





RISEN STAR PLAN COMES TOGETHER PERFECTLY FOR SIERRA LEONE

Trainer Chad Brown has been down this road a time or two. In 2013, Normandy Invasion (Tapit) made his 3-year-old debut in the GII Risen Star S., having dropped a nose decision in Aqueduct's GII Remsen S. three months previously. Sent off the 3-2 favorite, the Fox Hill runner ran on nicely to finish fifth. Just two years ago, Zandon (Upstart)--also beaten by the barest margin in the Remsen--shipped up from Florida and also came with a stretch rally to round out the trifecta as a 7-2 chance.

'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) is very much cut from the same cloth as those two--long-striding colts who save their best for last--and with that in mind, Brown opted to send the \$2.3-million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale-topper from 2022 up to the Big Easy from the Sunshine State.

The rationale? The nine-furlong distance of the Risen Star combined with a stretch run of over two furlongs would suit his charge better than the oft speed-favoring surface at Gulfstream Park, not to mention its comparatively short run home. Sierra Leone--who had last year's Remsen in the bag until he didn't--ensured that the plan came together swimmingly Saturday, virtually clinching a berth in the GI Kentucky Derby with a half-length defeat of **Track Phantom** (Quality Road), earning 50 points in the process. **Cont. p3**

DEJA VU! GODOLPHIN'S 'TDN RISING STAR' TARIFA BEST IN RACHEL ALEXANDRA

Raise your hand if this sounds familiar: a 3-year-old filly in the Godolphin blue captured the GII Rachel Alexandra S. at Fair Grounds to earn 50 points on the Road to the Kentucky Oaks.

So far, **Tarifa** (Bernardini) is following the script laid out last year by Pretty Mischievous (Into Mischief) perfectly. Like her year-older fellow Godolphin homebred, she, too, was named a **'TDN Rising Star'** on debut. In a replay of last year, she, too, won the Rachel Alexandra for her first graded score. Will she follow suit with a GI Kentucky Oaks win and ultimately an Eclipse championship after a stellar 3-year-old campaign?

Over a sloppy and sealed Fair Grounds track darkened by both the weather and the hour, Tarifa bounded cleanly out of the inside gate.



To succeed, Sierra Leone would have to overcome not only an 11-week absence, but also the race-fit Track Phantom, who entered the Risen Star undefeated in three runs around two turns, including the Dec. 23 Gun Runner S. and GIII Lecomte S. Jan. 20. The 3-1 second choice behind the 27-10 and first-time-blinkered Sierra Leone, Track Phantom was sent immediately to the front by Joel Rosario and set a modest tempo over a strip that began the program listed as sloppy and never appeared to dry out. Sierra Leone, ridden for the first time by Tyler Gaffalione, settled about four from the rear and at a distinct tactical disadvantage, as Track Phantom lobbed them along through fractions of :24.32 and :49.67.

Sierra Leone was in a good rhythm, but still behind midfield past six furlongs in 1:14.74, but when he was asked to pick up the bridle in earnest, the response was near-instantaneous. Fanned out extremely wide into the lane, Sierra Leone was forced to take some evasive action around a wayward **Catching Freedom** (Constitution) outside the eighth pole, but he was able to sustain the long run he'd been asked to make and gathered up Track Phantom in the waning strides to take it by a half-length.

"Given the track conditions and slow pace and that he hasn't run since the Remsen, I thought he showed a lot to run down a pretty good horse who was in form and fit and didn't have to ship," said Brown. "I wasn't sure if he'd reel him in--not because we're not good enough--but that was a tall order. So this proved a lot to me today." **Cont. p4**

Added Gaffalione: "The blinkers really helped him focus today. He broke alertly and we hoped going into this race there would be more speed. He got a comfortable trip up the backside and relaxed for me. When he took the lead in the stretch, I could feel beneath me he is only going to want to go longer after this. You always keep dreaming of the big races like the Derby and horses like this help you keep the dream alive."

Zandon moved on to the GI Toyota Blue Grass--in which he duly obliged--as his final Derby prep, and the plan will be the same for Sierra Leone, Brown indicated.

Pedigree Notes:

Sierra Leone is one of 27 stakes winners and 20 graded winners from the first three crops to the races for Three Chimneys' Gun Runner and the daughters of the late Malibu Moon are now responsible for 82 SWs, 26 at the graded or group level.

Heavenly Love, victorious in the 2017 GI Darley Alcibiades S., is a daughter of Darling My Darling, a \$300,000 Keeneland September purchase by John Oxley in 1998 who won the Doubledogdare S. and Raven Run S. in Lexington while also placing in the GI Frizette S. and GI Matron S. Darling My Darling is also the dam of 2016 GII Santa Ynez S. winner Forever Darling (Congrats), whose son Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}) is arguably top 3-year-old dirt horse in Japan and is scheduled to run in next weekend's G3 Saudi Derby for trainer Yoshito Yahagi. Sierra Leone's Grade I-winning third dam also produced Japanese Horse of the Year Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) (Sunday Silence).

Heavenly Love foaled a colt by Nyquist in 2022 and produced a full-sister to Sierra Leone Feb. 11.

She held on to her rail spot as Flavien Prat restrained her lightly in third while letting SP **Perfect Shot** (**Gun Runner**) and Untapable S. winner **Alpine Princess** (Classic Empire) lead the way through :24.37 and :48.55 early quarters. With positions unchanged going into the turn, GSW & GISP **V V's Dream** (Mitole), also a **'TDN Rising Star'**, joined Tarifa to the outside briefly until Tarifa was let loose. She tipped out with great energy, swapped to her wrong lead for several strides as her momentum carried her past the leaders, and quickly refocused when corrected back to her proper lead. She found another gear to finish a much-the-best, 2 3/4-length winner over GSW **Intricate** (**Gun Runner**). Final time for the 8 1/2 furlongs was 1:45.28.

"She jumped very well and showed some early speed. From there we got to the first turn and I was able to get myself to the pocket," said Prat. "She traveled well all the way around and kicked home."

Tarifa made her sophomore debut Jan. 20 over a fast Fair Grounds surface at a mile and 70 yards with an 86 Beyer Speed Figure with Florent Geroux in the irons and blinkers removed. Geroux, who had ridden her in all three previous starts, stuck with Tarifa's Brad Cox-trained stablemate, Alpine Princess, Saturday. Sandwiched between that Jan. 20 win and her ultra-impressive, six-length 'Rising Star' Keeneland debut in October, Tarifa had finished flat in an off-the-board November optional allowance at Churchill. "She acted like she could run before we debuted her at Keeneland," said Cox. "I thought running her on the Beard Course made sense for her. The second race at Churchill going a mile was a head scratcher. She responded well here in January. She jumped out well, got a good early position, tracked the leaders, and really stretched out well. The Rachel Alexandra has been a great path to the Kentucky Oaks and we've had some success with that route. This is a good filly and we will keep marching forward."

As has been well documented, four winners of the Rachel Alexandra in the past decade have won the Kentucky Oaks. The Rachel Alexandra offers 105 qualifying points for the Oaks, with the first five finishers earning points on a 50-25-15-10-5 scale. While Godolphin's win in the Rachel Alexandra last year was with trainer Brendan Walsh, who trains runner-up Intricate here, Cox previously won the race in 2022 with Turnerloose (Nyquist) and in 2018 with Monomoy Girl (Tapizar). The latter was one of the four who pulled off the Rachel Alexandra/Kentucky Oaks double in the last 10 years.

Pedigree Notes:

Classic winner, Eclipse champion, and leading sire Bernardini, a Darley homebred who stood at Darley's Jonabell Farm in Central Kentucky before his death at 18 due to complications from laminitis, is the sire of 87 worldwide black-type winners. While Tarifa is the first Rachel Alexandra winner among his 53 graded winners, he is the sire of the lone filly out of the race's namesake and that daughter--Rachel's Valentina--won the 2015 GI Spinaway S. Bernardini has top-class winners in nearly all categories and is also well established as one of the sport's leading broodmare sires. His final crop will race this year.



Although Tarifa is Bernardini's first stakes winner out of an Awesome Again mare, he has three graded winners out of daughters of Awesome Again's sire, Deputy Minister. They include Grade I winners To Honor and Serve and Angela Renee. Awesome Again has 102 stakes winners out of his own daughters.

Kite Beach, the unraced dam of Tarifa, was a Godolphin homebred after her dam, GSW Tizdubai (Cee's Tizzy), was purchased by the operation for \$950,000 at the Keeneland November sale of 2001.

Tizdubai is a full-sister to Horse of the Year and two-time GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow, as well as to MGSW and Classic runner-up Budroyale. Kite Beach was sold twice after Tarifa was born and most recently went to Calumet Farm for \$115,000 at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed sale. She has a 2-year-old full-sister to Tarifa named Josie's Girl, who was sold to Matthew Davis for \$105,000 at last summer's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky yearling sale, and a yearling Knicks Go colt. She was bred to Calumet's Lexitonian for 2024.



It may be safe to say that Money Supply enjoys an off going. The son of Practical Joke won his fifth straight and first graded-stakes race Saturday in the GIII Mineshaft S., an effort which saw him victorious over a wet track for the third straight race. Claimed for just \$35,000 from Klaravich Stables and Chad Brown last summer in Saratoga off a pair of poor efforts at Aqueduct to begin 2023, the 5-year-old rebounded nearly immediately for trainer Joe Sharp, finding the winner's circle at Churchill Downs, Fair Grounds and most recently Oaklawn Park in a series of allowance and starter allowance races.

Nearly right at his morning-line odds at 9-1, Money Supply enjoyed a clean break and was able to tuck down to be two wide into the opening turn. A trio of leaders quickly opened up a gap on the field with Tyler Gaffalione guiding his mount to be just off the fence in fifth past the half-mile marker.

With a rail-hugging ride around the turn, Money Supply tipped out to come after the leaders and charged up the center of the track to victory just ahead of Best Actor.

"He's got to be up there as one of the top claims in my career," said Sharp. "Now we've won five in a row at all these different tracks. He's a horse who keeps raising the bar every time we run him. He's developed into a different type of horse since we first claimed him. Now he could put the rider up into the race more. That's what he did today and was a big key. We're really looking forward to seeing how he can keep developing and raising the bar."

Pedigree Notes:

Money Supply, a \$400,000 Keeneland September yearling buy by his previous connections in Klaravich Stable, is the 34th stakes winner for Coolmore America's Practical Joke. Evita's Sister, the cleverly named full-sister to GISW Evita Argentina, has already produced a stakes winner in Sister Nation (Into Mischief) who also filled the trifecta in a pair of graded-stakes races at Woodbine. Last sold in foal to Audible for \$105,000 at the 2020 Keeneland November Sale, Evita's Sister produced a Tiz the Law colt in 2022 and was bred to Juddmonte's Mandaloun for this year.

On the heels of a career-high 104 Beyer Speed Figure in the Jan. 29 Jennings S. at Laurel, Post Time made it three wins a row in Saturday's GIII General George S. at the same track. It was the 4-year-old gray's first attempt at the graded level and he now sports seven wins from eight starts, with his lone loss coming last fall in Keeneland's Perryville S., where he was third behind GSW Raise Cain (Violence). Post Time, who was christened Maryland-bred champion juvenile of 2022, had previously collected three black-type races--all at Laurel, two in restricted company--for his CV before adding his first graded win in the General George.

Off as the 1-5 favorite Saturday, Post Time looked to brush with the 28-1 No Cents (Goldencents) to his inside at the break before dropping back to an early last in the compact field. With no great visible effort, he gradually improved his position behind the :23.81 and :46.61 first fractions set by Seven's Eleven. Splitting horses at the top of the stretch, he found himself a few paths off the rail and between rivals before rider Sheldon Russell asked him to briefly hesitate as Tenebris--racing to his outside--shifted slightly in. **Cont. p10**

Post Time gallantly let that horse take his intended spot but had the last laugh as he tipped out and around him, shifting into another gear to best all by a widening three lengths.

Frontrunner Seven's Eleven held second as Tenebris settled for third.

"There wasn't a whole lot of lightning-fast speed in the race, so my goal was to keep him close enough," said Russell. "I felt like he traveled good. If anything, I felt like we had to rush him a little bit but once I got him clear at the eighth pole he spurted clear and showed his true class."

The husband-wife team of rider Sheldon and trainer Brittany Russell captured their second graded victory of the day in the General George, following Apple Picker (Connect)'s win in the GIII Barbara Fritchie S. one race prior. It was also the third win in the General George for owner Ellen Charles's Hillwood Stable, who captured the race in 2022 with Cordmaker (Curlin) and in 2014 with Bandbox (Tapit), who sired runner-up Seven's Eleven in this edition.

"It started off slow, but it's been a great day," said Brittany Russell. "It's huge anytime to get a graded stake. It's hard to keep these horses healthy and moving forward and doing good. Obviously we're hoping we can keep going and do some bigger and better things, but just to get the graded stake is a major accomplishment in itself."

Pedigree Notes:

Tapit's Frosted, who wowed in a spectacular renewal of the GI Met Mile in 2016, is the sire of Post Time and 24 other black-type winners worldwide. His eight graded winners include Canadian champion Frosted Over and Japan's Jasper Krone, who shipped to the U.S. for an off-the-board attempt in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint last fall. Frosted stands at Darley's Jonabell Farm near Lexington.

Post Time, a third-generation Maryland-bred for the Bowman family, sold to Cary Frommer at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale for \$85,000. His dam has a 2-year-old McKinzie filly named Field Song, who hammered for \$80,000 to Mouse at the 2023 edition of Fasig's Midlantic sale, and was bred to Nyquist for 2024. The mare is one of two daughters of Fairbanks, a son of Giant's Causeway, to produce a stakes winner.

Not seen in the winner's circle since the Weather Vane S. at Pimlico last September, Apple Picker got her picture taken after a gutsy performance down the lane to bring home her first graded stakes win in the GIII Barbara Fritchie S.

Well-beaten in the GII Lexus Raven Run S. at Keeneland in mid-October, the filly returned to Maryland to run second in the Safely Kept S. Nov. 25 and posted the same result in the Willa On the Move S. Dec. 23--both at Laurel Park.

Sent on her way as a 5-1 shot here, the 4-year-old anchored a tightly bunched field up the backstretch. Apple Picker dropped back just before the far turn and appeared to be out of the mix.

Picking up her stride heading into the stretch run, the dark bay hugged the rail and began to make up ground on a pair of leaders who were beginning to tire at the eighth pole. Michael Dubb's entry tipped to the three path, shifted to a higher gear and proved best in the final jumps.

The well-related Beatbox had run well in three previous tries, a trio of runner-up efforts, over the oft-quirky Stall-Wilson turf course at the Fair Grounds, but managed to get over the hump Saturday with a narrow success in the GIII Fair Grounds S.

Away without incident from a high draw, the half-brother to 'TDN Rising Stars' Guarana (Ghostzapper) and Magic Dance (More Than Ready) was able to slot in to a spot one off the fence passing under the wire for the first time and saved ground from midpack around the turn and into the backstretch run. Slowly making inside progress approaching halfway as favored Strong Quality continued to lead over the rain-affected ground, Beatbox was committed to a rails run into the lane, set his sights on the front-runner a furlong out and proved just slightly the gamer of the two in a driving finish.

A dead-heat third first off an April layoff in Keeneland allowance company Oct. 13, Beatbox was runner-up to Rising Empire (Empire Maker) in a local allowance Nov. 30, filled the same spot behind the ill-fated GISW Two Emmys (English Channel) in the Dec. 23 Diliberto Memorial S. and was outnodded by Strong Quality in their most recent meeting in the Col. E. R. Bradley S. Jan. 20.

Pedigree Notes:

Beatbox becomes the 28th worldwide graded/group winner for his late sire, while daughters of the recently departed Distorted Humor have now accounted for 63 worldwide GSWs.

A daughter of 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff upsetter Pleasant Home, Magical World and her produce have unsurprisingly lit up the toteboards at both Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton. Three-time Grade I winner Guarana, the mare's second foal was purchased by Hill 'n' Dale for \$4.4 million in foal to Into Mischief at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Some 20 hips later, Magical World--also in foal to Into Mischief--was hammered down to Whisper Hill Farm and Three Chimneys for a sales-topping \$5.2 million to dissolve a partnership.

Beatbox was originally a \$2.1-million Keeneland September purchase by eFive Racing before being sold on at Keeneland November in 2021, and Magical World's foals of 2021 and 2022, the Into Mischief colts Magical Road and Cornucopia, each fetched \$1.1 million at KEESEP. Guarana's first foal, Mischievous Intent (Into Mischief), was purchased by Winchell Thoroughbreds for \$1.4 million at KEESEP last fall, while Magic Dance's first produce is a 2-year-old colt by Curlin.

Magical World is also the dam of a May-foaled yearling filly by Into Mischief and was not bred last season.

A stakes winner on turf and dirt last season, Honor D Lady kicked off her 4-year-old campaign on a high note with a smooth victory in the GIII Royal Delta S. at Gulfstream Park.

Getting aboard the Saffie Joseph, Jr. pupil for the first time, Jose Ortiz employed aggressive early tactics in a race with a short run into the first turn to gain some forward position, and it was mission accomplished, as Honor D Lady landed in third behind longshot Yuki (Chi) (The Lumber Guy) to the backstretch. Racing about five paths off the inside through the middle stages, Honey D Lady was asked for some speed at the half-mile pole as Imonra (Violence) rolled up to her outside with a wide bid. Hard-ridden three wide around the turn, Honor D Lady poked her head in front at the five-sixteenths going better than any of her rivals and was home comfortably best as Soul of An Angel took some ground off her late. Second choice Maryquitecontrary did her best work late to gain third.

Victorious in this track's grassy Honey Ryder S. last May, Honor D Lady was runner-up in the GIII Selene S. over the Woodbine synthetic two starts later. A distant last of 10 in the GIII Saratoga Oaks Aug. 4, she belied odds of 7-1 to scoop the GIII Remington Park Oaks Sept. 24 and closed the season with a good third in Aqueduct's GIII Comely S. Nov. 25.

"I watched the replay of when she won at Remington and Saffie told be how he wanted her to be ridden, so I followed instructions," said Ortiz. "We wanted to go forward and if could work my way to the clear, do that. I did that and it worked out great."

Pedigree Notes:

In the name of his Miacomet Bloodstock, Bill Harrigan paid \$110,000 for Complicated at the 2016 Keeneland November Sale and has since bred three winners from as many to race, including the stakes-winning Churchdown and Simply in Front (Summer Front), runner-up in last year's GI Natalma S. at Woodbine. The mare's current 2-year-old, a filly named And One More Time (Omaha Beach), was knocked down to Live Oak Plantation for \$750,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale and she is also represented by a yearling War Front filly.

The stakes-winning and Grade II-placed second dam is a daughter of GISW Educated Risk, a half-sister to champion Inside Information (Private Account). Complicated is due to Golden Pal this season.

GODOLPHIN HOMEBRED LOOKS TO KEEP HYACINTH STAKES ALL IN THE FAMILY

A field of 11--ten males and a single American-bred filly--head to the post for Sunday's \$243,343 Listed Hyacinth S. going a one-turn 1600 meters at Tokyo Racecourse. The race serves as the third of four legs on the Japan Road to the Kentucky Derby and will award the winner 30 points towards a berth in the field at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May.

Hyacinth S. cont.

Sheikh Mohammed's worldwide Godolphin operation won the 2022 Hyacinth with their homebred Combustion (Jpn) (Discreet Cat) and is represented Sunday afternoon by that colt's fullbrother **Unquenchable (Jpn)**. The chestnut defeated **Logi** Adelaide (Jpn) (Drefong) to win his maiden at second asking over this course and distance Oct. 27 and checked in a good third behind Amante Bianco (Jpn) (Hendrfny Hughes) in the first leg of the local series, the Cattleya Sho (allowance) last November, picking up three Derby points. Unquenchable, a latest second to the talented American-bred Sonic Star (Into Mischief) over track and trip Jan. 27, is favored at just north of 2-1 and has the services of Christophe Lemaire from gate 11.

Logi Adelaide proceeded to run second in his next start Nov. 4, but put it all together when romping home by seven lengths as the 2-5 chalk Nov. 26.

Ballon d'Or (Jpn) (New Year's Day) is the only member of Sunday's field to already have earned black-type via his close third-place finish behind Ammothyella (Jpn) (Bricks and Mortar) and Ecoro Gaia (Speightstown) in the Listed Bluebird Cup at Funabashi Racecourse Jan. 17. The bay was purchased for over \$650,000 as a foal at the 2021 JRHA Select Sale.

Sunday's winner will leap-frog to the top of the standings on the Japan Road to the Kentucky Derby, with just the Mar. 23 Fukuryu S. (allowance) at Nakayama remaining. The current leader, Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel (Jpn)), runs in next Saturday's G3 Saudi Derby, while second-placed Amante Bianco was second in the Feb. 14 Kumotori Sho, an allowance race at Ohi Racecourse that was outside the Derby series.



Stay Hot did just that as he took home his second consecutive stakes victory in the Baffle S. on Saturday afternoon.

The ridgling broke his maiden when he switched from the dirt to the turf at third asking going a mile in early October at Santa Anita. Though he was well-beaten next-out in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf over the same course and distance, the Peter Eurton trainee rebounded to win by a neck in the GIII Cecil B. DeMille S. at Del Mar Dec. 3.

Taking to the Hill, the 2-1 top choice trailed from the bell, but before the dirt crossover, Stay Hot was given his cue and started to roll. Running down the center of the course, the bay dug deep and got up in the shadow of the wire.

"I was kind of watching where he was at and I thought 'well, he's got a lot to do,' and then he had to swing wide to not take any chances where he wouldn't be able to get through. I think it took its toll a little bit. He fought and got a little tired but the result was well," said Eurton. "I do appreciate the fact that Antonio (Fresu) came here. We have a lot of great riders here and he is definitely one of them."

A full-sister to MSW Homeland Security, the winner's dam is responsible for a 2-year-old colt by Complexity, who Greg Foley purchased for \$95,000 at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton October Sale. Since impressing on debut in maiden special weight company at Churchill Downs last November, Halina's Forte has spent her last two starts in stakes races, earning placings in both the Fern Creek S. and finishing off 2023 as the beaten favorite at Fair Grounds in the Letellier Memorial S. Dec. 23.

A third stakes winner from the first crop of Mitole, Halina's Forte is a half-sister to the dam of SW/MGSP Whateverybodywants (Giant Oak) and out of a half to GSW/GISP sire Astrology (A.P. Indy) and MGSW Lunerpal (Successful Appeal). Lunarlady has not produced a foal since Halina's Forte and was not reported bred for this year. The picture of consistency in her 19 race career, Security Code's fifth win, and first at the stakes level, came in the Broadway S. at Aqueduct.

On the board in her prior seven starts dating back to May 2023, where she ran fourth in the state-bred restricted Bouwerie S., she added a victory last out Jan. 5 in a first-level allowance at this track to her tally before making her return to the stakes ranks here.

Chasing from third and well off the rail as Kant Hurry Love set the pace by way of a speed duel, Security Code inched closer to that pair down the backstretch and came under coaxing through the bend. Rolling six wide into the lane, she closed relentlessly under a full head of steam to take control inside the final sixteenth. Venti Valentine was closing fast behind her, but Security Code had enough left to fend off the charge.

"She's got some fight in her, doesn't she? We were kind of resigned to the fact that six furlongs might be her thing. She did win at seven furlongs before, but usually you see how good a horse is going to be somewhere into their 3-year-old year," said conditioner Phil Serpe. "But she just keeps getting a little bit better and she just seems to be improving. Maybe seven-eighths will be as far as she wants to go, but it's a good result considering the New York-bred program, which we love and we're a big part of, so that works out for her."

When asked about a potential next start, he added, "We'll take it a step at a time. Her last two races, she really had to grind it out. What I do know about her is she does like space between races and when she was 2-turning-3, I was a little bit aggressive with her in her starts. It came to me with the help of my crew that spacing her races out is something we should consider and

since we've done that, she's been more consistent."

A half-sister to a pair of talented runners in their own right-namely stakes runners Blewitt and No Mo' Spending--Security Code is the most recent to the races for Stopspendingmaria. The mare has 2-year-old Maria Moon (Malibu Moon) in the wings as well as a yearling colt by Modernist and a 2024 filly by Greatest Honour. REBEL'S ROMANCE LEAVES AMIR TROPHY RIVALS IN THE DOHA DUST



Rebel's Romance | QREC

Godolphin's globetrotting **Rebel's Romance (Ire)** (g, 6, Dubawi {Ire}--Minidress {GB}, by Street Cry {Ire}) entered Saturday's \$2.5-million G3 H.H. The Amir Trophy as one of three Group 1 winners in the field of 11, yet still had something to prove.

Winless since causing a mild surprise in the 2022 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Keeneland, the homebred failed--for a variety of reasons--in two tries in America last summer, but hinted at a return to his best with an eye-catching victory at Kempton in December. He was a somewhat unexpected entry for this newly upgraded race, but his class was on full display as he dispatched of the best field ever assembled in Qatar with complete authority.

Drawn gate 10, Rebel's Romance was ridden positively by William Buick and sat three deep outside Japan's **North Bridge** (Jpn) (Maurice {Jpn}) and **Satono Glanz** (Jpn) (Satono Diamond {Jpn}) passing the stands for the first time and was allowed to edge in front with a circuit to travel. Bowling along, ears straight-forward, turning down the back of the track at Al Rayyan, Rebel's Romance dropped anchor, and things got a bit messy behind him as a result, with North Bridge hard on the bridle for Yasunari Iwata, and **Simca Mille** (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}) also firing up from midfield. **Cont. p3**

LEARNING TO THRIVE

We all have days when we feel a bit low or even depressed. For many people that feeling will pass, but for some it can persist to a point where it becomes overwhelming and perhaps life-threatening.

For Keith Haggins, the latter had become the norm towards the end of his 30-year stint working in the bloodstock business, leading him, eventually, to seek help. As is becoming better known and more openly talked about in everyday life, help with mental health struggles is now fairly widely available and comes in a variety of formats. What works for some may not be so beneficial for others.

Haggins was not so keen on the idea of therapy in its traditional counselling format, but happened upon an eight-week online course called the Thrive Programme. Its website promises "a totally fresh approach to achieving lasting happiness, health and success" through focusing on managing thoughts, emotions and behaviour.

Sounds too good to be true, right? This is what Haggins thought initially too, but he found the course so beneficial to his own situation that he left stud work to retrain as a coach on the programme in the hope of helping others. **Cont. p6**

Rebel's Romance was holding firm on the run around the second bend, but Joao Moreira began to feel for **Zeffiro (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) 600 metres out and he looped the field, appearing a real threat. The G1 Hong Kong Vase runner-up had dead aim on the front-runner a furlong and a half from home, but drifted badly towards the stands, and Rebel's Romance ran out a comfortable winner. Satono Glanz outfinished North Bridge for third, while defending champion **Russian Emperor** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) finished off his race soundly to be fifth.

"He really enjoyed it," Buick said. "It wasn't plan A, but Charlie was keen to go forward from stall 10. He relaxed lovely in front. It wasn't so long ago he won a Breeders' Cup Turf, so he seems to be back to his best and it's great to come to Qatar and ride a winner. It's a big festival and I'm absolutely delighted. That was a good race, with Japanese horses, Irish and English. He had to be somewhere near his best and I'm pretty sure he was."

Added Appleby, "We were delighted with Rebel's Romance. It was a great ride by William, and we felt the horse was back to his best heading here following a confidence-boosting win at Kempton Park.

"This is an event that is growing with importance every year and the strength of today's field showed how its status is increasing on the international stage. We are very proud to be able to support these big races on behalf of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed and team Godolphin.

"I would imagine that we will look towards the Dubai Sheema Classic for Rebel's Romance, and then possibly head back out to America for the summer."

The only treble Group 1 winner in the field, Rebel's Romance had gone winless since the Breeders' Cup. A minor issue dictated that he raced in last year's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic without a prep and he was duly beaten into a distant seventh by world champion Equinox (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) at Meydan last March. Sent to America over the summer, he clipped heels in the GII Bowling Green S. at Saratoga in July, throwing Richard Mullen heavily to the turf, and caught unsuitably easy ground during an abnormally wet period in New York when fourth at odds-on in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic in October. Forced to regroup with a Breeders' Cup bid now out of play, he returned to action with a visually impressive victory in the Listed Wild Flower S. over the Kempton all-weather in December. From here, all roads lead back to Meydan in six weeks' time where the competition could include Auguste Rodin (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Japanese Triple Tiara heroine Liberty Island (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}), among others.

Rebel's Romance is one of two potential starters on World Cup night for his stakes-placed dam, whose exciting son Measured Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}) took out this year's G1 Jebel Hatta, customarily a pointer to the G1 Dubai Turf.

Second dam Short Skirt was a leading member of her generation in 2006, defeating hot favourite Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G3 Musidora S. at York for Sir Michael Stoute before finishing third to that foe in the G1 Epsom Oaks. Short Skirt was subsequently second to Alexandrova in that year's G1 Yorkshire Oaks and was purchased by John Ferguson for 1.4 million guineas at the Tattersalls December Mare Sale a few months later. Short Skirt produced five winners from eight to race, including G3 Nad Al Sheba Trophy hero Volcanic Sky (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}) and the dam of Japanese listed winner and Group 3-placed Due Process (GB) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}).

There is a further connection to Japan under the third dam, as Much Too Risky's champion daughter and G1 St Leger third Whitewater Affair (GB) (Machiavellian) produced Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}), a two-time champion who famously won the G1 Dubai World Cup only weeks after the devastating Japanese earthquake of 2011. Victoire Pisa's half-brother Asakusa Den'en (Jpn) (Singspiel {Ire}) won the G1 Yasuda Kinen in 2005.

Minidress is represented by a yearling full-brother to Rebel's Romance.



Brave Emperor Hong Kong Bound After ITM Cup

Overseas runners captured two of the three supporting features held Saturday in Doha.

In the opening event of the program, Middleham Park Racing's **Brave Emperor (Ire)** (Sioux Nation) raced prominently throughout and managed to stave off a stinging late rally down the centre of the course from **Cairo (Ire)** (Quality Road) to take the \$500,000 Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Cup for Archie Watson and Luke Morris. According to a report from the South China *Morning Post*, the 4-year-old is set to take on Hong Kong Horse of the Year Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) in the G1 FWD Champions Mile in late April.

Less than 24 hours after making history as the first female rider to win a race at Meydan, Saffie Osborne repeated the dose--again for her father Jamie--in Saturday's \$400,000 Dukhan Sprint, Sponsored By Breeders' Cup, getting home aboard Group 1 winner Emaraaty Ana (GB) just ahead of the locally based Monsieur Noir (Ire). Remarkably, each of the top two finishers is an 8-year-old gelding by Shamardal. Cont. p5

Godolphin's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hero **Mischief Magic (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) was a good third and could accompany his stablemate back to the States later in the year.

"We will probably travel out to America for the summer as we know he likes the tracks and style of racing out there," Appleby said.

Al Shaqab Racing's G3 Horris Hill S. winner **Orne (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) was expected to be a tough nut to crack in the \$400,000 Al Rayyan Mile for John and Thady Gosden, but the Gassim Ghazali-conditioned **Oddyssey (Ire)** (Ulysses {Ire}) more than covered his 80,000gns pricetag from last fall's Tattersalls Autumn Horses In Training Sale when driving home by two lengths in a time quicker than the older horses posted in the ITM Cup.



"I must emphasise how much I loved working in the industry and I want to pay something back to an industry that has given me so much," he says, while admitting that there is plenty about the racing and breeding business that he misses.

"I worked in the industry for 30 years and then retrained as a Thrive coach, but I'm still absolutely passionate about everything

horsey and the whole industry, not just the horse side, the agricultural side. That's obviously a huge part of it."

The Irishman, who now lives in Sussex, England, worked at Kildangan Stud and then spent six years assisting Jacqueline Norris before moving to the UK, where he later worked as manager of the late Lady Rothschild's Waddesdon Stud.

He says, "A few years ago I struggled with my mental health and found myself in a deep dark hole for a while and that's when I

discovered the Thrive Programme. There's some incredible support out there and some great help, but it seems to be geared for people who are in crisis or who are in the depths of depression, feeling suicidal, suffering from drug addiction or whatever it is. The message is 'when you get to that point, give us a shout and we'll help you'.

"But the Thrive Programme is based on learning and education, developing a skill set, so to speak. You don't need to be very academic to understand the programme as it is delivered in a simple way, it strips away all the complex terms we so often hear and delivers it in plain English. You also don't need to be in trouble to do it. You don't need to have a major significant issue going on in your life right now."

One of the hardest parts of seeking help if you are struggling is having to admit the fact to those around you. Thrive makes it easier in that regard as the course can be completed at home and doesn't requite participants to be off work or travel to appointments.

"Asking for help is the hardest part, because that's the day you have to accept the fact that something's not quite right," says Haggins. "That's difficult for a lot of people to get to that point. What drew me to the Thrive Programme is it's not therapy, it's not counselling. It's a training programme and it's structured with a start and middle and an end. And you can either do it at home on your own or with a coach, and then you become your own coach effectively, or whatever you want to call yourself at that point, but you learn the skills you need to do it yourself."

Through years of experience, Haggins recognises the specific pressures involved in working with horses.

"It's not a nine-to-five, 40-hour-a-week job, especially at management level," he says. "To be able to fulfil that role and have quality of life when that life revolves around the stud season can be hard. The calendar is very unsocial for parents,

impossible really, sometimes. When the children are off on holidays, it's sales, preparation, and so on. And it is a never-ending cycle of, 'I can't go in October half-term because we're in Book 1, Book 2. I can't go at Easter because we're foaling.'

"I know the industry, and when somebody comes to me and tells me about their struggles or battles, it's not that I understand it, I've walked in those shoes.

"People have said, 'Why did you give up on that industry?' I did it for 30 years. I don't think I gave

up, really. That's a full lifetime career."

The next stage of Haggins's career is vastly different, but through his more recent experiences he hopes to be able to help those still working in the racing and breeding industry.

"The Thrive Programme is already established in the Metropolitan Police, in a couple of leading companies, and it's in many schools up and down the country," he explains. "I'd love to see it available to kids in the likes of the racing schools to National Stud courses, and any other training establishment where people can benefit from it. I don't want to appeal just to people in crisis. I want to appeal to everybody.

"It can be tailored to any individual or groups in a variety of different ways. It's a lot of questioning, a lot of understanding. Where did that come from? Why do you think that or how could you think that differently? And when people start talking about that, it can inspire others." Cont. p7

He adds, "People don't tend to look for help until something's wrong but making this something that people can come across and do when things are good, it's much better. But obviously it is also there for people when they are struggling."

The learning-based approach was what drew Haggins to the Thrive Programme initially, and in a time in which mental health is spoken about almost as frequently as physical health, then this is perhaps as important as educating people in the benefits of eating your five-a-day, or why too much sugar is bad for you.

"For me, that's how the world works," he says. "Life is a journey of learning, and what I learned by doing the Thrive Programme is what got me better and got me to the point I'm at now where life is amazing."

As a result, racing on Sunday--featuring the crown jewel of St. Moritz, the Grosser Preis von St. Moritz, was cancelled and Saturday's Family Day was held with a reduced programme. Second in a Meydan handicap last month behind the GI Summer S. hero Mysterious Night (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), Nibras Passion reached a career high at Abu Dhabi on Saturday, defeating Fort Payne and Ventura Rebel, Group 3 winners in France and Ireland, respectively.

In midpack from the bell, Nibras Passion was a touch keen as

the field entered the turn, but still enjoyed plenty of running room. Traveling ominously well on the bend, the gelding needed a gap, and forged his own course in between horses a furlong from home before skimming across the line a narrow winner. The onrushing duo of Fort Payne and Ventura Rebel were separated by the smallest of margins in a bunched finish.

He is one of five winners for his dam and the third black-type horse after the stakes-placed duo of Mubaalegh (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}) and Lord Tennyson (GB) (Poet's Voice {GB}). His 4-year-old half-sister Martini Lodge (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}) is followed by 3-year-old colt Forever Noah (GB) (Dark Angel {Ire}), juvenile colt The Vital Spark (GB) (Mehmas {Ire}) and a yearling filly by Too Darn Hot (GB). Poppet's Passion is also a half-sister to the late "Budapest Bullet" and multiple Slovakian champion Overdose (GB) (Starborough {GB}). NO DOUBT, BERRI IS A CHAMP!

There was conjecture leading up the G1 Lightning S. that the star mare **Imperatriz (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}) wasn't her usual brilliant-self after a lacklustre jump-out at her home track of Cranbourne.

However, Te Akau Racing and her trainer Mark Walker consistently assured everything was spot on with the daughter of I Am Invincible, and on Saturday their assessment was proven correct.

Imperatriz dug deep and showed all her champion qualities to defeat a tenacious Private Eye (Aus) (Al Maher {Aus}) and a flying Espiona (Aus) (Extreme Choice {Aus}) to claim the G1 Black Caviar Lightning S. with her main man Opie Bosson in the saddle.

G1 Lightning S. Cont.

Mark Walker spoke to *Racing.com* post-race, "Good horses save their best for raceday. It was a lacklustre trial, no doubt but we galloped her Monday and were very pleased.

"It was a gun ride by Opie [Bosson] and it was a very tactical affair, but he used the initiative. It's a relief.

"Imperatriz is a gem really, to do it in the spring and come back and win a Lightning like that."

The Lightning S. is the ninth Group 1 victory for the 5-year-old mare and her fourth consecutive elite-level success, having won the G1 VRC Classic, the G1 Manikato S. and the G1 William Reid S. in her previous three starts.

Pedigree Notes

The most prolific stakes winner for her Yarraman Park-based, reigning Australian Champion Sire (whose stakes winner total sits at 105), Imperatriz was bred by Raffles Dancers and purchased by David Ellis CNZM (BAFNZ) for A\$360,000 from the Bhima Thoroughbreds draft at the 2020 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

Imperatriz is the second foal and first winner for Berimbau (Aus) (Shamardal) who earned her black type with a G3 Moonee Valley Fillies Classic third to Lumosty (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}).

Also dam of the multiple city winner Cabaca (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), Berimbau produced a full-brother to Imperatriz last August, subsequently served by Pierata (Aus). Her 2-year-old is a Capitalist (Aus) colt, a A\$200,000 Magic Millions purchase for Lofth Thoroughbreds and AGR Racing.

Berimbau is out of the winner Percussive (Aus) (Encosta De Lago (Aus)), half-sister to the G2 Todman Slipper Trial winner Royal Courtship (Aus) (Royal Academy).

Percussive's six foals to race have all been winners including the Listed Spear Chief H. winner Vinco (Aus) (also by I Am Invincible).

Boasting crosses of the wonderful mares Natalma (Native Dancer), Somethingroyal (Princequillo {Ire}) and Lalun (Djeddah {Fr}), Imperatriz hails from the same family as the stakes winners Poor Judge (Royal Academy) and Proud Player (Squill).
