the top three was lot 15, **Melbourne Shamrock** (Ire) (Hillstar {GB}), who hammered for £125,000 to Emmet Mullins from Ballycrystal Stables. Also a winner of a point-to-point--in his case at Ballycrystal--from two starts, the gelding is a half-brother to Barnaviddaun (Ire) (Scorpion {Ire}), who won the G2 Brown Lad H. Hurdle at Naas.

Overall, 16 lots sold of the 22 offered for a gross of £876,000. The average was £54,750 and the median was £67,500. Of the 16 sold, four made £100,000 or more.

### LUCKY SWEYNESSE PART OF BAKER'S DOZEN FOR CENTENARY SPRINT CUP

Having been officially recognized as the world's top-rated sprinter in London earlier this week, **Lucky Sweynesse (NZ)** (Sweynesse {Aus}) figures difficult to beat in defence of his title in Sunday's G1 Centenary Sprint Cup at Sha Tin Racecourse.

The 5-year-old added last season's G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup in March and the G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize the following month, but took a pair of defeats under big weights in his first two starts this season. More workmanlike than brilliant in besting Victor the Winner (Aus) (Toronado {Ire}) in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint in November, Lucky Sweynesse was more dominant in defeating Lucky With You (Aus) (Artie Schiller) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint, making him the first to win each of the jurisdiction's Group 1 sprints in a calendar year. Still, champion jockey Zac Purton believes his mount can do even better.

"It's not easy to win any international race in Hong Kong, so you've got to put it towards the top of his list," Purton told South China *Morning Post*. Cont. p10

"But it wasn't one of his most devastating performances. I think he's feeling pretty good. I think he's taken another little step again so I'm looking forward to the race."

Wellington (Aus) (All Too Hard {Aus}) is winless since taking the 2022 Hong Kong Sprint, a race in which Lucky Sweynesse endured a checkered passage, and was second in this event last season. Now under the care of Jamie Richards, the 7-year-old was a sound third in the International Sprint last time out.

**Courier Wonder (NZ)** (Sacred Falls {NZ}) was runner-up to Lucky Sweynesse in the Chairman's Sprint Prize, but hasn't seen a winner's enclosure since running his record to a perfect five-from-five in Group 3 company in May 2021. He returns from a six-month absence and now resides in the barn of Mark Newnham.

"I'm very pleased with him," the Aussie expat told the HKJC's Declan Schuster. "We've had him for about eight weeks now and so far the preparation has been without incident. I've been riding him a lot in work myself and I am happy with the way he is moving."

### **VELOCIOUS AND J-MAC STAR IN KARAKA**

MILLIONS 2YO by Jesse Dart & Keely Mckitterick

The New Zealand-born James McDonald returned to his native country in a blaze of glory when he partnered with Stephan Marsh's gun filly **Velocious (Aus)** (Written Tycoon {Aus}) to a visually comfortable victory in the NZ\$1-million R. Listed Karaka Millions 2YO.

It was a fairly painless watch for connections and backers of the daughter of Written Tycoon, as the visiting James McDonald, found plenty of room on the spacious Ellerslie course and set the filly alight (video).

Chasing hard was the Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson-trained Damask Rose (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}), partnered by Blake Shinn, while Full Force (Aus) (Cosmic Force {Aus}) from the Johno Benner and Hollie Wynyard stable finished third.

Holding fourth was the gusty **Bellatrix Star (Aus)** (Star Witness {Aus}), meanwhile, the Queensland-trained galloper **Beau Dazzler (NZ)** (Ardrossan {Aus}) ran home to grab fifth from **So Naive (NZ)** (U S Navy Flag) and **Poetic Champion (NZ)** (Super Seth {Aus}).

McDonald has ridden 10 winners at Karaka Millions meetings through the years, but it was his first success in the Karaka Millions 2YO.

"The Karaka Millions 2YO has eluded me a bit, but I was on the right filly today [Saturday]. Velocious was trained to the absolute minute, she gave me a beautiful ride and produced the goods, it was unreal," McDonald told local media post-race.

"She didn't ever feel like she was going to get beaten.
Returning to New Zealand has been emotional for me.
Everytime someone says you're returning home, I get
goosebumps, because Ellerslie was our headquarters growing
up; it was my favourite track, it still is, there's nothing like
home."

Velocious was bred by Gus and Biancna Wigely's Inglewood Stud. They will consign Velocious's half-sister by Dundeel (NZ) as lot 295 at the 2024 New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale at Karaka. Cont. p11

The filly has proven to be an outstanding juvenile. Velocious broke her maiden at Te Rapa before heading to Pukekohe Park to secure the Listed Challenge S. by 1.5l. She was freshened up and then resumed in the G2 Eclipse S. at Pukekohe Park where Bellatrix Star and Move To Strike (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) got the better of her that day.
