



THE AVENGERS: FIVE AMERICANS LOOK TO TAKE BACK THE SAUDI CUP

In the previous four runnings of the \$20-million G1 Saudi Cup, American-based horses have--surprisingly--passed the post in first on a single occasion while finishing second on each occasion. That 'victory' came in the much-discussed inaugural running in 2020, a result that seems likely to soon be overturned, albeit to the benefit of another American horse.

So, even though the U.S. is the epicenter of world dirt racing, its five representatives this year arguably still have something to prove when a field of 14 loads the gate around 12:40 p.m. ET Saturday afternoon. And it's anything but a fait accompli that one of them gets their picture taken in the King Abdulaziz winner's enclosure a short time thereafter.

We will analyze America's chances in these pages and will have a look at the runners from defending champion Japan, Saudi Arabia and the UAE, plus previews for Saturday's five other group races back in *TDN* Europe.

White Abarrio (Race Day) looks to become the first winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic to double up in Riyadh and races first-up since his defeat of the re-opposing **Derma Sotogake** (Jpn) (Mind Your Biscuits) at Santa Anita on the first Saturday of November. **Cont. Pg. 3**

Timberlake Favorite Choice in Rebel


The Arkansas series for the colts features another running of the GII Rebel S., which brings together a field of 13.



The 5-year-old really came to life at the back end of 2023, powering home in the Whitney prior to his Classic effort.

"We thought we had a chance of beating a couple of horses in the [Whitney]," trainer Rick Dutrow, Jr. told the Saudi Cup notes team earlier this week. "We weren't expecting or hoping to beat Cody's Wish (Curlin), but two turns at Saratoga might not have been Cody's Wish's game, who knows, so we said we'd take a chance.

He continued, "But I never got to breeze him for the race, so we were like 10 days without breezing and you just show up. But we did breeze him the morning of [the race] and Irad [Ortiz] happened to be there watching. It wasn't my plan, I wasn't even there, I was on my way up because I had to train at Belmont but Irad caught it and he was wondering if we were going to scratch!" laughed the trainer.

"When I knew that we were coming here, it was like 11 days before we came and I was like man, they are playing into our hands because we don't need to breeze him," the conditioner continued. "We can play the same game and right now I feel that he is over the trip and he's himself now."

White Abarrio, who will carry the red-and-white silks of Prince Faisal Bin Khaled Bin Abdulaziz, has saddle cloth 14, but gate one, and he'll want to leave there running to be handy to a pace that maps above-average quick. Dutrow has expressed his intention to blow out his charge on race morning.

National Treasure is one of three in the race for Quality Road, who accounted for 2022 Saudi Cup stunner Emblem Road. The \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga grad employed front-running tactics to take out last year's GI Preakness S. and nearly pulled off the upset when ridden the same way in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile last November. But the 4-year-old showed a bit of a rating gear when last seen in the GI Pegasus World Cup



Invitational S., as he shook free into the final furlong and held the rallying **Senor Buscador** (Mineshaft) in the run to the line.

"He has a good post to work from in seven," said Jimmy Barnes, assistant to trainer Bob Baffert. "This is our fifth runner in this race, we have been second three times (Charlatan, 2021, Country Grammer, 2022-23), so we are hoping to make the breakthrough."

Senor Buscador figures to sit a good trip from gate four beneath Junior Alvarado.

Reigning GI Pennsylvania Derby winner **Saudi Crown** (Always Dreaming) may have been out of his depth in the Classic, as he was a beaten horse a long way from home, but this 1800-meter trip figures to suit him much better. He was a convincing winner of the GIII Louisiana S. when last seen Jan. 20, but those immediately behind that day made no impact in the GIII Mineshaft S. last weekend.

"I think he's more suited from a mile [1600m] to a mile and an eighth [1800m] and the one turn should be ideal for him," jockey Florent Geroux said. "It's a very deep race. I've been on him many times before, I know him very well, the work rider has done a perfect job and I'll leave it to them."

Hoist the Gold (Mineshaft) is the least-likely among the five U.S. horses, but did post a 109 Beyer in wiring the GII Cigar Mile H. back in December.

"It's all about winning," said trainer Dallas Stewart. "If you're not in it to win, you best stay home and if you don't want to be in great races like this, you ought to go do something else."

Last summer, the bay powered across the Ellis Park wire by 9 1/4 lengths which earned him a 'Rising Star' blue ribbon at second asking. As the runner-up in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga, he returned to New York a month later to capture the GI Champagne S. during the Belmont at the Big A meet. His juvenile campaign came to a close when he finished fourth to 'Rising Stars' Fierceness (City of Light), Muth (Good Magic) and Locked (Gun Runner) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita.

"We gave him a little bit of a break after the Breeders' Cup," said Cox. "He had a long campaign, and we were very happy with what he was able to accomplish at the age of 2. Just excited about what lies ahead for him. He's really turned it on over the last two weeks with his works. We feel like we've got him about as good as we're going to get him."

Timberlake is the only entry without an attempt over the local strip in Hot Springs. Out of the other 12, Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt, who welcomed as an investor current Oaklawn leading owner Staton Flurry, will look for 'TDN' Rising Star' Carbone (Mitole) to improve. The favorite in the GIII Southwest S. turned in a seventh-place finish.

Others in for a bushel full of points include a pair from Ken McPeek's shedrow. **Northern Flame** (Flameaway) missed hitting the board last fall in the GI Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland and in the GIII Street Sense S. at Churchill Downs. However, his gate to wire win against optional claimers at Oaklawn Jan. 28 proves he can be dangerous up front. **Cont.**

March 12 - 14 obssales.com His stablemate **Common Defense** (Karakontie {Jpn}) displays the complete opposite running style, as he likes to be heard from late in the game.

"(Northern Flame) has improved from 2 to 3," said trainer Ken McPeek, who just celebrated his 2,000th victory this week. "He fought on well in that allowance race. He's a good, solid colt. ... (Common Defense) didn't like the mud last time. I'm hoping for a dry track this weekend. I started to take him to the (Mar. 2) Battaglia Memorial at Turfway because I think ultimately his future may be on turf. He worked so good this week that I went ahead and put him back in at Oaklawn."

Making his third start over the Oaklawn dirt is the experienced picker **Just Steel** (**Justify**) for Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who was the runner-up in the GIII Southwest S. He will break to the inside of an upstart named **Time for Truth** (Omaha Beach) on the stretch out for conditioner Ron Moquett and principal owner Harry T. Rosenbaum.

Honeybee Could Be Sweet For West Omaha

Just as with the boys, the fillies are also looking to harvest a top prize of 50 points. Their haul in Saturday's GIII Honeybee S. will be applied towards a spot in the starting gate for the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Leading the charge is another from Cox's stable, who like Timberlake, has been working out at his Fair Grounds base. Gary and Mary West's homebred **West Omaha** (West Coast) was scratched out of the GII Rachel Alexandra S. after she won the Silverbulletday S. by five lengths in New Orleans Jan. 20.

The filly will tangle the Martha Washington S. winner **Band of Gold** (Preservationist). The McPeek trainee turned on the jets down the lane in that Feb. 3 stakes race and won by 2 3/4 lengths in what was an impressive display of speed.

Finally, Greg Tramontin, who left racing for 23 years before returning once again as an owner in 2018, enters **Alys Beach** (Omaha Beach). The chestnut debuted a winner last summer at Saratoga under Tom Amoss, but she was a well-beaten fourth in the GI Spinaway S. upstate before the meet closed and when she faded to third in the GI Alcibiades S. at Keeneland in early October.

HIWU DROPS ITS CASE AGAINST JEFFREY ENGLEHART by Bill Finley

Originally charged with administering Clenbuterol to his horse and facing a possible two-year suspension, trainer Jeffrey Englehart was cleared Friday by the Horse Racing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU).

The positive was found in an unraced, unnamed horse out of the mare Fast Heart that Englehart purchased for \$14,000 at the OBS auction on June 15. He argued that he did not give the horse the drug and that it was had to have been given to the horse prior to his purchase at OBS. Englehart and his attorney requested that HIWU perform a segmented hair test colt, which can provide a time line for when a drug is administered.

HIWU had the Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory at the University of California, Davis perform the segmented test and it revealed that the Clenbuterol was in fact administered before Englehart became the trainer.

Friday, HIWU issued a statement, which read: "Following a positive test result for Clenbuterol in hair collected from Fast Heart 2021, trainer Jeffrey Englehart requested B Sample analysis and provided a formal explanation to HIWU that he believed that Clenbuterol was administered to the horse prior to his becoming the horse's Responsible Person. The right to request B Sample analysis and submit an explanation for an alleged violation is available to all Covered Persons subject to a potential violation of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority's Anti-Doping and Medication Control Program."

"Segmented analysis was performed on the B Sample of the hair by the Kenneth L. Maddy Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory at the University of California, Davis. The results of this analysis indicated that clenbuterol was administered to Fast Heart 2021 before he became a Covered Horse and before Mr. Englehart became his trainer. Thus, Mr. Englehart's explanation was confirmed, and HIWU withdrew the Equine Anti-Doping Notice that had been served on him. The case was dropped before a Provisional Suspension was imposed on Mr. Englehart or a Charge letter was served on him.

"This is great news," said an emotional Englehart who said he did not know that the charges had been dropped until being told so by the *TDN*. "I'm so happy I'm shaking right now. I'm very

emotional and very happy that HIWU did the right thing. The sport needs their oversight and I'm glad that in my case they decided to do the right thing."

The colt, who was by Classic Empire, broke down on Nov. 21 at Finger Lakes and had to be euthanized. It is standard procedure for HIWU to perform tests on any horse that has to be put down, and those tests confirmed the presence of Clenbuterol, which is a banned substance. However, Clenbuterol is known to stay in a horse's system for as long as a year, which meant there was a possibility that someone gave it to the horse before he was purchased at Ocala.

The colt was purchased for \$4,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearling Sale Oct. 26, 2022. The purchaser was Juan Centento, who entered the horse back in the Ocala Sales.

Centeno, who sells under the name of All Dreams Equine, has not responded to numerous phone calls, texts and emails from the TDN seeking comment. Englehart said he got Centeno on the phone for about 20 seconds before he hung up on him





NEW REVENUE RECORD FOR JOCKEYS AND JEANS ALL AMERICAN STALLION SEASON SALE

The 2024 All American Thoroughbred Stallion Sale put on by Jockeys and Jeans raised a total of \$95,550, the organization announced Friday. PDJF Board President Nancy LaSala added: "On behalf of the men and women the PDJF serves, we are most grateful to the breeders who have supported this auction and the time and effort of the Jockeys and Jeans Committee to make this a successful fundraiser."



JAPAN COMING IN HOT IN DEFENCE OF SAUDI CUP

Following the Thursday scratching of **Meisho Hario (Jpn)** (Pyro), Japan is left with a team of four as they look for back-to-back victories in the world's richest horserace, the \$20-million G1 Saudi Cup at King Abdulaziz Racecourse in Riyadh.

After fielding five starters in the first three runnings of the 1800-metre contest--a pair of sixth-place efforts were the best they could do--no fewer than a half-dozen jetted in from the Land of the Rising Sun 12 months ago, and the results were more than anyone could have reasonably expected. Panthalassa (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) made all from gate one, as his compatriots filled third, fourth and fifth placings. And, if anything, those on site this week are a collectively classier bunch.

Like Mishriff (Ire) (Make Believe {GB}), **Derma Sotogake (Jpn)** (Mind Your Biscuits) will try to parlay a placing in the G3 Saudi Derby into Saudi Cup success. The G2 UAE Derby winner and GI Kentucky Derby sixth, the chestnut was audaciously spotted first-up for six months in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and was getting to White Abarrio (Race Day) before time ran out. He reportedly suffered an eye injury in transit, and while connections can't be completely sure he'll run his race, the signs remain positive. **Cont. p3**

ANOTHER GROUP WINNER FOR GODOLPHIN AS NAVAL POWER TAKES SINGSPIEL

Godolphin's NAVAL POWER (GB) (g, 4, Teofilo {Ire}--Emirates Rewards {GB}, by Dubawi {Ire}) showed no signs of rust when closing in taking style to win the AED850,000 G2 Singspiel S. Presented by Longines on Friday. San Donato (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) gave a good account of himself to take second by two lengths.

Highland Avenue (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) streaked to the vanguard while monitored by Make Me King (Fr) (Dark Angel {Ire}) for the backstretch run. Meanwhile, Naval Power was perched well off the fence and in perfect cover in the back third of the field. The Godolphin grey still held a commanding advantage just outside the final quarter-mile, but his lead evaporated as Make Me King gained with every stride and Erzindjan (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) briefly loomed a danger was coming up the fence. Mickael Barzalona cued Naval Power for his run, and the duo began to shift out to the centre of the course. "The horse has got more mature, stronger I think," said jockey Christophe Lemaire. "He knows the place so he was more focused on what he had to do this morning. He was very smooth, reacting very well when I put him a little bit under pressure. He was actually very good. He looks happy here so I'm very confident."

Ushba Tesoro (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}) took advantage of his only previous trip to the Middle East to plunder last year's G1 Dubai World Cup and was scarcely disgraced in the Classic when fifth. He exits a defence of his title in the G1 Tokyo Daishoten at Ohi just 56 days after the Santa Anita effort, demonstrative of the toughness he's show over the past two seasons.

"He is very settled in and is fit and ready now," said Masakazu Fukami, assistant to trainer Noboru Takagi.

Lemon Pop (Lemon Drop Kid) is Japan's reigning champion dirt galloper and earned his ticket to the Saudi Cup when overcoming the dreaded outside gate to take out the G1 Champions Cup at Chukyo on Dec. 8. While he controlled things from the front, getting there this time around is going to prove tricky, though he did win the G1 February S. from off the speed.

"We've enormous confidence in our jockey [Ryusei Sakai], in our last race we drew the very outside and a horse had never won from that position before," Godolphin Japan President Harry Sweeney said at Wednesday's draw. "Lemon Pop overcame those odds. He's going to have to do it again but we'll see how it goes. It's a big ask for Lemon Pop, we're respectful of all."

Crown Pride (Jpn) (Reach the Crown {Jpn}) was a decent fifth in this last year and the 2022 G2 UAE Derby hero continued his world travels by outclassing his rivals by 10 lengths in the G3 Korea Cup at Seoul last September before disappointing when only 11th at Chukyo.

The home team had just six runners in the first three Saudi Cups--including the victorious Emblem Road (Quality Road)--and for the second year running is represented by four entrants.

Defunded (Dialed In) was a dual Grade I winner for Bob Baffert in the States, but was recently acquired privately by Muhaideb Abdullah A Almuhaideb and makes his first start since finishing runner-up in defence of his title in the GI Awesome Again S. in late September. Former Baffert inmate Carmel Road (Quality Road) ran them off their feet in the King Faisal Cup over a mile Jan. 13, while the most intriguing of the locals is Power in Numbers (Girvin), winner of four from five in Saudi, including the Jan. 27 King's Cup over course and distance, where he had Scotland Yard (Quality Road) a half-length back in second. The latter gained a run with the withdrawal of Meisho Hario. Cont. p4

Isolate (Mark Valeski), last year's G2 Godolphin Mile hero, is the lone representative from the nearby United Arab Emirates and was last seen annexing the G2 Al Maktoum Cup at Meydan on Dec. 29. He tries nine furlongs for the first time Saturday. He drew into the Saudi Cup once Aidan O'Brien re-routed Luxembourg (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) for Saturday's G2 Neom Turf Cup.

Jack Be Nimble, Jack Be Quick?

John and Thady Gosden trained subsequent multiple Group 1 winner Mostahdaf (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) to an explosive seven-length drubbing of the G3 Neom Turf Cup field in 2023, and the father-son training duo are back for more with Jack Darcy (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}), this time in the upgraded \$2-million 2100-metre Group 2 over the King Abdulaziz grass course on Saturday.

Formerly trained by Paul and Oliver Cole, the French

group winner was a 266,667gns pickup for Prince Faisal bin Khaled bin Abdulaziz out of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale. The 5-year-old gelding ran out of steam to take eighth in the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris in October.

"All good," co-trainer Thady Gosden said. "He did some nice exercise on the dirt and so far his prep has gone as we would have hoped."

The Coolmore partners' **Luxembourg (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) is a three-time Group 1 winner for trainer Aidan O'Brien. He was only a nose shy of added top-level victory number four in his

final run of the season in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup on Dec. 10.

Spirit Dancer (GB) (Frankel {GB}) had German Pattern scorer Calif (Ger) (Areion {Ger}) well in his wake in the G2 Bahrain International Trophy S. in November. The G3 Strensall S. hero, who races for a partnership including Sir Alex Ferguson, was a solid fourth to Measured Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in the G1 Jebel Hatta warming up for this on Jan. 26.

Trainer Richard Fahey said of the son of Frankel, "He did a very

nice piece of work there last week. We'll have no excuses for him in terms of his preparation."

King Power Racing's The
Foxes (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}), a
dual Pattern winner and
fast-finishing second in the
GI Belmont Derby
Invitational S. last year, adds
some intrigue to the race.
The Andrew Balding trainee
was a close third in his

Balding said. "We're delighted with his position in gate six and Oisin Murphy is back on and he rides him so well."

Naturally Japan has thrown their weight behind a trio of runners in this undercard affair, and leading them is Carrot Farm's **Killer Ability (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). The G1 Hopeful S. winner rallied mildly to take fourth over 2000 metres in the G2 Chunichi Shimbun Hai on Dec. 9, a race he won in 2022. The added real estate could be right up his alley, and he partners with Cristian Demuro from stall five. --Heather Anderson

Japan's Bathrat Leon Aims to Defend 1351 Turf Sprint Title

Thrust onto the international stage in 2022 when he captured the G2 Godolphin Mile in Dubai, **Bathrat Leon (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}) kicked off a landmark day for his home country in 2023 when he won the G3 1351 Turf Sprint--which has been upgraded to a Group 2 this year worth \$2 million and is now presented by Saudi National Bank--as the first of three Japanese-bred and -trained group winners on the Saudi Cup card. He's back this year for an attempt to defend his title in the 1,351-metre, or about 6 3/4-furlong, event.

Yoshito Yahagi's assistant Yusaku Oka indicated Bathrat Leon had done all his preparations at home and is not being asked for much during training in the days leading up to the Turf Sprint.

"He is tuning up for the race and is very well," said Osa earlier this week. "Hopefully he keeps good form until the race."

Japan sends four to the Turf Sprint this year, including **Aguri** (**Jpn**) (Caravaggio). The G3 Hankyu Hai winner has been in the mix in his last few and will be reunited with Christophe Lemaire, who piloted him to a third in the G2 Hanshin Cup two back.

Tim Easterby's striking grey veteran **Art Power (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) aims to make it a fifth consecutive year of adding at least one group win to his CV. He's been freshened since October after his biggest lifetime score: victory in the G1 QIPCO British Champions Sprint S. at Ascot.

"He is a wonderful little horse, the perfect gentleman and we're lucky we've got him," said Easterby. "He has run well on fast ground, he has run well on heavy. He goes on quick ground no problem--but when they win on a bog one day they get a name for it--but this is a great track and we're looking forward to it. I'm always confident when he runs because he can gallop."

Godolphin homebred and Canadian Grade I winner

Mysterious Night (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) is in form for Charlie

Appleby with two Meydan wins, including the G2 Al Fahidi Fort, separated by just a week last month. Yeomanstown Stud's Dark Angel is the sire of not just Art Power and Mysterious Night, but two others--Dr Zempf (GB) and Raaed (Ire)--also in the field. Neither has found the winner's circle since early last year, but Dr Zempf competed in a couple of Grade Is in America and Raaed finished third in the 2023 edition of this race behind Bathrat Leon. --Jill Williams

Forever Young Full of Potential For Japan, Yahagi

Japan won the first two renewals of the G3 Boutique Group Saudi Derby with the Hideyuki Mori-trained Full Flat (Speightstown) and Pink Kamehameha (Jpn) (Leontes {Jpn}) and filled the second and third slots in 2022 ahead of Derma Sotogake's effort last winter.

Trainer Yoshito Yahagi is the leading trainer at the Saudi Cup, his two victories in 2023 taking him to three overall, and he'll tighten the girth around the exciting Forever Young (Jpn) (Real Steel {Jpn}). By a full-brother to Yahagi star Loves Only You (Jpn), the 3-year-old hails from the family of champion Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn), but his immediate female side is all American dirt and he has run brilliantly over the surface. He is perfect in three tries, including a towering seven-length score in the Listed Zen-Nippon Nisai Yushun in December and will jump a hot favourite with Ryusei Sakai up.

"Forever Young has a good chance in the Saudi Derby," said the rider, who guided Yahagi's Bathrat Leon (Jpn) (Kizuna {Jpn}) in last year's G3 1351 Turf Sprint. "He has huge potential that even I can't imagine."

Pinehurst (Twirling Candy) in 2022 is the lone U.S.-based Saudi Derby winner to date, and there are arguments to be made for each of the American runners this time around. Cont. p6

Book'em Danno (Bucchero) took his career mark to four wins from five outings with a 12 1/2-length romp in the Pasco S. at

Tampa Bay Downs Jan. 13 and although his lone blemish to date came over Saturday's 1600-metre distance, he found himself on the lead on that occasion and was outfinished in the Nashua S. while full of run through the line.

Bentornato (Valiant Minister) ran the table in his first four starts, including a pair of stakes wins against Florida-bred competition, but he failed to see out the 1700-metre trip in the In Reality S. on Dec. 2 and cuts back to one turn here.

Commissioner King (Commissioner) won this for

Saudi Arabia last year and perhaps the best chance among the locals comes in the form of **Haayeet** (Outwork), a maiden winner at first asking over 1400 metres Dec. 26 and a 1 1/2-length winner when dropped back to 1200 metres last time. Leading jockey Camilo Ospina has the mount. --Alan Carasso

Japanese Hat Trick On The Table In Red Sea Turf

A quartet of Japanese horses have lined up to take on 10 challengers in their quest to collect the \$2.5-million G3 Longines Red Sea Turf H. over 3000 metres on grass for the third year running after Stay Foolish (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) (2022) and Silver Sonic (Jpn) (Orfevre {Jpn}) (2023).

The race sees Hirotsugu Inokuma's **Iron Barows (Jpn)** (Orfevre {Jpn}) the tip of the Japanese spear and he brings no stamina concerns. He delivered in the 3600-metre G2 Sports Nippon Sho Stayers S. two starts back in December--the same race Silver Sonic won before his Riyadh triumph--although his form has been hit-and-miss at times. Ridden by Cristian Demuro, the 7-year-old will be making his seasonal bow, while Yu Hirai's dual Group 3 winner **Echt (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}) is aiming to build on a seventh-place run in 2023.

Yoshito Yahagi is gunning for his second win in the race after Stay Foolish's 4 1/2-length triumph two years ago. He brings the lightly raced Koji Maeda-owned 4-year-old **Libyan Glass (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}), who was fourth in the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger) in October and is stretching back out after a pair of fruitless 2400-metre tries.

"As he's abroad for the first time in his career, he has done well. He feels great, maybe greater than he is at home. He likes these surroundings," assistant trainer Yusaku Oka said of his charge who is booked for gate nine with Yuga Kawada to ride. "I

hope this experience is going to be his big advantage for him in future and also I really hope he runs well."

Only 2 1/2 lengths back of Silver Sonic at the wire in 2023, Tracey Bell and Caroline Lyons's **Enemy (GB)** (Muhaarar {GB}) was kept busy with 11 starts as a 6-year-old, and is already rounding back into form, with a head victory over Southwell's all-weather on Jan. 25, two better than the Grade I-placed The Foxes (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}).

Scuderia la Tesa's G2 Yorkshire Cup S. hero

Giavellotto (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) was a close third in August's G2 Lonsdale Cup and enters the fray from stall eight coming off a six-month break. Patrice Cottier has entered G1 Prix de Royallieu bridesmaid Diva Donna (Fr) (Cima De Triomphe {Ire}), and she carries once of the lightest weights in the 14-horse field at 128 pounds while drawn in stall one.

Desert Deja Vu as Trainer Trifecta from 2023 Dirt **Sprint Back with Top Contenders**

While this year's renewal of the G3 Riyadh Dirt Sprint lacks the star power of the 2023 edition, a dozen will line up to take a shot at the \$1.5-million purse, including Bill Mott, trainer of twotime American champion and winner of last year's renewal, Elite Power (Curlin). This year Mott brings Bold Journey (Hard Spun), whose upward trajectory includes his last three straight, all at this 1200-metre distance on the dirt. His American speed figures hit the highest marks of his career in that win troika while he also tallied his first graded score as he toted three pounds more than he'll be asked to carry here.

"He is a late-developing horse that has rounded into a nice sprinter on the dirt," said Mott. "He has won his last three starts, two of them stakes races. In his recent wins, he has been held up off the pace to finish strongly in the stretch and I guess we can expect the same tactics again. My team there tell me that he has arrived in good shape and is training with plenty of good energy."

Trainer Steve Asmussen, second in this event last year with Gunite (Gun Runner), takes another crack at the winner's circle with Skelly (Practical Joke). The graded-winning gelding is on a seven-race win streak, all at 1200 metres, with all but one at his home track in Arkansas. He's tossed up bigger speed numbers than his fellow American and the two, who have never faced each other back home, make an intriguing match half a world away.

Remake (Jpn) (Lani) threatens to have something to say about the outcome and looks to improve on his third in this event last year. The well-traveled entire, trained by Shintani Koichi, tried the 2023 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen after his stint in Riyadh,

finishing a slow-starting fifth, and has since been first or second in four starts spread between Japan and Korea. Fellow Japanese contender Jasper Krone (Frosted) has dropped three Group 1s since October between Japan, the U.S., and Hong Kong, but Hideyuki Mori has long been accustomed to the international stage and this horse owns a pair of Group 3 wins at the distance in Japan. This will, however, be his first start on dirt.

No European trainer or horse is entered in the Dirt Sprint this year, while Rebellious Stage (Justify) ranks as one of the top local hopes. Undefeated in all five of his Saudi tries, including an romp over a track and trip prep on Jan. 26, he started his career in the U.S. for Brittany Russell. Albadah Abdullah has handled his conditioning since his move to the desert. -- Jill Williams

LORD NORTH TREADS A FAMILIAR PATH

It is the G3 Winter Derby, so it must be time for the return from hibernation of the Clarehaven stalwart and late-winter specialist Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). Gearing up for his attempt at a fourth consecutive G1 Dubai Turf, the 8-year-old will be reunited with Robert Havlin who has partnered him in the last two editions of this prize formerly staged over 10 furlongs at Lingfield. Now at Southwell with an extra furlong added on, it will represent a different test for the high-class veteran whose probable limit is a mile and a quarter.

"We think he is where he was this time last year before the Winter Derby--working slightly better than the year before, when he was second to Alenquer," Havlin said. "Lord North is an eight-year-old now and takes a bit of getting fit, but he seems to be bright in himself. From a fitness perspective, he will improve as he always needs this first run to get all the lights switched on, but he is the class act and we are expecting a big run."

"He is guite an uncomplicated horse, as he relaxes into a race and it is up to you when to press the button. His optimum trip is probably nine furlongs given his record in the Dubai Turf, but he has run well over a mile and a half at the Breeders' Cup."

While Godolphin's Listed Lingfield Derby Trial winner Military Order (Ire) (Frankel (GB)) failed to go on after that promising performance last May, the now-gelded full-brother to Adayar (Ire) showed form strong enough to be a major player here when second in the course-and-distance Winter Derby Trial Conditions S. in January. Possibly more attuned to the greater stamina test than Lord North, he represents a worthy rival alongside Prince Faisal's long-absent **Eydon (Ire)** (Olden Times {GB}) who is seen for the first time since finishing fourth in the 2022 G1 2000 Guineas.

"Military Order has definitely come forward since his last start," trainer Charlie Appleby said. "He ticks a couple of boxes in that he has run well already this year over the track and trip. He should be a big player based on the pick of his three-year-old form and what he achieved in the trial."

Ted Voute, racing manager to Prince Faisal, said of Eydon, "Andrew [Balding] has been pleased with him and was pleased with his gallop at Kempton. It's a pretty even field and they are all rated around the same figures apart from Lord North and we will see."

IRISH 2,000 GUINEAS WINNER MAC SWINEY RELOCATES TO ANNGROVE STUD

Irish 2,000 Guineas winner and Group 1-winning two-year-old **Mac Swiney (Ire)** has relocated from the Irish National Stud to Anngrove Stud for the 2024 season.

Mac Swiney lit up the 2021 season for trainer/breeder Jim Bolger when beating his stable-mate, the 2,000 Guineas winner Poetic Flare (Ire), to land the Irish 2,000 Guineas.

A three-time winner as a juvenile, he had ended his debut season with victory in the G1 Vertem Futurity having also landed the G2 Beresford S. Mac Swiney's dam Halle Na Saoire (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) is a full-sister to the Group 2 winner Light Heavy (Ire).

Anngrove Stud's Alastair Pim commented, "We are delighted to stand Mac Swiney. It's rare that a small stud gets the chance to stand a Classic winner in his first year at stud. He was a high class two-year-old who showed speed and versatility and is a Classic winning three-year-old. As the late great Paddy Mullins said to my father 'every National Hunt mare in the country will stay three miles, it's the bit of speed they need in the final furlong' and Mac Swiney certainly fits that criteria."

MacSwiney, described by Bolger as 'tough, courageous and adaptable' joined the Irish National Stud roster initially for 2024. However, the switch to Anngrove Stud is thought to better suit his appeal to the dual-purpose breeders.

Irish National Stud boss Cathal Beale said, "In recognition of the Irish National Stud's enduring support of National Hunt racing and breeding we are delighted to offer a horse of Mac Swiney's calibre to the breeders of Ireland, he is a beautiful specimen with lots of quality and a big strong athletic walk. INS has a long tradition of standing our dual-purpose horses with the Pim family at Anngrove Stud. The sire line speaks for itself with horses like Pied Piper flying the flag for New Approach."

Derham, who took out his trainer's licence last year, was in the news earlier this month when spending close to €500,000 on smart chasing prospect Imagine and talented race mare Mollys Mango at the Caldwell Dispersal, was visibly delighted to bag another big-priced recruit to his yard.

He said, "Ed has been following this horse for a long time, he is back and forth to Ireland all the time. The horse is a beautiful model, a good athlete and to have done this so early in his career, the type of horse he is, strikes us that he must be pretty smart - to be performing to that level already would bode pretty well. You look at him and think what a horse you will be in two years' time."

Of the horse's owner, Derham outlined, "He is for Ian Barratt, a new owner to me and who is wanting to develop real high-class team of horses both for the Flat and National Hunt codes--he owns the Jamie Osborne-trained Emaraaty Ana who won in Qatar last weekend. Jamie recommended me, which was very nice of him. Ian and his family are really enthusiastic, let's

hope they are lucky."

The Tattersalls Cheltenham February Sale produced a solid afternoon's trade which saw 34 horses sold for an aggregate of £2,469,500 with a strong clearance rate of 89%.

"I found a good spot very easily and in the end he showed plenty of quality," said Barzalona. "It was a huge performance and I'm sure for Charlie and the team to get him ready for this race after a break, they must have expected something."

Admirably consistent throughout his career, the bay won his first four starts and a pair of English listed races by September of his juvenile season. He ran sixth to subsequent G1 2000 Guineas hero Chaldean (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. in October. Cont. p13

Shining Jewel applied more pressure on the bend, while tracked by Sapphire Seas, as English Rose relaxed in fourth. The leaders looked vulnerable with a quarter-mile to travel, and English Rose was within a length and closing fast, as Sapphire Seas made her bid to her immediate left. English Rose was moving the better of the two, however, and forged to the front to win handily under Michael Barzalona. Nibras Angel (GB) (Harry Angel {Ire}) was third by three lengths.

"We went a good gallop and my filly travelled well from the beginning," said Barzalona after his first win in this race. "It went well for us as the horse to beat was just in front of us. Maybe she was a bit fitter today."

Appleby added, "Mentally she's come forward as she was a bit keen first time out. She had the race under her belt and this is probably her ideal trip.

"We haven't quite firmed up a plan for these fillies yet. This filly could join [Cape Verdi winner] Silver Lady on a trip to America for the Keeneland meet in April."

A winner of her first two starts on turf and all-weather at Newmarket and Kempton in May of last year and November, English Rose lost her unbeaten moniker when a neck second to stablemate Silver Lady (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in the G2 Cape Verdi on Jan. 19.

OAKS GLORY FOR STAR GUITAR'S GOLDEN

'TDN Rising Star' MANAMA GOLD (f, 3, Star Guitar--Charged Cotton, Dehere) remained perfect with a 1 1/4-length tally in the AED700,000 G3 UAE Oaks over the closing Mizzyaan (Justify) at Meydan Racecourse on Friday. It was the first stakes win for the chestnut, who covered the 1900-metre trip in 2:00.81.

In charge from the bell, as none of her five rivals seemed overly interested in picking up the baton, Manama Gold was always going along at an easy clip while staying fairly close to the rail past the clubhouse turn and down the backstretch. Mizzyaan kept a close eye on the Fawzi Nass trainee the whole way around from second just off Manama Gold's girth, and Lighting Paradise (Congrats) saved every inch of ground in third.

Once the real running began, Manama Gold did not open up as readily as in her past two trips to the post, but she still managed to come home without ever being headed, albeit the winning margin was smaller. Adrie de Vries took care with his filly, and did not ask too much of her to secure the victory. Lightning Paradise threatened to take over the place position down the lane, but Mizzyaan found another gear and fought her off to retain second, 1 3/4 lengths ahead of that foe.

"I'm very pleased; I have a lot to do with her in the mornings and she's a very special filly," said De Vries. "At the moment, I think she's not at her best--she's growing a lot--but she has a lot of class.

"I didn't really have a plan to make [the running] but no-one really wanted it. You can see when she gets in front she pricks her ears. I think she'll be a better filly next year, but I'll leave it to Fawzi and [owner] Sheikh Nasser to make a plan."

A winner of her Meydan debut going 1400 metres on Dec. 12, Manama Gold extended the margin to 9 1/4 in a 1600-metre conditions race where she earned her 'TDN Rising Star badge.

"I was devastated the last time when nothing went right in the Guineas after he fluffed his lines in the gates," said pilot Tadhg O'Shea. "He's a lovely horse, I've loved him from day one, even when he was unsold at the sale here--I rang Michael Burke [owner] and luckily he decided to buy him.

"He's got the perfect gap now; five weeks, so all roads lead to the [G2 UAE] Derby on World Cup night."

Third on debut sprinting here in November, the dark bay drew off to win by 7 1/2 lengths upped to 1600 metres on Dec. 8. A €55,556 buy-back out of the Goffs Dubai Breeze-Up Sale, he found only Mendelssohn Bay (Mendelssohn) too good in the Jan. 26 G3 UAE 2000 Guineas and upped his game accordingly on Friday.

His dam was stakes-placed six times, and has a 2-year-old colt

French rider Maryline Eon lifted the challenge trophy for the Invest Saudi International Jockeys Challenge at King Abdulaziz Racecourse on Friday and secured the largest share of the prizemoney. Saudi Arabia's multiple title-winning Camilo Ospina would finish second and visiting Brazilian rider Victoria Mota reached the final podium spot in third despite not managing a win on the evening.

A brisk early start in the contest, which went down to the wire, saw Eon hold off all challengers late thanks to those early efforts, ending on 25 points from four rides. She claimed a runner-up finish in Round 1 behind Ospina on Altawhidi (KSA) and a victory in Round 2 over 1400m aboard Mo Aela (KSA).

"I didn't know at first I'd won, I thought I would need to get points in the last race," Eon said. "I'm very proud. I try every day to win races in France and ride against very good jockeys but to win this against the very best jockeys in the world--I'm very grateful."

Round 3 went to America as Luis Saez, last year's winner, struck with Pagan (Ire) in a turf sprint, and Round 4 was claimed by South African Rachel Venniker, who willed her mount Cliffs Of Fury (GB) over the line to claim the final points race. Saez and Venniker tied for fourth place.

ROMANTIC WARRIOR FRONT AND CENTRE IN HONG KONG GOLD CUP by Alan Carasso

Seven times has **Romantic Warrior (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) gone to post over the 2000 metres at Sha Tin Racecourse and on six of those occasions, he has proved victorious, more times

than not in convincing fashion. His lone blemish over the course and distance came in the 2023 G1 Citi Hong Kong Gold Cup, when he was run down close home by multiple Horse of the Year Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) as the odds-on pop, but barring something unforeseen, Romantic Warrior should be righting that wrong against 10 others in this year's Gold Cup Sunday afternoon.

It has been a carefully managed season thus far for Romantic Warrior, who likely was in need of the run when fourth in the G1 Turnbull S. in Melbourne before just prevailing in the G1 Cox Plate three weeks later. Despite a six-week turnaround and a period of quarantine once returning from Australia, Romantic Warrior outlasted the nails-tough Luxembourg (Ire) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup Dec. 10.

A victory Sunday would complete the set of Hong Kong features over the mile and a quarter, which also includes the 2022 BMW Hong Kong Derby and last year's G1 FWD QE II Cup. He would join the likes of Vengeance of Rain (NZ) and Designs On Rome (Ire) should he do so.

"He's very good. He's happy, healthy and in good form. Hugh Bowman gave a very positive report to me," said trainer Danny Shum following a Tuesday gallop on the grass. James McDonald will be in from Australia for the ride.

The Kiwi was aboard **Voyage Bubble (Aus)** (Deep Field {Aus}) when he registered a maiden Group 1 success in the Stewards' Cup going a mile Jan. 21 and stretches back out to 10 furlongs for the first time since causing a 45-1 upset in last year's Hong Kong Derby. A good performance could lead to an appearance in the G1 Dubai Turf (1800m) at Meydan in five weeks' time.

Straight Arron (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) took advantage of Romantic Warrior's absence to defeat Sword Point (Aus) (American Pharoah) in the G2 Jockey Club Cup in November and was a troubled fourth, beaten under a length, in the Hong Kong Cup. Cont. p18
